Maestre, Jenkins' Counsel, Arrested on Charge of Complicity With Bandits

MEXICANS SAY CRISIS WAS PLANNED

State Department Charged With Attempt to Bribe About International Difficulty

(By the Associated Press)

WASHINGTON, Oct. 30.—The Mexican charges that Consular agent Jenkins is involved in a plot whereby he was to have allowed himself to be kidnapped by the bandits and held for ransom is regarded by the State Department as a further example of the Mexican government's policy to attempt to cloud the issue in the endeavor to cover up the inefficiency of the Mexican government as regards the protection of foreigners resident in Mexico.

Maestre in Custody. Attorney Maestre, the personal counsel of Jenkins, has been arrested and charged with complicity in the kidnapping.

The charge has been openly made by the state government of Puebla that Jenkins acted under orders from the United States hoping thus to provoke a grave international crisis.

This assertion is declared to be utterly absurd by State department officials.

Senior Correspondent. The Mexicans have seized correspondence between Jenkins and his wife hoping to find something on which to base their charges.

Articles have appeared in the Mexican city newspapers variously charging that Jenkins is an arrears collector posing in revenues to the Mexican government although it is not stated what revenues.

State department officials have likened the charges against Jenkins to those that had rebuffed themselves. It has been announced that additional representations had been forwarded to the Mexican government.

British Jenkins Case Up.

(By the Associated Press)

MEXICO CITY, Oct. 30.—The newspaper Executive, after an investigation by its representatives, denies the statements of certain officials to the effect that Jenkins had submitted to being kidnapped. It declared that Jenkins was really kidnapped and that a ransom was obtained for his return from the bandits.

The arrest of Attorney Maestre is believed to be intended to clear up certain hazy charges. Jenkins is still confined in a hospital in Puebla.

CAPSIZED HULK OFF BRAZIL MAY BE YANKEE SHIP

Benfica, With Cargo of Gasoline, Long Overdue at Rio, Believed to be Derelict

FEARED CREW WAS PERISHED

Sailors Arriving in Santos Tell of Receiving Distress Signals in Storm

(By the Associated Press)

RIOS ABERES, Oct. 30.—The steamship Benfica, floating upside down off the southern Brazilian coast, is now believed, in maritime circles, to be the American steamer Benfica.

The hull was at first supposed to be that of the Mount Hood which, while burning on the night of October 10, was towed seaward from the harbor of Montevideo.

Benfica Long Overdue. Dispatches from Rio de Janeiro report that the Benfica is long overdue from New York with a cargo of gasoline to Rio de Janeiro and is long overdue.

It is also reported that ships arriving in Santos reported receiving distress signals from a steamship supposed to be the Benfica during a storm but was unable to locate its position.

It is believed that the current has carried the hull southward.

COUNCIL AIRS DANIELS TELL CABINET HIS HUN BREACH OF TRUCE TERMS SAILORS AND MARINES ARE READY FOR ANY STRIKE DUTY

Germany Will Not be Punished Other Than Under Terms of Treaty

POSTPONE DATES DISCUSSION

Council Will Continue Argument Saturday as to When Treaty Becomes Effective

CONSIDERS ANOTHER PROTOCOL

Huns Will Be Required to Carry Out Armistice Clauses With Which They Have Not Complied

PARIS, Oct. 30.—The Supreme Council this afternoon discussed the dates for putting the treaty into effect but postponed a decision until Saturday.

The council also discussed the armistice conditions which Germany violated. The violations are mostly covered by the terms of the treaty and it does not seem likely that any steps to punish Germany will be taken outside of those provided for in the treaty.

Many Ask to Join Blockade. The note sent to Germany by the allied and associated powers asking her to join in the blockade of Soviet Russia, shows that such nations as Argentina, Chile, Colombia, Venezuela, Mexico, Spain, Finland, Sweden, Norway, Denmark, Poland and Switzerland were also asked to join in the blockade.

Some Note Sent to All. The text of the note to Germany was the same as those sent to the neutrals with the exception of the last paragraph which added: "The British and French warships in the Gulf of Finland continue to change the route of ships bound for the ports of Bolshevik Russia."

Consider Protocol. The Supreme Council also considered the text of the proposed additional protocol requiring the Germans, before the treaty becomes effective, to carry out the armistice clauses which have not been complied with and which have not been incorporated in the Versailles treaty.

FAVORS TARIFF REVISION

French Republican Committee Desire Duties on U. S. Goods Reduced.

PARIS, Oct. 30.—The executive committee of the republican committee of France and industry, has voted in favor of an early revision of the tariff and of the signing of a commercial agreement with the United States.

Auto Pay Be Adjusted. The committee also for a readjustment of the financial situation whereby the products of the United States are compelled to pay a high tariff while the products of neutral countries are exempted to pay a minimum import duty.

The committee has prepared a list of the products of the two countries which should obtain advantages over similar products from Germany.

CABINET MEETS IN SPECIAL SESSION TO DISCUSS PLANS TO DEAL WITH SITUATION—GARFIELD AND RAILROAD ADMINISTRATION WILL PARCEL OUT COAL TO INDUSTRIES

PRESIDENT LEWIS OF MINE-WORKERS, ATTACKS WILSON

(By the Associated Press.)

The Federal government's agencies are moving swiftly to meet the coal strike. The railroad administration has ordered that all coal in transit be confiscated where necessary to obtain a reserve supply to keep the railroads in operation.

Sailors and Marines Available. Secretary of the Navy Daniels, announced today that sailors and marines will be available for service on land should any emergency arise in the impending coal strike.

The Secretary of the Navy explained that if he was called on by President Wilson, sufficient forces would be landed and attached to the military commander of the area where their services were needed.

Senate Supports Administration. After a four hours session, the Senate adopted a resolution assuring the administration of the support of congress in maintaining order during the present industrial emergency.

Senator La Follette, of the Republicans offered but later withdrew an amendment to the resolution proposing assistance to the coal miners of their lawful rights.

Attacks President's Course. Acting President Lewis and the Executive Board of the United Mine Workers, from Indianapolis, wired Secretary of Labor Wilson at length today. In the message, acting President Lewis made a direct attack on President Wilson's course regarding the coal strike situation terming it "the climax of a long series of attempted usurpations of the executive power."

Cabinet To Help Faithful Miners. The cabinet is seriously considering granting protection to the coal miners willing to work despite the strike order.

It is generally understood that the police will first be used but that the troops will be ordered to the mines if necessary.

Secretary of the Interior Lane announced today that the government would not hesitate to curtail the coal consumption fifty per cent for the purpose of distributing the available supplies to the essential industries. It was declared that the plants engaged in the manufacture of munitions might be entirely cut off from all coal supplies.

Two Months' Supply Moved. It was asserted today that current supply of coal from the non-union mines was sufficient to meet the needs of the railroads, public utilities and domestic demands. Two months' supply has been stored in New England.

Cabinet In Special Session. Secretary of State Lansing summoned the cabinet to a special session this morning to consider the final plans where-with to deal with the strike of the bituminous coal miners on Saturday.

Federal Fuel Administrator Garfield advised the cabinet that it was not necessary to revise the fuel administration, contending that the war time powers of that body were now vested in the railroad administration, which was fully authorized to distribute coal to the essential industries.

At the conclusion of the cabinet meeting, Attorney General Palmer announced that the fuel administrator would assume control of the handling of the coal supply taking whatever steps might be considered necessary to meet the situation.

Release German Sailors Interned At Rio de Janeiro

Nearly Three Hundred to Be Free After Yesterday Will Be Sent Home Soon

(By the Associated Press) RIO DE JANEIRO, Oct. 30.—The release of nearly three hundred German sailors and officers interned in the vicinity of Rio de Janeiro, October 30, 1918, was announced today. The sailors were taken over by the Brazilian government and will be released immediately for Germany.

The remainder of the interned men will be released tomorrow and granted the privilege of remaining in Brazil or of going elsewhere at their own expense.

SHOP OWNERS REFUSE TO POSTPONE LOCKOUT

Barcelona Plants Will Close Monday and Lock-Out Will Spread to All Provinces

DESIGNED TO CRUSH UNION

State That Spanish Capital Is Lined in Lock-Out as Protest Against Government

(By the Associated Press)

MADRID, Oct. 30.—The employers issued a manifesto refusing to postpone the lock-out until the King returns. They declared that the lock-out would be effective in Barcelona on Monday and would gradually extend to all the provinces. Four thousand employees have joined forces for this purpose.

Employers' Reply. The syndicates of Barcelona issued a manifesto today saying that the lock-out was designed to break up the workers' organizations. They claim that the organization of the workers has a perfect right to exist, which is proved by the government's support of its policy, and also by the promise of the government to maintain order during the lock-out.

Replying to the manifesto of the syndicates of Barcelona to the effect that the lock-out was intended to break up the organization of the workmen which had the approval of the government, the employers issued a counter manifesto saying that the manufacturers and all the industries in Spain were united in favor of the lock-out as a protest against the attitude of the government.

Says Lock-Out Will Narrow. The newspaper A B C, one of the few newspapers supporting the lock-out, declares the assertion that the employers are divided. It says that the lock-out will be successful.

UNITED STATES TURNS DOWN TITTONI'S SCHEME

Refusal of Italian Proposal for Settlement of Fiume Problem Invites Other Plans

POLK LIKES PROPOSITION

Holds Out Hope to Italy to Expedite Washington's Refusal to Accept Offer, Is Believed

PLANS TO GO NO FURTHER

Fears National Sentiment More Than Rupture With Americans

BIENOS AIRES, Oct. 30.—The United States will not be able to accept the Italian proposal, but this could not be construed as an obstacle to the continuance of the discussion.

This was the Secretary of State's reply to Minister Tittoni, head of the Italian Peace delegation, on respecting Italy's latest proposition for a settlement of the Fiume problem, according to the correspondent of La Nación in Buenos Aires.

Polk in Favor of Plan. This suggestion for continuing the discussion was dealt on by the correspondent who says that Polk is personally in favor of Tittoni's proposal, and wished to expedite Washington's refusal to accept it.

Will Go No Further. The correspondent says that Tittoni's proposition is intended to be the maximum of Italy's concessions and that personally he is disposed to go further.

Nevertheless, the Italian government is not disposed to terminate the discussion without accepting Polk's suggestion and over the limits of the concessions of the Washington government are fixed, which step it then will return to Buenos Aires to inform the cabinet and obtain its decision.

Fears National Sentiment. The correspondent adds that he is able to anticipate that the acceptance of the proposition by the United States which would mean Italy's latest proposition, which is taking into account the more than the difficulties of which a rupture with the United States might expose Italy to, is not to go against national sentiment.

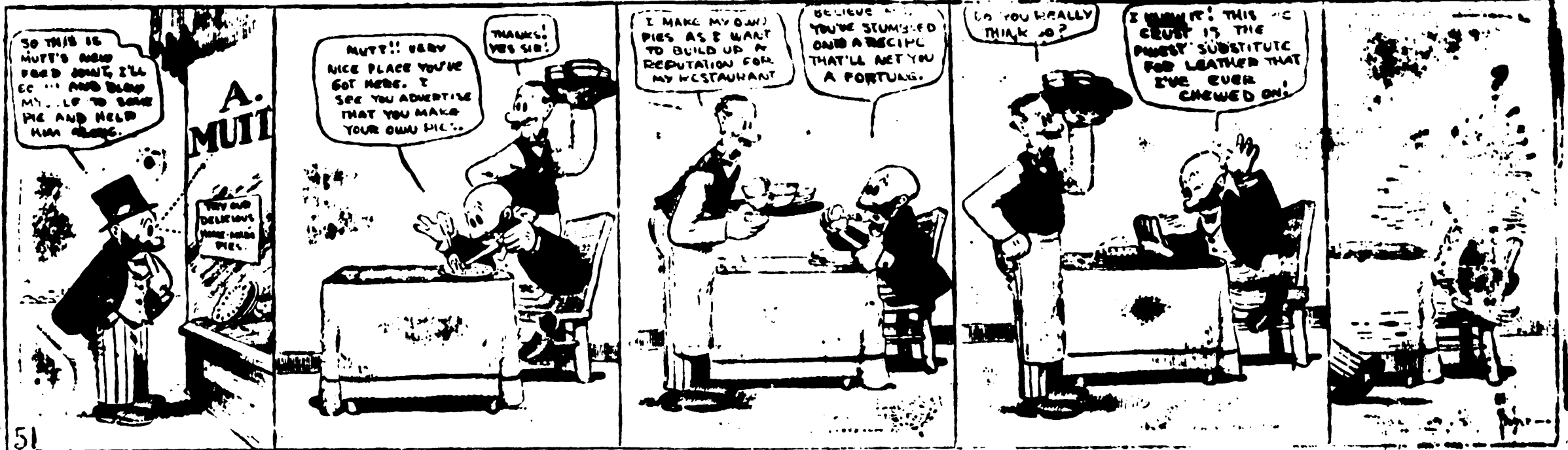

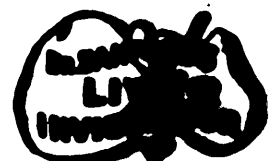

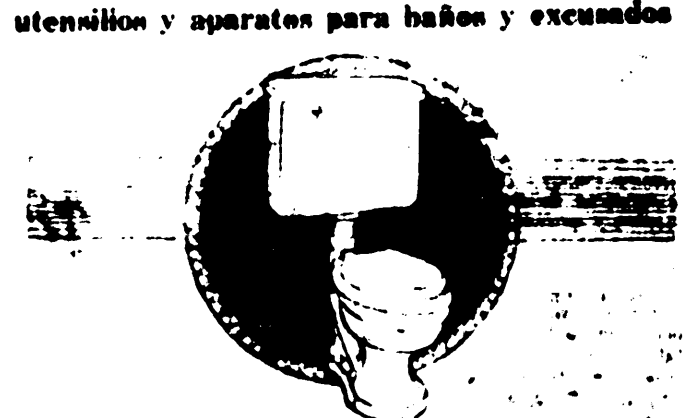
