Dempsey Matched Up To Fight With Carpenter

NEW YORK, Oct. 28.—George Carpenter, champion heavyweight pugilist of Europe, and Jack Dempsey, world champion, have been matched to fight a world's championship bout which will take place between February and July of next year.

While all parties refuse to state the amount involved, it is understood that the purse bidders in the neighborhood of half a million dollars, with the fighters sharing a percentage of cinema profits.

An announcement was made tonight that the fight would be held in Havana, but the number of rounds to be fought has not been definitely settled.

CLAIM BOAT WAS FAKE

NEW YORK.—Reports circulated in some newspapers intimating that the boat Tuesday night at Jersey City between George Carpenter and Battling Levinsky was not fairly fought tonight brought strong denials from the principals and others interested in the contest.

"Before I came to America," said Carpenter in a signed statement, "I looked upon all Americans as the personification of fair play; of sportsmanship in the true sense. In fact, I thought America was the land of the square deal. You went to war to insure the world fair play. I did all you asked me to do. I fought the man you selected for me to fight. And this is what I got—the fight is called a fake."

"Give me a square deal. That is all I ask."

"I pledge my honor as a soldier and a citizen of France to the great American Republic that I fought to the best of my ability and I sincerely believe from the bottom of my heart that Levinsky did the same."

Levinsky's statement said in part: "It is not possible for me to do anything to prove that this cowardly attack on my honesty is undeserved. In regard to the fight, I know my vindication will come if ever Carpenter meets Dempsey. In the second round Carpenter hit me harder than I have ever been hit before. From that moment to the end of the contest I was dazed."

John H. Smith, chairman of the New Jersey Boxing Commission, expressed the opinion that the bout was absolutely square.

BALBOANS ARE TO VOTE ON TWO DIFFERENT ISSUES

American Citizens of Legal Age Will Cast Their Vote for President of U. S. Separation Issue in April Lead for Mock Election Voters.

Six weeks ago there was started on the Canal Zone an election campaign. The idea was to arouse the interest of the many Americans who have been separated from their homes in the United States, and have them take more than the ordinary interest in the political situation in the home country. In order to carry out the idea it was considered that inasmuch as no provision has ever been made to allow people to vote on the Canal Zone, that there should be a "mock election," and that the campaign on the national issues should be separate from the local issues. This has been done especially in Balboa.

In addition to the Republican and Democratic parties it was deemed advisable to start some new parties, such as the Bachelor, Independent, and People's parties were formed. The ballot for the presidential nominees will be printed on a special form which has been provided and will be given to every American citizen twenty-one years of age and over who has registered his name with the Bureau at the Balboa clubhouse. The color will be pink. The local ballot will be white and will carry the names of the candidates nominated by the different factions.
