## O'Rourke enters 2020 field

Former Texas rep. attempting to score with bipartisan appeal

AUSTIN, Texas - Forme Texas Democratic Rep. Beto O'Rourke jumped into the 2020 presidential race Thurs day, shaking up the alread packed field and pledging to major parties as he tries to major parties as he tries to rity into a formidable White House bid.
After months of ignoring states that vote early in the presidential nominating process, O'Rourke made his ping into a coffee shop in th town of Keokuk while many cable networks went live. H took questions about every thing from his support of federal legalization of mari juana to abortion rights to the possibility of a universal bas arms and gesticulating. It was the kind of high energy, off-the-cuff style that made him a sensation in Texas, but O'Rourke also wa clear that he doesn't believe in drawing a policy distinction that could allow him to clash with President Donald Trump on the issue.
Trump, for his part, took note of O'Rourke's energetic gesticulation, on display a several cable TV network "Well I think semments of hand movement," Trump told reporters in the Oval Office. He added: "Is he crazy or is that just how he acts?" Until he challenged Republican Sen. Ted Cruz last year O'Rourke was little known Paso. But the Spanish-speaking 46-year-old former punk rocker used grassroots orga nizing and social media savvy to mobilize young voters and minorities and get within percentage points of winning state. state. campaign that seeks to brin

House panel calls for stricter scrutiny in wake of UCF scandal

The Florida House's top investiative committee adopted a series of recommendations on Thursday tices in the state university system after finding University of Central Florida officials ignored state rules when misspending $\$ 85$ million in state funds.
Seeking to address a systematic problem, the House Public Integrity and Ethics Committee wants
more training for university trustees and is recommending changes to practices and rules of the Board of Governors, which oversees the state university system.
"The personalities and relationships overtook checks and balances part of the problem that led to the issue here today," Committee Chair Tom Leek, R-Ormond Beach, said.
The House panel also called on the BOG to further investigate complaints of "waste, fraud and The committee now is turning its focus to the University of South Florida, which last year selfreported misusing $\$ 6.4$ million on construction project.
"An investigation in the size and scope of what had to take place time and bandwidth, so now with the end of this chapter we can turn o some of the other things we need o look at," Leek said.
For now, the only set of recommendations pushed by the committee is in relation to UCF's problems, which stem from the
misuse of $\$ 38$ million in leftover operating money, which cannot be spent on construction, to build Trevor Colbourn Hall.
The misappropriation of funds quickly snowballed, leading to the esignation of university leaders, including President Dale Whitaser. Whittaker, who had served vice president before becoming

## Boeing's stock rise ground to a halt

Boeing soared early in 2019 and lifted the Dow Jones Industrial Average with it. Now concerns about the safety of the newest version of its flagship airplane have halted the momentum.
Shares rose 36 percent in steady orders for Boeing jetliners, including its popular 737. Then came Sunday's deadly crash of a 737 Max 8 in Ethio pia, just months after the crash of a Lion Air Max 8 in the Java ea. Now, aviation authori

China have ordered the planes rounded, with U.S. regula ors saying new information showed some similarities between the two incidents. Boeing shares were down nearly 11 percent this week through Wednesday, and had lost about $\$ 26$ bilion in market
value. The shares still have outpaced the market in 2019 and account for more than 15 percent of the Dow's increase
so far. The immediate question for Boeing investors is whethe and crash investigations will have just a short-term effect on Boeing shares and finances, or have a longer-term impact. "We think an investment in Boeing stock should take into account its long history of sasiness and strong demand
dynamics," said Jim Corridore an equity analyst at CFRA. Canaccord Genuity analys Ken Herbert said Boeing has likely been working on a software fix for the new 737 s since the Lion Air crashlast year and much of the cost has already
been factored into its guidance for the year. But other risks remain. Plane delivery delays are now a concern along with costs for compensating airlines for service disruptions. "We still see some uncertainty around the timing of the root cause analysis," he said. The Max 8 is the latest version of the single-aisle 737 which is the world's mos common passenger jet. Boeing has taken orders for more than 5,000 of the Max planes from 376 of them.

## Legislature reaches too far down, again

nhis survey of America during the 1830s, French philosopher Alexis de Tocqueville wrote that the hear of American democracy was the "township" - that is, where else, the people is the only source of power; but in no stage of government does the body of citizens exer cise a more immediate influence," Tocqueville wrote.
Can someone please teach that lesson in Tallahassee The Republican-led Legislature is once again trying to flex its muscle over local governments, stripping Floridians of their ability to hav immediate influence" with local officials. "pre-emption" bills whereby Tallahassee decides how Florida counties and cities will govern themselves. One such measure - House Bill 3 , offered by state Rep. Michael Grant, R-Port Charlotte - h ocal governments particularly perturbed.
A House staff report notes that Grant's bill would prohibit ocal governments from enacting or imposing new regula
tions on businesses after July 1,2019 , unless the local gove ing body can publicly justify such requirements are essential to protect public health, safety, or welfare; that the regulations do not "adversely affect the availability of the business' services to the public"; and that the "least restrictive and most cost-effective regulatory scheme is being used." If local governments can achieve all that, officials stil latory costs. At that point the regulation requires support from two-thirds of the governing body, and would sunset within two years of the date of adoption.
The bill exempts proposed regulations dealing with zoning, nuisances and alcohol or tobacco, as well as those that increase building costs by less than \$750 Last week Grant told the Florida Phoenix that the bill's intent "is to save small business owners money." one county to another that differ," he said, "it increases the cost to businesses." Cragin Mosteller of the Florida Association of Counties told us the bill will affect things like retail sales, civil rights laws such as employment protection for the LGBT community and ordinances governing strip clubs. She added that the association believes the bill is applicable to zoning ordinances, reported that coastal communities worry it will repeal or preclude bans on plastic straws or cups on the beaches. Who knows where else it could lead?
This bill destroys the right of local officials to regulate commerce as they see fit for their constituents. People in Polk County, for example, may disagree with bans on plastic straws or local mandates on hir ing practices for certain minority groups. But that blocked from enacting such rules if they want them. The authority of local governments is not sacrosanct. On some issues, the Legislature must step in and overrule. But Grant's bill is too much, too controlling and goes too far. Lawmakers ought to reject it.

Q: I inherited a 2003 Final 500 Edition Oldsmobile Aurora with 58,000 miles and in pretty decent condition. It has only been in the last five years as it sat in a three-sided carport. I drive a late model SUV full time, but I'm thinking of using the Olds as a sum mer weekend sedan. 1 ave a trusted mech what type of things should have him check out to insure its reliable roadworthiness. Fluids, belts, hoses, belts brake lines, etc. Any advice would be greatly was the original owne and there is some senti mental value attached.

A: Your Tech should have no problem with any of this, but I'll chip classic were mine. I'd approach this from three angles: first, a comprehensive used vehicle inspection in order to establish a baseline for needed service and repairs; second, up to date and mileage; and, finally, addressing possible issues related o long-term storage. With 58,000 miles on the clock, the Olds should be in pretty good tion, with the possib exception of the battery, brake wear and rotor rust, and belts and hoses. A 60,000 service would take care of needed fluid and
maintenance needs.
'd certainly flush and renew brake fluid, remove and replace as much fuel as possible (gas goes stale over time), and check all four tires for the four-digit number embossed on the side wall, the final four digits of the tire information number. Look for the abbreviation "DOT" (Department of Transthis will be four charac ters; keep going to the right to an oval shaped area with bullets at each end. The date code is the final four digits of this sequence. For example 4304 would mean tured in the 43rd we of 2004. It's recommended to discard tires more than 10 years old. If the carport offered shade for the tires I stretch this a bit, if they look great otherwise. Adding a bottle of Techron or similar fuel system cleaner will help to diminish fuel system deposits. I'd run a half tank of fuel through and any remaining stale fuel before taking any trips or strong hill climbs. And if you'll be storing the car during the off-season, how abou hooking up a battery
