County budget dependent on FEMA

SEBRING — With millage at 8.55 and no sign of funds from the Federal Emergency Management Agency, county commissioners may see another lean year.

Gov. Ron DeSantis has directed the Florida Department of Emergency Management (FDEM) to disburse half of approved FEMA funds for Hurricane Irma damage and expenses. However, to date, the county has still not received its reimbursement check.

Until it does, Highlands County still only has just under \$4.95 million in reserve, according to David Nitz, manager of the county Office of Management and Budget.

That's enough for 0.92 months of operation, in the event of a weather or economic disaster that stops the flow of revenue.

Part of that \$4.95 million is \$3.6 million that was allocated to the 2018-19 budget to be used, if needed.

New SunTrust branch opening downtown; Demolition and repurposing of Midtown site to begin in early April

SEBRING — The mobile SunTrust Bank branch in downtown Sebring closed Friday and will no longer be in operation as a more permanent downtown location is prepared to open.

The SunTrust mobile branch opened Jan. 28 at the edge of the parking lot of 126 W. Center Ave., which is a three-story, white, concrete block and stucco building that was a Huntington National Bank and later a SunTrust Branch for short period of time.

The mobile branch was opened to provide customer service following the Jan. 23 shooting deaths of four bank employees and one customer at the SunTrust Midtown Branch at 1907 U.S. 27 S., Sebring. A suspect was taken into custody at the bank.

Smokable marijuana hits the market

TALLAHASSEE — A North Florida man who's struggled with fibromyalgia for years became the state's first patient to legally buy whole-flower cannabis for smoking Thursday, just days after Gov. Ron DeSantis signed into a law a measure repealing a ban on smokeable medical marijuana.

Trulieve, the state's largest medical marijuana operator, was the first of Florida's 14 operators to sell whole-flower products, for use in

joints, pipes or bongs. Later Thursday, a second firm, Curaleaf, also was approved by the state to start selling smokeable marijuana.

Trulieve Chief Executive Officer Kim Rivers joined Dixon and a handful of reporters who watched as Dixon purchased "Tru Flower," a treatment he hailed as a safer and healthier alternative to prescription drugs he once used to combat pain he suffers from fibromyalgia.

"I smoked back in my 20s, and when I was in

my 30s I quit. That's when I got put on pain pills and muscle relaxers, when I didn't smoke then. When this came out, it was a good opportunity," said Dixon, who made the purchase at a Tallahassee dispensary.

Dixon, a Crawfordville construction worker who was already purchasing other cannabis products at Trulieve, said he plans to smoke the whole flower in joints, a medicine he had been confident would "one day" be legalized.

"I didn't know if I would ever see it in my time.

But it is good to see it. It is good to have the alternative. These pharmaceuticals are killing people. I have lost so many family members," he told reporters.

Rivers, whose Quincy-based company sells more than 60 percent of the medical marijuana purchased by the state's nearly 200,000 qualified patients, said the sale of whole-flower cannabis — which is cheaper than processed products, such as tinctures — will make medical marijuana

SSA alerts public about phone scam

SEBRING — The Social Security Administration (SSA) and its Office of the Inspector General (OIG) launched a joint Public Service Announcement (PSA) campaign addressing a nationwide telephone impersonation scheme.

Social Security and the OIG continue to receive reports from across the country about fraudulent phone calls from people falsely claiming to be Social Security employees. Calls can even “spoof” Social Security’s national customer service number as the incoming number on the caller ID.

The new PSAs will air on TV and radio stations across the country to alert the public to remain vigilant against potential fraud.

“We urge you to always be cautious and to avoid providing sensitive information such as your Social Security number or bank account information to unknown people over the phone or Internet,” said Nancy A. Berryhill, acting commissioner of Social Security.

“If you receive a call and are not expecting one, you must be extra careful — you can always get the caller’s information, hang up, and

contact the official phone number of the business or agency the caller claims to represent,” Berryhill said. “Do not reveal personal data to a stranger who calls you.”

Social Security employees do occasionally contact people — generally those who have on-going business with the agency — by telephone for business purposes. However, Social Security employees will never threaten a person or promise a Social Security benefit approval, or increase, in exchange for information. In those cases, the call is fraudulent and people should not engage with the caller.

If a person receives these calls, he or she should report the information to the OIG Fraud Hotline at 1-800-269-0271 or online at <https://oig.ssa.gov/report>.

“These calls appear to be happening across the country, so we appreciate SSA’s partnership in this national public outreach effort,” said Gail S. Ennis, the Inspector General for the Social Security Administration. “Our message to the public is simply this: If you or someone you know receives a questionable call claiming to be from SSA or the OIG, just hang up.”

AP man arrested for battery

AVON PARK — Dwayne Kenneth Harris, 55, of Avon Park, should not live in a glass house because he throws stones. He was arrested Saturday, March 16.

Harris is facing charges of aggravated battery with a deadly weapon, weapon offense, missile into dwelling and vehicle; property damage criminal mischief; and burglary with assault or battery.

In the Highlands County sheriff’s arrest report, the victim told deputies she stepped outside the back of the residence at about 3 a.m. Harris allegedly forced his way into her home. The victim told Harris to leave and he didn’t.

The arresting deputy noted a small cut to the left side of the victim’s nose and a cut near her lip. The victim said the injury was due to Harris getting a push broom and striking her once he entered the residence. The deputy also noted the victim had a swollen bump on her cheek as well.

The report says when the victim ran outside

to call for help, Harris allegedly grabbed a blanket, a shirt and other items.

The victim re-entered the home. Harris exited the home where he smashed a piece of concrete on the sidewalk and used the smaller pieces to throw and break three of the victim’s apartment windows glass and screens. The woman was inside the residence when the glass broke and was struck by either glass or concrete pieces, according to the report. Next, Harris allegedly threw concrete pieces at the victim’s car cracking the windshield and the back right passenger window shattered. The victim told deputies that she estimated the windows value at \$1,200.

The arrest report shows that Harris was made aware of his Miranda rights. Harris did make a statement to the deputy however, it is redacted on the arrest report.

The Highlands County Clerk of Courts website shows Harris has had four other cases in Highlands County with the first being in 2008. The cases are for burglary, petit theft and failure to register as a career offender.

Harris was booked into the Highlands County Jail and bond has been set at \$80,000.

Public meeting Monday to discuss Sebring Strong fund disbursement

SEBRING — Shortly after the Jan. 23 shooting at the SunTrust Bank at 1901 U.S.27 S. in Sebring, donations for the survivors' families started pouring in. SunTrust Bank and SunTrust Foundation officials joined forces with the National Compassion Fund to create their own fund. The account is called Sebring Strong Survivor's Fund.

SunTrust Bank representatives will hold a public meeting at 6 p.m. Monday, March 25 at the Highlands County Government Center in the Board of County Commission

Meeting Room at 600 S. Commerce Ave. in Sebring. Dr. Anne Kerr, chairwoman of the fund steering committee, will be facilitating the meeting.

The meeting is anticipated to last one hour. The purpose of the meeting is to share how the donated money in the Sebring Strong Survivor's Fund



account will be distributed. Bank representatives will inform everyone who is eligible for funds and what the deadlines are to apply for them.

The final protocol will be created by National Compassion Fund. A draft protocol may be viewed in its entirety online at nationalcompassionfund.org.

According to the draft

protocol, money will be apportioned by the severity of injuries that were sustained in the "Sebring Attack." Category One will have the highest payouts and will all be the same.

The online draft shows two categories under which money will be distributed. Category One is applicants on behalf of a deceased victim of the shootings. They must be immediate family.

"The eligible applicant shall be the spouse or legal partner of the deceased or the personal representative of the estate of the deceased," the protocol states.

Category Two is for

anyone who was present at the time of the shooting. This category will have different payout amounts and will be less than Category One.

"Determination of the amounts for each eligible applicant will depend upon the following: (1) the balance in the Fund on April 30, 2019; (2) completion of the review of all submitted applications; and (3) review and approval by the Administrators," the online protocol said.

The SunTrust Foundation has invited residents to attend the public meeting on Monday and weigh in on the draft protocol.

Money could flow to environment, water quality

TALLAHASSEE — The Florida Senate is topping Gov. Ron DeSantis' request for environmental funding, despite early concerns about a tight budget and the need to react to Hurricane Michael.

The Senate Agriculture, Environment and General Government Appropriations Subcommittee on Wednesday released an initial \$5.9 billion budget proposal that includes \$656 million for Everglades restoration and water-quality efforts such as trying to reduce future outbreaks of toxic algae and red tide.

DeSantis has requested \$625 million for the fiscal year that starts July 1 as part of a four-year, \$2.5 billion environmental plan. The House on Tuesday introduced a

proposal that included \$607.4 million toward DeSantis' goal.

"We are excited about our budget," said Sen. Debbie Mayfield, a Rockledge Republican who chairs the Senate Agriculture, Environment and General Government Appropriations Subcommittee.

The full House and

Senate in the coming weeks will approve overall budgets and then enter negotiations on a final spending plan for the 2019-2020 fiscal year, which starts July 1.

As lawmakers started to review spending issues earlier this month Senate President Bill Galvano, R-Bradenton, said the governor's environmental

request may be "pushing" the limits of a budget expected to be stretched because of the response to Hurricane Michael.

But in the proposal from the Senate, \$360 million would go to Everglades restoration, including \$107 for the Everglades Agricultural Area Reservoir approved by lawmakers in 2017, and \$100 million would go to the state's natural springs.

The House proposal features \$327.4 million for work in the Everglades and \$50 million for springs. During the current year, \$50 million is going to springs projects.

The Senate is also putting up \$40 million for alternative water supplies and \$129 million for water-quality improvements, which includes \$25 million for septic-to-sewer conversion efforts.

Both the Senate and

House are seeking \$10.8 million to increase water-quality monitoring and the establishment of a Blue Green Algae Task Force within the Department of Environmental Protection.

The Senate is offering \$6.6 million to research red tide while the House has \$4.2 million for the creation of the Center for Red Tide Research within the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission.

The House has put up \$26 million, to the \$29.6 million sought by the Senate, for local water projects across the state.

Meanwhile, the Senate wants \$45 million for the Florida Forever land-preservation program, \$44.4 million for beach restoration, \$15 million for state park improvements and \$8 million for citrus

greening research.

The House has proposed \$20 million for Florida Forever, \$50 million for beach repairs, \$48 million for state park repairs and \$14.6 million toward citrus greening research.

The House also is offering \$58.1 million for citrus-canker payments to residents in Lee and Orange counties, something that isn't in the Senate proposal.

Legislators agreed to pay the money to compensate residents who lost orange, grapefruit and other citrus trees as part of a Florida Department of Agriculture program to stop the spread of deadly citrus-canker disease. Attorneys for the homeowners raised property-rights arguments in challenging the department's actions, and a judgment was entered in 2008.

Lawmakers look to make election changes

TALLAHASSEE — Fresh out of high-profile recounts in November and preparing for the 2020 presidential election, Florida lawmakers are working to revamp the state's elections laws to avoid being the "laughingstock" of the nation.

Rep. Blaise Ingoglia, a former chairman of the Republican Party of Florida, is sponsoring a House proposal (PCB SAC 19-01) that unanimously passed the House State Affairs Committee on Thursday.

The proposal would expand access to voting by changing deadlines that would offer voters and local elections supervisors more time to submit and count ballots.

"We will have 40 days to vote if this bill passes," Ingoglia, R-Spring Hill, said. "That is a long, long time."

Under the proposal, Floridians would be able to fix signature problems on their vote-by-mail and provisional ballots until two days after elections, and supervisors would be able to mail domestic vote-by-mail ballots earlier to voters, between 40 days and 28 days before elections.

The bill would also appeal to millennial voters: Ballot selfies would no longer be banned.

And for people eager to cast ballots, the 2020 primary election in the nation's largest swing state would come a week earlier. Under the

House proposal, the 2020 primary would be held on Aug. 18.

The proposal mostly seeks to address concerns raised during the 2018 midterm elections. In Florida, narrow margins required recounts in the races for governor, U.S. Senate and agriculture commissioner. The recounts prompted numerous lawsuits and allegations of improper handling of ballots.

At the center of the election mania were issues such as poor ballot design and old vote-counting machines that malfunctioned, along with problems related to counting absentee ballots and meeting recount deadlines.

"At the end of the day, we have to do something, right?" said Rep. Bobby Dubose, D-Fort Lauderdale. "We need to make sure we take into account all things that are a potential variable to make our election process the best process it can be."

However, DuBose said he would "keep a watchful eye" on Ingoglia and changes to the bill as it moves forward, considering Ingoglia's close ties to the state GOP.

Ingoglia said his bill seeks to bring greater transparency over local canvassing boards, which are responsible for tabulating votes during elections. He also wants to add rules to address ballot security, including mandates that would keep a tighter watch on ballot transportation and

requiring all ballots to be in locked rooms when not being canvassed.

Under the bill, canvassing boards would need to provide better notification of when they would meet, and the proposal would limit the number of alternate members who can serve on canvassing boards.

Also, upon request, candidates, party officials or political committee officials would be allowed to observe when canvassing boards make copies of physically damaged vote-by-mail ballots.

Democrats on the committee asked whether Ingoglia would consider making Election Day a holiday or if it would be held on a weekend so people are not prevented from voting because of work. Ingoglia said he did not believe in such moves.

Other concerns were related to funding the new requirements. Ingoglia said added costs would be the responsibility of local governments.

If not, the county will have what it has now: \$4.95 million, which will run the county for a little less than one month.

Right now, Nitz said, the county has no plans to use that \$3.6 million, and keep it available for the 2019-20 budget, which the Board of County Commission will start discussing in the next few months.

If all the county's \$13.4 million requested reimbursement from FEMA were to come back to the county, which Nitz said is not likely by Sept. 30, the county would have an \$18.3 million reserve — well over the minimum three-month cushion the county needs to have.

It's likely the biggest amount the county will see right away, Nitz said, is the 50 percent payment — just under \$6.7 million.

Combined with the existing \$4.95 million, that would provide \$11.64 million, which Nitz said would run the county for 2.16 months. Nitz said Assistant County Administrator Tasha Morgan, formerly the county's business manager, has estimated that FEMA and FDEM may have \$9 million back to the county by the end of the fiscal year.

If that holds true, Nitz said, the county would have approximately \$14.9 million in unassigned fund balance, enough to run the county for 2.6 months, if needed.

That would be a good thing, he said, because it's higher than for the last two years.

Not much tax?

Tax revenue, however, does not look like it will provide a lot more revenue.

Nitz doesn't have a solid number yet from Property Appraiser Raymond McIntyre, but the estimated property tax collections for this fiscal year are \$39.8 million.

Nitz made a conservative estimate of what improved property values might bring in: \$397,529, almost exactly 1 percent.

Last year's property tax increase from improved property values was 1.97 percent. Commissioners wanted to hold all county departments and constitutional officers to that amount, but couldn't.

Sheriff Paul Blackman needed more revenue to provide school resource

deputies under the state-mandated School Safety Program.

Clerk of the Courts Bob Germaine held his budget, but said his information technology department needs more funds to stay ahead of the cost in equipment and work hours to network and maintain all the county departments' and agencies' servers and communications.

McIntyre publishes official estimates of property value and improved property tax revenue on June 1, said County Administrator Randy Vosburg.

Basically, the ability for the county to budget comfortably or not depends heavily on FEMA. Hold the line

Commissioner Don Elwell advised caution.

"There's a tendency, as numbers go up, to spend more," Elwell said. "It just happens that way."

There are needs, he said, in personnel and equipment.

"However, we really need to make that effort, as you can see here, as David (Nitz) provided all this 'happy news,' if it goes up 3 percent, if property values go up 3 percent, we spend 2 [percent]," Elwell said.

The county has to bankroll as much as possible to get to the three-month number, he said, then look at reducing the millage rate.

"Clearly this storm has just completely knocked the wind out of our sails here, and taking 18-20 months for it to get reimbursed is just insane," Elwell said.

Plan ahead

Commissioner Greg Harris said he thought Elwell had a good idea a couple of years ago to look at the budget early on, find out what the anticipated revenue is, and set a benchmark for all departments and agencies to meet.

"Because we can't outspend what we take in," Harris said.

Elwell also pointed out the county hasn't hit the halfway point of the 2018-19 budget year, and pleaded with all departments to continue to hold their costs.

"It's a little early in the game to get too crazy with that," Elwell said, "but I'm sure in the near future, and I would definitely encourage

everybody to be really, really cautious and careful as we go forward because we can see where this could become a tighter-than-normal year, not because of spending patterns, but because of non-reimbursement."

Lower taxes?

Commissioner Arlene Tuck said she agreed with Elwell, and would even like to see property taxes lowered as much as a half point.

"I'd like to tell all the departments to please be realistic," Tuck said. "I've seen some budgets that come in that there's a lot left over at the end (of the year). Remember, that left-over amount would help us to leave the millage where it is or lower it a little bit."

She'd rather see department heads come in mid-year to ask for money than to raise millage.

Commission Chair Jim Brooks said he hoped the revenue from property taxes would be a little "rosier" after McIntyre makes his June 1 announcement.

Brooks also said he knows constitutional officers have pressures on them to find revenue and provide services. He said local news coverage has brought up the lack of a traffic unit within the Sheriff's Office.

Tuck advised commissioners to read the most recent audit of the county, which states that all county department and constitutional officer personnel have reduced in the last 10 years, except for the Sheriff's Office, which has doubled.

Part of that included the Sheriff's Office having to add 11 deputies onto the eight-member School Resource Unit under the Safe Schools Program.

What's next

Nitz said departments are working on their budgets and will have budget reviews with Elwell, followed by workshops and public hearings on Sept. 5 and 17.

Vosburg said the county will try to budget close to 95 percent of the expected budget, as a way of holding the line on costs.

"Just remember, it's all subject to change with one weather event," Brooks said.

He hopes the county will get reimbursed from the last hurricane, 18 months ago, before another one hits.

Allow teens to protect themselves from their anti-vaxx parents

California law gives teenagers the legal right to consent to abortions, obtain birth control, get tested for HIV or vaccinated for sexually transmitted diseases, even if their parents object. Should they also have the right to seek out immunization for other serious and potentially deadly diseases such as measles, tetanus and polio?

It's a reasonable question here — and everywhere — as measles cases continue to surge globally and in the U.S., and faith in vaccinations has eroded to the point that the World Health Organization listed vaccine skepticism as one of the biggest threats to human health in 2019. It's one thing to allow parents to make healthcare decisions, even bad ones, for their babies and toddlers who can't make rational choices for themselves. It's another thing entirely to deny scientifically proven treatment to worried high school students who have followed the news and fully understand what their parents do not: that the recommended childhood immunizations are perfectly safe and not having received one puts them at risk of contracting highly contagious and serious diseases that can lead to lifelong health complications or even death.

A large measles outbreak among Orthodox Jewish communities in New York has prompted state legislators there to propose an urgent measure allowing teens 14 and older to obtain vaccinations, even over their parents' objections. The Legislature should pass it, allowing teenagers who know better to protect themselves from the very real threat of this disease and others. Other states, such as Oregon and Washington, allow teenagers of various ages to obtain vaccinations on their own. (This is useful, in light of the major measles outbreak at the moment in the Portland-Vancouver metropolitan region.)

It makes sense to enable more people to obtain safe immunizations because the diseases they protect them from are not minor. Before wide-scale adoption of vaccinations, for example, measles killed more than 2.5 million people a year. Even now, the disease routinely kills thousands of people across the globe. A quarter of measles cases are so serious they result in hospitalization. Measles infections in children can lead to pneumonia, brain damage and encephalitis, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. What's more, vaccinations don't just protect the people who are vaccinated; they also raise the general "herd immunity" level that guards against disease outbreaks and protects even those too sick to get immunized.

And despite the fears and assertions of many parents, the vaccination for measles does not cause autism. Study after study have looked for and found no connection, including a major Danish study released just this month.

If kids are old enough to comprehend the danger of preventable disease, they ought to be old enough to take steps to avoid it — no matter what their uninformed parents think.

affordable for many Floridians who are now financially shut out of the treatment.

"For patients, it is a celebratory day in that folks who have been maybe forced to purchase product illegally, now have a legal and safe option," she said.

Trulieve's whole flower costs about \$10 per gram, or about \$280 per ounce. Under the new law, patients can purchase up to 2.5 ounces of marijuana for smoking every 35 days and have a total of four ounces in their possession at any time, if their doctors deem it the proper treatment.

Trulieve will sell whole flower at each of its 26 dispensaries throughout the state, the company said. In other states where medical marijuana has been legalized, smokable products comprise between 40 and 60 percent of sales, according to Rivers.

Although Trulieve was the first to receive approval from the state Department of Health to sell whole flower, other medical marijuana operators are racing to get authorization in an

industry that has rapidly expanded since marijuana began being retailed in January 2018.

"We do expect that there will be an increase in the Florida market. I don't know that we'll see as much of a shift of current patients, as we will patients who have not been medical patients up to this point, entering the market because they now see a product that they are attracted to and that works for them," Rivers said.

Florida voters in 2016 approved a constitutional amendment that broadly legalized medical marijuana. But in passing a law to carry out the constitutional amendment, the Legislature in 2017 banned smoking medical marijuana.

Orlando trial lawyer John Morgan, who largely bankrolled the 2016 constitutional amendment, led a legal challenge to the smoking ban. A Leon County circuit judge ruled that the smoking ban violated the amendment, spurring an appeal by former Gov. Rick Scott's administration.

But shortly after taking office in January, Gov. Ron DeSantis gave lawmakers an ultimatum, threatening to drop the state's appeal in the

smoking case if they did not repeal the ban.

Lawmakers complied, passing a measure two days prior to a March 15 deadline set by DeSantis. The governor signed the bill into law on Monday.

Under the law, smokable marijuana must be sold in "plain, opaque, and white" packaging "without depictions of the product or images other than the medical marijuana treatment center's department-approved logo and the marijuana universal symbol."

Doctors also have to provide documentation proving that smoking is the appropriate route of administration and swearing that "the benefits of smoking marijuana for medical use outweigh the risks for the qualified patient."

Dixon, whose doctor authorized him to smoke cannabis, said other forms of medical marijuana don't work as well for him.

"For me, a pipe is just a little bit too rough on my throat. It's the same with the vape. I think that because I am a smoker, I think I vape too hard. I smoke cigarettes, and so ingesting it that way is just easier for me," he said.

Communications, said, "To serve the needs of our Sebring clients longer term, we have recommissioned the building at 126 W. Center Ave. as a branch and plan to open our new Sebring Downtown branch on Friday, March 29. 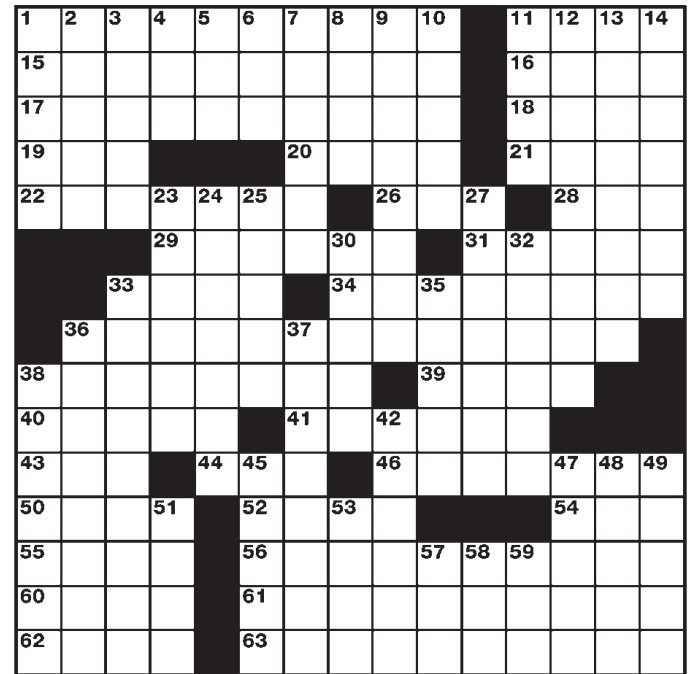

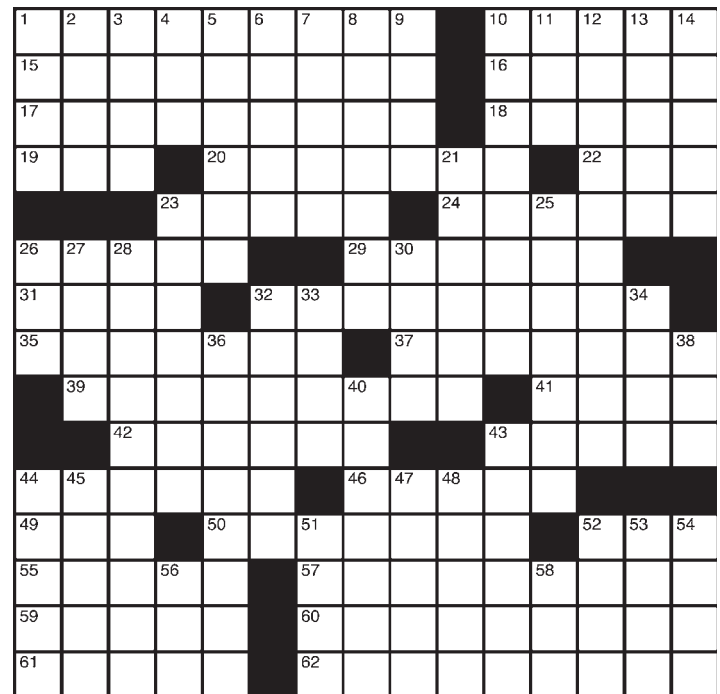

Critics blast House felons' rights plan

TALLAHASSEE — Felons would have to clear up any financial obligations, including court costs, fees and fines, before having their voting rights restored, under a House proposal castigated by critics Tuesday as a modern take on Jim Crow-era poll taxes designed to keep black voters from participating in elections.

In a strict party-line vote following heated testimony, the House Criminal Justice Subcommittee signed off on the measure aimed at clarifying parts of a constitutional amendment approved by voters in November.

The amendment, which appeared on the ballot as Amendment 4, granted “automatic” restoration of voting rights to felons “who have completed all terms of their sentence, including parole or probation.” The amendment excluded people “convicted of murder or a felony sexual offense.”

While some proponents maintain the measure does not require any legislative action, state and local elections officials, clerks of courts, prosecutors and others have asked the Legislature for guidance in interpreting what specific crimes qualify as exceptions and what is required for felons to have completed their sentences.

Under the House plan, felons convicted of first- or second-degree murder or about three

dozen sex-related crimes, including cyberstalking, would be excluded from the automatic restoration of rights.

But an even-more controversial part of the House bill (PCB CRJ 19-03) dealing with felons' financial obligations drew rebukes from civil rights advocates, Democrats and others who claim the plan disenfranchises voters.

“It’s a non-starter for me,” Rep. Michael Grieco, a Miami Beach Democrat who is a lawyer, said, adding he believes “there are efforts being made to purposely misinterpret” the Constitution.

“An overwhelming” number of states deal with restoration of voting rights “with no problem, but we seem to be fumbling around with a basic issue,” Grieco said.

Under the House plan approved by a 10-6 vote, felons would have to pay off all restitution, court fines and fees, including those that have been continued through civil judgments, such as liens. “Returning citizens,” the term used by backers of the constitutional amendment, would also have to pay “any cost of supervision.”

And before inmates are released, the proposal would require the Department of Corrections or county jail staff members to provide “an accounting of all outstanding financial obligations imposed by a court, the department, or the Florida Commission on Offender Review” for each felony conviction.

House Criminal Justice Chairman James Grant, R-Tampa, defended the legislation, saying it follows the language in the amendment.

“When a petition process leads to a constitutional amendment, we as legislators do not have the luxury, the latitude or the freedom to play the ‘what if’ game, to play the ‘edit the language’ game,” Grant, a lawyer, said.

But Neil Volz, political director of a committee that backed the amendment, said the Florida Commission on Offender Review currently does not take into consideration court costs, fees or fines when considering applications for clemency.

“It does not include costs outside of what the sentence was given by the judge,” Volz told the panel.

The House proposal would “move the line” of what completion of sentence means and “will restrict the ability to vote for thousands of Floridians, especially people who are poor, especially people of color,” he argued.

Kara Gross, a lobbyist for the American Civil Liberties Union of Florida, argued that the bill is “contrary to the voters’ will” expressed in the amendment because it “maintains lifetime disenfranchisement for non-violent, relatively low-level offenses.”

But, saying the amendment’s own lawyer told the Florida Supreme Court that court costs and fees could be considered as part of sentences, an

angry Grant rified on one opponent’s use of the words “near arrogance” to describe the House’s stance on financial obligations.

“Near arrogance is ignoring testimony in front of the Supreme Court and pretending it doesn’t matter,” he said.

“Near arrogance is suggesting this is a poll tax,” which “inherently diminishes ... what a poll tax actually was,” Grant added.

“To compare that to this is a slap in the face to every single person who was a free citizen told it would cost a dollar or more to vote. All we’re doing is following statute. All we’re doing is following the testimony that (was) presented before the Florida Supreme Court explicitly acknowledging that fines and court costs are part of a sentence,” he said.

Dave Ramba, a lobbyist who represents the

Florida State Association of Supervisors of Elections, praised the Legislature for providing clear direction to county officials, who work at the level “where the rubber hits the road.”

The definitions in the measure “are extremely helpful,” Ramba said.

“The bill specifies what offenses are included, and that was really our main goal,” he added. “Having something in law will allow us to be able to register the right folks.”

Supporters of Amendment 4, including the ACLU, pushed the constitutional amendment as an alternative to the state’s lengthy restoration of rights process, which spurred years of political and legal disputes.

Shortly after he took office in 2011, former Gov. Rick Scott and the Cabinet put in place a process that made it harder for felons to get rights, including

the right to vote, restored. Under the process, the state required felons to wait five or seven years to apply for rights restoration — — and years after that to complete the process.

Rep. Byron Donalds, R-Naples, acknowledged that “there’s a lack of trust” in how the Legislature is going to implement the amendment.

“Let’s be clear. ... The clemency process as it existed in the state of Florida has been a joke,” said Donalds, who is black.

But, he added, the state needs to interpret the amendment in a uniform way.

“We want to make sure that the next election ... that our state operates on the same wavelength in all 67 counties. That is what we should be striving for. None of us want to be on CNN talking about, ‘Oh man look, at what they did in Florida. Again,’” Donalds said.

Sebring win, performance helps with marketing

DAYTONA BEACH — With its win in the IMSA MICHELIN Pilot Challenge last Friday at Sebring International Raceway, Audi's plan of action for motorsports and business in North America is continuing to find success on and off the track.

The No. 39 Carbahn Motorsports Audi R8 LMS GT4 of Tyler McQuarrie and Jeff Westphal recorded an impressive five top-five finishes in 2018 as the only full-time Audi R8 LMS GT4 in the Pilot Challenge Grand Sport (GS) class. Yet its first win eluded the team until at Sebring.

It was a dominating

Jeff Westphal and Tyler McQuarrie — have just been so close to winning many races, last year when it was introduced to the market, and then

this year at Daytona.

"It was great to see them win, but it's also very important for us. We're against our competitors in the market

not from just the street car side, but also in motorsports."

There are 60 different Audi customer racing programs in the North American market that Herbert and his colleague Bernd Goeres manage across three levels — TCR, GT4 and the top-tier GT3. Audi is currently the only IMSA manufacturer to offer cars in all three classes as part of its ladder system for drivers and teams. It's also the only manufacturer competing for a sweep of the 2019 Pilot Challenge class championships in GS and TCR.

"Fifty percent of our entire sales are actually track day customers — Monticello in New York,

Spring Mountain in Las Vegas, Thermal Club in California, Lime Rock in Connecticut," explained Herbert. "We have a lot of customers that buy R8 LMS GT4's and Audi RS3 LMS TCR cars who just go out and track them."

"We've been investing a lot of time in trying to cultivate the track market, the gentleman driver who's running at The Thermal Club on the weekends. That's why we work with teams like Matt Moran and eEuroparts to really find those guys that are ready to graduate from running the track days at the club level into competing in places like IMSA and

other series."

And why Audi, one might ask?

If clinching last year's first-ever TCR championship in the Pilot Challenge, in addition to two Motul Pole Awards and one win between the two series classes already in 2019 isn't enough, Herbert points to the level of support that the manufacturer provides race in, race out to its customer teams at track.

"We have a full-time dedicated engineer for the GT4 program and a full-time dedicated engineer for the TCR Audi program as well," said Herbert. "Any technical issues, any support or

questions they have related to the platform, we can answer on site at any IMSA MICHELIN Pilot Challenge race.

"We also have a really good parts support program for TCR. We're the only brand that has a truck on site with TCR Audi parts. I don't think any other manufacturer offers parts support which tells you how important this market is for us. We have the most TCR cars in the field and we also have a separate parts truck that supports the GT3 and GT4 programs."

If the level of support is appealing to team owners and crews, Herbert credits the "drivability" of the car that is alluring to drivers, especially those just starting out in

their professional racing career.

"We offer three levels of motorsports platforms, but they're all factory-built cars that come with 50,000 kilometers of testing," Herbert said. "What you're getting is a very well-tuned product. Customers really like the fact that it's easy to drive and when you get it, it's turnkey."

And for those teams and drivers like CarBahn Motorsports pulling out their long overdue victory at one of the toughest road courses in North America?

"We give them the product, but at the end of the day I give the kudos to the teams because it's execution and teamwork that wins races," said Herbert.

St. Catherine's new principal offers new ideas for school

SEBRING — Originally from Brooklyn, New York, Nicole Loseto worked for a law firm and in banking before a career change and relocation put her on a path that brought her to St. Catherine Catholic School, Sebring.

As the school's new principal, Loseto has many plans to improve the school and involve the students and their families in beneficial activities.

She graduated with a degree in history from Washington University in St. Louis and worked in a law firm in New York City for a few years. She was working in a bank at the time of the 9/11/2001 terrorist attacks.

"After that I decided to make a change in my career," Loseto said. "I was always working with children and had

done some per diem work in the public school system in New York."

She was asked to work in a school part time in 2001 and that started her career in education.

After teaching different grade levels, she became an interim principal and director working in the Diocese of Brooklyn.

When Loseto and her husband decided to move to Florida she applied to work for the Diocese of Venice where she worked as the assistant principal at Epiphany Cathedral School in Venice.

Loseto's principal in Venice informed her about the principal opening at St. Catherine's. She started working part time at St. Catherine's on Dec. 12 and went full time in February.

Loseto said she has a lot of plans for the school with many areas

that need TLC.

"We really didn't have any activities for the kids the way I am used to," she said. "I have been fortunate to work in some really wonderful schools through the years so I have seen the best of what those schools could offer. I thought I could try to use what I have learned and draw from experience to help benefit the children here."

Starting a student council is one of the new changes at the school, along with choosing school colors — navy and red, and a mascot — the warrior, the St. Catherine Warriors. Also, the school has a new logo and new mission statements.

"We just rebranded to show the new St. Catherine's," Loseto said.

The school had a summer camp, but she is looking to start a half-day STREAM camp

— science, technology, religion, engineering, art and math.

Currently she is reviewing all the school's curriculum and hopes to provide more digital learning in the classroom, Loseto said.

The school currently has about 200 students in preK-3 through seventh-grade. Eighth-grade will be added for the 2019-20 school year.

St. Catherine Catholic School offers grants and scholarships and accepts Step-Up for Students and AAA scholarships and the Gardner and McKay scholarships, which the school didn't accept in the past, Loseto said.

The school will have a new website that is scheduled to be launched next week, she noted.

The one that causes the most problems may not be the biggest mistake



LIVING WITH CHILDREN
John K. Rosemond

A journalist recently asked me for the single biggest mistake being made by today's parents. I was tempted to say, "Having children," but stopped myself because even if I'd followed up with "Just kidding!" my bon mot would have gone into print. Oh my gosh! It just did!

I do, by the way, believe that some people are simply not well-suited to the responsibilities of parenthood. Nonetheless, I do not believe that people who want children should have to go through whatever process to obtain a "parenting license." That would represent government intrusion of the most egregious sort, and I'm not a fan of government intrusion in much of anything.

But on with the show: I don't know how one would determine "biggest" in a list of common parenting mistakes, but the one that causes the most problems for all concerned is the present proclivity for two parents to occupy the roles of mom and dad such that the roles of husband and wife become akin to the Cheshire Cat in "Alice in Wonderland"; that is, mostly invisible. It is an unarguable fact that in a two-parent family, nothing puts a more solid foundation of security and well-being under the feet of a child than the knowledge that mom and dad are in an enduring relationship.

Along those lines, another bigly mistake is paying children entirely too much attention, effectively promoting them to center-stage in the family and making idols of them. Children don't handle idol-hood well at all. Let's face it, adults don't either. As does the citizen, a child thrives best under libertarian circumstances; meaning he is managed minimally (allowing lots of trial-and-error) while being held completely responsible for the mistakes he will invariably make.

Paying too much attention to children is another biggie. In my experience, which is vast at this stage, 10 out of 10 children who seem "starved" for attention are not starved at all; rather, they have been for quite some time the recipients of entirely too much. They are attention-addicts, a synonym of which is "obnoxious." It is entirely unfair to burden a child with obnoxiousness. If

I was the Secretary of Parenting, I would only grant licenses to folks who pledged to love their children unconditionally but give them less than 15 minutes of one-on-one attention a day (excluding during infancy and early toddlerhood, which are unavoidably labor-intensive).

Today's parents tend to ascribe significance to their children's emotional output. As a consequence of talking to their children about every emotion they experience, they risk causing their children to become emotionally-driven individuals with little if any emotional resilience. My mother was fond of telling me that I was making mountains out of molehills; that there were children in the world who truly had problems ... real problems like not having enough to eat. She wasn't about to lend credence to a complaint about not being given a turn, called a name, or some such trivia. For that (among many other things) my mother receives my enduring gratitude.

Let's see ... I have room for two, maybe three more. Ah, yes! How about the habit today's parents have of assuming a servile squat when they talk to young children? You know, that absolutely absurd "getting down to their level" thing as if they are bowing to royalty. And then, to add the ludicrous to the absurd, finishing what they believe to be an instruction with "OK?" So what if it isn't OK?

Last one: Trying to discipline a child who has misbehaved without causing the child emotional discomfort (guilt and remorse) and inconvenience. That attempt annuls the attempt to discipline, which goes a long way toward explaining why so many of today's parents complain that nothing they do by way of "discipline" works.

That's because they are doing nothing.

Trump's tweet lifting just-announced North Korea sanctions spawns confusion

'I have today ordered the withdrawal of those additional Sanctions!'

WASHINGTON — President Donald Trump overruled his administration's new round of sanctions aimed at forcing North Korea to end its nuclear program, surprising his staff and confusing the public with a tweet Friday afternoon.

"It was announced today by the U.S. Treasury that additional large scale Sanctions would be added to those already existing Sanctions on

North Korea," Trump wrote soon after arriving for the weekend at his Mar-a-Lago retreat in Palm Beach, Fla. "I have today ordered the withdrawal of those additional Sanctions!"

The president appeared to be referring to a pair of sanctions that his Treasury secretary announced Thursday against two Chinese shipping companies accused of helping North Korea evade sanctions. Secretary Steven T. Mnuchin issued a strong statement in

Thursday's announcement, taking a hard line against North Korea that was greatly at odds with Trump's retreat and his spokeswoman's subsequent explanation.

Press secretary Sarah Huckabee Sanders dashed off a statement that did little to explain what was behind Trump's tweet. She reaffirmed Trump's personal relationship with North Korean leader Kim Jong Un, with whom he has had two summits that failed to yield a deal on nuclear

disarmament.

"President Trump likes Chairman Kim and he doesn't think these sanctions will be necessary," she said.

Mnuchin, in his statement a day earlier, said, "The United States and our like-minded partners remain committed to achieving the final, fully verified denuclearization of North Korea and believe that the full implementation of North Korea-related U.N. Security Council resolutions is crucial to a successful outcome."

He added, "Treasury will continue to enforce our sanctions, and we are making it explicitly clear that shipping companies employing deceptive tactics to mask illicit trade with North Korea expose themselves to great risk."

National security adviser John Bolton had also tried to underscore the tough stance against North Korea signified by Thursday's sanctions move, tweeting after they were announced that they were "important actions."

Mother Russia: South Florida sees a boom in 'birth tourism'

Pregnant Russian women give birth in US so their child can acquire all the privileges of American citizenship

MIAMI — Every year, hundreds of pregnant Russian women travel to the United States to give birth so that their child can acquire all the privileges of American citizenship.

They pay anywhere from \$20,000 to sometimes more than \$50,000 to brokers who arrange their travel documents, accommodations and hospital stays, often in Florida.

While the cost is high, their children will be rewarded with opportunities and travel advantages not available to their Russian countrymen. The parents themselves may benefit someday as well.

And the decidedly un-Russian climate in South Florida and the posh treatment they receive in the maternity wards — unlike dismal clinics back home — can ease the financial sting and make the practice seem more like an extended vacation.

The Russians are part of a wave of "birth tourists" that includes sizable numbers of women from China and Nigeria.

President Donald Trump has spoken out against the provision in the U.S. Constitution that allows "birth-right citizenship" and has vowed to end it, although legal experts are divided on whether he can actually do that.

Although there have been scattered cases of authorities arresting operators of birth tourism agencies for visa fraud or tax evasion, coming to the U.S. to give birth is fundamentally legal. Russians interviewed by The Associated Press said they were honest about their intentions when applying for visas and even showed signed contracts with doctors and hospitals.

There are no figures on how many foreign women travel to the U.S. specifically to give birth. The Center for Immigration Studies, a group that

advocates for stricter immigration laws, estimated that in 2012, about 36,000 foreign-born women gave birth in the U.S., then left the country.

The Russian contingent is clearly large. Anton Yachmenev of the Miami Care company that arranges such trips, told the AP that about 150 Russian families a year use his service, and that there are about 30 such companies just in the area.

South Florida is popular among Russians not only for its tropical weather but also because of the large Russian-speaking population. Sunny Isles Beach, a city just north of Miami, is even nicknamed "Little Moscow."

"With \$30,000, we would not be able to buy an apartment for our child or do anything, really. But we could give her freedom. That's actually really cool," said Olga Zemlyanaya, who gave birth to a daughter in December and was staying in South

Trump says Islamic State driven from last Syria territory

White House says all ISIS held territory in Syria has been "100 percent" eliminated

WEST PALM BEACH, Fla. — Islamic State militants no longer control any territory in Syria, President Donald Trump proudly announced Friday, though the U.S. was still launching airstrikes and sporadic fighting continued on the ground against the group's holdouts.

"It's about time," Trump exclaimed on an airport tarmac in Florida. He held up maps indicating the territory once held by the IS

group in Iraq and Syria had shrunk to nothing.

Elimination of the last IS stronghold in Baghouz in eastern Syria would mark the end of the militants' self-declared caliphate, which at its height blanketed large parts of Syria and Iraq. The campaign to take back the territory by the U.S. and its partners has spanned five years and two U.S. presidencies, unleashed more than 100,000 bombs and killed untold numbers of fighters and civilians.

Florida House, Senate release competing state budget plans

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP) — The Republican-led Florida House and Senate on Friday released competing budget proposals for the upcoming year with major funding differences in areas such as education and the environment — and an uncertain future for millions of dollars in Seminole Tribe gambling money.

The legislative plans also differ in many ways with the \$91.3 billion spending blueprint proposed last month by GOP Gov. Ron

DeSantis. The overall House total is \$89.9 billion, while the Senate figure is \$90.3 billion.

House and Senate committees will consider the bills next week. All three budget proposals for fiscal 2019-2020 are higher overall than current state government spending levels. The new fiscal year begins July 1.

On education, the Senate wants an overall \$1.1 billion increase for public schools, while the House increase is \$600 million. DeSantis'

plan is closer to the House figure. The Senate amount also includes about \$600 million that local school districts could use for teacher raises or other needs.

Senate President Bill Galvano said it's a tight budget year, particularly with plans to spend an additional \$219.9 billion on Hurricane Michael recovery needs that brings the total state commitment to \$1.8 billion since the storm hit the Panhandle on Oct. 10.

Parkland shooting survivor kills herself because of 'survivor's guilt,' parents say

MIAMI — Sydney Aiello, a 19-year-old Parkland shooting survivor, killed herself Sunday, according to family and friends.

The news made its way across social media Friday after Aiello's parents told Miami Herald news partner CBS 4 that her daughter took her own life because of "survivor's guilt."

Aiello's funeral took place Friday, her parents said. Their daughter was a senior at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School who was on campus Feb. 14, 2018, the day an armed gunman killed 17 people.

One of those victims was her close friend, Meadow Pollack.

Meadow's father, Andrew Pollack, told the Herald his "heart goes out to those poor, poor parents."

"It's terrible what happened. Meadow and Sydney were friends for a long, long time," Pollack said, pivoting his comments to students. "Killing yourself is not the answer."

He continued: "If anyone feels like that they have no one that can understand their pain, if there's any student out there that's having a hard time, please reach out to me on Twitter. I understand you. You aren't alone."

In a GoFundMe fundraiser, Aiello was described as someone who "filled her days cheerleading, doing yoga, and brightening up the days of others."

Man killed pregnant stepmom, called 911 at cemetery

EUSTIS, Fla. (AP) — Authorities in Florida say a 21-year-old man strangled his pregnant stepmother and called 911 from a cemetery to confess to killing her.

Police officers found Ian Anselmo in Sue Ellen Anselmo's SUV on March 13. The 39-year-old mother of six was bleeding and unconscious in the driver's seat, a cord wrapped taut around her neck.

Lake County charged Ian Anselmo in the assault of his stepmother, but offered no motive in a probable cause affidavit. The charges are likely to be upgraded because she later died.

Florida unemployment rate at 3.5 percent in February

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP) — Florida's unemployment rate was 3.5 percent in February, virtually unchanged from a month earlier.

Figures released by the state Friday show that 357,000 Floridians were jobless in February out of a total workforce of about 10.3 million.

Florida's unemployment rate remains below the national rate of 3.8 percent for February. Florida added 24,300 private sector jobs last month.

In February 2019, Monroe County had the state's lowest unemployment rate at 2.4 percent, followed by St. Johns County at 2.9 percent and Okaloosa and Wakulla counties at 3 percent.

Gulf County had the highest unemployment rate at 6.2 percent, followed by Citrus County at 5.3 percent and Hardee County and Sumter counties at 5.1 percent each.

UCF approves paying former president \$600K for departure

ORLANDO, Fla. (AP) — The University of Central Florida has agreed to pay its former president \$600,000 as part of a departure settlement.

The university's Board of Trustees on Thursday approved the one-time payment for Dale Whittaker. The school said in a statement that the payment would come from private funding, not state dollars.

Whittaker resigned last month to appease state lawmakers and education officials upset about the school using tens of millions of dollars in operating funds to pay for construction in violation of state rules.

UCF trustees voted to end payments worth \$330,000 to Whittaker's predecessor, John Hitt, who was president when operating money was used to construct a building for classrooms and study rooms.

The trustees agreed to let Thad Seymour stay on as interim president until someone permanent is named.

Home grown: Florida Senate passes vegetable garden bill

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP) — Floridians would be able to grow fruit and vegetables in their front yards without fear of local government fines under a bill passed by the Senate on Thursday.

The legislation was inspired by a court battle after Miami Shores told a homeowner to dig up a vegetable garden or face a \$50 a day fine. An appeals court upheld the ordinance.

Republican Sen. Rob Bradley said the city's front-yard garden ban is a "vast overreach" and that being able to grow your own food is a basic property right. Democratic Sen. Bobby Powell argued that it is an overreach to prohibit every local government from regulating gardens because of one local ordinance.

Bradley noted that there are so-called food deserts in many areas of the state where fresh fruit and vegetables aren't readily available.

The bill passed on a 35-5 vote. All no votes were cast by Democrats, including, somewhat ironically, Sen. Gary Farmer.

Farmer said he lives in a Broward County city where there's a large iguana problem and unrestricted front-yard gardens could make it worse.

"Having a vegetable garden in a front yard would just attract more iguanas as well as rats and similar stuff," Farmer said after the vote.

A House version of the bill has been approved in the first of three committee stops.

House passes bill to make opening hospitals easier

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP) — The Florida House wants to eliminate a requirement that hospitals and other health care facilities show there is a demand for their services before getting licensed to build or expand.

The House voted 77-33 on Thursday to eliminate the certificate of need for hospitals, nursing homes and other facilities.

Republican bill sponsor Rep. Heather Fitzenhagen said eliminating the licensure requirement would increase competition among hospitals and therefore decrease health care costs.

Democrats opposed the bill, saying that it will benefit private hospitals that are now price gouging patients. Democratic Rep. Even Jenne said certificates of need are needed to make sure that the market isn't oversaturated and that quality of care would be diminished.

A similar Senate bill is stalled in committee.

Trump administration announces new Venezuela sanctions

PALM BEACH, Fla. (AP) — The Trump administration on Friday announced additional sanctions for Venezuela in response to what it describes as the illegal arrest of opposition leader Juan Guaido's chief of staff.

The Treasury Department announcement came while the President Donald Trump met with leaders from five Caribbean nations, where Venezuela was at the top of the agenda. The region has been far from united in joining the U.S. call for the ouster of President Nicolas Maduro.

The department is specifically targeting Venezuela's national development bank, BANDES, and four additional subsidiaries that BANDES owns or controls.

"The regime's continued use of kidnapping, torture, and murder of Venezuelan citizens will not be tolerated by the U.S. or the international coalition that is united behind President Guaido," said Treasury Secretary Steven Mnuchin. "Roberto Marrero and other political prisoners must be released immediately."

The U.S. had already sanctioned scores of top Venezuelan officials and has blocked U.S. banks from doing business with that country, imposing a financial strangle-hold on the cash-strapped nation. The sanctions announced Friday also came as members of Congress from both parties condemned Marrero's arrest. They described it as a kidnapping.

The Trump administration considers Maduro's government a dictatorship and says he was re-elected in an illegitimate election. The U.S. has sanctioned scores of top Venezuelan officials and has blocked U.S. banks from doing business with Venezuela, putting a financial strangle-hold on the cash-strapped country. The country is in an economic meltdown and millions of Venezuelans have fled.

Coast Guard offloads 27,000 pounds of seized cocaine

MIAMI BEACH, Fla. (AP) — The U.S. Coast Guard is offloading more than 27,000 pounds (12,247 kilo grams) of cocaine in Miami Beach that was seized in the Eastern Pacific Ocean.

The Coast Guard said in a news release that the drugs taken off the U.S. Coast Guard cutter Tampa on Friday are worth an estimated \$360 million. The cocaine was seized in 12 separate operations off the coasts of Mexico, Central America and South America during a three month period.

Cyclone death toll tops 600 in Africa

BEIRA, Mozambique (AP) — With the flooding easing in parts of cyclone-stricken Mozambique on Friday, fears are rising that the waters could yield up many more bodies. The confirmed number of people killed in Mozambique and neighboring Zimbabwe and Malawi climbed past 600.

Eight days after Cyclone Idai struck southeast Africa's Indian Ocean coast, touching off some of the worst flooding in decades, the homeless, hungry and injured slowly made their way from devastated inland areas to the port city of Beira, which was heavily damaged itself but has emerged as the nerve center for rescue efforts.

"Some were wounded. Some were bleeding," said Julia Castigo, a Beira resident who watched them arrive. "Some had feet white like flour for being in the water for so long."

Aid workers are seeing many children who have been separated from their parents in the chaos or orphaned.

Elhadj As Sy, secretary-general of the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies, said the relief efforts so far "are nowhere near the scale and magnitude of the problem," and the humanitarian needs are likely to grow in the coming weeks and months.

Indonesian airline wants to cancel Boeing order after crash

JAKARTA, Indonesia (AP) — In a blow for Boeing, Indonesia's flag carrier is seeking the cancellation of a multibillion dollar order for 49 of the manufacturer's 737 Max 8 jets, citing a loss of confidence after two crashes within five months.

It is the first announcement of a cancellation since Boeing's new model aircraft were grounded following fatal crashes in Indonesia and Ethiopia. PT Garuda Indonesia, which had ordered 50 Max 8 jets in 2014 and had received just one plane last year, sent a letter to Boeing last week requesting to cancel the order worth \$4.9 billion, company spokesman Ikhsan Rosan said Friday. The carrier has so far paid Boeing about \$26 million for the order.

Garuda joined other airlines worldwide in grounding its one Max 8 jet after the crash of an Ethiopian Airlines flight this month which killed all 157 people aboard. It came less than five months after 189 people died in the Oct. 29 crash of another Max 8, operated by Indonesian private carrier Lion Air.

EU takes charge, forces Brexit deadlines on UK's May

BRUSSELS (AP) — Isolated at home and abroad, British Prime Minister Theresa May will be laboring against the odds once again to win backers in Parliament for her unloved Brexit deal, this time to a timetable dictated by the European Union.

Almost three years after Britons voted to walk away from the EU, the bloc's leaders seized control of the Brexit timetable from May to avert a chaotic departure at the end of this month that would be disruptive for the world's biggest trading bloc and deeply damaging for Britain.

May's mantra since Britain's EU membership referendum in 2016 has always been about "taking back control" of U.K. affairs from the EU. But the process has seen her lose control — of the U.K. Parliament, which has twice rejected her Brexit deal, and now of Britain's date of departure.

In a move that underlined their loss of confidence in May, EU leaders set two deadlines for Britain to leave the bloc of nearly half a billion people or to take an entirely new path in considering its EU future.

At marathon late night talks Thursday in Brussels, they rejected May's request to extend the Brexit deadline from March 29 until June 30.

Watchdog: FEMA wrongly released personal data of victims

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Federal Emergency Management Agency wrongly released to a contractor the personal information of 2.3 million survivors of devastating 2017 hurricanes and wildfires, potentially exposing the victims to identity fraud and theft, a government watchdog reported Friday.

The Homeland Security Department's Office of Inspector General found the breach occurred when FEMA was working with a contractor that helps provide temporary housing to those affected by disasters. FEMA is one of Homeland Security's many agencies; the sprawling 240,000-person department also includes immigration enforcement, and the U.S. Secret Service.

FEMA officials said that since the discovery of the issue, the agency was no longer sharing unnecessary data with the contractor and has conducted a detailed review of the contractor's information system and has found no indication to suggest data has been compromised.

The agency said in a statement it is working with the contractor to remove the data from its system and has instructed staff to complete additional privacy training.

Some information, like names, last four digits of a Social Security number and how many people live in a household are required to confirm eligibility and locate housing for victims. But FEMA also provided the contractor with bank names electronic funds transfer numbers and bank transit numbers that were not required by the contractor.

The 2.3 million people lived through California wildfires and Hurricanes Harvey, Irma and Maria.

US hits Iran with new sanctions while Pompeo visits Lebanon

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Trump administration hit Iran with new sanctions on Friday while Secretary of State Mike Pompeo was denouncing Iran's growing influence on a visit to Lebanon.

The Treasury Department said the sanctions target 31 Iranian scientists, technicians and companies affiliated with Iran's Organization for Defense Innovation and Research, which had been at the forefront of the country's former nuclear weapons program. Officials said those targeted continue to work in Iran's defense sector and form a core of experts who could reconstitute that program. Fourteen people, including the head of the organization, and 17 subsidiary operations are covered by the sanctions.

The sanctions freeze any assets that those targeted may have in U.S. jurisdictions and bar Americans from any transactions with them. But, officials say the move will also make those targeted "radioactive internationally" by making people of any nationality who do business with them subject to U.S. penalties under so-called secondary sanctions.

U.S. secondary sanctions apply to foreign businesses and individuals and can include fines, loss of presence in the American economy, asset freezes and travel bans. Officials said the threat of such sanctions will significantly limit the ability of those designated to travel outside of Iran, participate in research conferences or be hired for other jobs.

"Individuals working for Iran's proliferation-related programs — including scientists, procurement agents, and technical experts — should be aware of the reputational and financial risk they expose themselves to by working for Iran's nuclear program," the State Department said in a statement.

The move is unusual because the sanctions are not being imposed based on what those targeted are currently doing.

Instead, they were imposed because of their past work on nuclear weapons development and the potential that they would be at the forefront of any Iranian attempt to restart that program.

Trump orders colleges to back free speech or lose funding

President Donald Trump signed an executive order Thursday requiring U.S. colleges to protect free speech on their campuses or risk losing federal research funding.

The new order directs federal agencies to ensure that any college or university receiving research grants agrees to promote free speech and the exchange of ideas, and to follow federal rules guiding free expression.

"Even as universities have received billions and billions of dollars from taxpayers, many have become increasingly hostile to free speech and to the First Amendment," Trump said at a White House signing ceremony. "These universities have tried to restrict free thought, impose total conformity and shut down the voices of great young Americans."

The order follows a growing chorus of complaints from conservatives who

say their voices have been stifled on campuses across the U.S. Joining Trump at the ceremony were students who said they were challenged by their schools while trying to express views against abortion or in support of their faith.

Trump initially proposed the idea during a March 2 speech to conservative activists, highlighting the case of Hayden Williams, an activist who was punched in the face while recruiting for the group Turning Point USA at the University of California, Berkeley. He invoked the case again Thursday, noting that Williams was hit hard "but he didn't go down."

Under the order, colleges would need to agree to protect free speech in order to tap into more than \$35 billion a year in research and educational grants.

For public universities, that means vowing to uphold the First Amendment, which they're already required to do.

Private universities, which have more flexibility in limiting speech, will be required to commit to their own institutional rules.

GM announces jobs, electric vehicle after Trump criticism

ORION TOWNSHIP, Mich. (AP) — Less than a week after a series of critical tweets from the president over an Ohio plant closure, General Motors is announcing plans to add 400 jobs and build a new electric vehicle at a factory north of Detroit.

The company says it will spend \$300 million at its plant in Orion Township, Michigan, to manufacture a Chevrolet vehicle based on the battery-powered Bolt.

GM wouldn't say when the new workers will start or when the new vehicle will go on sale, nor would it say if the workers will be new hires or come from a pool of laid-off workers from the planned closings of four U.S. factories by January.

The moves come after last weekend's string of

venomous tweets by President Donald Trump condemning GM for shutting its small-car factory in Lordstown, Ohio. During the weekend, Trump demanded that GM reopen the plant or sell it, criticized the local union leader and expressed frustration with CEO Mary Barra.

In November, GM announced plans to shut the four U.S. factories and one in Canada. About 3,300 workers in the U.S. would lose their jobs, as well as 2,600 in Canada. Another 8,000 white-collar workers were targeted for layoff.

Plants slated for closure include Lordstown; Detroit-Hamtramck, Michigan; Warren, Michigan; White Marsh, Maryland, near Baltimore and Oshawa, Ontario near Toronto.

Florida until her child got a U.S. passport.

An American passport confers many advantages. Once the child turns 21, he or she can apply for "green card" immigration status for the parents.

A U.S. passport also gives the holder more travel opportunities than a Russian one; Americans can make short-term trips to more than 180 countries without

a visa, while Russians can go visa-free only to about 80.

Traveling to the U.S. on a Russian passport often requires a laborious interview process for a visa. Just getting an appointment for the interview can take months.

Some Russians fear that travel opportunities could diminish as tensions grow between Moscow and the West, or that Russia might even revert to stricter Soviet-era rules for leaving the country.

"Seeing the conflict

growing makes people want to take precautions because the country might well close its borders. And if that happens, one would at least have a passport of a different country and be able to leave," said Ilya Zhegulev, a journalist for the Latvia-based Russian website Meduza that is sharply critical of the Kremlin.

Last year, Zhegulev sold two cars to finance a trip to California for him and his wife so she could give birth to their son.

Trump denounced birthright citizenship before the U.S. midterm election, amid ramped up rhetoric on his hard-line immigration policies. The president generally focuses his ire on the U.S.-Mexico border. But last fall he mentioned he was considering executive action to revoke citizenship for babies born to non-U.S. citizens on American soil.

No executive action has been taken.

The American Civil Liberties Union, other legal

groups and even former House Speaker Paul Ryan, typically a supporter of Trump's proposals, said the practice couldn't be ended with an order.

But others, like the Center for Immigration Studies, which advocates for less immigration, said the practice is harmful.

"We should definitely do everything we can to end it, because it makes a mockery of citizenship," said Mark Krikorian, executive director of the Center for Immigration Studies.

Controlling territory and assets, such as oil facilities, has given the group a stream of revenue and a place from which to launch attacks around the world. However, if history is a guide, the reconquering of IS-held territory could prove a short-lived victory unless Iraq and Syria fix a problem that gave rise to the extremist movement in the first

place: governments pitting one ethnic or sectarian group against another.

Trump has been teasing the victory for days, most recently Wednesday when he said the milestone would be achieved by that night.

On Friday, after a flight to Florida, Trump held up a map to supporters cheering him on the tarmac. Then he turned to reporters standing nearby.

"Here's ISIS on Election Day," he

said, linking coalition gains since then to his presidency. He pointed to a swath of red signifying the group's previous territorial hold, and then to a version without any red, "Here's ISIS right now."

But Trump appeared to be overstating his administration's contribution to the anti-IS fight. A close-up of the map showed that he was displaying the group's footprint at a high-point in 2014, not Election Day 2016, by which point the U.S.-backed campaign

was well underway.

And American officials familiar with the situation in Syria said that the U.S.-backed Syrian Democratic Forces — who had not announced victory and weren't planning to on Friday — were still battling remaining IS fighters who were holed up in tunnels along river cliffs in Baghouz. Another official confirmed that the U.S. launched airstrikes there on Friday and that the fighting continued to clear out final pockets of IS members.

Hints on getting a proper night's safe and sound sleep

A recent headline, "Common sleeping pills muffle your sleeping brain's 'intruder alert,'" made us think of the saying, "You snooze; you lose." But while that may be true when you're behind the wheel or sleepwalking from sleeping pills, it couldn't be further from the truth when it comes to the importance of good sleep for good health.

This is a serious issue, because 35 percent of U.S. adults aren't getting the needed seven hours of shut-eye nightly, according to a 2016 Centers for Disease Control and Prevention report. South Dakotans were most likely to get enough sleep — fully 72 percent do! Hawaiians get the least; only 56 percent report seven hours nightly. And 48 percent of Americans have occasional insomnia, while 33 percent say it's a nightly or near-nightly torment.

No wonder Americans spent \$230 million on over-the-counter sleep meds — accounting for 85 percent of sleep aids used. The other 15 percent are prescription meds such as Ambien and Lunesta.

A CDC report found that 4 percent of U.S. adults used prescription sleep aids in the past month.

A combination of two factors is making a good night's sleep ever more rare, and making sleep itself risky business! Fortunately, you can change that — but first, those two ...

1. A dysfunctional stress response is the No. 1 sleep destroyer, making it hard to fall asleep and triggering disturbing dreams. Then, lack of sleep boosts your levels of stress hormones, and you're in a vicious cycle.

An American Psychological Association 2017 survey, called "Stress in America," found that money, work and the future of the nation (in terms of health care, the economy, crime, climate change and terrorism) rank as the top three stressors.

2. Chronic pain is a close second. Fifty million Americans deal with persistent pain and around 20 million have "pain severe enough that it frequently limits life or work activities." That's why so many folks depend on OTC and Rx pain meds to control pain and sleeping pills to help them snooze.

In fact, the number of Americans taking both pain-killing opioids (like Percocet or OxyContin) and benzodiazepines increased by 250 percent over a 15-year period. And there was an 850 percent increase in patients taking other benzodiazepines and so-called Z-drugs (Ambien and Sonata) on the same nights, according to a study published in the journal Sleep.

Another risk: Benzodiazepines may help you sleep, but research-

ers from Japan who tested this in mice say they also make it so you'd sleep through an intruder, fire or earthquake!

For Better Z's
1. Move. No matter what your physical abilities, use your legs for at least 30 minutes a day. Get up and move around every 20-30 minutes when sitting. Over time, increase your physical activity to include interval aerobics and strength training.

2. Meditate. Set aside 12 minutes a day to meditate. Be quiet — no cells, no music, no internet. Sit in a comfortable position with good posture. Breathe in through your nose slowly for four seconds and exhale slowly through an open mouth for as long as you can. Build to eight seconds. Repeat the breathing rhythm while you let your mind drift.

3. Make the bedroom sleep-ready: No light. No TV or phone. Use earplugs and eyeshades to limit light and sounds; maintain cool temp; use warm blankets.

DEAR ABBY: I'm a high school junior, and my school's prom is coming up. I don't have a date. I completely understand that I don't need a date for prom to have fun. However, within my group of friends, we are organizing who will sit at our 18-person table, and I'm the only dateless person at our table, which means I'm the odd one out (eight couples plus me for a total of 17 seats filled).

I know I should try to have fun even if I'm the only one by myself, but the situation makes me feel so alone.

How should I handle this situation and be able to have fun at prom, even though I'll be sticking out as the only person in our group who couldn't manage to find someone to go with? — Anonymous In Pennsylvania

DEAR ANONYMOUS: I understand why you would feel alone under these circumstances, but the truth is you WON'T be alone. You will be attending the prom with 16 friends. If you concentrate on that, you CAN have a good time hearing music you enjoy, surrounded by friends who are supportive and dancing if you wish to.

Dogs great with allergies

Karen, allergy-prone kids need a hypoallergenic breed.

What causes the allergies? Dander and shedding, mostly. The symptoms can be itchy, watery eyes, sneezing and rash.

No dog is completely hypoallergenic, BUT there are breeds that are more hypoallergenic than others: Shih Tzu, Yorkshire terrier, poodle, Maltese and even the hairless Chinese crested are good choices.



Hints from Heloise

These dogs (except the Chinese crested) have HAIR that grows, not FUR, and they require regular grooming, which can add up. These breeds need their faces and eyes kept clean, too.

Whichever breed you choose, look online for a rescue group for that particular dog breed. — Heloise

Lightning don't believe in mailing it in

With President's Trophy, home-ice advantage in hand, Tampa Bay still fighting

ST. LOUIS — Carolina seemed to be in a pretty good position after 40 minutes on Thursday. The Hurricanes had a lead, even if it was a one-goal lead, going into the third period against a team playing the second half of a back-to-back.

But no, the Lightning turned it on, playing with a short bench after a match penalty to Yann Gourde, scored four unanswered goals in its final 20 minutes of hockey in the span of 26 hours, and won the game.

The Lightning locked up everything last week — Presidents' Trophy, thus top seed

and home-ice advantage throughout the playoffs — and doesn't seem to have much to play for in the final nine games.

"Realistically, things have probably been wrapped up for a while," said Steven Stamkos, referring to the Lightning's 21-point lead over the rest of the league. "Just because we've clinched doesn't mean we mail it in and then press the button. It's not that easy."

Jon Cooper has been asked about how he keeps his team motivated. For the most part, his answer has been the players do it themselves.

Look at the quality of games the Lightning has played since clinching the Presidents' Trophy

on Monday. Tampa Bay beat Washington 5-4 in overtime Wednesday, then Carolina 6-3 the next night.

Neither was the game the Lightning wanted to play: Tampa Bay gave up 58 shots to the Capitals and needed a third-period comeback to beat the Hurricanes. A team without much on the line might not find ways to win a game that didn't go its way.

The Lightning has. Emotions may have been a factor against Washington, the team that embarrassed Tampa Bay in last year's Eastern Cup Finals, but not against Carolina.

Good teams find ways to win, Ryan Callahan

said. That game was a test of what is to come in the playoffs, having to come back from a one-goal lead late on the road.

That comeback didn't just happen. It wasn't the case of Carolina falling apart and giving up the lead.

Coaches are rarely in the position to praise the third-period effort of a team in the second half of a back-to-back, but that's what Cooper did Thursday night.

"We played a really good third period, pretty gritty effort especially playing against an extremely desperate team that's trying to fight for the playoffs," he said. "So really happy with how we finished."

No. 13 UC Irvine will face No. 12 Oregon after beating Wildcats 70-64 for first victory in tournament history

SAN JOSE, Calif. (AP) — When it comes to college basketball in California, UC Irvine is low on the totem pole.

Now the program that sometimes feels like a little brother to Pac-12 powers like UCLA and USC is the only school from the state still standing in the NCAA Tournament after pulling off a stunner.

The 13th-seeded Anteaters got back-to-back 3-pointers from Evan Leonard to spark the deciding run in a 70-64 upset Friday over No. 4 seed Kansas State for the first tournament win in school history.

Ryne Stanek, the man who changed history

Being an 'opener,' Tampa Bay pitcher is a 'first' just as DH Ron Blomberg was

PORT CHARLOTTE — Ryne Stanek is a free spirit. Life flows from him like his mane of hair, his apostle look. Stanek approaches things a little differently.

"I feel like I'm kind of a goofy cat, just always messing around," Stanek said. "I never take myself or anything too seriously." Baseball has caught up with him.

So, when Rays manager Kevin Cash and pitching coach Kyle Snyder approached Stanek last season about starting games after Rays closer Sergio Romo started the fad in May, the rookie right-hander embraced it.

"It's definitely weird," Stanek said. "I was just going out there, pitching as I was told, trying to establish myself as a

big-league ballplayer. I'm not going to say it's not cool. It's pretty cool. I've always been a quirky kind of guy. This fits kind of me being kind of weird."

Snell throws in minor league game, works on changeup

As Cy Young Award winner throws on back fields, Tampa Bay defeats Pittsburgh 3-2

Rays pitcher Blake Snell admitted he came into spring ball just a bit too energized.

But a lot has happened in his few weeks in Port Charlotte.

Nuggets beat Knicks for 6th straight

Jokic and Murray combined for 39 points, as Denver tied Golden State for first

NEW YORK (AP) — Nikola Jokic had 21 points and 17 rebounds, Jamal Murray scored 18 points, and the Denver Nuggets beat the New York Knicks 111-93 on Friday night for their sixth straight victory.

Gary Harris chipped in 14 points for Denver, which moved into a tie with defending champion Golden State for first place in the Western Conference with 11 games remaining for each team.

Will Barton scored 10 of his 12 in the opening quarter as the Nuggets jumped out to a 37-18 lead.

the order. He made 59 appearances in 2018, but only 30 in relief. He pitched only 66.1 innings but made 29 starts. His first-inning ERA was 2.22. Stanek became the first pitcher with at least 25 starts and 25 relief appearances in a season since household name Hugh Mulcahy did it for the Phillies in 1937. Those were the days.

"I feel like it gained me more infamy on Twitter," Stanek said. "Just a lot of people saying, 'Oh, this is stupid.'"

The New York Times labeled the 6-foot-4 Stanek as "an athlete who changed his sport," along with a few others, including Kansas City Chiefs quarterback and NFL MVP Patrick Mahomes.

"That's crazy company," Stanek said.

He added, "I didn't really have any honest idea what to think of it at first. Okay, we're going to try this and see how

it goes. By the end of the year, we'd done it 50 times and won a bunch of games that way. This is a legitimate thing."

Stanek's longest "start" lasted two innings but taught him a lesson. The 27-year-old began his career as a starter after being selected in the first round of the 2013 draft, but assumed his starting days were over when he moved to the bullpen in Double-A ball.

He held starter's dreams most of his life, to be a Verlander, a Scherzer.

"That's what I wanted to do, be the guy," Stanek said.

"I know I'm not getting the W. I go in thinking the only thing I can get is the L. So, don't get the damn L. At least it's not weird anymore. If you have success doing whatever you do, is that really a bad thing? That's my attitude. If you're doing well, why does it matter?"

"It's funny more than anything," Stanek said. "I just roll with it."

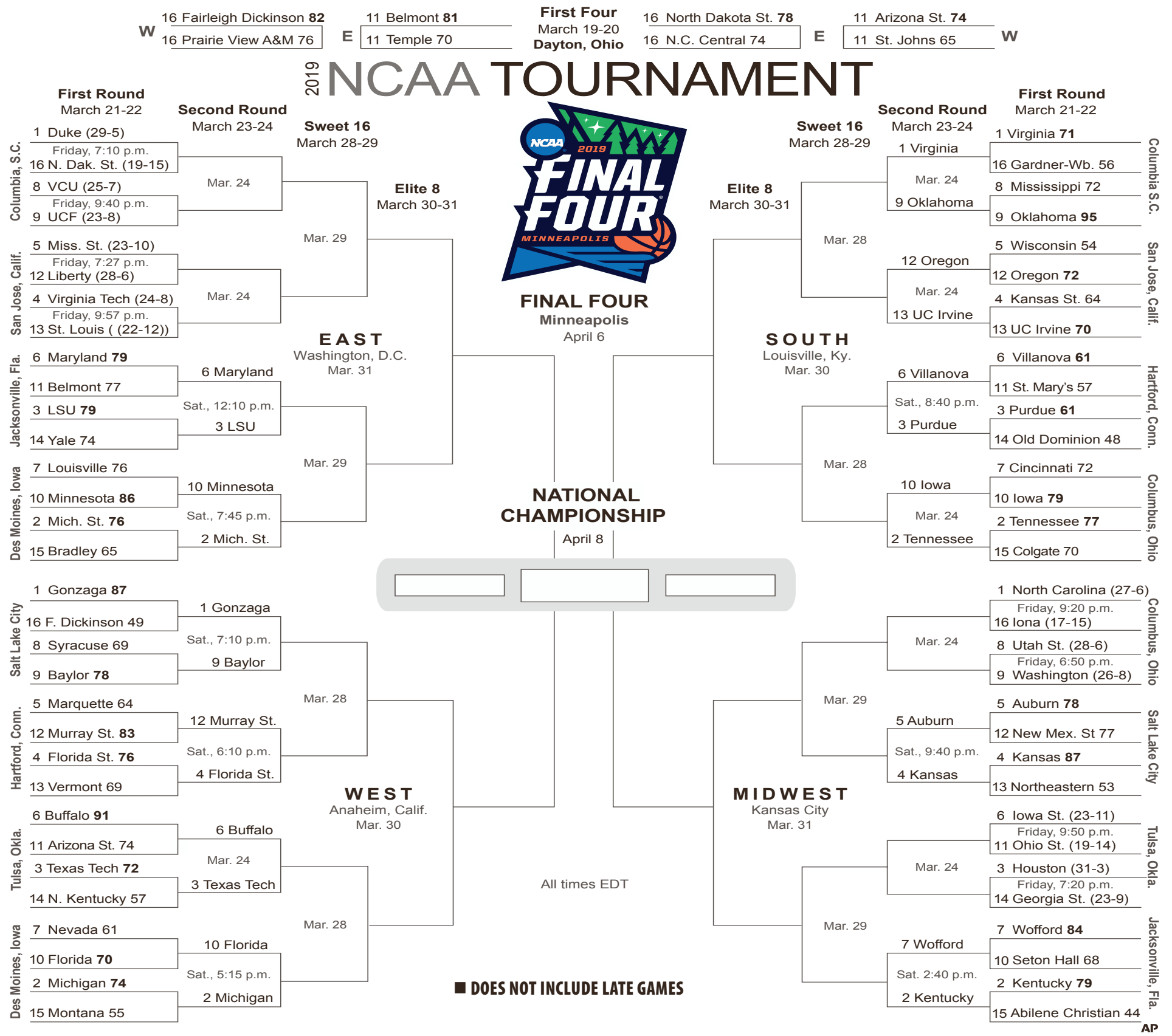

The game was tied early in the second half when the Ducks used their athleticism to take over. Wooten scored on back-to-back dunks and White followed with a 3-pointer as the

shot clock expired to make it 42-35.

White then blocked a shot by Happ on one end and converted on an impressive alley-ooop slap from Pritchard on the other to make it 46-37 with 12:31 to play.

The Badgers tried to cut into that deficit but King made a 3-pointer and two free throws to build the lead to 10 points with less than five minutes to play. Wooten then put the exclamation point on the victory with two blocks on one trip before Pritchard's layup made it 59-47 and the rout was on.

Wisconsin coach Greg Gard lamented a poor seven-minute stretch for the Badgers but was proud of his squad for making the tournament a year after the Badgers missed the field.

No. 12 Liberty 80, No. 5 Mississippi St 76

Caleb Homesley scored 22 of his 30 points in the second half and Lovell Cabbil hit a go-ahead 3-pointer with 1:16 to play to send 12th-seeded Liberty to its first NCAA Tournament win in school history, 80-76 over fifth-seeded Mississippi State on Friday night.

The Flames (29-6) were making their fourth tournament trip in school history, but lost twice as a No. 16 seed and once in the play-in game. This year's team had more respect, a higher seeding and capitalized on the opportunity.

Homesley helped rally Liberty from a 10-point deficit in the second half by scoring 14 points in a span of less than five minutes. Cabbil then hit from long range to make it 72-70 and celebrated with an enthusiastic fan section that made the cross-country trip from Virginia for the game.

Liberty did the rest at the foul line to spoil the first tournament trip for Mississippi State (23-11) in a decade.

The Flames advanced to the second round of the East Region to play the winner of the game between Saint Louis and Virginia Tech.

Quinnndary Weatherspoon

No. 1 Duke 85, No. 16 North Dakota State 62

North Dakota State hung around with No. 1 Duke for 20 minutes.

Zion Williamson decided it was time for the Blue Devils to separate from there.

Williamson scored 13 of his 25 points over the first six minutes after halftime as Duke turned a four-point game into a rout on the way to an 85-62 NCAA tournament first-round win at Colonial Life Arena.

Duke (30-5), the tournament's No. 1 overall seed, advanced to Sunday's East Region second round to play either Central Florida or Virginia Commonwealth.

After topping out at 29 wins each of the last two years while failing to make the Final Four, the Blue Devils reached 30 wins for the first time since their 2015 national championship year.

Achieving that 30th win this year was a little tougher than expected as 16th-seeded North Dakota State (19-16) led by seven points in the game's early minutes before Duke led 31-27 at halftime.

But after shooting just 42.9 percent in the first half, the Blue Devils ran away from the Bison with a 16-3 to start the second half.

Williamson spearheaded the charge.

The 6-7 freshman took a pass in the lane to score Duke's first points of the half. He missed the free throw short, but grabbed the rebound and slammed home two points.

After a Cam Reddish 3-pointer for Duke, Williamson knocked a pass away into the backcourt. He outran Bison point guard Vinnie Shahid to secure the ball, then used a behind-the-back dribble to get to the basket for a layup, giving Duke a 40-27 lead with 17:56 to play.

He scored inside at 16:18 before drilling a 3-pointer with 15 minutes left, putting Duke up 50-32.

Williamson's slam dunk pushed Duke's lead to 20 points before RJ Barrett's two-handed

reverse slam dunk on a break-away with 13:33 left gave Duke a 54-32 lead.

Williamson's last basket of the game at 11:33 to play gave Duke a 63-37 lead. Duke coach Mike Krzyzewski kept him on the bench for the final 9:15 of the game.

Barrett scored 26 points with 14 rebounds for Duke. A third Duke freshman starter, Reddish, added 12 points.

The Bison made 45 percent (9 of 20) of their 3-pointers while beating N.C. Central, 78-74, Wednesday night in a First Four game to advance to meet Duke. But North Dakota State struggled from the field against the Blue Devils.

The Bison shot 36.2 percent overall, making just 8 of 29 3-pointers (28 percent). Shahid lead the Bison with 20 points while Jordan Horn added 11.

Duke started sluggishly on offense, missing eight of its first 10 shots. That included misfiring on five of six 3-pointers.

No. 1 Virginia 71, No. 16 Gardner-Webb 56

A year after becoming the first team to be stunned in a 1 vs. 16 matchup in the first round of the NCAA Tournament, Virginia gathered itself and beat the Runnin' Bulldogs 71-56 in the South Region opener Friday.

Down six at halftime with the unthinkable prospect of looming, Virginia's coaches took a measured approach.

"Don't you dare leave anything in this locker room," Virginia coach Tony Bennett said he told his players. "But you don't panic."

Against Gardner-Webb, the Cavaliers (30-3) saved their season and the stain of forever being tagged as a team that roars through the regular season only to fail spectacularly in tournament time.

DJ Laster's short jumper put Gardner-Webb up 30-16 with 6:42 left in the first half and the crowd, dying to see history repeated, roared its support for the underdogs. The Cavaliers committed eight turnovers, one below their average for an entire game, and open shots simply were not falling.

But Kyle Guy sank a 3-pointer and Virginia's defense clamped down to cut the Runnin' Bulldogs lead to 36-30 at the break.

The Cavaliers opened the second half with a 25-5 run and their trademark stifling defense forced 11 Gardner-Webb turnovers in the first 12 minutes after the break.

De'Andre Hunter, who missed last year's upset after breaking his wrist in the Atlantic Coast Conference Tournament, led the Cavaliers with 23 points.

Mamadi Diakite added 17 points on 8 of 10 shooting and nine rebounds.

Jose Perez scored 19 points — he was 4 of 6 from behind the arc — for Gardner-Webb, which was playing in its first NCAA

Tournament. David Efanayi added 12 points and for at least one half of basketball, Gardner-Webb (23-12) felt unstoppable.

No. 2 Tennessee 77, No. 15 Colgate 70

Admiral Schofield had 19 points and No. 2 seed Tennessee held off a second-half rally by No. 15 seed Colgate in the opening round.

Jordan Bone added 16 and Jordan Bowden 14 for Tennessee (30-5).

The Raiders (24-11) erased most of Tennessee's 42-30 halftime lead with an 11-2 run, tied the score midway through the second half, and kept the game close after that.

Schofield hit back-to-back 3-pointers to give Tennessee a cushion with 45 seconds left.

Jordan Burns had 32 points for Colgate, which played much of the game without leading scorer Rapolas Ivanauskas because of eye problems.

No. 3 Houston, No. 14 Georgia St 55

Corey Davis scored 26 points to help the third-seeded Cougars beat Georgia State 84-55 in the Midwest Region on Friday night.

After reaching the national final in 1984, Houston went more than three decades without winning an NCAA Tournament game. Now, the Cougars have tourney wins in back-to-back seasons and are starting to resemble the program that has five Final Four appearances and produced stars including Elvin Hayes, Clyde Drexler and Hakeem Olajuwon.

Fabian White had 14 points and 11 rebounds and Brearon Brady added 13 for Houston (32-3), which will face either Iowa State or Ohio State on Sunday.

D'Marcus Simonds scored 18 points for No. 14 seed Georgia State (24-10), which received an automatic bid as the Sun Belt Conference Tournament champion.

No. 6 Buffalo 91, No. 11 Arizona St 74

Jeremy Harris and Nick Perkins each scored 21 points and had 10 rebounds to help lead No. 6 seed Buffalo past No. 11 Arizona State in the West Region.

CJ Massinburg had 18 points and six rebounds for Buffalo (32-3), which won its 13th straight game.

Zylan Cheatham scored 22 points and had eight rebounds before fouling out with 2:06 remaining for Arizona State (23-11). Romello White and Luguentz Dort each added 12 points.

Arizona State trailed 44-31 at halftime and pulled within nine early in the second half before Buffalo's 7-0 run pushed its lead to 16 with 16:13 remaining. The Bulls' advantage never fell below 14 the rest of the way.

Kamau Stokes led Kansas State with 18 points.

No. 3 Texas Tech 72, No. 14 N. Kentucky 57

Jarrett Culver had 29 points, eight rebounds and seven assists to help No. 3 seed Texas Tech shake off a slow start against No. 14 seed Northern Kentucky in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

Tariq Owens scored 12 points and Davide Moretti had 10 for Texas Tech (27-6).

Northern Kentucky (26-9) got 23 points from Tyler Sharpe and 11 from Dantez Walton while giving the Red Raiders everything they could handle in the West Region.

No. 9 Oklahoma 95, No. 8 Mississippi 72

Rashard Odomes and Christian James scored 20 points apiece, Kristian Doolittle had 19 points and matched a career-high with 15 rebounds and No. 9 seed Oklahoma blitzed Mississippi with a season high in points in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

The Sooners (20-13) scored on eight of their first nine possessions for a 12-0 lead and led by 17 at halftime.

The Rebels (20-13) had looked like a tired team for more than a month, and eight days off didn't appear to help. Terrence Davis led Ole Miss with 17 points.

No. 10 IOWA 79, No. 7 CINCINNATI 72

Luka Garza scored 20 points, Jordan Bohannon made a three-point play during Iowa's closing surge as the 10th-seeded Hawkeyes rallied past No. 7 seed Cincinnati in the first round.

The Hawkeyes (23-11) got their first NCAA Tournament win in four years despite what amounted to a home crowd for the Bearcats, who couldn't overcome a subpar game by Jarron Cumberland. He was 3 of 9 from beyond the arc and finished with 18 points.

Point guard Justin Jenifer scored a career-high 19 points for Cincinnati (28-7), which hasn't made it past the opening weekend for seven straight years.

No. 9 Washington 78, No. 8 Utah State 61

Noah Dickerson had 20 points and 12 rebounds, and ninth-seeded Washington made a successful return to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in eight years.

Eighth-seeded Utah State (28-7) had won 10 in a row and 17 of 18 while taking the Mountain West title. The Aggies got the highest seed in school history and were trying to end their own long NCAA Tournament drought — they haven't won since 2002.

Washington (27-8) got 19 points from Jaylen Nowell.

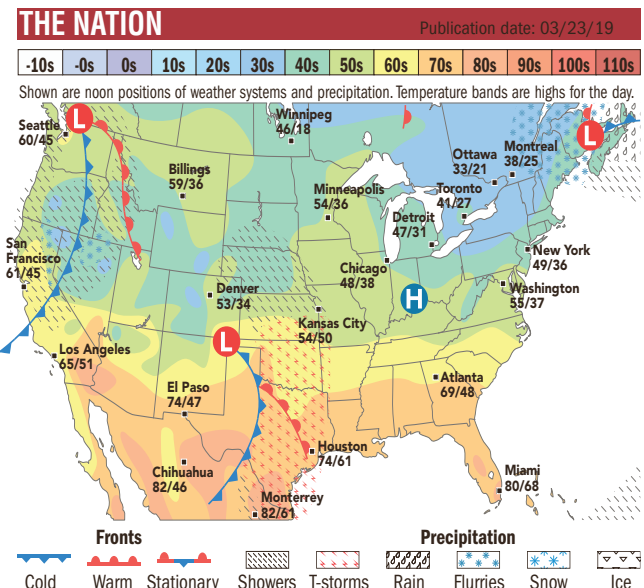

Casey shares early lead in title defense at Innisbrook

PALM HARBOR — Paul Casey drove into Innisbrook and saw his picture on posters and programs, just what he needed to forget the cut he missed last week.

He played Friday as though he wants those photos to stay. Casey holed a 30-foot eagle putt on the 599-yard fifth hole and made short birdie putts on the other three par 5s on his way to a 5-under 66, giving him a share of the lead with Austin Cook in the Valspar Championship.

No one has ever won back-to-back at the Valspar Championship since it became a PGA Tour event in 2000.

"I've never defended a professional event. I would love to do that," Casey said. "Mentally last year I was hoping I would

win, wanting to win. This year, knowing that I have won around here, I have a slightly different approach to it, and I played today quite aggressively and tried to take advantage of the golf course that I knew was going to get very, very tough this afternoon."

Casey and Cook, who shot a 67, were at 6-under 136.

Luke Donald holed a bunker shot for birdie on the par-5 fifth to take the lead, only to miss a 4-foot par putt on the next hole and drop another shot on the par-3 eighth. He shot 70 and was one behind, along with Scott Stallings (68) and Sungjae Im (67).

Dustin Johnson overcame a rough patch early in his round with five birdies on the front nine to salvage a 69. Johnson, the No. 1 player in the world, was two shots behind on a course he hasn't seen in nine

years.

Also at 4-under 138 was Curtis Luck, the former U.S. Amateur champion and last man in the field when Kevin Na withdrew 30 minutes before his tee time.

Luck had never seen Innisbrook until his opening tee shot.

"It does show you what a good job they do with the yardage books," Luck said.

Among those very much in the mix is Jon Rahm, three shots behind, who is making his Innisbrook debut.

Casey last year ended eight years without winning on the PGA Tour when he closed with a 65 and had to wait to see if Tiger Woods and Patrick Reed could catch him. It was the centerpiece of a resurgence for Casey, a 41-year-old from England who is back among the top 15 in the world.

BMW's warning

BMW, usually a standout performer with fat profit margins, saw its stock dip after it said its earnings before tax this year would be "well below" last year's. The reasons: high investment on new technology, unfavorable exchange rate shifts, higher raw materials, tougher emissions standards, and uncertainty in U.S.-China and U.S.-EU trade relations.

Compare that to the outlooks of its German competitors. Daimler, maker of Mercedes-Benz cars, says it expects a "slight increase" in earnings "despite high volume of expenditure to safeguard our future." Volkswagen left its



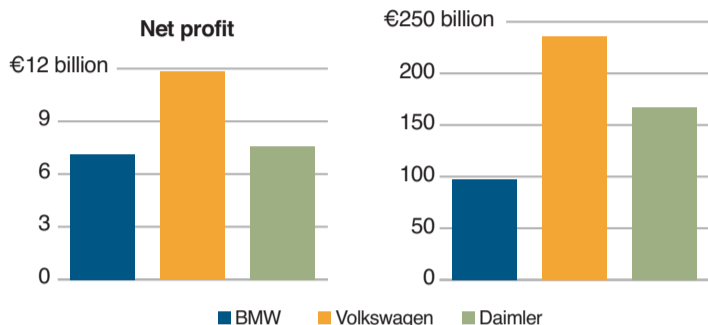
guidance unchanged for 6.5 to 7.5 percent operating margins, after achieving 7.3 percent in 2018.

Is BMW the canary in the coal mine for auto industry trouble ahead?

Analyst Max Warburton at research firm Bernstein says, "BMW has lost some of its stand-out, industry

leading characteristics in recent years but it is still arguably the strongest, highest quality company in the sector. So this warning...will inevitably increase worries about weaker names in the sector." The weaker outlook might be beatable but for now BMW just added to the narrative: The auto industry is under ever greater pressure.

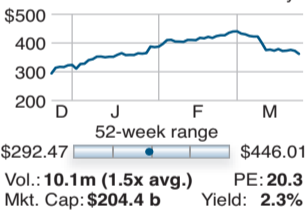

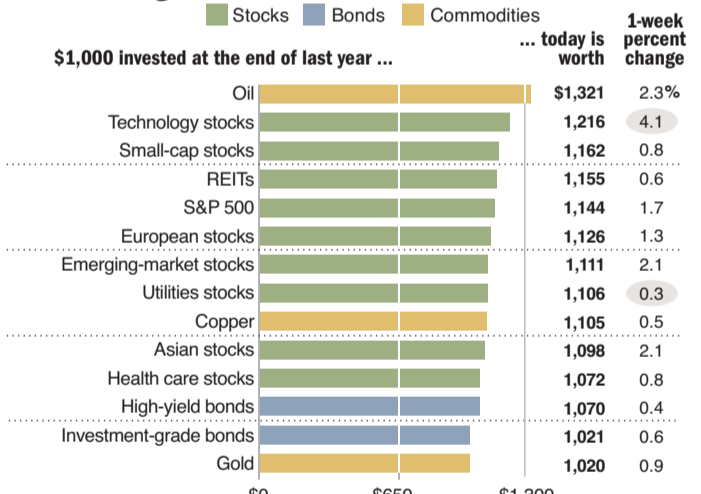

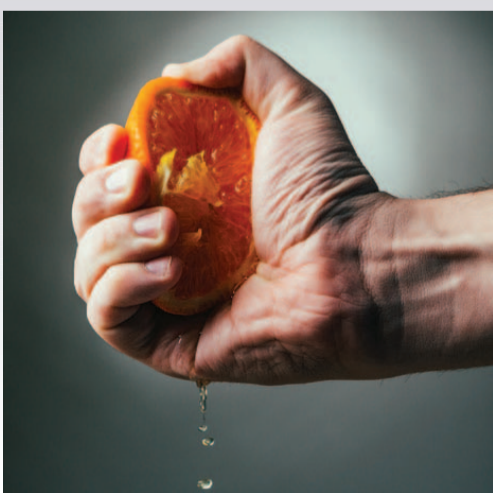
What's left to squeeze?

Companies are wringing ever-more profit from every sale, setting a record high last year. How much more can they squeeze?

Across the S&P 500 index, companies are

holding onto nearly \$11 in profit from every \$100 in sales they make. They've done that thanks to technological improvements that help them produce more with fewer workers, which has restrained payrolls. Last year's tax cut also helped, adding more than \$1 in additional profit on every \$100 in sales.

Now margins are so high that some question

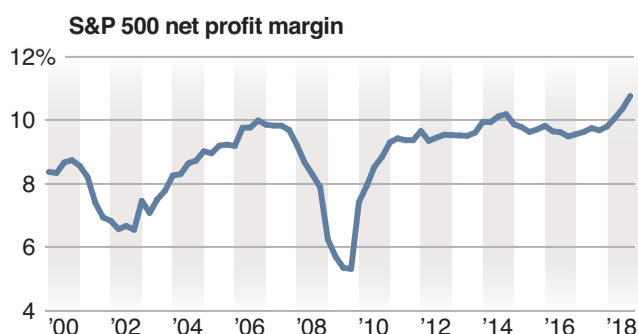


whether they're sustainable. U.S. workers' wages rose 3.4 percent in February, the fastest since 2009. Such wage growth could erode profit margins and spark inflation across the economy.

The price of crude oil is also rising, up more than \$10 per barrel since the start of the year.

Analysts forecast shrinking profit margins this year. That could deliver a double-whammy for companies, which are already facing a possibly slowing global economy.

That's one reason strategists at Goldman Sachs suggest focusing on companies with high and stable margins, such as AutoZone and Nike.

'What We Do in the Shadows' brings more vampires to TV

Vampires have meant big business on television.

Reaching back to "Dark Shadows" and progressing through "The Vampire Diaries" and "True Blood," dwellers of the night have put their bite on popular shows. Now hoping for a similar effect is "What We Do in the Shadows," FX's take on a 2014 New Zealand "mockumentary" that premieres Wednesday, March 27. Jemaine Clement and Taika Waititi, the writers, directors and stars of the original

movie, remain involved as executive producers and also in other ways: Clement ("Flight of the Conchords") wrote the series pilot, which Waititi ("Thor: Ragnarok") directed.

The saga sees a film crew follow several longtime – as in hundreds of years – roommates in Staten Island, N.Y., where the vampires have individual aims while pursuing their shared mission of conquering the world. Kayvan Novak, Matt Berry, Nastasia Demetriou and Harvey Guillen play

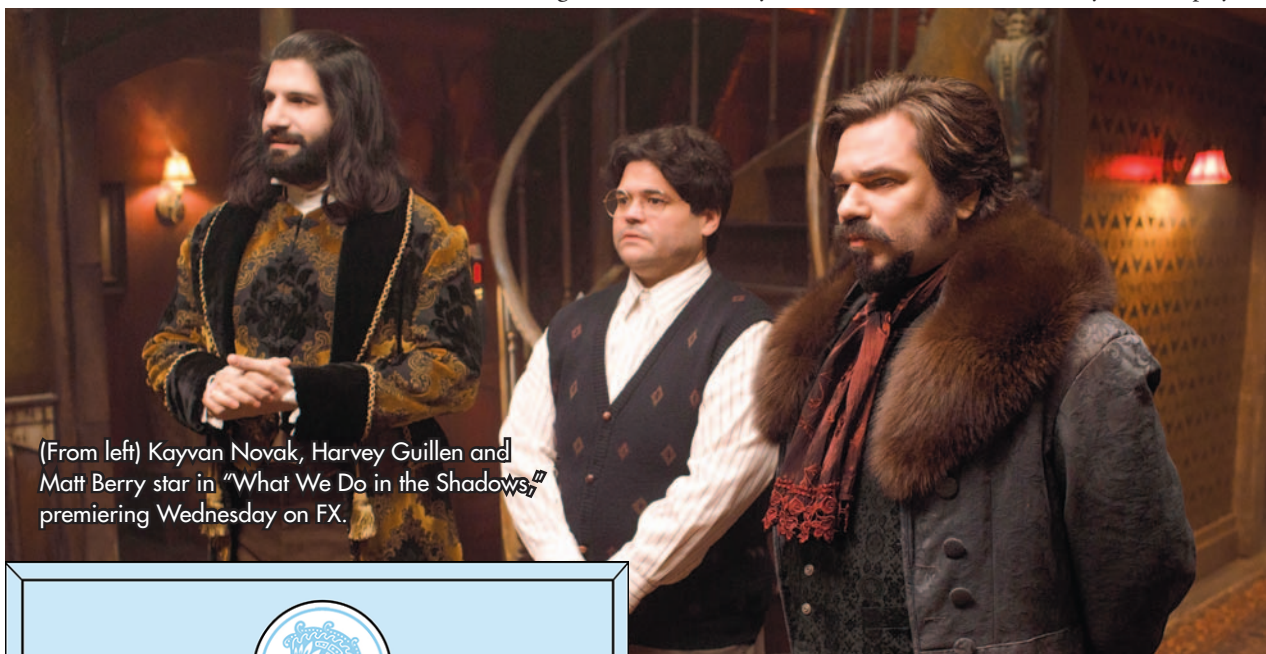
the horror-comedy's central quartet, with Mark Proksch and Beanie Feldstein also among cast regulars.

Describing the show's approach in discussing other creatures present in it, Clement says, "There are some werewolves in the series. They're not New Zealand werewolves. They're American, so they swear a bit more. They're East Coast and New York werewolves." Clement adds that the supernatural characters are affected by situations "that are happening in the moment, as well as stuff that happened 200 years ago that is informing how they react to the world now."

After experiencing what it's like to make a Hollywood blockbuster, Waititi muses, "What happened to my career? It was really comfortable going back to ('Shadows') because we'd spent so long doing the film. And we edited the film for about 14 months, so we lived in that world for what seemed like an eternity. Going back on the set felt very natural; we're used to that style of working." However, Waititi allows that now "with ten episodes, we have full character development and a lot more."

As much as the style of "What We Do in the Shadows" is well-planned, there's room for the unexpected when the cameras are rolling. "There's some improvisation going on," co-star Proksch confirms. "We may be in a scene, and Kayvan will come up with something on the moment that we don't know that he's going to say, and it will be really funny. That will always crack us up, so there's a lot of that type of situation."

Feldstein notes, "My character doesn't really know these people, so she's really taking it in – and I was taking it in. As Beanie, I was like, 'These are the funniest people I've ever seen in my life.' And then as my character, I had to keep a straight face, which was very hard."

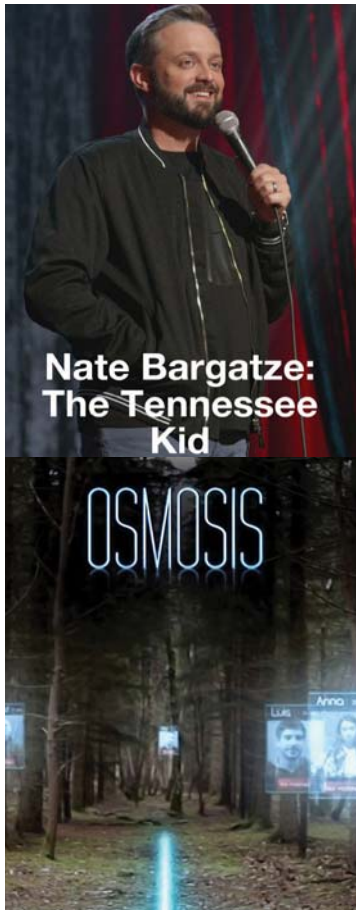

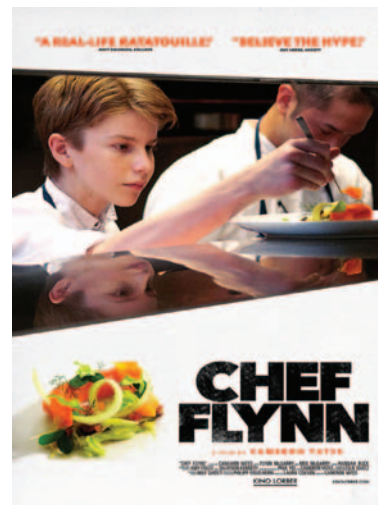


“Cardinal”

BEST GEORGE SEGAL MOVIES



“Who’s Afraid of Virginia Woolf?” (1966) Including Segal, every star of Mike Nichols’ film of the Edward Albee play was Oscar-nominated, with Elizabeth Taylor and Sandy Dennis eventually winning.

“No Way to Treat a Lady” (1968) This stylish melodrama casts Segal as a detective on the trail of a serial killer (Rod Steiger).

“Where’s Poppa?” (1970) Director Carl Reiner’s famously offbeat comedy stars Segal as a lawyer who wants his meddling mother (Ruth Gordon) out of the way.

“The Hot Rock” (1972) Segal, Robert Redford and others go all over New York as not-so-organized thieves who continually grab, then lose, a valuable diamond.

“A Touch of Class” (1973) Glenda Jackson win an Oscar for it, but an amusing, charming Segal is just as much a factor in the success of this sophisticated comedy about the

affair of an American family man and a British divorcee.

“Blume in Love” (1973) Segal is marvelous in Paul Mazursky’s comedy-drama as a divorce lawyer trying to win back his ex-wife (Susan Anspach).

“The Terminal Man” (1974) A grim Segal stars in Michael Crichton’s story of a scientist whose seizure-controlling brain implants may start new trouble for him.

“California Split” (1974) Director Robert Altman’s film casts Segal and Elliott Gould as gamblers who take different approaches to playing their hands.

“The Duchess and the Dirtwater Fox” (1976) Segal goes gambling again in this Western-comedy that gives him a great partner in Goldie Hawn.

“Fun With Dick and Jane” (1977) Segal and Jane Fonda have fun, indeed, as a suddenly employed aerospace engineer and

his wife who turn to robbery to maintain their lifestyle.

“Rollercoaster” (1977) Though the plot of this suspense is basic extortionist-threatens-amusement-parks stuff, Segal gives an edgy performance within it as a safety inspector playing a cat-and-mouse game with the sly felon (Timothy Bottoms).

“Who Is Killing the Great Chefs of Europe?” (1978) A fast-food magnate (Segal) and his pastry-making ex-wife (Jacqueline Bisset) reunite to determine ... well, check the title again.

“Carbon Copy” (1981) In an early starring role, Denzel Washington plays Segal’s previously unknown son – you read that right – in this comedy.

“Stick” (1985) Segal plays it to the hilt as a high-living tycoon who enlists an ex-convict (Burt Reynolds, also the director here) to be his security man.

What was it about your role of Talus that made you want to do "Knightfall"?


Well, I first was given sample episodes to watch of "Knightfall" when they asked me to be a part of it. I had no real intention of doing anything like that, but I got hooked immediately, and it was riveting. I mean, it transports you into this whole other world, and it's so relatable. I mean, it's seen through Landry's eyes. And I just thought, "I've never been offered anything like this before." I mean, I'd never done a character quite like this before, a religious zealot, a man of deep convictions and, yet, such a paradox. I mean, I remember thinking (as) he's lecturing the troops and he says, "Once you become a Templar knight you shall become God's executioners." How could there be such a thing? I thought, "Thou shalt not kill."

But that's the thing, I was flattered that they would think of me for such a diverse character part, and I thought, "Oh, I have to do this. I really do have to do this." And so, to be part of a largely British cast and in a period drama like this, which I'd never done before ... that's what I look for, challenges to try not to repeat yourself, and this was certainly a challenge.


Did the resemblance between the Knights Templar and the Jedi create any hesitancy for you?



I didn't really think it through. But the truth of the matter is that I'm sure ... George Lucas came from so many different inspirations of his own, both from the movies and literature. He was probably thinking more of King Arthur and the Knights of the Roundtable because it was more idealized and glamorous, certainly, than the Templar Knights, but there's no question that his inspiration was rooted, partially, in this mythology.

Wild child leads chase across Europe in Amazon's 'Hanna'

Hanna is a young woman who's been on the run her entire life.

As played by Esme Creed-Miles ("Dark River") in the Amazon actioner "Hanna," which begins streaming Friday, March 29, she's a 15-year-old raised in total seclusion in the remote Eastern European woods by her mercenary father, Erik Heller (Joel Kinnaman, "The Killing"), and trained to fight those who hunt them.

Her survivalist skills come to the fore when she and Dad are discovered by rogue CIA operative Marissa Wiegler (Mireille Enos, "The Catch") and her team of agents. Separated, Hanna must embark on a treacherous trek across Europe to reunite with her father, take down those who target them and ultimately crack an ever-deepening conspiracy that threatens them both. All the while navigating the perils of adolescence as someone accustomed to the cruelty of nature but not of society.

"It highlights the kind of humanness in all of us and the animal in all of us ..." Creed-Miles explained to a recent gathering of journalists in Pasadena, Calif. "And further to that point, she's grown up completely absolved of modern

convention and of the male gaze. So, she has a very interesting take on gender and love and sex, and all of this stuff that you then see how that unfolds and influences her relationships with other people in the modern world. So, as a young woman myself, it was a fantastic opportunity for 12, 13 hours of the day to be as raw as I could possibly be without any of that kind of internalized misogyny that I feel I have to unpack all the time."

The series is based on the 2011 feature film from director Joe Wright that starred, among others, Cate Blanchett as a sinister, darkly humorous Marissa, a portrayal Enos said she purposely avoided.

"This version of the story isn't a fairytale and I'm not the wicked witch," Enos says. "I'm a fully dimensional person who has done terrible things in my past and then has worked meticulously to hide those things and has built a lovely life for myself. And when Hanna comes out of the forest, she threatens to like blow the lid off of that. So, my Marissa is an intelligent, capable woman who's trying to quell something that could devastate her life. And of course, my hope is that everyone will feel very sorry for me."

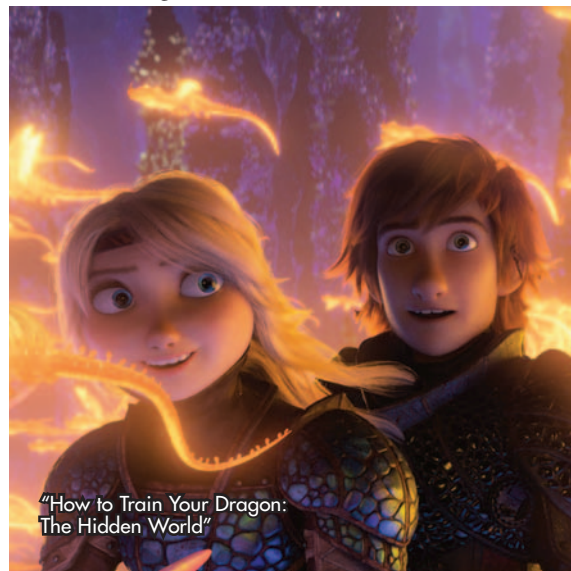

Third round shows 'How to Train Your Dragon' one more time

There certainly has been no shortage of animated movies in recent years, but the "How to Train Your Dragon" series has carved a special place for itself – not only because of its unique theme, but because of characters and an animation style that are easy to embrace.

"How to Train Your Dragon: The Hidden World" wraps up the trilogy by hitting a number of emotional high points and sending out the franchise in a satisfying way that, continuing the "Dragon" tradition, should appeal to viewers of all ages. Jay Baruchel is back as the voice of the Viking named Hiccup, whose friendship with the dragon Toothless remains strong.

Though Toothless is thought to be the last of his kind, a female dragon proves that wrong – and both are eventually imperiled by a villain voiced by Oscar winner F. Murray Abraham. Cate Blanchett, Gerard Butler, America Ferrera, Jonah Hill, Kit Harington ("Game of Thrones") and Craig Ferguson are among other returnees in the voice cast.

The story of a boy and his dragon captured audiences' imagination and affection right from the start, but it's to the credit of the DreamWorks-based animators that they have invested the series with unique visuals setting it apart from all the other animated product that's been out there. And there surely has been a lot of it, principally from such other studios as Disney (of course) and Universal (which, somewhat ironically, now distributes the DreamWorks fare).

Also significant is the way in which the voices have been chosen. Baruchel has an eternally youthful sound, but he wisely has moderated that over the trilogy as Hiccup has become more self-assured. Butler and Ferguson have been welcome from the start for the atmosphere-appropriate sound their accents provide, and "Amadeus" Oscar winner (and Shakespeare veteran) Abraham is a commendable addition to the third round for the aurally imposing quality he gives the story's chief bad guy.

If "How to Train Your Dragon: The Hidden World" fares well enough, it's possible that there could be future editions – after all, Hollywood never says "never" to success, especially at the box office – but at least for now, the fine finale reaffirms that the makers of the series took all their training to heart.

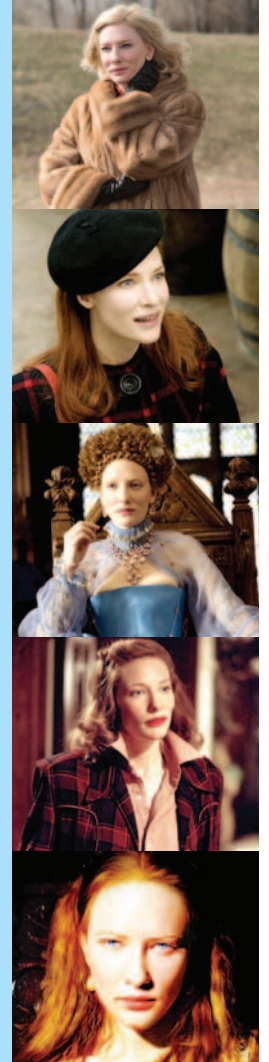

All rise, Aaron Judge is healthy again



In 2018, the New York Yankees set a single-season record for home runs by a team by going deep 267 times.

Now, Bronx Bomber Aaron Judge and his outfield mate Brett Gardner say they can do it again. And there's no reason to believe they can't.

Judge, for one, will be leading the assault. After hitting 52 dingers in his rookie campaign of 2017, the 26-year-old Californian was supposed to team with new cohort Giancarlo Stanton in '18 to form a fearsome 1-2 punch that some thought could produce triple-digit homers between them. But a broken wrist suffered when he was hit by a pitch in late July caused Judge to miss two months, thus limiting him to 27 homers in 112 games.

Now healthy again, the man nicknamed "All Rise" is feeling good about himself and his team. The Yanks had 12 players in double figures in home runs last year and Judge, Stanton (38), infielders Gleyber Torres (24), Didi Gregorius (27) and Miguel Andujar (27) and outfielder Aaron Hicks (27) all topped 20. Given that lineup (minus Gregorius, who will start the season on the disabled list), Judge figures to get a lot of good pitches to hit, and with him playing half his games in the bandbox of Yankee Stadium, just about anything is possible. Some have mentioned MVP and even team captaincy in his near future.

One who expects big things is the man known as "Mr. October," who patrolled Judge's position of right field in the Bronx 40 years ago.

"His competition, for me, is in the monuments," Hall-of-Famer Reggie Jackson has said. "... If you look at some of the things he has done, he compares to (Babe) Ruth and (Lou) Gehrig. He's put up crazy numbers."

Judge and the Yankees can be seen in action Thursday, March 28, when they open their 2019 regular season at Camden Yards against the Baltimore Orioles in a game airing on ESPN.

MATT LEBLANC



Matthew Steven LeBlanc was born to an office manager and a mechanic on July 25, 1967, in Newton, Mass. Louis C.K. was one of his high-school classmates.

After graduation, LeBlanc moved to New York with the aim of pursuing a modeling career, but he soon found himself in front of television cameras – first in a ketchup commercial, then on “Married ... With Children,” which yielded two spinoff series for his recurring character Vinnie (“Top of the Heap,” “Vinnie and Bobby”). He also appeared in music videos by such artists as Jon Bon Jovi, Alanis Morissette, Bob Seger and Tom Petty and the Heartbreakers.

In 1994, LeBlanc landed the role of dim but lovable aspiring actor Joey Tribbiani on the hugely popular sitcom “Friends” and stayed with that series for its entire 10-year run – coining such catchphrases as, “How YOU doin’?”

Parlaying his success in “Friends” into work in such films as “Ed,” “Lost in Space” and the two “Charlie’s Angels” movies, LeBlanc continued to play his series role in the spinoff “Joey” for two more seasons.

After taking five years away from television, LeBlanc eventually returned to it in the Showtime-BBC co-production “Episodes,” playing a fictionalized take on himself in the show that ran for five seasons; it earned him a Golden Globe Award and four Emmy nominations. A guest on BBC’s “Top Gear” for a couple of episodes, LeBlanc became a host of it for three seasons, but relinquished that role to spend more time with family and friends.

During his involvements with both “Episodes” and “Top Gear,” LeBlanc also began the CBS comedy “Man With a Plan,” which now is in its third season. He has a daughter by his ex-wife, and he also had two stepchildren from his former spouse’s first marriage.

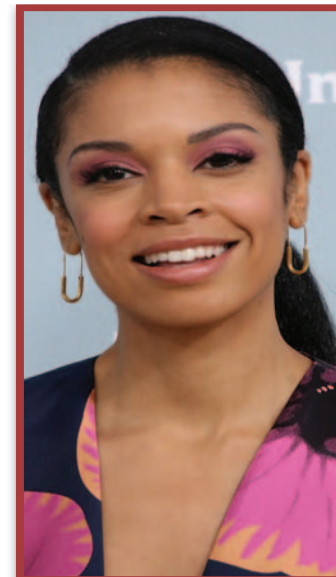

‘Great Performances’ offers an all-female ‘Julius Caesar’

As many times as “Julius Caesar” has been staged, it’s never been done quite the way “Great Performances” is presenting it.

Shakespeare’s classic gets an all-female cast and a very sparse set in the version by London’s Donmar Warehouse that airs Friday, March 29, on PBS (check local listings). Directed by Phyllida Lloyd (“Mamma Mia!”) and airing in conjunction with Women’s History Month, the production relocates the play to a women’s prison where the characters are inmates and guards.

The story basics remain familiar, though, as Brutus (played by “Mary Stuart” Tony Award nominee Dame Harriet Walter) grapples with whether to betray Caesar (Jackie Clunes) in the most pronounced way. Jade Anouka also is prominent as Mark Antony.

“I’d been in so many Shakespeare productions where the small-part players were kind of disgruntled because they’re kind of boring, those parts,” Walter says. “But if you’ve got women being allowed to do this stuff that they never get their hands on, the atmosphere was exciting all the time. It sounds like a bit idealistic, but it was true that everyone felt so grateful to be involved and to be allowed to do this stuff, it was like a great novelty.”

With her Royal Shakespeare Company background, Walter is keenly aware of potential differences in recording a play for later television presentation. “It’s very difficult for actors,” she reasons, “because their duty is to act to the people who have paid the money and are sitting there. We’ve got to give them what they’ve paid for. But at the same time, it can look very exaggerated on screen when you have close-ups.

“This way, I liked it, because you never lost the audience,” adds Walter. “You can see it’s a theatrical performance because you always see the audience, so that wasn’t a problem. And we had to act with big energy, because that’s what the play demands. I wasn’t going to kind of downplay it. You do adjust, but I didn’t play for the cameras. I played for the audience in the room, and luckily, it wasn’t too big a conflict.”
