Lead found

Elevated levels in water at five schools

POLK COUNTY – On Aug. 28, parents at five area public schools were notified by letter that elevated amounts of lead were present in the potable water supply. Three days later Polk County Public Schools Maintenance Services Manager, Rory Lucy led a press confer-

ence to discuss the news.


“One (public school) had quite a few hits,” Lucy told the media.

Of the 33 samples of water taken at Union Academy in Bartow on Aug. 16, for example, 12 came back with levels that exceed EPA “action level” standards according to data released by the Polk County School Board.

The “action level” is set at 15 parts per billion per liter (measured as .015 the data released by the school board) according to the EPA.

Lead became a national issue recently in Flint, Michigan where old pipes became corroded. The water there had levels exceeding 13,000 parts per billion. The highest amount of lead at Union Academy was .0845 parts per billion.

WINTER HAVEN – Annually Winter Haven City Commissioners vote to certify a list of property owners who neglect to pay for code compliance fees.

The Florida Constitution allows for city leaders to send these lists to tax collectors so the fees can be added to annual property tax bills, which if not paid, can lead to the property being sold at auction.

This year, the Winter Haven City Commission voted to alert the tax collector of around 20 taxpayers whose lawns were cut by city staff or had structures demolished.

This year, advertised public hearings were held on June 25 and Aug. 27 with no public comment.

The most recent list has around 25 lots that were cut at a cost of \$11,363.87. Five homes were demolished with taxpayer money at a cost of \$29,368.60.

Many of the property owners live out of the state making it difficult to collect fees. A list of the owners is published on the city website.

The Polk County Board of County Commissioners recently compiled a similar list, mostly going after property owners who evict tenants and leave a large amount of furniture at curbside for pickup. If you didn't know, that is your responsibility as a property owner to take bulk items to the dump. It is not the responsibility of taxpayers to pay for removal.

If your property tax bill is higher than normal this year, that may be the problem.

Legoland: Active, retired first responders get in free

WINTER HAVEN – For the entire month of September, first responders, correction officers, Fish and Wildlife officers, forest rangers, park rangers, Homeland Security agents, EPA officers and retired officers are eligible for free single day theme park admission at Legoland Florida Resort.

Eligible personnel can purchase general admission tickets for up to four guests at

a 50 percent discount.

Legoland Water Park admission is available as an upgrade for an additional \$22.50 plus tax.

To receive complimentary and discounted tickets, eligible personnel must visit the Legoland Florida Resort ticket window on the day of their visit and present their employee ID or professional organization membership card.

Lucy said Superintendent Jacqueline Byrd may have decided to test the water following a Tampa Bay Times investigative report Aug. 9 alleging that the Hillsborough County School Board withheld information about elevated lead levels in school water for more than a year.

Five Polk County schools were tested Aug. 16 and all five schools tested positive for lead. According to the EPA, lead levels above 15 parts per billion per liter are called "action levels" that require a plan to minimize the levels. Any amount of lead in water can lead to health effects according to the EPA. Four of the five local schools tested had levels exceeding the "action level."

Effective Aug. 29, Superintendent Byrd made bottled water available to students and staff at the five initial schools tested. All 150 school sites will be tested between now and January, Lucy said. The school board will be prioritizing older buildings to be tested first and Lucy said around 12-15 schools will be tested per week with three inspectors. The inspections will cost the district around \$150K, Lucy said.

Lucy said the last time water was tested in Polk County Public Schools was the 1990s and that laws do not require regular testing. Testing is recommended by the EPA, Lucy said.

"This sounds bad but it could just be a brass fixture," Lucy said.

Lucy said if a faucet in a school classroom is not used frequently, elevated amounts of lead can build up in the pipes and fixture screens. He said lead was not necessarily in the pipes and that the problem may be isolated to contaminated faucets. Problem sinks, faucets, fountains were replaced last week and tested again Sept. 4. Results from the retesting have yet to be made public.

If the readings are still high in replaced fixtures, Lucy said pipes may be replaced.

No schools were expected to be shut down Lucy said.

According to the EPA, lead can affect almost every organ and system of the human body. Children six and younger are most susceptible to the effects of lead. Symptoms include learning problems, lower IQ, slowed growth, hearing problems and Anemia.

A simple blood test by your family pediatrician can check your child for lead exposure.

Public water sources are tested for lead regularly but these tests cannot tell if the water coming from your home faucets are contaminated. If your home was built before 1986, home testing kits are available.

WH man killed by Uber driver, no arrest

WINTER HAVEN – By now you may have already heard that a Lake Wales Uber driver killed a Winter Haven resident last week in a stand your ground case on Dundee Road that Polk County Sheriff Grady Judd called a justified homicide.

The Uber driver was not arrested and Polk County Sheriff's Office Spokesperson Scott Wilder said there would be no court hearing to review this decision. Assistant State Attorney Jacob Orr said State Attorney Brian Haas would be reviewing the PCSO investigation to determine if a stand your ground court hearing is necessary.

On social media, Sheriff Judd referred to the deceased, Jason Boek, as a goofball and a bully who did not value his life. Plenty of media outlets have published Boek's criminal history.

Perhaps the most telling detail of this tragedy is an exchange of text messages between Jason and his girlfriend, whose name is not being published out of respect for those involved.

Jason and his girlfriend had been drinking together on the night of Monday, Aug. 27 at the New Grove Lounge on U.S. 27 in Dundee. At some point, he left her at the bar over a verbal dis-

pute. His girlfriend sent him a text later in the night saying, left alone, that she had to get another man to drive her home. Several heated texts later, Jason's girlfriend admitted that she was still at the bar and asked him to come to get her.

According to Sheriff Judd, there was some confusion when Jason arrived. A woman that neither Jason nor his girlfriend knew got into an Uber who Jason mistakenly thought was his girlfriend. Jason, whose license had previously been suspended for failure to pay child support, used a friend's F-250 to follow the Uber driver's Hyundai west on Dundee Road toward Winter Haven. Video from the Uber driver's car shows Jason passing the Uber driver, stopping in the middle of the road blocking the Uber driver. Jason got out, threatened the Uber driver that he had a pistol. Upon reaching the Uber driver's window, Lake Wales resident and Uber driver Robert Westland shot Jason Boek once in the chest, killing him.

This happened within seconds at approximately 2:20 a.m. Tuesday, Aug. 28. Jason reached for a cell phone that Westland mistook for a pistol. Westland had recently graduated from a police academy and was licensed to carry a concealed weapon even though it was against Uber policy for him to do so.

On the PCSO social media page, Jason's girlfriend posted that Jason stopped the Uber driver so that he could take her home. On her personal page, she wrote, "I love Jason even though we fought like cats and dogs and I truly wanted the best for him."

His girlfriend asked others to focus on the positive things that Jason did in the community. Several people spoke to the Winter Haven Sun about his life. All asked to have their names left out of the paper.

For years, Jason was a barber in downtown Winter Haven at Ringside Cuts, across the street from Grove Roots. Those inside the shop said Jason was known for his humor, crazy stories and making those around him happy. One of his other friends said she had known him for a long time.

"I don't blame the shooter as he was in fear but Jason was a very good man," she said. "He just had domestic problems and he was not using his best judgment based on his being under the influence (of alcohol at the time)."

A third friend said he saw Jason's mother in church the morning after his death and said that his family was struggling to cope with what happened. He also said Jason's relationships with women caused him to make some mistakes.

Last year Jason wrote a letter to the judge in his child support case, describing life with the woman he was living with at the time.

"I have a full household and responsibility that consumes everything I make a month as in rent, bills and truck payments," Jason wrote. "The previous months have been slower at work, looking to resolve this matter the best way I know I can afford."

"This is a justified homicide all day long," Sheriff Judd said. "You have the right to protect yourself. This is a classic stand your ground case."

Uber spokesperson Jodi Kawada Page said the driver's "app" has been suspended pending the investigation because Uber drivers are not allowed to carry a firearm on duty based on corporate policy.

"If the driver submits written clearance from law enforcement that he is not a suspect we will re-evaluate his status."

Jason Boek was on felony probation at the time of his death. In 2016 he was charged with beating a man related to the mother of his child who at the time was in need of a kidney transplant. He made mistakes and his last one was fatal.



WHPD officer charged with felony battery

WINTER HAVEN – A Winter Haven police officer was arrested by the Polk County Sheriff's Office Tuesday, Aug 28 and charged with breaking the leg of an alleged drug dealer in three places inside a jail cell at WHPD headquarters June 23.

According to court documents, WHPD Officer Brandon Boone used a radar gun to clock Winter Haven resident Ronal Augustin doing 49 m.p.h. around Lake Howard back in June. During the traffic stop, Officer Boone said he could smell marijuana coming out of the car.

At the time of his arrest, Augustin was in possession of several thousand dollars in cash, less than 20 grams of marijuana and he was on pre-trial release associated with 2016 charges of cocaine trafficking and possession of firearms by a convicted felon.

Winter Haven Police Chief Charlie Bird said Augustin repeatedly threatened violence toward Officer Boone and the officer's family after the arrest but that nothing justifies violent retaliation by a police officer.

Court documents state that once Augustin was brought to WHPD HQ, he refused to be placed in a cell and wanted to witness officers count his money. The PCSO investigator said that is when Officer Boone unjustifiably kned Augustin in the upper thigh area in an attempt to gain compliance. Once inside the jail cell, six-foot-four-inch, 280-pound Officer Boone then allegedly slammed five-foot-eight inch, 185-pound Augustin to the ground, bloodying Augustin's face and breaking his leg, which required surgery to start healing.

Chief Bird said he requested the Polk County Sheriff's Office investigate the incident. Officer Boone was suspended with pay after the June 2018 incident. After being arrested, Chief Bird said Officer Boone was suspended without pay and that Boone may never work as a police officer ever again.

Officer Boone has since been released from jail with no bond and his arraignment was scheduled for Sept. 18.

On Feb. 27, 2018, Chief Bird awarded Officer Boone with the Lifesaving Medal. A resident of Lakeview Tower Apartments was threatening suicide from a high-story window ledge in 2017. Chief Bird said Officer Boone got inside the Winter Haven resident's apartment, put the resident in a bear hug and brought the resident back safely inside the apartment.

Chief Bird said Officer Boone has no prior concerns of violent behavior.

On July 20, Augustin's attorney, Haines City lawyer Markeishia Smith, filed a motion to get her client out of jail on bond. Tenth Judicial Circuit Court Judge William D. Sites denied bond and Augustin is still incarcerated.

"Defendant (Augustin) suffered substantial and significant injuries while in custody of law enforcement in his arrest," Smith wrote in her motion. "Defendant's leg was broken in three separate places during his arrest."

In 2016 a WHPD officer assigned to the FBI Safe Streets Task Force requested a search warrant on 347 Avenue L NE in Winter Haven, where Augustin and his brother Kevin were living at the time. The search warrant alleged that over the course of two years, Augustin had been under surveillance for drug trafficking. The search warrant alleged that Augustin had been previously convicted on drug charges multiple times but had never spent any time in prison. Cocaine and firearms were located inside the home during the 2016 search.

"I think Augustin pushed his buttons and we have to be above that," Chief Bird said. "Every time our buttons are pushed we cannot strike back anybody in the public. That is not what we do."

Chief Bird said Officer Boone had been employed with WHPD for around the past two years.

2004 decision cost taxpayers \$200k

WINTER HAVEN – In the summer of 2004, the eyes of three strong hurricanes passed through Polk County. Some of the yard debris picked up by the Winter Haven Solid Waste Department was dumped where the Lake Maude Recreation Complex is currently being built.

City Manager Mike Herr said there has been so much growth in the city of late, so many permits and inspections being made, that city staff may be overworked and that factor may have played a role in nobody noticing and saying something about the fact that the city was building a park over an old yard debris dump.

City Manager Herr told the commissioners Aug. 27, "To ensure that we have the process and expertise in place to avoid major blunders in cost and embarrassment to the city commission, I think we can assure that you have the right team in place and I think you have the right leader in me to make sure those things happen. When things go well the team gets the credit. When things go poorly I deserve the criticism."

Commissioner Pete Chichetto asked if anybody on city staff or if any contractors had been negligent.

Dave Carter, an engineer on contract with the city, told commissioners that the land underneath the park was tested in nine places but that it is not normal operating procedure to test land where a football field will be built.

The park was originally scheduled to be open this month but due to the yard debris needing to be removed, the park opening has been pushed back to October 10. Yard debris buried under the ground is not as stable as soil and over time, if not removed, would cause the football field to have depressions in places. Rather than fix those down the road, the city commission voted unanimously to fix the problem now.

Delay in construction cost taxpayers around \$40K more than it would have cost to remove the debris before construction of the park started, Mayor Dantzler said.

The overall cost to remove the yard debris is more than \$200K.

Haven Firsts: Part II

Our history is a colorful stream of events that began with the community's platting in the early 1880s. Last week we detailed some historic "firsts" that occurred prior to the city's incorporation in 1911. This week we'll look at later milestones.

In 1915 the first K-12 high school opened on what is now the site of the downtown post office. Prior to that time students wanting to complete more than grades 1 - 8 had to go to other communities. This was also the year an ambitious group of private citizens formed the 20 Lakes Boat Club planning a project to create a system of canals connecting our lakes. Based on newspaper reports of the day, the purpose of the canals was to open more land for winter homes and agricultural pursuits. By 1917 the effort was bankrupt.

In 1919 Winter Haven residents voted 78 to 49 in favor of establishing the Winter Haven Lake Region Boat Course

District with taxing powers to fund the maintenance of the canal system. Today it is more commonly called the Canal Commission.

During 1923 the village adopted the City Council form of government and the Board of Trade evolved to become the Winter Haven Chamber of Commerce.

These were the years of the Florida Boom and Winter Haven, like many Florida communities, grew rapidly. Early 1924 welcomed the first Orange Festival. The agricultural exposition grew rapidly and was an annual community event until 2008.

On September 6, 1930, 22-year-old George Jenkins opened the first Publix Food Store on Fourth Street, NW in the space currently occupied by the Tempo 1930 Restaurant. A marker designating the historic site will be unveiled this coming week.

The first guests were officially wel-

came to Cypress Gardens on January 2, 1936. Two other Garden's firsts occurred during World War II. The first ski show took place when Mrs. Pope gathered her children and several friends out of school to perform for visiting servicemen. Also while Mr. Pope was serving in Europe a winter freeze damaged bright orange "flame vines" on either side of the Garden's entrance. Mrs. Pope dressed two employees in what she called "old fashions" or the first Belle dresses and had them stand on either

side of the entrance to hide the damaged vines.

Busy times for a growing town. Next week we'll conclude with more recent "Firsts."

Six/Ten purchased social security building

WINTER HAVEN – Longtime Winter Haven residents may remember the old Social Security building downtown next to the Ritz Theatre.

Back in 2006, the Winter Haven City Commission voted to purchase the building and another downtown parcel with plans to build the parking garage downtown. As it turned out, the city did not need the land where the old Social Security building was to build the garage and it has been vacant since 2013.

Over the years, the city commission has put out requests for proposals, in attempts to sell the building, multiple times.

In 2013 Six/Ten developers expressed interest in the building but the city and Six/Ten could not reach a mutually beneficial agreement on the property. The property was put out to bid again in 2014 and, once again, Six/Ten developers were the only people to express interest. It took more than a year to get a \$133K contract signed. The original plan was to replace the Social Security building with a three-story structure but after the contract was signed, Six/Ten developers inspected the property and determined that the old foundation of the building would not support a three-story structure.

In December 2016, the city and Six/Ten developers amended their contract and the purchase price climbed to \$190K. Additional soil testing was

done and it was determined that their amended plans for a two-story structure would also not work. A third plan for the building, a one-story structure was submitted to the city and the purchase price climbed to \$200K.

This plan was denied by the city commission July 24, 2017. That particular meeting was a hotly debated meeting, mostly about changing the city charter. In September 2017, Six/Ten withdrew their offer. In October 2017, once again the city commission put out a request to sell the building. By April 2018, the city advertised the property more than ever before.

And once again, Six/Ten was the only developers to express interest.

On Aug. 27, Winter Haven City Commissioners voted 3-2 in favor of selling the property to Six/Ten. Commissioners William Twyford and Chichetto voted in opposition, saying they thought the city could get more money for the property than was being offered.

Mayor Brad Dantzler said he would rather sell the property to a known developer with track record in Winter Haven than wait for more money and have the developer build something that city residents would not like. Mayor Dantzler proposed using the \$200K from the sale to improve Nora Mayo Hall. Commissioners agreed to vote on what to do with the money when the city budget is finalized.

Wetlands Park

WINTER HAVEN – Starting as soon as next month, construction of a wetlands park similar to the park on the south side of Lake Howard will commence on the south side of Lake Conine, Winter Haven Public Works Director M.J. Carnevale said.

Lake Conine is a 236-acre lake on the west side of Lucerne Park Road when driving toward Haines City.

Carnevale said that during the 1970s and 1980s, Lake Conine had some of the poorest lake water quality in Polk County. A water treatment plant used to discharge treated water directly into the lake. In the 1990s, this treated water was piped out and started being used for irrigation. Since then, water quality has improved but remains below acceptable standards, Carnevale said.


One of the main reasons why the lake still has some water quality issues is a creek tied to the lake that releases untreated stormwater directly into the lake. Carnevale said annually, 495 pounds of phosphorus, 2,255 pounds

of nitrogen, 365 pounds of heavy metals, 63,452 pounds of suspended solids and 10,164 pounds of oxygen-demanding substances are released into the lake.


In the mid-2000s, in partnership with Southwest Florida Water Management District staff, 34 acres on the southern shore of the lake were purchased. Plans to build a park were completed in 2011 but the cost was not something that would fit the city budget. Those plans were subsequently adjusted.

The Florida Department of Environmental Protection is providing \$750K of the funding for the wetlands and SWFWMD is paying 50 percent of the remaining costs up to \$857K. Fifty percent of the remaining funds are being paid by the Polk County Board of County Commissioners tax funds. Winter Haven taxpayers and county taxpayers will be paying \$428K in matching funds each.

The South Lake Conine Stormwater Treatment Project is scheduled to be completed by January 2020. Carnevale said if the city commission agrees at a later date, a park with elevated trails may be added to the wetlands.



Past state speech champion on hand at annual county event

BARTOW – Two years ago Madison Dvorak won the state finals of the Florida Farm Bureau Youth Speech Contest as a sophomore at Kathleen High in Lakeland and that victory has opened some doors for her.

Now as a senior she, who has no agriculture background in her family, is president of FFA, District 8 and the federal district. She is also earning college credits this year. Not only does she work on that as well as her studies, she works at an equine facility.

Dvorak was on hand to cheer on the next county winner at the Polk County Speech Contest on Tuesday, Aug. 28 at the Polk County Farm Bureau in Bartow. Dvorak originally got interested in agriculture when she was 12 years old when she finished fifth in the state in a science and technology contest.

At the state speech which she won in 2016,

the topic was “What is an unmanned aerial system and how it can be used to impact agriculture.” Eight contestants were judged on content and delivery and each had five minutes.

Dvorak said before she took on the subject she really didn’t know how drones were used on farms.

“I thought you had to purchase them, but I found out you pay someone to do it,” she recalled.

Meant to promote an interest and understanding agricultural aspects Dvorak won a plaque and \$500 for winning.

Due to the victory, she said she was able to meet political leaders, university professors, extension agents and “a variety of people.”

That moves along with her personal career goal of becoming active in agricultural policy.

Helps who she can

She understands the position she’s put herself in and through her YouTube page, she has gotten calls from people around the country.

“They ask how do you win? They want advice or my help,” she said. And, she helps.

“I say yes to everyone I can,” she added.

In Polk County, the Farm Bureau promotes economic, legal, research, and regulatory issues. It focuses on five areas that include Agricultural Education & Promotion, Legislative Outreach & Policy Development, Public Relations, Leadership Development and Organizational Management. It also focuses the students on leadership development to motivate future leaders of the farm industries.

“It’s really exciting to us to see young people come in and shine,” McKenzie said.

his grandfather) was a four-star admiral. He refused preferential treatment, keeping faith with his fellow POWs.

For his courage, he suffered even greater torture at the hands of his captors for more than five years.

Can you give a better definition of heroism?

President Trump, who managed to avoid draft-era service, declared that McCain was not a hero. Trump said he preferred service members who were not captured.

Even coming from a man famous for his outrageous statements, this hit a new low; still more disgusting was the cheering from his audience. Surely there were no veterans applauding this remark.

In Congress for more than three decades, John McCain was a maverick — a man who voted his convictions, rather than blindly following the marching orders of his party as propounded by the president.

In the celebration of his life, many associates on the opposite side of the aisle recalled how John McCain was willing to listen to views at odds with his own, and to maintain a collegial

relationship with his political adversaries.

If that is not the definition of political character, what is?

John McCain chose two political opponents who defeated him in his efforts to win the presidency — George W. Bush and Barack Obama — to speak at his funeral. And he asked Joe Biden, Democratic vice-president whose son died of the same brain cancer that took his own life, to deliver a eulogy.

In a final and well-deserved in-your-face rebuke, he directed that Donald Trump, the man who ridiculed heroism, not be invited to his funeral.

America has lost a man of courage and character.

The armed forces will continue to turn out men and women of courage.

Let us hope that our nation's leadership will still give us a few statesmen with the character of John McCain.





Former senator to replace McCain, at least until January

PHOENIX — Prolonging the uncertainty over who will fill the late John McCain's U.S. Senate seat, the governor of Arizona on Tuesday announced the appointment of former Sen. Jon Kyl but said he has only committed to serve until the end of the year.

Kyl, a Republican who retired from the Senate in 2012 to become a lobbyist and spend more time with his family, is currently shepherding President Donald Trump's nomination of Brett Kavanaugh to the U.S. Supreme Court. Kyl's appointment will

make it possible for him to vote for the nomination.

It's unclear what more Kyl, 76, will do in the Senate. He said he agreed to serve briefly out of a "sense of duty" and will not run for the seat in 2020, when Arizona voters will decide who fills the seat through 2022. The seat will then be up again for a full six-year term.

Gov. Doug Ducey, also a Republican, said Kyl was "the best possible person, regardless of politics" for the job, and he hopes Kyl serves past the end of the year.

If Kyl does leave the Senate after the end of the current congressional

term next Jan. 3, Arizona's governor can appoint another senator for the remaining year. By state law the senator will have to be a member of the same party as the departing one, in this case the GOP.

For now, Kyl will pad Republicans' margin in the narrowly divided Senate. They hold a 51-49 majority but that dwindled to a single vote while McCain stayed in Arizona for much of this year being treated for the brain cancer that killed him on Aug. 25.

The GOP is hoping Kyl will be a more reliable partisan vote than McCain, whose opposition to a partial repeal of President

Obama's health care law pitched the party into turmoil last year.

Kyl is well-respected in Arizona and has been able to avoid many of the battles with activists that complicated McCain's career and that of the state's other senator, Jeff Flake, who is retiring because his feud with Trump made his re-election impossible.

Kyl's entire career in Washington overlapped with McCain's, and he served with the state's senior senator for three terms before stepping down. Kyl carved out a profile as a reliable conservative vote and a foreign policy expert.

Tell-all book by Watergate reporter roils Trump White House

WASHINGTON — An incendiary tell-all book by a reporter who helped bring down President Richard Nixon is roiling the White House as current and former aides of President Donald Trump are quoted as calling him an "idiot" and admitting they snatched sensitive documents off his desk to keep him from taking rash actions.


The book by Washington Post journalist Bob Woodward is the latest to throw the Trump administration into damage-control mode with explosive anecdotes and concerns about the commander in chief. The Post on Tuesday published details from "Fear: Trump in the White House," the Watergate reporter's forthcoming examination of Trump's first 18 months in office.

Trump pushed back in an interview with the conservative Daily Caller, saying: "It's just another bad book. He's had a lot of credibility problems."

The president denied that senior aides took sensitive documents from his desk, saying, "There was nobody taking anything from me." And he stressed that he didn't speak to Woodward.

"I never spoke to him," Trump said. "Maybe I wasn't given messages that he called. I probably would have spoken to him if he'd called, if he'd gotten through."

The publication of Woodward's book has been anticipated for weeks, and current and former White House officials estimate that nearly all their colleagues cooperated with the famed Watergate journalist. The White House, in a statement from press secretary Sarah Huckabee Sanders, on Tuesday dismissed the book as "nothing more than fabricated stories,

many by former disgruntled employees, told to make the President look bad."

The book quotes chief of staff John Kelly as having doubts about Trump's mental faculties, declaring during one meeting, "We're in Crazytown." It also says he called Trump an "idiot," an account that Kelly denied.

"The idea I ever called the President an idiot is not true," Kelly said in a statement Tuesday.

The book says that Trump's former lawyer in the Russia probe, John Dowd, doubted the president's ability to avoid perjuring himself should he be interviewed in special counsel Robert Mueller's investigation into Russian election interference and potential coordination with Trump's campaign. Dowd, who stepped down in January, resigned after the mock interview, the book said.

"Don't testify. It's either that or an orange jumpsuit," Dowd is quoted telling the president.

Dowd, in a statement Tuesday, said "no so-called 'practice session' or 're-enactment'" took place and denied saying that Trump was likely to end up in an orange jumpsuit.

Chaos marks Kavanaugh confirmation hearing; Democrats seek delay

WASHINGTON — Quarreling and confusion marked the Senate hearing Tuesday for Supreme Court nominee Brett Kavanaugh, with politically charged arguments about White House documents and process getting as much attention as the role the conservative judge would likely play in shaping rulings on abortion, executive power and other national issues.

Strong Democratic opposition to President Donald Trump's

nominee reflected the political stakes for both parties just two months before congressional elections. The Democrats, including several senators poised for 2020 presidential bids, tried to block the proceedings over Kavanaugh records being withheld by the White House. Republicans in turn accused the Democrats of turning the hearing into a circus. And protesters shouted out frequent and persistent disruptions from the audience.

After hours silently listening to the partisan exchanges, Kavanaugh rose to be sworn in and give

opening remarks. He stressed the court's independence at a time when Democrats say he was picked because Trump believes the judge's expansive views of executive power will help the president in investigations.

"Our independent Judiciary is the crown jewel of our constitutional republic," Kavanaugh told the senators. "The Supreme Court is the last line of defense for the separation of powers and the rights and liberties guaranteed by the Constitution."

Advice on kids' concussions calls for better tracking

CHICAGO — New children's concussion guidelines from the U.S. government recommend against routine X-rays and blood tests for diagnosis and reassure parents that most kids' symptoms clear up within one to three months.

Signs of potentially more serious injuries that may warrant CT imaging scans include vomiting, unconsciousness and severe, worsening headaches, according to the guidelines released Tuesday.

The guidelines from the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention are the first broad evidence-based recommendations for diagnosing and treating children's concussions, the researchers say. They evaluated 25 years of scientific research on managing concussions in children and chose procedures with the strongest evidence of benefit.

The American Academy of

CDC brain injury specialist Matthew Breiding said many people mistakenly believe that "you need to lose consciousness or be 'knocked out' in order to have a concussion."

Neurology has similar evidence-based guidelines, but strictly for sports concussions in child and adult athletes and focused on restricting return to play. The American Academy of Pediatrics also has guidance for managing sports concussions, and for returning to school after a concussion.

The CDC's guidelines are for concussions from all causes, including falls, sports and car accidents. They recommend rest from physical and mental activity including school and sports immediately after a concussion, gradually resuming normal routines.

CDC brain injury specialist Matthew Breiding, a co-author of the guidelines, said parents should tell their kids to report any

concussion symptoms right away — whether they occur at home or during sports activities.

"Some children and teens think concussions aren't serious or worry that if they report a concussion they will lose their position on the team or look weak. Remind them that it's better to miss one game than the whole season," he said.

By some estimates, at least 1 million U.S. children get concussions each year although the true frequency is unknown because there is no national effort to track them and many go untreated. The CDC has proposed developing a surveillance system to fill that gap and the new guidelines, published in JAMA

Ex-deputy sued over 2003 disappearance of black man

NAPLES — The family of a black man who disappeared nearly 15 years ago filed a lawsuit Tuesday accusing a former sheriff's deputy of killing him, and filmmaker Tyler Perry took part in announcing the lawsuit.

Marcia Williams and her attorney Benjamin Crump sued former Collier County deputy Steven Calkins, accusing him of murdering her 27-year-old son Terrance Williams after detaining him in January 2004. Calkins was also the last person seen with Felipe Santos, an illegal immigrant he picked up in October 2003.

Williams' mother said she filed the lawsuit to get

answers for her son's four children. The complaint does not set a dollar amount for damages.

"I am not going to let it go until I get the answers that they deserve," Williams said at a press conference, thanking Perry for supporting the family and bringing attention to the case. In 2014, Perry offered a \$100,000 reward for information in the men's disappearance. He said it turned up nothing, so he raised the reward Tuesday to \$200,000.

Perry, best known for his African-American family comedies and his character "Madea," said "race has become such a polarizing" factor nationally, but this case should disturb any person, no matter their color.

"We have got to come

together to fight injustice, to fight what is wrong," Perry said.

Calkins did not return a call seeking comment and no one answered Tuesday at his current home near Cedar Rapids, Iowa. He told investigators in 2004

he dropped both men at a convenience store. He was never charged but the Collier County Sheriff's Office fired him after he stopped cooperating with the investigation. He is white. Santos was from Mexico.

Williams and Santos disappeared under similar circumstances in this southwest Florida county bordering the Everglades and its alligators.

In October 2003, Santos, a construction and farm worker, had been in a fender bender and Calkins took him into custody because he did not have his license and registration.

Three months later, Williams' car broke down and he parked in a cemetery parking lot. He had just moved to the area to be near his mother and had been facing jail in Tennessee for failing to pay child support.

Calkins came upon him and called for a tow. He then detained Williams for also failing to provide identification.

He was recording using a Southern black accent as he spoke to his dispatcher and described Williams' car as a "homie Cadillac."

Neither man was ever seen again. Calkins told investigators he had released the men before taking them to jail because they had been nice and he was cutting them a break.

Collier sheriff's investigators had no immediate response Tuesday, but they have said after initially cooperating, Calkins stopped and he failed a polygraph examination. He was fired. Investigators found no blood or signs of struggle in his patrol car. A tracking device was placed on it in case he ever visited a spot where the bodies may have been dumped, but he never did.

WTVT-TV reports the Sarasota thrift store workers were sorting clothing donations when they discovered a brown paper bag inside a plastic tote.

A Sarasota Police report says an employee noticed the bag early last week but put it aside until Thursday. It says the employee then cut a small hole in the bag and called police.

It's unclear if the

donation of the roughly 2,100 grams of vacuum-sealed marijuana was intentional.

Woman injured when pickup truck hits house

ST. PETERSBURG (AP) — Authorities say a pickup truck crashed into a house in Florida, injuring a woman who was in her bed.

St. Petersburg police said in a news release that 44-year-old Samuel Anderson was cited for careless driving on Monday evening.

Police say 38-year-old Ashley Zurla was taken to the hospital with injuries not considered life-threatening. Several children inside the home were not injured in

the crash.

2 bodies found after woman sees blood dripping from ceiling

MARGATE (AP) — A neighbor's call to police after noticing blood dripping from the ceiling of a South Florida apartment led to a grim discovery in the upstairs unit.

Margate police Lt. Joseph Galaska told news outlets Monday that 84-year-old Nicholas Mantzouranis killed his 66-year-old wife Sally Mantzouranis before turning the gun on himself.

Galaska said the tenant told a maintenance worker about the red

substance seeping from the ceiling Sunday afternoon. Paramedics and police were called to the apartment to perform a wellness check. When no one answered the door, they removed it and found the bodies inside. A pistol was next to Nicholas Mantzouranis.

Police are continuing to investigate the case.

Police investigate woman filmed dunking boy's head in toilet

LEESBURG (AP) — Police and social workers are investigating a woman who was recorded repeatedly dunking her 3-year-old son's head in a toilet and flushing it.

In a statement issued Sunday, the Leesburg

Police Department said detectives are working with prosecutors to determine whether to bring charges against the woman, who has been identified as Kaitlyn Wolf.

Since the video went viral, officers have had to park outside the woman's central Florida home in response to multiple threats.

Wolf told WKMG the video has been taken out of context and that the screaming boy also was laughing. She says he said, "let's do it again" when the video was finished.

Wolf said the video wasn't intended for Facebook. The Orlando Sentinel reports the video was posted by the girlfriend of the child's father.

Pedestrian killed by commuter train near Fort Lauderdale

FORT LAUDERDALE (AP) — A commuter train struck and killed a pedestrian near Fort Lauderdale during rush hour.

Tri-Rail spokeswoman Bonnie Arnold tells the Sun Sentinel that the pedestrian was trespassing just south of the crossing as the train was heading south on Tuesday morning. The train was carrying 124 people.

Arnold said she didn't have any additional details about the crash, which is being investigated by the Broward Sheriff's Office.

Death of Afghan group's founder unlikely to weaken militants

ISLAMABAD (AP) — The death of Jalaluddin Haqqani, the founder of Afghanistan's outlawed militant network that bears his name, is unlikely to weaken the group that is considered the most formidable of the Taliban's fighting forces.

The Taliban said Haqqani died Monday at age 71 after reports of years of ill health, including Parkinson's disease. Because of his

infirmity, stewardship of the organization had been given to one of his 12 sons, Sirajuddin, whose military prowess is credited with plotting and carrying out some of more audacious attacks assigned to the network.

The younger Haqqani is also deputy head of the Taliban, who have waged increasingly sophisticated and coordinated attacks against Afghanistan's struggling security forces. Washington's own watchdog in a recent report said nearly half

of Afghanistan is either under the control of the Taliban or influenced by the religious militia.

Jalaluddin Haqqani, once hailed as a freedom fighter by U.S. President Ronald Reagan for opposing the Soviet Union's presence in Afghanistan during the Cold War, had been paralyzed for the past 10 years, Taliban spokesman Zabihullah Mujahed told The Associated Press in a telephone interview. Reports of his death were

widespread in 2015, and he had not been heard from in several years.

In announcing his death, Mujahed called Haqqani a religious scholar and exemplary warrior. The United States declared the Haqqani network a terrorist organization in 2012, and it has been one of the fiercest opponents for U.S. and NATO troops in Afghanistan.

The elder Haqqani's death is not expected to affect the network's military might or strategy.

Strong typhoon slams western Japan; 8 dead, airport flooded

TOKYO — A powerful typhoon slammed into western Japan on Tuesday, inundating the region's main international airport and blowing a tanker into a bridge, disrupting land and air travel and leaving thousands stranded. At least eight people died and scores were injured.

Jebi, reportedly the strongest typhoon to make landfall in Japan since 1993, headed north across the main island of Honshu toward the Sea of Japan. It was off the northern coast of Fukui on Tuesday evening with sustained winds of 78 miles per hour and gusts up to 110 mph, the Japan Meteorological Agency said.

More than 700 flights were canceled, according to Japanese media tallies. High-speed bullet train service was suspended from Tokyo west to Hiroshima, though service partially resumed later Tuesday when the typhoon left the region.

More than 1.6 million

households remained without power in Osaka, Kyoto and four nearby prefectures late Tuesday, according to Kansai Electric Power Co.

High seas poured into Kansai International Airport, built on artificial islands in Osaka Bay, flooding one of its two runways, cargo storage and other facilities, and forcing it to shut down, said the Ministry of Land, Infrastructure, Transport and Tourism. A passenger was slightly injured by shards from a window shattered by the storm.

A 2,591-ton tanker that

was mooring slammed into the side of a bridge connecting the airport to the mainland, damaging the bridge and making it unusable, leaving about 3,000 passengers stranded at the airport, transport ministry official Mitsuo Nakao said.

The tanker was also damaged, but its 11 crewmembers were not injured and remained on board, according to the coast guard.

NHK public television showed passengers sitting or lying on the floor in the airport terminal in the dark without air conditioning.

Israeli jets fly over Lebanon in rare daytime raid on Syria

DAMASCUS, Syria (AP) — Israeli jets flying high over Lebanon struck at targets inside Syria on Tuesday, Syrian state media reported, in a rare daytime raid that killed at least one person.

Syria's SANA state news agency said the country's air defenses shot down five missiles, adding that one person was killed and 12 others were wounded.

It reported strikes on the Wadi Ayoun area in the western Hama province and on the town of Baniyas in the coastal Tartous province.

The Britain-based Syrian Observatory for Human Rights said the jets targeted military installations belonging to Iran, a key ally of the Syrian government.

Lebanese residents in areas north of the capital, Beirut, reported hearing jets overhead before sunset.

Israel is believed to be behind a string of strikes targeting government and allied military installations in Syria.

Major UK union backs calls for new Brexit referendum

LONDON (AP) — One of Britain's biggest trade unions on Tuesday joined calls for a new public vote on leaving the European Union, saying voters were misled during the 2016 referendum campaign.

The GMB union, which has more than 600,000 members, said "the promises that were made during the referendum campaign are simply not the reality we are facing."

GMB General Secretary Tim Roache says the union's members in manufacturing, retail and other sectors face uncertainty because the British government has yet to negotiate a deal with the EU.

The union says Britons voted to leave the EU, but they "did not vote for economic chaos or to put jobs and hard-won rights on the line," and voters should be able to accept or reject the final Brexit deal.

With less than seven months to go until Britain leaves the EU, the two sides have yet to strike a deal on divorce terms and future trade.

Libya says death toll from Tripoli clashes climbs to 61

BENGAZI, Libya (AP) — The death toll from more than a week of fighting between armed groups in Tripoli has climbed to at least 61 people, including civilians, Libyan authorities said Tuesday, as the U.N. expressed alarm over the fate of detained migrants and Libyans already displaced by years of unrest.

The U.N. mission in Libya said late Tuesday that the warring militias had agreed to a cease-fire, but it was unclear whether the violence had ended.

Fighting erupted last week when the Seventh Brigade, militias which hail from Tarhouna, a town about 40 miles south of Tripoli, attacked southern neighborhoods of the capital. The Tripoli Revolutionaries' Brigades — militias which support the U.N.-backed government — have come to the city's defense.

In addition to those killed, another 159 people, including civilians, have been wounded, while 12 people are still missing, according to Malek Mersat, an official at the Health Ministry.

Amazon is 2nd US company to reach \$1 trillion market value

NEW YORK — Amazon on Tuesday became the second publicly traded company to be worth \$1 trillion, hot on the heels of iPhone maker Apple.

Launched as an online bookstore in 1995, Amazon.com has changed the way people shop for toilet paper, TVs and just about anything else. In its two decades, the company has expanded far

beyond those bookseller beginnings, combining its world-spanning retail operations with less flashy but very profitable advertising and cloud computing businesses. It's now expanding into the health care industry and increasing its brick-and-mortar presence.

The company's rise has boosted the fortunes of its founder and CEO, Jeff Bezos: His 16 percent stake in Amazon is now worth about \$160 billion. Forbes magazine placed

him at the top of its 2018 billionaires list for the first time, surpassing Microsoft co-founder Bill Gates and billionaire investor Warren Buffett.

Amazon stock has increased almost 600 percent in the last five years, including a 70 percent surge so far in 2018 alone. On Tuesday, the stock climbed enough to push the company's valuation past the \$1 trillion mark, although it dropped back slightly after that.

Apple topped the

\$1 trillion mark in early August. Saudi Arabia's national energy company, Aramco, is widely believed to be worth much more than either Amazon or Apple.

Bezos left a hedge fund job in 1994 to start an internet business. He decided to sell books, and called Amazon "earth's biggest bookstore." It quickly added more products, and then eventually opened up a marketplace where others could sell their products. Amazon

has cemented customer loyalty through its Prime membership program, offering fast, free shipping as well as music and video streaming perks. In April, Bezos disclosed for the first time that Amazon had more than 100 million paying Prime members around the world.

Wall Street has become very enthusiastic about Amazon's other businesses. Amazon Web Services provides cloud computing services to companies and governments, and

Amazon's advertising division makes billions by selling ads to companies that want their products to show up when shoppers search on the site.

Those profitable businesses have helped offset the high costs associated with running its online store. Amazon saw its quarterly profit soar past \$2 billion for the first time earlier this year as the online shopping, cloud computing and advertising businesses all kept growing.

Health and tech stocks dip

NEW YORK — U.S. stocks finished lower Tuesday as losses for health care and technology companies canceled out gains for banks. Another gain for Amazon briefly brought its market value to \$1 trillion.

Banks rose as interest rates climbed. Nike slumped after it gave a major endorsement deal to former San Francisco 49ers quarterback Colin Kaepernick, known for his protests of police brutality and racial injustice.

Investors didn't commit to many big moves as trading resumed after the Labor Day holiday. They are likely to focus on trade this week, as the U.S. is scheduled to resume trade talks with Canada on Wednesday and could announce new tariffs on \$200 billion in Chinese imports later in the week.

Mark Hackett, chief of investment research at financial services firm Nationwide, said investors are paying less attention

to trade-related headlines recently because they are fairly certain they know how the talks will end.

"I'm still pretty confident that before midterms or by the end of the year we're going to have a handshake agreement with the NAFTA region and China," he said.

The S&P 500 index gave up 4.80 points, or 0.2 percent, to 2,896.72. The Dow Jones Industrial Average dipped 12.34 points to 25,952.48. The Nasdaq composite fell 18.29 points, or 0.2 percent, to 8,091.25. The Russell 2000 index lost 7.38 points, or 0.4 percent, to 1,733.38.

Drugmakers and suppliers took some of the sharpest losses Tuesday, and big technology companies including Facebook and Alphabet, Google's parent company, also slumped.

Nike stock fell 3.2 percent to \$79.60 after the company said Kaepernick will be one of the faces of its 30th anniversary "Just Do It" campaign. Investors feared a possible backlash from customers.

EPA watchdog faults Pruitt's \$3.5 million security costs

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Environmental Protection Agency failed to document any threats or security risks that warranted spending more than \$3.5 million on unprecedented around-the-clock bodyguards for then-chief Scott Pruitt, the agency's internal watchdog concluded on Tuesday.

The EPA allowed Pruitt and his administrative team to increase the security detail to 19 agents, up from six for Pruitt's predecessor. That "undocumented decision represents an inefficient use of agency resources," the inspector general concluded.

EPA spokesman Michael Abboud said in an email that officials had to look at more than specific and serious threats, or the lack of them, in deciding how much security an official needs.

Abboud cited gun attacks without warning on GOP lawmakers at

a baseball practice last year and on a Democratic congresswoman in Arizona in 2011.

"Lack of a threat does not mean that there is no risk or that protective services are not appropriate," the EPA spokesman wrote.

BROOKLYN CENTER, Minn. (AP) — A pair of ruby slippers used in "The Wizard of Oz" and later stolen from a Minnesota museum were recovered in a sting operation after a man approached the shoes' insurer and said he could help get them back, the FBI said Tuesday.

The slippers were on loan to the Judy Garland Museum in the late actress' hometown of Grand Rapids, Minnesota, when they were taken in 2005 by someone who climbed through a window and broke into a small display case. The shoes were insured for \$1 million.

The FBI said a man

approached the insurer in summer 2017 and said he could help get them back. Grand Rapids police asked for the FBI's help and after a nearly yearlong investigation, the slippers were recovered in July during a sting operation in Minneapolis.

The FBI said no one has yet been arrested or charged in the case, but they have "multiple suspects" and continue to investigate. As they unveiled the recovered slippers at a news conference Tuesday, they asked anyone with information about the theft to contact them.

Farrow says NBC misleading in explanation of story

NEW YORK (AP) — NBC News' decision to pass on Ronan Farrow's investigation into Harvey Weinstein's alleged sexual misconduct is an open wound, with Farrow and one of Weinstein's accusers criticizing the network's latest explanation and President Donald Trump chiming in Tuesday.

Trump tweeted that NBC

is "now fumbling around making excuses for their probably highly unethical conduct." He called NBC "FAKE NEWS."

NBC News Chairman Andy Lack sent a lengthy email to staff members Monday evening outlining last summer's decision to pass on Farrow's reporting. He said his story wasn't ready to be aired at that time, and that NBC had done nothing to block his reporting.

Meanwhile, Farrow's former investigative producer called on the network to agree to an independent investigation of its actions.

Farrow had tweeted overnight that Lack's statement contained several false and misleading statements — in particular Lack's claim that Farrow had no women ready to publicly identify themselves with their accusations.

"The suggestion to take the story to another outlet was first raised by NBC, not me, and I took them up on it only after it became clear that I was being blocked from further reporting," Farrow said.

Hot flashes can last 15 years after beginning menopause

DEAR DR. ROACH: I started going through natural menopause in my late 50s. I will be 65 in September. Should I still be having hot flashes? — B.G.

ANSWER: Unfortunately, some women (perhaps 25 percent) will continue to have hot flashes 15 years out from the start of menopause. There are many treatments for hot flashes, but although estrogens are the most effective, the risk of starting hormone replacement at age 65 is considerably higher than at age 50, so most clinicians are uncomfortable prescribing them.

Before thinking about medication, however, many women (and a few men, such as those on hormonal treatment for prostate cancer) have found non-medical ways to deal with them. Layers of clothing are key — take extra layers off when hot, but recognize that so much body heat can be lost, a person actually can shiver when the flash is over. Keeping the room cooler will help as well. Anyone living with you may just have to

deal with that. Handheld fans are great for some.

Prescription medications include medicines normally used for depression (like venlafaxine, citalopram or paroxetine) and for seizures (gabapentin often is prescribed, especially if symptoms are worse at night). Various supplements are used, but estrogen-containing ones, even plant estrogens, may have significant though poorly quantified risks. A new class of medicines (NK3 inhibitors) still is being studied and may be very beneficial, but it seems like I've

been saying that for a while now. Food and Drug Administration approval sometimes can take years.

DEAR DR. ROACH: I am wondering why the medical profession seems to be ignoring the potential of silver in combating the rise of drug-resistant bacteria. It seems that silver was used to combat bacteria for thousands of years, up until the advent of antibiotics, which supplanted its use.

I have heard that silver vessels were used to prevent spoilage of food and wine by the Greeks and Romans, that silver was placed in water barrels by pioneers crossing the prairies, and that silver nitrate was placed in my eyes at birth just in case my mother had gonorrhea (I'm 74).

My understanding is that silver impedes the metabolic process in bacteria, and as such prevents reproduction even if it doesn't kill them, but that it is much less toxic to "higher" organisms such as humans. Furthermore, I read in 2013 in a prestigious journal that low levels of silver render antibiot-

ics much more effective. Why aren't we using silver? — B.C.

ANSWER: Topical silver is indeed an effective antibacterial. That is, when silver is ionized, such as in silver nitrate or silver sulfadiazine. However, metallic silver — say, coins or cups — is not the most effective form.

I read the 2013 paper you mentioned, and it is clear that silver is helpful when added to antibiotics. However, the use of systemic silver in humans has shown problems. A silver-coated heart valve was effective at preventing infection, but was so toxic to heart tissue that it needed to be taken off the market. Excess silver ingestion causes argyria, a permanent blue-gray discoloration of the skin. Silver is a heavy metal, and the body does not have a way of removing it, so it can accumulate.

I should note that commercially available "colloidal silver" preparations are of uncertain purity, and the FDA has ruled that colloidal silver is neither safe nor effective for any condition.





Declarer led a spade to his ace and a spade back to dummy's king, drawing the trumps. He then led a low diamond from the dummy without cashing the ace first. This caught East off guard and he hesitated slightly before playing low. This was enough to telegraph the location of the king to South. A spade to dummy's jack was followed by the ace of diamonds and the queen of diamonds. East covered, and South ruffed leaving this position:

East won the opening heart lead with the ace and continued the suit, ruffed in dummy. Looking at an almost certain club loser, South wanted to develop three discards from dummy's diamonds. He thought it more likely that West held the king, as his hearts weren't very robust. Should West hold the king with only one or two little diamonds to go with it, South could ruff it out and have the needed discards.

When South cashed his last spade, discarding a club from dummy, East couldn't defend the position. A diamond discard and both of dummy's diamonds would be high. A club discard, instead, and South would have three club tricks. Nicely played!

US report criticizes FEMA response to Maria in Puerto Rico

SAN JUAN, Puerto Rico — A federal report published Tuesday found that staff shortages and a lack of trained personnel slowed the U.S. government response to Hurricane Maria, a storm estimated to have killed nearly 3,000 people in Puerto Rico.

The U.S. Government Accountability Office said 54 percent of federal emergency personnel were not qualified to do the rescue work in October 2017, a month after the Category 4 hurricane hit the U.S. territory. The report also states there were logistical challenges due to the location of Puerto Rico and the neighboring U.S. Virgin Islands, and added that the Federal Emergency Management Agency had to assume many of the local government's responsibilities given the loss of power and communications as

well as "limited local preparedness for a major hurricane."

Christopher Currie, the GAO's director of emergency management issues, said in a phone interview that FEMA was already stretched thin by responding to hurricanes Harvey and Irma, as well as California wildfires.

"The response in Florida, Texas and California was about what we planned for," he said. "In Puerto Rico, obviously, it was a much, much different story."

FEMA did not anticipate not having the support of local government officials in Puerto Rico, who he said were still reeling from the hurricane — the strongest to hit the territory in nearly a century. In addition, the power grid was destroyed and 95 percent of cellphone towers were not working, leaving the island with no communication for almost a week. This meant officials did not immediately understand the scale of the damage.

Hurricane Maria hit on Sept. 20 and is estimated to have caused \$100 billion in damage.

"Once the scale was understood, that's when FEMA called in the Department of Defense. They said, 'We're overwhelmed. ... We need help,'" Currie said. "From a FEMA standpoint, a couple of things happened that they were

not anticipating that they probably could have."

The report also said that FEMA lacked enough Spanish-speaking employees, and that some staffers were not physically fit enough to handle the "extreme or austere" environment.

Currie added that FEMA was already 30 percent understaffed after Hurricane Harvey, and

that some personnel were already drained by the storms and fires that hit prior to Maria.

"By the time they got to Puerto Rico, they were very tired," he said.

The report was issued nearly a week after U.S. President Donald Trump said his administration did a "fantastic job" responding to Hurricane Maria.

He said, "The Supreme Court must never, never be viewed as a partisan institution."

The 53-year-old judge choked up when talking about his family, particularly his parents, and drew chuckles from the room in naming all the girls he coaches on his daughter's basketball team.

Democrats raised objections to the nomination from the moment Chairman Chuck Grassley gavelled the Judiciary Committee to order. Several, including Kamala Harris of California, Cory Booker of New Jersey and Amy Klobuchar of Minnesota, all potential presidential contenders, demanded that Republicans delay the hearing. They railed against the unusual vetting process by Republicans that failed to include many documents from three years Kavanaugh worked in the George W. Bush administration, and 100,000 more pages withheld by the Trump White House. Some 42,000 pages were released on the evening before of the hearing.

"We cannot possibly move forward, Mr. Chairman, with this hearing," said Harris at the top of proceedings. Grassley disagreed.

As protesters repeatedly interrupted the session, Republican Sen. Ted Cruz, who is fighting for his own re-election in Texas, apologized to Kavanaugh for the spectacle he said had less to do about the judge's legal record than Trump in the White House.

"It is about politics," said Cruz. "It is about Democratic senators re-litigating the 2016 election."

Republicans' slim 51-49 majority in the Senate was bolstered during the hearing by the announcement from Arizona that Gov. Doug Ducey was appointing Jon Kyl, the former senator, to fill the seat held by the late Sen. John McCain. With majority Republicans appearing united, Democrats appear to have dim prospects of blocking Kavanaugh's confirmation.

As senators spoke, Kavanaugh occasionally sipped water and took notes. He was invited to introduce his parents, wife and children, who sat through much of the outbursts before being escorted out of the room.

Sen. Richard Blumenthal, D-Conn., made several motions to adjourn, saying if the confirmation continued, "this process will be tainted and stained forever."

Grassley denied all requests to postpone, defending the document

production as the most open in history. He said the chaotic scene was something he'd "never gone through" in 15 past confirmation hearings.

More than two dozen protesters disrupted the hearing at several points and were removed by police. "This is a mockery and a travesty of justice," shouted one woman. "Cancel Brett Kavanaugh!" Others shouted against the president or to protect abortion access.

Outside the room, women wearing red robes and white bonnets inspired by "The Handmaid's Tale" made their way through the Senate office building.

As patience thinned, Sen. John Cornyn, R-Texas, denounced what he called the "mob rule." Struggling to speak over protesters, Sen. Orrin Hatch, R-Utah, said: "These people are so out of line they shouldn't be in the doggone room."

But Sen. Dick Durbin, D-Ill., told Kavanaugh that the opposition being shown at the hearing reflected the concern many Americans have over Trump's "contempt of the rule of law" and the judge's own expansive views on executive power.

"It's that president who's decided you are his man," Durbin said. "Are people nervous about this ... concerned about this? Of course they are."

The panel's top Democrat, Sen. Diane Feinstein, described the hearing's "very unique circumstances."

"Not only is the country deeply divided politically, we also find ourselves with a president who faces his own serious problems," she said referring to investigations surrounding Trump. "So it's this backdrop that this nominee comes into."

Democrats appealed to Kavanaugh to intervene by seeking a delay to produce his full record, warning he would not want his nomination to be come with an asterisk or be under a cloud. "Don't you think you owe it to the American people?" asked Sen. Mazie Hirono, D-Hawaii.

But Republican Sen. Ben Sasse of Nebraska told Kavanaugh, "The deranged comments don't actually have anything to do with you."

Kavanaugh declared he would be even-handed in his approach to the law.

"A good judge must be an umpire, a neutral and impartial arbiter who favors no litigant or policy," Kavanaugh said. "I would always strive to be a team player on the Team of Nine."

Q&A: The Senate's feud over Kavanaugh records

WASHINGTON (AP) — Senate Democrats looking to win the battle of public opinion over Supreme Court nominee Brett Kavanaugh are essentially accusing Republicans of concealing evidence to ensure his confirmation before the midterm election.

The strategy was front-and-center as Kavanaugh's hearing got underway Tuesday, with Democrats immediately calling on the committee to adjourn. They characterized the hearing as a "charade and mockery of our norms."

Meanwhile, Republicans pointed to the huge number of documents released, the most ever for a Supreme Court nominee, to make the case that the review of Kavanaugh is "the most thorough and transparent confirmation process in history."

Here is a look at what the two sides are fighting about:

WHAT RECORDS ARE SENATORS REVIEWING?

The Senate Judiciary Committee has been able to review the more than 300 legal opinions Kavanaugh has authored and the hundreds more he has joined as a circuit court judge.

Republicans argue that those opinions are the most relevant records for determining a nominee's judicial philosophy and fitness to serve on the nation's highest court. But Kavanaugh's paper trail goes beyond that, as he also worked in the George W. Bush White House and for independent counsel Kenneth Starr during the investigation of President Bill Clinton.

The Judiciary Committee has reviewed tens of thousands of documents from Kavanaugh's work for Starr, including a memo he wrote urging lawyers on Starr's team to ask aggressive and graphic questions of Clinton concerning his relationship with White House intern Monica Lewinsky. Another 267,000 pages of Kavanaugh documents from his time working in the Bush White House have been made public, with another 215,000 provided for viewing only by committee members.

WHAT RECORDS HAVE NOT BEEN PROVIDED TO THE COMMITTEE?

Kavanaugh worked some five years in the Bush White House, first as legal counsel and then as staff secretary. It's those records that are at the center of the dispute. Grassley declined to request Kavanaugh's staff secretary records, which cover a 35-month period of Kavanaugh's work that he has described as "among the most interesting and most formative" in his career.

The Trump administration is also withholding more than 100,000 pages of Brett Kavanaugh's records from his tenure as legal counsel on the basis that disclosing the records would disrupt the functions or decision-making processes of the executive branch. Democrats denounced that decision Tuesday, saying there is no basis for those documents to be held back.

WHY ARE REPUBLICANS MOVING AHEAD?

Senate Judiciary Committee Chairman Charles Grassley of Iowa describes the documents sought by Democrats as "the least useful in understanding his legal views and the most sensitive" when it comes to the inner workings of the executive branch. Grassley says reviewing Kavanaugh's staff secretary documents would "teach us nothing about his legal views." For that, senators should rely on Kavanaugh's legal opinions, speeches and articles, Grassley says.

WHAT DO DEMOCRATS SAY ABOUT THE PROCESS?

Sen. Patrick Leahy of Vermont said about 4 percent of Kavanaugh's White House records have been posted for the public to view and about 7 percent have been made available to the committee. That compares to 99 percent of Justice Elena Kagan's records from her years at the White House being made available.

Sen. Dick Durbin said there is a "35-month black hole" in Kavanaugh's career from which senators have been denied any and all documents. Democrats have attacked the records production on two fronts. They're raising the question of whether Republicans are trying to hide something in Kavanaugh's record. They're also asserting that the Senate is "phoning in" its responsibility to carefully vet judicial nominees, calling the process a "sham."

ARE MORE RECORDS COMING IN?

Yes. The committee received 42,000 pages of documents Monday night. Democrats asserted that the lack of time to review those documents made the notion of properly vetting them "laughable."

The National Archives is also preparing to release more than 1 million documents from Kavanaugh's time in the White House counsel's office. But Archives says the review of those records will not be finished until the end of October.

Republicans hope to confirm Kavanaugh by Oct. 1, when the Supreme Court's new term begins.

thought of as nine separate judges, rather than a team. And on the most contentious cases, the court tends to split into conservative and liberal sides. But justices often say they seek consensus, and they like to focus on how frequently they reach unanimous decisions.

Kavanaugh, 53, has served for the past 12 years on the federal appeals court in Washington, D.C., and a conservative record includes a dissenting opinion last year that would have denied immediate access to an abortion for an immigrant teenager in federal custody.

Pediatrics, aim to improve detection and treatment.

The guidelines provide important advice for parents and doctors on managing kids' concussions and could contribute to a "personalized approach to state-of-the-art care," according to a journal editorial by brain injury experts at the Medical

College of Wisconsin and University of California, San Francisco.

Concussions, also called mild traumatic brain injury, are caused by a bump or jolt to the head. The impact causes the brain to bounce or twist, potentially damaging brain cells. Repeated concussions have been linked with a debilitating brain disease found in autopsies on some retired football players.

Breiding said many

people mistakenly believe that "you need to lose consciousness or be 'knocked out' in order to have a concussion."

Headaches, dizziness, sensitivity to light or noise and sleep problems are among other possible symptoms that experts say warrant medical attention.

The guidelines' highlights include:

- X-rays and CT scans aren't effective at detecting concussions. They are sometimes done if doctors

suspect a skull fracture or brain bleeding, but CT scans are preferred if a serious injury seems likely. Families should be told of potential risks from CT scans including radiation.

- Blood tests for detecting concussion haven't been proven to work and shouldn't be done outside of research.
- Most children's symptoms clear up within one to three months but recovery varies and can be delayed in kids who've had

previous concussions.

- Teens, kids with learning difficulties and those with mental illness all tend to recover more slowly than young children.
- Rest, the main treatment, is recommended for the first three days but inactivity beyond that may worsen symptoms.
- Children with undiagnosed concussions are at risk for another one and longer recovery times.

Wildlife officials work to coax stray sea lion back to sea

ANCHORAGE, Alaska (AP) — Wildlife officials came up with a new plan to try and coax a Steller sea lion back to the ocean after it had been shuffling through neighborhoods in Sitka since Friday.

"He's a big wild animal," Speegle said.
