Man gets life sentence for murder

No parole for North Port man in 2018 killing of girlfriend

SARASOTA — A North Port man has been sentenced to life in prison without the possibility of parole in the murder of his girlfriend last August.

Jason Doty, 43, was sentenced in the 12th judicial circuit court Friday morning. He was found guilty after a two-day jury trial.

Doty was convicted of murder in the second degree and found guilty of tampering with evidence in the Aug. 24, 2018 slaying of Erica White at her home in the 13500 block of Tamiami Trail in North Port. She was found after White called police around 4:30 a.m.

In his first discussion with police, Doty said he and White were often arguing and both were intoxicated the night before her body was found. He claimed he had been high on methamphetamine and awoke on the couch between 3 a.m. and 4 a.m.

He said he drove to a Circle K, a block west of the house, and bought cigarettes and a bottle of water. He said he returned to the house around 4:25 a.m. and found her wounded and in "labored breathing."

White was found to have three stab wounds near her chest and three lacerations on the left side of her neck.

A box cutter-style knife and a large kitchen knife were on the night stand next to her head.

Doty was found with blood on both of his hands and he had two scratches on his right cheek, according to police. He had pleaded not guilty to the charges.

Charlotte County Sheriff's Office investigating baby's death

Cause of 1-year-old's death Wednesday still pending

PUNTA GORDA — The Charlotte County Sheriff's Office is investigating the death of a 1-year-old girl. Deputies responded to a call of an infant not

breathing on Wednesday around 2:30 p.m., according to an incident report.

When a deputy arrived at the home on the 29500 block of Shell Creek Court in Punta Gorda, EMS was performing CPR on the child inside a carport.

The girl's father and grandmother were initially there watching, but were removed while EMS worked on the child, the report stated.

At 2:46 p.m., a battalion chief notified a doctor at Bayfront Health Punta Gorda

of the incident and the child was declared deceased.

The home where the death occurred is owned by the child's grandparents, according to property appraiser records.

Englewood Marine was one of last out as embassy fell marking end of Vietnam War

ENGLEWOOD — Forty-four years ago this week, Randy Smith recalls, the sun had barely crested over the horizon and the day was already hot, muggy.

"We felt like the Alamo," said Smith. The Englewood man was among the last group of U.S. Marines sitting atop the flat roof of the U.S. Embassy waiting to be evacuated by helicopter from Saigon. South Vietnam was falling, and waves of enemy soldiers had entered the defeated country's capital.

"We were surrounded, like sitting ducks," he said.

He was one of the Marines called to pull down the last American flag to fly over the embassy.

Smith plans to commemorate with other

veterans, their families and Englewood residents the fall of Saigon at 4 p.m. April 30 at the Clyde E Lassen Memorial VFW Post 10178 on North McCall Road, Englewood.

The service will also commemorate the service of Darwin Judge and Charles McMahan, the last Marines to die during the Vietnam War, and two of Smith's comrades in arms.

A kid from Dayton

Ten years after he served, Smith said he realized why he decided to join the Marines as a 17-year-old senior at Beaver Creek High School, outside of Dayton, Ohio.

"I wrestled at 98 pounds," he recalled. "I was tired of being the 98-pound weakling; I was tired of being the cute skinny kid."

New palm trees along U.S.41 median off to rough start

If trees don't survive they'll be replaced at contractor's expense, state agency says

Alert motorists have noticed some sad looking trees in the median of U.S. 41 in Port Charlotte.

The problem is, these are the trees that the Florida Department of Transportation just planted to replace the last sad looking trees on this section of the state's historic thoroughfare.

One Bismarck palm near the Bob Evans restaurant just bent over and died near Westchester Boulevard

and U.S. 41. It was recently removed, not long after it was planted. A large number of stately royal palms looked completely dead until some green fronds finally sprouted in the middle of a full display of brown fronds.

FDOT spokesperson Zachary Burch explained that the trees are experiencing transplant shock.

"This can take some time before the trees get acclimated to their new location," Burch said.

March home, condo sales lower than last year

Median sale prices still rose with inventory in region

The diagnosis is in: We're healthy.

At least, our real estate market is, according to data from the Punta Gorda-Port Charlotte-North Port Realtors Association March report.

"(The) market remains stable and healthy," said the association's president Afra Newell. "It's a win-win."

She does suggest, though, that buying remains a better alternative when compared to renting due to interest rates being a bit lower.

Here's a breakdown of the current health of the real estate market:

Sales are lower

For March, there were 359 single-family homes sold — 12.7 percent lower than this time last year.

Condominium and town home sales didn't do so hot either at 84 sales in March, which is the lowest they've performed in March in the past three years.

But Newell says not to worry, as these numbers show "a normal fluctuation of a healthy market."

Value is steadily growing

The median sale price for single-family homes in March was \$227,500, which was a 5.9 percent increase since this time last year.

Condos and town homes saw a 4 percent growth in value since this time last year at a median sale price of \$162,250.

We're well supplied

Months supply of inventory is a useful indicator of market conditions. The

benchmark of a balanced market, which favors neither buyer nor seller, is 5.5 months of inventory.

Traditionally, anything higher is a buyers' market, and anything lower is a sellers' market.

With that said, the area had 1,547 active listings for single-family homes and 370 active listings for condos and town homes in March.

This translates to 4.7 months supply of inventory for single family homes, or a 14.6 percent increase since last year. March also reported a 5.2 months supply of inventory for condos and town homes, which is a 20.9 percent increase since this time last year.

Newell said this increase in inventory indicates sellers are feeling more confident to sell, and prices are adjusting appropriately.

Punta Gorda named state's best up and coming housing market

The crystal ball foresees a bigger and better housing market for Punta Gorda.

Punta Gorda was named Florida's best up and coming housing market, according to a recent study conducted by Insurify, a homeowners insurance quotes comparison website.

Even better news, the Punta Gorda

metropolitan statistical area (MSA), which includes all of Charlotte County, has home values slated to increase by 6.1 percent, according to Zillow Research forecasts.

Meanwhile, the North Port-Sarasota-Bradenton MSA is predicted to have home values increase by only 1.9 percent in the next year.

Nationally, homes are valued to increase by 4.1 percent.

"Cities that put in the hard work to make their communities a better place in which to live often do so without recognition," said Kacie Saxer-Taulbee, a data scientist for Insurify.

"Punta Gorda is one of these cities, as can be seen in the investment it has made in the growth of its housing market."

To determine the best housing markets, Insurify measured the relative increase in

home values since 2009, forecasts for future home value and current year-over-year median sales price trends from Zillow Research.

Over the past decade, home values in Punta Gorda have increased an average of 4.61 percent,

which is around twice as much as both the national and Florida state average growth in that time period, Saxer-Taulbee said.

They also counted the total building permits issued in 2018, which were recorded by the

National Association of Home Builders, as well as the proportion of homeowners reported by City-Data.com.

Almost 1,900 building permits were issued for new home construction for Punta Gorda in 2018.

License suspended for nursing assistant

Kenneth Summerall is accused of battering patients with Alzheimer's

PORT CHARLOTTE — A Charlotte County nursing assistant accused of battering patients at Royal Palm Retirement Center last year had his license revoked by the Florida Department of Health earlier this month.

"Any time that we discover that a licensed practitioner has been arrested we begin a preliminary investigation and monitor the situation for a conviction," said Department of Health Spokesperson Brad Dalton. "We also look into the actions that led to the arrest to see if there are any violations where the department has regulatory authority."

If the department believes a practitioner poses an immediate serious danger to the welfare of public health, the Surgeon General has the authority to immediately suspend or restrict the person's license until the

prosecution has been completed, Dalton said.

Kenneth Summerall's order of emergency suspension states he "repeatedly lost his temper and used force against patients" from September through November of 2018.

One 72-year-old victim with Alzheimer's was tapping her foot when Summerall allegedly stood on her feet and told her to stop in a menacing tone.

Another 84-year-old patient with Alzheimer's had a habit of getting out of bed and wandering the hallways at night. On one occasion, Summerall allegedly grabbed the patient in a bear hug and dragged him back to his room, then shoved him onto the bed and began to undress him.

After removing the patient's belt, Summerall struck the patient with it several times, according to the order.

Another time when the same patient was wandering, Summerall again became irritated and shoved him into his room, making him lose his balance and hit his head on the door.

Summerall did not

report the patient's injury, despite knowing he would likely have been transported to the hospital via ambulance for examination, because he feared losing his job, according to the order.

The following morning, staff at Royal Palm found a bruise and knot on the patient's forehead, the order stated.

A third patient was sitting on the floor, refusing to stand up, and attempting to hit and kick Summerall when he grabbed her by the wrists and dragged her toward her room. A co-worker intervened and encouraged Summerall to treat the patient more gently.

But when Summerall took the patient into her room, he shoved her onto the bed and allegedly he told her, "You're not going to continue to get away with this behavior, especially after kicking me..."

The co-worker heard the patient scream and

entered the room, telling Summerall she would handle getting the patient ready for bed.

Two of Summerall's co-workers saw him curse and slam a door on the patient's face, according to the order.

Summerall was arrested on Dec. 8, 2018, for three counts of battery on a person 65 years of age or older. Two cases remain open, while the third was dropped shortly after his arraignment.

The order for suspension of his license states that nursing is an inherently stressful profession, and nursing assistants must have "good judgment and moral character" and must be able to employ effective de-escalation techniques to avoid engaging in violence toward patients.

"Mr. Summerall's use of force against multiple elderly, mentally disabled patients, including striking, shoving, and dragging

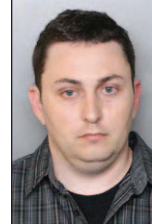
patients, indicates that Mr. Summerall does not possess the good judgment or moral character to practice as a nursing assistant in a manner that is safe for patients," the order states. "Mr. Summerall's disregard for the laws and rules governing the practice of nursing assistance shows that his continued practice as a nursing assistant presents an immediate, serious danger to the

health, welfare, and safety of the public."

Dalton said emergency suspension orders are not considered final action but are imposed for serious violations related to the commission of crimes, standard of care, drug use, as well as student loan defaults.

Neither Summerall or his attorney could be reached for comment Friday.

A precautionary boil water notice was issued today for Charlotte Harbor Water Association customers.

"A high service pump that provides pressure to the system failed," stated the water association in a press release. As a result, the system pressure dropped below a certain threshold, thus mandating the precautionary water boil notice for Charlotte Harbor Water Association

residential and business customers.

The association recommends using bottled water or boiling water for drinking, cooking, brushing teeth, making ice, washing dishes, etc. Boil the water for at least one minute.

"This 'Precautionary Boil Water Notice' will remain in effect until a bacteriological survey shows that the water is safe to drink," states the association.

The girl's parents have no prior criminal convictions.

The Sun is not naming the family of the child, absent any criminal charges in the case.

On Friday, CCSO spokesperson Katie Heck said the Major Crimes detectives were still actively investigating. The cause of death was still pending the outcome of the Medical Examiner's report.

The Florida Department of Children and Families also

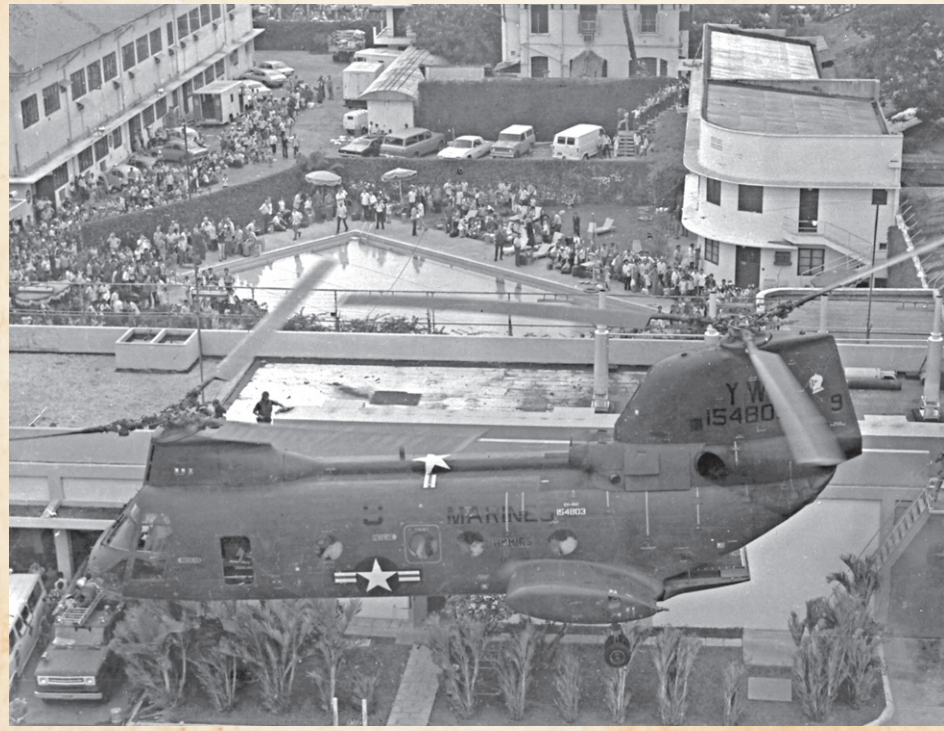
responded due to the death of the infant and the condition of three other children, who were removed from the home, Heck said Friday.

It's unclear whether abuse or neglect charges will be forthcoming in connection to that.

"We are currently still actively investigating the incident, which includes the conditions of the home and other children," Heck said.

A man at the house declined to speak with the Sun Friday.

The Marine Corps sent Smith to California for boot camp. Marines trained in Camp Lejeune or Parris Island tend to dub California recruits as "Hollywood Marines," but Smith described Marine drill instructors as "equal opportunity," no matter where you train.

While he was completing his training, Smith tested well enough — one of the 11 out of 250 young recruits — chosen to move on for embassy training and one of three who graduated for embassy duty.

"It was the toughest attrition rate," he said. "You are still a Marine but you are working for the State Department."

Smith arrived in Saigon, April 19, 1974. Then 18, he was the youngest Marine, "in country," in Vietnam, for 10 months.

"It was a different world," Smith said he felt when he stepped off the plane in Saigon. "It was oppressively hot and muggy."

Smith and other Marines were expected to guard various bases and other installations, besides the embassy itself. Judge and McMahon were on duty at a military base when they were killed in a mortar attack. In all the confusion, Smith said, their

bodies were "left behind."

"It took Sen. Edward (Ted) Kennedy's office 10 months to get those bodies back," Smith said.

The end

"They were telling us, even in April, that Saigon wouldn't fall," Smith recalled, but Da Nang and other outposts fell one after another as the North Vietnam troops advanced. "By April, you knew they were coming. We were a beleaguered city."

In the middle of April, Marines were assigned to "burn details" where they burnt top-secret papers and millions of dollars in U.S. currency.

"More and more, we focused on saving lives," Smith said. "Because anyone connected to the South Vietnam regulars or any of the American operations, they were put in 're-education' camps, basically concentration camps."

U.S. ambassador Graham Martin didn't want to leave and held on until President Gerald Ford ordered him to leave. Smith recalled how Martin's son and nephew died in Vietnam. The Marines and others tried to evacuate by helicopters to the Seventh Fleet offshore.

"Chaos was everywhere, like the end of the world — and for a lot of people, it was,"

Smith said. "A major came up to me and said for me and (Lance Corp. Jerome Thomas) to take down the flag. That's when we knew it was over, coming down to a bitter end."

Saigon is now Ho Chi Minh City, and nothing remains of the multi-story building that housed the embassy. But the flag pole was kept and part of the U.S. consulate, which was rebuilt on the grounds of the embassy in Ho Chi Minh City. In 2014, Smith returned to Vietnam and participated in a three-man detail at the consulate, "pulled colors" and was handed the flag.

having problems."

The post will hold a special commemoration 4 p.m. Tuesday that will mark the 44th anniversary of the fall of Saigon and the end to the Vietnam War. The last two Marines to die in Vietnam, Darwin Judge and Charles McMahon, will be remembered and honored at the commemoration.

Post members hope the ceremony will raise awareness of the post.

"I want to help this post," Randy Smith said. He's a lifelong VFW member but new to Post 10178.

Smith also is one of the last Marines to serve in Vietnam. He helped bring down the flag that flew over the U.S. embassy in Saigon as the last Marines and other officials boarded helicopters to leave the country.

"The VFW does the most for veterans than any other organization," Smith said. "That's what this post has done, and I hope it will continue to do."

The Englewood post itself was named for Clyde E. Lassen in 2005. Lassen, who grew up in Englewood, earned the Medal of Honor in 1969, presented by President Lyndon Johnson for his service as a Navy helicopter pilot flying search-and-rescue missions and rescuing two downed pilots in North Vietnam.

The VFW members have already invested more than \$7,000 for electrical and other significant maintenance on the building since January. Smith — a retired Charlotte County elementary school teacher who also worked as an independent residential contractor — said the post needs a major refurbishing of its interior. "Even the walls may need to be



re-drywalled," Smith said.

The Englewood office of Keller Williams Realty is already answering the veterans' call.

As part of the company's annual Red Day community activism program, Keller Williams associates and staff will spend May 9 at the post cleaning up the exterior grounds and sprucing up its landscaping.

Keller Williams has also made a commitment to rebuild a kitchen island, have its carpets shampooed, install security lighting and restore its memorial to Lassen.

More members

The post also needs to be reinvigorated with membership, Fuson suggested, especially with younger veterans who served in Iraq, Afghanistan and elsewhere. VFW members pay \$50 annually. Lifetime membership varies according to a veteran's age.

"We are 416 members strong at this post," Fuson said. "Pretty much 75 percent of those members are 79 to 106 years old."

Smith believes younger vets "need to get connected" with the VFW post so they can learn what veteran benefits are available to them.

"That being said, if the trees do not survive, they will be replaced by the contractor at his expense."

The state contractor, Cobb Site Development, used irrigation lines of Charlotte County's reclaimed (treated sewage) water to feed the newly planted trees.

A representative of Cobb said that the trees will be fine and that the company did water them. They also noted the impact on trees from transplantation shock.

"These things here, they were past shocked," said Ken Kuriger of Gardner Drive. Kuriger is a retired banker who read with interest a story in January about the new median trees. He also noticed the price tag of \$626,397. That was for 121 trees including 32 royal palms and 14 Bismarck palms.

"It's amazing. I just shook my head," he said as he drove by the failing trees. "I can't believe they're planting dead trees," he said he thought.

If you question the landscaping opinion of a retired banker, he has some expert confirmation.

"From what I see, it is not normal for transplanted trees to look the way they do," said Jim Yelverton, a board certified master arborist in Englewood. "They either got dry at some point during the transplanting process, or are dry now, and not receiving enough or any water," he said in an email to the Sun. To avoid transplant shock, a transplanted royal palm needs 20-30 gallons of water a day for two to three weeks, he said. If they receive less than that, they will lose fronds but still survive. The royal palms of U.S. 41, however, appear to have received far less than the minimum.

"The trees may survive ... but they will not likely ever be a nice tree again," he said. "They should be replaced and watered properly."

Pepito Cortes, who sells trees at Cortes and Son on U.S. 41, said he has noticed how bad the trees look. He also noticed that the

fronds were not bound during planting, which he said helps preserve moisture.

"The palms will not die, but it looks nasty for 41," Cortes said.

Kuriger said he noticed a lot of water flowing on U.S. 41 near the irrigation lines. In his experience, he said, underground irrigation lines get clogged.

Another local tree man, Tony Virgili, who owned Bees & Trees, said the contractor can't just assume the irrigation is working on the trees.

"You have to have somebody check them."

Those who commented said they are not reassured by the state's promise to replace the dead trees. They don't like the waste.

"We all waste so much money," said Dave Stottsberry of Dave's Handyman Service.

Virgili said a full-sized palm tree can cost thousands of dollars to transplant.

The solution is not hard, said Stottsberry. Next time, he said, "They're going to wait for the rainy season."

Sarasota County financial picture positive

SARASOTA — Sarasota County's budget picture looks positive with revenue coming in above projections, commissioners heard.

At the mid-year point of its annual budget year, county budget officials told commissioners Wednesday the news is positive with revenues exceeding expectations and expenditures about where expected.

"Looks like we'll be in great shape as we build the budget," Commissioner Alan Maio commented, referring to the 2020 budget.

Revenue from all major sources, Budget Director Kim Radtke told commissioners is 6.7 percent above projections, and general fund revenue, the source of funding for most county operations, is 6.5 percent above projections.

Most of the funding for the general fund comes from property taxes, and Radtke said the county had collected 97 percent of the

tax bills sent out. She added that most people pay their property taxes when the bill is received to avoid penalties.

The one downside in revenues was with the tourist development tax which was 4 percent lower than the projected amount. But reports on those collections run two months behind, and the lower revenues could also reflect the situation with red tide last year.

Turning to the expenditure side of the picture, Radtke told commissioners that overall expenditures were at 34 percent of the budgeted amount, while general fund expenditures were slightly higher at 42 percent of what was budgeted.

She explained that the lower expenditures varied due to a number of factors. For example, she said, Parks and Recreation expenditures tend to be higher in the summer months than the winter.

"Overall, the projections are where we thought they'd be," Radtke summed up.

As part of its budget practices, county administration always schedules a mid-year budget update for commissioners so they know the budget picture for the current fiscal year before their annual budget workshops in June.

Continuing to paint the positive news about the county's financial situation, Maio asked, as he always does in every budget meeting, the amount of total reserves the county held.

Radtke said it was \$170 million. "Anyone that tells you we're going bankrupt, we're not. Anyone that tells you our credit rating is bad, it's not," Maio said.

Commission Chairman Charles Hines credited the hard work of a lot of people over the past five or six years for the county's "good financial footing" along with the high ratings from the credit rating agencies.

Then he added, "And we still have the second lowest millage rate in the state."

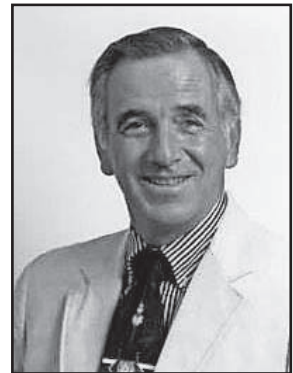

Impose all online taxes

If you buy an electronic doohicky online from Amazon or a plaid flannel shirt from L.L. Bean, an extra 6 percent will be added for state taxes.

Of course, you'll also be taxed for anything you buy at the local Ace Hardware, the frame shop or furniture store. State/local sales taxes are a given. We may not like it, but we accept sales taxes as a fact of life.

Except, it turns out, when it comes to smaller Internet retailers. Many of those sellers don't bother to tack sales taxes onto their bill. Instead, they leave it to you, the consumer, to send the appropriate amount to the state. Oh, please! Count the number of Floridians who actually bother on two hands.

Sen. Joe Gruters, R-Sarasota, is sponsoring a bill that would end the commonplace tax avoidance scheme and require all online retailers to collect appropriate taxes as part of a transaction.

Florida law currently puts the onus of payment on consumers, not on businesses, when a retailer does not maintain a physical presence in the state. That was a big, big, big loophole five years ago, before the behemoth Amazon opened its first warehouse in the state. The mega-retailer now collects and pays taxes owed. Many other retailers do too. Others — including many of Etsy and Amazon's third-party sellers — often don't.

Gruters' bill would require all online retailers to collect tax if they sell at least 200 items or \$100,000 worth of goods in a year in Florida. It fair play: There's no valid reason an online retailer should be free from the tax requirements imposed on Walmart, Captain's Landing, The Ruby Slipper or Lemon Bay Soap Company. This helps even the playing field a little more.

It also helps the state revenue stream.

According to former *Sun* reporter John Haughey in Florida Watchdog.org, Gruters' bill would collect about \$304 million in the next fiscal year, \$554 million in 2021 and \$710 million a year after that.

In Gruters' bill, the added revenues would be used to offset cuts to the tax rate on rents for commercial properties (from 5.7 percent to 3.5 percent), heavy equipment rentals and remote "telehealth" medical visits. The bill also would create a 14-day hurricane-preparedness sales tax holiday.

Leaving aside the wisdom of those tax cuts, the effort to impose tax fairness for all retailers is proper.

"This bill is about fairness. This bill is about collecting something that is already owed," Gruters said. "It's a tax that's currently owed."

FaceTime with the physician?

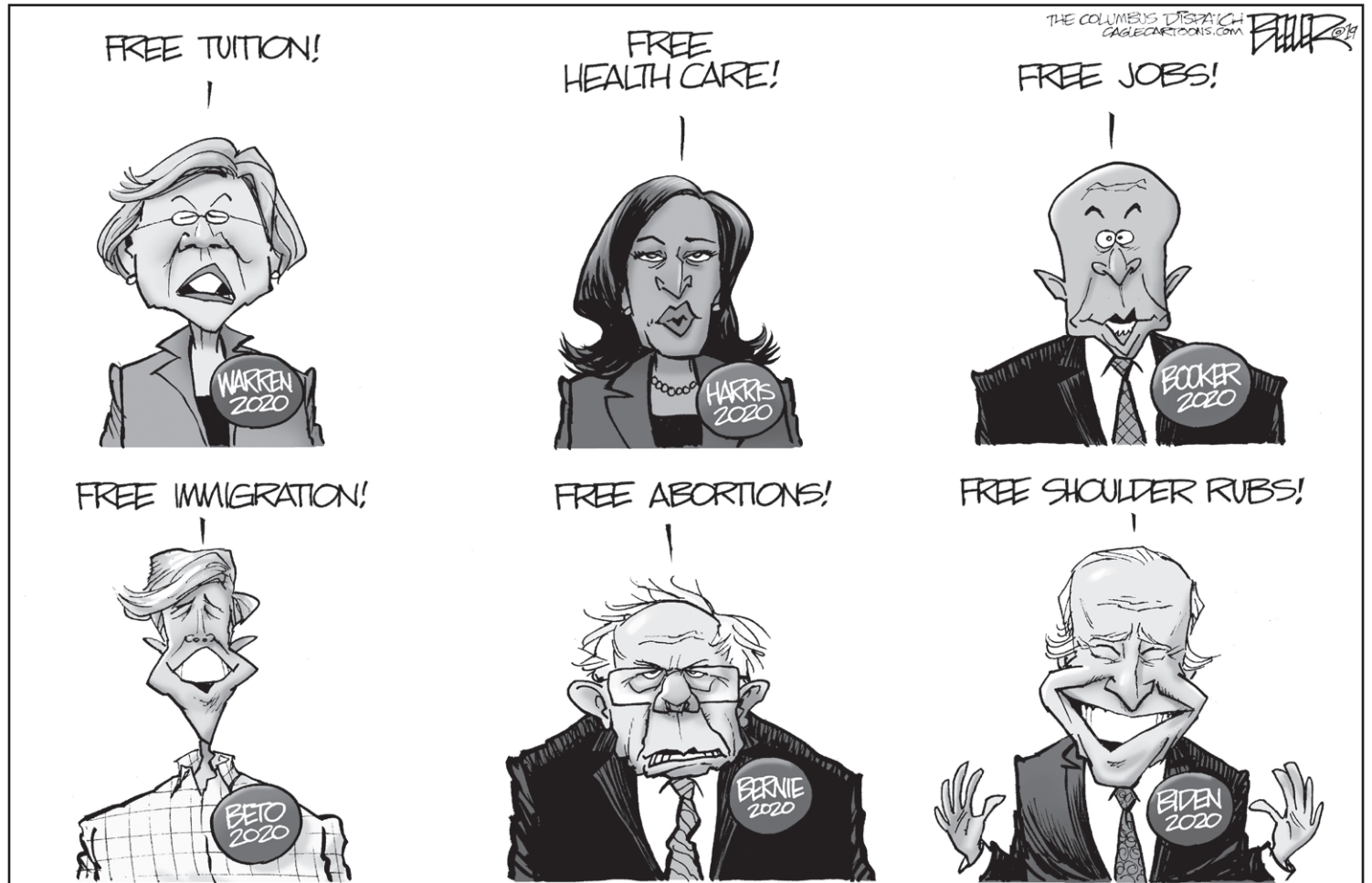

Yes, there are complex questions to be answered. But technology could bring new opportunities for efficiencies in health care. The concept is valid.

In this Legislature, House Bill 23 could expand tele-medicine. It would authorize health plans and insurance companies to use out-of-state providers and give insurance companies \$30 million in tax breaks. A Senate bill does not contain these provisions, but both work toward a tele-health framework.

Similar bills have died in the past Legislatures, and that fate may await the bills this year. But tele-medicine is coming, in some form. Beam us up, Scotty?

Health care in Charlotte County has huge issues

Whether you are primarily a consumer or primarily a provider you must realize that health care is a business. It is a big business in Charlotte County and is the second largest employer here. Only the schools employ more people. And, like the schools, the business of health care is vital to your well-being.

As large and complex as health care is in Charlotte County, there are several major gaps in services. If you are injured in a Charlotte County accident and need emergency help from an official trauma center, you will be flown to a facility somewhere else.

If you suffer injuries calling for special treatment at an approved burn center, you likely will be transported out of Charlotte County. If you injure your spinal cord, EMS might take you to the emergency

room of a Charlotte County hospital that has no neurologist on staff.

Charlotte County has almost no long term in-patient traumatic injury physical therapy rehab facilities for you.

All of Charlotte County's hospitals are for-profit. Recent government reports show that you will have to leave the county to be treated at a top-ranked hospital.

County residents, new or long-term, regularly face the challenges of locating a medical doctor who is accepting new patients, especially during "season." That is one reason why there are such crowds in the

county's emergency rooms.

Charlotte County's significant low-income population faces health care problems the rest of us know little about. Even with a reliable income, solid insurance or a job that pays more than minimum wage, you may well require medical services for which you will have to leave the county to find at any price.

You have heard the politicians' cries for "Medicare for all." Who will pay for it? Just as important, who will provide it? A hospital executive explains that if his facility served only Medicare patients and charged only Medicare rates the net annual profit would be 3 to 4 percent. Remember, all of our hospitals are for-profit. Investors can beat 3 to 4 percent profit almost anywhere.

Medicaid pays lower rates for even fewer services. Given these and other

health care issues, we need to gear up Charlotte County health care planning.

Have you ever lived in a place with more talk about "planning" than now in Charlotte County? There is planning for the master plan for the city of Punta Gorda, beach renourishment at Englewood, the Sunseeker resort, affordable/workforce housing, another try at a pilots' school, the airport expansion, a much-needed hurricane shelter, Placida, Murdock, roads and highways, mixed-use developments and more. But what about county planning for health care services?

Charlotte planning is done by city and county staff, by local elected and appointed officials, by outside consultants, by Team Punta Gorda, by self-appointed "partnerships," by state agencies, and assorted gatherings of volunteers. The county

Office of Economic Development is celebrated for its success. The three chambers of commerce are visible and active. The Economic Development Partnership is busy in front of and behind the scenes. City planners and boards are active. Developers are hungry for "transformational projects." The council that studies county transportation needs has two formal plans — short term and long term. But what about county health care planning?

Charlotte County does have a health officer who might be expected to take the lead. But he is part-time. He also is the health officer for Hendry and for Glades counties. So Charlotte has a one-third-time health officer, I guess.

All of the expansion and development underway will add population that expects quality,

available health care. Florida Trend magazine notes a net increase in Florida population of 919 every day. Sunseeker alone bragged that at full operation it will bring in 300,000 visitors per year. Our current facilities and services, already strained, face greater pressures.

So, health care already is Charlotte's second largest employer, exceeded only by the schools. We see that health care is essential whatever our status or lifestyle. We acknowledge health care's twin elements of high cost and high profits. So, folks, how about some careful, comprehensive health care planning in and for Charlotte County?

Last Straw looks to eliminate single-use plastics

It's the Last Straw! TEAM Punta Gorda is pleased to be participating in a wonderful project initiated by the Punta Gorda Isles Civic Association with the potential to have a great impact. Other partners in this effort are the Charlotte Harbor National Estuary Program, the Punta Gorda Rotary, the Peace River Wildlife Center, the Charlotte Harbor Environmental Center, and Smart Growth Punta Gorda.

The purpose of the project is to reduce plastic pollution, both in our waterways and on land. We hope to stimulate awareness of

our over-dependence on disposable plastic service items, to teach eco-friendly behaviors and to help us all begin to change some of our habits by using biodegradable products.

Single-use plastic items are one of the biggest threats to our environment. Plastic grocery bags, single-use water bottles, and straws are some of the most common litter seen strewn about any

neighborhood and are especially dangerous in an area such as Southwest Florida that is surrounded by water. Our estuary and our shoreline are among the greatest economic assets we have in this region. We must all be aware of our part in protecting these resources.

Petroleum-based plastics never biodegrade by breaking down into innocuous, component atoms. Over time, plastics exposed to air and sunlight get brittle and break apart into smaller and smaller pieces until you would need a microscope to see them. Plastics that end up in an ocean or lake take even longer to break apart.

Often these microplastic particulates cause harm to the creatures living there. The animals ingest the plastics, causing irritation to the digestive system, obstruction, or a satiated feeling when no nutritional substance has been eaten. This can lead to starvation. They also contain harmful chemicals and collect toxins that are ingested by aquatic animals. Additionally, wildlife become entangled in these items, causing further injury and even death.

In addition to public education, the Last Straw project will seek to work with local restaurants, businesses, grocers and event organizers

to ask them to sign on to this campaign. The project will also include the development and distribution of Clean Start Kits to model the kinds of products we are encouraging. Some restaurants have begun to have tabletop signs indicating that if you need a straw you can ask for one. Restaurants are also starting to use biodegradable take-home containers. These are welcome trends.

What can the public do?
• Start carrying re-usable cloth grocery bags;
• Pay attention to the service items you purchase, and seek out non-plastic products when

possible;
• When you go out, say "no thanks" to plastic straws and stirrers;
• Find new ways to recycle, reuse, reduce our use of disposable plastics service products.

As many of our residents leave for other parts of the country this time of year, take this message with you to your other community and do what you can to raise awareness.

'Transparent' redistricting of Sarasota County in 2019?

The Sarasota County Commission is currently assessing the need to redistrict the county in 2019 — which could change the boundaries of our five voting districts before the scheduled 2020 U.S. Census. If you think citizens should play an active role in this process, contact our county commissioners now.

Last November, voters in Sarasota County sent our County Commission a clear message. Voters overwhelmingly approved more direct and accountable representation from our County Commission. Starting in 2020, each commissioner will be elected solely by the voters in his/her voting district — a major change from the past countywide voting system.

But, in the meantime, our current County Commission is considering making changes to district boundaries this year, starting in early May. Commissioners (including two up for re-election, Mike Moran of District 1 and Nancy Detert of District 3; and one departing due to term limits, Charles Hines of District 5) would orchestrate this process themselves rather than taking the course recommended by the League of Women Voters/Sarasota County: Impanel an independent, expert committee

of citizens who are not seeking public office.

The LWV also stated that when "diverse stakeholders are left out of the redistricting process, it's more likely that elected officials will choose their voters than voters will be empowered to choose their elected officials."

At minimum, any county-level redistricting process must be fully transparent and should include input and feedback from county residents from start to finish. In advance of commission discussions or decisions, residents should know key background information, including:

• What universal criteria determine the need to

redistrict, Florida statutes, etc?

• Which standardized data sources will be used to determine current population (U.S. Census, other?)

• What methods and software will be used to "balance" each district?

Such questions have been posed to Sarasota County officials, but not answered. Waiting until county staff delivers a report to the commission in early May is not adequate. Residents and voters should not be passive bystanders in this process. We need answers to key questions before the May meeting, preferably at a public, interactive workshop.

A news report on the County Commission meeting on April 9 indicated that Commissioner Detert proposes that Commissioners

"make this the most open, transparent and, frankly, televised exercise that the county's ever been through." ... Additionally, Detert said, "I think we all need to work on restoring the average person's faith in their own government."

Please act now. Send a message to our five commissioners at www.scgov.net/government/county-commission-bcc. We the people must play a key and active role in the county redistricting process. Your vote is your voice.

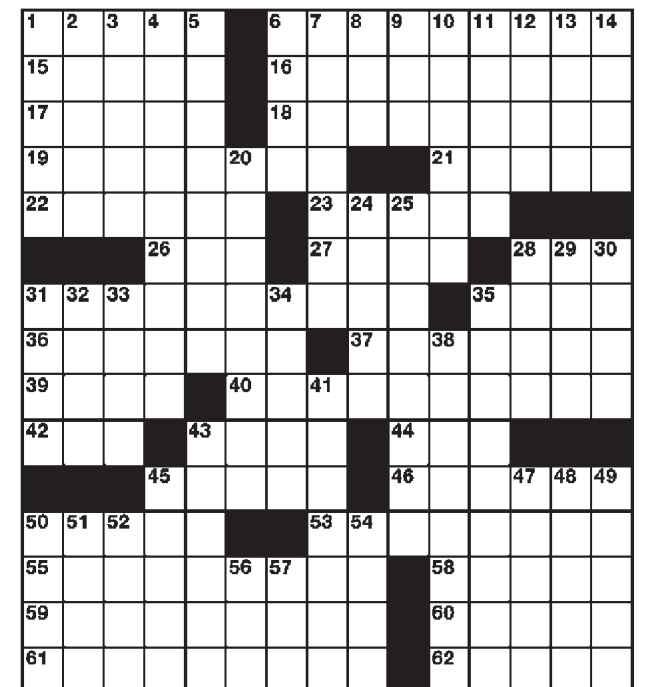

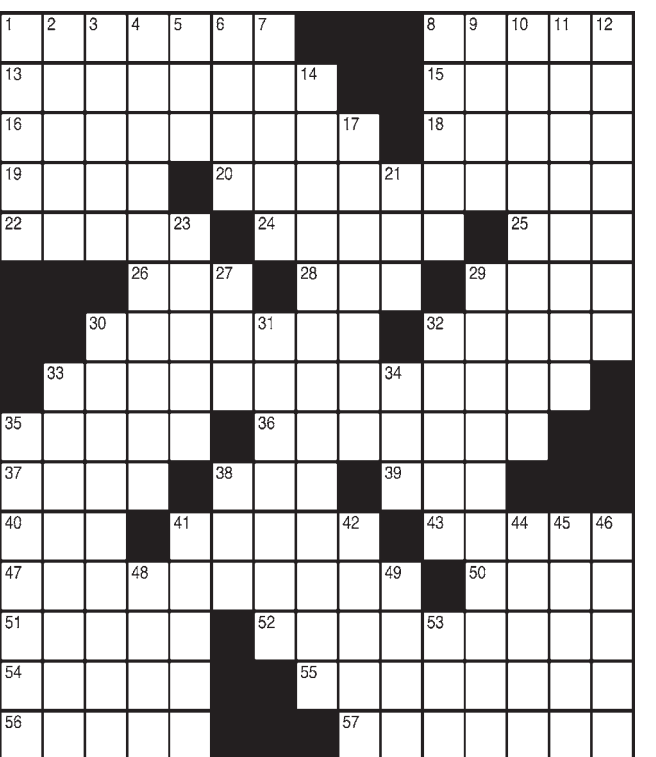

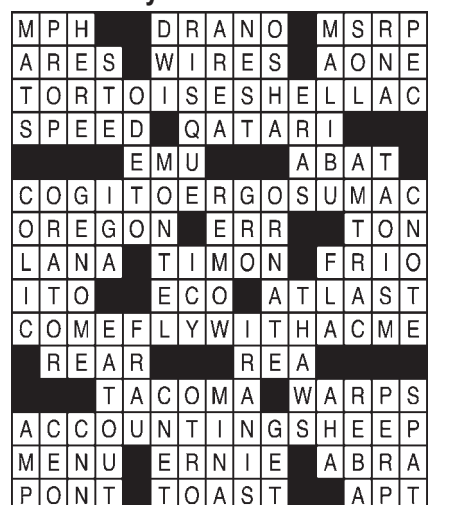

English language tutors hit the ground running

Local businesses have requested language assistance for employees

The first fifteen literacy tutors have been let loose on Charlotte County.

They appear to be a motivated bunch. "I've been told there's a big problem with adult literacy, right here in Charlotte County," said volunteer tutor Mari Usera of Port Charlotte.

"I want to do something to help people immigrating to our country, to be welcoming," said Dottie Territo of Rotonda West. "I feel the atmosphere has been very tense, and I'm sorry that families have been torn apart," she said, referring to recent disputes over whether refugee families should be separated as they arrive at the border.

Working with Charlotte County libraries, the Hispanic American Council of Charlotte County started putting out the word early this year that a literacy volunteer program was

starting up. The emphasis is on offering English language skills to non-English speakers.

Not long after this, they had enough people for two training classes of 12 hours each. Both the March and the April cohorts graduated on Thursday with a ceremony and some parting tips at the Port Charlotte Library on Aaron Street.

These tutors will be working with adults only, and mostly with adults who need help with their English language skills, said Hispanic American Council President Maria Lara. They're just starting to find out what student they are matched up with. Each tutor commits to about 1-2 hours a week per student. Some have signed up for multiple students.

The program is goal oriented, so the tutor and student set goals in the beginning. When the goals are met, they can decide what to do next, Lara said.

According to the U.S.

Census Bureau estimates, in Charlotte County a language other than English is spoken in nearly 10 percent of the households.

Charlotte County has long had a sizeable population of non-native English speakers, said Lara. A volunteer tutoring program allows working and non-working adults to meet and work one-on-one at times that are convenient to them, she said.

Some of the students are coming from local employers, Lara said, who have requested assistance for their non-English speaking employees.

Training for the program was provided for free by the Florida Literacy Coalition, using a curriculum from a national group called ProLiteracy. ProLiteracy also offers training materials that the tutors can use with their students. Charlotte County volunteers will keep track of their work and their

students to compile data that the state coalition can use to apply for grants, said Lara.

Many but not all of the volunteers are retired. Bette Pisarski of Englewood is a retired teacher of students with special needs. Patricia Pasca is still working as a liaison for immigrant families in the Charlotte County School District.

Myrna Charry is a retired linguistics professor from New York.

"This is right up my alley," she said.

Four of the volunteers are men. John Homan just retired from the police force in Cincinnati, Ohio.

"I didn't come down here expecting to do this," he said with a smile. "I came to the (Charlotte County)

Cultural Center. I signed up for a Spanish class."

His teacher, Betty Barriga, suggested he become a tutor.

"I said, 'It sounds like a really good program, Betty.'"

Homan said he's not a snow bird, but is here for all seasons.

"I'm a Floridian now!"

4-foot gator found in PGI sewer drain

Homeowner Majorie Haun said, "That was interesting, I thought I better call anyway. I didn't know how big it was—I'm glad they came." Haun said she hardly ever sees gators in the canal by her house, though her neighbor across the street had one in their sewer drain a year or two ago. According to FWC, alligator courtship begins in April, and mating occurs in May and June. Eggs are typically deposited in late June, early July and hatched in mid-August to early September. Commissioners fret over ranking economic development candidates

First set of interviews will be May 20

Charlotte County commissioners will take another stab at first round interviews for the job of economic development director on May 20.

That's when the board as a group will interview all candidates by the Skype video communication software, one at a time, from wherever the candidates are located. The board will be in room 119 of Building B at Murdock Circle and the meeting is open to the public at 8 a.m. or 9 a.m. The final time is not yet certain.

As of Friday, 10 people had applied for the job, said Communications Manager Brian Gleason. The deadline to apply is Sunday.

This is the second time the board has attempted a first round of interviews. Board members this week continued to debate problems they saw in their ranking methods in the first round as well as the candidates themselves.

"I'm alerting you guys, if I find a candidate to be substandard, they will receive a zero from me," said Commissioner Christopher Constance.

Commissioner Stephen R. Deutsch noted that the candidate first offered the job, Missouri-based Gary Carter, was the first choice of only one out of five commissioners. Other candidates had higher ranking, but lower scores.

To avoid that problem this time, County Attorney Janette Knowlton told the board they will be ranking the candidates in order rather than giving them

scores from 0-100. That way, the ranking will not be confused if one commissioner gives out just 40s and 50s and another, 80s and 90s.

Constance objected to using ranking, however, saying that it obscures an overall poor assessment. "There was one commissioner who gave everyone a C minus to a C plus," Constance said about the previous interviews.

Knowlton advised the board that they will reconvene after the Skype interviews, and can discuss whether they thought any of the candidates were acceptable for a second round of interviews.

Constance warned his colleagues to be prepared to reject another batch. "I want to pick somebody who is the best candidate for this job, and if we have to go back out again in my opinion, I'm willing to go back out again, if this next crop is substandard."

After Carter was offered the job in March, he countered with a higher salary request. The board declined to accept that offer, and his candidacy ended.

This position is to replace Lucienne Pears who left in January to become vice president of economic and business development for Babcock Ranch Holdings.

If the board picks candidates for further interviews, they will travel to Charlotte County for in-person interviews along with each commissioner, Knowlton said.

This is according to the annual youth substance abuse survey conducted by Drug Free Punta Gorda.

hula-hoop. Both participants won prizes, from Drug Free sunglasses to a brain-shaped stress ball that read, "no joke- 21 means 21."

Students had different ideas in mind when deciding to play.

Senior Chris Pappas said, "It looked fun—it looked like something to do before lunch."

His tic-tac-toe partner, Nico Creola had other motivations in mind, "I saw food," he said.

Senior Hailey Goeki said, "we play the games every time we see them."

Her tic-tac-toe partner, Jonqueile Carlson, said she noticed the posters with alcohol facts on them around the hallways and wanted to see if she was paying attention or not.

All students said they learned something from the facts on which they were quizzed.

Babcock said most of the time students have reported getting alcohol from home. "It's accessible in the home, and they're helping themselves from older relatives or siblings."

Experts: Storm surge is real

Hurricane season is coming, do you have a plan?

VENICE — One of the most-asked questions after a hurricane is When is it safe to return home?

One answer is, if there's still a lot of flooding, don't bother.

On Friday, Bob Harrigan, meteorologist at WWSB-TV in Sarasota since 1985, told a room full of mostly new residents that storm surge kills after a hurricane.

"Most people think that wind and rain is a major killer in a hurricane," Harrigan said Friday at the Venice Hurricane Expo. "Really it's storm surge. Freshwater flooding can be a real devastating problem. Do not drive in water where you can't see the road. Fresh water flooding can wash away roads and bridges."

He said more than half of hurricane-related deaths are from water/flooding while only 12 percent are wind-related and 11 percent are surf-related.

He said during one hurricane, 17 inches of rain fell in Sarasota, causing all four Interstate 75 interchanges to flood and preventing motorists from leaving the area via the highway.

Harrigan also said each hurricane has its own personality. Therefore, they should never be thought of as the same event every time.

"A category 2 storm can bring more rain and storm surge than a category 4 hurricane," he said. "That was the problem during Hurricane Katrina (August 2005). People who lived through Hurricane Camille in 1969 thought they could survive a category 5 hurricane, because there were near-200 mph winds. Therefore, when Katrina came along at a Cat. 5, they thought they could survive. They didn't evacuate. The difference was that Katrina brought 28 feet of water. It was the highest storm surge recorded."

Harrigan said while many believe Southwest Florida is protected by the Native American Indian blessings to protect ancient burial grounds, or because of its latitude. He said just because a hurricane hasn't made landfall here in many decades doesn't mean anyone should ignore evacuation warnings.

"If you are on the island of Venice and the bridge is damaged, you can't get off of it," he said. "There are three bridges in Venice and there's low elevation. For these reasons, you put yourself in danger because we cannot get first responders out to you. The storm surge in Venice can reach 18 feet."

Ed McCrane Jr., Sarasota County Emergency Management Chief, reiterated Harrigan's

statement while speaking about hurricane preparation.

"During Hurricane Irma, we could not send an ambulance, fire truck or law enforcement out once the wind reached 45 mph," he said.

"Dispatchers are trained to give you information on how to do CPR, how to deliver a baby and how you can help someone who's choking. We cannot get to you. This is why you need a plan."

McCrane suggests leaving early if the area comes under a hurricane warning. He said it's not always necessary to go hundreds of miles away, but it's OK to visit family or friends out of state. He said having a plan to "shelter in place" at home should include having a safe room. The room should not have windows. It should be in the interior part of the home.

Harrigan said he takes it two steps further. His family learns the direction of the storm. If it's coming from the northeast, the family is instructed to move to the southwest corner of the home. Then the family shifts to the opposite of the home with the safe room as the hurricane passes and the winds reverse direction.

"You have to think like that to protect yourself," he said. "The other important thing is to make sure your safe room isn't near a tree that could fall

on the home and trap you. I'm learning that tree trimming is a real important part of a hurricane plan."

Harrigan and McCrane are scheduled to speak again at the expo today. Harrigan, who shows slides of the cone of uncertainty and explains what it means, is speaking at 11 a.m. McCrane, who details Sarasota County's new alert system, will talk at noon.

McCrane said Sarasota County will alert the media and use Facebook, Twitter and Instagram to tell residents when it's safe to return home after a storm.

"We have a red, yellow and green system," he said. "When the area is in red, it means there's flooding and storm surge and other dangers. When it's yellow, it means there's debris and other issues and to return with caution. The green means it's clear."

Other speakers at the free event from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. at the Venice Community Center, 326 Nokomis Ave. S., Venice, include Phil Snyder, executive director of the Suncoast Humane Society. Snyder will explain that all shelters

in Sarasota County are pet-friendly. It wasn't the case in the past. Residents should never leave pets behind during a storm.

The city of Venice and vendors including the Venice Regional Bayfront Hospital, Jansen Shutters, the Division of Motor Vehicles, the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary and

more are giving away items and information. The city will also help residents check to see if they live in a flood zone.

Another hurricane expo is planned at 3 p.m. June 19 at Community Presbyterian Church, 405 S. McCall Road, Englewood.

for the Charlotte County Sheriff's Office and board chair for Drug Free Punta Gorda.

"What if someone said vaping isn't as dangerous as smoking?" Heck asked a student.

"They would be wrong," said Ember McCoy, sixth-grader.

"Why do you choose not to smoke?" asked Heck.

"I like to run," said McCoy. "If I smoked, I would lose my breath easier."

McCoy said she joined the student impact team, because she wanted to have a positive impact on other students. She said drugs have affected her family.

"I realized that's not what people should do with their future," she said.

Sixth-grader Justin Byassee said he joined the student impact team for similar reasons.

"I want to help people not be drug addicts," he said. "If you help someone, it would be something good — they don't go under arrest or get killed. I want them to have a better life."

Dionisio said she is amazed to see the way the students are talking now, having been in the group for several months.

"They definitely have a message," she said.

She said the students feel comfortable coming to her to tell her what they saw and sharing stories with her.

"Most of them have shared a story; they're here for a reason," she said.

Heck said, "This is

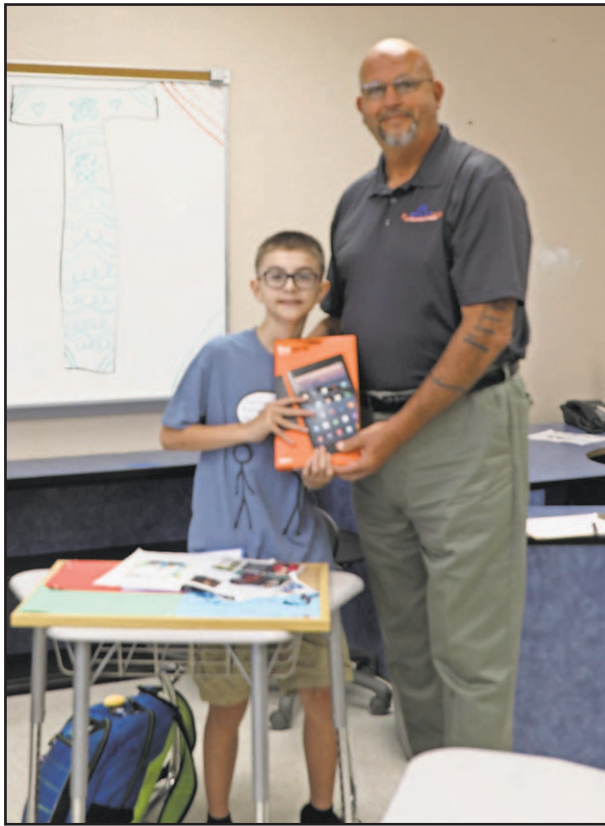

Is writing your cup of tea?

An agenda for writers to read their works and share with others is the monthly Writer's Tea. It takes place from 1 p.m. to 3 p.m. on the third Tuesday of each month at the Port Charlotte Library, 2280 Aaron St., next to the Cultural Center of Charlotte County. It's held year-round. The Writer's Tea is worth the drive to share writing — and to share the wonderful treats members bring. Whether it is a month with the table loaded with home-made goodies, or one filled with store-bought contributions, there is always tea and bottled water and lots of conversation and fun. They do a brief announcement of writers activities around the community and then start reading, taking turns around the tables. Each one reads for about three to five

minutes. Depending on the numbers on any given day, they do a couple of rounds and then break for tea and treats. The group had about 14 men and women, all contributors of reading poems, short pieces, both fiction and non-fiction, and chapters from novels. Arlene Kincaid, who hosts the group, does a good job of keeping the meeting moving along. She has a good sense of when to call for a reader to break — usually two to five minutes. The good thing is that since the reader will have a chance to

continue in the next round, the continuity isn't lost. There are quite a few authors with several self-published books — some even have a series or theme-related books. As a writer and writing teacher, I see that saying the members are serious about writing. So many times, I have seen people start a novel and stop somewhere, never to finish. There are others who write the book and never bother to put it out. I was impressed with the variety of topics covered by writers. In the hour I visited, some topics were gun control, mid-century historical fiction, several poems prompted by artwork and a cute ditty from Arlene, "The Computer." "Did you read about the oldest computer? It can be tracked back to Adam and Eve. It was an Apple, but it

had a very limited memory. Just one byte, then everything shut down." Next meeting will be 1 p.m. May 21 at the Port Charlotte Library. The group does not require copies to be handed out. Meeting are free. One member, Paul Holmes, leads a writers group called Writers Helping Writers. It's for reading help and getting feedback. It meets from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. on the first Tuesday of each month at the Punta Gorda Library, 424 W. Henry St. The next meeting is May 7. So while the traffic is not so bad, this summer would be a good time to visit the groups to the east and south of Englewood, along with attending our local May OWOW meeting, which will have two helpful segments. and character arc to help us all with our writing. And Ruth White will share a sector method from Right-Brain Writing. White says the method has helped her when she is stuck with description. This meeting will be 11 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. on May 11 in the meeting room at Englewood Charlotte Library, 3450 Access Road, next to Tringali Center. Come to discuss timely topics to inspire thinking and writing on Wednesdays at Cafe Philo at 3 p.m. at the Englewood Charlotte Library. Library website offers guides to your reading and more

Online resources are at your fingertips through Charlotte County system

The Charlotte County Library System has a book recommendation service called SelectReads. The basic premise of this service is to add a new and convenient way of putting people together with the books they love. The service can be completely customized for everyone to provide you with personalized newsletters or notifications about new publications. The service provides several different ways to find your next favorite book. You can find this on our website, www.yousemore.com/charlottecounty/ and click on the green bar that says Online Resources. There is a link to SelectReads and several

other services. One of those is the Author Check service, which allows you to track your favorite author, discover other authors your library has in stock, keep track of all the books in a series, see which titles are available in a book series, and receive an automatic email notification with this information. In the Author Spotlight section of the website, we highlight authors that are

currently most popular at your local library. On the other side of the webpage, a feed scrolls in almost real time of new authors and titles being added to the library collection. There is also an A-to-Z list of authors available in the library collection located at the top of the webpage. You may also search for a specific author using the search box. At the bottom of the page there are customized links to take you right to the library calendar, make a purchase recommendations, request an interlibrary loan and more. You can also browse by genre or subject group using the tabs at the top of the page that include fiction, non-fiction, top

picks, teens and more. The New Book Alerts link is a free service that lists the newest titles purchased by your library. You can choose to receive these alerts by email or RSS feeds. If you happen upon a new title that you are want to read, you can click "check catalog" to place a hold on the item immediately. You can tailor your alert to be as specific or as broad as you want. Categories include all fiction, top choices, all non-fiction, all multi-media and more. You can also get more specific within these categories to get just a list of all the new cookbooks recently added to the collection or limit it to the new mystery

books available. These alerts not only apply to books but also to audio books, DVDs, and music CDs. Sign up for the alerts for the newest DVDs added to the collection and you can click directly through to put a hold on the new movies and be the first on the list. There is also a section called My Select Reads that allows you to create a personalized newsletter with recommendations just for you. This newsletter is like having your own personal librarian sending you updates about new titles on subjects you have selected for yourself. It is as simple as choosing the topics that you are interested in and inputting

your email address. The service generates a weekly bulletin with book recommendations created especially for you — it's that simple! Try the Select Reads service today by going to the library website and select the online resources tab; the SelectReads links are located on the upper right side of the page. Putting diesel fuel in a gas engine is a nonstarter

Dear Car Talk: What happens if you put 5 gallons of diesel fuel in a gasoline engine's fuel tank, but you don't try to start the vehicle? — Anthony

Let me guess, Anthony. Asking for a friend? If you haven't tried to start the car, you haven't done any serious damage yet. Once you start the car, the fuel pump sends that diesel fuel into the fuel lines and through the injectors. And that makes a pretty good mess. But if all the diesel fuel is still in the tank, this is not going to require a home equity loan to fix.

The first step is to have the car towed to your mechanic. Obviously, you don't want to drive it to him. He'll drain your gas tank. Some cars actually have removable drains on their gas tanks. If yours is one of those, you're in fat city. He'll just open the drain over an approved container and let the entire contents of the fuel tank come out. Then close it up, add some fresh gasoline, and drain that mixture to get out most of the remaining diesel. He might even rinse it with fresh gas more than once.

If there's no drain on your gas tank, your mechanic will have to remove the gas tank and empty it for you. We call that "dropping the tank," even though we don't actually drop it. Well, once in a while we drop it. Anyway, once he dumps out

the existing fuel, your mechanic will do the same thing with some fresh gasoline, swishing it around in there to help remove whatever diesel remains. That should get rid of 99.98% of that diesel fuel.

Once you've drained and cleaned the fuel tank, there's nothing else you really need to do. Since you never started the car, don't get talked into replacing any fuel lines, filters, converters, seals or injectors. It won't be necessary.

Even if you have a little bit of diesel residue in the tank — the stuff that's still clinging to the walls — when mixed with enough gasoline, it should just get burned up in the cylinders and go out the tailpipe. By residue, I mean ounces, not pints or gallons.

I'd warn you to be careful to not do this again, but I'm sure that after you have to spend a couple of hundred bucks removing the tank, you won't need any further reminders. Good luck, Anthony.

Encore small crossover seeks to attract younger consumers to the Buick brand

Since arriving in the Buick lineup for 2013, the Encore small crossover, with a 2019 base price of just \$23,200 (plus \$995 freight), quickly became Buick's top-selling vehicle.

A major freshening of the five-passenger Encore made it even better for year 2017.

That brought a new, sculpted front end and streamlined design that included new front and rear fascias, a winged grille with a new Buick tri-color insignia, new headlights and taillights with LED signature lighting, a new hood and front fenders, and redesigned 18-inch alloy wheels.

The interior got its share of changes as well, with a new instrument layout, eight-inch touch-screen audio system, 4.2-inch driver-information screen, chrome accents, contrast stitching on upholstery, and premium materials.

The 2017 Encore also debuted such new features as pushbutton start, Android Auto and Apple CarPlay connectivity, keyless lock/unlock on the door handles, and improved six-power power-adjustable driver's seat (with manual recline).

For 2019, the trim levels have been dropped to four from last year's five, and include the base Encore (\$23,200), Preferred (\$24,600), Sport Touring (\$25,800) and Essence (\$29,300). Those prices are for front-wheel-drive models, but all-wheel drive can be added to any trim level except the base model for \$1,500.

Our test vehicle for this

Encore's all-wheel drive is designed to send power almost 50-50 to the front and rear on startup, but favors the front wheels in normal driving until the automatic system detects wheel slippage.

report was the top-end Essence model with all-wheel drive (base price \$30,800).

Also new for 2019 is the Safety Package II (\$940), available only on the Essence trim. It was included on our tester, and it added rain-sensing wipers, front and rear park assist, Forward Collision Alert, Lane Departure Warning and an air ionizer.

New exterior colors for 2019 are Satin Steel Gray Metallic, which was the color of our tester, and Deep Azure Metallic. On the Essence model, only Summit White is available at the base price. Our car's Satin Steel Gray, the Deep Azure and four other metallic colors — Ebony Twilight, Quicksilver, Winterberry Red and Coppertino — are \$495 extra, and White Frost Tricoat adds \$1,095 to the sticker price.

The Encore is a big part of efforts to bringing new, younger buyers to Buick as it tries to rebuild a brand that had long been

associated with big cars and older clientele.

This small crossover is a version of the Opel Mokka, from GM's now former German subsidiary that was sold to French automaker Peugeot in 2017. The Buick Encore and the similar Chevrolet Trax are assembled in GM's plant in South Korea.

Encore is a junior version of the full-size Enclave crossover, and is among a growing number of small crossovers introduced by a variety of automakers as more consumers look for vehicles that are versatile and economical to operate.

Along with the addition of the slightly larger China-built Envision compact crossover for 2016, Buick now has three crossovers, as well as a wagon version of the Opel-based Regal midsize sedan, called the Regal TourX.

With room for up to five people, the Encore was designed for young, upwardly mobile singles and couples looking for a

vehicle that fits their active lifestyles. It also appeals to empty-nesters and retired consumers.

For 2016, the Sport Touring model was added to the lineup. It comes with some unique features, such as 18-inch aluminum-alloy wheels with midnight silver finish, rear spoiler, and body-color door handles.

The base engine is a 1.4-liter turbocharged Ecotec four-cylinder with 138 horsepower and 148 foot-pounds of torque. It's connected to a six-speed automatic transmission.

Optional on the Sport Touring and Essence models, for \$250 extra, is a more-powerful 1.4-liter Ecotec turbo four-cylinder engine with start-stop technology. It has 153 horsepower and 177 foot-pounds of torque. It's also paired with a six-speed automatic. This engine was included on our test vehicle.

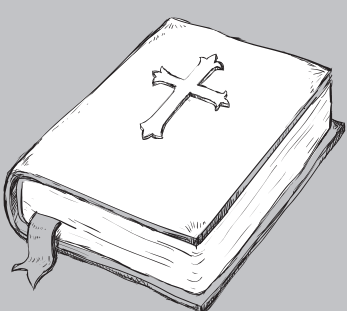

In the spirit of things, ghost-hunters haunt Arcadia

"Behind every man now alive stand 30 ghosts, for that is the ratio by which the dead outnumber the living."

Arthur C. Clarke, 2001: A Space Odyssey

The Indian River Hauntings/Florida Bureau of Paranormal Investigations group came to Arcadia recently for the great food at Mary Margaret's Tea & Biscuit ... and then to pursue ghosts. I tagged along to document the experience for Arcadian readers.

When asked as to why the group chose Arcadia, Larry Lawson, the Vero Beach group's founder, said that he had been asked to evaluate claims regarding paranormal activity relating to Royal Air Force training sites — Carlstrom and Dorr airfields — here in Arcadia and another in Clewiston. Twenty-three graves mark the sites of young pilots who died in training during WWII. When Lawson came to Arcadia, he enjoyed being here and wanted to share its history, including some of its ghost

stories. Saturday's visit was the end of that story.

Maybe you have gone on a ghost tour, sensed the presence of someone/something, had an uncanny experience of seeing something you could not explain, felt a cold breeze when something went by. Why in the 21st century do people seek out the paranormal? I contend it is because people still like old ghost stories as told around the campfire, or others such as the former British Prime Minister Winston Churchill reportedly seeing Abraham Lincoln's ghost in the White House. And because of TV shows and movies like "Ghost Adventures" or "Ghostbusters."

Or for some other reason that is significant to people's lives. Maybe they just like the adventure, the thrill of the unknown, communicating with those going before them. I'm not sure.

Twenty guests from Vero Beach, Sebastian, Sarasota and Arcadia joined Lawson and his investigators to learn about Arcadia's history, a definition of paranormal, to see equipment used in paranormal

investigations, and to socialize with others with a common interest in this field. Donna Iannotti from Vero Beach, for instance, made the two-hour drive with her sister and a friend because she found the event "interesting" and that she was "curious." She had never had a paranormal experience and had recently bought equipment to help her seek out the unusual.

It did not take long to know one had to have some knowledge of the "language" and terminology in this field. Some of the verbiage included: intelligent vs. residual hauntings, residual energies, apparition, shadow people, ADC, EVP, and infrasound. But more confusing was the array of equipment used — dowsing rods, EMF detectors, Mel Meter, Kinect SLS camera, EDI, K2 meter, EVP, REM Rod and the Ghost Box, to name but a few. Lawson and his group did an excellent job of explaining the concepts behind their paranormal work and the equipment they use ... and won't use.

The evening ended with a group of three teams

touring the downtown Opera House — a regular stopover for such tours — and Mary Margaret's, courtesy of the owner Helen Cooke. I joined the Mary Margaret's group with 10 others. Michael Maxwell and Lawson led the activity. Maxwell held two dowsing rods, like the

divining rods for water, and asked if anything was in the dark room that wanted to make its presence known and, if so, to let us know by moving the rods.

The rods moved. This was followed by a meter showing a drop in the temperature. Lights

came on another meter. Lawson saw movement on his Kinect camera. Why the meters reacted, we will never know.

The evening was both fun and educational. In the words of Larry Lawson: "We leave it to you and your beliefs."

For me, God is control.

with OnStar with 4G LTE connectivity and a built-in Wi-Fi hotspot. That gives everyone in the vehicle access to the Internet while the vehicle is in range of cell towers. GM says the hotspot is on whenever the car is running, and it includes a free three-month trial subscription. Encore's all-wheel drive is designed to send power almost 50-50 to the front and rear on startup, but favors the front wheels in normal driving until the automatic system detects wheel slippage. There is no low-range gearing for serious off-road driving, however.

Available high-tech safety features include Rear Cross Traffic Alert and Side Blind Zone Alert systems, included on all but the base model.

Driving the Encore is rather fun for a crossover. Even the base engine is turbocharged, which gives it a good boost when the accelerator is mashed. With either engine, you'll get the same six-speed automatic transmission.

The electric power steering was precise and predictable, and the four-wheel antilock disc brakes made for quick and sure stopping, even in the occasional near-panic situations that seem to occur with more frequency when traffic gets thick. With its small size and light weight (about 3,400 pounds), the Encore offers the best fuel economy in the Buick lineup, and EPA ratings that are among the best in the crossover realm. With the base

engine and front drive, the estimates are 25 mpg city/30 highway/27 combined; for all-wheel-drive models, 24/29/26. The optional turbo engine is rated slightly better, at 26/31/28 for front drive, and 25/30/27 with all-wheel drive.

During my test, I averaged about 26.8 mpg, with a combination of city and highway driving.

Inside, the Encore doesn't feel small. Tall people — six feet or more — can ride in comfort in the front bucket seats, and they're riding higher up than you would imagine in a vehicle with such a small exterior size. There is no feel of being in a tiny vehicle, sitting close to the ground.

Outside, the Encore looks somewhat like a junior-size version of the seven-passenger Enclave, with similar front-end styling and overall shape, and the signature Buick grille.

The Encore is about a foot shorter than the Honda CR-V. It's about the same size inside as the Volkswagen Tiguan, which is about six inches longer,

and the Audi Q5, which is about a foot-and-a-half longer.

We were able to seat three average-size adults in the rear bench seat for some short trips. Outboard passengers had plenty of leg and knee room, although the middle rider was a bit cramped and suggested that might not be a good place for a long trip. A child safety seat would fit there well, however, with two larger kids or even small-to medium-size adults on each side.

But the only cupholders in the back were a pair in a small pull-down center armrest that eliminates the middle seating position. Small door pockets were not wide enough to serve as bottle holders either in front or back.

In the front, the center console area provides two small cupholders and a lidded compartment for gadgets. In front of the shifter is a slanted cubby suitable for a couple of portable devices, and there are USB and auxiliary ports right next to a 12-volt power outlet in front of the storage spot.

There is 18.8 cubic feet of cargo space behind the rear seat, accessed through a rear hatch that flips up in one piece for easy loading and unloading. Fold down the rear seatback, though, and the cargo area expands to a whopping 48.4 cubic feet. You could get a big-screen TV box back there, if necessary.

Encore is relatively quiet inside, aided by Buick's exclusive QuietTuning, which uses Bose Active Noise Cancellation technology.

Even the base model comes loaded with features such as OnStar, cruise control, premium cloth upholstery, heated outside mirrors, six-way power driver's seat with

lumbar adjustment, and power windows/door locks with remote.

Also included are an AM/FM/CD/satellite audio system with eight-inch color display/USB port/Bluetooth connectivity, color-keyed carpeted floor mats, rear cargo cover, roof luggage rails, two gloveboxes, a theft-deterrent system, 18-inch painted cast-aluminum wheels, and a compact spare tire with jack.

Our top-end Essence model had leather seats, self-dimming rearview mirror, remote start, dual automatic climate control, 120-volt power outlet, fog lights, heated/leather-wrapped steering wheel, six-way power

passenger seat, and a driver memory package with settings for seat position, outside mirrors and climate control.

Other extras on our test vehicle included a power sunroof (\$900) and Bose premium audio system (\$595) with HD radio.

Standard safety features include 10 air bags, electronic stability control, rearview camera, cornering brake control with electronic brake assist, tire-pressure monitoring, and a safety-cage body designed to protect the occupants.

Total sticker price for our 2019 Buick Encore Essence with all-wheel drive was \$34,975, including freight and options.

A truck hauling lumber lost control and plowed into vehicles on Interstate 70, melting roadway

LAKEWOOD, Colo. — Four people died after a semi-truck hauling lumber lost control and plowed into vehicles on a crowded section of Interstate 70 near Denver, triggering explosions and

a fire so intense that it melted the roadway and metal off of cars, authorities said Friday.

“It was crash, crash, crash and explosion, explosion, explosion,” said John Romero, a spokesman for the Lakewood, Colorado, police department, describing the 28-vehicle chain reaction

of blasts from ruptured gas tanks.

The truck driver, Rogel Lazaro Aguilera-Mederos, 23, of Houston, was arrested on suspicion of vehicular homicide as police continue to investigate what happened.

Six people were taken to hospitals with injuries but their conditions were

unclear Friday.

“There is just a bunch of debris from this crash that took place. The carnage was significant, just unbelievable,” another department spokesman, Ty Countryman, said.

Officials say Aguilera-Mederos, who sustained

New study says universe expanding faster

Astronomer says universe may be a billion years younger than previously thought

WASHINGTON — The universe is expanding faster than it used to, meaning it's about a billion years younger than we thought, a new study by a Nobel Prize winner says. And that's sending a shudder through the world of physics, making astronomers re-think some of its most basic concepts.

At issue is a number called the Hubble constant, a calculation for how fast the universe is expanding. Some scientists call it the most important number in cosmology, the study of the origin and development of the universe.

Using NASA's Hubble Space Telescope, Johns Hopkins University astronomer Adam Riess concluded in this week's *Astrophysical Journal* that the figure is 9%

higher than the previous calculation, which was based on studying leftovers from the Big Bang.

The trouble is, Riess and others think both calculations are correct.

Confused? That's OK, so are the experts.

They find the conflict so confounding that they are talking about coming up with “new physics,” incorporating perhaps some yet-to-be-discovered particle or other cosmic “fudge factors” like dark energy or dark matter.

“It's looking more and more like we're going to need something new to explain this,” said Riess, who won the 2011 Nobel in physics.

NASA astrophysicist John Mather, another Nobel winner, said this leaves two obvious options: “1. We're making mistakes we can't find yet. 2. Nature has something we can't find yet.”

Even with the discovery, life continues on Earth the way it always has. But to astrophysicists trying to get a handle on our place in this expanding universe, this is a cosmic concern.

New measurements

To come up with his measurement of the Hubble constant, Riess looked to some not-so-distant stars.

Riess observed 70 Cepheid stars — stars that pulse at a well-observed rate — calculated their distance and rate, and then compared them with a certain type of supernovae that are used as measuring sticks. It took about two years for the Hubble telescope to make these measurements, but eventually Riess calculated an expansion rate of 74.

Using that 74 figure means the universe is somewhere between 12.5 billion and 13 billion years old. That's much younger than the established estimates of 13.6 billion to 13.8 billion.

“Hey, it's good news. Everybody likes to look

younger,” Riess said.

The old measurement

In 2013, the European Planck satellite helped scientists come up with a much slower expansion rate of about 67, but that was done in an entirely different, more complicated and less direct way and by looking at a much earlier time, when the universe was just a toddler.

The Planck team studied background radiation from a time just 370,000 years after the Big Bang. By examining cold and hot spots in that radiation, scientists figured out how big the spots were, which helped them determine how far away they were looking.

That team then fed those calculations into the standard model that astronomers use for the universe — based on Einstein's general relativity, among other things — factored in the known acceleration of the universe and came up with the

Trump tells NRA he's withdrawing from arms treaty

INDIANAPOLIS — In a largely symbolic gesture to a group that helped him win the White House, President Donald Trump said Friday he is pulling the U.S. back from an international agreement on the arms trade, telling the National Rifle Association the treaty is “badly misguided.”

Trump made the announcement at the NRA's annual convention, where he vowed to fight for gun rights and implored members of the nation's largest pro-gun group — struggling to maintain its influence — to rally behind his re-election bid.

“It's under assault,” he said of the constitutional right to bear arms. “But not while we're here.”

With pro-gun legislation largely stalled in Congress and few deliverables during Trump's term so far, the president told the group that he would be revoking the United States' status as a signatory of the U.N. Arms Trade Treaty, which regulates the multibillion-dollar global arms trade in conventional weapons, from small arms to battle tanks, combat aircraft and warships.

President Barack Obama signed the pact, which has long been opposed by the NRA, in 2013. But it has never been ratified by U.S. lawmakers.

“Under my administration, we will never surrender American sovereignty

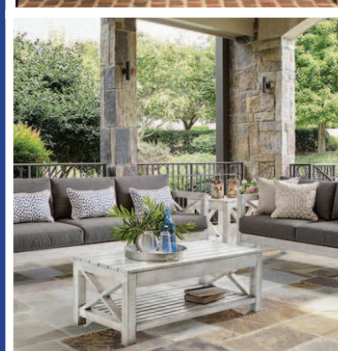

Sunday Mass canceled across Sri Lanka after bombings

Masses canceled until further notice over concerns it remains a top target of extremists

COLOMBO, Sri Lanka — Catholic leaders canceled Sunday Masses indefinitely across Sri Lanka and officials urged Muslims to stay home for Friday prayers in an extraordinary call by the clergy to curtail worship as fear of more attacks plagued the island nation after the deadly suicide bombings on Easter.

Shops were closed, streets were empty and heavy security patrols continued across the country despite police saying the alleged mastermind of the attacks that killed over 250 people had died in one of the suicide blasts.

Those Sri Lankans who did venture out spoke about the fear encompassing daily life at a level unseen since a long civil war ended a decade ago. Many are angry that the government, paralyzed by internal disputes, hadn't acted on intelligence obtained weeks before Easter that warned of the attacks.

On Friday night, Sri Lanka's military said its soldiers in the eastern part of the country engaged in a gunbattle with suspects believed to be linked to the attacks, and police announced a 24-hour curfew until further notice in the Muslim-dominated area where the shooting took place.

Continuing government confusion in its investigation — from drastically lowering the death toll to misidentifying a Brown University student as a

militant — only added to the public's worries.

"Everyone is nervous," said Abdullah Mohammed, a 48-year-old Muslim in Colombo. "Not just the Muslims. Buddhists, Christians, Hindus — everybody's nervous."

Officials from the police to the prime minister say militants remain on the loose and have access to explosives. That has led to increased security at shrines, churches, temples and mosques across the multiethnic country of 21 million off the southern coast of India.

Cardinal Malcolm Ranjith told journalists that church officials had seen a leaked security document describing Roman Catholic churches and other denominations as a major target. Ranjith, who is the archbishop of Colombo, asked the faithful across Sri Lanka to stay home for their own safety.

"We don't want repetitions," Ranjith said.

It was an extraordinary request for a Catholic clergyman to make, as churches often remain a refuge. It came on the day that priests allowed journalists inside one of the bombed churches, St. Anthony's Shrine in Colombo, where broken glass littered a blood-stained floor. Giovanni Maria Vian, a church historian and emeritus editor of the Vatican newspaper, said he believed it was the first time the church had cancelled Masses across a country for security reasons.

The U.S. Embassy in Sri Lanka also warned the public to stay away from

places of worship over the weekend, a stark alert underlining that authorities believe that attackers remain at large.

Authorities told Muslims to worship at home rather than attend communal Friday prayers that are the most important religious service of the week, but several mosques held services anyway. At a mosque in Colombo, police armed with Kalashnikov assault rifles stood guard outside for hundreds of worshippers as the imam inside and others wept while praying to Allah to help their country.

The Easter attackers are "not Muslims. This is not Islam. This is an animal," said Akurana Muhandramlage Jamaldeen Mohamed Jayfer, the chairman of the mosque. "We don't have a word (strong enough) to curse them."

Sri Lanka's government, crippled from a long political crisis between the president and prime minister last year, promised swift action to capture militants still at large. President Maithripala Sirisena said about 140 people had been identified as having links to the Islamic State group.

A "major search operation has been undertaken," Sirisena said. "Every household in the country will be checked."

On Friday night, soldiers raiding a house in Sri Lanka's Eastern Province fought a gunbattle with suspected militants linked to the bombings, said military spokesman Brig. Sumith Atapattu. After a couple of hours, he said soldiers were "engaged in a clearing operation," adding that some casualties were possible.

In the same area, police spokesman Ruwan Gunasekara said officers acting on information from intelligence officials found 150 sticks of blasting gelatin and 100,000 small metal balls, as well as a van and clothing suspected to be used by those involved in the Easter attack. Suicide bomb vests often are packed with such balls to increase the shrapnel in the explosion, making them even deadlier.

Earlier Friday, police confirmed the militant group's leader, Mohamed Zahran, died in the suicide bombing at the Shangri-La Hotel, one of six hotels and churches attacked. Zahran appeared in an Islamic State video

claiming responsibility for the coordinated assault, and authorities in both Sri Lanka and Australia confirmed links between IS and the attack.

Police said investigators had determined that the assailants' military training was provided by someone they called "Army Mohideen," and that weapons training had taken place overseas and at locations in Sri Lanka's Eastern Province.

Police said they arrested the operator of a copper factory who had helped Mohideen make improvised explosive devices and purchase empty cartridges sold by the Sri Lankan military as scrap copper.

On Thursday night, Sri Lanka's health ministry drastically reduced its estimated death toll from the bombings. A statement said "approximately" 253 people had been killed, nearly one-third lower than an earlier police estimate of 359 dead.

The discrepancy was not immediately explained, but it fit a pattern of confused reports by Sri Lankan officials that have muddled the investigation. On Friday, police apologized to a Brown University student and a human rights activist after they posted her picture to Twitter and erroneously identified her as a wanted militant. The police then deleted their Twitter account.

Trump confident US-Japan trade deal can be reached 'quickly'

WASHINGTON — President Donald Trump expressed confidence Friday that a bilateral trade deal between the U.S. and Japan can be reached quickly despite ongoing differences over tariffs as he opened talks with Prime Minister Shinzo Abe at the White House.

Abe is the rare world leader who has managed to develop a personal relationship with Trump. They get along so well that Abe and his wife, Akie, were joining Trump and his wife, Melania, for a couples' dinner Friday in the White House residence to celebrate the U.S. first lady's 49th birthday. The leaders planned to meet for a quick round of golf on Saturday.

But all the friendliness they put on display in the Oval Office didn't mask their differences over trade. Trump complained about Japan's tariffs on U.S. agricultural products while Abe aired his frustrations with U.S. levies on Japanese automobiles. Trump has slapped tariffs on steel and aluminum imports from Japan and has held the threat of even steeper auto tariffs over Abe's head.

Still, Trump sounded optimistic that an agreement will be struck.

"Ultimately, we have a chance to make a good and very long-term trade deal with Japan," the president said.

Asked later about the timetable, Trump said: "I think it can go quickly. I think it can go fairly quickly. Maybe by the time I'm over there, maybe we sign it over there. But it's moving along very nicely and we'll see what happens."

Trump plans to travel to Japan in late May with the first lady for a state visit to meet the country's

new emperor.

In their talks Friday, the two leaders were also expected to discuss North Korea's nuclear program and efforts by the U.S. and other nations to achieve a denuclearized Korean Peninsula. Trump and Abe met on the heels of Thursday's nuclear talks between North Korean leader Kim Jong Un and President Vladimir Putin of Russia. Trump's second summit with Kim in Hanoi in February ended with no agreement, but Trump said earlier Friday that progress is being made.

"I have a great relationship with Kim Jong Un," Trump told reporters. He said he appreciated help on the issue from Russia and China.

Kim had harsher words for Trump. North Korea's state-run Korean Central News Agency said Friday that Kim strongly criticized Washington for taking a "unilateral attitude in bad faith" that caused the diplomatic standstill following the Hanoi meeting.

Abe has had more face time and telephone conversations with Trump than any other world leader, said Michael J. Green, senior vice president for Asia and Japan Chair at the Center for Strategic and International Studies.

Abe was the first foreign leader to personally court Trump after he won the 2016 presidential election, visiting the then-president-elect at his Trump Tower penthouse in New York and bringing a golf club as a gift. They share a love of golf and have teed off together both in Japan and the U.S.

The president said he and Abe would head out very early on Saturday to play a "quick round of golf at a very beautiful place on the Potomac River. I won't name the place, but it's beautiful."

Trump said he asked his wife if she'd like the Abes to join them for her birthday dinner "and she said, 'I can't think of anybody I'd rather have.'" Abe told Trump: "I do look forward to celebrating this special day with you."

Trump also discussed some of the details of his planned visit to Japan, including the possibility of attending a sumo wrestling match.

"I've always found that fascinating" and "something I'll enjoy very much," he said. He said a trophy is being made for him to present to the winner.

The United States and Japan announced in September 2018 that they would open trade negotiations. Talks opened last week.

Amazon to bring 1-day delivery to Prime members

NEW YORK — Two-day delivery is going out of style.

Amazon, which hooked shoppers on getting just about anything shipped in two days, said this week that it will soon promise one-day delivery for its U.S. Prime members on most items.

The company hopes that cutting delivery times in half will make its \$119-a-year Prime membership more attractive, since nearly every other online store offers free deliveries in two days. Amazon also can't compete with Walmart and Target, where ordering online and picking up at a store is becoming more popular with shoppers.

"It is a smart change, but it is also one that is becoming increasingly necessary," said Neil Saunders, managing director at GlobalData Retail. "Other retailers have really upped their game in terms of delivery."

Still, Saunders said the shift is likely to put even more pressure on Amazon's retail rivals, as shoppers become accustomed to even faster shipping times. Shares of Walmart and Target fell Friday, a day after Amazon's announcement.

Walmart and Target offer free two-day shipping for those who spend over \$35 on their website. And both companies have been turning their physical stores

into shipping hubs, speeding up deliveries and helping to defray costs.

Walmart Inc. declined to comment Friday. Target Corp. said its shoppers already have ways to receive purchases "within hours."

Amazon didn't say when the change to its U.S. Prime membership will happen, but it said Thursday that in the past month it has been increasing its selection of items eligible for one-day deliveries.

In some other countries, such as the U.K., Prime members are already offered one-day shipping.

Brian Olsavsky, Amazon.com Inc.'s chief financial officer, said the Seattle company is equipped to offer one-day shipping, since it has spent more than 20 years adding warehouses around the country where orders are packed and shipped.

Amazon has also been delivering more packages itself, rather than relying on UPS, the post office and other carriers. It has expanded its fleet of jets, has plans to open package sorting hubs at two airports and launched a program last year that allows contractors around the country to deliver Amazon packages in vans stamped with the Amazon smile logo.

Still, Amazon said that it expects to spend \$800 million in this year's second quarter to speed up deliveries.

US stocks close higher as S&P 500, Nasdaq hit new highs

Wall Street capped a week of milestones by delivering a couple more Friday

Wall Street capped a week of milestones by delivering a couple more Friday.

A late-afternoon burst of buying lifted the major U.S. stock indexes, which had spent much of the day in a sideways drift. The gains nudged the benchmark S&P 500 index and Nasdaq composite to new closing highs for the second time this week. Both indexes also set record highs on Tuesday.

The Dow Jones Industrial Average eked out a gain, but ended the week slightly lower.

The market's latest milestones came as investors weighed a mixed bag of corporate earnings. Solid quarterly reports from Ford and Amazon helped lift the market. Weaker showings from Intel and Exxon Mobil cut into the Dow's gains.

Smaller company stocks fared better than the rest of the market, a bullish sign indicating that investors were more willing to take on risk.

While company earnings were mixed, investors drew encouragement from a government report estimating that the U.S. economy grew at a solid 3.2% annual rate in the first three months of the year — a much bigger increase than expected.

"The first quarter number is typically the weakest of the year, so the fact that this number was so strong is a positive sign going forward," said Cliff Hodge, director of investments for Cornerstone Wealth.

The S&P 500 rose 13.71 points, or 0.5%, to 2,939.88. The broad index

is now up 17.3% this year. The Dow rose 81.25 points, or 0.3%, to 26,543.33. The Nasdaq composite recovered from an early slide, adding 27.72 points, or 0.3%, to 8,146.40.

The Russell 2000 index of smaller company stocks climbed 16.20 points, or 1%, to 1,591.82.

Major European stock indexes ended mostly higher.

Bond prices rose. The yield on the 10 year Treasury fell to 2.50% from 2.53% late Thursday.

The S&P 500's latest all-time high underscores the market's blockbuster turnaround this year after nosediving at the end of 2018 amid fears of a recession, an escalating trade war between the U.S. and China, and concern that the Federal Reserve was moving too aggressively to

raise interest rates.

In the months since, those concerns have eased or taken a back seat to more optimism among investors about the prospects for steady economic growth. Improved economic data out of China and signals that Washington and Beijing are making progress toward resolving their costly trade dispute has also helped ease market jitters.

Perhaps most of all, traders have been encouraged by an increasingly hands-off Fed, which has signaled that it may not raise interest rates at all in 2019 after seven increases the previous two years.

More recently, companies that have reported first quarter results have mostly met profit forecasts, taking some

pressure off the market.

U.S. companies are about a third of the way through their latest round of quarterly reports. So far they've avoided analysts' most dire predictions for a severe contraction.

"It's marginally better than expected, so the market has rallied a bit," said Andrew Slimmon, managing director and senior portfolio manager at Morgan Stanley Investment Management.

Meanwhile, investor fears of a potential recession have subsided since the year started, helping the market steadily recover from its fourth-quarter meltdown.

"With no recession, the market was due for a bounce back," he said, noting that investors seem to be complacent with a less volatile market, which

he said could be setting it up for a pullback.

Wall Street's strong recover this year has helped fuel a surge in corporate deals. So far this year, there have been \$711 billion in mergers and acquisitions in the U.S., the fastest start to a year on record, according to Dealogic.

The market has also been rewarding some technology companies since their highly anticipated stock market debuts. Pinterest and Zoom both went public earlier this month and are trading near their raised initial prices. Ride-hailing company Uber and messaging platform Slack are set to be the next technology companies to open up for public investment.

All told, 34 IPOs have been completed this year, raising \$9.5 billion, down from 55 IPOs that raised \$18.5 billion in the same period last year, said Kathleen Smith, principal at Renaissance Capital, a provider of pre-IPO research and IPO exchange-traded funds.

Smith noted that the upcoming \$8.5 billion Uber IPO and a pipeline of over 200 others, could make 2019 a record year for capital raised in the IPO market.

On Friday, gains in financial, health care and other sectors offset losses in technology stocks. Energy companies also fell as the price of U.S. crude oil slumped for the third straight day.

Ford Motor rode its trucks and SUVs to a solid first-quarter profit. The stock vaulted 10.7%.

Amazon gained 2.5% a day after the e-commerce giant said its profit more

than doubled in the first quarter.

Intel shares tumbled 9% after the chipmaker warned that weak demand in China will likely continue through the current quarter. It slashed its forecast for the quarter and expects a drop in revenue for the year. Exxon Mobil slid 2.1% after the oil company's first quarter profit fell by half, missing forecasts due to more spending on oil production and lower margins in its refinery business.

Exxon was part of a broad slide in energy sector stocks Friday, as the price of benchmark U.S. crude oil fell 2.9% to settle at \$63.30 a barrel.

Oil prices increased during the first quarter following an agreement by OPEC and allies including Russia to limit production. More recently, prices have risen after the U.S. government announced it will end waivers from sanctions for countries that import oil from Iran, including China, India, Japan and South Korea.

Energy futures finished mostly lower.

Brent crude, the international standard, fell 3% to close at \$72.15 per barrel. Wholesale gasoline slid 1.5% to \$2.10 per gallon. Heating oil dropped 2.2% to \$2.05 per gallon. Natural gas rose 2.1% to \$2.57 per 1,000 cubic feet.

Gold rose 0.7% to \$1,288.80 per ounce, silver gained 0.8% to \$15.01 per ounce and copper added 0.9% to \$2.89 per pound.

The dollar slipped to 111.61 Japanese yen from 111.62 yen late Thursday. The euro strengthened to \$1.1154 from \$1.1128.

The answer is not always as obvious as you might think

"A day without sunshine is like, you know, night." That Steve Martin quote might seem obvious, but the humor comes from the fact that we just hadn't thought of it that way!

What is obvious but not funny is the difficulty folks have seeing the connection between certain health problems and serious complications that threaten quality of life and even life itself. So here are some important causes and effects that you'll want to learn about and act on, so you can thrive.

other health-damaging beliefs and misinformation:

— Fully 46 percent believe artificial sweeteners help you lose weight, when studies show they don't help.

— Most Americans don't know that obesity is linked to elevated lousy LDL cholesterol levels or coronary artery disease, and 64 percent don't know it can lead to a stroke.

Your takeaway: If you're gaining weight or are overweight or obese, you have great power to chart a new history for your family and

become heart healthier. The first step is to give up the Five Food Felons: red and processed meats, added sugars and syrups, and any grain that isn't 100 percent whole. Then move aerobically for at least 30 minutes, five days a week and do strength training twice a week.

One: Type 2 diabetes or prediabetes affects more than 100 million Americans.

Plus One: About 20 percent of adults with Type 2 diabetes — 7.2 million Americans — don't know they have it. Only 11.6 percent of adults with prediabetes know they have it.

Equals: Around one third of the U.S. population is at risk for serious complications related to prediabetes or diabetes.

Your takeaway: Lack of physical activity is a huge contributor to the development of diabetes-related complications. Research shows that as you age, if you build instead of lose muscle mass, you live longer! So start a walking group and get out for 30-60 minutes five times a week.

One: Forty-five million Americans go on a diet every year. But two-thirds of weight lost is generally regained within a year. About 75 million Americans have high blood pressure, but less than half of them have it under control.

Plus One: Frequent fluctuations in weight and blood pressure (as well as glucose and LDL cholesterol) cause stress on all of your systems and promote inflammation.

Equals: A study in Circulation found that those with the greatest ups and downs in weight were 53 percent more likely to die of heart disease, and those with the greatest fluctuations in blood pressure were 19 percent more likely to die of cardio complications.

Your takeaway: Before you develop heart disease, adopt a healthy diet and regular exercise routine — and stick with it. If you're diagnosed with those conditions, stick with medications and lifestyle changes. Your goal: Walking 10,000 steps a day this year; keep it up next year.

Meth smoking Florida man attacks mattress in jealous rage

FORT WALTON BEACH, Fla. (AP) — An apparently hallucinating Florida man used a bedpost to attack a mattress where he thought a man was hiding.

In a Facebook post, The Okaloosa County Sheriff's office quotes the girlfriend of 37-year-old Felipe Oquendo as saying that he began acting erratically early Friday. The girlfriend told deputies Oquendo thought she was cheating on him with a man he thought he saw in the mattress at their Fort Walton Beach home.

She said Oquendo hit the mattress with a bed post, ripped it apart and locked the bedroom door. She was able to escape and call police.

The sheriff's office says Oquendo later admitted to having smoked meth.

Jail records don't list a lawyer for him.

Florida developer pleads guilty in investment fraud scheme

BRIDGEPORT, Conn. (AP) — A Florida real estate developer has pleaded guilty in federal court in Connecticut to money laundering and tax offenses in connection with a failed hotel-condominium project.

Prosecutors say 61-year-old Robert Matthews, of Palm Beach, pleaded guilty Thursday to bilking foreign investors of millions of dollars by making attractive but false promises of celebrity and politician involvement in the project.

They say he moved investor funds through banks in Connecticut and Florida, and used the money to pay his and his wife Maria's credit card debts, and to purchase two properties in the small Connecticut town of Washington.

Prosecutors say the couple evaded paying taxes by using limited liability companies, a company bank account, and their attorney's trust account to pay personal expenses.

Both remain free pending sentencing at an undetermined date.

Russian Maria Butina gets 18 months for being Kremlin agent

Secret agent for the Russian government to be deported after serving prison sentence

WASHINGTON — In a quivering voice, Maria Butina begged for leniency, casting herself as a comparative innocent caught up in a massive geopolitical power game.

Prosecutors held a dimmer view, saying the 30-year-old Russian deliberately obscured her true purposes while developing backdoor contacts inside the American conservative movement to advance the interests of Russia.

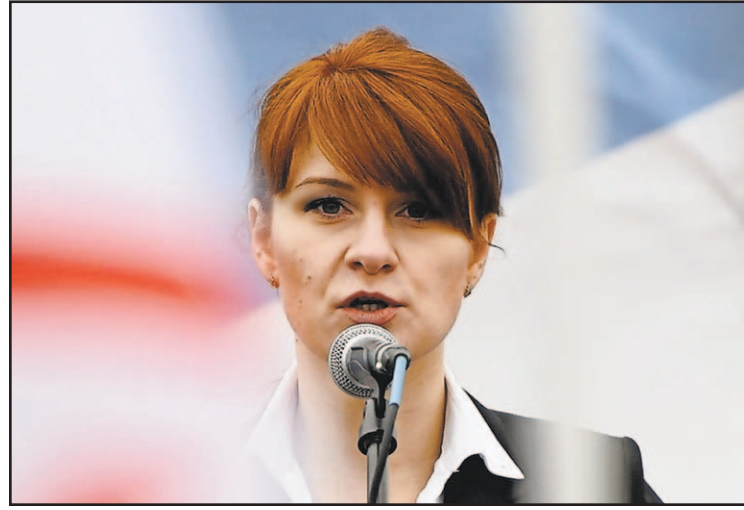
On Friday a U.S. District Court judge sided with the government version, sentencing Butina to 18 months in prison, followed by deportation. The judgment, which Butina can appeal, is a turning point in the high-profile case that garnered intense media coverage amid speculation over the extent of Russian interference in American politics.

Butina has been jailed since her July 2018 arrest, and admitted last year to covertly gathering intelligence on the National Rifle Association and other groups at the direction of a former Russian lawmaker. Her guilty plea to a single charge of conspiracy to act as an unregistered foreign agent came as part of a deal with federal prosecutors.

At Friday's sentencing hearing, Butina appealed to U.S. District Judge Tanya Chutkan to release her with nine months of time served.

"My reputation is ruined, both here in the United States and abroad," she said, asking for "a chance to go home and restart my life."

Chutkan, however, fully complied with the

government's recommendation and sentenced Butina to spend an additional nine months behind bars, before being deported.

The judge said the sentence was meant "to reflect the seriousness of (Butina's actions) and to promote deterrence."

Butina's lawyers decried the judgment as overly harsh; they had characterized Butina as a naive but ambitious international affairs student who simply didn't realize her actions required her to register as an agent of a foreign government.

"I feel terrible for Maria's family...I wish we could have done more to get her out sooner," said attorney Robert Driscoll. "I do not believe an additional nine months in jail serves any purpose."

The Russian Embassy in Washington said in a Facebook post that Butina "is a political prisoner, a victim of provocations by special services and the arbitrary use of repressive

US legislation. We insist on the innocence of our compatriot. We demand her immediate release. We will continue to provide her with comprehensive consular and legal assistance."

According to her plea agreement, Butina worked with former Russian lawmaker Alexander Torshin to use their contacts in the NRA to pursue back channels to American conservatives during the 2016 presidential campaign. All the while, she did not report her activities to the U.S. government as required by law.

Butina had faced a maximum sentence of five years in prison. Her case is unrelated to special counsel Robert Mueller's investigation into Russian interference in the 2016 election, which concluded last month.

A statement from the U.S. Attorney's office stated that Butina was guilty of acting as an unregistered "agent of a foreign government."

smaller expansion rate. The end result: a 13.8-billion-year-old universe.

Riess calculated the odds that the disparity between the two calculations was an accident at 1 in 100,000.

Fudge factors

While there is a chance either the Riess team or the Planck team is off, astronomers are talking about both being right.

Both calculations make sense and "nobody can find anything wrong at this point," said distinguished University of Chicago astrophysicist Wendy Freedman. Other outside experts praised both teams' research.

If that's the case, astrophysicists need to make adjustments in Einstein's general relativity theory.

"You need to add

something into the universe that we don't know about," said Chris Burns, an astrophysicist at the Carnegie Institution for Science. "That always makes you kind of uneasy."

In the past, astronomers added hard-to-fathom dark energy and dark matter to explain why calculations didn't add up, borrowing from a once-discarded Einstein theory. Now they're saying they need to do something similar again.

It could be there's an extra "turbocharge" from a past odd pulse of dark energy — an unseen expansion force that fits well in Einstein's theories — that caused the speeded-up expansion, Riess said.

Or there could be a new particle of matter that hasn't been discovered, Burns said.

"We have this dark sector that already has two ingredients, and

maybe we're discovering a third," said Planck team member Lloyd Knox of the University of California, Davis. "That's a scary prospect. Are we just going to always be introducing fudge factors?"

A third approach

Astronomers at the University of Chicago, led by Freedman, spent five years looking at different stars than Riess to come up with a third calculation of the expansion rate. They just submitted their work to the same journal. Freedman wouldn't reveal her number but said it is between the two other figures.

Twenty years ago, Freedman was part of similar debate about the Hubble constant, when there were few measurements to work with.

"It's an exciting journey to try to understand what the origin of the universe is," she said.

to anyone," Trump said, before signing a document on stage directing the Senate to halt the ratification process. "We will never allow foreign diplomats to trample on your Second Amendment freedom."

"I hope you're happy," he told the group, then appeared surprised by the cheers. "I'm impressed," he said. "I didn't think too many of you would really know what it is."

His move against the treaty came as Trump sought to excite an organization that was pivotal to his victory in 2016 but, three years later, is limping toward the next election divided and diminished. And it represents just the latest in a series of withdrawals from international pacts and organizations joined by previous administrations, like the Paris climate accord and the Iran nuclear deal.

Gun activists had denounced the treaty when it was under negotiation as an infringement of civilian firearm ownership, despite the well-enshrined legal principle that says no treaty can override the Constitution or U.S. laws. The treaty is aimed at cracking down on illicit trading in small arms, thereby curbing violence in some of the most troubled corners of the world.

It was the first legally binding treaty to regulate the international trade in conventional arms and was overwhelmingly approved by the 193-member U.N. General Assembly in April 2013. It has been ratified by 101 countries — but key arms exporters including

Russia and China and major importers such as India and Egypt have given no indication that they will sign it.

Advocates of tighter gun restrictions and those who had helped negotiate the treaty denounced Trump's decision Friday.

Kris Brown, president of the Brady organization, said will "only embolden terrorists and other dangerous actors around the world." And Rachel Stohl, managing director of the Stimson Center and a consultant to the treaty negotiations, said: "By turning its back on multilateral diplomacy yet again, the United States is disregarding global norms and allowing nefarious actors to trade weapons with impunity."

Yet Trump's showy rejection of the agreement from the stage has limited effect because it has been unlikely all along that he would send the treaty to the Senate for ratification.

At the United Nations, spokesman Stephane Dujarric called the treaty "a landmark achievement in the efforts to ensure responsibility in international arms transfers" and particularly important at a time of renewed interest in expanding weapons arsenals.

Trump's speech came at a troubled time for the gun rights organization, a one-time Republican kingmaker, which has been grappling with infighting, bleeding money and facing a series of investigations into its operating practices, including allegations that covert Russian agents seeking to influence the 2016 election courted its officials and funneled money through the group.

Pilot rescued from plane that crash-landed atop Idaho tree

MCCALL, Idaho (AP) — A pilot who was trying to crash-land this week in an Idaho field instead brought his small plane to rest at the top of a 60-foot tree, officials said.

Pilot John Gregory was not hurt in the Monday night crash, which happened when his single-engine Piper Cub PA-18 lost power and a wing strut became entangled in the tree, according to the fire department in the resort town of McCall.

Gregory was rescued from his perch atop the giant white fir by volunteer firefighter Randy Acker, who owns a tree removal company.

"My thought was, 'I need to get up there and see what's going on,'" Acker said.

Acker had Gregory stand up in the plane so he could cut the pilot's harness and clip him to a safety line for the descent. Gregory was brought down safely with the plane still lodged in the branches.

Most of the weight of the plane was borne by one tree, but it also was touching a nearby tree. "Those wings were perfectly centered over the top of the tree," said McCall Fire Capt. Brandon Swain.

A piece of the plane's propeller and one of its wheels had fallen to the ground, but the rest of the plane was intact, suspended in the tree.

Dolphins trade for Rosen

Miami slides from 48th pick to acquire Arizona quarterback while acquiring additional picks from Cardinals and Saints

DAVIE — The Miami Dolphins may have acquired their quarterback of the future.

The Dolphins traded for Arizona Cardinals quarterback Josh Rosen during the second round of the 2019 NFL draft Friday night.

The Dolphins traded the No. 62 pick in the second round to the Cardinals for Rosen, the former UCLA standout and No. 10 overall pick in the 2018 draft.

The Cardinals were poised to move Rosen after drafting Oklahoma quarterback Kyler Murray with the first pick in the 2019 draft Thursday night.

The Dolphins, in need of a starting quarterback, were a willing trade partner.

Earlier, the Dolphins traded their No. 48 pick in the second round and No. 116 pick in the fourth to the New Orleans Saints for two second-round picks, one of which is in 2020, and a sixth-round pick this year.

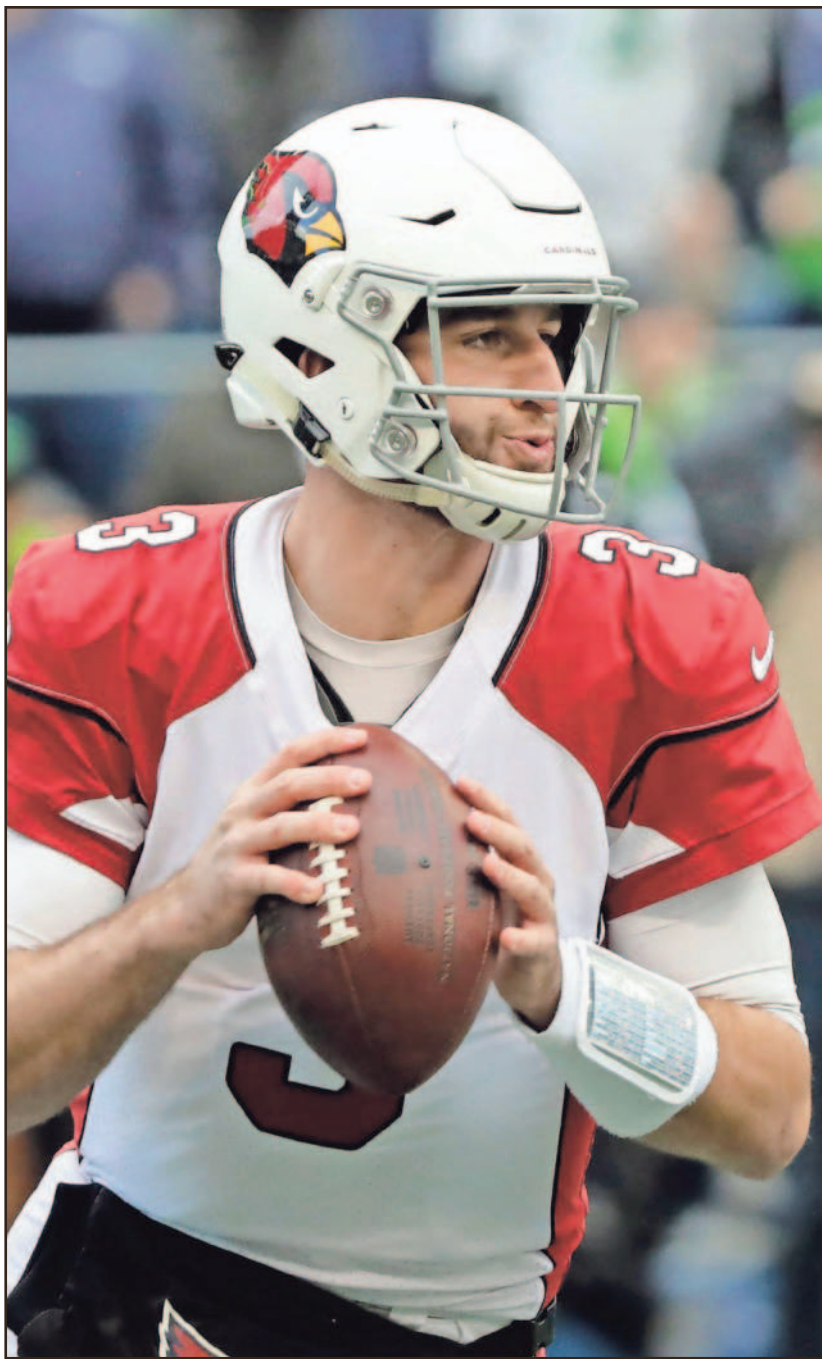
The Dolphins own the No. 62 pick (30th in the second round) and acquired No. 202 in the sixth.

The new 2020 second-round pick becomes Miami's 13th selection next year.

The Dolphins chose to trade back in the second round, while still remaining in trade talks for Arizona Cardinals quarterback Josh Rosen.

The Dolphins were in negotiations with the Cardinals throughout the day about a possible trade for Rosen, with Arizona seeking a second-round pick for the former UCLA standout and No. 10 overall pick a year ago.

As of now, the Dolphins chose to acquire two more picks in exchange of their second-round pick. With the 78th pick, they

Venice basketball coach resigns

Bullying, threats were alleged against girls' high school coach Joel Holloway to school board and news outlet

Venice High School is in need of a new girls basketball coach after the school accepted the resignation of former girls basketball coach Joel Holloway.

School administrators said that Holloway "stepped down to pursue other opportunities" on Thursday in a press release sent out to local media.

This comes after months of fielding complaints from parents of the Lady Indians.

The issues one parent had with the former coach became public in early March when Troy Dooling brought his complaints before the Sarasota County School Board.

"I have written every board member on this issue of my daughter being bullied by a coach and the threats that followed by the coach, the athletic director and a vice principal," Dooling said at a Sarasota County School Board meeting. "I received one response and it basically said, 'I'm sorry the coach upset your daughter, but the school will have to handle this.'"

"This is the same school and administration that had already threatened consequences if we spoke out on this matter. That did not give me confidence this would be dealt with, but just swept under the rug as it has with other parents."

For several parents, who also brought their

complaints to the *Venice Gondolier Sun*, the final straw was Venice's season-ending loss to Lakewood Ranch in the quarterfinals of the district tournament on Feb. 4.

The final game

When the Venice girls basketball team began the district playoffs, there were clear signs of a problem.

Not only were the Lady Indians' leading scorers — Miranda Hoffer and Ellie DiGiacomo — on the bench to start the game, but regular starter Kirstin Dooling wasn't even suited up to play against Lakewood Ranch.

Though Venice had beaten the Mustangs, 58-47, two weeks earlier, the Indians were easily eliminated from the

playoffs that night.

Asked after the game why his two best players were benched, Holloway said he had 'no comment' on the issue. The former coach also declined to be interviewed for this story.

However, the benchings were a punishment for a social media post and the defense of it, according to Kirstin Dooling.

"They did not care what he thought," she said. "They were saying how it's unfair, and he didn't like that. He didn't like that they wouldn't take his side. Some of the girls on the team showed him the team group chat conversation."

"I sent, 'I'm sorry, but I'm not gonna let him do

Chiefs: DA reopens domestic violence case involving Hill

New audio adds disturbing details involving wide receiver

OVERLAND PARK, Kan. — Kansas City Chiefs coach Andy Reid said Friday a local prosecutor has reopened a domestic violence investigation involving suspended wide receiver Tyreek Hill after a TV station broadcast audio in which Hill and his fiancée discuss injuries to their 3-year-old son.

Reid and general manager Brett Veach both declined comment about Hill's case and potential next steps involving their star player. The prosecutor, Johnson County District Attorney Steve Howe, did not immediately return a message.

"I'm not going to have too much to add," Veach said in response to multiple questions about Hill. "As I said yesterday, we're going to continue to gather information, evaluate information and, as I said yesterday, we'll make the right decision when the time is appropriate."

Police were called to Hill's home twice last month and determined the child had been injured.

On Wednesday, Howe said he would not file charges against Hill or Espinal even though his office believed a crime

had occurred. He said available evidence didn't establish who had hurt the child.

"As a prosecutor, as a father of four, yes, it frustrates me when someone hurts a child and you can't do anything about it," Howe said then. "One of the elements of a crime is you have to prove who that person is who committed the act."

A day later, KCTV in Kansas City aired part of an 11-minute audio file in which Espinal tells Hill earlier this year that when the boy was asked about his injured arm he replied: "Daddy did it."

Hill denied any role in what happened to the child, saying: "He says Daddy does a lot of things."

Espinal also tells Hill their son is "terrified of you."

Hill replies, "You need to be terrified of me, too, bitch."

Later, Espinal asks Hill, "What do you do when the child is bad? You make him open up his arms and you punch him in the chest."

Howe has not responded to requests for comment about the audio recording, which the TV station said has been provided to his office. KCTV said the

"With the way the microbreweries are these days and how popular different brews are today, I thought it would be a natural fit," Maddon said at an introductory media event this week in Chicago.

Wilkins gets early start to pass rush

Dolphins' first round pick sacks Goodell

DAVIE — Moments after becoming a Miami Dolphin, defensive tackle Christian Wilkins nearly sacked Roger Goodell.

Wilkins gleefully leaped into the commissioner on the draft stage in Nashville, Tennessee. The Dolphins hope it was the first of many NFL celebrations by Wilkins, a 315-pound lineman from Clemson with an outsize personality to match.

A rebuilding project has left the Dolphins perceived as the league's lightweights, and to help change that, they used the 13th overall pick on the bulky Wilkins.

Wilkins was thrilled to be Miami-bound, as Goodell could attest after being targeted with a flying shoulder bump.

"He wasn't too upset about it," Wilkins said with a laugh.

"He wished me good luck. I'm surprised he didn't hit back or anything. I did get him kind of hard. My shoulder is actually hurting a little bit from how hard I bumped him, but I was just so excited."

Dolphins, who went 7-9 last year, followed up their selection of Wilkins by trading their second round pick for Arizona quarterback Josh Rosen

after moving back in the draft by swapping picks with the New Orleans Saints in exchange for two draft picks in 2020. Rosen was the 10th pick in last year's draft. Last year the first-team All-American Wilkins had 15 tackles for a loss and six sacks. The Dolphins had an extensive scouting report on Wilkins because their new defensive line coach, Marion Hobby, was his position coach at Clemson. Wilkins helped the Tigers win two national titles, and became their first scholarship player

to earn a degree in 2 1/2 years. "I know about the history — guys like Dan Marino and Jason Taylor who put on that uniform," he said. "I want to work hard so I can get to the point where I can be considered great like those guys." Wilkins turned reflective when asked about his grandfather, killed in 2011 when a SWAT team rifle accidentally discharged during a raid. "My grandfather meant everything to me," Wilkins said. "He was the most influential person in my life."

NFL aerial circus makes for 2nd round of DBs, WRs

NASHVILLE, Tenn. — So you want proof the NFL is an aerial circus? Try the second round of the draft.

Of Friday night's 32 picks, 11 were defensive backs charged with holding down pass catchers, of which seven were chosen. Plus another seven offensive linemen charged with protecting the guys who throw the ball.

Only one of those, Drew Lock of Missouri, was taken in Round 2, going to Denver 42nd overall after the Broncos traded up with Cincinnati to get Lock. Some projections had him going in the opening round.

The defensive big guys dominated the opening round, then there was much more of a mix on Friday. Again, the SEC had the most picks with 13, on top of the nine the previous night.

"In the SEC, I had 35 career starts," Taylor said. "I left a year early, but I feel like I was ready and prepared to play in the NFL because I played against a lot of great competition. Definitely playing at Florida, playing in such a great conference, prepared me for this role."

The second round began with cornerbacks Byron Murphy of Washington and Rock Ya-Sin of Temple going to Arizona and Indianapolis respectively.

Florida's Jawaan Taylor enters the stage after the Jacksonville Jaguars selected Taylor in the second round.

A bit later, that run continued with Central Michigan's Sean Bunting, Clemson's Trayvon Mullen, Vanderbilt's Joejuan Williams, LSU's Greedy Williams — at one point considered the top defensive back in this crop — and Utah safety Marquise Blair.

It didn't subside until safety Juan Thornhill of Virginia went to the Chiefs on the penultimate selection in the second round.

One spot later, Seattle moved up for Mississippi WR DK Metcalf, who was rated by some of the best wideout in this group.

Arizona finally pulled off the trade of QB Josh Rosen, expendable because the Cardinals took Oklahoma's Kyle Murray to start proceedings on Thursday night. Miami sent the 62nd overall spot to the desert for Rosen, a first-rounder a year ago. The Cardinals opted for UMass receiver Andy Isabella with that pick.

Lemon Bay grad excels at Florida Southwestern

Freshman Rincones has batted a team-best .325 and shares the team lead with 30 RBIs

Warnner Rincones has been the master of multi-hit games for the Florida Southwestern State College baseball team.

The freshman out of Lemon Bay High School entered Friday's action with a team-high 13 multi-hit efforts, including four with three hits. In 37 games, he batted a team-best .325 and shared the team lead with 30 runs batted in.

"Some days I'm seeing the ball pretty well. Some games it comes out my way," the second baseman said. "I'm pretty good at battling the pitches until I get the pitch I want. Usually if I have two strikes, I'm trying to foul it off until I get the right pitch to hit."

Of course, his preferred pitch is the fastball. He had two hits, including a two-run triple, in five at-bats and four RBIs against South Florida State. "I was ahead in the count," he said of his first triple. "I got a fastball to hit."

"I usually try to hit where the ball is thrown and put a good move on it," he said.

Hitting in the top third of the order, he had a season-high five RBIs three days later against South Florida. He had three hits in five at-bats.

During the games against South Florida, he has seen former Manta Ray teammate Trey Fields, who transferred there after not seeing action at Florida Gulf Coast University last year.

Rincones said they have played together since Little League and that he got to talk to Fields after games.

Rincones had 25 stolen bases, second on the squad,

in 30 attempts. He had a .945 fielding percentage in 109 chances, fourth most on the team.

Men's golf

The fun in golf remains for Jacob Goldman and Jimmy Laurin.

Port Charlotte High graduate Goldman and Charlotte High product Laurin are a part of the National Collegiate Club Golf Association.

Sophomore Goldman plays for Florida State University, while senior Laurin competes for University of Florida. Although both clubs play in the North Florida Region, Goldman and Laurin haven't faced each other in tournaments.

Goldman said he considered playing for Tennessee Wesleyan University, where current Pirate Jeovani Veloz golfs, after high school.

But club route proved a better fit, and he gets to compete against golfers talented enough to play for college teams. "I didn't want it to seem like a job," he said. "It's more fun. I get to enjoy it a little more."

At the start of every semester, the club has a tournament to decide the eight golfers on the A squad and eight on the B. Events typically are in Tallahassee, Orlando and Ocala, he said, and he has been able to compete in most of the two or three events per semester. "I like to be able to contribute any way I can," he said.

Goldman has been on the A team both years. He shot 160 (80-80) to finish 10th at a recent Ocala tournament. He was fourth on the squad there and at a September event too. "I've been struggling," he said. "Overcorrecting and thinking a

little bit too much."

He said he has been trying to slow down, take a breath before every swing. "Off the tee has always been my issue, not hitting enough fairways and not putting it close enough to the pin," he said.

Laurin, too, contemplated playing for a college team. "I figured it wouldn't be a big-name school," he said. "I was pretty set on that school (Florida) because of its academic prestige."

As a freshman, he was a part of the Florida A team. He shot 147 (71-76) to finish eighth, and third on the team, in his first tournament. He didn't compete

during 2018, when he said he focused on academics, and most recently has been a part of the B squad.

He shot 154 (78-76) to place eighth at a March tournament, where he led the B unit and finished higher than three Florida A golfers.

The club has one practice a week, he said, though a good week has him getting onto the course two days. During the summers, he plays a lot more. "I am happy," he said. "I've just gotten a bigger appreciation for the game."

He graduates in May and then begins pharmacy school. Also, Veloz has been named

to the all-Appalachian Athletic Conference second team.

The Tennessee Wesleyan University junior tied for eighth at the conference Spring Championship, shooting 145 (72-73) to place second among the Bulldogs.

Senior Tate Smith shot 240 (83-77-80) at the Atlantic Sun Conference Championship, his final tournament for Stetson University.

The past Pirate tied for 35th and was fourth among the Hatters.

this to me. If he's gonna kick me off the team for what I have to say about him, by all means he can. This is how I feel. I'm not gonna take it back, because I mean it."

The social media post

Kirstin Dooling reached her breaking point when she sat on the bench for much of Senior Night — a 62-9 win over Sarasota Christian where the outcome did not affect playoff standings.

Kirstin said she and several of the seniors sat on the bench as parents yelled from the stands demanding for the seniors to get their spotlight.

"There were girls on the bench crying," Troy Dooling said of senior night.

"It's a night for them and the girls are just sitting there crying. There were about 30 of us in the stands chanting, 'Play the seniors. Play the seniors.' And he wouldn't even look up at anybody."

After the game, Kirstin Dooling took to social media to vent.

"I used to be in love with this game but my coach killed my passion for this game and it's the worst feeling you could possibly feel," she wrote on Facebook. "I've been playing this game since I was in the 6th grade. It's my senior year, it was supposed to be the best but thanks to the worst coach ever he made it a living hell for all 6 of us seniors."

That post, along with a profanity-laced post on Instagram, found its way to Holloway through teammates, according to Kirstin Dooling.

According to Kirstin, Holloway and Venice High administrators then told her to delete the post or she would not be allowed to compete for the school's track and field team this spring.

Despite initial resistance, Kirstin deleted the post and wrote Holloway an apology. But she was still kicked off the team for the season-ending game, and teammates were punished for defending her, according to Kirstin.

The fallout

Now with several players, parents and grandparents upset with how the conclusion of the season was handled, complaints began to flood in to the *Venice Gondolier Sun*.

Though several people reached out with concerns, all but the Doolings chose to remain anonymous for fear of retribution or consequence from the school.

While the season ended in early February, parents continued to call and email the *Gondolier Sun* through the month of March.

As more and more parents came forward to Venice High administrators, the school began an investigation.

"Complaints were made against Coach Holloway and the school district is taking them seriously, as we do all complaints against staff," Venice principal Eric Jackson wrote in an email to the *Gondolier Sun* on March 15. "At this time, there is an ongoing investigation, which will remain open in

an effort to receive as much pertinent information as possible to render an informed and fair decision. We are hopeful the investigation will conclude soon so that the girls' basketball program at Venice High School can continue to move forward and they can build upon their accomplishments from this past season."

But the end-of-season problems were just the tip of the iceberg for Kirstin Dooling, who said she has been upset with Holloway all season.

She said the coach would often spend practices and halftimes of games screaming at the team until players began to cry.

From her perspective, the only solution was to find a new coach to lead the girls basketball team.

"I think he should be fired because no one deserves to be treated like this," she said.

"No one deserves to be treated the way that he treated all of us. No one would say anything about it, and I just got to the point where I couldn't hold back and I just let everything out."

Swinney signs record contract with Clemson

After two national titles, Tigers' head coach inks \$92 million deal over the next 10 years

Two national titles in three years have helped earn Clemson football coach Dabo Swinney the biggest contract in college football history.

University trustees approved the 10 year, \$92 million deal Friday. It runs through 2028 and includes two new clauses to make sure Swinney stays with the Tigers and stays one of the sport's best paid coaches as long as he keeps winning.

The buyout in Swinney's contract increases significantly if he leaves Clemson to coach at Alabama, where he was a walk-on wide receiver and assistant coach in the 1990s. Swinney must pay \$4 million if he leaves Clemson before the end of this year, but the buyout increases to \$6 million if he coaches the Crimson Tide.

The deal also requires Swinney to be one of the three highest paid coaches in college football any season after his team makes the playoff semifinals or he can leave without penalty.

Swinney's contract is bigger than the \$74 million, eight year deal Alabama's Nick Saban has through 2025 and the 10 year, \$75 million contract Jimbo Fisher with Texas A&M signed through 2027.

Clemson athletic director Dan Radakovich, who also received a contract extension Friday through June 2024, said Swinney is worth every penny.

"Dabo's leadership of our football program has brought value, exposure and unprecedented levels of success not only to our athletics program but to the entire university," Radakovich said in a statement.

Swinney's first head

coaching contract in 2009 at Clemson paid him \$800,000 a year. He went 15-12 his first two full seasons, including his only losing season at 6-7 in 2010.

Swinney is 97-15 since then, making the past four college football playoffs — Clemson's only miss was the inaugural edition after the 2014 season — and won two national titles, both over Alabama.

Swinney, 49, will be paid at least \$8.25 million this season, with his salary increasing to \$10 million in 2027. The contract includes other incentives like a \$250,000 bonus for a national title, \$200,000 bonus for an ACC championship.

If Clemson fires Swinney in the first two years of the contract, it will have to pay him \$50 million with the buyout slowly declining over the next decade.

UCF QB Milton walks without crutches for first time in five months

ORLANDO — McKenzie Milton walked without crutches for the first time in five months, reaching another milestone as the UCF star quarterback works to recover from a catastrophic knee injury.

Milton's mother, Teresa, shared video on Instagram Thursday of the quarterback walking near the Mayo Clinic in Minnesota, where he has received treatment for a dislocated knee and extensive nerve damage he suffered during the Knights' game against rival USF in November.

She added the comment, "Our boy had another miracle today!! He walked."

McKenzie Milton shared the video on his Instagram stories feed, adding, "5 months since I walked ... thank God."

Milton told the Orlando Sentinel in March he was able to put 75 pounds of weight on his legs and he hoped to be walking as early as the end of April.

The milestone was big for Milton.

After suffering his knee injury, he was rushed to Tampa General Hospital for emergency surgery. Doctors were able to restore blood flow to his lower right leg after the knee dislocation damaged nerves. He went through multiple surgeries and one doctor told him 50 percent of people who suffer the same injury have their legs amputated.

Milton has since been focused on painful rehabilitation work during which he pushes to work through any scar tissue building up around his knee.

He has said the rehab is more painful than the original injury.

He has not set a timeline for his return to the football field, instead focusing on smaller milestones like the one he reached Thursday, the same day the 2019 NFL draft kicked off in Nashville, Tenn.

The recovery process is grueling, but Milton said he has faith he will eventually line up at quarterback again.

"I feel like I'm definitely going to play football again at a very high level," he said.

Spoiler Alert: LeSean McCoy tweets out Avengers movie plot

Bills' running back causes Twitter storm

ORCHARD PARK, N.Y. — If you haven't done it already, and you're on social media, mute LeSean McCoy's account.

The Buffalo Bills running back proved to be a one-man spoiler in tweeting out a significant occurrence in the newly released movie, "Avengers: End Game," shortly after it premiered.

The tweets didn't go unnoticed, especially among Bills fans. Rather than eagerly trying to search out any possible

news on who the Bills might select with their two draft picks in the second and third rounds on Friday, they instead learned a key plot twist.

The reaction to McCoy's tweets was so swift, it began trending on social media, and became its own "Twitter Moment."

Twitter posted a thread titled, "LeSean McCoy makes an enemy out of every fan who hasn't seen Avengers yet," and included several spoiler alert warnings.

The thread then featured several reactions to McCoy's tweets.

Jake Bencie, of

Indiana, posted a note asking the NFL to suspend McCoy, while adding he hoped "the Bills don't win a game this season."

Sara Cichon of Buffalo posted a message that read: "YOU'RE SUPPOSED TO SAY SPOILER ALERT!!!!!! I wish I could unsee this tweet...this is a horrible day now."

And an account named BetTheOver concluded: "Just forced me to buy a Yeldon jersey with that tweet," in reference to running back T.J. Yeldon, who signed with the Bills on Monday.

recording is believed to have been made in March when the parents were walking through an airport in Dubai. The station said Espinal sent it to at least one friend and was shared with KCTV "by someone who is concerned about the welfare of the couple's child."

The Chiefs have suspended Hill while the team looks into the developments. The NFL could also punish Hill under its personal conduct policy.

Hill's history with Espinal is well known. In 2015, he pleaded guilty to domestic assault and battery by strangulation in an incident involving his then-pregnant girlfriend the previous year. The incident resulted in his dismissal from the Oklahoma State football team and he was put on probation until August 2018.

He wound up playing at tiny West Alabama, where he juggled school and football with counseling sessions and other court-mandated service work until the NFL came calling.

Hill, a fifth-round pick who is a two-time Pro Bowler, was part of a controversial draft class by the Chiefs and then-general manager John Dorsey in 2016.

The Chiefs also spent a third-round pick that year on cornerback KeiVarae Russell, who missed an entire season for violating Notre Dame's honor code in an academic misconduct case; a fourth-round pick on wide receiver Demarcus Robinson, who was suspended four times at Florida for drugs and other violations; and a sixth-round pick on Virginia Tech linebacker Dadi Nicolas, who was once charged with larceny and suspended for bumping an official. Among them, only Robinson is still on the roster.

Last year, the Chiefs released star running back Kareem Hunt following a video that showed him pushing and kicking a woman in a hotel hallway.

Hunt is suspended for the first eight games of the upcoming season but has a one-year deal with Cleveland under Dorsey, the Browns GM who signed Hunt while he was with the Chiefs.

Bucs stick with defense in Round 2

The Tampa Bay Buccaneers continue to seek help for a leaky defense, selecting Central Michigan cornerback Sean Bunting in the second round of the NFL draft on Friday night.

Bunting is the first defensive back drafted out of the Mid-American Conference school in 34 years and the highest drafted

player from Central Michigan since offensive lineman Eric Fisher was the No. 1 overall pick in 2013.

In Tampa Bay, he'll join first-round selection Devin White as part of a potential fix for one of the NFL's worst defenses.

The Bucs ranked 24th in total defense last season and allowed 29 points per game, the second-most in the league.

White, a linebacker out of LSU, was the fifth pick of the opening round. He and Bunting, who had nine career interceptions in college, will get an opportunity to compete for starting jobs as rookies in the new 3-4 scheme being installed by Bucs defensive coordinator Todd Bowles.

Bunting was the seventh pick of the second round, No. 39 overall. The Bucs traded down in the third round from Pick 70 to 95.

Jacksonville gets first-round talent at No. 35

The Jacksonville Jaguars traded up to get some much-needed help for new quarterback Nick Foles. Jacksonville moved up three spots and chose Florida right tackle Jawaan Taylor with the third pick in the second round Friday night, adding a step-in starter to replace veteran Jermei Parnell and protect Foles.

The Jaguars sent picks 38 and 109 (fourth round) to Oakland in exchange for Nos. 35, 140 (fifth) and 235 (seventh). Jacksonville general manager Dave Caldwell

said he failed to trade into the bottom of the first round Thursday night to grab Taylor, who grew up about two hours down the road in Cocoa and lost 80 pounds to land a scholarship with the Gators.

Taylor plays the drums at church every Sunday and spends much of his free time fishing. Staying in the Sunshine State was an ideal landing spot for the 6-foot-5, 312-pound Taylor. How it happened left him perplexed and perturbed.

There were reports that a torn meniscus in 2017 caused teams some concern, but Caldwell said Jacksonville's doctors had no worries about Taylor's health. Taylor skipped the 40-yard dash at the NFL Combine and his on-campus pro day because of a strained hamstring.

"The medical reports are definitely false. I'm 100 percent healthy and ready to go," Taylor said.

"It hurt a little bit last night that you couldn't see the reason was why I didn't get picked. ... I'm a little upset, but everything happens for a reason."

Taylor is. He was a three-year starter at Florida and part of an offensive line that allowed just 18 sacks in 2018. He spent the last few months honing his technique with veteran NFL offensive line coach Bob Palcic in Pensacola. He also had private workout with Jacksonville, doing enough to land on the team's radar — and prompt Caldwell and personnel chief Tom Coughlin to scramble to get him in the second round.

Spurs packed and ready for Game 7 vs. Nuggets

DENVER — No stranger to the weight that accompanies Game 7s, DeMar DeRozan offered one overly basic reminder to his team.

“Us versus them,” the San Antonio guard said.

DeRozan’s point: It’s not his team playing a hostile crowd when the Spurs face the Denver Nuggets at Pepsi Center in the first-round series finale Saturday.

Still, the second-seeded Nuggets went a league-best 34-7 at home in the regular season behind all that noise.

“Go out there and play free, play smart,” said DeRozan, whose team forced a winner-moves-on scenario with a 120-103 victory Thursday in San Antonio. “We can’t get caught up in the crowd.”

The Spurs are packing enough outfits for a week’s worth of travel — just in case. Should they win, it’s off to Portland to start the Western Conference semifinals. Should they lose, the offseason begins.

“We’re not going to pack for no reason,” Spurs forward Rudy Gay said. “If I’m going to pack my clothes, I’m going to use them.”

That’s the sort of swagger the Spurs bring to the court. DeRozan believes that experience will play a role against a youthful Nuggets team that is in the postseason for the first time since 2013. With an average age of 24.9, the Nuggets have the youngest squad in the West bracket. The Spurs check in at 27.2.

And while Denver has proven a difficult place to play, the Spurs won

in the Mile High City during Game 1 and had a 19-point lead in Game 2 before Jamal Murray rescued the Nuggets.

“It’s literally win or go home. Simple as that,” said DeRozan, who played in two series that went to seven games in 2016 when he was with Toronto. “Once you understand the meaning of that going into the game, you understand that every single second on the court matters.

“The guys that have been in a Game 7 understand what it’s like.”

Like Denver forward Paul Millsap, who last played in a Game 7 during the 2014 playoffs while with Atlanta. The Hawks lost the first-round series to Indiana.

“You’ve got to play a perfect basketball game,” said Millsap, whose team would host the Trail

Blazers with a win. “The team that comes out and executes more, the team that’s more physical, the team that’s more aggressive, I think they’re going to win the game.”

Nuggets big man Nikola Jokic is coming off a monster game in which he had 43 points, 12 rebounds and nine assists. He is averaging nearly a triple-double for the series.

As for what he expects Saturday, he is not really sure.

“It’s my first Game 7,” Jokic said. “It’s probably going to be even tougher than this one.”

San Antonio coach Gregg Popovich facing Denver’s Michael Malone is another intriguing element in this game. Malone referred to his coaching counterpart as Bobby Fischer — the late chess prodigy — as

they tried to outmaneuver each other. This is Malone’s first playoff series as a head coach. In contrast, Popovich has been to the postseason 22 straight seasons, with five titles.

For his part, Millsap will try to keep his young teammates from feeling too many nerves.

“All the pressure is on them,” Millsap said. “This is why we fought so hard for home-court advantage. No pressure on us.”

Zion Williamson referenced at corruption trial

NEW YORK — The player widely projected to be the NBA draft’s top overall pick came up at a college basketball corruption trial Thursday as jurors heard a recording of a Clemson coach who seemed eager for help from an aspiring agent.

Zion Williamson played one year at Duke before entering the draft scheduled for June.

His name surfaced as video recordings of meetings with college coaches were played at the criminal trial of the aspiring agent, Christian Dawkins, and an amateur basketball coach,

Merl Code, who are charged with paying bribes to assistant basketball coaches to help secure NBA-bound players as customers.

Prosecutors say the defendants teamed up with undercover FBI agents and a corrupt financial adviser to decide which college coaches should get money to steer players their way.

The tapes showed several meetings at a Las Vegas hotel where coaches seemingly auditioned for the chance to prove their schools had enough top-tier talent.

If the schools were deemed qualified, they would be paid cash to match their best players

with agents and financial advisers who would follow them to the NBA.

Louis Martin Blazer is a financial adviser who started cooperating with the government after pleading guilty to ripping off clients for more than \$2 million. He described the meetings to a jury during his third day on the witness stand.

He said assistant coaches from Creighton, TCU, USC and Arizona State received cash, while no cash was given to assistant coaches from Louisville, Alabama, Connecticut and Texas A&M.

Some of the coaches did not get cash because “their

programs weren’t at that elite level” and their recruits were not valuable enough or certain to go high in the draft, Blazer said.

In a July 2017 recording, Dawkins was heard telling Clemson assistant coach Steve Smith he could help get Williamson’s family cash if the player chose Clemson over North Carolina, Duke and Kentucky.

Blazer testified that then-USC assistant coach Tony Bland was paid \$13,000 at his meeting after Bland flew to Las Vegas on the school’s private jet.

He said Bland needed money to try to recruit Marvin Bagley III. Blazer described watching

the undercover FBI agent put an envelope with cash on the table for Bland.

“I need you guys to be on campus the minute he signs,” Blazer said Bland told them. “Be ready for that.”

Bagley eventually played for Duke for a season before being selected second overall in the 2018 NBA draft by the Sacramento Kings.

Bland and three other former assistant coaches have pleaded guilty to bribery conspiracy and await sentencing. The others are Emanuel “Book” Richardson at Arizona, Chuck Person at Auburn University and Lamont Evans, who coached at South Carolina and Oklahoma State.

Nadal to face Thiem in Barcelona Open semifinals

BARCELONA, Spain (AP) — Rafael Nadal will meet Dominic Thiem in the semifinals of the Barcelona Open after the defending champion brushed off a challenge from German Jan-Lennard Struff to win 7-5, 7-5 on Friday.

The top-seeded Nadal broke Struff’s serve in the final game of each set to stay on course for

a record-extending 12th title on the outdoor clay courts at Barcelona.

He next faces the third-seeded Thiem, who beat Guido Pella 7-5, 6-2.

“I am getting better and better as the tournament goes on,” Nadal said. “These are two consecutive weeks that I will at least have reached semifinals on clay.”

Nadal lost in the

semifinals in Monte Carlo last week and then needed three sets to get past Leonard Mayer in his opening match in Barcelona. He saw off David Ferrer in straight sets on Thursday.

Struff, who beat last year’s runner-up Stefanos Tsitsipas in the previous round, fought back from an early break to make a match of it.

Nadal avoided a first-set tiebreaker by pushing Struff into a 0-40 hole on his final service game. He closed out the set when Struff could only stab his passing shot off the court.

Nadal then finished the match by chasing down a ball and landing a backhand return just inside the opposing corner, improving his record in

Barcelona to 61-3.

Nadal is 8-3 against Thiem, including a win in the 2017 final in Barcelona. But the Austrian is the only player to have beaten him on clay in each of the past two seasons.

Nadal said that Thiem “is a candidate to win any tournament on clay.”

While Nadal has won 57 clay-court titles, eight

of Thiem’s 12 titles have come on the surface.

Kei Nishikori, who won here in 2014 and 2015, also advanced to the final four after beating Roberto Carballes 6-4, 7-5.

The fourth-seeded Nishikori will play Daniil Medvedev, after the Russian hit five aces in defeating Nicolas Jarry 6-3, 6-4.

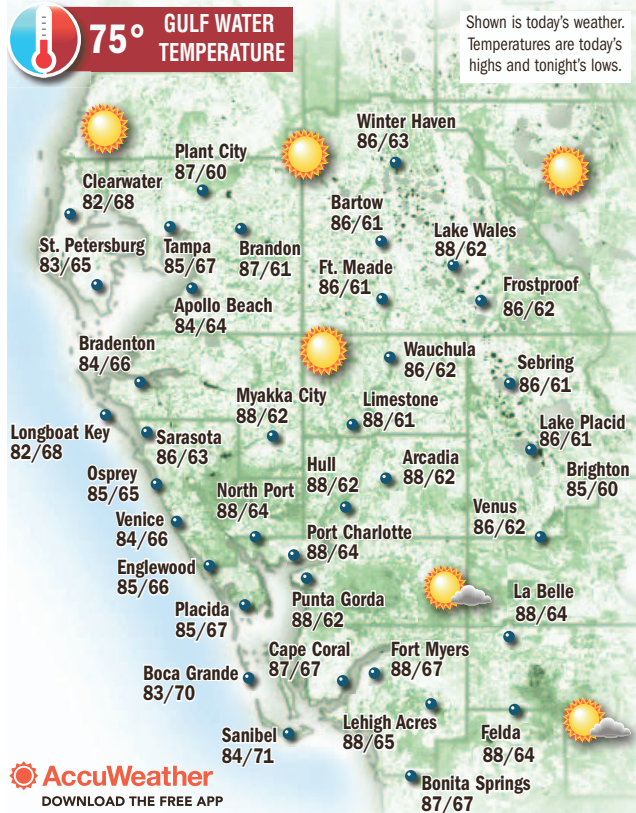
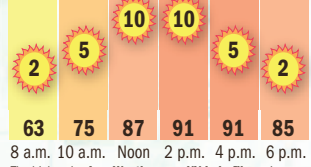

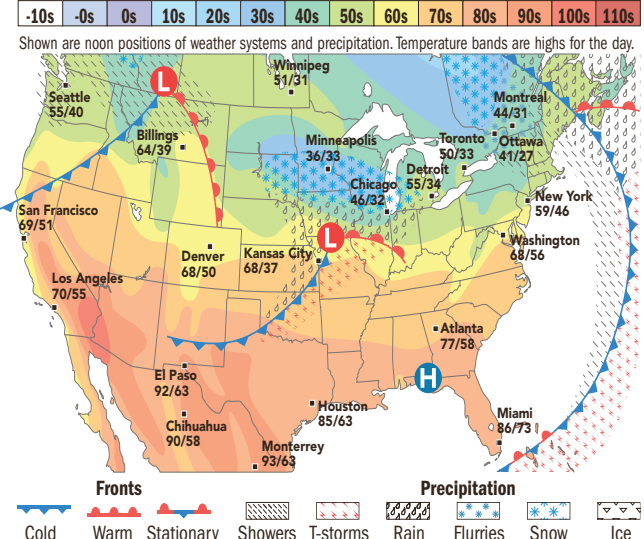

Noah Wyle rides 'The Red Line' in CBS' limited drama series

Chicago evidently is Noah Wyle's kind of town.

The actor did location filming there during his "ER" run, and he returned to the Windy City as a principal member of the ensemble cast of "The Red Line," a limited-run CBS drama series that plays out in two-hour installments over four consecutive Sundays starting April 28. Prolific TV-show maker Greg Berlanti ("The Flash," "God Friended Me") and filmmaker Ava DuVernay ("Selma") are among the project's executive producers.

So are Caitlin Parrish and Erica Weiss, who adapted a play they wrote into "The Red Line." It unites various characters through a tragedy: the wrongful killing of a black doctor (Corey Reynolds, "The Closer") by a white police officer (Noel Fisher, "Shameless"). Wyle portrays Daniel, a high-school teacher particularly impacted by the death, as is his teenage daughter (Aliyah Royale) ... who frequently rides the Chicago train known as The Red Line with him. Emayatzy Corinealdi (also of DuVernay's movie "Middle of Nowhere") and Elizabeth Laidlaw ("Chicago P.D.") also have prominent roles.

"I have to say the emotional reaction that I had to the first reading of this (story) was intense," Wyle recalls. "I have never read a piece of material and had it move me like that, and that consistently happened with

every single script. I can't even talk about this show without getting upset. It was much more about staying out of my own way and going in and doing my homework, but being really open to being in Chicago and working with the Chicago crew – and working with a diverse crew and a young crew, and a crew that didn't really have a frame of reference from when I was in that city before."

After producing his main acting projects ("The Librarians," "Falling Skies") in recent years, Wyle put himself in others' creative hands again for "The Red Line." Weiss explains that she and Parrish "are from the Chicago theater scene, and that community is a part of who we are in everything we do. When we created this show, it was never going to be set or filmed anywhere else.

"The city has a burgeoning industry in film and TV where more and more things are being filmed there," adds Weiss. "Amazing crew, incredible local talent ... so for us, it was a no brainer. And I think Chicago has a lot to prove in the national conversation. We want to show the country that we are more than a talking point, more than the narrative that is often used to describe the city. There are so many layers and so many different kinds of people, it really is the perfect microcosm to tell an American story."

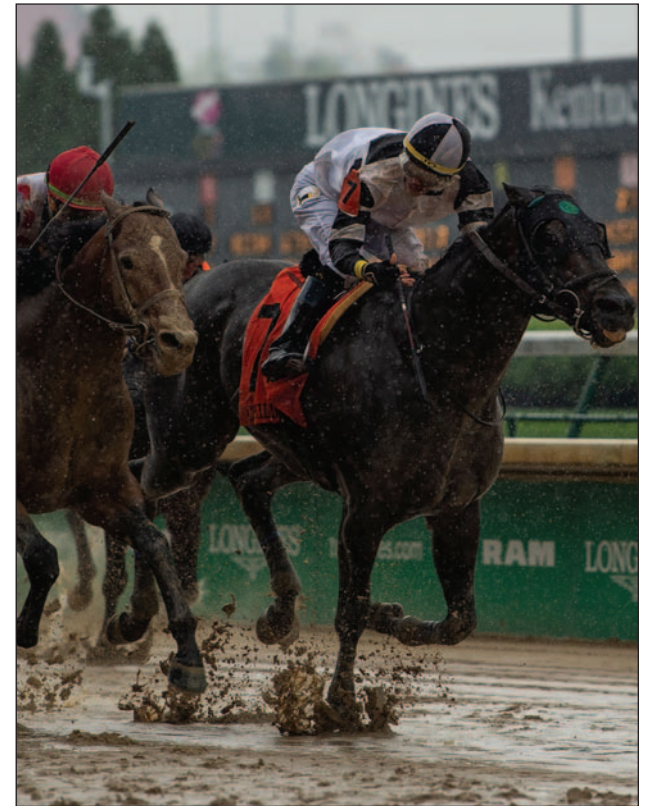

Netflix puts 'Street Food' and its makers front and center in new documentary series

Fans of the lush photography and storytelling of "Chef's Table" will want to check out a culinary series from the same production team that currently streams on Netflix.

In the aptly titled "Street Food," cameras go to some of the most vibrant cities in the world to explore their street food scene and the rich culture behind it, with each episode spotlighting stories of individual perseverance that bring each country's cuisine to life.

They're stories that address the human condition, maintains Brian McGinn, who served as executive producer and director of both series, as well as co-creator here.

"The thing that was so exciting to see," he explains, "was, instead of it being, 'How can I be the best chef in the country?' – the question became, 'How can I continually improve the dish? How can I make my food great so that I can support my family or I can help my son have a choice of what type of life he wants to lead?' And to me, those are such universal, human life questions, and to see how food intersects with those and to see what role food plays in helping people answer those questions is awesome."

The opening episode goes to Bangkok, where viewers meet Jai Fai, a Michelin-starred chef who is arguably the most famous street vendor in the world. It also spotlights Jek Pui, a cart vendor renowned for its curry.

"People line up in the morning for these curries," McGinn says, "and they sit on little

red stools and they eat their curry on the street. And it's the story of this family and how they started this curry business and how they have continued those traditions."

Other Season 1 episodes go to Japan, Indonesia, Singapore, Taiwan, South Korea, Vietnam, the Philippines and India, where a dish called nihari – aka buffalo stew – is all the rage in New Delhi.

"People line up about an hour-plus before ... this shop opens its stand – and basically jostle for position," McGinn explains. "So this shop that sells stew opens in the morning, people frantically jostle for position, they're yelling their orders out to the vendor and it's this incredibly frenetic, energetic scene for about an hour. And then they sell out and the stew is gone and the street returns to normal. And it's something that I had never seen before and was so exciting to witness."

"There's so much technique and craft and expertise and mastery that goes into making what seems like a simple plate of food that you can get for a very inexpensive amount of money from a stall in the street," he continues. "And what you don't kind of know is that a lot of these people have spent 40, 50, 60 years mastering that one dish or figuring out how can they improve one thing after the other. ... And what's so interesting to see is the dedication and the focus that people have in the street food world."

BEST CHICAGO MOVIES

“**In Old Chicago**” (1938) An oldie but goodie, this classic pits the dissimilar O’Leary brothers (played by Tyrone Power and Don Ameche) against each other just before Chicago is wracked by its legendary, allegedly cow-started Great Fire of 1871.

“**Some Like It Hot**” (1959) In one of the all-time-great movie comedies – and some believe the greatest ever – two musicians (Tony Curtis, Jack Lemmon) who witness a Mob killing disguise themselves as women to get out of Chicago alive.

“**The St. Valentine’s Day Massacre**” (1967) The grittiness of Chicago during its underworld era is captured well by producer-director Roger Corman, with such iconic gangsters as Al Capone (Jason Robards) and Bugs Moran (Ralph Meeker) represented.

“**The Blues Brothers**” (1980) This boisterous, “Saturday Night Live”-inspired musical comedy is a virtual tour of Chicago as conducted by siblings Jake and Elwood Blues (John Belushi, Dan Aykroyd).

“**Risky Business**” (1983) Chicago’s suburbs get the spotlight in the coming-of-age comedy that made Tom Cruise a star as enterprising Joel, whose school project becomes something more thanks to a savvy prostitute (Rebecca De Mornay).

“**Ferris Bueller’s Day Off**” (1986) Filmmaker John Hughes had a penchant for showcasing Chicago in his teen-character-driven movies, but arguably never better than in this comedy with Matthew Broderick as the title prankster.

“**Running Scared**” (1986) Billy Crystal and Gregory Hines are a terrific team as police-detective partners whose tracking of a local drug lord (Jimmy Smits) eventually puts them in a memorable car chase on train tracks.

“**The Untouchables**” (1987) Locations that evoked the Prohibition era were used by director Brian De Palma in this retelling of the battle between lawman Eliot Ness (Kevin Costner) and underworld kingpin Al Capone (Robert De Niro). As a Ness associate who

supported “the Chicago way” of fighting crime, Sean Connery won an Academy Award.

“**Backdraft**” (1991) Chicago firefighters receive an epic tribute from director Ron Howard via the brothers played by Kurt Russell and Stephen Baldwin, who also got screen credit for doing many of their own stunts in the film.

“**The Fugitive**” (1993) The city’s St. Patrick’s Day Parade, for which the river is dyed green, plays a big role in this hugely effective revision of the classic TV series with Harrison Ford succeeding David Janssen as the wrongly accused Dr. Richard Kimble. Oscar winner Tommy Lee Jones portrays relentless pursuer Gerard.

“**Chicago**” (2002) Well, of course. The Oscar-winning best picture of its year, the long-delayed screen version of the hit stage musical makes two shady ladies (Catherine Zeta-Jones, who won an Oscar here, and Renee Zellweger) the centers of the story and the Kander & Ebb songs.

These are not only the most talented people I know, but they've also become my really close friends. It's not just saying goodbye to a TV show, it's saying goodbye to a life over there (in Ireland, where the series was filmed). I really felt welcome over there; maybe it's my Irish ancestry, but I'll miss it terribly.

As for your home life, how was it for you to be based overseas for such long stretches of time during production of the series?

I live in New York, so I didn't get to go home as much as others who live in London or other parts of Europe. I got to know my way over there, and it's a really lovely and beautiful place. I was sad to see the whole thing end.

Now that "Game of Thrones" is over in terms of filming it, what do you see in store for you?

As much as I love Tyrion – and he's probably the greatest character I'll ever portray – it's always nice to do something completely unique. (Last year's HBO movie "My Dinner With Herve" was) the first time I've played a living, breathing person, so that was pretty daunting. I would bring everything I have in mind to HBO if I could ... but then, I think I'd be on it way too much!

Though it wasn't a surprise when you filmed your final "Game of Thrones" scene as Tyrion Lannister, was it still an emotional wallop for you when you actually did it?

Yeah. I knew it was coming, and I was about one of the last people to wrap up. I think the whole season and series wrapped up the following day. There was a lot of smoke in the air and a lot of sand in our shoes, but it was beautifully intimate, too. It wasn't a big, big scene.

OF 'SHETLAND' ON BRITBOX

What's ahead for your character of Shetland Islands Detective Inspector Jimmy Perez in Season 5 of "Shetland"?

The main theme is ... basically people trafficking in modern slavery. David Kane, our writer, found a story about a small house in a picturesque place in the Highlands of Scotland that was being used as a safe house for traffickers. And I think we all talked about how prevalent it is and how common it is and how widespread it is. And so that's (the subject of) the investigation of this year's series.

What originally attracted you to the role?

I think that policemen in most TV shows, I don't think you would call them empathetic or kind. You know, they tend to be kind of macho, kick-ass kind of maverick types, and I think that's very dull. So I like the idea of trying to make a man whose basic characteristics were empathy and kindness and to make those interesting to watch on television. I think that was what initially drew me in, certainly.

People always talk about how the exteriors of their shows are characters in their own right, but the

striking landscapes of the Shetland Islands here really are. Do you agree?

Yeah. The landscape is a kind of counterpoint, really, to what's going on in the story because you've got some very harsh things going on within the investigations, set against somewhere that's really very beautiful but sometimes is very harsh itself. You know, it's either a counterpoint or it's something that goes alongside the story. The landscape is very much a character, I suppose, but not really deliberately. And I think that's something that people like to watch the show for, but we don't really use it as part of our story deliberately.

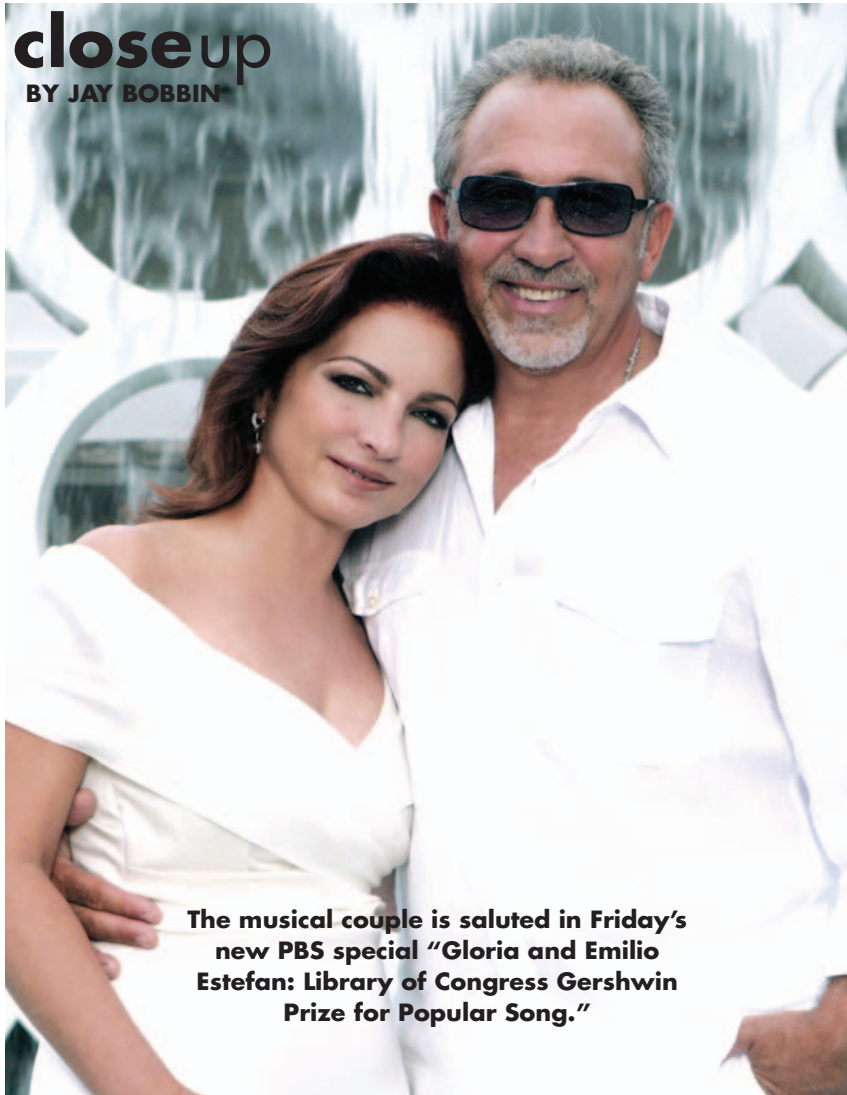

Their rhythm still gets you: PBS special fetes Gloria and Emilio Estefan

It's hard, if not impossible, to question Gloria and Emilio Estefan receiving an award for popular music.

The couple's writing, producing and performing skills have been evident for decades, extending to their story being told in the stage hit "On Your Feet!" They're given the Library of Congress Gershwin Prize for Popular Song in a PBS telecast Friday, May 3 (check local listings). Rita Moreno and Andy Garcia host the program taped in Washington, D.C., and featuring performances by Jose Feliciano, Cyndi Lauper, Il Volo and the Estefans' daughter Emily. Quincy Jones also appears.

With a career marked by such tunes as "Conga" and "Rhythm Is Gonna Get You," Gloria Estefan explains, "Music was what got me through my toughest times as a kid, when my dad was very ill. He came back from Vietnam with Agent Orange poisoning. I would lock myself up in my room and use other people's songs; I would learn to play them on my guitar and literally cry by myself. I wanted to be strong for my mom, so I have a very deep respect and love for music in general."

Emilio Estefan recalls, "When I met Gloria, I didn't even think she would be part of my band. I went to see her because she was singing in a church, and I loved her voice. Then, probably six months later, I was playing a

wedding and she came in. I said, 'Why don't you play one song with us?' And I really loved the whole thing.

"I was putting an ensemble together that became the Miami Sound Machine," adds Emilio. "Combining the base of rhythm, we found this fusion of sounds – and then with a girl singing, I think it was something fresh. We did the first album, and with a small label, we became No. 1 on the charts."

Previous Gershwin Prize honorees include Paul Simon, Stevie Wonder, Sir Paul McCartney, Carole King, the team of Burt Bacharach and Hal David, Billy Joel, Willie Nelson, Smokey Robinson and Tony Bennett. This year marks the first time the award has been given to a married couple, and to Hispanic talents.

Citing composers George and Ira Gershwin among her influences, Gloria Estefan – a Kennedy Center Honors recipient and three-time Grammy Award winner – notes, "I always try to either inspire or communicate with another person through my songs, whether they be romantic or not, and always from a position of strength and optimism. I'm very conscious of the power of music and what it does."

So is husband Emilio, though he also knows the power of Gloria. "I really loved the way she sang," he reflects, "and then I loved her."

'Dumbo' flies anew in live-action Disney remake

It's no secret that in recent years, the Disney studio has been in a cycle of turning some of its most popular animated features into live-action attractions.

That might seem especially tricky with a title character such as the one "Dumbo" has ... but consider that Tim Burton is the director, and the remake turns out to be very much its own creature. With his well-known knack for the offbeat, Burton might seem an odd match for a Disney project, though he also was among the makers of "The Nightmare Before Christmas," "James and the Giant Peach," "Alice in Wonderland" and "Alice Through the Looking Glass" for the company. And indeed, the result here is a "Dumbo" that isn't completely cuddly.

Digital effects help bring the baby elephant that gets separated from its mother to life – and yes, there are still those famous parent-and-child moments that don't merely tug at your heart, they just about rip it out of your chest. Still, there also are the famously bizarre Burton touches that are likely to keep much of "Dumbo" at arm's length for viewers who might otherwise anticipate getting fully wrapped up in it.

Danny DeVito (who was the Penguin for Burton in "Batman Returns") is wonderfully warm as the operator of the circus that becomes the big-eared, flying Dumbo's new home ... but there's also a really sinister rival showman, played by Burton's earlier Batman, Michael Keaton. The competitor's amusement-park concept is named Dreamland, but it may as well be called Nightmare Land, and Burton clearly is on familiar turf as he displays the site's various horrors.

That also may be where more than a few moviegoers question the bill of goods they've been sold by "Dumbo." Those who might expect strictly a live-action retelling of a childhood favorite are pretty much guaranteed to be surprised by the more ghoulish turns taken here ... which is to say nothing of how young children in the audience could react.

Colin Farrell, Eva Green and Alan Arkin also are in the esoteric cast of a "Dumbo" that works hard – a little too hard – not to be defined as a kids' movie. It's an interesting, not entirely successful exercise, and parents still should make sure that their youngsters don't miss a seminal part of childhood by letting them see the 1941 original.

Oliver James Platt was born on Jan. 12, 1960, in Windsor, Ont. He is the middle of three brothers whose father was a U.S. ambassador to Pakistan, Zambia and the Philippines. He also is a second cousin once removed of Diana, Princess of Wales, though he has said that he never met her.

Platt's father's career kept the family on the move, and at an early age, Platt was inspired by seeing a performance at Washington, D.C.'s Kennedy Center – by Morgan Freeman – to consider pursuing acting. He majored in drama at Tufts University, then did theater in Boston for several years.

One of Platt's New York performances drew the attention of Bill Murray, who recommended him to director Jonathan Demme – resulting in Platt launching his movie career in Demme's "Married to the Mob." Much other film work would follow for Platt, including early roles in "Working Girl," the original "Flatliners," "Postcards From the Edge," "Beethoven," "Indecent Proposal" and "Benny & Joon."

Television parts in such shows as "Miami Vice" and "Wiseguy" led Platt to a starring role as a newspaper columnist in the series "Deadline," and he later appeared as White House counsel Oliver Babish on "The West Wing," which earned him an Emmy nomination. He earned two more for the series "Huff," in which he worked with his college friend Hank Azaria.

"Nip/Tuck," " Fargo," "The Good Wife" and "Modern Family" are among other TV series that have featured Platt, and since 2015, he has starred as psychiatry chief Dr. Daniel Charles on NBC's "Chicago Med."

The New York-based Platt has been married since 1992, and he and his wife have two daughters and a son. He returns home often while working, since his family doesn't join him on location.

PBS's 'Nature: American Spring Live' celebrates the changing of the seasons

One might think viewing seasonal changes in real time is akin to watching grass grow but PBS' "Nature: American Spring Live" promises to give viewers a front-row seat to what it calls nature's biggest party.

Airing Monday through Wednesday, April 29 through May 1 (check local listings), the three-night multi-platform event "American Spring Live" goes to locations across the country such as the Florida Everglades, the Rockies, the Eastern Shore of Virginia and a sheep farm in Maine to view the arrival of spring and how various plants and animals respond to it.

The three hourlong episodes cover topics such as how the rising temperatures and longer days of spring awaken plants and animals, the mass movements of animals toward the burgeoning spring food supply, and the relationship between plants and animals and how climate change is affecting it.

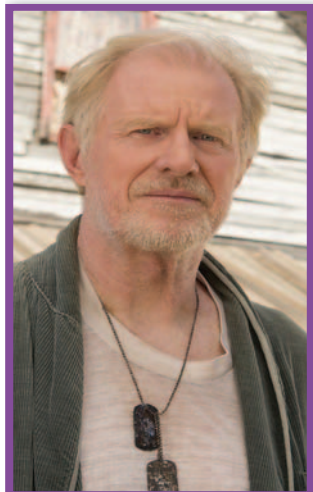
"One of the things we're going to look at," explains Juju Chang ("Nightline"), who hosts the event from California's Sequoia National Park, "is this idea of spring as a timing event and how that's being affected by climate change. This idea of some elements of nature are cued by daylight, other elements are cued by temperature. So if those things are off in the slightest, I mean talk about choreography and that's what's happening with climate change.

"And so how tragic would it be," she continues, "if a bird, a hatchling came out and there wasn't the right food because the bugs haven't (hatched yet)? So timing, as a scientific concept, is incredibly crucial and ... some of that timing is being thrown off by climate change."

The hope from all involved in the series is to awaken people's interest in science and in becoming citizen scientists, which Chang says can be done by doing things as simple as gauging rainfall or watching birds in their own backyard.

Baffert again the trainer to beat at Churchill Downs



It's the first Saturday in May and Bob Baffert again has multiple contenders in a major stakes race.

So what else is new?

Indeed, as the horses enter the gate at Churchill Downs in Louisville for the 145th running of the Kentucky Derby Saturday, May 4, on ABC, the white-haired trainer from Nogales, Ariz., who has saddled numerous Triple Crown Thoroughbreds in his half-century in racing could have as many as four in this race: Improbable, Game Winner, Roadster and Mucho Gusto. And those in the know will tell you no one is better at getting a talented 3-year-old to peak at the optimal time than Baffert.

Of course, this is all well-trod ground for the 66-year-old. He's been bringing horses to the three races that make up the Triple Crown — the Derby, Preakness and Belmont Stakes — since 1996 and has 15 wins to show for it, including three each for his two Triple Crown champions American Pharoah (2015) and Justify (2018). Those are pretty impressive accomplishments in an era that didn't have a Triple Crown champ for 37 years.

This year, Improbable, Game Winner and Richard Mandella's Omaha Beach (at this writing) are considered the three horses with the most Triple Crown potential. But when a horse is faced with a field of 20 (such as in the Derby), a short layoff (the Preakness) and a 1 1/2 mile distance (the Belmont) over a five-week schedule — and contend with fresh horses in the last two races — those expectations can evaporate in a hurry.

Which is why the Triple Crown is considered by some to be the most grueling gauntlet in all of sports.

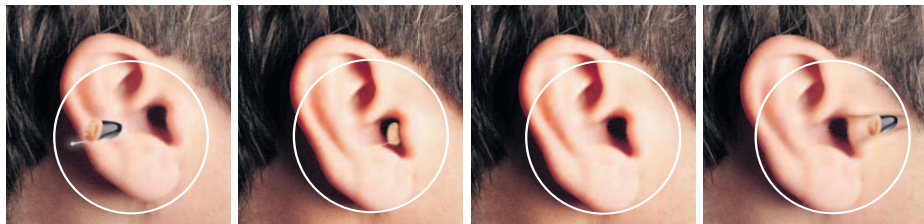

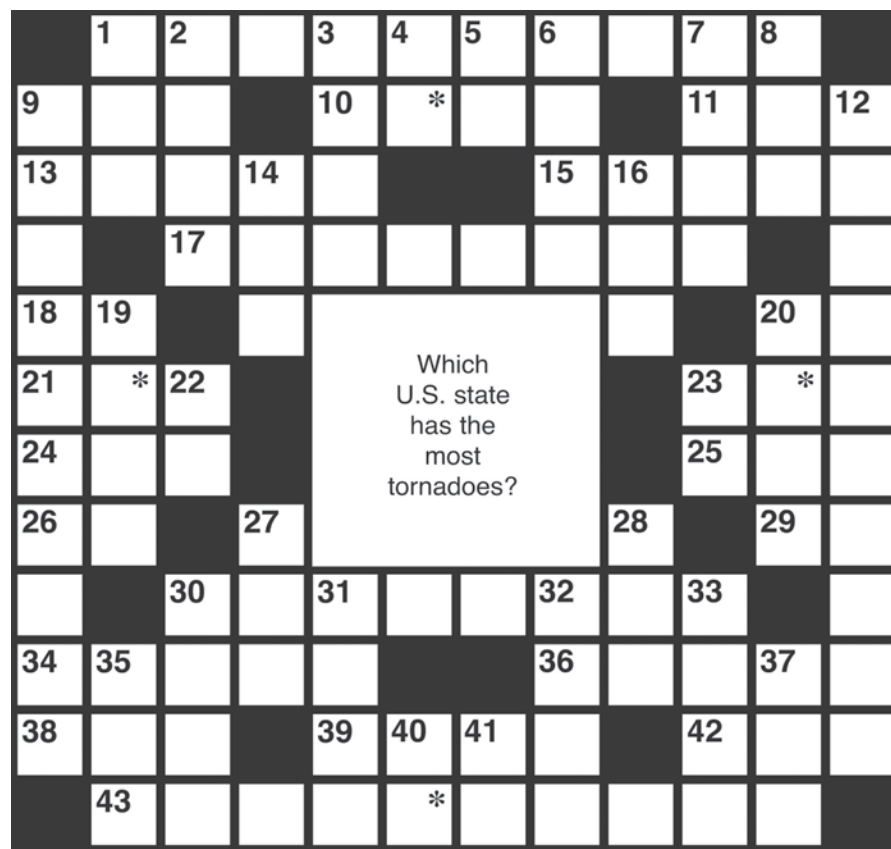

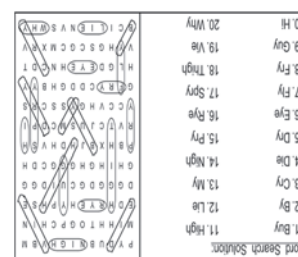
