The Putnam County Sheriff's Office has received reports of a telephone scam that involves people identifying themselves as Detectives with the Sheriff's Office.

The scammers are using a telephone service that allows them to choose how their phone call is identified by caller ID. Consequently, caller ID will show the scam call is coming from the Sheriff's Office.

The individual will telephone the victim, tell them they missed jury duty and a warrant has been issued for their arrest. The victim is then given the option of going to jail or going to Walgreens, CVS, or Winn Dixie and getting a green dot card for a specified amount and paying the money over the telephone using the green card.

Please be aware this is a scam! The Sheriff's Office will not contact anyone in this manner concerning a warrant or accept "payment" over the telephone to avoid arrest.

If you are contacted by anyone demanding money who says they are a law enforcement officer, please do not pay them anything and report it to the law enforcement agency in your local jurisdiction.

Man Stabbed to Death in Failed Robbery Attempt

On Friday, May 23, Deputies and Detectives with the Putnam County Sheriff's Office Major Crimes Unit responded to the Kangaroo convenience store located at 1140 County Road 309 in Fruitland in reference to an armed robbery attempt.

Upon arrival deputies and detectives found the

robbery suspect, 43-year-old Jeffrey Charles Lohman, deceased from a stab wound.

After interviewing witnesses it was determined that Lohman entered the store and demanded money while brandishing a box cutter. A bystander, 37-year-old Anthony Shebester, came to the aid of the store clerk arming himself with a pocket knife and in the ensuing struggle Lohman was

stabbed and expired on the scene.

Lohman was a resident of Fruitland with a criminal past and had an outstanding warrant for failure to appear on a warrant for organized skeem to defraud at the time of the incident.

Neither Shebester or the store clerk were injured during the incident. The store clerk's identity was not known at the time of this publication.

Buckle Up America! - **Click It or Ticket** is going on now through Friday, June 6. Click It or Ticket is a campaign that is aimed at increasing seatbelt use and awareness by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA). Before 1980, volunteer seatbelt usage was at about 11%. Despite efforts at the local and state levels to increase awareness by the end of 1984 usage had only increased to 15%.

In 1984, New York became the first state to enact a mandatory seatbelt use law, and by 1990 thirty-seven other states had followed their lead. Figures released in 2003 found that 83% of the 800 people polled said they wore their seatbelts.

Today's campaigns are aimed at Younger drivers and studies have shown that drivers are still not buckling up at night the way they should. More motorists who are killed in crashes at night are unrestrained at the time of the crashes (61 percent) than those killed in crashes during the day (43 percent).

NHTSA data show that the use of seat belts in passenger vehicles saved an estimated 12,174 lives in 2012. Seat belts have saved nearly 63,000 lives during the 5-year-period from 2008 to 2012. So, day or night, "Click It or Ticket"

Saturday, May 31 is **World No Tobacco Day**. This is a day that has been recognized annually since 1987, sponsored by the World Health Organization (WHO), to raise awareness of the affects smoking has on those who do it and also on those around them. The tobacco diseases and the deaths it causes are epidemic. Statistics show that nearly 6 million people die annually from tobacco related illnesses, and 600,000 of those are non-users who die from the effects of second hand smoke.

This year's campaign is focusing on the taxes assessed on tobacco products. Research has shown that a tax increase that will raise the price of tobacco products by 10% will decrease tobacco use in lower and middle income populations and help prevent young people from ever starting to smoke.

They also propose a 50% increase in excise tax, which would bring in an additional 1.4 billion in additional funds in 22 low-income countries. If allocated to health, government health spending in these countries could increase by up to 50%.

Here are some facts about cigarette smoke and smoking:

- There are more than 4,000 chemicals in tobacco smoke, of which at least 250 are known to be harmful and more than 50 are known to cause cancer.
- There is no safe level of exposure to second-hand tobacco smoke.
- In adults, second-hand smoke causes serious cardiovascular and respiratory diseases, including coronary heart disease and lung cancer.
- In infants, it causes sudden death.
- In pregnant women, it causes low birth weight.
- Over 40% of children have at least one smoking parent.



Nature Play "Prescription" Pilot Project

Time spent outdoors supports many aspects of children's health. Children who spend more time outside tend to be more physically active and are less likely to be overweight. Additionally, new research suggests that play in nature influences creativity, problem-solving, emotional and intellectual development, and may protect against nearsightedness and vitamin D deficiency. Outdoor play is also associated with a variety of other psychosocial benefits.

These findings are one of the reasons that the Florida Department of Health in Putnam County announced that the launch of the Nature Play "Prescription" Pilot Project. The goal of the project is

to increase healthy activity for children and their families through access to Florida's remarkable state parks. The "prescription" will grant a onetime, free entry into a state park for a child and their family or friends.

"Nature Play 'Prescription' is a great opportunity for children and families to get outside and enjoy Florida's outstanding state parks," said State Surgeon General and Secretary of Health Dr. John Armstrong. "This groundbreaking collaboration is another example of how state agencies are working together for Florida's families."

"With the Ravine Gardens, Dunn's Creek and the Cross Florida Greenway all Putnam county residents are in close proximity of a state park," said Mary Garcia, Administrator of the Florida De-

partment of Health in Putnam County, "If you live in the area, there's an opportunity to enjoy outdoor recreation at the State Parks and Putnam County's Blueways and Trails. Children will enjoy hiking, watching wildlife or playing on the playground."

Florida's 171 state parks and trails inspire residents and visitors with recreation opportunities and scenic beauty that help strengthen families, educate children, expand local economies and foster community pride. With 161 parks, 10 state trails, nearly 800,000 acres, 100 miles of beaches and more than 1,500 miles of multi-use trails, Florida's families are invited to visit soon and often to enjoy Florida's natural treasures.


The Department of Health in Putnam County will participate in the pilot program by providing Dr. Eric Jump, Kid's Care Pediatrics and Jane Zentko, Registered Dietician at DOH-Putnam "prescriptions" to hand out to patients. The pilot project includes 10,000 "prescription" passes, which may be used at Florida state parks from April through June.

Then in October the final data will be collected and evaluation. The evaluation will help determine just how many of the passes were "prescribed", how many were redeemed and which type of health professional "prescribed" them most often? The determination of efficacy: did park administrators and healthcare professionals find the program worthwhile and would they like to see it continue?

The program was launched during Children's Week, April 6-11 in Tallahassee, an annual week dedicated to promoting the health, safety and well being of children and families in Florida. The Department of Health participated in the week by highlighting the many services offered to children and their families from pre-natal through young adulthood. The Nature Play "Prescription" Pilot Project offers an opportunity for children and families to increase physical activity and represents the most recent effort of Healthiest Weight Florida. Like Nehemiah we can Re-new

I love the Bible story about Nehemiah's concerns for a people who are a lot like us. They live in a small, struggling community, and sometimes barely manage to get by. As he considers their predicament, Nehemiah feels compelled to help the community re-vitalize and re-build.

He begins the process by taking a slow walk around town at night. What a brave thing to do! We all know there are a lot of unseen things that go bump in the night – and we sure don't want to be there for that. To his credit, Nehemiah travels down the west side, across the south side, and up the east side, looking at the city from every point of view. After his midnight trip, he shares

an idea: Let's make this city like new! The people responded with enthusiasm and began working for the common good. (Nehemiah 2:11-20)

As a down to earth Christian, with a special love for Putnam people, two ideas from this story stand out: 'considering every point of view' and 'working for the common good.' I don't know about you, but these are ideas I'd love to engage. Granted, this is slow tedious work; but it's important work. Like Nehemiah, we can re-view and re-new, re-imagine and re-mind, and re-build.

In her book Amen, Gretta Vosper suggests people of faith also re-focus. No more pointing a fearful finger toward God in the sky. Instead, it's time we look at one another and focus on what we all have in common: life, right here, right

now, on this earth. She also suggests we re-new our commitment to the greatest commandment and tend to each other's needs with love. In Original Blessing, Matthew Fox re-minds: if we were to put the "...energies of people, knowledge, talent, and capital to work to feed, educate, heal and house..." we would have no shortage of jobs.

However, in order to accomplish such great things, we'll have to do a lot of letting go. Letting go of old ideas, to create space for re-imagining the future; letting go of assumptions, stereotypes and prejudices, to re-new meaning-filled relationships; letting go of how 'we've always done it' to re-connect with a spirit of creativity capable of re-building and re-birth.

So what do you say? Are you willing to take a stroll around our com-

munity and consider life from other points of view? Are you willing to widen the welcome and seek the common good? If so, I invite you to explore with me, an innovative internet resource offered by Global Ministries titled "R.E.A.D.Y." It is a useful guide for a slow walk around town. It begins with 2 videos: "Silent Beats" and "The Danger of a Single Story" which shine light on un-seen things which we fear will go bump in the night and offers a wider view. (Oh yeah, did I mention it's free?) Let's do it! Let's make our community like new!





The Watermelon is a true Summer Delight

You're at a summer picnic and someone pulls a watermelon out of a cooler full of ice and cuts it into slices. You grab a piece and bite into it's red, ripe flesh just knowing that it's going to be ice cold and sweet as sugar! Sure enough as you take that first bite and the juice runs down your chin onto your arms, you savor the taste that is summer, there's just nothing better than that!!



The watermelon (*Citrullus vulgaris*) dates back to prehistoric times where it was originally believed to have been found growing wild in Africa. It was known to have been grown by the ancient Egyptians as it is depicted in pictures that have survived until today. Watermelon

seeds were even said to have been found in the tomb of the famous King Tut. They have long been and remain until today an important water source for people in desert climates. They were introduced to the Americas in the 1600's by European slave traders and it was at that time they were also given their name. Until then they were known as citrul, a French-Italian word, or pasteque a French-Arab combination.

There are over 1200 varieties of watermelons, the ones we are accustomed to seeing in the grocery store usually range from round to oblong with red meat and are either seedless or seeded. There are also orange white and yellow and they can range in size from one to 200 pounds each. Forty Four US states produce watermelons and the season runs from May to September. Other times of the year watermelon is imported from Mexico and Central America where it has a longer season.

Watermelon is a member of the Cucurbitaceae family, the watermelon is related to the cantaloupe, squash, pumpkin, cucumber, and gourd that grow on vines on the ground. It has a very high water content (thus its name) of 90% or more. A one

cup serving contains only 46 calories making it a good option for those who are watching their waistline.

It has both antioxidant and anti-inflammatory properties, with one of the most prominent nutrients being lycopene.

Lycopene is a well-known antioxidant, with the ability to neutralize free radical molecules, found in the flesh of fruits and vegetables with pink and red flesh such as tomatoes, guava and pink grapefruit.

It is also able to stop many inflammatory processes in the body as well. It increases as the ripeness of the watermelon increases so for the most optimal amount of lycopene available make sure you are eating the ripest fruit available. It has shown promising benefit in its role in the prevention of prostate cancer, cardiovascular disease and breast disease. It is also showing benefit to lung cancer.

Another significant antioxidant that we find is beta-carotene. It also increases with the ripeness of the watermelon.

Beta-carotene has positive association with decreased risk of cardio-vascular disease as well as oral cavity, and lung cancers. Beta-carotene is also a precursor of vitamin A.

We need vitamin A for

healthy skin and mucus membranes, our immune system, and good eye health and vision.

Another nutrient that researchers are finding plentiful in watermelon is L-citrulline which is then converted into arginine. It was found in a study published in the American Journal of Hypertension that the L-citrulline in watermelon extract given over a 6 week period could help to reverse the inability of the blood vessels to dilate and function properly is known as endothelial dysfunction.

If watermelon can reverse this process, it would certainly provide a breakthrough alternative to many of the drugs used for primary prevention of hypertension and cardiovascular disease. It is a very promising direction for science to go in.

Watermelon is a great boost to beauty as well. It contains just the right amounts of Vitamins A, B6 and C to do wonders for your skin and with all that water it is perfect to keep you well hydrated all summer long! The Lycopene and beta-carotene mentioned earlier will also help to decrease the signs of aging.

For glowing, softer skin: Mix 1 teaspoon watermelon juice, 1 teaspoon plain Greek Yogurt.

The lactic acid and

enzymes in the yogurt will help gently exfoliate and purify while the watermelon hydrates and heals. Apply the mask to your face and neck for 10 minutes before rinsing off.

We all love to eat watermelon just the way it is nice and cold in slices or cut up in chunks, but here are a couple of recipes to give you some idea of a couple of ways to include it in your daily routine. The one for "vitamin water" makes a good replacement for soda on a hot summer day.

Watermelon-Cucumber Salad



INGREDIENTS:

- 6 cups cubed seedless watermelon.
- 4 cups cubed English cucumber (also known as a seedless cucumber) If you can't find these, use regular and scrape out the seeds
- 2 tbls. Fresh mint chopped.
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 tablespoon white sugar (optional)
- 1/2 cup balsamic vinegar
- 1-2 oz. crumbled

feta of goat cheese (your preference)

DIRECTIONS:

1. Place the watermelon and cucumber cubes in a large bowl, and gently toss with the salt and sugar and mint.
2. Drizzle with balsamic vinegar and toss to coat.
3. Refrigerate for 15 minutes or more.
4. Gently toss one last time before serving.
5. Scatter crumbled cheese on top.






