# Murder suspect on suicide watch at jail

Calm, with a serious expression and little to say, Lake County murder suspect Johnny Lashawn Shipman made his first court appearance via video camera from the Marion County Jail Thursday morning.

County Judge James McCune ordered Shipman, 36, held without bond on a warrant for the first-degree murder of Kristi Delaney, his 26-year-old girlfriend, who

was found dead in Mascotte on Monday.

The inmate, who is classified as a violent offender, told the judge he would hire a private attorney.

Officials said Shipman is being held under suicide watch at the jail and will be transferred to Lake County authorities. He was arrested on Wednesday afternoon by members of the Ocala Police Department's Special Deployment Unit.

They received a tip on his whereabouts and went to the

Fore Ranch area off Southwest State Road 200 in Ocala, where he was arrested without incident at about 4:55 p.m.

When OPD detectives Dan C. Clark and Jeff Hurst arrested Shipman, he had a shirt wrapped around his left hand, according to Clark's report. In both hands, Shipman had a jacket, a Bible and a cross made out of Palmetto leaves.

# Miles of self-discipline

## Hospital exec reflects on NYC Marathon

The chief operating officer for Leesburg Regional Medical Center and The Villages Regional Hospital was one of six Lake County runners who crossed the finish line of the 26.2 mile New York City Marathon earlier this week, a race that was filled with emotion and tight security in the aftermath of the Boston Marathon tragedy.

Saad Ehtisham believes the NYC race will go down as his all-time favorite.

"I know I will run several more, but this one will always hold a special place," said Ehtisham, a Pakistani immigrant who came to the U.S. in 1988 and became a U.S. citizen seven years later.

"The experience of running in New York was just amazing; the crowd was seven rows deep cheering you

on. It looked like the city had just gotten together for one purpose just to support all the runners, elite runners to recreational runners. It didn't matter. It was one community supporting everybody, the 50,000-some runners."

He noted there was a stretch of "eerie silence" when the runners came over the Queens Borough Bridge.

"That was the most deafening eerie silence portion of the race because nobody was allowed on the bridge other than the runners," he said, noting the only noise he heard were the footsteps of the runners, the breathing, and some who were listening to music.

Once Ehtisham came down the bridge on 59th Street and turned onto First

Avenue, he heard the loud crowd and spotted his wife, Tracy, and gave her a quick hug and kiss.

He enjoyed running through all five boroughs, and seeing the differences and the cultures in the boroughs. He also loved starting the marathon at Staten Island and the chance to see the Statue of Liberty.

"It was just amazing to see that, especially for somebody like me who is an immigrant. ... Just to have that experience in New York with the Statue of Liberty and running across, it was very emotional. And to enter Central Park and to know that we were almost to the end, and crossing the finish line and seeing the crowds that were there. This is going to be the best and favorite race that I have run in my life."

# Students help raise \$205K for healthier hearts

Gathering his students together, Michael Henry asks them a question that resonates with most of them: How many of them have a family member affected by heart disease?

Many small hands are raised.

"I have had multiple people in my family that have had heart disease," said Henry, who has taught physical education at Lost Lake Elementary School in Clermont since 1995. "It touches all of us. It is the No.1 and 3 causes of death in the United States."

Henry then gets his students rallied for a good cause: to raise money for the American Heart Association, whose mission is "building healthier lives free from cardiovascular disease and stroke."

Since 1999, Henry has led a student effort to bring awareness to heart disease by raising more than \$205,000 for the American Heart Association's Jump Rope for Heart program.

The educational fundraising program "engages elementary and middle school students with jumping rope or playing basketball while empowering them to improve their own health and help other kids with heart-health issues," according to the American Heart Association.

Students ask parents, family and friends to sponsor them with a flat donation for the program, which takes place in the spring at the school.

Recently, Lake County School Board members honored Henry for the program and Lost Lake Elementary School hosted a "Coach Henry Day" during which students dressed up in the coach's trademark outfit: plaid shorts and collarless T-shirts. Students then presented him with a banner signed by everyone.

Henry, a modest and soft-spoken man, said the effort is student-driven and less about him.

"I am getting too much credit," he said. "It is the community and kids that do more of this. It is all kids. We have less than couple thousand dollars donated by businesses."

He cited one fifth-grade student who raised \$3,000 alone for Jump Rope for Heart.

## Lake Square theater cited for unsanitary conditions

AMC Theatres Lake Square 12 — a big draw for the mall as it heads to the auction block — has been cited by the Lake County Health Department for unsanitary conditions.

That news follows announcements this week that the 82-employee Target store at the mall in Leesburg will be closing and another national chain, Pearle Vision, is looking for someone to buy its company-owned outlet there.

According to a recent health department inspection report, AMC Concessionaire Services at the 12-screen movie complex was cited for dirty floors, greasy equipment, broken ceiling tiles, and unsealed openings that could allow rodents, flies, cockroaches and other vermin to enter.

A follow up inspection found little had changed. "All equipment will be maintained in a clean and sanitized manner," the inspector noted, with yet another follow up inspection scheduled on Nov. 20.

The 33-year-old mall, which has been losing foot traffic for years, is headed to the auction block later this month. A start-

ing bid of \$4 million — with a bid deposit of \$100,000 — is being asked for by Auction.com, which stated that bidding will start Nov. 19 and end Nov. 21. Only online bids will be accepted.

Target announced on Nov. 5 that its store at the mall is considered under performing and will be closed Feb. 1. According to a Worker Adjustment and Retraining Notification filed with the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity on Nov. 5, 82 local store employees will be laid off.

Also on Nov. 5, Pearle Vision, one of North America's largest optical brands, announced it was seeking someone to buy its neighborhood eye care center at the mall. Three other Central Florida eye care centers also are available — in Orlando, Kissimmee and Viera.

Pearle Vision stated the sales are part of a company-wide effort to "re-license" 34 company-owned stores in 10 states.

Property showings at the mall, prior to the auction, will be held today and Tuesday, according to Auction.com.



## All but one retain seats after elections

Election day was a field day for incumbent Lake County candidates Nov. 5, with all but one winning re-election by a good margin.

The Montverde mayor's race was a real squeaker, though, with incumbent Troy A. Bennett besting challenger Billy Bates by a vote of 214-211 (43.8 percent to 43.2 percent).

The only incumbent to lose a race was District 4 Groveland City Council member Jared Mincey, who lost to former council member Evelyn Wilson by a vote of 290 to 245 (45.9 percent versus 54.2 percent).

Out of 45,606 registered voters in 29 precincts, 5,748 voters — or about 12.5 percent — went to the polls.

According to the Supervisor of Elections Office, all races were decided Nov. 5 and there will be no run-offs.

Other incumbents who won were Mascotte Mayor Tony Rosado, Minneola Mayor Pat Kelley, Lady Lake Mayor Jim Richards, Clermont city council member Keith Mullins, Montverde town council members Glenn Burns and Jim Pierce, and Mount Dora city council members Ryan

Donovan, Michael Tedder and Dennis Wood.

Mount Dora Mayor Robert Thielhelm Sr. was not seeking re-election and Cathy Hoechst won the job by capturing 58.4 percent of the vote. She beat challengers Randy Wiseman, who won 32 percent, and Andrew Mullen, who won 9.5 percent.

In Lady Lake, Richards won a landslide victory, receiving 75.4 percent of the Ward 5 commission vote compared to 24.5 percent for his opponent, Hen-

ryka Presinzano, former board member from 2001-07.

As he begins his fourth term, Richards said he wants the town to continue to be fiscally prudent.

"I just want to continue to watch the expenses, even though we have one of the lowest tax rates," he said.







Fair brings 17th century to life

The Renaissance history came to life on Nov. 3 for thousands of children and adults on the last day of the 12th annual Lady of the Lakes Renaissance Faire, where all ages escaped the 21st century to see knights in armor, jousting and experience the games, customs, food, and dress of England in 1606.

No leads in baby's murder

After five years, no murder charges have been filed in the case of 5-month-old Gabriel Golden, who died of two skull fractures he allegedly received in a home filled with people.


Still, investigators and prosecutors say the case remains open, with a new lead detective on the case after former lead detective Mark Knuutila had too much on his plate when U.S. Marshal duties were added to his job.

"No one has gotten away with murder, it's a difficult case that just hasn't been solved yet," Knuutila said.

Five years ago, a responding Lake County Sheriff's deputy found 31-year-old Ashley Baker and his 30-year-old wife, Tammi, attempting to perform CPR on the lifeless body of Gabriel in his crib at the couple's home on Picciola Road.

The child, who was purple when the deputy arrived on the scene, was taken to Leesburg Regional Medical Center where he was pronounced dead.

## Synthetic marijuana a growing problem among high schoolers


Even in the midst of tough economic times, David Kucharek vowed he would never sell synthetic marijuana at his store, PJ's Hit and Run in Astatula, which recently shut down.

"I have a conscience," he said, describing how the drugs have damaging and life-threatening health effects. "I want this stuff stopped. They are selling it to kids under 18."

Kucharek remembered a recent conversation with a parent, who learned her son was offered the drug. "He is in fifth grade,"

he angrily said. Experts and police officials say the sale of synthetic marijuana to minors is a growing problem in Lake Coun-

ty and other neighboring counties.

Just a few weeks ago the Marion County Sheriff's Department confiscated 11,623

packages of synthetic marijuana.

Such incidents are not foreign to Lake County. "Complaints regarding synthetic marijuana come in on a fairly regular basis," said Sgt. James Vachon, spokesman for the Lake County Sheriff's Office.

A recent 2012 Florida Youth Substance Abuse Survey of ninth to 12th graders in Lake County found that 16.7 percent of them have used synthetic marijuana in their lifetime. The survey was conducted with more than 1,000 students.

## Aid trickling into hard-hit areas in Philippines

TACLOBAN, Philippines — Desperately needed food, water and medical aid are only trickling into this city that took the worst blow from Typhoon Haiyan, while thousands of victims jammed the damaged airport Tuesday, seeking to be evacuated.

"We need help. Nothing is happening. We haven't eaten since yesterday afternoon," pleaded a weeping Aristone Balute, an 81-year-old woman who failed to get a flight out of Ta-

cloban for Manila, the capital. Her clothes were soaked from a pouring rain and tears streamed down her face.

Five days after the deadly disaster, aid is coming — pallets of supplies and teams of doctors are waiting to get into Tacloban — but the challenges of delivering the assistance means few in the stricken city have received help. Officials also were working to determine how many people had been killed, with the country's president saying the death toll

## New rules would put a third of adults on cholesterol meds

The nation's first new guidelines in a decade for preventing heart attacks and strokes call for twice as many Americans — one-third of all adults — to consider taking cholesterol-lowering statin drugs.

The guidelines, issued Tuesday by the American Heart Association and American College of Cardiology, are a big change. They offer doctors a new formula for estimating a patient's risk that includes many factors besides a high cholesterol level, the main focus now. The formula

a three-rung guardrail, or about half way down the 33 foot-high span.

Traffic slowed on the bridge and on U.S. 301 as dozens of people stood around watching emergency officials, with the help of a ladder fire truck, remove the body at about 8:30 a.m.

The bridge, which has sidewalks, was built about two years ago over a set of railroad tracks that crosses SR 44 to help alleviate traffic congestion caused by passing trains.

Valerie Millikin, who

works in a hair and nail salon in the shopping center, was one of several area employees and residents standing around to watch officials take down the body.

"It's something you just don't see around here," she said.

Wildwood Police Chief Ed Reeser said the victim's vehicle was discovered parked nearby. While detectives are working the case as a homicide, signs point to the death as a suicide, he said.

The rope used was purchased Monday morning.

Reeser said an autopsy is slated to be conducted today.

children, Lake County Commissioner Sean Parks said that he would like to bring back for further discussion an ordinance banning the sale of synthetic marijuana in the county, with violators incurring a civil code violation.

Other counties in the state have instituted similar ordinances and officials claim these laws have been effective in deterring the problem.

Parks said he wanted to get involved when he learned a Lake County child went into cardiac arrest after taking the drug.

"I think our kids' health is important," he said. "This is a poison that kids are putting in their bodies. It stops hearts and destroys lives."

Parks has had discussions with the sheriff about the extent of the problem.

Sheriff Gary Borders said he is supportive of "any ordinance that will make it illegal for convenience stores to carry and sell synthetic marijuana to our youth."

The drug, sold as "incent" and packaged in attractive pouches with exotic names such as "K2," "Black Mamba," "Spice," are sold openly in gas stations, experts said.

"The products are made from crushed leaves, garden trash, etc and then sprayed with powerful concentrated laboratory-synthesized chemicals that resemble THC, the active mind-altering ingredient in marijuana," said Dr. Morton Levitt, Senior Associate Dean for Faculty Affairs and professor of Clinical Biomedical Science at the Charles E. Schmidt College of Medicine at Florida Atlantic University.

On July 1, Florida law outlawed more than 140 chemicals used in synthetic marijuana.

But, unfortunately, Levitt said, manufacturers have found ways around the bans.

"Manufacturers easily alter the chemical formulations minimally to get around these around these bans," Levitt said. "These drugs are extremely dangerous because they contain highly powerful excitable hallucinogens that simulate THC, but have unknown/untested side effects, because manufacturers are constantly varying the chemical formulas to be one step ahead of the regulators."

Vachon said "synthetic marijuana is known to

be sold in many convenience stores and 'smoke shops' throughout Lake County."

Hillsborough County experienced a similar problem, which prompted the Hillsborough County Commission to implement an ordinance to outlaw the sale of synthetic drugs this past February.

Those who violate the ordinance face a civil fine of \$500 per packet of synthetic marijuana, said Capt. Kyle Cockream of the Hillsborough County Sheriff's Office.

"It has been very effective," he said. "We believed (at first) the retailers were not really intimidated by the ordinance. As it turned out, quite the opposite happened."

Indeed, he said there are 14 cases scheduled before the Hillsborough County Code Enforcement Board, where one store owner is facing a \$1.2 million fine.

"We have seen it disappear off the shelves," he said. "Not to say it is not there. It has been pushed underground."

Hillsborough County Commissioner Sandra Murman said lives are at stake.

"We must stop this epidemic from spreading more — these synthetic drugs are insidious, and our kids don't know that it can kill them," she said. "The customers include teenagers and some documented cases involve children as young as 13, who were lucky enough to end up in a drug treatment facility, and not in a morgue."

But Murman warned there have already been deaths reported in Texas and one in Florida.

Jim Hall, epidemiologist and co-director of the Center for Applied Research on Substance Abuse and Health Disparities, said synthetic marijuana has serious health effects such as seizures, chest pain, hallucinations, nausea, vomiting, rapid breathing and heart issues.

The ordinances, he said, are a step in a right direction.

"The retail ordinances were effective because they were directed at legitimate retail stores who particularly did not want to cause problems with their licenses to sell beer and wine," he said.

Commissioner Jimmy Conner said he supported the ordinance.

"I think honestly it is more of a problem then we realize," he said. "I am glad that Commissioner Parks brought it up."

While it is true that some people seem to be born under a lucky star, so that everything they touch turns to gold even when they don't know what they're doing, I always felt that Sylvia did not fall into this category.

However, the majority of the membership contended that Sylvia didn't even know what time of day it

was when it came to bridge, and they couldn't conceive that Sylvia ever consciously performed the amazing feats occasionally reported here.

In support of that contention, they might cite this example where Sylvia was declarer at five clubs. West led a heart, and Sylvia took East's eight with the ace. She then played a spade to the ace and returned a low club to her king, catching West's queen.

The situation at this point looked grim. East had two sure trump tricks, and then there was the matter of her two irritating diamond losers. True, she could discard one of them on the king of hearts, but the other one would inevitably constitute the setting trick.

But Sylvia, with indomitable spirit, carried on. She cashed the spade king and ruffed the jack in dummy. Then she led a diamond to her ace, forgetting in the excitement of the moment to discard a diamond on the king of hearts. She was heard to gasp at this juncture, but it was too late to retract the play.

When Sylvia next led a trump, East scored the A-10, but he then had to return a heart to dummy's K-J, allowing Sylvia to shed the 3-2 of diamonds and so make the contract. Now would you call this just dumb luck?

includes age, gender, race and factors such as whether someone smokes.

The guidelines for the first time take aim at strokes, not just heart attacks. Partly because of that, they set a lower threshold for using medicines to reduce risk.

The definition of high cholesterol isn't changing, but the treatment goal is. Instead of aiming for a specific number, using whatever drugs get a patient there, the advice stresses statins such as Lipitor and Zocor and identifies four groups of people they help the most.

"The emphasis is to try to treat more appropriately," said Dr. Neil Stone, the Northwestern University doctor who headed the cholesterol guideline panel. "We're going to give statins to

those who are the most likely to benefit."

Doctors say the new approach will limit how many people with low heart risks are put on statins simply because of a cholesterol number. Yet under the new advice, 33 million Americans — 44 percent of men and 22 percent of women — would meet the threshold to consider taking a statin. Under the current guidelines, statins are recommended for only about 15 percent of adults.

Some doctors not involved in writing the guidance worry that it will be tough to understand.

"It will be controversial, there's no question about it. For as long as I remember, we've told physicians and patients we should treat their cholesterol to certain goal levels," said the Cleveland Clinic's Dr. Steven Nissen. "There is concern that there will be a lot of confusion about what to do."

The government's National Heart, Lung and Blood Institute appointed expert panels to write the new guidelines in 2008, but in June said it would leave drafting them to the Heart Association and College of Cardiology. New guidelines on lifestyle and obesity also came out Tuesday, and ones on blood pressure are coming soon.

Roughly half the cholesterol panel members have financial ties to makers of heart drugs, but panel leaders said no one with industry connections could vote on the recommendations.

"It is practically impossible to find a large group of outside experts in the field who have no relationships to industry," said Dr. George Mensah of the heart institute. He called the guidelines "a very important step forward" based on solid evidence, and said the public should trust them.

## New tech saves time for first responders

Using iPads is helping Fruitland Park Fire Rescue crews save valuable time in the field and when responding to emergency calls, Fire Chief David Borst says.

The department initially looked at getting some new Mobile Data Terminals (MDTs), but opted instead for something smaller and cheaper, Borst said in a press release.

“We originally looked at MDTs, but the cost factor was out of our reach,” he said. “In addition, iPads give fire officers and firefighters access to vital information more quickly and more accurately. Also, the pricing of the iPads, and the applications, is about 20 percent of the cost of the traditional mobile data terminals (MDTs). That’s a con-

## Inmate executed for Orlando murder

STARKE — A man convicted in the 1991 sexual assault and murder of an aspiring artist in Orlando was executed Tuesday by injection.

Darius Kimbrough was pronounced dead at 6:18 p.m. at the Florida State Prison in Starke, officials said. He did not make any statement, telling officials "No, sir" when asked if he had any last words.

Kimbrough was condemned to die for the October 1991 killing of 28-year-old Denise Collins, who was attacked in her apartment as she slept. Experts testified at Kimbrough's 1994 trial that blood and semen samples taken from Collins' bed were compatible with the defendant's DNA.

Collins' mother and sister were among 24 witnesses, including news media, who attended the execution. Her mother, Diane Stewart, said the last 22 years have been "horrendous" while the family wait-

ed for the legal appeals to play out.

"This is well deserved," Stewart told reporters. "Let's see if we can pick ourselves up a little more and get on with our life."

The sister, Annette Collins, said the execution was a numbing experience but also a relief.

"I'm just happy that Denise received justice. Wherever she is, I hope she is smiling down,"

she said.

It was the second time a new mix of drugs was used in Florida since the previous execution in mid-October.

Kimbrough was not a plaintiff in a lawsuit by other inmates who have argued the use of the new drug mix should be halted as unconstitutional. The execution Tuesday appeared to go smoothly, with no apparent movements or unusual activity by Kimbrough.

In October, the state Supreme Court denied Kimbrough's appeal, rejecting the argument from Kimbrough's lawyers that he shouldn't be executed because the jury recommendation wasn't unanimous.

The U.S. Supreme Court rejected Kimbrough's final appeal late Tuesday afternoon.

Earlier Tuesday, Kimbrough ate his last meal including pizza, fried chicken, fried green tomatoes and chocolate chip ice cream. Kimbrough also met with a chaplain, his mother, three aunts, a cousin and a friend.

While searching the property, deputies reportedly found marijuana plants growing in and outside the home, cultivation equipment, loose marijuana in glass jars and devices used to smoke the drug.

Rentz remained in the Lake County jail Tuesday in lieu of \$14,650 bail.

could be lower than earlier feared.

"There is a huge amount that we need to do. We have not been able to get into the remote communities," U.N. humanitarian chief Valerie Amos said in Manila, launching an appeal for \$301 million to help the more than 11 million people estimated to be affected by the storm.

"Even in Tacloban, because of the debris and the difficulties with logistics and so on, we have not been able to get in the level of supply that we would want to. We are going to do as much as we can to bring in more," she said. Her office said she planned to visit the city.

Presidential spokesman Edwin Lacierda said relief goods were getting into the city, and the supply should increase now that the airport and a bridge to the island were open.

"We are not going to leave one person behind — one living person behind," he said. "We will help, no matter how difficult, no matter how inaccessible."

Tacloban, a city of about 220,000 people on Leyte island, bore the full force of the winds and the tsunami-like storm surges Friday. Most of the city is in ruins, a tangled mess of destroyed houses, cars and trees. Malls, garages and shops have all been stripped of food and water by hungry residents.

The loss of life appears to be concentrated in Tacloban and surrounding areas, including a portion of Samar island that is separated from Leyte island by a strait. It is possible that other devastated areas are so isolated

they have not yet been reached.

In Cebu, to the southwest, the Philippine air force has been sending three C-130s back and forth to Tacloban from dawn to dusk, and had delivered 400,000 pounds of relief supplies, Lt. Col. Marciano Jesus Guevara said. A lack of electricity in Tacloban means planes can't land there at night.

Guevara said the C-130s have transported nearly 3,000 civilians out of the disaster zone, and that the biggest problem in Tacloban is a lack of clean drinking water.

# World Trade Center named America's tallest building

CHICAGO — The new World Trade Center tower in New York will replace Chicago's Willis Tower as the nation's tallest building when it is completed next year, an international panel of architects announced Tuesday.

The Height Committee of the Council on Tall Buildings and Urban Habitat said that because the needle atop the New York skyscraper is a permanent spire and not an antenna it can be counted when measuring the structure's height.

The needle, measuring 408 feet tall, was more than enough to confirm Chicago is the Second City when it comes to tall buildings.

With the needle, 1 World Trade Center is a symbolically important 1,776 feet tall. Without it, the building would have been only 1,368 feet tall — well short of the 1,451-foot Willis Tower.

At stake was more than just the pride of two cities that feast on superlatives and the tourist dollars that might follow: 1 World Trade Center, with its beacon on top will stand as a monument to those killed in the 9/11 attacks, and its architects had sought to capture the echo of America's founding year in the structure's height.

Not only that, but the building's height without the needle also holds symbolism because at 1,368 feet it is the height of the original World Trade Center.

Antony Wood, the council's executive director, said the needle is particularly important as a "structural and symbolic element."

Further, he said, the decision to put the spire atop the building was

part of a 'quest' to build a permanent reminder of what the nation went through.

"This was not an economic quest for bragging rights to the U.S.'s tallest," he said. "This was a quest to put something meaningful and symbolic on that site because of the horrible history of what happened on that site."

He said the antennae on top of the Willis Tower help to make the committee's point about permanence, explaining that when the building went up there were no antennae, and that the original antennae have been replaced with taller ones.

Wood also made

another point that, though not a factor on the committee's decision, is significant: that the Willis Tower will continue to be an attraction for years just like the Empire State Building is decades after it, too, was eclipsed by taller buildings.

"Are any fewer people going to come to Chicago or even travel and visit the Willis Tower because it no longer holds the title of the U.S. tallest?" he asked. "No," I don't think it does."

The Height Committee comprises about two dozen industry professionals from all over the world and is widely recognized as the final arbiter of official building heights

around the world. They conferred behind closed doors last week in Chicago, where the world's first skyscraper appeared in 1884.

The new World Trade Center tower remains under construction and is expected to open next year.

The designers originally had intended to enclose the mast's communications gear in decorative cladding made of fiberglass and steel. But the developer removed that exterior shell from the design, saying it would be impossible to properly maintain or repair. Without it, the question was whether the mast was now primarily just a broadcast antenna.

# Blame game follows Iran nuke talks

WASHINGTON — The deadlocked international effort to sign a nuclear deal with Iran has spurred a global blame game over who walked away from the negotiating table and why.

It's a war of words playing out in public statements from top officials and across social media, with a bluntness that stands in stark contrast to the secretive and diplomatic nature of the negotiations themselves. And it raises questions about whether the debate will compound the years of mistrust between Iran and the West when the parties reconvene in Geneva for another round of talks next week.

The blame game centers on a seemingly basic point: Who put the brakes on what appeared to be last week's march toward an interim deal, one that would exact nuclear concessions from Iran and an easing of sanctions from the West? Was it Tehran or were there others in the so-called P5+1, a six-nation coalition comprised of the U.S., France, Russia, China, the United Kingdom and Germany?

According to U.S. officials, the answer is simple.

"The P5+1 were unified on the proposal that was put forward and that the Iranians did not accept

that proposal — and that's a statement of fact," White House spokesman Jay Carney said Tuesday.

Carney's words echoed assertions one day earlier from Secretary of State John Kerry, who said the U.S. and five other world powers were in agreement, "but Iran couldn't take it at that particular moment, they weren't able to accept that particular thing."

That comment earned a stern response on Twitter from Iranian Foreign Minister Mohammed Javad Zarif.

"Mr. Secretary, was it Iran that gutted over half of U.S. draft Thursday night? And publicly commented against it Friday morning?" Zarif tweeted on Tuesday.

In an earlier tweet, after Kerry's news conference, the foreign minister wrote: "No amount of spinning can change what happened within 5+1 in Geneva from 6 p.m. Thursday to 5:45 p.m. Saturday. But it can further erode confidence."

Zarif appeared to be alluding to French officials, who surprised many by publicly raising concerns in the middle of the talks that proposed limits on Iran's ability to make nuclear fuel don't go far enough. France also sounded alarms over a planned heavy water reactor that would produce greater amounts of byproduct plutonium, which can be used in nuclear weapons production.

# Prairies vanish in push for green energy

ROSCOE, S.D. — Robert Malsam nearly went broke in the 1980s when corn was cheap. So now that prices are high and he can finally make a profit, he's not about to apologize for ripping up prairie land to plant corn.

Across the Dakotas and Nebraska, more than 1 million acres of the Great Plains are giving way to corn fields as farmers transform the wild expanse that once served as the backdrop for American pioneers.

This expansion of the Corn Belt is fueled in part by America's green energy policy, which requires oil companies to blend billions of gallons of corn ethanol into their gasoline. Ethanol has become the No. 1 use for corn in America, helping keep prices high.

"It's not hard to do the math there as to what's profitable to have," Malsam said. "I think an ethanol plant is a farmer's friend."

What the green-energy program has made profitable, however, is far from green. A policy intended to reduce global warming is encouraging a farming practice that actually could worsen it.

That's because plowing into untouched grassland releases carbon dioxide that has been naturally locked in the soil. It also increases erosion and requires farmers to use fertilizers and other industrial chemicals. In turn, that destroys native plants and wipes out wildlife habitats.

It appeared so damaging that scientists warned that America's corn-for-ethanol policy would fail as an anti-global warming strategy if too many farmers plowed over virgin land.

The Obama administration argued that would not happen. But the administration didn't set up a way to monitor whether it actually happened.

It did. More than 1.2 million acres of grassland have been lost since the federal government required that gasoline be blended with increasing amounts of ethanol, an analysis of satellite data found. Plots that were wild grass or pastureland seven years ago are now corn and soybean fields.

That's in addition to the 5 million acres of farmland that had been aside for conservation — more than Yellowstone, Everglades and Yosemite National Parks combined — that have vanished since Obama took office.

In South Dakota, more than 370,000 acres of grassland have been

uprooted and farmed from since 2006. In Edmunds County, a rural community about two hours north of the capital, Pierre, at least 42,000 acres of grassland have become cropland — one of the largest turnovers in the region.

Malsam runs a 13-square-mile family farm there. He grows corn, soybeans and wheat, then rents out his grassland for grazing. Each year, the family converts another 160 acres from grass to cropland.

Chemicals kill the grass. Machines remove the rocks. Then tractors plow it three times to break up the sod and prepare it for planting.

Scattered among fields of 7-foot tall corn and thigh-high soybeans, some stretches of grassland still exist. Cattle munch on some grass. And "prairie pot-holes" — natural ponds ranging from small pools to larger lakes — support a smattering of ducks, geese, pelicans and herons.

Yet within a mile of Malsam's farm, federal satellite data show,

more than 300 acres of grassland have been converted to soybeans and corn since 2006.

Nebraska has lost at least 830,000 acres of grassland, a total larger than New York City, Los Angeles and Dallas combined.

"It's great to see farmers making money. It hasn't always been that way," said Craig Cox of the Environmental Working Group. He advocates for clean energy but opposes the ethanol mandate. "If we're going to push the land this hard, we really need to intensify conservation in lockstep with production, and that's just not happening," he said.

Chris Wright, a professor at South Dakota State University who has studied land conversion, said: "The conversation about land preservation should start now before it becomes a serious problem." Wright reviewed the AP's methodology for determining land conversion.

The AP's analysis used government satellite data to count how

much grassland existed in 2006 in each county, then compare each plot of land to corresponding satellite data from 2012.

The data from the U.S. Geological Survey and the Department of Agriculture identify corn and soybean fields. That allowed the AP to see which plots of grassland became cropland.

To reach its conservative estimate of 1.2 million acres lost, the AP excluded grassland that had been set aside under the government's Conservation Reserve

Program, in which old farmland is allowed to return to a near-natural state. The AP used half-acre sections of earth and excluded tiny tracts that became corn, which experts said were most likely outliers.

Corn prices more than doubled in the years after Congress passed the ethanol mandate in 2007. Now, Malsam said, farmers can make about \$500 an acre planting corn.

His farm has just become profitable in the past five years, allowing him and his wife, There-

sa, to build a new house on the farmstead.

Four miles south, signs at each end of the town of Roscoe announce a population of only 324. But the town, which relies in part on incomes like Malsam's, supports a school, a restaurant, a bank, a grocery store and a large farm machinery store.

The manager of the equipment dealership, Kaleb Rodgers, said the booming farm economy has helped the town and the dealership prosper. The business with 28 employees last year sold a dozen combines at about \$300,000 apiece, plus more than 60 tractors worth between \$100,000 and \$300,000, he said.

"If we didn't have any farmers we wouldn't have a community here. We wouldn't have a business. I wouldn't be sitting here. I wouldn't be able to feed my family," Rodgers said. "I think ethanol is a very good thing."

Faulstich, who farms and ranches in central South Dakota near Highmore, said much of the land being converted is not suited to crop production, and South Dakota's strong winds and rains will erode the topsoil.

"I guess a good motto would be to farm the best and leave the rest," he said.







# Israel halts plans to explore new settlements

JERUSALEM — Israel's prime minister on Tuesday abruptly halted a plan to explore the potential construction of thousands of new homes in West Bank settlements, saying it had created an "unnecessary confrontation" with the international community that threatened to weaken his campaign against Iran's suspect nuclear program.

The plan announced by Israel's Housing Ministry earlier in the day had prompted a Palestinian threat to walk out of U.S.-brokered peace talks and drew angry criticism from officials in Washington, who said they had been blindsided by the move.

In a statement, Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu said he had asked his housing minister, Uri Ariel, to "reconsider" the plan. He noted that Ariel, a member of the pro-settlement Jewish Home Party, had drawn up the plan "without any advance coordination."

"This step does not contribute to settlement. On the contrary, there is damage here for settlement," Netanyahu said. "This is a meaningless step — legally and in practice — and an action that cre-

ates an unnecessary confrontation with the international community at a time when we are making an effort to persuade elements in the international community to reach a better deal with Iran."

The statement said Ariel had accepted the request.

The issue of settlement construction has been at the heart of a standstill in peace efforts in recent years.

The Palestinians claim the West Bank, east Jerusalem and the Gaza Strip, territories captured by Israel in 1967, for an independent state. They say Israeli settlement construction on occupied

lands is a sign of bad faith. More than 500,000 Israelis now live in the West Bank and east Jerusalem. Israel withdrew from Gaza in 2005.

The ministry refused to say how many of these homes were in settlements. But the anti-settlement watchdog group Peace Now, which closely monitors construction activity, said the plans included nearly 20,000 apartments in the West Bank and 4,000 in east Jerusalem.

In all, Peace Now says Netanyahu's government has given final approval for nearly 3,500 new homes in Jewish settlements since taking office last March.

In addition, it has promoted plans for nearly 9,000 additional homes.

The international community rejects settlements as illegal or illegitimate, and the reaction to Israel's plan was swift.

The chief Palestinian negotiator, Saeb Erekat, said that at the instruction of his president, he had contacted the U.S., Russia, the European Union, the United Nations and the Arab League to voice objections.

"I informed them that if Israel implements this decision, then this means the end of the negotiations and the end of the peace process," Erekat said.

# China, Russia, Cuba win UN rights council seats

UNITED NATIONS — China, Russia, Saudi Arabia, Vietnam, Cuba and Algeria won seats Tuesday on the U.N. Human Rights Council, riling independent human rights groups who said their election undermined the rights watchdog's credibility.

The General Assembly elected 14 new mem-

bers to the 47-seat Geneva-based council, which can shine a spotlight on rights abuses by adopting resolutions — when it chooses to do so. It also has dozens of special monitors watching problem countries and major issues ranging from executions to drone strikes.

Britain, France, the Maldives, Macedonia, Mexico, Morocco, Namibia and South Africa were also elected to

three-year terms.

Human Rights Watch noted that five of the new council members — China, Russia, Saudi Arabia, Vietnam and Algeria — have refused to let U.N. investigators visit to check alleged abuses. China, Russia and Algeria have 10 or more unfulfilled requests for visits by U.N. experts, some dating back to 2000, the group said. Saudi Arabia

and Vietnam each have seven outstanding requests, they said.

"Countries that haven't allowed U.N. experts appointed by the council to visit have a lot of explaining to do," said Peggy Hicks, global advocacy director of the New York-based non-government group. "It's like hiring someone, then not allowing them to enter the office."

Across the street from

the main gate of U.N. headquarters, pro-Tibet activists hung a huge banner saying "China Fails Human Rights."

Seats, allotted by region, are sometimes contested and sometimes not. All 193 members of the General Assembly can vote by secret ballots, which were collected in wooden ballot boxes from delegates.

Geneva-based UN Watch, a frequent critic

of U.N. rights practices, denounced what it considered the worst new members.

"China, Cuba, Russia, and Saudi Arabia systematically violate the human rights of their own citizens, and they consistently vote the wrong way on U.N. initiatives to protect the human rights of others," said UN Watch executive director Hillel Neuer.

## Cubans heartened by possible reversal of 3D ban

HAVANA — Something unusual appears to be happening in Havana.

The Communist government may be backing off an unpopular economic crackdown barely a week after it was announced — a feat of political dexterity that islanders say they are not used to seeing from a leadership in power since the 1950s.

The brouhaha centers on a ban announced Nov. 2 on the dozens of private home cinemas and video game salons that have mushroomed in recent months, becoming a popular diversion for entertainment-starved residents.

The government denounced the cinemas as spreading uncultured drivel to the young, and ordered them closed for stretching the boundaries on the kinds of private businesses allowed under reforms instituted by President Raul Castro.

Then came the backlash, with entrepreneurs bemoaning thou-

sands of dollars in lost investment and moviegoers saying they were exasperated by heavy-handedness toward a harmless diversion. The official reaction was swift, and unprecedented.

An article in the Communist Party newspaper Granma on Monday acknowledged there was wide disapproval of the ban, and hinted it was being rethought.

Analysts said the reversal could signal a greater willingness by the government to heed the desires of private entrepreneurs and their customers, as well as their growing influence in a country where the government still controls as much as about 80 percent of the economy.

"It's extraordinary because the government made a very clear decision, and now it seems it's being walked back," said Philip Peters, a longtime Cuba analyst and president of the Cuba Research Center. "That's not something that happens every day."

# German stolen art website down because of demand

BERLIN — A website featuring artworks from among a massive trove discovered in a Munich apartment crashed Tuesday because of heavy traffic, officials said, as a handful of potential heirs came forward to claim art possibly looted by the Nazis.

Authorities posted 25 paintings from the more than 1,400 paintings, drawings and other works discovered in the apartment of 80-year-old Cornelius Gurlitt, the son of a dealer who worked with the Nazis. But the website — www.lostart.de — was overwhelmed by interest, according to Sabine Kramer from the government-run Lost Art Internet Database.

"There are simply too many people who want to look at the pictures and that's why we're facing technical problems," Kramer said.

As German officials scrambled to respond to criticism that they have been slow to make details public, several families came forward to stake their claims. Among them were the heirs of Fritz Salo Glaser, a Jewish lawyer from Dresden, who a lawyer says owned 13 of the 25

paintings listed online.

Officials had initially released few details about what was found in Gurlitt's apartment in part of an ongoing tax investigation, but the haul was known to have included works by Henri Matisse, Pablo Picasso and others. Bowing to demands to release more information, the government said Monday it believes about 590 of the more than 1,400 artworks may have been stolen by the Nazis.

It said the website would be regularly updated so people and institutions could tell if they had legitimate claims, but declined to give a time frame for the publication of the other artworks in question. The government also said a task force made up of six experts started working Tuesday on identifying possible former owners.

Looted art was stolen or bought for a pittance from Jewish collectors who were forced to sell under duress during the Third Reich. For the heirs of those collectors, the discovery has raised hopes, while the slow release of information has stirred frustration.

On Tuesday, Jewish groups and art experts welcomed the pub-

lication of the 25 paintings, but demanded that the rest be made public quickly.

"It's an important signal that the government intervened after the outrage about the silence surrounding the looted art," said Deidre Berger from the American Jewish Committee in Berlin. "But it's too little, too late. If the government is serious about this, they should get the information up in a way that everybody can access it — people worldwide have a legitimate interest in this."

Prosecutors in the Bavarian city of Augsburg, who are handling the case, acknowledged receiving requests for details from people or institutions with a possible claim to some of the works, but would not say how many.

Lawyer Sabine Rudolph, who represents Glaser's heirs, said that 13 paintings on the website belonged to him before the Nazis came to power. Rudolph said when the Nazis no longer allowed Glaser to work as a lawyer after 1933, he had to sell his art collection to make a living.

"The family, who still lives in Dresden, is very happy about the art found and of course they want them back," Rudolph told The Associated Press.

## Kosovo police arrest 6 terror suspects

PRISTINA, Kosovo — Six ethnic Albanians suspected of plotting a terrorist attack inspired by extreme Islamist ideology, including two believed to have fought alongside Syrian rebels, have been arrested in Kosovo, officials said Tuesday. A seventh suspect remains at large.

Two of the men are also suspected of attacking two American Mormon missionaries in the capital, Pristina, two days before their Nov. 5 arrest, a senior police official involved with the investigation said.

Authorities have grown increasingly worried about the rise of extremism in a country with a strong presence of NATO peacekeepers, including hundreds of U.S. troops. Authorities had followed the cell for three months after intercepting a call allegedly plotting an attack with another person of Kosovo descent in an unnamed European country, said the police official, who is part of a team that deals with terrorist threats.

Four of the suspects were arrested in a park in Pristina by undercover police agents posing as weapons dealers, the police official said. Another suspect was arrested in central Pristina and the sixth in the eastern town of Gnjilane. It was unclear whether a target had been identified and what the weapons were

being bought for.

A sniper rifle, handguns and material for making an improvised explosive device were found in suspects' houses, according to the police official.

A justice official said the suspects had been watched by video surveillance, phone tapping, and email monitoring, but gave no further details because of the ongoing investigation. Both officials spoke on condition of anonymity because they were not authorized to discuss the matter.

Though the country of 2 million is overwhelmingly secular, ethnic Albanians from Kosovo and neighboring Macedonia have been linked with terror plots in the United States, including a foiled bombing last year in Tampa, Florida, and a 2007 attack on military personnel at Fort Dix in New Jersey.

Around 150 ethnic Albanians are believed to have joined foreign fighters battling the forces of Syria's President Bashar Assad and some 12 are believed to have been killed there.

The arrest warrant seen by AP said the 7 individuals — identified as Genc Selimi, Nuredin Sylejmani, Valon Shala, Adrian Mehmeti, Musli Hyseni, Bekim Mulalli and Fidan Demolli — are suspected of "preparing a terrorist act against the safety and constitutional order" in Kosovo.

## US stocks fall as earnings disappoint

NEW YORK — Disappointing company earnings and falling oil prices pulled stocks back from record highs on Tuesday.

NRG Energy slumped after the company lowered its earnings forecast, leading other power companies lower. News Corp. fell after the media company posted an unexpected revenue decline due to weakness at its Australian newspapers. Energy stocks fell after oil dropped to a five-month low.

Winners included airlines. The gains were led by JetBlue Airways, after the Justice Department said it cleared the way for American Airlines and US Airways to merge, creating the world's biggest airline.


This year's 24 percent surge in the stock market has slowed in November. The Standard & Poor's 500 has edged up 0.6 percent this month after an average monthly increase of 1.7 percent in the previous 10 months.

"The market looks tired to us," said Jim Russell, a regional investment director at US Bank. "A little bit of a pause is actually healthy," allowing the economy time to catch up to the gains the stock market has made.

After closing at an all-time high on three of the previous four trading days, the Dow Jones industrial average fell 32.43 points, or 0.2 percent, to 15,750.67. The S&P 500 index dropped 4.20 points, or 0.2 percent, to 1,767 points. The Nasdaq composite edged up 0.13 point to 3,919.92.

Six of the 10 industry sectors in the S&P 500 index fell. Banks and utilities fell the most.

NRG Energy was one of the biggest decliners in the S&P 500, slipping 98 cents, or 3.5 percent, to \$27.06. News Corp. fell 27 cents, or 1.5 percent, to \$17.15.

## Gov't reaches agreement to allow airline merger

WASHINGTON — The Justice Department says it has reached an agreement to allow American Airlines and US Airways to merge, creating the world's biggest airline.

The agreement requires the airlines to scale back the size of the merger at Washington's Reagan National Airport and in other big cities.

In August, the government sued to block the merger, saying it would restrict competition and drive up prices for consumers on hundreds of routes around the country.

The airlines have said their deal would increase competition by creating another big competitor to United Airlines and Delta Air Lines, which grew through recent mergers.

The settlement reached Tuesday would require approval by a federal judge in Washington and eliminate the need for a trial that had been set to begin Nov. 25. It would

require American and US Airways to give up takeoff and landing rights or slots at Reagan National and New York's LaGuardia Airport and gates at airports in Boston, Chicago, Los Angeles, Dallas and Miami to low-cost carriers.

Attorney General Eric Holder said the agreement would ensure more competition on nonstop and connecting routes throughout the country. The department said the divestitures were the largest ever for an airline merger.

The companies expect to complete the merger in December. As soon as the deal closes, the airlines will coordinate prices and schedules as if they were one, but combining the fleets will take months or years, executives said.

Six states had joined the lawsuit to block the merger, fearing the loss of flights and jobs at their airports. The Justice Department said that American and US Airways agreed to maintain for three years the US Airways hubs in Charlotte, Philadelphia and Phoenix and American hubs at Miami, Chicago's O'Hare

Airport, New York's John F. Kennedy International Airport and Los Angeles International.

If the settlement is accepted, the combined American and US Airways would operate 44 fewer daily departures at Reagan National and 12 fewer at LaGuardia than they would have without concessions. But the new American will still be the biggest carrier at Reagan National. The two airlines run about 290 takeoffs a day at Reagan National and 175 at LaGuardia now.

Standard & Poor's analyst Jim Corridore said the airlines gave up more than he expected but the settlement shouldn't change the financial benefits of the merger to the companies.

The companies and some airline industry experts said the Justice Department had a weak case, especially after allowing four big airline mergers in the past eight years with few conditions. American and US Airways were not willing to bet their fate on the decision of a federal judge.

## Oil prices drop 2% on supply concerns

NEW YORK — The price of oil sank 2 percent Tuesday, hitting a five-month low, as the market anticipated another increase in domestic supplies.

Benchmark U.S. crude for December delivery fell \$2.10, or 2.2 percent, to close at \$93.04 a barrel in on the New York Mercantile Exchange. Oil has dropped about 9 percent in the past month. Investors also sold other riskier assets like gold, down 1.3 percent, and U.S. stocks.

Expectations for another increase in U.S. crude supplies weighed on oil.

Data for the week ending Nov. 8 is expected to show an increase of 1.8 million in crude oil stocks, according to a survey of analysts by

Platts, the energy information arm of McGraw-Hill Cos. That would mark the eighth straight weekly increase.

Markets also digested reports from the International Energy Agency and the Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries.

The Paris-based IEA said China and India would turn Asia into the world's main driver of energy demand in coming years, while the United States is expected to be able to meet its energy needs from do-

mestic sources by 2035.

OPEC, headquartered in Vienna and representing some of the world's largest oil exporters, including Saudi Arabia, Venezuela and Nigeria, kept forecasts for demand for its crude this year and next unchanged from a month ago but warned there were still risks to growth.

"Although the global economy continues to improve, the pace of growth remains sluggish and near-term developments will need close monitoring," OPEC said in its monthly report.

In the U.S., the nationwide average for a gallon of gasoline fell another penny to \$3.18, according to AAA. The price is down 6 cents from a week ago and down 26 cents from this time last year.





## Lake should build the fire station

Lake County's largest city has a problem. And county officials seem either oblivious to it or reluctant to find a solution.

Lake County Fire Station 90 is housed in a hotel in Clermont.

Five years ago, plans were for Value Place Hotel off of State Road to serve as a temporary dwelling place. But six firefighters still work in the makeshift firehouse.

The problem — at least the first one — is that the hotel is cramped.

The bigger problem is safety. Local police have received frequent complaints of vandalism and theft at the hotel, fire officials say.

Officials say a finding alternative location has been unsuccessful — until recently.

Lake County Sheriff Gary Borders offered to allow the fire department to build a modular building on the property of the sheriff's South Lake Substation on State Road 50, about a quarter mile from the hotel.

Fire officials hope to get the county commission's approval to begin planning the project.

We understand that sometimes pressing issues occupy the attention of county commissioners and smaller matters get overlooked.

But how do conditions at a fire station in the county's biggest city drop from commissioners' radar for half a decade?

As county commissioners discuss constructing county road interchanges and small-town stations in rural sections of Lake, they apparently scratch their heads in wonderment about where the money would come from for bigger-ticket items, such as a South Lake fire station.

The conditions of Fire Station 90 beg the question: What have commissioners been thinking?

We can't imagine any reasonable excuse for this oversight.

And we urge commissioners to give this issue their serious attention.

This is an essential public service. Commissioners should find the money to provide better and safer housing for their firefighters.

Firefighters deserve better treatment than this. And South Lake residents deserve better management of such a vital public service than this.

Commissioners, find the money for the station for the sake of both your employees and your constituents.

You can't afford not to.



## Watch for the coming betrayal of Israel

In Geneva, Switzerland, The United States and other major powers appeared close to a deal with Iran to curb its nuclear program in exchange for lifting some economic sanctions against the terrorist-sponsoring state. Negotiations, however, fell apart at the last minute when France and Iran balked at the final wording on the interim draft. Talks are expected to resume within a few weeks, but it is worth pausing to consider what was nearly agreed to and what the outcome could likely be.

President Obama has pledged to Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu that America has Israel's "back." Who knew he had a knife? An agreement that trusts Iran's promises and allows it to surreptitiously complete development of nuclear missiles would stab Israel in the back.

North Korea promised former President Jimmy Carter during his 1994 visit to Pyongyang it would close a nuclear reactor at Yongbyon in exchange for food and humanitarian aid. The reactor was subsequently re-opened. Memo to the Obama administrations: tyrants lie.

Unlike North Korea, an officially atheist state, Iranian mullahs have repeatedly said they have a religious duty to annihilate Israel, not to mention America. How do secular diplomats negotiate with people who, in their minds, would be violating "Allah's will" by making deals with the "great Satan"?

While the negotiations between Secretary of State John Kerry and Iran were taking place in Geneva, writes Ynetnews.com, "...the Iranian government

sent a different message with a broadcast on state television of a simulated missile attack on Israel." How much more evidence of Iran's intentions and ultimate objective are needed?

Last month, Kerry and Netanyahu met for seven hours in Rome. Caroline Glick of the Jerusalem Post, citing the Israeli newspaper Yediot Aharonot, writes, "The secretary of state told the prime minister that he heard from his European friends ... that if the negotiations (with the Palestinians) fail, Israel can forget about participating in the European research and development program 'Horizon 2020.'" Kerry is then quoted as saying, "And that will only be the beginning."

Doesn't Kerry have this backward? Sanctions might be lifted against Iran for a promise that won't be kept, but possibly imposed on Israel if it won't agree to what amounts to assisted suicide?

It would also appear that this "deal" had been in the works for at least several months before the Geneva meetings. The Daily Beast reports: "The Obama administration began softening sanctions on Iran after the election of Iran's new president in June, well before the current round of nuclear talks in Geneva or the historic phone call between the two leaders in Sep-

tember."

The administration pledges to watch Iran closely and if it violates any provisions in a final agreement, sanctions would be re-imposed. If sanctions and other means, such as the introduction of the Stuxnet virus into Iran's computers, failed to deter Iran's nuclear program, why would anyone think additional threats and more sanctions would produce the desired results? Iran is playing for time and it appears the United States is willing to give it to them.

History is a great teacher, but not everyone pays attention. In "The Guns at Last Light," Rick Atkinson's chronicle of World War II, the author recalls President Franklin Roosevelt's view of Soviet dictator Josef Stalin following their meeting at Yalta in February 1945: "Stalin doesn't want anything other than security for his country," the president said. "He won't try to annex anything and will work for a world of democracy and peace."


Winston Churchill similarly misjudged Stalin, writes Atkinson, telling his war cabinet, "Stalin I'm sure means well to the world and Poland. ... He will not embark on bad adventures." He added, "I don't think I'm wrong about Stalin," whom he had called "that great and good man."

Times and dictators change, but human nature remains the same. Roosevelt and Churchill were wrong about Stalin and the Obama administration is wrong about Iran.

## Managers of the Year: Francona and Hurdle


NEWYORK — Terry Francona of the Cleveland Indians and Clint Hurdle of the Pittsburgh Pirates won the Manager of the Year awards Tuesday after guiding their small-budget teams to charming turnarounds.

Francona edged John Farrell of the World Series champion Boston Red Sox for the American League honor 112 points to 96 in a close vote by the Baseball Writers' Association of America.

It was the first Manager of the Year honor for Francona, even though — in an interesting twist — he steered the Red Sox to World Series titles in 2004 and 2007. In his first season with the Indians, he directed them to a 24-win improvement and their first playoff berth in six years.

They lost the AL wild-card game to Tampa Bay, but voting is conducted before the postseason.

"This was one of the funnest years I've ever had," Francona said in an interview on MLB Network.

Hurdle was a runaway winner, selected first on 25 of 30 ballots by the NL panel after taking the Pirates to the playoffs in their first winning season since 1992.

Don Mattingly of the Los Angeles Dodgers came in second and Fredi Gonzalez of the Atlanta Braves finished third.

"It's a bit overwhelming, to tell you the truth," Hurdle said. "It's humbling. It's gratifying from an organizational standpoint."

she was on the brink of losing out on her chances of victory speaks volumes about mental makeup.

"Those who don't understand the pressures that exist in all the months and months of preparation, all of that coming down to one attempt for a 15-year-old girl, and for her to block all her fears, emotions, worries, negative thoughts and the pressure of the situation — a state championship — to nail the most important attempt of her career.

"It was the ultimate definition of clutch."

Holappa took the 69+ kilogram (at least 152 pounds) classification with a combined weight of 112 kilograms — a personal record. Holappa hit 50 kilograms in the Snatch and 62 kilograms in the Clean-and-Jerk.

Boyer said each of Holappa's final totals

in both disciplines also were personal records. He said she attempted to build on to her Clean-and-Jerk total, but missed with her final attempt.

"The great news for Leann is that she hit the Clean (on her final lift) in a very controlled manner," Boyer said. "Leann was in total control of her lifts. I was very proud of how she approached this meet in regard to her warm-up, her focus and her confidence."

Other Iron Jungle weightlifters at the two-day meet included: Kaly Trull, who finished third at 63 kilograms (138 pounds); Alex Smith, who finished third at 75+ kilograms (at least 165 pounds); Warren Brown, who finished second at 77 kilograms (169 pounds); and Jose Barajas, who finished third at 77 kilograms in the junior weight class.

Boyer also said the support of parents and fans have helped speed up the team's climb to elite status. He is quick to point out that he doesn't consider Iron Jungle Weightlifting to be an elite team ... yet. But he believes that day is coming.

# UF's Tyler Murphy a 'game-time decision'

GAINESVILLE — Florida quarterback Tyler Murphy probably will be a game-time decision against No. 11 South Carolina.

Offensive coordinator Brent Pease said Tuesday that Murphy's throwing shoulder is still sore and could keep him out against the Gamecocks on Saturday night.

Murphy sprained his right shoulder against LSU last month. He started the last three games — losses against Missouri, Georgia and Vanderbilt — and completed 55.7 percent of his passes for 479 yards, with one touchdown pass and four interceptions. He also was sacked 15 times.

Murphy said Monday he landed on his shoulder against the Commodores — he was sacked five times — and possibly made the injury worse.

He sat out practice Monday and Tuesday, and Pease said his availability will come down to "how well he

can throw the ball with spin."

"He's in a situation where he's spending time in the training room getting healthy again," Pease said. "I think it's day to day based on what the trainers have to say."

Murphy threw a career-high three interceptions in the 34-17 loss to Vanderbilt, and the Commodores turned them into 21 points.

"I need all the practice I can get," Murphy said. "It's just frustrating being banged up a little bit and having to sit out and try to get healthy. I'm just going to live in the training room and get healthy and try to get back out there as soon as possible."

Murphy declined to use the injury as an excuse, but he did acknowledge that he has been "fighting a little bit of pain."

The Gators have been decimated by injuries this season. They have 10 players sidelined with season-ending injuries and several oth-

ers who have missed significant time. The list includes quarterback Jeff Driskel, defensive tackle Dominique Easley, running back Matt Jones, kick returner Andre Debose, linebacker Antonio Morrison and three offensive linemen.

If Murphy can't play, redshirt freshman Skyler Mornhinweg would make his first career start. Mornhinweg, the son of New York Jets offensive coordinator Marty Mornhinweg, hasn't played a down in two years.

"He's ready to go," Pease said. "The thing that's tough on a kid in his situation is just experience. You hope you never really have to play with a redshirt freshman. Nothing against him because he's a smart kid, he works hard. But in a developmental situation, you hope that you get into your sophomore and junior year before you're in that situation, whether you're competing for the job or in a backup role ready to play."

# Spencer: OSU would wipe field with 'Bama, FSU

COLUMBUS, Ohio — Bring on 'Bama. Florida State, too.

Ohio State wide receiver Evan Spencer made it clear Monday that he believes the Buckeyes are better than No. 3. Spencer had a chance to watch two-time defending national champion Alabama and second-ranked Florida State last weekend while the Buckeyes had an open date.

"I guess I'm a little biased but I think we'd wipe the field with both of them," said Spencer with a chuckle. The junior, who is the son of former Ohio State and NFL player and coach Tim Spencer, added, "That's just my bias speaking."

Actually, Spencer didn't mention Florida State. Asked if he was referring to the Seminoles, he said, "Whoever."

Urban Meyer took a very different approach to making it known that he thinks the Buckeyes deserve a chance to play for the national title.

Meyer said he voted the Buckeyes (9-0, 5-0 Big Ten) No. 2 on his USA Today coaches' poll ballot — behind Alabama but ahead of Florida State.

"I believe we have

Alabama, Ohio State, Florida State," Meyer said of his ballot. He couldn't remember the order of the next two teams, between Stanford and Baylor.

Asked for his rationale in voting that way, Meyer said, "I had us (No.) 2 all year. I just think we're playing like one of the top teams in the country right now."

The coaches' poll is used in the BCS standings formula.

The Buckeyes are clearly a confident group, going into a game at Illinois on Saturday. The Illini (3-6, 0-5) have lost 19 consecutive Big Ten games, while Ohio State owns the nation's longest winning streak at 21 in a row.

Ohio State has dominated the Big Ten over the past two years, winning close games and winning blow-outs alike. That has worked against the Buckeyes, since many voters — both in media and among the coaches — believe the Big Ten has fallen on hard times in terms of talent.

For much of this season, the Buckeyes have been the only Big Ten team ranked among the top 15 in the polls.

The Southeastern Conference, meanwhile, has won the last seven national championships, with Alabama

winning three of the last four. The Crimson Tide and Florida State, which has powered its way back to national prominence this season, are both unbeaten. The top two teams in the Bowl Championship Series rankings will play in the national championship game at the Rose Bowl on Jan. 6.

The off week enabled Ohio State's players and coaches to watch most of the other top teams

in action. On Thursday night, they watched then-No. 2 Oregon lose to No. 5 Stanford, 26-20, and undefeated and fifth-ranked Baylor pound No. 12 Oklahoma, 4-12.

On Saturday, most of the Buckeyes were watching as Alabama broke free in the second half to take a convincing 38-17 win over No. 10 LSU and Florida State, which is second in the BCS standings

behind Alabama, roll over Wake Forest, 59-3.

"We're football junkies," Ohio State assistant coach Kerry Coombs said. "That was enjoyable. You do watch those guys. You want to watch good teams play and see how their kids stack up against your kids."

Coombs declined to say if he felt Ohio State could hold its own against the likes of the Crimson Tide and Sem-

inoles.

"I'm not in a place to evaluate that," he said. "I'd like to think we could hold our own against anybody. We're looking forward to playing anybody and everybody that shows up."

The Buckeyes remaining schedule after Illinois is home against Indiana (4-5, 2-3) and then the annual late-November feud with rival Michigan (6-3, 2-3) at The Big House.

After that will likely come the Big Ten championship game — the Buckeyes have the inside track at winning the Leaders Division title and the same goes for Michigan State in the Legends — before the final BCS rankings come out along with the bowl bids.

Meyer said the bar is raised as the season builds to a crescendo.

"The message is you have to play great," he said. "You're held to (a higher standard) to be even mentioned with those other teams. Be careful what you wish for — that means you have to practice and play at a certain level."

"We practiced at a very, very high level today. And we all expect them to play at a very high level, because you're in the same breath with some very, very good teams."

## Bucs hold off embattled Dolphins for first win

TAMPA — The Tampa Bay Buccaneers got a much-needed victory, and the Miami Dolphins showed a bullying scandal hasn't completely torn the team apart.

The Bucs (1-8) became the last NFL team to win, beating the embattled Dolphins 22-19 with a strong defensive performance on night the franchise honored Hall of Famer Warren Sapp.

"A win cures everything. ... It's good to get our first win, especially at home," cornerback Darrelle Revis said. "It was an emotional game for us, and we knew the type of game it was going to be on Monday night as well. It's great."

The Dolphins (4-5) lost for the fifth time in six games.

In its first outing since allegations of bullying engulfed the locker room in controversy, Miami rallied from a 15-0 deficit to take the lead before rookie Mike Glennon led a long touchdown drive put the Bucs ahead for good.

Bobby Rainey's 1-yard run capped an 80-yard drive, and Tampa Bay held on the final 10 minutes to win for only the second time in 15 games dating to last season.

The Bucs held fourth-quarter leads in four of their eight losses, losing each time in the final 89 seconds of regulation or overtime.

"It was rough. It was scary, I'm not going to lie," linebacker Adam Heyward said, recalling the Bucs blew a 21-point lead before losing at Seattle eight days earlier.

"It looked like last week. The guys, like Lavonte (David) and a bunch of us just said we're tired of it," Heyward added. "We can't do it again, and everybody just started stepping up and making plays."

Ryan Tannehill threw for 229 yards, including touchdowns of 6 and 19 yards to Rishard Matthews. But the second-year quarterback got no help from a running game that was limited to just 2 yards rushing.

"We didn't have any

type of way to keep them off balance because we weren't able to establish the run," Dolphins coach Joe Philbin said.

Despite the loss, the game was a welcome — albeit brief — respite from questions about tackle Jonathan Martin's allegations of daily harassment by teammates, including suspended guard Richie Incognito.

The NFL is looking into the case, and the league's special investigator will determine whether Incognito harassed Martin, and whether the Dolphins mishandled the matter.

"We had a good week of preparation, but the performance wasn't good enough," Philbin

said.

"We have good guys on this team who understand adversity and understand how to handle it," Tannehill said. "This is a good test. I'm not saying it's easy. I'm not saying it's fun to deal with. But I have faith in these guys."

**Five reasons why the Bucs have their first victory, and the Dolphins continue to struggle:**

#### STEADY GLENNON

Glennon didn't dazzle in his sixth start for Tampa Bay, but the rookie did hold his composure and throw for 139 yards and one TD. His first interception in four games — a stretch 159 passing

attempts — led to Miami field goal, however he came right back to led his team to the go-ahead touchdown. "It feels good. Hopefully now, the second half of the season, we can really get things going," Glennon said. "We've just got to keep playing the way that we're coached, and we feel like we'll be just fine."

#### SLOW START

The Dolphins were outplayed for most of the first half. Tannehill brought them back, but the second-year pro missed a couple of opportunities for potential game-changing plays with poor throws, including one that wide-open receiver Mike Wallace caught out of bounds. "I have to be able to make the throw," Tannehill said.

#### NO RUNNING GAME

Tampa Bay set a team record for fewest rushing yards allowed, holding the Dolphins to 2 yards on 14 attempts. One game after posting the first 100-yard game of his career, running back Lamar Miller carried seven times for 2 yards, with a long of 4 yards.

#### FOURTH QUARTER

Miami took a 19-15 lead into the fourth quarter. But the Dolphins' defense, which played better after yielding a TD on Tampa Bay's first drive of the night, struggled to stop the run down the stretch. With starter Mike James sidelined

after breaking his left ankle in the first quarter, Brian Leonard finished with 57 yards and Rainey gained 45 on eight attempts.

#### TAMPA BAY 'D'

In addition to stopping the run, the Bucs defense scored on a safety, had two sacks, and Revis intercepted Tannehill's final pass of the night — a desperation throw on fourth-and-28 from the Dolphins 15. "We knew it was going to be on us. Everybody stepped up," linebacker Lavonte David said. "Right at that two-minute warning, I came in, brought the guys in and said: 'It ain't going to happen again, man. We've got to make all this stuff end right here, right now.' That's what happened."

## Scandal, latest loss have Dolphins fans fed up

DAVIE — Miami Dolphins fans are venting on Twitter and complaining on radio about the team owner, the coach, the general manager and even the backup left guard.

A harassment case and a loss to a winless team can have that effect.

Already staggered by a scandal that has prompted an NFL investigation, the Dolphins must now try to bounce back from their

worst loss of the year. Rather than taking out their frustrations of the past two weeks on the hapless Tampa Bay Buccaneers, the Dolphins came out flat Monday night, dug a 15-0 hole and lost 22-19.

The loss left the Dolphins at 4-5, with the five defeats coming in the past six games. Fed-up fans took the latest loss hard, and many said owner Stephen Ross should fire everyone, himself included.

With the harassment case involving offensive linemen Jonathan Martin and Richie Incognito likely to remain unresolved for at least a couple of weeks, second-year coach Joe Philbin will try to salvage the season beginning Sunday at home against San Diego.

Philbin, now 11-14 at Miami, won a vote of confidence before Monday's game from Ross, but that could change depending on the findings of the NFL's special investigator. He'll meet this week with Martin, who is with his family in Los Angeles and receiving counseling for emotional issues.

Ross also plans to meet with Martin in California on Wednesday. The second-year pro suddenly left the team two weeks ago, and his attorney has alleged Martin was harassed daily by teammates, including Incognito, who has been suspended.

The case inspired a

national debate about workplace bullying, attracting a throng of media that has filled the Dolphins' locker room the past week. The team, however, declined to blame the case on its latest loss.

"Yes we faced a lot of distractions, but leading up to this game, the last few days I've had a good feeling that the guys were ready to play," quarterback Ryan Tannehill said.

A bigger factor might have been the absence of two starters in a line that was already lousy. At Tampa, the Dolphins netted a franchise record-low 2 yards in 14 carries.

That's 5.1 inches per carry. At that rate, they would need 71 carries to get a first down. Nate Garner whiffed on several blocks filling in for Incognito at left guard, but no one on the line seemed to get any push downfield.

"Not a good job by us," right tackle Tyson Clabo said.

There are plenty of other issues. Run defense is supposedly the team's strength, but Miami allowed 140 yards on the ground against the injury-riddled Bucs, whose fourth-string running back scored the deci-

sive touchdown. The Dolphins have sunk to 25th in the league in run defense.

Tannehill played well but misfired on a long pass to an open Mike Wallace, who was targeted seven times and totaled 15 yards. The \$60 million receiver still has only one touchdown this year. First-round pick Dion Jordan was also a non-factor again at linebacker, playing only nine snaps on defense.

While the scoreboard in Tampa argued otherwise, Tannehill said the harassment case unified the team. He predicted the Dolphins will yet bounce back.

"I feel like we've really come together over this adversity," he said. "This could've gone two ways: Guys could split up and take sides by dividing the locker room, or we could come together. ...

"Life is full of adversity. Not everyone deals with a situation like this, but you have to be able to face it. The old adage: As many times a horse knocks you off, you get back on. That's the mentality I have, and that's the mentality I think this team has, and we've just got to keep going."

# Texans decide to release safety Ed Reed

HOUSTON — Nine-time Pro Bowl safety Ed Reed was released by the Houston Texans on Tuesday, the latest blow in a disaster of a season.

A person familiar with the decision confirmed the move to The Associated Press on Tuesday on the condition of anonymity because the team had not made it official. Reed tweeted: "Thanks to the Texans! And the City of Htown!"

Reed missed the first two games after hip surgery and was recently relegated to a backup role. On Friday, he expressed his displeasure at not starting. On Sunday, after Houston's seventh straight loss, he publicly criticized the team and said they had been outplayed and outcoached in the team's first full game without coach Gary Kubiak, who is recovering from a mini-stroke.

Interim coach Wade

Phillips, who is the team's defensive coordinator, seemed unhappy when asked about Reed's comments on Monday.

"Everybody has their own feelings about what's happening," Phillips said. "They have their own ideas about what's happening or didn't happen. We try to keep everything in house."

The 35-year-old Reed was signed to a three-year, \$15 million contract in the offseason after he spent his entire 11-year career with Baltimore. The Texans courted him in an effort to beef up what they saw as an elite defensive unit that needed an upgrade in the secondary to make an expected run at the Super Bowl.

But Reed never showed the playmaking ability he had become known for in Baltimore and had just 16 tackles this season.

The move could mean the end of the career of a player many believe is the best to ever play his

position. He was the AP Defensive Player of the Year in 2004 and led the league in interceptions that season and again in 2008 and 2010. He's made the Pro Bowl in each of the last seven seasons and was a five-time All-Pro.

He started each game for the Ravens last season and had four interceptions and 49 tackles to help them to a Super Bowl win.

A first-round draft pick in 2002, his 61 career interceptions were most among active players and he has 109 passes defended, 524 tackles and 11 forced fumbles in 167 games.

The Texans are reeling. Besides Kubiak's health problems, quarterback Matt Schaub was benched and standout linebacker Brian Cushing was lost for the season to an injury. Running back Arian Foster also needs back surgery and the Texans have gone from Super Bowl contenders to AFC bottom-feeders.

# NASCAR's Trevor Bayne says he has MS

CHARLOTTE, N.C. — Determined to learn exactly what caused his mystery illness in 2011, Trevor Bayne made repeated visits to the Mayo Clinic over the last two years, asking questions about his health and medical history.

The youngest winner in Daytona 500 history wasn't sick and he wasn't suffering from any of the symptoms — nausea, fatigue, double vision and numbness in his arm — that had sidelined Bayne for five races in 2011.

He just wanted an answer.

Bayne finally got it in June when doctors confirmed that the 22-year-old Bayne has multiple sclerosis, a diagnosis he revealed publicly Tuesday.

"I think MS takes time to diagnose and, as a doctor, you don't want to jump right in and give a diagnosis to somebody," Bayne said. "I think a smart doctor is going to continue to do things. Obviously, it's a different kind of condition than something where you can just see it immediately, so over time they just evaluate you and the doctors just run a bunch of different tests."

Bayne, who was 20 when he won the Daytona 500 two seasons ago, will compete as scheduled at Homestead-Miami Speedway this weekend in the Nationwide and Sprint Cup Series finales. He will also run a full Nationwide schedule next season for Roush Fenway Racing and a partial Cup schedule for The Wood Brothers.

Bayne's younger sister, Sarah, also has MS, but he said the disease wasn't something doctors were particularly looking for when he was

hospitalized in 2011.

"MS is not a hereditary or family kind of condition, so it's something that is an individual basis," he said. "They don't connect them at all because it's not a family kind of thing."

Bayne first felt numbness in his arm during a race at Texas in 2011, six weeks after his Daytona 500 victory. At the time, he assumed it was related to an insect bite on his elbow that had become irritated and developed a rash.

He was admitted to the Mayo Clinic three weeks later for nausea, fatigue and double vision. Bayne underwent a spinal tap, doctors ruled out Lyme disease, and ultimately discharged him with a diagnosis of an "inflammatory condition." It was never made clear if it was related to the insect bite, and Bayne said in later interviews he believed he was suffering from Lyme disease.

Now he's not sure, and says the 2011 illness "is what led to my eventual diagnosis this year."

"Obviously, I've been going to the Mayo Clin-

ic regularly for check-ups and evaluations, and they started checking on me and researching," he said. "We didn't have a diagnosis then, so this is what has led to the diagnosis."

MS is a potentially disabling disease in which the immune system attacks the central nervous system, which includes the brain, spinal cord and optic nerves. Symptoms can be mild, such as fatigue, or severe, including paralysis or loss of vision. There is no cure, but treatment can help manage symp-

toms and reduce the progress of the disease.

MS is not technically hereditary, but having a relative such as a parent or sibling with MS can increase an individual's risk of developing the disease over the general population. Studies have shown there is a higher prevalence of certain genes in populations with higher rates of MS, according to the National Multiple Sclerosis Society.

Roush Fenway Racing President Steve Newmark said Bayne was dogged in his push for a definitive diagnosis.

"I think that it was refreshing that he actually got a diagnosis because there had been some uncertainty about what had unfolded previously, so I know it was comforting to him and that's why he pursued it so strongly," Newmark said. "The reality of it is if Trevor wasn't a race car driver and didn't have the means, he probably would never have been diagnosed at this point. It was through his determination of just regularly getting checked that it came to light."

Bayne, who competed in his first triathlon last December, said he's not taking any medication and suffers no symp-







# Save time and oven space by grilling your Thanksgiving turkey

It all started with the Butterball Turkey Talk-Line! My love of grilled turkey, that is.

Early in my career, I managed and promoted the annual Thanksgiving help line. And every fall, all of the operators would gather together for a training session that would prepare these “cooking counselors” for the nation’s upcoming turkey trauma. Everyone was assigned a different turkey cooking method and brand of turkey so we could all be familiar with the different scenarios home cooks might face.

As I watched all the veter-

an operators lobby to get the grilled and smoked turkey assignments, I wondered why. But after my first session, I knew! The flavor, texture and aroma of the grilled and smoked turkeys were far and away tastier than any other method, even the classic open-pan roasting method.

The natural convection-style heat of the outdoor grill is perfect for cooking a Thanksgiving turkey. But you must use a grill that has a lid and is configured for indirect heat. This is not a job for an open braiser! The lid down/indirect heat method ensures that the skin is golden brown and crisp

at the same time that the bird is done.

And there’s another benefit, too. All that hot air rotating around the big bird means the outdoor grill method takes less time than traditional oven roasting. Plus, moving the turkey onto the grill frees up oven space for all those wonderful sides you’re craving.

In recent years, I’ve upped my game by adding a brine to the recipe to produce the juiciest, tastiest, most golden brown and picture-perfect turkey you can image. The brine seasons the turkey to the bone and ensures it will be juicy. If you are brining the bird, it is important

# Sriracha shortage panic? There’s tons of options

Is a meal without Sriracha worth eating? It’s a quandary that recently took on real and scary proportions for fans of the wildly — perhaps even weirdly — popular tangy Thai hot sauce.

Sriracha lovers had a near miss when a judge rejected a Southern California city’s bid to shut down production at the Irwindale facility. Residents had complained that the pungent odor of peppers and garlic coming from the Huy Fong Foods plant gave them headaches, burned their throats and made their eyes water.

“If we did lose Sriracha, it would be a bigger crisis than having

an oil shortage,” joked — kind of — Edward Lee, who plies Asian-inflected Southern cuisine at 610 Magnolia in Louisville, Ky. “People would riot in the streets.”

So far, the streets are clear. But it never hurts to be prepared.

Sriracha is a puree of ripe, red jalapeno peppers, sugar, salt, vinegar and garlic. But many similar — and some would say superior — sauces are widely available in ethnic markets, mainstream supermarkets or online. Most just haven’t enjoyed the same attention as so-called Rooster Sauce, as some people call Sriracha (for the rooster on the Huy Fong label). So here are

# Side dish ideas for your holiday dinner

Every year my inbox is flooded with requests for the latest holiday side dishes and desserts. I am stopped more often than not in the grocery store and questioned about the ingredients in my basket.

"What are your favorite holiday side dishes?"

"What are you cooking with barbeque sauce this time of year?"

"Should I use salted or unsalted butter?"

"How and where do you find inspirations for some of your recipes?"

The questions never

stop and the conversations get pretty interesting. Here are some answers.

My favorite holiday side dish is corn pudding. I put barbeque sauce in my homemade baked beans that I make from scratch, not a can, and I always use salted butter. For inspiration, I ask friends — some old, some new.

I also go back to my old family recipes, old magazines and, of course, I ask a few kitchen veterans. I don't generally enjoy recipes with long and complicated ingredient

lists, so when I got this recipe from a friend, Jean W, I knew I had to share it. This is an old recipe that I updated. Do not use converted or par boiled rice such as Uncle Ben's. I also found that making my rice a day ahead of time was best. Cooked rice can be stored in the fridge for up to 3 days. Making this entire recipe and leaving the topping to be made the "day of" will make you look like a professional and will save you lots of time.

I decided to share with you both versions of this holiday dessert recipe: the original and my updated, Southern version. You can decide what version would tempt the palates of your table guests and let me know how it was received at your holiday dinner. I would love to hear from you.

## PUMPKIN RICE PUDDING (ORIGINAL)

### INGREDIENTS:

- 1 (15 oz.) can pure pumpkin
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon ground ginger

which make a wonderful gravy. Just remember to glaze only during the final 30 minutes of cooking to prevent burning.

- Start to finish: 2 to 3 hours (mostly inactive), depending on size of the turkey

### INGREDIENTS:

- 1/2 cup maple syrup
- Juice of 1 small orange
- 2 tablespoons Southern Comfort
- 12- to 14-pound turkey, thawed and brined (neck and giblets removed)
- 1 to 2 tablespoons olive oil
- Ground black pepper

### DIRECTIONS:

1. Prepare your grill for indirect, medium heat cooking. On a charcoal grill, this entails banking the coals to one side. On a gas grill, it means turning off one or more burners to create a cooler side.

2. In a small bowl or 2-cup measuring cup, whisk together the maple syrup, orange juice and Southern Comfort. Set aside.

3. To prepare the turkey for grilling, remove it from the brine. Set it on a large cutting board. Use kitchen twine to tie together the ends of the legs, then tuck the tips of the wings under them. Brush the olive oil over the entire turkey, then season it with black pepper.

4. Place the turkey on a disposable foil pan before setting on the grill grates. Cover the grill and cook for 11 to 13 minutes per pound, or until an instant-read thermometer inserted at the thickest part of the thigh (not touching the bone) registers 175 F and the juices run clear. Brush glaze on the turkey during the final 30 minutes of the cooking time.

5. Transfer turkey to a platter and let stand for at least 20 minutes before carving.

**DEAR ELINOR:** The booklet does. Not a day goes by that I don't receive letters and emails from readers who are upset enough to write because they haven't received a thank-you note for a birthday, graduation, wedding or holiday gift they sent. Some of the writers say they are so hurt and offended that they will stop giving gifts because they were left hanging, wondering if their gift was ever received. The problem may be that many parents no longer insist their children practice this courtesy, so the kids never learn how to do it. Chief among the reasons that thank-you notes aren't sent is that many people don't know what to say. They think the

note has to be a long, flowery composition when, in fact, short and to the point is more effective. Keeping a notepad handy when opening gifts and immediately taking a moment to jot down the first thought that comes to mind is helpful. (Example: Do you like the color? The style? # A little addition makes big difference in potatoes

Like onions, leeks develop a rich, savory flavor when cooked slowly. And when cooked this way, they make an excellent addition to a creamy mound of mashed potatoes.

Rather than caramelize the leeks, which requires a bit more hands on cooking, we decided to melt them. It's actually a braise, but the result is meltingly good. And braising requires only an occasional stir. The leeks are thinly sliced, then slowly simmered in broth or stock until extremely tender, then the whole mixture is stirred into the potatoes.

The easiest way to clean leeks is to cut them up first.

Trim off the ends, cut them in half lengthwise, then thinly slice them. Place the slices in a large bowl of cool water and toss well, separating the layers, to rinse away any dirt. Allow the dirt to fall to the bottom of the bowl, then use a slotted spoon to scoop out the floating leeks.

## MELTED LEEK MASHED POTATOES

■ Start to finish: 45 minutes

■ Servings: 8

### INGREDIENTS:

- 3 pounds Yukon gold potatoes, peeled and cut into chunks
- Salt
- 3 tablespoons unsalted butter
- 3 cups thinly sliced and cleaned leeks
- 1/2 cup chicken stock or broth
- 1/2 cup half-and-half

■ 3 tablespoons chopped fresh chives

### DIRECTIONS:

1. Place the potatoes in a large stockpot. Add enough water to cover by 1 inch. Set over high heat and bring to a boil. Cook until tender, about 20 minutes.
2. While the potatoes cook, prepare the leeks. In a large skillet over medium-high heat, melt the butter. Add the leeks and broth and cover. Bring to a simmer, then reduce heat to maintain the temperature and cook, stirring occasionally, until the leeks are extremely tender, about 30 minutes.
3. When the potatoes are cooked, drain and return to the pot. Add the half-and-half, then mash until smooth. Season with salt, then stir in the melted leeks — along with any liquid in the pan — and the chives.

a few Sriracha alternatives that deserve their 15 minutes of fame.

### SAMBAL OELEK

A chunky condiment of vinegar and lightly ground chilies, think of sambal oelek as Sriracha without the pureeing (or the garlic). Sambal delivers a big blast of heat, and works well on any food in need of spice.

"The flavor on it is very clean," says Scott Drewno, executive chef at The Source in Washington, D.C., where he uses it in stir-fries, dipping sauces and dozens of other preparations. "You can use it hot, cold," he says. "If the world didn't have Sriracha, it would definitely be the next thing."

### GOCHUJANG

Drewno also is a big fan of gochujang, a Korean paste of chilies and fermented soy beans. Less assertive than other chili pastes, gochujang offers a salty, savory component similar to miso, with just a hint of heat.

"I use that rampantly," Drewno says. "You get that umami, that depth, that haunting resonating flavor profile." Drewno said he smears gochujang on grilled steak and other meats, or sometimes uses it as a marinade with rice vinegar, sesame oil and a pinch of sugar. It rocks as a rub for roast chicken, and does a fine job of adding depth and heat to chili.

### CHIPOTLES IN ADOBO

Like Sriracha, chipotles are made from ripe, red jalapenos. The

ripe chilies are picked, dried, then smoked to create chipotles. The dried peppers then are pickled in adobo, a tomato-based sauce spiked with vinegar, herbs and sometimes other dried chilies.

"They have that same wild mix as Sriracha, where it's sweet, it's spicy, it's tangy," says Pati Jinich, author of "Pati's Mexican Table: The Secrets of Real Mexican Home Cooking." "That's what drives people crazy."

In the United States, the Mexican condiment most often is found in cans, but Jinich says that in Mexico it comes in squeeze bottles, just like Sriracha.

Chipotles in adobo can be used directly on sandwiches, and in stews, soups and other dishes, Jinich says. Or

they can be used to add heat and smoke to salsas. When nothing but the whole chilies are left, she says, remove the seeds, then puree them with mayonnaise, yogurt or sour cream (or perhaps cream cheese?) for a smoky-spicy dip or spread.

### WEST INDIAN HOT SAUCE

The island nations in the Caribbean Sea boast many assertive peppers, such as habaneros and the famous Scotch bonnet, which is about 40 times as hot as a jalapeno. Ground with vinegar, spices and sometimes mustard, these chilies deliver a powerful punch as a sauce.

"Sriracha is overrated," chef and cookbook author Allison Robicelli wrote in an email. "It's good, but not even close to the best hot sauce on earth."




