'Doggie dining' on the table for Charlotte County

CHARLOTTE COUNTY — Charlotte County animal lovers might soon see more dogs out and about in restaurants throughout the county. The Charlotte County Commission directed county staff Tuesday to begin drafting an ordinance so restaurants could apply for a permit to allow pets in a designated area.

The issue was brought to the commission by the Englewood Chamber of Commerce after restaurant owner Joe Reichard was cited by the Department of Health for allowing dogs at his restaurant during an inspection earlier this year. Live animals are prohibited from being in public food service establishments under Florida Food and Drug Administration Codes, unless the owners apply for a permit. However, Charlotte County currently has no ordinance allowing restaurant owners to obtain a permit.

Reichard said for the past 11 years, customers have been bringing their dogs to the restaurant with no issue. He suspects someone may have complained about a particular dog, prompting the sudden enforcement of the regulation.

"We found out in a very abrupt manner from the Department of Health that we had to come into compliance immediately, which we did, much to the disappointment of many of our customers who thought it was a policy we had changed," Reichard said.

For restaurant owners and their patrons in Englewood, the issue is particularly confusing because Sarasota County has a "Doggie Dining Ordinance" allowing authorized restaurants to have pets in their businesses. Since Englewood spans both Sarasota and Charlotte counties, many restaurant owners and customers were unaware of the inconsistency in rules.

"If you're on Dearborn Street, you

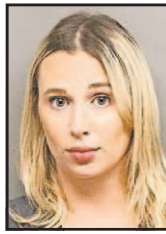

Two women arrested with 103 pounds of marijuana

LANCASTER COUNTY, NEBRASKA — Two women, one from North Port, the other from Venice, were arrested after Lancaster County deputies found over 100 pounds of marijuana in their vehicle, according to reports provided courtesy of the Lincoln Journal Star.

Kristin Schutz, 26, and Felicia D'angeleo, 27, were arrested Wednesday. D'angeleo, the Venice resident, is the daughter of Vanessa Carusone, who is

According to the Journal Star, deputies stopped the women around 3 p.m., when the white, 2018 Chevy Tahoe with Utah plates they were in was allegedly following another

Two local companies awarded \$25,000 in 'Shark Tank' competition

BABCOCK RANCH — Judges at VenturePitch of Southwest Florida couldn't decide on one winner.

So, they decided on two. The five-member panel chose co-winners from four finalists in the new-company investment event held at Babcock Ranch on Thursday evening.

Stabilized Steps of Naples and Envision Solutions of Bonita Springs each will receive \$25,000 in investment capital as Nos. 1 and 1A in the event, which is designed along the lines of the "Shark Tank" TV show. Under competition guidelines, the first two finishers would have been awarded \$25,000 each anyway.

In addition, AmbuTrak of Estero earned a \$10,000 "local host" award from Sun Newspapers as a startup within its area of influence deserving of investment.

Accugentix of Naples, which is developing an automated device for ingesting CBD hemp oil, did not take home a monetary award.

Punta Gorda builder and inventor Eryk Hardwick, who founded Stabilized Steps with partner Stephanie Gomez, called the award "tremendous. We're running on credit cards and prayers."

The business has created patented stabilizers for the bottom of walkers that provide people with mobility issues with freedom of movement on sand, gravel, mud, snow and difficult terrain.

Gomez, whose pitch was easily the best and most entertaining of the evening, said the award was "amazing. We're going to use it in marketing. As a next step, we're going to revamp our website."

New company managing Advanced Imaging of Port Charlotte

Some patients receiving medical imaging services at Advanced Imaging of Port Charlotte have recently complained of long wait times for their results upward of a month or longer.

Results can potentially uncover needs for surgery or additional treatments where timing can be crucial.

Because of that, at least one former patient wrote the Sun this week that she was planning to move on to another provider. Others have in recent months called the newspaper with complaints about employees not being timely paid and other staffing issues.

A report last month from WINK news cited an employee that confirmed the facility was short-staffed and struggling with financial troubles.

But wait times and staffing issues could soon improve as another imaging company has reached an agreement to manage the clinic at 2625 Tamiami Trail that is registered to Advanced Imaging of Port Charlotte, LLC.

Advanced Imaging — according to information from the Florida Agency for Healthcare Administration — was at least recently owned by MTL Investments, LLC and

KMH Health Inc, which are both associated with the same director.

The new managing company, Akumin — like the current owners — have ties to Canada.

Akumin is listed as a foreign profit corporation where its main officers and directors have addresses in Toronto, according to information from Florida Department of State.

Little Salt Spring presentation planned

NORTH PORT — George Guy will give a presentation, including the film, “The Springs of North Port Florida—History and the Future,” for the Friends of Little Salt Spring public meeting at 7 p.m. Tuesday, April 17, at the Jockey Club Community Center, 3050 Pan American Blvd.

The presentation is free.

With this one-hour multimedia film, Guy is hoping to educate attendees on the preservation of Warm Mineral Springs and Little Salt Spring.

“I’m tellin’ ya, there’s only one spring like this in the world,” Guy said. “It’s a treasure, like King Tut’s tomb.”

The spring was used, apparently, for burials from people who resided in the area thousands of years ago.

Guy, 84, has been teaching since the 1960s and has traveled the country while doing so.

He first fell in love with the water when he lived in Encinitas, a beach city in North County area of San Diego County, California.

He attended college, skated and competed in national events, spending much of his time on California beaches, helping make Rose Bowl floats — then began snorkeling and surfing.

Due to family medical needs, he moved back to Indiana, where he was born and raised.

He started teaching scuba lessons at the University of Evansville,

and eventually opened up his own dive shop.

In order for his students to complete their open water certification, they traveled to Venice. The first dive in the area was in Little Salt Spring because one of the students had family in the area and knew of it.

The excitement of ocean and spring diving convinced George that this would be a lifelong endeavor.

After deciding to reside in Venice, opportunities for commercial diving opened.

His jobs varied from

working underwater on Z-pilings for the supports of the Skyway Bridge to working on artificial reefs on the East Coast.

He also took part in sinking three vessels with explosives.

These last years though, Guy has been focused on preservation and education for the future.

“In my career, my theme is, ‘If you have a dream, follow it,’”

Guy said.

The springs in the area have taken on renewed interest after a former island, apparent spring and burial site was discovered under the water off Manasota Key.

Officials, community to discuss Punta Gorda growth

PUNTA GORDA — City employees and members from the marketing consulting firm, Aqua, plan to address “Appropriate Growth” for Punta Gorda, including the subject of the current

building codes.

A major focus for the meeting: building codes for potential incoming businesses.

“We’re so restrictive (in our building codes) that for a developer to want to come here ... they have no assurance that they’re going to get their project

through because they start from such a restricted place,” said Donna Peterman, a volunteer marketing coordinator with the city.

The meeting is an opportunity for the city to reinforce that community-wide growth is important, according to Peterman.

“There is agreement that we need appropriate growth but what does that mean? We have some people who think that it’s appropriate as long as it is not downtown ... anywhere else but. Whereas, there are some of us who say that it needs to be (downtown). We

need to finish downtown,”

Peterman said.

According to an editorial submitted to the *Sun*, City Manager Howard Kunik said the city is welcoming the community’s input to help create a vision for the city’s future growth.

“The city wants to

attract ... (and) continue to attract residents,” said Peterman. “We definitely want to attract more business.”

The meeting is being held at 6 p.m. April 16, at the Punta Gorda Isles Civic Association.

While making the pitch, she drew a laugh from the audience of about 100 businesspeople, community members and supporters of the new companies by confessing her depth of investment:

"When Eryk approached me with the idea, I took out 20 credit cards and two liens on my house. So, I'm all in."

Envision Solutions offers a computer-based therapy training program that can help stroke victims overcome some vision losses.

"It's great to have the acknowledgment that it's a valid product," CEO Andrew Maskery said as he accepted congratulations from supporters. "This is a huge pat on the back and proof that other people clearly believe it's a viable product worthy of investment."

He said the money will go toward clinical trials.

David Holmes, president of the Farr Law Firm in Punta Gorda, served for the second time as a judge. He was impressed by Maskery's pitch.

"I thought he had the most logical path to getting to market quickly," Holmes said. "He had a built-in market, a built-in sales channel. It just seemed to me the progression was there. There were leaps of faith in the other ones, but I felt like he had pretty much every step that was attainable."

David Scheck, 24, is the founder and CEO of AmbuTrak, which makes distance-measuring devices that attach directly to rolling walkers, enabling health-care professionals and caregivers to better track distances covered by walker-dependent patients.

The \$10,000 award from Sun Newspapers is "actually going to put me to where I can make my first product and start selling my device in the market. It's going to bring me to market."

Under the event's format, each finalist was allotted eight minutes to make a pitch. Seven more minutes were allotted to judges' questions to the contestants. At the end of the four presentations, the judges conferred privately. It took them about 20 minutes to determine there would be co-winners.

The judges used about a dozen criteria to weigh the value of the new companies' pitches, including anticipated problems, marketing strategy and financial projections.

"It was a very, very tough competition," said Tim Cartwright, general partner of Adrenaline Venture Fund, the investment arm of the event, and co-host with David Dunn-Rankin, president of Sun Coast Media Group, which owns Sun Newspapers.

VenturePitch was presented by Adrenaline Venture Fund, Fifth Avenue Advisors, Tamiami Angel Funds and Sun Newspapers.

In its eighth year, the VenturePitch series offers investment in companies located in Charlotte, Sarasota, Lee, Collier, Hendry and Glades counties. The businesses must be in the pre-revenue stage or within the first few months of generating income. They must also have been in business for two years or less, have a scalable business model, and have not raised more than \$1 million in capital.

This was the first time the event was held at Babcock Ranch, the new solar-powered town springing up on 18,000 acres in Charlotte County. It was the second time money

was awarded.

"Money is going to be spent tonight," Cartwright told the audience before the competition. "We're going to do small investments, but small investments that can be impactful to startup companies and hopefully bridge them from idea to viable product."

Dunn-Rankin said it was simply time for established businesses to reach out to new companies and invest in the economic future of Southwest Florida.

"It's time to put our money where our mouth is."

have one set of rules, but over on the other side of Beach Road you have another set of rules," said Ed Hill, executive director of the Englewood Chamber of Commerce.

Reichard said the issue has never come up in past inspections, and he believes few of the leading restaurants in the area were aware of the regulation. Many customers initially didn't believe it was a rule, and were disappointed when his restaurant began turning dogs away.

"People have strong views both ways about the dogs," he said. "It's a very polarizing matter. We have people basically saying, 'You don't like dogs, so I'm never coming to your restaurant.'"

He and his wife also operate Stump Pass Marina and set up a dog-friendly area there, telling customers they could order food to go at the restaurant and eat in that area with their dogs. They typically see at least five dogs a day in that area.

Sarasota County's Doggie Dining Ordinance requires restaurants requesting a permit to have a designated outdoor area for patrons with dogs and outlines other specific rules, such as requiring employees to wash their hands after touching a dog, prohibiting dogs from coming into contact with serving dishes, requiring specific signage and other health-related regulations. The city of Punta Gorda has a similar ordinance.

"We just want that same set up," Hill said. "We just think it makes sense."

Commissioner Bill Truex brought the issue up to the County Commission after hearing from Hill. The commission agreed to have legal staff begin looking at what neighboring jurisdictions have done and draft a similar ordinance.

If approved, it would be up to individual restaurants to decide whether or not to apply for the permit and designate the pet-friendly area. Reichard said if the ordinance is approved, he would be likely to apply for a permit and would be happy to designate a specific area to please everyone, "so if people don't want to sit near the dogs, they wouldn't have to."

The company is listed on the Toronto Stock Exchange and with over 70 locations in multiple U.S. states — including two dozen in Florida. Advanced Imaging is the first clinic Akumin is managing in the Southwest Florida region.

As one of the largest companies of its kind operating in the U.S., Akumin provides outpatient imaging with about 120 board-certified radiologists, according to Akumin Chief Operating Officer Rohit Navani.

Akumin since April 5 has had "boots on the ground" at Advanced Imaging, according to Navani.

The company and its staff of radiologists — including some who are working remotely — have been "fixing a lot of issues,"

he added.

Calls to Advanced Imaging last week were referred by its administrator — Kimberly Ridley, KMH Companies' vice president of operations — to Navani.

"Some patients will already see an impact," Navani said Friday.

For example, there had been a backlog of about 3,500 radiology readings when Akumin took management reigns of the clinic. By Friday, that had been cut by about 1,000, Navani said.

He noted two teams are handling the work — including one team analyzing older scans and another is reviewing new ones.

Though speed is increasing, Navani said management of the clinic is committed to quality.

Once the backlog is alleviated at the clinic — which could come as soon as the end of this week

— Navani said future reads will likely be turned faster than industry standards.

Navani said he was limited in his ability to respond to some questions from the Sun related to the management agreement due to confidentiality issues.

But he noted radiology companies lacking the scale that Akumin holds with its multitude of locations, have struggled recently with decreasing reimbursements from insurance companies.

A study last year in the journal Health Affairs stated that after nearly a decade of rapid growth, the use of imaging has declined along with federal Medicare reimbursement amounts.

"Patients should feel confident in continuing to use Advanced Imaging knowing their scans will be turned around very timely and with quality reads by sub-specialty radiologists," Navani said.

vehicle too closely while traveling eastbound on I-80.

The Probable Cause Affidavit issued by the Lancaster County Sheriff's Office — and provided by the Journal Star — stated Schutz was driving and D'angeleo was in the passenger seat of the SUV.

Sheriff Terry Wagner said at a press briefing attended

by the Journal Star that he had a "reasonable, articulable suspicion that criminal activity was afoot." Despite the fact Schutz denied both consent to search the vehicle and the use of a K-9, a K-9 handler was contacted, the PCA stated. During an "exterior sniff," the K-9 alerted to the scent of narcotics inside.

When the dog alerted deputies it smelled drugs, officers allegedly found 103 pounds of marijuana in large hockey bags in the cargo

area of the SUV and a 12-ounce ginger beer soda that contained THC. The PCA also stated a THC vape pen was found in D'angeleo's purse, along with other marijuana products in a plastic bag in the middle seat of the vehicle.

The drugs are estimated to be worth \$600,000.

Both women waived their Miranda rights, according to the PCA, and Schutz said the marijuana was being taken back to Florida so she could sell it. The PCA further stated

that D'angeleo said she saw the bags of marijuana being loaded into the SUV and was helping drive the vehicle back to Florida.

Both women were taken to jail on suspicion of possession of marijuana with intent to deliver.

Carusone said while she does not have all the information, due to Nebraska's strict public records laws, she did know her daughter was a passenger in the vehicle.

"She was on a spa trip

as a birthday celebration," Carusone said in an email Friday. "Since there seems to be a lack of due process and public record laws in Nebraska, I have very little information. While I do not support violating the laws, I truly believe it is time that all states catch up with societies acceptance of marijuana and begin changing statutes to reflect such."

D'angeleo was scheduled to be arraigned Friday afternoon, according to the PCA.

Craig Faulkner said. "We want to win every time we play, but they got us before. With two good pitchers that can happen."

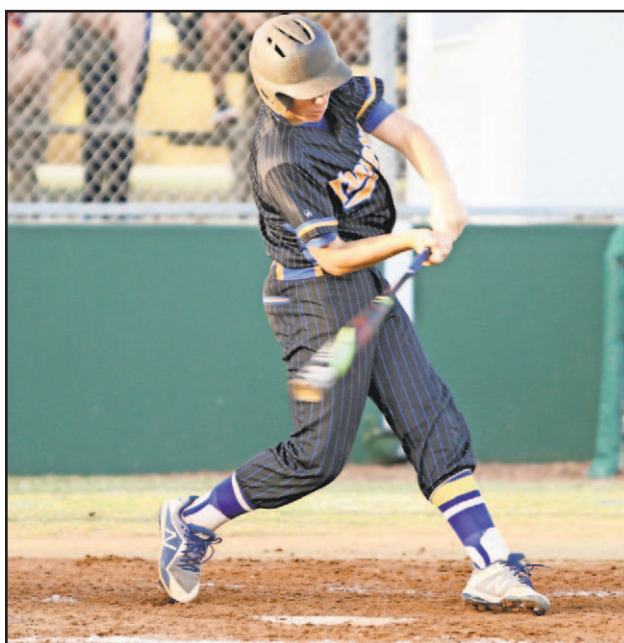

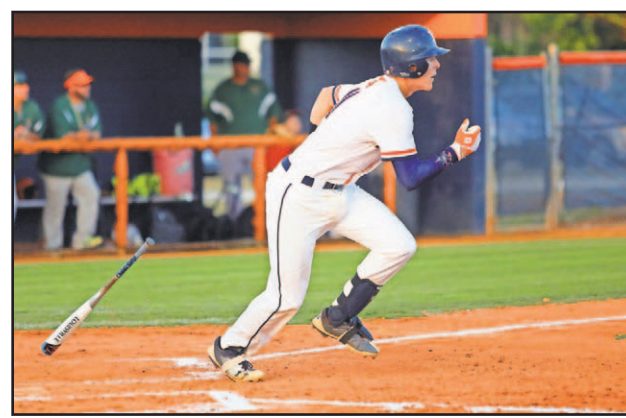
LePage to complete the scoring.

Food trucks' long and winding road

Matt Ashley made a little mistake when launching his dream business two years ago.

He figured he could park his **Triple B BBQ** smoker-truck on a vacant Charlotte Harbor lot to sell his wares. County code enforcers quickly set him straight, however, and he started parking his truck elsewhere.

Ashley lives in North Port, but no food trucks were permitted in his hometown except for special events. Sometimes "elsewhere" was as far as Osprey.

So, when North Port's City Commission met last week for a workshop supportive of food trucks, it was big news for food on wheels — especially for Ashley.

After years of misunderstandings and slowdowns, a last local roadblock to the colorful road-café will likely crumble this summer.

Roach coaches no more

Once seen queued up mostly at university quadrangles, food trucks — whose startup costs are one-fourth those of brick-and-mortar — are everywhere.

According to The Economist, the U.S. mobile food industry has grown 7.9 percent over the last five years. Florida's grew 25 percent over the last two.

The Florida Department of Business and Professional Regulation reported 3,584 mobile food-dispensing vehicles statewide in 2017 — nearly double 2009's tally and up 25 percent in just two years.

A look in the rear-view reveals how far we've come in catching up with a nationwide craze that got rolling in the early 2000s and has made the National Restaurant Association's annual "What's Hot" list since 2010.

Lee Caglioti of **The Ravenous Rhino** remembers, "When we launched the Rhino in 2013, we were a novelty. At first, when people stopped to try our food, they'd say, 'We didn't know if you were a roach coach.' Now I can't

remember the last time I heard that phrase."

Change comes to Punta Gorda

American municipalities haven't always welcomed food trucks. Widely varying town ordinances arose nationwide to protect brick-and-mortars and public health.

The first skirmish in the local food truck revolution was two years ago in Punta Gorda, where two unwitting champions emerged: **Kevin and Max Doyle** of **The Celtic Ray Public House**.

While the Doyles rebuilt their kitchen, they set up their own city-approved truck to continue serving fish and chips.

Then they got another idea: Invite guest trucks to park next to theirs. It would be a win-win, business helping business.

Two months in, the city put the brakes on. The trucks and the Ray itself started getting cease-and-desist letters.

Although the vendors were there with permission, each had failed to follow the letter of Punta Gorda code, which required a daunting, nonrefundable \$750 application fee at each location.

The same rule had restricted many trucks to special events and to spots in Charlotte County with friendlier code. For years, trucks had avoided downtown Punta Gorda altogether.

To politely ask if it weren't time for change, the Doyles and truck owners sat down with City Manager **Howard Kunik** and zoning officials.

Punta Gorda's City Council later heard the truck owners' case,

reviewed the ordinance and, thanks to a grassroots truck coalition, change happened. Today, trucks may park on any developed Punta Gorda property with the owner's permission. It was, said Kunik, "a 180-degree turn."

The rest of Charlotte County

The basic rules for Charlotte food truck operation are: state license and insurance, health inspection, business tax receipt and property owner's permission.

But the county last rewrote its ordinance 32 years ago.

Back then, Article IX, Roadside Peddling, governed, basically, ice cream trucks, horse-drawn conveyances and construction-site roach coaches.

When Punta Gorda loosened its mobile-vending ordinance, there were three food trucks cruising county streets. Although their numbers still fall far short of the hundreds in Orlando, Tampa and Miami, the army of local trucks has now grown to at least a dozen.

Realizing that their rules haven't kept up with all those rolling kitchens, Charlotte County officials have embraced trucks, held an ongoing series of roundtables, promise a brochure to help shortcut revising the ordinance, and host Food Truck Fridays at the Charlotte County Administration Center.

Planning and Zoning official **Shaun Cullinan** admitted, "Our codes are old. Things get Band-Aided over time, then start falling off, so

we need to get with the times."

North Port, too, gets with the times

North Port's regulations were always simple. No food trucks allowed — except in special circumstances.

North Port residents, including **Matt Ashley**, disagreed, but understood that change

would take time.

That time has come. North Port's commissioners, who favor food trucks, are now working toward a new ordinance based on Sarasota County's revised rules.

We might even see a food truck park established on city-owned land, like that planned for East Naples.

Said Caglioti, "Look at what Collier County is doing. Building a food truck park is evidence that people want a place to be able to track them down. I'd love to see something like that happen here."

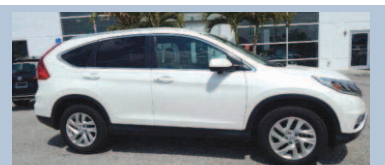

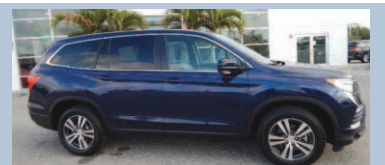

More active season ahead for hurricanes?

Hurricane Prediction Season is upon us again, and the latest research from national prognosticators warns of another active year, with the likelihood of more named storms than usual.

Take it for what it is: Longish-term weather prediction. A little hit and miss. But, also, an early reminder about the need for preparation.

The first in a series of annual assessments was made recently by the Colorado State Tropical Meteorology Project, a well-respected research center. Colorado State forecast 14 "named" storms this hurricane season — which officially runs from June 1 to Nov. 30. Those are storms with enough size and wind speed to win a nickname. (The first five this year, following the alphabet, are Alberto, Beryl, Chris, Debby and Ernesto.)

Of those, seven are expected to become hurricanes and three categorized as "major," which means they have regular wind speeds above 111 mph.

That is slightly above the 30-year average: 12 named storms, six hurricanes and two major hurricanes.

Unfortunately, they do not predict where the storms will hit. Of course, they can't. They can't even say whether they will strike the United States. As the Weather Channel points out, "There is no strong correlation between the number of named storms or hurricanes and U.S. landfalls in any given season."

The research is based on a number of technical factors over 60 years: Among them, surface temperatures in the Atlantic Ocean (near normal now, but a little cooler in the eastern tropics), sea level pressures (the air pressure at any given spot, usually 14.7 pounds per square inch), the level of vertical wind shear (variation in wind speed by height and horizontal distance) and the El Niño in the Pacific.

Non-scientists typically seize on El Niño, because it's catchy and seems exotic (more than "wind shear"). El Niño conditions exist when warmer tropical Pacific waters are present, increasing the possibility of stronger upper-level winds being sent into the Caribbean and Atlantic. This year, the researchers said, El Niño should not be a "significant factor." Bueno.

You never know, though. Which is the norm. As the Weather Channel notes, 2010 was an active year, with 19 named storms and 12 hurricanes in the Atlantic. Not one hit the United States.

Nevertheless, to repeat, you never know, which is why we have to prepare for the worst. Last year saw three Category Four storms hit the U.S.: Harvey, which flooded Houston; Maria, which devastated the island of Puerto Rico; and Irma, which withered as it approached us here in Southwest Florida, but still caused substantial damage and hardship.

No matter what, we do not want to be caught by surprise when the predictions come true and the storms, perhaps, head for our shoreline. In this case, ignorance really isn't bliss.

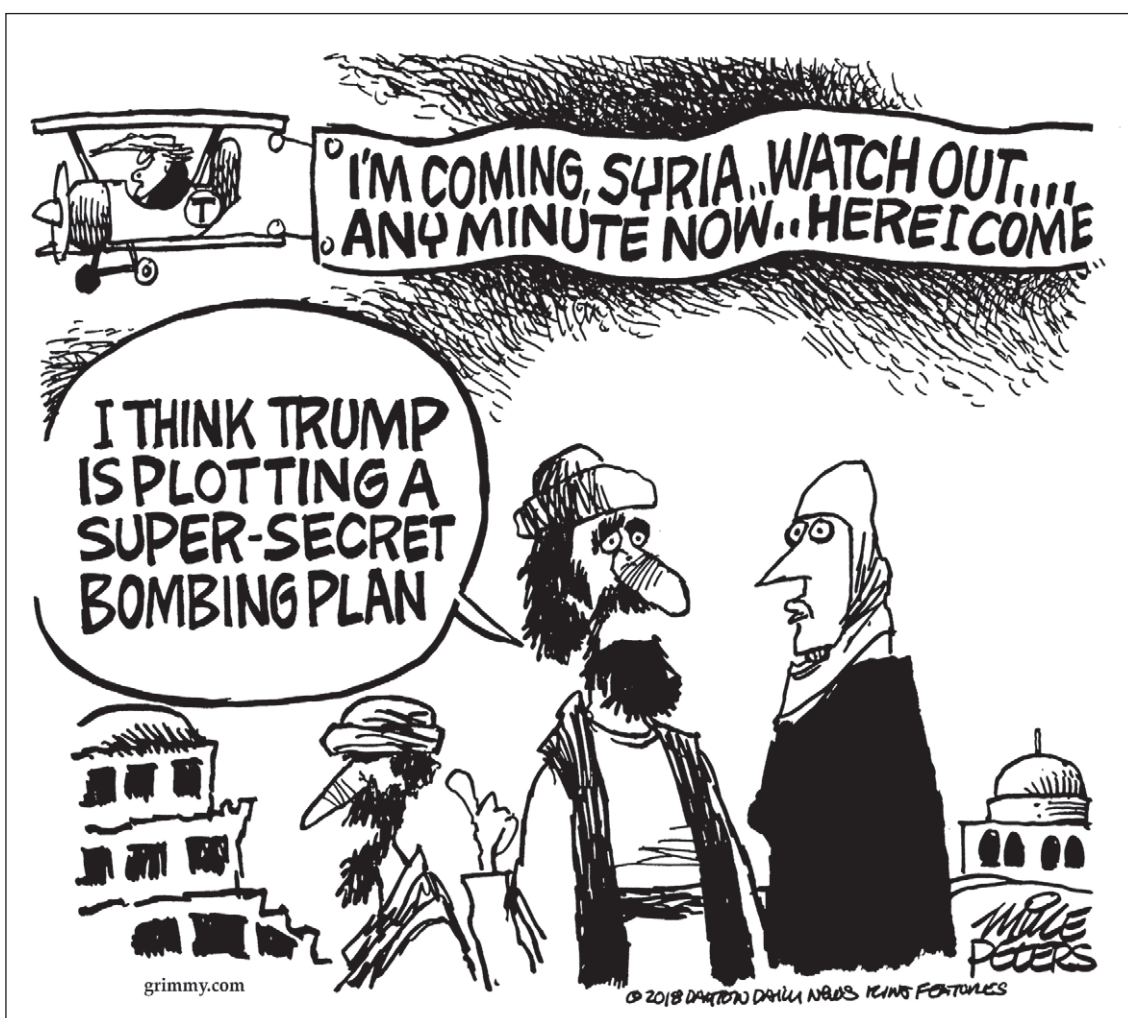

Term limitations needed for all elected officials

In 1992 the people of the state of Florida approved an amendment to the state Constitution proposed by the Constitution Revision Commission, which read:

“Limits terms by prohibiting incumbents who have held the same elective office for the preceding eight years from appearing on the ballot for re-election to that office. Offices covered are: Florida Representative and Senator, Lieutenant Governor, Florida Cabinet, and U.S. Senator and Representative. Terms of office beginning before amendment approval are not counted.”

In 1995, the U.S. Supreme Court ruled that limiting the terms of U.S. senators and representatives was unconstitutional. The term limits for the state legislature and executives were allowed to stand. Florida legislative and executive terms of office are four years; therefore, they are limited to two terms. The initiative was approved

by 77 percent, indicating the electorate favors term limits.

The following appeared in the April 2, 2018, issue of the Tampa Bay Times: “Term limits for school board members — one of the most popular proposals before the Florida Constitution Revision Commission — took a step closer to the November ballot on Wednesday. The measure, which would hold board members to two consecutive terms if approved, won strong support from the commission. It voted 27-6 to advance the idea to its Style and Drafting Committee to properly word the ballot question that voters would consider in November.

“I firmly believe the public is right in demanding term limits,” said Rep. Jeanette Nunez, a commission member who is term-limited herself from seeking another term in the Florida House.”

The Charlotte County Commission term of office is four years. One member is serving a first term, two members are serving a second term and two members are completing their second term. The city of Punta Gorda term of office is two years. Two council members are completing a first term, one council member is serving a second term, one council member serving a third term and one council member is completing a fourth term.

The Charlotte County Airport Authority term of office is four years. One commissioner completing a first term, one commissioner serving a second term, one commissioner serving a third term, one commissioner serving a sixth term and one commissioner completing

a seventh term.

The Charlotte County School Board term of office is four years. Two board members are serving a first term, one board member serving a second term, one board member completing a second term and one board member is completing a sixth term.

Governors of 36 states and four territories are subject to term limits. Fifteen state legislatures have term limits. The 22nd Amendment, which limits the president of the United States to two terms of office, passed after Franklin D. Roosevelt was re-elected to an unprecedented fourth term.

Thomas Jefferson earlier noted, “There will always be an excuse for the president seeking more than two terms.” He also noted in a letter to Sam Adams in 1800: “A government by representatives elected by the people at short periods was our object, and our maxim ... was, ‘where annual election ends, tyranny begins;’ nor have our departures from it

been sanctioned by the happiness of their effects.”

Examples of elected officials who have occupied office for an excessive number of terms are: Charlotte County Airport Authority commissioner Pam Seay, five-plus terms (22 years), and Kathleen Coppola, seven terms (28 years); Charlotte County School Board member Lee Swift, six terms (24 years); and Punta Gorda City Council Mayor Rachel Keesling, four terms (eight years).

These extensive years in office are reprehensible and an affront to our democratic form of government, certainly not what the framers of the Constitution intended. A good reason for term limits on elected offices.

What are the problems with representatives staying in office for long periods?

It breeds “familiarity” with lobbyists, with the possibility of an increase in corporate influence. Power becomes centralized

in a few individuals. Ideas become stale and the pool of individuals represented becomes limited. Representatives become comfortable and complacent. One political party can easily maintain dominance. The chance of corruption increases. Insider information could be used for personal gain. It becomes difficult for new individuals to attain office as they are challenging an incumbent who has support and funding in place.

Request the Constitution Revision Commission chairman, Carlos Beruff, 850-717-9550, (Carlos.Beruff@flcr.gov), and the other CRC commissioners (flcr.gov) to place a constitutional amendment on the ballot that will restrict all elected offices to two terms.

Rep. Ross never wanted to be congressman for life

A few years ago, U.S. Rep. Dennis Ross dropped by the editorial board of the Tampa Tribune for a chat. As metro columnist, I was invited to attend.

I don’t recall specifics about the meeting, but I do remember Ross saying emphatically that he didn’t want to be a career politician. He said it with such conviction that I actually believed him. He has repeated that position many other times, in many other places.

On Wednesday, he backed that up with the announcement he will not run for a fifth term to represent CD 15 in Washington.

“After thoughtful prayer and consideration, my wife

Cindy and I decided that I will not seek re-election for a fifth-term in office. I am grateful for this incredible opportunity to serve and I look forward to the next chapter of my life which will include, in some way, continued public service,” he said in a statement on Twitter and his Facebook page.

“I never viewed this amazing opportunity as a job or a career. My home

has been and will continue to be in Lakeland, Florida.”

This announcement was overshadowed by House Speaker Paul Ryan’s news that he, too, is stepping away. That brings the total of Republican members of Congress who won’t run for re-election this fall to 25.

Some of them were no doubt concerned about being swept away if the anticipated Democratic blue wave this November materializes. Ross, though, had no such worries.

His district, which is about 40 percent in Polk County as well as rural parts of eastern Hillsborough, is reliably ultra-conservative. Ross likely could have kept going back to Washington

for as long as he wished.

He has an A-rating from the National Rifle Association. He is pro-life, supported President Trump’s tax cut plan and immigration proposals, and was working his way up the House leadership ranks as senior deputy majority whip.

But he also is 58 years old and commuting between Lakeland and Washington is a hassle. He says he will return to practicing law and civic pursuits, like he always said he planned to do.

Who takes his place?

Well, it probably will not be a Democrat. The “blue wave” would have to turn into a flood of biblical proportions for this seat to fall from Republican

hands.

Among Republicans, Polk County Sheriff Grady Judd will draw some attention as a potential candidate. State Sen. Kelli Stargel could be formidable.

One name I heard tossed as a “what-about-this-guy” possibility is state Sen. Tom Lee, but who knows about that? He has basically gone dark in the last few weeks while speculation increases that he won’t make a planned run for Florida’s Chief Financial Officer position, after saying for months it was his intention to run.

Lee had said he would announce his plans shortly after Easter and, well, Easter in the rear-view mirror and we haven’t

heard anything.

But this day is about Dennis Ross, and this one time we can actually believe it when he says he has had enough.

When the job becomes more about raising money and wondering what will come out next from the president’s Twitter account, heading home to Lakeland for family, friends and weekend hunting trips can sound pretty nice.

As enticing as that sounds to Ross today, it will sound even better in January.

Speaker Ryan follows the lead of Speaker Reed

One hundred nineteen years ago, Speaker of the House Thomas B. Reed announced that he was, after 22 years of service, resigning from Congress. Reed had been one of the most effective speakers ever. Barbara Tuchman’s account, in “The Proud Tower,” of how he neutered the minority party has entranced readers for decades now. When Democrats tried to prevent the presence of a quorum by refusing to answer roll calls, he defeated their efforts by simply noting their presence from the chair.

In the process, Reed made policy, passing the first billion-dollar budget — which included generous Civil War pensions — the Sherman Antitrust Act and a big budget boost for the Navy. The civil rights bill he got the House to pass — the last such measure for 67 years — was blocked in the Senate.

Why did Reed leave Congress? He disagreed with his party’s president. William McKinley had reluctantly gone to war with Spain and acquired the Philippines. Reed thought that was

wrong policy. He left Washington and his native Maine and moved to New York to practice law.

The parallels aren’t quite exact between the resignation in 1899 of the 32nd speaker and the announcement by the 54th speaker, Paul Ryan, Wednesday that he won’t seek re-election, but they’re close enough for government work. Both cared a lot about policy and were partially successful at setting it. Each had the trust of a potentially fractious caucus. Both decided to leave because they were at odds with their party’s president.

And yes, there is more to Ryan’s claim that he wants to spend more time with his family than is usually the case. The Wisconsin Republican took the speakership only on condition that

he would stay home on weekends rather than, like his predecessors, fly around the country fundraising.

Like Reed with McKinley, Ryan is not at odds with Donald Trump on everything; for example, they were in sync with the tax bill that Ryan pushed through in December. But they didn’t agree on much else.

Ryan was first elected to the House in 1998, at age 28, after working as a staffer for Jack Kemp. As ranking member and chairman of the House Budget Committee, he sought Medicare

entitlement reform and got just about every House Republican to sign on. He backed changes in Medicaid and food stamps, as well, and supported free trade agreements. He fashioned programs to help people out of poverty. On almost all such issues, Trump has other views — or none at all. He has made clear that he opposes any entitlement reform, which leaves it with zero support from both Republicans and Democrats.

In temperament, Ryan and Trump are something like polar opposites. During

the 2016 presidential campaign, Ryan, the 2012 Republican vice presidential nominee, made clear his distaste for Trump’s tirades.

It’s possible that the realistic prospect of Democrats winning a House majority in November is one reason for Ryan’s retirement. Being minority leader is no fun. “The best system,” Thomas Reed said, “is to have one party govern and the other party watch.”

Speaker Reed left the House before he turned 60; Speaker Ryan will leave before turning 50. When he does, someone might well say of him these words Mark Twain said about Reed: “He was transparently honest and honorable, there was no furtiveness about him, and whoever came to know him trusted him and was not disappointed.”

Friends separated by the Holocaust reunite in California

LOS ANGELES — When Alice Gerstel bid an emotional farewell to her family's closest friends in October 1941, she was hopeful she'd see "Little Simon" Gronowski again. And she did — 76 years later and half a world away from where they were separated in Brussels.

Gerstel and her Jewish family had hidden in the Gronowskis' home for nearly two weeks before her father sent word from France that he had reached a deal with a smuggler who would get her, her siblings and their mother safely out of Nazi-occupied Belgium.

The Gronowskis, also Jewish, decided to stay. They hid for 18 months until the

Nazis came knocking at the family's door and put Simon, his sister and mother on a death train to Auschwitz.

"I thought the entire family was murdered. I had no idea," Gerstel (now Gerstel Weit) said Wednesday, the day after their tearful reunion. She and her friend clutched hands at the Los Angeles Museum of the Holocaust as they recounted their story.

"You didn't know that I jumped off the train?" asked Gronowski, now 86.

"No, no. I didn't know anything," his 89-year-old friend replied.

The two will return to the museum Sunday to recount to visitors how the Holocaust ripped apart a pair of families that had become fast friends after a chance meeting at a Belgian beach resort in 1939.

After the Nazis invaded Belgium, they hid together in the Gronowski family's home before the Gerstel family fled on a perilous journey that eventually led them to the United States.

How it led an 11-year-old boy to make one of the most daring escapes of the war. How it put the other family on a perilous journey through occupied France that reads like a scene from the film "Casablanca."

And, finally, how those separate journeys culminated three-quarters of a century later in a joyful, tear-streaked reunion in Los Angeles just before Yom HaShoah or Holocaust Commemoration Day.

"I didn't recognize him at all. I don't see Little Simon," Gerstel Weit said Wednesday of her previous day's reunion with the now-bald, white-bearded man who sat next to her chuckling.

"But he's here. Little Simon is here," she added, her voice breaking as she put her hand

over Gronowski's heart.

There was much hugging, kissing, and crying Wednesday as the two old friends held hands tightly while sitting outside on a museum patio to share memories from a long-ago past.

It was a past that began idyllically before turning nightmarish after the Nazis invaded Belgium in 1940 and began rounding up Jews.

Gerstel Weit's father, a diamond dealer with a wife and four children, decided to flee in 1941. He turned his diamonds into cash, bought nine visas that got his family and brother's family through Nazi-occupied France and to the French-controlled Moroccan city of Casablanca. There they boarded a ship

Trump: US, allies attacking Syria to stop chemical weapons

WASHINGTON — The United States, France and Britain together launched military strikes in Syria to punish President Bashar Assad for a suspected chemical attack against civilians and to deter him from doing it again, President Donald Trump announced Friday. Explosions lit up the skies over Damascus, the Syrian capital, as Trump announced the airstrikes from the White House.

Syrian television reported that Syrian air defenses have responded to the attack.

Trump said the U.S. is prepared to "sustain" pressure on Assad until he ends what the president called a criminal pattern of killing his own people with internationally banned chemical weapons. It was not immediately clear whether Trump meant the allied military operation would extend beyond an initial nighttime round of missile strikes.

Trump did not provide details on the joint U.S.-British-French attack, but it was expected to include barrages of cruise missiles launched from outside Syrian airspace. He described the main aim as establishing "a strong deterrent" against chemical weapons use. The Syrian government has repeatedly denied any use of banned weapons.

The decision to strike, after days of deliberations, marked Trump's second order to attack Syria; he authorized a

FBI probing Michael Cohen's 'personal business dealings'

NEW YORK — Federal prosecutors revealed Friday that their probe of President Donald Trump's personal lawyer, Michael Cohen, involved suspected fraud and the attorney's personal business dealings, and was going on long enough that investigators had already covertly obtained his emails.

The details in court papers came as lawyers for Cohen and Trump sought to block the Justice Department from examining records and electronic devices, including two cell

phones, seized by the FBI on Monday from Cohen's residences, office and safety deposit box.

The raids enraged Trump, who called them an "attack on the country." He sent his own lawyer to a hastily arranged hearing before a federal judge in Manhattan to argue that some of the records and communications seized were confidential attorney-client communications and off-limits to investigators.

Prosecutors blacked out sections of their legal memo in which they described what laws they believe Cohen has broken, but the document provided new clues about an investigation that the U.S. Attorney's office

in Manhattan had previously declined to confirm existed.

"Although Cohen is an attorney, he also has several other business interests and sources of income. The searches are the result of a months-long investigation into Cohen, and seek evidence of crimes, many of which have nothing to do with his work as an attorney, but rather relate to Cohen's own business dealings," said the filing, signed by Assistant U.S. Attorney Thomas McKay.

Prosecutors said they took the unusual step of raiding Cohen's residence and home, rather than requesting records by subpoena, because what they had learned

so far led them to distrust he'd turn over what they had asked for.

"Absent a search warrant, these records could have been deleted without record, and without recourse," prosecutors wrote.

The document was filed publicly after lawyers for Cohen appeared before U.S. District Judge Kimba M. Wood to ask that they — not Justice Department lawyers — be given the first crack at reviewing the seized evidence to see whether it was relevant to the investigation or could be forwarded to criminal investigators without jeopardizing attorney-client privilege.

Trump attorney Joanna Hendon told the judge that the president has "an acute interest in these proceedings and the manner in which these materials are reviewed."

"He is the president of the United States," she said. "This is of most concern to him. I think the public is a close second. And anyone who has ever hired a lawyer a close third."

McKay told the judge that he believed the proceedings were an attempt to delay the processing of seized material.

"His attorney-client privilege is no greater than any other person

Bovines online: Farmers are using AI to help monitor cows

SAN FRANCISCO — Is the world ready for cows armed with artificial intelligence?

No time to ruminate on that because the moment has arrived, thanks to a Dutch company that has married two technologies — motion sensors and AI — with the aim of bringing the barnyard into the 21st century.

The company, Connecterra, has brought its IDA system, or "The Intelligent Dairy Farmer's Assistant," to the United States after having piloted it in

Europe for several years.

IDA uses a motion-sensing device attached to a cow's neck to transmit its movements to a program driven by AI. The sensor data, when aligned repeatedly with real-world behavior, eventually allows IDA to tell from data alone when a cow is chewing cud, lying down, walking, drinking or eating.

Those indicators can predict whether a particular cow is ill, has become less productive, or is ready to breed — alerting the farmer to changes in behavior that might otherwise be easily missed.

"It would just be impossible for us to keep up with every animal on an individual basis," says Richard Watson, one of the first four U.S. farmers to use IDA since it launched commercially in December.

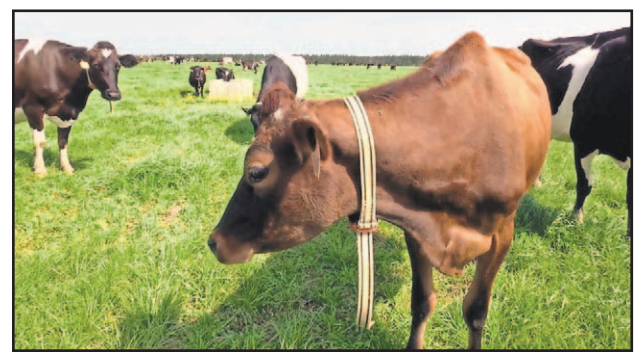
Watson, who owns the Seven Oaks Dairy in Waynesboro, Georgia, says having a computer identify which cows in his 2,000-head herd need attention could help improve farm productivity as much as 10 percent, which would mean hundreds of thousands of dollars to his family.

"If we can prove out that these advantages

exist from using this technology ... I think adoption of IDA across a broad range of farming systems, particularly large farming systems, would be a no-brainer," Watson says.

Dairy farming is just one industry benefiting from AI, which is being applied in fields as diverse as journalism, manufacturing and self-driving cars. In agriculture, AI is being developed to estimate crop health using drone footage and parse out weed killer between rows of cotton.

Yasir Khokhar, the former Microsoft employee who is the founder and

CEO of Connecterra, said the inspiration for the idea came after living on a dairy farm south of Amsterdam.

"It turns out the

technology farmers use is really outdated in many respects," he says. "What does exist is very

Heat's Ellington will play big role in playoffs

MIAMI — The last time Wayne Ellington played any meaningful minutes in a postseason game was nine years ago.

At the Final Four. Ellington was the Most Outstanding Player of the 2009 NCAA Tournament after leading North Carolina to the national title. But since turning pro, postseasons have marked the start of vacations for Ellington, who has been in only two NBA playoff games, logging 13 1/2 minutes — all in the fourth quarters of blowouts.

DeChambeau, 24, jump started his round with an eagle on the par-5 and took over the lead with birdies on the 13th, 15th, 16th and 17th holes. He made a knee-knocking, 12-footer for par on the 18th hole after his approach landed in a front-side bunker. DeChambeau pumped his fist when the ball curled in, as pleased with his improved putting with his composure at rallying late to the lead.

Punishment for hits to head prevalent early in NHL playoffs

George Parros is a busy man early in the Stanley Cup playoffs thanks to a rash of questionable hits around the NHL.

The vice president of player safety's department suspended Toronto Maple Leafs center Nazem Kadri three games for boarding Boston forward Tommy Wingels in what the league called a hit made in the name of retribution and Los Angeles Kings defenseman Drew Doughty one game for an illegal check to the head on Vegas forward William Carrier.

With two suspensions, two misconduct ejections for boarding that resulted in injuries, plus Capitals winger Tom Wilson's hit to the head that knocked Columbus center Alexander Wennberg out of the game, it has been a rough start to the playoffs — and there have only been eight games played. In 1,271 regular-season games, there were a total of 37 game misconducts and 22 suspensions.

The NHL has made a concerted effort to rid its game of fighting and questionable hits, wanting to keep skilled players on the ice and boost scoring. In the postseason, goals are usually harder to come by and the adrenaline of the moment brings hard hits that cross the line; a year ago, Penguins star Sidney Crosby missed a game with a concussion after a cross-check to the head from the Capitals' Matt Niskanen.

Through the first two days of the Stanley Cup playoffs, there have already been a handful of hits to the head, two ejections, one suspension and the possibility of more to come.

Kadri was tossed from Toronto's Game 1 loss at Boston for boarding Wingels, and Blue Jackets winger Josh Anderson was thrown out of their overtime victory at Washington for a hit from behind that injured Capitals defenseman Michal Kempny.

A game misconduct will likely suffice for Anderson, but Kadri wasn't as fortunate and will miss Games 2, 3 and 4.

"I certainly wasn't trying to hit him when he was down like that," Kadri said after Thursday night's game. "Obviously, if he's still standing up, I think

there's nothing wrong with that, but he ended up falling and reaching for the puck, and I'm not sure what happened after that."

What happened was another Bruins goal on the ensuing power play that made it 5-1 in the first game between the bitter rivals. Down the East Coast, Wilson's hit on Wennberg allowed the Blue Jackets to tie the score in a game they won in overtime. Wilson blamed himself for costing Washington Game 1 by taking a bad penalty at a critical moment.

"I've got to be better and maybe pass up on that hit," Wilson said.

"We've got the lead there so maybe a big hit's not needed. It's the playoffs. Trying to finish your checks, and unfortunately I took a penalty."

Wilson was suspended two preseason games for interference and then for the first four regular-season games for boarding but had cleaned up his game since. Part of that stemmed from meeting with Parros in Calgary in the fall and educating himself on what's acceptable and what the NHL looks for.

"We had a meeting, me, him and Parros, and went over videos and just what they were looking at when he was being

considered for suspensions and fines and other examples throughout the league," Capitals general manager Brian MacLellan said.

Parros spent almost a decade as an NHL enforcer and finished his career with 159 fights and 1,127 penalty minutes. When he took over the league's player safety department last September, he said he intended to crack down on "non-hockey plays" that have nothing to do with affecting the course of the game.

Some of the hits may alter series because of the resulting injuries.

Carrier, Kempny,

Wennberg and Wingels are all day-to-day with "upper-body" injuries — the customarily vague description in the NHL — with their statuses legitimately uncertain moving forward. Columbus general manager Jarmo Kekalainen called Wennberg "doubtful" for Game 2 Sunday at Washington and considered it a "dangerous hit" by Wilson that the league deemed wasn't worthy of further punishment.

Doughty, a Norris Trophy contender and Los Angeles' top defender, was suspended for Friday night's Game 2 against Vegas for what the league called an avoidable hit to Carrier's head. Kadri's hit came after Wingels crushed Toronto forward Mitch Marner, but the timing and force of the hit made it worse.

"The bottom line is, you always have to be disciplined at all times and emotions are a part of the game, but it's got to be controlled," Maple Leafs coach Mike Babcock said.

Kekalainen disagreed with officials giving Anderson a five-minute major and a game misconduct for his hit on Kempny, which was definitely a minor penalty but seemed less egregious than Wilson's later. That didn't stop Capitals coach Barry Trotz from voicing his displeasure with Anderson's play.

"I thought there's clearly numbers there," Trotz said. "Trying to get that out of the game."

The Penguins began pressing but Elliott responded. Crosby broke in alone just past the game's midway point but Elliott's glove swallowed up

the Pittsburgh captain's backhand attempt. Crosby had another chance in the final moments of the second period but when he couldn't convert from the right post, he smashed his stick over the crossbar in frustration.

When Konecny held off Chad Ruhwedel and chipped the puck over Murray's glove 1:21 into the third the Flyers had control of the game. Just over 18 minutes later they had their first victory Pittsburgh in 383 days to go home with the series even.

WINNIPEG, Manitoba — Paul Stastny, Andrew Copp and Patrik Laine scored in the third period and the Winnipeg Jets beat the Minnesota Wild 4-1 on Friday night to take a 2-0 lead in the Western Conference first-round series.

Defenseman Tyler Myers had a goal in the second period and also had an assist. Rookie Jack Roslovic, replacing injured veteran Mathieu Perreault, had two assists in the game that ended with a series of fights.

Zach Parise had his second goal of the series when he deflected Mikko Koivu's shot past Connor Hellebuyck to end the goalie's shutout bid with 45 seconds left. The goal came on the power play

after Jets forward Brandon Tanev was called for hooking with 59 seconds left.

Hellebuyck made 16 saves. Devan Dubnyk stopped 39 shots for Minnesota.

Winnipeg won 3-2 on Wednesday night. Game 3 is Sunday at Minnesota.

The Wild had more jump early in the scoreless first period, surpassing the four-shot total they had Wednesday in the opening frame by going 5-0 by the five-minute mark. That included three shots at Hellebuyck during a power play with Myers in the box for tripping.

Dubnyk didn't have to stop a Winnipeg shot until seven minutes had passed. The Jets then turned on a switch and had outshot the visitors 13-9 when the period

(Un)blinding Them with Science

Once the host of the popular children's show "Bill Nye: The Science Guy," the popular TV personality is on a mission to stop the spread of anti-scientific thought and action, taking on those who deny the importance of science. Debuting Wednesday at 10 p.m. on PBS' "POV," "Bill Nye: Science Guy" provides an intimate portrait of this inspirational advocate of STEM (science, technology, engineering and mathematics). Now the CEO of the Planetary Society, he's also leading efforts to launch LightSail, a satellite propelled by sunlight, all while fulfilling the legacy of his late professor and PS cofounder, Carl Sagan.

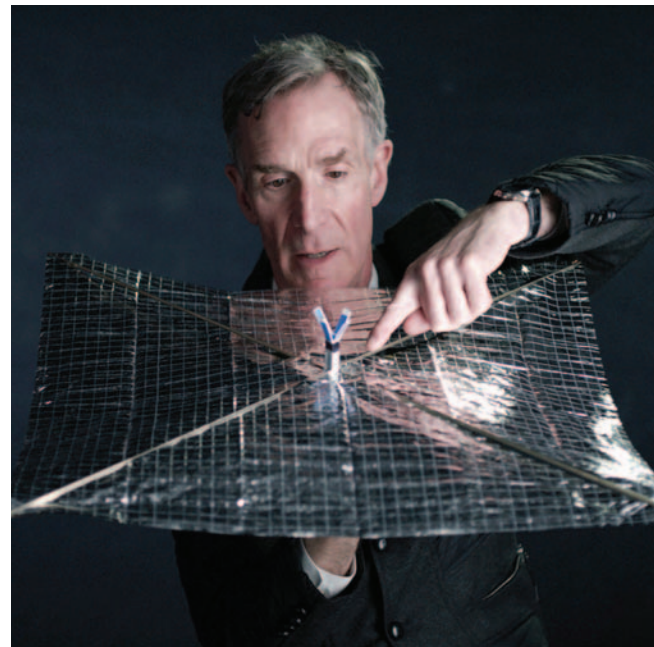
"Oh, the guy utterly changed my life," Nye says of the late "Cosmos" and "NOVA" star. "You know, I'm a mechanical engineer. I had finished all my engineering requirements, so I thought, 'Oh, I'll take astronomy as an elective.' And it was cool. When I was in class 40 years ago, Carl Sagan talked about a solar sail mission, but it never happened. So, this is realizing a 40-year-old dream of building a spacecraft that could fly in space propelled just by light. So, Professor Sagan, this one's for you."

"For a generation of millennials, [Nye's] show made science everyone's favorite subject," extols series executive producer Justine Nagan. "His blue lab coat and bow tie became iconic, his show's opening theme song a pump-up chant. For him, few aspects of natural science, from biodiversity to light optics, were out of children's reach. As the 'Science Guy,' Bill Nye gave young students the ability to grasp the wonders of space and the workings of our planet. Today this childhood hero is back, educating the public with a message that has a new sense of urgency, to stop the spread of antiscientific thinking across the globe. Now a New York Times best-selling author and host of the Emmy-nominated 'Bill Nye Saves the World' on Netflix, Bill is making science literacy a goal for everyone, from children to adults. It's a noble aim, considering today's climate of disagreement over evidence, theories, and ideas.

But if ever there were one to undertake this challenge, it's Bill Nye."

The film also features appearances by Neil deGrasse Tyson, Ann Druyan and many other luminaries in the field, as well as Nye going head-to-head with such "contrarians" as prominent creationist Ken Ham and climate change skeptic and occasional FOX News commentator Joe Bastardi.

"The 'Science Guy' show is over, and I've got to move on to something

bigger," Nye explains. "We have this increasing anti-science movement in the United States [that is] more powerful than it's ever been. If we raise a generation of kids that can't think critically, can't think scientifically, we are headed for trouble. These people who are denying science, denying evolution, denying the efficacy of vaccinations and especially denying human-caused climate change - we just can't have this. We've got to fight this fight. I've got to fight this fight.

"It was really 1998, maybe, when the guy people love to hate, Al Gore,

was pointing out to everyone that the world's climate is changing. And there was a movement in the United States government to suppress even the use of the phrase 'climate change' 20 years ago. And, as I say all the time, I didn't want to make science political. Don't come running to me, man. You all did that. So, we've got to fight this fight for the betterment of humankind. The U.S. is the world's most influential culture. Love it or hate it, it's very influential. When the United States is not a leader in using science for the betterment of humankind, it's a drag. So, we're fighting the fight, people."

As Nye points out, the orchestrated denial of climate change in par-

son - I don't understand how [Republican pollster and political consultant] Frank Luntz has a job. That guy, he told Mitt Romney and his crew, 'Introduce doubt. Doubt is your friend. Doubt, doubt, doubt, doubt, doubt.' And that's bad for everybody.

"But at some point, for economic reasons alone, conservatives are going to have to embrace climate change and do something about it. As the ocean gets warmer, it's getting bigger, and storms are more intense, and we're losing sea coast. People in Norfolk, Pensacola, Miami and Miami Beach, they're going to move. Where are they going to go? What are they going to do? How are they going to make a living?"

fully we’ll find out what is going on with Sherlock after last season’s cliffhanger of his MRI to find out why he’s been experiencing memory loss and hallucinations.

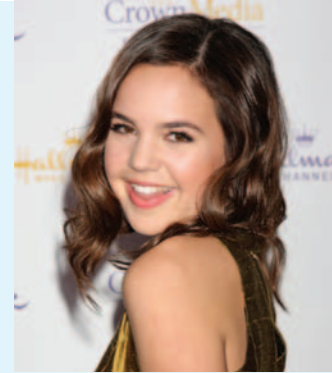

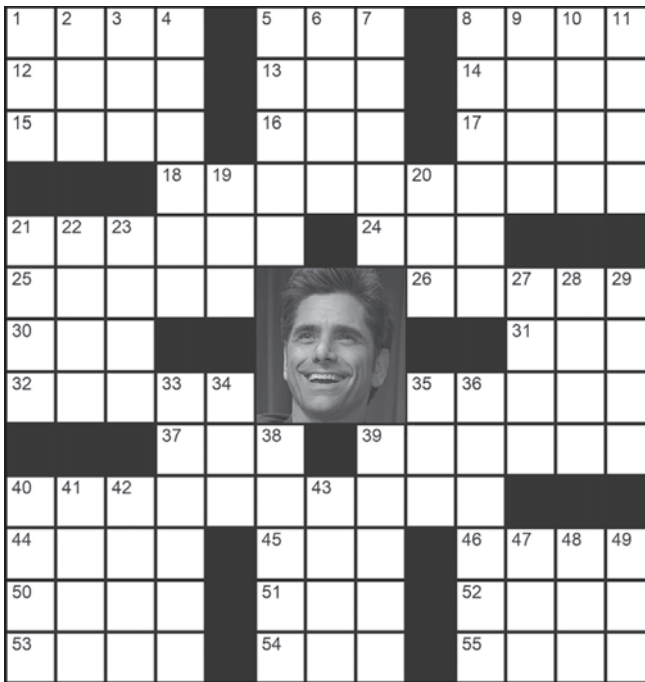
