APHS's Henderson named Teacher of the Year

AVON PARK — Avon Park High School AVID Coordinator Dawn Henderson was named the Highlands County Teacher of the Year 2020 at the Summit Awards Thursday evening at Avon Park High School.

Lake Placid High School media paraprofessional Alesia Cheshire was named the Highlands County School-Related Employee of the Year 2019.

Henderson said, "I was in shock; I am really humbled and excited and thankful that I get to come here every single day and do something I love."

Cheshire said, "I was very surprised; I am honored because I put in a lot of sweat and tears into our kids, and I think it is a great honor to be chosen. It is just amazing."

The district's prepared summary on Henderson's qualities as an educator note that she has worked at APHS since beginning her career in 2004.

Principal Danielle Erwin said, "Dawn is the heart of Avon Park High. She opens doors and changes mindsets for students under her watch. Five years ago, AVID was an initiative. Today it is our way of life."

Former principal Tealy Williams adds, "Dawn is a gifted teacher and an incredible humanitarian."

Former student Diana Eugenio shares, "Through Ms. Henderson's encouragement, I was brave enough to share my story of trial and triumph, and she played a vital role in my story of success. I have never had a teacher impact my life the way she has."

There is a long timeline from the local, regional, state and national level to the naming of the national teacher of the year, hence the 2020 designation for the Highlands County Teacher of the Year.

Principal Kevin Tunning states, "Students gravitate to Alesia because she is always looking out for them and encouraging them to achieve their dreams. Her defining feature is her ability to find students who need an advocate. We have had many examples where students would not have graduated without Alesia's encouragement."

"Her willingness to stand in the gap for them changes the trajectory of their lives. Her dedication to students is an example for everyone to applaud."

English teacher Melissa Sohn adds, "Alesia goes above and beyond to make

Registered sex offender charged with animal cruelty

SEBRING — A man who is a registered sex offender and resides in Highlands County was arrested Thursday for animal cruelty. His two dogs had been starved to the point where their rib bones were prominent, and they were eating acorns to try to survive, according to authorities.

Joseph Reyes, 41, of 3307 Baxter Ave. in Sebring, was arrested by the Highlands County Sheriff's Office Thursday.

Reyes, who is a registered sex offender, was charged with animal cruelty.

Previously, on July 10, 2003, he was charged with lewd and lascivious molestation on a victim between the ages of 12-15 years old.

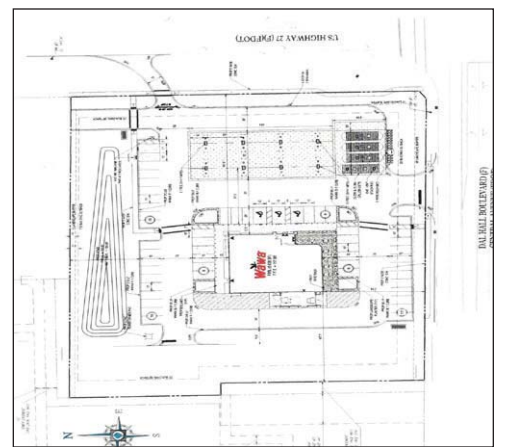
These charges were filed in Okaloosa County.

Authorities were looking for Reyes because he had a warrant from the

Council considers right of way for Wawa

LAKE PLACID — James Langford, assistant county engineer, placed an agenda item for the town council members to consider during its special meeting on Nov. 29. County Planner Jodene Thayer represented the engineer. She asked the council members for feedback of the county's intent to request 15 feet of the proposed Wawa frontage right of way. The county wants the right of way dedicated to the county for future land use.

The right of way in question is on the frontage of the proposed Wawa location, or the old Bank of America building. In an email to Town Administrator Phil Williams, dated Nov. 27, Langford said Wawa has been asking county engineers

Burglaries on the rise during holidays

SEBRING — Burglaries are on the rise this month, and Highlands County has also experienced a string of exes attempting to break into the homes of their former significant others.

How can residents protect their homes from people who want to steal their valuables and their privacy? Highlands News-Sun asked the experts, local law enforcement officers.

"During the holiday season, law enforcement urges the public to be cognizant of their surroundings as burglaries do tend to increase during this time," Cmdr. Curtis Hart of the Sebring Police Department said.

"If you are out shopping, make sure you do not leave items in plain view within your vehicle," Hart said. "If you are expecting deliveries, ask a friend, trusted neighbor or family member to keep an eye open for them and possibly pick them up for you if you are away."

Highlands County Sheriff's Office recommends the 9 p.m. routine where people lock their homes and vehicles every night before going to bed.

Scott Dressel, public information officer for the Sheriff's Office, said, "The best way to protect your home

from burglaries is to lock up. Most burglaries are the result of an unlocked door or window. Criminals want easy targets.

"Your doors and windows should have sturdy locks," Dressel said. "Your doors should have deadbolts, and you can also take the extra step of adding something that prevents a window from sliding open even if it is unlocked. This can be as simple as a piece of wood lodged between the window and the frame."

Lake Placid Police Chief James Fansler said, "My first recommendation is to make sure to purchase a good solid brand deadbolt. I understand money can be tight, but when it comes to protecting your assets and family, home protection is not the time to cut costs."

"ConsumerReports.org has compiled a list of some of the best deadbolts on the market," Fansler said. "Deadbolts are a sturdier lock than your standard door lock; however, they cannot offer 100 percent protection."

"With deadbolt locks, they are only effective if the person locking the door makes certain the tumblers inside fully rotate," Fansler said. "In some cases, the person only turns it far enough to remove the key and is left with a false sense of security. The bolt needs to fully rotate and lock in place to be fully effective."

"I would also suggest that homeowners install good lighting on the exteriors of their property to include motion lights," Hart said.

Fansler agreed. "Lighting is some of the most important anti-burglary investing you can do for your home. If you have a dark home, or dark areas around your home, anyone can hide and wait for you to leave. If there are none of the above measures in place, they can easily burglarize your home without detection. Invest in good lighting."

"It's also imperative that homeowners communicate with their neighbors and look out for each other's property," Hart said. "Always report odd or suspicious activity to law enforcement."

Fansler concurred with Hart. In fact, he contends that nosy neighbors are often the best kind of neighbors and some neighbors are best avoided.

Precautionary boil water notice

SPECIAL TO HIGHLANDS NEWS-SUN

LAKE PLACID — Due to a major line break in the Lake Blue area, the town's water system lost pressure. Loss of pressure requires the issuance of a precautionary boil water notice. The boil water notice affected the town water system in Lake Blue area (excluding Raceway, Holiday Inn and Lakeside Cottages).

A Precautionary Boil Water Notice will be in effect until a rescind notice has been issued. It is expected to be issued at noon Monday, Dec. 10. As required by the Florida Department of Environmental Regulation (FAC 655.340 etc), the utility must have two consecutive days of passing bacteriological samples taken. A rescind notice will be issued when passing results are received from the laboratory.

As a precaution, the Town of Lake Placid Utilities Department suggests that all water used for drinking or cooking be boiled. A rolling boil of one minute or longer is sufficient. As an alternate, bottled water may be used.

"Make friends with good neighbors. Now I didn't say make good friends with neighbors, I said make friends with good neighbors. There is a difference.

"You want to make sure you are not making friends with the one person who can easily learn your habits and break in while you are gone," Fansler said. "You want that neighbor who is always looking out for other neighbors. The one who is almost borderline nosy and will be quick to call the police if they

don't recognize the person on your doorstep. You want a neighbor who will not stand for shenanigans by hooligans.

"Second part to this is participating in a Neighborhood Watch program," Fansler said. "If there is not one already established, get the program started and make your home and neighborhood safer."

"Homeowners can also look into alarm and live monitoring video systems, which are becoming very popular," Hart said.

"When shopping for a security alarm company, you really need to do some quick research,"

Fansler added. "Don't be afraid to ask questions. You want to know if the company monitors their customers' systems, or is that function farmed out to a secondary monitoring company? That can make a difference in emergency response times. I personally recommend a local hometown company over the national brands.

"Along with the security system, I strongly encourage video security systems," Fansler said. "Nothing allows a would-be bad guy to know he is being watched like a camera in his face. If you can swing just a little bit more, you can have

the system show right on your cellular device, giving you constant ability to keep an eye on your home.

"If you cannot afford a full camera system and alarm, consider an inexpensive item such as the RING," Fansler said. "This is a camera/doorbell combination that hooks right to your home at the doorbell area. The RING has many features including video of anyone within a predetermined area to be sent directly to your cellular device. Once downloaded, the RING application has a tone that chimes when it captures a picture. Once again, this gives you

immediate information on the condition of your home and any criminal who may wish to come in.

"A dog is also an excellent way to make people think twice about breaking into your home," Dressel said. A dog will often hear a person who is near the house before the homeowner does. This gives extra warning time and acts as a deterrent to burglars.

During the past few months, Highlands County has had several incidents where eyes have forced their way into homes and have committed battery on their former significant

others. Hart and Fansler provided tips for dealing with estranged relationships.

"We would normally suggest that the parties obtain a restraining order or injunction to assist them keeping the other party away from their homes and businesses," Hart said. "It doesn't always work; however, it does give law enforcement a tool to work with in most cases."

"In regards to the ex entering the home," Fansler said, "change locks with every change of a significant other. They may have a spare key made some time during the relationship."

questions about the site.

The right of way is considered a Rural Major Collector road by the county. A road with that classification should have a 100-foot right of way and the current right of way is only 70 feet.

During the Nov. 29 meeting, Thayer said she would not have put the item on the Town Council's agenda.

"What is your opinion?" Thayer asked council members. "How do you feel about 15 feet of right of way, that, per the county regulations, is needed for Dal Hall Boulevard?"

"Wawa Corporation

has decided that's where they would like to put their business," Thayer said. "They usually come in with a site plan that is prepared well ahead of time. It's the site plan they use in several other sites across America. That's what we have here; they're tailored on their generic site plan.

"It fits the parcel as it is right now," she said.

The county would have to request the 15 feet of right of way from the Gate gas station on the south side of the intersection or from Wawa, which is eyeing the Bank of America property on the north side for its new location.

"If 15 feet is taken away for right of way, then Wawa has to go back to

the drawing board and do a new drawing," Thayer said.

The planner has not received any documents for the site plan process. The company has to comply with Florida Department of Transportation and the county's transportation concurrence before it can even apply to the county with the site plans.

Town Attorney Bert Harris III felt it was premature for the council to decide in favor or against the right of way until a traffic study was done.

Councilwoman Debra Worley said she wanted to table the agenda item. She said the previous property that Wawa was looking into on Interlake Boulevard was smaller

and was 80 feet wide so Wawa's engineers should be able to figure it out. She doubted the owners of the Gate station would give up 15 feet of their property, especially if it helped the competition.

"We're being asked to do something here," Worley said. "I think it's up to Wawa. We took all the hit on SunTrust Bank and it's a smaller site than this one. I said it wouldn't work and we said it wouldn't work. It wouldn't comply and then we got 'we don't want Wawa.' We do want Wawa. We want Wawa in Lake Placid."

Worley said Wawa might want to seek a different site because they are trying to fit a store onto a site that is too large

for the property.

Councilman Ray Royce asked Thayer if the engineers could give a variance. Thayer said yes.

"My point is, at this stage in the game, I think our preference is that we want to make sure that the transportation is well taken care of; that all the tenants of the Lake Placid Regional Planning are adhered to and taken care of, and that if Mr. Howerton and Mr. Langford in their infinite wisdom decide two months, three months from now that they can get 12 or 12 feet and that's enough, and they want to give them a slight break then that's within their purview," Royce said.

Royce said there would

need to be turn lanes eventually. He said Wawa could possibly change items in their plans or the engineering department could figure it out.

Councilman Greg Sapp said he wasn't sure if turn lanes would ease any problems at the location. He said Dal Hall Boulevard is too narrow, especially toward Main Avenue that the advantage would not be significant.

The council reiterated the motion be tabled.

Thayer emphasized that Langford was not looking to have the council give any concessions to Wawa for their commercial site process saying "that's not even on the table."

Sheriff's Office Sexual Offender & Predator Unit for animal cruelty. His two dogs were starved and their skeletal bones were protruding. According to Det. Luis Ramos, the dogs appeared scared and starved. Ramos had previously encountered Reyes' dogs and noted that they were friendly and healthy, but their health had greatly deteriorated.

The two dogs were fed and sent to a local veterinarian for treatment before being taken to Animal Services.

Reyes was found working in an orange grove near the Highlands and DeSoto county line, according to a Facebook post from the Sheriff's Office.

The Sexual Offender & Predator Unit worked with three DeSoto County Sheriff's Office deputies to capture Reyes.

Residents can call 863-402-6730 if they suspect that an animal has been abused. The number can also be used to call in an animal complaint.

"Call us anytime you suspect an animal is abused," Joe Minshew, animal control officer with Animal Services, said. "We will issue a welfare check and take pictures of the animal."

"We will find out if vaccinations are up to date," Minshew said. "We don't give up until we get our hands on the dog [or cat] and physically see the dog. We can also do a welfare check on livestock. We do a full report. We have to go out [if animal abuse is suspected]."

Man yells 'there's no Santa' at holiday event

CAPE CORAL — It wasn't the Grinch who stole Christmas. It was a man who screamed "there's no Santa Claus" over and over during a recent holiday festival in Florida.

A southwest Florida woman shared cellphone footage with Fort Myers television station NBC-2 of the man yelling during the Cape Coral Festival of Lights on Saturday night.

Cape Coral police told the station that officers were at the event but couldn't do anything because the man was exercising his freedom of speech. They added they could have intervened had he used a voice enhancer such as a megaphone, or started a riot.

Cindy Menkes of Cape Coral says it's about decency and said she's sad that "the magic of this time of year" was taken away from some children.

Audit details errors Florida made in issuing gun permits

TALLAHASSEE — An audit shows the Florida department that approves gun permits and licenses for security guards and private investigators had inadequate oversight that led to hundreds of permits issued in error.

The state auditor general report released this week details many of the problems that were previously disclosed by the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, but said the department understated the number of concealed weapons permits that had to be revoked.

The department previously reported that it revoked concealed weapons permits from

291 people after discovering an employee had failed to complete all of the required background checks.

The state audit said it was actually 310 permits that were revoked and said the number was misstated because of a transposition error.

The report says that the department also issued permits to two people who didn't apply for one.

Residents of Keys remember Bush's fishing legacy

ISLAMORADA — Longtime residents of the Florida Keys remember the late George H.W. Bush and his sportfishing trips to the island chain before, during and after his presidency.

The 41st president's affection for catch-and-release fishing of bonefish, tarpon and permit was so significant, he lent his name to an annual Keys tournament.

From 1994 to 2003, the George Bush/Cheeca Lodge Bonefish Tournament attracted participants including former treasury secretary Nicholas Brady and Gen. Norman Schwarzkopf Jr.

The tournament served as a fundraiser for causes including Florida Everglades conservation.

In 1995, the president and his grandson, Jeb Bush, Jr., each caught and released a permit. In late November 2000, the president fished the tournament, but his mind was focused on that year's presidential election and the Florida recount.

Bush was buried Thursday at his presidential library at Texas A&M University.

Leaping lemur surprises trooper during DUI arrest

SANFORD — A lemur surprised a Florida

Highway Patrol trooper when it crawled from a trailer being pulled by a pickup truck that had been stopped for driving erratically and hitting other cars.

Dashcam video shows the lemur peeking out of the trailer before hopping to the ground and leaping around the trooper who was talking to the driver along Interstate 4 in Sanford on Saturday night.

The video shows the trooper doing a double-take as the lemur runs around and stands on its hind legs.

Twenty-seven-year-old driver Shane Taylor warned troopers that the lemur named Miko "bites." Taylor was arrested on several charges including DUI.

State wildlife officers took custody of the lemur

and other exotic animals including a tortoise, a goat, a parrot and a wallaby.

Jail records don't list a lawyer for Taylor.

Marine from Miramar killed in military crash

MIAMI — Military officials say a 28-year-old Florida man has died in a crash of two U.S. warplanes that collided off Japan's coast.

The U.S. Marine Corps said in a statement released Friday that Capt. Jahmar F. Resilard of Miramar, Florida, died in the Thursday crash. Another crew member was found and is in fair condition. Five others remain missing.

Resilard was a F/A-18 pilot with the Marine All

Weather Attack Squadron 242 and was stationed on Marine Corps Air Station Iwakuni in Yamaguchi, Japan.

Lt. Col. James Compton called Resilard an "effective and dedicated leader who cared for his Marines and fellow pilots with passion." His decorations include the Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal, Global War on Terrorism Medal and National Defense Service Medal.

The crash remains under investigation.

Sheriff: 6-year-old killed in house fire

MIMS — Authorities say a 6-year-old Florida child has died in a house fire.

Brevard County Sheriff's spokesman Tod Goodyear tells news

outlets that the fire was reported early Friday at a home in Mims, which is near Melbourne on Florida's Atlantic Coast.

The American Red Cross told reporters they are assisting the family, which included guests who were visiting from out of town. The television station reports five people were taken to the hospital with minor injuries.

An investigation is underway. Officials haven't released the child's name.



Report Natural Gas Leaks at Once

The purpose of natural gas pipelines is to carry one of the world's most efficient and environmentally-friendly fuels to businesses and homes like yours. These pipelines help meet the energy needs of the region. According to federal statistics, pipelines are the nation's safest and most reliable energy transportation system. Although gas incidents are rare, this mode of transportation does carry some hazards should a release occur. These risks may include ignition, fire, and explosion; which can have a significant impact to both property and/or life. For this reason, Peoples Gas considers a natural gas leak first priority. Be aware of the signs of a pipeline leak

Natural gas is lighter than air and may pose a hazard, especially if released in confined spaces. It's important to be able to identify signs of a natural gas leak, especially the rotten egg-like odor that natural gas gives off. Near a gas line, watch for blowing dirt, bubbling water, dry spots in moist areas or dead plants surrounded by live, green plants. Listen for a hissing sound. All of these things could mean there is a natural gas leak nearby.

If you suspect a leak, leave immediately — don't try to find or stop the leak. Don't touch anything electrical before you leave or use a telephone, even a cell phone. Don't smoke, don't turn appliances or lights on or off, and don't operate any vehicle or equipment that could create a spark. Once you are out of the suspected area, immediately call **877-832-6747 (877-TECO PGS)**. If the smell of natural gas is particularly strong, call **9-1-1**.

How to spot pipelines in your area

Peoples Gas installs yellow pipeline markers along the route of the pipeline including at road crossings, fence lines and street intersections. Pipeline markers show the name of the owner of the pipeline, the product contained in the pipeline and the number to call in case of an emergency. Please note that pipeline markers indicate that a gas facility is in the general area and are not necessarily placed directly over the pipeline nor do they indicate the depth of the pipeline. In areas of high density such as residential areas and downtown districts pipeline markers may not be present; however, gas pipelines may be located within the rights of way of streets and roadways. Be aware that unauthorized infringements on pipeline rights-of-way inhibit our ability to respond, perform routine maintenance, provide surveillance, respond to third party damage, and perform required federal and state inspections.

Prevent damage to pipelines

Florida law requires anyone working on a project that involves digging of any kind — whether they own the property where the digging is taking place or not — to call 8-1-1 two full business days before digging starts. Trained professionals will visit the property where digging will happen to locate and mark all underground utility lines. The service is free and the message is simple: Call before you dig. All addicts pose a threat to others

It is easy to stereotype opioid users as poor, misguided souls, down on their luck and in search of reality-altering fixes. The reality is considerably more complex. The scourge of addiction is among us, masked in plain sight in the workplace, even among health professionals who should know better.

This is the sad takeaway from a Dallas Morning News report chronicling the deaths of two nurses at the UT Southwestern Medical Center's Clements hospital in Dallas. They overdosed in the same way — on the job and in a locked bathroom, each clutching a syringe, track marks on their arms, using the painkiller fentanyl.

Tragically, more than 100 deaths occur each day from opioid abuse in the U.S. But addiction is far-reaching and embedded in the lifestyles of too many Americans. The National Council on Alcoholism and Drug Dependence estimates that more than 70 percent of abusers of drugs in America are employed even as they binge drink, use marijuana, cocaine or abuse prescription drugs.

And medical providers aren't exempt. The Journal of Clinical Nursing estimates that approximately 20 percent of all nurses struggle with an addiction to drugs or alcohol. Among physicians, about 10 percent will struggle with drug or alcohol abuse.

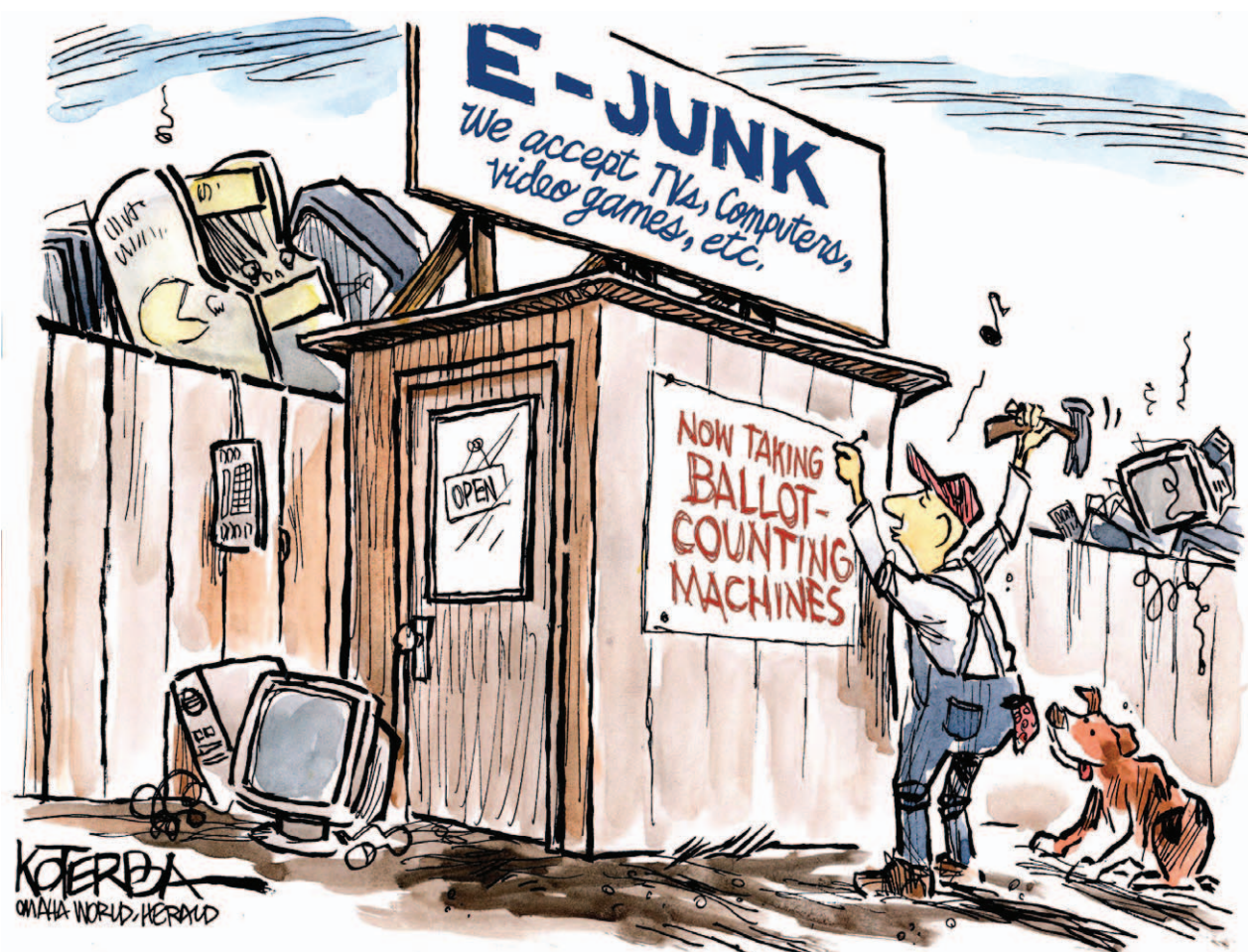
UT Southwestern has released few details about the nurses and can't say for sure how they obtained the drugs, though it is clear that fentanyl is stolen from hospitals with concerning frequency. The Addiction Center, which monitors abuse among medical professionals nationally, says medical professionals face a deadly combination of opportunity and temptation.

Doctors and nurses have access to oxycodone or fentanyl in the course of their jobs and may be tempted to abuse these powerful prescription medications if the drugs aren't properly inventoried and kept under the closest guard. Knowledge of the consequences should deter medical abusers, but the center notes that expertise about drug-induced euphoria may be too much for some to resist. And there is another factor in play — stress.

Medical professionals make life-and-death decisions on patients during unpredictable and exhausting work shifts. Some handle it well, but those who don't are susceptible to self-medication, a reaction that is commonly found in many other high-stress jobs, too. Detecting a drug or alcohol dependence in doctors or nurses or even accountants and lawyers can be difficult; many are highly functional addicts.

And that is the challenge. Regardless of their occupation, addicts pose a threat to others even if they don't think they do. Not only are they putting their health at risk but also the well-being of others on and off the job. The sooner an addiction is faced head on, the better. And that's why it is crucial that people with addictions — especially medical professionals — get treatment and not hide in the dark recesses of drug abuse.

Movie tells the ignored story of 'America's biggest serial killer'

WASHINGTON – A word can be worth a thousand pictures. In the movie “Gosnell: The Trial of America’s Biggest Serial Killer,” the mild word “snip” describes what the camera, demonstrating the eloquence of reticence, does not show in gory detail: Kermit Gosnell’s use of scissors to cut the spinal cords of hundreds of babies that survived his late-term abortion procedures.

Directed by actor Nick Searcy (“Three Billboards Outside Ebbing, Missouri,” “The Shape of Water”), this gripping true-crime courtroom drama, with dialogue taken from court transcripts and police records, made it onto 670 screens, and earned nearly \$4 million, and soon will be available in DVD format through Netflix. This, in spite of impediments from portions of America’s cultural apparatus that are reflexively hostile to examining Gosnell’s career in infanticide.

The movie’s makers tried to raise money on a crowdfunding website that balked at graphic – meaning accurate – descriptions of the subject, because “we are a broad website used by millions of people.” However, a pluckier site gathered \$2.4 million from 30,000 contributors. Almost all regular critics of movies were offered copies of the movie. A major film will receive about 270 media reviews, according to Mark Joseph, CEO of MJM Entertainment Group. “Gosnell” received 12, even though in the October week it was released it was the top grossing independent film and cracked the top 10 of all films in theaters. The critics’ boycott of the film continued the journalists’ indifference toward Gosnell’s trial.

As the prosecutors drove to the courthouse in 2013 for the first day of Gosnell’s trial on

eight counts of murder (a woman who died following an abortion procedure, and seven snipped babies) and 24 felony counts of abortion beyond Pennsylvania’s 24-week limit, they anticipated a difficult maelstrom of media attention. They encountered something worse: virtually no attention. In spite of – actually, because of – its gruesome substance, the two-month trial, which ended with Gosnell sentenced to life imprisonment without parole, was not covered until, by their example, a few journalists – especially USA Today’s Kirsten Powers – embarrassed others into paying attention. If Gosnell’s victims had been middle class instead of inner-city minorities, there surely would have been more interest in an abortion facility where babies were heard crying, and where a woman victim of Gosnell’s slapdash procedures went home with an arm and a leg of her baby still in her. According to grand jury testimony, early in Gosnell’s career of carnage he used a medical device lacking federal approval, “basically plastic razors that were formed into a ball”:

“They were coated into a gel, so that they would remain closed. These would be inserted into the woman’s uterus. And after several hours of body temperature ... the gel would melt and these 97 things would spring open, supposedly cutting up the fetus, and the fetus would be expelled.”

Recently in Texas, Samuel Little, 78, has been confessing to more than 90 murders spanning 35 years. Now serving three life sentences for the murders of three Los Angeles women in the 1980s, he has been giving police details that

seem to validate his claim to have killed in at least 14 states. A Texas district attorney says “we anticipate that Samuel Little will be confirmed as one of the most prolific serial killers in American history,” and The New York Times observes, “How a serial murderer could go on killing for years, apparently without anyone noticing a pattern, seems perplexing.”

That Gosnell could have been a much more prolific killer than Little is not perplexing, for two reasons. People who should have known did not want to know because knowing would have forced them to answer questions about when in an infant’s gestation it is preposterous to deny that a baby is present. And given that most “reproductive rights” militants oppose restrictions on late-term abortions because pre-born babies supposedly have no more moral significance than tumors, Gosnell sincerely thought he was doing nothing wrong in guaranteeing dead babies for those who paid for late-term abortions. This is why, in the movie and as actually happened, a female prosecutor is accurately warned by her supervisor that she would be characterized as “the prosecutor who went after reproductive rights.”

No one knows how many – certainly hundreds, probably thousands – spinal cords Gosnell snipped before the 2010 raid on his “clinic.” Law enforcement came looking for illegal drugs. They also found jars of babies’ feet, fetal remains in toilets and milk cartons, and a pervasive smell of cat feces – in a facility that had not been inspected for 17 years. Pennsylvania nail salons receive biennial inspections.

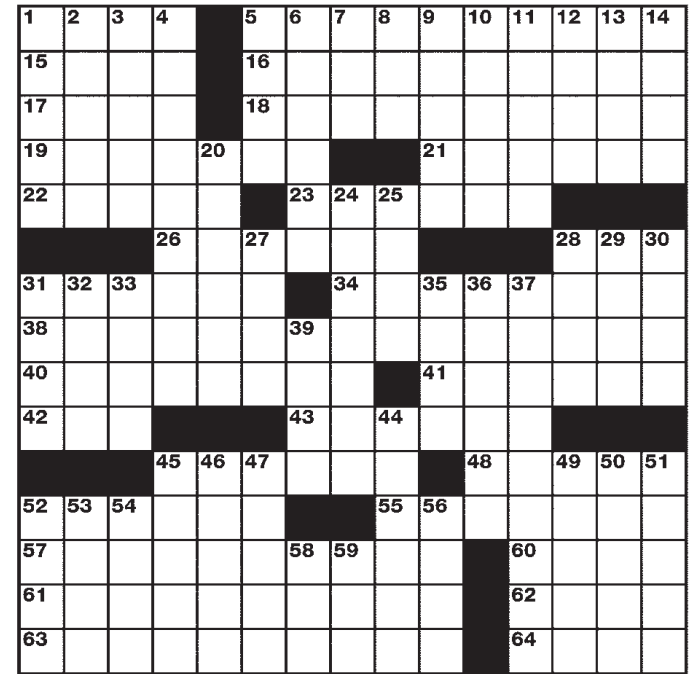

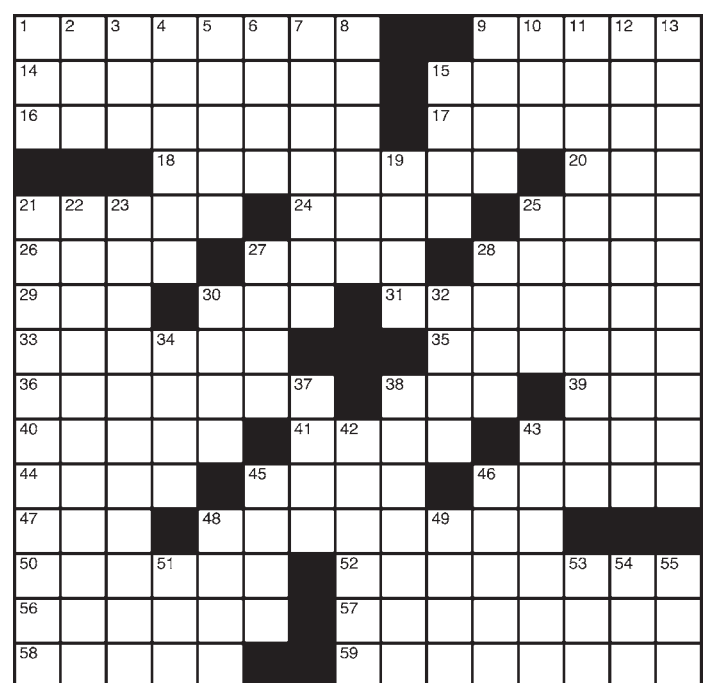

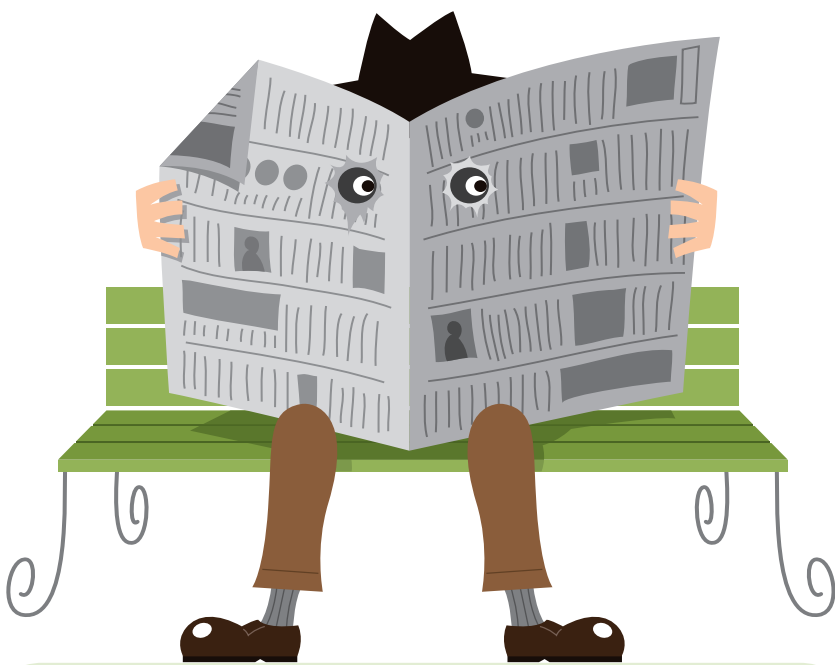

Higgins, was off target much of the game.

Their teammates understand they'll need the best of both to win another national title.

Higgins had talked with Etienne several times about starting fast before the game against the

Panthers.

"I told him, 'First play, take it to the crib.' That's exactly what he did," Higgins said.

It hasn't been a smooth journey for either Lawrence or Etienne.

Lawrence arrived at Clemson amid tremendous hype, the top quarterback prospect who had surpassed the Georgia state high school

marks of ex-Tiger national championship passer Deshaun Watson. Four quarterbacks, including last year's starter who opened the first four games this season in Kelly Bryant, transferred when it became clear they'd losing playing time to Lawrence.

For the freshman, it was difficult seeing teammates, friends and

mentors go and knowing he couldn't let down the Tigers after they placed immense trust in his abilities.

"There were plenty of bumps," Lawrence said. "I'm just going to keep working hard and doing what I'm asked."

Etienne was one of Clemson's final recruiting gets in 2017, a gangly, happy-go-lucky — sometimes aloof — youngster who had plenty to learn about the college game.

Clemson running backs coach Tony Elliott, also co-offensive coordinator, been at times frustrated, overjoyed and skeptical at Etienne's progress.

"It's taken a long time for him to get here," Elliott said.

A year ago, Etienne relied too much on his breakaway ability instead of patiently finding holes to extend runs, Elliott said. Etienne's vision and ability to read the line of scrimmage has vastly improved, his position coach said,

leading to 1,463 yards and a Clemson single-season record 21 rushing touchdowns.

Etienne credits Clemson's rotation of backs (Tavien Feaster, Adam Choice, Lyn-J Dixon) and offensive line for the Tigers putting up a single-season record of 46 rushing TDs and 3,377 yards on the ground, the school's second highest one-year total since the 1978 team gained 3,469 yards rushing.

"You want to go out and lay it on the line for them," Etienne said of the offense.

The Tigers (CFP No. 2) will face third-ranked Notre Dame (12-0, CFP No. 3) in the Cotton Bowl on Dec. 29 for the right to play for the national title.

Notre Dame coach Brian Kelly is aware much of his game plan involves slowing Lawrence and Etienne.

"Certainly, their offensive firepower is outstanding," Kelly said. "Etienne at the running

back position, great depth. We all know about Trevor Lawrence and what he can do at the quarterback position."

Lawrence and Etienne acknowledge their shortcomings.

Lawrence is masterful on his laser-like, mid-range throws to the sidelines. He's less effective on deep balls, overthrowing open receivers as many times as he connects.

Etienne still spends too much time in his own head. He was demonstratively upset on the sidelines early as Duke led Clemson 6-0 on Nov. 18. The anger, Etienne said, was over his own mistakes in Clemson's slow start.

"No one's tougher on Travis than he is," Elliott said.

Lawrence is glad to have the speedy Etienne in his backfield.

"We've had some weird situations, but 13-0, you can't expect any better than this," Lawrence said.

partners. (Engine builder) AER has been with us — as we head into 2019 — that will be our 17th season with AER. They have been a great partner. They continue to step up their game. We had flawless reliability from Sebring on (in 2018), so I'm really proud of what they've done.

"(Chassis constructor) Multimatic has absolutely been a shining star and our relationship with them is so massive. They've improved the race car so much, put so many people and resources on the project and they're just a terrific partner. Obviously, Joest Racing and their history and experience has been a nice addition as well.

"So I think what you have heading into 2019 is all the partners working as one unit, which you can talk about, but when it actually happens — which is what I am experiencing now — that's when I think everybody is aligned, hopefully, for some success."

Ultimate success in terms of race wins has eluded the Mazda DPI program to date, but just barely. Especially as the 2018 season wound down, a breakthrough victory was tantalizingly close. In addition to the double podium at Motul Petit Le Mans, there was late-race splash of fuel that took them out of the lead in the closing minutes at Road America, and an incident with a

lapped car while leading late at WeatherTech Raceway Laguna Seca.

So, the team heads into 2019 hungrier than ever to finally get that breakthrough victory.

"We certainly threatened on a number of occasions in 2018 to meet that goal," Doonan said. "For a variety of reasons, some bad luck at times, some just strictly fuel strategy or the way our race strategy played out — not a mistake on our part, but just the way our race strategy played out — we weren't able to stand on the top step.

"But there's plenty of bright spots. We led a lot of laps. The car was competitive with the other cars in the category, and then to end the season on a high note like Petit was really good for everybody."

Doonan is under no

illusion that the 2019 season will be any easier. Like the Mazda Team Joest program, many of their competitors also head into the season with the benefit of experience from a full 2018 season working together.

"Everyone said it was tough last year," he said. "It's going to get tougher. Everybody's got a year under their belts at least. I think the level of quality that's assembled in the IMSA WeatherTech Championship is the best sports car racing talent, from teams to engineers to drivers, in the world. It just got tougher. I think it's going to come down to some luck, of course, everybody executing, and it's going to be a battle. I can't wait to see how it shakes out and I'm really glad we're in the thick of it."

SEBRING — When Leonard Whitman, 67, learned that his first-grade teacher was still alive and lived near his cousin in Sebring, Florida, he knew that was a trip he had to make. Though it had been over 60 years since he sat in her classroom, he never forgot the impact Carrie Fox had on his life.

Both Carrie Fox, who resides at the Sudan Interior Mission retirement village here in Sebring, and Whitman grew up in the small central Maine town of Athens. In that small town, everyone knew and looked out for each other. Whitman remembers Fox as a kind, loving and disciplined teacher. One teaching method she employed that sticks out in his memory is using slices of banana to teach addition and subtraction. With the added benefit, of course, of eating the slices at the conclusion of the lesson.

It was under Fox's Bible teaching at Sunday school a few years later that Whitman remembers asking Christ into his heart as his Savior. After

high school, Whitman joined the Navy in Vietnam. Upon leaving the Navy, he went on to pastor churches in Maine, Texas and Arkansas.

Fox didn't stay in Athens, either. After teaching for 21 years in Maine, she joined the teaching staff of a mission school in Nigeria, Africa. After 21 years in Africa, retirement brought her back to the U.S. and to the SIM retirement village in Sebring, where she has resided for 27 years.

This visit from her former student was somewhat of an early birthday gift. Fox turns 95 today, Dec. 8.

The trip has been in planning for over a year and had to be aborted once due to health complications. Whitman, who lives in Malvern, Arkansas, has battled Philadelphia leukemia for over 10 years.

Now, Whitman feels like he has come full circle. He was able to reconnect with his first teacher and let her know the influence she had on his life. For Fox, it is a special gift to learn that her work in the classroom had a lasting impact on a young life.

than absolute excellence.

Instead of simply filling a teacher's position to quickly fill a spot, she advertised and sought only the best applicants. She even asked for student and parent input regarding teachers. The stress was high during those initial months, but she always wore a smile and demanded the utmost professionalism.

"I want my teachers and staff to model a

positive attitude for students and set an example," Jacobs said.

Jacobs' heart is to help children. "When I was a child, I was molested by an uncle," she said. "It was his sickness, not mine." Even as a child, she displayed an incredible strength and resiliency. She understood it was not her fault, yet she struggled because she wanted to talk to someone.

"As an 8-year-old kid, I couldn't talk to anyone," Jacobs said. Her uncle threatened to kill her family, so she remained silent. She told herself, "When I grow up, I will be there for kids. They will always know they can tell me anything. They can come to me. I won't judge them." Jacobs smiled and then added, "I kept my word to myself and God."

Jacobs related a story about a child who came to her and told her that she wanted to die because she was being bullied. Jacobs told her, "They don't want you to feel special, because they don't feel special." Jacobs assured her that she was special, perfect just the way she was, and that she shouldn't allow anyone to take that feeling away from her. Later, the girl wrote a note that talked

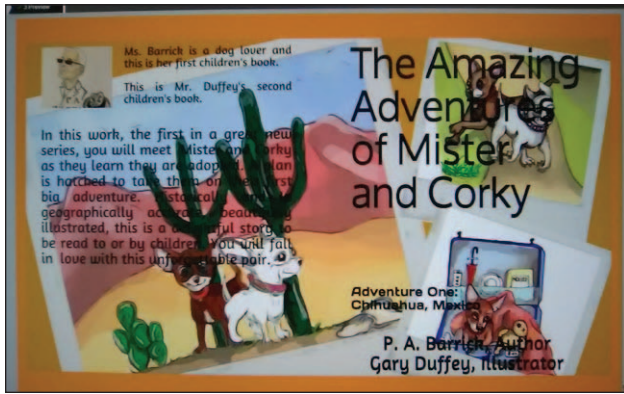

Coping with grief ... and Christmas: Part 1

Christmas is a joyful season, a time for family and children's excitement, a reason to give gifts of love and appreciation, a time to reflect on the meaning of the birth of our Lord, and an opportunity to remember those less fortunate while recognizing God's blessings. If you have experienced the death of a loved one, however, the holiday season often seems to intensify feelings of sadness and loneliness.

Sooner or later we are all bereaved. Death takes a grandparent, a sibling, a spouse, a child, a friend, or a dear companion pet. Whether you've lost a loved one or not, we can all reflect on how difficult navigating the holidays may be when a loved one is no longer physically present with us.

Memories of past holidays contrast sharply against the present one where the absence of our loved ones is acutely visible. Children and adults often feel alone, outside the circle of the joyfulness and cheer, different from, and not understood by their peers.

We may contemplate such questions as: How am I going to make it through the holidays? How can I help my child through this time, especially in light of my own grief? We may just want to sleep through or skip these next few weeks. We wonder why the holidays are still painful even though we grieved last year. The holidays may still only bring us hurt and bitterness. How, therefore, can we rejoice?

Know, first, that recovery from a painful loss is a slow process. Despite your grief, Christmas can become a blessing, a time for hope. Know you can find meaning and solace during these challenging days.

Let go of expectations of what the holiday should be.

In our culture, these seasonal holidays are not just holy days of great religious significance; it is also a preeminent holiday. It may cover weeks of preparation involving shopping, decorating, baking, parties, pageants, and more. It dominates the economy and media. Our norm may have been to become part of the whirlwind of activities and cheer.

This time, however,

allow yourself to have a different holiday from what is the general norm. Do what comforts and nourishes you, what you are capable of doing. Simplify what you customarily did in the past. You might decorate but on a smaller scale. You might reduce gift giving or decline some party invitations. Do what you can and let that be enough.

Grieving takes energy. You may have less energy now than at other times of the year. Be gentle with yourself and your family and allow yourself to take whatever time you need for yourself. Whatever you feel or decide to do in participating in this holiday, don't deny yourself the gift of healing tears.

Allow yourself to remember Christmases past.

Memories can bring healing to your grief. Sift through decorations, photos, or cards. Share your memories with others and listen to theirs. Use your loved one's name in conversation. List examples of your loved one's giving spirit and what was accomplished through it.

Remember your loved one in your Christmas traditions. You might set a place for this person at the Christmas table, hang that special ornament or their stocking on your mantel. Write a Christmas letter to your loved one. Sit among other family or friends – this may trigger warm, lovely memories of your loved one. Be prepared for this and don't be surprised by your tears.

Sometimes, all we can remember are the painful details surrounding our loved one's death. This holiday season try to remember all the wonderful moments of your loved one's life – the gifts that were given to you – the joy, laughter, affection, and companionship.

Plan out your activities. Grief can ebb and flow and, thus, surprise and overwhelm us. While this is OK and necessary, we

want to be mindful of our responsibilities and commitments. Thus, focus on your and your family's needs can be helpful in planning space for grieving and reducing off-guard moments. Decide with your family what traditions to continue and what to postpone. Your life will never be the same now – your grief is a process. Part of this process may be changing traditions and rituals and discovering new meanings.

Limit your involvement in activities.

Don't be tempted to immerse yourself in too many holiday activities as a means to avoid the painful grief. Grief will arise in some form unexpectedly regardless of efforts to suppress it. It is not something to "get over" or "put behind" us. There are lessons to learn during these times about ourselves after our loss. When we allow ourselves silence, time to be alone and not constantly engaged in celebrating, eating, drinking, or other means of avoidance, we slowly begin to accept the emptiness in our heart and to adjust to the absence of our loved one. It is then that we can look towards the purpose God has for us.

Seek out supportive people.

Please reach out even though you may believe that others should be rushing to your side at this time. Many people are tentative and may be fearful in approaching you, believing reminders of your grief is not welcome. You, too, may learn that some people you would normally turn towards are unable to recognize or understand your grief. This time may be a learning process. Please don't give up. There are people who accept your feelings, know the holidays are difficult, and will allow you to express your feelings. Romans 12:15 – "Rejoice with those who rejoice; mourn with those who mourn."

Mid-life dating can actually be fun

As we reach the holiday season, it's not uncommon for someone not in a relationship to feel a need to be with a significant other, or at least to have someone to take with him or her to that office party or family gathering. If you're in your twenties, the stress to make this happen is often pretty low. But if you're a bit older, it can sometimes produce lots of anxiety.

Today, mid-life dating has become much more common. Divorce, a partner's passing, or simply a career-based decision to wait on getting into a serious relationship are a few reasons why an older person is on his or her own.

Take, for example, the decision to get married. In 1980 the average marriage age for a woman was 22 years. By 1990 it had climbed to 24 and today the Census Bureau reports that women marry at an average age

of 27.4 years and 29.5 years for men.

Waiting on marriage is one reason for dating at an older age, but another change that has promoted more dating, especially for those well past 30, is the availability of numerous Internet services promising to find your perfect match. While that promise may only sometimes come true, millions are using such services to more easily enter the active dating pool.

But while online apps may make it easier to locate someone to date, mid-life dating still can be a stressful proposition. One reason is that dating when older can easily upset an established life. You have a career, friends, regular routines and activities that hopefully you enjoy. Then, suddenly, a new romantic interest can affect many of those established things.

Instead, you can limit some stress by maintaining much of your normal life, rather than suddenly

changing everything for that new person. If that someone has you canceling plans and changing schedules, it sends a message about how little you value your current life.

Similarly, you want to hold on to existing friends. When you focus only on that new person, you can eventually leave yourself feeling guilty and anxious over how you've treated, and possibly lost, trusted friends.

The key is to view mid-life dating as an enjoyable, interesting adventure that's an addition to your existing life, not a replacement for what you already have. When mid-life dating isn't an "all or nothing" proposition, it will be much less stressful.

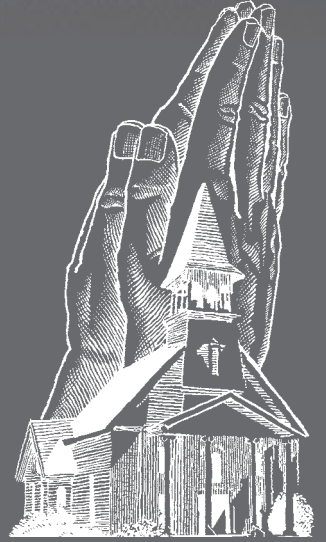

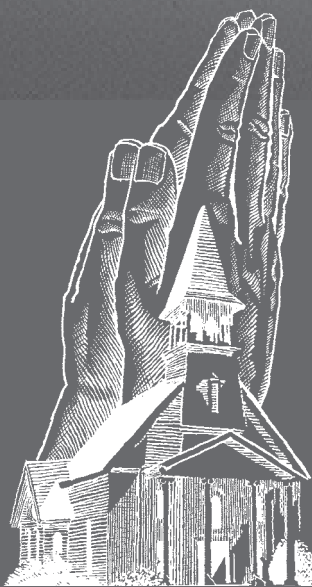

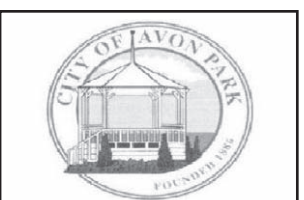

wards and branches (or congregations) in their meetinghouses throughout the world. Some buildings are shared by two or more separate congregations meeting at different times. "I've learned in 46 years that there are always going to be trials, but they are always going to pass," Jacobs said. She tells herself, "I have to get through this [trial], especially with my faith. God's always got it worked out. I have to walk by faith and trust in him. It [the trial] will add to my testimony and help someone else."

Mueller submits court filings on Cohen, Manafort

US: Former Trump lawyer deserves substantial prison sentence

WASHINGTON — President Donald Trump's former lawyer, Michael Cohen, was in touch as far back as 2015 with a Russian who offered "political synergy" with the Trump election campaign, the federal special counsel said Friday in a court filing.

Filings by prosecutors from both New York and the Trump-Russia special counsel's office laid out for the first time details of the cooperation of

Cohen, a vital witness who once said he'd "take a bullet" for the president but who in recent months has become a prime antagonist and pledged to come clean with the government.

Federal prosecutors said Friday that Cohen deserves a substantial prison sentence despite his cooperation with investigators. He is to be sentenced next week, and may face several years in prison.

In hours of meetings with prosecutors, Cohen detailed his intimate involvement in an array of

episodes, including some that directly touch the president, that are at the center of investigations into campaign finance violations and potential collusion between the Trump campaign and the Kremlin.

In one of the filings, Mueller details how Cohen spoke to a Russian who "claimed to be a 'trusted person' in the Russian Federation who could offer the campaign 'political synergy' and 'synergy on a government level.'"

Survivors gather for attack remembrance

PEARL HARBOR, Hawaii — About 20 survivors gathered at Pearl Harbor on Friday to pay tribute to the thousands of men lost in the Japanese attack 77 years ago.

They joined dignitaries, active duty troops and members of the public in observing a moment of silence at 7:55 a.m., the time the bombing began on Dec. 7, 1941.

John Mathrusse was an 18-year-old seaman second class walking out of the

chow hall on Ford Island to see a friend on the USS West Virginia when the bombing began.

"The guys were getting hurt, bombs and shells going off in the water. I helped the ones that couldn't swim, who were too badly injured or whatever and helped them to shore," said Mathrusse, now 95.

Mathrusse, who traveled to Hawaii for the event from Mountain View, California, remembers carrying injured people to the mess hall and setting them on mattresses grabbed

from the barracks above.

Robert Fernandez, who was assigned to the USS Curtiss, recalls being petrified.

"I was kind of nervous too. I was scared. I was 17. I went to go see the world. What did I get into? A war," he said.

The 94-year-old from Stockton, California returns for the annual remembrance each year because he's now alone after his wife died four years ago.

Adm. Phil Davidson, commander of the U.S. Indo-Pacific Command, said the nation can never

forget the heavy price paid on that day. He cited 21 vessels damaged or sunk, 170 planes destroyed, more than 2,400 people dead, including servicemen and civilians.

"Despite these losses, it did not break the American spirit. In fact, it charged it," he said in a keynote address.

The survivors are declining in number as they push well into their 90s, and are increasingly treated as celebrities. They say people ask for their autographs

Working while they wait, migrants seek jobs at US border

TIJUANA, Mexico — Before dawn each morning, migrants slip away from a Tijuana shelter within sight of the U.S. border to head to jobs across this sprawling city. Moving solo or in pairs, they are easily recognized by their determined strides as people with someplace to be.

By sunrise, another crowd has gathered at a corner near the shelter to wait for job offers. On a recent morning, a dozen migrants scrambled into the bed of a Dodge pickup, their enthusiasm bringing a chuckle from the driver. The migrants didn't even know where they were going or when they'd be back — some carried bedrolls — but said the work would be peeling tomatoes.

Facing a likely months-long wait in Tijuana before even getting the chance to request asylum in the United States, many migrants are looking for work. Others who have already decided to stay in Mexico have applied for, and in some cases received, permits to work in Mexico. It's something the Mexican authorities have encouraged all the migrants to do in the hopes that jobs will help them put down roots here rather than crossing into the U.S.

In most cases the migrants are relieved to have something that takes them away from the miserable conditions in the overcrowded shelter, where the hours pass slowly, and puts some money in their pockets.

"Here you make a little money," said Nelson David Landaverde, a 21-year-old Honduran who was out looking for food for his 16-month old son when someone approached and asked if he wanted to work at a car wash. He didn't think twice. He and his pregnant wife have put their names on an informal list of thousands of potential applicants for asylum in the U.S., but in the

Audit details errors Florida made in issuing gun permits

TALLAHASSEE (AP) — The Florida department that approves gun permits and licenses for security guards and private investigators had inadequate oversight that led to hundreds of permits issued in error, according to a state audit released this week.

The state auditor general report

details many of the problems that were previously disclosed by the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, but said the department understated the number of concealed weapons permits that had to be revoked.

The department previously reported that

it revoked concealed weapons permits from 291 people after discovering an employee had failed to complete all of the required background checks.

The state audit said it was actually 310 permits that were revoked and said the number was misstated because of a transposition error.

The report also said the department issued weapons permits to two people who didn't apply for one.

The problems with permitting became an issue during the governor's race, with Commissioner Adam Putnam having to explain the mistakes as he was being challenged in the Republican

primary by then-U.S. Rep. Ron DeSantis. DeSantis is now the governor-elect.

Putnam's office was also questioned about a separate 2012 report by the department's inspector general that detailed 48 employees who made mistakes in issuing permits, including applications that weren't even

looked at before permits were approved.

The state audit released this week made several recommendations on how to improve the permit process. Department spokesman Aaron Keller said all of the recommendations have been put in place or are in the process of being implemented.

Parents upset by unannounced 'code red drill' at high school

ORLANDO (AP)

— Some parents are outraged that a Florida high school conducted an unannounced "code red drill," sending students and teachers into a panic.

Orange County school district spokesman Michael Lawrence tells the Orlando Sentinel that Thursday's panic was caused when a Lake Brantley High School student shared a screenshot of an alert that some teachers received during the drill, warning of an active shooter on campus.

Lawrence says schools sometimes conduct unannounced drills and immediately alert parents. He says Thursday's message may have gone out a "bit later" than normal.

A parent responding to the school's Facebook message said: "nothing is more terrifying than getting a text from your daughter who is hiding in her classroom having a complete anxiety attack." She said it was the wrong way to practice safety.

Hospital hit hard during Hurricane Michael to lay off 800

PANAMA CITY (AP)

— A hospital on Florida's Panhandle says it will lay off 800 employees — nearly half its staff — because it suffered such serious damage from Hurricane Michael.

Bay Medical Sacred Heart said it will make the cuts Feb. 4 after it reopens in January at one-fourth its previous size.

The News-Herald reports that most of the hospital sustained heavy wind and water damage

in the hurricane. It can't be repaired any time soon. Only the hospital's emergency room has been operational since the Category 4 storm in October. The city's other hospital, Gulf Coast Regional Medical Center, sustained less damage and has managed to re-open more of its services.

The hospital has continued to pay employees and provide benefits in the weeks since the storm.

Man yells 'there's no Santa' at Florida holiday event

CAPE CORAL (AP)

It wasn't the Grinch who stole Christmas. It was a man who screamed "there's no Santa Claus" over and over during a recent holiday festival in Florida.

A southwest Florida woman shared cellphone

footage with Fort Myers television station NBC-2 of the man yelling during the Cape Coral Festival of Lights on Saturday night.

Cape Coral police told the station that officers were at the event but couldn't do anything because the man was exercising his freedom of speech. They added they could have intervened had he used a voice enhancer such as a megaphone, or started a riot.

Cindy Menkes of Cape Coral says it's about decency and said she's sad that "the magic of this time of year" was taken away from some children.

New species of aquatic salamander found in Florida

TALLAHASSEE (AP)

— There's a new swamp critter in Florida, and no, this isn't a political joke. A paper published

recently in the science journal PLOS ONE confirmed the existence of the reticulated siren, a new species of large, fully aquatic salamander.

Native to the swamps of Florida's Panhandle and southern Alabama, the creature looks like it's covered in blue and black leopard print, with frilly face appendages.

It can grow to be almost 2 feet long.

The Bradenton Herald reports it ranks among the largest amphibians in the world.

Two researchers spent nearly a decade searching for the creature after one heard the legend of a "leopard eel" around a campfire in 2001.

Witness tells troopers woman was hit multiple times on I-95

POMPANO BEACH (AP) — The Florida Highway

Patrol has shut down a portion of Interstate 95 in South Florida after a crash involving a woman who witnesses say was run over by multiple vehicles.

Troopers were called to the scene north of Fort Lauderdale early Friday morning.

A witness tells Miami television station WSVN that he was driving south on the interstate and saw what looked like a body "laying across the road." He said he "couldn't react in time" and ran over it.

The man says he stopped and spoke to a motorcyclist who told him a woman had been hit. The motorcyclist drove away before police arrived. The witness says other cars hit the woman but he knows of only three people who stopped.

Authorities are investigating the crash.

France girds for weekend protests, fearing more violence

PARIS — Anticipating a fourth straight weekend of violent protests, France on Friday mobilized armored vehicles and thousands of police, cordoned off Paris' broad boulevards and made plans to shut down tourist sites like the Eiffel Tower and Louvre.

The heavy security will put central Paris in a virtual lockdown Saturday against what the interior minister called "radicalized and rebellious people," who authorities believe will join members of the "yellow vest" movement that has been holding anti-government demonstrations.

Nationwide, about 89,000 police will fan out in the streets, an increase from 65,000 last weekend, when more than 130 people were injured and over 400 arrested as the protests degenerated into

the worst street violence to hit the French capital in decades.

Fearing increasing violence, hundreds of businesses planned to close Saturday, preferring to lose a key holiday shopping day rather than have stores smashed and looted, like they were a week ago when protests over rising taxes turned into a riot. Workers hammered plywood over the windows of shops and businesses, making the plush Champs-Elysees neighborhood appear to be bracing for a hurricane.

"According to the information we have, some radicalized and rebellious people will try to get mobilized tomorrow," Interior Minister Christophe Castaner told a news conference. "Some ultra-violent people want to take part."

President Emmanuel Macron met Friday night with about 60 anti-riot security officers who will be deployed in Paris. He

made the unannounced visit, without the press, to a fort used as military accommodation in Nogent-sur-Marne, east of Paris, and thanked the officers for their work.

About 8,000 police will be deployed across Paris, equipped with a dozen barricade-busting armored vehicles that could be used for the first time in a French urban area since riots in 2005.

"These vehicles can be very useful to protect buildings," said Stanislas Gaudon, head of the Alliance police union. "And in case they set up barricades, we can quickly clear out the space and let our units progress."

Police removed any materials from the streets that could be used as weapons, especially at construction sites in high-risk areas. Those included the renowned Champs-Elysees, which would normally be packed with tourists and shoppers.

"It's with an immense sadness that we'll see our city partially brought to a halt, but your safety is our priority," said Mayor Anne Hidalgo. "Take care of Paris on Saturday

because Paris belongs to all the French people."

As it did last weekend, the U.S. Embassy advised Americans to avoid the demonstrations. Prime Minister Edouard

Philippe scheduled a Friday night meeting with representatives of the yellow vest movement to try to open a dialogue, said government spokesman Benjamin Griveaux.

12 dead in bank robbery attempts, police shootout in Brazil

RIO DE JANEIRO — At least 12 people, including two children, were killed Friday when police engaged in a shootout with bank robbers, according to authorities in northeastern Brazil.

The two attempted heists in the state of Ceara began around 2:30 a.m. in the downtown area of the city of Milagres, police said in a statement.

News portal G1 reported that the robbers blocked off a road into the downtown and took hostages as they began hosting two banks on the same street. When police responded, a firefight ensued, leading to several deaths.

Lielson Macedo Landim, the mayor of Milagres, told G1 the hostages were executed by the criminal group and not killed by police fire. Macedo

Landim said that two children, between 10 and 13 years old, were among the dead hostages.

His account could not be immediately verified, as police did not respond to numerous email and

phone requests for more information about the shootout or how the hostages died.

Two suspects were apprehended, and several fled, according to the police statement.

Report: Mexican cartel denies US consulate attack

MEXICO CITY (AP)

— Officials in western Mexico confirmed Friday that a drug cartel has hung up banners denying involvement in a Nov. 30 grenade attack on the U.S. consulate in Guadalajara.

Several media outlets posted photos of the banners, which read: "Our cartel totally and completely distances itself from what happened at the U.S. embassy (sic)."

The banners were signed "Jalisco New Generation cartel."

A Jalisco state government official who was not authorized to be quoted by name confirmed the content of the banners, and said they were found strung on an overpass and footbridge in Guadalajara on Thursday.

The official could not vouch for the authenticity of the banners.

President says fuel theft costs Mexico up to \$3.5B yearly

MEXICO CITY (AP)

— Mexican President Andres Manuel Lopez Obrador said Friday the country loses \$2.5 to \$3.5 billion annually to fuel thieves who drill illegal taps into government pipelines.

Lopez Obrador said "there still isn't an exact figure" on the losses. The state-owned Petroleos Mexicanos company hasn't given out new figures on pipeline taps since September; that last report indicated that 11,240 taps were found in the first nine months of 2018, or about 41 per day.

The illicit fuel-theft industry involves not just drilling taps, but bribing or threatening oil company employees, stealing tank trucks to carry the fuel and turf battles between rival gangs.

That has caused a surge in the number of homicides in states like

Guanajuato, where fuel theft is rampant.

Oil producers join forces and cut production again

VIENNA (AP) — Oil prices spiked sharply higher Friday as major oil producers, including the OPEC cartel, agreed to cut global oil production by 1.2 million barrels a day to reduce oversupply.

Following two days of meetings, the Organization of the Petroleum Exporting Countries that includes the likes of Saudi Arabia and Iraq said they would cut 800,000 barrels per day for six months from January, though some countries such as Iran, which is facing wide-ranging sanctions from the United States, have been given an exemption.

The balance will come from Russia and other non-OPEC countries. The United States, one of the world's biggest producers, is not part of the deal.

Trump Justice pick likely to be queried on Mueller comments

WASHINGTON — President Donald Trump on Friday picked former Attorney General William Barr to once again serve as America's top law enforcement official. But while his experience and mainstream background may boost his prospects for confirmation, Democrats are raising alarms about his comments on the Russia investigation and Hillary Clinton.

Barr has expressed concerns about political donations made by prosecutors on special counsel Robert Mueller's team

and has supported calls for an investigation into a uranium deal approved while Clinton was secretary of state, a pet issue of Trump supporters.

It's not clear whether Barr, if confirmed, would take office in time to shape the Mueller investigation, which has shown signs of being in its final stages. But even if it wraps up before he takes office, Barr would be in a position to influence prosecutions stemming from the probe, as well as deal with other politically sensitive cases, such as responding to referrals from the House's new Democratic majority.

Barr, 68, would

Questions were raised about Whitaker's credentials, critical comments he had made about the Mueller investigation before joining the Justice Department and his involvement with a company that was accused of misleading consumers and is under investigation by the FBI.

Barr was attorney general between 1991 and 1993 at the same time Mueller oversaw

the department's criminal division. Barr later worked as a corporate general counsel and is currently of counsel at a prominent international law firm, Kirkland & Ellis LLP.

Trump called Barr "one of the most respected jurists in the country."

"During his tenure, he demonstrated an unwavering adherence to the rule of law," Trump said. "There's no one more capable or qualified for this role."

Confirmation hearings are unlikely before January, when Republicans will have a 53-47 majority, leaving Democrats powerless to block the nomination

unless four Republicans break ranks.

The next chairman of the Judiciary Committee, Sen. Lindsey Graham, R-S.C., called Barr's pick an "outstanding decision" and pledged to "do everything in my power" to quickly push the nomination through the committee and onto the Senate floor for confirmation.

But the Senate's top Democrat, Chuck Schumer, said Barr must promise that Mueller's investigation can proceed unimpeded and that Mueller's final report will be made available to Congress and the public immediately after it is completed.

Military officials unveiled damage from powerful Alaska quake

ANCHORAGE, Alaska (AP) — Military officials at the sprawling Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson say last week's magnitude 7.0 earthquake near Anchorage caused multiple problems, including damage to steel frameworks, ceilings, and sprinkler and heating systems.

But as with the rest of the earthquake zone, there were no deaths, serious injuries or widespread catastrophic damage.

Base officials unveiled damage to a swimming pool room on base Friday during a press briefing on the impact of the Nov. 30 quake that struck 7 miles north of Anchorage. Ceiling panels were still missing and the floor near the empty pool was littered with debris.

The 123-square-mile base is located on Anchorage's north side.

Man who drove into crowd convicted of first-degree murder

CHARLOTTESVILLE, Va. — A man who drove his car into a crowd of counterprotesters at a white nationalist rally in Virginia was convicted Friday of first-degree murder for killing a woman in an attack that inflamed long-simmering racial and political tensions across the country.

A state jury rejected arguments that James Alex Fields Jr. acted in self-defense during a "Unite the Right" rally in Charlottesville on Aug. 12, 2017. Jurors also convicted Fields of eight other charges, including aggravated malicious wounding and hit and run.

Fields, 21, drove to Virginia from his home in Maumee, Ohio, to support the white nationalists. As a large group of counterprotesters marched through Charlottesville singing and

laughing, he stopped his car, backed up, then sped into the crowd, according to testimony from witnesses and video surveillance shown to jurors.

Prosecutors told the jury that Fields was angry after witnessing violent clashes between the two sides earlier in the day.

Heather Heyer, a 32-year-old paralegal and civil rights activist, was killed, and nearly three dozen others were injured. The trial featured emotional testimony from survivors who described devastating injuries and long, complicated recoveries.

US hiring pullback could signal mild slowdown in growth

WASHINGTON (AP) — U.S. job growth declined modestly in November, a move that could signal a slower but still steady pace of hiring and growth next year.

The potential for a more anemic economic growth contributed to a sharp drop in the stock market Friday, sending the Dow Jones average down 560 points, or 2.2 percent, by market close.

Yet most economists said last month's job gain of 155,000 is more sustainable than some of the larger increases posted earlier this year.

And hiring at last month's pace would make it easier for the Federal Reserve to slow its interest rate increases, which investors worry are weighing on the economy.

"This is the new Goldilocks," said Josh Wright, chief economist

at iCIMS, a recruiting software company. "Still strong-enough job growth, but a more cautious Fed."

The unemployment rate stayed at 3.7 percent, a nearly five-decade low, for the third straight month, the Labor Department said Friday in its monthly jobs report.

Your guide to healthy and mindful intermittent fasting

Studies show that eating the same amount of calories early or later in the day produces two very different results. Frontload your food intake so you get 80 percent of your calories before 1 or 2 p.m., and you can lose weight. Eat more than 20 percent of your calories in the evening, and you'll have trouble losing weight and may even pack it on.

Your body is made to consume food while the sun is shining and to not consume food while it's dark. That aligns with the healthy choice of having at least 12 hours between dinner and breakfast.

One option that can help you cut out your late-night snacking or dinner-then-right-to-bed syndrome is to consider some kind of intermittent-fasting schedule. You eat so that there's a chunk of hours in the day when you DON'T consume anything but water, coffee or tea.

It can improve your nutrition, superpower your energy level, help you sleep, reduce your risk for Type 2 diabetes and promote weight

loss and improved HDL and LDL cholesterol levels.

How does it do that? As Mark Mattson, the senior investigator for the National Institute on Aging, says, "There is considerable similarity between how cells respond to the stress of exercise and how cells respond to intermittent fasting." True, most studies have been done on lab animals, but there's mounting evidence that intermittent fasting is beneficial.

— One study of overweight adults with asthma had participants eat 20 percent of their regu-

lar caloric intake on alternate days for eight weeks. The results: They lost 8 percent of their initial body weight, reduced levels of markers of oxidative stress and inflammation and saw asthma symptoms and quality of life improve.

— Multiple studies indicate that intermittent fasting may help stimulate production of adult stem cells, particularly in the intestines and skeletal muscles, which are essential to counter the decline in bodily functions associated with aging.

In "What to Eat When," Dr. Mike's new book with Dr. Michael Crupain, the "When Way" guidelines are:

1. Fast each night with at least 12 hours between dinner and breakfast. Want more benefits? Extend that to 14 hours, and then 18. This causes your body to burn up most circulating glucose and stabilizes insulin levels. Then your body burns stored fat.

2. Breakfast and/or lunch should contain lean and plant-based protein (think whole grains, legumes,

salmon) and fats (think healthy fats in salmon, or use extra-virgin olive oil with grains and veggies). Because your body is naturally more insulin-resistant at night, avoid simple carbs after mid-day. Dinner should be plant-heavy (salad and other green, leafy veggies) and calorie-light (about 400 calories, if you need 2,000 a day to maintain a healthy weight.)

3. The Longevity Institute at USC says you can superpower your health and boost weight loss by reducing your calorie intake to 1,000 for one day, 750 for four days. Then resume eating the When Way.

You may want to try eating for eight hours — say, noon to 8 p.m. daily — and fasting for 16. Or try the two-five routine, in which you restrict your intake to 500 calories a day twice a week. Then, five days you eat a healthy, full complement of calories (that's 1,800 to 2,400 for most). And then there's the Warrior Plan: eating during four hours a day and fasting for the remaining 20. 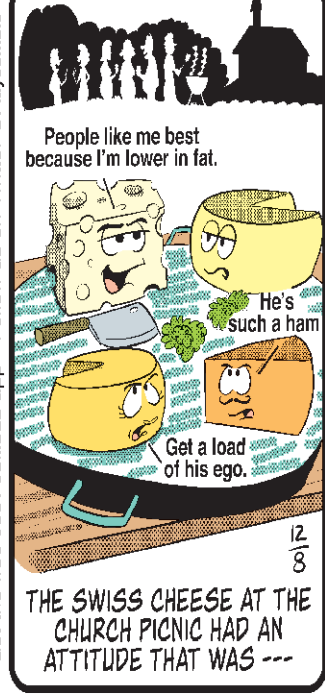

Chinese executive facing US extradition appears in court

VANCOUVER, British Columbia — A Canadian prosecutor urged a Vancouver court to deny bail to a Chinese executive at the heart of a case that is shaking up U.S.-China relations and worrying global financial markets.

Meng Wanzhou, the chief financial officer of telecommunications giant Huawei and daughter of its founder, was detained at the request of the U.S. during a layover at the Vancouver airport last Saturday — the same day that Presidents Donald Trump and Xi Jinping of China agreed over dinner to a 90-day ceasefire in a trade dispute that threatens to disrupt global commerce.

The U.S. alleges that Huawei used a Hong Kong shell company to

sell equipment in Iran in violation of U.S. sanctions. It also says that Meng and Huawei misled American banks about its business dealings in Iran.

The surprise arrest, already denounced by Beijing, raises doubts about whether the trade truce will hold and whether the world's two biggest economies can resolve the complicated issues that divide them.

"I think it will have a distinctively negative effect on the U.S.-China talks," said Philip Levy, senior fellow at the Chicago Council on Global Affairs and an economic adviser in President George W. Bush's White House. "There's the humiliating way this happened right before the dinner, with Xi unaware. Very hard to save face on this one. And we may see (Chinese retaliation), which will embitter relations."

Canadian prosecutor

John Gibb-Carsley said in a court hearing Friday that a warrant had been issued for Meng's arrest in New York on Aug. 22. He said Meng, arrested en route to Mexico from Hong Kong, was aware of the investigation and had been avoiding the United States for months, even though her teenage son goes to school in Boston.

Gibb-Carsley alleged that Huawei had done business in Iran through a Hong Kong company called Skycom. Meng, he said, had misled U.S. banks into thinking that Huawei and Skycom were separate when, in fact, "Skycom was Huawei." Meng has contended that Huawei sold Skycom in 2009.

In urging the court to reject Meng's bail request, Gibb-Carsley said the Huawei executive had vast resources and a strong incentive to bolt: She's facing fraud charges in the United

States that could put her in prison for 30 years.

Meng's lawyer, David Martin, argued that it would be unfair to deny her bail just because she "has worked hard and has extraordinary resources."

He told the court that her personal integrity

and respect for her father, Huawei founder Ren Zhengfei, would prevent her violating a court order. Meng, who owns two homes in Vancouver, was willing to wear an ankle bracelet and put the houses up as collateral, he said.

The filing says the meeting never happened.

In an additional filing Friday evening, prosecutors said former Trump campaign chairman Paul Manafort lied to them about his contacts with a Russian associate and Trump administration officials.

Manafort, who has pleaded guilty to several counts, violated his plea agreement by then telling "multiple discernible lies" to prosecutors, they said.

Cohen also discussed a Moscow real estate deal that could have netted Trump's business hundreds of millions of dollars and conversations with a

Russian intermediary who proposed a meeting between Trump and Russian President Vladimir Putin as well as offering synergy with the campaign, prosecutors said.

Cohen, dubbed Trump's "legal fixer" in the past, also described his work in conjunction with Trump in orchestrating hush money payments to two women — a porn star and a Playboy model — who said they had sex with Trump a decade earlier. Prosecutors in New York, where Cohen pleaded guilty in August in connection with those payments, said the lawyer "acted in coordination and at the direction" of Trump.

Despite such specific allegations of Trump's

actions, the president quickly tweeted after news of the filings: "Totally clears the President. Thank you!"

Later, press secretary Sarah Huckabee Sanders said in two statements that the Manafort filing "says absolutely nothing about the President" and the Cohen filings "tell us nothing of value that wasn't already known."

Prosecutors in Cohen's case said that even though he cooperated in their investigation into the hush money payments to women he nonetheless deserved to spend time in prison.

"Cohen did provide information to law enforcement, including information that assisted the Special Counsel's

Office," they said. "But Cohen's description of those efforts is overstated in some respects and incomplete in others."

In meetings with Mueller's team, Cohen "provided information about his own contacts with Russian interests during the campaign and discussions with others in the course of making those contacts," the court documents said.

Cohen provided prosecutors with a "detailed account" of his involvement, along with the involvement of others, in efforts during the 2016 presidential campaign to complete a deal to build a Trump Tower Moscow, the documents said. He also provided information about attempts by Russian

nationals to reach Trump's campaign, they said.

However, in the crimes to which he pleaded guilty in August, he was motivated "by personal greed and repeatedly used his power and influence for deceptive ends."

Prosecutors said the court's Probation Department estimated that federal sentencing guidelines call for Cohen to serve at least four years in prison. They said that "reflects Cohen's extensive, deliberate and serious criminal conduct."

Prosecutors say Cohen "already enjoyed a privileged life," and that "his desire for even greater wealth and influence precipitated an extensive course of criminal conduct."

meantime he's eager to earn money to make their lives a little easier in Tijuana.

The job pays about 75 cents per car, and by washing as many as 10 cars on a good day he hopes to take in more than Mexico's minimum wage, which is less than \$5 a day.

While authorities have closed the shelter near the border and relocated many of the migrants to another more distant shelter, hundreds have refused to leave the old one and are camped outside. The reason many give is that they have found jobs nearby.

Marco Rosales, a Honduran immigrant who has lived in Tijuana for eight years, stood in the street surrounded by Central American migrants eager for his job advice.

"Don't come here with the mentality of Honduras," he said.

"This is a new country, a new state where you can change yourself if you want to."

He only had room that morning for a handful to work at another nearby car wash, but he was sure he could find work for more later if they were willing.

"I'm trying to explain to them that you'll get ahead doing things the right way," he said, when asked why he had urged them to work instead of joining a march to the border. "If we do things the wrong way we're not going to get anywhere. If they want to march close to the border it's not going to accomplish anything."

At a downtown location migrants were gathered to start the paperwork to apply for temporary visas in Mexico that would allow them to work legally. Once they get their Mexican identification numbers they can meet with recruiters for assembly plants, where turnover is high and jobs are always available.

Baja California state officials say they have identified thousands of jobs that the migrants could apply for.

Fernando Hernandez said he had just arrived in Tijuana a day earlier, but was there to find work while he awaited a chance to enter the U.S.

"If we can cross (to the U.S.), we cross, but if not, you've got to work in the meantime," said the 24-year-old who has worked in warehouses in his native Honduras.

Attendance at a job fair set up to help the migrants find work has surged since a Nov. 25

march on the U.S. border devolved into chaos when some migrants breached the border and U.S. agents responded by firing tear gas into Mexico. Before the march, only about 100 migrants were showing up each day, a number that has grown to 400-plus or more since.

and request to take photos and selfies with them.

"I am given a lot of attention and honor. I shake hands continuously," said Tom Berg, who lives in Port Townsend, Washington. Berg, who is 96, served on the USS Tennessee.

This year, no survivor from the USS Arizona attended the ceremony as none of the men were able to make the trip to Hawaii.

The Arizona sank after two bombs hit the ship, triggering tremendous explosions. The Arizona lost 1,177 sailors and Marines, the greatest number of casualties from any ship. Most remain entombed in the sunken hull of the battleship at the bottom

of the harbor.

Dozens of those killed in the attack have been recently identified and reburied in cemeteries across the country after the military launched a new effort to analyze bones and DNA of hundreds long classified as "unknowns."

In 2015, 388 sets of remains were exhumed from the USS Oklahoma and buried in a national cemetery in Honolulu. The Oklahoma had the second-highest number of dead after the Arizona at 429, though only 35 were identified in the immediate years after the attack.

The Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency has identified 168 sailors and Marines from the Oklahoma since the exhumations three years ago. It has said it expects to identify about 80 percent

Adam Humphries and then three plays later was flagged on a deep sideline route with Bradberry in coverage. Bradberry held Evans without a catch in the second half of the Bucs' 24-17 victory.

Koetter said that the officials do an admirable job of trying to set a standard for what to allow, but it's difficult, especially when physical players like Evans and Bradberry are involved. The league sends officiating videos every week that dissect plays in an attempt to offer clarity on calls.

"They try to keep it consistent, but when you look at who these guys are, how elite athletes these guys are, can you really be perfect, consistent?" Koetter said. "That would be really tough to do. They try and the officials do a really good job of trying to show what is (a penalty) and what isn't."

"We just watched a couple clips of that today with the team along with some other stuff, but we've got to remember, that stuff all happens split second. They want to let these guys play, the fans want to see these guys play, but there have to be some guidelines."

with Lemon Bay (2-2) as the Mantas countered with countless drives to the basket by senior Martell Yale (17 points).

Heading into the final quarter with Venice clinging to a 36-35 lead, Lemon Bay went cold, scoring six points in the first 4:30 of the fourth quarter.

With a high-flying dunk and 7-for-8 free-throw shooting down the stretch, Rockymore put the Mantas away to earn Venice its first win of the season.

“It felt really good for us to overcome some rough spurts of going down or it getting close, so it felt good to see us pull out a tight game,” he said. “This means a lot, getting the first one. We started the season with two tough

games, so it feels good to get this win.”

Though Venice coach John Flynn wasn’t pleased with the fouling and the disruption of play early on in the game, the second-year coach said getting the season’s first win out of the way was important.

“I’ll tell ya, this is a big win for us,” Flynn said. “We schedule those two teams, Riverview and Port Charlotte, on purpose to get us out of the box. We did the same thing last year, and it helped us down the end.

“We’re really coming together and growing together. The work is starting to pay off.”

For Huber and Lemon Bay, the loss was

especially disappointing with a lot of friendly faces and several members of the 2017-18 Mantas team out in support of a team that’s hoping to carry forth some momentum after winning the 7A-11 district title last season.

“I’m disappointed,” Huber said. “I want to win for those guys. And not just them, everyone’s home. I saw guys tonight that I haven’t seen in 10 or 12 years. It’s amazing to see. There were people in here watching the game who haven’t watched us play since we were in the old gym.

“But my dad is a wise old coach, and he always said, ‘Whoever makes the most layoffs and free throws usually wins.’ And we didn’t do that.”

How the Rays can get what they want this offseason

ST. PETERSBURG — The Rays have made it abundantly clear what they are planning to do this offseason, adding pieces (plural), impactful and even reasonably expensive, to the youthful core of their 90-win team enough to reach the playoffs next season.

The challenge now, with the winter meetings starting Sunday in Las Vegas, signings and trades picking up industrywide and spring training less than 10 weeks away, is actually figuring out how.

First, here's a couple things the Rays won't do.

One, while they have money to spend, with the potential to field their current squad for about \$32 million, they are not going to break from past bonds to start throwing millions around haphazardly, or committing to spend up to a specific payroll number, like matching last year's \$76 million, just to do so.

Are they willing to take on bigger-name, higher-profile additions than in the past? Yes. Would they pay \$15 million plus more for a year, and maybe a second or with

an option, the largest salary in team history (David Price, \$14 million 2014)? It's doable for the right guy, short term.

But the Rays budget over a rolling five-year period. So what they don't spend now is available later, and vice versa. As much as they benefit currently from having many young and inexpensive players (only five making \$1 million plus), they know banking some money benefits them when those guys start making more later.

Two, they're not going to make incremental upgrades that clutter the roster, taking away at-bats or innings from young players who stepped up last year, and potentially retarding their development.

The idea is to add impact — a right-handed hitter who can be a legit force in the middle of the lineup, a starter as sure of a thing as they can find to back Blake Snell while hoping Tyler Glasnow is real deal, a closer to add a known quantity to the stable of young power arms. While the bat, especially after ditching C.J. Cron, seems the top priority, some in the organization say the

starter is more vital.

Want to make it a good winter? Sign Nelson Cruz to DH, trade for starter Noah Syndergaard or Trevor Bauer and wait out the relief market for the closer without a job, adding maybe \$30 million to the payroll. Or trade for soon-to-be-a-DH Carlos Santana (at a discount) or Jose Martinez, sign Charlie Morton, spend a bit more on the back end of the 'pen and bring on the Red Sox and Yankees. There's also some talk internally that if they can't land the right hitter at an appropriate cost, they'd be better off rolling out what they have.

They're confident their young (Willy Adames, Jake Bauers) and previously unproven (Ji-Man Choi, Joey Wendle) players will continue to get better.

And they will benefit from full seasons of Kevin Kiermaier (injured) and Tommy Pham (acquired July 31), plus the addition of catcher Mike Zunino.

"The balance that we're trying to strike is making sure we don't rest on our laurels and that we don't walk past opportunities to make the group better and more competitive," senior VP Chaim Bloom

said, "but that we also don't get away from what got us here, which was giving opportunities to players who needed the chance to establish themselves and letting

them grow and letting them take the next step in their careers.

"We have a club that we think is capable of competing for the postseason and playing in October,

and when you have that those opportunities are not to be taken lightly and they are precious and you want to do everything you can to support those chances," Bloom said.

Valbuena, Castillo die in Venezuela car crash

CARACAS, Venezuela (AP) — Former major league players Luis Valbuena and Jose Castillo were killed in a car crash caused by highway bandits who then robbed them, officials said Friday.

The 33-year-old Valbuena and 37-year-old Castillo died late Thursday when their SUV crashed as it tried to veer around an object placed in the road.

He said four people have

been detained after being found with property of the athletes.

Valbuena and Castillo were teammates on the Cardenales de Lara team in the Venezuelan winter league and were returning from a game in the capital when the crash occurred.

Third baseman Carlos Rivero was in the car and survived.

Valbuena, an 11-year major league veteran, hit .199 with nine homers and 33 RBIs in 96 games this year for the Los Angeles Angels, who released him on Aug. 7.

"I will miss Luis' banter, smile, genuine love for his teammates, and, of course, the bat flips," Astros manager AJ Hinch said in a statement.

"He was a beloved person whether he was on our team or across the field."

Valbuena hit .226 with 114 home runs over 11 big league seasons with the Angels, Seattle, Cleveland, the Chicago Cubs and Houston.

"Luis was always smiling and was one of the happiest players in baseball," Astros general manager Jeff Luhnow said in

a statement. "He provided joy to his teammates and our fans. He helped our franchise turn a corner in 2015 and provided many cherished memories."

Castillo played five seasons with Pittsburgh, San Francisco and Houston. He had a .254 average with 39 home runs.

Baseball Commissioner Rob Manfred called it "a very sad day for our sport."

"It is clear by all the stories today that they loved baseball and made an impact on their teammates and the Clubs they represented," he said.

Lawrence, Etienne anchoring Clemson's offense

Trevor Lawrence and Travis Etienne are young, a bit raw and awfully talented.

Together, they anchor Clemson's high-octane offense and have helped the No. 2 Tigers get into in the College Football Playoff. Now, Lawrence, a freshman quarterback, and Etienne are hunting a national title.

"We've had goals set out for the season, obviously, to win championships," Lawrence said. "We want more than just the ACC

championship."

The duo — Etienne, a tailback, is the ACC player of the year and Lawrence was named ACC rookie of the year — have complemented each other during Clemson's 13-0 season. In a September game against Syracuse, Lawrence was ineffective and had to leave the contest with an injury in the second quarter as the Orange built a double-digit lead. It was Etienne who rallied Clemson with 203 yards and three touchdowns in a 27-23 victory.

In the ACC title game,

Etienne set the tone en route to being named MVP when he went 75 yards on Clemson's first play in a 42-10 victory over Pitt for the Tigers' fourth consecutive league championship. Etienne finished with 156 yards rushing as Lawrence, despite a pair of touchdown throws to Tee Higgins, was off target.

Lawrence arrived at Clemson amid tremendous hype, the top quarterback prospect who had surpassed the Georgia state high school marks of ex-Tiger national championship passer

Deshaun Watson. Four quarterbacks, including last year's starter who opened the first four games this season in Kelly Bryant, transferred when it became clear they'd be losing playing time to Lawrence.

Etienne was one of Clemson's final recruiting gets in 2017, a gangly youngster who had plenty to learn about the college game.

Clemson running backs coach Tony Elliott, also co-offensive coordinator, has seen at times frustrated and overjoyed at Etienne's progress.

"It's taken a long time for him to get here," Elliott said.

A year ago, Etienne relied too much on his breakaway ability instead of patiently finding holes to extend runs, Elliott said. Etienne's vision and ability to read the line of scrimmage has vastly improved, Elliott said, leading to 1,463 yards and a Clemson single-season record 21 rushing touchdowns.

Etienne credits Clemson's rotation of backs (Tavien Feaster, Adam Choice, Lyn-J Dixon) and offensive line

for the Tigers putting up a single-season record of 46 rushing TDs and 3,377 yards on the ground, the school's second highest one-year total since the 1978 team gained 3,469 yards rushing.

"You want to go out and lay it on the line for them," Etienne said.

The Tigers (CFP No. 2) will face third-ranked Notre Dame (12-0, CFP No. 3) in the Cotton Bowl on Dec. 29 for the right to play for the national title.

"We've had some weird situations, but 13-0, you can't expect any better than this," Lawrence said.

Canucks see rivals, partners in Seattle franchise

VANCOUVER, British Columbia — Sitting high above the ice of Rogers Arena, Vancouver Canucks general manager Jim Benning has fond memories of his time playing junior hockey for the Portland Winterhawks of the Western Hockey League and their trips up Interstate 5 to play at the old Mercer Thunderbirds.

Well, how fond he is depends on the perspective. "They had chicken wire, and the fans were rowdy," Benning recalled

recently. "The thing with the chicken wire is like you'd line up for a faceoff and they could spit right through the chicken wire."

While Benning's memories playing against Seattle remain — including chain-link fence in place of glass boards at one end of the rink — he's also thinking ahead.

He has no doubt it will be a healthy rivalry and great for the sport. But the Canucks see the addition of Seattle as more than adding a rival 2 ½ hours away by car.

"We see this as a kind of one plus one equals

three. We're going to be able to grow the sport of hockey in this region, working with the Seattle team," Canucks COO Jeff Stipec said.

The approval of Seattle as the 32nd NHL franchise earlier this week has thrilled hockey fans who for years made their way north to Vancouver to see the game played at its highest level.

"Vancouver is already a partner. They were the most enthusiastic team in the league about this. They love the idea of this rivalry," Seattle team President Tod Leiweke said.

Adding Seattle to the league helps the Canucks in various ways, from marketing to travel. Stipec noted that even as Vancouver's on-ice product is improving around a core of young stars and rejuvenating interest in the city, the fans flocking back to the games are seeking different opportunities.

"Our season ticket members, what they're looking for now are experiences," Stipec said. "They'll hop down, go to Vegas, follow the team down to Vegas. But to be able to put together some packages where our

season ticket members are hopping on the bus, having a great time, going down to Seattle for a game and then coming back, that's something they're really excited about, too, and we're excited to be offering that."

While it would seem the proximity of the two cities could create issues when competing for dollars on the business side, it doesn't appear that will be the case largely because of the border. The border creates a natural break between the two teams, both in their attempts to gain

market share, but also in corporate dollars and talent acquisition.

"It couldn't be a more perfect storm for the Canucks in that it's not that we just have somebody that's two and a half hours away, we have that international border between us," Stipec said. "So that protects us a lot from corporate partnerships, broadcast rights, a whole bunch of things. It's not like a Pittsburgh-Philadelphia situation. So it's great that way, that we have our own protected markets in a sense in some of those key areas."

Brady seeks to turn around his Miami luck

FOXBOROUGH, Mass. — Tom Brady has one simple answer to why his New England Patriots have struggled in Miami.

“They play well and we don’t,” Brady said Friday.

He was smiling, but you know — and he knows — winning in Miami is one thing in a brilliant career that Brady hasn’t been able to do consistently. Look at the numbers:

—Brady is 7-9 at Miami, where the Patriots have lost four of the last five years. He is 15-1 against the Dolphins at home. Brady has lost seven career games in December, five of them at Miami.

—Brady is 79-19 against the AFC East in the regular season, with 10 of the losses coming at the hands of the Dolphins, a team he has beaten 22 times.

“Regardless, none of that stuff matters,” Brady said. “This week it’s really this team against that team and we’re going to have to play well. They play good at home, they’re 5-1, they’ve got a good defense. We’ve got a big challenge. Should be fun.”

A win would give the Patriots their 10th straight AFC East title, the 18th in 25 years. The division is consistently the most lopsided in football — and New England has dominated.

But not in the Florida sunshine.

“We’ve tried a bunch of different things over the years,” Brady said of preparation for this annual visit, which has also included practicing indoors with the heat cranked up. “We’ve gone down there Thursday night and practiced Friday, gone down there Friday night after practice, stayed there Saturday. It’s just really about playing good when it comes down to it; there’s no magic formula.”

This week, the Patriots, who have won eight of their last nine games, have been working in the New England cold after beating the Minnesota Vikings 24-10 on a drizzly day at Gillette Stadium.

“When you look at those stats, it is pretty interesting, the way some of those teams from the South come up and play, the teams from the North play in the South — there’s got to be

something to it,” Brady said.

“I think just playing down there has its challenges,” Brady said. “Every team kind of has its challenges going down there. They play well at home. I think they use the climate as a benefit to them, just as we use our as a benefit to us.”

This week, they face a Miami team that is 5-1 at home, 1-5 on the road, and one that will be without its best defender. NFL interceptions leader Xavien Howard, who picked Brady twice down there last year, is injured.

Dolphins center Jake Brendel was also ruled out because of a calf injury. Receiver Danny Amendola, limited in practice all week, is questionable to play against his former team.

Howard might be able to return for next week’s game at Minnesota, coach Adam Gase said.

Howard was hurt when tackled following an interception in Sunday’s win over Buffalo. He missed only one play but sat out practice this week. He has seven interceptions, including two in each of the past two games.

Bears remove Trubisky from injury report

— The Chicago Bears removed quarterback Mitchell Trubisky from their injury list Friday, clearing the way for a start Sunday night against the Los Angeles Rams.

“Well, he put together three really good days in practice,” coach Matt Nagy said. “I thought the velocity on his throws was good, his decision making

just getting in and out of the huddle, that part was easy.

“The main thing was for us, seeing conditioning-wise, being able to see can he hold up with that, and he did. He did well.”

Nagy said there should be no limitations on Trubisky, who missed the last two games with a right shoulder injury.

Trubisky led all NFL quarterbacks in rushing with 363 yards before his

injury Nov. 18 against the Minnesota Vikings. Nagy said how Trubisky’s shoulder can hold up in the running game and against a pass rusher is something the coaching staff has addressed with the quarterback.

“We talk through those things as much as you can, those scenarios,” Nagy said.

“But decision-making wise, with the quarterbacks and whether there’s an injury or no injury, we

talk through that stuff, especially at the quarterback position, exactly that: down and distance, reaching the ball out, when do you sacrifice your body and your health versus not, and all that.”

Chase Daniel led the Bears to a 23-16 win over the Detroit Lions on Thanksgiving Day and Daniel was the quarterback again last Sunday in a 30-27 loss to the New York Giants.

Ex-linebacker Robertson killed in Texas car crash

MABANK, Texas (AP)

— Former two-time All-Pro linebacker Isiah Robertson was killed when the limousine he was driving skidded on a rain-slicked curve on a dark, rural East Texas highway and was hit by two other vehicles.

A DPS statement says the limousine Robertson was driving entered the curve at an unsafe speed for the rainy conditions.

It veered off the road and skidded sideways before coming to a stop partially on the road. A pickup truck following behind hit the limo, knocking the limo into the southbound lane where it was slammed by an oncoming car.

Robertson, a 69-year-old Garland resident, was taken to an Athens hospital where he died. The truck driver was treated

for minor injuries.

The Los Angeles Rams drafted Robertson from Southern University in the first round of the 1971 NFL draft. He remained with the Rams through 1978, then played in 1979-82 for the Buffalo Bills. He was named first-team All-Pro in 1973 and 1976 and was chosen for the Pro Bowl in his rookie 1971 season, as well as 1973-77.

In a statement, the Rams said: “We are deeply saddened by the loss of one of our Legends, Isiah Robertson. He will be remembered not only for the great player he was, helping our team achieve multiple division championships in the ‘70s, but also by the work he did helping others through the House of Isaiah recovery center he founded in Texas.”

Ka’imi Fairbairn made a field goal as time expired in overtime to lead the Texans to a 37-34 victory in that game and they haven’t lost since, reeling off a franchise-record nine straight wins entering Sunday’s rematch.

Houston (9-3) led 28-10 in the third quarter in that first meeting before Andrew Luck threw three second-half touchdowns to rally the Colts (6-6) and set up the wild finish.

The Colts failed to convert a fourth-and-4

with 24 seconds left in overtime to give Fairbairn a chance to win it.

“Being up 28-10 ... and then letting them come back and being down in overtime and pulling through the adversity it kind of slingshot us to where we are now,” Houston quarterback Deshaun Watson said.

“That was one game where we went through all types of phases and situations that put us through this nine-game win streak. It was the start of everything.”

Defensive end J.J. Watt said that Sept. 30 game seems as if it was a long time ago and noted how difficult it has been for the Texans to win in Indy, a place where they’re just 3-14 all time.

“We needed one to get started. That was the one

to get us started on this streak,” Watt said.

The Texans are coming off a 29-13 win over the Browns while the Colts were shut out 6-0 by the Jaguars last week.

TOUCHDOWN THOMAS

Houston rookie tight end Jordan Thomas has a knack for scoring with four touchdown catches despite having just 14 receptions this season. His four touchdown receptions are tied with Andre Johnson for second-most TD receptions by a rookie in franchise history. The 6-foot-6, 277-pound Thomas has been a favorite target of Watson’s in the red zone with all his scores coming on catches of 13 yards or less.

Indiana's defense took away the perimeter game from a Magic team that had made 20 3-pointers the previous game against Denver. The Magic were eight for 33 (24.2 percent) on 3-pointers against the Pacers.

Bogdanovic hit 9 of 13 shots and had 21 points in the first half when the Pacers patiently ran through options to find open shots on the perimeter, a tactic they kept working the entire game.

The Magic survived a scare in the first quarter when Vucevic stayed on the floor clutching his ankle after coming down on Turner's foot. The

The Nuggets looked to cut it back to a one-possession game, but Michael Kidd-Gilchrist had a huge block on Juancho Hernangomez with 24 seconds left.

Walker hit three free throws in the final 14 seconds to put the game away. Walker finished the game 11 of 12 from the free throw line, offsetting a tough 4-of-11 shooting night.

Nets 106, Raptors 105 (OT)

D'Angelo Russell scored 29 points, including six in overtime, and the Brooklyn Nets snapped an eight-game losing streak by beating the Toronto Raptors 106-105 on Friday night.

Brooklyn picked the most unlikely way to end its skid, snapping a 12-game slide against Toronto with its first victory over the Raptors since April 3, 2015.

Jarrett Allen made the go-ahead basket for the Nets with a little more than a minute left, their only basket in overtime not made by Russell.

Kawhi Leonard scored 32 points for the Raptors, but Toronto couldn't get a look for him on its final possession and had to settle for Fred VanVleet's

3-pointer that just missed.

Spencer Dinwiddie scored 17 points for Brooklyn.

Jonas Valanciunas added 24 points for the Raptors.

Kings 129, Cavs 110

De'Aaron Fox had 30 points and 12 assists, and the Sacramento Kings beat the Cleveland Cavaliers 129-110 on Friday night.

Buddy Hield added 25 points for the Kings, who led by as many as 25 after the game was tied at 66 at halftime. Marvin Bagley III scored 17 points on 8-for-9 shooting after missing two games due to back spasms.

Fox and Hield each hit two 3-pointers in the first five minutes of the third quarter, helping Sacramento open an 84-73 lead.

Jordan Clarkson scored 26 points for Cleveland, and rookie point guard Collin Sexton had 23.

Cleveland became more short-handed when guard Rodney Hood injured his right foot and didn't play in the second half.

The Kings (13-11) have won three straight, including the first two on their four-game trip.

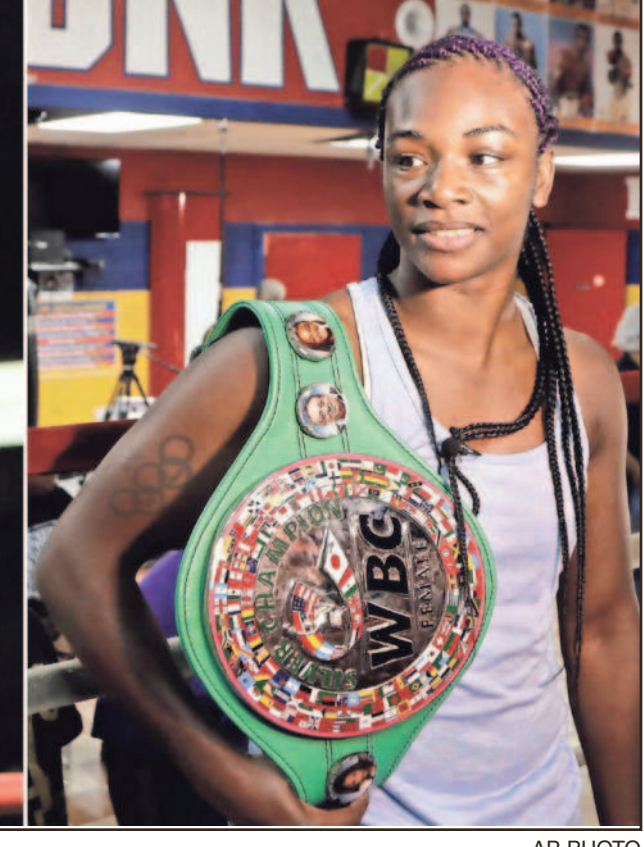

Nexstar's TV trip

Texas-based Nexstar aims to make itself the biggest operator of local TV stations in the U.S. with its \$4 billion offer to buy Chicago's Tribune Media. The move, announced Monday, follows the August collapse of a similar bid from Sinclair Broadcast Group that drew FCC concerns.

Tribune Media owns or operates 42 local TV stations that reach 50 million households, as well as the national network WGN. It also has a stake in the TV Food Network.

Local TV stations have been consolidating recently, pushed by competition for advertising dollars with major tech companies. Bigger media companies



have been merging, too. AT&T snapped up TimeWarner earlier this year, and Walt Disney is working to close its deal for Fox entertainment assets.

The Nexstar-Tribune deal is expected to close in the second half of 2019, if approved by regulators and shareholders.

B. Riley analyst Barton Crockett said the deal could both boost Nexstar's finances and help out other TV station operators. For instance, Nexstar is now less likely to bid for Cox stations, making them available for other bidders, and it might sell some stations that other operators such as Tegna could be interested in.

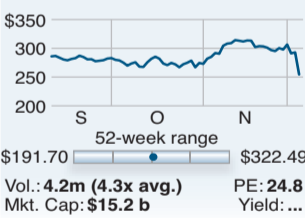

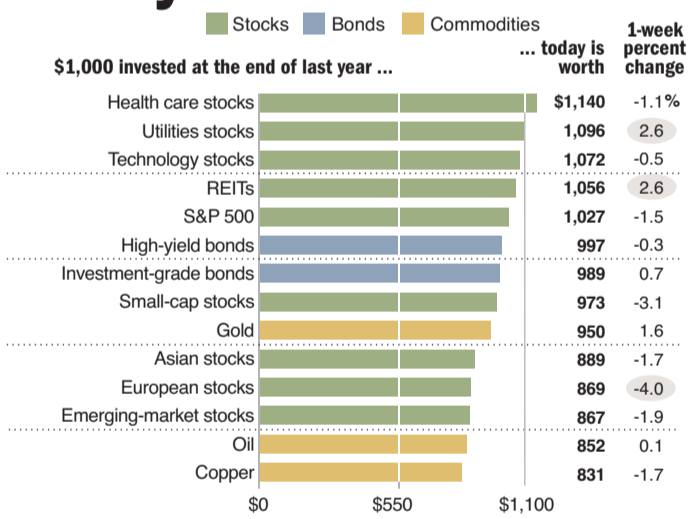

Brexit scares off EU workers

Brexit has yet to happen but there's one area where it's already having an impact — the number of EU citizens in the U.K.

The number of people coming from the other 27 EU countries into Britain has fallen consistently since Britain voted to leave the bloc in June 2016.

With less than four months to go until Britain officially leaves, many EU citizens are heading back home or opting against making the trip to a country where the economic outlook is so unclear. Net migration from the EU — the difference



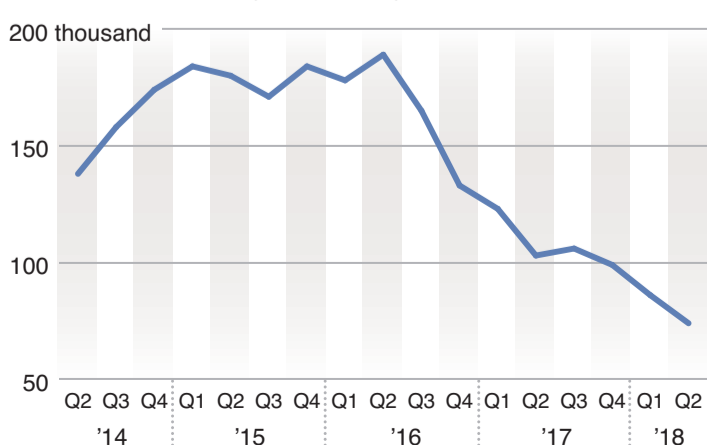
between those coming into Britain and those leaving — has now fallen to a six-year low.

EU nationals in Britain have lived in uncertainty since the Brexit vote, which was partly driven by concerns over immigration and a perception that

migrants were depressing wages. One of the main tenets of EU membership is the freedom for citizens to move and work anywhere within the bloc.

The Brexit vote also led to a sharp fall in the pound, which made Britain a relatively less attractive place to work for foreigners.

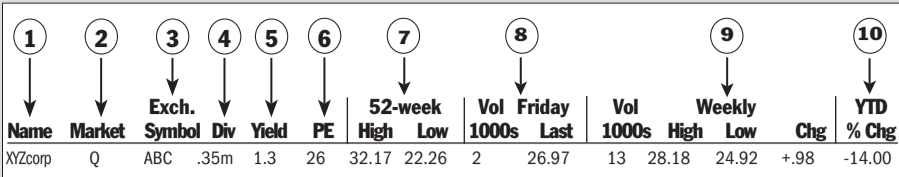

A: The Travel Channel is one of several cable networks that barely resemble their former selves. I agree that they should just rename the

network if they are going to stick with the supernatural shows, like TLC (originally called The Learning Channel) eventually did. It now focuses on reality shows like “90-Day Fiance” and “Say Yes to the Dress.”

Since the Travel Channel’s only “traveling” these days involves driving to the nearest haunted house, your best bet is to seek out other networks. PBS, The Food Network and HGTV are probably going to be your best bets. HGTV shows glimpses of outdoor scenery and amazing views on “House Hunters International,” “Castle Hunters” and “Beachfront Bargain Hunt.”

READERS: I goofed! Thank you to reader Jane L., for pointing out my mistake about which network airs “Chicago Fire,” “Chicago Med” and “Law & Order: SVU.” They are NBC shows, not ABC. Therefore, if you would like to give your opin-

ion about the distracting music on the above shows, visit www.nbc.com/contact-us, and under “Select the best option,” choose “I have feedback on NBC programming,” then choose which TV show, then “I have a complaint or concern” and go from there.

For those of you who might have already written ABC, your complaint was not made in vain. Reader Sally R. also corrected me, but she pointed out that some of producer Shonda Rhimes’ dramas (“Grey’s Anatomy,” for example) also are guilty of this, but even worse because the music isn’t just instrumental and that Closed Captioning doesn’t help because the words of the songs compete with the words in the dialogue.

Tuesday at 8 p.m., AXS TV begins a block of all-new insightful rock docs with "Rock Legends: Pat Benatar," whose highly successful, multiple Grammy-winning career spawned such hits as "Hit Me with Your Best Shot" and "Love Is a Battlefield." Up next at 8:30 p.m., "The Day the Rock Star Died" looks back at the late, great David Bowie, one of the most influential musicians of the 20th century. And then at 9 p.m., "The Big Interview with Dan Rather: Kenny Loggins" has the



Debuting Friday at 9 p.m. on PBS' "Great Performances," "k.d. lang: Landmarks Live in Concert" features a complete, uninterrupted performance of the entire "Ingénue" album for its 25th anniversary.

American singer/songwriter, known for his compositions on the soundtracks of such films as "Caddyshack," "Footloose" and "Top Gun," talking about the songwriting process, as well as how to do a little soul searching.

Framing the concert sequences is Smith's tour of this historic south-central Texas city, visiting such iconic sites as the Alamo and the famous Riverwalk where Johnny Cash wrote "Walk the Line."



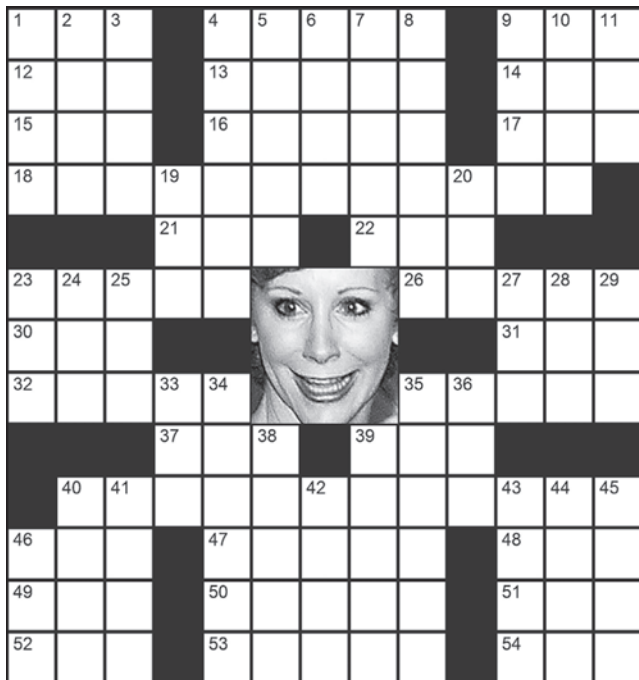
