

first and second, first and third, or first second and third base occupied before two are out. Runner need not retouched and may advance at their own peril. APPROVED RULING: in this situation, the batter is not out if the fielder permits the ball to drop untouched to the ground.

(m) a preceding runner shall, in the umpire's judgment, intentionally interfere with a fielder who is attempting to catch a thrown ball or to throw the ball in an attempt to complete any play;

(n) with two out, a runner on third base, on two strikes on the batter, the runner attempts to steal home base on a legal pitch and the ball touches the runner in the batter's strike zone. The umpire shall call "strike three", the batter is out and the run shall not count; before two are out, the umpire shall call "strike three", the ball is dead, and the run counts.

The political campaign for the Windward Islands' Seat in the Staten began in St. Maarten on Saturday March 17th., the first punch was delivered by the W.I.P.P., which was a clean one above the belt; The W.I.P.P.'s No. 1 Candidate and leader, the Windward Islands Representative in the Staten Mr. Hugh Lopes read the W.I.P.P.'s Programme of Action: The old age pension is to be improved so that young workers begin to pay social security not at 15 years but at 20 years of

age and that social security (old age pension) be paid out at 60 years instead of 65 years. By this one would have only to contribute for 40 years instead of 50 years. Also the old age benefits be raised so that those receiving fl. 95.-- a month receive fl. 125.-- a month and other payments raise in proportion. That the MULO-School in the Windward Islands be brought on the same level, teaching all of the subjects taught in the MULO-Schools of Curacao and Aruba - That a University be built in the N.A. preferably in Aruba, so that our children would not have to go to Holland for their further studies, but will be within reach of their parents. These main subjects along with many more important ones, were offered to our voters - He also spoke of an un-employment fund, where workers out of a job under the age of 60 can receive a sum of money to maintain one's self and one's family until a job was had.

On Tuesday March 20th. the D.P. struck back, the both Deputies of St. Maarten, struck below the belt in the meanest ways - some of their own candidates blushed, these two members of the Executive Council throw with "filth" in several directions.
