Mamie Street Investigation

The May 13 issue of the *Mullet Rapper* reported that an archaeologist hired by Florida-Georgia Grove LLP would be investigating the Mamie Street site. On May 23, Jacksonville consultant Marsha Chance visited the site with property owner Gary Blackman and general contractor Greg Griffin. Ms. Chance is to report her findings back to the county and the state.

Recently, a member of the Seminole Tribe of Florida traveled to Chokoloskee in preparation for an upcoming Seminole religious ceremony. After discovering that the land had been destroyed, he wrote to the Collier County Commissioners to request that they "restore access to the property, preserve any archaeological artifacts that remain on the property, uncap the artesian wells, and return the Chokoloskee property to the Seminole Tribe of Florida." To the Seminoles this site is still sacred, as this tribal member relates how "many Seminoles take what the non-Indians might call a pilgrimage to the Chokoloskee property. Some of my first memories are of traveling to Chokoloskee to learn where to get the water, to pray, and to reconnect with family members related by blood and by clan. But this time my pilgrimage was to mourn the destruction of this site, to pray that it will be stopped and that the land will be returned to my people."


Build-a-Boat Project



A VIEW FROM THE BRIDGE

The Chokoloskee bridge – CR29 Bridge #030161 - built in 1955 over Chokoloskee Bay has been identified as in need of replacement.

Findings obtained for the 2009 Bridge Inspection Report rated this bridge as functionally obsolete. Some minor repairs were done to improve the structural deficiencies; however, the bridge continues to experience rapid deterioration to the seawalls. Recently installed concrete block mats, designed to protect the embankments, began to slump creating a hole behind the north seawall. Further investigation found that there are voids in the seawall joints below the water line. Sediment is leaking through causing the embankment slope to slump. The structural failures are a result of tidal influences. A follow up assessment determined that the bridge should be replaced. The most recent FDOT inspection in January of this year showed that the bridge still does not meet minimum standards for safety; and, furthermore, the bridge has a history of being damaged from storm surges and has the potential of being lost during a significant storm event.

Collier County Transportation Engineering Department issued a request for proposals for design and related service for replacement of the bridge and once established, will then seek proposals and funding and construction.

On Tuesday, May 24, the Board of Collier County Commissioners voted under the "Consent Agenda," Item 16.A.5 to approve of the Growth Management Division's "Recommendation... of the short list of design professionals and to enter into negotiations between Collier County and TYLIN International, Inc....for design and related services for replacement of the CR29 Chokoloskee Bay project."

Recipe for Good Eating Calamondin Pie by Patricia Huff

1 can sweetened condensed milk ¹/₄ cup pureed calamondin 3 eggs, separated 1 pie shell, frozen or make your own

Make calamondin puree by cutting calamondin in half, remove seeds and put whole fruit in blender to puree. Add egg yolks to condensed milk; slowly stir in calamondin. Whip egg whites and fold one half into mixture (discarding remainder); pour into prepared pie shell. Cook for 20 minutes at 325°. Same recipe as Key lime pie and just as tasty.

June Fishing Report by Captain Bill Lindsay

Lots of fishermen enjoy fishing in the Glades at this time of year. Yes, hot weather, afternoon thunder storms, and bugs are part of the deal. But, less boats on the water

and very good fishing at first light and dusk can be lots of fun. Tarpon are here all summer and will feed in the rivers and passes. Look for them early and late in the day on the falling tides. Capt. Ned Small has been taking his parties way back into the backcountry in kayaks and catching "baby" tarpon on fly tackle. Snook will hit top water plugs as long as the sun is not too high, once that happens our casting skills will be put to the test because you must place your plug or fly up under the mangrove branches to be productive. Casting after a rain storm can produce great strikes, especially if you can find a "drain" running out from under the mangroves, trout can still be caught inshore, but the best catches are in deeper water near shallow wrecks or structure. Tripletail are very active and I have caught several close to shore on the incoming tide while fishing for tarpon. On calm days, permit fishing with live crabs on the shallow wrecks is at its best. Snapper fishing gets good at this time of year and will keep the fish dinners coming. If things are slow, you can always catch a shark on a strip of ladyfish. If you have not hooked a blacktip shark on light tackle, you will be surprised how much fun it is. They jump and run like tarpon. One note of concern is the turbid water along the edge of the Gulf. It has hurt our inshore fishing and has been with us for too long. It extends out several miles past the park boundary markers. Let's hope it clears up soon.

SHERIFF'S REPORT

On May 13 District 7 deputies responded to a possible vehicle burglary in Everglades City that had just occurred. While the suspects were attempting to flee, deputies arrested 2 individuals who were charged first with "Loitering and Prowling" and after investigation with "Vehicle Burglary". On May 21, three vehicles were burglarized while parked at an airboat site on East Tamiami Trail. Forced entry was gained by smashing a window although the vehicles were locked. Valuables left in plain view enticed the thief. Most vehicles burglarized nationwide are found to be left unlocked so remember to lock your doors and keep valuables out of sight.

The Collier County Sheriff's Office has learned that some citizens have been receiving phone calls from individuals who say they are soliciting donations on behalf of CCSO. Citizens should be aware that these calls are fraudulent. The Sheriff's Office does not solicit donations over the phone. If you receive this type of call, hang up and do not give the caller any personal information. To report a fraudulent solicitation call, you can contact CCSO at 239-252-9300.




