Peacock Arts District to celebrate with music, art

Inaugural street festival will collect food for veterans while shining light on expanding art community

FORT PIERCE - Anyone who has spent any time in Fort Pierce has noticed the community of peacocks that strut their stuff around the streets around Orange Avenue and Seventh Street. The glorious birds stroll across the streets, hang out in the trees, and show off their feathers for passersby. What the peacocks don't know is that on Nov. 10, the district that built itself around them will be celebrating.

The inaugural Peacock Arts District Music & Arts Street Festival will take place along Seventh street, between Boston and Orange avenues, and event organizers Angel Webb and Smokey Gage, said this event is going to really put the up and coming arts district on the map.

"This area is unique in that it folds art, culture

and businesses into one," said Ms. Webb, owner of Sunrise City Spa and Yoga Studio. "I opened my business in the Arcade Building a couple of years ago, and was absolutely drawn to this neighborhood. There are so many beautiful aspects to this part of Fort Pierce and being able to celebrate that is humbling."

The Peacock Arts District, which sprouted from a 2016 meeting between the city of Fort Pierce, citizens and business owners in the area, has an eclectic vibe full of color and a unique flair. Ms. Webb's spa is one of the original businesses of the PAD and she's hoping the street festival will showcase what the area has to offer.

"It's important that people know what's taking place in the PAD," she said while sitting on the porch of her Seventh Street spa. "The gym (Any-time Fitness) recently opened up on the corner



and there are other businesses that are slowly starting to pop up. The hope is that we can encourage other businesses and galleries to open up over here. We are a great addition to Fort Pierce. Not only is downtown thriving, but we're starting to feel the uptick over here. It's very exciting. The street festival is the first of its kind on this side of U.S. 1. It's huge for us and for everyone in the area."

The festival, initiated by Ms. Webb, and sponsored by the City of Fort Pierce will benefit local veterans, feature live music, vendors, yoga, and arts and crafts. It will also offer those who may not be familiar with the area a chance to interact with PAD business owners, hang out with some peacocks, and listen to music by some of Fort Pierce's best-known bands.

"There's going to be a lot of great music and lots of fun things to do all day," said Mr. Gage. "We have music until 9 p.m. We have some really great acts such as Jon Prestage, String Assassins, Big Pine Band and The Easy People Band, Tom and Lisa Darcy will get things going at 12:30 p.m. We are collecting canned goods for the veterans, so we're really glad to be able to give back on Veteran's Day weekend."

Some of the local art that will be showcased during the event will include mosa-

ics, poetry, air brush, palm leaf art, art on canvas, stained glass art, tie dye, pottery, and woodcarving. There will be a free community yoga session in the shaded grassy area on the corner of Seventh and Boston, led by the Traveling Yoginis, while the sounds of Tom and Lisa Darcy fill the air. Those participating in the yoga session should bring a mat or blanket and a bottle of water.

The free event will have a free trolley running from the parking garage on Orange Avenue and U.S. 1 to shuttle visitors back and forth. There will also be street parking available near the event. Although there is no charge for the family-friendly event, the local elks lodge will be collecting non-perishable food for local veterans and for those serving overseas.

"All of the food collected will be equally distributed to either local veterans or to those currently serving in the armed forces," Ms. Webb said. "The Elks will also be selling baked goods to raise money for local veterans. There will be other food options, including Dune Buggy Dogs, Island Style BBQ, Bonner Bar service will have a full-liquor bar, and Blue Dog will have the cool treat of shaved ice."

Guests can bring a chair to relax in or a blanket to stretch out on while enjoying the day full of music, art and good vibes.

Don't get hooked by phishing emails

As I went through my email this morning (deleting all the spam one email at a time) I couldn't help but notice the number of "phishing" emails I was getting.

The practice of phishing is when someone out there in cyberspace constructs an e-mail to look like it's coming from a legitimate source (usually a bank website) when it's not.

Most of the time, these emails will tell you that (for one reason or another) you need to confirm your user name and password in order to keep your account open. If you don't, they say you run the risk of having your account closed. They usually will include a link to follow and the page the link brings you to looks exactly like what you would expect were you to go to the actual (bank's) website.

Enter your user name and password, and you can find your account drained in minutes.

So, what is one to do to keep from getting scammed like this? Well, to try to answer this question I'm looking at some of the phishing bait emails I have received over

the last few months (yes, for some strange reason I've been collecting them) and one reoccurring theme I see is a sense of urgency. Most of the emails will have the original bank (or other organization's logo) making it look like it is from a legitimate source, but it will contain an urgent message.

Following are two examples.

Example 1: "In order to be prepared for the smart card upgrade on Visa and MasterCard debit and credit cards and to avoid problems with our ATM services, we have recently introduced additional security measures and upgraded our software. The security upgrade will be effective immediately and requires our customers to update their ATM card information. Please update your information by following the link given below."

This is to generate a sense of urgency. In this case, if you don't follow the link, you "run the risk" of having your card stop working due to "upgraded software and security measures."

Example 2: "This is your final warning about the safety of your account. If you do not update your billing information your access on will be restricted and the user deleted. The reason to do this might include: a recent change in your personal information (i.e. change of address), submitting invalid information during the initial sign up process, an inability to accurately verify your selected option of payment due an internal error within their processors. Please update your profile in order to restore your online access."

Then they include a link for you to follow to submit the required information.

If you ever get an email saying an account you have with some institution is in danger of getting cut off unless you update your information online, a bell should go off in your head.

No legitimate institution is going to contact you over e-mail to update your

account.

If your account were in jeopardy, you would receive a phone call or postal message, not an e-mail.

Another thing you can do is hold your mouse over the link they want you to click. Don't click it or fill out any information of course, but hold your mouse over the link and see what the actual address is (it may pop up in a little pop up or reveal itself down in the Status Bar). You will likely see that the address is either a raw IP address (xxx.xxx.xxx.xxx) or will have your bank name embedded in some other domain name (such as http://your_bank.otherdomain.com) a sure sign of a fake.

If you have doubts and think the e-mail may actually be legit, pick up the phone and call whoever supposedly sent you the e-mail but don't call the number on the email they sent, call the number you have in your own account records. At least you know that number is real.

Planes, trains and automobiles

Fort Pierce has big multi-modal transportation dreams

FORT PIERCE -- If the dreams of the City Commission come true, the Sunrise City could eventually see a small fleet of seaplanes ferrying passengers back and forth to the Bahamas, who arrive on the Treasure Coast via high-speed train from Orlando that also brings in workers and visitors to the city's new port complex.

City staff presented both transportation concepts to commissioners Oct. 15, creating excitement in the air for those awaiting the renaissance of Fort Pierce. Commissioner Rufus Alexander said the potential of the city having both a seaplane base and Brightline train station would completely alter the environment.

"We [would] have a gold mine if we can get our train stop here," he said during the seaplane discussion. "It would be almost like Disney World."

Commissioner Thomas Perona concurred.

"You know, I'm just thrilled by all this," he said. "It's all related to the community working so hard for so long knowing that some day this community would be a leader in so many different things. Five or six years ago it looked pretty bleak for Fort Pierce, and now we're on the cutting edge of everything happening at once -- planes, trains and automobiles, horses, boats, kayaks, anything -- we've got them all."

Administrative Assistant Kaitlyn Ballard launched the discussion with a PowerPoint overview of the seaplane industry in Florida and its two oldest bases, the City of Miami and the City of Tavares in Central Florida. She highlighted the economic boom that Tavares has seen since city officials baptized it the American Seaplane City several years ago.

"Since they opened the seaplane base in 2010, nine new restaurants and bars have opened up, and they actually have 23 new businesses," she said. "They estimate about \$30 million in new private sector development has gone into their community since their re-branding and since they implemented the seaplane base facility."

Ms. Ballard said City Engineer Jack Andrews had developed two possible sea-

plane base cost scenarios, with both options utilizing the stretch of the Indian River just south of the Riverwalk Center near the present location of the shuffleboard courts. The more expensive option would be a \$500,000 pervious pavement construction of six seaplane bays, a roundabout for passenger pick-up and drop-off, and a ramp for sea plane accessibility to and from the river. The more economical asphalt pavement version would cost about \$370,000 and have only four bays. She then put the ball in the Commission's court to decide whether to contact the Florida Department of Transportation and other agencies to get the planes off the water.

"If this is something the Commission decides to push forward with, we would look at contacting the FDOT Aviation Office," she explained. "We'd apply for a seaplane base license, and once that is situated, we would contact the Federal Aviation Administration for an airspace review and certification. Once those processes take place, then we would lean on Mr. Andrews to identify funding and administer construction."

Ms. Ballard then introduced the executive director of the International Seaplane Pilots Association, Steve McCaughey, who has worked with City Manager Nick Mimms and other staff members to analyze the city's potential for creating a new seaplane destination in the aforementioned location.

"As a Florida native who is based here in Florida with our association, anytime we have an opportunity to look at creating a new seaplane base facility, it's incredibly exciting," he said. "With the help of Mr. Mimms and Mr. Andrews, we've done some forward work looking at this proposed site location and evaluating whether it would be suitable or not, and it is -- it's very suitable. I think that would be a very fine location for a public seaplane base."

Mr. McCaughey emphasized that he had already consulted with the two largest commercial operators of seaplanes on the Eastern Seaboard who were both interested in utilizing a potential Fort Pierce seaplane base.

"These operators are operating from Boston to Key West currently," he added. "They're operating at a very high safety level and they're operating in very challenging conditions -- much more challenging than here -- if you look at the Port of Miami and Manhattan. They're stable, well financed, and currently using the Miami Seaplane

Base, so there's a very good analog for this. With our association, I'd like to extend our resources to help you make this a reality if you choose to go in that direction."

For his part, Commissioner Alexander expressed concern about protecting the barrier islands the federal government created to protect the downtown waterfront from future hurricane tidal surges. Mr. McCaughey did his best to allay his fears.

"I've already done an initial assessment of that," he emphasized. "We looked at the small barrier islands and those are not an issue whatsoever. We've also already looked at the manatee zones and other fish and wildlife considerations, and I believe that you have a very good operational area that keeps everyone out of the manatee areas or the no-wake areas. What that also does is gives some separation between the bridge and the power lines so it keeps the airplanes well clear where they can operate where there's no conflicts with any vertical obstructions."

Commissioner Jeremiah Johnson worried about the environmental threat of fueling aircraft so close to the Indian River and the potential for spillage into the waterway.

"We're potentially creating more impervious and hopefully we go to the more pervious option," he said. "How do you balance that if there's a mobile refueling operation and they come over with the hoses that connect to the airplane. How safe is that?"

"Most of the aircraft are fitted with what's called single-point refueling, which is a lock and seal system so there is no spillage," Mr. McCaughey explained. "It's what commercial airlines use on their airplanes."

Some of the commissioners wondered if the river was wide enough for a seaplane approach, and both Mr. McCaughey and Mr. Andrews agreed that space would not be an issue.

"We do have enough room -- we've looked at it in the field," the latter said. "The typical wingspan in some of the aircraft was 57 feet. Our channel is close to 150 feet. It will take up the whole channel when the plane comes in, but there is adequate room."

Mr. McCaughey also addressed environmental concerns typically expressed by residents, saying that even the federal government viewed seaplanes as environmentally safe.

"Honestly, we're much more environmentally friendly than boaters in most cases," he said. "The U.S. Fish & Wildlife operates a fleet of 58 seaplanes for doing bird studies

and environmental studies, and they've gone on record saying they use seaplanes because they have a smaller impact on their studies than any other motorized vehicle that they use."

Following the seaplane base discussion, Mr. Mimms launched the potential Brightline station discussion with a brief overview of Fort Pierce's historical relationship with the Florida East Coast Railroad, the parent company of Brightline. He addressed the three areas requested by Brightline officials of ridership potential, development potential and community support.

"We have prepared a very, very detailed statement of interest," he said.

As part of that statement, Mr. Mimms has proposed two potential locations for the station: the former 7.2-acre H.D. King plant site and a site along Depot Drive. The city is currently trying to sell the former to a potential developer, while the latter was purchased more recently.

"If you recall, some of us were here in 2010 when we went through an exercise with Amtrak, and this site was designed for an Amtrak station," he said, referring to the Depot Drive site. "This is over 1,000 feet long spanning from Orange Avenue to the Citrus Avenue overpass. This is ideally situated on the eastern side of the FEC rail right behind the Sunrise Theatre. Basically we see this as developable site if chosen by Brightline or FEC."

The city also launched a Facebook survey to gauge community support, which the city manager says was "overwhelming" in support of a Brightline station.

"We had over 1,700 responses to that survey, and 85 percent of the people that took that survey said they are in favor of a train station in Fort Pierce," Mr. Mimms added. "Passenger rail has been one of our strategic priorities and we've been talking about this for quite some time. I do believe the time is now that we move forward with this initiative."

Mayor Linda Hudson attempted to use the idea of a potential stop on the high-speed railroad as a way to encourage some of the resident's who'd ardently fought the planned high speed passenger rail from the onset.

"What I like about it is, if we have a stop, then the train has to slow down in our city, and that is attractive," she said. "I think if there's a consensus, let's forge ahead on both tracks, the [King Plant] RFQ and this particular offer."

New phone app available for reporting suspicious activity in schools

TREASURE COAST — The Florida Department of Education has launched a new phone app called FortifyFL, created and funded as part of the Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School Public Safety Act. According to the Indian River County

Emergency Services Department, the app “is critical to ensuring all Florida schools are safe environments where students and educators can experience and share the joy of learning without fear.”

The application was named by students from Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School. The development was a collaboration between the Office of the Attorney General, the Department of Education, and

the Florida Department of Law Enforcement.

With FortifyFL, any student, educator, parent or member of the public can report school safety concerns. FortifyFL automatically routes the tip report to the appropriate law enforcement agencies and school officials. State-level officials also have access to tips to make sure proper steps are taken.

Students and others working in or visit-

ing schools can provide a description of a threat, share photos and videos, and optionally submit their contact information. Submitters decide whether to include their name and contact information.

The app is available for download for Apple phones from the App Store and Android devices from Google Play.

If you're heading to Orlando, this golf course is worth stopping for

With theme parks for the kids, spas and shopping for the rest and golf for me, Orlando is a regular destination for my family. Being less than a two-hour's drive away helps as well.

On the east side of town, between U.S. Highway 192 and State Road 528, on Highway 15, lies Eagle Creek Golf Club. If you happen to be headed to the Orlando airport or Orlando itself, there is a good chance this course falls right along your route. If not, it's certainly worth the detour.

International golf course architect Ron Garl is a friend of mine and he is rightfully proud of his design work on this course. It is also one of my favorites. Also intriguing is that it plays to a par of 73, a slight departure from the norm. You just need to remember that when you add up your strokes at the end of your round.

Another interesting trait of this wonderful track is its British seaside feel. Not only because of the rolling terrain and the seaside types of grasses found throughout, but also because of the sod-walled bunkers. Trust me, as beautiful and unique as they are, you will want to avoid them at all cost! Not that it's easy to avoid them, mind you. The course sports over 90 bunkers in all, with some waste areas taking up over a half-acre.

"Eagle Creek is one of my favorites," Garl told me with a smile. "It has a great variety of holes. There is a touch of the British Isles,

a British and Scottish Links right in the middle of Florida."

The course features five sets of tees, playing as long as 7,217 yards, down to a little as 5,324 yards. The variety of holes includes a couple of short par-4s, a very reachable par-5, as well as a monster of a par-5. There are four par-3s, challenging every club in your bag.

One of the things I like best is that the design forces you to think before you step onto the tee of each hole. There is a safe and easy play available on each hole. However, the safest shot from the tee may give you the longest or most difficult approach to the green. You have to pick your poison.

The par-5s all require you to pay attention. Just because you are laying up, don't think that you're being given an easy shot. Pay attention to the pin position and where you can give yourself the best angle from which to attack it with a short iron. Then, layup to that spot and give yourself a shot at a birdie.

The seventh hole is a lot of fun. This very sharp, dogleg-right, par-4 entices you to cut the corner and give yourself a much shorter

shot into the green. Play it safe off the tee and you may find yourself hitting three or four clubs more for your approach.

Your front-nine ends with a tempting par-5. The shortest on the course at 524 yards from the tips, you can make up ground or stretch that lead with a couple of nice shots.

Don't be fooled by the beautiful landscaping and waste bunkers that frame the uphill par-3 eleventh. At 217 yards from the back tees, it is quite daunting and the longest of the par-3s on the course.

The closing holes feature a couple of par-5s that bookend a lovely par 3. The 18th was originally planned as a long par-4, but the owners and Garl decided that making it a tempting par-5 would make for an exciting end to everyone's round. The green sits right next to the clubhouse, guarded by water, bunkers and rocks. How well you hit your tee shot and where you stand in your match, will likely decide how much you challenge the hole.

Eagle Creek features the first Mini Verde greens in the state. Carts come equipped with state-of-the-art Parview GPS to make



club selection much easier. The tips provide when you reach each tee are there to help you to play the hole better as well.

After your round, the New England manor-style clubhouse features a restaurant as well as full locker rooms for men and women. It's always a nice treat to be able to take a shower and refresh yourself before getting in the car to head either back home or to your Orlando area destination.

2 cups dried fruit (whatever you like — raisins, cherries, cranberries)
2 tablespoons melted butter

Directions

Place peanuts in bowl, coat with melted butter, and then coat with seasoning. Mix fruit with peanuts and enjoy.

HARD BOILED EGGS WITH CRABMEAT

Ingredients

4 ounces lump crabmeat

1/2-stick celery, finely chopped
1 tablespoon mayonnaise
1 tablespoon Dijon mustard
1 tablespoon fresh lemon juice
3 tablespoons chopped fresh parsley or cilantro
Salt and freshly ground black pepper
6 hardboiled eggs, peeled, halved, and yolks removed

Directions

In a medium mixing bowl, combine the crabmeat, celery, mayonnaise, Dijon mustard, lemon juice, cooked egg yolks and parsley. Season to taste with salt and pepper. Spoon the crab mixture into the egg halves. Transfer the filled eggs to a platter and serve. Can be made ahead of time, but tightly wrap and refrigerate.

ST. LUCIE COUNTY - St. Lucie County's Animal Safety, Services & Protection Division, in partnership with Operation SOS, is offering a promotion to have male cats or dogs neutered on Saturday, Nov. 3 for free with the purchase of a St. Lucie County Pet License (annual license is \$10 or Lifetime License: \$25).

Pet owners in the unincorporated area of St. Lucie County (outside city limits) can

take advantage of this neuter program and request to have your pet microchipped and update its distemper vaccination for \$10 per procedure at the time of surgery. Pet owners must provide proof of residency (driver's licenses, utility bill, car registration) to qualify.

This event will take place at the Lakewood Park Regional Park, 5990 Emerson Ave., Fort Pierce. Drop off will be between 8-9 a.m., and pickup will be between 3:30-4 p.m. Clients who show up after the 9 a.m. drop off time will not be accepted due to

scheduling restrictions.

All pets must be at least 4 months of age, between 2 to 80 pounds; both testicles must be present (not retained) and animals must be current on their rabies vaccination (proof required). If your pet is not current on their rabies vaccination or if proof cannot be provided, a rabies vaccination will be administered at the time of surgery.

For safety purposes, all dogs must be on a leash and cats must be in carriers when arriving to the scheduled visit. If you are in need of a leash or cat carrier, please email

Don't get hooked by phishing emails

As I went through my email this morning (deleting all the spam one email at a time) I couldn't help but notice the number of "phishing" emails I was getting.

The practice of phishing is when someone out there in cyberspace constructs an e-mail to look like it's coming from a legitimate source (usually a bank website) when it's not.

Most of the time, these emails will tell you that (for one reason or another) you need to confirm your user name and password in order to keep your account open. If you don't, they say you run the risk of having your account closed. They usually will include a link to follow and the page the link brings you to looks exactly like what you would expect were you to go to the actual (bank's) website.

Enter your user name and password, and you can find your account drained in minutes.

So, what is one to do to keep from getting scammed like this? Well, to try to answer this question I'm looking at some of the phishing bait emails I have received over the last few months (yes, for some strange reason I've been collecting them) and one reoccurring theme I see is a sense of urgency. Most of the emails will have the

original bank (or other organization's logo) making it look like it is from a legitimate source, but it will contain an urgent message.

Following are two examples.

Example 1: "In order to be prepared for the smart card upgrade on Visa and MasterCard debit and credit cards and to avoid problems with our ATM services, we have recently introduced additional security measures and upgraded our software. The security upgrade will be effective immediately and requires our customers to update their ATM card information. Please update your information by following the link given below."

This is to generate a sense of urgency. In this case, if you don't follow the link, you "run the risk" of having your card stop working due to "upgraded software and security measures."

Example 2: "This is your final warning about the safety of your account. If you do not update your billing information your

access on will be restricted and the user deleted. The reason to do this might include: a recent change in your personal information (i.e. change of address), submitting invalid information during the initial sign up process, an inability to accurately verify your selected option of payment due an internal error within their processors. Please update your profile in order to restore your online access."

Then they include a link for you to follow to submit the required information.

If you ever get an email saying an account you have with some institution is in danger of getting cut off unless you update your information online, a bell should go off in your head.

No legitimate institution is going to contact you over e-mail to update your account.

If your account were in jeopardy, you would receive a phone call or postal message, not an e-mail.

Another thing you can do is hold your mouse over the link they want you to click. Don't click it or fill out any information of course, but hold your mouse over the link and see what the actual address is (it may



pop up in a little pop up or reveal itself down in the Status Bar). You will likely see that the address is either a raw IP address (xxx.xxx.xxx.xxx) or will have your bank name embedded in some other domain name (such as http://your_bank.otherdomain.com) a sure sign of a fake.

If you have doubts and think the e-mail may actually be legit, pick up the phone and call whoever supposedly sent you the e-mail but don't call the number on the email they sent, call the number you have in your own account records. At least you know that number is real.




