BELIEF PREVAILS IN WASHINGTON THAT U.S. WILL NOW HELP EUROPE

CABINET MEETING FOLLOWS HUGHES MEETING WITH GERMAN AMBASSADOR

Some Are Inclined To Associate Present Events With Morgan's Recent Conference With Secretary Hughes Seeing Therein A Projected Loan For Germany — Ambassador George Harvey Summoned To Washington — Policies Tells Chamber France's Intentions Are Pacific

WASHINGTON, Dec. 15.—(By the Associated Press.)—The discussion of the German question by the Cabinet today after a conference between Secretary of State Hughes and German Ambassador Waldfeld has aroused much speculation concerning the United States' attitude toward Europe.

Some are inclined to associate today's events with the recent conference between Secretary Hughes and J. P. Morgan seeing therein a project for a loan to Germany.

It is stated by White House officials that the administration believes that American influence can help towards a solution of the reparations problem but indicated that no announcement was possible at present.

Secretary Called to Parley.

LONDON, Dec. 15.—(Associated Press)—Ambassador Harvey has been called to Washington for a consultation, it was stated at the Embassy this morning. He departs on December 22d.

Possible Causes Of Calm.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 15.—(By the Associated Press.)—In the absence of any official explanation, the impression is growing here that Ambassador Harvey has been called to Washington in connection with the situation brought about by the reparations problems now threatening a rupture between France and Britain.

Want Full Information.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 15.—(By the Associated Press.)—Ambassador Waldfeld of Germany conferred lengthily with Secretary of State Hughes just before the cabinet meeting this morning. Indications were that President Harding desired all available information on the precise condition in Germany relative to the reparations problem.

Situation Improved.

PARIS, Dec. 15.—(By the Associated Press.)—Premier Poincaré promised appearance before the Chamber today to tell of the negotiations begun in London and to outline the Government's reparation policy, created greatest interest. The galleries were packed with visitors.

The Premier told the Chamber that the general situation had grown better instead of worse, and said that he had followed faithfully the program laid down by the Government when he took office. He declared that Franco-British relations had improved and that the negotiations in Lausanne were proceeding well, and that the reparations conference for Belgium had merely adjourned to be re-opened in a better atmosphere.

To Treat Germans Gently.

Pacific intentions instead of coercive measures, engineers and customs officers instead of soldiers, colonies in words and action rather than impulsive methods and decisions and the keeping of the Balkan alliance high above questions of petty differences and details, were measures advocated by Premier Poincaré for the present situation.

U. S. HAS BIG TOBACCO & SUGAR CANE AND BEET CROP FOR THIS YEAR

WASHINGTON, Dec. 15.—(By the Associated Press.)—This year's tobacco production totalled over 1,324,000,000 pounds, valued at \$306,000,000, according to the Department of Agriculture. The cane sugar crop reached 482,000,000 pounds not valued, and the beet sugar crop to \$382,000 also not valued.

FEDERAL EMPLOYES TO GET HALF DAY ON DECEMBER 23

Unless "Special Public Reasons" Make Services Indispensable, All Employees of Uncle Sam Will Get Half Holiday Next Saturday

WASHINGTON, Dec. 15.—(By the Associated Press.)—President Harding has ordered that Federal employees be given a half holiday on December 23d, unless their services are required for "special public reasons" on that afternoon.

HOUSE CHURCH VIRGINIAN REPRESENTATIVE

TO HELP SHIPS THRU CANAL FOR \$25

Panama Railroad Is Prepared To Act As Agent For Ships Transiting Canal When No Local Agent Exists

Acting Governor M. L. Walker announced yesterday at Balboa Heights that the Panama Railroad company will act as agent for any vessel transiting the canal at \$25 per vessel.

Colonel Walker's announcement stated:

"The Panama Railroad Company through the Receiving and Forwarding Agent, Cristobal, is prepared to act as agent for any vessel desiring to transit the canal when such vessel has no other agent to look after its interests."

Fee Is \$25.00 Per Vessel.

"The agency fee is \$25.00 per vessel. This fee covers the services ordinarily performed by a local agent and includes the expense of handling the vessel in a seaport, purchasing fuel and other supplies, sending cablesgrams, an mail, securing bills of health, having consular documents issued and similar service."

"No fee is charged if the vessel requires no service other than the procurement of fuel or supplies from the Panama Canal de Panama Railroad Company."

"The handling of agency work for vessels making Canal Zone ports a regular stop for handling cargo or passengers, and requiring loading of cargo or passengers, or handling of claims, will be subject to special arrangements."

"If funds are advanced by the Panama Railroad to cover a vessel's expenses, the charge is 2½%."

LUCIA DI LAMMERMOOR TONIGHT AT BALBOA CLUBHOUSE

(By the Associated Press.)—The Arab Mosul oilfields tonight became an important issue in the conference when it was reported that the Entente had notified the Turks that the Vilayet of Mosul must be considered as part of the Arab realm of Iraq. The Turks contend that Mosul is within Turkey and that Turkey alone is empowered to dispose of the oil concessions. If Mosul belongs to Iraq then it is subject to a British mandate.

Before the minorities' sub-commission, the Turks reaffirmed that the establishment of an Armenian homeland in Turkey is impossible.
