# Invasion of the Exotics

From Burmese pythons to wild boars,  
non-native species making inroads

ON A RECENT WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON, Conservancy of Southwest Florida staff biologist Ian Bartoszek had seven Burmese pythons bagged and resting on a lab table. The largest, a female, hadn't been measured yet, but he estimated she was about 13 feet long and 80

pounds. Mr. Bartoszek and a team of four other scientists had extracted all of the snakes, by hand, from a gopher tortoise burrow in southeastern Collier County earlier in the day.

## Make it your job to see Marco museum exhibit





## Gunning for meteors



Florida legislators, like those in Texas, Arkansas, Utah and a few other states, are struggling this spring to decide if students or faculty with concealed-carry permits for handguns should be allowed to bring their weapons onto college campuses.

Actually, Florida legislators are not struggling, unlike university and college presidents in the state, many faculty members and students, and the chiefs of every campus police department, who hate the idea.

But they're all probably just a bunch of liberal patsies.

So while they sit around mewling, along with a few Democrats in the legislature, a Republican bill to arm-up campuses has squirted into and right through both the House and the Senate Committee on Higher Education, like crap through a goose.

If it gets through the Senate Judiciary Committee, it will only be up to Gov. Rick Scott to sign it into law. After that, everybody with a concealed weapons permit — and there were 1,364,584 in the Sunshine State as of five weeks ago, according to the Florida Division of Licensing — can enter academia car-

rying their pieces under their jackets: their 9 mills, their .45s, their .44 mags and .357s, not to mention their .38s and .40s, their widow-makers, their Saturday-night specials, their cannons, blasters, zips or equalizers, their mortars, their peashooters or their persuaders.

When was the last time you were on a college campus?

I visited two of them last week — one in Florida and one in Colorado, a state that confuses the hell out of me even though I grew up in it. In Colorado, legislators voted to legalize marijuana recently, but they have also legalized guns on campus, one of seven states to do so, creating a kind of hippy-high-yi-yo Wild West environment.

I used to walk through that Boulder campus of pink sandstone buildings topped by red Spanish tiles dreaming of utopia and love, and staring at either the coeds or the mountains right above town. But last week I felt a terrible compulsion to run from one tree to another and to stare at nothing, so I wouldn't get shot.

Some of these kids are probably armed, I thought in horror, studying the motley, half-stoned, mostly besotted assortment of undergraduate and graduate students stumbling along with the crazed and hopeful expressions of humans in high heat or with free passes to the ski slopes, or both.

Run, I thought. For cover. But I felt nothing like that on one of the Florida campuses a few days later —

the lovely wetland home of Florida Gulf Coast University in Lee County.

There, the students appeared freshly showered, cheerfully goal-oriented, and as peaceful as summer mornings in the park. To a man and woman they were unarmed, carrying books, cell phones and iPads, not bullets, magazines and pistols.

I felt, once again, that I could dream as I walked, as long as I wasn't dreaming when I walked past the alligator sunning himself on the bank of a pond near the campus's public radio station.

If he pulled that stunt on campus in Colorado and didn't freeze to death first, he might get shot.

It comes down to this, I realized: There are manifest places that define the reason for any guns in the service of something other than food gathering. Those are the places without guns.

Many people think of churches in this regard, and traditionally campuses of higher learning — like other schools, like courthouses or libraries — have also been viewed as the flowers of a culture or a country whose sacrifices have won them.

Peace, along with the quietude or repose that always swells like silent music where fear is held at bay, is the harvest of such places.

All of which made me wonder if, perhaps, Gov. Scott might recognize how valuable that harvest is, and reject the guns-on-campus bill when it comes across his desk.

But then I recalled that in 2011, the governor — a staunch ally of the National Rifle Association, a lobbying group for the very wealthy gun industry — was pushing legislation that would have allowed open-carry in Florida, in effect scratching the word "concealed" right out of the state's gun laws. I admired him for it and I know the National Rifle Association did, too, but for different reasons.

I liked the idea because I figured the governor would have looked so good wearing two pearl-handled Colt revolvers holstered on a black, hand-tooled gun-belt made by Rocky Carroll, the legendary Texas boot maker whose black boots appear on the governor's feet regularly, and are also worn by former President George W. Bush, Texas Sen. Ted Cruz and Texas Gov. Rick Perry, among many others.

The NRA, on the other hand, liked the idea because the more guns it helps the gun industry sell, the richer they get. They do that by creating a climate of fear, as if the only thing between you and a guy with a rifle, a pistol and some high-capacity magazines (pitched and promoted by the NRA's aggressive salesmanship) is that peacemaker on your hip.

Well, maybe. And it's also possible that instead of a deranged gun-bunny, an off-course meteor will come whistling in and hit you on the head.

Unless you shoot it out of the air first, of course. ■

## A diplomatic revolution

The socialist government in France usually doesn't have much in common with congressional Republicans, for whom both France and socialism tend to be anathema. But the French, according to a *Wall Street Journal* report, are taking the toughest line among the powers negotiating with Iran over its nuclear program and are alarmed by the Obama administration's accommodating approach.

"Some U.S. officials," the *Journal* writes, "privately believe France is seeking in part to maintain strong ties to Israel and to Arab countries deeply skeptical of Washington's outreach to Tehran."

The Iran deal will nullify the half-dozen U.N. resolutions calling on Iran to halt all uranium enrichment, at the same time the administration is floating the idea of going along with a new effort to isolate Israel at the U.N., in effect for the offense of re-electing Bibi Netanyahu.

There are barely words for the perversity of this turnabout. It would be a

step toward normalizing a rogue state and making a rogue state out of a normal country. It would be a rapprochement with a sworn enemy and a breach with a tried-and-true friend. It would be a diplomatic revolution in keeping with President Barack Obama's purported realism that has little regard for either our deepest-held values or coldblooded interests.

In a Huffington Post interview, President Obama warned that the Israeli-Palestinian status quo is "not a recipe for stability in the region." What stability? The Israeli-Palestinian conflict manifestly has nothing to do with the collapse of Syria into a catastrophic civil war, or with ISIS establishing control over a swath of territory in Iraq and Syria, or Yemen descending into chaos.

Israel holds free-and-fair elections in which Arabs can freely vote, even if Netanyahu made an ill-advised election-day comment about them; in country after country, Sunni and Shia forces kill and maim one another in a vicious fight for dominance by force. Israel builds settlements (mostly in areas that will stay part of Israel in any peace deal); Bashar al-Assad drops cluster bombs on people, and has reportedly returned to using chemical weapons.

It doesn't take great discernment to see the differences. It takes only a modicum of perspective, which President Obama can't muster as he sets about engineering a rupture with our only democratic ally in the Middle East.

Obama is often accused of amateurism and drift in his foreign policy. In a compelling essay in the online publication *Mosaic*, Michael Doran argues that the president has always had a strategic vision, with an opening to Iran at its heart.

This explains, Doran contends, the president's muted response to the 2009 democratic protests in Iran; his willingness to allow Iran to take a large hand in the Syrian civil war and hesitance to arm and train moderate Syrian rebels; his gift of sanctions relief to the Iranians, as well as major concessions in the ongoing negotiations; and his accommodation of a heavy military role for Iran in the fight against ISIS in Iraq.

The public campaign against the leader of Israel fits with the overall scheme. It is a testament to the folly and radicalism of this project that even the French have misgivings. ■

## The costs of war, the price of peace

What price would you pay not to kill another human being? At what point would you commit the offenses allegedly perpetrated by Sgt. Bowe Bergdahl, who was charged Wednesday with desertion and "misbehavior before an enemy." Bowe Bergdahl was a private when he left his post in Afghanistan, under circumstances that are still unknown to the public, and was captured by the Taliban. They imprisoned him for five years, until he was released in a controversial prisoner swap negotiated by the Obama administration. Five Taliban members who were held for years at Guantanamo Bay were released to house arrest in Qatar in exchange for Bergdahl. He now faces a court-martial and potentially life in prison. Meanwhile, the architects of the disastrous wars in Iraq and Afghanistan remain untried, while a new report asserts that up to 1.3 million people have been killed in Iraq, Afghanistan and Pakistan in the first 10 years of the so-called war on terror.

The report is called "Body Count" and is published in the U.S. by Physicians for Social Responsibility. "It has been politically important to downplay Allied forces' responsibility for the massive carnage and destruction in the region," writes San Francisco doctor Robert M. Gould in the report's foreword. He told me: "We need to take full responsibility for the true cost of war as we are preparing to continue our involvement in Afghanistan and deepen our involvement in Syria and Iraq. There's great

anger throughout the region about our involvement and the underplaying here of what the true costs are in terms of death and destruction."

This report was released just as Afghanistan's new president, Ashraf Ghani, was welcomed at the White House by President Barack Obama. Obama announced that he is slowing the planned departure of U.S. troops from Afghanistan, leaving 9,800 soldiers at least through the end of 2015. "It is my judgment, it's the judgment of General (John) Campbell and others who are on the ground, that providing this additional time frame during this fighting season for us to be able to help the Afghan security forces succeed is well worth it," Obama said. America's longest war continues, with no end in sight. Ghani visited the Pentagon during his time in Washington, as well as Arlington National Cemetery, where he laid a wreath of flowers to honor the fallen U.S. soldiers.

"Body Count" provides a startling update to the previously widely accepted estimate of casualties from the war on terror in Iraq, Afghanistan and Pakistan. "The figure is approximately 10 times greater than that which the public, experts and decision makers are aware. ... And this is only a conservative estimate," the report stated. "The total number of deaths in the three countries ... could also be in excess of two million, whereas a figure below one million is extremely unlikely." The report, writes former U.N. Deputy Secretary General Hans von Sponeck in its introduction, "must be seen as a significant contribution to narrowing the gap between reliable estimates of victims of war, especially civilians in Iraq, Afghanistan and Pakistan and tendentious, manipulated

or even fraudulent accounts. These have in the past blurred the picture of the magnitude of death and destitution in these three countries." Von Sponeck — who, in 1957, was one of West Germany's first conscientious objectors — also served as the U.N.'s Humanitarian Coordinator for Iraq at the time when crushing sanctions were killing thousands of people in that country. He resigned in protest of the sanctions.

We have not heard former POW Bowe Bergdahl explain, in his own words, how or why he left his post that June night in 2009. If he is subjected to the same military "justice" that Chelsea Manning received, we may be denied access to Bergdahl's voice completely through the trial. In Manning's court-martial, his voice was only heard because of a leaked, clandestinely made recording. The late Rolling Stone journalist Michael Hastings reported on Bergdahl, quoting emails from Bowe to his parents, before he was captured, that were harshly critical of the U.S. occupation. Bowe wrote, "I am sorry for everything here."

Afghan President Ghani honored thousands of U.S. military dead at Arlington National Cemetery. Will his gesture inspire President Obama, or his successor, to travel to the many cemeteries swollen with war dead in Iraq, Afghanistan and Pakistan? ■

after that, turned in our notices at work. We haven't lost sight of where we want to go in life and have lofty goals in mind ... We simply chose to enjoy a little detour while we have the means and ability to do so.

### What were your lives in Naples like before the trip?

Our lives were normal. We worked regular corporate jobs, Jereme as a professional engineer and myself as a marketing and brand manager. I also own and operate Kimberly Joy Photography, a family photography studio. We both spent most of our free time with family and friends ... Otherwise, Jereme could be found working on some home improvement project or another, and I loved volunteering at Humane Society Naples.

### How did it feel to go through the motions of putting your life on hold?

It was a whirlwind of emotions. The excitement and anticipation of what lay ahead felt amazing, and the sense of freedom was unreal ... Sharing this news with family and friends was a bit more interesting. We were both quite nervous to tell our wonderful, loving parents that we were giving up perfectly great careers to live on a sailboat in the Caribbean. But they took the news in stride. Both sets of parents encouraged us to go for it.





“It’s been a very snakey day,” Mr. Bartoszek said. “Every day on this project is a surprise.”

It’s widely known that Florida has, by far, the worst invasive reptile problem in the United States and state agencies cannot keep up with efforts to eradicate many of the most injurious species in the area. Most of these invasions result from released or escaped pets that thrive in subtropical environments, which has inspired the federal government’s crack-down on exactly what creatures Florida residents can purchase and keep for companionship.

On March 6 of this year, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Commission announced its latest move to combat the Sunshine State’s rampant reptile problem: Four

more species of exotic snakes have been banned from being imported and sold as pets. Snake enthusiasts can say goodbye to their hopes of owning a reticulated python, DeSchauensee’s anaconda, green anaconda or a Beni anaconda.

Even worse, reptiles are only part of the problem. An influx of exotic animals of all kinds are here to stay, leaving land managers with the task of managing populations rather than giving them the boot. Some species are without a doubt a nuisance and threat to native species; others, however, could be beneficial or neutral to our Southwest Florida environment — it just takes time and resources to figure it out. According to the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission, Floridians spend about \$500 million each year to combat and research wild invasive species, \$50 million of which goes specifically to eradicating injurious plants and weeds.

### Burmese pythons

Over the last few years, the Conservancy’s Mr. Bartoszek and his colleague, Paul Andreadis of Denison University in Ohio, have been leading a study of Southwest Florida’s Burmese python population with the goal of providing local land managers tools to deal with these new apex predators. The snakes, classified as one of the five largest basilisks in the world, are thriving and adapting to Collier County’s landscape with ease, to the point that few experts believe they can still be eradicated from the wild.

One of the researchers’ first, and key, findings is that Burmese pythons have figured out how to adapt to cold weather by seeking shelter to breed in gopher tortoise and armadillo burrows. The female they recently found is referred to as a “scentinal snake” because she had been previously tagged with a radiotelemetry device so researchers can track her movements. Mr. Bartoszek and his associates found her in a burrow, actively breeding with six male pythons.

“When you have a scentinal snake — more than likely a female with a tag that is receptive — she will lead us to other breeding males,” he said. “This time of year we know they’ll be looking for each other.”

Because of the python’s elusive nature, it’s practically impossible to know how many are established locally or in South Florida. There could be anywhere from 10,000 to 100,000 in Florida, all the way up to the Alabama and Georgia borders, but the current breeding population probably only extends to Lake Okeechobee, Mr. Bartoszek said. The ability to escape

short-lived freezes has been crucial to the snakes’ survival in South Florida, but it’s difficult to tell whether they have been able to expand their territory any further.

Utilizing the underground refuges of burrowing mammals might help Burmese pythons expand their range further to the north than previously thought possible, Mr. Bartoszek said. “If these microhabitats allow them to survive through a freeze event, then the snakes will continue to adapt to their new environment and gain ground.”

Burmese python sightings in the Everglades extend as far back as the 1980s,

but experts at the Florida Fish & Wildlife Conservation Commission think the problem was exacerbated when a breeding facility in Homestead was destroyed in Hurricane Andrew in 1992. However, Southwest Florida's crop might be from a different introduction to the wild, Mr. Bartoszek said.

"Some evidence is leading us to believe that, but it isn't proven," he continued. "I'm becoming more and more confident that's what were seeing in Southwest Florida. At the same time, the east coast group is coming in and overlapping." At some point researchers will have to perform genetic tests to confirm their suspicions, he added. In 2010, the state of Florida amended a previous statute that stopped the sale of certain species of pets, adding Burmese pythons and a variety of other reptiles to the forbidden list. Residents who acquired one of the reptiles before July 1 of that year were allowed to keep their pet, but are now required to maintain an ownership license. Reptile dealers, researchers and exhibitors, such as zoos, must also maintain a license to own "reptiles of concern."

It's still difficult to know whether the pythons are a unilaterally bad addition to our local ecosystems, but it is true that they have almost no natural predators in the Everglades or the highland areas that Mr. Bartoszek and his team have been studying. Alligators might be the snakes' only competition, and the two species eat each other in relation to their size and development. Farther afield, pythons have been found to eat a few endangered species, including the Key Largo woodrat, and protected species of wading birds.

"Some endangered species may benefit," Mr. Bartoszek said. "If raccoons eat sea turtle eggs and snakes eat raccoons, it would be good for the sea turtles."

Researchers' recent findings point to a number of applications. For instance, it's feasible that land managers could eventually have a device to trap the snakes in the burrows they invade, Mr. Bartoszek said. In the case of tortoise burrows, which it is illegal to disrupt, it's most likely the managers would have to acquire special permits, however.

Nevertheless, environmental officials and biologists now know to find the pythons in burrows during Florida's dry season in order to control the population.

The effort to understand pythons' impact on Southwest Florida's native species extends to Florida Gulf Coast University, where herpetologist John Herman, who contributed to the burrow research with Mr. Bartoszek, is hoping to mount a study on the python's effect on two native snakes: the federally threatened eastern indigo snake and the eastern diamondback rattlesnake.

"They live in the same relative ecosystem as the python is invading, and they seem to intersect at the use of gopher tortoise burrows," Mr. Herman said. Although a python would not eat either of the native snakes, he added, "they're going to be competing for food resources and for space."

Mr. Herman's proposed study would require that native snakes rather than Burmese pythons be tagged. Neither he nor any of his colleagues have any idea what the results could be, but it's an important step to figuring out what exactly the pythons plan to do now that they're here. "Hopefully, at the end of this and with the knowledge that they've gathered, we can put it together to make a really nice cohesive picture," he said.

Mr. Bartoszek is certain, however, that the public does not need to be frightened of pythons or do more than report sightings. Relatively few have been found in urban landscapes, even though the snakes do use manmade canals and water features to move easily through eastern Collier County.

"These animals are here through no

fault of their own," he said. "I'm more afraid of driving down 41 during season than I am about any snake or alligator, bar none. Period. That's the most dangerous thing out there."

"These animals aren't interested in us. They're just doing what they do well: repopulating the earth."

#### Lionfish

Adults of a certain age may remember the fascination of visiting a "fancy" restaurant as children and watching the majestic — and aggressive — lionfish flit around a massive saltwater aquarium. Today's Florida kids don't have to find a carefully curated collection of marine animals to sneak a peek at a lionfish. In recent years, the fish has made a break from tanks and now run rampant off the Atlantic coast and are found in increasing numbers in the Gulf of Mexico in Southwest Florida.

"Are you going to see them every time you stick your head underwater? No," said Florida Sea Grant Agent Brian Fleuch. "But in the past two or three years, the increase is impressive."

The flashy fish is widely recognizable for its garishly fanned fins and 18 poisonous spines. Lionfish can grow up to 18 inches in habitats where it is not indigenous, and in addition to being large and aggressive, they also reproduce at a remarkable rate. Unlike native species, lionfish can reproduce within a year of hatching. Female fish can release 5,000 to 20,000 eggs every four days to float on ocean currents to new locations.

"The big concern over all is that these guys can reproduce year-round," Mr. Fleuch said.

Like many other invasive species in Florida, experts believe the lionfish invasion started with only a handful of pet fish released into the ocean. From this point, the fish followed Atlantic currents to spread up the coast all the way to Rhode Island and down throughout the Caribbean and eventually into the Gulf of Mexico. The first reported sighting in Florida was in Dania Beach in 1985.

The lionfish is native to the Indian and Pacific oceans, where they have a variety of natural predators such as sharks, large

eels and grouper. Unlike their south Asian home, the Atlantic Ocean and neighboring water bodies have no animals likely to control the lionfish population. The fear, as with all invasive predators, is that the fish will compete with native marine species for habitats and gulp up everything in the food chain below it.

"They're voracious predators," Mr. Fleuch said. "That's certainly a concern for most of our biologists, the impact on commercial fisheries."

Most concerning of all is research published last year by Zack Jud, a marine ecologist at Florida International University, who discovered that lionfish are capable of moving into estuaries where much of South Florida's marine life hatches and grows to maturity.

"The estuaries are nursery grounds for a lot of species we depend on," Mr. Fleuch said. "That would be a major concern in terms of ecological and economical impact."

The rapid spread of the noxious species caught the attention of local officials when an angler snagged one with a hook and line (an unlikely method of capture) in 2013 within 100 yards of the beach in front of The Ritz-Carlton Beach Resort. In response, Collier County commissioners effectively lobbied the state of Florida to lift a spearfishing ban in state waters unique to Collier to effectively combat the lionfish spread.

Although most lionfish remain far offshore, people are increasingly finding them near onshore structures, according to Bill D'Antuono, president of the Naples Spearfishing League. "Someone found one at the (Naples) pier while they were diving," he said. "Anywhere you find structure or anywhere big fish are, you'll find lionfish, but you find more of them the farther out you go."

In the Gulf of Mexico and Atlantic Ocean, lionfish are partial to reefs, shipwrecks and what is called "live bottom," or seafloor that is exposed limestone. Southwest Florida doesn't have much of that habitat close to shore, unlike the east coast.

"The reef on the other coast is massive and only two miles out," Mr. D'Antuono said. "Here, it's just so far out and not

many people are going out there to dive. We do it because we're kind of crazy."

Because much of the Southwest Florida lionfish population resides offshore, it's even more important that locals be able to spearfish within the nine miles between shore and federal waters. Spearfishing is the only reliable method of capturing the fish, as they do not typically respond to hook-and-line capture or bagging.

"It's good that we can go after them now," Mr. D'Antuono said. "In a year, I got about 30 lion fish, personally." At a lionfish derby last year, he added, spearfishermen nabbed 55 in one day.

#### Nile monitors

Unlike the other invasive species being studied in Southwest Florida, Cape Coral's Nile monitor lizards are an urban problem that has been creeping out residents for almost 20 years. These smart, temperamental reptiles eat pets, climb roofs and frighten children as they devour pretty much anything that will fit in their mouths.

"They're a nuisance for sure," said Todd Campbell, associate biology professor at University of Tampa. "It's not like they're in the middle of the Everglades eating wood storks. People are afraid of these things and rightly so."

Nile monitors are popular pets — the second most popular African monitor sold in the U.S., according to Florida Fish & Wildlife Conservation Commission — that at some point were released in Cape Coral. They can grow up to 7 feet long and are best known for their hunting capabilities, intelligence and surly demeanor. They are the largest lizard in Africa and span the largest amount of territory, usually found in the vicinity of water bodies from desert fringes to rainforests. In Cape Coral, the monitors burrow along canals and can often be seen atop seawalls.

Mr. Campbell mounted a study of the monitors in 2003 to track their activities and movement throughout the area. Now that city of Cape Coral has an established method of trapping the lizards, it sends Mr. Campbell euthanized remains for study. He has been surprised by the number of amphibians and reptiles the monitors are eating, having expected they would have plenty of opportunity to replicate their native diet of invertebrates, small animals and ground birds. Cape Coral, for example, has Florida's largest population of burrowing owls.

"It's a regular occurrence that we find whole clutches of turtle eggs" in a Nile monitor, Mr. Campbell said. "One had 23 eggs, which is probably two clutches."

At the moment, he's attempting to identify which species of turtles the monitors are targeting. While Cape Coral isn't a nesting area for sea turtles, he is concerned about the monitors' ability to quickly travel long distances and their advanced swimming abilities. It's possible they could establish themselves on Sanibel Island, he said, which contains rich — and protected — habitat for many endangered and threatened species that would be part of the monitors' natural diet. Although the lizards have been spotted on the island in the past, they don't seem to have established a breeding population, he said. There are also other local spots within reach of Cape Coral where sea turtles nest.

"I would absolutely stake my reputation on the notion that if these monitors were in an area where sea turtle nesting occurs, all they would have to do is walk out on the beach and smell those eggs," he said. "Would it be as bad as raccoons? You'd have to have a lot of monitor lizards to be a problem."

Trapping is currently managed by Harry Phillips, an environmental biolo-

gist at the city of Cape Coral, who said the city has let go of any hope to eradicate the monitors.

“It’s really a situation of maintenance and a control effort,” he said. “We’re beyond that point in terms of how long they’ve been in Cape Coral. They’re in too many little pockets for us to get rid of them.”

## Feral pigs

Often referred to as the “king of pests” in Japan, wild boar have been rooting their way through the United States for centuries, after having been brought to North America in 1539 with Hernando de Soto. Today, feral pigs cause up to \$1 billion per year in damage to natural habitats and agricultural crops in 39 states. Florida has the second largest population, behind Texas.

In Collier County, experts have expressed concern over the pigs overtaking islands in the Rookery Bay National Estuarine Research Reserve and eating up sea turtle eggs. Having at one time populated mostly inland areas, urban development seems to have forced the pigs to swim to less-populated areas where the protected turtles return each season to lay eggs.

“They’re probably on just about every island in the Rookery Bay area that has enough elevation for them,” said David Addison, a senior biologist with the Conservancy of Southwest Florida. “They are a real threat to the sea turtles. In 2007

they got into the nests, and we’ve seen an increase over the last few years.”

Once a member of the pig population figures out “the egg puzzle,” he continued, they will continue to return to the beach and decimate nests.

“It’s like they threw a grenade in (the nests). It’s like they blew it up,” Mr. Addison said about the aftermath of a wild boar’s raid on a turtle nest. “Animals are OCD when it comes to that stuff. If they find a source, they keep coming back.”

Rooting and wallowing, which severely damages native plants and transports invasive seeds, seems to be the pigs’ most destructive behavior. They are also vec-

tors of disease that can infect wildlife, livestock and occasionally humans with pathogens including swine flu, cholera, tularemia, pseudorabies and anthrax.

Responsibility for managing the pigs and other invasive species in local state lands falls on Rookery Bay National Estuarine Research Reserve, which is currently trapping hogs in areas of concern, especially on Keewaydin Island and other barrier islands where sea turtles nest. Resources for such initiatives are limited, however; in the past, the reserve has hired private contractors and federal agencies to perform those duties.

One obstacle to controlling the pig

population is that the species is so entrenched in the United States that it would take a massive multi-state effort to eradicate them. In addition to being present in most states and Canada, pigs are an incredibly hardy species that can adapt to a variety of hardships. The current population is a hybrid of the Eurasian population brought over during the Spanish colonial era and escaped domesticated pigs.

“They’re very tough, they’re very adaptable, and they’re here to stay,” Mr. Addison said. “You’re not going to get rid of them.” Now it’s all about somehow getting the numbers under control, he added. “In terms of exterminating, there’s no way.”

## What to do

Because the invasive species problem is so pervasive in the area, environmental stewards rely on cooperative efforts between agencies and the public to track and manage all manner of non-native species. Homeowners are more likely to run into a plant problem than an animal problem (unless they live in Cape Coral), and are encouraged to report sightings by calling (888) IVE-GOT1 or visiting ivegot1.org.

The public is urged to not eliminate an animal, particularly a predator, themselves. Conservation organizations and state agencies follow specific protocols for the capture and elimination of individual animals, and those steps often require permits and licenses.



# NEWS OF THE WEIRD

## Man's best friend

Researchers are now preparing a study seeking to confirm that dog slobber, by itself (and not just the psychological advantages of playing with and petting a dog), might provide human health benefits (such as relief from asthma, allergies and inflammation).

Specialists from the University of Arizona and University of California San Diego point to existing evidence of the comparative healthiness of dog-owning families and suspect that canine saliva, like yogurt, may have unusual probiotic value.

## Updates

■ **India Justice:** Since News of the Weird last visited the judicial backlog in India (2013), the problem has worsened. The open caseload grew to 31,367,915 by the end of that year — a quantity that, if all of the country's judges, working around the clock, each resolved 100 cases an hour, it would still take 35 years to clear. Bloomberg Business Week reported in January that lawyers needlessly fatten the backlog with multiple filings, mainly to jack up their fees (and thus encouraging "extortion threats," in place of "law," as the preferred method of resolving disputes).

■ **Death-penalty opponents** have long sought a clear-cut case in which an obviously innocent person was wrongfully executed, and unsurprisingly, the great state of Texas appears about to provide that, in Cameron Todd Willingham (convicted in 1992 and executed in 2004). Since his trial, the arson evidence "proving" murder has been thoroughly discredited, and recently an ex-cellmate's 1996 letter surfaced — demanding that his own prosecutor comply with the sentence-reduction he was promised if he claimed that Willingham had "confessed" to him (and in fact the cellmate's sentence was substantially reduced after he wrote the letter, though the cellmate later appeared grievously remorseful). Prosecutor John Jackson is facing a state investigation for not disclosing the sentencing promise before trial.

■ **Elf Justice:** Public policymaking in the United States is often gridlocked by recalcitrant ideologues, but at least admin-

istrators are not constrained by elves, as in Iceland. After seven years of controversy, the country's Road Administration recently approved a new pathway near Reykjavik that had been delayed by a troublesome, 70-ton boulder in the right-of-way — which could not be dislodged because it is believed to be a "church" for the country's legendary "hidden people." The elves' leading spokeswoman, Ragnhildur Jonsdottir, finally declared, to officials' relief, that the elves had accepted the boulder's relocation (to the side of the road), having "been preparing for this for a long time, moving their energy to the new location."

■ **Four weeks ago,** News of the Weird noted that a United Nations representative opposed a suggestion to open certain meetings to the public, fearing that it would only invite spectators in the gallery to throw "mayonnaise" at the delegates. However, two months earlier (and unknown to News of the Weird), the Belgian prime minister, defending his country's austerity measures, had faced a group of protesters who had rained upon him french fries topped with mayonnaise.

■ **Three months ago,** News of the Weird highlighted a London man's agreement to pay the equivalent of \$500 for surgery on a nondescript office-aquarium goldfish, to relieve its constipation. Subsequently, however, veterinarians in Scotland (charging the equivalent of \$750) performed cancer surgery on two goldfish, and in September 2014, in Melbourne, Australia, a goldfish received "brain surgery" (for the apparent bargain of \$200).

## Recurring themes

■ **Japan may have its cat restaurants** (where loaner felines lounge during meals) and even its penguin bar in Ikebukuro, and London (as reported here a month ago) an experimental owl cafe (with specially domesticated birds perched on diners' shoulders), but not to be outdone, an entrepreneur in Seoul, South Korea, guesses that his Thanks to Nature Cafe will be a big hit — with sheep wandering through the dining room. (After all, according to the lunar calendar, 2015 is the Chinese zodiac Year of the Sheep.) Owner Lee Kwang-ho said his novel business model has attracted visitors from Macedonia, Saudi Arabia and New Zealand, among other countries.

■ **Home Unimprovement:** Recent cases to add to the classic "Don't DIY" Files: (1) Fred Horne of Columbus, Ohio, burned down his house in February trying to smoke the bedbugs out of his couch. Only that one piece of furniture caught fire, but carrying it out of the house, Horne got stuck in a doorway, and the blaze spread. (2) Near Darwin, Australia, in February, an unnamed woman living in an RV came face-to-face with a snake and decided to encourage the serpent to leave — by lighting a fire beneath the RV's floor. The vehicle was destroyed but, said the police superintendent, "we don't know what happened to the snake."

■ **Supporting the Troops:** Federal law prohibits foreclosures and repossessions (unless by court order) against active-duty military members, but Americans would hardly know that from observing creditors. A 2012 Government Accountability Office report found at least 15,000 violations by U.S. financial institutions, small and large, including J.P. Morgan Chase (violations News of the Weird reported in 2011). In February, auto lender Santander Consumer USA agreed to pay \$9.35 million to settle charges that it illegally seized cars of 760 service members (some while deployed in war zones) over the last five years.

■ **Artists Working in the Medium of Silicone:** Padge-Victoria Windslowe, a "Gothic hip-hop" performer known as "Black Madam" who carried out buttocks-enhancement procedures on the side ("thousands," she bragged) using industrial-grade silicone (and Krazy Glue to seal the injection site), was convicted in Philadelphia in March of the third-degree murder of one "patient" whose silicone leaked to her lungs. During the trial, Windslowe told the jury she had been called the "Michelangelo of buttocks injections" — though the reigning overachiever still appears to be Ron Oneal Morris, some of whose patients achieved higher booty-circumference numbers. (Morris is awaiting trial in Miami on manslaughter charges.) ■



  
  





# Research shows teen drivers most distracted by passengers, cell phones

Comprehensive research conducted into crash videos of teen drivers has found significant evidence that distracted driving is likely much more serious a problem than previously known, according to the AAA Foundation for Traffic Safety. The foundation's extensive video analysis finds that distraction was a factor in nearly six out of 10 moderate-to-severe teen crashes, which is four times as many as official estimates based on police reports.

Teens have the highest crash rate of any group in the United States. About 963,000 drivers ages 16-19 were involved in police-reported crashes in 2013, which is the most recent year of available data. These crashes resulted in 383,000 injuries and 2,865 deaths.

For the foundation's study, researchers analyzed the six seconds leading up to a crash in nearly 1,700 videos of teen drivers taken from in-vehicle event recorders. The results showed that distraction was a factor in 58 percent of all crashes studied, including 89 percent of road-departure crashes and 76 percent of rear-end crashes.

The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration previously has estimated that distraction is a factor in only 14 percent of all teen driver crashes.

"Access to crash videos has allowed us to better understand the moments leading up to a vehicle impact in a way that was previously impossible," says Peter Kissinger, president and CEO of the AAA Foundation for Traffic Safety. "The in-depth analysis provides indisputable evidence that teen drivers are distracted in a much greater percentage of crashes



than we previously realized."

The most common forms of distraction leading up to a crash by a teen driver included:

- **Interacting with one or more passengers:** 15 percent of crashes
- **Cell phone use:** 12 percent of crashes
- **Looking at something in the vehicle:** 10 percent of crashes
- **Looking at something outside the vehicle:** 9 percent of crashes
- **Singing/moving to music:** 8 percent of crashes
- **Grooming:** 6 percent of crashes
- **Reaching for an object:** 6 percent of crashes

"This research confirms that passen-

gers and cell phones are the two most prevalent distractions for teen drivers involved in crashes," says Matt Nasworthy, traffic safety consultant for the Auto Club Group of AAA. The findings, he adds, make a strong case for states to review their graduated driver licensing and distracted driving laws.

AAA recommends that state laws prohibit cell phone use by teen drivers and restrict passengers to one non-family member for the first six months of driving. Graduated driver licensing laws allow new drivers to gain practical experience in a relatively safe environment by restricting their exposure to risky situations. Thirty-three states have laws that prevent cell phone use for teens; 18 states have passenger restrictions meeting AAA's recommendations.

Parents play a critical role in preventing distracted driving. AAA recommends that parents teach teens about the dangers of cell phone use and restrict passengers during the learning-to-drive process.

Before parents begin practice driving with teens, they should create a parent/teen driving agreement that includes strict ground rules related to distraction.

AAA offers a comprehensive driver education program, where teens can learn specifically how using a cell phone affects driving abilities and increases their crash risk. For more information, visit [teendriving.aaa.com](http://teendriving.aaa.com).

# Florida consumer confidence reaches a 10-year high in March

Consumer sentiment among Floridians rose in March by more than three points to 96.8, the highest reading in 10 years, according to a monthly University of Florida survey. All five components that make up the index increased.

"Florida consumers are particularly optimistic about the future," says Chris McCarty, director of UF's Survey Research Center in the Bureau of Economic and Business Research. "The three components that are forward-looking are much higher than they have been for quite some time."

Expectations of personal finances a

year from now increased 2.4 points to 103.6, the highest level since August 2004. Perceptions of U.S. economic conditions over the next year rose 1.2 points to 94.6, while expectations of U.S. economic conditions over the next five years increased 3.4 points to 93.6, the highest since July 2004.

On the question of whether now is a good time to buy big-ticket items such as a car or appliance, March saw an uptick of 7.4 points to 106.1.

"Overall the index reflects a Florida consumer who is really feeling a recovery," Mr. McCarty says.

While increases in the overall index were broad-based across age

and income groups, there were some differences in some components.

Gains in the component comparing personal finances now with a year ago were higher among households making less than \$50,000 (up 4.5 points) compared with those making more than \$50,000 (down 1.9 points).

An even greater difference was noted in expected U.S. economic conditions over the next five years: Those making under \$50,000 per year decreased slightly (down 2 points), while those making more than \$50,000 surged up (9.4 points).

"This reflects lower-income households who have made some gains

recently but are less optimistic about the future," Mr. McCarty says, adding, "Upper-income households appear to be happy with future trends."

Floridians at various income levels may have different reasons for a positive outlook. Those invested in the stock market have cause for optimism as stock values recovered from a mid-month decline and approach record levels. For lower-income Floridians, gas prices remain low and are likely to stay there for a while because of the strengthening U.S. dollar, the currency used for international oil exchange.

positive. Housing prices increased in February to \$180,000 for the median price of a single-family home, up \$5,000 from the previous month and a 9.1 percent increase from a year before. Mortgage rates have been declining over the past month and are once again near historic lows.

The Florida unemployment rate remained steady at 5.7 percent in January. And although the "U6" measure of unemployment that also counts part-time and discouraged workers is still higher in Florida (12.8 percent) compared with the U.S. (12 percent), it has declined considerably from 19.3 percent in 2010.

"For now, Florida's economy is doing quite well — with the caveat that wages remain persistently stagnant," Mr. McCarty says. "But many

economists see signs that wages will pick up. The rate of people who quit a job is up to 2 percent in January from 1.7 percent a year ago, suggesting that workers see better-paying opportunities that later translate to higher wages."

Conducted March 1-23, the UF study reflects the responses of 419 individuals who were reached on cell phones and who represent a demographic cross section of Florida.

The index used by UF researchers is benchmarked to 1966, which means a value of 100 represents the same level of confidence for that year. The lowest index possible is a two; the highest is 150.

on historical photographs and archival accounts of workers to tell the story of how work impacts our individual lives and the historical and cultural fabric of our communities.



## Three nonprofits team up for community art project

After sea turtle nesting season ends on area beaches in the fall, other turtles will arrive in the form of "Turtles on the Town," a collaborative art project of the Community Foundation of Collier County, the Conservancy of Southwest Florida and the United Arts Council of Collier County.

Turtles on the Town will include a public art exhibition from November-February of 50 fiberglass reinforced polyester sea turtle sculptures embellished by local artists and artisans. A gala auction of the sculptures will take place in March 2016.

The model used for the sculptures is based on a bronze sea turtle created by the late Kathy Spalding, a longtime supporter of local environmental and arts projects. Ms. Spalding offered her support to Turtles on

the Town before she died last September. The models are being cast locally by Architectural Masters.

Many community and business leaders have already pledged their support. Lavern Gaynor and Geraldine Martin have each made a \$50,000 commitment as major sponsors.

May 1 is the deadline for artists to submit renderings of their vision for a sea turtle sculpture. They can submit more than one rendering, and more than one artist can work on a single turtle. Interested artists should email [info@uaccollier.com](mailto:info@uaccollier.com) for details.

Turtles on the Town patrons — businesses, individuals, couples, families, groups of friends, alumni associations, school PTOs,

youth and adult sports teams, etc. — will pay \$5,000 to underwrite a sculpture during the public exhibition stage. Patrons do not keep the sculpture they support. For information about becoming a turtle patron, email [kreisman@cfcollier.org](mailto:kreisman@cfcollier.org).

Those who want to own a turtle will ultimately vie for the opportunity at the Turtles on the Town gala set for March 9, 2016.

### About the collaboration

The Community Foundation "hatched" the idea and seeded Turtles on the Town with a start-up loan of \$150,000. The foundation will use its share of the proceeds to establish two funds to support the arts and the environment in the community.

The Conservancy of Southwest Florida

will use its proceeds to support its loggerhead sea turtle protection and monitoring program, Kemp's ridley sea turtle research efforts and education programs that reach more than 7,000 students annually.

For more than 32 years, Conservancy biologists have tracked the threatened loggerheads, documenting more than 4,500 nests on Keewaydin Island and giving more than 260,000 hatchlings have had a chance at survival.

The United Arts Council will use its portion of proceeds to expand its education efforts with at-risk students, among other things.

Many people have heard about LASIK or know someone who has had it done, but do not know what LASIK actually does. LASIK surgery is the use of a laser to correct the need for glasses or contact lenses.

**What if I need reading glasses?**

People around age 40 who need reading glasses are still good LASIK candidates as they can have something called monovision performed, which involves using the laser to correct one eye for distance vision and the other eye for close vision.

**What if I am older than age 50?**


Generally people over the age of 50 are not LASIK candidates.

**Does LASIK hurt?**

The answer is usually not. There is a slight discomfort and pressure during the surgery, but no need for pain medication after the surgery is done.

**What do I need to do to prepare for surgery?**

If contact lenses are worn they have to be removed a week before surgery. Prior to the treatment further instructions will be provided.



**Will I see during the surgery?**

During the surgery the eyes will be numb with anesthetic drops. The eyelids will be held open to prevent blinking. Any eye movement is tracked with the laser's tracking system. During certain parts it is normal for everything to go dark and to see the flashing lights of the laser.

**How do I choose a LASIK surgeon?**

When it comes to surgery, experience and training is the key component. Having an ophthalmologist with LASIK subspecialty training is very important.







Jereme had to jump in the water in the middle of nowhere to inspect our propeller and make sure we didn't have any of the plastic rope remains on our boat. Luckily, we didn't ...

Or how about our hefty sail from the Dominican Republic to Puerto Rico, where we had a close call with a huge cargo ship in the middle of the night? Jereme misjudged the direction of the ship and tried tacking away from it. Much to his dismay, he actually tacked closer to the ship. A crew member on the container ship immediately began flashing white lights at us from their control tower, so Jereme quickly tacked back. This little bout of excitement took place while Oliver and I were obliviously unaware and napping below deck.

Probably one of the biggest experiences for us was getting engaged on my birthday, two months after we had set sail. We were anchored in Calabash Bay off Long Island, Bahamas ... To this day, it is still one of our favorite spots we've visited in the Caribbean.

We've also snorkeled some of the clearest turquoise blue waters I could have ever imagined. We found and harvested live conch and dined on homemade conch salad in the out islands of the Bahamas. We fed beach pigs in the Exumas, swam with stingrays in the Berry Islands and friendly sea turtles in Culebra. We watched whales surface off the coast of Mayaguana. We hiked the breathtaking 27 waterfalls of Rio Damagua and motor-biked through sugarcane fields and gorgeous Dominican countryside. We rode horses on the beach in Rincon. We've met some of the most generous and kind people on the planet and enjoyed some of the best sunsets of our lives.

### Any life lessons you're bringing home?

There are so many parallels between the sport of sailing and real life. We've learned that it is not in our best interest to keep the boat sitting anchored in one spot for more than a few days. Otherwise, the boat tends to accumulate bottom growth, which can seriously affect its performance. We tend to think that the same could be said for the real world. It's important to keep things alive and moving. You can never realize your full potential if you allow yourself to get too comfortable.

We have also learned a great deal about ourselves and one another. Life aboard, in less than 200 square feet of living space, takes extreme teamwork, camaraderie and a passion for life and one another.

### What are your plans for getting your life back up and running?

We enjoy land life just as much as this simple boat life we've been living for the past year. As much as we are excited to return to some of life's little luxuries, we know all too well how much we will miss certain aspects of this cruising lifestyle.

Professionally, I am beyond thrilled to get back to my photography business and all of my amazing clients who have patiently awaited our return. Jereme is planning on getting back into the working world as well and is open to all different types of opportunities.

We have lots of grand plans for our future and a family. What's great about this sailing journey is that it's really just one small notch in our grand adventure at life. And what a wonderful thought it is that some of the best days of our lives haven't happened yet. ■



## Depression is common and requires individualized care

At some points in life, we all experience bouts of the blues, moodiness, sadness, worry, fear and anxiety. For many people, the feelings are temporary. For others, the feelings persist and affect day-to-day life. When this happens, it is important to seek help from a mental health professional, as depression often gets worse if left untreated.

"Depression is very common — one in six adults may be depressed," explains Daryl Tanski, M.D., psychiatrist at the Lee Physician Group Behavioral Health Center. "There isn't one specific cause of depression; it can be a combination of genetics and stressors, like traumatic or stressful events, the death of a loved one or even going to college or starting a new job."

Dr. Tanski says depression often manifests in the late teenage years or early 20s, but, because of social stigmas or cultural bias, it may be years later that a person seeks treatment.

"Unfortunately, there are still misunderstandings about depression, and people feel ashamed," he says. "But, just like a heart problem or other physical condition, depression and mental illness require medical intervention, which, depending on the severity, may involve medication, psychotherapy — also known as talk therapy — or both."

The treatment plan is individualized. "For most people, depression doesn't just happen once; it is reoccurring," he says. "It is very important that we



provide education so the patient recognizes when he or she should reach out for help."

Dr. Tanski added that short bouts of sadness or anxiety don't constitute depression. Instead, symptoms of depression last most of the day, nearly every day for more than two weeks. These symptoms can include:

- Loss of pleasure/joy, withdrawing from family and friends.
- Feelings or a sense of sadness, emptiness, unhappiness.
- Changes in appetite — either loss of or increase in appetite.
- Altered sleep patterns — either insomnia or sleeping too much.
- Concentration problems, trouble thinking.
- Negative thoughts — feelings of

worthlessness or guilt.

■ Anxiety — 50 percent of patients with depression will have significant anxiety

■ Thoughts of suicide. If you are having suicidal thoughts, get help right away from a close friend or loved one, or call the National Suicide Prevention Hotline at (800) 273-TALK.

"Depression is highly treatable, and there shouldn't be shame or discomfort in seeking help," Dr. Tanski says. "Untreated depression can lead to other issues, like substance abuse if someone is self-medicating with alcohol or drugs, for example. We are here to help determine the best plan of care in order to restore each patient's quality of life." ■

# Dog's nose for cancer may improve treatment

• A scent-trained German shepherd mix named Frankie had an 88 percent success rate in detecting thyroid cancer in human urine samples. A study presented earlier this month at the Endocrine Society meeting in San Diego found that the accuracy of the canine “diag-nose-tician” is only slightly less than that of the more invasive fine-needle aspiration biopsy, not to mention less expensive.

“Frankie is the first dog trained to differentiate benign thyroid disease from thyroid cancer by smelling a person’s urine,” says study co-author Army Ferrando, Ph.D., of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences in Little Rock, where the study was conducted.

• Have you ever wondered which cat breeds are largest and smallest? Compared to dogs, cats don’t vary a great deal in size: There might be a feline equivalent to the Chihuahua, but not to the Great Dane (lucky for us!). Among the heaviest breeds are Norwegian forest cats and Maine coons, weighing 7 to 22 pounds; Siberians, 10 to 20 pounds; Turkish vans, 7 to 19 pounds; and Savannahs, 20 pounds or more. Falling into the featherweight category are the singapura, 4 to 7 pounds; and the Cornish rex, Devon rex and Japanese bobtail, all weighing 6 to 9 pounds.

• Genetic testing isn’t enough to improve the health of purebred dogs, say scientists at the University of Edin-

burgh’s Roslin Institute. To improve genetic diversity, they recommend a combined approach using DNA analysis, health screening, limiting the use of individual stud dogs, and cross-breeding — an approach that has been successful in breeding Dalmatians lacking a genetic defect that causes kidney stones, a common problem in the breed. Screening

dogs for health problems before breeding them has helped to reduce the prevalence of some diseases, and DNA tests may help to eliminate disease-causing genes, but relying solely on tests and screening can reduce the gene pool. ■

# Battle *of the* Convenience Stores

At a RaceTrac convenience store and gas station in Fort Myers, Thomas Maloy, Lucius Jones, and John Griffin often come in for lunch. The store boasts a frozen yogurt bar with more than 40 toppings, fresh sandwiches, and tables inside and out.

"This is our everyday stop right here," Mr. Jones said. "Nice drinks, food — and beautiful women."

Customers expect more from convenience stores these days than just a tank gas, some junk food, and a coffee. Chains in South Florida are ramping up with expansion plans, building new and bigger stores. They're upping the ante, especially on food and beverages that often emphasize health, as well as other services such as free Wi-Fi at



## After years of writing about money, columnist to call it quits



It is hard to imagine that I have been writing this column since 2008. The expression “time flies” seems trite until you experience the fleeting passage of time.

This week’s column bids adieu to my readers and ends my tenure as *Florida Weekly’s* Money and Investing columnist. This is not my very last column, but it is an announcement that my departure draws nigh. I wanted to write my farewell now so as to capture the eyeballs of my seasonal readers and prepare them for an upcoming column that will be a comprehensive look at investing and where investors currently find themselves.

In 2008, the newspaper’s executive editor suggested a column that would cover a broad range of money and investing topics. He felt that if I could talk to him about all sorts of money and investing topics, I might well be able to write about them, too.

I was not sure that I was up to the task; money and investing is a broad subject and *Florida Weekly* entertains and educates readers with widely varying economic and educational back-

grounds. But I was a single mom raising two teenage children and I needed to re-launch my investment career, which I had left on Wall Street some 15 years earlier. I counseled myself that the column was an opportunity for me to re-engage my mind on these topics and I would be pleasantly forcing myself to get clear about these money topics. The last time I had written for the public was at NYU’s Graduate school of Business as co-editor of the school newspaper in 1978.

My first *Florida Weekly* column was presented to one of my sisters who is a professional writer for her review before submission. The second column was less a family project. Pretty soon, I was writing so much that a week’s passage would find me forgetting about that which I had written a week earlier.

Then and now I hold to the premise that you cannot write about that which you do not understand nor believe to be true. Many can talk about a subject, but far fewer can write about it. Not that the speaker would lack writing skills (and some might), but there is something about print that is unforgiving and allows scrutiny by readers. A presentation with slides, a meeting in lavish offices, an animated discussion with hands flying and emphatic vocal tones etc. allow many a half-baked investment idea to pass muster or a marginal sales pitch to be bought hook, line and sinker. Print changes all of that. The words and concepts stand on their own. They are

their own energy and their own logic.

Over the course of eight years, many readers have written to me. I have greatly appreciated their time to read my column and to write — and the courtesy of providing their names as opposed to anonymous critiques. Do not hesitate to email a columnist, as we are pleased to get feedback, and we need your many good ideas for column topics. For me, for many other columnists, writing requires work: much reading, much conceptualizing and then much writing effort.

Here are several writing-related concepts that might have relevance for you.

Take time to write what you understand to be your financial plan. Yes, an expert can write it for you but if you write it, you will know if you understand it. Putting it on paper and posting it in a visible spot holds you accountable to that plan; whether it be savings, portfolio allocation, education, visiting with new advisers, etc.

Second, when you read financial content, in this paper or elsewhere and you do not understand it, take the column to others who might understand and have a conversation. Much of my understanding has begun with, “Can you explain what this means?” The reason there are so many areas of financial specialization is that it is sufficiently complex.

Third, write to your children and grandchildren about financial topics. It is part of your legacy. You can pass on to them your financial successes and

failures. How much better if they vicariously experience our financial blunders rather than their own.

Back to the present: After 15 years of being a solo parent, a single gal, I am going to tie the knot. I recently got engaged to a man of great character who once ran a large publicly traded company. Interestingly, my fiancé was a friend first; his lack of romantic interest in me did not deter me from wanting and enjoying his friendship. Time often snuffs a flame, but it can also fan a flame. I plan to exit my peripheral business interests as my mainstay investment profession will continue and it is sufficiently demanding.

I thank those who have edited my columns over the years. They connected the disjointed, challenged me to explain the confusing and created titles when I felt brain dead.

I am so happy for the success of this newspaper — for the founders who took great entrepreneurial risk and for the Florida residents who have benefited from the excitement the paper brings to local communities. I’ve been proud to work with a product that highlights positive community news and has announced to the print media industry that the newspaper is alive and well when content is good and relevant. ■

RaceTrac or surcharge-free ATMs.

That's a feature of the beloved Pennsylvania-based chain Wawa. It is opening its first Southwest Florida stores on April 23, promoting a "kitchen forward" concept with a touch-screen ordering system for its famous hoagies, and options like smoothies, pita and hummus, and skim milk with your latte.

Demand for better food is shaping offerings at convenience stores industry wide.

"Customers who come to our stores really like the taste of our food and we believe that's a part of having loyal customers," said Dorian Cunion, manager of franchise, marketing and recruiting for 7-Eleven, pointing out the chain's proprietary pizza, sandwiches and doughnuts. "We're seeing really strong growth rates in food and beverage in those stores."

Wawa plans to open 50 stores in the state in 2015 and 2016, and hopes to break ground in Broward and Palm Beach counties in 2016. It already has more than 50 stores open in the Tampa and Orlando areas. RaceTrac, Speedway, 7-Eleven and other chains are growing as well.

The new stores are a normal part of a recovering economy and population growth, said Christopher Westley, an economist and professor at Florida Gulf Coast University. They also provide entry-level jobs.

Not including construction, a Wawa store provides up to 40 jobs, a spokesperson said.

"These are important jobs for unskilled workers to have," Professor Westley said. "A lot of times these are entry level jobs to better jobs."

## Wawa

Wawa is opening three stores in Lee County on April 23, at 2370 Colonial Blvd. and at 12701 South Cleveland Ave. in Fort Myers, and at 1622 NE Pine Island Road in Cape Coral.

"We've got something kind of tailored to everyone's cravings and I think that's what makes us distinct from other retailers," said Wawa spokesperson Lori Bruce.

Wawa is a privately held company with 675 stores. It opened its first Florida store in July 2012. Each store costs on average \$5.5 million to build.

Wawa considers itself "friends and neighbors serving friends and neighbors," Ms. Bruce said. "Beginning with our first store, our associates pride themselves on working their way into the hearts, minds and fabric of people's lives."

Their competition has similar goals. "Our people are our competitive advantage," said RaceTrac franchisee Joe

Graham, who owns 14 stores in Charlotte and Lee counties. "We want to be your neighborhood store."

"The key in the end is caring and being persistent, basically having a relationship with the customers and being part of the community," said 7-Eleven franchisee John Hays, who owns four stores in Palm Beach County and Miami.

## RaceTrac

Joe Graham used to manage logistics for a high-end furniture company. He got into the convenience store business six years ago, becoming a franchisee with RaceTrac. His 15th store is scheduled to open in Estero this summer.

"Fresh and healthy is big," he said. "We want to be a lunch destination and a breakfast destination."

RaceTrac, an Atlanta-based chain with 380-plus locations in the Southeastern U.S., has built eight new "6k" for 6,000-square-foot stores in the last 30 months in Lee County, Fort Myers, Cape Coral and Bonita Springs.

"It's just a bigger, brighter, more appealing store," said RaceTrac spokesperson Jessica Rice.

It has no stores planned in Charlotte County but "we are actively looking to expand our footprint" there, Ms. Rice said.

RaceTrac's newest location in Collier County opened near the end of March on Marco Island, with two more set to open this year. The company has three new stores opening in Palm Beach County this year as well.

A subsidiary of Marathon Petroleum Company, Speedway has also expanded its footprint. Last year, Marathon bought out Hess stores in the eastern United States.

"Our Speedway assets were in nine states and this acquisition pushed us into 22 states," said Chuck Rice, a spokesperson for Marathon, and doubled their total number of stores.

That includes two Speedways in Charlotte, seven in Collier, 23 in Lee and eight in Palm Beach counties.

## 7-Eleven

John Hays bought into 7-Eleven as a franchise owner last year after working for more than 20 years in the retail banking industry. Now instead of products like auto loans, mortgages, and credit cards he offers hot sandwiches, fresh fruit, and of course, Slurpees.

"Coffee and tea and the foundation drinks and in our case especially the Slurpee, that is a focal point and a public attractor," said Mr. Hays, who owns two 7-Elevens in Palm Beach County, and two in Miami with a fifth soon to open. "I have seen a lot of innovation even in the few months that I've been partnering with 7-Eleven. We're coming out with two hot melts that are being launched now.

These are Italian and chicken sandwiches. All of that is obviously increasing the basket because in the end it's helping the customer do everything in one place and that's what convenience means."

With so much competition in the market, Mr. Hays said standing out means being persistent and consistent.

"Making sure everything's clean and the store's fully stocked every time," he said. "The consistency there is key."

7-Eleven currently has 19 stores under construction in the state. It currently has 465 stores in Florida, some corporate owned and some franchise owned.

To attract franchisees like Mr. Hays, the chain is waiving most of the new franchise fees on 44 stores in Florida through June 30, typically those at locations with lower sales. That's a savings of about \$80,000 per store. It cuts the costs of licensing, permits and initial down payments to about \$30,000.

That includes locations in West Palm Beach, North Fort Myers and Bonita Springs. Basic qualifications for a franchisee are having excellent credit and

\$50,000 in liquid assets.

"Some of our most profitable stores are in Florida and we're seeing really strong growth rates in food and beverage in those stores," said Mr. Cunion. "We want to increase our market share in Florida." ■

# Microsoft taps Naples company for annual Visionary Award

Naples-based Kelly Roofing is one of 12 companies that received a 2015 Visionary Award during the recent Microsoft Convergence conference in Atlanta. The awards recognize customers who have achieved new levels of excellence with their Microsoft technology. Other winners include Pandora Jewelry, Barclays and AccuWeather.

Ken Kelly, owner of the company with his father, Joe Kelly, accepted the award on March 17 while on stage with Microsoft staff to discuss how he uses Microsoft products.

In 2012 when Ken Kelly anticipated the economic recovery had begun, he sought a technology solution to ensure that customers, sales staff and administrative employees had accurate and ongoing communication about where each job was in the company's production cycle.

"I was looking for software that would allow us to manage customer relations as well as the operational side of the business," he says. He selected Microsoft Dynamics CRM, which provides personalized customer experiences, proactive tasks for customer contact and analytics to identify patterns and predict outcomes.

Mr. Kelly says the efficiencies of the software helped his company double in business without growing its staff. His staff can access the software from anywhere, which is important because most of his employees do not work in the office. The software allows everyone to add notes to a file, receive automatic reminders and spend more time with customers, because mundane tasks are automated.

He was surprised when the Minneapolis-based company he hired to help him implement and program the software nominated his firm for the Microsoft award, which was won by Delta Airlines last year.

"It's an absolute honor," he says. "We're just a little family business, a roofing company, that doesn't typically win this type of stuff."

Microsoft conducted several phone interviews with Mr. Kelly before selecting the firm as the winner. They flew to Naples to film and create a two-minute video about the roofing company. The conference in Atlanta included Mr. Kelly's presentation to 15,000 attendees and a live stream broadcast to 60,000-100,000 people.

Kelly Roofing has approximately 75 employees working in Collier and Lee counties and last year did more than \$10 million in sales. ■



### Add Some Women to Your Portfolio

Diversity in investing has been getting more attention lately, as many investors are now seeking companies that have promoted more women to key managerial positions and placed more women on their boards of directors.

With women now making up nearly half the workforce, it would seem natural that women would start playing a bigger role at the heads of the nation's companies. And yet last year, only 17.7 percent of Fortune 1000 companies' board of directors seats were held by women, and more recently, only 4.8 percent of CEOs of companies in the S&P 500 were women.

With that in mind, some investor groups and organizations have begun to promote as choice investments companies that support the advancement for women. And this strategy isn't just a feel-good idea, either.

Data has shown that women are often superior investors compared to men, with a lower risk tolerance that can lead to better decision-making, more long-term planning, less frequent trading and higher use of outside help. In fact, from 2000 to 2009, hedge funds managed mostly

by women produced an average annual return of 9.1 percent, versus 5.8 percent for a broader composite of hedge funds.

Other data has shown that companies with more women in their top managerial positions and boards are more successful, even during periods of financial strain. From 2006 to 2012, large companies with more women on their boards averaged annual revenue growth of 14 percent versus 10 percent for companies with mostly male boards.

If you're interested in a mutual fund focused on companies with progressive practices of advancing women to key roles within the organization, check out the Pax Ellevest Global Women's Index Fund (PXWEX). Some of its top holdings (among several hundred) are PepsiCo, Lockheed Martin and Procter & Gamble; the first two have female CEOs, and the third has a significant number of female executives.

While gender diversity should not be your only consideration when choosing an investment option, the long-term benefits of diversity could provide your portfolio with staying power. ■

## My Smartest Investment

### Marriage and Money

One of my dumbest investment stories is intertwined with one of my wife's smartest ones. Way back in 1973, I made the mistake of "telling" her to sign some papers so we could sell some of our stocks. Since I hadn't discussed it with her before telling her to sign, she refused. Over the next bunch of years, I invested \$35,000 in a lost cause, losing 95 percent of the money. We still held those unsold stocks, though, and they did very well. I'm still thanking my wife.

**The Fool Responds:** It's always best for couples to discuss their finances together, ideally making joint decisions. It's also smart to not let one partner take care of all things financial without involving the other. The less-involved one should know where all the related papers and passwords are, in case they need to take over at some point.

Hanging on to stocks for many years is a great way to build big wealth, but you shouldn't do so blindly. Check in on your holdings every quarter or so to make sure the companies are still performing well, with strong prospects. ■

What does a REIT's "FFO" refer to?

— R.N., Petal, Mississippi

First off, know that REIT stands for Real Estate Investment Trust. A REIT may look and act like an ordinary stock, but it's a different kind of company, getting certain tax benefits and required to pay out at least 90 percent of its income as dividends. REITs typically own many properties, such as offices, laboratories, nursing homes, hotels, shopping centers or apartments.


With most companies, investors will examine net income, which reflects the profits left over from sales after all expenses have been subtracted. REITs are different, though. According to accounting rules, the value of REIT properties is decreased over time, with depreciation charged against and reducing net income.

In reality, however, real estate properties are probably not falling in value and may even be appreciating. So a REIT's net income tends to understate its health. Thus, you should look at a REIT's "funds from operation," or FFO, instead. It ignores the effect of depreciation and other non-cash charges and gives you a truer picture of the REIT's performance. ### Is It Time to Step on the Gas?

You don't witness a 55 percent drop in oil prices without there being some genuinely negative repercussions for energy stocks. The collapse, which has been driven by a glut of oil in U.S. terminals and refineries, as well as the insistence of Saudi Arabia that it has no plans to cut production, could, for example, cause ExxonMobil's profits to fall by more than half in 2015.

But this weakness in oil prices, and the resulting drop in energy-company stock prices, can be a reason to go on the offensive rather than retreat. Carbon-based fuels are expected by some to continue to meet 75 percent of the world's energy demands in 2040, and energy demand is expected

to rise 35 percent by then, too. If you're skittish about investing in energy stocks now, or aren't confident you'll pick the right ones, consider investing in the Energy Select Sector SPDR ETF (NYSE: XLE).

Exchange-traded funds, or ETFs, are a bit of a cross between mutual funds and stocks. The Energy Select one, for example, is an easy way to invest in about 43 oil-and-gas and service companies for an ultra-low annual fee — just 0.15 percent of assets. Not surprisingly, ExxonMobil and Chevron make up more than a quarter of total assets, resulting in strong cash flow and a recent dividend yield of 2.3 percent. (The Motley Fool recommends Chevron.) ■



## Ashton Woods opens four models at Naples Reserve

## Fit for royalty: Miami's Taj Majal in the sky for \$3.2 million

Miami is no stranger to avant-garde architecture. Known for years as a cultural melting pot and America's southernmost gateway to the world, it has brought star architects from around the world and like-minded developers together for decades.

Long after the original Art Deco period in South Beach, the next colorful and avant-garde architectural statement came in 1963 when the Bacardi rum family fled Cuba and re-established their headquarters on Biscayne Boulevard, building the stunning Bacardi Building with its brilliant blue and white tile design up its tall sides. Then came Arquitectonica, which infused new life into Brickell Avenue where Old Florida mansions once overlooked Biscayne Bay. Arquitectonica's high-rises were boldly colorful with what some thought "shocking" design such as large openings in the middle as seen every week on the opening segment of NBC's "Miami Vice."

But one of Miami's luxury condos, the Palace, had a secret. On its 40th floor rooftop was a glamorous three-story glass condo with a terrace that encompassed the entire roof and 360-degree views over Key Biscayne, the Miami skyline, west and south Miami and the Atlantic beyond Biscayne Bay.


Completed in 1981, the condo was immediately grabbed by Leona "Queen of Mean" Helmsley. Always seeking the

best for herself, Mrs. Helmsley was well practiced in knowing a great piece of real estate when she saw it, and this one she had to have. But just before she and Mr. Helmsley were to move in, Saudi Sheik Saoud Al-Shaalan made an offer — and if there was anything Mrs. Helmsley loved better than superb real estate, it was a big profit. She took the offer and happily went off on her next spending spree.

The sheik brought in 27 Moroccan craftsmen and in two years had turned the rooftop residence into a romantically exotic blend of Persian, Turkish and Indian style inspired by the Taj Majal. He sold it in 1999 to international real estate developer and antique weapons collector Anthony Tirri. But as Tirri's type tend to do, he moved on to remodel an aging French chateau, and now Miami's Taj Majal is up for sale.

At 5,801 square feet, the Palace's sky palace has six bedrooms and five baths with lavish details of mosaic tile, carving and plasterwork throughout. The massive great room is large enough to hold any fundraiser in ultimate style; on west-south side, a huge greenhouse-sunroom offers an additional venue for entertaining or sitting back to enjoy the sun and fragrance of the potted citrus blooms.

Wonderfully eccentric, luxurious and romantic with jaw-dropping views, the home on top of Miami's Palace condominium priced at \$3.2 million. ■

## Yours to have for \$26 million: Lauren Bacall's Dakota apartment

With a long history of some of the world's most powerful business, sports and movie star owners, The Dakota at Central Park West in New York City is one of the most prestigious residential addresses in the world. John Lennon and Yoko Ono moved into the building in 1973 and lived there until John was murdered outside the building's 72nd Street entry in 1980 by a deranged fan; Yoko still has a home there. The building's exterior was filmed as the home of Mia Farrow's character in "Rosemary's Baby."

The building's design is a mix of French Renaissance, German Gothic and English Victorian steep-pitched roofs,

dormers, moldings, balconies, pavilions and a Dakota Indian figure watching over the main entrance. (The legend is that it was named "The Dakota" because it was built in 1884 in the boondocks, far away from the most popular areas of Manhattan.)


The idea and construction of the building was from Edward Clark, co-founder of the Singer Sewing Company, who did real estate on the side.

One of the most famous long-time residents of The Dakota was the sultry, contralto-voiced Lauren Bacall. She began her long career as a model doing covers for Harper's Bazaar and Vogue before getting her first acting job at age 19 in "To Have and Have Not." Her most famous films, including "Key Largo" and "The Big Sleep," were with co-star Humphrey Bogart who she married in 1945 and stayed with until his death in 1957.

Ms. Bacall died at age 89 in 2014 at her home in The Dakota where she lived for 53 years. Her nine-room, three-bedroom, four-bath apartment with almost 100 feet facing Central Park is now for sale.

The residence retains exceptional 19th century Dakota features such as 13-foot ceilings, a foyer fireplace, 11-foot pocket doors, wainscoting, the original butler's pantry, plaster moldings, shutter-framed windows and hardwood flooring. A 70-foot-long gallery opens to the major public rooms including the library, great room, and formal dining room. A Juliette balcony opens over treetop Central Park views.

## Russian painter captures Naples on canvas

Gallery on Fifth in Mercato presents “Neapolitan Moods,” an exhibition of oil paintings by Russian artist Julia Kostsova depicting Naples streetscapes, beachscapes and other favorite places.

Ms. Kostsova was academically trained in the Russian traditions at her hometown art school in Yekaterinburg, Siberia, and later at the famous Repin’s Art Academy in St. Petersburg. She paints in an impressionistic style that gallery owner Olga Arkhangelskaya considers to be quintessentially Russian and Siberian — not preachy, but “raw, crude and powerful.”

“Siberia is quite a rigorous place and it affects everything — the outlook of the people and how they look at the world — and it reflects their character,” Ms. Arkhangelskaya says. “Despite being very soft-mannered and very soft-voiced, Julia demonstrates tremendous strength in her work.”

Gallery on Fifth first presented an exhibition of Ms. Kostsova works last year. The paintings, many depicting pre-Christian folk customs from her homeland, were so well received that Ms. Arkhangelskaya invited the young artist to spend time in Naples painting local scenes.

The work was quite a departure for Ms. Kostsova.

“When I arrived in Naples, I knew immediately that I was facing working in a completely different light — the sun is quite different from other places I’ve been,” she says. “In this sun-drenched environment, the colors of nature are quite different from what I was used to.”


“She couldn’t grasp it. The light is so different,” Ms. Arkhangelskaya says. “Everything here is so absolutely flat. There are no shadows, there is no depth. The sun is so high it is absolutely disorienting. She was puzzled.”

After several days of thinking and studying, Ms. Kostsova ventured to Lovers Key and Big Cypress National Preserve, among other outdoor destinations.

“We directed her to go to the most beautiful places, but they’re differently beautiful,” Ms. Arkhangelskaya says. “They’re not Russian, they’re not France, they’re not Europe. This is Florida.”

The landscapes themselves were different from the European scenes



## Visualizing a garden ... but wishing for something else



My whole life, I wanted a garden. I could picture it with exquisite clarity: Rows of tomatoes, squash and peppers. Herbs, too — cilantro, basil, mint.

In all my time wandering the globe, a long stretch of rootlessness flecked with an aching loneliness, I held on to this image of a garden. Some day, I thought, I will cultivate my own plot of land.

Now, here we are.

I have a house, a yard and — you guessed it — a garden. I turned over this little strip of dirt alongside the fence up close to the house and planted all the things I'd been imagining: tomatoes, peppers, a row of herbs at the front and a big eggplant smack in the middle. I water every morning. I'm always down on my hands and knees weeding.

One day, I spent the better part of an afternoon digging up old bricks from beside my driveway and building a low wall around the garden. When it was done and I was sunburned, my back screaming, I stood in front of the little plot of land and thought, *This is it?*

After years of seeing it clearly on the screen of my mind, I discovered a disconcerting truth: I don't really want a garden. For all that labor, all that sweat and hard work, I've ended up with a



few mealy tomatoes and three of the mildest jalapeños you can imagine. The squirrels beat me to the best part of the harvest, and I don't even mind. The entire experience has been, well, underwhelming.

Someone told me recently that the key to happiness is visualization. I don't disagree. I've long believed that the way to get what we want is to first imagine

it. But what if the thing we're imagining — visualizing — isn't what will make us happy?

Like most women, I've been trained since infancy to believe I want two things: marriage and children. If we can just lock that down, the common wisdom goes, then everything else will fall into place. For my part, I've been visualizing this for so long and with such

intensity that the image is burned into my mental screen. *Why, I agonize, is it not working out for me?*


Midway through my garden project, I bought my first papaya tree. It was a revelation. The unexpected beauty of it, the knowledge that I'd have to wait months for it to bear fruit, the idea of the fruit itself was all so exotic and complex. I loved the tree so much that I went back the next day for two more. Then I bought a mango tree. An avocado. A lychee. As it turns out, what I really wanted was a tropical orchard.

Here in my mid-30s, with neither husband nor baby on the horizon, I wonder if all these years I've been visualizing the wrong thing — not what would make me happy, but something I thought I was supposed to want.

Sometimes we invest so much energy envisioning a particular version of our future that we forget to consider other options.

The good news? There's a whole world out there. Why waste our time planting tomatoes when what we really want is lychees? ■



Ms. Kostsova is accustomed to painting. She says she was most struck by Lovers Key, where the waves “were almost lyrical, poetic.”

“When I was painting, I stood alone in the warm waves, like solitary rugged trees,” she says. “The feeling was of complete peace and immersion into purity and oneness with nature.”

After finishing some paintings in natural settings, she turned her attention to some urban landscapes, capturing the downtown Neapolitan atmosphere while painting in plein air on Fifth Avenue and Third Street South.

Consisting of 15 paintings, “Neapolitan Moods” will hang in Gallery on Fifth until April 22. Several of Ms. Kostsova’s renderings of Russian folk customs remain on display there as well. ■

## Fikry &amp; Zevin &amp; Hozier &amp; Annie

A while ago, I had dinner with people who, throughout the entire meal, talked about food and recipes and restaurants.

Reading Gabrielle Zevin's novel, "The Storied Life of A.J. Fikry," was a little like that experience: I was reading a book in which the characters love books, read books and talk about them all the time.

It'd be an understatement to say books are important to them. (In fact, one character decides not to go on a second date with a man because when she asks what book had the greatest influence on his life, he replies, "Principles of Accounting, Part II.")

The A.J. Fikry of the title, whom the author describes as "a little bit Silas Marner, a pinch of Mr. Darcy," is a curmudgeonly, 39-year-old widower who owns a bookstore on an island off Massachusetts. He's surrounded by books, literally and figuratively.

His life changes when a 2-year-old is abandoned in his bookstore, with a note from her desperate mother that reads in part: "I want her to grow up to be a reader. I want her to grow up in a place with books and among people who care about those kind of things."

Mr. Fikry's life also changes when he meets a publisher's sales rep, Amelia Loman, from Knightley Press. (Yes, Loman as in Willy Loman in "Death of a Salesman," and Knightley as in Mr. Knightley in Jane Austen's "Emma." Literary references abound in this novel. Even its paperback cover is self-referential; it's the image of a bookstore, and in the front window is a copy of the hardcover edition of "The Storied Life of A.J. Fikry.")

Kirkusreviews.com describes it as "a likeable literary love story about selling books and finding love."

This *New York Times* Best Seller is a behind-the-scenes look at the commerce of bookselling and includes mention of publishers' seasonal catalogs, galleys and advance readers' copies; it affirms that books have

the power to change our lives in ways great and small. And it's also a behind-the-scenes look at how our hearts work.

Elaine Newton, of the Critic's Choice lecture series at Artis—Naples, has picked it to wrap up this year's season. She'll also interview the author, Ms. Zevin, onstage at 10 a.m. Thursday, April 9, and Saturday, April 11. Tickets are \$45. The April 9 session is sold out. (Ms. Zevin will also give a talk and sign books at Barnes & Noble in Waterside Shops at 7 p.m. Thursday, April 9.)

Because this season marked the 25th anniversary of Critic's Choice, Ms. Newton says, "I was looking for a novel that could happily and suitably end this special season, a season that included (Donna Tartt's) 'The Goldfinch,' (Sue Monk Kidd's) 'The Invention of Wings,' (Anthony Doerr's) 'All the Light We Cannot See,' (Helen Oyeyemi's) 'Boy, Snow, Bird' and (Colum McCann's) 'Transatlantic.' A novel that would be different from each of these. Perhaps a new, young voice, certainly one that was entertaining, poignant, wise and honest."

When she devoured "The Storied Life of A.J. Fikry" in two sittings, she knew this was the novel.

"It's a love story about books and writers and booksellers and the role of reading in all our lives," she says. "It's full of humor and sadness and love. It's heartwarming, delightful and very, very clever."


"Perfect. Just the right gift to say 'Thank you for 25 years' to a loyal, thoughtful audience of committed readers. And it would be just the right thing to have Gabrielle Zevin on

stage in conversation with me."

## Hozier &amp; Annie Lennox

I know the Grammys were televised back in February, but I still can't get them out of my head.

Sometimes the awards show seems like a contest for the biggest display of ego, and sometimes the musicians seem like they're competing to see who can be the most outrageous when they perform.



For me, the Grammys isn't half as much fun now that they've cut the number of awards handed out, and the awards for the not-as-commercial awards aren't even televised. (Did you know, for example, that Rosanne Cash won three Grammys this year?)

The producers of the show match people up to together.

Sometimes they're a really odd mash-up. But sometimes they make sense, as when they paired Jessie J with Sir Tom Jones this year to sing the Righteous Brothers' "You've Lost That Lovin' Feelin'." Both are powerhouse singers with great voices, and they were both coaches for a couple of seasons on the UK version of "The Voice."

But then, a little later in the show, Hozier performed his hit "Take Me to Church," and about two minutes into the song he introduced Annie Lennox, who walked out to wild applause to join him on the chorus. The band then segued into "I Put a Spell On You," and the crowd cheered as Annie took the lead.

Ms. Lennox has a voice so powerful, so compelling, she could've been

a siren luring sailors.

She certainly cast a spell over the audience. They were on their feet before she'd finished the song.

She was sexy, she was sultry, she was mesmerizing.

She won the audience over without any back-up dancers, unusual costumes or special effects — just her voice, belting out the song, slowly raising it to a fever pitch. She was, hands down, the best performance of the night, showing them all, effortlessly, how it should be done.

And, the former Eurythmics singer is 60, proving the adage that age is just a number.

Her performance has close to 5 million hits on YouTube right now, and continues to rise. I've watched it numerous times myself, and the magic is still there, every time.

It's compelled me to go back and watch some of the early Eurythmics music videos, now 30 years old. Not the hits that got the most radio play — "Sweet Dreams (Are Made of This)" and "Here Comes the Rain Again" — but the ones that make you want to turn the volume up to 11: the rousing "Would I Lie to You?," the haunting "Love is a Stranger" and "I Need a Man," where Ms. Lennox struts around and vamps like a trashy-sexy version of Marilyn Monroe.

The songs are so good, I just can't get enough of them. And so I watch and listen to them over and over.

I've watched her medley with Hozier so often that now when I hear his hit played on the radio, I'm always disappointed not to hear her at the end of the song. To me, the two songs are forever joined.

And yet, here's the mystery of the short-sightedness of current radio programming and today's music industry: I've yet to hear Annie Lennox singing "I've Put a Spell on You" on the radio.

Apparently, they seem to think we want just the same few songs played over and over and over.

As for me, I'm going to keep watching the videos and listening to the music that way.


I agree with Rosanne Cash, who, upon receiving one of her Grammys, said, "Ray Charles said, 'You're a better singer at 50 than you are at 30, because your whole life shows up in your voice.'"

Annie Lennox is certainly proof of that. ■



Narrative Spotlight films include Evangelos and George Giovanis' "Bereave" (Malcolm McDowell, Jane Seymour), Bill Pohlad's "Love and Mercy" (John Cusack, Paul Giamatti), Olivier Assayas' "Clouds of Sils Maria" (Juliette Binoche, Kristen Stew-

art) and Andrew Bujalski's "Results" (Guy Pearce, Cobie Smulders).

Documentary Spotlight films include Matthew Heineman's "Cartel Land," Bryan Carberry and J. Clay Tweel's "Finders Keepers," Barbara Kopple's "Hot Type" and Albert Maysles' "Iris."

SFF 2015 will also honor the late documentary master Albert Maysles by screening a newly restored print of his classic "Grey Gardens" and his penultimate film "Iris" to cap a daylong program of "The Most Fashionable Films Ever" in honor of that film's subject. The Sundance Institute Short Film Challenge, a partnership between the Sundance Institute and the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation to spark conversations about solutions to global challenges, will showcase "175 Grams" (India) by Bharat Mirle, "Dropping In" (South Africa) by Willem Van Den Heever, "Isabelle's Garden" (U.S.A.) by Jef-

frey Palmer, "Man in the Maze" (U.S.A.) by Phil Buccellato and Jesse Ash, "A Will of Iron" (Nigeria) by Seyi Fabunmi and Mobolaji Adeolu, "Melody" (Chile) by Marialy Rivas, "The Visible Hand" (Argentina) by Gael García Bernal, "The World is as Big or as Small As You Make It" (U.S.A.) by Heidi Ewing and Rachel Grady, and "Nana" (Mexico) by Diego Luna.

This year's festival also includes its first-year partnership with the prestigious Screenwriters Colony, founded in 2002 by John Johnson, co-founder of BuzzFeed and a Henry Crown Fellow at the Aspen Institute. The Screenwriters Colony was formed to provide an outlet for a select group of emerging screenwriters to engage with peers and receive guidance from industry professionals. Past mentorships have included Cary Fukunaga ("True Detective"), Frank Pugliese ("House of Cards") and Henry Bean ("Internal Affairs"). During the partnership's inaugural year, the colony will present a television writing intensive workshop.

(Voices of Jim Parsons, Rihanna, Jennifer Lopez) Alien Oh (Mr. Parsons) comes to Earth and clumsily helps a girl (Rihanna) find her displaced mother (Ms. Lopez). There's nothing special about the animation, it's not all that funny and there's not much here for adults. Rated PG.

**While We're Young** ★★

(Ben Stiller, Naomi Watts, Amanda Seyfried) Middle-aged marrieds Josh (Mr. Stiller) and Cornelia (Ms. Watts) receive a shot of youthful adrenaline when they spend time with the much-younger couple Darby (Ms. Seyfried) and Jamie (Adam Driver). Although writer/director Noah Baumbach's ("Greenberg") film has occasional laughs, it lacks the conviction to say something worthwhile. Rated R.

**The Gunman** ★★

(Sean Penn, Javier Bardem, Idris Elba) A sniper (Mr. Penn) tries to figure out who ordered a hit on him in the Congo. Mr. Penn is fine and the action is decent, but the whole thing plays like a tedious slog. Rated R.

**Run All Night** ★★★

(Liam Neeson, Joel Kinnaman, Ed Harris) Mob boss Sean (Mr. Harris) and his hit man Jimmy (Mr. Neeson) are old friends, but all that changes when Jimmy is forced to kill Sean's son (Boyd Holbrook). It's a tense

drama with solid action and performances. Rated R.

**Cinderella** ★★1/2

(Lily James, Cate Blanchett, Richard Madden) Maiden Cinderella (Ms. James) falls for Prince Charming (Mr. Madden) despite her step-mother's (Ms. Blanchett) efforts to make her miserable. This live-action, non-musical reimagining of the classic fairy tale is pure and sweet as can be, which is good for the little girls of the target demo but a bore for adults wanting a little bit of edge. Rated PG.

**The Second Best Exotic Marigold Hotel** ★★1/2

(Dev Patel, Maggie Smith, Judi Dench) With his marriage looming, Sonny (Mr. Patel) tries to open a second hotel while his current guests get into trouble of their own. It's a noble sequel with its heart in the right place, but it's nothing special. Rated PG.

**Focus** ★★

(Will Smith, Margot Robbie, Gerald McRaney) Con artist Nicky (Mr. Smith) takes an aspiring grifter (Ms. Robbie) under his wing and is surprised he falls for her (even though she's ridiculously hot). It's fun for a while, but you never buy the love story and the plot is disjointed. In other words, it lacks focus. Rated R. ■

## 'Get Hard'

Is it worth \$10? No

The opening moments of "Get Hard" feature two shots of Will Ferrell's pale white backside. This is expected; he shows his derriere in all his comedies, and we're getting it over with early here. Now the movie can be creative. Daring. Try new things. Push boundaries. Make us laugh for reasons we didn't know existed.

That "Get Hard" attempts to do all of the above is laudable; that it only moderately succeeds is, well, laughable for many reasons.

Mr. Ferrell is millionaire fund manager James King, and he's on top of the world. His gold-digging fiancé, Alissa (Alison Brie), can't wait to spend her life with him in their mansion. Her father, Martin (Craig T. Nelson), also happens to be James' boss, and things couldn't be better at work. Or so James thinks. Then, at their engagement party, while John Mayer plays a song for them, James is arrested and charged with 43 counts of securities fraud and 30 counts of embezzlement.

He maintains his innocence but is sentenced to 10 years in maximum security at San Quentin prison. He's given 30 days to get his affairs in order. Accordingly, he completely freaks out. For help he enlists the guy who washes his car, Darnell (Kevin Hart), to teach him to survive in prison.

To be clear, director Etan Cohen is asking us to believe that even though James is smart enough to run billion dollar hedge funds, he's also so blatantly ignorant that he thinks Darnell has been in prison just because he's African-American. Ordinarily this would be offensive, but Darnell is in on the joke, and director Cohen gets some good laughs from Darnell's wife (Edwina Findley Dickerson) and daughter (Ariana Neal) as a result of the situation.



The burden of the bulk of the laughs, however, lands on Mr. Ferrell and Mr. Hart, and while both are game for the challenge, they're not always effective.

James' training includes how to fight, survive a riot, always be on guard, etc., and in each scenario the two actors never lack for energy. What they do lack, however, is chemistry, because they never play well off one another. They're nearly uncomfortable together, in fact. It's as if they're consumed with doing their own thing to make sure they appeal to their fan base, forgetting that the collaborative power of comedy is stronger than what an individual can provide.

A prime example is when they're in the makeshift prison yard and Darnell imitates what a contentious African-American, Latin and gay confrontation could feel like. The scene requires Mr. Hart to shift gears in a nanosecond while Mr. Ferrell stands there as the straight man, likely unsure if he should improvise in order to keep the scene going or just let Mr. Hart do his thing. Conversely, Mr. Ferrell later has a moment in which he goes


on a trash-talking rant that requires Mr. Hart to just sit and listen. Add to this some truly desperate moments (James having a tough time performing fellatio, and the otherwise cowardly Darnell breaking up a Neo-Nazi party, for example), and you have a comedy that probably reads funny on paper but doesn't play well on the big screen.

This is Mr. Cohen's first feature directing gig, and no doubt the lack of chemistry between the two leads is in part due to the way the film was shot and edited. Timing, pacing and editing are essential in comedy; a great joke can be delivered perfectly by the actor, but if it's not presented correctly, all the humor will be lost. This is not to say that happens all the time in "Get Hard," but it happens enough for more jokes to miss than hit. ■

## BEACH READING

### 'Audrey and Bill: A Romantic Biography of Audrey Hepburn and William Holden'

Audrey Hepburn could appreciate the irony that while she spent years studying ballet, she never became a dancer. And although she didn't devote time to acting during her formative years, she became both a movie and stage star.

She was a rare phenomenon who did not have classic movie-star looks. In fact, renowned British photographer and fashion designer Cecil Beaton once described Hepburn as "a new type of beauty: huge mouth, flat Mongolian features, heavily painted eyes, a coconut coiffure, long nails without varnish, a wonderfully lithe figure, a long neck, but perhaps too scraggy." What Beaton failed to note is that regardless of the imperfections he saw, Hepburn had a presence that connected

both professionally and privately. She appeared in the Broadway production of "Gigi" when she was 22 years old. In 1953, she made her first film, "Roman Holiday," co-starring Gregory Peck. It was a hit, and she began "Sabrina" the following year.

A great deal was riding on "Sabrina." The film was crucial to her career, since it would prove — one way or another — if her success in "Roman Holiday" had been a fluke. It was a difficult project. The script was written as they went along, and Humphrey Bogart and William Holden, her co-stars, disliked each other. The set was often hostile and tense. Despite difficulties, when Hepburn and Holden met it was electrifying, and their attraction gave "Sabrina" an authenticity that made the film a major hit.

Through extensive interviews, author Edward Epstein reveals for the first time the on-set romance between these two film legends, and how it became a common thread in both their lives. ■

# FLORIDA WRITERS

## An exciting account of an astounding engineering achievement

Can statistics be exciting? In the case of Les Standiford’s energetic presentation of this enormous undertaking, the quantitative facts are essential and astounding. The goal was simple: to find a way for a small desert town to flourish. The lack of an adequate water supply circumscribed that possibility. William Mulholland had the vision — a vision many doubted and quite a few mocked.

Mr. Mulholland designed an aqueduct system to bring copious amounts of fresh water from 223 miles away via the power of gravity. Through landscapes often beautiful, but remote and stubbornly resistant to conventional reshaping methods, crews working under Mr. Mulholland’s leadership reshaped the flow of rivers, built conduits above and below ground and established a network of dams incrementally taking the

water from higher to lower levels.

Before the aqueduct could be built, however, an infrastructure was needed to provide transportation, electricity and the housing, nourishment and medical care for the countless workers who would be involved in the project. Because much of this construction would be through a mountainous region, equipment had to be invented and fashioned to solve engineering problems never before faced.

A self-taught Irish immigrant, Mr. Mulholland was up to the task that took six years and cost \$23 million. How did the fellow find himself in the position to do this job? To what extent did his colossal, confident and forthright personality predict the course and eventual outcome of this venture? These are among the questions the author answers in a book that is at once biography, history and science.

Such projects need to be sold. Where does the money come from? What vested interests have to be satisfied? What kind of water and property rights need to be obtained? Mr. Standiford clarifies the economic and political issues, which are also enormous in scale. Indeed, often these issues threatened to cripple the endeavor.

Such gigantic undertakings are a bet on the future. For Los Angelinos, the bet paid off big — if you think immensity is desirable. Fresh water became more plentiful and less expensive, making all kinds of expansion possible. Confidence in the future of Los Angeles brought plenty of investment capital.

Transforming waterpower into electric power helped to sell and sustain the aqueduct system.

Though people in the northern communities affected by the aqueduct construction often complained about the project’s negative impact on their property values, it is likely that some of those communities gained substantial benefits. The project, and the enhanced water and electric power system, were and still are an employer. Mr. Standiford provides a fine analysis of the pros and cons, sorting out the claims, the facts and the rumors.

He also paints glorious pictures of the region around the Owens River (the source for the aqueduct flow), the Owens Valley and other scenic areas along the aqueduct’s path. These well-wrought descriptions make us wonder if building the aqueduct and the associated dams necessitated ecological damage. This, too, would be a cost to set against the benefits.

Given the unparalleled scope of the Los Angeles aqueduct project — the difficult terrain, the knotty engineering problems and the magnitude of the legal and financial issues — one can be amazed at how accurate the author’s timetable and budget turned out to be. Of course there were setbacks now and again, but most were resolved smoothly and effectively.


One full-fledged disaster, however, sullied Mr. Mulholland’s reputation and seemed to suddenly change

this robust figure into a fading old man. This was the March 1928 collapse of the St. Francis Dam with the attendant flooding, property damage and loss of life. Approximately 600 people died, a number exceeded only by the San Francisco Earthquake in 1906.

Mr. Standiford, experienced in crafting similarly fascinating slices of American history — beginning with “Last Train to Paradise:

Henry Flagler and the Spectacular Rise and Fall of the Railroad that Crossed an Ocean” (2003) — has done an outstanding job recreating an epoch, a change-making enterprise and a larger-than-life American. If he hadn’t before been recognized as a major exemplar of the American Dream — and of dreaming big — William Mulholland, certainly not a man without flaws, can be recognized now in the full dimension of his astounding achievement and remarkable personality.■

## KOVEL: ANTIQUES

### A jug designed for fools at the bar

Practical jokes are not a new idea. Puzzle jugs that trick bar patrons can be traced back to the 15th century or even earlier. By the middle of the 17th century, puzzle jugs large enough to hold about two cups of beer were made by many pottery companies in England. Almost all had decorations related to drinking, plus unusual cut-out designs and a rounded rim with protruding spouts. There often was a poem that encouraged a bet with a drinker to test if he could drink without spilling. The idea persists. George Ohr, the early 1900s pottery genius from Biloxi, Miss., made small puzzle mugs that held just one cup of beer. Early puzzle jugs from Liverpool, Leeds, Bristol and Doulton, as well as 19th century jugs from Cambrian Pottery, Swansea, Sunderland, Ridgway and others, all relied on the same puzzle. Of course the pierced holes made it impossible to tip the jug without spilling liquid, but to win the wager, you had to drink the contents of the jug. It was a simple trick. The rounded rim had one hollow spout that was used as a straw to suck the drink thru the hollow handle. It led to the inside and the contents of the jug. Smart bar patrons should not have been fooled twice. Today, there are copies of early jugs that sell for \$75 to \$150 and antique examples that are \$150 to over \$1,000. They are all fun on April Fools' Day.

**Q:** My husband and I bought a hexagonal "occasional" table at an Atlanta flea market about 40 years ago. The top is about 30 inches across. It has a lower caned shelf and turned legs with carved stretchers. A metal tag underneath says "H. Pander & Zonen, Den Haag, Amsterdam, Rotterdam." The table is in good condition with original finish. We'd like to sell it. Any idea of its history?

**A:** The Pander family was in business in the Netherlands for over 100 years. In 1855, Klaas Pander started making rush mats for fisherman. His son, Hendrik, opened a furniture workshop, with model rooms displaying furniture, in 1887. It became H. Pander & Zonen (H. Pander & Sons) and eventually was one of the largest furniture companies in the country. H. Pander & Sons bought an airplane-manufacturing company in 1924 and made small planes, as well as furniture, until 1934. The company had offices or factories in The Hague, Amsterdam, and Rotterdam. It went out of business in 1985.

**Q:** My scale was in an upstairs room in my grandparents' old farm house as far back as I can remember. I have the original envelope with instructions on how to use it. The directions say it's a 10-ton capacity wagon scale. There is a date of "11-10-41" in one corner. Do you have any information about this scale and what it's worth?

**A:** Thaddeus and Erastus Fairbanks, two brothers, founded The E & T Fair-

banks Co. in St. Johnsbury, Vermont, in 1824. Thaddeus Fairbanks invented the platform scale and held several patents for weighing scales. By the late 1800s, Fairbanks scales were sold worldwide. Today the company, called Fairbanks Scales, sells a wide variety of scales. It has corporate offices in Kansas City, Missouri. There are a limited number of buyers of old wagon scales. It probably would have to be sold at a farm auction.

**Q:** I have a white cup and saucer marked "Pyroceram Brand Tableware By Corning." What is Pyroceram?

**A:** Pyroceram was developed at Corning in the 1950s. The process was discovered by accident in 1952, when a piece of glass was overheated and turned into a white glass-ceramic material that was break-resistant. The material originally was used on rocket-nose cones because it was transparent to radar. It was used to make CorningWare cookware beginning in 1958. The cookware was resistant to sudden extreme temperatures and could go directly from freezer to stovetop to table. Millions of pieces of the cookware and restaurant ware were made. Your cup and saucer are part of the line made for restaurants. Original Pyroceram was not made after the late 1990s. World Kitchen bought Corning's consumer products division in 1998 and began making CorningWare in 2001. The original Pyroceram material was brought back in 2009. Four Pyroceram cups and saucers sold online for \$12 and a cereal bowl sold for \$7.

**Tip:** Always carry a slab of marble with the thin edge up. The weight of the piece, if carried the wrong way, could crack the marble. ■



**CONTRACT BRIDGE**

**The better way**

BY STEVE BECKER

Safety plays come in all shapes and sizes, and are necessary in many deals. Sometimes, though, declarer must not get so carried away with guarding against an unfavorable division that he winds up more sorry than safe.

Take this case where South was in four spades and West led the king of hearts. Declarer won with dummy's ace and, intent on guarding against a 4-1 trump division — the only real threat to his contract — led the nine of spades and let it ride after East followed low. West won with the jack, cashed the heart queen and continued with the jack. Declarer ruffed and mulled over how to handle the remaining trumps.

One possibility was to enter dummy with a diamond, lead a trump and repeat the finesse. This would succeed if East had all the remaining spades, but would lose if West had started with two or three spades including a second honor card. In that case, South would lose two spades, a heart and a club for down one.

South decided that the remaining spades were much more likely to be divided 2-1 than 3-0, so he cashed the ace. When West showed out, declarer had to lose another trump trick, and he finished down one.

South had the right idea about protecting against a 4-1 trump break, but he went about it the wrong way. A superior approach is to cash the spade ace first and then lead a low spade to dummy's nine. In the actual deal, East wins with the ten, but declarer later picks up East's

queen via a finesse.

The suggested play has more to recommend it than the obvious advantage of averting a guess on the second round of trumps. It is also the correct play mathematically. Cashing the ace first guards against West's having started with the singleton ten, jack or queen, while the first-round finesse wins only when West started with the singleton two or three. The odds are therefore 3-to-2 in favor of playing the ace first. ■

“We all have lied, we’ve all been lied to, we’ve all told the truth, we’ve all gotten into trouble because of telling the truth,” says Cody Nickell, director of the Gulfshore Playhouse production that runs April 4-26 at The Norris Center in Naples.

“We’ve all fallen in love, we’ve all wanted to be in love,” he adds. “The ideas in this play are universal.”

Originally a 17th century farce by Pierre Corneille, “The Liar” has been updated and adapted by David Ives. It won the Charles MacArthur Award for Outstanding New Play at the Helen Hayes Awards in Washington, D.C., in 2011. Mr. Ives, who wrote the Tony-nominated “Venus in Fur,” is also known for his adaptation of Feydeau’s farce, “A Flea in Her Ear,” and Mark Twain’s “Is He Dead?” And his collection of short plays, “Lives of the Saints,” just closed Off-Broadway in late March.

Mr. Ives told NPR in an interview that the character of Dorante in “The Liar” is “constantly stepping very close to the edge of an incredible cliff with his lies, and yet he always finds his way out of them. And so the language had to be a high-wire act as well.”

The play is written in rhyming couplets, in iambic pentameter, which is the meter Shakespeare used. “But it’s not a museum piece,” Mr. Nickell promises. “There’s nothing sitting on a pedestal there. Audiences will understand every word that’s said.”

The rhymes and off-rhymes lend “a buoyancy and a bubbiness” to the play, he says, adding the hardest work for audience members will be to keep from

doubling over in laughter.

The adaptation fuses the baroque with glam rock of the late 1970s-early '80s, he says, with a little bit of rock 'n' roll thrown in as well. “It’s a fun, sexy romp,” he says. “No one will leave this play saying, ‘I didn’t understand it.’”

Because the play deals with lying and truth-telling, we talked with Mr. Cody and the two leads, John Keabler and Scott Aiello about lying, what is true, and whether the nature of acting owes anything to lying. Here’s what they had to say:

### Director Cody Nickell

#### ■ What’s the best lie you’ve ever told?

My best, most joyful lie was when I proposed to my wife. We were working at Shakespeare Santa Cruz, and I took her camping. I had a friend in the cast contact a florist to make a bunch of beautiful flower arrangements ... We left the campsite and went to the beach for a whole day, and I’d prearranged that my friend would deliver all these flower arrangements (while we were gone) and set them up around the camp site. Which he did, and it was lovely.

I’m terrible at keeping secrets, but this was one of my favorite lies I ever told, a lie of omission. It may be one of the only ones I’ve ever been able to keep.

#### ■ What is the one true thing you know?

The one true thing I know is that if people try hard enough and get rid of their ego, anybody can get along. You’ve got try really hard.

#### ■ Are actors better liars in real life?

I think there’s a whole section of people in my life who assume actors are not to be trusted, because they lie for a

living. I'm a pretty terrible liar in real life, and ultimately, if an actor is doing their job well they're not lying, they're pretending, they're being. It's something else other than a lie.

■ **Is acting lying?**

No, not for me ... think lying is the opposite of acting. It's holding something back.

But in this play, the way the character spins these lies, it's putting this wonderful imagination into the world, and ultimately everything works out for the best ... The lies are more imaginative and more active than I think the pejorative idea of a lie is: obfuscation, equivocation and malice. There's not really any malice in this play.

**Actor John Keabler**

(Dorante, the liar)

■ **What is the best lie you've ever told?**

I've been lying to myself for years now that I can do this as a career, that it's economically, seriously feasible for me to do this. I do it because I love it. There's nothing else to do.

■ **What is the one true thing you know?**

As Geronte, my character's father, says in the play: Everyone is just making things up as we go. In any business, any career, any family, I think we're just making it up as we go. And we don't have to follow certain rules.

What attracts me to acting, to the arts in general, is that artists kind of sit back and say, "Wait a minute, I don't think that's the way it has to be, I don't have to follow a certain tradition. Life can be

■ **Are actors better liars in real life?**

I think actors overall have a better imagination ... Their wit, their sarcasm, their ability to meld into something else is better than most people's. They're

used to that. It doesn't necessarily make them better liars. I think their word play and wit is better — which does aid in lying, I must say.

■ **Is acting lying?**

I think only in the sense, it's lying to yourself that you're feeling these emotions. You are in a room where everyone is looking at you, yet you lie to yourself that no one is judging you, no one is questioning your choices. You're in a film and you've got cameras and a whole crew is looking at you. You're lying to yourself that at the moment it's real, and it gets easier to believe that.

That's the difference between actors who are just starting out and those who are experienced. (The ones who have been doing it for a while) shed that little voice in their head that's telling them it isn't real.

You're lying to yourself, which is not hurtful most of the time.

**Actor Scott Aiello**

Plays Cliton, who cannot tell a lie.

■ **What's the best lie you've ever told?**

I lived in Italy for a little while, about a year, when I was in school ... Italians had trouble with my name, with saying Scott. John is really my first name, so I called myself Giovanni while I was in Italy, mainly because it is my real first name and was easier for the Italians to pronounce.

When I got back to the States, I took a job in an Italian restaurant. While I was there, I missed Italy a lot, so just for kicks I would introduce myself as Giovanni (to the customers.) It got me better tips! And I would go so far as to do it with an Italian accent. It was a big gag with the staff, who would get a kick out of it.

Until my father came in one night and he asked for Scott to wait on him. And they told him there was no Scott working at this Italian restaurant, because by then they were all calling me Giovanni. He saw me, and he pointed me out to them. They said, "Oh, that's Giovanni." My father has a great sense of humor. And

ever since then he's never let me live that one down. Sometimes just to razz me he will call me Giovanni.

■ **What is the one true thing you know?**

My little sister loves me. And I love her, too.

■ **Are actors better liars?**

It all depends on the human being. I can't say that specifically of actors. I've met actors who are excellent liars and those who aren't. I'm one of the latter. I can't tell a lie. I'm real bad.

■ **Is acting lying?**

I think acting is truth-telling ... It took me a long time to learn that. It's a very fine distinction, but I know the difference between pretending to be someone and just being and reacting as that person. The difference between pretending to be a character and actually just being that character out on stage and reacting to everything: the lines, the physicality, as that person would, then it become effortless, and I equate effortlessness with truth.

I think I equate — and this is a personal thing — tension with lying. I can feel myself seize up, my body, my brain ... I equate that with non truth-telling.

When I'm telling the truth, I'm a better actor. ■

# PAST REPASTS

Here are some capsule summaries of previous restaurant reviews:

■ **Araya Sushi Asian Grill, 2650 Immokalee Road, Naples; 593-3344.**

The creators of Fuji Sushi Bar & Asian Bistro, Jon and On Augsonthung, have opened a second, somewhat more upscale space with Araya. Like Fuji, it offers a wide range of sushi as well as cooked Thai and Japanese dishes. Stop in for the stellar sushi, but stay to explore the cooked fare. Try any of the dozen yakitori items (priced by the skewer) and specials such as sautéed chicken livers with asparagus or mainstays including spicy tuna nachos and carpaccio of hamachi with jalapenos. A Tiger Roll (shrimp tempura with asparagus, avocado, rice, seaweed, sesame seeds, masago, smoked salmon, eel and wakame) was huge and wonderful. A nightly special, the Mummy Roll, contained spicy blue crab in rice paper with mango sauce, tobiko and gold flake. Grilled salmon with baby bok choy and Lychee Duck Curry were as delicious as the sushi. For dessert, try the Tokyo Sundae (sticky rice, green tea ice cream, red bean paste, lychee and coconut). Beer and wine served.

■ **Brunina's Pizza and Pasta, 4330 Thomasson Drive, Hammock Cove, Naples; 530-0084.**

Pizza is the main draw at this bustling neighborhood joint, but a menu of moderately priced Italian classics is available as well, and it's just fine to show up

in your shorts and T-shirt. Mushrooms stuffed with cheese, spinach and garlic and fried calamari were good, although the calamari arrived late. Salads were fresh, with tasty balsamic vinaigrette, but our entrees arrived before we had much time to enjoy them. Shrimp over pasta with pesto cream sauce was a nightly special. The shrimp were big and juicy, but the sauce was disappointingly bland. Better were the gnocchi a la Mamma, tender-chewy pillows topped with mushrooms, spinach, white wine, garlic and olive oil. Service was pleasant but spotty, with long periods when our waiter was absent. Full bar.

■ **The Counter Custom Built Burgers, 9110 Strada Place, Mercato, Naples; 566-0644.**

If it's burgers, fries and sodas the kids want, here's a place at which everyone will feel happy about their meal. The Counter serves Angus beef from humanely raised cows free of hormones and antibiotics. (Or select vegan, bison, turkey or chicken burgers.) Then choose from a dozen cheeses, 32 toppings, 23 sauces, six buns (one is gluten free) or a salad. Milkshakes come in regular or adult versions (with a shot of your favorite alcoholic beverage). I enjoyed a turkey burger with Gruyere, cole slaw, grilled pineapple, roasted corn and black bean salsa, sautéed onions and ginger soy glaze on a wheat bun. To my surprise, the whole thing even held together. My companion liked the Old School burger (beef with Tilla-

mook cheddar, lettuce, red onion, pickle, tomato and red relish). Sweet potato fries and crispy onion strings were just right, as were cocktails and a brownie with ice cream, caramel and chocolate sauce. Great service, too. Full bar.

For 18 years, this low-slung box of a building with white lace curtains and Scandinavian tchotchkes has been sustaining locals and tourists with hearty breakfasts and speedy inexpensive lunches. Its homemade pies are the stuff of legend, with soaring meringues and incredibly flaky crusts. Lunchtime brings homemade soups, burgers made with hand-ground beef, sandwiches piled high with deli meat and great salads. After all the half-pound Black Angus patties with "gourmet" toppings of smoked gouda, baby arugula and balsamic ketchup I've eaten in the name of the current burger craze, the Dolly's burger offered a welcome retreat to streamlined ingredients and uncomplicated flavors. You can — and should — upgrade from chips to sweet potato fries, which are thickly hand-cut to maximize flavor and coated with a light, flaky batter for extra crispness. Soft drinks served.

Whether it's crepe, salads or burgers early in the day or the more complex and interesting dinner lineup, Chef Andy Hyde's fare is tres magnifique. The octopus salad is outstanding (rendered tender via sous vide preparation) and served with broccoli rabe, cherry tomatoes and lemon verbena pesto. A chevre starter with cherry tomatoes, dried cranberries, pumpkin seeds and mixed greens was also excellent. Entrees of diver scallops with English peas, scallops and pommes fondants were elegant and perfect, as was the Crisp Lavender Duck with Florida orange glaze, kohlrabi and pommes almond. A cheese plate and aphrodisiaque crepe provided a wondrous ending to a flawless meal. Beer and wine served.

# CUISINE

## The Local offers tasteful blend of healthy food, casual ambience

The name says it all yet does it so succinctly the less observant among us might miss it altogether. Even though The Local has been serving farm-to-table and sea-to-table food in a fairly obvious location just off Pine Ridge Road for close to two years, I still run into people who have yet to experience its charms.

Fresh produce, meats and seafood, craft beers and a carefully chosen wine list all delivered by a most agreeable staff in a comfortable, rustic atmosphere make this one of my favorite restaurants in Naples.

Chef/owner Jeff Mitchell trained at the Culinary Institute of America — and it's obvious when you taste his extravagantly layered sauces. Outstanding sauces are one of the hallmarks of CIA graduates, and Mr. Mitchell does his alma mater proud.

The Local has matured from its opening days in May 2013. Mr. Mitchell has migrated from managing the place to the front lines of the kitchen following the departure of his friend and colleague, Rich Demarse, last year. He revels in the deliveries of fresh foods that show up each morning and in figuring out what the day's specials will be.

It's unlikely you'll dine anywhere else on food that's fresher than what you'll get here. Most of it comes from Southwest Florida places including Worden Farm in Punta Gorda, Herban Gardens in North Fort Myers, Twelve Seasons Farm in Fort Myers and Inyoni Farm in Naples.

Daily specials (of which there are always many) are scrawled in a rainbow of colors on chalkboards posted on the wall and are also printed out for slightly easier reading along with the regular menu (which also changes with the availability of ingredients).

We arrived a bit before 6 p.m. on a Thursday and had no trouble securing a comfortable booth; an hour later, however, the place was fairly well packed. The Local doesn't take reservations, so early birds get the best spots.

Considering The Local's emphasis on healthy fare, don't expect a basket of bread to be delivered as soon as you sit down. Instead, there are fresh raw veggies — carrots, celery, cauliflower — and white bean hummus drizzled with extra virgin olive oil, a light and satisfying nibble that's just right while you ponder the menu options and savor a glass of wine or a craft beer.

From the appetizer menu, I can highly recommend the Pine Island clams in coconut red curry (\$16) — or anything, for that matter, that is lucky enough to be bathed in that incredible sauce that's sweet and spicy, redolent of basil and studded with crunchy bits of scallion. Next time I just might order it as a beverage.

Not quite as successful were the Palmetto Creek Farms pork gyoza in ginger lemongrass broth (\$15). The bowl filled with the plump dumplings looked lovely, but the broth was very mildly seasoned — both the ginger and lemongrass quite understated — and it saturated the gyoza, rendering them soggy.

From the entree specials, we tried the pan-seared triggerfish (\$24) with mango and avocado salsa. The flaky white fillet was expertly cooked, so that the outside had a golden crust while the interior remained moist. The salsa was good, but even without it this fish would have been a winner. It comes with a choice of two side dishes; our blackened potatoes and beets with shallots and sherry vinegar proved fine accompaniments.

Mustard roasted all-natural Joyce Farms free-range chicken breast with mustard breadcrumbs, soft-boiled egg and pecorino sauce (\$27) was an imaginative and delicious way to dress up what diners some-

times take for granted. Full of flavor on its own, the poultry was enhanced by the seasonings and cheese that coated it. A sweet potato cake and roasted beets partnered well with it.

We shared a piece of vanilla cake with raspberry filling and buttercream icing (\$6) that was moist, with rich raspberry flavor and an icing that wasn't cloyingly sweet. In addition to full-size desserts, the restaurant offers miniatures for those who just want a couple of bites.

The Local is the kind of place where it's perfectly acceptable to hang out even if you aren't going to eat a full meal. A large bar at the back of the room is just right for enjoying a glass of wine or a well-chilled beer with friends. Those who sit here also get a good look at the cakes, cookies and cupcakes displayed under glass on the counter, all baked fresh on the premises.

Vegans and those who shun gluten will also find plenty on which to feast here and, if you find yourself inspired to try your hand at cooking as a result of a meal here, sign up for one of Mr. Mitchell's classes. They're held on Saturdays, but not every Saturday, so check with the staff or on Facebook for the schedule.

Whether you are looking for a healthy restaurant meal or simply one that tastes great, The Local has plenty to offer. ■
