POLAND'S REQUEST FOR U.S. SUPPORT IN SILESIAN PLEBISCITE QUESTION IS REFUSED BY STATE DEPARTMENT

U.S. MAY NOT INTERFERE IN PURELY EUROPEAN POLITICS IS SECY. HUGHES CONTENTION

American Representatives on European Councils Should Act Solely as Observers Except in Cases where U. S. is Directly Affected.—Reports from Oppeln, Declare that the Situation Continues Serious.—Inter-Allied Commission Needs Force to Enforce Decisions.

(By The Associated Press) WASHINGTON, May 18. Poland has informally appealed to the United States for support in the Silesian plebiscite question.

Replying to the Polish government's appeal for American support in the Silesian controversy, the United States government reiterated its announced policy of non-interference in questions of peculiarly European character.

It is indicated that the Polish Minister Lubomirski failed to convince Secretary of State Hughes that there is cause for the alteration of that policy and that the United States representatives on European councils should act solely as observers except in cases where the United States is directly affected.

Situation Continues Serious

(By The Associated Press) PARIS, May 18.—Reports from Oppeln declare that the situation in Silesia continues serious. The members of the inter-allied commission are reported to be making efforts both in Polish and German circles to reach an understanding, but they have declared that their efforts will probably not be successful if the forces at their disposal are not increased to at least three times their present number.

Supreme Council to Decide

(By The Associated Press) LONDON, May 18. Premier Lloyd George stated this morning that "the fate of Upper Silesia must be decided by the Supreme Council, not by Korfanty, leader of the insurgents." The Premier reiterated the British attitude expressed by himself in the House of Commons and disclaimed all responsibility for the "distorted reports of French newspapers."

Discuss U. S. Representation

(By The Associated Press) LONDON, May 18.—The possibility of the United States participating in the forthcoming meeting of the Supreme Council scheduled to take place the next week and at Boulogne or Ostend to consider the Upper Silesian question, is being discussed in connection with the semi-official announcement that the conference will be plenary. Allied official circles are keenly interested in the attitude of the United States as the result of the latter's announcement that it would be represented in the various bodies created by the Versailles treaty.

Harvey Wanted at Conference

(By The Associated Press) LONDON, May 18. Pending the meeting of the inter-allied conference, exchanges are going on between the French and British governments in an attempt to clear up their differences over the Silesian question. Diplomats desire that the United States Ambassador, Mr. Harvey, attend the conference. Heads of allied governments have stated that Mr. Harvey will be welcome and can help very much in reaching a settlement particularly because of the disagreement between the French and British.

WETS AND DRIES STILL LOCKING HORNS OVER 4th

"Boss" of Balboa's City Council, Refutes Atlantic Siders' Assertion That Pacific is Wetter Than Atlantic. (2)

The chairman of the City Council of Balboa, Honorable William G. Hall, states that owing to the fact that Mayor Hallett is so busily occupied arranging for the send-off of the Red, White and Blue troops, he will take up the fight on rain.

"So-called" crusty of New Orleans states that the record of several years rainfall on the 4th was left out of the statement appearing in the Star and Herald of recent date. He said, "I find upon checking over these figures that the City Secretary's stenographer, typist and queen has installed a spirit of reduction of force in her typewriter and accordingly is operating upon half the number of keys. In all fairness to the Atlantic and Pacific sides, I will state that the total rainfall on the Pacific side has been 6.57" on the Atlantic side 4.02" However, the average rainfall for the 4th of July at Balboa for this period is .28" at Colon .90"

Last year it rained at 7:00 A. M. which spoiled the beginning of the day, 9:00 A. M. which interfered with the track and field events and tennis match, 1:30 P. Figures and facts are on file which prove conclusively that the reason why the Atlantic side has such a small rise and fall of the tide is because it rains so much and that the tide does not have a chance to get out before it has to come back.

Atlantic Siders Welcome

Setting all comparisons aside the people of the Atlantic side are most cordially invited to attend and participate in the celebration to be held at Balboa. The celebration was held at Balboa in 1919, at Cristobal in 1920 and it should be held at Balboa this year. If His Honor, "Slim" Grayley will attend he is most cordially invited to complete in the annual Mayor's race between Mayor Lloyd and Mayor Hallett.

Infantry Club Meets Today

At noon today the Rotary Club will hold one of the most important meetings for some time, in the dining room of the Hotel Central when matters of vital interest to the Republic of Panama will be handled. It is hoped to have some very prominent American officials present to speak on the matter of securing a permanent means of crossing the Panama Canal. A full attendance of members is strongly urged.

Chief Justice E. D. White, Author Of The White Award In Limits Dispute Between Panama and Costa Rica, Reported Dying.

WASHINGTON, May 18. Physicians in attendance at the bedside of Chief Justice Edward D. White of the United States Supreme Court of Justice, announced at eleven o'clock this morning that they entertained little or no hope for the aged jurist's recovery. Late last night it was announced that his condition was "very high" (pronounced). The Chief Justice was operated on Saturday for bladder trouble and since the operation has been in rather low condition. He has shown no rally after Tuesday's relapse when he sank into unconsciousness. Chief Justice White has recently been the central figure in the international boundary dispute between the Republics of Panama and Costa Rica on which he rendered an award in 1910.

PANAMA CANAL BLDG. DIVISION TO BE ABOLISHED EFFECTIVE JUNE 1, GOV. MORROW DECREES

All Construction and Repair Work Now Carried On Under Old Department Will Be Passed Over to Supply Department. J. B. Fields, to Be Constructing Quartermaster.—Further Reduction in Force Without Pending Asst. Eng. of Maintenance's Arrival.

The Building Division of the Panama Canal is to be entirely abolished effective June 1 and the construction and repair of all buildings and like structures now being performed by that division will be transferred to the Supply Department. This is officially announced in a circular signed by Governor Jay J. Morrow, which bears the caption, "Building Division Abolished."

The work under the Supply Department will be in charge of J. B. Fields, now chief of the Atlantic Side Building Division work. Mr. Fields has been appointed Constructing Quartermaster. Such organization and plant of the Building Division that may be required by the Constructing Quartermaster will also be transferred on June 1.

GOVERNOR MORROW PRESCRIBES BOUNDARIES OF CANAL ZONE TOWNS EFFECTIVE JUNE 1.

According to New Limits Ancon and Balboa Are One Town, New Limits Fixed For Corozal, Fort Clayton, Pedro Miguel, Paraiso, Gatun and Cristobal.

Town limits for every town in the Canal Zone are prescribed in an official circular signed by Governor Jay J. Morrow yesterday afternoon. The newly established limits become effective June 1.

Ancon and Balboa are outlined as a single town while the other towns upon which limits are prescribed are Corozal, Fort Clayton, Pedro Miguel, Paraiso, Gatun and Cristobal.

The following will be the new town limits:

ANCON-BALBOA.—That area lying within the line beginning at the junction of Truxtun Avenue and Gaillard Highway at the Canal Zone Panama boundary line running east and along the Panama Railroad main line to a point just opposite the north end of House No. 31A, thence southwest to the Canal Zone Panama boundary line and thence along the boundary line to the point of beginning.

CORROZAL.—All streets and roads connecting with Gaillard Highway and lying within the area beginning at the double railroad crossing and extending north on the said highway to its intersection with Miraflores Road.

FORT CLAYTON.—All street and roads connecting with Gaillard Highway and lying within the area beginning at the Cardenas River bridge and extending north on the

Constitutional Liberals Warn Oregon That Fate Similar To Madero's May Be His Lot If His Policy Is Not Changed.

(By The Associated Press) MEXICO CITY, May 18.—Beware of the fate of Madero who failed to heed the solicitations to change his policy and fell is the warning sent to President Obregon by 138 Liberal Constitutional deputies and senators. The warning contains charges that General Calles, who was Secretary of Interior in the Huerta administration and is now Secretary of Treasury, attempted to cause a disaffection against the Obregon administration and that his Radical sympathizers again attempted to invade the Chamber of Deputies Tuesday evening to attack the Liberal Constitutionalists who were holding a caucus. The Fire Department dispersed the Radicals.

PANAMAN DIPLOMATIC MISSIONS TO EXPLAIN NATION'S POSITION IN DISPUTE WITH COSTA RICA

Prominent Panamanian Intellectuals Head Missions to Chile, Argentina and Brazil to Defend Nation's Stand in Dispute With Costa Rica.—Foreign Minister Narciso Garay, Sails Today for Washington on a Similar Mission.—Other Mission Goes to Peru Soon.

C. Z. HONORS COL. GAILLARD AND GEN. BOLIVAR

Two Highways on Canal Zone Named After Historic Figures in Panama Canal and Isthmian Life, By Gov. Morrow.

In renaming ten Canal Zone roads that so far have been without an official name, Governor Jay J. Morrow, in a decree issued yesterday, perpetuates the memory of Lieutenant Colonel D. D. Gaillard, former member of the Isthmian Canal Commission, and the great South American liberator, General Simon Bolivar.

The two newly named highways will be known hereafter as Gaillard Highway and Bolivar Highway, respectively.

Gaillard Highway is the main road extending from the Ancon Railroad crossing to Gamboa, Colima, which were formerly referred to as General Road, Miraflores Road, Pedro Miguel Road, Paraiso Road and Gamboa Road. This name has been selected in acknowledgment of the distinguished services rendered to the Canal by the late Lieutenant Colonel D. D. Gaillard, U. S. A., a former member of the Isthmian Canal Commission.

Bolivar Highway is the main road connecting with Gaillard Highway and lying within the area beginning at a point on said highway 150 feet south of Red Tank colored school House No. 553 and extending north on the said highway to a point 150 feet north of Pedro Miguel railroad station.

PARAISO.—All streets and roads connecting with Gaillard Highway and lying within the area beginning at the south end of Paraiso railroad station and extending north on the said highway to a point 100 feet north of Paraiso colored school House No. 361.

GATUN.—All streets and roads connecting with Bolivar Highway and lying within the area beginning at the south end of Gatun railroad station and extending north on the said highway to the point of beginning of the Gatun Lock.

CORROZAL.—That area lying within the line beginning at the intersection of the Canal Zone Panama boundary line with the shore line at Fols River and running along the said boundary line to its intersection with the shore line of Lagoon Bay thence along the said shore line to the railroad bridge over the old French Canal thence easterly to the East Inverton bridge on Bolivar Highway thence northerly along the East Inverton to Fols River and thence along the shore line of Fols River to the point of beginning.

EX-SECRETARY F. K. LANE DEAD

Death Follows Operation for Appendicitis When Heart Trouble Became Acute.—Died a Poor Man Leaving No Estate.

Lane Started Life as Newspaper Reporter and Later Became Part Owner of Tacoma Daily News.—Began Law Practice in 1889.

(By The Associated Press) HOUSTON, May 18. Franklin Knight Lane, Secretary of the Interior during the Wilson administration, died today following an operation for gall stones.

The death of ex-Secretary Lane was due to heart failure following an operation performed on May 6 for gall stones and appendicitis. After the operation ex-Secretary Lane said: "I am surprised to be alive. I hope I will have a long life doing good things for others without the thought of money." He died a poor man and left no estate.

Starts as Reporter Franklin Knight Lane, like many men who have risen to high rank in the United States, began his career as a reporter in the Tacoma Daily News.

He was a New York Times reporter for western newspapers. He later became editor and part owner of the Tacoma Daily News. Born in Prince Edward Island, Canada on July 15, 1863, his parents removed to California during his early childhood days. He received his education in California and in 1885 was married to Miss Anne Wintermute, of Tacoma, Washington.

Admitted to Bar 1890 Still part owner of the Tacoma News, he studied law and in 1890 was admitted to the California bar. He began his law practice in San Francisco, California, and was corporation counsel for San Francisco from 1897 to 1902.

He was candidate for Governor of California in 1907 and a member of the Interstate Commerce Commission from December, 1905, to March 5, 1913, when he took charge of the Portfolio of the Interior in President Wilson's cabinet. He was a Democrat.

He was at one time a member of the Permanent International Railroad Commission representing the United States government. In 1915 he was conferred the degree of Doctor of Laws by the New York University.

NO RELATIONS WITH REDS THE U. S. IMPRISONED CITIZENS ARE FREED

(By The Associated Press) WASHINGTON, May 18. The United States State Department has again notified the Russian Soviet government that there is no change of its recognition, while United States citizens are held as prisoners in Russia. The exact nature of the communication of the State Department is not revealed but it is intimated that it was made through British or Red Cross channels and that it leaves no doubt as to the position of the United States. It is understood that the Soviet government was told that unless it released more than twenty United States citizens who are now prisoners, further negotiations, direct or indirect, is useless.

POPE APPOINTS NEW TURKISH BISHOPS

(By The Associated Press) ROME, May 18. The Pope has appointed Monsignor Lorenzo Lauri, Nunzio to Peru as Nunzio to Poland succeeding Monsignor Ratti. The latter will be named Cardinal in June consecrated and later he will be appointed Archbishop of Milan. The Pope has also appointed Monsignor Petrelli apostolic delegate to the Philippines as Nunzio to Peru. Monsignor Petrelli was already appointed Nunzio to China in 1918 but the opposition of France prevented the creation of a new creature in Peking.

GATUN NOTES

C. Z. Ministers Meet At Cristobal

A Gatun Athletic Club is being formed to be composed of men and women living in Gatun. Under its auspices sports will be conducted on Memorial Day at 2 P. M.

The nature will be a half mile swim open to all athletes on the Canal Zone. Those entering the contest will be able to secure passes from the respective club house secretary. It is expected that a large number of entries will be received in this case. Gold, silver and bronze medals will be given to first, second and third.

Several events are open to children and school children of Gatun. The following events are open to boys weighing 100 pounds or less: 25 yards dash on foot; 50 yards swim; tub race, in water.

For girls weighing under 100 pounds the following events are open: 25 yards dash on foot; 50 yards swim; tub race in water; running high jump, handball 100 yards; bas-relief fancy diving, handball; running high jump, handball 100 yards; open to men of Gatun.

Gold, silver and bronze medals will be awarded to first, second and third in each event. The prizes have been ordered from a well known jewelry house in New York and should arrive about June 8th.

A. A. C. rules will govern all contests and entries will not be accepted after May 29th. Entries should be taken at the Gatun Club house.

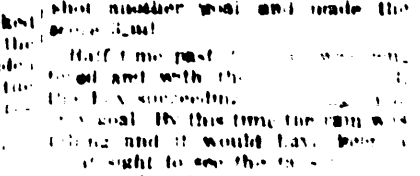

"GUILTY OF MURDER IN SECOND DEGREE" IS VERDICT OF JURY IN JAPANESE SHOOTING CASE

Mitsugi Ohira, Fireman Aboard Peruvian Steamer Iquitos, Faces Long Term in Gamboa Penitentiary for Killing His Countryman Kaneko Yamamoto.—Ohira Explains He Was Goaded Beyond Moral Endurance by Constant Tricks of Deceased Who He Says Was Favorite of Engineer.

Colon, May 18.—Mitsugi Ohira, Japanese fireman, aboard the Peruvian Steamer Iquitos, last of trial today before a jury at Cristobal on the charge of first degree murder for the shooting of Kaneko Yamamoto, also a Japanese member of the crew of same steamer, on 14th of April in the harbor of Cristobal, about the noon hour.

The jury six out at 4:30 and shortly after six o'clock returned a verdict holding the accused guilty of murder in the second degree.

The testimony of the witnesses for the Government showed that prior to the shooting the two had a little altercation, the defendant claiming that one of the officers of the ship had shown a little partiality toward the deceased relative to the work about the ship, the defendant being required to do more and harder work than Yamamoto's. This resulted in the feelings between them.

Always Picking the Hon

About three days before the shooting, Murakami, first mate of Yamamoto, had told Ohira that he was too large and it would be broken up. Acting upon this information Ohira went down to the engine and found the man to be a good deal heavier than he was.

Was Deceased Lied

On the day of the shooting Yamamoto told Ohira he should go up to the Engineer's office to get his papers, but when Ohira went he found the engineer did not want him for any purpose. He then returned and asked Yamamoto who had told him to go up. Yamamoto explained that he was only pick-

ing to be informed of the shooting.

Ohira came forward from the starboard hatch, and when first seen he was 30 feet from Yamamoto.

Ohira told the jury that he was the one who asked Yamamoto to go to the Engineer's office to get his papers, and pointed out that he had put the gun in his pocket, which was on board some cans. The gun of the ship turned over to these empty cartridges on the deck of the ship near the hatch.

Tells Story to Jury

In being taken to the launch from the ship to the Cristobal penitentiary, Ohira said that he made the following statement to him in broken English, in the presence of Officer Rothman, Mr. Ross and the Peruvian Consul:

"That the deceased was a particular friend of the Chief Engineer and did not have to work on account of being a friend, and he also talked defendant about having to work so hard. He showed me his hands and callous marks from working; that accused went into fore-castle and came out with gun in hand, and on seeing this he had time to shoot him, and turning the gun towards, took it out of his hand and in doing so he was here first. The defendant afterwards identified the gun as the gun with which the shooting was done."

On cross examination the defendant stated that he went through a physical demonstration with the defendant, the defendant demonstrating as to how he had taken the gun out of Yamamoto's hands, the Lieutenant holding the gun in his hand, representing the man, when Ohira did a job on his feet on his wrist, and forced the gun into his hand, the defendant would be shot him.

Ohira's Testimony in Box

The story told by Ohira on the witness stand varied somewhat from that given by the police.

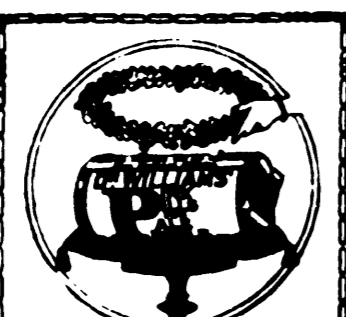
