AMERICAN LEAGUE, BRUM'S PROPOSAL

Basis Is Absolute Equality For All American Nations For Common Action Against External Foe And Arbitration Of Inter-American Disputes

FREE CAILLAUX OF TREASON CHARGE

Ex-Premier of France Stands Guilty of Commerce and Correspondence With Enemy. Jury of Peers Decides

Caillaux is Convicted of Placing Personal and Political Ambition During War Above Country's Interest

(By The Associated Press) PARIS, April 22. Joseph Caillaux, ex-premier of France and twice minister of finance, stands to-night convicted of having placed his personal and political ambition during the war higher than the interests of the country that honored him and gave him birth.

Caillaux, while escaping conviction of the heinous charge of high treason, was found by his former peers to have been imprudent and reckless and very close to treasonable ambitions, for such is the interpretation of the verdict, "Guilty of commerce and correspondence with the enemy," which had just been handed down against him by the French Senate.

First of Sort This is the first verdict of this sort to be rendered since the war began in any of the allied countries.

Commerce as interpreted by the senators and judges does not mean financial trading but commerce by means of common news while correspondence is not meant in the literal or technical etymology of the word.

Determined To Finish The senators entered the Luxembourg palace this afternoon with the determination to have finished with the affair which took up their time in the past three months and entered into the discussion in a vigorous and businesslike manner, presenting a strange contrast to their bored attitude during the closing days of the trial.

The Senate High Court convened at 2:30 o'clock and immediately went into secret deliberation, discussing whether the accused was guilty of high treason, intelligence with the enemy, commerce with the enemy or merely "Defeatism."

Gravest Degree First Ballots were taken on the above charges in the order given in order to consider the gravest degree of crime first.

Heavy Banishment The verdict rendered means a sentence of five years' banishment which may be lessened to one year as extenuation of the circumstances is found.

Incarceration in the fortress is another sentence which may be pronounced to-morrow when the high court reconvenes.

It was the consensus of opinion that the sentence would be a light one.

District Court Judge's Address Was Outstanding Feature of Fourteenth Semi-Annual Meeting of Federation of Women For Christian Work Held at Balboa Union Church Yesterday. The outstanding feature of the fourteenth semi-annual meeting of the Federation of Women for Christian Work at the Balboa Union church yesterday was Judge John W. Hanan's masterly address which might well be entitled "The Power of Women for Good."

ARIAS SEIZES THIRD TRUNK OF TREASURE

Port Captain Follows Carmelo Crespo From Steamer David to Hotel Corco Where Silver is Revealed

Search Resumed From Suspicion Aroused When Crespo Left for London Month Ago With Panama Hats

The third of Panamanian silver trunks held up by the customs authorities during the last three weeks was seized by Port Captain Ernesto E. Arias yesterday afternoon. They belong to Carmelo Crespo and amount to seven trunks of different denominations.

Follows To Hotel Crespo arrived from Chicago yesterday on the David and after a brief stay at the Hotel Corco with his baggage, Captain Arias followed and inspected it with the result that a trunkful of money and another bundle wrapped in baroque was seized.

Captain Arias stated that about a month ago he became suspicious of Crespo when he left for the interior with sixty dozen good quality Panama hats. There is scarcely any sale for Panama hats in the interior, Captain Arias said, and consequently he was led to believe that Crespo intended trading them for silver.

Verified Suspicion When he learned that Crespo had arrived on the David yesterday he at once proceeded to examine his baggage with the result that the money was found.

Crespo declared that he sold the hats receiving American money as well as Panamanian, in payment and that he returned to Panama with the Panamanian currency intending to purchase more merchandise. Captain Arias declares that he could not have received the Panamanian currency in legal payment as there is no Panama money at all circulating in any part of the republic.

The silver was taken to the Treasury's office for deposit there until this morning, Crespo being cited to appear there at 9 o'clock.

The authorities intend to hold the money pending an investigation and will probably give Crespo the amount in American currency.

Although the face value of the Panama silver is only \$1,000, the selling value is estimated to be at least \$2,500.

ARIAS TO DEMAND DUTY ON SALVAGE OIL DRUMS
Natives Rescued Empty Barrel From Ocean Must Pay 10 Per Cent or be Guilty of Violating Law

About four hundred empty, five-gallon gasoline drums off the steamer Olochea which was at Balboa have been reported to have been thrown into the sea from the Panama, and have been picked up by natives who intend to sell them.

Action Unlawful
This action is unlawful, says Captain Arias, who demands that the duty of 10 per cent is paid on the drums as they cannot be brought into the republic otherwise.

Several of these drums have already been seized by the Panamanian authorities, who declare that they are the property of the Olochea, which the Panama Agencies company represent here, he said. Otherwise than make a profit by bringing the drums into the country, he says.

Must Go To Court
If the Panama Agencies company wishes to claim the drums, he says, they must go to court.

BISHOP CRAIK MORRIS PAYS OFFICIAL VISIT TO ST. PETER'S CHURCH

The rector declared that he was convinced that there are no church people anywhere in the world who can show greater love and respect for their pastors than colored West Indians, and thus the Bishop, he was sure, would prove to be true in proportion to the amount of latitude he gave those under his jurisdiction to appreciate him.

A hymn was then sung, and the Bishop ascended the pulpit, thanked the rector and the congregation for the hearty welcome they had extended him, and preached a most inspiring and instructive sermon, taking his text from Matthew 23:23. At the close of the service, the Bishop shook hands with quite a number of the members of the church and spoke kind words to each.

Speaks at Colon Baptist Church on Wednesday Night and Compares Isthmus of Panama to Isthmus of Coriath

As was expected, the Rev. T. Gordon Somers was greeted by a crowded church at the Colon Baptist church last Wednesday night.

The meeting commenced about 7:30 o'clock, when Rev. L. Will, pastor of the church, made a few opening remarks and stated that Rev. A. G. Kirkham was indisposed in consequence of which he could not be present, much to the disappointment of all present.

The collection was next taken up after which the rev. gentleman was introduced.

He opened his address by stating how very pleased he was to find himself before such a gathering and congratulated Pastor Will on his fine church, congregation and choir. He also stated that he had visited the church about eleven years ago when he met Dr. West.

Comparing the Isthmus of Panama to the Isthmus of Coriath, so well known in sacred history, the speaker called attention to the opportunities of the church in these parts. In closing this point home the speaker reminded his audience of the case of France, when by a decree, all church doors were closed and all preaching stopped, how as a result the national life of that country literally decayed.

CAN TANK OIL HERE EASIER THAN COLOMBIA

Oil Company Official Tells How Nearness to Coast Is Great Factor Of Isthmian Oil Fields

CRISTOBAL, April 22.—G. W. Moore, vice-president of the Sinclair Panama Oil corporation and who is responsible for the quality of the oil that flows into this country, said today that it is easier to bring oil from the fields in Bogas to the tanks here than from the interior of Colombia. He was asked, "Colombia's Oil Possibilities"
"Colombia undoubtedly has the most oil in the world today," said Mr. Moore, "and there seems an unlimited quantity of it but the government does not seem willing to help in the manner that it might and there, of course, is the great difficulty."
"It is not easier to bring oil from the fields in Bogas to the tanks here than from the interior of Colombia," he was asked.

"It might cost as much as one hundred million dollars to bring pipe lines from the interior of Colombia to the coast," he added.

"Panama has indeed a great future," he concluded, "and that future is in safe hands when men like Llorente and Porras are at the helm."

Heron's Fine Temperament

You will have to go far before you will find a greater temperament for golf than that possessed by Dave Heron, the amateur champion. The Pittsburgh star has constant concentration for every stroke without any appearance of tension to his play. He is never both cool, worried, flustered or upset no matter what happens. If he is, the same is well concealed by the new champion. He is a hard fighter at all times. At a critical point of his match with Bobby Jones we saw him shake a mighty shot, driving it into a trap. No turn in the game can be more upsetting or develop more annoyance. But Heron might have had the ball dead to the cup, so far as you could tell from his expression. Certainly, in the way of temperament he compares favorably with O'Connell, Travers and Travis, the three leading exponents of wonderful temperaments in American golf. This is especially noteworthy on the greens, where he goes a few hundred paces with a combination of cool and coolness. He doesn't waste a lot of time fussing with the stroke, but on the other hand he is never hurried. There is no exceptional gruffness nor downcast to his play, but neither is there any attempt at frivolity.
