Honorable Congressman Fauntroy:

On July 3rd 1988, all haitians were very proud of you. You made us believe that we had a great friend in Walter Fauntroy. During your speech to the Haitian Community of Miami at the Dupont Plaza Hotel, you promised us that the next 4th of July, we would celebrate in a free Haiti, " a Haiti free from Henri Namphy, Jean-Claude Paul, a Haiti free of Prosper Avril..., it will be good-bye military dictatorship, good-bye Avril..." We still want to believe in those words. We keep that tape very preciously; we listen to it all the time. We love to think that you are a man of word.

Now through the media, we heard that, as Chairman of the Haitian Task Force you are contemplating the reinstatement of U.S. foreign aid to Haiti.

Congressman Fauntroy, you and all Haitians know who Prosper Avril is. Useless to go back to the Duvalier era to remind you that the man is a crook and a criminal. Avril himself, if he were a decent citizen could put back in the haitian treasury, some 46 millions or more he stole personally during the last regime. Before asking for U.S. assistance, he could sell his house, which is worth 2 ½ millions, to a foreign Embassy and return the money to the haitian treasury. Avril should continue legal proceedings to recuperate the Duvalier's money, since for 11 years he was their banker and knows all the Swiss bank accounts of the Duvaliers. Then the U.S. Congress and the Chairman of the Haitian Task Force could consider helping Haiti with U.S. aid. The american taxpayers should be tired of helping tin horn dictators, "lazy military thugs, who refuse to work" as you called them at the Dupont Plaza Hotel speech, stuffing money in their Swiss bank accounts.

What we need in Haiti now is:

- 1.- The immediate restauration of the 1987 Constitution, without amendments, which was approved by 99% of the Haitian People.
- 2.- A Civilian Government of men, who do not fall under Article 291.


