As a team, we have successfully completed Operation Unified

Statement by the North Atlantic Council in KFOR format on the situation in Kosovo

On 1 December we discussed the situation in Kosovo with our partners in KFOR (Kosovo Force). NATO Allies and KFOR partners are deeply concerned about the recent developments in the northern part of Kosovo, which we continue to monitor carefully. The use of violence against KFOR is unacceptable and we deplore it.

NATO and our KFOR partners welcome President Tadić's statement of 29 November, which must be followed by concrete actions. We urge all parties to exercise restraint and cooperate fully with all international actors on the ground to ensure freedom of movement without delay. NATO Allies and KFOR partners fully support Commander KFOR, as KFOR continues to act carefully, firmly and impartially to contribute to the maintenance of freedom of movement and a safe and secure environment for all people in Kosovo, in accordance with its United Nations mandate. NATO and our KFOR partners commend KFOR's coordination with EULEX (European Union Rule of Law Mission in Kosovo) in this regard.

NATO Allies and KFOR partners call on Belgrade and Pristina to continue their constructive participation to the EU-facilitated dialogue.

News says nothing about reality It's all about the journalist and your quote

An interview in front of a film camera, on the radio or for a newspaper can be stressful, regardless of whether you do it on a daily basis or just occasionally. You find yourself in an unnatural situation, with a microphone or camera in front of your nose, worrying that you are going to make a wrong statement or find yourself misquoted in the newspaper.

Many see the media as a threat, but it's what you say during the interview that can be harmful. Can we control a journalist's pen? No but we can control how we conduct ourselves during the interview. Simply use common sense, good preparation and the support of your Public Affairs Officer (PAO). When you stick to a few key rules, the media provide the best and the fastest way to tell your and our message.

Be very careful during informal contacts with a media representative. Having a quick chat with a journalist, talking "off the record" or having an interview without PAO might result in unwanted media attention. First you have a nice chat and the next day your quotes make the newspaper's headline.

Not all journalists are alike. A good journalist will most likely ignore your personal quote or simply not write it up, especially if it is not relevant to the topic. Unfortunately some journalists are looking for a spicy story and will use your quote or change it to make it a little juicier.

A lot of people think this will never happen to them, but believe me, it will - and without you realizing it. So never underestimate a journalist.

For a PAO it is very hard, often impossible, to get a personal quote or "off the record" remarks taken out of an article. Most likely the journalist will use it and your statement will be in the open. The outcome? I guess you know...

Just some simple tips to prevent this from happening:

Don't be afraid to talk to the media, but:

• Stay in your lane, only talk about your job.

- Remember there is no such thing as "off the record" remarks!
- Don't answer any NATO-related questions without PAO present.
- Check your national communication restrictions via your Senior National Representative. (All national and international news agencies send requests to PAO at the Component.)
- If you feel uncomfortable, call in the PAO representative.
- Do not discuss classified information.

Keep these points in mind, use common sense and realize you are talking to a journalist. An interview should be seen as a risk, but also as an opportunity to communicate our message to the public.

Winter driving information



Winter driving does not have to be a nightmare. So make sure that you and your vehicle are prepared. This is a reminder for all Component members:

1. Use of winter tires

Under German law, the regulations for the use of winter tires in Germany changed with effect from 1 December 2010. The following rules apply:

- Black ice and slippery surfaces caused by packed snow, ice or frost are part of winter weather conditions. During these weather conditions the use of winter tires is mandatory.
- Winter tires are all tires with a snowflake symbol and/or M+S tires with the same symbol and/ or mountain pictogram.

Component Security Forces may deny access to the confines of NATO Air Base Geilenkirchen for privately owned motor vehicles (POMV) not equipped with suitable tires.

2. Black ice and dirty roads

Beware of suddenly changing road conditions. In recent years quite a few Component members have found out the hard way that their intended direction of travel did not match the forces of gravity and traction.

Do your tires have sufficient tread and are they suitable for winter weather conditions?

3. Windscreen wipers

You should check your windscreen wipers to make sure the blades are in good working condition and ready for the winter time. Keep your windscreen washers clear of obstructions. Keep the fluid container filled and your wipers in good working order.

4. Excess idling

It is a violation of German Traffic Law and E-3A Component Order 3.4-1 to leave a vehicle in idle for more than three minutes. This means that leaving the engine running while you remove ice and snow from your car windows is prohibited!

5. Use of lights, rear fog lights and parking lights

Please ensure that all your vehicle lights are clean and in working order. Rear fog lights are only to be used when visibility is reduced to 50 meters or less. This also means that you have to reduce your speed to 50 km/h in those conditions. A parking light is only to be used for enhancing the visibility of a parked vehicle. Fog is one of the most dangerous hazards any driver will have to face. An accident with a vehicle ahead can quickly involve many others. So slow down and keep a safe distance. When following another vehicle in fog, leave enough space to stop. There is always the possibility of an unforeseen hazard ahead, which may cause the vehicle in front of you to make an emergency stop.

6. Clearing ice from vehicle windows

You have to remove ice from all the windows of your vehicle before you drive off. In the past, a vehicle crossing Rommelstraße in the off-base housing area struck a Component member who was walking towards the Main Gate. The operator of the vehicle was waiting for an opportunity to enter Lilienthalallee and, because he had only cleared the ice from a small portion of his windshield, did not see the other Component member walking in front of his vehicle.

To ensure traffic safety on base the IMPs & Civil Guards, as 'Gate Entry Controllers', are ordered to deny access to all vehicles whose windows are not clear of ice.

Finally, please take special care when operating a vehicle during darkness or low visibility. Pay special attention to the important things around you and do not let yourself be distracted, e.g. by advertisement signs.


Rotodome cooks up Thanksgiving classics

This region has a very high rate of under-five mortality resulting from drought, high food prices and the ongoing conflict in Somalia.

On the day the Public Affairs Office received its annual 'Esprit de corps' funds, I read an article in the local newspaper about a current UNICEF (United Nations Children's Fund) project for children in Eastern Africa. What followed was a quick and spontaneous collection on the lower floor of the Headquarters building. In the end, other offices from the whole base became involved too. Colleagues were soon keen to support the UNICEF project under the motto 'We want to live'.

My initial aim was to collect 50 euro coins. This donation would enable UNICEF to give vital vaccinations to 18 children in Eastern Africa. In a team effort, many small inputs produce a remarkable effect. This aim of collecting 50 euros was soon achieved. In the end we were able to transfer 91.30 euros to UNICEF.

You might think the collected money is only a drop in the ocean. But never forget that many drops together make an ocean. Our donation to Unicef is shown on this published proof of payment.

Changes to the Food Services System

The management of our Food Services System on base is always striving to provide customers with the best possible service. Sometimes this is not an easy task, considering the high costs involved and the fluctuating income. Nevertheless, the year started off well at the Rotodome with about 450 customers per day - well on the way to reaching our budget forecast.

Unfortunately, due to the operational support/deployment situation, which was not anticipated during budget preparation, the customer ratio significantly decreased to 300 customers per day. Consequently, this influenced the income and the overall Food Services System financial situation.

In mid-2011, it was decided that something had to be done to improve this deficit situation and an evaluation of the Food Services System services was conducted, revealing that the fast food line (except for pizzas and salads) and the E-3A Club evening operation received the least customer interest. It was therefore decided that the system will be slightly adjusted as of 1 January 2012, as explained below:


