Zimbabweans: Mugabe must quit

HARARE, Zimbabwe — Giddy with joy and finally free to speak out, vast throngs of demonstrators turned Zimbabwe's capital into a carnival ground on Saturday in a peaceful outpouring of disdain for President Robert Mugabe and calls for him to quit immediately. Still clinging to his now-powerless post, the longtime leader was scheduled on Sunday to discuss his expected exit with the military command that put

him under house arrest.

People in Harare clambered onto tanks and other military vehicles moving slowly through the crowds, danced around soldiers walking in city streets and surged in the thousands toward the building where Mugabe held official functions, a symbol of the rule of the 93-year-old man who took power after independence from white minority rule in 1980. There, in a situation that could have become tense, the protesters instead showed deference to the small number of soldiers blocking their way and

eventually dispersed.

It was a historic day when the old Zimbabwe, a once-promising African nation with a disintegrating economy and a mood of fear about the consequences of challenging Mugabe, became something new, with a population united, at least temporarily, in its fervor for change and a joyful openness that would have seemed fanciful even a few days ago.

The euphoria, however, will eventually subside, and much depends on the

As sex harassment scandal grows, minorities seldom involved

PHILADELPHIA — In the weeks since dozens of women have accused movie mogul Harvey Weinstein of rape or sexual harassment, unleashing an avalanche of similar charges against other prominent men across American life, women and men of color have been largely absent from the national furor.

The stories of abuse have roiled the entertainment industry, politics, tech and more, raising the possibility that this could be a watershed moment to end tolerance of such behavior. But some observers fear

Climate talks end with progress despite US stance

BONN, Germany — As the first glimmer of dawn appeared across the Rhine River, delegates stumbled out of an all-night negotiating session at this year's global climate talks, expressing satisfaction Saturday at the progress made toward creating a comprehensive rule book for fighting global warming.

The two-week meeting in Bonn, Germany, was billed as a "blue-collar" event designed to hammer out the technical details of the 2015 Paris climate accord. But fears had loomed large beforehand that the administration of U.S. President Donald Trump, who rejects the Paris agreement, would seek to block any advances seen as counter to American interests.

In the end, most agreed that U.S. diplomats had engaged constructively, while delegations from several American states, cities and businesses were praised for committing themselves to the goals of the Paris agreement.

The role of spoiler almost fell to Saudi Arabia, which held up a final agreement for several hours over objections to a phrase it feared might allow for future levies on fossil fuels like oil.

"There has been positive momentum all around us," said Fiji's Prime Minister Frank Bainimarama, who presided over the meeting and swung the gavel to close it about 7 a.m.

"We leave Bonn having notched up some notable achievements," Bainimarama said, citing agreements on agriculture, ocean protection, indigenous people's rights and the launch of a new system to help people in poor countries get insurance against the effects of climate change.

TOLEDO, OHIO Scooby the camel returned to owners after getting loose

A young camel named Scooby is back at home after going on a 90-minute jaunt that blocked traffic and provided an uncommon photo opportunity for motorists in Ohio.

The Blade reports 1-year-old Scooby escaped from his fenced-in home in Springfield Township on Friday afternoon and began walking along township streets, prompting wide-eyed reaction.

A neighbor of the owner who was on her way home from work alerted the Lucas County Sheriff's Office. Owner Nabil Shaheen was then contacted and led Scooby safely home.

Shaheen said he bought Scooby as a baby and is glad no one was hurt.

BERLIN Germany bans children's smart watches with listening app

German regulators have banned certain types of smartwatches marketed to children, saying the devices have been used to listen in on school classrooms and run afoul of Germany's surveillance restrictions.

The Bundesnetzagentur, or Federal Network Agency, said in a statement issued Friday that watches that would allow parents to "listen unnoticed to a child's environment" constitute an unauthorized transmitting system.

The agency said parents have been using watches marketed to children between the ages of 5 and 12 to monitor teachers.

Palestinians vow to quit talks if US closes office

WASHINGTON — The Palestinians threatened on Saturday to suspend all communication with the United States if the Trump administration follows through with plans to close their diplomatic office in Washington. The potential rupture in relations threatens to undermine President Donald Trump's bid for Mideast peace — a mission he has handed his son-in-law, Jared Kushner.

Senior Palestinian negotiator Saeb Erekat said the U.S. decision was "very unfortunate and unacceptable," and accused Washington of bowing to pressure from Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's government "at a time when we are trying to cooperate to achieve the ultimate deal."

In a video statement on social media, Erekat said: "We will put on hold all our communications with this American administration."

There was no immediate reaction from the Trump administration. Netanyahu's office said the closure was "a matter of U.S. law."

U.S. officials had insisted before Erekat's statement that the move wasn't aimed at increasing leverage over the Palestinians, but merely the unavoidable consequence of U.S. law.

The administration announced late Friday that the Palestinians had run afoul of a legal provision that says the Palestine Liberation Organization cannot operate a Washington office if the Palestinians try to get the International Criminal Court to prosecute Israelis for crimes against Palestinians.

Secretary of State Rex Tillerson determined that the Palestinians crossed that line in September, when Palestinian President Mahmoud Abbas called on the court to investigate and prosecute Israelis, according to State Department officials. They weren't authorized to publicly discuss the situation and spoke on condition of anonymity.

It wasn't clear when the office would close or whether

the Palestinians would have to clear out of the building entirely or just close it to the public.

Under the law, Trump now has 90 days to consider whether the Palestinians are in "direct and meaningful negotiations with Israel." If Trump determines they are, then the mission can reopen, officials said.

PLO official Hanan Ashrawi said the U.S. was "disqualifying itself as a peace broker in the region" by refusing to extend a waiver from the law.

"Conditioning the renewal of the waiver on the Palestinians' sticking to 'direct and meaningful negotiations with Israel' is actually superfluous since negotiations are nonexistent, and the current U.S. administration has yet to present any kind of peace initiative," she said in a statement.

The U.S. said it wasn't cutting off relations with the Palestinians and remained focused on a comprehensive peace agreement between Israelis and Palestinians. One of the U.S. officials said in an email that "this measure should in no way be seen as a signal that the U.S. is backing off those efforts."

The Palestinians quickly dismissed that argument, with Foreign Minister Riad Malki telling Palestine Radio that the Palestinian leadership "will not accept any extortion or pressure." Erekat contended the move was the result of "the pressure being exerted on this administration by the

Netanyahu government."

In response, the Israeli prime minister's office said, "We respect the decision and look forward to continuing to work with the U.S. to advance peace and security in the region."

The Israelis and Palestinians are not engaged in active, direct negotiations. But Trump's team, led by senior White House adviser Kushner, is working to broker a deal aimed at settling the intractable conflict.

The Palestinians, publicly supportive of the U.S. effort, are nonetheless skeptical because Trump's close ties to Israel suggest whatever deal he proposes might be unfavorable to them. The threat of losing their office in the American capital could become one more pressure point as the Trump administration tries to persuade the Palestinians to come to the table.

The PLO is the group that formally represents all Palestinians. Although the U.S. does not recognize Palestinian statehood, the PLO maintains a "general delegation" office in Washington that facilitates Palestinian officials' interactions with the U.S. government.

The United States allowed the PLO to open a mission in Washington in 1994. That required President Bill Clinton to waive a law that said the Palestinians couldn't have an office. In 2011, under the Obama administration, the U.S. started letting the Palestinians fly their flag over the office, an upgrade to the

status of their mission that the Palestinians hailed as historic.

Israel opposes any Palestinian membership in U.N.-related organizations until a peace deal has been reached.

The Trump administration has not disclosed details about its effort to achieve an agreement that ostensibly would grant the Palestinians an independent state in exchange for an end to its conflict with the Israelis. Kushner and other top Trump aides have been shuttling to the region to meet with Palestinians, Israelis and officials from Arab nations.

The requirement about the mission closing stems from a little-noticed provision in U.S. law that says the U.S. cannot allow the Palestinians to have a Washington office if they back the international court's move to investigate or prosecute Israeli nationals for alleged crimes against Palestinians.

Abbas said at the United Nations in September that the Palestinians had "called on the International Criminal Court to open an investigation and to prosecute Israeli officials for their involvement in settlement activities and aggressions against our people."

The U.S. president can let the Palestinians keep the office despite the violation, only if certifying to Congress "that the Palestinians have entered into direct and meaningful negotiations with Israel." The provision doesn't explicitly define what would constitute direct or meaningful negotiations.

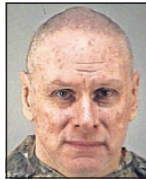

Inmate volunteers for execution

Allen Cox asks judge to 'please' sentence him to death

TAVARES — A man sentenced to die by lethal injection for killing another prisoner 19 years ago is up for resentencing, but he has told a judge he would rather be executed.

Allen Cox, 55, citing poor health, a comfortable, safe cell on death row and fears he will be preyed upon by prisoners in general population, has asked Circuit Judge Larry Semento to keep his death sentence intact.

"But if you decide (sic) to sentence me to life the very first time one of those scum bags trys (sic) to rob me I promise you that I will put

a big hole in his heart the same way I did the last one and his blood will also be on your hands as well as mine."

Cox was convicted of stabbing Thomas Baker, 25, with a homemade knife at Lake Correctional Institute just before Christmas 1998 because he believed Baker stole almost \$500 cash he had collected for drug transactions behind bars.

It's not unheard of for a death row inmate to volunteer for execution, said John Spivey, executive assistant public defender. Public defenders still work for the defendant.

"We almost become an agent of the judge," he said.

Public defender investigators gather mitigating evidence that might exclude the prisoner from death, like mental illness or brain injuries. "Our duty is not really changed."

Prosecutors also keep working while awaiting a ruling from the judge, said Assistant State Attorney Walter Forgie.

Cox sent a letter to the trial judge asking for the death sentence shortly after he was convicted.

"I don't want to die an old man in prison. They will be doing me a favor if they give me a shot and put me to sleep," he told Circuit Judge T. Michael Johnson.

Cox is entitled to a new sentencing trial because recent court rulings demand that juries be unanimous in death sentence recommendations. His jury in 2000 recommended

death by a 10-2 vote.

In his letter to the judge dated Oct. 23, he said he didn't want his family to have to come down from Kentucky to testify on his behalf.

"Second (sic) if I were to get life DOC will lock me in a cell for five years with no TV, no radio, no fan, no canteen and no visits and then after those five years Ill (sic) be sent to one of the very worst prisons in the state of Florida where the blacks prey on any whites that show the least bit of weakness. They rob, rape and beat up and extort protection money from the old and weak and Ill (sic) be 60 years old in five years way to (sic) old for all that crap.

"I have been to these types of prisons where they send ex-death row inmates and

Bell Ceramics potential site for Clermont boat ramp

CLERMONT — The City of Clermont has not taken any official action on relocating their boat ramp, but the Lake County Water Authority now has.

In their monthly meeting on Wednesday, held in the county's council chambers in Tavares, the board voted 5-0 to recommend that the city relocate their ramp to what is known in Clermont as the Bell Ceramics site. A few interested parties were at the meeting to listen and

others watched remotely.

Greg Amann is a Clermont native and a lifelong boater. He told the board, "To take that (the boat ramp) completely away December 17, a lot of people are not happy about that."

Pointing out that Bell Ceramics would be the cheapest site to put a ramp, he suggested that a ramp could be put there temporarily while the city considered whether or not they are willing to put it there on a permanent basis.

Steve Franklin is one of the members of the Clermont

boating community that has been lobbying in council meetings in favor of the Bell Ceramics site.

"I watched the meeting online," he said. "I'm dancin'."

The Bell Ceramics site is at the east end of Clermont's property on Lake Minneola. The current boat ramp is further west along the shore. As things stand now, Dec. 17 is the last day of operation for that boat ramp, as it is slated to be demolished to make way for the final stage of Clermont's Victory Pointe storm water

treatment facility.

As Water Authority board member Peggy Cox pointed out at the meeting, "If there's a boat ramp when the project (Victory Pointe) is finished, it wouldn't be very big."

The remaining portion of the boat ramp site is slated to be taken for the city's planned Triathlon Beach, an event area intended to bring athletic events closer to the downtown shopping and dining area.

Executive Director Mike Perry gave the boat ramp presentation to the board.

“What I agreed to do is help the city in any way we could to come up with another site,” Perry said. “We looked at four or five or six sites. They all had warts. Some had more warts than others.”

The Bell Ceramics site has been the best fit so far. The main drawback there seems to be that the city would lose an event parking area, and that some future economic development plans there could be derailed. The site that came in second was on the northwest part of Lake Hiawatha — which would require substantial alteration to wetlands and to the city’s passive nature park, Lake Hiawatha

Preserve. The other site that Perry briefed the board on — which Perry described as coming in a “distant third” — is adjacent to the city’s Palatka recreation area. That site would cost the city a soccer field and could conceivably aggravate the Emerald Lakes residents who would be adjacent to the facility.

Water Authority Board Vice-Chairman Keith Farmer ran the meeting on Wednesday. He described the Bell Ceramics site as the only one he was “comfortable” recommending. He also said, “If I were a businessman, I think you should have your boat ramp downtown, where your businesses and restaurants are.”

Cox said, “We have a 10,000 acre chain of lakes that at some point in the future might be without public access, and this is not acceptable.”

AC/DC founding member dies

Rhythm guitarist Malcolm Young, loses long battle with dementia at 64

NEW YORK — Malcolm Young, the rhythm guitarist and guiding force behind the bawdy hard rock band AC/DC, who helped create such head-banging anthems as “Highway to Hell,” “Hells Bells” and “Back in Black,” has died. He was 64.

AC/DC announced the death Saturday on their official Facebook page and website. A representative for the band confirmed that the posts were true. The posts did not say when or where Young died, but said the performer had been suffering from dementia. He was diagnosed in 2014.

“It is with deepest sorrow that we inform you of the death of Malcolm Young, beloved husband, father, grandfather and brother. Malcolm had been suffering from dementia for

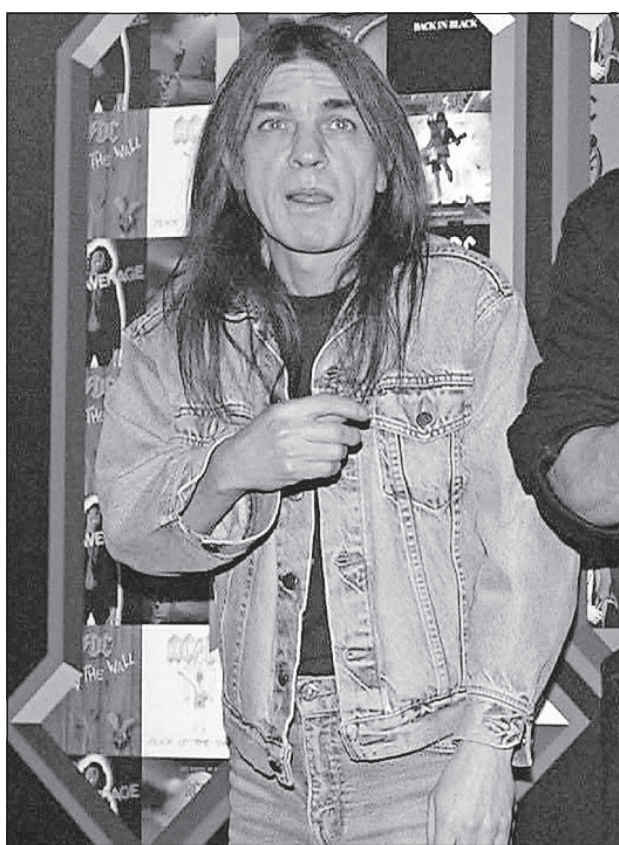
several years and passed away peacefully with his family by his bedside,” one of the posts read.

The family put out a statement posted on the band’s website calling Young a “visionary who inspired many.”

While Young’s younger brother, Angus, the group’s school-uniform-wearing lead guitarist, was the public face of the band, Malcolm Young was its key writer and leader, the member the rest of the band watched for onstage changes and cutoffs.

AC/DC were remarkably consistent for over 40 years with its mix of driving hard rock, lusty lyrics and bluesy shuffles, selling over 200 million albums, surviving the loss of its first singer and creating one of the greatest rock records ever in “Back in Black,” the world’s second best-selling album behind Michael Jackson’s “Thriller.”

Several musicians paid their respects to Malcolm Young on social media, writing about his influence and impact in music. “It is a sad day in rock

and roll. Malcolm Young was my friend and the heart and soul of AC/DC. I had some of the best times of my life with him

on our 1984 European tour,” Eddie Van Halen tweeted on Saturday. “He will be missed and my deepest condolences to his family, bandmates and friends.”

“The driving engine of AC/DC has died. A tragic end for a sometimes unsung icon. One of the true greats. RIP,” Paul Stanley, of Kiss, wrote on Twitter.

Scott Ian, of Anthrax, posted a photo of his Malcolm Young tattoo and said “what he means to me is unquantifiable.”

Mike Portnoy, co-founder of Dream Theater, called him “one of the great rhythm guitar players of all time.”

The Glasgow-born Young brothers — who moved to Sydney, Australia, with their parents, sister and five older brothers in 1963 — formed the band in 1973. They were inspired to choose the high-energy name AC/DC from the back of a sewing machine owned by their sister, Margaret.

Angus experimented with several different stage costumes at first — including a gorilla suit and a Zorro outfit — but the school uniform was a natural, since he was only 16 at the time.

you have to carry a knife with you at all times and sleep with one under your pillow and you MUST be prepared to use it.”

Cox said he has “several” medical problems “and I suspect the skin cancer has already spread and will kill me in a few years.”

He asked the judge to “please” sentence him to death. He said he knows the judge will have concerns “but I’m fully aware of what im (sic) doing.”

“And if in a few years they decide to execute me so be it. I’m ready to see if there really is anything on the other side but I doubt (sic) there is.”

He said he would accept whatever the judge decided but stressed there was no point in the court delaying his request “because I will not ever change my mind about this.”

Cox was already serving three life sentences, including one for breaking a store clerk’s hip when he threw her over a wall and raping her on top of a mound of fire ants during a robbery.

Johnson, who spent years as a public defender, said Cox had forced him into making “the most difficult decision as a judge and as a human being,” but he ruled the state proved four aggravating circumstances: He was imprisoned, had prior violent felonies, the crime was heinous, atrocious and cruel, and it was cold, calculated and premeditated.

behind-the-scenes maneuvering to get Mugabe to officially resign, jumpstart a new leadership that could seek to be inclusive and reduce perceptions that the military staged a coup against Mugabe. The president was to meet military commanders on Sunday in a second round of talks, state broadcaster ZBC reported.

"The common enemy is Robert Mugabe. That's for starters," said 37-year-old Talent Mudzamiri, an opposition supporter who was born soon after Zimbabwe's independence.

He had a warning for whoever takes over Zimbabwe: "If the next leader does the same, we are going to come out again."

Many Zimbabweans believe the most likely candidate will be Emmerson Mnangagwa, a former vice president with close military ties whose dismissal by Mugabe triggered the intervention of the armed forces, which sent troops and tanks into the streets this week, effectively taking over the country. The increasing presidential ambitions of Mugabe's wife Grace, a polarizing figure who denounced Mnangagwa amid a factional battle within the ruling ZANU-PF party, alarmed those

who feared a dynastic succession.

"Leadership is not sexually transmitted," read a poster at the Harare rallies. Other signs denounced "Gucci Grace," a reference to the first lady's record of high-end shopping expeditions outside Zimbabwe, which suffered hyperinflation in the past and is currently struggling with a cash shortage and massive unemployment.

The discussions over Mugabe's fate come ahead of a key ruling party congress next month, as well as scheduled elections next year.

The president, who is believed to be staying at his private home in Harare, a well-guarded compound known as the Blue Roof, is reported to have asked for more time in office. He has been deserted by most of his allies, with others arrested. The ruling party has turned on him, asking for a Central Committee meeting this weekend to recall both him and his wife, who heads the women's league of the party. Impeachment is also a possibility when Parliament resumes Tuesday.

Even as concerns remained about who next would be in charge and what freedoms might be available if the military lingers in power — or if Mugabe's recently fired deputy leads a new government — people reveled Saturday in the rare chance to express

themselves freely.

In Harare, people ran through intersections, raising their arms in triumph. Young men shouted, laughed and embraced. Others danced on top of moving buses. One man stripped to his underwear and danced on a car roof.

Some marchers had posters with an image of the military commander who swept in to take control, with the slogan: "Go, go, our general!!!" Marchers handed flags to soldiers, who accepted and waved.

"It's like Christmas," said one marcher, Fred Mubay, who said Zimbabweans have been suffering for a long time.

Veterans of the long war against white minority rule, once close allies of Mugabe, took part in the demonstration, along with opposition activists who long have faced police crackdowns by the Mugabe government. Thousands gathered for speeches at the Zimbabwe Grounds, where Zimbabweans gathered to cheer Mugabe's return from exile in 1980 after the liberation war.

Elizabeth Sithole, 60, said her husband died in 2004, she lives with her children in a 2-room apartment and her business selling vegetables has collapsed. On Saturday, though, she had a big smile while standing near soldiers in downtown Harare.

"I'm very happy," she said.

agency had documented approximately 39,000 green sea turtle nests.

The preliminary

estimates are based on an index from 27 beaches that represent about 68 percent of green sea turtle nests statewide. A final survey covering 800 miles of Florida coastline will be available in early 2018.

State officials said that nearly 30 years ago only

464 green sea turtle nests were recorded on the 200 miles of beaches that are part of the survey. By 2011, there were 10,701 green sea turtle nests.

The commission noted that green sea turtles nest more abundantly every other year.

when he was accosted. He was not hurt, and police have arrested two suspects.

"I think the meeting was very proactive," said Mount Dora City Manager Robin Hayes on Friday morning. "We were able to learn of some of the merchants' concerns and even with those we'd already heard, they were able to provide us further insight into their points of view and feelings."

As in the past, parking continued to be a concern for merchants, some noting that they and their employees can't park in prime spots because they have to leave them for patrons. Consequently, they have to walk a long way, sometimes in the dark or alone, to get to their cars.

One business owner said a young female employee was harassed while making the trek to her car. She said she ended up confronting the harasser but feels she shouldn't have had to.

Hayes said the city is working on various solutions like valet parking and a shuttle service, both of which would be available at night.

Hayes also mentioned that First United Methodist Church offers their parking lot to anyone who wants to park there all day Monday through Saturday and Sunday evenings at no charge.

A police officer at the meeting said any person, whether a business owner, employee or customer, who is uncomfortable walking to their cars alone can call the non-emergency number for an escort.

A merchant said when she tried it, however, she was told it would take about 90 minutes for officers to arrive.

Another major concern from business owners had to do with vendor deliveries to downtown shops and restaurants.

Delivery trucks are blocking customers in front of businesses for long periods of time. One business owner said a truck blocked one of her customers for hours in the middle of the afternoon.

Discussions revolved around allocated spots and times for deliveries.

"We've thought about an ordinance requiring that all deliveries are done by 11 a.m.," Hayes said, explaining that other cities, like Winter Park, have such rules in place.

Public Works Director John Peters assured merchants the city was seeking solutions, including timed parking.

"The city is approaching it in kind of a recipe book fashion. We'll have multiple solutions. You'll see some physical improvements, some ticketing improvements and fine improvements. We'll need to work with the deliveries and it's a challenge so as to not affect deliveries for services," Peters said.

"It's going to be a baker's dozen solution for about 12 months, but after that we'll be looking at longer-term solutions like parking garages and shuttle systems."

And then there is signage.

Many business owners asked about rules for signs, including temporary signs for events, window and street signs leading people to their businesses.

Hayes said she couldn't discuss the matter too widely because

of ongoing litigation regarding the "Starry Night" mural in a residential area on 441. She said the City Council will look at the signage code as soon as the matter is resolved, calling it "strong legal."

Peters said, "We're not trying to strongarm the signage issue. It's just kind of something that surfaced. It's something we'll have to polish up, tweak, work for everybody's enjoyment. It's just that we want to keep our town charming, clutterless and have everyone enjoy the scenery without the I-Drive type of format."

Phil Barnard, owner of Magical Meat Boutique, said he feels the meeting was "quite progressive."

"The city listened to business owners at least and hopefully, it was the start of many more meetings to come," Barnard said. "I'm glad to see they are letting merchants have a voice."

Hayes said no matter what the topic, the important thing is flexibility.

"The thing is that everything we do at this point needs to be looked at from a pilot program standpoint," Hayes said.

"We have to be fluid and open to change because if we try it and it doesn't work, we'll be changing it up to see if something else works better."

From here, Hayes said all ideas will be discussed

between the Community Redevelopment Agency Board, City Council and merchants at meetings, forums, etc.

"It's stages and it's also baby steps. We're getting there," Hayes said.

minority women may miss the moment, as they often are more reticent to speak up about sexual harassment.

"The stakes are higher in a lot of instances for us than they are for a lot of other women," said Tarana Burke, a black activist who founded the #MeToo movement on Twitter in 2006 to raise awareness around sexual violence. "That creates a dynamic where you have women of color who have to think a little bit differently about what it means for them to come forward in cases of sexual harassment."

A few high-profile

minority actresses have come forward. New York authorities are investigating claims from actress Paz de la Huerta that Weinstein raped her twice in 2010; he has denied charges of non-consensual sex with any woman.

When Oscar-winning actress Lupita Nyong'o wrote in a New York Times op-ed last month that she had an unsettling encounter with the producer in 2011 at his home, Weinstein quickly denied doing anything inappropriate with Nyong'o, after days of silence following similar accusations by famous white actresses.

Author and activist Feminista Jones said that Weinstein's denial of Nyong'o's allegations sent the message to black women that they can't be

harassed, they can't be assaulted."

For black women, that is a message that dates back to slavery, when black women's bodies were not their own and racist stereotypes were used to justify abuse, said Rutgers University historian Deborah Gray White.

"Historically, African-American women have been perceived as promiscuous," said White, author of the book, "Ar'n't I a Woman?: Female Slaves in the Plantation South."

"Black women's bodies, from Day One, have been available to all men," she said.

As a result, White said, black women have had a hard time proving sexual exploitation. In response, many chose to remain silent as a form of self-preservation.

"Somehow talking about it is admitting, 'I walk the land unprotected,'" White said. "They were damned if they did and damned if

they didn't."

For Asian-American women, speaking up after sexual assault can be daunting for a variety of cultural reasons, said Anna Bang, education coordinator at KAN-WIN, a Chicago-based domestic violence and sexual assault services group that frequently helps Asian-American and immigrant women. Bang said she has noticed the absence of Asian-American women from the Weinstein conversation and, as a Korean immigrant, doubts that she would tell her family if she were ever assaulted.

"It's such a shame and guilt," she said. "You don't want your parents to be worried about you ... When we are growing up, your parents teach you, 'Don't share your family problems with people.' We're trying to break that silence by educating our community members."

Many of the women who seek help from KAN-WIN

do so a decade or more after the abuse took place, she said.

"In our culture, women ... they teach you how to suck it up," she said. "They teach you to swallow your anger, your fear. It's tough."

Women of Latin American descent also weigh economic and cultural issues when deciding whether to speak out about sexual abuse.

Women of Latin American descent have been stereotyped as being submissive and sexually available, according to Monica Russell Rodriguez, a Northwestern University ethnographer whose research includes sexuality, race and class in Latino communities. She said that undocumented immigrants in the United States would be even less likely to report an assault or harassment, fearing anything from job loss to blackmail or deportation.

"Even for white women,

there's not going to be any guarantee of an equitable resolution, so it's a lot to expect women in a more highly vulnerable situation to be willing to speak out at the same rate," Russell Rodriguez said. "There's no reason to expect that Latinas aren't being sexually harassed or raped at the same degree or more."

While most of the recent spate of sexual abuse allegations have been against white men, men of color have not been immune to such charges. Before the Weinstein scandal upended Hollywood, Bill Cosby's name became synonymous with sexual abuse, as more than 50 women came forward and said the pioneering black actor once known as "America's Dad" forced sexual contact with them over decades. Last June, Cosby went to trial on charges that he drugged and molested a woman in 2004. The case ended in a mistrial and Cosby is expected to be retried next year.

Since the Weinstein scandal, a writer for The Root, a website geared toward the black audience, said both Jesse Jackson and John Singleton sexually harassed her. Jackson and Singleton declined comment when contacted by The Associated Press, as did the Root writer.

George Takei, best known for his role in the original "Star Trek," was recently accused of groping a man decades earlier; he denied the allegations. Actor Terry Crews went public with a claim that a Hollywood agent groped him, and that agent was later fired.

And an actress, Demi Moore, filed a lawsuit Thursday in which she alleged agent Cameron Mitchell sexually assaulted her. Mitchell, who is black, was fired by Creative Arts Agency, LLC.; he called Mann's claims false.

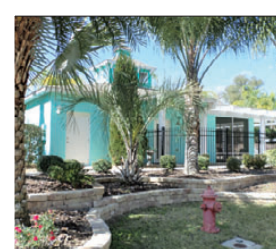

Moore critic: Alabama Senate race a battle for nation's soul

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. — A leading figure among religious liberals says the candidacy of Republican Roy Moore for U.S. Senate is a struggle for the “soul of the nation.”

The remarks Saturday by the Rev. William J. Barber come a day after a letter signed by dozens of progressive pastors in Alabama said Moore — dogged by recent allegations of inappropriate conduct toward teenage girls decades ago — is unfit to serve.

Barber, former head of the North Carolina NAACP, spoke at an anti-Moore rally at the Tabernacle Baptist Church in Birmingham, Alabama, that drew

more than 100 people. The event was in direct contrast to a news conference Thursday during which religious conservatives expressed their commitment to Moore, who describes himself as a conservative Christian who hews to family values.

Signs carried by Moore opponents at Saturday's rally decried his opposition to gay and transgender rights. Moore was also criticized for opposing federally backed health care, assistance for the needy and more.

Barber and other speakers claimed Moore's campaign is fueled by a perversion of Christianity linked with white supremacy, and Moore is trying to take those forces to the Senate.

“What is happening now in Alabama matters for the soul of the nation,” said Barber, of Goldsboro, North Carolina, and the force behind the “Moral Monday” protest movement that calls for greater rights for gays and minorities.

On Friday, more than 50 Alabama pastors signed a public letter stating Moore isn't fit to serve in the U.S. Senate. The letter continued to collect signatures Saturday.

The letter says Moore demonstrated “extremist values” incompatible with traditional Christianity even before recent allegations of sexual misconduct involving young women.

The pastors cite Moore's opposition to the expansion of Medicaid, which provides health care for the poor. It also accuses him of denigrating people from

other countries and faiths and cites his opposition to homosexuality.

The letter was written by a group of pastors in Birmingham. It includes the signatures of ministers

from mainstream and liberal denominations including Methodists, Presbyterians, Episcopalians, the United Church of Christ and some moderate Baptists.

Moore still enjoys the support of conservative evangelical leaders, but he has ignored mounting calls from Washington Republicans concerned that if he stays in the race he may not only lose a seat they were sure to win but also may do significant damage to the party's brand among women nationwide as they prepare for a difficult midterm election season.

Since last week, Moore has been engulfed by accusations of sexual misconduct toward women in their teens when he was a deputy district attorney in his 30s. Several of his accusers have allowed their identities to be made public.

One said Moore molested her when she was 14. Another said Moore assaulted her when she was a 16-year-old waitress after he offered to drive her home. Five others said Moore pursued romantic relationships with them when they were between the ages of 16 and 18.

'Faithful' Detroit priest beatified by Catholic church

DETROIT — A priest known for his steadfast devotion to the needy cleared a threshold on the way to possible sainthood Saturday as the Roman Catholic Church beatified Solanus Casey, who is credited with the miraculous cure of a woman with a chronic skin disease.

More than 60,000 people attended a Mass in Detroit where Father Solanus, as he was known, has an extraordinary following, decades after his death in 1957. Many insist their prayers to him have led to remarkable changes in their lives. Some of their stories were told on the scoreboard screens at Ford Field.

Pope Francis said Father Solanus met the requirements to earn the rank of "blessed," especially after Paula Medina Zarate of Panama was instantly cured while she prayed at his tomb in 2012.

Zarate had a formal role at the Mass, placing a

cross in front of a portrait of Father Solanus near the altar. Italian Cardinal Angelo Amato read a decree by the pope, who described the priest as a "humble and faithful disciple of Christ, tireless in serving the poor."

Father Solanus can be made a saint in the years ahead if a second miracle is attributed to him. He's only the second U.S.-born man to be beatified by the church, joining the Rev. Stanley Rother, a priest killed in Guatemala's civil war, who was beatified in Oklahoma in September. One U.S.-born woman has been beatified and two others have been declared saints.

"It's a great event," Detroit Archbishop Allen Vigneron said ahead of the Mass. "It's hard to communicate how vivid and real the presence of Father is to our community."

Even 60 years after his death, "people don't say, 'I'm going to Father's tomb,'" Vigneron told The Associated Press. "They say, 'I'm going to talk to

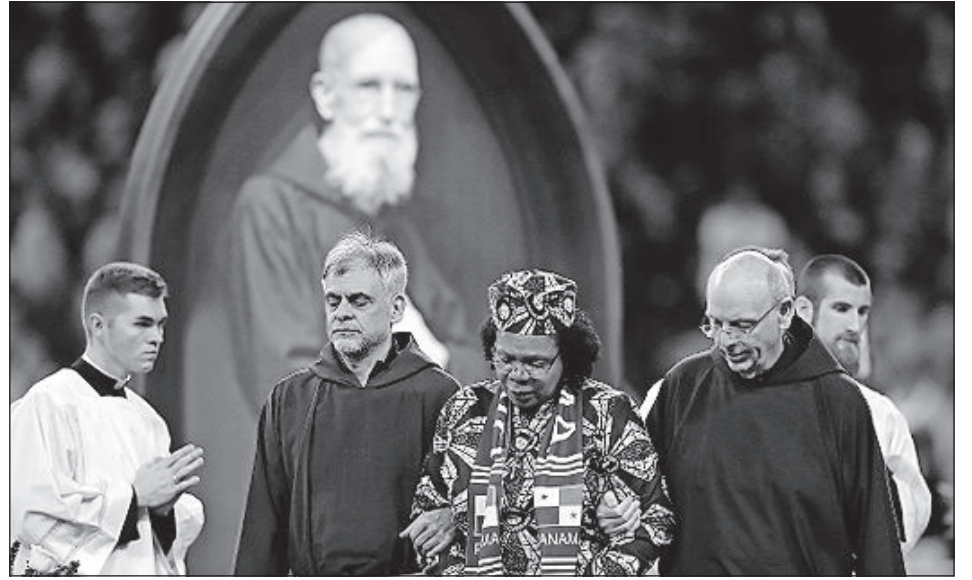
Father."

Father Solanus, a native of Oak Grove, Wisconsin, joined the Capuchin Franciscan religious order in Detroit in 1897 and was ordained a priest seven years later. But there were conditions: Because of academic struggles, he was prohibited from giving homilies at Mass and couldn't hear confessions.

"He accepted it," said the Rev. Martin Pable, 86, a fellow Capuchin. "He believed whatever God wants, that's what he would do."

He served for 20 years in New York City and nearby Yonkers before the Capuchins transferred him back to the St. Bonaventure Monastery in Detroit in 1924. Wearing a traditional brown hooded robe and sandals, Father Solanus worked as a porter or doorkeeper for the next two decades, but his reputation for holiness far exceeded his modest title.

The unemployed shared their anxieties with Father Solanus, the parents of

wayward kids sought his advice, and the ill and addicted asked him to urge God to heal them. As he listened, he took notes that were later turned into typewritten volumes of his work.

Later in life, when Father Solanus was stationed at a seminary in

Huntington, Indiana, Detroiters boarded buses for a four-hour ride just to see the man with a wispy white beard. Mail piled up from across the country.

"He had a gentle presence. He left people with a wonderful feeling of peace inside their hearts," Pable said. "He would say,

'Let's just pray about this and see what God wants to do.' Some people were not healed. He told them to bear their problems with God's help."

In 1929, Father Solanus co-founded the Capuchin Soup Kitchen, which serves up to 2,000 meals a day in Detroit.

Hariri says he will be in Beirut within days

PARIS — Lebanon's Prime Minister Saad Hariri said Saturday he will return home in the coming days from where he will declare a political stance for the first time since making a strange resignation announcement from Saudi Arabia that unleashed fears of a crisis in Lebanon.

Hariri and his family met Saturday with French President Emmanuel Macron, who invited the Lebanese leader to Paris

to dispel fears that he was being held in Saudi Arabia against his will. Macron is seeking to calm tensions and avert a proxy conflict between Saudi-backed and Iranian-backed camps in Lebanon.

Hariri's appearance in Paris — looking relaxed and posing with his wife and older son on the steps of the Elysee Palace with the French presidential couple in front of a large crowd of journalists — contrasted with his limited-access, carefully choreographed appearances from Saudi Arabia.

Hariri told Lebanese

President Michel Aoun on Saturday that he will take part in Independence Day celebrations in Beirut on Wednesday, according to Macron's office.

After his meeting with Macron, Hariri told reporters: "God willing, I will attend Independence Day in Lebanon and will declare my political stance from Lebanon and after meeting President Michel Aoun."

"As you know I have resigned and we will talk about this matter in Lebanon," Hariri said after thanking Macron, who he added "expressed pure

friendship toward me that I will never forget."

The independence day ceremony is usually headed by the president, prime minister and parliament speaker, and Hariri's presence could help calm uncertainties that have escalated since his strange and surprising resignation announcement on Nov. 4 from Saudi Arabia.

However, Hariri's political status is murky. Lebanon's president refused to accept Hariri's resignation, accusing the Saudis of holding him against his will.

Many countries are already feeling the heat that is enveloping the globe, with dramatic floods, hurricanes and droughts across the world in recent months adding a sense of urgency to the talks.

Environmental groups expressed satisfaction at the outcome of the negotiations, while noting there's much still to do and little time left to ensure the Paris accord's goal of keeping global warming significantly below 2 degrees Celsius (3.6 degrees Fahrenheit) is met.

Experts say worldwide average temperatures have already risen 1 degree Celsius since pre-industrial times, largely due to carbon emissions from the United States and Europe over the past century.

"The conference gets a grade of 'meets expectations,'" said Andrew Deutz of The Nature Conservancy, an Arlington-based environmental group. "We are still headed in the right direction, but since the U.S. took its foot off the accelerator, the risk of global climate action slowing down has increased."

U.S. diplomat Judith Garber, speaking at the talks Thursday, reiterated Trump's position that the United States will leave the Paris accord but added that "we remain open to the possibility of rejoining at a later date under terms more favorable to the American people."

Garber, the acting assistant secretary of state for oceans and international environmental

and scientific affairs, said Washington remains "committed to mitigating greenhouse gas emissions through, among other things, increased innovation on sustainable energy and energy efficiency, and working toward low greenhouse gas emissions energy systems."

The conciliatory tone coming from U.S. diplomats was at odds with the more combative position taken by White House adviser George David Banks, who raised eyebrows by hosting a pro-coal event during the talks.

"Having already abandoned its leadership role on climate, the Trump administration appears to be living in an alternate universe with its focus on fossil fuels," said Paula Caballero, who heads the climate program of the Washington-based World Resources Institute.

Caballero noted that the leaders of U.S. states, cities and businesses — who came to Bonn separately from the White House and State Department delegations — earned widespread approval for pledging to honor the Paris accord.

Germany, which hosted the meeting, received mixed reviews. While many praised the country's negotiators for brokering deals between opposing groups at the talks, there was also disappointment that German Chancellor Angela Merkel failed to join other rich countries in announcing a firm deadline for phasing out the use of coal-fired power plants.

Merkel is currently locked in coalition talks with the environmentalist Green party and the pro-business Free Democrats, who disagree about the use of coal.

The Bonn meeting was a stepping stone toward next year's talks in Katowice, Poland, where key decisions will have to be

made, including on finalizing the Paris rulebook and raising countries' national ambitions for cutting greenhouse gas emissions.

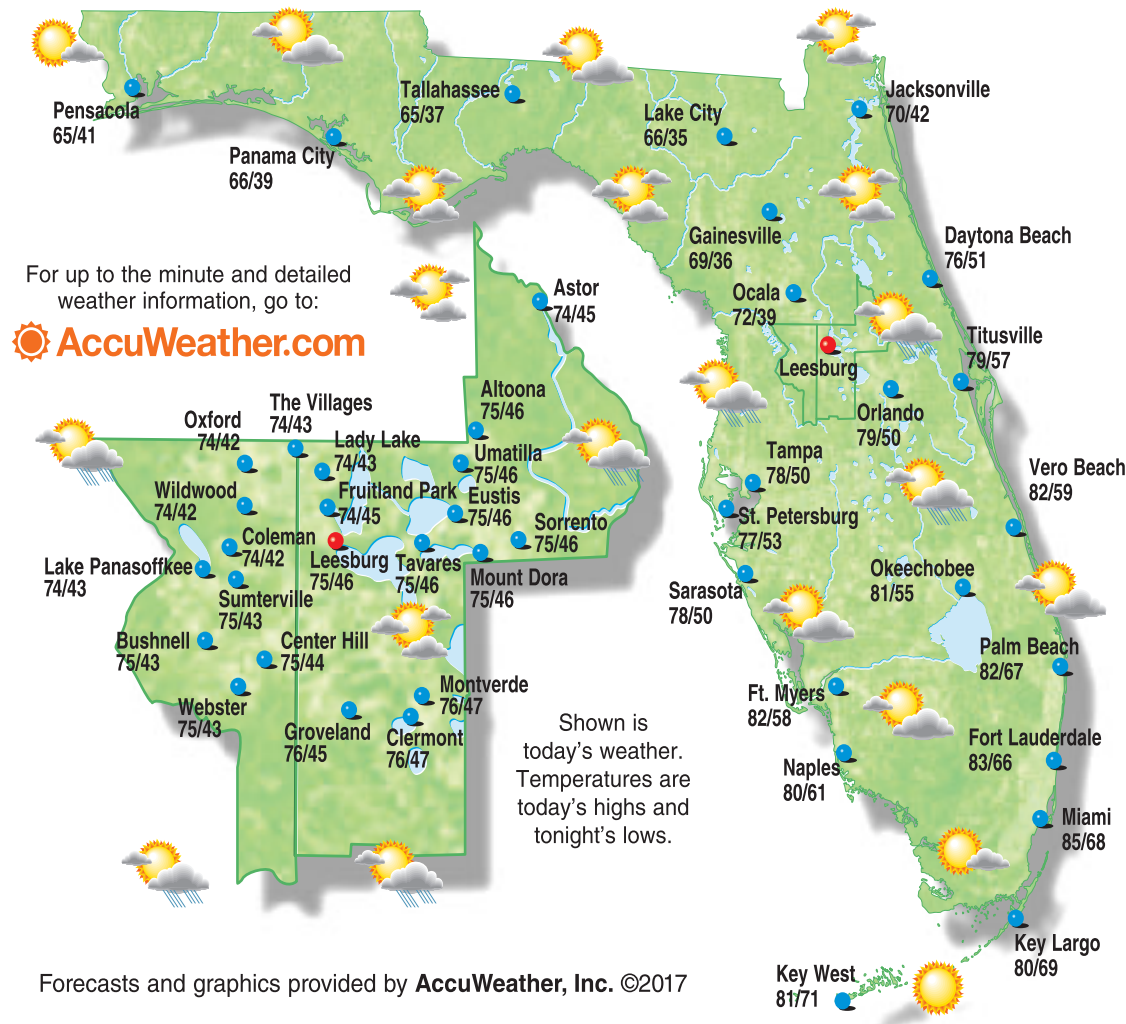

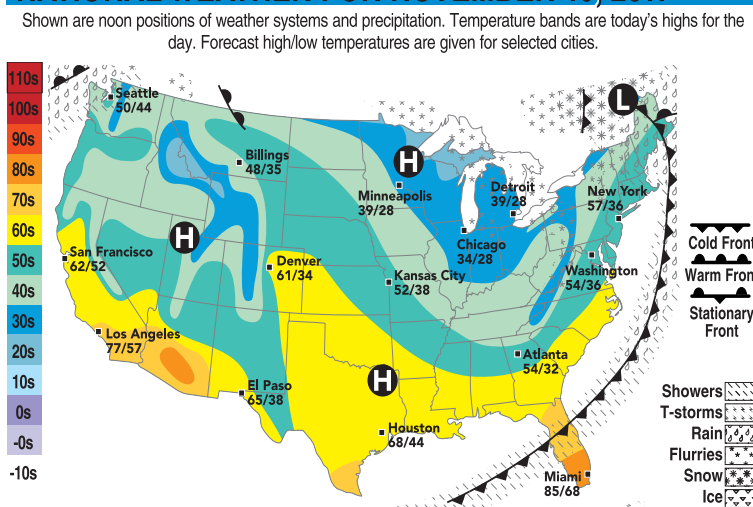

5 a day is way too many

Our nation seems engulfed by crises: rampant sexual harassment, racial strife, gun violence, opioid addiction, an ever-eroding trust in government.

What about child abuse? We don't hear much about it, relative to other social plagues. But recently we found ourselves tremendously morose by news that underscores how problematic this is for our society. Consider some examples.

On Tuesday, Markiya Mitchell of Rochester, New York, was arrested after admitting she drowned her 10-day-old baby. Prosecutors contend she held her son under water for up to two hours. The motive was unclear. That was not the case last month in Lady Lake, however. There, Jeremy Main was arrested after he confessed to drowning his 18-month-old daughter. Why? To get revenge on his wife, who was divorcing him.

Also on Tuesday, police in Mount Lebanon, Pennsylvania, arrested George Gazzam after an autopsy of his 4-month-old daughter revealed she had been beaten to death, and had not fallen out of her crib, as Gazzam told investigators. Gazzam did admit to repeatedly striking the child.

Alleged "discipline" was also an issue elsewhere. In mid-October sheriff's deputies in Pensacola arrested Veronica Posey for murder after the death of her 9-year-old cousin. The 325-pound woman told investigators she sat on the girl because she had been "out of control." Last week police in Jerseyville, Illinois, arrested Michael and Georgena Roberts after their 6-year-old son died. The youngster, who weighed 17 pounds, was literally starved to death "as a form punishment," police said. On Monday, police in Strasburg, Virginia, arrested Chad Ritchie after one his girlfriend's 22-month-old twins died at a hospital. The toddler, police said, died from "multiple blunt force traumas." Last Friday deputies in the Panhandle found the body of a 3-year-old girl dumped in the woods near Crestview. The child's mother, Destinee Merrell, told authorities her boyfriend, Cory Hagwell, kicked the little girl in the head because she climbed out of her car seat.

All of that within the space of a month. It's sad beyond belief.

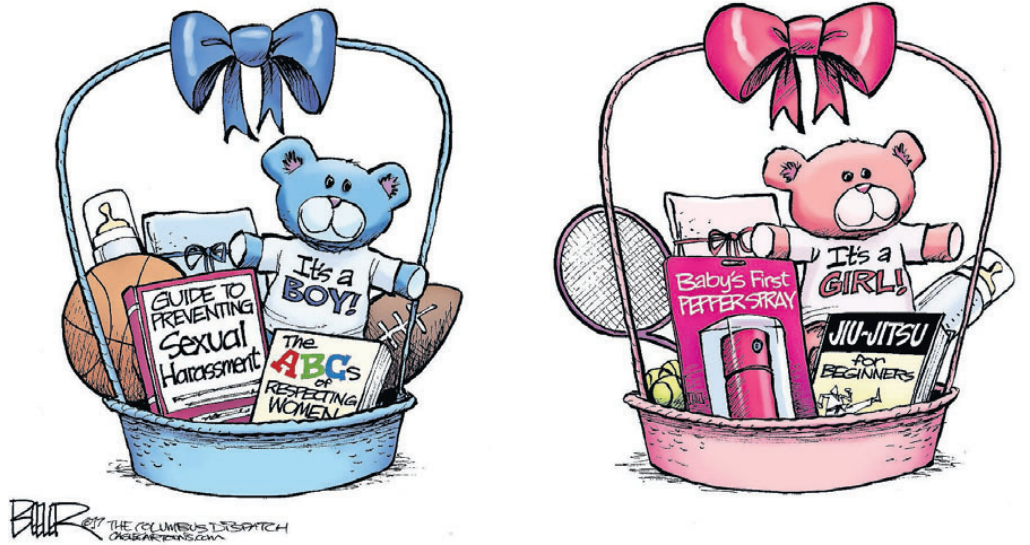
Earlier this year, the American Society for the Positive Care of Children noted that abuse cases nationwide jumped 10 percent between 2014 and 2015, the most recent year available. The number of children victimized by abuse and neglect increased from 6.6 million to 7.2 million. Within there, the number of abused-child deaths rose from 1,580 to 1,670 — although one estimate suggested the fatality total might be 1,740 or higher.

The group quoted an essay by Michael Petit, president of the Every Child Matters Education Fund, who wrote, "Over the past 10 years, more than 20,000 American children are believed to have been killed in their own homes by family members. That is nearly four times the number of U.S. soldiers killed in Iraq and Afghanistan. The child maltreatment death rate in the U.S. is triple Canada's and

We must unify on stronger fertilizer ordinance

On Tuesday the Lake County Board of County Commissioners will consider an update to the county's existing fertilizer ordinance. An improved ordinance will further protect our lakes and rivers from nutrient pollution.

"This is not a 'left' or 'right' issue, we can protect our lakes and our property rights by just refraining from using nitrogen and phosphorous fertilizer products in the summer. Sadly, it is being artificially politicized by fertilizer lobbyists and certain opportunists as a way

to alienate and divide residents on the issue. We live in the land of 1400 named lakes and if there was ever an issue conservatives, independents and liberals could be unified on it should be this one," says Lake County Commissioner Leslie Campione.

Last spring, at the suggestion of some local citizens, commissioners asked their Keep Lake Beautiful advisory committee (KLB) to research the issue and produce recommendations. Lake County Environmental Services updated the ordinance using the recommendations from KLB. These have been approved by the Lake County Water Authority, Lake Soil and Water Conservation District and Lake County Planning and Zoning. The KLB recommendations reflect the

common sense provisions in the time-tested strong ordinances that are already in effect in 11 counties and over 82 cities since as early as 2007, including those in Seminole County. Those provisions include the following:

Fertilizers containing nitrogen and phosphorous may not be applied during the summer-time rainy season.

A 15-foot fertilizer-free zone adjacent to water bodies.

At least 50 percent slow-release nitrogen is required outside of the rainy season.

Newly planted turf should not be fertilized until after a waiting period.

Everybody, including the lawn care services, must play by the same rules.

During the Obama administration we watched an Army soldier, Bradley Manning (now Chelsea Manning), release 750,000 classified or sensitive military and diplomatic documents to WikiLeaks in violation of our Espionage Act. Manning, a declared trans woman, was convicted of 17 of the original charges and was sentenced to 35 years at the maximum-security U.S. Disciplinary Barracks at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas. Before he left office, former President Obama commuted

Manning's sentence from 35 years to just under 7 years. 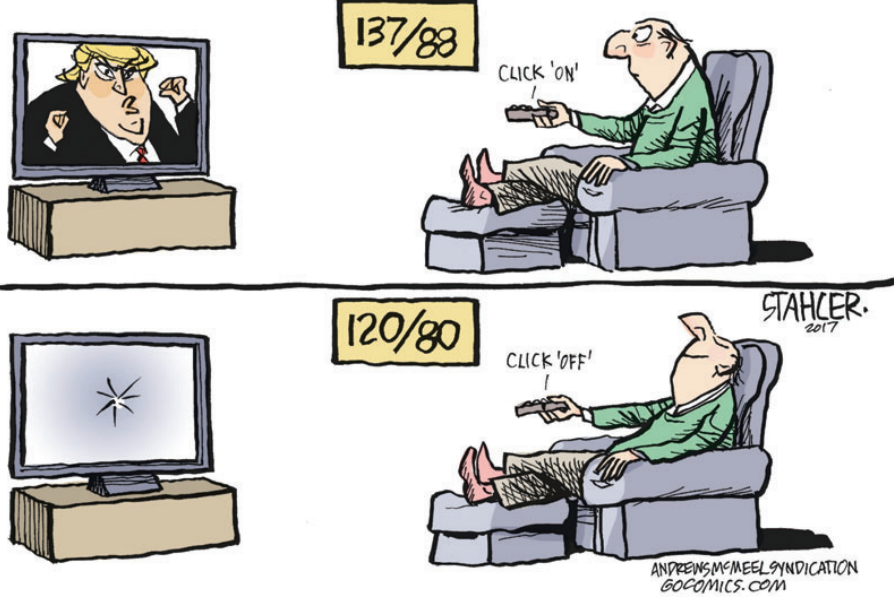

As if you're not worried enough ... enter Brett Talley

You are not worried enough. Granted, that may seem a nonsensical claim. Assuming you don't belong to the tinfoil hat brigades who consider Donald Trump the greatest thing to hit 1600 Pennsylvania Avenue since Abraham Lincoln left for the theater, you've spent the last year worrying as much as you know how. There has certainly been no shortage of things to worry about: white supremacy, Russian interference and nuclear war, to name a few. Not to mention that a credibly accused child molester may soon join the United States Senate as a Republican — the party of “family values.” Of course, the self-confessed sexual predator in the Oval Office thinks the accused child molester should step aside, news that gave irony a stroke and left satire unemployed. So yes, chances are, you're worried plenty. But you're probably not worried about Brett Talley. Indeed, you've probably never heard of him. If Trump has his way, though, Talley, 36, will soon be a federal judge. His qualifications for that honorable — and lifetime

— position? They're pretty well nonexistent. He graduated Harvard Law School in 2007, so there is that. Since then, Talley has worked as a law clerk, a speechwriter, and also as a deputy attorney general and solicitor general in his native Alabama. He writes horror novels. And he blogs and tweets. The one thing the would-be federal judge has never done is, well ... judge. Or even try a case. In fact, he's only been a lawyer for three years. The guy Trump thinks fit to oversee a courtroom has never even been in a courtroom as the attorney of record. What, then, are his qualifications? The aforementioned blogs and tweets are instructive. In them, Talley emerges as a right-wing culture warrior, loudly decrying “Hillary Rotten Clinton,” condemning the “outrage” of calling for gun control after the Newtown massacre, urging his readers to join the NRA, and otherwise shredding any lingering illusion of judicial impartiality. Before Trump came to town, the American Bar Association hadn't rated a judicial candidate “not qualified” since 2006. Counting Talley, it has now given that rating four times since January. Which didn't stop Talley from sailing through the GOP-controlled Senate Judiciary Committee and on to the

full Senate, where he's expected to be approved on a party line vote. Even if he isn't — news broke this week that Talley failed to disclose his marriage to a White House lawyer, which has raised conflict-of-interest questions — it would provide little solace. There's more where he came from, including Jeffrey Mateer, who once called transgender children part of “Satan's plan” and disavowed the separation of church and state. He was also given a pass by the Judiciary Committee. He is also awaiting confirmation. And it bears repeating: these are lifetime appointments. Your children's children could end up before one of these men, seeking justice. It's understandable that we are mesmerized by the frequent, high-profile illustrations of Trump's unfitness. But arguably more frightening and important are the low-profile ways he is institutionalizing Trumpism, imposing changes whose effects will linger long after the stench of him has left the Oval Office. And he knows it. As Trump bragged last month, “The judge story is an untold story” whose consequences will be felt “40 years out.” He's right about that. So let's start telling it. Because you're not worried enough. You could stand to be angrier, too.

One of the greatest things about strong, water quality-protective urban fertilizer ordinances is that they help you keep your lawn and landscape healthy and beautiful too. Less nitrogen applied where strong ordinances have been in effect for years have resulted in fewer pest infestations and therefore less pesticide use. The rainy season blackout period only applies to specific types of fertilizer. There are dozens of summer-safe products you can use during the rainy season. The worst thing the County Commission could do next Tuesday is to take out the summer rainy season nitrogen and phosphorous application ban.

This is the backbone of the ordinance — without it the ordinance would be weak and ineffective. The rainy season is when no one can prevent leaching and runoff, no matter how well-intentioned or well-trained. The slogan at the Tampa Bay/Sarasota Bay area website BeFloridianNow.org is “Saving our Lakes, Rivers & Estuaries One Yard at a Time.” As they point out, “In Florida, summer rains don't water fertilizer in — they wash it off our lawns and into our rivers, lagoon and ocean. The excess nitrogen and phosphorus in the water feeds algae blooms that use up oxygen, kill fish and turn the water the color of pea soup. As more and more people move to our area, the problem gets bigger and bigger.” We don't have oceans or lagoons here

in Lake County, but we do have a problem with excess nutrients in our springs and lakes. Many of us live in Lake County because of the natural beauty of our lakes and springs. Additionally, much of our economic development activity is based on utilizing and showcasing our waterways. You can make a few small changes in your own yard that will impact our quality of life. You can make a bigger impact that will protect all of Lake County's water resources by contacting your county commissioner to encourage him or her to vote for the summer rainy season application ban and the rest of the protective provisions recommended by the KLB. It is time for our county to take this step towards conserving and improving our outdoor lifestyle here in Lake County.

A moving experience

SAN FRANCISCO — Evidence that when Democrats rule taxes are never high enough can be found at any gas station in this once politically competitive state. Last month, the California gas tax was raised 12 cents a gallon. Regular gas at some stations is again approaching, and in some cities exceeding, \$4 a gallon, a level not seen since natural disasters temporarily curtailed refinery production, and Gulf States manipulated prices. Republicans plan to put the gas tax issue on the 2018 ballot; hoping voters will roll back the increases. Some are not waiting for the next election, but are voting with their feet. One couple I know recently moved from San Diego to Arizona solely because of high taxes on their income and regulations on their small business. They are not alone. Coupled with the increasing cost of living in big cities, California, once a magnet for new arrivals, has now reversed polarity. Taxes are only part of the reason for the exodus. According to Chief Executive Magazine's annual survey of the best and worst states for business, California has ranked last six years in a row. Texas, by contrast, has ranked first. Add to this the recurring earth tremors, even earthquakes — there

was another Monday in Monterey County that registered 4.7 — and expectations of a “big one,” which continues to be talked about in scientific circles. Floods and forest fires destroy homes and lives. One-party rule also serves as an irritant for many of a different political persuasion. Gov. Jerry Brown recently signed legislation declaring California a “sanctuary state” for illegal immigrants. The law forbids state and local police from providing any information to the federal government about illegal aliens that isn't already publicly available. Then there is the annoying traffic. USA Today recently declared Los Angeles as having the worst traffic, not just in the country, but the world. San Francisco is not far behind. The state legislature is flirting with a single-payer health insurance system, similar to Canada's. But with many Canadians coming to the U.S. for serious medical treatment, why would legislators want to replicate their less than ideal health care system? It again raises a question I have asked many times before and have yet to get a satisfactory answer: Why do so many turn to government as a first resource when government has proved its inability to achieve so many things competently and cost efficiently? In this city by the bay, housing prices are so ridiculous The Guardian newspaper found a high-tech employee paying \$1,400 a month to live in a “private room,” which resembles a closet.

“One Apple employee,” it said, “was recently living in a Santa Cruz garage, using a compost bucket as a toilet. Another tech worker, enrolled in a coding boot camp, described how he lived with 12 other engineers in a two-bedroom apartment rented via Airbnb. ‘It was \$1,100 for a ... bunk bed and five people in the same room.’” Salaries in Silicon Valley are high compared to other parts of the country, but the inflated housing costs dilute whatever buying power someone with that level of income would enjoy in most other states. California is still a mostly beautiful state, especially along the coast, but its beauty is more superficial than substantive. According to the Orange County Register, “In 2016, some 26,000 more people left the Bay Area than arrived. San Francisco net migration went from a high of 16,000 positive in 2013 to 12,000 negative three years later. “Similar patterns have occurred across the state. Between 2010 and 2015, California had cut its average annual migration losses annually from 160,000 to 50,000, but that number surged last year to nearly 110,000. Losses in the Los Angeles-Orange County area have gone from 42,000 in 2011 to 88,000 this year. San Diego, where domestic migration turned positive in 2011 and 2012, is now losing around 8,000 net migrants annually.” Given the policies of state government, don't look for those numbers to improve.

to see if any classified information was part of those e-mails. She did break the law in what she did but former FBI Director James Comey stated that her law breaking was not intentional.

Be part of the rebuild

After fires, businesses urge visitors to spend in Wine Country: 'This would be a great time to come'

SAN JOSE, Calif. — As the recovery continues from last month's devastating Northern California wildfires, the iconic wine regions are looking to kick-start their important hospitality and tourism industry with a simple message: We are open for business.

The damage to some areas was indeed devastating. In the 22 days from the start of the fires to when they were completely contained, 43 people were killed and thousands of homes and other structures were destroyed. But in this tourism-heavy area, businesses are opening their arms to visitors, saying economic recovery depends on it.

"There is a misperception that everything is gone," said Tim Zahner, chief operating officer of Sonoma County Tourism, but that is not the case. "Sonoma County has more than 1 million acres."

The region has more than 1,200 wineries, and fewer than 10 were heavily damaged, according to a news release from Visit California, the state's tourism and marketing arm. While a slew of businesses across the region were forced to close during the fires — either because of evacuations, power outages or fire damage — most tasting rooms have reopened, according to the organization.

"Now we need to do our part to help the recovery," said Caroline Beteta, president and CEO of Visit California. "If you're already planning a trip, don't cancel — Wine Country residents need your business now more than ever."

Sonoma Mission Inn & Spa, said the hotel lost millions of dollars worth of reservations as the fires struck in mid-October — typically a month that is among the busiest time for the hotel. It first had to evacuate and close the property, then reopened at low rates to house insurance groups and emergency responders. It is now open for the public, but Corcoran fears that the news of the fires is driving away visitors, especially those from outside California who do not know the region well.

"If you looked at news and you were outside of California, you would have perhaps thought Napa and Sonoma were completely devastated, but we wanted to counter that," Corcoran said. Now, he wants to get the word out that the hotel and region are again welcoming visitors.

"We want to put our own people back on their feet. Four of our colleagues lost everything they had," he

said. "I feel like I'm responsible for 500 livelihoods."

To draw people back in, the hotel is offering a discounted rate on rooms and spa services, what Corcoran calls its "Sonoma Strong" rates.

"We've made our rates very attractive," Corcoran said. "This would be a great time to come and visit."

Other businesses are trying to send the same message, and many are donating proceeds to relief funds for victims of the fire. Grgich Hills Estate announced on its website that its tasting room is open and the winery will donate 100 percent of its proceeds in the month of November to the Napa Valley Community Disaster Relief Fund.

Iconic Michelin-starred restaurant The French Laundry reopened Oct. 17 after closing for several days during the fires and said via Facebook that it would be donating some proceeds to relief efforts. The restaurant, which is notoriously difficult to book, actually

has some reservation slots open for four-person tables in November and December, though it's unclear whether that is because of cancellations or other factors.

"We want people to come and support these causes — most of the tasting room fees are being donated to fire relief," said Angela Jackson, director of media relations for Visit Napa Valley, which is promoting "cabernet season" in the valley, as well as events like the Napa Valley Film Festival. "There really isn't a better time to come. The skies are blue. It still is warm and beautiful."

Mendocino County, similarly, is promoting its Mushroom, Wine and Beer Festival, happening now through Nov. 12, said Alison de Grassi, marketing coordinator for Visit Mendocino.

Fires ravaged Mendocino's Potter Valley and Redwood Valley areas, and did damage to some farms and wineries, but most tourist-centered

businesses were spared, de Grassi said. Now that the fires have been contained and rebuilding efforts begun, she hopes to get the word out on her organization's website and through social media that Mendocino businesses are open and welcoming visitors.

The economic implications are big. Mendocino's tourism industry employs about 6,000 people, and the county saw 1.8 million visitors last year, de Grassi said. Tourism spending last year totaled \$386 million.

In Sonoma County, annual tourism spending was \$1.93 billion in 2016, according to data from Visit California and research company Dean Runyan and Associates, and the tourism industry there employs more than 20,000 people. Most of the tourism-related businesses in the area are locally owned. Napa County saw \$1.4 billion in tourism spending in 2016, with the industry employing nearly 14,000 people.

Sweden's Glass Country sparkles

You can blame my Norwegian heritage, but I'm not so hot on the Swedish countryside. Even so, you can't say you've seen Sweden if you've only been to Stockholm. Rural Sweden — especially the province of Smaland — is a worthy addition to any Scandinavian itinerary.

Covering the entire southeast coast and running deep into the interior, Smaland's most appealing corner is bookended by the smallish towns of Vaxjo and Kalmar. In between lies Sweden's famous "Glasriket," Glass Country, sparkling with glassblowing studios.

It's no surprise that glassmaking caught on here. The necessary resources are abundant: The region is densely forested (endless wood to fire the ovens) and blanketed with lakes (ample sand to melt into glass). Glassblowers have been at work in Smaland since at least 1742.

Glass Country's first boom came during the difficult 19th century — when a sixth of Sweden's population emigrated to America as the country's iron mills were closing. The Smaland laborers who stayed behind were highly skilled at working with

materials at high temperatures. Glassmaking became their salvation, and by the early 1900s, this region had more than 100 workshops creating everyday glasses, vases, bowls, and bottles. One local who left for America later helped design the iconic Coca-Cola bottle.

There are fewer glassworks now — cheaper imported glass has taken its toll. Today's Glass Country artisans have refocused their efforts, emphasizing high-quality, high-end art pieces and welcoming guests to tour (and shop) their workshops.

There's something deeply satisfying about a visit to a "glasbruk." Even at the bigger places — and especially at the smaller ones, you'll feel genuine artistic energy in the air, as glassblowers persuade glowing globs of molten glass to take shape. Demonstrations are intimate — you'll be close enough to feel the heat from the glowing furnaces.

The storied Kosta Boda workshop dominates, with a flagship campus in the village of Kosta that's complete with plush hotel, art glass gallery, and a distillery second shop. But there are many friendly independent producers scattered throughout the woods, where you'll be invited into a simple barn-like studio to watch glassblowers at work (nearly all demonstrations are free; for more information, see www.glasriket.se).

Glass Country also sustains the only artisan papermaking workshop in Scandinavia.

Tucked next to a giant modern paper plant, the tiny 300-year-old Lessebo mill follows each hands-on step for making fine paper: soaking cotton and linen fibers until they become pulp, packing the fiber into a frame, then pressing, drying, glazing, and hand-tearing the paper into the perfect size and shape. Swedes covet this traditional paper for special-occasion invitations and announcements (daily tours; www.lessebopapper.se).

If art's not your thing, check out local critters at the Moose and Farm Animal Park. At this offbeat attraction (just outside the village of Kosta), you'll walk through the moose-happy gift shop before taking a mile-long stroll around the perimeter of a pen holding live moose. Life-size dioramas with stuffed moose (including one plastered to the hood of a car) round out the attraction. You can even buy moose sausage to grill on-site.

Because the 70-mile stretch of the Glass Country is relatively undeveloped, most visitors tour the glassworks by day, then sprint to the nearby coastal town of Kalmar for dinner and a bed. History students may remember Kalmar as the place where Norway, Sweden, and Denmark signed a 1397 treaty that united their countries into one huge kingdom. That union lasted about a hundred years before dissolving in the 16th century ... and since then, even the European Union hasn't been able put them back together again.

Historic Kalmar has an Old World ambience that's rare in Scandinavia. It's dominated by a moated castle that's a great medieval experience. With stout watchtowers, park-like ramparts, and a creaky, drafty interior, this place was a royal hub for centuries. But when the Swedish border shifted south in the mid-17th century, the castle lost its strategic importance. No matter — it's now the biggest attraction in Kalmar, and well worth a visit.

Besides the famous castle, the town offers a cozy, cobblestoned center. For a small city, you'll find a surprising number of good dining options. The restaurants survive on the town's short, intense summer season, when vacationing Swedes make the streets lively day and night. If you drop by the café/tea parlor Kullzenska, tucked into an 18th-century

house, you'll be surrounded by locals enjoying warm berry cobbler and richly brewed coffee — the classic Swedish "fika," or coffee break.

If you're lucky enough to be in Kalmar on a hot summer day, stroll out to its beach — a festive and happy slice of Swedish life. With snack stands, sand castles, and views of the castle, the beach makes Kalmar an unexpected fun-in-the-sun stop. For people-watchers, it's a combination of Swedish beauty pageant and tattoo show. For me, it's the best possible dose of authentic, off-the-beaten-path Sweden.

Florida State routs Delaware State 77-6

TALLAHASSEE — Florida State had not scored over 30 points this season before facing Delaware State. The Seminoles accomplished that early in the second quarter on Saturday and didn't let up in a 77-6 rout.

The 71-point win is the second-highest margin of victory by Florida State (4-6), falling three points shy of tying the 74-0 win against Whiting Field in 1949.

The 77 points also ties for the second-most points the Seminoles have scored in a game. The school record is 80 against Idaho (80-14) in 2013.

"I'm proud of our guys, we played a complete game," coach Jimbo Fisher said. "We dominated the game, but we should have dominated the game and we went out and played and did it and there's something to that; playing for four quarters."

The victory keeps Florida State's hopes of making a bowl game for the 36th consecutive season still alive. They need wins at Florida next Saturday and against Louisiana-Monroe on Dec. 2 in order to be bowl eligible.

"We've just got to feed off this week and bring it into next week," said Ermon Lane, who

5 Pineiro FGs lead Florida over UAB 36-7

GAINESVILLE — Eddy Pineiro kicked five field goals and Florida used a stifling defense to overwhelm UAB 36-7 on Saturday.

The Gators (4-6) ended a five-game losing streak with a strong second half when they gained 228 of their 409 total yards. Florida accumulated 257 yards on the ground with three players — Adarius Lemons (89 yards), Lamical Perine (86) and Mark Thompson (78)

accounting for most of the yards.

"Our running game really kicked in tonight. The running backs and offensive line really did a tremendous job of running the ball and getting big plays and putting us in situations to get touchdowns," Florida interim coach Randy Shannon said.

Pineiro connected on all five of his field-goal attempts, connecting from 39, 26, 50, 50 and 42 yards. He became the first player in Florida history to make two field goals from 50

yards or longer in a game.

"The first 50-yarder I hit it didn't come clean off my foot, but the second 50-yarder I put some juice on that kick. It felt good," Pineiro said.

Gators quarterback Felipe Franks passed for 152 yards and had touchdown passes to C'yontai Lewis (11 yards) and DeAndre Goolsby (13 yards).

FISHING REPORT

Tip of the week: According to www.fishingtipsdepot.com, when fishing for specks, take your time. You will get more action if you are slow and steady, compared to rushing.

1. Yankeetown/Waccasassa: According to Jim Zaloga, the trout should be biting well with this new cold front coming in. Live shrimp on a Cajun Thunder Popping Cork or a Z-man Paddletail both work well for these fish. Redfish should be at the points or in the beginning of the creeks and river.

2. Crystal River/Homosassa: Capt. William Toney said with the warm weather, not much has changed from last week. Look for trout over hard yellow bottoms with brown rock grass. Some of the best low tide spots can be found by studying Google Earth. Old channels that were formed long ago can be seen starting westward from known creek and river mouths. These old channels will hold fish and float your vessel on the very low tides. Learning the deeper water that is surrounded by the flats can help an angler catch more fish and also prevent lower unit damage on the way back to safe water. Redfish are on the outside keys and biting on the last part of the incoming tide. Live shrimp is very good bait but as of late cut lizard fish (aka snake fish) is working well. Toney said he saves them for bait to use while trout fishing. The near-shore rocks are producing keeper gag groupers on casting plugs. Sheepshead, Spanish mackerel and flounder are being caught on live shrimp. Incoming high tide will be in the afternoon this weekend.

3. Withlacoochee: Capt. Bob at Angler's Resort on the Withlacoochee River in Dunnellon reports fishing on the river continues to be slow but some bass are still being caught on wild shiners and catfish using worms and fishing in the deep holes. Lake Rousseau is also still on the slow side but some bass are being caught on wild shiners. Some crappie are being caught in the barge canal using Missouri minnows. The Fish and Wildlife Commission have done a fish count on the river and hopefully we will have their findings soon.

4. Orange Lake/Lochloosa: Gary at Lochloosa Harbor reports that while winds made for a slow fishing Wednesday, the days leading up were filled with happy speck fishermen. Most have been caught in the center of the lake using either jig heads with a plastic tail or jig heads with minnows. Two anglers also had success in the lily pad area, catching 80 and keeping their limit of 40.

5. Ocklawaha River: Roger Robbins at Buck 'N Bass Sports Center reports that the Ocklawaha River and Rodman Reservoir have been prosperous with large specks and an excellent warmouth bite. Red wiggler worms and minnows are the best bait for these. Bass have been caught in abundance use wild shiners and Zoom sinko worms in green and June bug colors. The St Johns River has produced some nice bass and a few specks at the south end of Lake George and along the banks down to the Astor bridge. Fishing about 30 yards off the bank and troll minnows slowly to find the specks. Also the deeper holes have produced some nice specks.

6. Salt Springs: Roger Robbins at Buck 'N Bass Sports Center reports that fishing is great now that the boat ramps have been reopened on Lake George, Lake Kerr and Salt Springs Run. Water on Lake George is finally getting back to normal and bass fishing continues to improve. Salt Springs Run is producing some nice bass and catfish,

along with some mullet.

7. Forest Lakes: Fat Daddy's reports that fishermen are catching specks with regularity, due in great part to the recent drops in temperature. Small minnows with jigs or large minnows without jigs have been the baits of choice. Bass fishing has also been good using shiners as bait.

8. Lake Weir: Fat Daddy's reports that specks have been caught here in abundance. Most are using either small minnows with jigs or large minnows without jigs.

9. Harris Chain: No update.

10. Panasoffkee/Tsala: No update.

11. Astor Park: Roger Robbins at Buck 'N Bass Sports Center reports that Astor has high water and flooding, but is producing fish with several bass weighing more than eight pounds being reported.

12. Ponce Inlet: According to www.floridasightfishing.com, the bite is still red hot

in the Mosquito Lagoon and near New Smyrna Beach and Ponce Inlet. Redfish have been biting with regularity since Hurricane Irma. Tours are fishing schools of redfish every morning in Mosquito Lagoon and wrapping things up catching bunches of spotted sea trout. There are lots of snook and tarpon in the deeper waters around New Smyrna. Fishing is not going slow down for a while, then we'll start to see baitfish thinning out and the fall transition taking place. Fishing for Mosquito Lagoon redfish have been excellent the last couple weeks. Lower water levels have the fish schooled up big time during the morning. Numerous groups of 75-150 grouped up fish ranging between five and 10 pounds. Giant bull reds have also been schooled up in both lagoons for their annual spawn with fish in the 20-40 pound range coming to the boat each day recently. Summer and early fall is prime time for catching these trophy-sized redfish. Live bait has been the

ticket with mullet, pinfish, pigfish all catching plenty. Soft plastics, plugs and spoons have worked when throwing lures. The speckled trout bite in Mosquito Lagoon is still going strong. It's also picked up well in New Smyrna Beach around oysters, creek shorelines, and docks. Live bait is producing around 15-to-20 trout each day. Many are smaller keeper-sized fish with some big ones upwards of seven or eight pounds. Fishing for speckled trout will remain like this until the cold fronts start to roll through and baitfish supplies run out in late September. Fishing for snook in New Smyrna Beach and Ponce Inlet has been good around the docks, bridges and shorelines. However, it's going to get even better next month when cold fronts start to get going and baitfish begin their fall migration. Where snook are hanging out now makes for tougher fishing with heavy gear and lots of lost fish or break-offs but anglers are getting a fair number of bites each time out.

FRISCO, TEXAS Jerry Jones apologizes for racial remark in video

Dallas Cowboys owner Jerry Jones has apologized after a gossip website posted a 4-year-old video of him making a racially insensitive comment.

The Blast website reported the video was shot in 2013 at a Dallas hotel by a white man who asked Jones if he would tape a message for his fiancée.

Jones appeared to be joking when he said, "Hey, Jennifer, congratulations on the wedding. Now, you know he's with a black girl tonight, don't you?"

After the video's release Friday, Jones apologized in a statement issued by the team, saying, "That comment was inappropriate. It's not who I am, and I'm sorry."

The website reported the video was shared by someone who thought it was relevant in light of players sitting or kneeling in protest during the national anthem in the NFL.

Former San Francisco quarterback Colin Kaepernick started the protests last year to bring awareness to issues of racial inequality.

MACAU British rider Hegarty dies after crashing in Macau GP

British motorcycle rider Daniel Hegarty has died after crashing in the Macau Grand Prix on Saturday.

The 31-year-old Hegarty, competing for Topgun Racing Honda, came off his bike on a sharp bend during the sixth lap on the street circuit.

He was flung into barriers, losing his helmet and sustaining fatal injuries.

The race was immediately red flagged and never restarted as Hegarty received emergency treatment.

He died on his way to the hospital.

Race organizers said on Twitter: "The Macau Grand Prix Committee extends its deepest sympathies to the family and friends of Daniel."

PARK CITY, UTAH Russia's Elena Nikitina wins World Cup skeleton

Russia's Elena Nikitina won a World Cup skeleton race Saturday while her Olympic bronze medal remains under scrutiny as part of the investigation into state-sponsored doping at the 2014 Sochi Games.

She erased a slight deficit in her second run to finish in 1 minute, 40.49 seconds.

Germans took the next two spots — Tina Hermann in 1:40.51 and Jacqueline Loelling in 1:40.73.

Katie Uhlaender was the top American, finishing seventh, and reigning Olympic champion Lizzy Yarnold of Britain was eighth.

In the men's race, Yun Sungbin of South Korea convincingly beat Latvia's Martins Dukurs for the gold — as the two reversed their finishes from the season-opener in Lake Placid, New York, last weekend.

Yun had the fastest start in both heats and finished in 1:37.32, while Dukurs completed his two runs in 1:37.95 and was denied what would have been his 50th World Cup victory.

The 'U' stays unbeaten

No. 2 Miami rallies to beat Virginia for 15th straight win

MIAMI GARDENS, Fla. — Malik Rosier threw three touchdown passes and ran for another score and No. 2 Miami pulled off its biggest comeback in five years, by holding off Virginia 44-28 on Saturday to extend the nation's longest winning streak to 15 games.

Jaquan Johnson had an interception return for a touchdown for Miami (10-0, 7-0 Atlantic Coast Conference, No. 3 CFP), which went on a 30-0 run in the second half to remain unbeaten.

The Hurricanes erased a pair of 14-point deficits, and had lost 15 consecutive games in which they trailed at any point by such a margin. But they got a pair of fourth-down stops in Virginia territory in the fourth quarter, and the Hurricanes finished their first 7-0 home regular season since 1988.

No. 1 Alabama 56, Mercer 0

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. — Jalen Hurts passed for 180 yards and three touchdowns in a little more than a quarter and Alabama beat FCS team Mercer.

The Crimson Tide (11-0, 7-0 SEC, No. 1 CFP) raced to a 35-0 halftime lead in what amounted to a tuneup for the team's biggest game.

Now, Alabama heads to No. 6 Auburn with the winner of the Iron Bowl facing No. 7 Georgia in the Southeastern Conference championship game in Atlanta.

No. 3 Oklahoma 41, Kansas 3

LAWRENCE, Kan. — Oklahoma's Baker Mayfield threw for 257 yards and three touchdowns after getting dissed by the Kansas captains before kickoff.

Mayfield had tried shaking hands with Daniel Wise, Dorance Armstrong Jr. and Joe Dineen Jr. after the coin toss, but they stared stoically back at him. Mayfield quickly pulled his hand away, clapped a couple of times and set about burnishing his Heisman Trophy candidacy.

No. 4 Clemson 61, Citadel 3

CLEMSON, S.C. — Kelly Bryant threw for 230 yards and three touchdowns and was out of the game before halftime for Clemson against the lower-division opponent.

After Bryant's 14-yard touchdown pass to T.J. Chase on the offense's 26th play, Clemson (10-1, No. 2 College Football Playoff) led 28-0. Bryant completed 17 of 22 passes.

No. 5 Wisconsin 24, Michigan 10

MADISON, Wis. — Alex Hornibrook threw a 24-yard touchdown pass to A.J. Taylor in third quarter to break open a defensive slugfest, and Kendric Pryor scored on an end-around to help Wisconsin remain undefeated.

The Badgers (11-0, 8-0 Big Ten, No. 5 CFP) padded their playoff resume by winning a grinding, physical matchup against the Wolverines (8-3, 5-3, No. 24 CFP).

No. 6 Auburn 42, Louisiana-Monroe 14

AUBURN, Ala. — Darius Slayton caught a 50-yard touchdown pass late in the first half and Auburn pulled away to set up next week's visit from No. 1 Alabama.

No. 7 Georgia 42, Kentucky 13

ATHENS, Ga. — Nick Chubb and Sony Michel led a dominant running game and Georgia bounced back from its first loss of the season.

In the final home game of their careers, Chubb and Michel went out with a bang on Senior Day between the hedges. Chubb rushed for 151 and two touchdowns, including a 55-yard burst down the sideline to seal the victory early in the fourth quarter. Michel rambled for 87 yards and three scores of his own, most notably a 37-yard TD that sent the Bulldogs into the half with a 21-6 lead.

No. 8 Ohio State 52, Illinois 14

COLUMBUS, Ohio — No. 8 Ohio State scored on its first six possessions — including J.T. Barrett's 100th career touchdown pass — and the Buckeyes wrapped up the Big Ten East title.

Barrett, playing in his last game at Ohio Stadium, threw for two touchdowns and ran for another score to help the Buckeyes (9-2, 7-1, CFP No. 9) dominate from the opening kick. Barrett became the Ohio State leader in rushing yards among quarterbacks (3,070), eclipsing Braxton Miller. He holds 35 Big Ten and school records.

Ohio State's defense limited the Illini (2-9, 0-9) to a season-low 105 yards in handing them a ninth straight loss. They didn't record a first down until near the end of the first half.

No. 9 Notre Dame 24, Navy 17

SOUTH BEND, Ind.

— Brandon Wimbusch threw for 164 yards and two touchdowns and ran for a score as Notre Dame rallied in the rain and wind to beat Navy.

Kansas St. 45, Oklahoma St. 40

STILLWATER, Okla. — Byron Pringle caught three touchdown passes and returned a kickoff for another score to help Kansas State stun Oklahoma State.

Oklahoma State nearly erased a 29-point deficit, but Kansas State (6-5, 4-4 Big 12) held on to become bowl eligible for the eighth consecutive season.

No. 11 TCU 27, Texas Tech 3

LUBBOCK, Texas — True freshman quarterback Shawn Robinson ran for 84 yards and threw a key second-half touchdown in his first career start to help TCU to stay in contention for a spot in the Big 12 championship game.

No. 14 UCF 45, Temple 19

PHILADELPHIA — McKenzie Milton threw four touchdown passes and ran for a score and Central Florida stayed unbeaten heading into a showdown with rival USF.

No. 17 Mississippi St. 28, Arkansas 21

FAYETTEVILLE, Ark. — Nick Fitzgerald threw a 6-yard touchdown pass to Dedrick Thomas with 17 seconds remaining, and No. 17 Mississippi State survived a lackluster performance and four fumbles.

No. 18 Memphis 66, SMU 45

MEMPHIS, Tenn. — Darrell Henderson rushed for 147 yards, including two long touchdowns, and Riley Ferguson threw for 320 yards and two scores to help Memphis wrap up the American Athletic Conference West Division championship.

Jackson, McAdoo feeling the heat most among NFL coaches

Hue Jackson's position on an NFL coaching hot seat is no surprise. Nothing was expected of the Browns anyway.

Ben McAdoo's spot on a similarly burning seat is stunning because plenty was projected for the Giants.

Those are the two most prominent cases of a head coach in trouble as the NFL heads toward its stretch drive. Among those two, their teams have one victory.

Jackson and McAdoo are not the only head men whose job security is tenuous — if even that. Add in Chuck Pagano in Indianapolis, John Fox in Chicago, Marvin Lewis in Cincinnati and Dirk Koetter in Tampa Bay.

And don't think that Jim Caldwell in Detroit and Todd Bowles with the Jets are completely safe.

Several betting outlets even have odds on which of the current NFL coaches in precarious positions will go first.

As all of them would say — and some of them have — "it's our job to coach, not to worry about those things."

That, of course, doesn't mean they aren't somewhat nervous.

HUE JACKSON, BROWNS (0-9)

This one is most obvious, although to his credit Jackson doesn't seem to have lost the faith of his players. Upper management is another story.

Jackson appears to be at odds with Cleveland's analytics-reliant front office. He can only coach the "talent" he is given, and the skill level in Cleveland might not win in the Big Ten.

He consistently takes the blame for what goes wrong in Cleveland.

And plenty does go wrong.

BEN MCADOO, GIANTS (1-8)

This one is confounding.

New York didn't make the playoffs in each of the four seasons Tom Coughlin coached after winning his second NFL title by beating the Patriots in the 2012 Super Bowl. When Coughlin was forced out, the Giants elevated offensive coordinator McAdoo, who also was coveted by other clubs.

He guided the Giants to an 11-5 record and playoff berth in 2016 with a big-play defense.

That defense has crumbled, the offense has been inept — it's fair to blame injuries to three key receivers, including Odell Beckham Jr. for some deficiencies — and the locker room is a mess. McAdoo has suspended both starting cornerbacks for a game for violating team rules, and what some characterize as rumblings are more like earthquakes.

Do you think there are some Giants fans clamoring for Coughlin nowadays?

CHUCK PAGANO, COLTS (3-7)

When you lose your outstanding quarterback to lengthy injury, as Pagano has with Andrew Luck, you probably are doomed. That Luck's surgery was at the start of 2017 and he never got onto the field this season is beyond Pagano's

control, but the coach's Plan B has been a bust.

Lowlights this season have included continual late-game collapses and some mind-boggling plays by the opposition. The Colts haven't been the same since losing the AFC title game in the 2014 season. Yeah, the "Deflate-gate" game.

Owner Jim Irsay also is seeing empty seats in Indy. Pagano's seat is on fire.

MARVIN LEWIS, BENGALS (3-6)

Like Jackson and Pagano, Lewis is a nice man who spent lots of time working his way through the ranks. He's also the best coach Cincinnati has had since founder and Hall of Famer Paul Brown from 1968-75.

But the time perhaps has come for the second-longest tenured NFL coach to move on.

The Bengals have gone to the playoffs seven times under Lewis. They've left the postseason after one game all seven times.

Their offense is abysmal as the front office, which includes decisions by Lewis, allowed top linemen Andrew Whitworth and Kevin Zeitler to walk in free agency. QB Andy Dalton has regressed. Dalton is earning a ton of money, so Lewis has stuck with him

over AJ McCarron, who could become a free agent after this season.

Perhaps most damning: The Bengals are downright dull.

JOHN FOX, BEARS (3-6)
Fox guided the Panthers and, later on, the Broncos to Super Bowl appearances (and losses). The Bears are about as close to a Super Bowl as Chicago is to Mars.

Bears fans are ticked that Adam Gase departed for Miami before last season, ending any hopes he would take over for Fox at some juncture. The Bears haven't been relevant in the Windy City since Lovie Smith was in charge, and he got fired in 2012 with an 84-66 record and two NFC championship appearances. Smith was 10-6 in his final season; Fox is 12-29.

DIRK KOETTER, BUCCANEERS (3-6)

Tampa Bay rivals the Giants in some ways as a flop this season. While a huge leap upward was expected — the NFC South was supposed to be a powerhouse division, with the Bucs in the mix. It has been the league's best sector this season, but with the Bucs mired at the bottom.

History is not on Koetter's side. The past two coaches (Greg Schiano and the aforementioned Lovie Smith) only got two years. The coach before that (Raheem Morris) got three. The Bucs haven't made the playoffs since 2007 and haven't won a postseason game since the 2002 team won the Super Bowl.

Where are you, Jon Gruden?

But Koetter's players verbally are supporting him, and he has the offensive touch needed to help Jameis Winston progress.

"Three of us have won championships, and Martin has won a lot of races this year. Our intention is to go down there and win the championship, and I think if you're one of those four and you don't have that mentality, you're not prepared for what you're getting into."

Indeed, Sunday has the makings of one of the better showings in NASCAR's championship history.

Truex has won seven races this year and leads the series in nearly every category. He has been the fastest of the contenders all weekend, and anything short of a victory would be

a deflating end to a dream season.

"I'm ready to go," Truex said after leading Saturday's final practice.

Truex and the Denver, Colorado-based Furniture Row Racing team have excelled through adversity all season: Truex's longtime partner, Sherry Pollex, had a recurrence of ovarian cancer; a mechanic died of a heart attack the night before Truex's win last month at Kansas; and team owner Barney Visser is sidelined in Colorado because of emergency heart surgery a week ago.

Then Truex scraped the wall during Saturday practice and his crew — with a borrowed mechanic from Toyota teammate Busch's team — had to hammer away any damage.

"The teamwork has been

amazing all year long, and that's what's got us to this point, both of us really," Truex said.

Dale Earnhardt Jr., who will retire from full-time racing after Sunday, is openly rooting for his hunting buddy. Earnhardt gave Truex his start in the sport, and Truex went on to win a pair of second-tier titles driving for Earnhardt's team.

"Drivers have such big egos, all of us do, but Martin is not on that list," Earnhardt said. "He just doesn't abuse the opportunity and what the sport has provided him. I just think that says so much about his character as a person and a man."

"I don't know how you put into words what it would mean for him to win. It is bigger than words."

more comfortable.” Florida held the Blazers to 180 yards, including just 3 yards on the ground. UAB (7-4) had just 93 yards in offense through three quarters. But on the first play of the fourth quarter, Blazers quarterback A.J. Erdely

connected with Xavier Oboji on a 74-yard scoring play for their only score.

THE TAKEAWAY

Florida: The Gators won for the first time since Sept. 30 when they beat Vanderbilt 38-24. Even with a win over Florida State next Saturday in the season finale, the Gators won't make a bowl game for only the third time in 31 seasons.

Florida's defense recovered two fumbles and had two interceptions while the Gator offense did not have a turnover.

UAB: The Blazers had converted 56.8 percent of their third-down conversions (25 of 44) over their last three games, but managed just one of seven against the Gators. UAB's three-game winning streak came to an end as the Blazers missed

out on an opportunity to record a program record eighth FBS win. Running back Spencer Brown was the nation's second leading rusher among freshmen but only managed 17 yards in eight carries.

was one of nine FSU players to score a touchdown.

Delaware State (2-9) was competitive for the first 10 minutes. A Nyfease West 1-yard touchdown run brought the Hornets within 14-6 with 4:04 remaining in the first quarter before FSU scored the final 63 points.

The Seminoles would lead 56-6 at halftime, which tied a school record for most first-half points (they also scored 56 on Nov. 14, 1992, against Tulane). They took control by scoring a touchdown on six of their first eight possessions.

Florida State also accomplished a rare trifecta in the first quarter, scoring touchdowns on offense, special teams and defense. That is the first time the Seminoles have done that

in the same game since 2013 against Wake Forest.

The Seminoles opened the scoring on a Jacques Patrick 14-yard touchdown run and extended their lead to 14-0 when Tarvarus McFadden took a blocked field goal 63 yards.

The Hornets got the ball back with a chance to tie the game at 14, but Derwin James picked off Keenan Black and ran 41 yards for his first career touchdown.

James Blackman completed 11 of 15 passes for 179 yards and three touchdowns for FSU. Ryan Green (seven carries, 96 yards) and Patrick (three carries, 28 yards) also ran for a pair of scores.

The Hornets gained 125 yards on their first two drives but were held to 67 the remainder of the game. Black played quarterback in the first half and was 7 of 18 for 98 yards.

“Obviously you never want to get beat like that,” Delaware State coach Kenny Carter said. “When

you make mistakes early and you are playing a team that has superior talent it's hard to overcome that.”

SHORTENING THINGS UP

The teams agreed to play 10-minute quarters during the second half. NCAA rules state that at “any time during the game, the playing time of any remaining period or periods and the intermission between halves may be shortened by mutual agreement of the opposing head coaches and the referee.”

It is the seventh time since 2012 a game has been shortened in the second half.

It is the second time involving Florida State (2012 against Savannah State).

“You don't ever want to embarrass and humiliate anybody. There's no sense in that, so we agreed to do that,” Fisher said.

THE TAKEAWAY

Delaware State: Coach Kenny Carter and his team can claim at least one moral victory. The touchdown marked the first time in nine games that an FCS team had scored a first-quarter TD on the Seminoles.

Florida State: Players who normally don't get snaps got a lot of playing time. Sophomore fullback Gabe Nabers and redshirt junior wide receiver Justin Motlow got their first touchdowns, while senior running back Ryan Green got his first TD since 2013. Motlow is the first member of the Seminole Tribe of Florida to score a touchdown for Florida State.

UP NEXT

Delaware State: Season complete.

The Villages reached the Class 5A state semifinals where they lost to Tampa Catholic, who got 40 points from Kevin Knox, now a freshman stand-out at the University of Kentucky.

The Wildcats and the Buffalo look primed to make another run at Final Four appearance, along with Mount Dora Christian Academy in Class 3A. And on a national level, Montverde Academy appears set to compete for its fourth national title in six years.

“The future of this team looks very bright,” said Wildwood coach Von Moreland, shortly after the Wildcats lost to West Gadsden for the championship. “I'm so grateful they took this old coach on a ride I will never, ever forget. And I believe they have the potential to put together another memorable run and just maybe, we'll finish off the ride with one more win.”

Last year, the Yellow Jackets started out sluggishly, compiling a 7-6 record before going on a tear and winning their final 16 games, including the postseason.

In the playoffs, Leesburg's ball-hawking

approach on the defensive end proved to be the difference, with five of its seven games being decided by six points or less.

The Yellow Jackets lost only two players from last year's team to graduation, but they were critical to the team's success. Ernest Hagins and Quentin Peoples never lit up a box score, but their efforts on the court — adding a measure of physicality — were often apparent to anyone who watched them play.

“We wouldn't have gotten to Lakeland last year without Ernest and Quentin,” Campbell said. “When we play, we talk about winning plays and they did the things that helped us win plays and, in turn, win games. I haven't found anyone who can step up and fill their roles, so I think we're going to need everyone to step up, collectively, and be more physical.”

Still, the foundation Campbell has to work with is impressive.

Among those returning from last year's title run are Keon Ellis, Lance Erving, Corey Patterson, Calvin Heflin, Trey Johnson, Jyre McCloud and Cordrayius Graham, the Daily Commercial All-Area Player of the Year. That group averaged 65.9 points per game for the Yellow Jackets in 2016-17 — 88 percent of

the team's per game scoring average of 74.7.

Still, much of Leesburg's success comes from its relentless defensive pressure and ability to create turnovers leading to run-out baskets. The Yellow Jackets make up for their relative lack of size — this year's team has only three players taller than 6-foot-1 — with their quickness, which often overwhelms opponents.

Never was that more apparent than in the Yellow Jackets' state semifinal and state championship games. In the two games, the Yellow Jackets forced 53 turnovers.

Against Jacksonville Ribault — a 70-64 win — in the state semifinals, Leesburg induced 38 turnovers, including 14 in the third quarter. That work on the defensive end enabled the Yellow Jackets to transform a 34-28 halftime deficit into a 52-50 lead.

In the championship game against Cape Coral Mariner, the Yellow Jackets got off to a quick start, forcing six turnovers, which allow them to build a 16-3 advantage in a 57-53 win. It was Leesburg's third state title — the previous two coming in 1977 and 2011.

Leesburg has won more state titles in boys basketball than any public

school in Lake and Sumter counties.

And with so many returning players who went through the post-season experience, the Yellow Jackets have to be considered an early season favorite to make a return trip to the RP Funding Center — formerly known as The Lakeland Center — for the Final Four in March.

“What these guys went through last year was invaluable in terms of experience,” Campbell said. “They know what to expect and they know how to manage themselves and the pressure that grows with every game in the playoffs. The postseason is a different season and the dynamics of those games are completely different.”

At the same time, Campbell feels it could be a double-edged sword.

“They can't be impatient with the regular season,” Campbell said. “A trip to the Final Four has to be the last thing we worry about. We have a big game to open the season — a home game against Eustis (at 7 p.m. Nov. 28). Eustis is always tough and we'll get a good feel for where we are and what we need to work on.”

“We need to approach every game as if it is a piece of the road that eventually ends in Lakeland.”

Some players haven't a care in the world and let nothing bother them, while others, like Atlas, carry a whole world of worries on their shoulders. Consider this deal played in a match between Poland and China.

At the first table, the Polish North-South pair got to six spades on the bidding shown. Four notrump was Blackwood, and five diamonds South lost was a trump, and he easily showed one ace.

West led a diamond, won by dummy's ten, and South played a low trump to the ace, on which West produced the nine. The Polish declarer, obviously a chronic worrier, was afraid the nine might be a singleton, so to cover this possibility, he led the six of spades toward dummy's ten at trick three. This would have limited East to one trump trick had he started with the Q-J-7-4 of spades.

In the actual case, though, South's cautious approach backfired when West won with the jack and led a second diamond, ruffed by East for down one. Declarer's attempted safety play thus lost the slam by making allowance for a 4-1 spade division (which did not exist) as opposed to guarding against a 6-1 diamond division (which did exist).

At the second table, the Chinese South adopted a much more happy-go-lucky style in both the bidding and the play. The bidding went:

North East South West
1♥ Pass 1♠ Pass
2♠ Pass 6♠

Here, too, West led a diamond, taken by the ten. Declarer then played a spade to the ace and — without a care in the world — continued with the king. As a result, the only trick South lost was a trump, and he easily made the slam.

Lake County history: Did you know?

Sitting on the upper part of Lake Griffin and west of Buck Lake Slough is Emerald Island, one of a string of hammocks in north Lake County.

Once a self-contained community with a few stores, school, church, post office and several packing houses, Emerald Island was an island only "in times of high water," according to William Kennedy's "History of Lake County," which was published in 1929. The rest of the time it was connected to the mainland, the book

added.

It certainly was no picnic getting to Emerald Island when John Vanderslice Oberholtzer arrived in the area in 1885. He'd been advised to leave Pennsylvania because of bronchitis and first settled in Higley, about two miles northeast of Emerald Island on a hill overlooking Lake Yale.

Oberholtzer's parents had bought bearing groves at Emerald Island, and they charged their son to care for them. He lived in Higley for about five years and commuted back and forth through a swamp. On the west side was Lake Griffin and the other three

sides were sawgrass marsh about a foot deep. It was surrounded by water. At that time, there wasn't a causeway. The only way to get there was by boat, mule or walking through the water. Oberholtzer rode a mule.

While Florida isn't known for its Civil War battlefields, the state played an important role. The Sunshine State produced staples such as cattle and salt, which were important commodities for the Confederate Army.

It was Captain J.J. Dickison, known as the Civil War's "Swamp Fox" or

the "Marion of Florida," who played an important role in protecting those resources and making sure they got where they needed to go.

Despite his qualifications and success, and also repeated urgings by his superiors, Dickison remained a captain until the end of the war.

He spent his later years in Okahumpka near the edge of Bugg Springs from 1880-89.

Dickison died Aug. 26, 1902. He is buried in the Evergreen Cemetery in Jacksonville with his wife Mary Elizabeth, who died Jan. 15, 1913.

He was a handsome little fella of six when he came to live with me and his dad and my three younger children. He couldn't seem to accept the fact that others had the same rights as he did. Discipline escaped him. He didn't seem to understand it at all so of course he got into trouble a lot and, because of that, when something went wrong he was always suspect. He confided

in me when he was a teenager that he wished he could be like his stepsister and stepbrother but he just could not.

When you look around at your friends and acquaintances you make judgments and sometimes you wonder what makes this one happy, this one glum, another hard to get along with, someone else very sweet tempered, one cooperative, another helpless. Then there is the old question of nature or nurture. Those of us who raise children know both are involved in the development of character and personality. Sometimes you feel helpless in dealing with an recalcitrant young person.

Is it because today we are informed by television, radio or newspapers about all the mayhem in the world that we have become aware of all the evil that exists or are human beings worse than they used to be? You don't have to study much history to know that evil has always been with us. It seems to change its face with each new generation.

I remember taking my 4-year-old grandson Zech to a little park with a lake in the middle of it. We were watching a mother duck swimming along followed by five little ducklings. They were so cute and Zech was fascinated by them when a large predatory

bird flew down and plucked the last little duckling out of the water. Zech's little boy face fell and he turned to me with a questioning look.

"That's nature's way, sweetheart," I said. It is the food chain and the baby duck is at the bottom, just before bugs. When we get home we will look it up in your encyclopedia."

He was still stunned but was always interested in learning something new. As soon as we got back to the house he ran for the book about birds and found something new that day about life and some of its cruelties. He learned that man is the only animal

that kills just for the killing.

When you get too caught up in the latest horror one of us humans perpetrates on his brothers and sisters, look at what some very good and loving ordinary people are doing to help others who are victims of man-made tragedies and natural disasters. Some are so forgetful of self that they risk their own lives for strangers. It will help you to keep your perspective.

Holiday pet safety reminders

Like it or not, the holidays are fast approaching and that means parties, house guests, decorations, lots of food, and more! However, some of these things also bring dangers to your pets. Here are a few important reminders to keep your animals safe during the festivities.

Dangers of food

It's important to keep human food out of reach of pets, in particular, turkey bones (and other types of bones), spicy foods, alcoholic beverages and chocolate. Toxins

According to the Pet Poison Helpline website, human medications also rank very high on the list of items that poison pets so keep these well out of reach and again that's a good one to remind house guests about. These include vitamins, minerals,

anti-depressants, cardiac medication, and ibuprofen. Many holiday houseplants can also make animals sick or irritate them including poinsettias, lilies, mistletoe, and holly so you should keep those out of reach of animals. Pets ingesting Holiday decorations can cause huge problems so try to keep those out of reach as well!

Holiday package deliveries

The holiday season brings a huge spike in lost pets and I have been informed by a local lost pet expert that a large number of these incidents are caused when packages are delivered; the door opens and the animal bolts. So before

you open the door to a delivery person, please secure your pets in another room or crate, or go out and close the door behind you to accept the package. Keep an ID tag on your pet's collar and make sure they are microchipped which can significantly

increase the chances of getting your pet back should they get out.

Parties

Cats typically do not like a lot of noise, commotion or visitors, including loud music and voices, small children

chasing them or people trying to pick them up. If hosting a party, make a safe spot for your cat in a quiet room, with their litter and food and water, where they can stay away from the noise. Dogs tend to fare a little better at parties than cats and are often more sociable at gatherings, however, dogs who like to run, are fearful, sick or old, may be better off crated for a few hours in a quiet room if you are going to have a lot of people around.

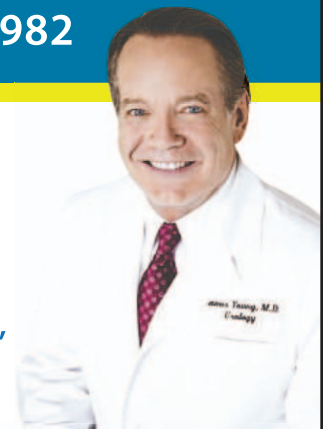

do is very hard. Are all the stories the best ever? No, of course not. There are definitely weaker stories some weeks, but overall as a show, we're so proud of the consistency and the humor and the heart that we bring.

I don't know why more shows don't do this, to be honest. I think we all have such short attention spans now, with Instagram and social media and all of that, it feeds right into our demographic. The show is so quick and short that if you don't like one story, go to the bathroom and come back, and you'll like the next one.

With the stories being so short, how does that affect your work schedule on the series?

It's a dream for us as actors, let me tell you. We shoot three to four days a week, but it's not full days because of the way our show is structured. We really have a cushy schedule. It's great.

Since you recently became a first-time mom, can one assume that's a particularly happy situation for you?

I have my mom, I have a nanny, and I'm able to bring the baby to the set – so I can be with her when I'm not shooting. ("Life in Pieces" creator and executive producer) Justin Adler and (executive producer) Aaron Kaplan both have three girls, so I'm dealing with family men who understand the importance of that.

What's your thought about "Life in Pieces" combining four stories weekly in a half-hour's time – which is more like 22 minutes without commercials?

It's like 88 episodes a season, basically. At least that's how it feels, and what our writers

With as much series work as you've done, and with "The Good Doctor" having gotten a full-season pickup early, did you have the sense that it would be a successful venture?

It's always tough to know what a project is going to turn into. And it's guesswork. And sometimes I've guessed wrong, and sometimes I've guessed right, you know? You roll the dice based on conversations that you have with people, so ("The Good Doctor" developer and executive producer) David Shore was the first person I talked to about this.

When I have to make a decision, I go into panic attack. My brain shuts off, and I have to ask everyone around me what should I do. It's really tough, especially (with) something that might demand my attention and presence for quite a long time, which this has the potential to do – so having a conversation with David and what his vision was, and is, was a huge factor.

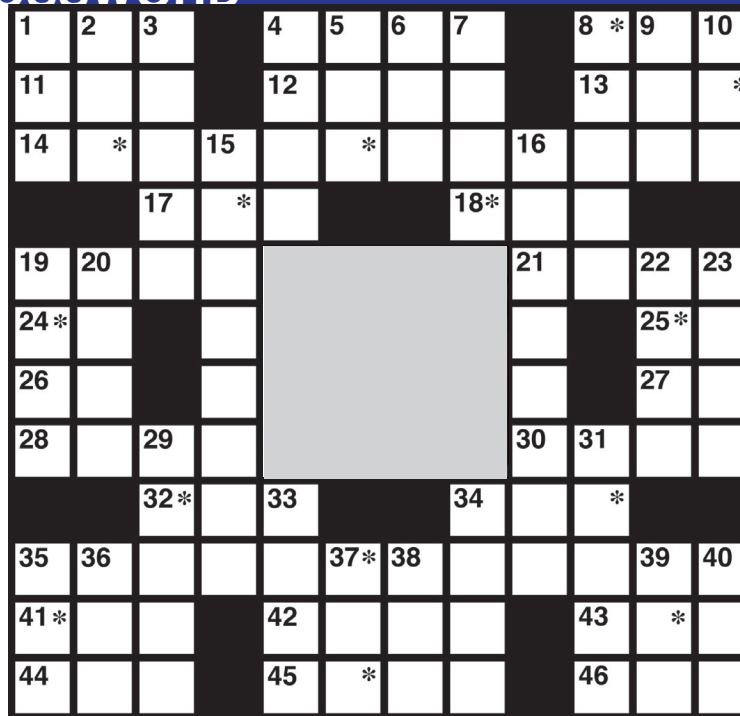

A new 'Anne of Green Gables' is PBS' Thanksgiving treat again

Thanks to one of the most popular characters in literature, PBS has started a Thanksgiving tradition.

Last year on the holiday, the network aired a Canadian production of the classic Lucy Maud Montgomery story "Anne of Green Gables," about a spirited orphan's impact on the aging siblings who took her in. Now, principal cast members Martin Sheen, Sara Botsford and (in the title role) Ella Ballentine return in "Anne of Green Gables: The Good Stars," which PBS debuts Thursday, Nov. 23.

they all have really enjoyed this version," Ballentine says. "Definitely, older viewers really like it, and they've been getting their kids to watch it. I've had so many people messaging me on Twitter or Facebook or Instagram, saying that they sat down as a family and now, their kids are big fans of it. And I think that's really great.

"Many things nowadays are very gory or graphic, and things in the world right now are very upsetting," notes Ballentine, "but this is definitely a film to really lay back (with), and you don't have to worry about anything and it's very light-hearted and sweet. You

don't feel like there's a weight on your shoulders."

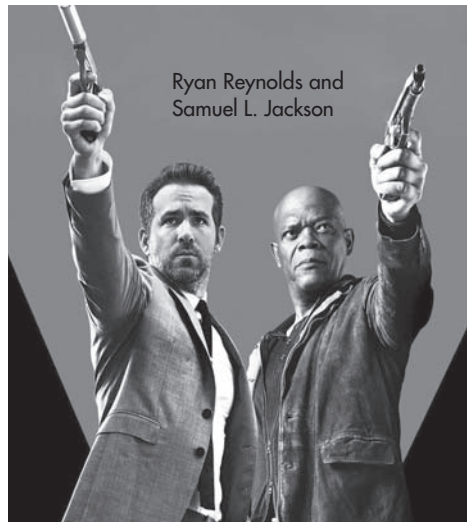

The story's effort to create its own universe smacks of "Star Wars," but ultimately less effectively; Clive Owen and music superstar Rihanna also appear, and John

Ballet is the main subject in this animated story, featuring the voice of Elle Fanning ("The Beguiled") as an orphan who heads for Paris with her best friend (voice of Nat Wolff, "The Fault in Our Stars") to fulfill her dream of dancing professionally. She has lots of hurdles to leap over upon her arrival, including having to assume a different identity to gain admission to a prestigious ballet school, then dealing with intensely competitive classmates.

Expectations were modest at best when CBS debuted this show, but as is now known, the Las Vegas-set drama became internationally popular and ultimately racked up a 16-season run and endured some major cast changes. The show begins with William Petersen (also an executive producer of the series) as the leader of a forensic crime lab—a position that later would go to succeeding "CSI" stars Laurence Fishburne and Ted Danson — that applies the most current scientific techniques to probes that largely involve murders. The program would yield spinoffs based in Miami and New York, and crossover episodes with those shows are included here; the cast also includes Marg Helgenberger, George Eads

Combining two PBS documentaries that were telecast more a year apart, this release begins with a profile of astronaut brothers Scott and Mark Kelly — among the most famous symbols of NASA in recent times — and their experiences, both in space and at home on Earth. Scott is seen training for the 12 months he spent aboard the International Space Station, with his identical twin Mark used as a basis for gauging any physical or mental changes in Scott during his time in orbit. Then, Scott's participation back on Earth in post-mission medical tests helps NASA determine the effects of long-duration space travel. ★★★ (Not rated)

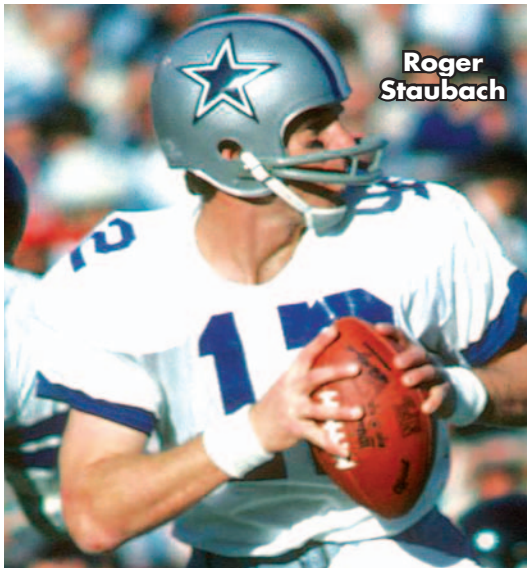

What's Trending **THANKSGIVING FOOTBALL, AN AMERICAN TRADITION**

Thanksgiving Day football is an American tradition that dates back long before the Detroit Lions and Dallas Cowboys began regularly hosting annual holiday games. In fact, it has been going on for over a century and has a history all its own.

In the early days of college football, conferences sometimes held their championship games on Thanksgiving Day. High School leagues got in on the action, as well as private football clubs across the nation who also gathered for a spirited holiday game.

Prior to World War II, NFL clubs often played on Thanksgiving Day, including the New York Football Giants. NFL action in Detroit has taken place on the holiday since 1934 when owner G.A. Richards decided to hold a Thanksgiving Day game for his team. Back then, the sports world was dominated by baseball and the "Motor City" belonged to the Tigers. Depression-era fans who came to the game were treated to a battle between the Lions and Chicago Bears. It was the beginning of a divisional rivalry that continues to this day.

After World War II, the Lions got right back to hosting Thanksgiving football, often against division rivals that included the Bears and Green Bay Packers. Other professional football leagues also played on Thanksgiving in the post-WWII era, including the American Football League (AFL) which rotated holiday games around the league starting in 1960. In 1966 the

NFL's upstart Dallas Cowboys also began hosting Thanksgiving football.

As the league's popularity grew, likewise did that of traditional holiday games. This carried on into the '80s and '90s. Remember John Madden handing out turkey legs to players he had decided were MVPs of the games he covered?

Ultimately, it's the games themselves that real fans remember. In 1974 rookie backup quarterback Clint Longley stepped in for an injured Roger Staubach and led the Cowboys to a come-from-behind victory over the Washington Redskins. The Cowboys weren't so lucky in 1993, when Leon Lett tried to pounce on a blocked field goal in the snow at Texas Stadium and handed the game to the Miami Dolphins. In Detroit, in 1998 a referee's botched coin toss awarded the Lions the ball in overtime, helping them to an eventual victory over the Pittsburgh Steelers.

In 2006 the NFL Network got on board, adding a third game, an evening broadcast, to the holiday football lineup. This somewhat pleased other owners who sometimes complained that Detroit and Dallas got all the glory from hosting the games on a regular basis, and in some cases, a home-team advantage. With Thursday football a regularity, nearly every NFL team now plays on a Thursday at some point in the season.

Here's wishing everyone a Happy Thanksgiving and some exciting football.

NEWS FLASH: TEENS THINK THEIR FOLKS ARE EVIL ... BUT THEY REALLY ARE IN HULU'S 'MARVEL'S RUNAWAYS'

No longer feeling safe in their own homes, they go on run. The trouble is, they don't necessarily like one another, but if they're to band together against their common enemy, they must learn to get along, develop trust and become something of a makeshift family.

"I think the thing all of our characters share is, you know, we don't really like each other," Sulkin told a recent gathering of journalists in Beverly Hills, Calif. "But one thing we do want to get to the bottom of is, 'Are our parents evil?' And if they are, what are we going to do about it?"

At a time when public trust in our leaders seems to be at an all-time low, series co-creator/executive producer Josh Schwartz ("The O.C.," "Dynasty") thinks this series will resonate.

"I think this is a time where figures of authority are in question for some of us," he says, "and this is a story where teenagers are at that age where they're starting to see their parents as fallible and human. And I guess ... it is that just because somebody is in charge doesn't necessarily mean they are here to do good."

"Marvel stories work best," series co-creator/executive producer Jeph Loeb adds, "when we take things that are happening in the real world - our world, if this world is actually real - and we put this through the Marvel prism, and they come out as action, adventure, drama, comedy, those sorts of things, so that the audience can come away looking at it and go, 'Wow, it's super cool that some of these kids do unusual things.' And some people go into it and say, 'Oh, I get it. This is a way of their commenting on what's going on outside.'"

It's probably not a huge stretch to say that at one time or another, most every teen has thought of their parents as being evil. But in a sci-fi/action series debuting this week on Hulu, they actually are.

In "Marvel's Runaways," which begins streaming Tuesday, Nov. 21, six Los Angeles teens of disparate backgrounds - played by Gregg Sulkin ("Pretty Little Liars"), Allegra Acosta ("100 Things to Do Before High School"), Ariela Barer ("One Day at a Time"), Virginia Gardner ("The Goldbergs"), Lyrica Okano ("The Affair") and Rhenzy Feliz ("Casual") - discover their parents are secretly part of a cabal of supervillains known as The Pride.

The very model of 'Modern' Emmy winners

Q: Have any of the stars of "Modern Family" won an Emmy for the show? — John Bender, Wilkes-Barre, Pa.

A: The ABC comedy has had several repeat Emmy winners in its ensemble cast. Eric Stonestreet was the first, picking up the honor for outstanding supporting actor in a comedy series (as Cameron) in 2010. The following year, Julie Bowen and Ty Burrell both earned Emmys for their roles as spouses Claire and Phil.

In 2012, Bowen and Stonestreet were both Emmy winners again — and in 2014, it became Burrell's turn once more. In fact, Burrell has been Emmy-nominated for every one of the show's past seasons.

Q: What happened to "Ten Days in the Val-

ley"? — Tracy Evans, via e-mail

A: The serialized Kyra Sedgwick-starring ABC mystery series performed below the network's ratings hopes in its Sunday slot, so it was pulled from that night after four airings. It will get to finish its season, though, and viewers presumably will get resolution to the plot about the kidnapping of a television producer's (Sedgwick) young daughter.

"Ten Days" will be brought back on Saturdays.

As of this writing, the plan is for two episodes to air on Dec. 16, with one chapter to be shown each of the following two weeks, then another two-hour telecast that will wrap up the story on Jan. 6. Also an executive producer of the drama, Sedgwick — doing her first series starring role since her Emmy-winning work on "The Closer" — announced the move (via Twitter) before ABC did, having been vocal about her belief that the network hadn't promoted the show sufficiently.

Q: Watching "Blue Bloods," I see that Danny Reagan's wife was written out of the show. At first, I thought she died when the family's house caught fire. How did the show explain her death? — Ken Fabian, Roselle, Ill.

A: Though this was addressed in a recent column, many questions about it continue to come in. Actually, Linda Reagan

— as then still played by Amy Carlson — was shown standing outside the burning house in the Season 7 finale of the CBS series, so she did survive that. That was one factor in the major surprise of the reveal in the Season 8 premiere that she had died.

It then was explained that Linda had perished in a helicopter crash while on a medical mission in her job as a nurse. That development resulted from Carlson's decision to leave the show at the end of her original seven-year contract. After the season premiere aired, the actress issued an "open letter" thanking the network, her "Blue Bloods" colleagues and fans of the series.

Broadcasters offer up a veritable cornucopia of Thanksgiving programming

Thanksgiving is the Rodney Dangerfield of holidays: It just doesn't get any respect.

Consider: On a last Thursday (or thereabouts) in November when we're supposed to be sitting down with loved ones and giving thanks for all we have — including the great feast before us — we're instead barraged with messages telling us that Christmas is just around the corner and we'd better leave the table soon to catch all the great sales and beat the Black Friday crowds. That is, if we're not still working on our Halloween candy.

Yep, Thanksgiving isn't feeling the love these days, but fortunately there are a few programs on broadcast and basic cable this week to remind us what we already know — that when it comes to sheer magnificence, Thanksgiving takes a back seat to no other holiday.

And that's evident in spades the morning of Thursday, Nov. 23, when NBC broadcasts the 91st

Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade from New York City. "Today" regulars Matt Lauer, Savannah Guthrie and Al Roker will have the call as giant balloons, marching bands, celebrities and, of course, Santa Claus make their way down 6th Ave. to Herald Square to mark the beginning of the holiday season. At the same time over on the Eye Network, there is "The Thanksgiving Day Parade on CBS," which also covers the New York procession from its perch near Times Square.

Immediately following on NBC is "The National Dog Show," the Kennel Club of Philadelphia's an-

nual event in which more than 2,000 canines in 170 breeds vie for the titles of First in Group and ultimately Best in Show, all before the watchful eyes of host John O'Hurley and analyst David Frei.

Thanksgiving surely isn't complete without football, and this Turkey Day is no exception, offering up a tripleheader of gridiron action that starts at midday (ET) on Fox with the Detroit Lions hosting the Minnesota Vikings. Immediately following on CBS, the Los Angeles Chargers visit the Dallas Cowboys, while in prime on NBC, it's the New York Giants

invading the home turf of the Washington Redskins.

Movie lovers will have their pick of classic films and holiday-oriented fare. In the case of the former, SundanceTV on Thursday will offer up a marathon of "Gone With the Wind" while AMC is running all three "Godfather" movies all day long, in addition to the "Titanic" marathon on Wednesday. And on Hallmark Movies & Mysteries, there are titles such as "The Thanksgiving House" (Sunday, Nov. 19) starring Emily Rose, "Love at the Thanksgiving Day Parade" (Wednesday) with Autumn Reeser, and "A Family Thanksgiving" (Thursday) starring Daphne Zuniga.

It's five seasons and done for 'Fixer Upper'

What would make the stars of one network's top-rated series walk away from it?

To hear Chip and Joanna Gaines tell it, it's to "catch our breath for a moment." The couple begins the fifth and final season of their hugely popular HGTV show "Fixer Upper" Tuesday, Nov. 21 – and while they'll have added name value from such celebrity guests as former First Lady Laura Bush and athlete Tim Tebow during the last 19 episodes, there's no doubt that the two spouses have "owned" every hour of the program with their rapport, repartee and renovation expertise.

Memories of the Gaineses' original house, which helped them sell the "Fixer Upper" concept in the first place, will be woven into the concluding season to acknowledge that the end is near. While they have focused on improving homes in their hometown of Waco, Texas, their influence has extended far beyond their own locality.

Their Magnolia Market, which they reopened in 2014 after closing it to focus on their family (also one of their stated reasons for ending "Fixer Upper") has become a destination for fans, physically and also online. The Gaineses also have operated the

Magnolia Homes construction and design business and the Magnolia Realty real-estate firm, they're marketing their wares nationwide in a new deal with Target, and they've written such best-selling books as "The Magnolia Story" and Chip's recently published "Capital Gaines: The Smart Things I've Learned by Doing Stupid Stuff."

"We've been called crazy before," Chip writes in the latter book about bringing "Fixer Upper" to its conclusion, but a spinoff is among the projects the Gaineses have in their immediate future. "Fixer Upper: Behind the Design" – which HGTV expects to debut next spring – will hold to its title literally by showcasing the designs Joanna has created for the parent series, explaining how she has devised and executed them.

movie review

Great: a network of weather-controlling satellites has been established to prevent environmental disasters.

Not so great: That network has gone haywire, and actually is starting to cause said disasters.

And there you have the story of "Geostorm," which harks back to such movies as "Meteor" and "The Day After Tomorrow" with its theme of Mother Nature run amok. Though it tries to make itself more important than it is by adding aspects of politics and climate change, at its heart, it's just a good old disaster movie – and it works best when it lets the audience take it on that level.

Gerard Butler, who's never met a rebel role he didn't like, plays the mastermind of the satellites – thrown off the project because of his hotheadedness. However, several years later, he's brought back to try to correct things from the International Space Station when those orbiting wonders start to cause bad things to happen on Earth.

That's not enough for "Geostorm," though, and it's here that the movie runs into as much trouble as what happens to the cities it targets. Butler's alter ego also has to contend with his brother (Jim Sturgess), who's the one who fired him, and whose girlfriend (Abbie Cornish) is an agent protecting the president ... which just happens to be the job Butler had himself in "Olympus Has Fallen" and "London Has Fallen." Andy Garcia plays the chief executive here, with Ed Harris another very familiar face featured.

For those who know their sci-fi films, "Geostorm" follows a tradition of stories about trying to manipulate the weather and what a really bad idea that typically is. (For a classically kitschy example, also see the '60s James Coburn spy spoof "Our Man Flint.") Recent real-life examples of nature's cataclysms have made the picture somewhat more timely than initially expected, but at its base, it's still principally a tribute to long-standing movie tropes.

From a technical standpoint, "Geostorm" is in the right hands, since director and co-writer Dean Devlin is a veteran of such movies as "Stargate" and "Independence Day." Its problems really come when it tries to reach beyond its genre and make big statements. As long as it's just doing its essential job of wreaking havoc on our planet, the forecast for "Geostorm" is fine.
