Record-breaking bid at livestock auction to help girl who lost parents

SEBRING — As Hana Piety paraded her hog called Chloe at the Highlands County Livestock Auction Thursday evening, the buzz in the audience grew louder when the bids kept getting higher.

People erupted into applause when the bidding stopped at \$126 per pound, a high bid far above what any other animal received. The price paid for Chloe, which was just over \$31,000 for the 248-pound hog, was most likely a record in the history of the event. With additional donations, the total amount is more than \$34,000.

"I was speechless," Hana said on Friday. "In the beginning I was concentrating on my pig."

But, as the bids skyrocketed, she said, she didn't quite know what to think.

For those who didn't know what was going on, the auctioneer, Brian Trimble, told attendees that the highly unusual bids were part of a community effort to help Hana, 13, a student at Hill-Gustat Middle School, and her family. She lost both her parents to illness within the last four years. She now lives with Marc Piety, her older brother, who has become her guardian.

Hana will receive about 5 cents per pound immediately, but the rest of the money will go into a trust fund that will help her go to college or with her life after school. The trust fund will be administered by Swaine and Harris PA. The hog will be slaughtered and its meat donated to her family.

Marc Piety said people from Hill-Gustat Middle School told them the hog might fetch slightly higher-than-normal bids.

"It was nothing like we expected," he said. "We were in complete awe."

It's been a hard time for Hana, losing her mother first and then her father, he said. "It's been rough for all of us. We have a very close family."

the junior livestock committee when the fair began, and told members about Hana.

He said that Hana has always liked working with animals and she wants to become a veterinarian or be part of another profession that involves animals.

Having the opportunity to raise a hog and prepare it for the fair "has provided an outlet for her," he said. His sister also was happy that her hog was judged third in its class.

Every day, Hana said, she would feed the hog in the morning and at night and clean its enclosure area in the morning.

The special bids for Hana's hog came about through efforts of Hill-Gustat and the Highland County Fair's junior livestock committee.

Jara Ann Corson, a teacher at Hill-Gustat, alerted the livestock committee about Hana and her having lost her parents.

"She's a very good student," Corson said. She's an honor student, a cheerleader and a member of Future Farmers of America.

Candis Dean, assistant principal at Hill-Gustat, agreed that Hana was certainly deserving, as she has been an excellent student.

Corson contacted the junior livestock committee when the fair began, and told members about Hana.

Lindsey Sebring, a member of the livestock committee, worked quickly to find people who would commit to helping with the purchase of the hog. The word quickly spread in the agricultural community and people came forward to help.

Both Corson and Dean said the efforts of Sebring and other members of the junior livestock committee, exceeded what they could have expected.

County Fire assessment on agenda

Consultant to present fire study, assessment amounts

SEBRING — Highlands County commissioners will hear Tuesday about county fire service needs, how much it will cost, who will pay for it and how much they'll pay.

It's the next step in creating a countywide paid fire service out of the existing county-run volunteer-based system. During the 9 a.m. meeting Tuesday at the Board of County Commission chambers, 600 S. Commerce Ave. in Sebring, commissioners will discuss assessment rates for the new system, as proposed by consulting firm Government Services Group Inc.

New rates will replace existing fire district rates on homes, businesses and land to provide centralized funding for all fire stations.

Currently, the county has 10 departments running 22 stations throughout the county: DeSoto

SNL Board tables rate study

SEBRING — Ten months and two supervisors later, the Sun 'n Lake of Sebring Board of Supervisors has not decided yet to study district maintenance assessments.

The board had a recommended consultant, GAI Consultants Inc./Community Solutions Group of Orlando, on Friday's agenda with a proposed \$17,500 contract. Board members tabled the matter for further discussion and to give GAI and competing consultant Government Services Group Inc. out of Tallahassee each an opportunity to explain, at a future meeting, exactly how they intend to gather information and make recommendations on the maintenance assessment rates.

Board President Mark Camp said there needs to be a review of the assessments. In a previous report in 2014, Camp said, GAI suggested raising commercial rates 19.3 times the existing rate and Tanglewood as much as 4.7 times existing rates.

However, he raised questions over whether or not GAI, this time,

Where the sidewalk ends — abruptly

Sidewalks to be repaired, made ADA compliant

LAKE PLACID — Several of the sidewalks in the town are in disrepair and not in compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act. Town Administrator Phil Williams brought several improvement projects before the Town Council during its regular monthly meeting on Feb. 12 to be prioritized.

Williams recommended that sidewalk repairs be one of the highest priorities for the safety of citizens. The council members agreed.

"I have tried to commit to upgrading our sidewalks a little bit every year," Williams said at the meeting. "They were not taken care of for a lot of years. Of all of the projects, I would leave it to council to decide which one you value the most."

"The ones that your town administrator values the most are the sidewalk projects in different areas."

The total for the projects is \$7,246. A few of the named projects include the southwest corner of East Park Avenue and North Pine Avenue where a portion of the sidewalk would be removed and an ADA compliant ramp

Man accused of robbery

SEBRING — A man was arrested after being accused of stealing a purse from a woman inside a convenience store, according to a warrant affidavit released Thursday.

Donnie Bowens Jr., 25, of 3531 Ellington Ave., Sebring, was arrested by the Sebring Police Department and charged

with robbery by sudden snatching. The victim reported after she went into the convenience

store a man later identified as Bowens approached her and told her a man outside in a vehicle was interested

in her. The man then proceeded to proposition her for the other man, the report said.

The victim told authorities she went outside and told the man that he was disrespectful and then returned to the store, the affidavit said. When she left the store, a man believed to be Bowens approached her wearing a surgical mask and a hood with the hood up and grabbed her purse, the affidavit said.

The woman reported that she struggled to get the purse back and ended up being dragged on the parking lot pavement.

Later, several police officers identified Bowens as the suspect from store video, the warrant said.

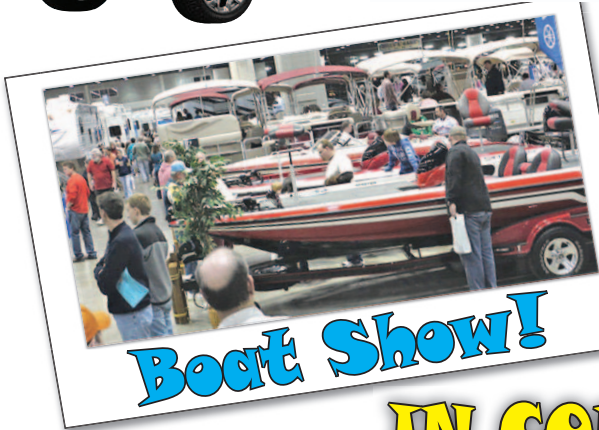

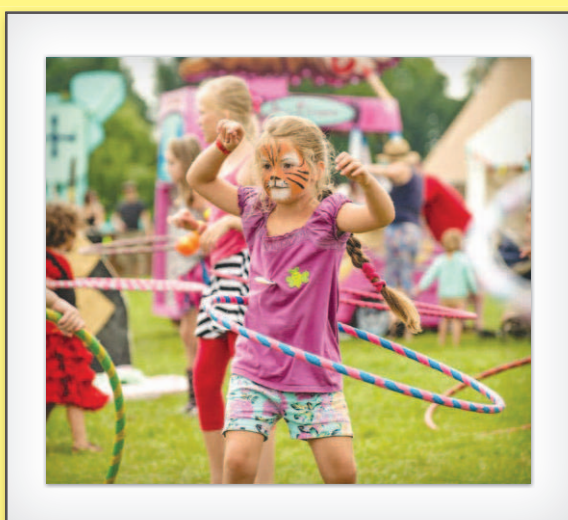

Visible help for CRA district

Between U.S. 27 becoming a major artery of commerce and the Great Recession, downtown Sebring suffered tremendously. Many businesses moved to the highway or closed altogether.

Recently, a rebirth has begun, showing much promise for the future. The Sebring Community Redevelopment Agency has been one of the main engines behind the revival. Actively recruiting small business and offering grants to make moving to downtown not only possible, but advantageous, the CRA is in the forefront of rebirth.

Of course the city itself and the Greater Sebring Chamber of Commerce are also playing vital roles, but it is the new "hands on" attitude of the CRA board that is making the most difference, making sure local tax dollars are used locally.

As of its most recent meeting, Feb. 12, the CRA made clear it intends to become even more proactive in bringing people downtown to shop and dine. From considering outdoor dining areas and special events, the CRA made it clear to Kristie Vasquez, its executive director, she has their support in continuing to create a renaissance.

This is why we strongly support the idea of the CRA moving into what is now the chamber's satellite office right on the Circle.

Looking back over the two years plus since that column, I see we've learned nothing about talking to each other. And I'm not even talking about what to do about

the action.

With a public storefront and easy access, the opportunities it offers small businesses and residents will become better known and put to more use. Especially as the CRA wants to promote more special events.

Having knowledgeable individuals at hand means visitors who stop in will leave with information to be passed on. Even someone who just stops by to use the restroom will learn more about opportunities in downtown and the CRA area.

What needs to be worked out between the CRA and the city is how the expenses will be shared. The city owns the building, which it leased to the chamber. The city provided the funding for the water, sewage and garbage. It also paid the property insurance, which the chamber reimbursed. The CRA hopes that arrangement continues, as well as the \$1 a year lease the chamber paid the city.

The building, however, requires two major upgrades: a new roof and an antennae to provide WiFi. The CRA board indicated it was willing to split the cost of the new roof, and take on the expense of refurbishing the interior. It hopes the city will keep the lease as it is, rather than try to defray other costs by raising the rent. It hopes the city will also pay for the new antennae.

We urge the city to support the CRA in this way. All the money involved comes from tax dollars. Investing in a stronger, more visible presence, right in the heart of an area we all want to prosper, is an intelligent decision. One that will help the entire city.

Issue tickets, not warnings

There have been many letters to the editor lately calling for the lowering of the speed limit on U.S. 27 in an effort to prevent future accidents, and although I applaud their thoughts along those lines, lowering the speed limit is not going to prevent accidents on U.S. 27.

My reasoning for that is two-fold. First, with all the lights in place, 55 mph should not be a problem. The biggest problem is that U.S. 27 has become a veritable speedway with people doing well over the posted speed limit ... many times when I am driving 55 people literally fly past which means they are doing in the 70-80 mph range, if not more. Lowering the speed limit will have no impact on these drivers who are travelling that fast simply because they feel they don't have to observe any speed limit; they can drive at whatever speed they want.

The real problem on U.S. 27 in Sebring is a total and complete lack of any police presence to enforce the speed limit as posted. Sheriff Blackman has touted many of his accomplishments since taking office, and I am not trying to diminish those. He has done a

number of good things, but I believe he has stated that there simply are no funds to dedicate an officer(s) to strictly radar patrol duty. Somewhere in the budget, he must find the money to have dedicated officers out 24/7 with radar and issuing tickets.

Much publicity has been made about the few times they put up a radar tower or did have patrol units out issuing "warnings." Sorry, but with the number of high speed offenders on U.S. 27 the days of warnings must be over and tickets issued with the maximum penalty allowed to get the attention of the habitual high speed drivers on the road. It has been ignored for so long that virtually no one pays attention to the posted 55 mph speed limit and they would simply not pay attention to it being 45 either.

Several of the letters suggested pressuring the Florida DOT to change the speed limit, but the pressure really needs to be applied to the Sheriff's Office to strongly and strictly enforce the speed limit as it now stands. People driving on U.S. 27 at 70 mph or more need a strong signal that this will not be tolerated.

As a final note, it is not just on U.S. 27 that we have a problem. These patrols with radar should also be posted in the school zones. The other

day while I was driving 20 through the school zone with kids and the crossing guard in the middle of the road, a lady drove past me doing at least 40 mph or more so not only did she ignore the school zone of 20 mph, the actual posted speed limit on that street is 35. So, by any standard she was way over and this is not an unusual event. It is bad enough these speeders have turned U.S. 27 into an extension of the Sebring Race track, but really? You can't slow down in a school zone with kids in the street? It is beyond just being rude and these people must be ticketed. Only hitting in the pocketbook will get their attention.

Secondly, as to really applying pressure, it should be applied to our lawmakers in Tallahassee that have literally "goofed" around with passing a law that would make texting while driving a main offense, and not a secondary one. With the amount of traffic on the roads today, while driving you must focus 100 percent on driving. Period. These people on the road that we see every day with a phone in front of their face, texting while doing 70 mph absolutely must be stopped. Unfortunately, I see this every day and for the record it is not just some teenager doing it as it has become main stream. Women with kids in the car, men driving trucks ... and they could be lawyers, doctors, maintenance workers, nurses or in any field and there they are driving with a phone in front of their face. Here is the reality people; no matter how good of a driver you think you are, you simply cannot focus on driving while you are messing with texting or GPS or playing with your radio, turning around to talk to the kids or any distraction from having your focus 100 percent on the road. Accident after accident has been put on driver distraction and this is the focus of what must be stopped.

Lowering the speed limit on U.S. 27 really would not solve the accident problems. Enforcing the speed limits as posted, banning the use of phones for texting while driving would do a great job of reducing accidents not only on U.S. 27, but all roads. I urge everyone to pressure Sheriff Blackman to do what is necessary to get a few patrol cars out on the streets 24/7 to enforce the speed limits, (with tickets not warnings!), and pressure Tallahassee to once and for all ban the use of phones for texting while driving.

They cover the town of Lake Placid and the unincorporated areas of the county outside Sebring and Avon Park. All county departments have funding districts, some of which can raise more money than others. Proposed fire fees are:

• \$1.6 million for operations (contract services, repair, maintenance, supplies, education/training and reserves)
• \$821,799 for capital improvements (machinery, equipment, engines, tankers, brush trucks and stations)
• \$2.55 million in improvements (new personnel, training, gear and stations)

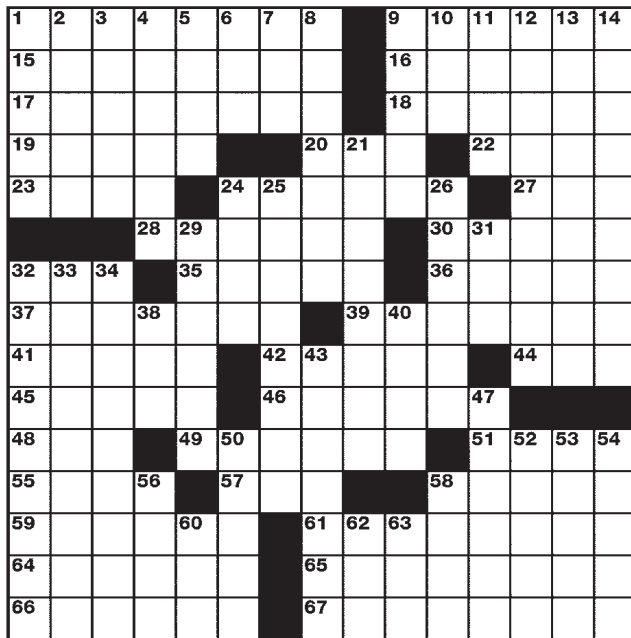
would make a concerted effort to look through the current assessments and give a detailed report based on current data. "My major concern is, these people have not really demonstrated to me, anything about updating any of their records," Camp said. "They seem to take the same proposal and pass it on." He said he did not believe the district would get what it wants for \$17,500. Instead, he believes, GAI would come back with a very similar proposal. "I'm not in favor of using these people," Camp said. "It's my humble opinion." Instead, Camp prefers Government Services Group, which submitted a \$34,500 bid. Not only does he have more confidence in their work, Camp said Government Services Group would have to take its time — three to four months — to review all records before making a recommendation on any new assessments, because it does not already have previous records on Sun 'n Lake. Supervisor Ray Brooks

noted at the Friday, Feb. 9 meeting that GAI recommended a complete assessment overhaul in 2013, but the study proposed now would just be a review of the rates to see if they are equitable. District General Manager Tanya Cannady also pointed out it's been nine years since the last rate change. This review, she said, would include commercial rates and would take up to four weeks to gather the data and make recommendations. The final decision on any rate changes, Cannady said, would be up to the board. Camp said GAI's \$17,500 proposal falls below Cannady's \$25,000 discretionary spending threshold; she didn't have to ask for permission to hire them. Still, he appreciated her bringing the matter to the board. Camp also said the board had taken bids on such a study last year, and asked for a presentation from GAI, but didn't receive one, so they didn't vote to do a study. Brooks said he would like to hear what GAI has to offer. Cannady said she could arrange presentations from both companies, and supervisors agreed to that. "I would think that

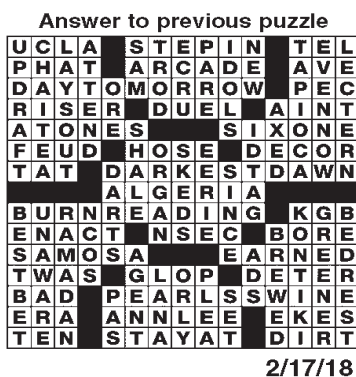

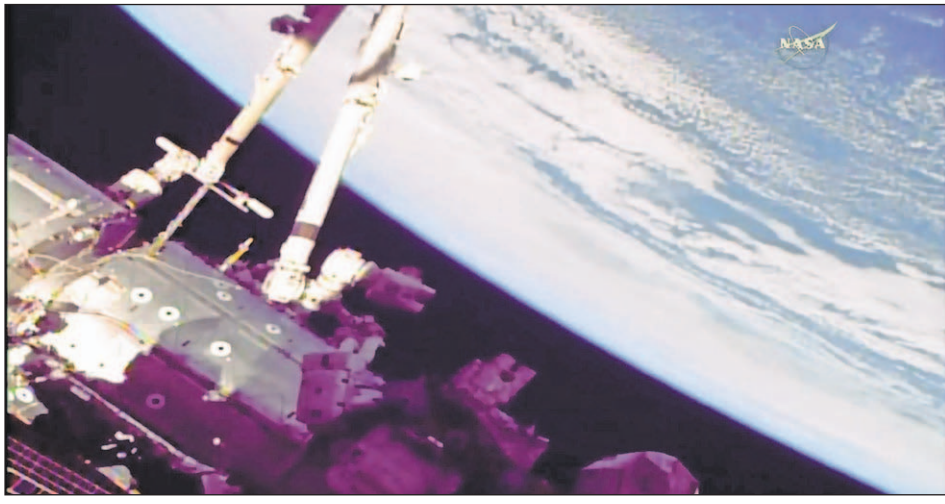

Spacewalking astronauts finish months of robot arm repair

CAPE CANAVERAL — Spacewalking astronauts wrapped up months of repair work Friday on the International Space Station's big robot arm.

The Canadian-built, 58-foot robot arm had both of its aging mechanical hands replaced on spacewalks conducted in October and January. NASA astronaut Mark Vande Hei and Japan's Norishige Kanai quickly moved one of those old hands to a long-term storage location outside, and prepped the other to bring it back inside so it can be returned to Earth for a tuneup and then flown back up.

This last spacewalk in the series should have been completed by

now, but was postponed because of complications with the robotic hand

that was installed last month. Ground controllers eventually solved

the problem. Further delays were caused by this week's late arrival of a Russian supply ship.

The old mechanical hands are original space station parts, in orbit since 2001. Each hand — a bulky bundle of latches — is more than 3 feet, or a meter, long and more than 440 pounds (200 kilograms).

Vande Hei and Kanai accomplished their main objectives so fast that they had time to tackle extra chores.

"Great job, guys," Mission Control radioed.

The astronauts emerged from the orbiting complex as the sun rose over Peru, 250 miles below. A half-hour later, they were soaring

over London and, 15 minutes after that, over Turkmenistan.

"It's an amazing view over someplace that's got lots of snow ... or maybe not," radioed Vande Hei, making his fourth spacewalk. He returns to Earth at the end of this month.

It was the first spacewalk for Kanai, a surgeon who arrived at the space station in December. An experienced Japanese astronaut who previously visited the station, Akihiko Hoshide, relayed directions to the spacewalkers from Mission Control in Houston.

Four other men currently live at the space station.

House eyes plan for health care during hurricanes

TALLAHASSEE — During the next major storm, Florida may turn to university faculty and even students enrolled in health-care programs to help work with some of the state's most vulnerable residents.

Sparked by shortages in special-needs shelters during Hurricane Irma, a House panel on Thursday approved a bill that would expand the list of people who could help out in the facilities during emergencies.

The legislation, which will be led by Rep. Ralph Massullo, R-Lecanto, also would require home health-care providers and nurses to develop emergency management plans for their patients. It also calls on hospitals to enter into contracts with local emergency management agencies

to provide shelter for people who require more medical attention than is available at special-needs shelters.

Many of the proposals included in the bill stem from a Jan. 16 report issued by the House Select Committee on Hurricane Response and Preparedness.

The select committee heard more than 20 hours of testimony on a variety of issues, from shelters to evacuation routes to mitigating future storm damage.

As Irma barreled toward the state last year, 6.8 million people evacuated their homes to flee the storm's path. Nearly 700 shelters were opened throughout the state, housing 191,764 people. There were 113 special-needs shelters in 53 counties. Those shelters served 10,452 people with special needs and

4,490 caregivers.

Legislators heard testimony that the shelters were inadequately staffed. To that end, the bill requires the Florida Department of Health to establish a statewide special-needs shelter registry form by October.

Currently, the Division of Emergency Management maintains a special-needs registry, and local emergency management agencies also have their own registries. The differing lists, plus a surge of last-minute registrations, made it difficult for local agencies to find enough people to staff the shelters.

The Arc of Florida is one of the organizations that will work on the form with the Department of Health. In testimony before the House Health & Human Services Committee,

Arc of Florida Executive Director Deborah Linton said several recommendations from her group are in the bill, including allowing flexibility for health-care professionals during mandatory curfews.

Despite the mandate on hospitals to have agreements with local emergency-management agencies — and the possibility of facing fines for not doing so — Florida Hospital Association CEO Bruce Rueben said the proposal provides a "comprehensive approach to managing care for the special needs population during emergencies."

"We support efforts that improve Florida's emergency management plans and coordination with providers," Rueben said in a statement to The News Service of Florida.

Not all recommendations in the bill are new, though. Some just put teeth into existing law. For example, health care facilities are required to have comprehensive emergency-management plans. The bill would amend the existing law to make clear that they could face \$500 fines if they don't have plans and could be subject to disciplinary action for not abiding by details of the plans.

The House select committee made several recommendations that weren't ultimately included in the bill (PCB HHS 18-02) approved on Thursday. For instance, the select committee recommended that the state provide funding so 42 domestic violence shelters could qualify for a federal grant that would allow them to buy generators. The bill didn't

include that proposal.

The select committee also recommended that nursing homes be required to have adequate emergency power to protect residents from unsafe temperatures. The recommendation also was for additional requirements on assisted living facilities, but nothing specific was enumerated.

The bill is silent on those issues, though Health & Human Services Chairman Rep. Travis Cummings, R-Fleming Island, told the News Service that his panel will consider a bill next week about the ratification of a pair of emergency generator rules for nursing homes and ALFs. Cummings said the House has concerns with the potential fiscal impact of requiring ALFs to have generators.

Sinking feeling: 911 caller reports prowler, finds sinkholes

THE VILLAGES (AP) — Several sinkholes have opened up in a Florida retirement community, displacing seven people and evacuating some homes.

The Villages resident Doris Morrill says she heard a creaking noise at about 1 a.m. Thursday and suspected a prowler so she called police. Several hours later, she heard another creaking noise and noticed a crack on the floor of her home. Then she noticed the hole opening up outside.

Emergency Management Director Preston Bowlin tells the Ocala Star-Banner that five more sinkholes have opened up since Morrill's call. Two homes have been condemned and two have been evacuated, power has been cut to all four. As of Thursday morning, water lines around the sinkholes were unaffected. If they break, up to 20 homes could be affected by the loss of water.

Parents of Florida murder suspect in court for contempt

TAMPA (AP) — The parents of a suspect in the random shooting deaths of four people are due in court for a civil contempt hearing for refusing to cooperate with prosecutors.

Howell Donaldson Jr. and Rosita Donaldson are due in Circuit Judge Mark Wolfe's court Friday and could face fines or possible jail time if they continue to refuse to talk to prosecutors about their son, Howell Donaldson III.

The 24-year-old Donaldson has been charged with four counts of first-degree murder in the October and November shootings of four people in Tampa's Seminole Heights neighborhood.

Howell Donaldson Jr.'s lawyer, Ralph Fernandez, tells the Tampa Bay Times the parents are reluctant to provide information that could be used to help send their 24-year-old son to Death Row. The state is seeking the death penalty.

Developer convicted again in wife's fatal shooting

ORLANDO (AP) — A millionaire developer in Florida has once again been convicted of killing his wife.

The Orlando Sentinel reports that jurors found James "Bob" Ward guilty of manslaughter on Thursday. Prosecutors had argued for second-degree murder, which Ward had previously been convicted of. That conviction and a 30-year sentence were later overturned.

Prosecutors say Ward shot his wife, Diane, in the master bedroom of their Isleworth home after an argument in 2009. Authorities say they were possibly arguing over financial problems or fraud allegations at Ward's real estate business.

Ward's attorneys say Diane Ward became aggressive after taking too much of her anti-depressant and drinking red wine.

Ward previously told a reporter that his wife had been holding the gun,

and it went off when he tried to get it away from her.

Former corrections officer gets 2 years for taking bribes

OCALA (AP) — A former federal corrections officer in Florida has been sentenced to two years in prison for taking bribes in exchange for delivering drugs to an inmate.

A U.S. Department of Justice news release says 27-year-old Albert Harris was sentenced Thursday. He pleaded guilty to a bribery charge in November.

Harris was arrested last summer while working as a correctional officer in a penitentiary at the Coleman Federal Correctional Complex northwest of Orlando. Authorities say Harris started providing inmates contraband in exchange for cash payments in June.

Harris met with an undercover federal agent in August. Authorities say he accepted a \$5,000 payment and agreed to deliver 200 strips of an

opioid-like drug to an inmate.

Police: Another victim linked to suspect killed on highway

BOCA RATON (AP) — Authorities say they've connected another fatal shooting to a gunman who ended a two-day crime spree by killing his girlfriend before he was fatally shot by a sheriff's deputy on an interstate.

Boca Raton police said in a statement Thursday that ballistic evidence links 22-year-old Hugo Selva to the Feb. 7 shooting death of 29-year-old Edvin Milkevic, who was found dead in his car. Authorities say Selva shot his 26-year-old girlfriend, Nicole Novak, in a shopping center parking lot later that morning. He then pulled her into his SUV and drove the wrong way on Interstate 95 before crashing into several cars. A deputy then shot him.

Selva's and Novak's Facebook pages show they had a daughter last year.

Police haven't said how

Selva knew the other victims.

Landscaper gets life sentence for fatally shooting boss

JACKSONVILLE (AP) — A Florida landscaper has been sentenced to life in prison for fatally shooting his boss.

The Florida Times-Union reports that 26-year-old Ezequiel Soriano Lopez was sentenced Thursday after being convicted of second-degree murder.

Authorities say Lopez shot his supervisor, 55-year-old Andrew William Little, at B&L Landscape Co. in Jacksonville in March 2016.

Several coworkers told police they had witnessed the shooting. Lopez was arrested shortly after the shooting when police found him in a car near the business.

Police say Lopez had worked for the company for about six years and had some previous run-ins with other employees, including Little.

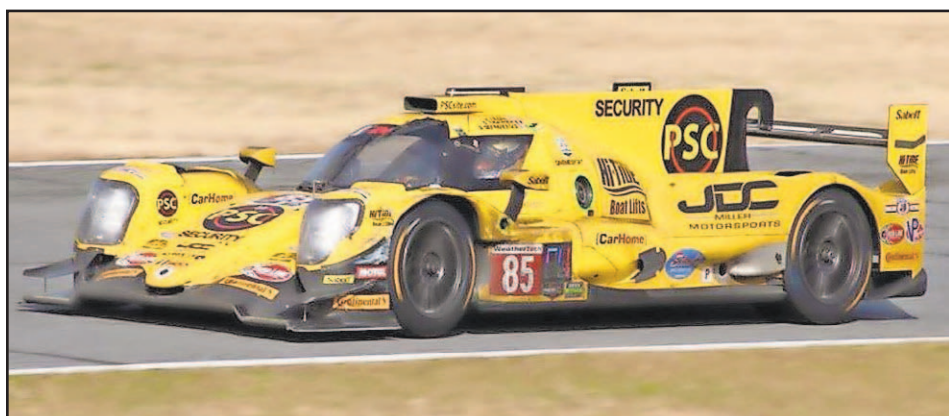
The first two days of the test are for the support series; the Continental SportsCar

Hardeman ready for the next step

Seeks success in Porsche GT3 Cup Challenge USA by Yokohama

DAYTONA BEACH – Four years ago, when he made his Porsche GT3 Cup Challenge USA by Yokohama debut, Texan Will Hardeman was the true definition of a rookie.

He not only hadn't raced in the series before, he really hadn't raced much of anything.

"It's pretty amazing,

because four years ago, we started this journey together and he'd never been in a car before," recalls David Moore, president of the Texas-based Moospeed team for which Hardeman races. "It's been great. He got quick fast, because he's got some talent, but he's worked really hard at it. He's always been playing catch up with the competition because they had so much more

experience than he had."

In 2016, Hardeman's second season of racing in the Porsche GT3 Cup Challenge USA by Yokohama, he earned the first podium result of his career with a third-place run at his hometown track, Circuit of The Americas in Austin, Texas. That was an abbreviated season for Hardeman, as he

took time off from the series for the birth of his daughter, Lily, who now attends several races along with Hardeman's wife, Anna.

"I am very grateful and thankful at the end of the day that my family supports me in this endeavor," Hardeman says. "I have the satisfaction that my family is there supporting me and we're at a good place in that regard."

"I do still have to balance the responsibilities that I have now as a family man and with racing. Yes, there are more things that I'm juggling, but it's nothing that other successful people in racing have not been able to do in the past, so I'm not unique in that regard."

While being a family man at the racetrack may not be unique, that doesn't mean Hardeman isn't unique in other ways.

"He's just a special person," Moore says. "I don't know if you've ever been around Will, but he's just not your normal guy, man. He's old school, but he's a renaissance man."

"I've always known that he was an athlete. How I'd describe it is, he's got bounce. You can throw Will up in the air like a cat and he's always going to land on his feet. He just has that innate ability and he's very analytical, but he's very artistic too."

Hardeman and Moore believe the combination of art, analytics and ability will translate to ultimate on-track success in 2018. Last year, Hardeman had his best season in the series, finishing sixth in the final standings with two runner-up results, at Barber Motorsports Park and Watkins Glen International.

"My goals are always to do as well as possible," Hardeman says. "I would say, more specifically, I would like to end up on the podium every race, which means top three within the Platinum division. That would put me in strong contention for finishing the season in the top three. Always,

gunning for first place, obviously."

To aid in their efforts, Hardeman and the Moorespeed team will work again with Earl Bamber, a two-time 24 Hours of Le Mans overall winner and full-time driver of the No. 911 Porsche GT Team Porsche 911 RSR in the 2018 IMSA WeatherTech SportsCar Championship, as a driver coach.

They first worked together two years ago but took last year off when Bamber was racing the Porsche 919 Hybrid full time in the FIA World Endurance Championship. However, they did one race together, a Blancpain GT Series Asia race in Shanghai, finishing an impressive second in the Pro/Am class.

"I would say the reason that I'm able to compete in IMSA and consistently be in the top five has a lot to do with Earl and a lot of his help," Hardeman said.

Making grandparents struggling parents again

HARRISBURG, Pa. — Joanne Clough forgot about the baby gate, which sent her sprawling into the dark room. Her first thought was about the toddler in arms. Her next thought was about her artificial knee, her pain and, with her cellphone downstairs, how she would summon help.

The 60-year-old lawyer can be forgiven for forgetting about the gate. It was the first one in her home since her own children were small. But Clough now has full-time responsibility for another young walker

-- the 22-month-old child of her daughter, who died of a heroin overdose in 2016. "I am a broken-hearted, mother-grandmother doing the best I can each day to just breathe,

live, survive and raise my granddaughter so this addiction does not destroy us too," said Clough, who lives in Cumberland County. Clough is among thousands of grandparents

in Pennsylvania caring for a grandchild because one or both of the child's parents is incapacitated by opioid addiction or dead of an overdose. It's one more bleak consequence of the crisis which killed more than 4,600 people in Pennsylvania last year and has become the second leading cause of death for Americans younger than 50.

In Pennsylvania, about 88,000 grandparents are raising 195,000 grandchildren. In about 40 percent of those cases, drug or alcohol addiction is the main reason for the children being placed with the grandparents. But these

Smiling, whether to family, friends, co-workers or even to strangers on the street, sends out a positive message and makes you feel better, too. It's difficult to be smiling and in a bad mood at the same time. Plus, others will smile back, and that's also

nice.

You can increase your laughter quota by searching out things that make you happy. Maybe it's playing with a small child or a family pet. Maybe it's taking the time to find a funny movie, TV show or a video on YouTube. Try reading a humorous book, or sharing a good joke or funny story with others. Read the comics, watch a comedian on TV, or have a night out at your local comedy club.

Yes, life can be serious and we can't always be laughing, but putting a little extra effort into trying to find the funny in your life can leave you feeling happier while providing real benefits to your physical health and mental well-being.

Conquer yourself

An ancient Chinese philosopher Lao Tzu once said, "He who conquers others is strong; He who conquers himself is mighty."

The biggest most ferocious battle we fight is the battle of the mind. We are constantly under attack on one front or another. When the enemy finds a weakness in our thoughts that he can exploit, he will wage a full on assault to take control. He aims to make us second guess ourselves and our ability to trust God.

Overcoming a confrontation with another person is up to us. We can choose to remain angry and continue to take part in the nonsense, or we can decide to forgive and move past it. Conquering others is not just about having authority or a stronghold over them, rather an ability to not allow them to create an atmosphere of defeat in you. We will not be easily offended. This is an easy battle to conquer.

Taking on the inner portion of our mind is a battle we have a hard time fighting. This is a battlefield covered with the worst weapons the enemy has at his disposal; our very own self-science. figures don't tell the full story. Many more grandparents are raising their children under arrangements without knowledge or involvement of children and youth services.

The grandparents say they desperately need help. Some of them are retired, and the fixed incomes they were relying on to get them through the rest of their lives are now strained by the expense of raising one or more young children. About 20 percent are living in poverty. Others still work and now face expenses including daycare, which typically costs several hundred dollars per week. Saving for retirement can become impossible.

Those who gained custody without involvement of child protection authorities often did so to avoid having to go to court and make the case that their own child is an unfit parent. But it also denies them access to financial help that would be available to foster parents.

"Nothing drives a wedge between relatives more than one calling CYS on another or suing them in custody court," said Brian Bornman, executive director of the Pennsylvania Children and Youth Administrators.

If grandparents do involve child protection authorities, they could open the door to the child being placed being in the care of someone else. Or, if the grandparent is deemed appropriate and wants official

status, they must submit to background checks and home visits by caseworkers, and meet assorted qualifications pertaining to things such as the square footage of their home.

Summing up the overall situation, state Rep. Eddie Day Pashinski of Luzerne County said, "Grandparents don't get a dime. They get nothing."

That's especially unfair, he argues, since grandparents who have rescued children from the consequences of the opioid addiction crisis are saving Pennsylvania taxpayers about \$5 billion annually that would otherwise be spent on foster care.

Deborah Friday had to tell state police her daughter was stealing her jewelry. That's when her daughter, who had three children and was pregnant with her fourth, admitted she was addicted to heroin.

As with many people who become addicted to heroin, Friday's daughter, now in her 30s, has alternated between recovery and relapse since acknowledging the addiction in 2012.

Friday and her husband, Mike, have custody of the four grandchildren, whose ages range from 4 to 10. They are in their mid-50s and live in Dixonville in Indiana County. She's a registered nurse at a hospital and he's a rural mail carrier.

"Any day I may have off is spent doing what needs done to keep the kids well, physically and emotionally. I would love to go to family support meetings but there is no time because I have to work or get the kids

someplace," Deborah Friday said.

The grandmother said it helps she can work 12-hour shifts, giving her more days off to devote to the children. They don't qualify for any help toward day care.

Thankfully, they have family and friends willing to help with child care.

Their youngest grandchild has three different sets of sitters in a week. All are past 60; two are 80.

Living with an addicted parent and then adjusting to life with their grandparents has had emotional and behavioral consequences for the children. "This has been a real challenge for our marriage - differences in parenting the kids, managing all the activities the kids are involved in and all the parenting,"

opportunities that accompany addiction, it will be hard for her daughter to ever fully provide for four children.

That points to something else she would appreciate from lawmakers: helping people in recovery to overcome criminal records related to addiction, so they can rebuild their lives and provide for their children.

Despite all the work and stress, Deborah Friday lives for arriving home from work, knowing four happy grandchildren will rush toward her. It serves to "remind me that we will make it through this time."

The opioid crisis has given Vickie Glatfelter a worry she knows will last until her dying day.

Her son, Bob, died of an overdose, leaving behind a boy with autism. Glatfelter's grandson, who doesn't speak, is now 10.

Glatfelter, 56, and her husband, Bob, know they'll care for him for the rest of his childhood and beyond, probably until they become physically unable.

"Then what?" she said.

They've acted as parents to their grandson almost since his birth. The younger Bob Glatfelter and the child's mother weren't married, with both addicted to opioids. He moved back home with his parents not long after his son's birth. Eventually, during a time when Bob and his girlfriend were both gone because of rehab and jail, Vickie Glatfelter called Children and Youth Services in York County, where they live.

"I called and said I don't know what to do,"

she said.

CYS determined the grandparents were the best placement option and helped them attain legal guardianship. Later, after Bob died, they went to court and were given primary physical custody.

Because of his disability, their grandson receives a Social Security benefit and also qualifies for health insurance through Medicaid. He also receives a Social Security death benefit of about \$500 per month, which will continue until age 18.

"It doesn't cover everything. It helps, believe me," she said.

Vickie Glatfelter and her husband both work full time. So just as they enter the time in their lives when they would otherwise be thinking about retirement, they face the costs of raising another child.

"I'll never have a normal life," she said.

At times she wrestles with anger about her situation, the lack of help from the system, that her son allowed heroin to cause such pain in all their lives and left an innocent boy without a father. At other times, she mourns the toll of a national epidemic and the loss of a son who was once so full of life and goodness. She sees her son in her grandson.

"It breaks my heart some days. I get choked up," Vickie Glatfelter said.

It also removes any doubt she will persevere, no matter the cost.

"I love him like he's my own," she said. "That's what I have left of my own son. I'll do anything I can to make sure he's as successful as he can be."

An open letter to those who are grieving

I write this letter in the hope that a handful of you read it. And within that handful, I hope my words offer support to a few of you.

I don't have any answers here in this letter. I've been where you are today completely devastated and in total shock at the magnitude of my loss.

My grief was suddenly thrust upon me, perhaps yours has been too. Or perhaps your grief marks the end of a long journey with your loved one. No matter how our grief is packaged, or what our relationship was to them, it is, of course, a complete tragedy.

I'm not here to paint a gloss over how you will possibly feel in the future for what it's worth. I still miss my parents and brothers as acutely as I did on day one. I expect I always will. There were so many things left unsaid where my brothers are concerned.

You already know by now that grief is tragic, dark, messy and brutal. It completely knocks you off whatever course you were on and leaves you incapable of managing even the simplest task. The idea of washing, sleeping, eating, shopping and paying bills is now as trivial as it is impossible. Let alone the idea of organizing a

funeral.

People mean well at a time like this, surrounding us with support (if we're lucky), particularly in those first six weeks. After around six weeks, people start to get on with their lives again and the flowers stop arriving ironically at a time when they would be most appreciated. I hope that this letter finds its way to you around this time, if not earlier. Grief can be an incredibly isolating and lonely experience. Despite the many people around you offering support, no one really understands the aching loss you feel right now. Supportive sayings can come across as patronizing, and cards with painted doves, waterfalls or forests are laughably out of touch with your new reality.

Perhaps you're being told to "remember the

happy times," "be strong" or "eventually move on." Though well-meant, these expressions can be as unhelpful as they are insensitive to the depth of your loss.

Of course, you will remember the happy times, but probably not today. And why be strong? Honor your grief and the aching loss you feel right now. You have plenty of time to "be strong" later on if you really must.

Anyway, I hope that somewhere within this letter, something resonates with you. In the spirit of sharing, I've written down what grief and loss has personally taught me, and so many others. Next week I will share these insights. It would be too lengthy to add here.

Until then, may God's love, peace, comfort and consolation always bring you from mourning to joy. It is what He wants for us. It is what our loved ones in Heaven want for us.

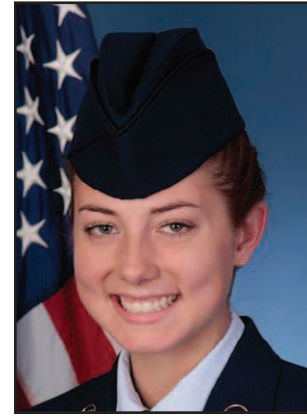

Miracles happen

When your faith is bigger than your fear

For three years, Becky Davis made plans to leave her corporate job at an optical retailer, but each time her exit date arrived, she struggled to take the leap.

Next year, she'd tell herself.

Then as 2011 faded into the new year, Davis found herself flat on her back in a hospital. Days after undergoing surgery to remove fibroid tumors, she started to feel excruciating pain and nausea. It was so bad she fainted.

In the hospital emergency room that December day, doctors discovered she had been hemorrhaging from an ovary that hadn't been closed all the way.

"Once I realized I was still here, I started to cry," she recalled recently.

Davis realized she had been letting her fear get in the way of her faith in God, the one she believed birthed the idea for her business MVPWork in the first place.

Some of you might know how that is. Even if you believe fear has no place in faith, it can be

pretty scary parting ways with what we believe is a sure paycheck for one that we think may or may not come.

Davis, a mother of four adult children, had grown up in the church. Even after leaving home to attend college, she always found a place to worship.

When she decided to marry during her last semester there, that changed, she said.

"He didn't go to church, so I didn't go," Davis said.

When the couple divorced five years later, Davis returned to God, her first love, for her own sake and the daughter she now had.

By then, she had gone through the Dale Carnegie speaker training to become a motivational speaker. A coach assured her she was ready to begin the journey, but when she accepted an invitation to speak to a group of Dallas county employees in Texas, fear took a seat and refused to leave.

"What am I going to tell these people?" she asked herself. "What if they ask me about my political views?"

You better not do this, she told herself.

Davis declined the

offer and threw herself into her 9 to 5, creating training programs for fellow managers and then teaching them how to implement the programs.

She loved her job and she was good at it. Not only could she meet sales numbers, she often exceeded them because she was at her best developing and inspiring people. She'd been promoted six different times to poor performing markets and each time had managed to move them to the top tier.

The more she did that, the more her confidence grew. More importantly, she had refocused her attention on building a relationship with God.

In 2002, Davis pledged her love to Willie Davis, and four years later, the couple moved their family from Fort Worth, Texas, to Atlanta, where she continued to work for Luxottica Retail.

Before long, however, she sensed something in the company dynamics was changing.

"I started to notice people weren't as important as the bottom line," Davis said.

Now in the hospital, she had eight weeks of recovery time to really think about that and

her decision to not follow God's lead and launch the coaching firm for small-business entrepreneurs.

On April 1, 2012, Davis returned to work. Things still didn't seem right. She was complaining to her husband. Her boss wanted her to terminate an employee without good reason.

"I knew it was the beginning of the end," she said.

For 15 years, company execs had been telling Davis she was at the top of her game when it came to motivating people, coaching them and driving results. Now she finally had the confidence to take those qualities and use them to help other companies do the same — accelerate and grow their business.

In July, Davis tendered her resignation and left the following month.

"It was really the first time, my faith was stronger than my fear," she said. "I totally believed that if I walked out on the ledge, God would provide a foundation for me to stand on."

On Jan. 1, 2013, after writing her first book, Davis launched MVPWork or Meaning, Values and Purpose Work, to empower

women across the globe to build sustainable businesses.

Now at 50, Davis, known as the "Chief Bosspreneur" and "Greatness Facilitator," is a member of the Forbes Coaches Council and spokesperson and empowerment speaker for the Coca-Cola Co.'s 5 by 20 entrepreneurship initiative that launched in 2010 to enable the economic empowerment of 5 million women entrepreneurs across the company's value chain by 2020.

She recently signed a second contract with Coke to continue in that role for three more years and host a bimonthly small-business breakfast network event that Coke

will sponsor next year.

"I figured out where my target audience was and started to grow my business through building relationship networking," she said. "Coke puts me in places that would take me years to open the doors. It's been an amazing ride with a great partner."

It would not have been, she said, without her faith in God to silence her inner villain and awaken the hero that is within all of us.

"It takes courage to wake up your inner hero," she said, "but you'll see miraculous things happen once you do."

The question is, is your faith bigger than your fear?

FBI says it failed to investigate tip on Florida suspect

PARKLAND, Fla. — The FBI received a tip last month that the suspect in the Florida school shooting had a “desire to kill” and access to guns and could be plotting an attack, but agents failed to investigate, the agency said Friday. Florida Gov. Rick Scott called for the FBI’s director to resign because of the missteps.

Attorney General Jeff Sessions said the shooting that killed 17 people Wednesday was a “tragic consequence” of the FBI’s failure and ordered a review of the Justice Department’s processes. He said it’s now clear that the nation’s premier law enforcement agency missed

warning signs. In more evidence that there had been signs of trouble with the suspect, Broward County Sheriff Scott Israel said at a Friday news conference that his office had received more than 20 calls about Nikolas Cruz in the past few years.

A person close to Cruz called the FBI’s tip line on Jan. 5 and provided information about Cruz’s weapons and his erratic behavior, including his disturbing social media posts. The caller was concerned that Cruz could attack a school.

In a statement, the agency acknowledged that the tip should have been shared with the FBI’s Miami office and investigated, but it was not. The startling admission came as the agency was already facing

criticism for its treatment of a tip about a YouTube comment posted last year. The comment posted by a “Nikolas Cruz” said, “Im going to be a professional school shooter.”

The FBI investigated the remark but did not determine who made it.

The 19-year-old Cruz has been charged with killing 17 people at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School in Parkland, north of Miami.

FBI Director Christopher Wray said the agency, which received an average of 2,101 calls to the tip line each day in 2017, was still reviewing its missteps on the January tip. He said he was “committed to getting to the bottom of what happened,” as well as assessing the way the FBI responds to information from

the public.

“We have spoken with victims and families and deeply regret the additional pain this causes all those affected by this horrific tragedy,” Wray said in the statement.

Florida’s governor sharply criticized the federal law enforcement agency Friday, calling the FBI’s failure to take action “unacceptable.”

“Seventeen innocent people are dead and acknowledging a mistake isn’t going to cut it,” Scott said. “... The families will spend a lifetime wondering how this could happen, and an apology will never give them the answers they desperately need.”

The FBI is already under intense scrutiny for its actions in the early stages of the investigation into Russian

meddling in the 2016 presidential campaign. President Donald Trump and some congressional Republicans have seized on what they see as signs of anti-Trump bias.

The president has repeatedly slammed the agency and its leaders, writing on Twitter that its reputation was in “tatters.”

On Friday evening, Trump met with victims of the school shooting who were recovering at a Florida hospital and praised the “incredible” work of doctors, nurses and first responders who helped the victims.

Also Friday, mourners gathered for the first funeral for a shooting victim, packing the Star of David chapel to remember 14-year-old Alyssa

Indictment: Social media firms got played by Russian agents

Friday’s election-interference indictment brought by Robert Mueller, the U.S. special counsel, underscores how thoroughly social-media companies like Facebook and Twitter were played by Russian propagandists.

And it’s not clear if the companies have taken sufficient action to prevent something similar from happening again.

Thirteen Russians, including a businessman close to Vladimir Putin, were charged Friday in a plot to interfere in the 2016 U.S. presidential election through social media propaganda. The indictment said the Russians’ conspiracy aimed, in part, to help Republican Donald Trump and harm the prospects of his Democratic opponent, Hillary Clinton.

The alleged scheme was run by the Internet Research Agency, a troll farm based in St. Petersburg, Russia, which used bogus social media postings and advertisements fraudulently purchased in the name of Americans to try to

influence the White House race.

“I created all these pictures and posts, and the Americans believed that it was written by their people,” wrote one of the defendants, Irina Kaverzina, in an email to a family member obtained by investigators.

Tech companies have spent months pledging to fix their platforms ahead of the upcoming midterm elections this year, and reiterated those promises Friday. Twitter said in a Friday night statement it

“committed to addressing, mitigating, and ultimately preventing any future attempts to interfere in elections and the democratic process, and to doing so in the most transparent way possible.” Facebook thanked U.S. investigators for taking “aggressive action” and pointed out its own role in helping the investigation.

Researchers, however, noted that the companies’ business incentives don’t necessarily align with

Under fire, Kelly overhauls White House clearance procedure

NEW YORK — Under pressure over his handling of abuse allegations against a top aide, White House chief of staff John Kelly on Friday ordered sweeping changes in how the White House clears staff members to gain access to classified information, acknowledging that the administration “must do better” in how it handles security clearances.

Kelly issued a five-page memo that acknowledged White House mistakes but also put the onus on the FBI and the Justice Department to provide more timely updates on background investigations, asking that any significant derogatory information about staff members be quickly flagged to the White House counsel’s office.

The issue has been in the spotlight for more than a week after it was revealed that former staff secretary Rob Porter had an interim security clearance that allowed him access to classified material despite allegations of domestic violence by his

two ex-wives. “Now is the time to take a hard look at the way the White House processes clearance requests,” Kelly wrote in the memo. “We should — and in the future, must — do better.”

The memo said the FBI and Justice Department had offered increased cooperation and, going forward, all background investigations of top officers “should be flagged for the FBI at the outset and then hand-delivered to the White House Counsel personally

upon completion. The FBI official who delivers these files should verbally brief the White House Counsel on any information in those files they deem to be significantly derogatory.”

Dozens of White House aides have been working under interim clearances for months, according to administration officials, raising questions about the administration’s handling of the issue and whether classified information has been

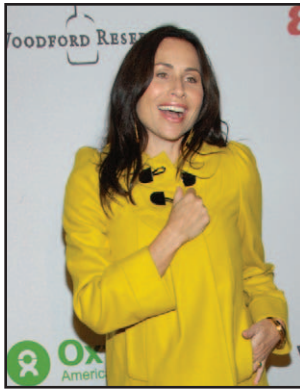

MEXICO CITY — A powerful magnitude-7.2 earthquake shook south and central Mexico Friday, causing people to flee buildings and office towers in the country's capital, where residents were still jittery after a deadly quake five months ago.

She said she was still scared thinking of the Sept. 19 earthquake that left 228 people dead in the capital and 369 across the region. Many buildings in Mexico City are still damaged from that quake.

“It was awful,” said Mercedes Rojas Huerta, 57, who was sitting on a bench outside her home in Mexico City's trendy Condesa district, too frightened to go back inside.

The U.S. Geological Survey put its preliminary magnitude at 7.2 and said its epicenter was 33 miles northeast of Pinotepa in Oaxaca state. It had a depth of 15 miles.

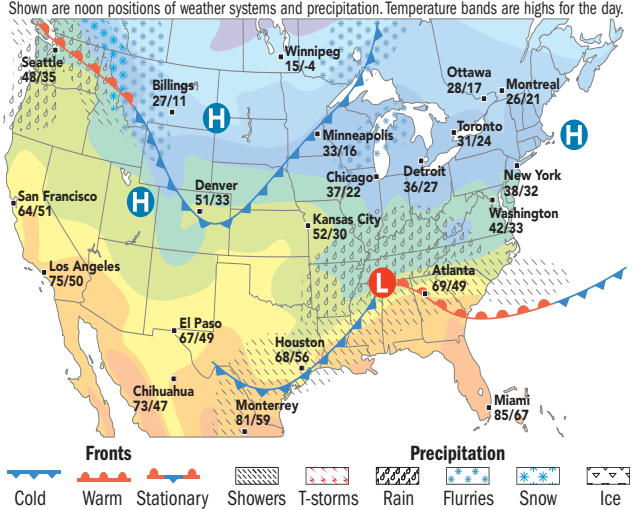

Here's how to separate the fundraisers from frauds among gofundme pages

MIAMI — Gofundme.com pages proliferated almost as soon as cops took Nikolas Cruz into custody after Wednesday's 17-death massacre at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School in Parkland. Donors must parse the funding pages from the fraudulent. Start with the official gofundme page created by Broward County Public Schools' official fund-raising cousin, Broward Education Foundation, gofundme.com/

StonemanDouglasFund. "Donations raised here will be used to provide relief and financial support to the victims and families of the horrific shooting," the page declares. In an e-mail to The Herald, a gofundme.com spokesperson Bobby Whitmore wrote, "if another campaign is created to provide general relief to all of the families, we'll either direct them to the Broward Education Foundation or transfer their funds raised to the Broward Education Foundation. Either way, the funds are going to the victims and families."

The State of Florida will cover funeral costs for the deceased victims. Common sense says, then, pages declaring they're raising money for the funerals fail the fraud test or match having good intentions with being uninformed. Also, avoid vague pages, such as ones, that use general cliches about raising money without really telling you who they are. Another page purports to be from North Bay Village-based WSVN-Channel 7 but says it's based out of Boca Raton. Another stop sign: the page misspells the school name. Don't trust bad

spelling. A typo here or there, OK, but truly bad spelling tends to be the sign of someone rushing to cash in on a situation. Example: "We are raising the money for the family's of this tragedy." As far as individual family pages, "We are reviewing every campaign created related to the shooting in Florida and we are monitoring the platform for all campaigns set up to support individuals and families impacted," Whitmore wrote. "We guarantee the money raised by those campaigns will be transferred to the right person. It's important

to remember that when a campaign is created for an individual, funds are collected, held, and then only transferred directly to the ultimate beneficiary of the campaign. Those will also be verified and we will be sure to pass along those pages. We have a whole host of measures to verify a page, including verifying the identity and banking information of the beneficiary before funds are transferred." GoFundMe's centralized place for verified campaigns for individual survivors and family members is at GoFundMe.com/stonemandouglas.

Alhadeff. From outside the chapel, other mourners strained to hear the voices chanting Jewish prayers and remembering the star soccer player as having "the strongest personality." She was also remembered as a creative writer with a memorable smile. At a later funeral for 18-year-old Meadow Pollack, her father's anger boiled over. With more than 1,000 mourners including Scott packed into Temple K'ol Tikvah, Andrew Pollack looked down at the plain pine coffin of his daughter and yelled, "You killed my kid!" referring to Cruz.

A day earlier, details of Wednesday's attack emerged, showing how the assailant moved through the school in just minutes before escaping with the same students he had targeted. Cruz jumped out of an Uber car and walked toward building 12 of the school, carrying a black duffel bag and a black backpack. He slipped into the building, entered a stairwell and extracted a rifle from his bag, authorities said. He shot into four rooms on the first floor then went upstairs and shot a single victim on the second floor. He ran to the third floor, where according to a timeline released by the Broward County Sheriff's Office, three minutes

passed before he dropped the rifle and backpack, ran back down the stairs and quickly blended in with panicked, fleeing students. Florida State Sen. Bill Galvano, who visited the third floor, said authorities told him it appeared that Cruz tried to fire point-blank out the third-floor windows at students as they were leaving the school, but the high-impact windows did not shatter. The sheriff clarified Friday that Cruz never had a gas mask or smoke grenades during the attack, but officers did find a bal-clava. Israel said his office would be investigating every one of the previous calls about Cruz to see how they were handled. Authorities have not

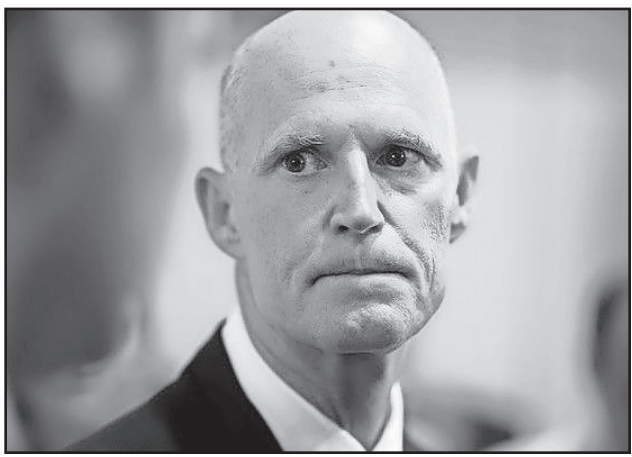

described any specific motive, except to say that Cruz had been kicked out of the high school, which has about 3,000 students and serves an affluent suburb where

the median home price is nearly \$600,000. Students who knew him described a volatile teenager whose strange behavior had caused others to end friendships.

"I've never been convinced that these sites are motivated to fix a problem like this," said Notre Dame business professor Timothy Carone, who added that security controls make it harder for sites like Facebook to offer users new features and keep advertisers happy. "It's a really, really, really difficult problem." The indictment confirms earlier findings from congressional investigations that Russian agents manipulated social media to promote social division by mimicking grassroots

political activity. It also underscores that the problem wasn't just "bots" — i.e., automated social-media accounts — but human conspirators who fine-tuned propaganda and built online relationships with American activists. "The idea wasn't necessarily to help one political party over another, but to sow as much discord as possible," said Melissa Ryan, a Democratic social media marketing expert who now keeps track of right-wing online activity. "This was America that was attacked." Social-media companies weren't the only ones subverted in the influence campaign. Federal prosecutors allege that Russian criminals used PayPal as a primary conduit to transfer money

for general expenses and to buy Facebook ads aimed at influencing voters. Prosecutors say the accounts were opened using fake identities to help bypass PayPal's security measures. PayPal spokesman Justin Higgs said the San Jose, California, company has been cooperating with the Justice Department and is "intensely focused on combatting and preventing the illicit use" of its services. In an interview with The Associated Press on Tuesday, Facebook Chief Technology Officer Mike Schroepfer outlined the complexity of preventing abuse. "Election integrity is challenging because again, you're dealing with adversaries," Schroepfer said during a conference

in Half Moon Bay, California. "They are trying to accomplish a goal and they have smart people who are trying to figure out their way into the system to accomplish that." For instance, infiltrators often react immediately to countermeasures. If they figure out Facebook is checking the internet addresses of computers to identify visitors from particular countries, Schroepfer said, "they'll take over a machine with malware in the U.S. and post from there instead. People say, 'Why don't you just check the currency or the IP address?' And as soon as you do that, literally that afternoon, they will change tactics." Schroepfer said the company is making "good headway" on the problem,

although he declined to give specifics. "By kind of doing a lot better job of trying to figure out the authenticity of these different actors, we can certainly stop that sort of behavior," he said. "There's a big focus on that." On the other hand, now that the Russians have shown how this sort of campaign is done, the door is open for others — including American special interest groups — to use the same tactics to target disaffected voters in the right places, said David Gerzof Richard, a communications professor at Emerson College. "This is the new norm," he said. "It's not going away. It's not going to be magically fixed by a Silicon Valley CEO or a group of executives saying they're going to do better."

jeopardized. Kelly's plan would limit interim clearances to 180 days, with an option to extend them another 90 days if background checks had not turned up significant troubling information. The memo also recommends that all Top Secret and SCI (Sensitive Compartmented Information) clearances that have been pending since last June be discontinued in a week. That change could potentially put at risk the clearance of Jared Kushner, the president's son-in-law and a powerful senior adviser. Kushner's attorney, Abbe Lowell, told The Associated Press this week that Kushner has been working on an interim clearance for more than a year as his background check was being conducted. Lowell said again Friday that "there are a dozen or more people

at Mr. Kushner's level whose process is delayed" and "it is not uncommon for this process to take this long in a new administration." He added, "The new policy announced by General Kelly will not affect Mr. Kushner's ability to continue to do the very important work he has been assigned by the President." But Lowell did not respond to questions about whether Kushner's clearance would be stripped or whether his role would require him to avoid looking at documents for which he did not possess clearance. A White House spokesman did not immediately respond to a request for comment about Kushner's situation. The memo is addressed to White House counsel Don McGahn, who has also been criticized for his role in the Porter matter, as well as national security adviser H.R. McMaster. Copies were sent to Attorney General Jeff Sessions, Director of National Intelligence Daniel

Coats and FBI Director Christopher A. Wray. The memo also warned about issues with the security clearance process across the federal government. U.S. officials said numerous U.S. government agencies in addition to the White House routinely grant interim clearances. At the State Department, interim clearances are granted by Diplomatic Security after a review of an employee's completed SF-86 questionnaire and initial checks of public records, a State official said. If any derogatory information turns up, no interim clearance is issued and the worker must wait until the full investigation is finished, said the official, who wasn't authorized to discuss the clearance process and demanded anonymity. The White House has struggled to explain its handling of the Porter matter, offering several versions of events in recent days. McGahn was apprised of at least some of the accusations about Porter

at least four times, including as early as January 2017, according to White House officials familiar with the matter who spoke on condition of anonymity to discuss internal matters. In November, one official said, one of Porter's ex-girlfriends called McGahn to describe allegations of domestic abuse by the aide. Kelly, meanwhile, said he first learned something was wrong with Porter's clearance in November. Trump officials have faulted the FBI and the White House Personnel Security Office for not passing along sensitive information about Porter. The staff secretary, who had access to classified documents delivered to the president, maintained his interim clearance until he resigned last week. A sense of unease about Kelly's fate has persisted in recent days. For months, Kelly — with help from Porter — had established a semblance of stability in a White House often rattled by an unpredictable

president. That has eroded in a week's time, as accounts about the handling of the Porter matter continue to shift and some aides came to believe Kelly lied to save face and save his job. Trump has complained to confidants that Kelly let the scandal spin out of control and that the constantly shifting narratives made the White House — and, by extension, Trump himself — look amateurish and incompetent, according to one person familiar with the discussions but not authorized to talk about them publicly. The president has floated names of possible replacements but there was no sign that a move was imminent. The president is known to frequently poll his advisers about the performance of senior staff but is often reluctant to actually fire aides. In the memo, Kelly defended his handling of clearances, including his order in September to cease granting new interim clearances unless the chief of staff had given his blessing.

Dozen day care workers say parent's cookies made them high

BANGOR, Maine (AP) — The director of a Maine day care says cookies dropped off by a parent as a Valentine's Day treat left about dozen staff members feeling high. Police were called to the Watch Me Shine day care in Bangor on Wednesday and seized the cookies for testing. Day care director Tiffany Nowicki tells the Bangor Daily News that the cookies were left on a staff room table. No children ate any. Two workers reported feeling woozy. About 10 others reported less intense symptoms. Police say the parent who brought them in could be charged if the cookies test positive for drugs. Nowicki says the day care has always barred adults from sharing food with children, but will now prohibit bringing in outside food for children or staff.

Drug used to put dogs down causes recall of Gravy Train, other dog food brands

MIAMI — J.M. Smucker is “withdrawing” all lots of certain Gravy Train, Kibbles ‘N Bits, Skippy and Ol’ Roy canned dog food products manufactured since 2016 because they might contain pentobarbital, a sedative used in pet euthanasia.

An FDA alert was posted Friday.

“The FDA’s preliminary evaluation of the testing results of Gravy Train samples indicates that the low level of pentobarbital present in the withdrawn products is unlikely to pose a health risk to pets,” reads Friday’s FDA alert. “However, pentobarbital should never be present in pet food and products containing any amount of pentobarbital are considered to be adulterated.”

Smucker is calling it a “withdrawal,” not a “recall.” Either way, it still means these products are coming off store shelves and should not be used if already bought.

“Any detection of pentobarbital in pet food is a violation of the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act — simply put, pentobarbital should not be in pet food,” the alert reads.

A study released Feb. 9 by the Clean Label Project, testing various pet food brands bought off shelves and through Amazon.com, found pentobarbital in one brand — Gravy Train. All three Gravy Train types tested had pentobarbital. The FDA began investigating, as did J.M. Smucker. “One possible way (the drug got into the food) is through the use of contaminated ingredients,” Clean Label Project Executive Director Jaelyn Bowen explained in an email to the Miami Herald. “Rendering plants take slaughterhouse animal tissues and convert them into stable, usable materials like purified fats such as lard or tallow. This rendered material is then sourced by some pet food manufacturers and sold to consumers as wet and dry pet foods. It is possible that animals exposed to pentobarbital were included in the rendering process.”

But Bowen also said, “I would be especially concerned about other brands within the umbrella of Big Heart Pet and Smuckers because what that could ultimately point to is a systemic lack of robust quality control and quality assurance. Brands either care and test for this stuff and mandate the testing within their supplier contracts or they don’t.”

Food box idea draws criticism

WASHINGTON — The Trump administration is pushing what it calls a “bold new approach to nutrition assistance”: replacing the traditional cash-on-a-card that food stamp recipients currently get with a pre-assembled box of canned foods and other shelf-stable goods dubbed “America’s Harvest Box.”

Office of Management and Budget Director Mick Mulvaney likened the box to meal kit delivery service Blue Apron, and said the plan could save nearly \$130 billion over 10 years. But the idea, tucked into President Donald Trump’s 2019 budget, has caused a firestorm, prompting scathing criticism from Democrats and nutrition experts who say its primary purpose is to punish the poor.

“The main goal is to alleviate food insecurity, and the reason SNAP is so successful is because it gives low-income families the autonomy and dignity to make their own food choices,” said Craig Gundersen, a professor in agricultural strategy at the Department of Agricultural and Consumer Economics at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. Gundersen said people will leave the program as a result of the shift.

SNAP — the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program — is the official name for the food stamp programs. “All of a sudden

you’re saying, ‘we don’t trust you to make the right decisions for your

family.’ It’s demeaning and it’s patronizing. This is pro-hunger, because people will leave the program,” Gundersen said.

Under the proposed plan, households that receive more than \$90 in SNAP benefits each month — roughly 81 percent of households in the program, or about 16.4 million — would be affected.

Agriculture Secretary Sonny Perdue called the box “a bold, innovative approach to providing nutritious food to people who need assistance and their families.”

But the proposal doesn’t include any concrete details about how much the program would cost or how it would be implemented, saying only that states will be given flexibility to distribute the boxes “through existing infrastructure, partnership, and/or directly to residences through commercial and/or retail delivery services.”

Critics say sending boxes with the same foods to millions of SNAP recipients with no regard for tastes, medical conditions or cultural customs would be devastating to families with dietary restrictions. And while SNAP recipients are presently able to use their benefits to purchase fresh fruits, vegetables, meat and poultry from grocery stores, the boxes would contain unhealthy, packaged alternatives.

Lawmakers say they aren’t even sure where the idea came from.

Rep. Jim McGovern, D-Mass., the ranking member of the House

nutrition subcommittee, called the proposal a “crucial joke” that came out of nowhere. He said despite having numerous hearings on SNAP, Monday’s budget was the first time he’d heard of the food box proposal.

“I don’t even know how to implement it. Who would distribute these boxes?” he said. “How would we do this? Do they anticipate recipients getting them at supermarkets? In addition to being a cruel and demeaning and awful idea, it’s just not practical.”

A spokeswoman for House agriculture committee Chairman Mike Conaway, R-Texas, said the committee has held 21 hearings and invited 80 experts to speak about SNAP in its preparations of the forthcoming farm bill, and the idea of a food box was not once discussed.

An Agriculture Department spokesman said the idea was developed internally, but didn’t provide further details on the brainstorming process. Mulvaney credited it to Perdue.

Michigan Sen. Debbie Stabenow, top Democrat on the Senate agriculture committee, said the food box idea “isn’t a serious proposal and is clearly meant to be a distraction from this Administration’s proposed budget that fails our families and farmers.”

The proposal is part of a broader plan to gut the SNAP program, reducing it by roughly \$213 billion — nearly 30 percent — over the next decade.

The plan also proposes tightening work requirements for recipients.

In the What-to-Avoid Department: A study published in *Physiology & Behavior* showed how opting for a low-fat diet and sliding into indulgences marketed as healthy, but crammed with sugar, can change your gut biome, ramp up inflammation and pack on pounds. The study was reinforced by the recent revelation that for decades the sugar lobby worked to deflect attention from the major health risks associated with added sugar and syrups while blaming fats, when there's plenty of blame all around for the polluted food supply.

If you don't eat red meat, you can dodge Type 2 diabetes! That's the finding of a large study out of Singapore. And that's on the heels of the study that found that folks with Type 2 who went on a vegetarian diet lost more body fat and weight while improving insulin processing and glucose control.

What to Drink: Drinking three to four cups of coffee daily (compared with drinking none) increases longevity and helps prevent death from heart disease, said a study published in *BMJ*. You can drink more, but the benefits accumulate at a slower rate the more coffee you drink. In addition, coffee drinking is associated with lower risks of prostate, endometrial, skin and liver cancers, Type 2 diabetes, gallstones and gout.

Food O'clock News: Timing your meals is as important as what you eat when it comes to weight management and control of glucose levels. University of Pennsylvania Medical School researchers found that if your habit is to eat dinner later in the evening, you're at risk for increased weight, elevated insulin and cholesterol levels, and are negatively affecting markers for heart disease, diabetes and more.

Romney makes it official: He's running for Utah Senate seat

SALT LAKE CITY — Former presidential hopeful Mitt Romney is running for a Utah Senate seat, officially launching his political comeback attempt Friday by praising his adopted home state as a model for an acrimonious national government in Washington.

Having been one of the Republican Party's fiercest internal critics of President Donald Trump, Romney didn't mention the administration or Trump himself in a campaign announcement posted online. The closest allusion to Trump was Romney noting that Utah "welcomes legal immigrants from around the world," while "Washington sends immigrants a message of exclusion."

In an interview Friday with The Associated Press, Romney said he will continue to speak out when he takes exception to something the president says or does.

"I call them like I see them. Neither he nor I are likely to change very much," Romney said,

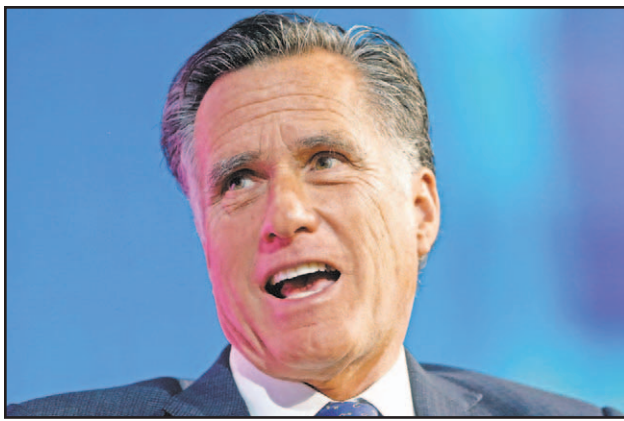
adding that they could work together on policy. "You can expect me to be as forthright as I have traditionally been."

Romney, 70, will be the heavy favorite for the Senate seat being opened by Sen. Orrin Hatch's retirement. Hatch was among the first Republicans to pitch Romney as his potential successor, and gave Romney a memo last year outlining his case for why Romney should run, the former presidential candidate confirmed Friday.

Romney said he won't run for president again but wouldn't rule out seeking re-election in six years if he wins Utah's Senate seat this November.

"It's a little early to make that decision, but I recognize that I'm getting into this for the long haul. At age 70, that may not be three or four terms, but it may well be two," he said.

Romney demurred when asked if he'd seek or accept Trump's endorsement and said he's focusing his campaign on Utah, where he moved with his wife, Ann, after losing the 2012 presidential election to incumbent Democrat

Barack Obama.

"Utah has a lot to teach the politicians in Washington," Romney said in his announcement video, noting that "on Utah's Capitol Hill, people treat one another with respect."

Still, Romney, a former Massachusetts governor and wealthy business executive, would come to Capitol Hill with a higher profile than a typical freshman senator. Romney acknowledged that to the AP, saying, "I can fight for the people

of Utah and do more for Utah than the average junior senator might be able to accomplish"

That reality was made clear by immediate reactions to his announcement from across the political spectrum.

House Speaker Paul Ryan, whom Romney tapped as his vice presidential running mate in 2012, immediately hailed his old partner's "unparalleled experience, conservative leadership and lifetime of service." Democrats, despite

not yet offering any credible threat to the Republican dominance in Utah, answered with a scathing rebuke, dismissing Romney's periodic criticisms of Trump. "Mitt Romney desperately wants to separate himself from the extremism of the current administration," said Democratic National Committee spokesman Vedant Patel in a statement, but "the basis policies of Trump's GOP ... were his before they were Donald Trump's."

Hours after making his campaign announcement early Friday, Romney filed paperwork with Utah's elections office allowing him to start collecting the signatures of 28,000 registered Republicans to earn a spot on a June primary ballot.

He then toured a dairy farm in the northern Utah city of Ogden, driving a tractor and posing for pictures with workers and the farm's owners. He didn't take questions from reporters.

Later, Romney dropped by a campaign volunteer booth set up at Utah Valley University in Orem, where he shook hands and posed for pictures

with a mob of excited college students he asked to sign his candidate nominating petition.

He is scheduled to give a speech Friday night at a GOP county dinner event in Provo, south of Salt Lake City.

As he did in two presidential campaigns, Romney's announcement highlights his stewardship of the 2002 Winter Olympics in Salt Lake City. Romney is respected in the state for taking over the troubled games amid planning and financial disarray.

Romney supporters describe him as a "favorite son" of Utah. He's a Brigham Young University graduate who went on to become the first Mormon presidential nominee of a major political party. About 60 percent of Utah's residents are members of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.

Some Utah Republicans may still question whether the one-time abortion-rights supporter is too much of an outsider or too moderate for their tastes, but he's not expected to face any serious primary or general election challenge.

EPA head expenses nearly \$200,000 in travel

SAN FRANCISCO — Environmental Protection Agency administrator Scott Pruitt and staffers billed taxpayers nearly \$200,000 for his trips over six months last year, according to travel vouchers obtained by an environmental organization.

Pruitt is one of several Trump administration officials who have drawn attention over travel costs, including Pruitt's frequent travel at first-class rates. Pruitt earlier this week said a "toxic environment politically" required first-class travel and protection from a 24-hour security detail.

The Environmental Integrity Project environmental group obtained the

travel vouchers, which cover trips by Pruitt and 14 staffers from March to August, through open-records requests. Previous vouchers acquired by the group covered the EPA chief's travel over a shorter period.

Pruitt is a former Oklahoma attorney general and longtime Tulsa-area resident. Most of at least 10 expensed trips involving stops in his home state of Oklahoma were into the Tulsa airport, including for events in or closer to Oklahoma City, the state's capital and site of the biggest state airport.

Vouchers released for some of the Oklahoma trips cited the reason for travel only as "meetings in state" or as tours of companies in the Tulsa area.

Eric Schaeffer, founder

of the group that obtained the records, called the justifications for some of the trips back home "a little squirrely."

"You can't do what you can do as maybe a corporate lawyer," as head of the EPA, Schaeffer said. "You're putting one meeting on the calendar so it's official business."

Jahan Wilcox, an EPA spokesman, said he had no immediate comment on the six months of travel costs. A handful of the travel reports for Oklahoma trips said routing trips to multiple destinations through Tulsa was as affordable as a more direct route, or said Pruitt or another party had picked up some or all of the costs.

The costs included \$138,969 overall for trips

involving commercial airfare from March to August, including \$93,308 for flights, according to the environmental group's records.

Another \$56,000 went to charter flights. Among those was a \$14,434 charter to carry Pruitt and staffers from Tulsa, in far eastern Oklahoma, to Oklahoma's western panhandle to meet with farmers.

That trip and some others have been previously reported by news media. The EPA has said all the charter flights were necessary and previously approved by ethics lawyers.

Most of the reported expenses did not appear to include travel costs of the unknown number of security guards traveling with Pruitt.

Flu season shows signs of leveling off

NEW YORK — This nasty flu season, which has been worsening for months, may finally be leveling off.

Health officials on Friday said about 1 of every 13 visits to the doctor last week was for fever, cough and other symptoms of the flu. That's no reason for health officials to celebrate yet: That level is among the highest in a decade. But it's no worse than last week, and flu activity had been increasing each week since November.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention report said the number of states reporting heavy flu patient traffic also held steady at 43.

"I thought I was going to die, I really did," said Ben Bland, a 39-year-old event planner in Kansas City, Missouri, who was hospitalized this week with pneumonia on top of flu. "My lungs felt like they were going to blow out of my esophagus every time I coughed. My body ached head to toe."

This season started early and has been driven by a formidable type of flu that tends to put more people in the

hospital and cause more deaths. Making a bad year worse, this year's flu vaccine is estimated to be only 25 percent effective against that type.

Preliminary data released last week indicated patient traffic in doctor's offices and emergency rooms this flu season was as bad as the height of the swine flu pandemic in 2009. However, the CDC readjusted its numbers down slightly in Friday's report, meaning this season did not quite match the intensity of flu activity seen in October 2009.

Still, it counts as one of the most intense flu seasons in more than

a decade. Whether it's peaking or not, flu season is still expected to last several more weeks.

"We are not out of the woods yet. We are not seeing any increase, and that is encouraging. But there still is a lot of flu happening out there," said Dr. Daniel Jernigan, the CDC's influenza chief. He said people should stay home from work or school if they get sick to prevent spreading flu, and people should still get vaccinated if they haven't already.

Even though the vaccine is not as powerful as officials hoped, it can lessen the illness's severity, keep people out of the hospital,

and save lives.

Flu remained widespread in every state except Oregon and Hawaii, the same as the week before.

The new report shows that for the week ending Jan. 27, just under 10 percent of U.S. death certificates listed flu or pneumonia. That's down slightly from the week before, but indicates that flu remains at epidemic levels. There are as many as 56,000 deaths connected to the flu during a bad year.

Eighty-four children have died so far. Childhood deaths have reached about 170 in a season.

Figures released Thursday suggest this year's flu vaccine has worked fairly well in children younger than 9. That was no comfort to parents with sick children.

"It's horrible to see your child with a breathing mask on her face," said Stephanie Calvin, 35, of Mandeville, Louisiana, whose 4-year-old daughter has been sick with flu for four weeks.

Calvin has taken four days of unpaid time off work to care for her daughter, alternating with her husband. "I'm a mom before I'm an employee. It was a no-brainer to stay home with her."

Man who sued ex-Seattle mayor on sex abuse claims found dead

SEATTLE (AP) — A 47-year-old man who sued former Seattle Mayor Ed Murray over sexual abuse claims that effectively ended Murray's political career has been found dead.

The King County Medical Examiner's Office said that Delvonn R. Heckard died Friday in the Seattle suburb of Auburn. The cause and manner of Heckard's death are pending.

Heckard's lawsuit filed in April claimed Murray raped and molested Heckard as a teen. Other men came forward with similar claims after the lawsuit was filed.

Murray was in his first term as mayor when he resigned Sept. 12, hours after The Seattle Times reported his cousin, Joseph Dyer, had become the fifth man to publicly accuse Murray of child sexual abuse decades ago.

Murray has denied all of the allegations.

Judge approves Takata bankruptcy plan

WILMINGTON, Del. (AP) — A Delaware judge has approved the bankruptcy reorganization plan submitted by Japanese auto-parts supplier Takata.

Following a hearing Friday, the judge said there was substantial and sufficient support from creditors to merit plan approval.

The ruling comes after Takata reached a settlement last week with creditor groups representing current and future victims of the company's lethally defective air bags, whose claims will be handled by a trust.

Takata was forced into bankruptcy last year amid lawsuits, multimillion-dollar fines and crushing recall costs involving air bag inflators that can explode with too much force, spewing shrapnel

into drivers and passengers. The faulty inflators prompted the largest automotive recall in U.S. history.

Under the restructuring plan, Takata will sell most of its non-air bag assets to a Chinese-owned rival for \$1.6 billion.

Police: Man crashes truck into Planned Parenthood clinic

EAST ORANGE, N.J. (AP) — A Massachusetts man has been accused of deliberately crashing a stolen bakery delivery truck into a Planned Parenthood clinic in New Jersey, injuring a pregnant woman and two other people.

Marckles Alcius faces numerous charges stemming from Wednesday's crash in East Orange, including aggravated assault, theft and attempting to cause widespread injury or damage. Further charges also are possible, authorities said.

The 31-year-old Lowell man pleaded not guilty during a court hearing on Friday, and prosecutors in New Jersey said they will seek to have him detained until his trial.

The three injured people were two patients and a staff member, who were treated at a hospital for minor injuries. Alcius wasn't injured in the crash, but authorities have not said how he got the bakery truck or where it was stolen from.

Authorities also have not disclosed a possible motive for the crash and have declined to comment further, citing the ongoing investigation.

A spokeswoman for the prosecutor's office said there was no information that Alcius had a connection to the clinic, but she would not say why prosecutors believe the crash was intentional.

An after-hours message left Friday night at the clinic was not immediately returned.

Why 'Everyman' Boyle connected with fans

2014 champ Shiffrin drops to 4th place in slalom

PYEONGCHANG, South Korea — Mikaela Shiffrin is, without a doubt, the best women's slalom skier there is. Has been for years. All of the victories confirm it. Her competitors are aware of it. And, yes, so is she. "This is going to sound so arrogant," Shiffrin said Friday, her eyes closed. "I know that

I'm the best slalom skier in the world." She spoke those words after failing to live up to that billing. Stars descend on LA for NBA showcase

The stars will be out in Los Angeles, on the basketball court and all around it.

The NBA's All-Star festivities are back at Staples Center, with the usual events on All-Star Saturday night and a new format for the game Sunday.

Captains LeBron James and Stephen Curry drafted players from the pool of All-Stars and the winning team gets a \$350,000 donation from the NBA to the charity it chose.

The league is hoping the new format that replaced the traditional East-West matchup will make it more competitive after a couple of lackluster games the previous two years.

Perhaps the players can heed the words of Kobe Bryant, who won the MVP award on his home floor when the All-Star Game was last in Los Angeles in 2011.

"I feel like we have a sense of responsibility and we are voted in for what we do during the season, which is play hard," Bryant said following that game.

"And we come here, that's what the fans want to see. They want to see us go at it and see us compete and that's what I try to do and that's what I try to tell my teammates to do."

Bryant is gone now but Beyonce and Jay-Z, Jack Nicholson and Justin Bieber are among the celebrities who attended that game

Some things to watch as Los Angeles hosts the All-Star Game for a record sixth time:

Lebron in L.A.

James refuses to discuss his free agency during the season, but figure on it coming up in Los Angeles since there's been such speculation about him signing with the Lakers.

The Lakers, after a trade with James' Cavaliers last week, would

have enough salary cap space to offer a maximum contract to James and another star if he opts to become a free agent and leave Cleveland this summer.

Sidelined stars

Bieber will return to play in the celebrity game on Friday night after winning MVP honors in the 2011 game. He will play on Team Lakers, co-coached by actor Michael B. Jordan. They will play against Team Clippers, who feature Academy Award winner Jaime Foxx.

Jr.'s coveted seat at Hendrick Motorsports when concussions forced the superstar to retire. Bowman is 24 and had washed out of NASCAR once before when he got the call to help during Earnhardt's absence. Team owner Rick Hendrick gave him a car capable of earning the top starting spot for the biggest race of the year, and after nearly a full year out of a race car, Bowman will lead the field to green.

"I haven't speedway raced in a year, so it's going to be tough," Bowman said. "I have to get my feet back under me as far as speedway racing goes."

Bowman has given no indication how his car will handle because, in an effort to keep it safe for the Daytona 500, he dropped to the back of the field during his qualifying race and avoided drafting. Hendrick teammate Chase Elliott took the opposite approach, won his qualifying race and earned a starting spot in the second row.

Elliott is 22 and one of NASCAR's budding stars. His peers believe he'll replace Earnhardt in fan voting for NASCAR's most popular driver, and Hendrick gave him a boost this year by switching Elliott's car number to No. 9 so the driver can honor his Hall of Fame father, Bill.

"Car looks good. I'm a little biased, but the 9 looks good on top of the scoring pylon," Elliott said after Thursday night's victory. "I would love to have it there more throughout the season."

Elliott is still seeking his first points victory in the Cup Series after five runner-up finishes last season. He won his

Daytona qualifying race last year, too, but ran out of gas racing for the Daytona 500 victory.

Elliott will be Hendrick's answer to the Ford brigade that has so far been led by Team Penske at Daytona.

Ford drivers won all four restrictor-plate races last season, including Kurt Busch's victory in the Daytona 500, and Penske drivers Brad Keselowski and Ryan Blaney have one win apiece this Speedweeks. Blaney's victory in the qualifying race put him on the second row for the start next to Elliott, and teammate Joey Logano is right behind Blaney.

Logano, winner of the Daytona 500 in 2015, has two runner-up finishes in Speedweeks behind his teammates. Keselowski is the Las Vegas betting favorite to win the race, but Blaney absolutely should be in the mix. In fact, Roger Penske appears to have three entries all capable of winning the race.

Should they find themselves lined up 1-2-3 — the way they've run most of Speedweeks — on the final lap of the Daytona 500, they know the boss expects one of them to win.

"Our team orders are to work together as best you can, but it's a race. Roger expects us to race for wins," Logano said. "It's a challenge when you're all racing for the win. There's a lot on the line. That's probably one of the most challenging times for teammates, is to be able to work together. It's probably the most stress on a relationship, with a team."

Ford drivers have speed, but 2007 winner Kevin Harvick noted the cars are much harder to drive under new NASCAR technical regulations. The sentiment was shared by

Busch, who, like Harvick, is considered among the most talented in car control, so their gripes could be an indication NASCAR has gone too far.

"I wasn't very comfortable to pull on the wheel like I needed to, to be aggressive in making moves and blocking, all the things I needed," Harvick said after his qualifying race.

If teams can't make some gains by Sunday, passing could be difficult in the race. Ricky Stenhouse Jr., winner of two plate races last season, was admittedly "greedy" in his qualifying race when he made aggressive moves to try to figure out the draft. He twice spun competitors not because he made contact with their cars, but because Stenhouse sucked the air away from their cars and caused them to lose control.

If drivers can't solve that problem before the Daytona 500, it could be an ugly race. NASCAR could have a single-car parade for some 400 miles, or the lack of experience in the field could lead to youthful mistakes.

Remember, Jeff Gordon, Tony Stewart and Dale Earnhardt Jr. retired in three consecutive seasons. Carl Edwards walked away after the 2016 season and Matt Kenseth, a two-time Daytona 500 winner, has no ride in 2018.

The Daytona 500 also will be Danica Patrick's NASCAR finale.

The rapid driver turnover has created a 40-car field that includes six drivers under age 30 in the first eight spots.

Also racing in the Daytona 500 is 66-year-old Mark Thompson. He's the anomaly, though, as the field has a considerably youthful feel.

Stumbling on the world stage

Nathan Chen crumbles under pressure of spotlight

GANGNEUNG, South Korea — Two-time U.S. champion Nathan Chen continued to wilt Friday under the great expectations leading to the Pyeongchang Games underscoring the tension some young athletes experience when overtaken by immense public interest.

A teenager thrust into the Olympic favorite role has been unable to handle the emotions after he struggled on three jumps in men's figure skating short program — including an opening fall on a quadruple flip.

The Los Angeles-based skater scored 21.85 points below his season best to finish the short program poorly a week after stumbling through the same routine in the team event. He has all but been knocked out of medal contention as the competition concludes Saturday (Friday night, Pacific) with the free skate.

Chen, 18, finished behind American teammates Adam Rippon (seventh place) and Palo Alto's Vincent Zhou, who became the first athlete to land a quadruple lutz in an Olympic competition. The history-making jump led to a 12th-place finish with the possibility of more to come.

Chen, on the other hand, was expected to battle reigning Olympic and world champion Yuzuru Hanyu of Japan for the gold medal. It had the makings one of the best skating dramas in years.

Until Chen found himself on his backside after the first jump.

"Honestly, it was bad," he said. "I made as many

mistakes as I possibly could have."

On a day Hanyu soared to music from Chopin, his chief nemesis came unnerved in an Olympic debut that was expected to be a crowning moment. Chen tumbled all the way to 17th place and will face a Himalayan climb to respectability.

Hanyu scored 111.68 points in a winning performance so good he clapped with the audience at the end after two

effortless quadruple jumps. Spain's Javier Fernandez is second with a score of 107.58 points while Hanyu's teammate Shoma Uno is third (104.17 points).

Hanyu, 23, came to Korea nursing an injured ankle that led many to consider Chen the favorite here. Now he has the chance to become the first man to win consecutive Olympic titles in 66 years.

"It's something that he wants more than anything," coach Brian Orser said. "It has been amazing how he's been able to pull this off in such a short amount of time." Hanyu credited all the support he has received after the injury, saying no athlete could have been lifted by more fans.

But Fernandez, his training partner in Toronto, saw the Japanese star returning to form in the past few weeks. The Spaniard recalled repeated questions about Hanyu's status.

"Don't ask me," he replied. But Fernandez knew what

his coach, Orser, did.

Hanyu was fully recovered and ready for a chance to be the first repeat winner since Dick Button in 1948 and 1952.

Unlike four years ago in Sochi, the men were as strong as advertised. The top four competitors landed a total of eight quadruple jumps and four triple axels, which are 3 1/2 rotation jumps.

Rippon, the Americans' elder statesman at 28, didn't even try a quad. But he scored one for artistry in a 2-minute 50-second show to "Let Me Think About It." Rippon lied back on the ice and pumped his fists after a performance that earned 87.95 points.

"I want to show the world what I am made of and to show the world why I fell in love with skating," said Rippon, who helped the United States win the team event bronze medal.

Zhou wasn't the only skater to land the quadruple lutz. Russian Dmitri Aliev also did it to finish fifth in the short program.

A pair of college players was instrumental in helping the United States secure an important 2-1 win over Slovakia in the preliminary round. Ryan Donato scored two power-play goals and Troy Terry dominated with his speed. They are two of four NCAA players on the no-NHL Olympic roster. Goalie Ryan Zapolski made 21 saves for his first Olympic victory, which is crucial considering only the top four of 12 teams avoid the qualification round Monday. The regulation win means the U.S. vaults to the top of Group B with four points. Slovakia was second with three, followed by

Slovenia and Russia. The U.S. faces Russia in each team's final preliminary-round game Saturday night. Russia beat Slovenia 8-2 on Friday.

FREESTYLE SKIING

Dario Cologna of Switzerland became the first cross-country skier to win three Olympic gold medals in the same event by capturing the 15-kilometer freestyle. "Super Dario," as he's known, also won this race in Vancouver in 2010 and Sochi in 2014. The win also gave Switzerland its first gold medal of the Pyeongchang Olympics.

SPEEDSKATING

Dutch speedskater Esmee Visser won gold in the

women's 5,000-meter race, finishing in 6 minutes, 50.23 seconds. Two-time defending champion Martina Sablikova of the Czech Republic took silver in 6:51.85. Russian skater Natalia Voronina earned bronze in 6:53.98. The Dutch have won six of seven golds so far in speedskating.

CURLING

A rare moment of controversy in the typically ultra-polite sport of curling erupted Friday over a foul known as a "burned rock" in the Canada vs. Denmark women's match. The drama unfolded in the fifth end, or period, of the already tense game, when a Danish player touched a stone that was in

motion. That is a foul called a "burned rock." When burned rocks occur, the opposing team has three choices: They can ignore the foul, rearrange the stones to whatever position they think they would have ended up if the stone hadn't been touched, or remove the stone from play. Canada's captain, or "skip," Rachel Homan chose to remove the stone. While such a move was within her rights, it is considered the most aggressive option. Canada, which was behind before the foul, then went on to score four points, taking the lead at 6-4.

Stars of the Olympics are changing the sponsorship game

A gold medal used to be the golden ticket for lucrative endorsements — think Mary Lou Retton on a Wheaties box. But in the age of social media, athletes are making a name for themselves well ahead of time. Even more so than in Rio in 2016 and Sochi in 2014, Pyeongchang athletes are Olympian at building brands. Before breakout star Chloe Kim won gold in the snowboarding halfpipe event, her infectious personality and heartwarming origin story had already won her sponsorships from Toyota, Samsung, Visa and others. Of course, winning a gold medal amplifies an athlete's reach. When Kim started the Olympics, she had 15,000 Twitter followers. She now has more than 285,000. She charmed thousands with tweets about eating ice cream and churros and being "hangry" because she didn't finish breakfast before her race. Christopher R. Chase, a specialist in high-profile sports marketing at the Frankfurt Kurmit Klein & Selz law firm, estimates the 17-year-old Kim could be worth "in the high hundreds of thousands" or even the low millions of dollars, propelled in part by her achievements off the slope. Medals still matter. Skater Nathan Chen likely hurt his chances for new sponsorships after a pair of disappointing performances, which made him unlikely to medal at an individual event. But Chen can still capitalize in the long run. "He is young and should have more Olympic competitions in the future," Chase said. "America loves a comeback story." For athletes these days, medals are icing on the cake, no longer the sole reason for endorsements. And medal winners without a good personality might have trouble finding sponsors. "The more medals, the more coverage, the more salient these people are" for endorsement consideration, said Will Davie, a group strategy director at Droga5, an ad agency that has worked with athletes such as Michael Phelps.

Wendy Holdener was 0.05 seconds back for the silver, followed by Austria's Katharina Gallhuber.

"A lot of surprises today," Holdener said.

Not really in the men's race across the way at the Jeongseon Alpine Center, where Austria's Matthias Mayer added a super-G gold to the downhill title he won four years ago. This time, Mayer edged Switzerland's Beat Feuz and Norway's Kjetil Jansrud.

The biggest news 30 miles (50 kilometers) away at the Yongpyong Alpine Center, really, was Shiffrin's showing. She finished in 1:39.03 — 0.08 away from the bronze and less than a half-second from the gold.

That Shiffrin's poor-for-her performance in slalom came one day after she won the gold medal in the giant slalom, an event at which she is not as good, was not only stunning but also perhaps related.

After attending the medal ceremony Thursday night, Shiffrin said, she didn't get to bed until around 10

p.m., roughly 1 1/2 hours later than normal during the Pyeongchang Games. More influential than that, she thought, was the inability to properly modulate her emotions after that victory in the opening women's Alpine event.

"I had too much of a peak yesterday and too much of a valley today. And when you have two races in a row, it's really important to keep that mental energy stable. And I didn't really do that," Shiffrin said. "So today, it was like all of the tools that I have that make me feel equipped to handle whatever pressure I

feel, I didn't have anymore."

Her whole Olympics are shifting now.

Shiffrin's mother, Eileen, who also coaches Mikaela, already had said Saturday's super-G was no longer part of the plan. Now Shiffrin says she might not ski the downhill, either, for what would shape up as a show-down against U.S. teammate Lindsey Vonn, the 2010 gold medalist in that event. Shiffrin did say she definitely will remain part of the field for the combined.

There is pressure galore, from others and from Shiffrin herself.

That is based in large part on her resume: She won the slalom gold at the age of 18 at the 2014 Sochi Olympics; she won three consecutive world championships in that event; she had a five-race winning streak in January; she is on pace for a second overall World Cup title.

"I think it's more my own expectations and knowing the magnitude of what I'm trying to do," Shiffrin said. "Less about what everybody else wants to see."

That might be. It's why she says she would vomit before races last season.

Straily glad he wasn't among those traded

JUPITER — While Giancarlo Stanton and Christian Yelich were happy to be traded by the Miami Marlins, right-hander Dan Straily says he wants to be a cornerstone of the team's rebuilding plan.

And that's not all.

"I'm glad they're gone," Straily said Friday. "If they don't want to be here, good for them."

Straily's reaction to the Marlins' offseason dismantling under new CEO Derek Jeter differs dramatically that of fans angered by the moves and players wanting out because they anticipate lots of losing. Half of the everyday lineup was traded, including Yelich and National League most valuable player Stanton, and Miami received mostly prospects in return.

But Straily said a reboot was justified after eight consecutive losing seasons under former owner Jeffrey Loria.

"I really agreed with what happened," said

Straily, who went 10-9 last year and might be the opening day starter next month. "I feel like with the pieces they brought in, this might flip around a little quicker than people realize. I'm not saying today, but I'm excited to be here and try to mentor guys coming into the big leagues for the first time."

The Marlins went

77-85 last year, and after the season, Stanton voiced his frustration with a pitching staff that had the fifth-worst ERA in the majors.

Was Straily insulted?

"In a way," Straily said. "It's not like I was upset-insulted. It's no secret our starting rotation didn't exactly carry the team. When I hear that kind of stuff, it's motivation to continue

to focus on bettering myself, because that's the last thing you want to hear."

There was speculation Straily would be among those traded this offseason, and he's glad he wasn't. The roster purge didn't bother the well-traveled 29-year-old veteran because he has been part of makeovers before.

Straily pitched briefly

for the Chicago Cubs and 2014 and the Houston Astros in 2015 when both teams were building toward eventual World Series titles. He believes the Marlins can follow the same path, and this time he hopes to remain for the duration of the climb to the top.

"That's the goal," he said. "I want to be part of the rebuilding and part of a championship."

Manager Don Mattingly, who has also been vocal in endorsing Jeter's plan, said it's good to have a veteran like Straily on board with the approach.

"You want it from the guy helping you at the door, the guy selling tickets, all the way through the organization," Mattingly said. "You want people that are here to build a championship mentality."

Straily, eligible for arbitration the first time, missed the first two days of spring training this week to argue his case in Arizona. He sought a raise from \$552,100 to \$3.55 million but lost his case Friday and was awarded the Marlins' offer of \$3,375,000.

Fiers eager for a chance to pitch in with Tigers

LAKELAND — Mike Fiers has thrown a no-hitter and pitched for a World Series champion.

He's also experienced the other end of the baseball spectrum, so the 32-year-old right-hander tries not to take anything for granted.

"I've got to be very thankful for everyone that's given me a chance," Fiers said Friday. "And definitely Detroit this year, giving me another opportunity to start and really show my ability out there on the field."

Fiers signed with the Tigers in December after an eventful two-plus seasons in Houston. In 2015, shortly after being traded from Milwaukee to the Astros, Fiers pitched a no-hitter. He was still with Houston last year when the Astros won the World Series, but he was left off the

roster during the post-season, and the team eventually let him go. He caught on with the rebuilding Tigers as one of Detroit's few significant offseason additions.

"The biggest thing is just an organization wanting me to play for them. I think that goes a long way," Fiers said. "When I was with Milwaukee, they drafted me, but Houston trading for me said a lot. Then when they ended up feeling I didn't help them anymore, a team like Detroit was right away trying to get me — and felt like I could help this team."

Fiers was 26 when he made his big league debut in 2011 with the Brewers. He went 9-10 with a 3.74 ERA the following year, averaging more than a strikeout per inning, and he was effective for a good portion of his tenure with Milwaukee before being traded to Houston.

His no-hitter against the Los Angeles Dodgers came less than a month after that deal, but his numbers were nothing special with the Astros. He went 11-8 with a 4.48 ERA in 2016 and 8-10 with a 5.22 ERA last year. Houston added Justin Verlander last August, and Fiers didn't pitch much after that.

Winning the championship was a highlight, obviously, but the end of the season was still a little bittersweet.

"To be left off the roster, it definitely hurts, but you can't complain too much," Fiers said. "Ended up winning the World Series, which is definitely a big accomplishment, because being with that team all year, I felt like I got them to the point of being in the playoffs — taking the ball every fifth day, and picking the guys up when we had a lot of injuries."

That's what the Tigers want from Fiers — reliability and professionalism. Detroit finished tied for the worst record in the majors last year, and its rotation is a question mark.

Huskers' NCAA hopes uncertain

RALEIGH, N.C. — By any measure, Nebraska is having its best season since moving to the Big Ten, from its win total to its RPI and KenPom rankings. It's unclear whether that will be good enough to secure an NCAA Tournament bid.

Nebraska (20-8, 11-4) has won six straight to reach 20 wins for just the first time in a decade. The Cornhuskers are also a win away from setting a program record for Big Ten wins since joining the league in 2011-12. But they lack any notable wins, played a weak nonconference schedule (ranked 286th) and don't have much left on the schedule to help their resume.

"All the teams from here on out are playing for something," sophomore forward Isaiah Roby said.

"Every game, it's like a tournament game. You lose, it can hurt your chances a lot."

Nebraska sits at No. 52 in Friday's RPI rankings and No. 54 in KenPom's

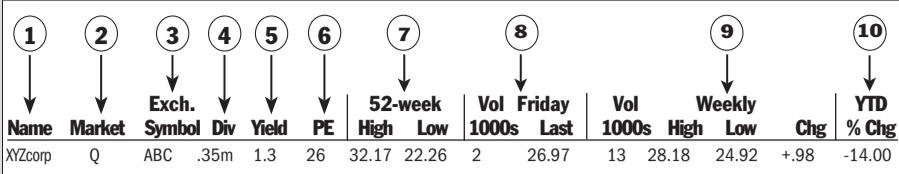

Lamponing the Counterculture

A city where the young go to retire, Portland, Oregon, is known for the atypical lifestyles and leisure activities embraced by its local champions of individuality. Their eccentric yet charismatic counterculture is nicely summed up by the motto of "Keep Portland Weird" (borrowed from the Keep Austin Weird organization and slogan in Texas) and the surreal satire of "Portlandia," IFC's flagship Emmy-nominated and Peabody Award-winning sketch comedy series, now airing in its eighth and final season, Thursdays at 10 p.m. For creators and stars Fred Armisen and Carrie Brownstein, the decision to draw the curtain on their cavalcade of curious hippie and hipster characters was a practical one that considered the big picture.

"We just thought that we would like to have some sense of control over how to conclude the series," Armisen explains, "as opposed to it getting away from us, or getting canceled - we wanted to end the show while we all loved doing it. We had good feelings about it, and it just seemed like the right time. And also, eight seasons is a lot of time. So, it was a very organic decision."

"I think one of the freedoms that comes from making sketches, you know, people aren't looking for everyone to get pregnant or die or, I don't know, go off into space or something," Brownstein notes. "So, we were able, I think, to avoid sentimentality a little bit. There were a couple of characters that we were interested in kind of a suggestion of finality or closure. But I don't think that's what we led with in the writing process."

"We were just careful not to make it seem too much like a last season," Armisen continues. "I think we wanted the episodes to be able to be watched in any order, because I think that's how people watch things, anyway. Even sketches. So, there were a few things that we did, to, you know, give a little bit of a signature to it. But really, I remember at the beginning of when we were writing, we said, 'Let's make sure that we are writing sketches that can still last a while, that can have some

shelf life, that are still funny in some way,' you know, hopefully. Other than that, I don't know if we really took any extra time to do anything."

However, season eight did open with something rather special. "For the very last season, we put this band together for someone who wanted to relive his punk days," Armisen acknowledges. "Because of our current administration, punk can come back

and be an angry type of music again. It was sort of impossible to do for a while. So, we got Henry Rollins, as the lead singer of the band, and Krist Novoselic from Nirvana, and Brendan Canty from Fugazi. So, that was like a great group to put together. That felt like a good thing for the last season."

Season eight features returning cast favorites Ed Begley Jr., Jeff Goldblum, Natasha Lyonne, Kyle MacLachlan and Kumail Nanjani, along with such popular Armisen and Brownstein characters

as middle-aged couple Peter and Nance, the annoyingly active Dave and Kath, and feminist bookstore proprietors Candace and Toni.

"These characters, they're permutations of who Fred and I are, who the writers are," says Brownstein. "They're versions of people who we know. And I think that there is an openness and earnestness with which we portray and write these people who I think allows a way in. It's not a show that leads with mendacity. It's not scabrous in any way, and so I think that there is just an openness. It's not targeting people, or sort of making them the butt of the joke. I feel like the intention is one of con-

ing it, you just get a buzz of like, ahhh, you know. But I have no proof of that. I just know that when I watch edits, as soon as that theme song comes up, I love it. It's like a comfy place to be."

"I think something that we become more aware of as it's coming to a close is just the joy that kind of imbued the entire process," says Brownstein, "from the creation of it, to the writing of it, to getting to film up in Portland with our amazing cast and crew. I think we just never took it for granted. We just really had a lot of fun there. It was like a true elasticity in what we were able to do. We were able to change the narrative season after season. And just the whole process was amazing."

And I don't know why I think this, but I think the theme song is very seductive. There's something about that theme song that, like, as soon as you start watch-

Q: James Brolin has always been one of my favorite actors, ever since his “Hotel” days. Can you tell me what he has going on now? — Janet F., Fort Meyers, Florida

A: Up next for James is the Hallmark movie “Royal Hearts,” which debuts Saturday, Feb. 24. And James is no stranger to Hallmark: his credits include the popular holiday movies “Christmas with Tucker” and “I’ll Be Home for Christmas.”

I wasn’t very comfortable or good at it all those years, so I really studied the art behind it, trying to get over my fears and my dislike of saying words into a machine. The whole time, I always had the latest camera. I had my own darkroom when I was 10, and my first movie camera when I was 15. But it wasn’t until I was in the beginning of the second year of ‘Hotel’ when Aaron Spelling said, ‘OK, you can direct one.’”

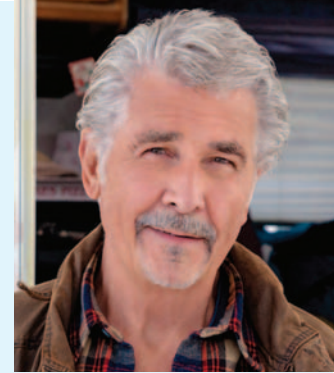
If you’re in the mood for fun family entertainment, take it from James himself: “I think this is the best Hallmark film ever made. That’s a real self-centered comment,

but I do believe that. I invite someone to come up to me with a DVD and say, ‘Hey, this one’s better.’ Because the only time I learn anything is when I’m wrong.”
