NO AGREEMENT YET WITH JAPAN

Secretary Colby and Ambassador Shide Hara are Still Discussing Question of Japanese Immigration to U. S.

Solution of Problem Must First be Found After Which Means for Making it Effective Must be Worked Out, Officials Say.

(By The Associated Press) WASHINGTON, Sept. 1. Press reports from Tokyo via Honolulu announcing that an agreement had been reached in Washington regarding the immigration question are apparently premature. Officials of the State Department today declared that the discussion going on between Secretary Colby and Japanese Ambassador Shide Hara has not passed the stage of an informal conversation for the purpose of reaching an agreement in principle on the question, although last week Secretary Colby indicated that he regarded the progress made as very favorable. The officials added that the ways and means of making such an agreement effective must be worked out after the solution is reached.

Report Agreement Reached

HONOLULU, Sept. 1. The negotiations between the Japanese Ambassador Shide Hara and Secretary of State Colby in Washington have resulted in the solution of the Japanese immigration problem in the United States, according to a dispatch to the newspaper Nippon Jiji from Tokyo. The report says that the United States will permit all Japanese subjects who are now in the United States to become naturalized, and Japan will prevent further emigration to the United States.

Colby Promises to Act

WASHINGTON, Sept. 1. Frank G. Walsh, chairman of the American Commission of the Irish Independence, conferred with Secretary of State Colby today regarding the McSwiney case. After the conference Walsh announced that Secretary Colby has promised to endeavor to do something and to do it quickly.

Mail Airplane Wrecked

MORRISTOWN, N. J., Sept. 1. The government's all metal mail airplane while on route from New York to Chicago, crashed to the ground this morning and burst into flames, the explosion throwing the mail bags hundreds of feet in every direction. The pilot, Miller, and the mechanic, Pearson, were pinned under the wreckage and were instantly killed.

Supersedes Priority Orders

WASHINGTON, Sept. 1. Owing to the coal congestion in Atlantic ports the inter-state commerce commission has suspended for five days, beginning Thursday, its recent order given priority to coal shipments made by water to New England states.

Welles Succeeds Borah

WASHINGTON, Sept. 1. Senator Welles has been appointed acting chief of the division of Latin American affairs of the state department, succeeding Mr. Howe who has become Director General of the Pan-American Union.

Received No Bids

WASHINGTON, Sept. 1. Today the Shipping Board did not receive any bids for the sale of the fleet of 1,200 steel merchant ships offered for sale under the general policy which fixes the minimum prices at from \$100 to \$105 per ton.

MEXICAN PRESIDENT WANTS LAW GIVING ALL WORKERS SUNDAY OFF

(By The Associated Press) MEMPHIS, Tenn., Sept. 1. President Adolfo de la Huerta delivered a message to the twenty-ninth legislature which was instated Tuesday. The message mentioned Mexico's international relations resulting in the downfall of the Carranza regime and explained the aims of the present administration. The new legislation suggested includes the increasing of the President's responsibility, the formation of a Labor Department and the granting of Sunday holidays to all workmen, the re-organization of land and the concession of votes for women.

THE SPRINTER.

PORT OF SPAIN, Aug. 31. The Jamaica government has refused to make any contribution towards the West Indian Agricultural College, says the Barbados Advocate. It is proposed that the memorial to Archbishop Nuffall should take the form of an Agricultural College in Jamaica. Moreover, the benefactor's name of the college in Trinidad was not seriously considered. British Guiana has also turned its back on the Trinidad scheme. At a conference between the government and the elective members of the Combined Court, it was agreed that it would be better for British Guiana to have its farming than to contribute £3,000 annually towards the upkeep of a college in which the benefit of which to British Guiana would be proportionate. The Barbados Legislature has approved of an annual grant of one and a half percent of the income of the colony which would probably be £2,000 per annum towards the upkeep of the college with the proviso that it should be located in Trinidad and that the other colonies should contribute in proportion. The proviso will have to be withdrawn now that Jamaica and British Guiana are standing out if Barbados is to contribute. In view of the decision of the two big colonies which were counted on as partners in the scheme to have their two institutions the considerations which led the Secretary of State for the Colonies to promise financial assistance to the scheme will probably require further reviewing.

PORT OF SPAIN, Aug. 31. The Jamaica government has refused to make any contribution towards the West Indian Agricultural College, says the Barbados Advocate. It is proposed that the memorial to Archbishop Nuffall should take the form of an Agricultural College in Jamaica. Moreover, the benefactor's name of the college in Trinidad was not seriously considered. British Guiana has also turned its back on the Trinidad scheme. At a conference between the government and the elective members of the Combined Court, it was agreed that it would be better for British Guiana to have its farming than to contribute £3,000 annually towards the upkeep of a college in which the benefit of which to British Guiana would be proportionate. The Barbados Legislature has approved of an annual grant of one and a half percent of the income of the colony which would probably be £2,000 per annum towards the upkeep of the college with the proviso that it should be located in Trinidad and that the other colonies should contribute in proportion. The proviso will have to be withdrawn now that Jamaica and British Guiana are standing out if Barbados is to contribute. In view of the decision of the two big colonies which were counted on as partners in the scheme to have their two institutions the considerations which led the Secretary of State for the Colonies to promise financial assistance to the scheme will probably require further reviewing.

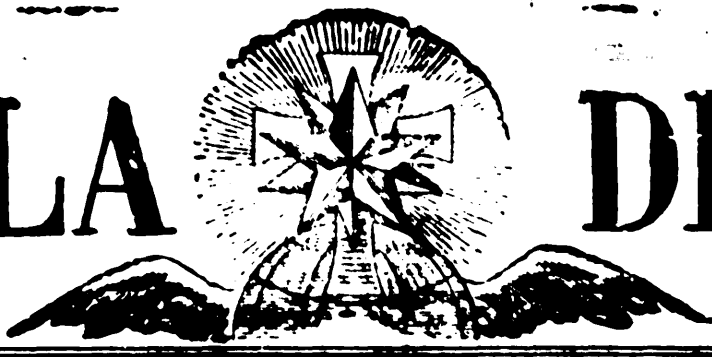
