

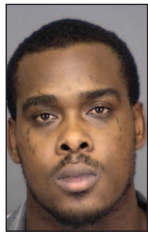
Washington murder case continued

Motion to dismiss denied

SEBRING — A murder trial scheduled for this past week got continued a week to let the defense attorney argue a motion to have the charges dismissed.

Estrada denied the motion, but has continued the next pretrial conference for Freddie Washington, 26, until 8:30 a.m.

this Wednesday.

Washington was to have jury selection last Monday. Before adjourning a pretrial conference on April 3, Estrada asked both the defense and prosecution attorneys if they had any matters to bring before him.

Both said, "No."

However, both sides filed a joint motion for continuance last Tuesday, when a jury would have been seated and the trial set to start.

Peter J. Brewer, of Fletcher & Brewer P.A., filed a motion the next day to dismiss the indictment against Washington, alleging his client did not receive due process under U.S. Constitution Amendments 5 and 14, which protect, respectively, against self-incrimination and against loss of life, liberty, or property without due process.

Brewer alleged that the state failed to preserve material

evidence that was favorable to Washington in a way that would play a significant role in his defense, and cited court precedent to that effect, stating that charges should be dismissed.

Washington, 26, stands charged alongside 30-year-old Daryl Dennard Cason with first-degree murder, robbery with a firearm, aggravated assault with a firearm and

Lawsuit against School Board still pending

SEBRING — An attempt at mediation reached no agreement in the civil negligence lawsuit against The School Board of Highlands County related to the sexual assault allegations against a former Avon Park Middle School teacher.

Morgan & Morgan law firm attorney Adam Kemp filed the lawsuit against the district on behalf of the student who is the alleged victim in the

criminal legal proceedings against former district teacher Kevin Dewberry.

Dewberry is facing criminal charges for lewd and lascivious behavior involving a 13-year-old female student.

The civil complaint, which was filed in the 10th Judicial Circuit, Highlands County, states that during a period of time from Oct. 1, 2017 to Feb. 4, 2018 the student was sexually assaulted by Dewberry on numerous occasions. At the time, Dewberry was employed as an athletic coach and special education teacher for the defendant, The School Board of Highlands County.

The sexual assaults allegedly occurred both on School Board property, specifically at Avon Park Middle School, as well as off-campus locations, the complaint states.

The mediation session on April 3 ended with an "impasse," according to the mediator's report that was filed Tuesday.

The School Board is being represented by attorney Allen Sang of Carman, Beauchamp, Sang & Gonzales, Winter Park.

Sang's response states the minor plaintiff may have been guilty of negligence so any award should be reduced in proportion to the minor's negligence. The defendant (School District) enjoys immunity for any discretionary policy making decisions.

Meanwhile, in the criminal case against Dewberry there has been no activity on the court docket since February, but a pretrial conference before Judge Peter Estrada is scheduled for 8:30 a.m. Wednesday.

There have been six previous scheduled pretrial conferences that were either continued or cancelled.

Dewberry remains in the Highlands County Jail with bond set at \$400,000 on the charges of four counts of lewd/lascivious behavior with a victim between the ages of 12 and 16, and the bond set at \$550,000 on subsequent charges of 55 counts of possession of child pornography.

Politicians and scientists fight red tide

SEBRING — Red tide, the harmful algal blooms, that plagues both the east and west coasts of Florida through the summer and fall may have met its nemesis — Mote Marine Labs and politicians.

Republican Sen. Joe Gruter of Sarasota sponsored the proposed Senate Bill 1522 that would send \$3 million per year to Mote Labs for research to eradicate and mitigate red tide and other harmful algal blooms, or HABs. Republican Senator Ed Hooper of Pinellas and Pasco counties co-introduced the proposed bill.

SB 1522 has marched through the Senate subcommittees and on Tuesday, April 9, received a unanimous vote in the Senate Agriculture, Environmentals and General Government Appropriations Subcommittee. As of Wednesday it is in Appropriations, where the Senate proposed \$6.6 million a year for the HAB research.

The proposal did meet with some resistance. Some lobbyists felt the proposal did not address the human-factor in spreading the HABs. While scientists fight over the percent of blame to place on humans,

farm animals, and the nutrients they regularly dump in water tables, it is a fact that HABs are a naturally occurring phenomenon, according to Mote.

Red tide algae blooms are caused by the organism *Karenia brevis*.

These organisms bloom together and can make it appear the water has turned red. They cause neurotoxicity in fish, manatees, dolphins, birds and even humans. The toxins produce massive fish kills like those seen on

The heavy toll of red tide

SEBRING — Anyone who has ever walked a beach filled with fish kills can imagine the toll red tide and other harmful algal blooms (HABs) takes on the marine life. However, those who live in or do business near affected areas, know there is an impact on human health and economic health.

Last season's red tide blooms were many and vast but not entirely unusual, according to Mote Marine Labs. Some floating around measured 150 feet long. They were stubborn as well.

The blooms, which are normally found in the Gulf of Mexico side of Florida, eventually moved over to the Atlantic

side of the peninsula.

Forecaster Tony Hurt from the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration said Hurricane Michael had a hand in breaking the blooms up after sweeping through the Gulf but they still lingered after that. Hurt said the HABs will probably pop up again in May or June but it was too early for any official forecasts.

Mote Marine Labs is a premier red tide researcher. If a proposed bill is approved, the labs will receive millions to mitigate damage and eradicate HABs. There are untold tons of dead fish, sea creatures, and birds that were cleaned

up on the shores of beaches last summer. Volunteers came from all over and some people were sent by temporary work agencies to pitch in and clean up carcasses from the affected areas.

From Jan. 1, 2018, to Dec. 31, 2018, Mote reported 169 manatees confirmed dead with another 55 suspected dead by red tide. So far there has been one suspected manatee death due to red tide in 2019.

Many businesses, especially on the west coast, had to shut down because the neurotoxin produced by the HABs

Toll road plans cruise in Senate

TALLAHASSEE — Plans for three new or expanded toll roads across rural areas of the state continued to roll through the Senate on Thursday, despite critics warning about sprawling development.

With the issue a priority of Senate President Bill Galvano, the Senate Appropriations Committee backed the proposal (SB 7068), which calls for spending \$45 million next year and would lead to establishing task forces to study economic and environmental impacts of each project.

Sen. Tom Lee, a Thonotosassa Republican who is carrying the bill for Galvano, said the intent is to anticipate the future

needs of the state.

"If there are people that think we need to all live in an urban area and ride around on scooters, I can't help them. I mean, that's just not reality," Lee said.

The proposal would extend the Suncoast Parkway from the Tampa Bay area north to the Georgia border, extend the Florida Turnpike west to hook up with the Suncoast Parkway and build a new transportation corridor from Polk County to Collier County.

Galvano, R-Bradenton, has said the roads would help rural communities, address the state's continued rapid growth, provide new hurricane-evacuation options, expand bicycle and pedestrian trails and lay the groundwork for new

water and sewer lines and broadband.

Lee said it's difficult to project costs and potential sprawl until studies are completed and the routes and interchanges are detailed.

"These are areas that are lacking economic development activity, they lack some of the related infrastructure improvements that you see in urban areas for their populations," Lee said "As we look at all of those things, and try to ... look 20 years out into the future, we need to consider whether we should be getting these projects on the map for production to begin construction, if in fact they are feasible."

But critics argued the potential impacts of growth on rural communities should be

addressed before the roads are approved.

David Cullen, a lobbyist with Sierra Club Florida, said the roads will fragment the landscape and negatively impact wildlife habitat and the natural systems residents depend upon.

"Why would a large land owner donate their land?" Cullen said. "Because they can see being able to develop that land. That's why they're willing to give it away. And that's why we think that bringing in roads that not only have transportation, which is the first thing you need for development, it's also going to bring in water and sewer infrastructure, and that is a recipe for sprawl."

Thomas Hawkins, policy and planning

director for 1000 Friends of Florida, which opposes the proposal, said a focus should be on urban areas that already face transportation and safety issues.

"Anybody who has driven I-10 from Jacksonville to Pensacola knows that just having roadway facilities through your jurisdiction, expressways don't bring jobs," Hawkins said. "I would just offer that we'd be much better redirecting our scarce infrastructure dollars towards supporting our existing communities rather than risking our rural and agricultural lands."

Under the proposal, funding would grow from \$45 million next fiscal year to \$90 million in the 2020-2021 fiscal year, about \$135 million the

next year and a recurring amount of \$140 million starting in the 2022-2023 fiscal year.

The task forces would have to complete their work by Oct. 1, 2020 — the date was pushed back from June 1, 2020 in an amendment on Thursday. The proposal calls for construction to begin by the end of 2022 and the roads to open to traffic before Dec. 31, 2030.

The proposal has backing from the Florida Chamber of Commerce, Florida Ports Council, the Florida Trucking Association and the Asphalt Contractors Association of Florida. An identical measure in the House (HB 7113) cleared the Transportation and Tourism Appropriations Subcommittee on March 28.

House takes tough stance on genetic tests

TALLAHASSEE — Amid privacy concerns and dramatic growth in genetic-testing products, the Florida House on Thursday passed a bill that would ban life-insurance and long-term care insurance companies from using genetic testing information in policy decisions.

The House passed the measure (HB 879) by an 88-26 vote amid opposition from the insurance industry.

Bill sponsor Jayer Williamson, R-Pace, said the measure bill would help protect private information of consumers as they apply for life-insurance or long-term care coverage. Applicants are already required to provide health information

when seeking such coverage, but supporters of the bill say genetic testing information should be shielded.

"I think that's the most private of private information," Williamson said during a discussion Wednesday on the House floor.

A federal law prevents health insurers from using genetic information in the underwriting process and in setting premiums. But the prohibition doesn't apply to life insurance or long-term care coverage.

The House bill would ban life insurers and long-term care insurers from requiring or soliciting genetic information; using genetic test results in the absence of diagnoses; or considering people's decisions or actions related to genetic testing.

Curtis Leonard, regional vice president of the American Council of Life Insurers, said his group is "disappointed" with the House bill and called it government regulation that is "unlike any other in the country."

Williamson said he hasn't had lengthy conversations with insurance-industry lobbyists who oppose the bill.

"I have not had a lot of in-depth conversations with the life insurance people on this bill because I haven't had a lot of them knocking down my door to come speak to me about how they can make this bill better," Williamson said. "I have had many testify about how horrible this bill is but have never come to me with a solution to make it better."

Insurance lobbyists, however,

have been speaking with Sen. Aaron Bean, a Fernandina Beach Republican sponsoring the Senate version of the bill.

Bean earlier in the session delayed a vote on his bill — which was initially identical to the House bill — so he could meet with insurance industry representatives.

Following those meetings, Bean crafted an amendment to his bill (SB 258). That amendment, in part, would prevent insurers from requiring applicants to take genetic tests or from collecting applicants' genetic information or genetic test results without the applicants' authorization.

But unlike the House bill, the Senate version would not preclude insurers from using the information if it already is in people's medical records.

Leonard said his group was encouraged by the changes in Bean's bill.

"The Senate bill would be the most restrictive limitation on insurers' use of DNA information in the nation, while preserving honesty and transparency in the marketplace," Leonard said.

Lawmakers must bridge the differences between the two bills before the scheduled May 3 end of the 60-day legislative session.

Though Bean said the issues were "complicated," he remained optimistic that the two chambers can reach an accord.

"We're still talking," Bean said. "There's a lot of nuances. We're 95 percent of the way there, we just have to work on that 5 percent."

House backs lease tax cut, sales tax 'holidays'

TALLAHASSEE — A pair of sales-tax "holidays" for storm preparation and back-to-school shopping and a tax cut on commercial leases dominated a package that advanced Thursday out of a key House committee.

But Democrats raised questions about part of the proposal dealing with charter schools and money raised by school districts through local referendums.

The \$102.4 million package (PCB WMC 19-02) was approved 14-2 by the Ways & Means Committee. The package is being set up for conference talks with the Senate, which has been rolling out potential tax-reduction measures in individual bills.

Committee Chairman Bryan Avila, a Miami Springs Republican who said he was given a "certain allocation" from House leaders for the tax package, said the proposal remains a "work in progress." But he added it will provide "much needed relief for our residents."

However, several Democrats, including some who voted for the measure, expressed concern that the package goes beyond tax reductions. The measure includes language that would seek to ensure charter schools receive a portion of tax dollars from voter-approved referendums.

The proposal is

intended to address recent levies in Indian River and Palm Beach counties. Rep. Blaise Ingoglia, R-Spring Hill, said school districts have been writing referendums to "skirt Florida law" regarding charter schools.

"They know deep down that what they attempted to do with cutting out these charter schools was absolutely wrong," Ingoglia said.

In voting against the overall proposal, Rep. Anna Eskamani, D-Orlando, said she agreed with the tax holidays and the reduction in the commercial lease tax, but she opposed the charter school language.

"I'm a firm believer in school choice, but I believe in also supporting parents that choose traditional public education," Eskamani said.

The package includes a back-to-school holiday period in early August that would provide an estimated \$33 million in savings for shoppers. During the period, shoppers would avoid paying sales taxes on clothing priced at \$60 or less, school supplies at \$15 or less and on the first \$1,000 on personal computers.

The other tax holiday — providing discounts on such supplies as batteries, tarpaulins, portable generators and even reusable ice — would be timed around the June 1 start of the annual hurricane season.

The biggest feature of the House proposal is a business-backed

reduction of the sales-tax rate on commercial leases, which is currently 5.7%. The tax was reduced from 5.8% last year.

Under the new proposal, the House would reduce the rate from 5.7% to 5.35%. That would produce a savings of \$47.9 million in 2020, when it would only be in place half of the fiscal year. The savings would grow to an estimated \$99.9 million on a full-year basis.

Rep. Dianne Hart, D-Tampa, said if the lease tax had been lowered years earlier, she could have used the savings

to expand her small business.

"I know that had I had that for 35 years I could have employed that many more people with those dollars that I spent, because I never owned the actual building," Hart said.

While the House has put its tax proposals in a single package, the Senate Finance and Tax Committee has approved a number of separate proposals during the past two weeks, including a back-to-school tax holiday (SB 576); a disaster-preparedness tax holiday (SB 1412); and a sales-tax exemptions for

diapers and incontinence products. Details of the tax holidays also differ from the House proposal.

Rep. Amy Mercado, D-Orlando, unsuccessfully sought to make several changes Thursday to the House package. Among her proposals was language similar to the Senate's diaper-exemption bill and an effort to make the tax holidays permanent, rather than being considered for approval each year.

Avila said making the holidays permanent could hinder future lawmakers when the economy again goes sour. "We will have a

downturn at some point," Avila said. "So, certainly we don't want to restrict ourselves in terms of the decisions that we have to make going forward."

Last year, lawmakers approved a \$171 million tax package that offered a three-day back-to-school tax holiday; a seven-day disaster-preparation tax holiday; and property-tax breaks stemming from such things as damage from hurricanes and tropical storms.

Also included in the package was a 9% reduction in traffic fines for motorists who attend driver-improvement courses.

Galarza back in county to face murder charges

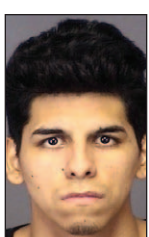

SEBRING — Daniel Luis Galarza, 19, of Avon Park was extradited from Wilson County, North Carolina and returned to the Highlands County Sheriff's Office on Thursday. Galarza was arrested in Wilson on Wednesday, April 3.

Galarza was fleeing from charges of attempted first degree murder and armed robbery in

connection with a shooting at 5:20 p.m. on Dec. 2, 2018 at 1016 Marble Ave. in Avon Park.

The suspect had his first appearance in court

on Friday morning and was held without bond on all counts. His arraignment is scheduled for 8:30 a.m. May 20. Galarza declined a public defender and will hire a private attorney, according to the office of the Highlands County Clerk of Courts.

HCSO had an FBI task force officer who was working in conjunction with the FBI task force officer in the Wilson Police Department who found Galarza in a

home in Wilson. HCSO officials are not sure if the house was owned by friends or family. He also said Highlands County is responsible for any extradition fees.

According to deputies, the Dec. 2, 2018 shooting involved three suspects who shot and injured a man who was 21 years old at the time. He was grazed by a bullet. A 17-year-old male victim was shot in the collarbone. Both victims

were transferred to local hospitals and the minor victim was treated at Tampa General Hospital. HCSO officials have said they think Garza was the suspect who pulled the trigger.

Sebastian Martinez, 16 years old at the time of the shooting, is still at large and is facing warrants in this case. Martinez is facing counts of attempted homicide and one count of robbery and

possession of a firearm by a convicted felon. He will also be charged with probation violation stemming from a concealed weapon conviction when he was 15 years old.

The third alleged accomplice, Torin Lamell Swain-Daniels, was arrested on Dec. 3, 2018 on two counts of attempted murder and robbery with a firearm. He has a pre-trial conference on April 18.

Man charged with DUI, no license

AVON PARK — A Highlands County sheriff's deputy followed a yellow car last Sunday on U.S. 27 after receiving reports of a reckless driver.

When he stopped the car, he found a foreign national, apparently drunk, with no Florida driver's license. Miguel Armenta Flores, 21, of Guerrero, Mexico, has been charged with driving under the influence and without a driver's license.

At 8:19 p.m. Sunday, April 7, Highlands County Consolidated Dispatch received reports of a reckless driver in the area of U.S. 27 and Main Street in Avon Park.

The deputy arrived in the area and found a southbound two-door yellow car matching the complaint description and apparently weaving, hitting a curb at least once, according to arrest reports.

The deputy activated emergency lights, but the

car took a quarter mile to stop, reports said, pulling over in the Winn-Dixie parking lot at 802 U.S. 27 South.

The deputy spoke with Armenta Flores, identified by a Mexican identification card. When asked for his Florida driver's license, he gave a statement that was redacted from reports, but reports stated that dispatchers confirmed for the deputy that Armenta Flores has not license.

Allegedly, the deputy smelled a strong alcohol odor coming from the car, and saw glassy, watery eyes on the driver.

Armenta Flores, allegedly, repeated himself several times and was unsteady on his feet when asked to step out of the car, leaning on the car for balance, reports said.

He also, allegedly, stated several times he was

"sorry," would call someone to pick him up and would not drive anymore.

The deputy asked how many drinks Armenta Flores had that night. His statement and a large portion of narratives after that point were redacted from reports.

However, the remaining narrative stated the deputy, based on observations and investigation, had determined Armenta Flores was intoxicated, and charged him.

The car was turned over to the driver's sister, who had arrived on his request.

At the jail, Armenta Flores agreed to provide two breath samples.

The first, at 9:59 p.m. — an hour and 40 minutes after the initial call — measured 0.223.

The second, at 10:02 p.m., measured 0.222, well above the legal limit of 0.08 blood alcohol concentration (BAC).

The 0.08 percent BAC limit is the standard measurement used across the United States for an "impaired" driver.

Robocall madness

You know the game by now: A call comes into your mobile phone. A number pops up on your screen. You don't recognize it. Your first instinct is to decline it, but what if it's your child's school? The auto repair guy? Something else? It's a guessing game, and we're the losers, again and again each day.

U.S. mobile phone users received 48 billion robocalls last year, and it's getting worse. Companies, some of them overseas, are using auto-dialing programs that encode Caller ID information so that the call looks like it's from a local number — sometimes even numbers that look like your employer. That's why we're answering calls from computers and sending humans to voicemail. We're cussing at our phones instead of talking on them. It's annoying, and it violates laws that are supposed to protect Americans from spamming and scamming.

But there is, potentially, a flickering of relief to the robocall madness.

Lawmakers from state capitals to Washington are moving to slow the firehose of robocalls, and on Thursday, a U.S. Senate committee will hold a hearing on what it calls "The Scourge" of phone spam. It's a bit of a show hearing — a chance for lawmakers to grill a telecom representative and signal that they understand their constituents' misery. But the hearing is backed up with some legislation — the TRACED Act — which would push telecoms to improve their technology so that consumers can more easily identify scammers who wish to steal personal information. All four major carriers — AT&T, Sprint, T-Mobile and Verizon — have said they'll adopt the strategy, but critics think they need the 18-month deadline the TRACED Act would mandate.

The bill also makes it easier for the FCC to more quickly slap robocallers with significant fines, and it nudges the agency to be more aggressive with phone companies. The FCC has been ratcheting up its requests for telecoms to adopt more robust robocall technology, but it has been slow to actually require action.

Meanwhile, states are taking steps of their own, including Virginia, which passed a law cracking down on companies that call residents who are on the National Do Not Call Registry or have stated previously they don't want to be solicited by that company. Little, however, has been done recently in North Carolina beyond Attorney General Josh Stein joining 34 attorneys general in a letter urging the feds to do something about robocalls.

tampering with evidence in the Oct. 9, 2016, shooting death of Aaron Hankerson outside Shooters, now Club Cino, in Sebring Square shopping plaza in Sebring.

A witness told Sebring police that both Pahokee men approached Hankerson and started shooting at him. When Hankerson fell, they allegedly stood over him and kept firing, then removed money from Hankerson's clothing, arrest reports said.

Brewer said both his and the state's cases rest on the witness' credibility. Brewer said the witness gave multiple accounts to Sebring police, specifically to Sgt. Ryan Magnuson and to Detective Mike Cutolo.

There is a summary to that statement in arrest reports, which states the witness said Hankerson had been in an argument on Oct. 8, 2016, over Hankerson's cousin, "Tweet," being shot and killed by law enforcement the previous night.

The argument allegedly was at Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard and Lemon Avenue.

Allegedly, people arguing with Hankerson told him to bring his gun if he ever came out again. After that, the witness told police, she made Hankerson leave the area.

Reports said the witness did not know the people arguing with Hankerson, but allegedly specified that they were not Washington or Cason.

Allegedly, the witness later that day received a call from Hankerson asking if she wanted to go to Shooters, and she declined. Still later, a friend called her to say Hankerson was at that club, so she went there, arriving at 11:30 p.m.

Allegedly the witness saw two people there she later identified as the shooters, but didn't know there was a problem. She told Hankerson at 1:45 a.m. she wanted to leave.

The witness told police that as she and Hankerson were walking through the parking lot, she saw the two men — later identified as Washington and Cason — approaching on foot. When they got within 12 feet, they started shooting, she told police.

She alleged that after Hankerson fell to the ground they kept shooting, almost standing over him, then started taking everything out of his pockets, including money and a cell phone.

They backed away, at which point the witness rolled Hankerson on his side, trying to talk to him, while he was bleeding from "everywhere," according to arrest reports.

Allegedly, the shooters came back, cursed at the witness and told her to move "before I put you next to his cousin," pointing a handgun at her face.

The witness told police she was afraid and put up her hands, backing away.

She described a black male in a white shirt, jeans and short black hair and a second black male, medium build, with a black and gold shirt, dark jeans and medium-length black hair in a Mohawk style.

She said one had a black handgun and the other had a silver and black handgun.

Allegedly, she told police she was "200%" sure Cason and Washington were the shooters.

Brewer said a detailed statement she made to Cutolo has been lost, destroyed or misplaced. It varies greatly from her other statements, Brewer said, and he considers it exculpatory evidence — helpful to his client. It allegedly answers:

- If she was present at an argument earlier that day.
- If the victim was told not to come back without a gun.
- If those who threatened him were actually Washington and Cason.
- If she had seen Washington and Cason at Shooters that night.
- If she had adequately

described the suspects.

• If she adequately described the guns used in the shooting.

Brewer said Cutolo can answer these questions from memory, but there is no written transcript available and the recording has been lost, leaving a lot of detail unavailable to Washington's defense.

Both Brewer and the State Attorney's Office gave case law briefs to support their arguments. The State Attorney's Office argued, in its brief, that dismissal of an indictment is an action of such magnitude that it should only be used when no viable alternative exists.

Under The State of Florida v. Richard Del Gaudio and Howard Turnoff, the District Court of Appeal of Florida, Third District, argued that even if a defendant was tried and convicted without being given the discovery material, and it is made available after the fact, the relief is to get a new trial, not have the charges dismissed.

Pending cases

Nothing has changed in the murder cases against Joseph Ables and Zephen Xaver. Both are set for hearings, respectively, in early May and mid-June.

Zephen Allen Xaver, 21, has waived his right to appear at a June 20 pretrial conference on five murder charges from the Jan. 23 SunTrust bank shooting.

He's charged with killing Debra Cook, Marisol Lopez, Jessica Montague, Ana Maria Piñon-Williams and Cynthia Watson — four employees and one customer. Joseph Edward Ables has been in jail almost a year on charges of shooting Deputy Sheriff William J. Gentry Jr. on May 6, 2018. Gentry died from his injuries early the next morning.

Ables' next court hearing is May 10.

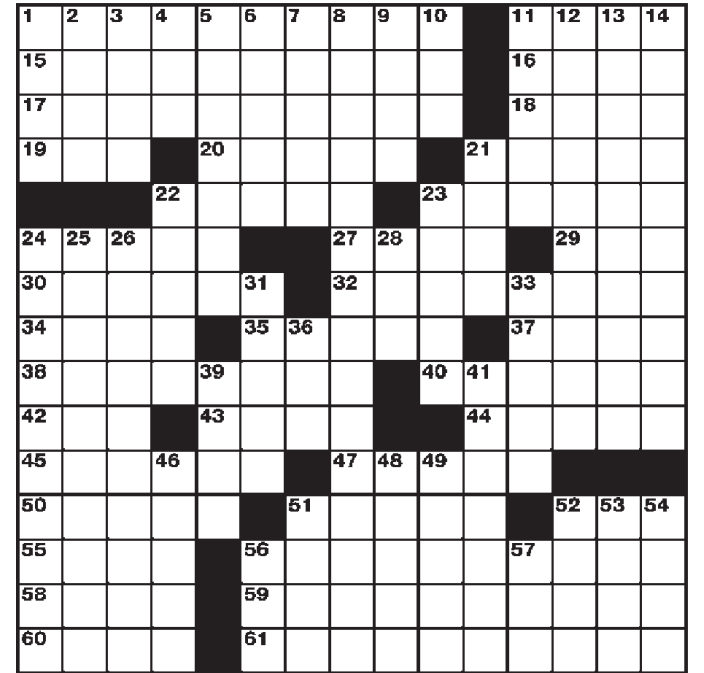
District 10 State Attorney Brian Haas is seeking the death penalty in both cases.

also can be found in seafood and can also cause respiratory distress in humans. Beaches were deserted due to the sight, smell and sickness surrounding red tide.

The Florida Department of Health came out with some astonishing numbers. The number of patients for respiratory and gastrointestinal visits in Sarasota were significantly higher than in hospitals that were not located near the red tide.

"On average, \$22 million are lost annually (figure includes medical expenses and lost work days) during an HAB event," DOH states on their website.

It also said Okaloosa County lost \$6.5 million in hotel and restaurant industry tourist dollars. Fisheries have an annual impact of \$13 to \$25 million annually from HABs.

Several politicians began throwing money at Mote and others to find a solution and find it

quickly. However, science takes time. VISIT FLORIDA tourism developers didn't need that much time.

Sara Sowerby-Bagdadi, communications specialist, said the organization jumped in to help as they were dealing with two devastating issues to hit Florida.

"Following Hurricane Michael and red tide, VISIT FLORIDA launched a nearly \$9 million marketing plan to highlight the Sunshine State. The multi-phased plan included

more than \$5 million to support the Panhandle following Hurricane Michael and nearly \$4 million to assist the areas that were impacted by naturally-occurring red tide," she said.

VISIT FLORIDA made \$900,000 through Tourism Recovery Grant Program for Red Tide to affected communities. The local tourist development boards requested the funds from VISIT FLORIDA.

"Because of VISIT FLORIDA's aggressive marketing efforts, 2018 was another record-breaking year for tourism. Florida welcomed an all-time record number of visitors last year with 126.1 million out-of-state visitors. This announcement marked the eighth consecutive record year for visitation to Florida, exceeding the previous record of 118.8 million visitors in 2017 by an astounding 6.2%," Sowerby-Bagdadi said.

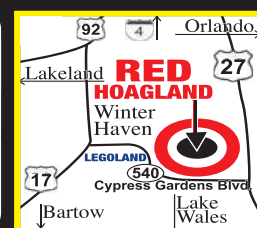

Your greatest priority

A woman from southern Alabama went into the local newspaper office to see that the obituary for her recently deceased husband was published.

The obituary editor informed her that the fee for the obituary was 50 cents per word. She paused, reflected, and then said, "Well, have it read, 'Billy Bob died.'"

Amused at the woman's thrift, the editor said, "Sorry, Ma'am, but there is a seven-word minimum on all obituaries."

The widow was only a little flustered, but she thought things over for a few moments. Finally she responded to the editor, "In that case, put down, 'Billy Bob died. 1983 pickup for sale.'"

I wonder who or what was the greatest priority to the widow? Was it her husband, or was it the pickup? Each of us leads busy lives — some busier than others. Nevertheless, we each create priorities in our lives that take precedence over all other matters. To some, their jobs fill the position of highest priority. To others, their families fill that role. Still, to others, money, power, or some other material influence always seems to come first.

Jesus taught that of all the priorities we may have in this world, we must always place Him at the top of the list. That means that Jesus must take precedent over everyone and everything in our lives! That may not always be the easiest thing to do, but it will always be the right thing to do.

In Matthew 10:34-38, Jesus said, "Do not think that I came to bring peace on the earth; I did not come to bring peace, but a sword. For I came to set a man against his father, and a daughter against her mother, and a daughter-in-law against her mother-in-law; and a man's enemies will be the members of his household. He who loves father or mother more than Me is not worthy of Me; and he who loves son or daughter more than Me is not worthy of Me. Loving acts do not always feel loving

I've been writing this column for 43 years and speaking publicly for nearly as long. If there's one thing I've learned it's that when it comes to my subject matter, you can't win 'em all.

What is now called "parenting" has become a highly emotional subject for many, right up there with religion, politics, and pit bulls. Early on in my career, it puzzled me when people became bent completely out of shape, taken over by emotion, over something I said. People storming out of my presentations was common. On three occasions, people stood up in the middle of talks and began shouting at me. Twice, sponsors had to hire security because of threatened group disruptions.

That sort of stuff has long ceased to puzzle me. Besides, it happens very rarely these days, primarily because most of the folks who come to my presentations know

what to expect: to wit, psychological heresy. But, "rarely" is the operative word. After a recent talk in California, a woman cornered me and began berating me for putting too much emphasis on the need for proper discipline.

"You need to tell people to love their children!" she nearly shouted, fighting off tears, before marching angrily away. It is relevant and only fair to note that she had identified herself as an abused child. (It is also only fair to note that I had told my audience, as always, that unconditional love is no less important to proper childrearing than unequivocal authority.)

Had she stuck around, and had she been able to hear me with some degree of objectivity, I would have told her that there's not much point in telling parents to love their children. Let's face it, a parent is either going to give up his seat in a lifeboat to his child or he is not, and me saying, "You should give up your seat in a lifeboat..." is not going to make any difference. Furthermore, the human capacity for self-deception is pertinent. A person who says (and even believes) he is so willing may, when push comes to shove, leave his child to sink or swim.

The second relevant consideration here is the fact that people who do not love their children are not in my audiences, nor are they likely readers of this column. My sponsors frequently lament that the parents who most need to hear me didn't show up.

Third, people who don't

possess genuine, self-sacrificial love for their children don't always know who they are. Their next-door neighbors and next-of-kin may not know who they are either. Some of said folks do the right thing where their kids are concerned, but lack depth of feeling. They're just going through the motions, for which we should all be grateful.

Fourth, even people who genuinely, self-sacrificially love their children do unloving things. They may have screamed at their children or spanked in a rage. "Unloving things" can and does even include things many if not most other parents are doing. For example, loving parents may drag their children around to one after-school activity after another, depriving their kids of discretionary time (which ought to occupy a significant slice of a child's life). Or they may defend their kids when they get into trouble in school, undermining

their kids' respect for adults. They may solve every problem their kids encounter, depriving their kids of responsibility and emotional resilience. A loving act is not defined by good intentions.

The converse of loving parents doing unloving things is that loving acts do not necessarily appear to be or feel loving at the time. For example, children do not like being disciplined, but the fact that a child does not like what a parent has done does not define the act as unloving. I've said it before, but it can't be said enough (for today's parents): Children don't know what they need; they only know what they want.

Come to think of it, there are no small number (these days) of adults who fit that description.

Learning to let your children make mistakes

What parent doesn't want to protect their children, to see them safe, healthy and happy? Such concerns are part of our DNA, inherited from our cave dwelling ancestors and their dangerous world. While today's kids don't need protection from saber-toothed tigers, there are still numerous ways for children to make mistakes. As parents we need to realize that some mistakes are "good mistakes," errors in decision making that may result in the wrong outcomes, but that can be valuable learning experiences for our children.

Parents always have a responsibility to try and keep truly dire, life-threatening consequences from occurring. But trying to ensure that children never make a bad decision, whether as toddlers, teens or even young adults, is really not doing them any favors.

The modern term for overly-protective moms and dads is "helicoptering." It describes parents who constantly are hovering over their child, trying to ensure that all goes well. It's parents

keeping in constant contact and trying to help their child make all the right decisions.

Unfortunately, being over-protective can inhibit a child's natural growth and independence. When dad is up all night finishing that school science project, it isn't helping prepare the child for the future. Kids with overly-protective parents often have trouble making their own decisions because they know mom or dad is always there to jump in. Such children can also end up rebelling strongly as their desire and need for independence grows.

And no, it isn't always easy to give your kids room to make their own decisions, good or bad. However it's important that they do so for healthy development. And parents can still be involved. You can be there while they work through their dilemmas and to help point them toward good solutions, but your job isn't to find the solutions for them.

Yes, you should be ready to step in when a child's decision could be dangerous or life threatening, but giving your kids more space helps build confidence and independence. It

encourages them to try new things, even things that might seem scary. You want to offer sympathy and understanding when things go wrong, but don't always try to make things right.

When a child is allowed to face possible failure, and even sometimes to experience it, he or she will learn valuable lessons about growing up.

How to teach your children age-appropriate financial lessons

National nonprofit credit counseling agency Take Charge America helps parents identify financial milestones for toddlers, kids and teens

PHOENIX – When it comes to understanding money management, responsible spending and healthy saving habits, it's best to start young.

"For better or worse, parents serve as the prime example when it comes to financial behaviors," says Michael Sullivan, a personal financial consultant with Take Charge America, a national nonprofit credit counseling and debt management agency. "Beginning financial discussions early-on, and continuing these conversations through each age, can help kids become financially independent and confident come adulthood."

Sullivan outlined age-appropriate financial

lessons that parents can instill in daily life.

Ages 2-5
Basic money knowledge – Teach toddlers the names of individual coins and the value of paper bills. Explain how cash is deposited into a bank for safekeeping.

Saving up – Set up a piggy bank for kids to start saving on their own and talk to them about the responsibility of keeping money safe.

Ages 5-8
Help at checkout – Allow little ones to help at checkout, letting them purchase small items or counting cash with guidance. This helps them understand that money is exchanged for goods — and that items in a store must be bought.

Spend/save/share – Upgrade the piggy bank

to three separate funds for kids to divide their money: spend, save and share. This teaches kids how to allot money to daily expenses, work toward bigger purchases and share with others.

Ages 9-12
Odd jobs – Parents may encourage children at these ages to start making and saving their own money through odd jobs, chores around the house or an allowance.

Comparing prices – Discuss how to find the best price. Ask pre-teens why they think certain products might cost more than others. It might be helpful to talk about situations where a more expensive price is warranted or if a bargain price is better suited.

Ages 13-16
Credit cards and more

– This is a good age to introduce credit cards, the importance of building and maintaining credit, paying bills and other associated responsibilities.

Gaining independence – Teens will probably show more interest in having a regular income as they age. Whether they're saving up for a car or otherwise, a first job is an opportunity to learn important life skills, including depositing paychecks, paying taxes or opening a savings account.

Ages 17+
Higher education – Take the time to discuss college with young adults. If higher education is in their future, ask where they'd like to attend, their desired area of study, how they plan to pay for it and their expected starting

salary in their chosen field.

Loans and interest – College is frequently associated with student loans. Explain how "buy now, pay later" can result in accumulating interest. Stress the importance of reading the fine print and paying off debt consistently.

Feeling secure – College or no college, help outline a long-term financial roadmap to support them on their journey to independence. Discuss where they see themselves in five years and explore how to realistically and financially get there.

Take Charge America offers parents and teachers free financial resources and elementary school lesson plans to guide such conversations.

Trump 'strongly looking' at releasing migrants in Dem cities

WASHINGTON — President Donald Trump said Friday he is strongly considering releasing “Illegal Immigrants” into Democratic strongholds to punish congressional foes for inaction on the border — just hours after White House and Homeland Security officials insisted the idea had been rejected as fast as it had been proposed.

“Due to the fact that Democrats are unwilling to change our very dangerous immigration laws, we are indeed, as reported, giving strong considerations to placing Illegal Immigrants in Sanctuary

Cities only,” Trump tweeted. He added that, “The Radical Left always seems to have an Open Borders, Open Arms policy — so this should make them very happy!”

The reversal, which appeared to catch officials at the Department of Homeland Security off guard, came as critics were blasting Trump for the supposedly-rejected idea, accusing him of turning migrants into pawns to go after his political opponents. It comes as Trump has grown increasingly exasperated by a surge of Central American migrant families crossing the southern border and is looking for new ways to pressure congressional Democrats to

change laws that he insists are making the problem worse.

Indeed, last week Trump urged his soon-to-be acting Homeland Security Secretary Kevin McAleenan to seal the southern border and told McAleenan he would pardon him if he were to find himself in trouble for blocking legal asylum-seekers, according to two people familiar with the conversation who spoke on condition of anonymity to describe a private exchange.

It was not clear whether the president was joking, and a Homeland Security spokesman said in a statement: “At no time has the president indicated,

No-cash a no-go?

As cashless stores grow, so does the backlash

NEW YORK — Hembert Figueroa just wanted a taco.

So he was surprised to learn the dollar bills in his pocket were no good at Dos Toros Taqueria in Manhattan, one of a small but growing number of establishments across the U.S. where customers can only pay by card or smartphone.

Cash-free stores are generating a backlash among some activists and liberal-leaning policymakers who say the practice discriminates against people like Figueroa, who either lack bank accounts or rely on cash for many transactions.

Figueroa, an ironworker, had to stand to the side, holding his taco, until a sympathetic cashier helped him find another customer willing to pay for his meal with a card in exchange for cash.

“I had money and I couldn't pay,” he said.

The issue got some high-profile attention this

week when retail giant Amazon bowed to pressure from activists and agreed to accept cash at more than 30 cashless stores, including its Amazon Go convenience

stores, which have no cashiers, and its book shops. Amazon declined to say when the change would happen.

There is no federal law

that requires stores to accept cash, so lawmakers are working on the issue at the state and city level.

Charging Assange reflects dramatic shift in US approach

WASHINGTON — The decision to seek the extradition of Julian Assange marked a dramatic new approach to the founder of WikiLeaks by the U.S. government, a shift that was signaled in the early days of the Trump administration.

President Barack Obama's Justice Department had extensive internal debates about whether to charge Assange amid concerns the case might not hold up in court and would be viewed as an attack on journalism by an administration already taking heat for leak prosecutions.

But senior Trump administration officials seemed to make it clear early on that they held a different view, dialing up the rhetoric on the anti-secrecy organization shortly after it made damaging disclosures about the CIA's cyberespionage tools.

“WikiLeaks walks like a hostile intelligence service and talks like a hostile intelligence service,” former CIA Director Mike Pompeo said in April 2017 in his first public speech as head of the agency.

“Assange and his ilk,” Pompeo said, seek “personal self-aggrandizement through the destruction of Western values.”

A week after the CIA director's speech, then-Attorney General Jeff Sessions said the arrest of Assange was a priority, part of a broader Justice Department crackdown on leakers.

“We've already begun to step up our efforts, and whenever a case can be made, we will seek to put some people in jail,” he said.

Pompeo, now secretary of state, declined Friday to discuss the issue, citing the now-active legal pursuit of Assange following his removal a day earlier by British authorities from the Ecuadorian Embassy in London.

Buttigieg, once cordial to Pence, now critical amid campaign

WASHINGTON — On the campaign trail, Democratic presidential contender Pete Buttigieg blasts Vice President Mike Pence's cultural and religious conservatism. But as the mayor of Indiana's fourth largest city, his tone toward the state's Republican former governor was more muted.

During the four years in which they overlapped in Indiana politics, Buttigieg, the South Bend mayor, had a cordial relationship with Pence. The two collaborated on economic development issues. Buttigieg presented Pence with a South Bend promotional T-shirt that said "I (heart) SB." And at ceremonial events, Pence would lavish Buttigieg with praise.

The relationship between the two men has come under scrutiny as Buttigieg's campaign becomes

a surprise hit, raking in \$7 million during the first quarter. As he formally launches his White House campaign on Sunday, the gay mayor has emerged as a celebrated voice for LGBT equality and religious tolerance. And Buttigieg has hardened his rhetoric toward Pence, using President Donald Trump's vice president as a foil representing an oppressive opposition.

At a recent LGBT event, Buttigieg spoke of the importance of his marriage to his husband, Chasten, and framed his sexuality in religious terms.

"If me being gay was a choice, it was a choice that was made far, far above my pay grade," Buttigieg said. "And that's the thing I wish the Mike Pences of the world would understand: that if you've got a problem with who I am, your problem is not with me. Your quarrel, sir, is with my creator."

He has previously called Pence's

religious conservatism a "fanatical" ideology.

By Buttigieg's own admission in his campaign memoir, his relationship with Pence is "complicated." In an interview with CNBC that aired on Thursday, Pence said they had a "great working relationship" and criticized the mayor's characterization of his religious beliefs. "He knows better," Pence said. "He knows me."

S&P 500 notches 3rd straight weekly gain as stocks rally

Stocks notched solid gains on Wall Street Friday, erasing most of the losses the market sustained after an uneven week of trading.

The strong finish gave the S&P 500 its third straight weekly gain. The benchmark index is now just under 1 percent from its most recent all-time high set on Sept. 20, reflecting the strong rebound for the market this year after a dismal slide in December.

The S&P 500 index rose 19.09 points, or 0.7 percent, to 2,907.41. The Dow Jones Industrial Average climbed 269.25 points, or 1 percent, to 26,412.30.

The Nasdaq composite gained 36.80 points, or 0.5 percent, to 7,984.16. The Russell 2000 index of smaller-company stocks picked up 5.66 points, or 0.4 percent, to 1,584.80.

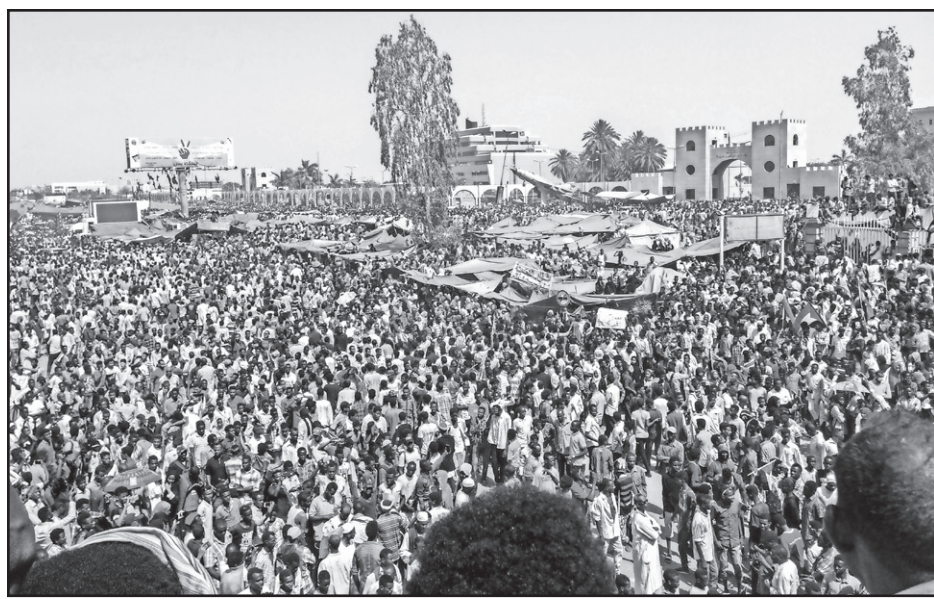
Chevron vaults into new league on \$33B Anadarko acquisition

Chevron is buying Anadarko Petroleum for \$33 billion, energizing its oil and gas drilling capabilities in Texas and the Gulf of Mexico while vaulting itself into a new league.

The combined company will remain far behind Exxon Mobil Corp. and Royal Dutch Shell Plc. in market capitalization, but Chevron will jump from being the world's fourth biggest energy producer, to second, according to Wood Mackenzie.

"Chevron now joins the ranks of the UltraMajors — and the big three becomes the big four," wrote Roy Martin, senior analyst at Wood Mackenzie, referring to Exxon, Shell and BP.

The cash-and-stock deal announced Friday comes as U.S. crude prices have shot up 40 percent this year.

Sudanese army refuses to extradite ousted president

CAIRO — The Sudanese military on Friday rejected calls that it hand over ousted President Omar al-Bashir to the International Criminal Court where he faces genocide charges for his deadly campaign in the western Darfur region and said he would be put on trial at home.

Meanwhile, Gen. Awad ibn Ouf, who was name de facto leader after al-Bashir's ouster on Thursday, announced he was stepping down as transitional leader and another general would take his place.

The developments point to the sensitivity of the case of the Darfur conflict for the military council that has taken power after removing

and arresting al-Bashir amid mounting protests against his 30-year rule.

Ibn Ouf was head of military intelligence during the brutal campaign to suppress the Darfur insurgency in the 2000s. The United States has imposed sanctions on him since 2007, saying he armed and directed pro-government militias known as the Janjaweed, accused of widespread atrocities against civilians and rapes during the conflict.

Ibn Ouf said he would be replaced by Gen. Abdel-Fattah Burhan, general inspector of the armed forces, as head of the transitional council. He said he was stepping aside to preserve unity of the armed forces.

Tens of thousands of Sudanese protesters have

been rallying in front of the military headquarters in Khartoum, against the military takeover of power after ousting al-Bashir, chanting slogans calling for ibn Ouf to be removed.

Earlier Friday, another top general, Omar Zein Abedeen said that 75-year-old al-Bashir would not be extradited to the International Criminal Court, based in The Hague, Netherlands, saying doing so would be "an ugly mark on Sudan."

"Even rebels carrying weapons, we don't extradite them," he told reporters at a news conference in Khartoum.

Zein Abedeen said Sudanese courts would hold al-Bashir "accountable," but did not specify what charges he could be prosecuted on.

UN says Congo's Ebola outbreak not yet a global emergency

GENEVA — The ongoing Ebola outbreak in Congo does not yet warrant being declared a global emergency but is of "deep concern," the World Health Organization said Friday.

Following a meeting of its expert committee, the U.N. health agency called for efforts to be redoubled to stop the deadly virus, noting that the recent spike in Ebola cases raises the risk of spread to other countries.

The outbreak announced on Aug. 1 has become the second-deadliest in history, behind the West African one from 2014-16 that

killed more than 11,300 people. Congo's health ministry on Thursday reported 1,206 confirmed and probable cases, including 764 deaths.

This is the second time the expert committee has decided this outbreak is not yet a global emergency. Committee chair Robert Steffen called Friday's decision unanimous and said the experts had feared making the declaration might even hurt response efforts. He did not give details but said experts were "moderately optimistic" the outbreak could be contained within a "foreseeable time."

Ahead of the WHO announcement, a top Red

Cross official said he was "more concerned than I have ever been" about Ebola's possible regional spread.

Emanuele Capobianco, head of health and care at the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies, cited Congolese health ministry data showing 40 new cases over two days this week. He called that rate unprecedented in this outbreak.

To be designated a public health emergency of international concern, a situation must be "serious, unusual or unexpected," threaten to infect other countries and require "immediate international action."

UK's anti-EU Brexit Party launches EU election campaign

LONDON — Pro-Brexit British politician Nigel Farage on Friday launched a campaign for an election that may never take place to an institution he routinely insults — the contest for U.K. seats in the European Parliament.

Britain was supposed to have left the European Union before the European elections, which take place in late May in every EU nation. But with Britain's Parliament still deadlocked over whether to approve the government's divorce deal with the bloc, EU leaders have postponed

the Brexit deadline until Oct. 31.

British Prime Minister Theresa May says taking part in this year's European elections three years after the nation voted to leave the EU would be "unthinkable." She still hopes Britain can avoid the U.K.'s May 23 election by leaving the 28-nation bloc before then.

But with British lawmakers unwilling to endorse the divorce agreement that May forged with the EU, preparations have begun to fill the 73 U.K. spots in the 751-seat European legislature. Winning candidates from Britain will only get to serve as long as their country remains in the EU.

Britain's ruling Conservatives and the opposition Labour party are unenthusiastic about running in the European Parliament election, where they are likely to be punished by disgruntled voters.

But pro-Brexit and pro-EU parties are eager to run in a contest seen by many as a way to express their strongly divergent views on the EU.

Farage held the first campaign rally of his newly formed Brexit Party, calling delays to Britain's departure from the EU "a willful betrayal of the greatest democratic exercise in the history of this nation."

Judge: Don't seal school shooting suspect's jail logs

FORT LAUDERDALE (AP) — A judge has denied a request from the suspect in last year's Florida high school massacre to seal the identities of jail visitors from prosecutors and the public.

Circuit Judge Elizabeth Scherer said the logs are subject to release under the Public Records Act, without exemptions for defense experts visiting inmates.

Nikolas Cruz's attorneys said prosecutors will learn their strategy if they learn which mental health experts are examining him.

Scherer's Friday ruling said only the identities are disclosed, and the "mere potential speculation" about visitors will not compromise Cruz's right to a fair trial.

The Associated Press and other news outlets argued for the jail records' release.

The 20-year-old Cruz faces the death penalty if convicted in the shooting that killed 17 people in February 2018 in Parkland.

Number of Hepatitis A cases grows in Martin County

PORT ST. LUCIE (AP) — Health officials say the number of cases of Hepatitis A in a Florida county is growing.

Health officials reported Friday that there have been 19 cases of Hepatitis A in Martin County, with three deaths related to complications from the virus.

The Florida Department of Health considers a community "high risk" when there are five or more confirmed cases.

Hepatitis A is a highly contagious liver infection. It spreads when someone ingests the virus from objects, food or drinks contaminated by fecal matter of an infected person.

The health agency says statewide there have been 1,200 confirmed cases of Hepatitis A.

The virus can be prevented through vaccine, and the health agency in Martin County was offering free vaccinations to anyone uninsured or underinsured.

Video: Florida train crashes with SUV; driver hospitalized

ORLANDO (AP) — Police have shared surveillance video showing how a woman drove her SUV into the path of a Florida commuter train.

Orlando police Sgt. Eduardo Bernal told news outlets the driver remained hospitalized Thursday in serious but stable condition. The SunRail struck her SUV during rush hour downtown.

Bernal says her timing was "weird," but police don't believe she intentionally drove into the train's path Wednesday.

The video shows her drive under the guardrails as they were coming down, pause at the tracks' edge, and then drive in front of the oncoming train.

Florida's Transportation Department says 82 passengers and two employees were on board. Witnesses say a nurse on the train and others rushed to help the woman.

Two train-car collisions happened at the same intersection within hours in December.

Man gets prison for attacking customs officer at airport

ORLANDO (AP) — A Florida man has been sentenced to seven years and three months in prison for attacking a customs officer at a Florida airport.

Court records show that 67-year-old John Craig Myrick was sentenced Thursday in Orlando federal court. He was convicted in January of assaulting a federal officer causing bodily injury.

Myrick arrived at the Orlando International Airport from Bogota, Colombia, in August 2018. Prosecutors say a U.S. Customs and Border Protection officer directed Myrick to the baggage control seating area, where he had an altercation with another officer.

The officer attempted to control Myrick by grabbing his arm. Officials say Myrick resisted, fell on top of the officer and began punching the officer in the back of the head. The officer suffered a fractured ankle.

Mom accused when daughter, 2, dies in hot car

PENSACOLA (AP) — Authorities say a 36-year-old Florida woman slept as her 2-year-old daughter died in a car parked outside her apartment.

The Pensacola News Journal reports Jessica Monell faces charges of homicide-neglect manslaughter, child neglect and possession of a controlled substance.

Escambia County Sheriff's Maj. Andrew Hobbs says Monell arrived at the Aqua Porta Apartments around 6 a.m. Wednesday and went inside. She left Joy Monell in the car until she woke up shortly before 4 p.m.

Hobbs says investigators found three bags containing suspected crystal meth and other drugs in Monell's home.

The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration recorded a heat index of 82 degrees in Pensacola on Wednesday.

A lawyer wasn't listed for Morell.

asked, directed or pressured the acting secretary to do anything illegal. "The reported conversation came during the president's trip last week to Calexico, California, a day after he announced he was delaying his threat to close the border because Mexico appeared to be stepping up its enforcement efforts.

Before Trump's tweets on Friday, both the Department of Homeland Security and a White House official had insisted in nearly identical statements that the sanctuary-cities plan had been floated but then flatly rejected.

But not, apparently, by the president, who emphatically revived the idea.

Asked about it by reporters, he said he was "strongly looking at" releasing migrant families into those communities.

"They're always saying they have open arms. Let's see if they have open arms," he said.

There were no indications, however, that officials were taking any steps to move forward with the idea or considered the president's words anything more than bluster.

"Sanctuary cities" are places where local authorities do not cooperate with Immigration and Customs Enforcement officials, denying information or resources that would help ICE round up for deportation people living in the country illegally.

They include New York City and San Francisco, home city of House Speaker Nancy Pelosi, who on Friday called the idea "unworthy of the presidency of the United States and disrespectful of the challenges that we face as a country, as a people, to address who we are — a nation of immigrants."

Rep. Bennie Thompson

of Mississippi, who chairs the House Homeland Security committee, said it "serves as a reminder that the Trump administration's reckless immigration agenda is not about keeping the country safe, but about partisan politics and wantonly inflicting cruelty."

The plan, which was first reported by The Washington Post, is one of a litany of ideas being tossed around by an increasingly anxious White House in recent months. Officials say they are running out of options, and have proposed and recycled numerous ideas that have never come to fruition. Trump in recent weeks, for instance, has discussed the idea of renewing his administration's controversial family separation policy — even as he's publicly declared he won't do that — and has threatened to completely seal the border despite opposition from many in his administration.

The administration won't say why they decided now to charge Assange with a single count of computer intrusion conspiracy that dates to 2010. Back then, WikiLeaks is alleged to have helped Chelsea Manning, then a U.S. Army intelligence analyst, crack a password that gave her higher-level access to classified computer networks.

Nor will they say whether the Obama administration had the same evidence that forms the basis of the indictment, or whether Assange will face additional counts if he is extradited to the United States.

But a U.S. official, speaking on condition of anonymity to discuss internal and legal matters, traced the genesis of the indictment to what's known as the "Vault 7 leak" in 2017, when WikiLeaks released thousands of

pages of documents revealing details about CIA tools for breaking into targeted computers, cellphones and consumer electronics.

A former CIA software engineer was charged with violating the Espionage Act by providing the information to WikiLeaks and is to go on trial later this year in New York. And the leak was a tipping point in deciding to pursue Assange, the official said.

"Vault 7 was the nail in the coffin, so to speak," the official said.

It ended years of ambivalence about what to do about Assange, who was hailed by many when WikiLeaks published hundreds of thousands of State Department cables and U.S. military documents, including many that revealed previously unknown facts about the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan and the detainees held at the U.S. base at Guantanamo Bay, Cuba.

Earlier this year, Philadelphia became the first city to ban cashless stores, despite efforts by Amazon to dissuade it. New Jersey passed a statewide ban soon after, and a similar ban is working its way through the New York City Council. Before this year there was only one jurisdiction that required businesses to accept cash: Massachusetts, which passed a law nearly 40 years ago.

"The potential societal cost of a cashless economy I think outweighs the potential benefits for businesses," said Ritchie Torres, a New York City councilman for the South Bronx who introduced the bill.

Policymakers argue that while cashless enterprises

aren't widespread now, the practice could expand to more services, including some that cater to lower-income people.

Walmart-owned Sam's Club opened its first cashier-less store in Dallas last year, using technology that allows customers to scan and pay for items with their smartphones. Kroger has installed similar technology in about 400 stores nationwide.

Stadiums in Tampa Bay, Florida, and Atlanta have started to go cashless, or nearly cashless, and the Barclays Center, where the Brooklyn Nets play, is now effectively cashless as well.

Advocates for cashless bans worry technology is moving too fast for the 6.5 percent of American households — 8.4 million — who do not have a bank account, according

to the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation.

Figuroa is among the much larger group considered "underbanked," meaning they have a primary bank account but regularly rely on alternative financial services like check cashers. More than 24 million U.S. households are underbanked, according to the FDIC.

The issue disproportionately affects African-American and Hispanic communities. About 17 percent of African-American and 14 percent of Hispanic households have no bank accounts, compared to just 3 percent of white households, according to the FDIC.

Figuroa, an immigrant from the Dominican Republic, only opened a credit union account two years ago. It took another year to build up enough funds to use his debit

card regularly.

He relies occasionally on a check casher if he needs money quickly, and much of his income comes in cash from his weekend job as a busboy. He has no credit card and no apps on his phone and has only shopped online three times.

Business owners who go cashless say they are following the lead of the majority of customers who are abandoning cash payments. Retailers are under pressure to cater to customers with heightened expectations for fast and seamless service, driven by companies like Amazon, Uber and Grubhub.

Leo Kremer, co-owner of Dos Toros, said the volume of cash transactions at his stores fell from about 50 percent a decade ago to 15 percent last year. That made

the cost and logistics of handling cash especially onerous. Before going cashless, Dos Toros locations were robbed twice. Still, Kremer said the company would adjust if legally required to accept cash.

"There are no bad guys on this issue. Everyone is trying to do the right thing and make sure there are no unintended consequences," he said.

Critics say banning cash-free stores is an over-reaction.

There are no overall estimates on how many U.S. stores have gone cashless, but it remains a rarity. In New York City, the trend appears to be gaining traction mostly with "fast casual" dining establishments like Dos Toros. Far more common are stores that require a minimum purchase for non-cash payments.

What you eat affects your frame of mind and motivation

Professional athletes know it. Just ask tennis great Venus Williams, who joyously returned to the court after she became vegan to help treat her autoimmune disease, Sjogren's syndrome. Linebacker Wesley Woodward persuaded 10 other Tennessee Titans to switch to a plant-based diet the year the team made it to the playoffs after a decade of being out of the running. That's a great feeling! Then there's free agent NFL lineman David Carter, aka the 300-pound vegan, who says eating a healthy diet changed his life, making him stronger, faster and happier. What you eat transforms your mood, your energy and your motivation. Body and mind are intertwined. Research confirms what you've felt in your muscles, bones and brain.

Nutritional Neuroscience. Those researchers found that fast-food diets may tip you toward depression by delivering an abundance of the depression-linked fatty acid (n-6 PUFA) and a relative lack of the depression-fighting fatty acid (n-3 LCPUFA).

With the epidemics of obesity, poor nutrition, lack of physical activity and chronic pain that are engulfing the U.S., that's a lot of fuel for the blues.

In "What to Eat When," Drs. Roizen and Crupain lay out the smart, long-term approach to food

that will help protect you from depression and boost your health in different ways, reducing the risk of many cancers; diabetes; joint, sexual and memory problems!

Your sources for mood-lifting, nutrient-dense, high-fiber protein:

— If you don't go vegetarian or vegan, stick with fish that deliver a good dose of healthy omega-3 fatty acids: salmon, sea trout, herring, sardines. Studies indicate that omega-3s help improve the function of neurotransmitters, which may boost or protect your mood.

— Rely on plant-based proteins and protein builders. They include: 100 percent whole grains (wheat, sorghum, teff, barley, farro, corn, millet, oats, etc.); beans of all kinds, lentils, chickpeas, soy/tofu; nuts and nut butters; peanuts, which are loaded with tryptophan — a building block of serotonin, which is a neurotransmitter that is in short supply in folks with chronic depression; and colorful veggies such as broccoli, spinach, asparagus, artichokes, potatoes, sweet potatoes and Brussels sprouts.

— Keep green tea nearby. One of its many benefits is how it calms you by easing stress responses that can fuel the blues.

Minor depression causes you to have symptoms for longer than two weeks at a time, but does not meet the criteria for major depression.

However, about 16 million American adults contend with MDD (major depressive disorder), and only about two-thirds are receiving treatment.

Both regular exercise and good nutrition are ESSENTIAL components of a healthy mind and body, and you do not want to risk serious health problems associated with chronic depression, such as heart disease, diabetes, self-injury or attempted suicide.

So, if your blues persist, talk with your doctor; seek talk therapy; join an in-person or online support group (check out the Anxiety and Depression Association of America and the National Alliance of Mental Illness online to find support); and tell a friend or family member.

Woods one shot behind crowded hilltop

For first time, five players are tied for lead after 36 holes; attention centered on Tiger

AUGUSTA, Ga. — Tiger Woods made the largest logjam in Masters history look even bigger by making Augusta National sound as loud as ever.

Even on a Friday, in the rain.

Golf's best worked their way to the top of the leaderboard at a Masters pregnant with possibilities. The first five-way tie for the lead after 36 holes at Augusta featured Francesco Molinari, Jason Day, Brooks Koepka, Adam Scott and Louis Oosthuizen.

All of them are major champions. Three have been No. 1 in the world.

Looming just as large was Woods, who atoned for missing two birdie

chances inside 8 feet on the back nine with consecutive birdie putts from 30 feet that sent him to a 4-under 68 and left him one shot behind.

Woods was tied with Dustin Johnson, another major champion and world No. 1, along with Xander Schauffele and Masters newcomer Justin Harding of South Africa.

If that's not enough, Phil Mickelson and Justin Thomas were very much in the mix.

"This is really stacked," Scott said. "I think it's going to be an incredible weekend no matter what happens now."

Woods has gone 14 years since he last won the green jacket, 11 years since his last major and had five surgeries — four on his back, the other to rebuild his left knee.

But he feels he's getting closer.

"The last three majors, I've been right there," Woods said.

He briefly held the lead Sunday in the British Open. He chased Koepka to the finish line in the PGA Championship. And now he goes into the weekend one shot behind, the closest he has been to a lead going into the weekend at a major since the 2013 British Open at Muirfield.

But that's not just anyone he's trailing.

Molinari, the British Open champion who has shown he belongs among the elite in golf, had a 67 and was the first to reach 7-under 137. Day was right behind, coping with nagging soreness in his

WEST VILLAGES — There was a different vibe in the North Port dugout as the Bobcats took on Venice for the second time in a week at CoolToday Park on Friday.

Though the Indians (15-4, 4-0) scored in three straight innings to build a comfortable lead, winning 8-2, the Bobcats (11-7, 0-4) were much more pleased with their performance in Round 2.

The glitz and glamour of the newly built Braves spring training complex had subsided and North Port came in ready to play. It showed in the first 2 1/2 innings.

North Port pitcher Brandon Long retired the first six batters he faced and the Bobcats offense got five hits, a run and a walk.

"They did what we wanted them to, we told them to be aggressive," North Port coach Miles Mayer said.

Lightning sink

Tampa Bay falls behind 0-2 in first-round series stunner

TAMPA, Fla. (AP) — Matt Duchene had a goal and three assists, Sergei Bobrovsky made 23 saves, and the Columbus Blue Jackets stunned the Tampa Bay Lightning 5-1 on Friday night to take a 2-0 first-round series lead.

Columbus also got goals from Cam Atkinson, Zach Werenski, Riley Nash and Artemi Panarin. The Blue Jackets started the postseason last season by winning the first two games of the first-round series with eventual Stanley Cup Washington, which won the next four games.

Mikhail Sergachev had a goal and Andrei Vasilevskiy stopped 22 shots for the Lightning, who lost two games in a row just twice in the regular season. Tampa Bay matched the 1995-96 Detroit Red Wings for the most wins in a regular season with 62.

Lightning right wing Nikita Kucherov, who led the NHL with 128 points, was held off the scoresheet for the second consecutive game and picked up tripping, boarding and 10-minute misconduct penalties late in the third period.

The Blue Jackets rallied from a three-goal, first-period deficit to beat Tampa Bay 4-3 in Game 1 on Wednesday

night as Seth Jones scored the go-ahead goal on the power play to cap Columbus' three-goal third period.

Duchene assisted on both Columbus goals during the first period and put the Blue Jackets ahead 3-0 on the power play when the center scored on the rebound at 1:28 of the second after Vasilevskiy had stopped his tip-in try.

The Lightning got within two goals at 3-1 when Sergachev's shot went into the net off Blue Jackets defenseman Markus Nutivaara's skate five minutes into the third. But, Nash and Panarin scored goals over a three-minute span midway through the period.

Bobrovsky stopped Kucherov's shot and got a piece of Steven Stamkos' scoring chance that also went off the crossbar during an early second-period power play.

Duchene stole the puck from J.T. Miller along the left-wing boards and sent a pass into the low slot that Atkinson redirected past Vasilevskiy 5:15 into the game.

Werenski made it 2-0 from the blue line after Duchene won a faceoff during a power play at

Walton, Lakers part ways

Departure of coach follows Magic Johnson's resignation

LOS ANGELES — Luke Walton is out as coach of the Los Angeles Lakers after three losing seasons.

Lakers general manager Rob Pelinka announced Walton's departure Friday, three days after the abrupt resignation of president of basketball operations Magic Johnson. Pelinka called Walton leaving a mutual decision.

The former Lakers forward went 98-148 after getting his first permanent head coaching job with the 16-time NBA champions. The former Golden State assistant never led the Lakers to the playoffs, not even after the arrival of LeBron James last summer.

Walton leaves three days after the Lakers' final game of their 37-45 season was upstaged by the shocking pregame

resignation of Johnson, who inherited Walton when he took over the Lakers' front office in February 2017. Johnson attributed his decision in part to his desire and reluctance to fire Walton, who is close to Lakers owner Jeanie Buss.

A potential power struggle instead ended

with both men out of their jobs.

Pelinka, who was hired along with Johnson, announced the move in a sign of the increased organizational power of Kobe Bryant's former agent.

Walton joined the Lakers with fanfare in 2016 after his successful

tenure alongside coach Steve Kerr with the powerhouse Warriors. Walton stepped in as Golden State's interim coach when Kerr was sidelined by health issues to start the 2015-16 season, and he led the Warriors to a 24-0 start and a 39-4 record before Kerr returned.

Packers great Gregg dies at 85

Offensive lineman was key part of Green Bay's five championship teams in 1960's

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. — Forrest Gregg, the great Hall of Fame lineman for the mighty Green Bay Packers of the 1960s that Vince Lombardi called the “finest player I ever coached,” died Friday at age 85.

Barbara Gregg said her husband of 59 years died in Colorado Springs from complications of Parkinson's disease.

“I lost my sweetheart this morning,” she said. “It’s awful. He died in my arms.”

She said that in the last two weeks her husband received a constant flow of calls from former teammates and players telling him he’d made such a big difference in their lives.

“I’m overwhelmed at the amount of people that loved Forrest, of the number of players that said he made men out of them,” she said. “Forrest loved people. He loved everybody. He loved his children. He loved me. And it just broke

my heart. My heart is broken.”

She said the funeral will be sometime next week in Colorado Springs and open to the public.

Hall of Fame president David Baker described Gregg, who was enshrined in 1977, as a “giant” who “exemplified greatness during a legendary career.”

“He was the type of player who led by example and, in doing so, raised the level of play of all those around him,” Baker said.

The flag at the hall will be flown at half-staff in Gregg’s honor.

Gregg, who earned the nickname “Iron Man” for playing in a then-record 188 consecutive games during his career, was diagnosed with Parkinson's in October 2011. He quickly embarked on a campaign to raise public awareness about the incurable disease, urging others to seek treatment early enough to delay the degenerative effects on both the mind and body.

His family and his neurologist said the disease may have been

related to concussions he suffered during his playing career in the 1950s at SMU, and from 1956-71 with the Packers and Dallas Cowboys.

Gregg never blamed football for his health ailments. He refused to join concussion lawsuits against the NFL and said he still would have chosen to play the sport if he’d known there would be a hefty price to pay later in life.

In an interview with the AP in 2013, Gregg said he didn’t begrudge those who sued the league, but he had his pensions from his playing and coaching days, and “I don’t need anything from anybody but what I earned.”

A guard and tackle, Gregg is one of four NFL players to win a-half dozen NFL championships, including the first two Super Bowls with the Packers. Gregg finished his career with another Super Bowl title with the Cowboys in 1971. The six-time All-Pro and nine-time Pro Bowler was elected to the NFL’s all-decade team of the 1960s and to its 75th anniversary team.

lower back with a 67 to match the Italian.

29 minutes. Woods returned to miss the putt, and then took three shots from 35 feet behind the par-5 13th green to lose another prime birdie opportunity. But he made it up for them with a couple of long birdie putts, and he had no complaints with his position.

“I feel like I played my own way back into the tournament,” Woods said. “I was just very patient today, felt very good to be out there doing what I was doing. This is now three straight majors that I’ve been in the mix and so it’s good stuff.”

Mickelson stumbled to a 73 but still was only three shots behind. Bryson DeChambeau, who shared the 18-hole lead with Koepka, went bogey-double bogey around the turn and shot 75. He still was within four shots, along with Justin Thomas, who had a 68.

Rory McIlroy, played the par 5s in even — two bogeys, one par and an eagle on No. 8 that got him under par, but only briefly. He was only seven shots behind, but he had 35 players in front of him.

Contreras goes deep twice as Cubs top Angels

Rizzo, Bote also go deep as Hamels gets victory

CHICAGO — Willson Contreras homered twice on a blustery day at Wrigley Field as Cole Hamels and the Chicago Cubs stopped the Angels' six-game win streak Friday with a 5-1 victory over short-handed Los Angeles.

Anthony Rizzo and David Bote also connected to help Chicago win for the third time in four games on its first homestand of the year. Hamels (2-0) pitched eight crisp innings in his second straight victory, improving to 5-2 with a 2.63 ERA in 12 career starts against Los Angeles.

The Angels played without star center fielder Mike Trout, who missed his second straight game after he strained his right groin during the team's last homestand.

Albert Pujols went deep for Los Angeles in its first trip to Wrigley since 2016. It was Pujols' 57th homer in 183 career games against Chicago, second only to his 58 long balls against Houston.

But the Angels were unable to overcome a rough outing for Tyler Skaggs (1-2), who surrendered three long home runs in his four innings.

After Kris Bryant singled with one out in the first, Rizzo drove Skaggs' next pitch to the back of bleachers in right. Rizzo's third homer of the season traveled 472 feet, according to Statcast.

Contreras hit his fourth homer with two down, making it 3-0 with a drive to left that made it to Waveland Avenue.

Bote added his first homer of the season in the fourth, and Contreras went deep again in the sixth. Contreras' second homer of the day also reached the street beyond the wall in left.

TRAINER'S ROOM

Angels: Manager Brad Ausmus said he thought Shohei Ohtani was going to hit off a machine Friday. The 2018 AL Rookie of the Year had Tommy John surgery last October. Ohtani has been taking batting practice for a couple weeks. "It's a baby step up," Ausmus said. The 24-year-old Ohtani isn't expected to pitch this year, but he could return to the Angels' lineup in May.

Phillies 9, Marlins 1

Jake Arrieta allowed one run in seven innings to earn his 100th career victory and the Philadelphia Phillies sent the Miami Marlins to their fifth consecutive loss, 9-1 on Friday night.

Arrieta (2-1) took a 6-0 lead into the seventh, when the Marlins ended a streak of 21 consecutive scoreless innings on Austin Dean's sacrifice fly.

The Marlins have lost nine of their past 10 games, and they've been outscored 30-2 in the past four games.

The Phillies' J.T. Realmuto hit into a double play with the bases loaded to end the first inning, but finished with two hits, two runs and an RBI. The game was his first at Marlins Park since Miami traded him in February.

Andrew McCutchen had three hits, including a three-run homer in the eighth. Bryce Harper had an RBI and two hits to hike his average to .325 as the Phillies tied a season high with 14 hits.

Arrieta gave up five hits, struck out eight, lowered his ERA to 2.25 in three starts and improved to 100-68 in 10 seasons.

Sandy Alcantara (1-1) gave up six runs and 11 hits, both the highest totals of his brief career, while working five innings.

The Phillies reached Alcantara for six consecutive hits and five runs in the third. Rhys Hoskins doubled home one run, and Odubel Herrera added a two-run double.

Jackson signs with Athletics

Veteran pitcher started for Oakland last season

ARLINGTON, Texas (AP) — Edwin Jackson has agreed to a minor league deal with the Oakland Athletics, which last year became his record-matching 13th big league team.

As manager Bob Melvin said Friday that the 35-year-old right-hander will go to the club's spring training facility in Arizona before pitching in some games for Triple-A Las Vegas.

"Then hopefully see him here pretty soon because he's just an infectious guy," Melvin

said. "He fits in here very well."

Jackson also signed a minor league deal with the A's last June, and then was 6-3 with a 3.33 ERA in 17 starts for Oakland, which was 14-3 in those games.

With his A's debut, Jackson matched former reliever Octavio Dotel's record of pitching for 13 different teams.

Jackson has started 305 of his 394 career major league games since his debut in September 2003 with the Los Angeles Dodgers.

Trout to miss Chicago series

CHICAGO (AP) — Mike Trout has been ruled out for the Los Angeles Angels' weekend series against the Chicago Cubs after he strained his right groin during the team's last homestand.

Trout visited Dr. Steve Yoon on Friday in Los Angeles. Angels general manager Billy Eppler said imaging showed a reduced amount of swelling.

"Mike also reports daily improvement," Eppler said in an emailed statement. "He will continue treatment in Anaheim and he will be re-evaluated on Sunday."

Trout first felt discomfort after working out Tuesday. The injury flared up while he was running to second base in the second inning of the Angels' victory over Milwaukee

that night.

Manager Brad Ausmus said the team doesn't think Trout will need a stint on the injured list. He could rejoin the Angels for their next series in Texas.

"It's just a matter of how he feels and what the doc thinks," Ausmus said before the Angels' 5-1 loss to the Cubs.

Trout signed a record \$426.5 million, 12-year contract near the end of spring training. The two-time AL MVP is batting .406 with five homers and 12 RBIs in 12 games.

The injury means one of baseball's biggest stars will miss a rare trip for Los Angeles to one of the sport's iconic venues in Wrigley Field. Trout is 5 for 15 in four career games at Chicago's longtime home.

Sanchez 12th Yankee to hit IL Catcher has strained left calf

NEW YORK (AP) — Gary Sanchez was as startled as anybody by the news announced Friday.

The Yankees catcher has a strained left calf and became the 12th New York player on the injured list, a day after a precautionary MRI revealed the injury.

Right-handed reliever Dellin Betances, another member of that achy dozen, returned to New York on Friday to visit a doctor after his simulated game Thursday did not go well. Betances is dealing with a right shoulder issue.

Sanchez said through a translator that he was "surprised" by the MRI result, believing the tightness he felt in his calf this week wouldn't require him to miss more time. He was held out of the starting lineup Wednesday at Houston and struck out as a pinch-hitter. He said he felt fine after that game.

He had the MRI during a day off Thursday, and the Yankees decided the strain was severe enough to warrant placing him on the 10-day IL, retroactive to Thursday.

Sanchez hopes to return when he's eligible. Manager Aaron Boone said Sanchez didn't want to go on the IL, but the team convinced him to take the cautious route early in the season.

"It's frustrating because you want to play," Sanchez said. "You want to play all the time."

Sanchez will take five days off from baseball activities. New York hopes he'll only need five or so days after that to build

back up.

"Hopefully it's something that's a pretty short stint," Boone said.

More than half the Yankees starting lineup is hurt. Sanchez joined outfielders Giancarlo Stanton (strained left biceps) and Aaron Hicks (left lower back strain), shortstop Didi Gregorius (recovering from Tommy John surgery last October), third baseman Miguel Andujar (torn labrum in right shoulder) and shortstop Troy Tulowitzki (strained left calf) on the IL.

The ailing Yankees were swept over three games by the Astros this week, falling to 5-7 a year after winning 100 games.

"It's our reality right now," Boone said. "The bottom line is, we feel like, unlike any other team maybe, we're equipped to be able to still have success through this."

New York will get left-hander CC Sabathia off the IL on Saturday. Sabathia is set to make his first start since having an angioplasty and right knee surgery during the offseason.

The 38-year-old Sabathia had been rehabbing with Class A Tampa. He returned to New York on Wednesday, and his message to the clubhouse was simple. "Keep playing," he said. "It's a long season. It's April, so we'll get our guys back, but right now we just got to keep going out and playing hard with the guys that we have in here. We have capable guys that can step up and do the job."

Marek Houston proved productive for Venice in the bottom of the order.

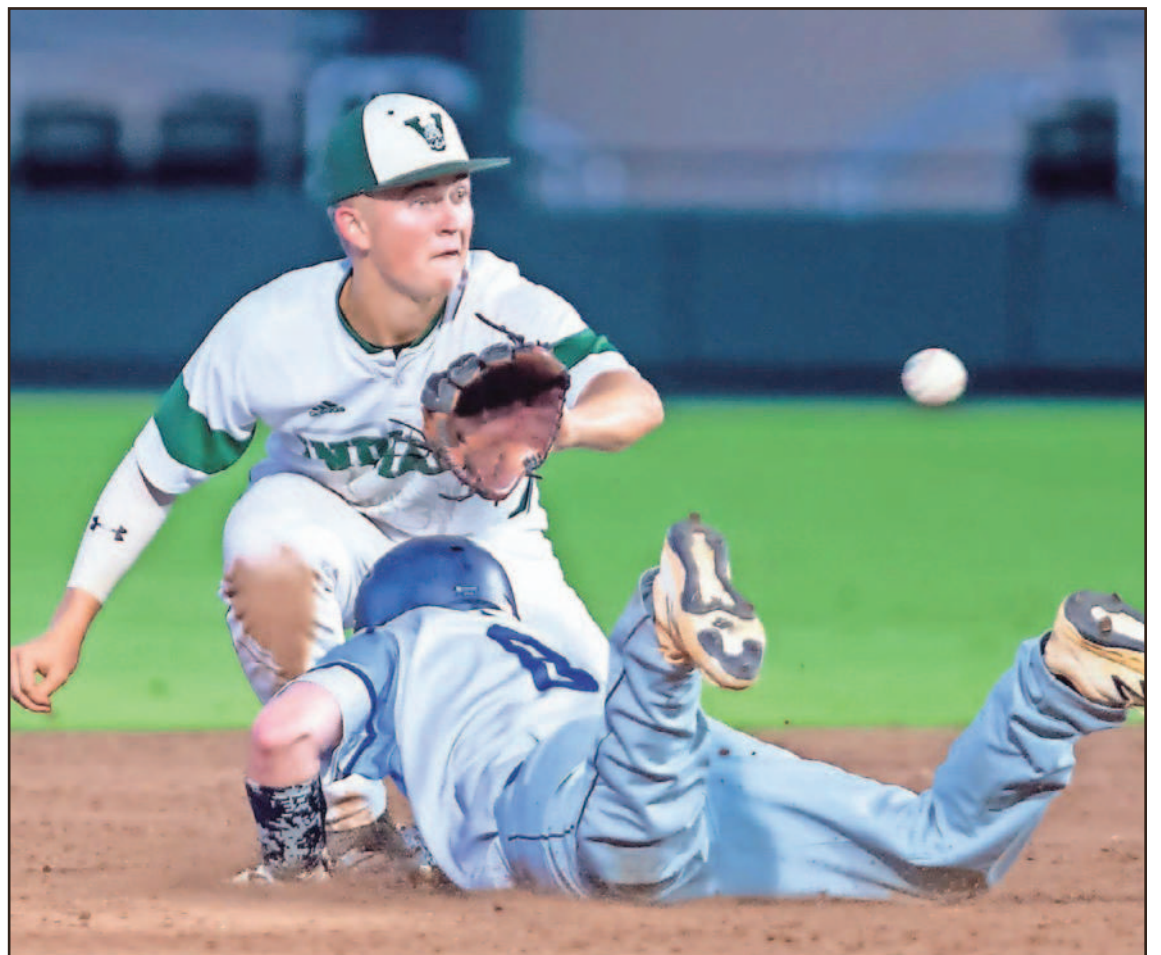
He singled on a fly ball to centerfield to score Reegan Jackowiak and Danny Rodriguez.

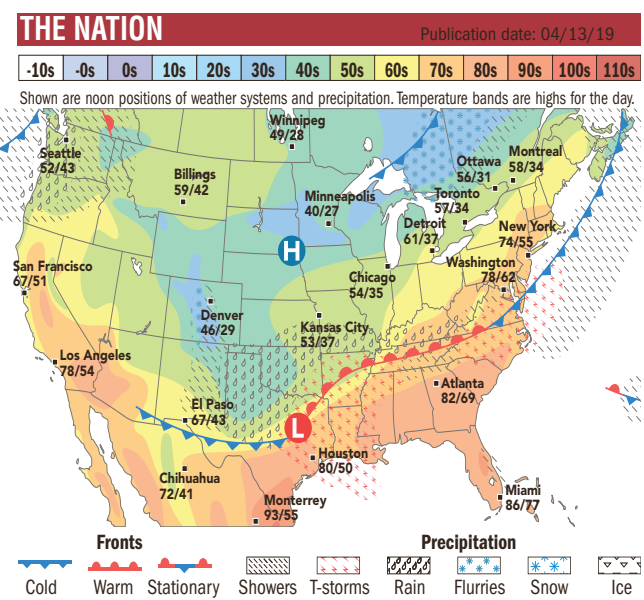

Bottas, Vettel in front after Chinese Grand Prix practice

SHANGHAI — Mercedes driver Valtteri Bottas and Ferrari rival Sebastian Vettel led Friday's practice sessions ahead of the Chinese Grand Prix.

Off the track, Formula One prepared to celebrate its 1,000th race on Sunday. The first F1 race took place in 1950 at Silverstone, a converted World War II airfield in southern England. It was won by Giuseppe Farina driving an Alfa Romeo. Vettel was quickest in the morning session, and Bottas was slightly faster in the afternoon with Vettel right behind. The afternoon session was quicker overall with Bottas clocking 1 minute, 33.330 seconds on the track located about 40 kilometers (25 miles) from downtown Shanghai.

Vettel was timed in 1:33.357 in the afternoon, followed by Red Bull driver Max Verstappen (1:33.551) and Lewis Hamilton (1:34.037) in his Mercedes.

Bottas and Hamilton have each won one of the first two races this season. Mercedes, Ferrari and Red Bull dominate and are expected to do the same in qualifying on Saturday and in Sunday's

race. Liberty Media took over Formula One two years ago for \$4.6 billion, taking control of a sport long run by British billionaire Bernie Ecclestone.

Sadler returns to Xfinity Series

RICHMOND, Va. (AP) — Virginia native Elliott Sadler retired after last season, but will make his return to NASCAR's Xfinity Series on Friday night at Richmond Raceway. The 43-year-old Sadler

will drive for Kaulig Racing in one of just two planned starts this season. He is also scheduled to race at Las Vegas in September. "It's good to be back. I was nervous this week.

"I'm not going to lie," he said about racing for the first time since last season's finale at Homestead. "I didn't sleep much this week, wanting to come here, excited and nervous and all that good stuff to come back to my home

track. ... It was good to be back in my office for a little while." A native of Emporia, about 70 miles from Richmond, Sadler has raced 55 times on the 0.75-mile oval and never won.

Hamlin happy to be at home

Virginia native has won three times at Richmond

RICHMOND, Va. — Denny Hamlin would love to think he has an advantage when it comes to racing at Richmond Raceway.

The Joe Gibbs Racing star has won three times on the 0.75-mile, D-shaped oval and has been coming to the track for much of his life, even long before the Virginia racer became a driver in the Monster Energy NASCAR Cup Series. "I don't know if there's any advantage for sure, but I certainly feel like I know what I need out of the car to be successful here," Hamlin said Friday. "Certainly this is kind of our wheelhouse for tracks you could say."

The Daytona 500 winner has plenty of reason to feel good heading into the weekend. He's already won twice this year, but his last victory at Richmond came in the fall of 2016. Teammate Kyle Busch swept both races last season, has already won three times this season and is trying to follow up a victory last weekend at Bristol.

Hamlin hopes familiarity can keep his solid start going.

"I've always loved coming to this race track. It is home. It's one that I've been to many, many times when I wasn't racing," he said. "It is certainly the home track for me but it's just exciting because I know that I could very well have a great weekend ahead of us, really focus a lot of my efforts on how can we go out there and dominate the race, not just win, but dominate. Really, that's been the focus for the last five days."

Teammate Martin Truex Jr. has been close to winning with second-place finishes at Atlanta and Phoenix, and said Busch is on the kind of role that makes him seem invincible. Besides his success in the Cup series, Busch has started four races in the Truck series and won them all, and won three of four Xfinity races. "You look at a couple of races like last week. He even said he wasn't going to win the race and the next thing you know he's leading. They stay out and he's leading and he drives off into the sunset," Truex said.

Only once in the last decade has an English team won the competition — Chelsea in 2012.

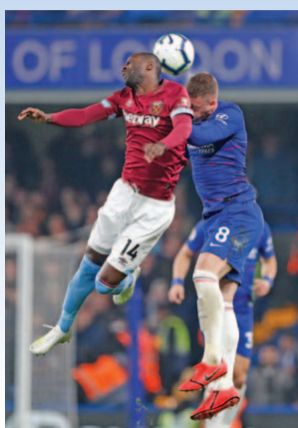

All are in the top 10 of soccer's top

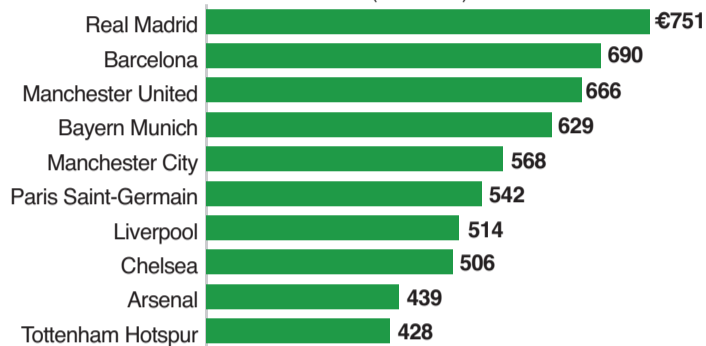

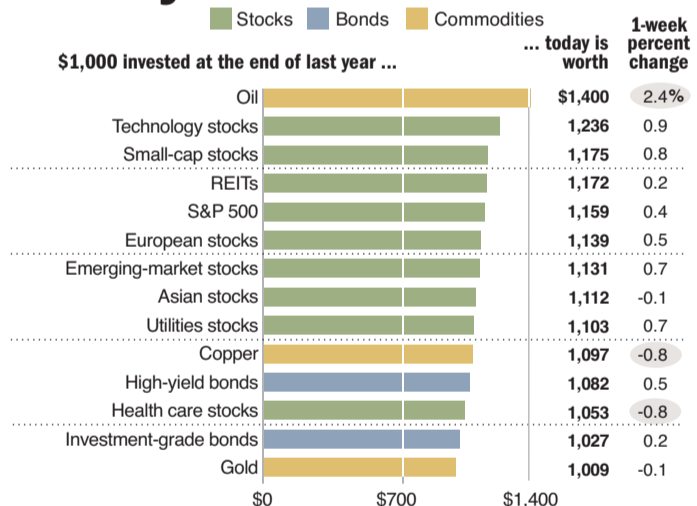

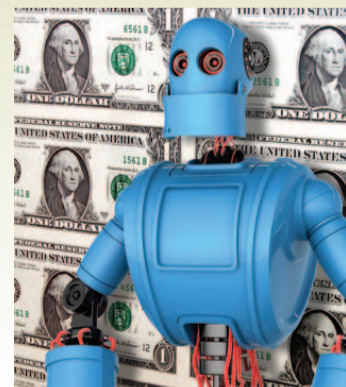

Robo-advisers rise

Automated financial advisers continue to gain popularity, as smartphone apps and online portals make it fast and easy to set up an account. Investors should take it slow and assess whether a robo-adviser is a good fit for their needs, state securities regulators say.

"Robos" are brokerage firms that use computer-generated formulas to manage investments for clients online, often with little human contact and at a fraction of conventional advisers' fees.

The North American Securities Administrators Association issued an investor advisory this week on robo-advisers. Before starting, you should research various robo-advisers' investment offerings and fees, the regulators say.



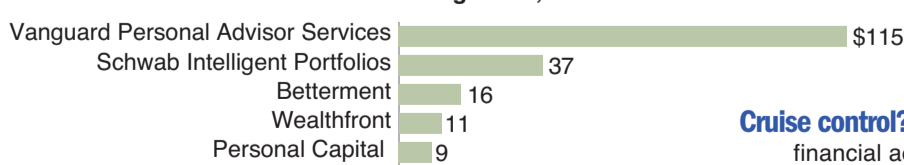
Among the questions to ask: Does the robo-adviser build a portfolio based on your financial goals while taking into account your appetite for risk?

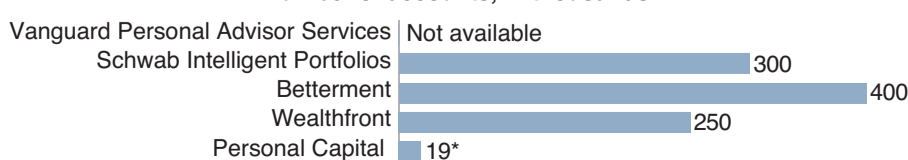

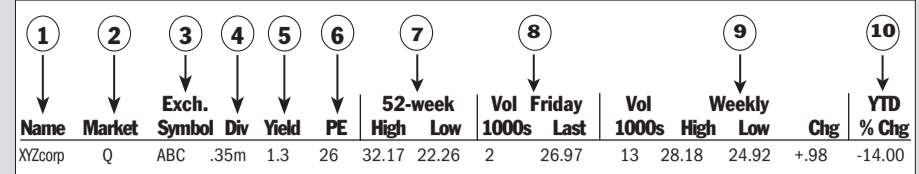

Varys plays a mostly benign 'Game' in HBO's blockbuster fantasy

"Big, bigger, biggest" seems to be the motto for the eighth and final season of "Game of Thrones," which premieres Sunday, April 14, on HBO.

The epic fantasy blockbuster has just six more episodes in which to wrap up its sprawling storylines, although the last four of those will clock in at 80 minutes each instead of the usual hour's duration.

The Season 7 finale teed up some jaw-dropping cliffhangers, including the relentless march southward by the army of the dead, led by the Night King perched atop a flying zombie-dragon.

But the other big shocker in that finale was more personal: Jon Snow (Kit Harington) was revealed to be, not the illegitimate son of Ned Stark, but a royal descendant of the Targaryen line and, as such, the true heir to the Iron Throne.

It's a development that is sure to have head-spinning implications for some of the show's power players and under-the-radar manipulators alike, including Varys (Conleth Hill), the cunning spymaster with a knack for moving human chess pieces to ensure the most favorable results for Westeros.

"If you notice, most of the negative things that are said about Varys are said about him by those who don't like him or trust him, but I always have believed he's a good man," Hill says. "He does his

best. He's not as self-centered as Littlefinger was, who was both egotistical and wanted everything for his own good. I believe Varys when he says 'for the good of the realm,' which he says so often it's almost his hashtag. I've certainly seen nothing to contradict that."

In a memorable Season 3 scene with Peter Dinklage's Tyrion Lannister, Varys revealed details about the brutal life that had taught him survival skills, but also the value of kindness.

"Varys sees that kindness can be as effective as cruelty," the actor says. "I loved a scene in Season 6, I think, where you saw him actually interrogate someone, and it was the opposite of what you may have been expecting. Instead of 'I'm going to torture you and you'll tell me what I want to know,' it was 'Why don't I give you lots of money and get you and your son out of here?' He knew what appealed to people, what buttons he could push to get information that would be useful to anyone, not just himself."

The first time he had to shave his head for this role, a colleague helped him maintain perspective.

"Rory McCann, who plays The Hound, could tell I was unhappy and asked what was wrong," Hill recalls. "I've sold my soul to HBO," I said. "Shut up and get in your Bentley," he told me."

Conleth Hill plays the clever Varys in "Game of Thrones," premiering Sunday on HBO.

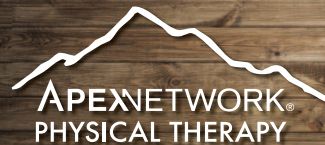

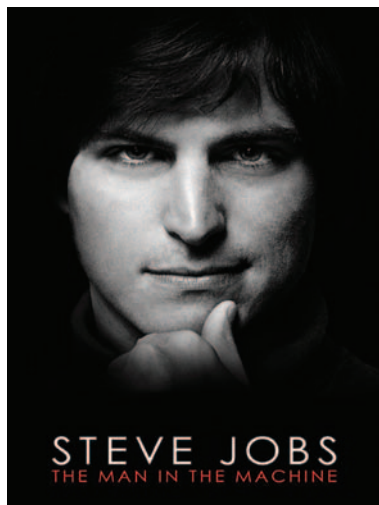

BEST GAME SHOWS

“What's My Line?” (1950-67, 1968-75) “Is it bigger than a breadbox?” It rarely was in the case of this game revolving around a guest's secret profession or product, but viewers had fun guessing along with the panel.

“The Price Is Right” (1956-65, 1972-present) The more basic the game, the more durable it is, at least in the case of this shopping contest, originated by host Bill Cullen, who was succeeded by Bob Barker in one of the longest tenures of its kind. Drew Carey currently holds court.

“Password” (1961-75, brief revivals afterward) Single-word clues were the essence of guessing the password and winning this game, long overseen by Allen Ludden and later by Regis Philbin on CBS' short-lived “Million Dollar Password.”

“Let's Make a Deal” (1963-76, 1980-81, 1984-86, 2009-present) Some dignity fell by the wayside as contestants dressed like their favorite vegetables (or

other items) to get the attention of the host, originally Monty Hall and now, Wayne Brady. Whether to settle for what they had or risk it for something bigger yielded suspense, later emulated by NBC's “Deal or No Deal.”

“Jeopardy!” (1964-75, 1978-79, 1984-present) The brainy person's game show, this Merv Griffin-created classic is educational and fun as players give the questions for provided answers. The unfailingly classy Alex Trebek has been the ideal steward throughout the program's run in syndication.

“The Dating Game” (1965-73, brief revivals afterward) Single contestants had to choose from unseen prospective dates, based on their responses given from the other side of the wall, in producer Chuck Barris' and host Jim Lange's hit that helped spawn “The Newlywed Game.”

“Wheel of Fortune” (1975-present): Merv Griffin also had his creative hand in this long-running show, a variation on

the game Hangman. Contestants guess at elements of a word or phrase, and if they're right, hostess Vanna White happily reveals the corresponding letter.

“Family Feud” (1976-85, 1986-95, 1999-present) With only a few brief breaks, the fact this game has aired for nearly 40 years speaks to its endurance ... with Richard Dawson initially, and now Steve Harvey, adding humorous fuel to the feud between teams of relatives to guess what a “survey says” about the most popular answers to questions.

“Who Wants to Be a Millionaire” (1999-present) At a time when network game shows had all but waned, this multiple-choice contest, first hosted by the aforementioned Philbin on ABC, then by several others (currently, Chris Harrison) in syndication, re-energized the genre by popularizing such phrases as “Is that your final answer?” and “I'd like to call a friend.”

And the show has those moments, too, and I think that's what makes it a little bit different ... especially for a broadcast-network comedy. It can be broad and crazy and funny, but it also has really grounded moments that, just as a viewer, I think helps the show go the distance. I want to know what happens to these people.

What do you think about the future for "Life in Pieces"?

In this business, I don't count my chickens until I'm having egg drop soup, but I can't even stomach thinking about this show not going a few more years. It's a really, really fantastic group.

"Breaking Bad" is such a unique program in television history, how do you reflect on also having had that acting experience?

I loved playing Marie, and I still miss her and love her, but I didn't want to keep playing her with different names. A lot of times, people have the reaction, "Oh, do that on my show, too!"

I had never played a character who was anything like her, and I loved her great and not-so-great qualities and I embraced them all, but I felt like I did that. And I was really happy with where she got to at the end of the show.

As "Life in Pieces" starts its fourth season, does its several-stories-per-half-hour format still satisfy you?

You want to be economical, because you only have so many minutes to tell the beginning, middle and end of whatever story you're doing. I'm always so satisfied when I watch it - I'm like, "It's over already?" - and I think that's what you want, especially with a comedy.

That half-hour just zips by you, but even in the quiet moments, there's so much happening.

quite a few episodes now that were just for us. They're a little bit whacky, a little bit outside of the canon. But I think, also, as a character over time mine started out fairly buttoned down, reserved, perhaps, judgmental, whether it be because of science or religion, and a lot of those layers have slowly been peeled off, and you've got a character that's probably a little more empathetic and has had to adapt to his surroundings. So, as he is somewhat the eyes of the audience he is kind of the audience's vehicle. He has to grow and evolve, and probably lighten up a little bit.

How difficult is it to balance that lightness with the grimness of some of the crimes?

That's been a tough balance to strike from the beginning. Certainly the books that the series is based on were a little more stark and doing things in that era, we've seen a lot of photos of actual crimes that we referenced from the period. It was very tough. Life was tough back then, and it's kind of uncomfortable to see a lot of that - the petticoats, the mud. You know, it was a bit more gruesome. So trying to keep the tone light, I think, is what has been our recipe for success, because people can tune in and we don't get too far down into the darkness. We don't get mired down too much, although, I think, every once in a while, seeing a spike sticking out of somebody's head is entertaining.

When a show goes as long as this one has, can you look back at earlier seasons and recognize a tonal difference?

I think tone-wise we've lightened up a little bit. We're taking some more chances just by the fact that, you know, we're able to. We've made

Does putting on the wig for "Queens of Mystery" help turn you into your character of Mattie?

Definitely the whole style and aesthetic of the show is really particular and individual, so I think that it creates the world really well. And Ian (Emes), the director of the first and the third episodes, had such a particular eye for it, so he has a lot of influences from "The Avengers" and Emily and Wes Anderson films. So I think aesthetically it's very different and that really helped to create the characters in the world.

There are so many crime shows that come out of the U.K. and so many great crime shows, why do you think that genre is so prolific in the U.K., and why do you think it's so embraced here in the U.S.?

I think there's an incredible history with crime fiction within the U.K. from Sherlock Holmes and previous writers ... that it kind of feels in the blood and part of the history. And there's something about small places ... where if something intriguing or mysterious happens, it's different.

Everyone's really, really excited about it ... so there's something about the very small town nature of places within the U.K. So if something like a murder was going to happen, it's quite an incredible event, so I think that's part of it.

What have been your favorite mystery shows over the years?

When I was young I have to say, I really loved "Poirot." ... I grew up in Belgium for many years, and because he always says he's a bloody little Belgian

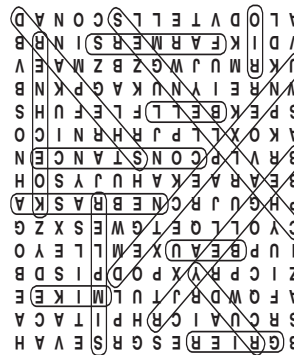

A young Muslim American considers his place in the world in Hulu's 'Ramy'

Ramy is a young man caught between two worlds. As played by stand-up comic Ramy Youssef in the Hulu comedy "Ramy," which begins streaming Friday, April 19, he's a likable first-generation Egyptian-American twentysomething toiling among self-involved Millennials at a struggling start-up and still living at his childhood home in Jersey City, N.J.

Of course, his traditional parents Farouk (Amr Waked, "Salmon Fishing in the Yemen") and Maysa (Hiam Abbass, "Blade Runner 2049") would like him to get out of the house, get a real job and find a nice girl, preferably Muslim, because that's what his married friends have done. But his outspoken sister Dena (May Calamawy, "The Long Road Home") would prefer he not go anywhere, lest the folks turn their nagging on her.

Meanwhile, his Uncle Naseem (Laith Nakli, "I'm Not Me"), a card-carrying misogynist and anti-Semite, has a job for his nephew in his diamond business if he so chooses to go that route.

The series, which was created by Youssef and is based on his experiences, plays against the usual sitcom trope of the first-generation American rejecting their heritage and/or religion in favor of American culture. Which is a sentiment Youssef –

also a New Jersey native, son of immigrants and practicing Muslim – never bought into.

"The tension is always, 'I don't want to be like you,' or 'I wish I was like my white friends,' and I never really related to that," he says. "I always really felt this connection to my culture, to my faith, and the tension in my life has always been how do I hold onto both things. What does it feel like when you want to go to Mecca and you also want to go to Burning Man? I've never seen that played out. It's always just like either/or; you're watching people try to erase their history."

In addition to finding that middle ground, Youssef also wanted to show Muslims as humans with very human virtues, foibles and frailties.

"I think because we're so underrepresented when people see us, we're constantly trying to apologize or over-prove ... that we're good," he says. "I think what really shows that someone's good is that they're a human being and they're really dealing with real things, and that's what I think this show is doing for the first time for Muslims. It's just showing us not being afraid to show us in all of our problems. And it's not an apology ... it's just these are things we're dealing with, and what we're dealing with might also be what you're dealing with, too."

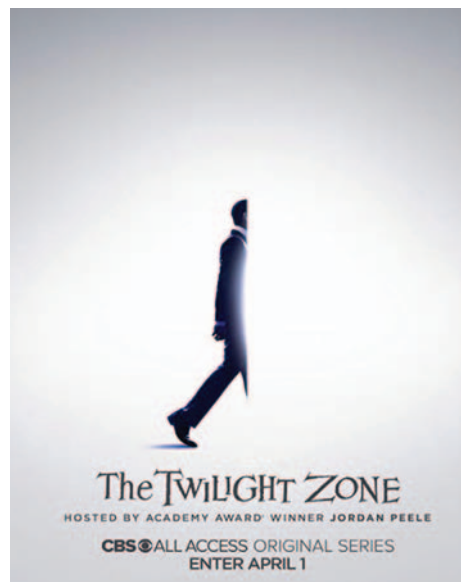

movie review

Aliens besiege a 'Captive State'

At first glance, "Captive State" might seem like "Independence Day" meets "Red Dawn" meets any number of other alien-invasion or enemy-occupation movies.

It certainly is that, to a large degree – but thanks to clever writing and directing and smart casting, it also is more than that, a story that plays effectively (if calculatingly) into the paranoia of our times. It poses the eternal debate over where someone's loyalties lie, which might seem to have an easy answer when it comes to fighting aliens, but it's more complex than that here.

The focus of "Captive State" is on an area of Chicago that has been overtaken by said extraterrestrials. Many residents accept their apparent fate to be under alien rule, but bands of freedom fighters arise to challenge the oppressors – and to prompt law enforcers to try to contain them, so as to limit the potential mayhem.

And thus arises the big questions the movie asks: Do you simply remain complacent under such repression? And if not, what exactly can you do about it? Though we do get to see the monsters in "Captive State," director and co-writer Rupert Wyatt wisely keeps the emphasis on the human element, and what certain individuals choose or do what they feel they must.

There's a "Cloverfield" feel to the result, helped by the presence of "10 Cloverfield Lane" star John Goodman. Vera Farmiga and Ashton Sanders ("Moonlight") also have prominent roles, and they bring an ordinary-person quality that helps the picture attain what it aims to.

The "Cloverfield" parallel extends even farther in the case of "Captive State," which also reaches past its presumed boundaries. In that way, it follows in a great tradition of stories of people who rise up against those who would keep them down. The aforementioned "Independence Day" is another clear example of transferring the theme to the sci-fi realm, but the cerebral aspect runs deeper in this case.

Indeed, some viewers may be disappointed that "Captive State" doesn't have more of the basic "Let's blow up the creatures!" approach that its ads promise. However, because of the path it takes, its reputation may well grow over time as a thoughtful portrait of just how much the human spirit can achieve under major duress.

"10 Cloverfield Lane" (2016):

Goodman's presence is essential to this three-character melodrama, in which his character warns the others about danger outside his door.

"Flight" (2012): Welcome from the second he shows up here, a take-no-prisoners Goodman is great as the gregarious supplier who keeps an addicted airline pilot (Denzel Washington) "connected."

"Monsters Inc." (2001): In one of the numerous voiceover jobs he's had (including the current "Valerian and the City of a Thousand Planets"), Goodman greatly enhances this animated Disney-Pixar comedy-fantasy with his vocal contribution as a supposed monster named Sulley.

"The Big Lebowski" (1998): Just about anyone connected to this cult classic from the Coen brothers is iconic for their work here, including Goodman as an unpredictable comrade of "The Dude" (Jeff Bridges).

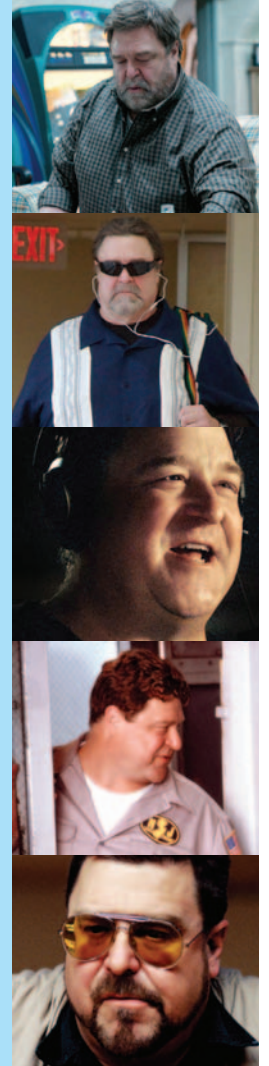
"The Babe" (1992): Goodman does a credible job, warts and all, in filling the shoes and uniform of baseball icon George Herman "Babe" Ruth.

"Barton Fink" (1991): Joel and Ethan Coen gave Goodman another great role as an insurance salesman trying to help his title neighbor (John Turturro) get past a case of writer's block.

"Arachnophobia" (1990): Showing how well he fares in bringing supposedly fantastic characters down to Earth, Goodman is first-rate as an ultra-exterminator battling deadly spiders.

"Sea of Love" (1989): A simply terrific Goodman makes his mark as Al Pacino's police-detective cohort ... and his all-in, a cappella rendition of the title song is a showstopper.

"Raising Arizona" (1987): Goodman's association with the Coens began with his supporting role in this dark comedy about a couple (Nicolas Cage, Holly Hunter) who decide to become parents in a less-than-legal way.

Ellen Kathleen Pompeo was born on Nov. 10, 1969, in Everett, Mass.

After moving from Miami to New York with her then-boyfriend, Pompeo was spotted by a casting director who found work for her in commercials, but she also began doing independent films. Television entered her career with two guest shots on "Law & Order," which she followed with appearances on shows including "Strong Medicine" and "Friends."

Pompeo's movie credits gained traction with a lead role in director Brad Silberling's semiautobiographical drama "Moonlight Mile," and she also had big-screen parts in "Catch Me If You Can," "Old School," "Eternal Sunshine of the Spotless Mind" and "Daredevil."

In 2005, Pompeo began playing the role of Meredith Grey in ABC's Seattle-set medical drama "Grey's Anatomy," which she continues to this day. During his time on the series, Patrick Dempsey – as the doctor who became commonly known as "McDreamy" – and Pompeo formed one of TV's most popular romantic couples.

Pompeo has achieved several milestones on "Grey's Anatomy" during its run. Having earned a number of award nominations (encompassing three People's Choice wins and, along with the rest of the "Grey's" cast, a Screen Actors Guild victory), she is among the highest-paid performers on TV.

Named a producer of "Grey's Anatomy" (two episodes of which she has directed) via her 2018 contract renegotiation, Pompeo also is a co-producer of the "Grey's" spinoff "Station 19" and has space on the Walt Disney studios lot for her production company, Calamity Jane.

After meeting in a grocery store in 2003, Pompeo and Chris Ivery married four years later, with then-New York mayor Michael Bloomberg as the legal witness. The couple has two daughters (one born via surrogate) and a son.

Turner Classic Movies marks its 25th birthday

Ted Turner's favorite film, "Gone With the Wind," was the first attraction when Turner Classic Movies launched 25 years ago.

The former cable mogul no longer owns the channel, but its mission to deliver movies uncut and uninterrupted continues. The Oscar-winning 1939 saga of Rhett Butler and Scarlett O'Hara (Clark Gable, Vivien Leigh) also will be a major element as the home of the phrase "Let's Movie" marks its silver anniversary Sunday, April 14, the same day the 2019 TCM Classic Film Festival ends in Hollywood.

"It's a pretty great gig when your job means you have to watch three or four classic movies a day," attests principal TCM host Ben Mankiewicz, who now has on-air allies in Alicia Malone, Dave Karger and "Noir Alley" specialist Eddie Muller.

"We have great chemistry, and I like them very much," Mankiewicz says. "When Robert (the late TCM founding personality Robert Osborne) was hosting, as we increased the number of movies that were hosted, I took some of the burden off him – so I'm thrilled to be able to have the workload lessened slightly. It's still the greatest job in the world, but somewhere along the line, it stops being easy."

For many viewers, TCM is much more than a channel. It's a passion and even a state of mind, as verified by the success of such related events as the annual Classic Film Festival, the

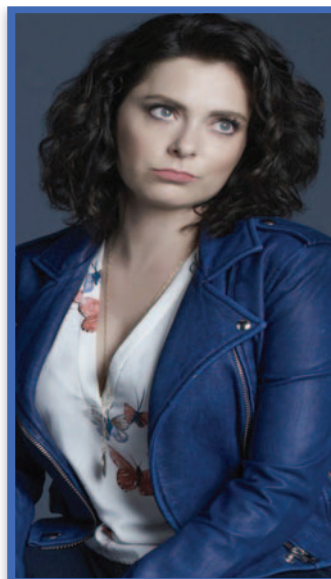
TCM Classic Cruise and TCM-themed bus tours in New York and Los Angeles ... plus the "Backlot" initiative that unites fans. And to whet the palette literally, there's even the TCM Wine Club.

Also the author of two books on women in film, Malone got early training for TCM by recording a movie host in her native Australia. "I wore out my tapes," she claims, "but I knew every word of those intros from back to front." Her longtime friend Karger – an entertainment-journalism veteran – adds, with a nod to TCM's history, "If I can just try to emulate Robert Osborne for the rest of my life, I think I'll be in OK shape."

Donaldson seeks health and a comeback year in Atlanta



Lost in the buzz of the Bryce Harper and Manny Machado free agencies this past offseason was the quiet signing of a former MVP that could have great impact on the race in the ultra-competitive National League East this season.

Josh Donaldson, who last November signed a one-year, \$23 million contract with the Atlanta Braves, was one of the most feared hitters in the game from 2013 to 2017, putting up a .282 batting average with 164 home runs, 491 RBIs, a .380 on-base percentage and an OPS of .904 as a member of the Oakland A's and Toronto Blue Jays. His best season came with the Jays in 2015, when his 41 homers, 123 RBIs and .297 average earned him the American League MVP award.

But then injuries began to take their toll, first a strained calf that limited him to 113 games in 2017, and then shoulder and calf woes that saw him play only 52 games in '18 and bat just .246 with eight homers and 23 RBIs, all career lows since he became a regular in 2013. With free agency looming, the Jays decided to get what they could for the three-time All-Star and shipped him to the Cleveland Indians for a pitching prospect in August.

Now at 33, in a new league and coming off two-straight injury-riddled seasons, Donaldson has something to prove. Toward that end, he worked on his lower body in the offseason to strengthen his feet, improve his mobility and most importantly, stay on the field all year. If he's right, he knows that the numbers – and another contract – will follow. The Braves are counting on it.

Donaldson can be seen in action when the Braves host the New York Mets Sunday, April 14, on ESPN's "Sunday Night Baseball."

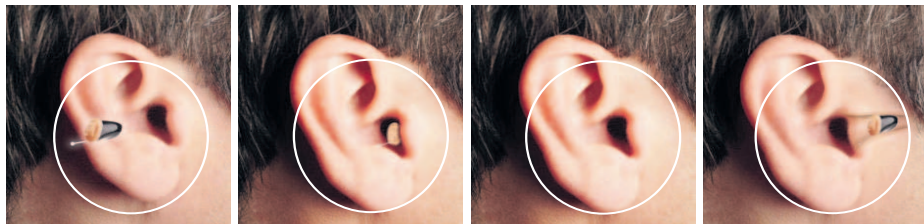

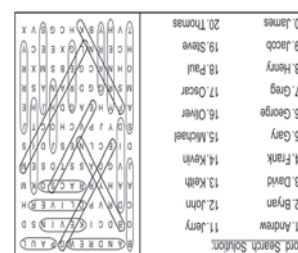
