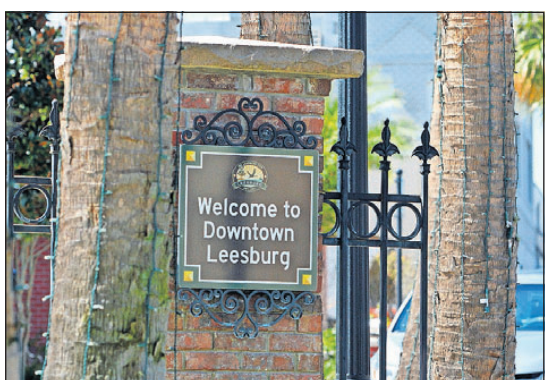

LEESBURG — “We need to stand on the rooftops and shout, ‘This is Leesburg,’” said Bob Bone. “We have so many positive

things here,” said the city commissioner who moved here from Fort Myers in 2004.

He is not the only one who feels that way, but the Leesburg Partnership may have found a more conventional way to spread the word.

Behind closed doors

Lake School Board increasingly resorts to closed meetings to do business

TAVARES — The Lake County School Board’s decision on Monday to hold a closed-door discussion on the issue of arming teachers in the wake of the South Florida school shooting two weeks ago, faced criticism by Florida open meetings experts.

It’s not the first time the board’s actions in regards to public access have come under fire in the last few months.

The latest issue came up when Bill Mathias, a board member, wanted the board to talk about arming teachers. The board could not implement the plan without a change to state law, so the board could discuss the issue but could not take action.

But the board closed the

More flooding expected from deadly nor’easter

BOSTON — People along the Northeast coast braced for more flooding during high tides Saturday even as the powerful storm that inundated roads, snapped trees and knocked out power to more than 2 million homes and businesses moved hundreds of miles out to sea.

Areas from Maryland to Maine remained under flood warnings. Officials in eastern Massachusetts, where dozens of people were rescued from high waters overnight, warned of another round of flooding during high tides expected around noon.

As Saturday’s midday high tide arrived, heavy surf crashed into the cliffs along Cape Cod Bay in Bourne,

Mostly male Oscar nominees reflect dearth of women

LOS ANGELES — Academy Awards voters made history this year when they nominated Rachel Morrison for the cinematography Oscar — the first woman so recognized in the organization’s 90 years. Greta Gerwig is also up for best director, only the fifth woman nominated in Oscar history. Yet in nearly every Oscar category, nominees are overwhelmingly male.

Three of the 24 awards have no female nominees at all.

Outside of acting, 77 percent of this year’s Oscar nominees are male, according to a recent study by the Women’s Media Center. And because the academy can only recognize films that have been released in theaters, the gender-based disparity among Oscar nominees reflects how vastly underrepresented women are in Hollywood.

The Oscar nominations are in line with actual employment statistics, said Women’s Media Center president Julie Burton. Citing the most recent Study of Women in Television & Film

produced annually out of San Diego State University, she said women were only three percent of composers and eight percent of supervising sound editors. No women are nominated for best score or visual effects this year. There is one woman, Mary H. Ellis, included among the 25 people nominated in the two sound categories.

“In Hollywood, on every level of decision-making, there are far more men calling the shots, making the deals, and hiring and firing, than there are women,

CINCINNATI Man convicted of indecent exposure for sixth time

An Ohio man has been convicted for at least the sixth time for publicly exposing himself.

The Cincinnati Enquirer reports a Hamilton County jury deliberated several hours Friday before convicting 50-year-old Gerald Fornshell of felony public indecency.

Prosecutors say the Lebanon man exposed himself last July to a 21-year-old woman at a Cincinnati Half Price Books store after spotting him earlier that day at a bookstore in Mason. The woman says she pities Fornshell but thinks there should be stricter laws for repeat offenders.

Fornshell's attorney says he has bipolar disorder. Fornshell told investigators he doesn't remember exposing himself.

MONTGOMERY, ALA. Moore seeks donations to legal defense fund

Former U.S. Senate candidate Roy Moore has issued a plea for money to pay legal bills, saying his "resources have been depleted."

In a Thursday post on his campaign's Facebook page, Moore asked for contributions to his legal defense fund. Moore has sent regular fundraising emails for the fund since losing the 2017 election to Sen. Doug Jones, a Democrat. However, the link to the donation site indicated that Moore had raised just \$32,000 of a \$250,000 goal.

Moore lost the election amid accusations that he pursued romantic and sexual relationships with teens as a man in his 30s. Moore denied accusations of sexual misconduct.

Va. pushing to expand DNA databank

RICHMOND, Va. — Before Jesse Matthew killed 18-year-old University of Virginia student Hannah Graham, authorities say he left a trail of DNA evidence linking him to a 2005 rape and the 2009 slaying of another female student.

That link could have been uncovered when Matthew was convicted of trespassing in 2010, but authorities didn't take a DNA sample. Virginia law didn't call for it.

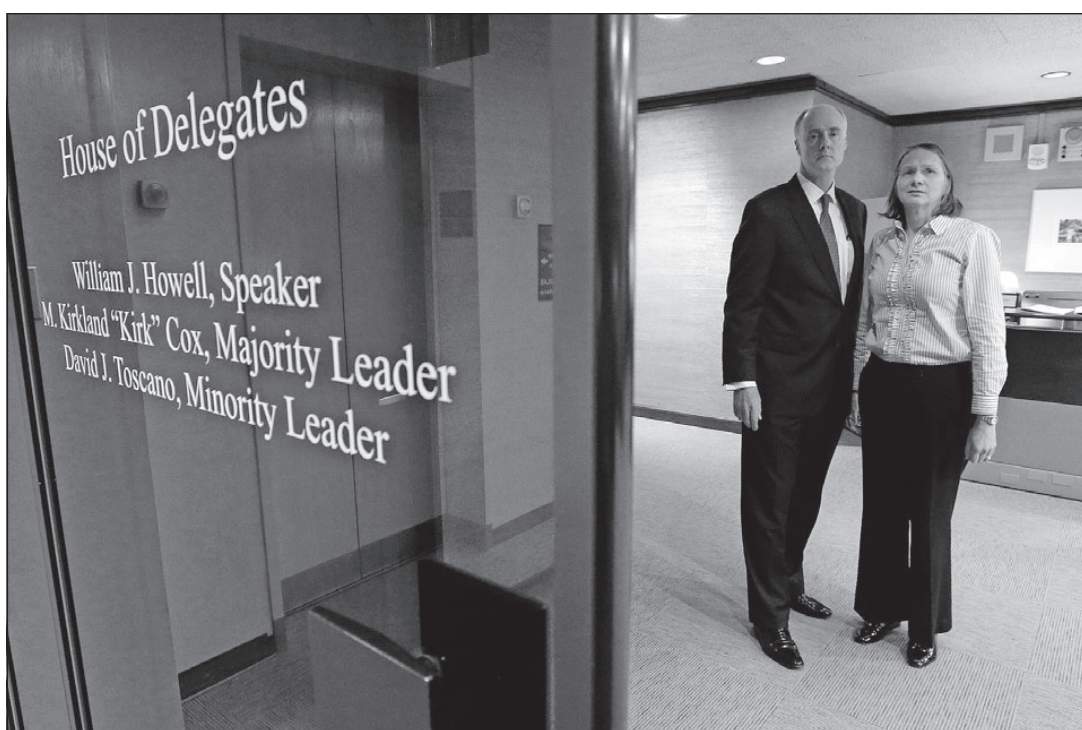
For Sue Graham, that's one of the most painful aspects of her daughter's slaying; knowing that her killer could have been locked up and unable to prey on her if only police had been able to take that DNA sample.

Graham and her husband, John, have been lobbying Virginia lawmakers to add trespassing and several other misdemeanors to the list of crimes that trigger mandatory DNA collection. It's part of a nationwide movement to expand DNA databanks by including misdemeanors ranging from shoplifting to trespassing to destruction of property. Currently, 42 states and the District of Columbia collect DNA for certain sexual misdemeanor convictions. At least 26 states, including Virginia, collect DNA for a limited number of non-sexual misdemeanors. Three states — New York, Wisconsin and Utah — collect DNA for large numbers of misdemeanors.

Had police swabbed the inside of Matthew's cheek after his trespassing conviction, that DNA sample could have connected him to the 2009 slaying of 20-year-old Virginia Tech student Morgan Harrington. Her case remained a mystery for years, until Matthew was charged with killing Graham. Matthew pleaded guilty to the two slayings in 2016.

"He was flying under the radar. Had his DNA been tested in 2010, he would have been convicted of those offenses, and I have no doubt Hannah would be alive today," Sue Graham said. "It's a hard thing to have to acknowledge."

Proponents of increasing the number of crimes requiring

DNA samples say it's simple logic: more samples mean more likely "hits" — matches of DNA left at crime scenes to samples in a databank — and more crimes solved or prevented.

But opponents say making DNA samples mandatory for crimes as minor as shoplifting or trespassing is going too far.

"We have the highest degree of sympathy for anyone who's lost a loved one through a violent crime, but subjecting hundreds of thousands of people to law enforcement scrutiny who haven't committed that kind of offense and never will is a problem," said Bill Farrar, a spokesman for the American Civil Liberties Union of Virginia.

In 1989, Virginia became the first state in the nation to require certain offenders to give DNA samples for a databank. The state has added offenses, and the number of samples in the databank had grown to about 441,500 by the end of June 2017.

Virginia law already requires DNA collection upon conviction for 14 misdemeanors, most related to sexual offenses. Two pending bills would add up to seven more, including: assault and battery; assault and battery against a family or household member; trespassing; concealing

merchandise; destruction of property; obstruction of justice; and the theft of property valued at less than \$200.

In New York, authorities began collecting DNA in 1996, initially only from people convicted of homicide and some sex offenses. In 2012, the state created an "all crimes" databank, requiring DNA samples from anyone convicted of all felonies and more than 200 misdemeanors.

DNA samples taken because of the expansion have produced nearly 1,800 investigative leads. Of those, 95 were linked to homicides, according to the New York Division of Criminal Justice Services. Spokeswoman Janine Kava said the agency does not track how many of those leads resulted in arrests or convictions.

Richard Aborn, president of the Citizens Crime Commission of New York City, said the expanded databank has benefited crime victims and defendants.

"DNA helps exonerate the innocent, holds offenders accountable, prevents future crimes, provides justice for survivors, and helps solve crimes — especially cold cases that have been unresolved for decades," Aborn said.

Since Virginia began adding misdemeanors to its databank

in 2012, there had been 26 hits as a result of misdemeanor conviction samples, as of November 2017. The first hit in 2016 was linked to a sex offense case from 1997. Most of the hits have helped solve burglary and larceny convictions.

Del. David Toscano, chief sponsor of a bill that would add three new misdemeanors to Virginia's databank, said Hannah Graham's murder has been a driving factor.

"DNA has proven to be a very powerful tool to help people who might have been unjustly convicted. In the aftermath of the Hannah Graham case, you realize that the power of DNA can also help convict people who are guilty before they commit a subsequent offense," Toscano said.

But the ACLU says collecting DNA for minor crimes is an invasion of privacy.

"What is the right of the government to keep your personal information? ... It's unconstitutional," Ferrar said.

Sue Graham said she believes adding a handful of misdemeanors will be minimally intrusive and is a small inconvenience compared to the potential benefits.

"If things can be changed to help other young women in the future, then we believe that that should be done," she said.

NAPLES Python devours deer that weighs nearly 4 lbs. more

NAPLES — Researchers studying invasive Burmese pythons in Florida came upon something they'd never seen before: an 11-foot-long python had consumed an entire deer that weighed more than the snake itself.

The wildlife biologists tracking the slithery creatures stumbled upon bloated snake in Collier Seminole State Park, and when they moved the creature it began regurgitating a white-tailed deer fawn.

Biologist Ian Bartoszek told the Naples Daily News that the fawn weighed 35 pounds; the snake 31.5.

"We were sitting there just trying to process that an animal this size could get its head around what turned out to be a deer," Bartoszek said. "It's surreal to see that in the field."

Senate rejects assault weapons ban

TALLAHASSEE — The Republican-led Florida Senate turned back efforts Saturday by Democrats to shift the focus of the Legislature's response to the Parkland massacre toward a statewide ban on assault-style weapons.

Meeting into the night in a rare Saturday session, the Senate rejected dozens of Democratic amendments to a school security and mental health package that also imposes some limits on gun purchases.

The proposal positioned

for a Monday vote doesn't touch the availability of such military-grade weapons as the AR-15 rifle used in the Valentine's Day slaughter of 17 students and teachers at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School.

That outraged Democrats. "The root common denominator of all mass killing is the instrument used," said Sen. Gary Farmer, D-Fort Lauderdale, adding that, "These are just military-style, killing machines."

Senate Republicans, though, fought back.

"It's not the weapon. It's the evil from within," said Sen.

Kelli Stargel, R-Lakeland.

During hours of often-emotional debate, senators poured over the measure that lawmakers are scrambling to finalize before Friday's scheduled end of the 2018 session. The House is set to take up the legislation after the Senate votes.

The bill (SB 7026) provides at least \$400 million to expand mental health services, "harden" schools by adding 2,000 resource officers and a controversial, new "marshal" program that allows specially trained teachers and staff to carry weapons.

The legislation also raises the age to 21 for buying a gun

and adds a three-day waiting period for all gun purchases, a standard that currently applies only to handguns.

The National Rifle Association opposes raising the age limits.

Gov. Rick Scott has spoken out against the school marshal program, along with the Legislature's black caucus, whose members warn it could pose a heightened threat to minority students.

Democratic senators Saturday pointed out that eliminating schools as gun-free zones is a provision

Senate backs changes in payday loans, workers' comp

TALLAHASSEE

— Meeting in a rare Saturday session, the Florida Senate approved revamping regulations for payday loans and supported expanding workers' compensation insurance benefits for police and firefighters who suffer from post-traumatic stress disorder.

Senators voted 31-5 to pass a measure (SB 920) that would allow payday lenders to make larger loans for longer periods of time. The industry-backed proposal also has sailed through House committees, though it has drawn opposition from some consumer advocates.

The bill would allow the businesses to make "installment" loans up to \$1,000, with repayment over 60 to 90 days. Current law limits the high-interest loans to \$500 for periods of seven to 31 days.

Supporters say the proposal was prompted by potential changes in federal regulations that could affect the

types of smaller-dollar, shorter-term loans made by payday lenders in Florida. Also, supporters contend that payday loans play a key role for many low-income people who don't have access to other types of credit.

During brief comments on the Senate floor Saturday, sponsor Rob Bradley, R-Fleming Island, alluded to those issues, saying the bill would ensure the "short-term credit market" would survive amid the potential federal changes.

But some consumer and religious groups have fought the proposal, arguing that payday loans can put borrowers in a "debt trap."

"We have seen members of our congregations and those in the communities around them fall victim to the debt trap that this type of loan creates," Rachel Gunter Shapard, of the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship of Florida, said in a statement this week.

The bill was opposed Saturday by Sen. Daphne Campbell, D-Miami; Sen.

Anitere Flores, R-Miami; Sen. Rene Garcia, R-Hialeah; Sen. Jose Javier Rodriguez, D-Miami; and Sen. Annette Taddeo, D-Miami. The issue now goes to the House, with the 60-day legislative session scheduled to end Friday.

Senators met Saturday primarily to take up a school-safety package stemming from the Feb. 14 mass shooting that killed 17 people at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School in Broward County.

Along with the payday-loan legislation, senators also voted on several other bills. Among them was a measure (SB 376) that would expand workers' compensation benefits for first responders who suffer from post-traumatic stress disorder.

The bill, sponsored by Sen. Lauren Book, D-Plantation, was approved 33-0. The House on Friday also took up its version (HB 227) and is poised to give approval.

Under state workers' compensation laws, injured workers generally

cannot receive benefits for mental or nervous injuries unless accompanied by physical injuries, according to a Senate staff analysis.

First responders, however, may receive benefits for medical treatment of mental or nervous injuries without accompanying physical injuries. But they may not receive benefits for lost wages in such situations.

The bill would allow law-enforcement officers, firefighters, emergency medical technicians and paramedics to receive benefits for lost wages under certain circumstances if they suffer from PTSD.

State Chief Financial Officer Jimmy Patronis, whose role includes serving as state fire marshal, issued a statement Saturday noting testimony about first responders who have suffered from PTSD.

"Today, we approach the finish line and are one step closer to ensuring first responders get access to the mental health benefits they deserve," Patronis said.

Dockless bikes increase access, sometimes chaos

DALLAS — Shared bikes that can be left wherever the rider ends up are helping more people get access to the mode of transportation that reduces car traffic and increases exercise. But they are also producing some chaos — discarded bikes cluttering public spaces, blocking sidewalks and even placed in trees and lakes.

Over the last year, startup companies have brought the bikes that don't require docking stations into city after city in the U.S. The bikes that can be unlocked with an app can bring bike sharing to cities like Dallas that didn't previously have a system and in cities with established systems, they

can get bikes into areas that don't have docking stations.

"There's a lot more flexibility with this model but then that's kind of the con also: you can put it anywhere, but then you can leave it anywhere and then how do you control that," said Jared White, a Dallas Transportation Department manager, adding: "The execution may need some refining."

Most shared bike systems use docking stations and are the result of some kind of public-private partnership. With dockless bike sharing, which was first seen in China but is now global, companies including San Mateo, California-based LimeBike, Beijing-based Ofo and San Francisco-based Spin simply bring their bikes to

town.

This has allowed some cities that hadn't been able to fund their own program to get bike sharing started, said Dana Yanocha, a senior research associate at the nonprofit Institute for Transportation & Development Policy. White said attempts to get a dock-based bike sharing program in Dallas had stalled because of funding: A program would have been a \$6 million investment until it got stable.

Dallas, which has allowed companies to bring as many bikes to town as they see fit, has seen a flood of 18,000 to 20,000 dockless bikes since the summer. Washington, D.C., which already had an established docked bike share program called

Capital Bikeshare, started allowing five dockless companies in September to each bring in up to 400 bikes. After Seattle's docked bike share program went out of operation in April, city officials allowed three dockless companies to operate beginning in July, with each allowed up to 4,000 bikes.

Ofo spokesman Taylor Bennett said that the more people become familiar with the concept, the more they'll "recognize and feel comfortable with the bikes being ubiquitous." Since Ofo was founded in 2014, it has expanded to more than 21 countries in more than 250 cities. The company, which offers rides for \$1 an hour, entered the U.S. market in August.

supported by the NRA.

"I don't think our response to the Parkland shooting should be a bill that includes part of the NRA's wish list," said Sen. Jose Javier Rodriguez, D-Miami.

But Sen. Wilton Simpson, R-Trilby, said having someone in a school with a weapon during a shooting could be vital.

"It takes three to five minutes to do that damage, and it takes five to seven minutes for law enforcement to get there," Simpson said.

He added, "The only thing that's going to stop a slaughter in that moment, is to have a person with a firearm in that room."

Sen. Dennis Baxley, R-Ocala, added, "If you don't do something within the first five minutes, you won't stop a killing."

But the school marshal program barely overcame the effort to eliminate it, led by Miami Sen. Oscar Braynon, the Democratic leader. Braynon's amendment was defeated, 20-18.

Most proposed changes to the bill by Democrats were defeated on party-line votes.

But at one point, the Senate accepted on a voice vote an amendment that would have imposed a two-year moratorium on the sale of AR-15s, a potentially stunning change that likely would have derailed the legislation in the more

conservative House.

But when senators were forced to cast a vote on the Senate board, the moratorium failed, 21-17.

Amid Saturday's long debate, senators also paused for a moment of silence at 3 p.m., as requested statewide by Scott. Saturday marked the 17th day since the 17 people were slain at the Broward County high school, a massacre that has spawned unprecedented attention on weapons and school safety at the state Capitol.

Many students who survived the shooting have come to Tallahassee calling for stricter gun limits, while the parents of some victims also have joined in urging lawmakers not to arm teachers.

Thousands of gun-control demonstrators also have come to the Capitol since the shooting.

In debate Saturday, Democrats said lawmakers should support the view of many Parkland families. Among the failed amendments were limits on high-capacity ammunition clips, creation of a gun registry, a ban on military-style weapons near schools, and giving local governments authority to enact new gun restrictions.

According to court records, the woman said that Broughton drove to Apalachicola National Forest during a ride-along, grabbed his baton and asked her to expose her breasts. She said she feared he would hit her, so complied.

Broughton's attorney Scott Maddox advised him not to answer any questions, and he turned himself in.

New headaches for Mideast hopes

Turmoil surrounds Trump, Netanyahu ahead of meeting this week in Washington

WASHINGTON — Under the best of circumstances, a Mideast peace deal is the Holy Grail of diplomacy, a goal that has eluded American presidents for generations.

With Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu set to visit Washington this coming week, the mix of politics, personalities and historical grievances that has stood in the way of Israeli-Palestinian peace is even more combustible than normal.

President Donald

Trump's point man for mediation, Jared Kushner, is in the middle of a political firestorm, his plan remains a mystery and the Palestinians aren't even speaking to the White House. If that weren't enough, Netanyahu and Trump are both distracted by mushrooming legal investigations at home.

It's all contributing to an intensified pessimism in the U.S., Israel and the West Bank about prospects for a Trump-brokered initiative to succeed.

Kushner and a small team have spent the past year preparing a much-awaited blueprint for peace, but no details have emerged. Many in the region wonder whether the vaunted plan will ever come.

Papers: Access to resources fueled monument reviews

Access to fossil fuels and other natural resources played an early role in a Trump administration review that resulted in size reductions at two Utah national monuments, according to internal documents released following a public records lawsuit.

Interior Department officials focused on how much oil and gas, coal, grazing lands and timber had been placed off-limits when the monuments were created, the documents show.

President Donald Trump in December ordered drastic reductions to Bears Ears and Grand Staircase-Escalante National Monuments

following a months-long review.

He said they were part of a "massive federal land grab" by previous administrations and that local authority needed to be restored. Those comments stand in contrast to internal administration deliberations and correspondence with Congress emphasizing the monuments' economic potential. The documents were released after The New York Times sued the agency with the assistance of Yale University Law School, the paper reported Friday.

One memo asked Interior staff to prepare a report on each national monument and examine "annual production of coal, oil, gas and

renewables (if any) on site; amount of energy transmission infrastructure on site (if any)." It was followed by a reminder to staff to look at how the decision to create new monuments in Utah might have hurt area mines.

Other documents detailed interest among administration officials in gaining access to more than 11 billion tons of coal reserves within the Grand Staircase-Escalante National Monument.

Agency spokeswoman Heather Swift said Interior Secretary Ryan Zinke considered the viewpoints of "members of Congress, governors, state and tribal leaders, and the public" before recommending reductions at the Utah monuments.

Tariff talk provokes urgency

GOP scrambles into action after president announces steep charges on steel and aluminum imports

WASHINGTON — Republicans in Congress have learned to ignore President Donald Trump's policy whims, knowing whatever he says one day on guns, immigration or other complicated issues could very well change by the next.

But Trump's decision to seek steep tariffs on steel and aluminum imports has provoked rarely seen urgency among Republicans, now scrambling to convince the president that he would spark a trade war that could stall the economy's recent gains if he doesn't reverse course.

The issue pits Trump's populist promises to his voters against the party's free trade orthodoxy and the interests of business leaders. Unlike recent immigration and gun policy changes that require legislation, Trump can alter trade policy by executive action. That intensifies the pressure on Republican lawmakers to change his mind before he gives his final approval for the penalties as early as this coming week.

Trump on Saturday showed no sign of backing

away, threatening on Twitter to impose a tax on cars made in Europe if the European Union responds to the tariffs by taxing American goods. He also railed about "very stupid" trade deals by earlier administrations and said

other countries "laugh at what fools our leaders have been. No more!"

House Speaker Paul Ryan, R-Wis., called Trump after the president's surprise announcement, and continues to hope the White House will reconsider the decision. Sen. Ben Sasse, R-Neb., and others have offered the president their own private counsel. Some are appealing to his desire for a robust stock market and warning that the trade penalties could unravel some of the gains they attribute to the tax bill he signed last year.

Rep. Kevin Brady, R-Texas, chairman of the tax-writing House Ways and Means Committee, tried one of the most direct lines that lawmakers have to the White House: talking to Trump through cable TV news.

"The president has not yet issued these tariffs," Brady told Fox News on Thursday, hours after Trump announced the tariff targets. "He's been continuing to listen."

Listening to various viewpoints, though, has never been the gripe against Trump.

Unlike President Barack Obama, who often irked lawmakers for lecturing them during meetings, Trump retains a level of popularity among Capitol Hill Republicans in part because he's more than happy to invite lawmakers in and hear them out.

But problems have arisen when members of the legislative branch leave the White House under the impression Trump was on their side — or at least willing to consider their views — only to find out later that his support drifted away.

The dynamic played

out repeatedly during last year's health care debate over replacing the Affordable Care Act. This past week, Trump publicly belittled a modest gun background check bill from the second-ranking GOP Senate leader, John Cornyn of Texas, during a televised White House meeting. Democrats appeared giddy with the president's praise of gun control proposals, while Republicans fumed.

"I love the president, but people disagree sometimes," said Sen. John Kennedy, R-La.

True to form, Trump's flirtations with gun control showed signs of subsiding by week's end. A day after his meeting with lawmakers, the president tweeted that he had a "Good (Great!) meeting" in the Oval Office with the National Rifle Association. The gun lobby's executive director also tweeted afterward that Trump and Vice President Mike Pence "don't want gun control."

It's unclear what gun control measures, if any, Trump may endorse. But his back-and-forth on the matter was reminiscent of his waffling on immigration this year.

Earlier this year, with a government shutdown looming, Trump welcomed lawmakers for a meeting at the White House to discuss immigration law changes. During the televised session, he told them he would take the political "heat" and sign into law whatever Congress could agree to pass.

Two days later, Sens. Lindsey Graham, R-S.C., and Dick Durbin, D-Ill., dashed to the White House to present their bipartisan agreement. But the session ended in heated exchanges after Trump rejected the bill and used crude language to question why the U.S. would want to welcome immigrants from Africa and some other nations.

"Let's talk about two Trumps — the Tuesday Trump and the Thursday Trump," Graham said later during a Senate Judiciary Committee hearing. "Tuesday we had a president that I was proud to golf with, call my friend."

"I don't know where that guy went. I want him back," Graham said. Republicans, who hold a majority in the House and Senate, have largely learned to take these setbacks in stride. They all but shrug off the president's policy pivots, just as Ryan and Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell, R-Ky., often decline to comment on the Trump tweet of the day.

But on trade tariffs, Republicans say the stakes are too high for them to sit back and wait for Trump to change his mind. Indeed, their relentless public condemnation of the tariffs was notably sharper than their typical handling of the president's policy whims.

Not wise, said Sen. Orrin Hatch, R-Utah. A "big mistake," said Sen. Pat Toomey, R-Penn. "Kooky," said Sasse.

Trump, after the White House's own internal deliberations, proposed a 25 percent tariff on imported steel and 10 percent on aluminum. That quickly sparked global warnings of retaliation and left the financial markets reeling.

Republican lawmakers, and some outside groups, want Trump to at least consider a more targeted approach, or exemptions for countries that engage in what they view as fair trade practices.

"We're all urging the president, look, continue to narrow this to these unfairly targeted products," Brady said.

Global security measures vary

School security around the world does not involve arming teachers

The United States is in the midst of a national debate over school security after the mass shooting at a Florida school.

To President Donald Trump and some gun supporters, the solution is to put more guns in the hands of trained school staff — including teachers — to “play defense” against a rampaging gunman.

The rest of the world has different strategies to deal with violence around schools. But the U.S. appears to be the only place in the world where some want to arm teachers to the degree the president wants.

Rather, emergency drills, armed guards patrolling school campuses and intruder drills seem to be more of the norm.

Here is a look at school security measures at some countries around the world.

Israel

Education Ministry spokesman Amos Shavit said “the vast majority of schools have armed security guards” and those that don’t are supposed to have heavy locks and security systems.

Visitors to the school are questioned by the guard, who checks their bags and sometimes uses a hand-held metal detector. Entry is strictly forbidden to anyone without authorization, Shavit said.

That’s augmented by municipal security units that work in conjunction with police. “If there is an incident at a school they will be there in a minute or less,” Shavit said.

He said the small number

of teachers who have a legal gun license and usually carry a weapon can do so as well in school, but that this is not policy or encouraged. “Teachers here aren’t supposed to be carrying weapons in classrooms, teachers are supposed to teach,” he said.

Russia

Violent incidents have been rare in Russian schools, but two attacks last month attracted nationwide attention and drew comparisons to the school violence in the U.S.

In one, a teenager armed with an ax attacked fellow students at a school in southern Siberia, wounding five children and a teacher. In another attack in the Urals city of Perm, two teenagers stabbed children and their teacher with knives, wounding 15 people. They then attempted to kill each other, but were detained.

The incidents highlighted lax security in schools, triggering calls for stronger protection.

Now, there are security guards at Russian schools.

France

In the wake of deadly

terror attacks in Paris and Nice, France introduced new security guidelines at schools when children went back to classes in September 2016.

The measures, which remain in place, include a tighter screening of people entering schools, which can include bag checks, and improved coordination with police.

Police officers patrol in school areas, while parents and students are requested to avoid gathering near schools and report any suspicious behavior or object. French schools also hold three security drills a year, including one in which an alleged assailant enters their premises. Students are taught how to hide or to escape.

All students aged 13 to 14 and class representatives also get basic training on life-saving measures. In pre-school and kindergarten, for toddlers aged 2 to 6, children are taught to hide and keep quiet through games.

Japan

Attacks on schools are rare in Japan, where there have been a handful of knifings, but guns are practically non-existent.

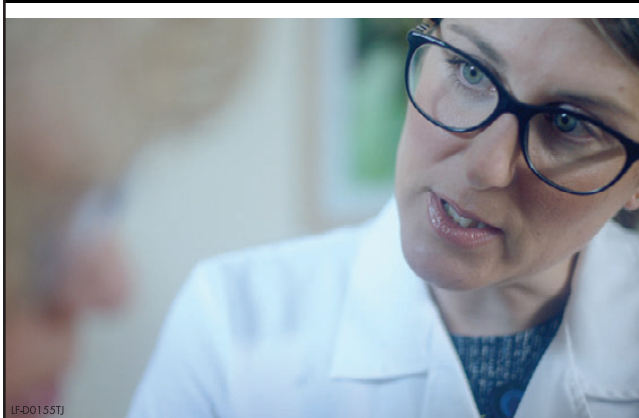

Police: Gun belonged to suspect's dad

A 19-year-old student suspected of fatally shooting his parents at a Central Michigan University dormitory had been acting so strangely the day before the killings that campus police talked to his mother and then took him to a hospital for suspected drug abuse, authorities said Saturday.

University police Chief Bill Yeagley told reporters that James Eric Davis Jr.'s parents had just picked him up from that hospital and brought him to his dorm to pack up for spring break when Friday's shooting happened. He said the gun used in the shooting belonged to Davis' father, James Davis Sr., a part-time police officer in the Chicago suburb of Bellwood.

Yeagley would not say whether the father had brought the gun to the university's campus in Mount Pleasant, Michigan, when picking up his son, but he noted that Davis Jr. can be seen on video in the dorm's parking lot with the gun before he entered the residence hall where his parents were shot around 8:30 a.m.

"We can make a lot of assumptions, but I'm

not going to make those assumptions. But I can tell you for sure that the gun came from outside, in the parking lot, with (Davis Jr.) through the building," Yeagley said.

Davis Jr. has been charged with two counts of murder and a weapons charge in the shootings, university spokeswoman Heather Smith said Saturday.

He remained under guard Saturday at a hospital where he was taken following his arrest, but will be moved to the Isabella County jail when he's discharged, Yeagley said.

Yeagley declined to say whether drugs were found in Davis Jr.'s system. He also would not say what type of gun was used or

whether it was Davis Sr.'s service revolver. But he did say that it would have been a violation of campus policy for Davis Sr. to bring a gun on campus because only law enforcement on active duty or those with special permission can do so.

Davis Jr. was arrested without incident shortly after midnight following an intensive daylong search that included more than 100 police officers, some heavily armed in camouflage uniforms, authorities said. Authorities found him after someone aboard a train spotted a person along railroad tracks in Mount Pleasant, and called police, Yeagley said.

Yeagley said Davis Jr. was under guard at a

hospital Saturday and would be moved to the Isabella County jail when he's discharged.

Mount Pleasant is about a 285-mile drive from the family's hometown of Plainfield, Illinois. The shooting occurred on a day when parents were arriving to pick up students at the university for the beginning of a week-long spring break.

Yeagley said witness statements and video indicate that at the time they were shot, Davis Jr.'s parents were in his fourth-floor dorm at the campus' Campbell Hall "simply packing up for spring break."

He said police had first come into contact with Davis Jr. on Thursday morning when he came running into a community police officer's office in his dorm "very frightened" and "not making a lot of sense."

"He said someone was out to hurt him, someone was going to harm him, and the officer calmed him down and tried to gain more information about what was going on. ... Mr. Davis was very vague and he kept talking about someone having a gun," Yeagley said, adding that Davis Jr. said he had not actually seen the person with a gun.

Massachusetts, drawing dozens of onlookers to watch churning brown waves take big bites out of the eroding coastline.

"We've been here a long time and we've never seen it as bad as this," said Alex Barmashi, who lives in the hard-hit village of Sagamore Beach.

Up the coast in Scituate, Massachusetts, Becky Smith watched as ocean waters started to fill up a nearby marina's parking lot from her vantage point at the Barker Tavern, a restaurant overlooking the harbor.

"It looks like a war zone," she said, describing the scene in the coastal town near Boston where powerful waves dumped sand and rubble on roads and winds uprooted massive trees. "It's a lot of debris, big rocks and pieces of wood littering the streets."

Residents in other coastal areas, meanwhile, bailed out basements and surveyed the damage while waiting for power to be restored, a process that power companies warned could take days in parts. More than 2 million homes and businesses remained without power Saturday.

"The rest of today will be clean up," said Miles Grant, after he secured a generator to run a pump to remove standing water from his basement in Marion, Massachusetts. "Usually when you think of bad weather in New England, you think of snow. But it's been all wind and coastal flooding."

Authorities on Saturday reported two more deaths from the storm, bringing the total to at least seven in the Northeast. A 25-year-old man in Connecticut and a 57-year-old Pennsylvania man were killed when trees fell on their cars Friday.

The other five people killed included two children. A man and a 6-year-old boy were killed in different parts of Virginia, while an 11-year-old boy in New York state and a man in Rhode Island, both died. A 77-year-old woman died after being struck by a branch outside her home near Baltimore.

The National Weather Service expected wind gusts of up to 40 mph (64 kph) in coastal areas Saturday, down from Friday's hurricane-force gusts.

"The primary remaining hazard is all the floodwater including the effects of the high tide with the continued onshore flow of the wind," said Patrick Burke, a meteorologist with the National Weather Service Weather Prediction Center in Maryland. "The damaging winds we saw yesterday have calmed down just a bit. But it's still going to be a windy day."

Burke said the main part of the storm was about 350 miles (560 kilometers) southeast of Cape Cod on Saturday morning. With the storm so far away, the lingering hazards showed how powerful and massive it is, he said. The storm swept in Friday and prompted more than 2,800 flight cancellations, mostly in the Northeast. LaGuardia and Kennedy airports in New York City were brought to a near standstill. By Saturday afternoon, airports from Washington, D.C. to Boston were still reporting dozens of delays and cancellations.

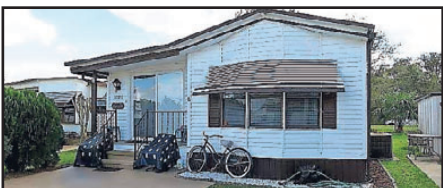

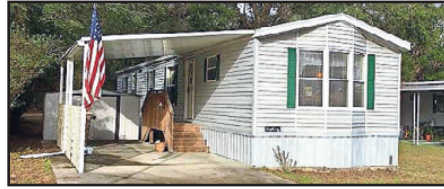

and this power imbalance is reflected in the employment and nomination gender gap," Burton said. "Women cannot get through the door, and if they can't get through the door, they can't be recognized and rewarded for their excellence and impact."

And because who makes movies influences what's in them, the dearth of women in all areas of filmmaking means "male voices and

perspectives are largely responsible for what we see on screen," she added.

Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences chief Dawn Hudson said the academy, which bestows the Oscars, has actively sought to diversify its membership in recent years. It has pledged to double the number of women and people of color in its ranks by 2020, and she noted, the number of women on its board has more than tripled since 2011.

"We look to the rest of the film community to follow suit," she said.

"Boys Don't Cry"

director Kimberly Peirce, who has long been active with the academy and the directors' guild, said there have been concerted efforts within both organizations to open doors to more women.

"When there is a culture of men doing something, they do tend to bring more men in. Like likes like," she said. "That's why it's so important to me to hire people of color, hire women, because those people are going to get experience and they're going to work, and they're going to hire people like them. But also they're going to hire the best people."

discussion, explaining it was a wide-ranging meeting that included steps they are taking to improve school security.

"(W)e did conduct a meeting in the shade. Specifically in the shade because it would make us more vulnerable if the public knew what our security measures currently are," said Stephanie Luke, board chairwoman.

Luke said the discussion included safety recommendations proposed by Florida Gov. Rick Scott and the idea of arming teachers.

While a discussion of actual security plans can happen behind closed doors, a discussion of hypothetical plans should not, in the opinion of two Florida authorities on the subject

"There is a narrow exemption in Florida's open-meetings law for disclosure of security system plans, but that is understood to literally mean a 'plan' like where the security detail will be stationed when the president visits or where the backup power supply is located in the event of a terrorist bombing, not just general policies and attitudes toward security," said Frank D. LoMonte, director of the University of Florida's Brechner Center for Freedom of Information.

Barbara Petersen, president of Florida's First Amendment Foundation, agrees.

"The question is does the discussion of arming teachers fit within the definition of the exemption in the law? I don't see how it does," she said. "Once they have the authority to arm school teachers and they come up with a plan and they want to amend that plan, then maybe but right now, no."

LoMonte agrees that even the discussion of the district's security policies may not fall under the exemption.

"I do not think that schools have any clandestine security plans that aren't publicly known or knowable — it's not like undercover officers are roaming the hallways in disguise — so it would be hard to justify closing a meeting to talk about 'what-ifs' in the event that the Legislature changes the law," he said.

Both felt the emotions and polarizing nature of the idea of arming teachers likely was a factor in closing the discussion. More than 100 people with strong opinions on the issue showed up for the meeting to make their voices heard.

"They just didn't want to go on the record and that in and of itself doesn't give them the authority to close doors," Petersen said.

LoMonte said the public deserves to know the stance of those they elected.

"As a matter of good policy, it seems like the arming of school employees is one of the most important issues facing school districts today, and the public has a legitimate interest in knowing where

their elected school board members come down on that issue," LoMonte said.

Petersen said closing the discussions cheated the public from having the full picture.

"You're allowing the public a right to speak, but it's uninformed speech," she said. "As a parent, as a teacher, as a student, I want to know what my school board is doing. If my school board is talking about it, I want to know what they are saying. In my opinion, this is an issue of grave public concern and they should be holding those discussions in public."

The closed meeting issue follows two other moves by the board which drew jeers from several open government experts.

In January, the board decided to implement an employee hotline to report fraud and other issues. The board was uncomfortable that unfounded, anonymous complaints would go into employees' files as required by public records law. At the school board attorney's suggestion, the board agreed to instead have a master file for all unfounded, anonymous complaints. Experts panned the idea as a way to skirt the law.

In December, the board attorney assured members their private, individual meetings with top district staff days before regularly scheduled public meetings were legal and above board. The closed-door sessions purportedly made it easier for board members to ask questions about the issues on the agenda. The meetings fell on Thursday's in quick succession of one another. Petersen questioned the legality of those meetings at that time.

Superintendent Diane Kornegay said she would

continue to hold the private meetings.

The ongoing issues with the board are not uncommon to school boards around the state. School boards, in particular, are not populated by career politicians and rely on guidance from their attorneys to stay in compliance with the law, Petersen said.

"The whole point of these open government laws is to provide an opportunity for public oversight and accountability, and they don't seem to be embracing Sunshine. Either that or they don't understand it. I don't know which it is. Maybe it's both," she said.

Definition of 'security plans' in Florida Statutes, Chapter 119

1. As used in this paragraph, the term "security system plan" includes all:

- Records, information, photographs, audio and visual presentations, schematic diagrams, surveys, recommendations, or consultations or portions thereof relating directly to the physical security of the facility or revealing security systems
- Threat assessments conducted by any agency or any private entity
- Threat response plans
- Emergency evacuation plans
- Sheltering arrangements
- Manuals for security personnel, emergency equipment, or security training.

2. A security system plan or portion thereof for:

- Any property owned by or leased to the state or any of its political subdivisions; or
- Any privately owned or leased property

marketing and redevelopment company operates out of Delaware and South Carolina.

Bone, who did not attend the meeting, has been concerned about the perception people have about Leesburg.

There are two sets of people, Bone said. There are investors, like the new owners of the Lake Square Mall, and downtown merchants. "These are people making serious investments," he said, and they are confident Leesburg will grow and prosper.

Then, there are others, who have been here awhile. "I think people forget sometimes what they have."

It's like the family car, he said. You love it when it's new, but then it gets some dents and scratches, you stop taking care of it,

and you want to get rid of it. "Then, someone says, 'You've got a classic car there.'"

Bone said when he thinks about Leesburg he thinks about oak trees, lakes, parks, Beacon College, proximity to The Villages, and more.

Joanie Smalley, the Main Street manager for the Partnership, agrees.

"We can be a destination, like Mount Dora and Tavares, and we have things that they don't have," she said. "We have a rich history in Leesburg, there's so much we have, our natural parks are amazing."

The city government has been spending millions to improve Venetian Gardens, including building a new playground and splash pad, renovate Ski Beach, build a new community building and create attractive "gateways" on roads leading to the city.

Recently, however, Bone pointed out that

the city may be wasting its time if it doesn't put out the "fires" in the public schools. Poor performance is holding down property values and causing families to spend money on private school tuition instead of consumer items. It is off-putting to businesses that might want to come in. "We can't even get a Starbucks here," he said. Last year, Leesburg led the county in increased crime, with a 28 percent jump.

"These are things that can be addressed," he said.

The city needs to decide what is important and focus its resources on that, he said.

So far, the Partnership has spent no money on the idea of branding the city, but Joe Shipes, executive vice president of the Partnership, believes it is something the group may choose to do.

Smalley is sold. "I love this city," she said.

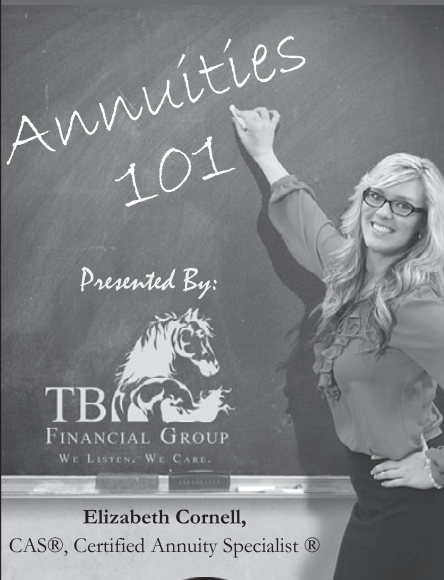

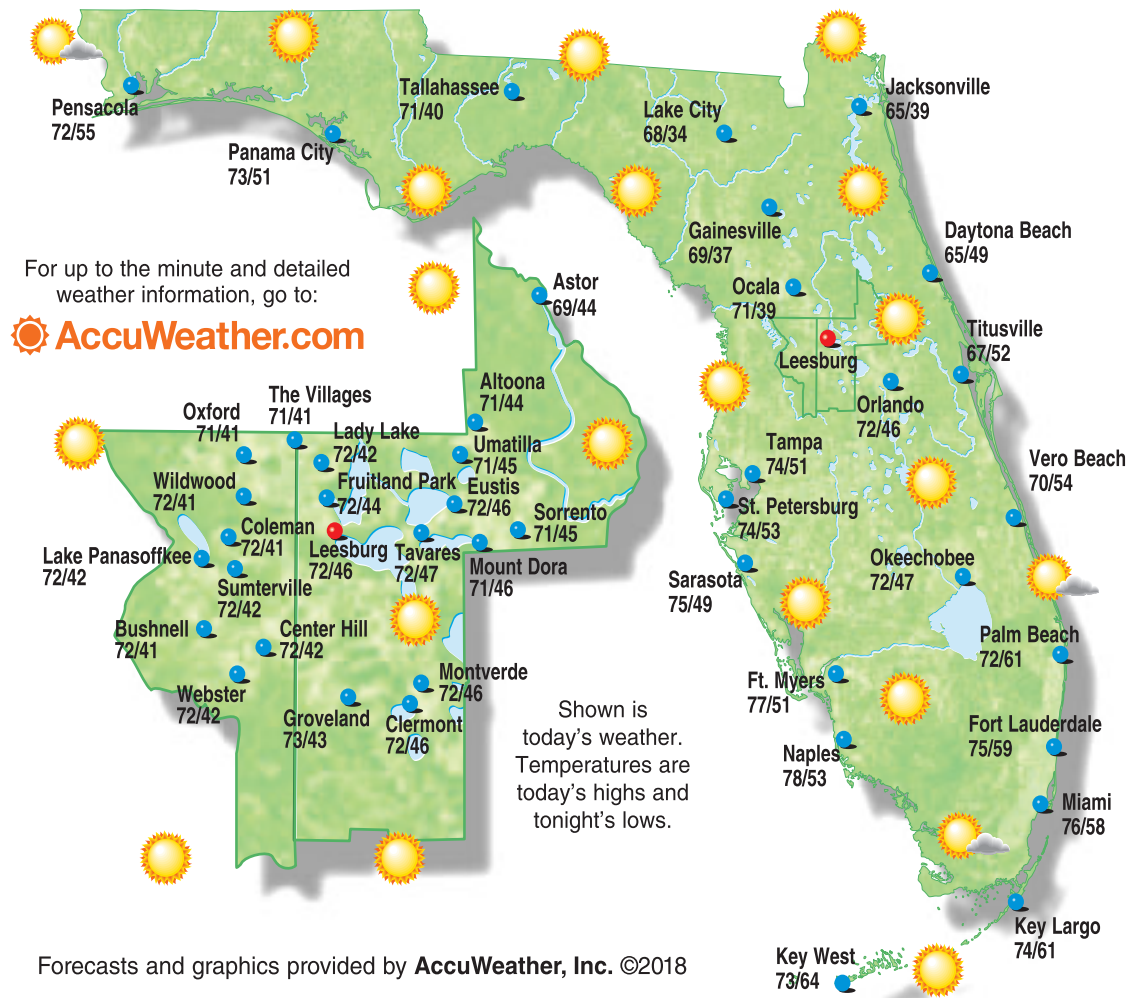

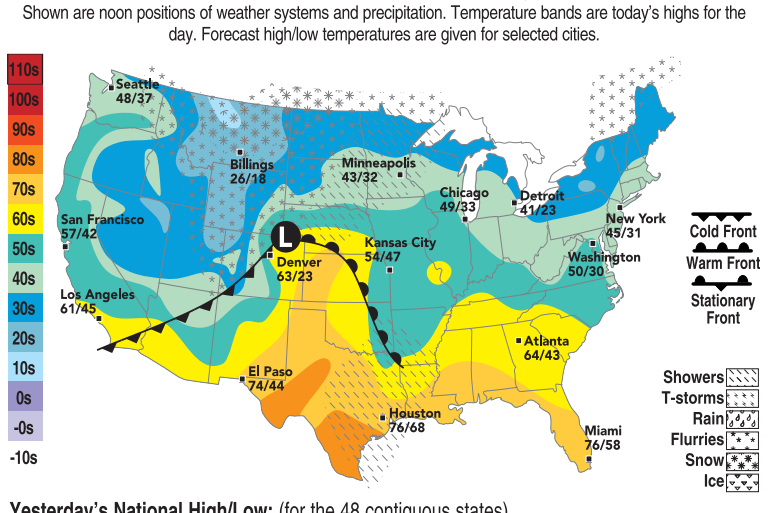

The growing secrecy of the School Board

In case you were wondering whether the Lake County's School Board's sudden affinity for conducting business behind closed doors is a fluke, they erased any doubt last week.

It isn't.

It's their new normal.

You may recall that in recent months, Superintendent Diane Kornegay has started holding regular closed-door meetings with individual School Board members to go over the board agendas days before the actual public meetings takes place. The practice apparently started to give each board member a chance to ask questions about items on the agenda before the public meeting.

Of course, nothing stops them from doing that in public.

You see, in the past, the board simply held public workshops to discuss issues that they would be voting on later. But like schoolchildren who are too timid to ask questions in class, apparently they weren't comfortable grappling with issues in full view of you and me, so they decided to hold individual meetings with the district administration where they could talk about these issues privately.

Whether this is legal is an open question, although some experts say it isn't. Florida's Sunshine Laws prohibit two or more board members from meeting privately and discussing official business because that's how secret deals get made. In this case, there is only one board member at a time in the room, so that makes it OK, right? Not necessarily.

The courts have ruled that board members can't use go-betweens to communicate either. So a staff member can't tell board member A what board member B is thinking.

Kornegay says that's not occurring in these meetings. But how do we know? Remember, these meetings are private. There is no transcript of what occurred or what was said. We just have to trust everyone involved that they are not violating the Sunshine Law. Sorry, but that's not how open, transparent government works.

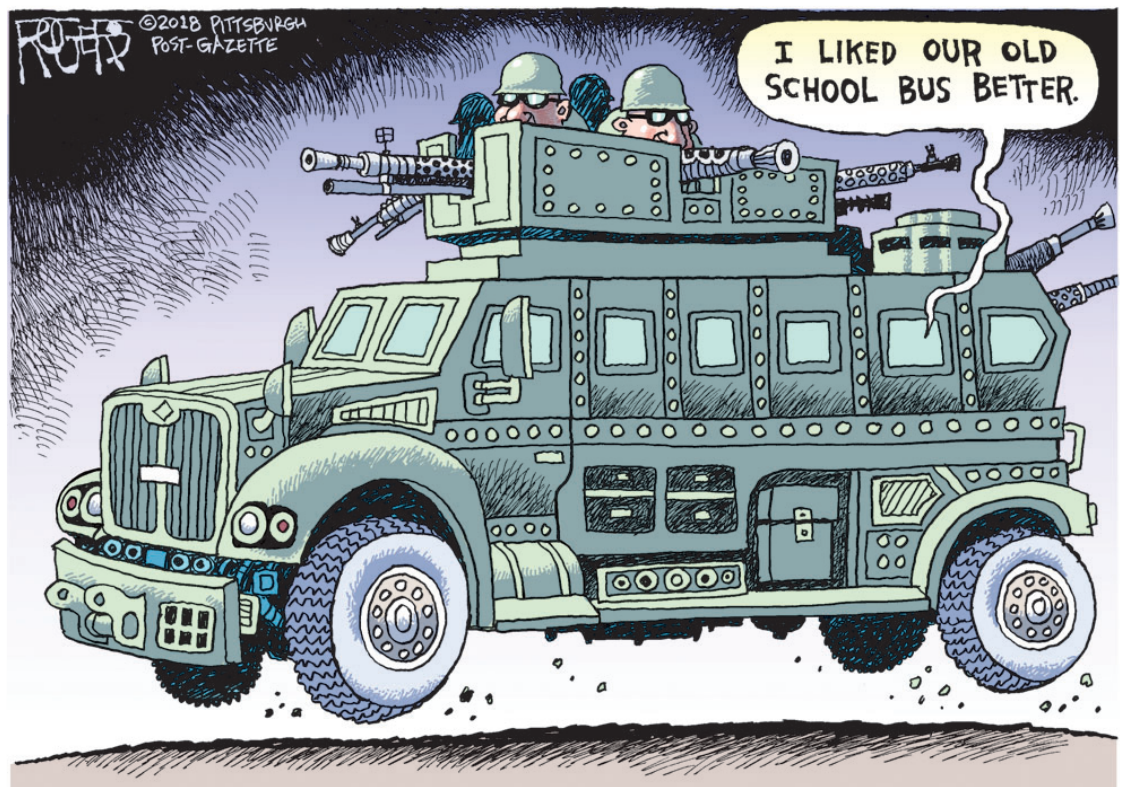
The editorial board of the Daily Commercial recently called for Kornegay and the board to quit this secrecy.

Instead, they doubled down.

On Monday, the board met to talk about whether to arm teachers in the wake of the massacre at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School in South Florida. What did they do? They went into executive session and talked about it outside

Our nation needs clarity on the Second Amendment

It was so refreshing to read the editorial "Put our elected leaders in the crosshairs" in a recent Daily Commercial, about holding local politicians accountable. In order to actually hold politicians accountable, the media members must have a complete understanding of the issues they are questioning politicians about. Otherwise, they will fall for the misconceptions politicians exploit to their advantage.

The Second Amendment suffers from a lack of understanding by the media members, general public and politicians, leaving it the National Rifle Association to define the amendment. The Second Amendment needs to be explained to the nation in an honest documentary by someone like Ken Burns, to dispel the NRA narrative of it.

In the two cases that the Supreme Court ruled on the Second Amendment, the first in 1939 in the U.S. v. Miller case, the court upheld a law that banned sawed off shotguns, machine guns, silencers and grenades. It also said Congress had the power to prohibit "dangerous and unusual weapons."

In 2008 the Supreme Court opinion in District of Columbia v.

Heller gave Americans the right to have a handgun in the home for self protection. Justice Anthony Scalia went out of his way to add in the 5-4, majority opinion that: "Nothing in our opinion should be taken to cast doubt on longstanding prohibitions on the possession of firearms by felons and the mentally ill, or laws forbidding the carrying of firearms in sensitive places such as schools and government buildings, or laws imposing conditions and qualifications on the commercial sale of arms."

Clearly Congress has the power, based on these two rulings, to ban the sale of military-grade weapons to civilians. The only thing stopping them is the fact they owe their positions to the money the NRA provided them to win election. The case can be made that they are being blackmailed by the NRA, or, at the least, are puppets of the NRA. Their allegiance is to the NRA, not their constituents or school children facing the possibility of a madman with a menacing AR-15 in front of them.

We as Americans have no understanding of how vulnerable we are, wherever we are, because of the easy availability of military-grade weapons to almost everyone. It could be wherever people gather in large numbers. Unless we act, there will be a mass killing with thousands of fatalities.

Shouldn't there be somebody to defend Donald Trump?

Shouldn't there be somebody to defend Donald Trump?

Opinion page editors have been wrestling that question for over a year. A good opinion editor, you see, prides herself on ideological balance, mixing and matching pundits who reliably leave the conservative right gnashing its teeth with those who routinely leave the progressive left rendering its garments.

But Trump has thrown that balance into disarray.

It's easy to find progressive writers willing to lambaste him. But as more than one editor has lamented, when they look for balance to writers on the right who can usually be depended upon to defend a conservative Republican, it turns out they view him with similar scorn.

I once heard an editor muse about maybe making a concerted effort to find new voices willing to stick up for Trump, but to me, that smacks of false equivalence — and obscures an important point. If writers who unstintingly praised George W. Bush, John McCain and Mitt Romney are unwilling to champion this guy, is that not visceral confirmation of what an outlier he really

is?

The Trump question, though, is just a subset of a larger one. Namely, how should mainstream news media deal with the fever swamp of conspiracy, lies and hogwash that produced and sustains him? To put it another way: should crazy have a place in the public square?

USA Today says yes. A few days ago, it published a column that raised eyebrows — and blood pressures — among progressives. It wasn't the writer's opinion — teachers should be armed — that rattled them. It was, rather, the writer himself.

Jerome Corsi is a birther who heads the Washington bureau of InfoWars, the conspiracy theory empire of Alex Jones. He's the guy who says the Newtown massacre never happened and who once promoted claims of Hillary Clinton running a child sex ring out of a pizzeria. As Media Matters put it, "No serious outlet should elevate Corsi's opinion."

But USA Today did. In a statement to the Daily Beast, editorial page editor Bill Sternberg defended his decision: "USA Today's Opposing View shows readers more than one point of view on an issue. Our signature debate format reinforces our reputation for fairness, which is one of our core values."

Which is disingenuous on two counts: One, it's not really the "point of view" people are objecting to, but the

author thereof. Two, while fairness is, indeed, a core value, nothing about fairness precludes the obligation to use judgment.

Sternberg implicitly pretends otherwise, but ask yourself: If the paper ran a piece condemning child molestation, would it feel compelled to offer an opposing view from a pedophile?

Of course not. Journalists like to pretend judgment is not part of what we do but it is, in fact, at the heart of it.

This is not an abstract argument. Mainstream news media have been frustratingly slow to realize that we are under attack. A recent Washington Post story documents how, just 47 minutes after news broke of the shooting in Parkland, online conspirators were already building their "crisis actors" narrative. Forty-seven minutes. There were still bodies on the floor.

"There's a war going on outside," one anonymous poster wrote, "...and it is only partially being fought with guns. The real weapon is information and the attack is on the mind."

So yes, this is coordinated. It is intentional.

That's why USA Today's decision to legitimize Jerome Corsi is appalling. He represents forces that threaten not simply news media, but ultimately, the nation. Yes, fairness is one of our core values.

But isn't common sense one, too?

Boldly going like no president before

Of all the promises candidate Donald Trump made during the 2016 presidential campaign, none will be more difficult to fulfill than cutting the size and cost of the federal government. That's because Congress, which must decide whether to keep a federal agency, has the final word in such matters and spending, especially spending in one's home state or district, is what keeps so many of them in office. Who doubts that self-preservation is the primary objective of most members of Congress?

Ronald Reagan made similar promises about reducing the size of the bloated federal government, but was unable to fulfill them because of congressional intransigence. Perhaps his most notable failure was attempting to eliminate the Department of Education, an unnecessary Cabinet-level agency created by Jimmy Carter, reportedly as the fulfillment of a campaign promise to the National Education Association (NEA), the largest labor union in the United States, which backed him in the 1976 and 1980 elections.

This pithy statement by Reagan got to the heart of the issue: "No government ever voluntarily reduces itself in size. Government programs, once launched, never disappear. Actually, a government bureau is the nearest thing to eternal life we'll ever see on this earth!"

President Trump has asked every federal agency to submit a reorganization plan

to the White House. Some programs, like the U.S. Geological Survey's (USGS) Biological Survey Unit (BSU), are decades old. The BSU was established in 1885, and among its tasks is the preservation of the whooping crane.

Last I checked those birds seemed to be doing OK, but why is this, along with so many other things, a responsibility of the federal government?

Reorganization of these outmoded and unnecessary programs and agencies should not be the goal. Elimination should be the goal. Unless they are killed off, the risk of their return is likely.

What's needed is a strategy that shames Congress, which sometimes seems beyond shame, for misspending the people's money. What will help in that shaming is for the president to establish an independent commission made up of retired Republicans, Democrats and average citizens.

This commission would conduct a top-to-bottom audit of the federal government and present its findings to Congress, while simultaneously releasing them to the public, which would then apply pressure on Congress to adopt them.

The commission would be modeled after the Base Realignment and Closure Commission (BRAC) of the '80s, which eliminated military bases that were no longer needed for the defense of the country. Some members of Congress complained about BRAC, but in the end they could not justify maintaining the bases.

The president might want to start with some of these ridiculous programs recently highlighted by Thomas A. Schatz, president of Citizens Against Government Waste, a

private, nonpartisan, nonprofit organization whose mission it is "to eliminate waste, fraud, abuse and mismanagement in government."

"Without authorization," notes Schatz, "the feds spent \$19.6 million annually on the International Fund for Ireland. Sounds like a noble cause, but the money went for projects like pony-trekking centers and golf videos."

"Congressional budget-cutters spared the \$440,000 spent annually to have attendants push buttons on the fully automated Capitol Hill elevators used by representatives and senators."

"Last year, the National Endowment for the Humanities spent \$4.2 million to conduct a nebulous 'National Conversation on Pluralism and Identity.' Obviously, talk radio wasn't considered good enough."

"The Pentagon and Central Intelligence Agency channeled some \$11 million to psychics who might provide special insights about various foreign threats. This was the disappointing 'Stargate' program."

The list goes on and on. Go to cagw.org, read all about it and remember it's our money paying for these boondoggles (definition: "a project funded by the federal government out of political favoritism that is of no real value to the community or the nation") that helps keep our free-spending career politicians in office where they get benefits the rest of us can only dream about.

Yes, entitlements are the main drivers of debt and they, too, need reform. But starting with programs most people would find outrageous and worthy of elimination is a good way to build confidence and make the tackling of entitlements more palatable.

control has to be the breaking of the total control the NRA has over this issue. It has to start with us, the American public, making an endorsement from the NRA a sure way for a politician to lose an election.

This would require more people to become involved in our democracy. In order for democracy to work it has to become more than a spectator sport.

The Heller v. DC Supreme Court ruling basically said one can have a handgun in his home for self protection, nothing more. We can live with that and that people can have normal rifles for hunting purposes, with some limits on round capacity.

The second draft of the Second Amendment in 1791 read: A well regulated militia, composed of the body of the people, being the best security of a free state, the right of people to keep and bear arms shall not be infringed: but no person religiously scrupulous shall be compelled to

bear arms.

The 3rd draft changed the last line to: but no one religious scrupulous of bearing arms shall be compelled to render military service in person.

It was taken out because of the fear too many men would use it to not serve in the regular militia or slave patrols in the South.

The intent of Congress when they wrote the bill was to have a well-regulated militia — being the best security of a free state — provide protection to the state as stated, not any right for individual protection.

death and leaving little to no empathy for life.

We also have what I call the "naked streakers effect," which surfaced on the TV coverage of Major League Baseball games in which the camera's would follow the streaker's path on the playing field. When the cameras quit showing the streakers, the streaking largely disappeared. How many of the school shootings we are witnessing have spawned other youthful shooters because

of the massive media coverage they receive? I believe this has been a contributing factor and terrorists rely on the same 24-hour media coverage. The Swiss have a long established gun culture similar to our history. Yet the Swiss have experienced but one mass shooting in a regional parliament (in 2001), in which 14 were killed and 14 wounded. The major difference between the U.S. and the Swiss: The Swiss have a long standing gun culture based on personal responsibility and gun safety that is anchored in their society and passed on from generation to

generation.

More gun control laws and increased mental health options dominate the conversation. Few talking heads want to factor in the breakdown of the family unit, raising kids with minimal respect for authority and not clearly defining the difference between right and wrong. Collectively these factors have taken an immense deadly toll in producing young killers with no empathy for others. The negative cultural changes in my lifetime have produced youthful copycat killers who place no value on human life.

the public view. And they did so under the flimsiest of rationales.

By law, school boards and other public boards are allowed to discuss

security plans outside the public view, but "security plans" has been understood to mean undercover protocols that have been implemented or are being implemented that would compromise the security of an event or building if they were to become known.

The law was never intended to allow a board

to hold public policy discussions in private.

So while a broad swath of America publicly debates arming teachers, the Lake County School Board alone concocted a rationale for doing so behind closed doors. And today, we still don't know what they decided last Monday because they

emerged from their secret meeting as tight-lipped as when they went in.

It's worth noting that a day after the School Board's secret deliberations, the Lake County Commission took up a similar issue — in public — and decided — in public — to let county workers carry weapons if they

already possess concealed weapons permits

And on Wednesday, School Board member Kristi Burns is scheduled to address the South Lake Democratic Club to talk about what measures the district is taking to safeguard the schools. It's curious that one board member can speak about

those measures to a club but the entire board can't do so.

Make no mistake, these secret School Board meetings are not a matter of necessity. They are a matter of convenience for a board that simply prefers discussing public business in private.

They need to stop. Now.

Beacon of freedom

African-American history shines in St. Louis

Africans originally came to this country not as immigrants seeking religious freedom or economic opportunity, but as property. The Griot Museum of Black History not only tells this dark chapter in American history, but celebrates the lives and accomplishments of prominent African-Americans with a Missouri connection, including George Washington Carver, Miles Davis, Josephine Baker, and Dred and Harriet Scott.

The Scotts, slaves whose suit for freedom went all the way to the U.S. Supreme Court, are featured prominently in the Field House Museum. The 1845-built, three-story structure was originally preserved as the childhood home of Eugene Field, the “Children’s Poet,” but the museum’s narrative has recently expanded to include Eugene’s father, Roswell, who formulated the legal strategy that took the Scotts’ suit to the Supreme Court. The Scotts argued that since they had traveled to a free state, they were entitled to emancipation. The Supreme Court, however, ruled in 1857 that blacks, free or slave, were not and never could be citizens of the U.S. and were therefore unable to petition for freedom. The decision helped foment the Civil War.

The suit for the Scotts’ freedom was initiated at the Old Courthouse, on whose steps slaves were once sold. Now a museum — part of the Jefferson National Expansion Memorial, which includes the Gateway Arch — the Old Courthouse (1839-1862) features restored courtrooms, exhibits relocated from the now-closed Museum of Westward Expansion and the beautifully decorated dome.

The Missouri Civil War Museum at Jefferson Barracks

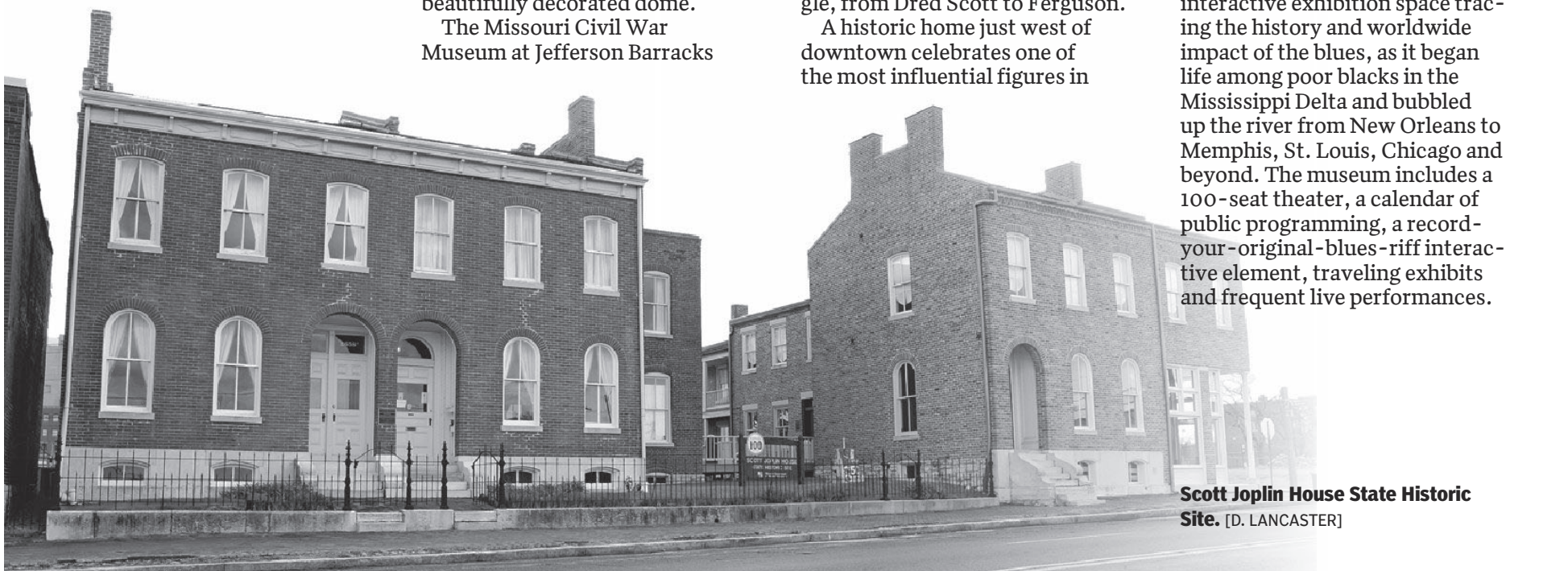
is the state’s largest educational complex dedicated exclusively to Missouri’s role in the war, using thousands of artifacts, documents and weapons.

An exhibit on view through April 15, 2018, at the Missouri History Museum, “#1 in Civil Rights: The African American Freedom Struggle in St. Louis,” makes the case for the city’s leading role in the Civil Rights struggle, from Dred Scott to Ferguson.

A historic home just west of downtown celebrates one of the most influential figures in

popular music. The Scott Joplin House State Historic Site is the only building in existence where the ragtime king is known to have composed some of his famous melodies. The downstairs museum traces the composer’s life and career; the upstairs apartment has been furnished to reflect the period.

The National Blues Museum contains 16,000 square feet of interactive exhibition space tracing the history and worldwide impact of the blues, as it began life among poor blacks in the Mississippi Delta and bubbled up the river from New Orleans to Memphis, St. Louis, Chicago and beyond. The museum includes a 100-seat theater, a calendar of public programming, a record-your-original-blues-riff interactive element, traveling exhibits and frequent live performances.

Learning through literacy

Lake County focusing on teaching students to think critically

CLERMONT — The expectation in classrooms at Lake County Schools is for students to read, write, think and talk through every lesson, every day. It’s called authentic literacy, and the goal is to help students learn to think critically so they are better prepared for college, careers and life as productive citizens.

But how do teachers make that happen?

That’s where the Literacy Design Collaborative (LDC) comes in. A cohort of Lake schools is using the LDC framework to learn how to design mini-units of instruction with rich assignments that will help students learn content through reading, analysis and writing.

East Ridge High School has been in the forefront with LDC and recently hosted an LDC Demonstration Day to help district and school leaders learn more about their work. “Our students look at writing differently now,” East Ridge High School Principal Julie Robinson-Lueallen said. “They don’t run from it. With LDC, it has all come together to support our kids and support our teachers. We are making connections, giving them structure, putting frameworks in place for them.” The approach is different from the familiar one that asks students to read a passage and write an essay or report to show they understand what they have read.

“It’s not just writing about what we read,” said Seth Edwards, an innovative professional development

facilitator for the district. “We’re writing about what the author did in the text to communicate the information, and it changes from content area to content area.”

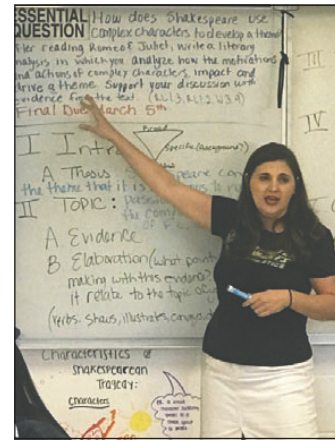
One example comes from a middle school history unit called “The Road to Revolution,” which requires students to examine the causes, course and consequences of the American Revolution. After studying primary and secondary sources about key events leading up to the writing of the Declaration of Independence, students write a response paper discussing the structure of the declaration and evaluating the extent to which that structure effectively supports the colonists’ argument for independence.

The exercise is driven by Florida standards such as

“analyze in detail the structure of a specific paragraph in a text” and “write arguments focused on discipline-specific content.” The Lake cohort is creating similar tasks across content areas and grade levels and adding them to a bank of modules that teachers throughout the district can use.

The goal is to give students the tools they need to master any content, understanding that reading is the key to accessing new knowledge and writing is the measure of understanding. Students say it’s working.

“When you’re doing history and you’re just answering multiple choice questions, it’s more of a memorization type of thing,” said Emily Curatolo, an East Ridge High School student featured in a student voices

video that was shared with the group. “If you’re able to go do certain skills, you know that you truly understand and you can show it in your writing.”

Beacon College hosts workshop for disability educators

LEESBURG — There’s one cardinal rule for magicians: never reveal your secrets.

Yet, Beacon College did just that. Beacon faculty, staff and students revealed the magic behind the liberal arts school’s peerless 70 percent four-year graduate rate for students with learning differences during a workshop for college disability educators.

“It’s important to share the ‘secret sauce,’ as it’s all about helping students achieve academic goals,” said Stephanie Knight, Beacon director of admissions. “Just because they (other students) aren’t physically on our campus

doesn’t mean we can’t provide a service to them.”

Designed to empower disability offices to build collaborations across campus, assess college readiness, and foster student success, the “Cultivating Campus-wide Collaborations to Support Student Success” workshop attracted educators from throughout Florida, but also drew people from Georgia, Maryland, New York, North Carolina, South Carolina and Texas for the two-day skull session.

“Not only did they provide such a wealth of information and such a unique approach to many things, it also provided us all with the chance to

network and talk with others in the field,” said Danielle Dietz, a learning specialist for the Learning Partners Program at Louisburg College in North Carolina. “Often we are the only ones on our campus that focus on disability issues, so being in a room full of knowledgeable and passionate educators was just good for the soul.”

Beacon President George Hagerty opened the workshop by outlining the slow evolution of higher education in effectively addressing the needs of students with learning disabilities.

LD graduates, Hagerty explained, are far more likely to enjoy purpose and career

engagement if they believe professors cared about and inspired them, were partnered with a mentor who encouraged the graduate to pursue ambitions, and enjoyed an internship that allowed the graduate to apply what he or she was studying.

Other sessions explored the Beacon College teaching model, social-emotional intelligence, the college’s Breakthrough Semester program, evaluations and diagnostics, faculty training, and the learning-specialist model.

Current and former students at Beacon College — America’s first college or university accredited to award

bachelor’s degrees primarily to students with learning disabilities, ADHD, dyslexia and other learning differences — added their voices and perspectives to the sessions.

NASCAR will be back this year for playoffs

LAS VEGAS — NASCAR's annual early-season trip to Las Vegas Motor Speedway is an understandable favorite for many teams and drivers. This year's event, however, is about getting much more than a few hands of blackjack

and the checkered flag.

For the first time, everybody is coming back to Vegas in six months for the opening race of the playoffs.

Each turn in today's Monster Energy Cup Series race should provide experience and data to the drivers hoping to dominate the postseason this fall.

"There is definitely some added importance to this race with (Las Vegas) being in the

playoffs," said Kyle Larson, who excelled in practice this week at the track where he finished second to eventual Cup champion Martin Truex Jr. last year.

"Hopefully we have a strong race, and if not, you know what you need to go back and work on to be better when you come back later in the year to benefit your playoff run," Larson added. "Not that this race when it was just

a stand-alone event wasn't important, but anytime you can race at a track that you are going to come back at in the final 10, it's got some added importance to it."

While other tracks have downsized their NASCAR ambitions when faced with smaller crowds in recent years, Las Vegas has been eager to host a second race for several years, confident in its local fan base and the visiting

fans who plan a vacation weekend around the March race.

The track finally got a second date last year when New Hampshire's second race was given to Vegas, which was backed by sponsorship deals with the local Convention and Visitors Authority and with the South Point hotel-casino, owned by former race team

Sharma holds his nerve and the lead in Mexico

MEXICO CITY — Shubhankar Sharma held his nerve to the end and held a two-shot lead going into the final round of the Mexico Championship.

Now the 21-year-old from India has one last round to hold off a few of golf's biggest names.

Sharma stretched his lead to as many as four shots Saturday at Chapultepec Golf Club until he started dropping a few shots late on the back nine. After clipping a tree and going into the bunker on the 18th, he holed a 15-foot par putt for a 2-under 69.

That left him 18 holes away from capping off his amazing rise. Just three months ago, Sharma had yet to win a tournament outside India's developmental circuit, didn't have a European Tour card and was No. 462 in the world. A victory in this World Golf Championship would be his third in his last eight starts and likely put him in the top 25.

His biggest test might come from the names on the leaderboard.

Phil Mickelson played bogey-free for a 65 that will

put him in the last group with Sharma and Tyrrell Hatton of England, who had a 64. Also two shots behind were Masters champion Sergio Garcia and Rafa Cabrera Bello, who each had a 69.

Another shot back was Dustin Johnson, the No. 1 player in the world and defending champion, who managed a 68 despite playing the par 5s on the back nine in 1 over.

Sharma, the only two-time winner on the European Tour this year who leads the Race to Dubai, didn't blink.

Even so, there was some emotion packed into those two short fist-pumps when his par putt dropped on the final hole.

He was at 13-under 200. Mickelson, coming off three straight top 10s for the first time since 2009, is in his best position yet. His drivers aren't as wild, he is making more key putts to keep the round going and his iron game is solid as ever.

"It's been a long time since my game's been back to this point," Mickelson said. "I'm back playing some of my best golf again. It will start to click and get better and better as the year goes on."

Florida tops No. 23 Kentucky behind Hudson's 22 points

GAINESVILLE — With Kentucky rolling, Florida reeling and the lead dwindling, Jalen Hudson decided to do something about it.

His 3-pointer from the wing with 6:19 to play was a turning point — for both teams.

Hudson scored 22 points — highlighted by one that bounced around the rim several times and hit the backboard before falling through — and the Gators beat the No. 23 Wildcats 80-67 on Saturday, ending the Wildcats' four-game winning streak.

"That was huge," Hudson said. "I think it got every part of the rim."

It was deflating for Kentucky, which used a matchup zone to trim a 23-point deficit to 65-56. It also was exactly the boost Florida needed.

The Gators (20-11, 11-7 SEC) won their third straight, swept Kentucky for the first time in four years and secured the No. 3 seed in next week's Southeastern Conference Tournament.

"We're playing our best basketball of the year, and I think the best way to continue doing so is to not rest on our laurels and not feel like we've got it all figured out," Florida coach Mike White said.

"We've got to handle success much better than we

have at other times in this basketball season. We've got remain on edge and continue to understand who we are and what our deficiencies are and stay as connected as we've been lately."

The Wildcats (21-10, 10-8) will be seeded fourth or fifth in the SEC Tournament. No team seeded lower than third has won the SEC since it went to a 14-team format in 2013.

"If we play this way, we're not winning," Calipari said. "This hopefully wakes us up and we go."

The Wildcats entered Saturday as the league's hottest team, having won four straight while averaging 87.7 points a game. They looked

PORT ST. LUCIE — The Tim Tebow Show is back for a second season in Mets spring training, and the setting this time is major-league camp — as opposed to minor-league camp with cameos in the bigs, as was the case for the quarterback-turned-outfielder last spring.

The biggest difference between the two sides?

"Um, food," Tebow said with a laugh Friday afternoon. Tebow, 30, had enough to

smile about after making his first start of camp, slotting in as the designated hitter in the Mets' 2-1 loss to the Nationals at First Data Field. He went 1-for-3 with a line-drive single and also reached base on an error.

But it didn't start well. Tebow's first at-bat came against Max Scherzer, the reigning two-time NL Cy Young Award winner, and lasted about a minute. Strike looking, strike swinging, strike looking.

"He's nasty," Tebow said. "In a good way, I mean."

Tebow followed with a single to left-center against Erick Fedde, considered Washington's top pitching prospect. In his last plate appearance, Tebow fouled off five consecutive pitches before sending a hard grounder to first baseman Jose Marmolejos, who booted it, allowing Tebow to reach.

"He has a good swing," manager Mickey Callaway said. "He's putting some really good swings on pitches."

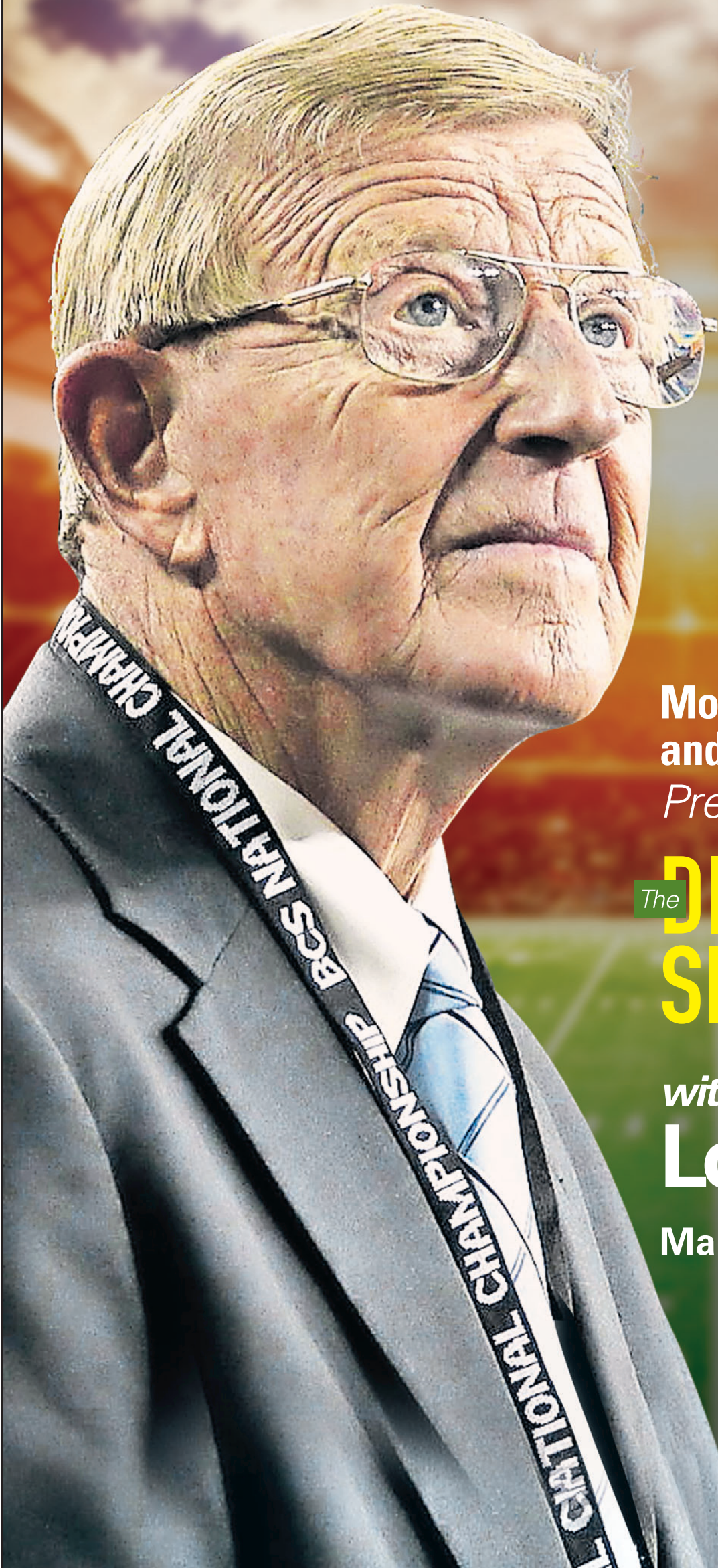

Mushers, fans gather for famed Iditarod in Alaska

ANCHORAGE, Alaska — Cheering fans lined the streets as mushers took their dog teams for a short sprint in Alaska's largest city Saturday for the ceremonial start of the Iditarod Trail Sled Dog Race.

The morning trek along snow-heaped paths in downtown Anchorage gave supporters a chance to mingle with mushers and their furry teams before the competitive portion of the 1,000-mile (1,600-kilometer) race to Nome begins Sunday to the north in the community of Willow.

But two hours before Saturday's action got started, a dog on Norwegian musher Lars Monsen's team got loose and disappeared during preparations for the 11-mile (18-kilometer) run through town. The dog, Hudson, was not immediately found, Iditarod spokesman Chas St. George said.

This year's Iditarod comes amid a plethora of troubles for race organizers, including a former winner's dog doping scandal, the loss of a major sponsor and increasing pressure from animal rights activists following the deaths of five dogs connected to last year's race.

But on Saturday, the focus for mushers was on the race ahead.

"It's all about the dogs now," said defending champion Mitch Seavey, a three-time winner. "Dogs are what we focus on. I think that's why everybody showed up down here on the streets today, it's because we love the dogs."

Veteran musher Scott Janssen of Anchorage said that for now, he is letting all "the negative stuff go in one ear and out the other," but will do everything in his power after the race to change the face of the Iditarod.

"I run this race because I love the Iditarod and I love my dogs," said

Janssen, a funeral home director known as the Mushing Mortician. "My dogs have been training all year to do this and we're going to go out there and we're going to have a great time."

Fans also were concentrating on the race itself. Among them were sisters Liz and Jenny Ott of Bradford, England. The pair first got a desire to see the Iditarod in person after going on a sled dog ride with Iditarod veteran Ryan Redington, grandson of late race co-founder Joe Redington Sr., as part of an Alaska cruise land excursion five years ago. "It's a bucket list thing," Liz Ott said.

"Something you have to do before you die," her sister added.

Also present for the parade of dog teams were members of the People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals, which brought five headstones with the names of the Iditarod dogs that died in 2017, including two dogs that died after being

dropped from the race. Stuffed toy dogs topped with long-stem red roses were placed in front of the gravestones.

PETA, a longtime Iditarod critic, says more than 150 dogs have died in the race over the years, a number disputed by Iditarod officials who have not provided their count despite numerous requests by The Associated Press. PETA also plans to protest at

Sunday's official start of the race and at the finish in Nome.

"These dogs are being treated like machines," said spokeswoman Tricia Lebkuecher. "And they are literally being run to death."

Iditarod officials acknowledged the various problems they've faced over the past year have been a growing process for organizers.

Perhaps the most

challenging issue was the October disclosure that four dogs belonging to four-time winner Dallas Seavey, one of defending champion Mitch Seavey's sons, tested positive for a banned substance, the opioid painkiller tramadol, after his second-place finish last year behind his father. The race's leadership faced criticism for not releasing the information sooner.

The Iditarod said it couldn't prove Dallas Seavey administered the drugs to his dogs and didn't punish him. Since then, the rules have been changed to hold mushers liable for any positive drug test unless they can show something beyond their control happened.

Seavey has denied administering tramadol to his dogs. He is sitting out this year's race in protest over the handling of the doping investigation. Instead, he is in Norway to participate in another sled dog race, the Finnmarksloppet, which begins next week.

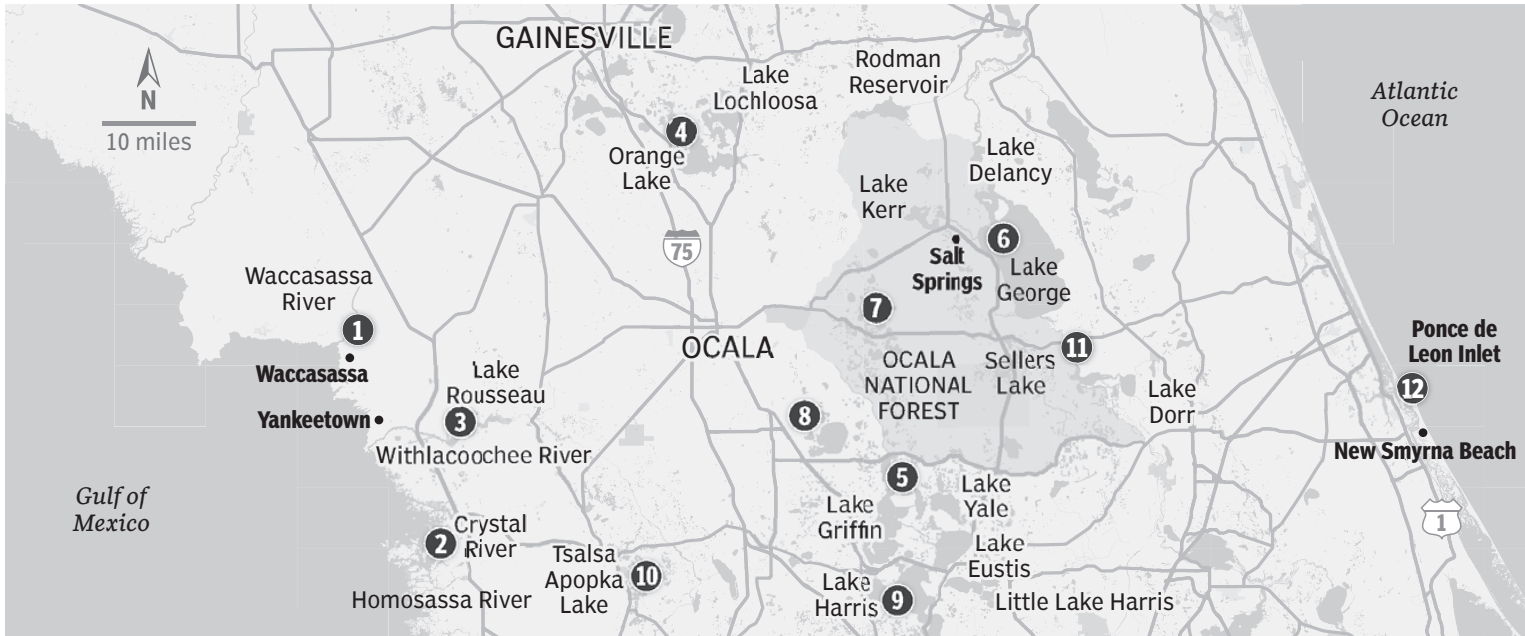
FISHING REPORT

Tip of the week: According to www.fishingtipsdepot.com, remember that night crawlers are an effective live bait for catching trout, along with minnows and crayfish. A neat trick is to take a look at what lives on the shore of where you're fishing for trout and see what might be native to their lunch or dinner menu.

1. Yankeetown/Waccasassa: According to Jim Zaloga, the warmer weather has made the trout active. The grass flats off of Yankeetown is a good area to start. The first tripletail was caught last Saturday. It was 12 pounds! Live shrimp is your best bet for both. Snook season starts today. Use lures such as a Shimano Colt Sniper, or Yozuri 3d inshore twitch bait, or the traditional Zara Spook.

2. Crystal River/Homosassa: Capt. William Toney said that he is looking forward to better tides this week with the upcoming full moon. One fish that has been a standard target aboard his vessel is redfish. As of late the low tides have hampered most of his redfishing, but with the better incoming high tides, Toney said he believes that could change. The better areas have been around Ozello on the inside keys. Look for jumping mullet on rocky points and shorelines to target with live shrimp, pinfish, gold spoons and soft plastics. The trout bite remains strong on the outside points and near shore flats. On windy days a soft plastic jig under a cork works best. The near shore rocks are holding plenty of Spanish mackerel, a few grunts and sheepshead. Toney said he also has received a few reports from local captains that are catching triple tail on crab trap buoys. Look for incoming high tide around midday this weekend.

3. Withlacoochee: Capt. Bob at Angler's Resort on the

Withlacoochee River in Dunnellon reports fishing on the river and Lake Rousseau remains slow but is continuing to improve slightly. Best results on the lake have been with worms and wild shiners. With the full moon coming this week the fishing should improve. Some crappie are still being caught in the phosphate pits on the river using Missouri minnows.

4. Orange Lake/Lochloosa: Lochloosa Harbor is reporting that specks are all over the weed areas and are being caught with regularity. Minnows have been the best baits.

5. Ocklawaha River: Roger Robins at Buck 'N Bass Sports Center reports that Rodman Reservoir and the Ocklawaha River has started picking up on the number of fish being caught. Bass are in the reservoir and below the dam up to seven pounders. Catfish has been caught below the dam with a couple over 12 pounds. Speck fishing has improved in the reservoir on the northern part along the Lilly pads. Minnows and Jiffy Jigs trolled are

the baits of choice.

6. Salt Springs: No update
7. Forest Lakes: Liz at Fat Daddy's reports that anglers are catching a lot of specks with minnows and minnows with jigs being the baits of choice. Bass also have been caught with regularity.

8. Lake Weir: Liz at Fat Daddy's reports that specks are being caught with regularity here. Minnows have proven to be the most effective baits.

9. Harris Chain: According to BassOnline.com, bass often can be found here in the open water. The canals have them at times, too.

10. Panasoffkee/Tsala: Specks have been biting here with minnows and jigs the baits of choice.

11. Astor Park: Roger Robbins at Buck 'N Bass Sports Center reports that the south end of Lake George into the St Johns River has produced some nice bass up to six pounds on wild shiners and top water lures. The specks have been hit or miss in this area. Speck fishing has been better in the canals along the St Johns River just north of the Astor bridge. Wildcatlake has

been good for bass on the east side.

12. Ponce Inlet: According to www.floridasightfishing.com, the bite is still red hot in the Mosquito Lagoon and near New Smyrna Beach and Ponce Inlet. Redfish have been biting with regularity since Hurricane Irma. Tours are fishing schools of redfish every morning in Mosquito Lagoon and wrapping things up catching bunches of spotted sea trout. There are lots of snook and tarpon in the deeper waters around New Smyrna. Fishing is not going slow down for a while, then we'll start to see baitfish thinning out and the fall transition taking place. Fishing for Mosquito Lagoon redfish have been excellent the last couple weeks. Lower water levels have the fish schooled up big time during the morning. Numerous groups of 75-150 grouped up fish ranging between five and 10 pounds. Giant bull reds have also been schooled up in both lagoons for their annual spawn with fish in the 20-40 pound range coming to the boat each day recently. Summer and early fall is prime time for catching

these trophy-sized redfish. Live bait has been the ticket with mullet, pinfish, pigfish all catching plenty. Soft plastics, plugs and spoons have worked when throwing lures. The speckled trout bite in Mosquito Lagoon is still going strong. It's also picked up well in New Smyrna Beach around oysters, creek shorelines, and docks. Live bait is producing around 15-to-20 trout each day. Many are smaller keeper-sized fish with some big ones upwards of seven or eight pounds. Fishing for speckled trout will remain like this until the cold fronts start to roll through and baitfish supplies run out in late September. Fishing for snook in New Smyrna Beach and Ponce Inlet has been good around the docks, bridges and shorelines. However, it's going to get even better next month when cold fronts start to get going and baitfish begin their fall migration. Where snook are hanging out now makes for tougher fishing with heavy gear and lots of lost fish or break-offs but anglers are getting a fair number of bites each time out.

Michigan ends Spartans' 13-game winning streak

NEW YORK — Michigan was the best team in the Big Ten Conference at tournament time last year, and things aren't changing.

Mo Wagner scored 14 of his 15 points after a dreadful first half and fifth-seeded Michigan moved within a game of its second straight Big Ten Tournament title with a 75-64 victory over top-seeded Michigan State on Saturday, ending the No. 2 ranked Spartans' 13-game winning streak.

Senior swingman Duncan Robinson said this year feels like 2017 when the Wolverines won the tournament as the No. 8 seed, the lowest seed to win the event.

"I think coming down the stretch in that championship game and how it felt, I think all the guys want that again more than anything," said Robinson, one of five players in double figures in the eighth straight win for No. 15 Michigan (27-7). "We are one step closer, but we still have to stay locked in on the task at hand." Michigan will play third-seeded Purdue (28-5) on Sunday as the five-day tournament ends at Madison Square Garden. The No. 8-ranked Boilermakers, who edged Michigan twice in the regular season by a combined five points, beat seventh-seeded Penn State 78-70 in the second semifinal.

Muhammad-Ali Abdur-Rahkman and Xavier Simpson also had 15 for the Wolverines, who were also the last team to beat Michigan State (29-4), when they did it on Jan. 13. Robinson added 13 points off the bench and Charles Matthews had 12.

No. 8 Purdue 78, Penn State 70

NEW YORK — Purdue threw a little of everything

at Penn State star Tony Carr, the Big Ten's leading scorer. Bigger guys. Smaller ones. Switches and some double teams.

Carr managed only 12 points in a woeful shooting game, and No. 8 Purdue separated from Penn State in the second half of a 78-70 victory Saturday that put the Boilermakers in the Big Ten Tournament championship game for the second time in three seasons. Third-seeded Purdue (28-5) faces No. 5 Michigan, which will try to repeat as tournament champs on Sunday at Madison Square Garden.

Purdue frustrated Carr and held him to 4-of-18 shooting.

The sophomore faced an array of defenders, including the 6-foot-6, 220-pound Noel Eastern, 5-10 P.J. Thompson, 6-4 Dakota Mathias, 6-8 Vincent Edwards and 6-1 Carsen Edwards.

No. 1 Virginia 62, Notre Dame 57

CHARLOTTESVILLE, Va. — Devon Hall scored 17 points in his final game at John Paul Jones Arena and top-ranked Virginia won its second nail-biter in three days with a 62-57 win over Notre Dame.

Ty Jerome added 13 points for the Cavaliers (28-2, 17-1), who won their fifth in a row.

Bonzie Colson, playing in just his second game since missing 15 with a broken foot, had 24 points and 14 rebounds for the Irish (18-13, 8-10). Martin Geben added 14 points and 10 rebounds, but only three other Notre Dame players scored. They shot 19 of 53 (35.8 percent).

No. 4 Villanova 97, Georgetown 73

PHILADELPHIA — Jay Wright moved into a tie atop Villanova's career wins list with 413 in the fourth-ranked Wildcats'

97-73 victory over Georgetown on Saturday night. Wright improved to 413-165 since he took the job in 2001 and has led the Wildcats to the 2009 Final Four and 2016 national championship.

He matched Al Severance, who went 413-201 from 1936-1961. Wright can top Severance with a win in the Big East Tournament.

Villanova used the Hoyas (15-14, 5-13) as little more than a tune-up in the finale and took a 15-point lead in the first half that was never seriously challenged. Mikal Bridges scored 24 points and Jalen Brunson solidified his player of the year candidacy with 16 points and seven assists.

Oklahoma State 82, No. 6 Kansas 64

STILLWATER, Okla. — They're barely considered a bubble team for the upcoming NCAA Tournament, but Oklahoma State just bolstered its resume with another big win.

Kendall Smith scored a career-high 25 points and Mitchell Solomon had 16 points and seven rebounds to help lead

Oklahoma State to an 82-64 victory over No. 6 Kansas in the regular season finale for both teams on Saturday.

Oklahoma State (18-13, 8-10) swept the season series from Kansas, marking the first time that the Jayhawks have been swept in a home-and-home since 2001, a span of 103 series.

No. 14 Auburn 79, South Carolina 70

AUBURN, Ala. — Con-fetti and Bryce Brown 3-pointers rained down at Auburn Arena.

Brown scored 29 points, making eight 3-pointers, and No. 14 Auburn claimed a share of the Southeastern Conference title with a 79-70 comeback victory over South Carolina on Saturday.

The Tigers (25-6, 13-5) earned the top seed in next week's SEC tournament with their first regular season title since 1999 and third overall. Auburn and No. 16 Tennessee share the title after the Volunteers beat Georgia 66-61, but Auburn won the head-to-head tiebreaker.

Brown led a comeback

after Auburn trailed by 14 points midway through the first half.

No. 16 Tennessee 66, Georgia 61

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. — Admiral Schofield scored 23 points to lead Tennessee's second-half comeback Saturday as the 16th-ranked Volunteers rallied past Georgia 66-61 to win a share of the Southeastern Conference regular-season championship. The Vols

(23-7, 13-5) share the SEC regular-season title with No. 14 Auburn. Because Auburn won 94-84 at Tennessee on Jan. 2 in their lone regular-season matchup, the Tigers (25-6, 13-5) get the No. 1 seed in the Southeastern Conference Tournament that starts Wednesday in St. Louis. After trailing by as many as 11 late in the first half, Tennessee pulled ahead for good at 62-61 when Jordan Bowden sank two free throws with 1:01 left.

Grant Williams scored 22 points for Tennessee.

No. 19 Arizona 66, California 54

TUCSON, Ariz. — Deandre Ayton had 26 points and 20 rebounds, helping No. 19 Arizona clinch the Pac-12 regular-season title outright with a 66-54 victory over California on Saturday night.

Arizona (24-7, 14-4) had the title in its sights for its seniors' final home game.

Instead of rolling against the Pac-12's last-place team, the Wildcats had a hard time shaking the Bears (8-23, 2-16).

Arizona closed the game with a 13-1 run, finishing off its fifth Pac-12 title in six seasons.

Florida State rallies for win over Boston

TALLAHASSEE — Florida State's Braian Angola got a big surprise before Saturday's game, when his mother flew in from Colombia to see his final home game.

The senior guard responded with one of his best games of the year. He scored 19 of his 21 points in the second half as the Seminoles rallied for an 85-76 victory over Boston College.

"I was focused on the game but looking at my mom. I didn't see anyone else in the crowd," said Angola, who made all seven field goal attempts and was 5 of 5 from the line in the second half.

Angola, who came to Florida State after two seasons at North Idaho Junior College, expected only his girlfriend, Kama Griffiths, would be here for Senior Day festivities. His junior college coaches surprised him on Friday but the biggest surprise was during pregame ceremonies when his mother, Ofelia Rodas, came on the court. Angola's girlfriend, who plays professional basketball in Denmark, flew her in for the game.

"He's had an emotional couple days having the people close to him make the effort to see him," Florida State coach Leonard Hamilton said.

The Seminoles (20-10, 9-9 Atlantic Coast Conference) trailed most of the game and were down 72-67 with 6:13 remaining before scoring nine straight points. Trent Forrest — who also had

21 points — keyed the run with seven points while Angola's dunk with 5:04 left put Florida State up for good, 74-72.

Boston College (17-14, 7-11) went scoreless for 4:38 during the run and was 0 of 7 from the field with three turnovers.

"We lost our composure and got away with what was working. We didn't get back on defense while they ratcheted it up and forced some turnovers," coach Jim Christian said.

Jordan Chatman, who had 20 points, ended the run with two free throws with 1:35 remaining to make it 76-74. Florida State ended the game with

a 9-2 run.

Ky Bowman led the Eagles with 22 points and Jerome Robinson added 16.

Angola had scored in double figures in Florida State's first nine ACC games and was averaging 18.8 points in conference play before averaging 5.9 points and reaching double figures twice in the next six.

He is hoping the past three games, where he scored in double figures and is averaging 15.3 points, has him back on track.

"We know our season is on the line. When we play from behind we play

better. We start executing on offense and playing better defense," Angola said.

TAMPA — Steven Stamkos and Victor Hedman were too much for the Philadelphia Flyers on Saturday.

Stamkos and Hedman combined for four goals and five assists to lead the Tampa Bay Lightning to a 7-6 shootout victory against the Flyers.

Stamkos scored twice and added three assists to set a career high with five points while Hedman had two goals and tied a career high with four points.

League-leading scorer Nikita Kucherov returned from a two-game absence and had three assists.

"When these guys are rolling you just have to keep putting them out there," Lightning coach Jon Cooper said.

"You want them to keep going with that feeling they are having and it paid off for us tonight."

Brayden Point added a shootout goal and the league-leading Lightning improved to 6-0-1 in the past seven games. Andrei Vasilevskiy finished with 37 saves for his league-leading 38th victory.

Ivan Provorov had a goal and two assists for Philadelphia, which suffered consecutive losses for the first time since a four-game losing streak from Jan. 25 to Feb. 3.

Claude Giroux, Jakub Voracek and Nolan Patrick each finished with a goal and an assist.

Tampa Bay overcame two multi-goal deficits to win for the third time in franchise history, second time against the Flyers.

"Anytime you're down

a couple of goals in different parts of the game, especially in the third and you come back and win it's emotional," Stamkos said.

"It shows guys care. Guys never gave up."

The Lightning fell behind 3-1 after the opening period as the Flyers scored twice in a span of

3:37 in the first on goals from Voracek and defenseman Robert Hagg.

Tampa Bay tied it on goals from Hedman and Dan Girardi in the second period, but Philadelphia regained the two-goal advantage on a late second-period goal from Jori Lehtera and early third-period goal from Provorov.

"We know we didn't play well a couple of nights ago," Flyers coach Dave Hakstol said.

"It's not just about losses it's about the overall performance. That wasn't us the other night and we knew we had to raise our level from where it was the other night. I thought our guys did that."

But the Lightning raised their level as well with three consecutive

"It was a pretty fun game to play," he said. "They have a lot of talent, they have a lot of players that can make a difference. You give them chances to score and they will. But we did a good job of keeping our composure."

Callaway, as the Mets' first-year skipper, has to take Tebow's word for comparative purposes. And Tebow made himself clear in saying that he feels far better this year than he did last year.

In addition to having a full season of professional baseball behind him, Tebow also spent much

of the offseason reworking his swing, including with Mets assistant hitting coach Tom Slater.

The hardest part, Tebow said, has been maintaining those changes while ramping up the intensity, from soft toss to batting practice to live BP to, now, exhibition games.

"I feel a lot more adjusted to the game," Tebow said. "I feel like I have a very different approach and swing, so I can be a lot more patient

seeing pitches and trusting all the work I put in.

"Just being able to see pitches, timing, having hopefully a cleaner path, so I hopefully have a little bit more time, buying time to see the pitch longer.

"It's so much more natural, with mobility, flexibility and the path and the work of the swing. I put in a lot of work this offseason."

In short, Tebow feels more like a baseball player.

"He looks comfortable at the plate, and he tells us he's feeling more and more comfortable," Callaway said. "He feels like he's in a much better spot than he was last year at this time."

The Mets have not said where Tebow will open the 2018 season. After he split last season between low-A Columbia and high-A St. Lucie — batting .226 with a .309 OBP and .347 slugging percentage — Double-A Binghamton would be a

logical starting point.

Don't forget that general manager Sandy Alderson already said this month that Tim Tebow, major leaguer, could become a reality.

"That's my hope, and to some extent now after a year and a half, a modest expectation," Alderson said.

So despite naysayers inside and outside the game, don't expect Tebow to go away soon. He said "I definitely do" still get butterflies every

time he steps to the plate.

"I get butterflies for almost everything I do, because I just care so much about it," Tebow said.

"I'm passionate. I love it. I enjoy it. Whatever you want to call it — butterflies, excitement, adrenaline. All of it. I like it. If I didn't have that, I probably wouldn't be playing. It's one of the best parts about sports, that competition. That feeling you get, it's really fun."

As for winning for the first time since the 2013 British Open? "I think whether it happens tomorrow or not — very good chance it will — but if it doesn't, it's going to happen soon because I'm playing too well for it not." Even then, his goal was to get to 10 under by the end of the tournament. "Got a pretty good jump-start on that," said Thomas, who was at 9-under 204. "I may have to reset that goal a little bit." Spieth birdied three of his last four holes and was six behind.

Allen finished with 11 points, seven rebounds and a career-high seven assists.

The Wildcats showed some life midway through the second half, but Hudson answered with his biggest basket of the game. Egor Koulechov followed with two free throws, and Stone put an exclamation point on the lopsided victory with a thunderous dunk that sent the home crowd into a frenzy.

Shai Gilgeous-Alexander led Kentucky with 17 points. Kevin Knox added 14 in the regular-season finale for both teams.

"Now the real stuff starts," Calipari said.

Everybody already knows this track from NASCAR's annual visits, but teams are paying particularly close attention this week.

"This race has more importance around it than it ever has before, just because of the playoff atmosphere that will be around it in September," said Kurt Busch, who was born in this city. "This is big for Las Vegas."

The winter weather in Las Vegas isn't necessarily helping the teams to prepare for September, when temperatures are almost certain to be

sizzling. The speedway has been chilly this week, with occasional 40 mph winds buffeting cars and possibly changing drivers' tactics. "It's definitely an important weekend to make sure you have a firm understanding of this track and what you're going to need when you come back for the playoffs," said Kevin Harvick, who won last week in Atlanta. Other things to watch on the 1 1/2-mile track on the northernmost end of the Strip:

ON THE POLE: Ryan Blaney earned his third career pole Friday, and his Team Penske Ford will start alongside Harvick on the front row. Blaney has been impressive already this season, nearly winning at Daytona after leading 118 laps before

late-race contact with Kurt Busch forced him to pit for repairs. Penske's rising star gets another chance to earn his second career Cup victory in Vegas.

JJ'S GAMBLE: Jimmie Johnson is the most successful active driver in Las Vegas, winning four times and recording nine top-10 finishes. Johnson intends to get his season back on track on his native West Coast.

track that was built during their youth. Kyle Busch won the Cup race in 2009, but he also has victories there in the Xfinity Series and the Truck Series race, which he won Friday night. The 39-year-old Kurt Busch, who will start third after an impressive qualifying run, makes no secret of his desire to raise the trophy in the desert before he retires.

FORD TOUGH: Fords earned the first three spots in qualifying, along with five of the first eight, and eight of the first 12. Fords also excelled last week in Atlanta, but the drivers and teams aren't prepared to say they've got all the answers yet.

IN THE WIND: The drivers could get a respite from the high desert winds today, but they're

I am still able to read a newspaper, but I can no longer drive. I'm unable to see at night, and the loss of my peripheral vision has become dangerous for me. Please let your readers know that a person with a white cane may still be able to see to some degree, but they do need the cane for their own safety. -- **SAFETY FIRST**

DEAR SAFETY FIRST: Thank you for your letter. When I looked online for

more information about white canes, I learned there are many different kinds. They include the "symbol cane," which is held to let others know the person is blind or vision-challenged. It's carried when out in public to remind others to be careful about possibly colliding with him or her.

Other canes are the "guide cane" and the "long cane," which are used to detect objects in front of the sightless person, to prevent tripping on curbs, steps or other objects. (There are also red-and-white banded canes, which indicate the person carrying one has a hearing impairment as well as sight loss.)

Readers, I know it's easy to be cynical, but if you see someone with a white cane, please do not accuse the person of faking, because he or she is contending with enough challenges already.

Opening lead — queen of spades.

Here is a test of good technique in declarer play. Let's say you're in four hearts and West leads the queen of spades. You play low from dummy and ruff the spade continuation. How would you proceed?

The club loser is inescapable, so the problem is to avoid losing two diamond tricks, one of which must be lost in any case. Two factors are obvious. If the trumps are divided 2-2, you can make the contract by drawing them and playing the A-K and another diamond. The fourth diamond can then be ruffed in dummy if

the missing diamonds are not divided 3-3.

Likewise, you will be in good shape if the diamonds are divided evenly, whether trumps are drawn early or not. So you proceed on the assumption that both suits will break badly and consider what, if anything, you can do about it.

Note that you cannot afford to test the trump situation by first drawing two rounds. If you did this and then played the A-K and another diamond, you could be defeated by a trump return, as in the actual deal.

The way to give yourself the best chance is to cash one high trump at trick three and then lead a low diamond! This gives you the maximum protection against bad breaks.

Assume the diamond is taken and a spade is returned. You ruff and cash a second round of trumps, hoping they are divided 2-2. But when West shows out, you next play the A-K of diamonds, still hoping for a 3-3 break in that suit.

The diamonds don't split, but you get lucky when it turns out that East is the one with the greater length. This allows you to ruff a fourth diamond in dummy safely, and you wind up making the contract.

At no point were you sure you'd make four hearts, but at least you followed the line of play that offered the best chance of success.

Leesburg pastor gives to the community through Love Week, Church of the Lakes

LEESBURG — Love Week Central Florida recently made a stop at the Circle K/Shell station at the corner of U.S. Highway 27 and Dixie Avenue where volunteers pumped \$2,000 worth of free gas and handed out another \$2,000 in bread from Flowers Bakery.

But Love Week is more than free gas and bread.

Founded by Pastor Mike Matheny in 2005, Love Week is a grassroots movement that has raised more than \$130,000 for the community.

“The concept is very simple: how can you serve your community?” Matheny said. “The picture I had is to help by giving. What would it look like if several thousand people did it at the same time? What if 5,000 in our area did something to serve the community on some kind of level?”

Matheny came to Leesburg to join the staff at Southpointe Baptist Fellowship after training and outreach in The Gambia, West Africa. He was ordained and served as youth and children’s pastor for five years. In 2005, Matheny joined The Father’s House as youth and children’s pastor and went on to serve as executive pastor from 2014-17.

After he formed Love Week Central Florida, Matheny said he felt called to start a new church.

Matheny sought help from the Association of Related Churches, which provides support, guidance and resources for new churches. He put together a launch team and raised funds, then started looking for a building to house the church. Frustrated at the high cost of real estate, he found himself at the Tropic Theater in downtown Leesburg.

Terri Hicks, owner of Dance Dynamics, bought the building about 11 years ago

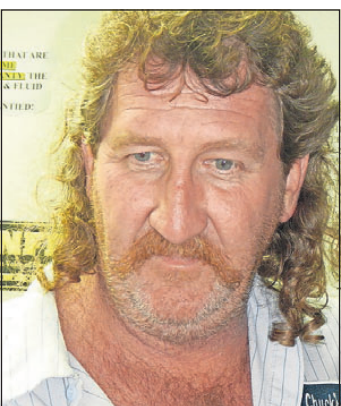

LAKE COUNTY HISTORY DID YOU KNOW?

Dudley W. Adams, Tangerine's first visitor, first came to Florida in the early 1870s and traveled along the St. John's River. He spent two winters searching for the ideal place to build his future and his home. He knew he found it when he discovered the pine-covered hills overlooking Lake Beauclair, according to "Tangerine Memoirs," compiled and written by Winifred W. Estey in 1957.

Estey was the daughter of George H. Wood, a Tangerine pioneer. The booklet was sponsored and printed by the Tangerine Improvement Society.

"At length on a January evening I came unto the hills overlooking Lake Beauclair just as the sun was going down in a blaze of glory," wrote Adams of the sight. "The air was as soft as a breath of peace. The pines, the palms, the gorgeous coloring of

the clouds and sky and setting sun were reflected in the mirrored waters."

Adams had quite the flair with a pen. He was known as a poet, a writer and a naturalist.

"To the north Lake Dora half encircled beautiful Beauclair in her crimson embrace, while to the south, Ola and Carlton glistened through the pines, like gems of purest water in emerald settings. Among the health-giving pines, surrounded by lovely lakes, here in this place, the gem of Florida, will I live and die."

Florida State Supreme Court Justice Glenn Terrell was asked by the Sumter County Times to write an article for its silver anniversary edition published on Feb. 23, 1956. Terrell was born in Daleville, Mississippi in 1877. His father moved the family to Sumter County via covered wagon in the fall of 1883, just two years after the

Sumter County Times was founded.

After getting his law degree in 1903, Terrell practiced in Sumter County until 1915. He was a state representative for three two-year terms beginning in 1909, and he served as a state senator for two terms

beginning in 1915. Terrell was appointed as a justice to the Florida Supreme Court in 1923 and served until he died Jan. 12, 1964.

Some 70 years after arriving in Florida, Terrell wrote in the Sumter County Times about the trip and life after they arrived.

"The trip took more than six weeks to complete. The roads followed generally the Indian trails, none of them were paved and few of them were even graded. The pioneer traveler knew nothing of the commodious tourist courts, comfortable hotels or inns that frequent these highways at the present time."

and remodeled the nearly 20,000-square-foot space as a performing arts school.

Although there wasn't a for-rent sign outside, Matheny looked around as much as he could with dance classes in session. He thinks maybe the devil whispered in his ear that people would not come to church in a theater, so he told Hicks he wasn't interested.

Days later, Matheny's wife said she wanted to see the rest of the building, and they made a second visit.

"I had not seen there was another theater they had set up as a dance room," Matheny said. "It was the perfect space for children, and another room perfect for preschool. She (Hicks) said she could give us office space and we could use a room for storage. It was literally like God dropped it in our laps."

The Church of the Lakes held its first service Aug. 13, 2016.

"The theater gives us a place that is not intimidating," Matheny said. "It gives a unique alternative for people to come and learn about God in a very

non-traditional setting."

Church trustee Wally Meyer got to know Matheny when he was at The Father's House and used his business background to help him start the new church. The pair organized breakfast meetings to find people who weren't going to church and get them to attend.

"Pastor Mike keeps looking for new ways to serve

— it's part of his DNA," Meyer said. "I think it's fun to be a part of that."

Among other projects, the church partnered with Vic's Catering to provide the staff at Oak Park Elementary breakfast, enlisted a retired magician to put on a show for the kids and gave each teacher a gift card. As a memorial to 9-11, the church worked with Oakwood Smokehouse

and delivered barbecue to local emergency medical technicians, firefighters and police officers.

"One thing we ask our congregation to do is to tithe," Matheny said. "From the dollars that were given, 10 percent we give away."

Since opening, the church has given about \$35,000 to organizations and the community.

Leesburg EAA chapter visits vintage aircraft restorer

TANGERINE — Experimental Aircraft Association Chapter 534, based at the Leesburg International Airport, recently visited Jim Kimball Enterprises to check out current aircraft restoration projects.

The business was started by Jim Kimball many years ago, but after Jim retired, it was taken over by his son, Kevin, who is the president of the company and runs the day-to-day operations.

Jim Kimball Enterprises cut its teeth with Stearman restorations. Originally restoring a Boeing World War II vintage Stearman for the family's use, others saw how well it turned out and wanted the company to restore theirs. For years, they worked on this type of aircraft and collected parts from all over the country.

The next major endeavor was to secure the rights to build the Pitts Model 12 biplane. Jim Kimball Enterprises became the exclusive manufacturers of the kit for this aircraft. They would either sell the kit so people could build them or put it together for customers.

"We have sold around 125 Pitts Model 12 kits, with around 78 having been completed and flown," Kevin said.

Jim Kimball Enterprises sold the Pitts Model 12 part of the business and decided not to take on any new restoration projects.

Kevin and his son, Kal, instead began working full time doing research and development for Indmar Marine Engines. These are powerful inboard boat engines for ski-type watercraft.

Kevin said the only aircraft restorations that will be done will be on family projects. Kal is currently restoring

another WWII-era Boeing 1940s vintage Stearman.

Outside the hangar stood a beautifully completed Stearman that the family restored for their own use. It had a few

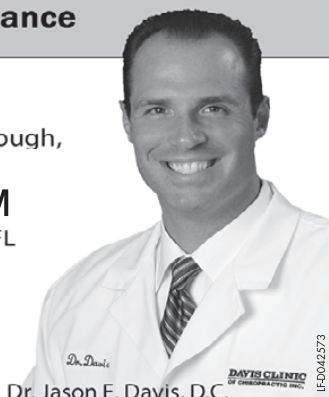

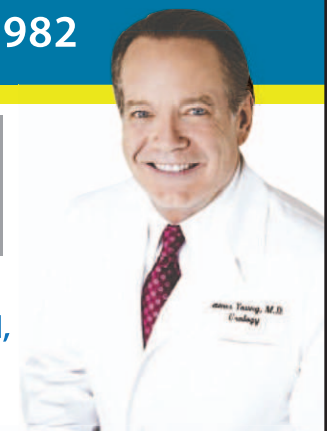

The Paramount dark comedy 'Heathers' reimagines a cult classic

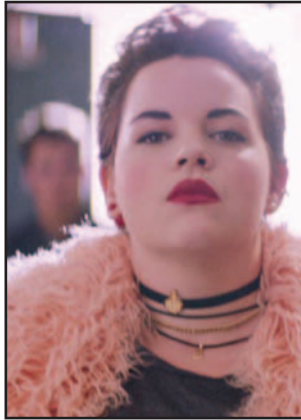

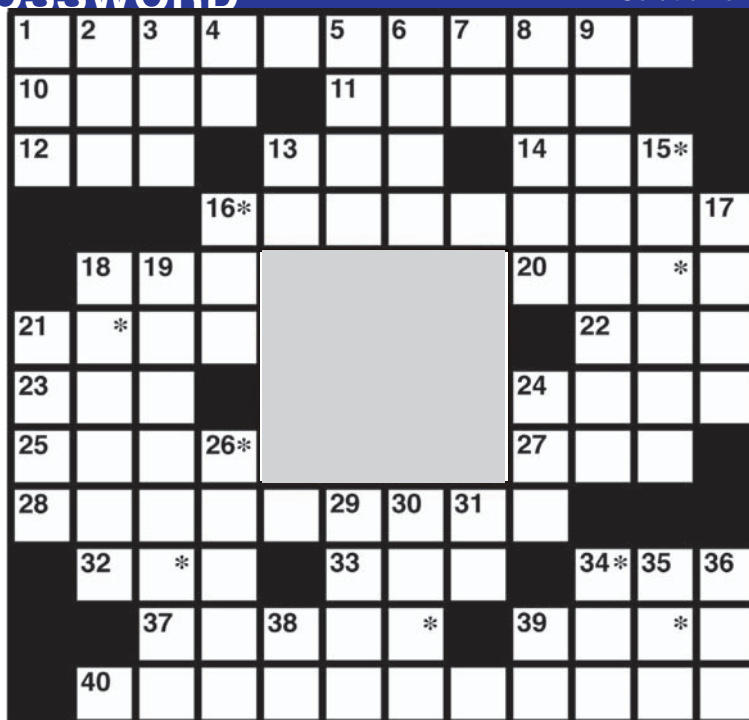

In resuming series work after "Pretty Little Liars," Lucy Hale plays someone who gets what arguably is the ultimate reprieve.

Premiering Wednesday, March 7, the seriocomic CW show "Life Sentence" casts her as cancer patient Stella ...who suddenly learns she's cured, putting a very different spin on decisions she made and situations she experienced when she thought she had only a limited amount of time left. She also discovers secrets her loved ones had

kept from her, such as the marital discord between her parents (Dylan Walsh, Gillian Vigman) her sister's (Hale look-alike Brooke Lyons) self-sacrifice and her brother's (Jayson Blair) drug dealing. Elliot Knight and Carlos PenaVega also star.

"I, luckily, have not been personally affected by cancer," Hale says, "but I'm from Memphis, and I visited St. Jude (Children's Research Hospital) multiple times. I've visited Children's Hospital of Los Angeles, and what I noticed in all the patients and the families is that they're giv-

en one of the worst possible scenarios you could be given, but their positivity is what remained with me.

"I was just blown away by everyone, that they're making the best of an awful situation. I think anyone who has met someone who has been diagnosed with cancer can say that (someone who has it is) more positive than someone that doesn't have it, so I think that that's what we are trying to show."

Series creators Erin Cardillo and Richard Keith — who previously made the comedy "Significant Mother" for The CW —

are executive producers of "Life Sentence" along with "Pretty Little Liars" alum Oliver Goldstick and Bill Lawrence, a television-comedy veteran of such shows as "Scrubs" and "Spin City."

"The thing that is interesting to me in television is taking chances," Lawrence notes. "I can't tell you how many people I sat in front of when I handed 'Scrubs' in that said, 'The amount of comedy and silliness you're doing with these people living and dying is not going to work.' And I believe this is where you take chances.

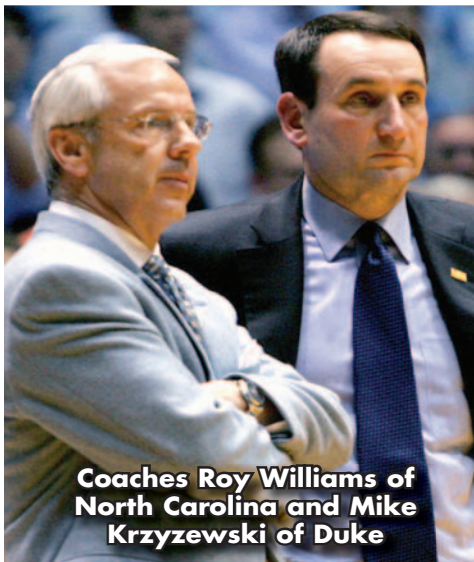

DUKE / UNC: COLLEGE HOOPS' BIGGEST RIVALRY

Duke and North Carolina never gets old. On Saturday night, March 3, the two teams met for the second time this season, and their regular season finale. UNC won the February 8 matchup 82-78.

It's the "Tobacco Road Rivalry," one of the biggest in all of sports and certainly that of college basketball. No matter how good or bad one or the other teams is, they can beat each other on any given day on any given court. But, usually they're both good.

The rivalry stems mostly from the fact that the Duke Blue Devils and North Carolina Tar Heels are located only eight miles apart as the crow flies, and ten miles on U.S. Highway 15-501 (Tobacco Road). Duke is a private school, UNC is public. Both are prominent universities and they both play in the ACC and play each other twice each season.

They've been meeting regularly since 1920, with North Carolina owning a 136-110 victory margin. But the rivalry really came to the forefront in what is considered the modern era of college basketball. In 1982, UNC won a championship for legendary coach Dean Smith on a last-second jumper by Michael Jordan. College basketball, Smith, Jordan and the Tar Heels all gained national prominence simultaneously.

Meanwhile, Mike Krzyzewski took over Duke's program in 1980 and soon enough, his teams too were regulars in the

NCAA tournament. In 1991 Duke and North Carolina were both in the Final Four. UNC lost to Kansas in the semi-finals while Duke stunned UNLV, before going on to beat Kansas for their first NCAA championship. They would win again in 1992, followed by the Tar Heels in 1993.

Since 1991 Duke has won five NCAA championships under Coach K, including titles in 2001, 2010 and 2015. In 2003 UNC hired coach Roy Williams, a Dean Smith disciple, and the result has been national championships in 2005, 2009 and 2017. They were also the runner-up in 2016.

The Tobacco Road rivalry has gotten a little violent at times, including in 2007 when UNC's Tyler Hansbrough got his nose broken. Fans of both teams taunt the other and celebrate their victories wildly in their home cities. Recently, however, the rivalry has been one of respect between the two coaches who often speak highly of the other's players.

Some years, such as in 2017, these two teams meet more than once; facing each other in the ACC Tournament. An NCAA Tournament matchup has never happened and if it ever did, especially in the Final Four, it would be on a level of proportion bigger than anything prior in college basketball. For now, both teams are just trying to position themselves for another March Madness run.

'THE OATH' FOLLOWS POLICE GANGS AND COPS WHO GO BAD



"The Oath"

At a time when police departments across the country are beset by accusations of racism, brutality and other crimes, a series about police gangs and their nefarious activities isn't likely to help their image. Especially since it's based on the experiences of its showrunner, an ex-cop.

Premiering Thursday, March 8, on Crackle, "The Oath" introduces us to the Ravens, a group of big-city California cops involved in everything from drug distribution and money laundering to robbery. That is illustrated in the series' opening sequence, when a group of masked, machine-gun-toting thugs storm a bank and demand the key card to the safe. After getting away with the loot, the thieves are

revealed to cops, who are eventually cornered, apprehended and brought in by the FBI.

It is there that the cops – Steve Hammond (Ryan Kwanten, "True Blood"), Karen Beach (Katrina Law, "Training Day"), Cole Hammond (Cory Hardict, "Labyrinth") and Pete Ramos (J.J. Soria, "Animal Kingdom") – meet no-nonsense Agent Aria Price (Elisabeth Rohm, "Law & Order"). She tells them she knows about the Ravens and scores of other gangs in the department and she wants them to help her build a RICO case against them. So she offers them a deal: Let undercover agent Damon Byrd (Arlen Escarpeta, "The Magicians") infiltrate their operation or go to prison.

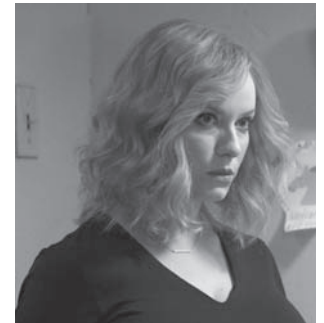

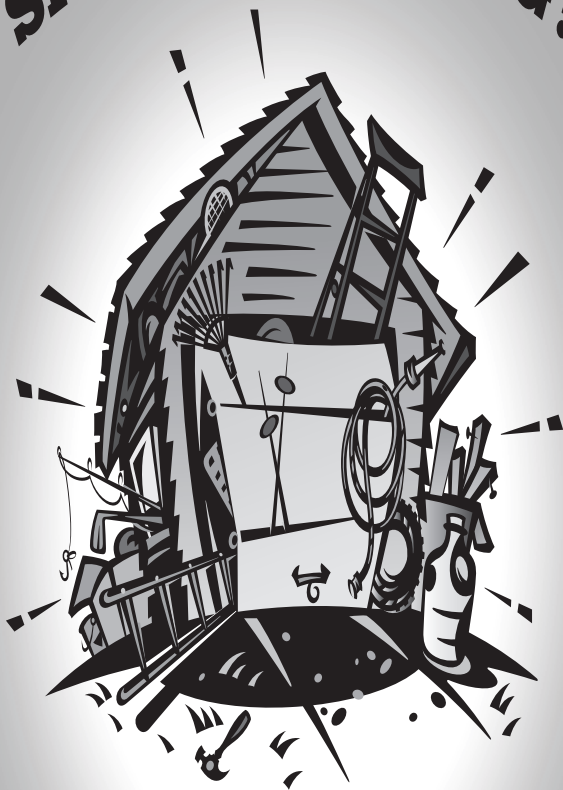

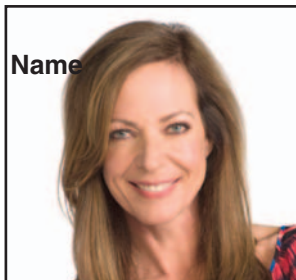
Is more 'Mom' in the cards for Allison Janney?

Q: Since she got an Oscar nomination and has been winning many awards for "I, Tonya," will Allison Janney stay with "Mom"? — Kate Johnson, Warren, Ohio

A: We'd expect so, should the CBS comedy be renewed again. Janney has been continuing her movie work throughout the run of the series, which also has brought her a bounty of honors — and the television role of Bonnie has given her plenty to do, in both comedic and dramatic terms. She's an actress who clearly appreciates good writing, as her "I, Tonya" acceptance speeches indicated, so it would surprise us if she didn't stay with "Mom" for as long as the show is around.

Q: Are Barba and the actor who plays him



really gone from "Law & Order: Special Victims Unit"? — Todd Dimmick, via e-mail

A: Yes ...though, with the way that franchise works, we'd never rule out a possible guest appearance down the road. (Consider that Sam Waterston returned as the mother ship's Jack McCoy in that same episode.) The NBC series successfully kept under wraps the fact that Raul Esparza would be leaving until the early-February story aired.

It had been announced that Philip Winchester would transfer his "Chicago

Justice" character to the show, but supposedly on a recurring basis rather than as a full replacement. However, that "SVU" tale gave his Peter Stone a considerable amount to do — including in the opening scene that literally laid his father, Ben Stone (represented by a portrait of actor Michael Moriarty), to rest — so eagle-eyed viewers might have suspected something more was up before the hour's final scene confirmed Barba's (and Esparza's) exit.

Q: Why did CBS decide to do a celebrity version of "Big Brother"? — Alice Kahn, Glen Burnie, Md.

A: The idea didn't originate completely with CBS, since other versions of the reality-competition series around the world have done installments featuring famous people. Julie Chen recently told us those behind the American

version had thoughts of a star-driven "Big Brother" dating back to very early in the show's run, with Roseanne Barr among those saying at the time that they'd be interested in participating.

What finally made the idea a reality this year was driven at least in part by programming needs, since it gave CBS a handy way to fill several hours per week with just one cost-efficient new series to counter NBC's coverage of the Winter Olympics. Just about everything else on CBS was a repeat during that period, and since "Big Brother: Celebrity Edition" got off to a fast and solid start, it did its intended job.

Jimmy Kimmel is back to host 90th Oscars

Though Jimmy Kimmel doesn't expect another misstep in the announcement of an Academy Award winner, he concedes he wouldn't mind if it happened.

After last year's error heard round the world, with "La La Land" declared best picture — instead of the movie actually specified in the envelope, "Moonlight" — ABC late-night host Kimmel returns for the second consecutive year to preside over the network's broadcast of the 90th Oscar ceremony Sunday, March 4. Presented again from Hollywood's Dolby Theatre, the event is sure to reflect the new consciousness about sexual misconduct that has rocked the entertainment industry in recent months. However, Kimmel also wants the occasion to be the fun that it's always been for movie lovers.

"I think it's important to make the people in the room laugh," he reasons, "and if the people in the room laugh, the audience

at home will at least ... you know, we've been conditioned to react to a laugh track since probably the '50s. And I think it's important for the audience at home to hear people laughing, maybe even more important than making them laugh themselves."

Regarding the awards themselves, vote counter and envelope guard Price-waterhouseCoopers has instituted several new rules to prevent last year's now-legendary wrong-winner gaffe from reoccurring.

Still, Kimmel muses, "If it happens again, literally everyone that works at ABC should be fired, right? If it happens one time,

that's, I think, understandable. But if it happens a second time, no one (there) is competent enough to be running a television show or network ... so I don't think it's going to happen again. If it did, I would have to admit, it would tickle me deeply."

DID YOU KNOW



Mariska Hargitay was born in 1964, in Santa Monica, California. Her parents are Mickey Hargitay and Jayne Mansfield. She is the youngest of their three children.

In June 1967, Hargitay and her two brothers were in the backseat of a car when it was involved in the fatal accident that killed her mother. The children escaped with minor injuries.

She majored in theater at UCLA. Her first motion picture feature was the cult favorite, "Ghoulies" in 1984, in which she gave a memorable performance as Donna.

Unlike her mother, who had changed her name, her hair color, and did nude pictorials to become a star, Hargitay took a very different approach on her journey to become a star. She rejected advice to change her name and appearance. And she refused to copy her mother's image by turning down nude scenes in her films.

Her recurring role on the top-rated "ER" in 1998 gave her career enough of a jolt to land her the starring role of Det. Olivia Benson in "Law & Order: Special Victims Unit." She played Olivia as a tough,

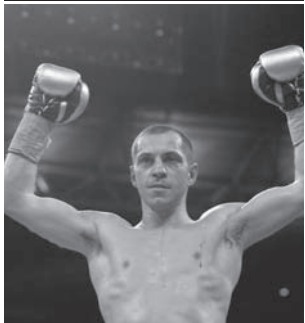
compassionate detective, and did action scenes and her own stunt work, reaping the rewards from the hit TV show, after struggling and studying her craft for 15 years.

Hargitay became one of the highest-paid actresses on television, winning Emmy and Golden Globe awards for her performances on "Law & Order: SVU." The show also changed her personal life, since she met her husband, actor Peter Hermann, on the set and married him in 2004.

Hargitay became an activist, when fans of her show, who had been abused, would write to her, and she founded a non-profit organization called Joyful Heart Foundation to help "survivors of sexual assault, domestic violence, and child abuse."

She gave birth to her son, August, in 2006. But that tremendous joy was soon followed by tremendous sadness when her beloved father, Mickey, died just two months later at the age of 80. Mariska and her husband adopted two children, a girl named Amaya, and a boy named Andrew, within a span of few months in 2011.
