County OKs Triumph deal for recovery

More than \$6.6 million in BP settlement money will be used to soften Hurricane Michael's impact

PANAMA CITY Bay County is set to get more than $\$ 6.6$ millio money for Hurricane Michael recovery through an agreement officials approved Tuesday.
The money will be used mainly to help cove property tax losses caused by Hurricane Michael for the county's unincorporated areas, the cities and the school district.
Come Bay County Commission approved Triumph Gulf Coast Board during its regular meetin on Tuesday. The board still must finalize the agreement during its meeting at the end of the month before

How it works
In February, the Triumph Gulf Coast Board, which oversees the use of settlement money from the 2010 Deepwater Horizon disaster, created a $\$ 15$ million fund for Bay, Gulf, Franklin and Wakulla counties. The money can of the ad valorem property tax revenue an applicant expects to lose because o the hurricane.

## PC mayor grabs 61.6\% of the vote

PANAMA CITY - In an easy victory, Panama City Mayo Greg Brudnicki will be able to continue what he started after Hurricane Michael, claiming $61.6 \%$ of the vote in Tuesday' election. election.
"It's a great feeling to know that I have that much support from our citizens," Brudnick said. "I'm just ready to continue working as I have for the last eight years with the job of shrinking the time between disaster and recovery. ... It was worth it. The citizens are worth it. Panama City is worth it."
While celebration was breaking out at Brudnicki's party, across town in the Ward
2 race it was a different story. 2 race it was a different story. incumbent Ken Brown, Community Redevelopment Agency Director Ton Shamplain and newcomer Marquis Tyson yielded no clea winner Tuesday night.
To win the race, a candidate needs 50 percent of the vote plus one, a target Brown fel just three votes shy of based Tuesday night. In a race with 675 votes cast, Brown took 335, Shamplain had 267 and Tyson had 74. There will be a

He also said he was feeling "pretty good" about the number of votes he received. Shamplain could not be reached for comment. In the event of a runoff, the election would be May 21, according to the supervisor of elections website

"The voters who voted have spoken," Brudnicki said, after a race that often questioned past decisions Brudnicki was a part of, such as the cost of the new Panama City City Hall. "I want to thank every single person in this room for their support and the voters."
Brudnicki was the clear leader in the race going into voting day, raising far more money than his opponents, a strong indicator has been a strong indicator ahead of elections in Panama City

Inhis victory speech, Brudnicki made a point of saying that people called him asking to support his campaign. "I will work tirelessly to make Panama City bigger, better and stronger," Brudnicki said. ## What was lost, saved from fire?

Notre Dame Cathedra blaze didn't destroy a of famed structure

PARIS - More than simply an iconic cathedral and jewel of Gothic architecture, Notre Dame was a treasure trove, housing priceless and irreplaceable marvels of immense religious, artistic, musical, historical and architectural value.
Some were lost to humanity forever in the blaze that ravaged the Paris cathedral Monday. Others were spared, at least in part, or saved before the flames con A look at what is know about Notre Dame's treasures and their fate.

## CROWN OF THORNS

Regarded as the cathedral's most sacred relic, Paris Mayor Anne Hidalgo says the Crown of Thorns was saved. It is purported to be a reic of the Jesus Christ at his crucifixion, Jesus Christ at his crucifixion, by King Louis IX in the 13 th century. It is made of rushes wrapped into a wreath and tied with gold filament. Since 1896 it has been kept under glass and only occasionally displayed. Wife of ex-Texas lawman pleads guilty in homicides

The wife of a former Texas police chief has accepted aplea deal in a western New York double homicide.

Police say they have arrested more than 200 people after climate change protesters blocked major bridges and intersections in central London, bringing traffic to a standstill.

Samsung handset's nnovation hinges

LONDON - When Samsung said this year it would launch a smartphone with a folding screen, the big question was whether the innovation was something people actually wanted or eeded.
Is the Galaxy Fold a gimmick to help sell more market or a true breakthrough that will change how we use our devices?
Major manufacturers have in recent years been argely updating smart phones with marginal mprovements like better cameras and face scannin echnology, so skepticism as been high
The South Korean electronics company this hands-on preview ahead of the release in the U.S this month, and the first mpression is that a folding screen in some circum tances might be a useful innovation - but at a cost of almost $\$ 2,000$ it won't e mass market product anytime soon.

WHY A FOLDABLE SCREEN?

## OPEN AND SHU

Closed, the Galaxy Fold is about 2.5 by 6.3 inches. It felt ine holding a TV The phone's two panels are held shut by magnets, so a bit of force is needed to get it open. With a little practice I was able to do it one-handed by jamming my thumb between the two sections to pop them apart. Samsung spent nearly five years working on the hinge, which went through more than 1,000 prototypes. It uses cogs and gears to give two two open positions. First, handy if you want to put it down on your desk but still need to angle part of the screen for a video call, for example. Bend it further and the screen silently and solidly opens to a flat position. To close the phone, you click it out of the open position and snap the sides shut.

## SCREEN TIME

Fully open, there's plenty of real estate on the Galaxy Fold's main screen, which measures 7.3 inches diagonally. It's great if you want watch videos or reade-books
without squinting. Multitasking is also possible withup to three apps open at the same time. Wide open, the Fold felt more like a small tablet than a smartphone, which suggests that one possible market is people who want both kinds of devices but don't want to

YouTube's Notre Dame9/11 flub highlights AI's blind spots

SAN FRANCISCO - YouTube might need a few more humans. The machines whose ob is to tamp down conspiracy theories are not cutting it just yet.
As people around the world watch Notre Dame Cathedral burn in Paris, an automated system attached background information about the Sept. 11 terror attacks in New York to livestream videos of the fire.
The cause of the blaze has not been determined, but authorities said it appeared to be accidental, not arson or errorism.
The background note was posted by a system YouTube recently put in place to combat
well-known conspiracies about such events as the moon landing or $9 / 11$. In this case, the algorithm might have had the opposite effect, fueling speculation about the cause of the fire and who might be behind it.
It's the latest example of artificial intelligence misfiring - and a signthat we have along way to go before AI becomes mart enough to understand nuance and context

Well, the effort continued last week in the Senate. It actually began with Sen. Travis Hutson, R-St. Augustine.
Part of the bill in progress calls for a $\$ 25,000$ fine for any municipality or county that prohibits the sale of some sunscreens. It looks like the Senate prohibition on any municipal ban of plastic straws will continue though the stiff penalties have been waived. Hutson, who chairs the Senate Appropriations Subcommittee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development, also had wanted any city that didn't toe the state line on sunscreens and soft drink straws to be declared "off limits" for any of
the $\$ 50$ million in tourism marketing handed out by Visit Florida. It appears he's backed off that, at least for the time being - or this session. Studies show chemicals in some sunscreens have been shown to have detrimental effects on coral reefs oxybenzone in particular. According to manufacturer Johnson \& Johnson, oxybenzone studies have led to "widespread disinformation about the effects of the chemical on coral reef bleaching." Yet, the chemical has been banned in Hawaii, Palau, Bonaire and Aruba It's also worth noting that Johnson \& Johnson - along with Walmart and Publix - are registered to lobby for SB 588 in Tallahassee, Two other studies recently released indicate oxybenzone is associated with adverse effects on pregnant women and newborns. It has also now

Disease. It develops in the first trimester of pregnancy Disease. It develops in the first trimester of pregnan
and stops nerve cells from developing in the colon and rectum. This prevents newborns from passing stool, usually requiring surgical intervention. Two months ago the U.S. Food and Drug Administration delisted oxybenzone from being generally recognized as safe and effective. Health \& Human Services' National Toxicology Program has run tests showing oxybenzone can cause endocrine disruption to reproductive physiology, including lower sperm density, reduced prostate size, changes in estrous cycles, lower testosterone breast develop lend reduction to immunitie breast development and reduction to immunities. that sunscreen bans are "silly" because th lotions protect us from sunburns.
He wants credible science on his side before allowing the ban. The USDA and HHS apparently are not credible enough for the senator. And he's going to have both plastic straws and sunscreen studied by the Office of Program Policy Analysis and Government

Telemedicine, walk-in clinics cloud role of family doctor

Lisa Love hasn't seen her doctor of 25 years since she discovered telemedicine.
Love tried virtual visits last summer for help with a skin irritation and returned for She doesn't feel a pressing need to seek care the old-fashioned way, especially since she also gets free health screenings at work.
No more waiting for the doctor's office to open. Convenience rules in health care now, where patients can use technology or growing options like walk-in clinics and urgent care centers to need it. A survey last year found U.S. adults don't have a regular doctor. Some like Love wonder how much they still need one. "Telemedicine proba bly can't do everything but for most of the things I might ever have, I'm pretty sure they can take care of it," the Twin Falls,
Idaho, resident said. Health resident said. the changing, fragmented nature of care is precisely why people still need someone who looks out for their overall health, which is the traditional role of primary care physicians like family doctors and internists.

More recently mployers have started adding worksite clinics, and thousands of urgent around the country to treat emergencies that aren't life-threatening. Then there's telemedicine, which patients can se to connect to a doctor in minutes without leav ing their home or office. Love said she's hooked on virtual visits. They half the price of an office visit under her insurance "plan. "Ilike technology and saving money," Love said. "It was worth it to me to try it." About 25\% of adults don't have a regular doctor, the nonprofit Kaiser Family Founda jumps to $45 \%$ foar. That umps to $45 \%$ for thos under age 30.

TALLAHASSEE - Gov Ron DeSantis on Monday downplayed growing concerns that President Donald Trump is putting Florida's coastal waters exploration.

In two of the highest profile issues of the 2019 legislative session, the Senate today is slated to take up pro posals designed to bolste school safety and build o expand three toll roads. During a floor session senators are expected to consider a wide-ranging Education Chairman Manny Education Chairman Mann diaz Jr., R-Hialeah, that is a follow-up to school-safety legislation passed last yea
after the mass shooting a Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School in Parkland. The bill has drawn controversy because it would expand a school "guardian" progran to allow trained classroom teachers to be armed.
Also during the floor ses a bill (SB 7068), sponsore
by Infrastructure and Security Chairman Tom Lee, R -Thonotosassa, that would ead to three major toll-road projects.
The bill, a priority of Senate President Bill Galvano, R-Bradenton, seeks to extend the Suncoast Parkway from the Tampa Bay area to the Georgia border; extend the Florida Turnpike west to connect with the Suncoast Parkway; and build a new toll road that would go from Polk
County to Collier County. Galvano says, in part that the projects could help boost the economies of rould help boost the economies of rural areas
of the state, but environmentalists have raised concerns about urban sprawl.

TALLAHASSEE Bill would hike smoking, vaping age to 21
The minimum age for Floridians to possess tobacco and vaping products that deliver 21 under legislation approved 21 under legislation approved The measure that cleared the House Appropriations Committee on Tuesday also would establish 21 as the minimum age for smokable forms of medical marijuana. Members of the military would be exempt from the age restrictions.
Sponsors said the bill would improve public health and reating cancer, heart disease and other smoking-related and othe Thes.
They said the health effects of vaping are largely unknown and that the practice could ead young people to tobacco. The vaping industry and some health groups said can help people quit or avoid moking tobacco.
A similar bill is moving in the Senate.

FLASH IN THE PAN
Just like Mom's
Matzo meal makes Mexican meatballs taste like home

$\tau T$ hen I was a restaurant hen I was a restaurant
critic in Albuquerque, I reviewed a small Mexican establishment named Dahlia's, tucked into a strip mall on the city's west side. The meal had its ups and downs, but the highlight
was as unexpected as it was impreswas as unexpected as it was impres-
sive: a bowl of matzo balls worthy of my Jewish mother's respect. Technically, they were albondigas, Mexican-style beef meatballs served in a shallow bowl of tomato-based vegetable soup. But they felt like Mexican matzo balls. Mom's matzo balls were always my favorite part of Passover. They have a mellow, soothing flavor and broth without softening and I could always count on the juicy, savory satisfaction of a matzo ball dunked in her dilly chicken soup.

## Food and faith

Albondigas don't always taste like good matzo balls, especially Mom's, but Dahlia's had that general quality. I wondered if they had anything to do with the secret Jews of the Southwest. For centuries, rumors have perSisted of so-called "crypto-Jews" Texas, and historians have gradu ally come to a consensus that the crypto-Jews were indeed real. And that they had good reason to keep their faith and rituals a secret. The crypto-Jews are descendants of Spanish Jews who converted to Christianity - sometimes by force - to escape persecution during the 1300s. Many of these marranos, as they were called, continued to practice Judaism covertly, and some migrated to the New
During the Inquisition Span officials would go from village to vil lage, asking residents if they had see evidence of Jewish behavior among their neighbors, such as the lighting of candles on Friday nights, or avoiding pork. This attitude, understandably, kept Judaism underground.

## Matzo Albondigas

Makes $\mathbf{1 5}$ golf ball-sized spheres

- $3 / 4$ cup matzo meal
- $1 / 2$ teaspoon black pepper
- 1 teaspoon salt
- $1 / 2$ teaspoon garlic powder
- 2 tablespoons crushed pecans
-1 pound ground chicken or turke
- $1 / 2$ cup minced parsley
- 1 tablespoon minced garlic
- 2 eggs, beaten
- 4 tablespoons hot chicken soup broth (recipe below)
Mix the dry ingredients in one bowl, and the parsley, garlic, meat and egg in another. Combine the contents of both bowls, and mix well. Refrigerate for walnut-sized orbs. Drop them in the chicken soup and simmer covered for about 30 minutes.

Mom's Chicken Soup
Serves a whole party

- 1 baked chicken (could be a storebought rotisserie chicken if you're pressed for time) - Salt, garlic salt and pepper to season
burned in my belly: "Is there matzo meal in the albondigas?" Matzo meal being the pulverized matzo used to make matzo balls.
I decided to find out for myself, by using matzo meal in a typical albondigas recipe in place of the rice or masa (corn tortilla flour) traditionally used. My plan: Make matzo albondigas, with chicken instead of beef, because they would be floating in chicken soup, like a matzo ball should. I conducted side-by-side comparisons of my matzo albondigas
the chicken
- 5 quarts water
- 1 onion, unpeeled, cut into quarters - 2 carrots, chopped for soup (about 2 cups)
- 3 celery stalks, cut for soup (about 2 cups)
- Parsley stems leftover from matzo ball-making
- 3 tablespoons dried dil
- 1 teaspoon salt, plus more for the final seasoning

Sprinkle the chicken with salt, garlic powder and and black pepper, and bake at 325 F for about two hours, periodically turning and/or basting the bird until it's as soft as a rotisserie chicken from the store. (Or just bring work with remove the meat from th bones and refrigerate.

Heat the water and add the bones along with the attached cartilage and tendons, and as much skin as you wish, as well as the pan drippings (or bag drippings), and simmer for an hour minimum. Add the vegetables, lemon juice, salt, dill and any chicken meat you haven't already devoured, and cook for another 60 minutes. Season
against versions made with rice, masa and even a combination of matzo and masa. Only the pure matzo meal-based albondigas had that special quality, reminiscent of Mom's matzo balls or Dahlia's albondigas.
If you are attending a serious, traditional Passover sedar, I don't recommend bringing these albondigas and attempting to pass them off as matzo balls. Not all Passover veterans are as tolerant as my mom. But you could bring them to a Mexican party call them albondigas, and be fine.

## A saucy way to poach eggs in potatoes

Shakshuka-Stuffed

Makes 2 servings - 2 russet potatoes, no more than 8 ounces each - 2 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil, or more as needed - $1 / 4$ teaspoon fine sea salt, or more as needed - Freshly ground black pep - 1 reasted red pepper (ja 1 1/2 toasted red pepper (jarred) pepper flakes, or more as needed

- 2 tablespoons tomato paste - Whole, no-salt-added toma toes from one 14.5 -ounce can
canned diced tomatoes, drained)
4 large eggs Several stems curly or flat leaf parsley, for garnish

Scrub the potatoes well, cutting out any eyes or spots, hen pat dry. Use a fork to poke each potato 4 or 5 times on with some of the oil, sprinkle with salt and pepper. Place in microwave-safe dish. Microwave on HIGH for 5 minutes Turn them over and microwave on HIGH for an additional 2 or 3 minutes, until soft enough to squeeze. Let them cool on
cutting board. Position an oven rack 4 to ment; preheat the broiler. Lin a small rimmed baking sheet with aluminum foil. Mince the garlic and coarsely chop the roasted red pepper, placing them in a smal saucepan. Add the 2 tablespoons of oil, the $1 / 4$ teaspoon pepper flakes and tomato paste.
Place over medium-high heat and stir, cooking for just 45 seconds or so until everything is fragrant. Crush the tomatoes with your hands so they fall right into the saucepan; once
the mixture begins to bubble at the edges, remove from the as needed and add more salt zest of the $1 / 2$ lemon directly $^{2}$ into the sauce and stir to incorporate.
Cut each cooled potato in half lengthwise, then use a fork to fluff up their insides. Place them on a small rimmed baking tear just shape the potato hal back in place. Use the back of a spoon or ladle to create a deep well at the center of each potato half; you may need to take out a little of the potato flesh. Spoon the sauce onto each potato half; season lightly
with more crushed red peppe flakes. Reshape a well at the enter of each sauce portion this is where an egg will sit. Crack an egg into a small bowl, then gently slide it into the sauce well of one potato half. Repeat with the remaining eggs and potato halves. All of the egg white may not fit, or it might spill out. Try to spoon it eeds a little protection from the intense heat.
