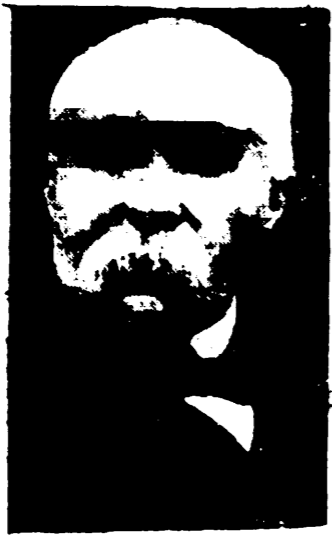


CLEMENCEAU ARRIVES IN N.Y. ON LECTURE TOUR TO EXPLAIN FRANCE TO U.S.

"I Have Seen My Country Invaded Twice and Hope Not To See a Third Invasion Before My Death—We Will Disperse Our Army Only When We Can Be Shown That We Are Safe From Invasion," He Says, Replying To Address of Welcome At N. Y. City Hall

NEW YORK, Nov. 18 (By the Associated Press.)—M. Clemenceau arrived here aboard the liner Paris early this morning.

First Speech Tuesday The notables greeting the great statesman at the docks included French Ambassador Jusserand, Assistant Secretary of State Bliss and Colonel Edward House.

Replying to address of welcome at the city hall, he said: "For fifty years I have been mixed up in the most important political crisis in the world. I have seen my country invaded twice. I do not want to see a third invasion before my death. We will disperse our army when we can be shown that we are safe from invasion."

RED CROSS EXPECTS EVERY MAN TO DO HIS DUTY NOW

Canal Zone Chapter of American Red Cross Called Upon To Go To The Aid of Chilean Earthquake Victims—Will You Help Pay?

and in 1915-16 during a struggle similar to the one we are now engaged in. I was a member of the Board of Directors of the Panama Canal Employees' Association at first and later Secretary-Treasurer. I am present I am Secretary of the Panama Metal Trades Council, Secretary of the Legislative Committee of that organization, and Secretary of the Panama Central Labor Union; was also a delegate to Washington from the Panama Metal Trades Council with Mr. Hushing from July 28 to November 3, 1921, during which time we had conferences with Mr. Tompkins and the other labor leaders in Washington, President Harding and Secretary Weeks, and succeeded in saving six months' rent and other charges by having the date of their inception postponed from July 1, 1921, to January 1, 1922.

Organized the F. E. U.

"I had the honor of organizing the F. E. U., No. 6; procured the data from Washington as to the necessary procedure, called and presided at the first meeting, which was held in the Board Room of the Administration Building on August 1, 1918. One of my most treasured possessions is receipt No. 1, signed by Mr. A. B. Korman for the first dollar paid into the Treasury of the organization.

"Have always been an active worker, and from December, 1917, to October, 1919, when I was compelled to resign because of ill health, was Financial Secretary and Chairman of the Membership Committee.

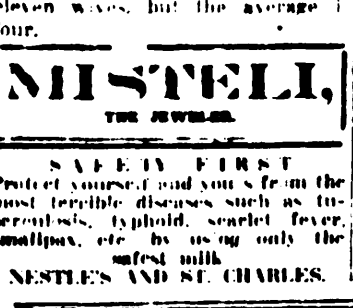

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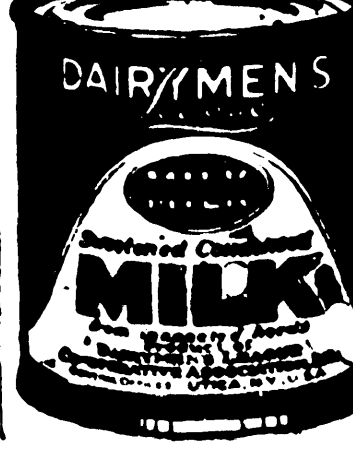

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BRYAN DEFENDS BIBLICAL THEORY OF CREATION

IN STIRRING ADDRESS BEFORE ATLANTIC SIDE ROTARY CLUB, VISITING STATESMAN DEPLORES TENDENCY TO DECRY HOLY WRIT

Hon. William Jennings Bryan Addressed Gatherings At Cristobal Clubhouse and Washington Hotel During Evening and During Afternoon Had Addressed Young Americans At Colon Beach High School—Meeting of Rotarians Was Most Enthusiastic In History of Club—Judge Wade Made Able Chairman

CRISTOBAL, Nov. 18.—The Hon. and Mrs. Jennings Bryan sailed today on the Ecuador again for Havana and Baltimore, and before leaving Mr. Bryan said that he had been delighted with his visit to the Isthmus. "This makes my third visit to Panama," he told the Star and Herald man "for I was here before in 1906 and 1910 and have been acquainted with the progressive changes which have taken place here since my last call. "I do not think that the Canal is as interesting when full of water as it was when I saw it last. The last time I was here I walked through the dry Canal. "Don't you think the scenery of Galin Lake is very beautiful?" we asked the great orator. "Yes," he replied. "The islands are certainly very pretty. Galin Lake compares with Lake George and our States Lakes for beauty, and I just enjoyed my trip through the Canal and Lake."

Mr. Bryan spoke of his reception in Salvador and of his trip ashore in a bucket. He also spoke of the welcome given him at Guatemala City and in Nicaragua. "They just outdid themselves in Guatemala," he said, "where the three pretty daughters of the President accompanied the delegation which came down to welcome us. A most amusing thing happened for when the band started to play, my parrot, who remembers so many of my campaigns, commenced to sing out: "Hurrah for Bryan, Hurrah for Bryan, it was just the same as in the old campaign days."

Rotarians' Reception Yesterday afternoon Mr. Bryan addressed the American school children at the Colon Beach High School. He was introduced by Miss Elizabeth J. Dadds and gave a most interesting and enjoyable talk to the boys and girls.

The American Consul, Dr. J. D. Dreher, and Mr. T. S. Booz were with him and later in the day Mr. Bryan returned the call of Governor J. D. Arseno at the Government Palace. The big event in the Atlantic side reception of the great statesman was the dinner last evening given in his honor at the Washington Hotel by the Rotary Club of Cristobal Colon.

Mr. Bryan arrived promptly at 7 o'clock, accompanied by Dr. Dreher and in the hotel patio an informal reception was held. Judge Richard A. Wade, the chairman of the evening, and an old friend of Mr. Bryan and the constant presiding member of the club.

Large Number Present The dinner was served in the big breakfast room of the hotel and the table was in the shape of a large "U" with Judge Wade sitting at the head table and with Mr. Bryan at his right and the Governor, Dr. Dreher and other guests, I take

His ideals and theories of self-government have been discussed not only in the republic of which he is a citizen, but in the legislative halls of every civilized country on the face of the globe, both by the press and by rulers of nations.

"Mr. Bryan, the Rotary Club extends to you its sincere thanks for the distinguished honor you have done us in being present at this luncheon, and we assure you that our best wishes will follow you throughout life for the great work which we believe you are doing in the cause of good government and the uplift of humanity. We say 'Welcome.' And now Mr. President, Rotarians, and guests, I take

pleasure in introducing Mr. William Jennings Bryan, journalist, and fellow-Rotarian from the Club at Miami, Florida."

A Fellow-Rotarian Mr. Bryan spoke as follows: "Rotarians and Friends: I greatly appreciate the honor you do me and I find myself very much at home here. I have just been talking to Judge Wade and I find that he lived very near to Jacksonville, Fla. where I began to practice law. I find that one of his nearest and dearest friends was also one of mine, in fact, he was the man who I think did me more good as an instructor in public speaking than any other person who has had an influence upon my life. It was a very pleasant thing to find that we had this to bind us together. I also find our consul, Mr. Dreher, an old friend of mine, here. I did not know he was here until I received a letter from him on the way down. One of the first visits I paid to the South was to Virginia when he was president of the college, and I spoke of the 'Young Man in Politics.' I knew Mr. Howard when he was five years old. His father was an old friend, and the wireless news on board ship brought me the information that he had been elected to Congress. This all makes me feel at home, but I am always at home at a Rotary reunion. We have a great Rotary Club at Miami. I think one of the best in the country, and I have had the chance to compare Rotary Clubs all over the United States. The only one thing that disappointed me was that national anthem that is sung in all parts of the country. 

Join this organization in order that we may join our efforts and energies and brains. The work of co-operation is the great work of our generation. Co-operation is more than merely joining ourselves together, it is a test of sanity. Let me tell you a story to illustrate this idea. It is the story of a man who went to one of the insane asylums and he saw the attendants, unarmed, leading great bodies or groups of the insane, and he went up to one of these attendants, who was leading fifty insane patients about the yard and asked if he was not afraid to handle so many by himself. "Afraid of what," the attendant asked him. "Why, that they will all jump on you some day when they get together, and hurt you." The attendant answered, "If they had sense enough to get together, they wouldn't be here." The insane cannot get together. The test of sanity is our ability to get together.

Twenty-five years or more I have been having people come to me and say that they thought they had solved perpetual motion, but they have not as I seem to have one difficulty, and that is that they cannot eliminate friction. There is such a force in physics as friction, and the effort is always

to reduce it to a minimum, but it is never eliminated. Whenever anybody produces a machine that will produce more power than it takes to start and run it we shall have perpetual motion. But so far nobody has made such a machine, and I think the prospects are not probable, although so many things that seemed impossible have been achieved that no one can tell what may come in the future.

"But in a social sense we have a machine that multiplies energy. If I ask you if the twenty-four members of this club can do as much as twenty-four could do separately, you will tell me that of course we can do more unitarily than we can separately. I ask you how much more. You may say there is no limit, no ratio, that accurately measures or measures the power that comes from co-operation. Twenty-four men acting as a unit accomplish more than twenty-five times as much more, they may accomplish a hundred times, or a thousand times as much, because they accomplish together what they could not even think of doing singly. To show what co-operation of energy can accomplish: If all the people of the world were to walk across the Isthmus singly, not one of them would ever think of building a canal by himself. But when 4,000 persons co-operate, they can accomplish what all the people in the world could, not undertaking singly.

Co-operation and Power

The first thing that comes with increase of strength from co-operation, and which cannot be separated from it, is responsibility, that comes with increased power. In the brute kingdom the animals may have power, but not responsibility; but man cannot have power without responsibility, and every time you increase power you increase responsibility, and we expect every human being to live up to the responsibility. And so when we increase power by co-operation, we increase the responsibility. Let me give you an illustration. If a child two years old was on the bank of a stream and saw a child one and a half years old fall into it, we do not say that the child of two years should have saved the child of one and a half years. The child has the opportunity but not the power. If a man is a mile away from the stream when the child falls in, we do not say that the man should have rescued it. He had the power, but not the opportunity. But if the man is standing on the bank when the child falls in he has the power plus the opportunity, and he must rescue the child. If he does not do it best to save it he would be called a coward and shunned by his community, because we measure human beings and ascribe to them a responsibility in accordance with the power and opportunity they possess. Now I think that this question of responsibility is inseparable from the question of power, and I think it is worth while to speak to the members of the Rotary Club to remind them of the fact that when by co-operation they have increased their power, they cannot escape responsibility; it comes with it. Now this organization has grown up in our community, and we have others of a similar character, all to fight for some particular work or good, or to put down some evil that ought not to be there.

"As a rule people will step to the right side of a bus, if it is clearly marked. My observation is that mankind will choose to live up to high ideals, and take the right side, really even politicians will do that. I do not know anything more cowardly than a politician—the only thing is two politicians. And if you have those, whatever courage our best would be disappointed by the other two. the day in the regular order. The good of the party occupies no such position as the dodging of issues in politics, but if you make a politician choose, he will always take the right side. For there is no more cautious person than a politician. If all the opposition are brought together for the right, the politician will join in.

W. J. O'NEILL STORY

"My wife and I were reading of the conquest of Peru by Pizarro. We read of an incident where everything had been a failure and disappointment, and there was talk of quitting. They were on an island, and one of the generals called his military officers together and he talked to them frankly. When they had started out to accomplish the failures and reverses, and when he had finished the review of the past, he told them of the place he had for the future and he drew a line on the sand with his sword, and said—overcome that

wanted to share the results of the future to step across the line to him; and not one stayed on the wrong side. The line is to be drawn—what better organization than the Rotary Club to draw the line and invite all the righteous to step up to it?

"In the campaign of '08 you would have thought to hear some personal talk, that the gold dollar had no alloy in it; that like baking powder, it was absolutely pure; but the gold dollar has 10 per cent of alloy in it, and so you will find that the things we speak of as good have alloy in them also. When I came back from South America twelve years ago, I stopped in Washington and called at the White House. Mr. Taft was then President, and he welcomed me and said, 'You are just back from South America. I envy you. I have often wanted to go to South America, but I don't have time.' Well, I said, 'did you ever read Emerson's essay on Civilization?' 'Yes,' he replied, 'I am going to give you an illustration and then the carrying over the top of it.' I told him, 'You have been under the hurrah. It is so much elected President, but I have had more difficult; and I want to warn

you against becoming too enthusiastic as to what people can do in a crowd as to forget the earlier duty that comes of starting a movement.

No Quibbles

"Now, some of you may think that I have been engaged in a movement in the last two or three years which I think is the greatest one that I have ever participated in. It is the greatest cause in which I have enlisted. I have been discussing what I regard as a very fundamental truth, whether man is, as God tells us, made in the image of God and brought into the world by Him, or whether he has ascended from the brute. I am not going to argue it now, this is not the place for such a discussion, but I think it is proper to bring out that if man has ascended from the brute there would have been no such thing as civilization.

"There is no martyr in the brute. Man dies and is willing to die for the truth. He has no brute blood in him. He is a God-like character that leads him to die for that which he believes to be right. When a man sees the right he cannot keep silent. The question of personal danger is a matter immaterial to him. We know that the truth once spoken cannot be recalled, the truth goes on. It may be but a still small voice in the beginning, but it echoes and echoes and echoes until the echo of that truth drowns out all other sound. And so I would see you not to forget that the initiation of a cause is necessary and that you have an early duty to God than you have to the people, and if you find the truth it is your duty to God to proclaim it.

"Have you ever thought what would happen if a man had a thought or belief, and would wait until everybody agreed with him before he would communicate it? How impossible it would be for any movement to start if the one who suggested it was willing to wait until everyone agreed on it. Prohibition. How long would it have taken prohibition to come if no one had been willing to suffer and die for it?

"Suppose it was desirable or thought desirable to have every clock in the United States run at the same time in the morning and begin work at the same moment. Just suppose for illustration that it was proposed. Of course New England would insist that the time should be fixed upon the sunrise in Boston and that everybody must get up no matter how dark it was when the sun rose in Boston. I have been in California and I am sure sure that the people think that there is only one place in the world where the sun can properly rise and set, and that is San Francisco, and would insist that everyone should stay in bed until the sun rose in California. Chicago would propose a compromise, that when the sun rose in Chicago it would be in order for the people in Boston and California to get up. But the truth is that when the sun shines into the home it is daylight and when day comes it is time to work, and so we find a million people rising as the sun rises across the continent from East to West. And so my friends if we had to wait until everybody would agree to a question we would have no progress. But that is not the law. Whenever truth shines on the human soul, then it is time to get up and go to work, and it is to get up when men see the truth and act on it regardless of the consequences.

Responsibility of Power "Now these are the three things that I wanted to impress upon you. First, the power that comes with co-operation.

Second, the responsibility that comes with power.

Third, the danger of carrying the spirit of co-operation so far as to struggle initiative.

"I know only one way to guard you against failure to realize your power and to stand your responsibility, and also to understand the earlier duties of initiating great movements, and I know that you all are citizens of a country. But cannot think your duties to your fellow-men, you must remember that you are children of a Heavenly Father, that you are creatures of a Creator.

"If in these few moments I have been able to increase your appreciation of the Rotary Club and its cause of the pleasure of fellowship, and because of the delight of these meetings, but because of the consciousness of increased power that comes with membership, and then if I have been able to impress upon you the sense of responsibility that you cannot shirk the sacredness of your duty, and then have been able to lead you up to see that high and early duty of seeing the truth and proclaiming it as soon as you can. I am satisfied. If I have been able to do these things, I then my friends, my pleasure has been increased, for in life we get our pleasure from the service we

can render, rather than from the enjoyment that is temporary and fleeting.

At the Clubhouse Lead and continued applause greeted the speaker as he sat down again and then accompanied by Mr. Brecher and Mr. T. A. Bank, Mr. Bryan was taken to the Central clubhouse where a large and enthusiastic crowd awaited him, and was the applause as he stepped out to be met by a group of well chosen words. Once again the great voice opened forth and without note or pause addressed the gathering with words of wisdom and with little stories that caused no doubt their delight, and Mr. Bryan spoke for nearly an hour delighting every body.
