## Former jail informant asks for relief

The man who claimed he was forced to eat his own feces at the Charlotte County Jail last year was back in court Tuesday fighting for postconviction relief.

Mark Kapuscinski, 58, is less than halfway through a 15-year sentence for drug trafficking based on a 2012 offense. He pleaded guilty to the charges in 2013.

In his motion for relief, Kapuscinski claims his previous defense counsel was ineffective for failing to advise, investigate and assert an insanity defense, failing to file motions to suppress evidence, and coercing him into accepting a plea offer. If the motion were to be granted, Kapuscinski could be released from prison.

Kapuscinski began working with the Charlotte County Sheriff's Office as a confidential informant after a drug-related arrest in 2011. According to testimony Wednesday, Kapuscinski helped investigators make arrests in 25 Charlotte County cases.

Much of the testimony Tuesday revolved around Kapuscinski's mental state while he was working as a CI. According to his own testimony, he was diagnosed with

## Gas prices at local pumps tick up

Prices at local pumps were edging up this week, which analysts attributed to a higher demand for gas, higher oil prices and instability in the Middle East.

The upward movement is unusual this time of year, analysts said.

On Tuesday, gas prices averaged \$2.39 in the Punta Gorda area, which was an increase of about 9 cents over just 24 hours.

The statewide average was up Tuesday to \$2.45, which

was about 5 cents higher than the day before.

"While some markets only rose a couple cents, others like Orlando and Tampa jumped 10 cents or more," AAA spokesman Mark Jenkins told the Sun.

AAA doesn't track specifically for the North Port area, but this upward movement in pump prices is the trend across the state and nation right now, said Jenkins.

Sarasota-Venice-Bradenton area was up to an average of about \$2.41 on Tuesday, jumping about 8 cents from Monday, according to AAA.

According to gasbuddy.com Senior Petroleum Analyst Patrick DeHaan, crude oil prices hit levels not seen since June of 2015, which is helping to push up gas prices at local pumps.

"Florida has started to see prices go up," said DeHaan. "Activity in the Middle East is causing instability."

The final week of October carried the highest gasoline demand in 11 years, and that high demand caused a dip in gasoline supply last week, said Jenkins.

Crude oil influences half the price of gasoline, Jenkins said.

"The fact that supplies are somewhat tightening, leaves oil prices more vulnerable to headlines like a potential extension of the production cut agreement between OPEC, Russia and other oil-producing countries that could span all of 2018; and the uncertainty caused by the arrests of some major figures in Saudi Arabia," Jenkins said.

Those 11 princes arrested last weekend in Saudi Arabia — which is a major crude oil producer — were through an "anti-corruption committee"

Add in a spring training stadium, restaurants, resort amenities, an assisted living facility, a water park,

numerous new or growing neighborhoods in North Port and Englewood and perhaps hundreds of various commercial facilities.

All seeking to be constructed in the next few years.

Is there sufficient construction labor available to meet these massive construction demands in both a timely and cost-efficient manner?

According to interviews conducted by the Sun, the answer, in the short term, is probably no. But long term, the construction industry is

## Communing with nature at the Calusa Nature Center

In case you haven't noticed from the "Live Like a Tourist" columns I write, I love to be outdoors. And since we live in an area of the country that has a temperate climate almost year-round, there always seems to be an abundance of outside activities available.

If you can combine the outdoors with an educational experience, that's a bonus.

Right off of I-75, in Fort Myers, is the 105-acre Calusa Nature

Center & Planetarium. I've lived in Southwest Florida for more than 20 years and had never heard of this beautiful place, but am happy to at least know about it now.

# County rejects Veterans Blvd. access for planned gas station

MURDOCK — Charlotte County has denied a request for access to Veterans Boulevard for a proposed Circle K gas station and convenience store at Cochran Boulevard.

However, this rather straightforward issue is complicated by the fact the entrance was actually constructed 17 years ago, with county approval, said attorney Robert Berntsson, representing the land owner.

In 1999, commissioners adopted a resolution authorizing three driveways leading into the 3-acre parcel, which were then installed on Veterans, Cochran and Peachland boulevards, he said. But the property owner, Dr. Kenneth Levy, was told last month by

county officials that the Veterans Boulevard driveway never received the final go-ahead.

"Nowhere is there a record of final site plan approval," said Venkat Vattikuti, county transportation engineer.

Nonetheless, the developer proceeded to install all three driveways. And the county allowed it, even though the Veterans driveway was too close to the Cochran intersection for safety reasons. The overall project never did materialize.

"The county dropped the ball, the applicant dropped the ball, everybody dropped the ball," County Commissioner Ken Doherty said. "They were supposed to come back to the board and get approval before they built that driveway opening."

Consequently, when the land owner approached the county

in 2015 about a new gas station project for the same property, the driveway issue resurfaced.

Attorney Berntsson said that when the county originally approved the driveway, it was granted an easement on the property as a permit condition. Yet, the county now is rescinding that approval.

"This simply comes down to the county not having a record of final sign-off of an approval that occurred over 15 years ago," attorney Berntsson wrote in an Aug. 7 letter to the county. "The overwhelming evidence shows the driveway was constructed as approved and should be vested as an allowed driveway on Veterans Boulevard."

In his own letter to the county, on June 7, George Davis, president of DM Construction,

said his company built the three drive connections in accordance with approved construction plans. He said all the work was inspected, corrected for minor deviations and signed off as being complete by Charlotte County right of way inspectors.

Engineer James Herston also said everything was done with proper clearance.

"It was all in accordance with all ordinances and regulations that are still in effect today," he said.

Herston added that denying access to Veterans Boulevard now would only create more of a hazard at the crossroads of Cochran and Peachland boulevards.

"It's already a failing, chaotic intersection," he said.

But county officials were adamant that, regardless of past actions,

the Veterans Boulevard driveway would pose a safety risk.

Vattikuti explained that the Veterans driveway is located just 270 feet from Cochran Boulevard, which does not meet minimum distance standards set by the Florida Department of Transportation, which are based on traffic speed. Therefore, the right-turn deceleration lane to the driveway is far shorter than what is required, he said.

With a 45 mph speed limit on Veterans Boulevard when the driveway was constructed, the approach lane needed to be 440 feet long. The current allowed speed of 55 mph mandates at least a 660-foot-long, slow-down lane. Either way, it falls short.

"It gets right down to safety and liability," Doherty said.

Commissioner

Stephen R. Deutsch argued in favor of allowing the driveway, citing other corner gas stations on State Road 776 with the same speed limit in place. He said the county should recognize both the project's value and the property owner's rights.

"I'm so frustrated by this. I don't see any way how this can be a safety issue," Deutsch said. "When I look at the whole picture, this would be a positive thing."

His motion to approve the driveway failed for a lack of a second.

The proposed Circle K would consist of a 4,400-square-foot convenience store with 20 fueling positions (10 fuel pumps). Under the plan, the site would have a driveway on Peachland Boulevard, plus right-in/right-out access on Cochran Boulevard.

# Homeless man charged in vehicle burglary

A homeless man was arrested Monday in connection with a vehicle burglary.

Charlotte County Sheriff's Office deputies responded to a vehicle burglary that

occurred on the 2000 block of El Jobean Road on Monday. The victim reported a large amount of construction tools missing from a work truck.

According to a CCSO press release, video surveillance footage caught the suspect riding a bicycle with a makeshift trailer attached.

Detectives began an investigation, which included canvassing

the neighborhood and speaking to potential witnesses. In the area of Collingswood Boulevard and Toledo Blade Boulevard, detectives saw a male riding a bicycle who matched the suspect in the video.

He was identified as Timothy Joseph Roberge, 40, a convicted felon who had failed to register as required by law, according to the press release.

Prior to being placed

under arrest for that charge, a syringe was located in Roberge's pants pocket, containing liquid that tested positive for codeine, which he had no prescription for, the press release stated.

Detectives found the camp in which Roberge was living, where all the tools were located, secured under a tarp and covered by palm fronds. According to the release, a witness in the area

gave a statement linking Roberge to the concealment of the tools.

Roberge was charged with burglary to a conveyance armed, grand theft of more than \$300 but less than \$5,000, concealing/tampering with evidence, possession of a controlled substance without a prescription, possession of drug paraphernalia, and failure to register as a convicted felon. He

was transported to the Charlotte County Jail, where he was held with a \$41,000 bond.

According to the Charlotte County Sheriff's Office, 58 percent of vehicle burglarizing in 2017 were unlocked vehicles. CCSO asks vehicle owners to remove valuables from sight and lock doors to prevent crimes of opportunity.

schizophrenia during his teenage years. While he was working as a CI, he said he developed an alter ego which would tell him what to do, and he felt the instructions were coming from a "higher power."

A forensic psychiatrist testified that he evaluated Kapuscinski and believes he suffers from schizo-affective disorder, which has symptoms common to both schizophrenia and bipolar disorder. The stress of his work as a CI would likely have exacerbated the illness.

Kapuscinski also received many threats

while he was a CI. He testified that at one time, a three-time murderer held a knife held to his throat and threatened to kill him if he found out Kapuscinski was a CI. When Kapuscinski's identity was later compromised while he was in jail after the second arrest, he also received threats from

inmates and was called a "snitch" by the guards, he said.

The motion for relief filed by Defense Attorney Mary Elizabeth Fitzgibbons in 2015 states, "Kapuscinski had put in almost a year working for CCSO, helping them with about 60 or more low-end deals, and was left with nothing to show

for it but death threats, 15 years in prison and a fine of \$50,000."

Assistant State Attorney Tracy Detzel testified there was no lesser option for Kapuscinski as a habitual felony offender. Both she and Kapuscinski's defense attorney at the time, Mike Powell, said they had no reason to

believe he was incompetent to proceed with the sentence.

The hearing was continued to a later date after Kapuscinski grew stressed Tuesday afternoon. He will be transported back to a state correctional facility as quickly as possible to avoid further issues at the jail.

headed by the country's crown prince, according to news reports. And prices could be

back up to where they were during some of September.

Based on the stock market and future trading data, Jenkins said the statewide fuel averages could be in the \$2.50-range soon.

"Punta Gorda prices tend to be about 5-10 cents less than the state average," he said.

For now, prices at the local pumps are bucking trends, and that makes long-term expectations "somewhat unpredictable," Jenkins said.

Indeed. As an example, from 2006 to 2010, Sarasota County lost 9,361 construction jobs, according to the county’s Planning and Development Services department. But from 2010 to 2015, the most recent year available, it has gained 3,271, and everyone agrees there are thousands of more posts.

Many days the positions fill the Sun classified sections, the largest in the state, and the cdbia.com website. Roofers, tile workers, plumbers, window installers, carpenters, laborers.

“It’s a challenge,” Barrett said. “Our members have needs. It may take longer for some projects to get done, but we will get them accomplished, absolutely. Our industry is a very strong industry. We will make it, no matter what.”

Workers, too, have been drawn away for mass construction opportunities in areas devastated by hurricanes, such as the Keys, Texas and Puerto Rico.

County Commissioner Bill Truex, president of Truex Preferred



Construction in Englewood and vice president of the Florida Home Builders Association, agreed with Barrett of the challenge ahead that could increase time lines for local contractors overwhelmed with work, at least in the short term.

Yet, he said, staging the work is important.

“It’s not going to happen all at once,” he said, “so that should lessen the fears.”

Outside contractors will be necessary anyway for large projects like Babcock Ranch, he said. And in bringing contractors in from outside the area, you’re introducing new people and to the area, who just might want to come back here to live and work.

“It’s happened before,” he said, noting the years before the recession in 2008.

A bigger problem, Truex said, may be providing housing for the construction workforces: “That

may be our toughest challenge.”

John Carlson, Project Manager for Core Construction in Sarasota, and a CDBIA board member, concurs. There is “definitely a shortage,” he said, and that will tend to “extend the duration” of some projects, “depending on how it all stacks up.” But the problem “is not one that would keep (the projects) from completion.”

Compounded by the challenges of the summer’s hurricanes, Florida Lifestyle Homes President Bill Ennen said he has found recently that homes that were taking as little as eight months to build are now taking up to a year.

Cost is another matter. There most likely will be additional costs, he said, both in the longer time for construction and in the carrying costs for money borrowed to finance the projects. But they will be completed.

Labor from other areas of Florida — Fort Myers, Tampa, Orlando — will be necessary, particularly for major projects like the Sunseeker Resort in Charlotte Harbor.

“There is no short-time answer,” Carlson said, but the CDBIA is putting together both short-term and long-term tasks forces “to promote jobs available in the building industry. We are willing to train people interested in construction.”

According to Barrett, the construction boom provides a major boost for the area job market in the construction trades. The association will recruit and train applicants with no formal construction experience.

“Anyone who can swing a hammer, use a paintbrush, read a ruler,” she said, “can come in off the street with no experience at all, and make \$12 to \$15 an hour.

“What our industry needs is people who don’t mind working. You have to want to work. To work 40 hours a week. Willing to work overtime. The rewards are great. You have the gratification that you helped build something. It’s exciting.”

is to get people who want to come into the industry. There’s nothing like working in the building industry. You wake up in the morning and give blood, sweat and tears into everything you do. When you pass by a house and can say, ‘I’m proud. I built that roof.’”

## Technical colleges

The industrial technologies courses offered by Suncoast Technical College, which has its ribbon-cutting this month at its new campus in North Port, are trying to prepare workers.

Among the half-dozen or so programs off Toledo Blade Boulevard are topics such as carpentry.

The director, Michael Endee, says they are designed specifically to help push students directly in the path of the most needed jobs in the community and provide “another opportunity for our students coming from North Port High School, all the other area high schools and the adults in the area.”

Charlotte Technical College is involved with in dual enrollment classes with Charlotte, Port Charlotte and Englewood high schools, and The Academy, an alternative high school. Its two courses involving the building industry are Building Construction Technologies and HVAC.

Under the program, high school students in grades 9-12 can use their elective credits by studying 100 minutes a day at the college, can take some credits online via the Charlotte Virtual School, and can graduate with a high school diploma, a certificate of completion from the college, multiple other certifications, and credits towards a degree from a state college.

The college also houses a chapter of the Future Builders of America, founded across the state by the Florida Home Builders Association, and sponsored locally by the CDBIA. It provides construction tools for the students and the college, college scholarships in the building trades for students, and trips to state conferences.

The program, says CTC director Deelynn Bennett, “holds the students in the palm of their hand.” Carlson and Truex are FBA trustees.

The college also is researching the possibility of a new, larger building trades venture — an apprentice program for its students with businesses in the construction industry.

According to Bennett, the program is in the “very early stages” of discovery, research and data collection. If implemented, it would involve a company training and employing a student, who would work 35-40 hours a week, earning a progressive wage as his or her skills increase.

There are several aspects mandated by the Florida Department of education, including a business registering with the state as an apprenticeship, and the necessity for the student to complete 144 hours of instruction.

“There are still a lot of unanswered questions,” she said. “It’s a possibility, but not without community support and the knowledge and foundation to do it the right way.


“The devil,” she said, “is in the details.”

## Benefits, recruiting help companies fill staff

Rebuilding in the wake of three hurricanes is further stressing a Florida construction labor market that’s already tight.

Even before three hurricanes brought devastation to Texas, Florida and Puerto Rico, two-thirds of contractors from the South reported having trouble filling key jobs, according to a third quarter report by USG Corporation and the U.S. Chamber of Commerce. Electrical and concrete workers were in shortest supply throughout the South, the report found.

One company reported targeting its hiring and retention efforts.

Robert Lipscomb, chief executive of the Williams Company construction firm, now recruits at Purdue and Iowa State universities. He said he likes students’ Midwestern sensibility. And while competition to hire top recruits can be tough in Florida, students in Indiana and Iowa typically line up for recruiters wearing Hawaiian shirts and talking about surf conditions.

Lipscomb said retaining workers is just as key during a time when head hunters regularly reach out to his 110-employee workforce.

The company recently celebrated the 10th anniversary of its employee stock-ownership plan.

“Probably the most important aspect of the ESOP is that our owner-employees are building a significant retirement fund that comes to them at no cost at all,” said Lipscomb, who added that he sits down with groups of about 10 employees to make sure their long-term financial plans are in order.

Thomas Donohue, president of the U.S. chamber, said Florida’s labor-challenged landscape is unlikely to improve anytime soon. “It’s likely to remain a challenge,” he said. “Finding skilled construction workers will be essential.”

## Youth, the future of the industry

Carlson, Truex and Barrett all strongly agree that a long-term solution to the construction labor shortage depends on the youth of the area.

“Absolutely,” Carlson said. “There’s no doubt about it. Our industry is aging. Median age is rising. Our future depends on them.”

The local construction labor market, Truex said, “is a great opportunity for youth to expand their future. It’s a great option for them, for better pay. This is the time to build a nest egg in the next few years, to open their own business someday.”

For Barrett, a career can start in middle school. “Middle school students right now are going to be the luckiest students out there.”

When they are ready to go into a Charlotte County high school, she said, they have the opportunity for dual-enrollment in Charlotte Technical College — not only for building construction studies and Heating-Ventilating-Air Conditioning, but for myriad studies in other fields.

“There are so many courses over and above construction,” she said, “they can graduate from high school with tools to work in an industry they want, for \$15 to \$20 an hour or even more. Graduating from high school with a trade, or having that experience, you never know where that experience is going to bring you.

“But not every job is for everybody,” she said. In construction, “you can get dirty on the job. It’s not all glitz and glory. But the difference you’re making is immeasurable.

“Our biggest interest right now

# Local Rotary clubs donate dictionaries to schools

A Google search of quotes on the power of words results in more links than one needs to count. “I impress upon them how powerful words are,” he said. “We talk about the table of contents,



Students listen attentively to Riley’s 15-minute presentation as he pushes the power of words and the impact they can have, whether in a positive or negative effect. “We talked about how words make them feel — like chocolate, there are lots of ‘mmmm’s’, then turnip greens, a lot of ‘ughs.’”

Riley said, “It is always fun to show them the longest word in the dictionary, which takes almost an entire page, and I tell them that it’s going to be on their next spelling test; they groan and squeal.”

The donations are a “win-win” for Rotary, according to Riley. “The children, they get a good feeling by getting such an important, valuable gift, and we have good feeling giving it to them and knowing that it’s going to help them with their academic success.”

one being the Pine Loop Trail. It’s a peaceful walk, and you’ll hear nothing but the sound of swaying pine trees. It’s also educational, with frequent signs telling you about what’s around you, from animal habitats to plant and tree types.

The forest there is a pine flatwoods habitat, with an abundance of slash pines. Did you know that those particular trees are fire-resistant? They have a thick, multi-layered bark and their needles and cones are held way up at the top of the tree, which provides less fuel for a fire down on the ground. These trees were used to construct many of the early homes in the region.

Near the trail entrance there are some areas that allow visitors an up-close and personal view of some of the property’s resident creatures. There is a butterfly aviary and an Audubon aviary, which houses permanently injured birds of prey, like hawks, vultures, bald eagles, owls and more.

Not to be missed is the planetarium, which is the only one south of Bradenton and west of Miami. The shows there typically take place at noon, 2 and 3 p.m., and include not only educational presentations about our starry sky, but special laser light shows for both kids and adults.

The whole property is also a great place to hold events, and is used quite often by Fort Myers residents for that purpose. Though the museum doesn’t serve food, they do have a large, covered picnic area and you can either bring in your own food, or if there is a large event, the museum will bring in food trucks.

As for me, I was just content to wander on the trails all morning



Val Rankin needs to check her date-book before she can make a commitment. But those little appointment books with a small space for daily activity can't contain a typical day for the Punta Gorda woman.

"I need to write things down so I don't double book," she said, explaining she pet-sits for several people and takes care of "a little old lady with dementia."

A while back Val was startled to learn that the "little old lady" is five years younger than she is. "Age is such a meaningless number," she said.

When it comes to Val's age, people find it hard to believe she just celebrated her 85th birthday.

No wonder. She's out dancing almost every night of the week, with friends that are almost half her age.

"I have no idea why they like to hang out with me but we have such a great time together. It doesn't matter about age. We all just live to dance," she said.

A strict adherence to healthy eating and daily exercise has kept her healthy, free of all medication and ailments. "We are what we eat," she believes.

She's even more vigorous now than she was five years ago when she won the "Shake your

booty" dance contest at Fishermen's Village.

It's her energy and exuberant dance moves that set her off from others on the dance floor.

After she dances continuously until the band stops playing at 11 p.m., Val rounds up her friends to go to one of her favorite places that has music until midnight.

The next night she's on her cellphone texting friends to go dancing again.

If Val spots someone "just watching," she motions for them to join her on the dance floor. There's something contagious about her enthusiasm because she finds it easy to convince strangers to join her.

When no one is dancing, Val proves to be "the ice breaker," and the social director, going out on the floor alone until she is soon joined by others.

There are no strangers in Val's world. There are only potential friends. If someone walks into a place alone, Val motions for them to join her table.

When Val's husband of 49 years died three years ago, she lost her favorite dance partner.

They say "attitude is everything" and Val is proof positive of that.

She refuses to sit around moaning about the loss of the good old days. "Instead, I enjoy the good new days," she said.

If you doubt that every day of life can be

a celebration, hang out with Val.

"I celebrate everything I do. I even celebrate taking out the garbage," she laughed.

Because Val was never alone for one day of her life before her husband died, friends worried she would lose the joy that is so ingrained in her. Instead, she relishes her new stage of life.

"I concentrate on the positive things," she explained. "I now have the freedom to do anything I want."

Not even spending Hurricane Irma in a school shelter dimmed the joy that bubbles within her.

When others at the shelter invited her to play cards with them to pass the time, she said she wanted to do something active.

So she turned on her

### Endless possibilities for Charlotte sales tax surplus

**OUR POSITION:** *Charlotte County's 1 cent sales tax, approved in 2014, is bringing in more money than expected and there are plenty of options where to spend it.*

Just in time for Christmas. That's one way to look at the recent good news about the 1 cent sales tax extension that was approved by voters in 2014.

County commissioners were briefed by Travis Mortimer, county capital projects manager, recently that the sales tax is raking in more money than expected — millions more.

Original estimates — admittedly conservative — were that the tax would bring in about \$54 million. But the latest numbers show the county can expect \$65.4 million added to its coffers. That is over a 21 percent increase in expected revenue.

And, if that isn't enough good news, the county still has \$4.5 million in surplus from its 2008 sales tax extension.

The ideas of how to spend that money are almost endless.

And, while some commissioners may be thinking of a rainy day fund, the best use is to spend it — either on a number of Tier II projects that are on the county's list or other critical needs that have cropped up since the sales pitch made to voters. The Tier II projects were used to whet the voters' appetite when the referendum was offered up. They were all good ideas but did not make the cut when the original budget was drawn up.


They include:

- Build a planned aquatic center for North Charlotte Regional Park earlier than expected. The \$4.44 million aquatic center tops the list of Tier II projects.
- A Port Charlotte Beach Sailing Center.
- The widening of Toledo Blade Boulevard.
- A Cattle Dock boat ramp.

There are some other ideas that came up when commissioners met with the legislative delegation. They include projects the county hopes the state will fund. But, with our poor history of getting state funding, maybe these projects could use some sales tax funds:

- \$2 million for the El Jobean septic-to-sewer project — although this may have a shot for state money since this is also seen as a priority in Tallahassee. The project received \$500,000 in state funding this year.
- \$1.25 million for the Piper Road water and wastewater project, which may help attract new companies to the business park around Punta Gorda Airport.
- \$1.45 million — or more — for the Manasota Key 10-Year Beach Management Plan. The shoreline has seen severe erosion over the past couple of years.
- We could always use more money for Charlotte Behavioral Health Care's new Community Action Team, which serves the mental health needs of children.
- The county could also use some cash for its South County Library.

The possibilities are head-spinning. Commissioners would be wise to draw up a priority list and advertise it for public comment and go from there. Maybe they could even do it for Christmas.

The division also assists veterans in need of referrals for living arrangements, whether it is a home or apartment, assisted living facility or nursing home, or help filing a homestead exemption or qualifying for state tax relief for veterans.

Our Veteran Services staff is highly trained, including certifications from the Veterans Administration. Veteran Services Officer Assistant Ivey Winkler serves as secretary on the board of directors of the Charlotte County Veterans Council, which partners with Charlotte Transit to provide free van rides to the Lee County VA Clinic in Cape Coral and the Bay Pines VA Hospital in St. Petersburg.

Honoring our veterans also includes providing preferred parking for combat-wounded veterans at county facilities and achieving a Purple Heart County designation from the Military Order of the Purple Heart organization. Each month the County Commission pays tribute

to a combat-wounded veteran during a commission meeting.

Honoring our veterans also means remembering those who have left us. Earlier this year, we completed a new Veterans Memorial Park in Rotonda West, a solemn place where the community can come together (or reflect alone) in remembrance of our fallen service members. The county also contributed \$50,000 toward the construction of the Vietnam Wall of Southwest Florida in Punta Gorda.

# City Council to review branding, marketing plan

Aqua Marketing & Communications will conduct a workshop with City Council today at 2 p.m. in Punta Gorda Council Chambers regarding the next phase in the marketing of the city's brand and tagline, "Florida's Harborside Hometown."

Topics will include how branding will help in business attraction, developer interest and tourism; how the brand was developed; and communications coordinated messaging.

All are welcome to attend and hear how the new brand's adoption will influence the future direction of our community. Aqua will meet with City staff prior to the workshop to go over the nuts and bolts of a brand, branding guide and consistent messaging.

Police Chief Selection Process — Eight of 10 invited candidates (two recently removed their names from consideration) interviewed for the position this week.

In addition, the candidates had conversations with panels' representative of police department staff as well as the residential and business community. The next step in the vetting process will be development of a short list, final discussion with city manager, and an in-depth background investigation. A hiring selection will be made within a short time frame.

Business Development Initiatives — Staff is currently drafting a new zoning district to address recent development issues in the city's more suburban areas.

The district is tentatively titled "Commercial General" and is targeting large parcel, auto-oriented developments. The city's current code is urban-oriented, and

pedestrian-friendly. Due to recent annexations, this code change is necessary. In addition, the City Council approved an ordinance on first reading to allow rental residential developments over five units under one ownership an opportunity to pay impact fees over a five-year period instead of all up front. The second reading will be Nov. 15.

Seawall Replacement Responsibilities — Several residents have inquired about their responsibilities and contractor responsibilities related to the seawall replacement.

Seawall contractors will be responsible for removing old seawall and anything in their way including docks and davits, installing the new seawall, backfilling the area and installing Floratam or Bahia sod.

Residents are responsible for their own docks, lifts, fences, irrigation and water lines, electrical and any other owner improvements in the vicinity of the seawall. Seawall contractors can usually work around freestanding docks that were not damaged by the seawall. Residents with damaged docks and lifts

are encouraged to contact a marine contractor to determine whether parts of your dock or lift can be secured and reused prior to the seawall contractor performing his work.

• Reduce Boat Speed In Canals — Many properties have downed seawalls and severe erosion to their property. The city of Punta Gorda is requesting that all boaters in Punta Gorda Isles and Burnt Store Isles please restrict boat speed and reduce boat wakes through the canals until all seawalls have been repaired.

Where the wall is down, even a small wake tends to increase the erosion and may cause significant damage in addition to already

documented damage from IRMA. Please be mindful and conscientious of your neighbors as this will be a long-term recovery. We need to be careful to minimize additional damage.

• Volunteer opportunities — Charlotte County-Punta Gorda Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) Bicycle/Pedestrian Advisory Committee is seeking a South County resident to serve on the BPAC. The BPAC makes recommendations on transportation plans and projects that the MPO board will consider.

The Citizens' Advisory Committee is seeking a Charlotte County resident to serve as an at-large representative. The CAC also

makes recommendations on transportation plans.

Charlotte County Transportation Disadvantaged Local Coordinating Board (LCB) is seeking a volunteer representing the private transportation industry. The purpose of the LCB is to identify local service needs and to provide information, advice and direction to the community transportation coordination of service to be provided to the transportation disadvantaged.

## Pirates can't stop Dalton sisters in season opener

PORT CHARLOTTE — Take enough shots and they'll eventually find the back of the net.

It took 18 tries before Venice finally struck in Monday night's season opener against Port Charlotte, but once one goal fell, more followed.

Sarah Dalton scored in the 32nd minute and her sister Rachel scored twice in the second half to lead the Indians to a 3-0 win over the Pirates at the Cove.

"Our girls were a little anxious early on and shooting from too far out instead of getting that extra pass to get it in closer," Venice coach Gary Bolyard said. "We were shooting from too far out but we finally put some in."

The Indians (1-0) dominated possession throughout the match and outshot Port Charlotte 33-6. The Pirates (0-1) didn't even take a shot on goal until the 36th minute when Makenzie Ferraro

struck a ball straight to Venice goalkeeper Ashton Pennell, who only had to save three shots all night.

"Personally, I thought for the first 10-15 of the first half we possessed evenly," Port Charlotte coach Chip Stec said. "I don't think either team was in their attacking third much, it was all in the midfield. I thought we were pretty evenly matched and then all of a sudden we just got tired legs and just couldn't keep up with them. They were just passing around us while we were standing still."

Despite their offensive struggles, the Pirates nearly tied the match in the 51st minute when Megan Porto sent a shot right off the right post. The ball rolled right along the goal line but never rolled over it according to the officials. Porto's teammate Tori Thompson was standing to the left on the line and had a chance for a rebound but couldn't connect to tie the match.

Less than a minute

later, Dalton scored her first goal to extend Venice's lead to 2-0.

"I think it was deflating because it looked like the ball actually rolled into the goal and I don't know if the referee was in position to call it or not," Stec said, "and right after that they countered on us and they put a goal right into the back of the net and then we went down the tubes from there. We started the second half a little stronger than we ended the first half, which was good to see but when they score that many goals on you it's sort of tough to come back."

Dalton would score again in the 66th minute to finish the scoring against Port Charlotte goalkeeper Kendall Cryer, who finished with 17 saves. Cryer made her first career start in place of Grace Stec, who tore her ACL and meniscus in the offseason. Stec is currently in month six of the recovery process and may not be able to play this season.

"She played a heck of

a game. She's only 5-foot tall I think at most and she made some saves I didn't think she was going to get to," Stec said. "My hats off to her because she played her heart out."

But Cryer could only save so many shots as

she was constantly put at a disadvantage by her defense, especially in the first half when she saw 22 shots.

"We held the ball good, we moved the ball and the girls moved without the ball to get open. It

was an impressive game by them," Bolyard said.

"We played good, we just didn't put the ball in the net a much as we should have. But for our first game we're happy."

The Charlotte Symphony Orchestra will begin its 2017-2018 concert season — its 40th — on Sunday evening with a “Salute to Our Armed Forces” at the Charlotte Performing Arts Center in Punta Gorda.

The program will include John Williams’ “Hymn to the Fallen,” from the movie “Saving Private Ryan,” and his suite from the movie “JFK.”

In a new venture for the orchestra, Vincent Persichetti’s “A Lincoln Address,” will be performed with narration of Lincoln’s

second inaugural address by historian and former Punta Gorda City Council member and State Representative Lindsay Harrington, before concluding with John Philip Sousa’s classic, “Stars and Stripes Forever.”

## In Seoul, Trump calls for North Korea to 'make a deal'

SEOUL, South Korea — In a striking shift of tone, President Donald Trump abandoned his aggressive rhetoric toward North Korea on Tuesday, signaling a willingness to negotiate as he urged Pyongyang to “come to the table” and “make a deal.”

Trump, in his first day on the Korean Peninsula, again pushed Pyongyang to abandon its nuclear weapons program, but sidelined apocalyptic threats for an optimistic note, saying confidently, if vaguely, that “ultimately, it’ll all work out.” And while he said the United States would use military force if needed, he expressed his strongest inclination yet to deal with rising tensions with Pyongyang through diplomacy.

“It makes sense for North Korea to come to the table and make a deal that is good for the people of North Korea and for the world,” Trump said during a news conference alongside South Korean president Moon Jae-in. “I do see certain movement.”

Trump said he’s seen “a lot of progress”

## Church gunman once escaped from mental health center

SUTHERLAND SPRINGS, Texas — The gunman who carried out the massacre of 26 people at a small-town Texas church briefly escaped from a mental health center in New Mexico in 2012 and got in trouble for bringing guns onto a military base and threatening his superiors there, police reports indicate.

Devin Patrick Kelley was also named as a suspect in a 2013 sexual assault in his hometown of New Braunfels, about 35 miles from the scene of the church attack.

The records that emerged Tuesday add up to at least three missed opportunities that might

have offered law enforcement a way to stop Kelley from having access to guns long before he slaughtered much of the congregation in the middle of a Sunday service. Kelley died of a self-inflicted gunshot wound after he was chased by bystanders and crashed his car.

The Air Force confirmed Tuesday that Kelley had been treated in the facility after he was placed under pretrial confinement stemming from a court-martial on charges that he assaulted his spouse and hit her child hard enough to fracture the boy’s skull.

Involuntary commitment to a mental institution would have been grounds to deny him a weapon provided that

## GOP tax bill would end deduction for wildfire and earthquake victims

WASHINGTON — The House Republican tax bill would eliminate the deduction for personal losses from wildfires, earthquakes and other natural disasters, but keep the break for victims of the recent severe hurricanes.

If the bill becomes law, the deduction would disappear next year, but would be available for victims of the massive wildfires that struck Northern California last month — as long as they can figure out their uninsured losses and include them on their 2017 tax return.

The legislation

specifically repeals the deduction for personal casualty losses. The Internal Revenue Service describes casualty losses as including those from “natural disasters like hurricanes, tornadoes, floods and earthquakes. It can also include losses from fires, accidents, thefts or vandalism.”

In the case of a

major disaster, Congress still would be able to pass special legislation offering tax breaks for victims, as it has done in the past.

But such bills would be difficult to pass for smaller scale incidents that still are devastating to the victims, said Rep. Brad Sherman,

## Proposal takes aim at ‘coercion of sex’ in capitol

TALLAHASSEE — Kentucky’s speaker of the House resigned from his leadership post amid reports he had secretly settled a staff member’s sexual-harassment claims.

A state senator from Illinois stepped down from his spot as the leader of the Democratic caucus after a victim rights advocate accused him of sexually

harassing her.

In Massachusetts, legislative leaders created a task force to probe sexual misconduct following an explosive Boston Globe column detailing a decades-old climate of sexual harassment and intimidation.

The Florida Capitol is one of at least a half-dozen statehouses forced to confront a culture of women being mistreated or even abused by men in power in the wake of news reports sparked

by revelations about Hollywood movie mogul Harvey Weinstein.

A high-ranking Florida Democratic senator resigned from his post late last month after admitting he had an extramarital affair with a lobbyist.

On Monday, Sen. Jack Latvala, a Clearwater Republican who is running for governor, was stripped of his post as the powerful budget chief amid an investigation into allegations of sexual harassment and

misconduct made by six unidentified women, who accused Latvala of groping them and making unwelcome comments about their bodies.

Now, a handful of women legislators want to change Florida ethics laws to make it a crime for elected officials to coerce someone into having sex in exchange for official acts, in the same way that it’s off-limits for officials to accept other kinds of gifts.

State law prohibits solicitation and acceptance of gifts by elected officials, but “never mentions sexual harassment or assault or abuse of power of any kind related to withholding political power or exercising it in exchange for sex,” said Sen. Lauren Book, a Plantation Democrat who’s leading the charge for the legislation.

“I went back to double-check,

## Bannon's forces may not like him, but Mitch McConnell is here to stay

WASHINGTON — Conservative activists eagerly hope the November 2018 election delivers a strong rebuke to Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell, whom they blame for stymieing President Donald Trump's agenda.

They're likely to be disappointed.

When a new Senate convenes in January 2019, the Kentucky Republican will almost certainly remain in charge of Senate Republicans.

Former Trump adviser Steve Bannon, who threatened a "season of war" against establishment Republicans, has championed primary challenges to sitting senators. He says he'll support only candidates who pledge to vote against McConnell as Republican leader.

But only nine Republican seats will be on the ballot this year. That means that even if Bannon's army and its allies successfully topple one or two incumbent senators — a daunting challenge — and the insurgents then win a general election, McConnell critics would still be outnumbered among Senate Republicans.

"They'd have to replace half the Republican conference (membership) if they're going to threaten him," said Jennifer Duffy, senior editor for the Cook Political Report, a non-partisan publication that analyzes U.S. House and Senate races.

Leadership positions are determined by a secret vote of senators from the same party, and there's no sentiment for replacing McConnell.

He was first elected Senate Republican leader unanimously by his colleagues in 2006 and was unanimously elected majority leader when Republicans won control of the Senate in 2014. The

vote is generally held the month after the election and only senators who will serve in the upcoming Congress are eligible to vote.

Currently, "he absolutely has the support of the overwhelming majority of the caucus," said Sen. Richard Shelby, R-Ala.

Yet Bannon allies dismiss the significance of any such vote count. Instead, they cite the experience of former House Speaker John Boehner, who resigned his leadership position and left Congress in 2015 amid pressure from the conservative wing of his chamber.


"We don't need a majority of Republicans in the Senate to depose Mitch McConnell," said a Bannon ally who asked to speak on the condition of anonymity to discuss strategy. "All we need to do is make him politically toxic, and whether his allies want to admit it or not, we've already succeeded."

A recent Harvard-Harris poll showed McConnell with the lowest favorability rating of any elected official with national stature.

Missouri Attorney General Josh Hawley, Republicans' top recruit to challenge Democratic Sen. Claire McCaskill, has not committed to voting for McConnell as Republican leader if elected in 2018.

Activists have blamed McConnell for failing to deliver on a campaign promise to repeal and replace Obamacare. They're furious that he's presided over a 2017 session that has produced no major legislative accomplishments, despite Republican control of the White House and Congress for the first time in a dozen years.

The Obamacare measure cleared the House, but efforts have languished in the Senate. The latest effort collapsed in September, with three Republican senators firmly opposed.

Republican senators say the repeal failed because the chamber doesn't have enough Republicans, not that McConnell fell short.

"He has about 47, 48 strong people with him and maybe three or four outliers that he can't depend on at times," Shelby said. "That's not his fault."

Outside groups have the right to complain, said Sen. Lamar Alexander, R-Tennessee, but they don't vote in the Senate and can't appreciate McConnell.

"Republican senators elect their own leader and will continue to do so," Alexander said. "Mitch has done an exceptional job and he's earned the strong support of our caucus."

McConnell, like most veteran congressional leaders, maintains his grip on his job partly through relationships developed over the years. Senators tend to remember and are grateful for the leader providing plum committee assignments, the ability to offer favorite amendments and schedule long weekends so they can go home.

They've also been the beneficiaries of a powerful super PAC that has plowed millions into Republican Senate campaigns. The Senate Leadership Fund, one of two outside groups

run by McConnell loyalists, spent nearly \$86 million in the 2016 campaign, making it the third largest outside spender. It trailed only the super PACS that backed Democratic presidential candidate Hillary Clinton and Republican presidential primary contender Jeb Bush.

Alabama Republican Senate nominee Roy Moore, who railed against McConnell and the Washington "swamp" during his primary race, attended the Senate Republicans' weekly policy lunch last week and said he had a "nice" chat with McConnell.

Moore, who during the campaign told supporters that he'd be the "biggest threat" to the Washington establishment if elected, would not say if he'd vote against McConnell if he wins the general election in December.

"I'm not going to give an opinion on that right now," Moore told reporters as he left the lunch.

McConnell's camp says Bannon's effort began to falter soon after McConnell appeared last month at the White House with Trump, who had critiqued McConnell on Twitter but insisted in the Rose Garden appearance that the two were good friends with a shared agenda.

## Trump administration moves ahead with Obama menu-label law

WASHINGTON — The Trump administration is moving ahead with Obama-era requirements to post calorie counts in restaurants, supermarkets, convenience stores and pizza delivery chains nationwide next year.

Despite years of opposition by some food sellers, the Food and Drug Administration is offering only minor compromises to industry complaints about the difficulties of displaying calories at takeout chains, self-service buffets and other non-restaurant food locations.

The FDA posted a preliminary guidance online Tuesday to help businesses comply with the law.

Trump appointees have delayed or upended regulations passed by the Obama administration including rules for water pollution, fuel emissions and policing for-profit universities. But the menu labeling rules, championed by former first lady Michelle Obama, appear on track to take effect next May after years of delays.

Behind the law is the idea that people may

think twice about buying their daily doughnut at the gas station if they see how many hundreds of calories it contains.

"When you arm consumers with reliable information, they are going to make better decisions, smarter and more informed decisions about their diet," FDA Commissioner Scott Gottlieb said in an interview with The Associated Press. "Providing this information is more important now than ever because more people are eating their meals away from the home."

In a key move, the FDA rejected requests from pizza chains, including Domino's Pizza, which wanted to post calorie information on their websites instead of each store location, arguing that most customers don't visit their physical locations. However, the agency said stores have a variety of options for displaying calorie counts beyond traditional menu boards, including electronic kiosks, tablet devices and even paper menus.

"At first glance, there appears to be some progress, showing that the FDA is listening to concerns," Domino's

spokesman Tim McIntyre said in an email.

However, he added that the company still wants Congress to intervene to change the law. Industry groups are backing legislation in the House of Representatives that addresses many of their concerns.

Pizza chains have argued that displaying calorie counts in their locations doesn't make any sense because most of their customers don't come into the store. Grocery and convenience stores have said the rules would be more burdensome for them because they typically have more limited offerings than restaurants and one central ordering point.

The FDA offered clarifications that it said could reduce the workload for some businesses. The agency said posters, coupons, mailings and other advertising materials are not considered menus and do not have to list calories.

The agency will take comments on its guidelines for 60 days before moving to finalizing them.

The restaurant industry has backed the law and major chains including Starbucks, Subway and

McDonald's are already posting calorie counts.

New York City and several other cities have passed laws requiring restaurant chains to list the information, but the federal rule would apply to more places and require them in non-traditional food outlets such as gas stations and movie theaters.

Most of the setbacks to implementing the 2010 law came during the Obama years. The FDA took more than four years to write the rules and establishments originally had until the end of 2015 to comply. But that deadline was pushed back twice. Last year, the Trump administration pushed the date back again to May 2018 to review how to "reduce costs and enhance flexibility."

Consumer advocates who lobbied for years to pass the law expressed relief after reviewing the FDA guidelines.

"We were worried about the Trump administration caving to industry and weakening the information people get when they eat out," said Margo Wootan, a lobbyist for the Center for Science in the Public Interest. "That didn't happen today and that's great news."

### FBI identifies latest victims of suspected MS-13 violence

FARMINGDALE, N.Y. (AP) — Authorities believe the remains of three young Hispanic men found in recent weeks in suburban New York are likely the latest victims of MS-13 gang violence.

The FBI on Tuesday released the names of 16-year-old Javier Castillo and 19-year-old Kerin Pineda. Both were missing more than a year.

Their remains were discovered a few days after authorities found the corpse of another missing teen, 16-year-old Angel Soler.

All were found in wooded areas

A law enforcement official speaking on condition of anonymity said all three are suspected victims of MS-13 gang violence. The official was not authorized to speak publicly because of an ongoing investigation.

Their discovery makes 25 suspected MS-13 victims on Long Island during the past two years.

Castillo and Pineda disappeared in 2016. Soler vanished in July.

### Judge tosses Louisiana man's decades-old rape conviction

BATON ROUGE, La. (AP) — A judge in Louisiana has thrown out the conviction of a man serving a life sentence for the 1971 rape of a nurse, ruling that authorities withheld evidence that could have exonerated him decades ago.

Wilbert Jones' attorneys asked the judge Tuesday to order his immediate release. State District Judge Richard Anderson is expected to hear that request next week.

District Attorney Hillar Moore says his office will ask the Louisiana Supreme Court to review the judge's Oct. 31 ruling.

Jones, now 65, was 19 when police arrested him on suspicion of abducting the nurse from a Baton Rouge hospital's parking lot and raping her.

Anderson said the case was "weak, at best." He concluded that authorities concealed "highly favorable" evidence pointing to another perpetrator in the rape.

### Man defends himself with toy in violent thermostat spat

MINOT, N.D. (AP) — Authorities say a heated argument over a turned-up thermostat in a mobile home took a violent turn when a Minot man punched his fiancée's brother in the face and threatened him with a knife.

Police say the man tried to defend himself by hitting 33-year-old Cornelius Young with a children's toy in the attack Friday.

Police say Young eventually left the home after his fiancée jumped on his back and bit his ear to distract him. Two children were present during the fight, but neither was injured.

The Minot Daily

News reports that Young is charged with felony terrorizing. Court documents don't list an attorney who can speak on his behalf, and a home telephone listing couldn't be found.

He could enter a plea during a Dec. 7 hearing.

### Twitter doubles character limit to 280 for (nearly) everyone

NEW YORK (AP) — Twitter says it's ending its iconic 140-character limit — and giving nearly everyone 280 characters.

Users tweeting in Chinese, Japanese and Korean will still have the original limit. That's because writing in those languages uses fewer characters.

The company says 9 percent of tweets written in English hit the 140-character limit. People end up spending more time editing tweets or don't send them out at all. Twitter hopes that the expanded limit will get more people tweeting more, helping its lackluster user growth. Twitter has been testing the new limit for weeks and is starting to roll it out Tuesday.

The company has been slowly easing restrictions to let people cram more characters into a tweet. It stopped counting polls, photos, videos and other things toward the limit. Even before it did so, users found creative ways to get around the limit. This includes multi-part tweets and screenshots of blocks of text.

Twitter's character limit was created so that tweets could fit into a single text message, back when many people were using texts to receive tweets. But now, most people use Twitter through its mobile app; the 140-character limit is no longer a technical constraint but nostalgia.

### Democrats win in Virginia and New Jersey for governor's race

(AP) — Democrats in Virginia and New Jersey who sought to tap into anti-Donald Trump sentiments have won contests to become their states' next governors.

In Virginia's closely watched contest, Democratic Lt. Gov. Ralph Northam defeated Republican Ed Gillespie. In New Jersey front-running Democrat Phil Murphy topped Republican Lt. Gov. Kim Guadagno on Tuesday to succeed Republican Gov. Chris Christie.

Northam rode to victory in part by tapping into voters' regret at Trump's victory in last year's national election.

Murphy had an easier pathway in New Jersey, where Guadagno contended with Trump's and Christie's unpopularity.

Democrats were eager to show they could harness anti-Trump energy into success at the polls, while Republicans hoped to prove they could put together a winning blueprint in blue-leaning states.

# Trump not invited to Paris climate summit next month

PARIS — French authorities said President Donald Trump is not among more than 100 world leaders invited to Paris for a climate summit next month.

French President Emmanuel Macron plans a summit to push his “Make our Planet Great Again” agenda on Dec. 12, the anniversary of the 2015 Paris climate accord.

The summit aims at promoting green projects and providing new funding sources, a few weeks after separate talks that are currently being held at a global climate conference in Bonn, Germany.

A French diplomatic official said the countries whose heads of state are being invited are those who are “especially committed” to applying the Paris accord.

An invitation will soon be sent to invite the United States “at a diplomatic level,” the official said. He was spoke on customary condition of anonymity.

Officially called the “One Planet Summit”

in English, the event is also when Macron is going to announce the winners of his offer of a generous fellowship to U.S. climate scientists who come to do their research in France.

In June, Trump said that the U.S. would pull out of the 2015 Paris accord unless he can secure a better deal.

The same day, Macron said “wherever we live, whoever we are, we all share the same responsibility: make our planet great again” and called on U.S.-based

scientists to come to France to work on climate-related issues, in an unprecedented English-language speech from the French presidential palace.

French organizers are expecting about 2,000 participants, including non-governmental organizations, foundations, banks, startups, local governments, city mayors and others.

France co-organizes the summit with the United Nations and the World Bank.

### Observers call for murder inquiries after Nicaragua election

MANAGUA, Nicaragua (AP) — The Organization of American States mission in Nicaragua is calling on the government to investigate and punish those responsible for at least five killings following local elections.

The ruling Sandinista Front won 135 of 153 mayoralties in voting Sunday.

The police have not provided details on the killings. Deputy director of the police, Gen. Francisco Diaz, said Tuesday that 67 people were also injured in violence in 13 municipalities.

The most serious violence was along Nicaragua’s northern Caribbean coast.

Alan Artola, a supporter of the indigenous rights party Yatama from that part of the country, says they believe there was fraud and do not accept the results.

Wilfredo Penco, head of the OAS mission, says there were some weaknesses in the process, but they did not affect the results.

### Germany: Inmate allegedly raped wife during visit with kids

BERLIN (AP) — German authorities are investigating how an inmate was able to

allegedly rape his wife while she and their children visited him in prison.

The 35-year-old suspect threatened his wife with a weapon and sexually assaulted her at a prison in the western town of Diez last week, prosecutors in nearby Koblenz alleged.

Prosecutors said in a statement released Monday that a fellow inmate urged the suspect to release the woman, who suffered a stab wound. The statement said prison guards eventually overpowered the incarcerated man.

The inmate hasn’t been identified.

### Israeli media mogul apologizes over sexual harassment claims

JERUSALEM (AP) — An Israeli media mogul and member of the International Olympic Committee has apologized after being accused of sexual harassment by two female journalists.

Haaretz columnist Neri Livneh said this week that Alex Gilady exposed himself to her during a 1999 business meeting at his home. Days earlier, Channel 10 TV journalist Oshrat Kotler said Gilady made an “indecent” proposal during a job interview 25 years ago.

Gilady founded local media group Keshet. He also is a former

sports executive at NBC and is Israel’s IOC representative.

Gilady told Haaretz he did not recall the Kotler incident but said Livneh’s claim was “mainly correct.”

“In each of these cases, there was no intention to harm, and if my conduct caused mental anguish, I am deeply sorry,” he said.

### UK tweaks offer on citizens’ rights ahead of Brexit talks

LONDON (AP) — Britain is promising European Union citizens the right to appeal if they are denied permission to live in the U.K. after Brexit — part of an improved offer ahead of a new round of divorce talks this week.

The status of citizens affected by Brexit is one of the main hurdles in negotiations. Britain says EU nationals already in the U.K. can stay, but EU officials say British proposals would erode existing rights.

On Tuesday, the U.K. government said people would be able to appeal decisions about residency to British courts, and promised no one would be refused over “minor technicalities.”

Brexit Secretary David Davis said “safeguarding the rights of EU citizens is our top priority in negotiations.”

The two sides are due to meet Thursday and Friday in Brussels.

records of his confinement were submitted to the federal database used to conduct background checks on people who try to purchase guns.

Kelley was also caught trying to bring guns onto Holloman Air Force Base in New Mexico when he was stationed there, according to an El Paso, Texas, police report released Tuesday.

While in the military, Kelley, who was 21 at the time, had made death threats against superior officers, according to the June 2012 report, which also mentioned the military charges. He was eventually sentenced to 12 months of confinement for the assault.

The Air Force acknowledged Monday that it did not enter Kelley's criminal history into the federal database, as required by military rules.

Had Kelley been convicted of sexual assault, he would likely have been prevented from purchasing a gun because federal guidelines prohibit sales to anyone convicted of a felony punishable by more than one year in prison. The Comal County sheriff said he was reviewing whether his department mishandled the sexual assault investigation.

Officers recovered a Ruger AR-556 rifle at the church and two additional handguns from the shooter's vehicle, said Fred Milanowski, the agent in charge of

the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives in Houston. All three weapons were purchased by Kelley, Milanowski said.

The sporting goods chain Academy Sports & Outdoors confirmed Monday that it sold Kelley two guns.

The El Paso report notes that Kelley was committed to a mental health facility in Santa Teresa, New Mexico, but at some point escaped and was later found by police at a bus station in downtown El Paso in June 2012.

In New Braunfels, Comal County Sheriff Mark Reynolds said that it appeared sheriff's deputies investigated the rape case for three months after being called to Kelley's home in June 2013, but stopped investigating after they believed Kelley had left Texas and moved to Colorado. Reynolds said the case was then listed as inactive.

Reynolds said he was trying to find out how deputies came to believe Kelley had moved and why they did not continue to pursue the case, either in Colorado or after Kelley returned to the area later. Deputies were called to the same house in February 2014 to investigate a domestic violence report involving Kelley and Danielle Shields, his girlfriend at the time, whom he married two months later.

"The last information that we have is the suspect moved to Colorado and then the investigation seems to have tapered off," Reynolds

said Tuesday. "That's what we're looking into."

The district attorney for Comal County said in an interview that she became aware of the sexual assault case Monday before the records were released to The Associated Press and other media.

"That case was never presented to our office," Jennifer Tharp said.

Meanwhile at the First Baptist Church in tiny Sutherland Springs, investigators continued analyzing a gruesome crime scene and tried to gain access to the shooter's cellphone, a longstanding challenge for the FBI in thousands of other cases.

Authorities aimed to conclude the crime-scene investigation at the church by Wednesday evening. Investigators have no reason to believe anyone conspired with Kelley, who acted alone, said Texas Department of Public Safety Regional Director Freeman Martin.

Martin repeated earlier statements that

the shooting appeared to stem from a domestic dispute involving Kelley and his mother-in-law, who sometimes attended services at the church but was not present on Sunday.

"We don't know what he was thinking or what was in his mind," Martin said. "There was conflict. He was upset with the mother in law."

Also Tuesday, authorities explained that the death toll of 26 included the unborn baby of one of women killed.

The gunman's phone was flown to an FBI lab for analysis, but agents have yet to access it, said Christopher Combs, who is in charge of the agency's San Antonio division.

The inability to access the shooter's phone highlights a longstanding frustration of the FBI, which said it has been unable to retrieve data from half the mobile devices it tried to access in less than a year.

FBI Director Christopher Wray said last month that in the

first 11 months of the fiscal year, agents were unable to access the content inside more than 6,900 mobile devices, an issue he said stymies investigations.

The FBI and other law enforcement officials have long complained about being unable to unlock and recover evidence from cellphones and other devices seized from suspects even if they have a warrant. Technology companies have refused to help, insisting they must protect customers' digital privacy.

The long-simmering debate was on display in 2016, when the Justice Department tried to force Apple to unlock an encrypted cellphone used by a gunman in a terrorist attack in San Bernardino, California. The department eventually relented after the FBI said it paid an unidentified vendor who provided a tool to unlock the phone and no longer needed Apple's assistance, avoiding a court showdown.

to make sure. Nothing. Nowhere," she said.

Book said her proposal, still in the works, would treat "coercion of sex for official action as a crime, no less than taking tickets to a sporting event."

Senate President Joe Negrón wouldn't comment on the proposal because he hadn't spoken with Book about it yet, Negrón spokeswoman Katie Betta said in an email.

Book and another Broward County Democrat, Rep. Kristin Jacobs, have teamed up on the framework for a task force to address the once-hidden issue of sexual harassment and misconduct, which some women who work in the legislative process contend is part of the cost of doing business in Tallahassee.

The task force would meet three times and present its recommendations to legislative leaders in 2019, Book and Jacobs said in interviews.

Book also wants an independent entity to handle probes of alleged sexual misconduct, something now handled internally by the Senate or by the Office of Legislative Affairs.

"I know that gives everybody heartburn, but the fact that it gives everybody heartburn kind of means we're doing the right thing," said Book, an advocate for victims of sexual abuse who was molested by a nanny when she was a child.

Negrón ordered an independent inquiry into the allegations against Latvala, but only after Dawn Roberts, the Senate's chief lawyer whom Negrón originally assigned to lead the investigation, asked to be taken off the case because she had lengthy professional ties to Latvala.

Jacobs, who served on the Broward County commission before being elected to the state House in 2014, said she's served on plenty of task forces whose recommendations were ultimately adopted as well as others whose suggestions were ignored.

"So there is always a risk, when you stand up to do something and evoke change, that those from whom you're

seeking change are just not going to accept it or act on it. Period. But I don't think that means that you don't do it,"

Jacobs, D-Coconut Creek, said. Many officials — including Attorney General Pam Bondi — are encouraging people who've been subjected to sexual harassment or mistreatment to come forward and report abuse.

Bondi on Tuesday told reporters that the women who've accused Latvala of wrongdoing should identify themselves.

"As a career prosecutor, I would say that you have to come forward ...," she said.

But Jacobs said most victims may prefer to remain in the shadows for a variety of reasons — including fear of losing their jobs, retaliation from powerful men or public shaming — even when they receive promises that their complaints will be treated confidentially.

"There's this illusion that you're safe. We're going to create this environment where you can come out and you can be safe. Whether that's true or not, I don't believe it's true. I don't think you're safe when you say (something), but I don't think keeping it shielded is the right way to go, either. But somewhere in this process, we ought to be talking about what other options you also have to deal with this something that's happened to you. And it doesn't necessarily mean you go running around to go tell everybody else. It may mean that in your particular case, it works better for you to handle it directly with the person who's done this. And if that's the case, what we all find ourselves, I included, saying to ourselves is, what should I do? What are all the ramifications of doing anything? What's the appropriate response?" Jacobs said.

She's hoping the task force, if created, would come up with guidelines for answers to those questions, and she envisions training similar to what lawmakers receive on issues such as how to deal with the media or how to file a bill.

With all of the current focus on sexual harassment and misconduct in Florida's capital city, Jacobs said she thinks it would be better to have the workshops after the task force makes its recommendations.

in dealing with North Korea, though he stopped short of saying whether he wanted direct diplomatic talks.

Trump also underlined the United States' military options, noting that three aircraft carrier groups and a nuclear submarine had been deployed to the region. But he said "we hope to God we never have to use" the arsenal.

And he responded to a question about a mass shooting at a south Texas church, saying tougher gun laws would not have prevented the deaths.

During his first day in South Korea, Trump at least temporarily lowered the temperature on his previously incendiary language about the North. There were no threats of unleashing "fire and fury" on North Korea, as Trump previously warned, nor did the president revive his derisive nickname for North Korean dictator Kim Jong Un, "Little Rocket Man."

But he did decree that the dictator is "threatening millions and

millions of lives, so needlessly" and highlighted one of the central missions of his first lengthy Asia trip: to enlist many nations in the region, including China and Russia, to cut off Pyongyang's economic lifeblood and pressure it into giving up its nuclear program.

Trump bemoaned that previous administrations had not handled Pyongyang, saying "Now is not the right time to be dealing with this but it's what I got."

Moon, who has been eager to solidify a friendship with Trump, said he hoped the president's visit would be a moment of inflection in the stand-off with North Korea and said the two leaders had "agreed to resolve the North Korea nuclear issue in peaceful manner."

"I know that you have put this issue at the top of your security agenda," said Moon. "So I hope that your visit to Korea and to the Asia Pacific region will serve as an opportunity to relieve some of the anxiety that the Korean people have due to North Korea's provocations and also serve as a turning point in resolving the North Korean nuclear issue."

D-Calif.

"Let's say your home burns down and it isn't a disaster that CNN covers," he said. "You're affected the same way, whether it's nine of your neighbors or 900 of your neighbors that lose homes."

Rep. Mike Thompson, D-Calif., called the elimination of the deduction "cruel" and "heartless."

"There's never been a fire like this in our country," Thompson said of the Northern California wildfires.

"Do you really think that we're going to be able to go in, assess all of the costs, get everything cleaned up, figure out where people are going to stand in time to do their taxes?" Thompson told colleagues on the House Ways and Means Committee on Monday night as they began debating the legislation. "It's not going to happen."

Rep. Tom Rice, R-S.C., said California residents could file amended 2017 returns later. And Rep. Kevin Brady, R-Texas, the committee's chairman, said he planned

to introduce legislation within the next month offering special tax relief for wildfire victims.

But Thompson and some California officials are concerned that killing the deduction would hurt people in the state.

"Eliminating the deduction will place even greater strain on residents of our region at a time when our county is most in need of assistance," Shirlee Zane, chair of the Sonoma County Board of Supervisors, wrote to Thompson.

The Northern California wildfires last month destroyed nearly 8,800 structures and killed 43 people, she said.

Even more frustrating to some California officials is the decision by Brady to grandfather in losses from Hurricanes Harvey, Irma and Irene. Brady's district is just north of Houston, which was severely damaged by Hurricane Harvey.

Santa Rosa Mayor Chris Coursey said that move "smacks of political favoritism."

"Please, let's not play politics with families who are suffering the very real impacts and challenges of recovering from this fire disaster," Coursey wrote to Thompson in urging him to fight the tax change.

# FEMA rethinking ban on disaster aid to church buildings

When disaster strikes, houses of worship are often on the front lines, feeding and sheltering victims. Yet churches, synagogues and mosques are routinely denied aid by the Federal Emergency Management Agency when it comes time to repair or rebuild their damaged sanctuaries.

Pressure is mounting to change that after this year's series of devastating hurricanes damaged scores of churches in Texas, Florida and Puerto Rico.

FEMA is rethinking its policies in the face of a federal lawsuit, heard in court Tuesday, by three Texas churches hit by Hurricane Harvey. President Donald Trump has signaled his support, via Twitter, for the religious institutions.

At the same time, several members of Congress have revived legislation — first proposed after 2012's Hurricane Sandy — that would force FEMA to pay for repairs at places of worship.

The debate centers on two key questions: Does providing such aid violate the First Amendment separation of church and state? Or is it an infringement on the First Amendment right to free exercise of religion to deny churches the same aid available to numerous other nonprofit organizations, such as libraries, zoos and homeless shelters?

"It seems like the only reason churches

are excluded is because they're churches, and it just seems discriminatory to me," said Bruce Frazier, pastor of Rockport First Assembly of God Church, which is part of the lawsuit.

Religious entities already can receive some government help in disasters. They can be reimbursed by local governments for sheltering evacuees and can receive U.S. Small Business Administration loans to repair their buildings. FEMA grants are available to religiously affiliated schools, health care providers and nursing homes. And FEMA also can provide money to repair church-run facilities that function like community centers, but only if less than half the space or use is for religious purposes.

Over the past five years, FEMA has authorized a net of \$113 million for about 500 religiously affiliated entities such as schools, medical clinics and community centers after hurricanes, tornadoes, floods and other disasters, according to an AP analysis of data made public as part of the lawsuit.

But FEMA hasn't supplied money to repair sanctuaries, and its 50 percent rule excludes many other types of church facilities.

"It is the faith community that responds so robustly to the need. And then to say, 'Tough luck, we're not going to help you put your own facility back together' is wrong," said Rep. Christopher

Smith, a New Jersey Republican sponsoring the bill that would change the policy.

Not everyone shares that view, noting constitutional concerns.

"I really can't see anything more core and more of an establishment of religion than building a house of worship," said Maggie Garrett, a lawyer who has lobbied against FEMA aid to religious institutions on behalf of Americans United for Separation of Church and State.

FEMA declined to comment, citing the lawsuit. But in a court filing, the U.S. Justice Department said the challenged policies are being reconsidered.

High winds and flooding from Hurricane Katrina in 2005 damaged more than 1,000 buildings owned by the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of New Orleans. FEMA later came through with more than \$300 million, an amount the archdiocese's chief financial officer, Jeff Entwisle, described as "extraordinary assistance."

Even so, he estimated that FEMA deemed less than one-third of the buildings eligible for funding. The archdiocese opted not to rebuild nearly one-quarter of its churches and schools.

When Hurricane Harvey slammed Texas in August, it blew down the steeple, ripped away the front doors and destroyed the roof of Frazier's church, causing extensive water damage. The church applied for

FEMA disaster aid but was directed instead to private insurance coverage and the Small Business Administration for a loan.

Frazier said the church of about 125 members couldn't afford wind-storm insurance and can't even afford the loan payments that would be necessary to fully rebuild.

"We're just asking to get help," Frazier said. "I mean, we're struggling."

The Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston and Congregation Torah Vachessed, a Houston-area synagogue flooded by Harvey, filed briefs in support of the churches that are suing. The synagogue asserted that the "pernicious effect of FEMA's policy of explicit discrimination" is "to deter and discourage the exercise of the Jewish faith."

The lawsuit contends hundreds of other places of worship also are being denied access to FEMA funding, but it's hard to say how many would seek federal aid if given the opportunity or how much money is at stake.

First Baptist Rockport Church, a mile from the First Assembly of God, sustained about \$1 million in damage when Hurricane Harvey collapsed a choir room wall and caused leaks in the roof. Senior Pastor Scott Jones said he doesn't fault others who seek FEMA aid, but his church won't be doing so.

"We believed that God would provide for us another way, and that we were going to respect the separation of church and state, and not expect or count on help from the federal government," Jones said.

Last June, the U.S. Supreme Court found

that a Lutheran church in Columbia, Missouri, had been wrongly excluded from a state grant program to install a soft playground surface made of recycled tires. Chief Justice John Roberts called it "odious to our Constitution" to deny an otherwise eligible recipient solely because it's a church.

Richard W. Garnett, a University of Notre Dame law professor who runs the school's program on Church, State and Society, said that based on that ruling, there is a good chance the high court would allow FEMA to provide aid to rebuild places of worship.

"The purpose of the support would not be to subsidize religious worship but rather to clean up the community and help local institutions that themselves provide important relief services to those in need,"

### Last defendant pleads guilty in drug distribution conspiracy

TRENTON, N.J. (AP) — Federal prosecutors in New Jersey say a Florida man has admitted his role in a conspiracy to distribute more than 45 kilograms of drugs including heroin, fentanyl, cocaine and morphine.

Sauro Estevez Figueredo pleaded guilty Tuesday to conspiracy.

Figueredo is the last of five defendants charged in the case to plead guilty. The 49-year-old Miami man faces at least 10 years in prison and could get a life term when he's sentenced Feb. 15.

Prosecutors say authorities saw a truck driven by Figueredo and another man parked near a store in Clifton in February 2016. Later that day, two other men drove to the truck and left with a suitcase given to them by another defendant.

Another man soon arrived with two empty bags and then left with them filled.

### 2 men charged, guns found in carry-ons at Virginia airport

RICHMOND, Va. (AP) — A Florida man and a Virginia man are accused of having handguns in their carry-on bags during separate

incidents at Richmond International Airport.

News outlets report the Richmond Airport Police Department cited the two men Monday on state weapons charges.

The Transportation Security Administration said in a statement that an officer detected a 9 mm semiautomatic pistol loaded with 15 rounds as the Blacksburg man's bag passed through an X-ray machine at a security checkpoint. In the other incident, a TSA officer detected an unloaded .38-caliber handgun, along with 11 additional bullets, as the Florida man's bag passed through the X-ray machine.

The unidentified travelers have become the 10th and 11th people to be caught with a weapon this year at the Virginia airport, topping last year's record of 10.

### Pitcher Roy Halladay dies in Gulf of Mexico plane crash

HOLIDAY (AP) — Authorities have confirmed that former Major League Baseball pitcher Roy Halladay died in a small plane crash in the Gulf of Mexico off the coast of Florida.

Pasco County Sheriff Chris Nocco said during a news conference that Halladay's ICON A5 went down about noon Tuesday near Holiday, Florida.

The sheriff's office

marine unit responded to the downed plane and found Halladay's body. No survivors were found.

They said they couldn't confirm if there were additional passengers on the plane or say where it was headed.

Halladay retired in 2013 after 12 seasons with the Toronto Blue Jays followed by four seasons with the Philadelphia Phillies.

### Measure to create slavery memorial heads to Florida House

TALLAHASSEE (AP) — The Florida House will vote on whether to create a state memorial to honor slaves and acknowledge the cruelty of slavery.

A bill (HB 67) to create a memorial on the Florida Capitol's grounds cleared its final committee stop on Tuesday and now heads to the full House. The House will consider the legislation during the session that starts in January.

Democratic Rep. Kionne McGhee says the memorial would honor the men, women and children who were enslaved and haven't been recognized for their contributions.

The bill language recognizes the "injustice, cruelty, brutality, and inhumanity of slavery in the United States."

A similar bill died last year when it was blocked by a

Republican senator who's a descendent of a Confederate soldier.

### Woman accused of sitting on girl indicted on murder charge

PENSACOLA (AP) — A 325-pound woman accused of killing a 9-year-old girl by sitting on the child as punishment has been charged with first-degree murder, carrying a mandatory life sentence if she's convicted.

The Pensacola News Journal reports that a grand jury indicted 64-year-old Veronica Green Posey on Tuesday. She's also charged with aggravated child abuse.

Authorities say Posey told deputies and paramedics responding to a 911 call from the family's home Pensacola that she sat on her cousin, Dericka Lindsay, because the girl had been out of control. Deputies said the girl told Posey and her adoptive parents during the punishment that she couldn't breathe.

The parents face neglect charges. Posey is free on \$125,000 bail. Jail records don't list an attorney.

### Florida Gov. raises questions about Supreme Court justices

TALLAHASSEE (AP) — Florida Gov. Rick Scott is raising questions about how justices on the

Florida Supreme Court are handling a case that could greatly affect the court's future.

Scott's general counsel this week asked the high court to hand over a document that Justice Barbara Pariente was seen discussing with Chief Justice Jorge Labarga during a court hearing. The Scott administration also asked for all raw audio recordings of the two hours justices were in court.

The discussion came right after a hearing over a lawsuit that deals with whether Scott can appoint three new justices on his final day in office in 2019.

Part of the conversation between the two justices was caught by the state-run Florida Channel.

Scott said Tuesday that he wants to know exactly what the justices were discussing.

### Thousands seek Irma food assistance in South Florida

MIAMI (AP) — Help is available this week for people whose households in South Florida were affected by Hurricane Irma.

Food assistance through a federal program called Food for Florida is being handed out this week at Hard Rock Stadium in Miami Gardens and the BB&T Center in Sunrise. Long lines of people

flocked to both sporting venues on Tuesday in hopes of qualifying for food aid cards. The awards range from a few hundred dollars to more than \$1,000. The payments depend on the family size, storm loss and income.

The event was moved from county parks after large crowds overwhelmed officials last month.

The Florida Department of Children and Families, which is running the event, encourages people to register online in advance.

### Nursing assistant accused of stealing from senior citizens

GAINESVILLE (AP) — A Florida nursing assistant is accused of stealing more than \$14,000 from two people in their 80s.

The Gainesville Sun reports 37-year-old Carmen Michelle Walker was arrested Monday and charged with grand theft from people over 65.

A police report says Walker used their debit cards to withdraw money. She is accused of taking \$9,887 from an 88-year-old and \$4,952 from an 85-year-old victim.

Police said Walker worked as a certified nursing assistant for Nursing Nannies.

Jail records don't list an attorney for Walker.

## Gourde, Point, Palat form line to fear

TAMPA — They are not the top line on the team. No, not when you have Steven Stamkos and Nikita Kucherov, who send pucks past goalies this season at a dizzying rate, and Vladislav Namestnikov, who is more than a third wheel on the Lightning's scoring line.

But take a few minutes and forget about Stamkos, Kucherov and Namestnikov, as Columbus coach John Tortorella suggested

Saturday night after the Lightning's 5-4 shootout victory. What caused him fits was the Ondrej Palat, Brayden Point, Yanni Gourde line.

"I think that Point is one hell of a player, and quite honestly it looks like he's the heartbeat of that team right now," Tortorella said. "And that line, I guess it's not their first line, but that's a good second line."

Maybe not when it comes to scoring, but Palat, Point and Gourde are often the Lightning's best line.

They are matched

with the top scoring line on the opposing team, meaning Lightning coach Jon Cooper is not afraid to send the second-year Point and Gourde, with his less than half an NHL season worth of experience, against the Sidney Crosby and Alex Ovechkins of the world.

"They don't get the press. Obviously, we've got a line that puts a lot of points on the board," Cooper said. "You look at the line that matches up against the big boys all the time and it's usually that line."

The words tenacious, relentless, tireless and smart are used by those describing the Lightning's second line.

At 6 feet, 194 pounds, Palat (four goals/nine points) brings size to the line and muscle when the puck is in the corners. The other two — the 5-10, 174-pound Point (seven goals/16 points) and the 5-9, 173-pound Gourde (four goals/nine points) — dart around the ice, fill the holes, force turnovers on defense and create

## Halladay killed in Florida plane crash

HOLIDAY — Roy Halladay, a two-time Cy Young Award winner who pitched a perfect game and a playoff no-hitter for the Philadelphia Phillies, died Tuesday when his private plane crashed into the Gulf of Mexico. He was 40.

Pasco County Sheriff Chris Nocco said during a news conference that Halladay's ICON A5 went down around noon off the coast of Florida. The sheriff's office marine unit responded and discovered Halladay's body in shallow water near some mangroves. No survivors were found.

Police said they couldn't confirm if there were additional passengers on the plane or say where it was headed. The National Transportation Safety Board is investigating.

Halladay, who retired after the 2013 season, was an amateur pilot who often posted on social media about small planes.

"I have dreamed about owning a A5 since I retired! Real life is better than my dreams!!" Halladay tweeted on Oct. 13.

ICON aircraft had posted a video with Halladay trying out a new plane. The video showed Halladay taking delivery of a new ICON A5, a two-seat "light-sport aircraft" that can land on water.

In the video, Halladay said the terms of his baseball contract prevented him from having a pilot's license while playing, and that his wife was originally against the idea of him getting the aircraft.

"She's fought me the whole way," Halladay said.

"Hard. I fought hard. I was very against it," Brandy Halladay said in the same video, before explaining why she eventually understood and approved of her husband's desire to have the plane. The couple have two sons, Ryan and Braden.





Halladay spent 12 seasons with the Toronto Blue Jays followed by four seasons with the Phillies. He was 203-105 with a 3.38 ERA and an eight-time All-Star.

"Such a sad day," former Phillies first baseman Ryan Howard tweeted. "We lost a great ball player but an even better human being."

Other baseball players to die in plane crashes included Pittsburgh Pirates star Roberto Clemente in a relief mission from Puerto Rico traveling to earthquake victims in Nicaragua on New Year's Eve in 1972; New York Yankees catcher

Thurman Munson piloting his own plane near his home in Canton, Ohio, in 1979; and Yankees pitcher Cory Lidle piloting his own plane in New York City in 2006.

Halladay was nominated several times for the Roberto Clemente Award, given by Major League Baseball to players for sportsmanship and community involvement. The Halladay Family Foundation has aided children's charities, hunger relief and animal rescue.

A 6-foot-6 right-hander, Halladay was a throwback on the mound. Durable and determined to finish what he started, Halladay won the AL Cy Young in 2003 after going 22-7 and the NL prize in 2010 after going 21-10.

# Patrick back earlier than expected

TALLAHASSEE — Florida State's offense this season has been beset by injuries. But the Seminoles have received some good news for once as they prepare for Saturday's game at fourth-ranked Clemson.

Running back Jacques Patrick has returned to practice and could see action against the Tigers. The 6-foot-4, 234-pound junior was thought to be lost for the season after having knee surgery on Oct. 24, but the injury was not as bad as originally believed.

"At first they thought (the cartilage) was torn like what (safety) Derwin (James) had last year," Patrick said. "I knew after the surgery though when I woke up and was able to put full pressure on it that I was fine."

Patrick's return comes as the Seminoles (3-5, 3-4 Atlantic Coast Conference) are trying to avoid a losing season for the first time since 1976 and having a string of 35 consecutive bowl appearances snapped.

Patrick injured the knee in a 31-28 loss to Louisville on Oct. 21. He thought it was just a knee sprain, but an MRI had the original diagnosis as torn cartilage that would sideline him 4-to-6 months. But Patrick was able to walk following the surgery, and his recovery was quick from there.

Patrick was doing conditioning and running drills last week before being cleared to return.

"People were just looking at me crazy because I just had surgery and I'm walking into practice," Patrick said. "It started out as a real devastating moment but I overcame

it." Patrick's return should bolster an offense that has found its greatest success is on the ground. The Orlando native is averaging 72.3 rushing

yards in six games (434 yards on 76 carries), including a 120-yard effort in a win at Wake Forest on Sept. 30. He is also fifth on the team in receptions with 13 for 88

yards. Cam Akers rushed for 199 yards and two touchdowns in last Saturday's 27-24 win over Syracuse. The 5-foot-11, 213-pound freshman is fifth

in ACC, averaging 86.9 yards per game (127 carries, 752 yards), and has three 100-yard games this season.

"We've run the football well at times, which has helped us create some big plays on offense," coach Jimbo Fisher said. "Both backs are continuing to learn and play well. Jacques, this is his first full season as a starter, and Cam is starting to do some really good things."

Clemson (8-1, 6-1) comes into the game second in the ACC and 20th nationally in run defense, allowing 121.9 yards per game, and has allowed only two backs to go over 100 yards in its last 16 games.

Florida State has had success running the ball the past two years against Clemson. Dalvin Cook had a pair of 100-yard games and tied a school record with four touchdowns last season. However, the Seminoles lost both games and are trying to avoid their first three-game losing streak to the Tigers since 2007.

A loss would also mean that FSU would finish below .500 in the ACC for only the second time since joining the conference in 1992.

"They had the injuries that kind of hurt them. They looked good last week," Clemson linebacker Kendall Joseph said. "Not their best offense, but they're definitely capable of moving the ball on us and playing well. So we definitely have to be ready and come ready to play."

as the committee members let head-to-head results and strength of schedule be their guide. The final rankings that will determine the participants in the College Football Playoff semifinals come out Dec. 3.

Georgia and Alabama, Southeastern Conference rivals, are both 8-0 and have been dominating their competition. The Bulldogs' one close game was at Notre Dame in September, a 20-19 victory.

Committee chairman Kirby Hocutt, the athletic director for Texas Tech, said the Bulldogs had a slight edge over the Crimson Tide because of their victory against the Irish on Sept. 9.

The Fighting Irish

(7-1) have not lost since, including blowouts of Michigan State (24th), Southern California (17th) and North Carolina State (20th). Those victories and the close loss to Georgia made the Irish the highest ranked among one-loss teams.

"The teams ranked three through seven are very evenly matched," Hocutt said.

Hocutt said Clemson's six victories against teams with winning records, including Virginia Tech (13th) and Auburn (14th), outweighed a loss on the road to a Syracuse team that is 4-4. That's been a fairly consistent trend in the short history of the selection committee. The members tend not to get too caught up in the notion of a bad loss.

Hocutt also said Clemson (7-1) playing

the second half against Syracuse without injured quarterback Kelly Bryant was a factor for the committee.

On the same night Georgia beat Notre Dame, Oklahoma (7-1) won 31-16 at Ohio State.

"For the teams five through seven, their head-to-head results were very important to the committee," Hocutt said.

Ohio State (7-1) rallied to beat Penn State (7-1) last Saturday, 39-38.

In the latest AP Top 25, Ohio State was No. 3, Penn State No. 7 and Oklahoma was No. 8. Those rankings had some Sooners wondering if the committee would do something similar.

"We all just watched it as a team just now," Oklahoma linebacker Ogbornia Okoronkwo said.

Notre Dame has rushed for at least 318 yards in each of its last five games. "It's an outstanding front four," Notre Dame coach Brian Kelly said about Miami. "The linebackers run and tackle as well as any group that we've played. ... They can play a number of different coverages by keeping three linebackers on the field and that's pretty hard to do today in college football. A unique skill-set in that group."

Kelly spent much of his weekly news conference Tuesday raving about the Hurricanes' defense. In Coral Gables, Miami's Mark Richt offered similar sentiments about the Irish offense.

"Their offensive line, probably the best in America," Richt said. "I don't think very many people would argue that. ... Very experienced

## Detroit on quest to win NFC North

ALLEN PARK, Mich. — The Detroit Lions have improved their chances of winning a division title for the first time since 1993.

Detroit won 30-17 at Green Bay on Monday night and is the only NFC North team without a loss in division play.


Lions coach Jim Caldwell, though, refused to bask in the relative glow.

"It's a matter of making certain that we kind of keep our focus narrow," Caldwell said Tuesday. "We can have kind of 360-degree awareness, but 180-degree focus in terms of what's ahead of us."

The Lions (4-4) are two games behind division-leading Minnesota (6-2), but they beat the Vikings on the road and can own a potential tiebreaker by defeating them again on Thanksgiving.

Detroit has a favorable schedule, starting with Sunday's home game against the winless Cleveland Browns (0-8). The Lions' last three games at Ford Field are against NFC North teams, ending Dec. 31 with the Packers. And their four remaining road games are against teams with losing records.

"I don't buy into that," Caldwell bristled when asked about his team's

remaining schedule. "Games are hard to win in this league, and every team has talent and ability."

Perhaps most important, Matthew Stafford is the best quarterback still standing in the division.

Minnesota's Teddy Bridgewater hasn't played this season because of a knee injury, though he might return soon. Green Bay's Aaron Rodgers is out indefinitely with a broken collarbone. Chicago is giving rookie Mitch Trubisky, the No. 2 pick overall, a chance to play even though he has

completed less than half his passes and has two touchdown passes and two interceptions in four games.

The Lions took full advantage of facing the Packers with Brett Hundley under center.


"We just knew that he wouldn't be able to do the stuff that Aaron does at the line of scrimmage," said Detroit cornerback Darius Slay, whose man-to-man coverage limited Jordy Nelson to four catches for just 35 yards.

Stafford, meanwhile, completed a season-high 79 percent of his passes for 361 yards. He threw a

touchdown pass in each half, didn't throw an interception and finished with a season-high 132.4 passer rating.

"This is a guy who deserves to thrive in this league, experience playoff games, playoff wins, NFC championship games and even the Super Bowl," said receiver Golden Tate, who signed with Detroit in 2014 after helping Seattle win a Super Bowl. "He is that type of quarterback, and I want to be a part of it and help him get there. I think we are working in the right direction."

## Continuity in cups could lead to a closed shop

Americans finally found the recipe for continuity in the Ryder Cup and Presidents Cup.

The key now is to avoid a closed shop.

Jim Furyk is the Ryder Cup captain for next year's matches in Paris, and it will be the fourth straight team event that he is assigned a radio and a cart.

He was an assistant captain the previous three cups in South Korea, Hazeltine and Liberty National.

Furyk has appointed only one assistant so far — Davis Love III, who will be involved for the sixth time in the last seven years. Love, popular among the players, was the Ryder Cup captain in 2012 and 2016 and an assistant at the Presidents Cup in 2013, 2015 and 2017.

Steve Stricker was an assistant for three straight years before taking over as Presidents Cup captain at Liberty National.

He is a strong candidate to be the Ryder Cup captain for 2020 when the matches are held at Whistling Straits in his home state of Wisconsin. It would not be surprising to see him in Paris.

This was all part of the plan.

Among the strategies that came out of the Ryder Cup Task Force was to choose assistants who either were past captains or would be considered as future captains. It only made sense to apply the concept to the Presidents Cup.

But it led to a question that made Phil

Mickelson pause.

With such a solid core, which includes Tiger Woods and Fred Couples, how does anyone join the club?

"We'll be starting to have turnover and stuff," Mickelson said. "It's a good question. But we're only three years in."

The turnover should start in the next few months, and it's one reason that Furyk is more than just a little curious whom the PGA Tour will select as the next Presidents Cup captain for 2019 in Australia.

Ron Cross, the senior vice president in charge of the Presidents Cup, said the tour was still in the early stages of the process.

Any decision should not be expected until early next year. Whoever it is just might be among the five assistants that go to Paris.

"There's a lot of similarities between the cups," Furyk said. "It's been good for me to work on both. I would have been bummed not to have been at the Presidents Cup. Stricker fought hard for me to join."

"It was good to be there with the guys. ... And I think it was good for them to see me there."

Two names that merit consideration are Justin Leonard and David Toms.

Under this new blueprint, they both might seem like outsiders, and they shouldn't be. Leonard played on eight teams, and he hit one of the most memorable Ryder Cup shots with a 45-foot birdie putt on the 17th hole at Brookline in 1999.

## NFL: Packers

## Packers lose 3rd straight, seek answers

GREEN BAY, Wis. — Aaron Rodgers is the great equalizer for the Green Bay Packers, a once-in-a-generation type of talent who can help mask mistakes and turn busted plays into big gains.

Without him, miscues are magnified and the margin of error shrinks considerably for the Packers.

It happened again Monday night when Green Bay fell 30-17 to the Detroit Lions for its third straight loss, a streak that started when Rodgers hurt his collarbone on Oct. 15 at Minnesota.

"We're a better team than what we're putting on film, regardless of

whether (Rodgers) is in there or not," receiver Davante Adams said. "We've still got ... enough talent in here where we can win these types of games."

The Packers were coming off a bye, exuding optimism that an extra week of rest and preparation could help turn things around. Coming into the game,

coach Mike McCarthy in part stressed the need to get the ball more to his playmaking receivers.

They did just that, though most of the opportunities came on short passes. Adams had seven catches for 53 yards with a long of 9. Jordy Nelson finished with four catches for 35 yards. He was blanketed by Lions cornerback Darius Slay on a couple deep shots in the third quarter while the game was still competitive.

Randall Cobb had five catches for 58 yards, including a 46-yard gain on a catch-and-run that set up Hundley's 1-yard quarterback sneak that made it 20-10 with 9:52 left.

## TENNIS: Rule changes

## Shot clock &amp; Hawk-Eye most popular changes to tennis players

MILAN — "Can you say something useful and not be this useless all the time? Just say one thing that is actually useful."

"Go more to the net ... not just to shake hands."

And with that, coach Marcelo Melo let Alexander Zverev return to the baseline with, hopefully, a winning tactic.

Player coaching, normally forbidden during a match, is being trialed at the ATP's Next Gen Finals in Milan this week, and conversations like the above are giving fans new insight, and entertainment.

Coaches and players conversing through headsets at the end of sets is one of the new rules being applied, along with shorter sets, no-Ad scoring, medical timeout limits, and no lets on serve.

But, for the players,

the most popular innovations are the shot clock, and Hawk-Eye making all the line calls.

The on-court clocks enforce the 25-second rule between points, and shorter warm-ups ensure matches begin precisely five minutes from the second player walk-on.

Zverev withdrew from the Next Gen Finals to focus on the elite ATP Finals starting on Sunday in London, but turned up in Milan on Tuesday to play an exhibition match against alternate Stefanos Tsitsipas.

"The Hawk-Eye calling all the lines, that would be something that I wouldn't mind at all," Zverev said. "The shot clock is something not bad. There has to be a few adjustments maybe made to that but I think that has potential."

ATP executive chairman and president Chris

Kermode believes the clocks will become a feature on the regular tour from 2019.

"Next year, for sure not, but I think 2019 there's a possibility," he told The Associated Press.

"To me, having a shot clock, people have been talking about it for years

and it's like can we just do it or not do it? This is clearly let's just do it. The reduced warm-up for sure we can get done, too, and the rest is then up for discussion.

"You've got to have a year's lead-in so everyone is fully aware of what's happening. You can't just thrust it

upon them and go, 'By the way, January, guys, you're playing under different rules.' Also I think we need to analyze the success of this week. This is just day one. Let's take all the data through all the matches, see what works, what doesn't work."

The most drastic change is the shorter set, where the first to four games takes the set, with a tiebreak at 3-3.

While Kermode says it is his favorite innovation, he recognizes it is unlikely to be brought in anytime soon.

"There are a couple of no-brainer ideas that we should be doing," he said. "But once you start the dramatic scoring format changes that's going to be the most difficult. I'm actually a big fan of the system but I'm aware of the challenges."

"Will this happen on the tour in the next five

years? Probably not. But 10 years down the line could this be the way it's played? Yeah, it could be."

Automatic line calling was another change that was met with universal appreciation.

Hawk-Eye cameras decide all line calls, eliminating the need for line judges and ensuring the chair umpire is the only match official on court.

When triggered, the new system will make an instant automated "out" call.

"For now, live Hawk-Eye is a good thing," No. 2 seed Karen Khachanov said after losing to Daniil Medvedev. "Only thing is I would like to hear different voice."

Khachanov said he'd prefer if the Hawk-Eye recorded the voice of whoever was the chair umpire, so the calls sounded more legitimate.

## Oklahoma, Texas set for tourney return

Oklahoma went from the joy of a 2016 Final Four appearance to the misery of a 20-loss campaign last season.

Now the Sooners have a chance to redeem themselves.

"Last year motivates me every day," Oklahoma forward Khadeem Lattin said. "It's something I lose sleep over, I've lost plenty (of) sleep over. I'm ready to get it right."

Oklahoma isn't the only team left out of last season's NCAA Tournament that believes it will earn a bid this time around.

Plenty of teams have chances for a big turnaround. Especially with many of the nation's top incoming freshman headed for programs coming off disappointing seasons.

Which teams that missed the 2017 tournament are mostly likely to return in '18? Here's a sampling:

### Alabama

**2016-17 record:** 19-15, lost in first round of NIT

Alabama's hopes of earning its first NCAA Tournament berth since 2012 may depend on the uncertain status of

freshman guard Collin Sexton and top returning starter Braxton Key. Alabama announced Monday that the NCAA hasn't yet cleared Sexton to play and that Key has a meniscus injury that requires surgery with no timetable set for his return.

### Missouri

**2016-17 record:** 8-24  
New Missouri coach Cuonzo Martin has dramatically improved the talent base of a program that has finished in the SEC basement the last three years. Missouri landed top

recruit Michael Porter Jr., a preseason AP All-America selection. Porter headlines a Missouri recruiting class that was ranked fourth nationally according to the 247Sports Composite, behind only Duke, Kentucky and Arizona. Missouri returns Jordan Barnett, Kevin Puryear and Terrence Phillips, who all had double-figure scoring averages last season.

### Oklahoma

**2016-17 record:** 11-20  
After going from the Final Four in 2016 to 20

losses season last season, Oklahoma should find a happy medium between those two extremes. The Sooners lost their leading scorer in Jordan Woodard but return three starters in Kameron McGusty (10.9 ppg last season), Rashard Odomes (10.1) and Khadeem Lattin (8.4). Oklahoma also adds promising freshman point guard Trae Young, rated as the nation's No. 23 recruit in his class by the 247Sports Composite.

### Texas

**2016-17 record:** 11-22  
Texas' freshman class should help the Longhorns rebound from a dismal 2016-17. Texas' incoming group was ranked sixth in the 247Sports Composite and features 6-foot-11 forward Mohamed Bamba, the nation's No. 3 overall recruit. Freshman Matt Coleman could take over immediately as the Longhorns' top point guard. Texas returns guards Andrew Jones and Kerwin Roach Jr., who each averaged over nine points last season. Tulane transfer Dylan Osetkowski was the Green Wave's leading rebounder two years ago.

### No 25 Texas A&M

**2016-17 record:** 16-15

Texas A&M is the only team in the pre-season Top 25 that failed to earn an NCAA bid last season. Robert Williams' surprising decision to return for his sophomore season rather than entering the NBA Draft makes the Aggies legitimate NCAA Tournament contenders, though he has been suspended for the Aggies' first two games. Williams, one of four returning starters, averaged 11.9 points and 8.2 rebounds last season. Texas A&M also returns Tyler Davis (14.1 ppg, 7 rpg last season), Admon Gilder (13.7 ppg) and Tonny Trocha-Morelos (8.1). Davis and Trocha-Morelos are both 6-10.

### TCU

**2016-17 record:** 24-15

After winning the NIT in coach Jamie Dixon's first season, the Horned Frogs have their sights set on their first NCAA Tournament appearance since 1987. TCU returns all five starters, including preseason all-Big 12 forward Vladimir Brodziansky. The Horned Frogs also add VCU graduate transfer Ahmed Hamdy and New Mexico Junior College transfer Shawn Olden, who began his college career at Pepperdine.

## Rams, Bills, Jags succeeding with new coaches

DENVER — Of the half dozen first-year NFL head coaches, Vance Joseph inherited what was widely considered the best situation: a team just one year removed from a Super Bowl parade with a championship-caliber defense and a renovated offense.

Unlike the other five teams that averaged 4.4 wins last season, Denver was coming off a 9-7 season and the job only came open because of Gary Kubiak's health concerns.

Yet, it's the Broncos (3-5) who are spiraling with five losses in their past six games while Sean McVay's Rams (6-2), Doug Marrone's Jaguars (5-3) and Sean McDermott's Bills (5-3) are primed for playoff pushes.

Even Anthony Lynn's Chargers (3-5) are on the rise after a winless first month that included three losses by a field goal or less.

While the 49ers are an NFL-worst 0-9, Kyle Shanahan could end up being the biggest winner of them all with his team jockeying for the top pick in next year's draft.

Suddenly, all that winning ugly over the past couple of years, highlighted by Denver's defense carrying a diminished Peyton Manning to victory in his Super Bowl 50 farewell, looks pretty good in retrospect.

When Kubiak quit, defensive coordinator Wade Phillips joined McVay in L.A. and offensive coordinator Rick Dennison joined McDermott in Buffalo.





### A primer on the 2017 flu season vaccines

**DR. ROACH WRITES:**

It is nearly flu season, and I want to discuss the options for vaccines available this year in North America. I do not recommend the nasal vaccine, as expert groups have questioned its effectiveness. There are seven influenza vaccines available.



**Dr. Roach**

For most people, any vaccine is acceptable. The usual flu shot offered at your doctor or pharmacy most likely is the standard-dose trivalent or quadrivalent vaccine. The trivalent protects against three strains of flu expected to be prevalent (two "A" strains and one "B" strain), whereas the quadrivalent adds a second "B" strain. If both are available, I'd recommend the quadrivalent, but don't skip the trivalent if that's the only one available.

Adults over 65 may benefit more from the high-dose trivalent vaccine (Fluzone High-Dose) or from Fluad, which contains an adjuvant (a substance added to the vaccine to make it work better). Adults age 18-64 with fear of needles might consider the intradermal low-dose quadrivalent vaccine (Fluzone intradermal). This uses a tiny (1.5-mm), ultra-thin needle. Another option for people with needle phobia is the standard trivalent vaccine (Afluria) using a jet injector device. (It is like the hypospray in "Star Trek." I have yet to talk to anyone who has gotten this, so please write me with your experience if you get this). People with severe egg allergies can get the Flucelvax, produced in cultured mammalian cells, not eggs, or Flublok, made with recombinant DNA technology, which comes in both trivalent and quadrivalent.

That's a lot of choices, but the bottom line is that any of the approved vaccines will give some protection against the flu, which is always an unpleasant experience but can be a life-threatening illness: The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention estimates that there are 12,000 to 56,000 deaths from flu in the U.S. each year. Most of these are in people who are not vaccinated.

**DEAR DR. ROACH:** Uterine fibroids in the

right (wrong) place can cause bowel compression and constipation. I wasted a lot of time adding more and more fiber to an already fiber-adequate diet to the point where I developed diverticulosis from bowel pressure. A hysterectomy solved the problem completely. Wish I'd known sooner. — J.Q.

**ANSWER:** Thank you for writing.

Fibroids are benign tumors of the uterus. They are very common: Up to 80 percent of women over 40 have them, although many don't have any symptoms. The most common symptoms are bleeding, pelvic pain or pressure, or a pelvic mass noted by the woman. The vast majority of uterine masses are benign: There is a risk of a malignant tumor (sarcoma), but only about two cases per 1,000 women with symptomatic fibroids.


It is not a common presentation, but you are completely right that a fibroid in the posterior part of the uterus can press directly on the rectum. This can cause mechanical pressure, requiring increased straining to void. Fibroids also can bleed, causing anemia, and the iron tablets many women take to counteract this also can cause constipation.

Not all women with fibroids need surgery. They usually get smaller after menopause. However, very large or symptomatic fibroids can be treated surgically.



Rubber bridge players, in general, show disdain for overtricks and will vilify an opponent that goes after them. Overtricks in duplicate bridge are very important and declarers will make every effort to try for them.

South won the opening heart lead in his hand with the king and led a low club to dummy's jack, losing to the queen. East shifted to a low

spade, won by declarer with the ace. A low club went to the 10 and king, and a third round of clubs set up the rest of the suit. West continued with the jack of spades to South's king. Declarer crossed to dummy with the ace of hearts and cashed the remaining clubs. East discarded three spades on the long clubs and South two diamonds.

The contract was assured at this point with two spades, three hearts, a diamond and three clubs. Could declarer find an overtrick? South reasoned that East would not have discarded three spades unless he was protecting something in diamonds, so he crossed back to his hand with the queen of hearts and exited with his remaining spade. Success! East won with his queen and was forced to lead a diamond away from his king. Making four and a great result!





The Army Air Corps activated the PGAAF on Dec. 11, 1943, with a mission to train pilots for overseas duty. The first student pilots arrived in February 1944. Average class size was 30 students per squadron. This included the 490th Fighter Squadron and the 502nd Fighter-Bomber Squadron. Over 750 student pilots completed 15 weeks of training at the base. Pilots flew the Curtiss P-40 Warhawk and the North American P-51 Mustang.

PGAAF contributed to the victory in World War II and was deactivated on Sept. 1, 1945, one day before the surrender of Japan. Today the Punta Gorda Airport serves our community through both private and commercial aviation.

Around 2004, Tania Garcia and her husband Frank Ridondo began their own personal mission to start eating and living healthier.

Tania was suffering through some genetic health issues, and through her research, discovered that she may be able to alleviate some of her symptoms by preparing food with all-natural, organic ingredients. It didn't take long before the effects of her and Frank's healthier overall diet began to be noticeable and she felt better.

Only two years after that, she and Frank had the opportunity to buy longtime Deep Creek dining staple K's Family Pizzeria and they jumped at the

chance to put their newfound knowledge to work for others.

At the time, Frank had already accumulated years of experience working in restaurants, and Tania was (and is) a

licensed clinical therapist. They jumped right in with both feet.

"The original owners of K's, Angelo and Debbie Kourpouanidis, owned it for more than 18 years, Tania said. "Our oldest daughter Samantha, when she was going to Charlotte High, worked here for them in her first teenage job. The family loved her and even took her to Greece on vacation with them."

When Angelo and Debbie were ready to retire in 2006, they offered to sell the restaurant to Tania and Frank. After the sale, they even stayed for three more months and helped the new owners acclimate to the way they did things at K's. After all, it was already a very successful, neighborhood eatery.

As the new owners, Tania and Frank mostly kept the same items on the menu. The pizza and Greek and Italian entree selections were especially popular. But one major difference they instituted was with the sources of the ingredients.

"A lot of people don't know how to access organic and sustainable products, so they don't use them at home," Tania said. "But here, our produce is organic and our natural chicken and beef are grass-fed and hormone-free and have no GMOs or antibiotics. We even grow our own organic herbs, like basil and oregano, in pots out in front of the restaurant."

Though you are aware you are eating healthier at K's (they remind you of it on the menu), until you eat a dish from there, you have no idea of the difference in taste that fresh, organic ingredients

make. Each bite of a Greek salad, every bit of Lebanese-style hummus and each slice of vegetable-laden El Greco pizza bursts with flavor.

K's Pizzeria is truly a family restaurant. Besides Tania and Frank, the couple's son Paul is the manager and their youngest daughter Briana works there when she can. Samantha now lives in the northeast.

Frank says that each night he posts family specials, which might include combinations of pizza and salads or wings. But he knows that whatever he makes, he and Tania can feel good about the quality of the food they are serving.

"Fridays we try to do specials that are not on the menu, like pulled pork, salmon and shrimp scampi," he said. "When people walk in, if they feel at home and their taste buds are happy, you've got them."



# Charlotte Symphony Orchestra's new season: Exciting, diverse and eclectic

There is something eye-catching about the Charlotte Symphony Orchestra's new concert season: The scope of the music it will be playing is broad.

From patriotic melodies to "Bolero," from Gershwin to Stravinsky, the symphony will cover the full spectrum. The only thing missing is rock 'n roll, and if you consider "Bolero" as the palette for Jefferson Airplane's "White Rabbit," that's covered too.

"That's exactly what we intended," said Raffaele Ponti, in his fourth season as the symphony's musical director and conductor. "We want to be exciting, diverse and eclectic."

"There's so much great music out there. I'm amazed every time I turn a page how much great art is out there, and we should be experiencing it."

In a newly created partnership with the Military Heritage Museum, the symphony will open its season at 7:30 p.m. Sunday, Nov. 12, with "A Salute to our Armed Forces."

According to a news release, the Charlotte Performing Arts Center will feature military memorabilia from the museum and a preconcert dessert reception to honor attendees who are veterans. The Military Heritage Museum, located at Fishermen's Village in Punta Gorda, showcases military history from the Civil War to the present.

According to the release, the concert will include Persichetti's "A Lincoln Address," Harris' "Epilogue to JFK's Profiles in Courage," and Copland's open-air homage, "An Outdoor Adventure" among other melodies.

The opening concert is "important to me," Ponti said. "It's important to Punta Gorda, which just built the Vietnam Wall and has the museum. It has a large population of veterans and people who are serving in community."

"You turn on the news and we're still dealing with war and death and loss. Art can often heal, and we're hoping this concert will help do that. I've selected beautiful music to honor beautiful people."

Lindsay Harrington, former state representative, mayor of Punta Gorda and an Air force veteran, will narrate the Lincoln Address, according to Devorah Kermisch, the symphony's new executive director.

Ponti called Harrington "just an outstanding American and a wonderful gentleman. His narration will be "very powerful."

"We see the audience walking away from the first concert saying, 'Wow, I had no idea,'" Ponti said.

The annual Christmas concert will command two performances, at 2 p.m. and 7:30 p.m. Sunday, Dec. 3. It will include secular selections such as "White Christmas," hymns such as "Silent Night," and classical music such as excerpts from the "Nutcracker."

"The idea is to get families to bring their children and enjoy holiday season," Ponti said of the matinee performance.

The Feb. 25 "Bolero" concert will feature a performance by Sabrina-Vivian Hopcker, a critically acclaimed young German violinist. She will play during Wieniawsky's Violin Concerto No. 2.

That will follow the Sunday, Jan. 14 performance of Gershwin's "Porgy & Bess."

Other concerts will be held on Sunday, March 18, "An Evening of John Williams and Friends" and Sunday, April 8, is "Stravinsky's Firebird."

Ponti is proud of the range his orchestra will show this season.

"We can sell Mozart," he said. "But I don't like that pigeon-holing. We have the courage that we can do this, and the audiences take this wild ride with us. When they come, they will hear a first-class performance. And when they leave, they'll have heard something new. We're expanding their musical ears, their taste."

"We're in this together."

the Florida Gators, and devoted a lot of time and resources to supporting local youth leagues like Englewood baseball, Pop Warner teams and Lemon Bay High School. For other sports lovers, the comfortable, casual restaurant he and Joanne created doesn't have a bad seat in the house, when it comes to watching any game that happens to be on. No matter where you sit, there's a television in view.

But it's not just the sports viewing that customers come for at The End Zone Sports Grille, it's the food.

"Our Phillies and our pizza are just

great," Joanne said. "We also make a delicious New England-style roast beef sandwich, with a special sauce, cheese and mayo on a soft roll."



# His music carries message of faith

Rodrigo Rodriguez has been playing guitar his whole life. He has spent only the last couple of decades playing music that represents a means to an end.

Music was always an end in itself to him. He was accomplished enough at the guitar that he was touring world-wide by age 15. He cut his first record when he was 12.

"Guitar used to be my God," said the Greenville, South Carolina, resident, a native of Ecuador.

Instead, Rodrigo experienced a transformation. His outlook on life, his music — everything — changed.

"It adds interest to the concert. Ours is not just a concert. It's an event."

"It's a full spectrum," Skowyra said. "We have amazing people. We have people for whom music was their life. We try to have new soloists every year, bring in new faces."

"You can't have all classical or all Broadway because there are going to be people who don't like it. What he tries to do is make a program that has a little bit of everything in it, so everybody gets something they love."

## 'Bad Moms Christmas'

A movie can be unreasonably formulaic and still be reasonably diverting, and "A Bad Moms Christmas" is the proof. Some sequels take time to come together. This one took a mere 15 months to reunite Mila Kunis, Kristen Bell and the extraordinarily valuable Kathryn Hahn as the suburban Chicago pals perennially under the gun of peer pressure and familial expectation. (The movie was shot in Atlanta, with some fake-looking snow-machine snow in tidy little piles here and there.) Screenwriters and directors Jon Lucas and Scott Moore return and, while their staging, and setups and what the old folks call "moviemaking" remain functional at best, a fair number of the jokes hit their targets.

Gone is the tedious narrative machinery of the first "Bad Moms" that involved the Kunis character's brutal rivalry with her fiercest PTA enemy, played by Christina Applegate. In its place, Lucas and Moore steal their own opening from "The Hangover," with a stunned Amy (Kunis) sitting amid the wreckage of a rough Christmas Eve, complete with roving camel and broken glass.

Flashback: We go back a few days to meet our heroines' unexpected-drop-in mothers, played by Susan Sarandon, Cheryl Hines and Christine Baranski. Hines portrays the Klingon who can't let go, to the point of not leaving the bedroom where her daughter (Bell) is having sex with her husband. Baranski's controlling, imperious, demanding character is the reason why, we're told, narrator Amy finds Christmas so hard on the ego and the spirit. "You have to do (everything) perfectly or you'll never forgive yourself," Amy says.

While the Baranski character bigfoots her daughter's attempts at ramping down and mellowing out the holiday, Sarandon's hard-living ex-roadie hits town to ask daughter Carla (Hahn) for money. "A Bad Moms Christmas" rotates through exercises in confrontation, evasion, bonding, letting off steam and building the steam back up again for the next round.

The sequel accommodates some genial beefcake in the form of Justin Hartley's firefighter/male stripper, the love interest for Carla. They meet over a testicle waxing (she works in a spa) and, against all odds, the scene starts funny and stays funny. Baranski, who has played these sorts of women before, brings rapier comic timing to scenes such as a Christmas Eve chapel quasi-apology to Kunis, where she can't quite say the words "I'm sorry." It's Hahn, though, who kills throughout. Even when the movie confines the audience to the inside of a mall for a distressing length of time, she energizes the formula.


Comedy is hard. In order for performers to fly, the material — which is both the trapeze and the net — must be in place, supporting the riffs. Nobody goes to a movie like "A Bad Moms Christmas" for fresh plotting; they just want a few dirty laughs, a little heart and a pretense, anyway, of relatability (though Kunis, who glides through unruffled even when her character's supposed to be frazzled, isn't everyone's idea of relatable). Moviemakers take so few chances with sequels because there's no money in it; risking overfamiliarity is a better bet than disorienting the pre-sold customer. On the other hand, 2017

has been laden with sequels of varying quality performing below expectations. This one's not bad.

These days, that means more than it should.

# 'A Christmas Story, the Musical'

"A Christmas Story, The Musical" is based on the popular 1983 movie that plays round-the-clock on television each Christmas season. The musical version was written in 2009, and was produced regionally before arriving in New York in 2012 for a limited Broadway run. It boasts a book by prolific playwright Joseph Robinette and music and lyrics by song-writing dream team Benj Pasek and Justin Paul. In the past year, Pasek and Paul have won the Tony Award for Dear Evan Hansen and an Oscar for La La Land. With such an accomplished creative team, it's no surprise that A Christmas Story, The Musical has been called, "The best darn musical I've seen in years," by David Richardson of WOR Radio and "a joyous Christmas miracle," by The Associated Press.

The beloved story, based on the writings of Jean Shepherd, is told through the eyes of mischievous, bespectacled Ralphie Parker. He wants only one thing for Christmas: An Official Red Ryder Range Model Carbine-Action BB Gun. 



**Homegrown Sounds:**  
A unique mix of music

The easy listening tones of Homegrown Sounds — husband and wife duo Emery and Peggy Williams — can best be described as “Contemporary coffee house/wine bar,” a unique mix of folk, classic country, American standards and original music all rolled together in one.

The pair hails from the Buffalo, New York area, but lives in North Port these days.

“Living here beats the heck out of the snow and winter,” Emery laughed. “We paid our dues up north and wanted a warm place to go. We have that here, although we moved here as snowbirds in 2004, just in time for Hurricane Charley. We made Florida our permanent home in 2012.”

Peggy’s gentle guitar style and soothing voice, along with Emery’s endless array of percussion sounds and harmonica interludes, provide especially memorable takes on popular tunes as well as their own musical creations.

“In addition to the guitar, Peggy plays an Irish hand drum called a bodhran,” Emery said. “Added to my harmonica and percussion work, I play a drum called the cajon. I’ll also have cymbals with me as well as chimes, spoons, the marimba, even a kazoo. It all depends on what the song calls for.”

“We call ourselves Homegrown Sounds because they’re sounds we

developed at home,” Peggy added. “We really have created our own sound. I grew up listening to Joan Baez and a lot of folk music. I really like Patsy Cline, in that old country vein. But I also like contemporary female artists like Adele, who tells stories with her songs, as well as jazz singer Diana Krall. I play what I like and I like a lot.”

The two can also be found at numerous folk festivals around the state as well as at the Americana Community Music Association in Fort Myers, which is where they play a lot of their original tunes.

“At our local gigs, though, we primarily play for a dinner crowd,” Emery said. “It’s not necessarily a listening room setting. We start out with quiet, easy listening tunes and progressively turn up the heat by our third set, where we play a lot of blues, for example. But we do tailor our music to the venue.”






