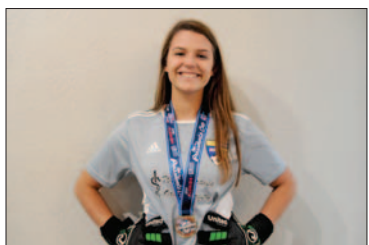

## Bartow Fire Department repeats as winner of charity softball game

BARTOW - The annual Bartow Fire-Bartow Police charity softball game May 10 at Bartow High School proved to be an entertaining way to raise a few bucks for the George Harris Youth Shelter.

The George W. Harris Jr. Runaway and Youth Crisis Shelter is a 24-bed facility for youth, ages 10-17, who have been abused, neglected, traumatized in some other way or who have runaway from their home.

The program also offers counseling and other services.

"Due to being a small department of 20 members, we have to reach out for some 'honorary members' and family each year," Bartow Police Chief Jay Robinson said.

## Robert Weech tapped as new county fire chief following report's release

The ongoing controversy surrounding Polk County Fire Rescue took a new turn last week when the county appointed an interim fire chief to tackle the problems outlined in a report to the county commission.

The new Fire Rescue Department leader is the department's chief logistics and special services officer, Robert Weech, who has been with the department for about two years. Weech inherited the department from Chief Tony Stravino, who had been chief for only three years.

Stravino retired May 7, just before Polk County Manager Jim Freeman faced the press to review a consultant's report on a fatal fire that claimed the life of a 76-year-old north Lakeland woman six months ago.

Weech now has to lead a department facing a wrongful death lawsuit and a storm of controversy over how the department handled the November fire call from Loretta Pickard, who died alone as her Rockridge log home burned around her.

"We obviously have inherited serious issues and challenges (that) we have to meet head-on," Weech said May 9. "Now, we have to move forward and make adjustments."

Weech will have the 242-page investigative report, which contains 24 recommendations from the consulting company that investigated the Pickard fire, to follow as he takes the helm of the 600-person department.

"Not only will the report be my road map," he explained, "but we'll use that just as our starting point and we'll enhance it. We will use it to show us our challenges and our weaknesses."

The investigation followed reports that Pickard died while she was talking with a 9-1-1 operator and allegations that firefighters did not attempt to rescue her.

The supervisor at the fire scene, Capt. James Williams, resigned in March after it came to light that he had posted videos of the fire to social media, in violation of several county policies.

There were 24 recommendations contained in the lengthy report and Weech said he plans to "dissect it and analyze the issues."

Some, he said, "are complex and some are simple. We need to cut to the core and fix them."

Weech echoed the findings of the review panel, saying "communication was an issue in that incident and we will work diligently to refine and perfect our internal communications methods. We will also continue to work closely with the Polk County Sheriff's Department

to improve our operations to the best of our ability."

Stravino's retirement is effective at the end of May and Weech said he will be working closely with the outgoing chief for an easy transition.

Marbutt of Citizens Bank got the crowd laughing.

"I just wanted to start out by saying I was at GrowHealthy today and it was groovy man," Marbutt said.

GrowHealthy Vice President of Production Darrin Potter accepted the award on behalf of the company. Jason Penrod of Family Elder Law introduced Potter.

"Darrin Potter is the vice president of production or maybe it's quality control, I'm not sure," Penrod said. "Is that really your name, Darren Pot-ter?"

## Problem Solving Court celebrates 20 years

POLK COUNTY – Twenty-two area graduates celebrated life during the 20th Annual Polk County Problem Solving Court Graduation Ceremony May 9.

Problem Solving Court is a court-supervised, comprehensive addiction treatment program for nonviolent defendants, according to the court website. Defendants have regular court appearances in front of a judge and are offered treatment if they agree to drug testing, counseling and regular attendance at support group meetings.

It's one of many diversion programs that exist in Polk County court system.

More than a dozen area judges, State Attorney Brian Haas, County Commissioner Rick Wilson and many other supporters packed inside the Oliver L. Green Jr. Courtroom on the first floor near the main entrance to witness Judge Green talk about the creation of drug court more than 30 years ago.

John Quirk III, a veteran mentor volunteer for the program for the past three years, was also invited to speak to the graduates.

"Judge Green helped save my life," Quirk said.

After serving his country on the USS Forrestal during Operation Dessert Storm, Quirk was discharged in

1993 and, in his telling, "started making bad choices" with drugs.

"I was facing 20 years in prison," Quirk said.

Quirk said 24 years ago he had first appearance hearing with Green, and soon after, drug court staff visited him in jail and offered him an opportunity to enter a diversion program. At age 25, the court asked his parents whether they'd allow their son to move in and monitor his behavior.

After completing probation and graduating from drug court in 1997, Quirk started working at a shelter and has since worked with veterans for the Society of St. Vincent de Paul. Quirk said he has been sober since Jan. 13, 1995.

"I was a monster," Quirk said. "The drug court program turned my life around and saved me."

A woman identified as "Rebecca" graduated from Problem Solving Court more recently and she spoke about the challenges of accountability during her two and a half years of recovery.

"I'm so happy now," Rebecca told those who graduated Thursday. "My washing machine just broke but I have the money to buy one now. We couldn't say that two years ago. You have a second chance in life, take it."

Presiding Judge Susan L. Barber shared a personal story about her father, former Judge Jesse Clay Barber Jr. Barber said she has a better understanding of how

combat experience can lead to lifestyle changes that cause some veterans to get into legal trouble. Barber said her father was a World War II fighter pilot who didn't talk about the war until two decades after returning home to Lake Wales.

"He was changed," Judge Barber said. "After he returned home he was lost... but the point is it did happen. He did finish school, he did have a family, he did use his great wisdom, his talent, his experience to serve this community as a judge. He would say don't ever, ever, ever give up because it is never too late to be what you might have been."



# Polk County Board of Commissioners talks budget

Polk County may have to borrow \$30 million to pay for a new, county-wide communications system upgrade, to pay for updating its internal computer systems and to build four new fire stations.

At a recent budget workshop, County Manager Jim Freeman told the board there wasn't enough money in the bank to pay for those things and suggested the county commission consider borrowing the money instead of tapping into its reserve funds.

Freeman and Polk County Budget Director Todd Bond told the board it should also consider hiking the Fire Rescue Department's annual fees by about \$10 across the board to offset the department's annual property assessment.

Bond explained that the county's existing annual fire fee of about \$191 per household may need to be increased to help offset the cost of the new firehouses and to add 27 more firefighters or paramedics to the staff.

Presently, Polk Fire Rescue has about 600 employees and mans 50 stations scattered across the county's 2,000 square miles. In addition to providing service to homes and businesses in the unincorporated areas of the county, Polk Fire Rescue also acts as the fire service for the cities of Eagle Lake and Mulberry, as well as the Hillcrest Heights community.

The four new stations are proposed for Loughman in the northeast county, Sleepy Hill, Frostproof and one in the Nalcrest area.

While most of the department's emergency medical and

fire runs are covered by the annual assessment, Bond explained, the department uses about \$4 million on average from the Board of County Commissioners' general fund to augment what it collects annually.

Bond said the county provided \$4.4 million to the Fire Rescue service in this budget year, adding that he expects to pay out about the same amount next year and double that for fiscal year 2020-21.

He said the board's general fund support doesn't include any funding for the building of the new fire stations.

Bond told the board it would have to come up with \$11.5 million to replace the county's entire radio system -- which includes the fire rescue department, the Polk Sheriff's Department and all the county offices that use radio communications, like code enforcement, and the road and water departments.

Freeman said the radio system was outdated and much of the communications network's radios were so old that even replacement parts were no longer available to repair inoperable units.

The last of the three primary needs outlined at the workshop was \$5.4 million needed to upgrade the Enterprise Resource Planning computer programs used by multiple agencies for billing, cataloging and recording financial data. Bond said the system was also used for payroll, payables, payments, purchasing, tracking work hours and vendors.

Bond said the computer programs were last updated nearly a decade ago and existing tech support for those programs will expire by 2021.

The borrowing options Bond suggested included an out-

right bank loan, a commercial loan, establishing a line of credit or floating a bond issue. He said, for example, that a bank loan for the \$30 million could be obtained at a 3.25 percent interest rate.

Commissioner Rick Wilson said he favored the line of credit scenario, so the county could borrow sporadically as the money was needed, with Commissioner John Hall adding that "would give us the flexibility to use the money as it was needed."

Also under brief discussion was the need for several additional positions, including a coordinator to make sure the county complied with the Americans with Disabilities Act and two cyber security analysts.

The county governing board was told that several Florida municipalities' computer systems had been "hacked," which created problems, and the cyber pros would be on hand to protect the county's system should attempts to disrupt its operations be discovered.

Commissioners also will be pursuing the purchase of additional parklands. Freeman said the county needed to establish "at least two more parks" -- one in the northeast county and another in the southeast county area.

"I think we need to get the land purchased for these parks quickly," Freeman said. "Especially in the northeast county, where so much development is going on so quickly and property prices are steadily increasing."

The board took no action on any of the proposals since the budget preparation process is in its initial phases, but will approve the budget as a whole in a formal session later this year.

## Turnpike Enterprise, County discuss link

Florida's Turnpike Enterprise officials will be showing their drawings to Polk County again this summer when they give County Commissioners a look at the preliminary layout of the highway segment that will replace the county's dead Northern Connector and tie the Central Polk Parkway to State Road 60.

Turnpike officials say the initial Central Parkway segment, from the Polk Parkway's Winter Lake Road interchange to U.S. 17, is already being designed and that the alignment has already been approved by the county board.

Planners will give commissioners a look at how the limited-access road will cross U.S. 17 and tie into S.R. 60, east of Bartow, as well as how much land they will have to buy and an educated guess on how much it may cost to build.

The link has long been on the county's radar. Former County Commissioner and current State Rep. Melony Bell pushed for money to build the connector, with state and federal transportation departments, but previously to no avail.

"We applied repeatedly for federal funds to pay for extending Smith Boulevard to 17 to 60, but couldn't get federal grant money to build it," says Assistant County Manager Tom Deardorff. "It was the TPO's number one project for years."

The project, handed off to the Turnpike, last year got a legislative boost when State Sen. Kelli Stargel jump-started funding with a \$15 million allocation.

"It has been a high priority for a long time," Stargel said then, touting the proposed road's ability to alleviate truck traffic through congested intersections in Bartow.

The county's own trans-

portation planning group, the TPO, has had this project -- or a semblance of it -- as its number one priority for nearly a decade.

Turnpike staff will informally brief county commissioners on the proposed alignment, right of way requirements and projected construction costs on May 23, then again at a formal board meeting on June 6, before taking the plans to the public later in June, said Turnpike Planning Manager Carol Scott.

The date or location of the public information meeting had not been set late last week.

As plans are being prepared, right of way and construction costs will also be nailed down, Scott added.

Scott said no money was appropriated for construction in the Turnpike's five-year work program, but some reports say ground could be broken to start construction in 2024 or 2025.

## Diversity study proposed

WINTER HAVEN – City Manager Mike Herr recently asked his friend Tom Freijo for help trying to make city staff more diverse. Freijo, who has lots of experience on this issue, agreed to help study the concept and write a report about best practices and examples of municipalities with diverse staff populations.

“Many municipalities throughout the country have a concern that in order to be optimally responsive to their citizens, they need to have a demographic makeup on staff

-- that to some degree -- matches the demographic make-up of the community being served,” Freeman said. “To the city manager’s credit, he thinks that this is something that the City of Winter Haven should look at.”

The Winter Haven City Commission authorized a relatively small amount of money to fund the study on May 13.

“Mike (Herr) wanted to be better educated about this whole matter,” Freeman said.

Freeman said he has never done a study exactly like this before, but has written multiple similar studies.

According to the proposal, Freeman will be submitting his review sometime before May 17.

## City authorizes purchase of mobile stage

WINTER HAVEN – The city commission authorized \$142,000 to purchase a mobile stage May 13.

Commissioner Pete Chichetto asked staff if that was the best use of taxpayer money during an agenda review meeting at city hall May 8. Chichetto asked if staff if it would be more cost effective to rent stages as needed, whether staff had plans to rent the stage out, and whether it was necessary to own multiple stages.

Winter Haven Assistant City Manager T. Michael Stavres

said that the city currently owns one stage -- a stage built by city staff 15 years ago -- and that staff regularly rent the city stage out regularly at \$250 per rental.

Staff said this would be the city’s first “store bought” stage and that staff is considering raising the rate to rent the stage, should a new one be purchased. City staff recently attended the demonstration of a slightly more expensive stage that was so heavy it could only be towed with a dump truck. They instead chose a stage that can be towed by a pickup truck and is light enough to set up on grass.

The stage has a hydraulic roof system and is similar to the main stage at Smoke on the Water earlier this year.

## Planning Commission recommends changes to dock ordinance

WINTER HAVEN – On May 7, the Winter Haven Planning Commission voted to recommend the city commission pass an ordinance clarifying what types of marine structures can be built on commercial properties in the city.

According to city documents, there is an ordinance that clarifies what types of marine structures -- such as docks, piers, boat houses, seawalls and slips -- can be built on residential property, but not commercial property.

City staff recommended the change after soliciting input from the Greater Winter Haven Area Chamber of Commerce Development Roundtable, the Lake Region Lakes Management District, local dock builders and Winter Haven Natural Resources Division staff.

“It is the intent of this subsection to ensure that neighboring uses of lakefront property do not conflict with each other and to preserve and restore the ecological integrity of the City’s lake and water resources by regulating the location, size and impact of marine structures,” the proposed ordinance states.

The proposed ordinance would also allow marine structures to exceed 75 feet in length if the water at that point is not two feet deep. Some limitations were added in reference to where a marine structure could be built on residential and commercial land. The proposed ordinance would disallow fish cleaning stations, wet bars, restrooms or permanent cooking facilities on any marine structure.

## Lake Florence neighbors prepare for another dispute

WINTER HAVEN – According to Winter Haven Commissioner Pete Chichetto, residents who live around Lake Florence rallied several years ago in opposition to changing the residential zoning of a house on the corner of South Lake Florence Drive at Cypress Gardens Boulevard to commercial zoning.

In part due to that public dissent, the county commission at the time denied the owner-initiated zoning change proposal. The same owner is now seeking the property be annexed into the City of Winter Haven in a second attempt to turn the house into a small real estate office.

Tom Freeland lives on Lake Florence. He and dozens of others recently showed up again at a county commission meeting in opposition to a proposed apartment complex on Overlook Drive and the shores of Lake Florence.

“A couple of neighbors were asking about (the proposed real estate office) recently,” Freeman said. “We

will look into this.”

In order to get zoning for a small office there, the owner would need to remove the circular driveway on the property now, build at least one paved handicap space, and get permitted for a storm water runoff plan.

Commissioner William Twyford expressed concern about people who apply for zoning changes in the county, get denied, and then try again with an annexation proposal.

First reading of the “voluntary annexation” of 115 South Lake Florence Drive was Monday, May 13. A

public hearing is scheduled for May 28.

## Six students earn college scholarships from Bartow Rotary

BARTOW – From among dozens of applicants, the Bartow Rotary Club awarded six high school students \$1,000 each in scholarships -- and coming up with the six students was not an easy task, said Steve Githens, who chaired the committee that chose the students.

“If you could see what all these students accomplished it was amazing,” Githens said. “And it was pretty amazing listening to them.”

The first student introduced to the club was Myra Mir, who had previously won the Rotary Club’s speech contest. In her high school career, Mir had a 4.427 GPA and scored a 1300 on her SAT to go along with 149 community service hours.

Mir, a four-year International Baccalaureate student, said she enrolled in that school after seeing her sister do it and she wanted the challenge.

“I said I was going to go and this is the last week and I did it,” Mir told the club.

She plans to attend the University of Florida and wants to be an orthodontist.

Jada Hewitt compiled a 4.619 GPA and scored 1370 on her SAT and 29 on the ACT. She compiled 342 community service hours, volunteering at Lakeland Regional Medical Center, Relay For Life, the Polk County Sheriff’s Office and the Bloomin’ Arts Festival, just to name a few.

An IB student at Bartow High, she plans to attend the University of South Florida and major in medical science. She plans to be a gynecologist.

Rotary Club member John Griffis said Parrish Westmoreland, who plans to attend Florida State University, is an example of why interviewing students is a highlight of his year. Westmoreland plans to go to medical school and travel the world to help people in

need.

“I went to a leadership conference in Washington, D.C., and I was handed a card about the situation in some areas,” Westmoreland said. “I want to use my privilege to help others.”

During high school, she compiled a 4.473 GPA and scored 1300 on the SAT and 29 on the ACT, doing 246 hours of community service -- 183 of them with the ASPCA.

Jasmine Primus, in her four years at IB, had a 4.62 GPA, scored 1390 on the SAT and 25 on ACT, compiling 122 community service hours. Enrolled at USF, her interest in science and art has her hopeful she can combine the two for her career.

“With my interest in biology and art, I’m thinking I can do plastic reconstructive surgery,” she said.

Carina Copley said she decided to attend the IB school because she wanted the challenge and to build her confidence. She said she accomplished that, compiling a 4.759 GPA and scoring 1520 on the SAT while tallying 421 community service hours. Copley also was the captain on the high school swimming and tennis teams.

“I realized that academics is not the only thing you should pursue,” she said in reference to her participation in sports. “Getting that and service hours is tough

but it’s manageable.”

Copley plans to attend the University of Florida and wants to become a dentist.

“Go Gators -- and thank you for this scholarship,” she told the club.

Not present at the Rotary Club meeting where the scholarships were presented on May 1, Abigail McKellip was introduced and awarded her scholarship at the May 8 meeting.

Planning to attend Polk State College to earn her AA degree, McKellip had a 4.055 GPA in high school and compiled 202 community service hours, doing a lot of her volunteering at Bartow Elementary Academy. Her plan is to go back to school for her professional career.

“I learned a lot and had a lot of good teachers at Bartow High,” she said. “I want to pursue a career in teaching.”

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**INGREDIENTS**

- 2 cups ground walnuts, toasted
- 1/4 cup sugar
- 2 teaspoons ground cinnamon
- 12 sheets frozen phyllo dough, thawed
- 1/2 cup butter, melted

**Syrup:**

- 1/2 cup Leighton's honey
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1/2 cup water
- 1 tablespoon lemon juice

**DIRECTIONS**

1. Preheat oven to 350°. Combine walnuts, sugar and cinnamon.
2. Place one sheet of phyllo dough on a 15x12-in. piece of waxed paper; brush with butter. Place a second phyllo sheet on top, brushing it with butter. (Keep remaining phyllo covered with a damp towel to prevent it from drying out.) Sprinkle with 1/4 cup walnut mixture. Using waxed paper, roll up tightly jelly-roll style, starting with a long side, removing paper as you roll. Slice roll into four smaller rolls; transfer rolls to a greased 13x9-in. baking dish. Repeat with remaining phyllo dough and 1/4 cupfuls of walnut mixture. Bake until light brown, 14-16 minutes. Cool dish on a wire rack.
3. Meanwhile, in a small saucepan, combine all syrup ingredients. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat; simmer 5 minutes. Cool 10 minutes. Drizzle cinnamon rolls with syrup; sprinkle with remaining walnut mixture.



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# City weighs possibility of developing master plan

BARTOW — In a workshop that lasted upward of three hours on May 9, Bartow City Commissioners were told if they were to come up with a master plan, residents would have to be involved in the process and — if they were to use Community Solutions Group — it could cost anywhere from \$25,000-\$500,000.

Vice Mayor Scott Sjoblom said he believes the political will is there and the people in Bartow will help.

“The reality is we had a lot of work to do to dig ourselves out of a hole we inherited,” Sjoblom said. “We’re in place now and we can stop looking out of the rearview mirror and look (forward) through the windshield.”

Sjoblom was referring to the fact the city was in a deep hole financially, one which the 2008 recession exasperated. Over the last decade, though, the city has rebounded.

The possibility of developing a master plan was presented to the city by Community Solutions Group, a venture under the larger umbrella of Orlando-based GAI Consultants.

This is the same group that developed ideas of what to do with the Thompson & Company Cigar Factory. Potential developer Gregory Fancelli submitted the Cigar Factory to this company which delivered a report on it last month.

Community Solutions Group has done master plan projects for several cities and has a track record of success. Bartow Commissioner Trish Pfeiffer said she saw what the group had accomplished in Clermont, talked with its leadership and invited them to set up a workshop to see what it could offer Bartow.

Peter Sechler, director and vice president of Community Solutions Group, said in order to create a successful master plan there has to be public leadership and a private sector response to work with common goals.

“The city cannot build (economic success). What the needs are is the city and private sectors work together,” he said.

This, he explained, would be done through studies, public meetings and communication. The social, physical, environmental and economic aspects have to work together, Sechler said, adding that the takeaway commissioners should get from the workshop is there has to be a “large community public focus.”

“Then (you) figure out the funding mechanisms for new ideas and what is the benefit of the move,” Sechler said. “From grassroots to grass tops, work together to

move the needle.”

One way suggested to improve communication with residents is to develop an online site and communicate through social media.

“The community has to feel has access to the process,” Sechler said.

“We’ve never had social media,” Pfeiffer said. “We are five people of 20,000. Social media would be huge. It would be a great tool to get input.”

Commissioner Leo Longworth said the plan would have to take into account other plans that have been done and since shelved and that this new plan would have to cover all of the city.

“This could bring everything together,” Longworth said.

New Mayor Billy Simpson agreed, saying “We need to look at the community as a whole. Yes, we’ve got all those plans we’ve done along the way, but as times change we have to change. We have to understand how we get the money (for it.)”

Also chiming in on the idea that people in Bartow don’t always know what’s going on, Rob Clancey -- the president of the Bartow Economic Development Council -- said talking with the Leadership Bartow class the previous day was an eye opener.

“There were 30 people, the future leaders (of Bartow), and they had no idea what was going on in the community,” Clancey said. “We should have told the story better.”

And despite a growing downtown corridor, the prevailing belief that “there is nothing to do in Bartow” has persisted, said Hal Wallace, the owner of PalletOne.

“People (don’t move to Bartow ) because of a dead downtown, no movies, schools, better shopping,” Wallace said. “It’s a 30-minute drive to get to Target.”

Longworth said local youth are going elsewhere for their respective college educations and they often don’t come back, to which Pfeiffer said that is the fault of leadership not looking to develop.

“Lakeland and Winter Haven are making their cities vibrant,” she said, also acknowledging that

downtown Bartow is starting to grow.

A microbrewery is to open at the corner of Florida Avenue and Summerlin Street and a upscale restaurant is going in on Summerlin Street, across from that. The Stuart Building, near the Post Office, has been coming back, too, Pfeiffer said.

As far as moving forward in developing a master plan, and working with this particular firm to develop one, Pfeiffer said there is a lot of potential the city could tap into.

“I think it’s exciting and the community will be excited about this,” Pfeiffer said.


Simpson said the session had provided commissioners with a lot to be educated on and the city should “find out what we really want to do and move forward.”

## Seminole exhibit stops at Lake Wales Museum

LAKE WALES — Back in the 1920s, 1930s and 1940s, under pressure to assert their identity and generate income at the same time, entrepreneurs associated with the Seminole Tribe created several tourist trading posts around the state.

Seminole Indian athletes wrestled alligators on the hour at these tourist traps. Some of the tribe's women would sell colorful clothing and crafts were sold at places such as Silver Springs, near Ocala, and Musa Isle, near Miami.

Postcards depicting Seminole life were printed to make more money and keep the tourists coming.

In March 2010, staff at the Ah-Tah-Thi-Ki Museum in the Everglades created a museum exhibit called "Postcards and Perceptions" featuring these post-

cards. Many contain politically incorrect text and sometimes inappropriate names as labels. Since then, this has become a traveling exhibit and Lake Wales Museum staff are featuring this exhibit through June 1.

"Postcards serve as a guidepost to the changes of early 20th Century Florida history," Lake Wales Museum Director Jennifer D'hollander said. "Their simple, yet evocative, imagery reveals the adaptive nature of the Seminole people and attest to the complex pressures and adjustments Seminoles endured to assert their identity."

D'hollander said the traditional Seminole lifestyle of hunting and canoeing faded away under Florida land development and tourism offered an alternative source of income.

Part of the creation of

this exhibit involved re-searching who was featured on these postcards and what their lives were like — not just what was depicted on the postcard. Museum staff then traveled to community centers on tribal property, identified many of the people in the postcards and documented their history.

At the traveling exhibit in Lake Wales, there will be lots of banners about history, crafts and significant figures of Seminole tourism dating from the early 1900s to the 1950s. There is an interactive true/false station and an oral history station.

The exhibit is sponsored by the City of Lake Wales and Visit Central Florida. The Lake Wales Museum is free and open to the public Tuesday through Saturday, 9 a.m. until 5 p.m.

In the coming weeks, city staff and the city commission will be debating next year's budget. The first budget meeting took place yesterday, Tuesday, May 14.

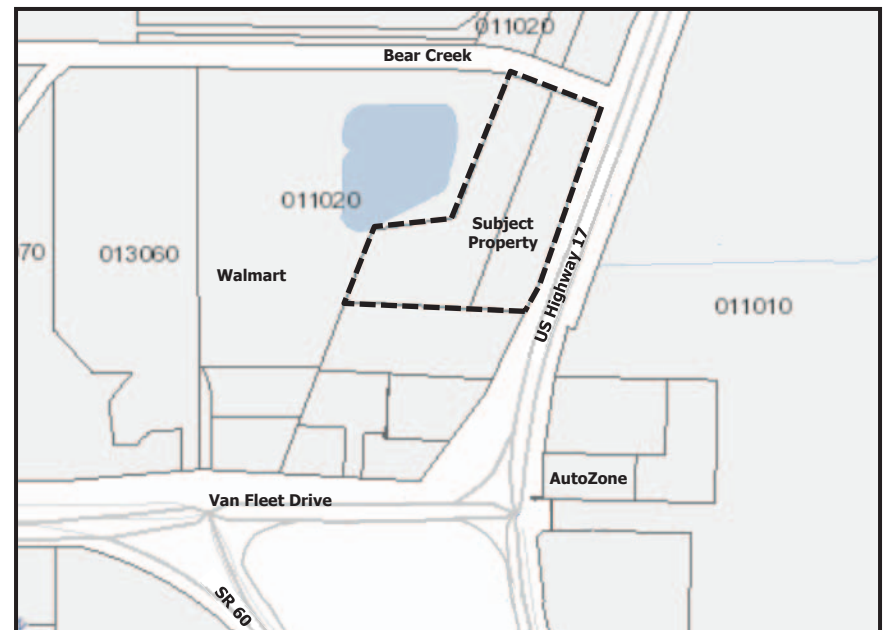

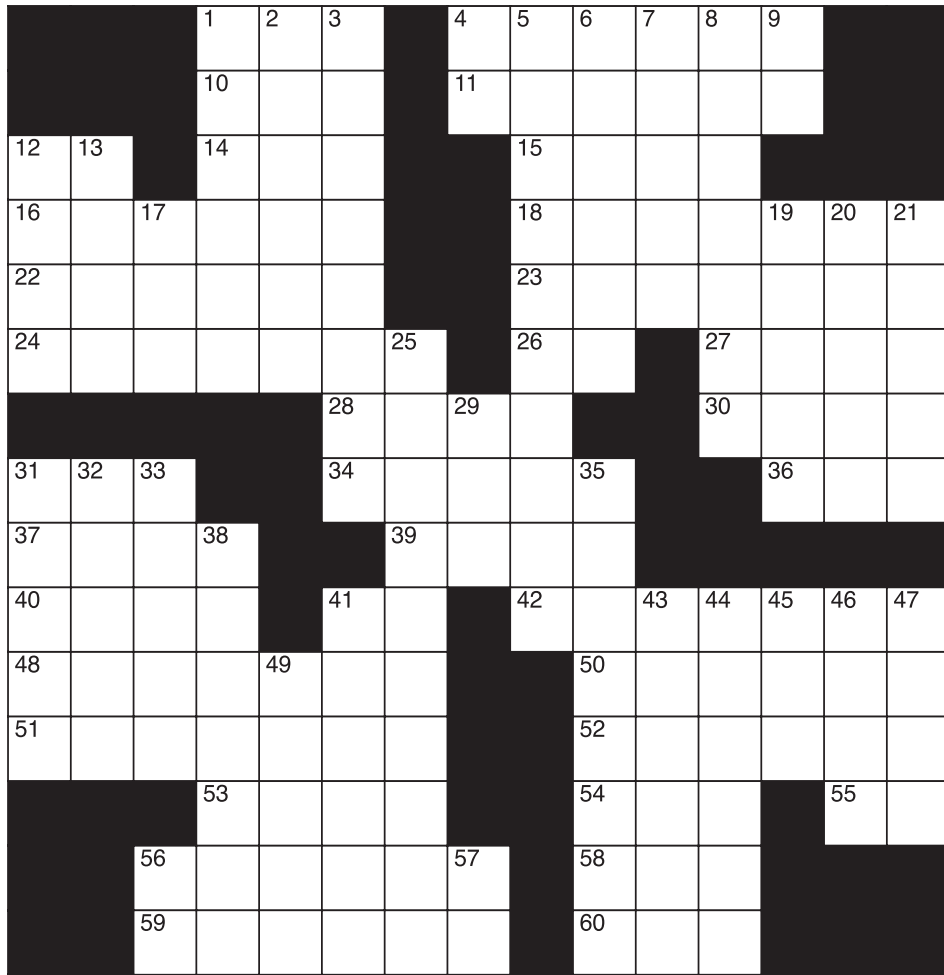

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# Commissioners square off on Seminole Hotel

LAKE WALES – There was a lengthy and unscheduled debate about developer Ray Brown during the Lake Wales City Commission meeting on Tuesday, May 7.

Brown has owned the historic — and long vacant — Walesbilt Hotel in downtown Lake Wales for around a decade. The city commission at the time sold the iconic building to him for \$10 to help him bring the building back to life.

But, over the years, new commissioners have been elected and new city staff have been hired. Some have since suggested that Brown may not have the resources to finish the large project in a timely manner.

Brown has consistently alleged the opposite — that he would have completed the Walesbilt restoration already if some city staff and commissioners had not interfered with his work, making the process take more time.

This conflict between Brown and some city officials over the Walesbilt has been on and off for several years. Now that Brown has expressed interest in purchasing and restoring the nearby Seminole Hotel, the conflict appears to have intensified.

The Seminole Hotel is a historic downtown building that, for years, was used as a rooming house for low-income residents. Crime was problematic in the building and, around a year ago, city staff shut it down, stating the building was structurally unsafe.

According to the Lake Wales Police Department, several weeks ago Brown called the department, identified himself as the owner of the Seminole and requested an officer help him enter the hotel and

make sure there were no homeless people illegally living inside.

The responding officer witnessed Brown use a crowbar to remove a piece of wood placed over the front door by the city. Also that day, the code enforcement officer who shut the Seminole down responded. The code enforcement officer knew Brown did not own the building and warned Brown not to vandalize city property again or he could be arrested.

Subsequently, Brown tried to remove city barriers to get inside the property again. Four Lake Wales Police officers and a code enforcement responded and, again, Brown was warned that if he attempted to get inside the property without city staff present he would be arrested.

At the city commission meeting following the incident, Commissioner Curtis Gibson alleged that this police involvement was “arbitrary and petty.” He further alleged that when he was discussing this privately with City Manager Ken Fields, that Fields misled Gibson about what happened.

“You told me Monday (that Brown) was not trespassed,” Gibson said.

Fields replied by saying,

“I told you he was not arrested.”

“No, you said in your office he was not trespassed. I asked you three times,” Gibson said. “You said ‘we warned him twice not to go back on the property.’”

Fields asked Gibson to allow him to finish telling his interpretation of what happened. Around this time, Mayor Eugene Fultz interjected, saying the debate was not on the agenda and that it was time to move on.

According to the Lake Wales Police Department, a trespass warning can be rescinded upon request of the owner.

The mayor was the last to speak on the matter before the meeting was adjourned.

“I will say this — and I will say it personally and I will not back off on this,” Fultz said. “If it has taken Mr. Brown 12 years to get to the point where nothing is done at the Walesbilt except for the exterior, how long will it take him to finish that and the Seminole? I have seen nothing over the past 12 years that excites me about him actually being able to finish that. Hopefully he will, because that will be a drawing card for the city — but how long will that take?”

LAKELAND — Watson Clinic Women's Center radiologic technologist and children's book author Jennifer Hazen Buss understands the challenges of helping a child cope with a food allergy. Her two youngest children — Isabella and Alexander — have been living with debilitating food allergies for years.

"Beyond the obvious physical dangers, severe food allergies can also result in low self-esteem and a feeling of isolation from your peer group," Buss explains.

With her writing pen in hand, and with the help of illustrator Noel Hodge, Buss decided to use her gifts to raise awareness and inspire children to find strength in the face of adversity.

## Help protect Polk State's Lake Wales Campus

The 2019 Legislative Session concluded May 4 with the budget now awaiting Governor Ron DeSantis' approval. For the second time in three years, \$2.5 million of Polk State College's recurring operational budget supporting our Lake Wales Campus — more than 5 percent of the College's total budget — is at risk of being vetoed.

This line item is one of 14 Florida College System items listed separately.

This line item, titled Polk State College Access to Academic and Workforce Programs, was originally allocated to the College during the 2011 Legislative Session to fund the Polk State JD Alexander Center, the Lake Wales Campus, in expanding educational opportunities to residents in rural southeast Polk County.

These critical funds operate and staff the Campus, serving an average of 1,100 students — nearly 10 percent of the College's total student population — annually with classes, support services and programming that enables students to complete associate and workforce baccalaureate degree programs.

Seventy-eight percent of students enrolled at the Lake Wales Campus are either female or a minority; most are the first in their families to go to college; and many have limited access to transportation. Additionally, 44 percent of Lake Wales Campus students receive the federal, need-based Pell Grant to complete their education.

For many in rural southeast Polk, this campus is the only affordable and accessible higher education option at which to pursue education and workforce training.

We ask our community to come together to protect the Lake Wales Campus. We respectfully suggest contacting Governor DeSantis to request his support of Polk State College Access to Academic and Workforce Programs, Lake Wales Campus. ## Making a commitment to protect our children

The world we live in is constantly changing. It used to be that parents could let their children go outside and play without an adult to watch over them. A parent could send their child to school and not ever wonder if they'll

be safe while they're there.

That's not the world we live in anymore, unfortunately. We have a new normal. There are sick people who have committed horrible mass shootings targeting children.

Since the massacre at Marjory Stoneman Douglas just over a year ago, we've seen a lot of changes being made in Florida which will help protect our children at school.

Within a month of that attack, the Florida legislature passed a law that mandated that each public school in the state would have either a law enforcement officer or

an armed Guardian. The Guardian program was born out of the Sentinel Program which we at the Polk County Sheriff's Office created several years ago.

And, just days ago, Governor Ron DeSantis signed a law that would allow teachers — only after they have volunteered, passed a background check and psychological evaluation, and undergone extensive firearms and scenario-based training and testing — to carry a gun at school for the sole purpose of interdicting a violent threat against the school.

Here locally, the Polk County Sheriff's Office has created a unit that focuses on reported threats or statements that could potentially bring harm to our area schools. The unit will operate 24/7, investigating and resolving each threat.

Our children are our most precious and important resource we have, and our aim is to protect them, but it all starts with the community — and when you hear or see something, make sure you say something.

## Worries over US sliding toward Iran war

Potential deployment of 120,000 US troops to the Mideast only a 'rumor'

WASHINGTON — International worries that the Trump administration is sliding toward war with Iran flared into the open Tuesday amid skepticism about its claims that the Islamic Republic poses a growing threat to the U.S. and its allies in the Persian Gulf and beyond.

The U.S. military rebutted doubts expressed by a British general about such a threat. President Donald Trump denied a report that the administration has updated plans to send more than 100,000 troops to counter

Iran if necessary. But Trump then stirred the controversy further by saying: "Would I do that? Absolutely."

The general's remarks exposed international skepticism over the American military build-up in the Middle East, a legacy of the 2003 invasion of Iraq that was predicated on false intelligence. U.S. officials have not publicly provided any evidence to back up claims of an increased Iranian threat amid other signs of allied unease.

As tensions in the region started to surge, British Foreign Secretary Jeremy Hunt said his nation was worried about the risk of accidental conflict "with an escalation that is unintended

really on either side." Then on Tuesday, Spain temporarily pulled one of its frigates from the U.S.-led combat fleet heading toward the Strait of Hormuz. That was followed by the unusual public challenge to the Trump administration by the general.

"No, there's been no increased threat from Iranian-backed forces in Iraq and Syria," said Maj. Gen. Chris Ghika, a senior officer in the U.S.-backed coalition fighting the Islamic State group. Ghika, speaking in a video conference from coalition headquarters in Baghdad, told reporters at the Pentagon that the coalition monitors the presence of Iranian-backed

forces "along with a whole range of others because that's the environment we're in."

But he added, "There are a substantial number of militia groups in Iraq and Syria, and we don't see any increased threat from any of them at this stage."

Late in the day, in a rare public rebuttal of an allied military officer, U.S. Central Command said Ghika's remarks "run counter to the identified credible threats" from Iranian-backed forces in the Mideast. In a written statement, Central Command said the coalition in Baghdad has increased the alert level for all service members in Iraq and Syria.

"As a result, (the coalition) is

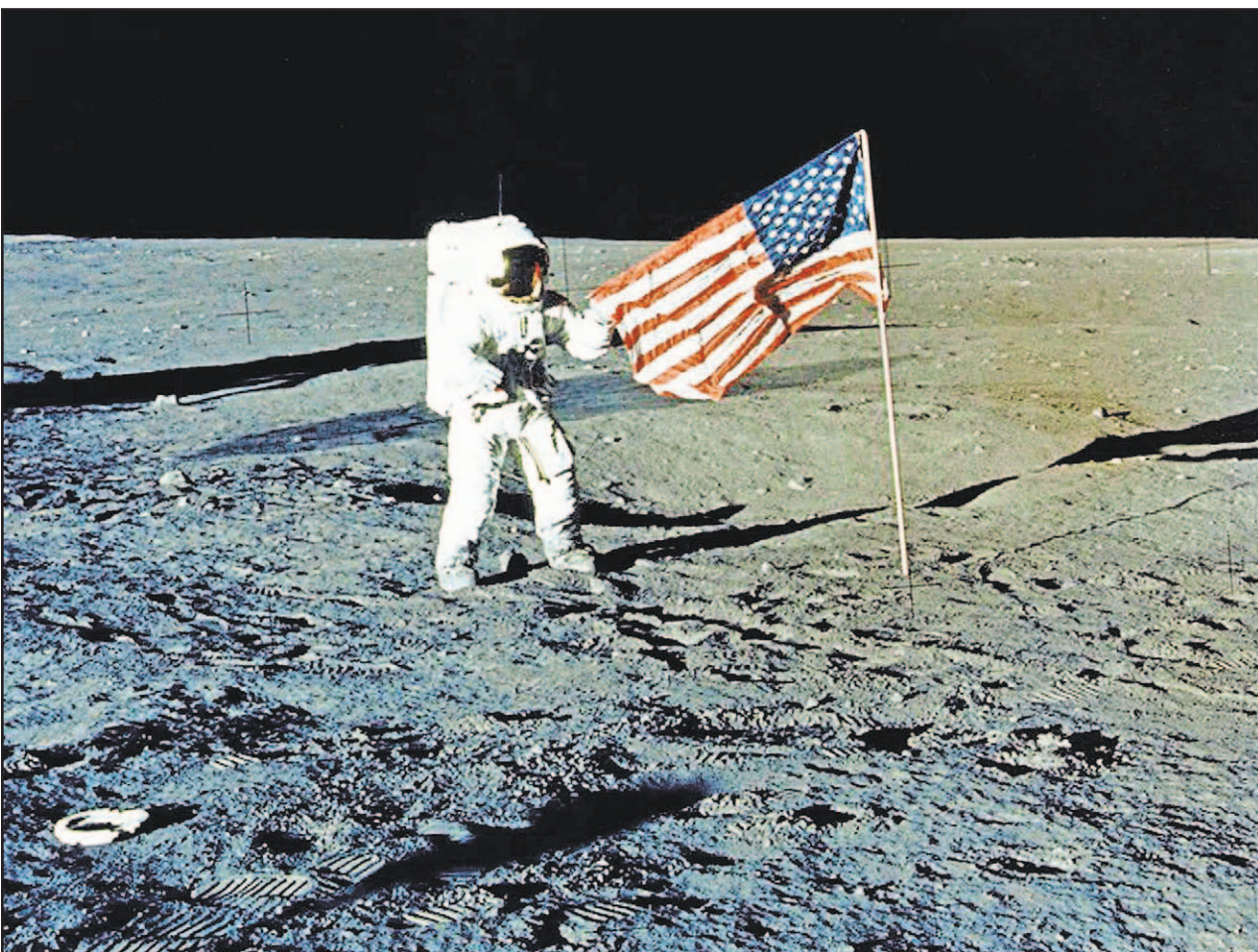
now at a high level of alert as we continue to closely monitor credible and possibly imminent threats to U.S. forces in Iraq," the statement said.

At the White House, Trump, who has repeatedly argued for avoiding long-term conflicts in the Mideast, discounted a New York Times report that the U.S. has updated plans that could send up to 120,000 troops to counter Iran if it attacked American forces.

"Would I do that? Absolutely," he told reporters. "But we have

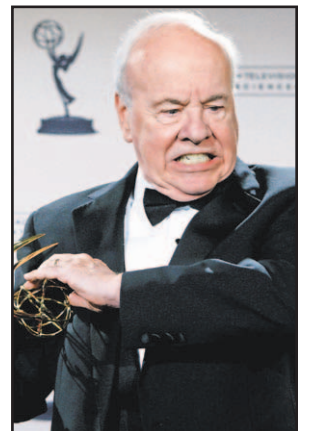
LOS ANGELES — Tim Conway, the impish second banana to Carol Burnett who won four Emmy Awards on her TV variety show, starred aboard "McHale's Navy" and later voiced the role of Barnacle Boy for "Spongebob Squarepants," has died. He was 85.

Conway died Tuesday morning in a Los Angeles care facility, according to Howard Bragman, who heads LaBrea Media. Conway's wife, Charlene Fusco, and a daughter, Jackie, were at his side.

The cause was a disorder in which there is an excess of fluid on the brain, Bragman said.

Burnett said in a statement Tuesday that she was heartbroken. "He was one in a million, not only as a brilliant comedian but as a loving human being. I cherish the times we had together both on the screen and off. He'll be in my heart forever."

Tributes also came from across the comedy world, including from Conan O'Brien, who said "no one made me

## AP sources: Panel reaches deal with Trump Jr. for interview

WASHINGTON — The Senate Intelligence Committee has struck a deal with Donald Trump Jr. to appear for a closed-door interview next month, pulling the two sides back, for now, from a confrontation over a subpoena

as part of the panel's Russia investigation.

Under the terms of the deal, according to two people familiar with the agreement, Trump Jr. will talk to the committee in mid-June for up to four hours. The people spoke

on condition of anonymity Tuesday to discuss the confidential terms.

The deal comes after the panel subpoenaed President Donald Trump's eldest son to discuss answers he gave the panel's staff in a 2017 interview. Trump Jr. had backed out of interviews twice, prompting the subpoena, according to people familiar with Senate

Intelligence Committee Chairman Richard Burr's remarks to a GOP luncheon last week. Those people spoke on condition of anonymity to discuss Burr's remarks in the private senators' meeting.

The deadline for Trump Jr. to respond was Monday, according to one of the people familiar with the terms. His lawyers drafted a letter to

the committee declining an appearance and the president's son expected to be held in contempt for declining to be interviewed.

But before the letter was sent, the committee reached out Monday evening and extended the deadline. The deal was then struck.

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## Venezuelan security forces seal off opposition-controlled parliament

BOGOTA, Colombia — Venezuelan security forces on Tuesday prevented lawmakers from entering the parliament building, after the Supreme Court placed several of the legislators under investigation on treason charges last week.

Soldiers and police sealed off the area following an alleged bomb threat, local media reported.

Opposition leader Juan Guaido accused President Nicolas Maduro's government of "persecuting" and trying to "kidnap" the opposition-controlled National Assembly.

"Today (Maduro) has again shown he is afraid of the legitimacy of the Assembly," he tweeted.

The parliamentary session was postponed until Wednesday.

The National Assembly, which is headed by Guaido, is trying to oust Maduro, who won a second term in a disputed election a year ago.

His rule has been marked by a massive economic and political crisis, with about 3.4 million Venezuelans fleeing hyperinflation, goods shortages and political unrest abroad.

More than 50 countries have meanwhile recognized Guaido as Venezuela's legitimate leader.

The National Assembly had on Tuesday been due to discuss the situation of several lawmakers whom the Supreme Court placed under investigation on charges including treason. The legislators are suspected of involvement in an alleged coup attempt by Guaido on April 30.

Edgar Zambrano, the vice president of the assembly, was also arrested last week.

Two of the lawmakers under investigation have sought refuge at the Italian

Embassy and one at the Argentine Embassy in Caracas.

Also on Tuesday, Amnesty International said Maduro's government may have committed crimes against humanity and called for it to be taken before "an independent and impartial judicial body."

"Selective extrajudicial executions, arbitrary detentions, and deaths and injuries caused by the excessive use of force by Nicolas Maduro's government as part of a systematic and widespread policy of repression since at least 2017 may constitute crimes against humanity," the rights group said in a statement based on a new report.

During massive anti-government protests from Jan. 21-25 this year, at least 47 people were shot dead in 12 of the country's 23 states, according to Amnesty.

At least 33 of them were killed by state security forces and six by third parties acting with the approval of the authorities. More than 900 people were arbitrarily detained.

The events during those five days reflect a policy of repression documented by Amnesty since 2014, the rights group said.

Amnesty has also denounced more than 8,000 extrajudicial executions by the security forces between 2015 and 2017.

Amnesty urged the U.N. Human Rights Council to establish a commission of inquiry and called for "the activation of universal jurisdiction by countries genuinely concerned about the situation in the country."

The Office of the Prosecutor of the International Criminal Court, which began a preliminary examination on Venezuela at the start of 2018, "should also take these events into consideration," the statement added.

## Saudi Arabia says its oil pipeline was hit by drones

Regional tensions flare just days after what they says was an attack on two of its oil tankers

DUBAI, United Arab Emirates — An oil pipeline that runs across Saudi Arabia was hit Tuesday by drones, the Saudi energy minister said, as regional tensions flared just days after what the kingdom called an attack on two of its oil tankers in the Persian Gulf.

While both U.S. President Donald Trump and Iran's Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei said they were not planning for conflict, the volatility was felt in oil markets with benchmark Brent crude trading over \$71 a barrel, up more than \$1 on the day.

The pipeline that runs from the kingdom's oil-rich Eastern Province to a Red Sea port was shut down, but Saudi Energy Minister Khalid al-Falih Al-Falih vowed that the production and export of Saudi oil would not be interrupted.

The Houthis, who are at war with Saudi Arabia, said earlier Tuesday they launched seven drones targeting vital Saudi installations, without elaborating. They later claimed responsibility for the pipeline attack in comments broadcast by Houthi military spokesman Brig. Gen. Yahya Sari. In a statement carried by the

state-run Saudi Press Agency, al-Falih called the pipeline attack "cowardly," saying recent acts of sabotage against the kingdom were targeting not only Saudi Arabia but also the safety of the world's energy supply and global economy.

The attacks demonstrated the increased risks in a region vital to global energy supplies amid heightened tensions following the Trump administration's withdrawal from the 2015 nuclear deal between Iran and world powers,

and the subsequent re-imposition of U.S. sanctions to cripple the Iranian economy. Iran has since said it would begin enriching uranium at higher levels by July 7 if world powers failed to negotiate new terms for the deal.

The Saudis did not immediately assign blame for the drone assaults, which targeted two oil pumping stations west of the capital supplying the pipeline that runs from the east of Saudi Arabia to the Yanbu Port on its western coast.

## Powerful quake rattles Papua New Guinea

WELLINGTON, New Zealand — A powerful earthquake rattled coastal townships in Papua New Guinea late Tuesday and authorities say there have been no initial reports of major damage or injuries.

The magnitude 7.5 quake struck in the ocean about 28 miles northeast of Kokopo, a town with a population of about 26,000, according to the U.S. Geological Survey. It

was followed by several large aftershocks.

Chris McKee, the acting director of geohazards management, said there was some damage in Kokopo as items were shaken from shelves and the power had been cut. He said there had been a small tsunami although it was dark at the time and information about it remained sketchy.

McKee said the earthquake was a strike-slip event along a fault line, a type of quake that doesn't usually trigger major

tsunamis.

The quake struck at a relatively shallow depth of 6 miles, according to the USGS. Shallow earthquakes tend to cause more damage on the Earth's surface, but the USGS estimated that damage and injuries would be low because of the area's sparse population.

Garfield Tarabu, a spokesman at the National Disaster Centre, said a disaster coordinator was on the ground assessing the situation in

and around Kokopo but they hadn't yet gotten an update on the extent of the damage.

The U.S. Pacific Tsunami Warning Center had said tsunami waves of up to 3.3 feet were possible along coastal areas up to 620 miles from the epicenter, including Papua New Guinea and the nearby Solomon Islands.

Papua New Guinea is located on the eastern half of the island of New Guinea, to the east of Indonesia.

## Honeymooner lost at sea is officially declared dead

DELRAY BEACH — Two years, almost to the day, after a Delray Beach woman presumably was lost at sea while honeymooning with her husband in the Bahamas, a judge legally and officially has declared her dead, court records show.

Isabella Hellmann's husband, Lewis Bennett, is scheduled to be sentenced in his wife's death later this month.

By officially declaring Hellmann's death, the judge has cleared the way for the couple's 2-year-old daughter, Emelia, to inherit \$18,000 from her mother's modest estate.

Bennett, 42, entered into a plea bargain with prosecutors in November and pleaded guilty to involuntary manslaughter after repeatedly claiming he had been asleep below deck when the couple's catamaran got into trouble, took on water and sank.

His 41-year-old wife

had been at the helm and disappeared, Bennett said, when he later was rescued in a lifeboat.

He swore he had nothing to do with wife's death at sea. Now he's expected to plead guilty to manslaughter.

"As Isabella Hellman has not been heard from nor seen since being lost at sea on May 14, 2017 ... there are no reasonable inferences or an explanation of her absence other than her presumed death at sea," Palm Beach

County Circuit Court Judge Scott Suskauer wrote in a May 9 order.

A copy of Hellmann's completed death certificate was included in court filings. She had no will.

The judge also ordered the FBI to give the keys to Hellmann's condominium to an attorney representing her parents, so that it can be sold, records show.

The condo, records show, is valued at \$130,000 and Hellmann's bank accounts totaled \$41,117.

Hellmann, a real estate

broker, had \$8,524 in credit card bills, according to court filings.

The judge ordered that \$18,000 go into Emelia's trust account. The girl will turn 3 in July and lives with Bennett's parents in Scotland.

Another \$20,000 will go toward attorney's fees and the rest will go toward paying creditors.

When Bennett, a dual citizen of the United Kingdom and Australia, goes before a federal judge on May 28 in Miami,

he faces a maximum sentence of eight years in prison.

When Bennett made an apology in court in January to Hellmann's family, he said: "I know that they have been through unimaginable pain as a result of my actions and for that I am truly sorry."

He did not describe what happened to Hellmann the night she vanished.

Despite a four-day ocean search, Hellmann's body was never found.

#### Woman arrested for CBD oil at Disney demands apology

ORLANDO (AP) — A 69-year-old woman is demanding an apology for her arrest at a Walt Disney World security checkpoint last month after a guard found CBD oil while searching her purse.

Hester Burkhalter has hired high-profile attorney Benjamin Crump, who represented Trayvon Martin's family.

Crump said Tuesday that Disney World and the Orange County Sheriff's Office "need to take responsibility for their actions" or he will file a lawsuit on the North Carolina woman's behalf, alleging violations of her civil rights.

The sheriff's office said in

an emailed statement that the arrest was lawful. Disney said in an emailed statement the incident was a law enforcement matter.

Prosecutors dropped a drug charge against Burkhalter, saying it wasn't suitable for prosecution.

The oil is extracted from marijuana plants but doesn't produce a high.

#### Woman dies after collapsing during snorkeling trip

KEY WEST (AP) — Authorities say a woman is dead after collapsing during a snorkeling trip in the Florida Keys.

A Monroe County Sheriff's Office news release says 70-year-old Linda Gay Adams

was pronounced dead at a hospital Saturday.

Officials say the Lake Alfred woman was snorkeling with family members at the Eastern Dry Rocks south of Key West when she returned to the boat and said she wasn't feeling well. She collapsed and CPR was started.

A U.S. Coast Guard crew responded and took her to shore, where paramedics were waiting.

Investigators say there were no signs of foul play.

#### Man arrested after 29 animals found caged in U-Haul

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — A South Florida man faces animal cruelty charges after authorities

found 29 caged animals in a U-Haul with no access to food or water.

Hollywood police and animal control officers rescued four dogs and 25 cats and kittens on Saturday as temperatures in South Florida approached 90 degrees.

The SunSentinel reports 47-year-old Marlon Antonio Flores told police that he rented the U-Haul after being evicted on March 31.

Hollywood police spokeswoman Miranda Grossman says Flores was arrested on 87 charges including animal cruelty and unlawful confinement.

Police say some of the animals were covered in urine and feces. Two of the dogs were in a cage so small they couldn't turn around.

#### Man charged with killing ex-boyfriend, setting home on fire

WILTON MANORS (AP) — Authorities say they've arrested a Florida man who killed his ex-boyfriend and set his apartment on fire.

A Broward Sheriff's Office news release says 38-year-old Michael Mitchell was arrested Saturday and charged with first-degree murder and arson.

Detectives say Mitchell and 40-year-old John Young had recently broken up and had a well-documented history of domestic violence. Officials say Mitchell went to Young's Wilton Manors home on Thursday, killed Young and set the fire.

Firefighters found the body while putting out the blaze.



# Dive team probes icy Alaska waters for missing passengers

ANCHORAGE, Alaska — Dive teams plunged into the icy cold waters of a southeast Alaska inlet Tuesday, searching an area the size of 24 football fields for two cruise ship passengers missing after two sightseeing planes collided.

The Coast Guard has confirmed four fatalities in the collision Monday afternoon near Ketchikan, a popular destination for cruise ships in Alaska. Ten people, all Americans, were injured. The missing passengers were from Canada and Australia, Princess Cruises said.

The Royal Princess, which can carry up to 3,600 people, was among four city-sized cruise ships in the tiny coastal community on Monday.

During port stops, visitors can shop in tourist stores or take part in several excursions, such as visiting an Alaska Native village, tour the backcountry, or visit a raptor center.

Another popular trip is flightseeing in Misty Fjords National Monument. Visitors marvel at the lakes, snowcapped peaks and glacier valleys in the wilderness area. Trips cost about \$260 each.

The larger plane, a de Havilland Otter DHC-3 with 10 passengers and the pilot, was returning from Misty Fjord when it collided with another sightseeing plane, carrying four passengers from the same cruise ship and a pilot.

The cause of the crash in relatively good weather, high overcast skies with light southeast winds was not known.

The crash occurred about eight miles from Ketchikan, near George Inlet. The planes came down about a mile and a half apart with some of the debris field on land. Their altitude wasn't immediately known.

The smaller plane, a de Havilland DHC-2 Beaver, was partially submerged in the shore of George Inlet after the single-engine plane overturned and hit some trees before crashing, according to Coast Guard Lt. Brian Dykens. The larger Otter landed in water and sank, he said.

Investigators from the National Transportation Safety Board were due to arrive later Tuesday.

Three others who died were among the five people aboard the Beaver, according to Coast Guard Lt. Brian Dykens. Princess Cruises in its release said two passengers and the pilot were among those killed in this plane.

Canadian officials said Tuesday that one of its citizens was among the dead. Global Affairs Canada expressed condolences but did not identify the person because of privacy reasons.

The smaller plane, which operated independently and not as an official excursion flight booked through the cruise ship, was owned by Mountain Air Service of Ketchikan, which didn't immediately return a call Tuesday.

The Beaver appears to have broken apart in midair, according to Jerry Kiffer, duty incident commander of the Ketchikan Volunteer Rescue Squad. He said the plane's tail and section of the fuselage were 900 feet from the aircraft's floats, which landed near shore.

# Brewery offered free beer as reward for finding stolen van. It was back in 42 minutes

CHARLOTTE, N.C. (TNS) — A brewery in Charlotte may have set a record this week for the recovery of a stolen vehicle, after offering a keg party to whoever found it — including the thieves.

It took just 42 minutes for the missing truck to turn up, The Unknown Brewing Co. says.

"(Three) fine individuals stole one of our vans early this AM," said a Monday Facebook post by the brewery, located just south of Uptown.

"Please help us find it. Share with all of your friends. Whoever finds it, (the owner) Brad will buy you a keg party," the post continues. "If you stole it and bring it back: you will also get a keg party. (Smile

for the camera.)"

A woman named Caroline Faith was credited by the company with finding the van 42 minutes later, parked on a Charlotte side street. She posted a photo of it on Instagram as her proof.

"New world record for finding a stolen van," said the brewing company's follow-up post. "Over 15 people called in with tips."

The company did not say if there were any suspects in the case.

Social media responses to the theft and the quick discovery were largely humorous, with some accusing a competing brewery and others noting the futility of stealing a van with a company logo on it.

# Alabama Senate heads toward vote on abortion ban measure

Lawmakers debating proposal to outlaw almost all abortions

MONTGOMERY, Ala. — Alabama lawmakers headed to a Tuesday night vote on a bill to outlaw almost all abortions in the state, the latest conservative state to try and enact new restrictions on abortion access.

The bill before the GOP-dominated Alabama Senate would make performing an abortion at any stage of pregnancy a felony punishable by up to 99 years or life in prison. The only exception would be when the woman's health is at serious risk.

Supporters said the bill is intentionally designed to conflict with the U.S. Supreme Court's landmark 1973 Roe v. Wade decision legalizing abortion nationally, because they hope to spark a court case that might prompt the justices to revisit abortion rights.

"The question for me — for us

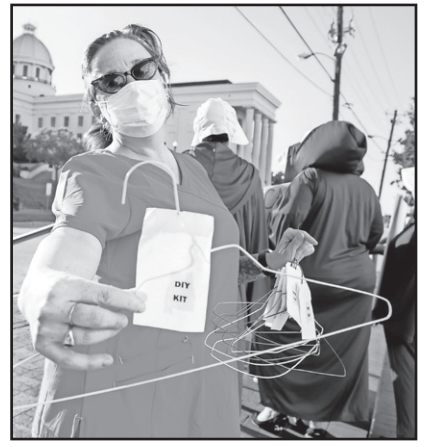
— is: When is a person a person?" Republican Sen. Clyde Chambliss said as debate began on the proposed ban.

Senators rejected an attempt to add an exception for rape and incest. The amendment was voted down 21-11, with four Republicans joining Democrats in the seeking the amendment.

"You don't care anything about babies having babies in this state, being raped and incest," Democratic Sen. Bobby Singleton said angrily after the amendment's defeat. "You just aborted the state of Alabama with your rhetoric with this bill."

The bill's sponsor and other supporters had argued exemptions would weaken their hope of creating a vehicle to challenge Roe.

Emboldened by conservative justices who have joined the Supreme Court, abortion opponents in several states are seeking to challenge abortion access. Kentucky,

Mississippi, Ohio and Georgia have approved bans on abortion once a fetal heartbeat is detected, which can occur in about the sixth week of pregnancy.

# San Francisco bans police use of face recognition technology

SAN FRANCISCO — San Francisco supervisors voted Tuesday to ban the use of facial recognition software by police and other city departments, becoming the first U.S. city to outlaw a rapidly developing technology that has alarmed privacy and civil liberties advocates.

The ban is part of broader legislation that requires city departments to establish use policies and obtain board approval for surveillance technology they want to purchase or are using at present. Several other local governments require departments to disclose and seek approval for surveillance technology.

"This is really about saying: 'We can have security without being a security state. We can have good policing without being a police

state.' And part of that is building trust with the community based on good community information, not on Big Brother technology," said Supervisor Aaron Peskin, who championed the legislation.

The ban applies to San Francisco police and other municipal departments. It does not affect use of the technology by the federal government at airports and ports, nor does it limit personal or business use.

The San Francisco board did not spend time Tuesday debating the outright ban on facial recognition technology, focusing instead on the possible burdens placed on police, the transit system and other city agencies that need to maintain public safety.

"I worry about politicizing these decisions," said Supervisor Catherine Stefani, a former prosecutor who was the sole no vote.

# Synagogue shooting suspect pleads not guilty to hate crimes

SAN DIEGO — The man suspected of killing a woman in a shooting at a Southern California synagogue pleaded not guilty to federal hate crime charges Tuesday.

John T. Earnest spoke twice during the brief hearing — to acknowledge his name and to say he agreed with his court-appointed attorney's decision against seeking bail.

Earnest, 19, is charged with bursting into the Chabad of Poway synagogue on April 27 and opening fire with an assault rifle, killing one and injuring three.

Peter Ko, an assistant U.S. attorney, told the judge that the government had not decided whether to seek the death penalty. He reaffirmed plans to try Earnest separately and simultaneously with a state charge of murder that is classified as a hate crime, which

also exposes Earnest to a potential death sentence.

A federal affidavit detailing the hate crime charges that was filed last week describes a deeply disturbed man filled with hatred toward Jews and Muslims, which are detailed in a manifesto he allegedly published online. Earnest claimed to be inspired by the attacks on the mosques in New Zealand and the shooting at the Pittsburgh Tree of Life synagogue last fall, the affidavit said.

# Texas officer shoots and kills woman after stun-gun struggle

BAYTOWN, Texas — A police officer shot and killed a woman at a Houston-area apartment complex after she hit him with his Taser during a struggle, shocking him, police said.

In a video recorded by a witness and posted on social media, the officer can be seen standing over Pamela Turner and reaching down to try to grab her arms. Turner, who is lying on the ground outside the apartments in Baytown, yells "I'm pregnant." Moments later, something flashes as she reaches her arm out toward the officer. Suddenly, the officer pulls away from Turner, steps back and fires five gunshots.

Police Lt. Steve Dorris said Tuesday that the officer shot at Turner after she hit him in the groin with the Taser. Turner did not fire the stun gun but it shocked the officer when it struck him, Dorris said.

The lieutenant said police have since learned from the medical examiner's office in Harris County that Turner, who was 44 and black, was

not pregnant. She was pronounced dead at the scene, he said. A spokeswoman with the medical examiner's office declined to comment.

The officer, who police have not identified by name, has been placed on paid administrative leave, Dorris said. The department is reviewing whether the shooting was in line with its policy on the use of deadly force, he said.

Before the shooting, the officer, who is Hispanic and an 11-year veteran of the police force, was patrolling the apartment complex and tried to arrest Turner because he knew she had outstanding warrants, Dorris said. The two had previous dealings, but Dorris did not provide further details about the interactions or Turner's warrants.

Turner had three outstanding misdemeanor warrants for two separate incidents, according to Harris County court records. She was accused of criminal mischief and assault on April 25 after a manager at her apartment complex told police that Turner scratched her face and broke her glasses during a confrontation over an eviction notice.

# Stocks rise, claw back chunk of Monday's trade-war plunge

NEWYORK (AP) — Stocks climbed on Tuesday and clawed back a chunk of their losses from Monday's rout, the latest whipsaw move as investors weigh just how badly the escalating U.S.-China trade war will hurt the economy.

The day's rally was nearly a mirror image of Monday's plunge, when the S&P 500 had its worst day since early January, just not as severe: Technology companies led the way higher after bearing the brunt of the selling on Monday, Treasury yields rose modestly and gold gave back a bit of its gains.

The S&P 500 rose 22.54 points, or 0.8%, to 2,834.41. It recovered nearly a third of its loss from Monday, and would now need to rise 3.9% to regain the record it set a couple

weeks ago. The Dow Jones Industrial Average rose 207.06, or 0.8%, to 25,532.05, and the Nasdaq composite index jumped 87.47, or 1.1%, to 7,734.49.

Of course, stocks are still lower than they were last week, following China's pledge to raise tariffs on U.S. goods. Stocks also remain lower than they were on May 5, when President Donald Trump ignited this latest round of fear for markets by announcing on Twitter that the U.S. would raise tariffs on Chinese goods.

Tuesday's rally came after another round of morning Trump tweets on trade. He said, "When the time is right we will make a deal with China," and he cited his "unlimited" respect for and friendship with China's leader.

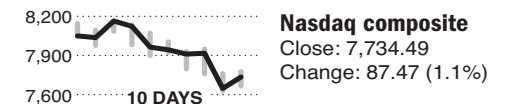

# There are many different options for prostate treatment

**DEAR DR ROACH:** I am a 79-year-old male who has been on tamsulosin for years, but it is not helping much. A recent CT scan showed my prostate at 6.2 cm transverse measurement. My urologist suggests taking Avodart to shrink it. However, I have read that this drug, along with other similar drugs, can cause an aggressive type of prostate cancer and other problems. I have noticed that you also favor prescribing those drugs. My question is, Why should I take it if I'd have to give up my sexual relationship and end up dying from cancer? I am very sensitive to drugs and am allergic to many. My urologist says that the aggressive cancer information is not true. What is your opinion? — T.F.X.

**ANSWER:** I wouldn't prescribe a drug if I really thought it would cause terrible side effects in many people and increase their risk of aggressive prostate cancer. Let's start with side effects. All drugs have the potential for side effects. Dutasteride (Avodart) and drugs like it block the form of

testosterone that both increases prostate size and helps cause baldness. The major side effects are sexual. They can cause a decreased libido, difficulty getting an erection and problems with ejaculation. In one study, the risk of developing any of these problems was only 5% of men. Newer studies suggest the risk is closer to 14%, which is similar to what experienced clinicians see in practice. Fifteen percent is a large enough number that it deserves consideration before prescribing, but most men will not have these side effects.

As far as prostate cancer risks, one study did suggest that aggressive prostate cancer might be more likely in those who take these testosterone blockers. However, shortly after publication, critics identified a methodologic problem in the study, suggesting that the apparent increase in risk of aggressive prostate cancer was not real. In November 2018, another study was published looking at the same issue. It found that Avodart and Proscar reduced the overall risk for prostate cancer, but that benefit was in low- and medium-risk prostate cancers. Aggressive prostate cancers were not significantly reduced by taking the medication, but there was a trend toward reduction, especially in men who took the medication the longest.

After reviewing all of the available data, I still feel that these medications are a valuable part of therapy for men with symptomatic enlarged prostate. Men with intolerable sexual side effects should find a different option. In addition to medications, there

are a wide variety of surgical and "semi-surgical" options, some of which have very low risk of sexual side effects.

**DEAR DR. ROACH:** I have been prescribed Janumet XR and am concerned if this drug is addictive. I do not want to be on this medication long-term. Can I get my diabetes under control by weight management and diet? — S.S.

**ANSWER:** Janumet is a combination of Januvia (sitagliptin) and metformin (Glucophage). Together these drugs work to reduce sugar made by the liver and to increase release of insulin by the pancreas. Janumet is not addictive.

Many people are able to control diabetes through careful management of diet and weight control; however, depending on where your sugar levels have been, your doctor may have decided to put you on medication now to protect your body. It's possible for many patients to get off medications, but it requires a real commitment: a big change in diet and exercise, usually with significant weight loss.

# Border wall to go up in national monument, wildlife refuge

PHOENIX (AP) — The U.S. government plans on replacing barriers through 100 miles of the southern border in California and Arizona, including through a national monument and a wildlife refuge, according to documents and environmental advocates.

The Department of Homeland Security on Tuesday again waived environmental and dozens of other laws to

build more barriers along the U.S.-Mexico border.

Funding will come from the Defense Department following the emergency declaration that President Donald Trump signed this year after Congress refused to approve the amount of border wall funding he requested.

Barriers will go up at Organ Pipe Cactus National Monument, a vast park named after the unique cactus breed that

decorates it, and Cabeza Prieta National Wildlife Refuge, which is largely a designed wilderness home to 275 wildlife species. The government will also build new roads and lighting in those areas in Arizona.

Environmental advocates who have sued to stop the construction of the wall say this latest plan will be detrimental to the wildlife and habitat in those areas.

not planned for that. Hopefully we're not going to have to plan for that. If we did that, we'd send a hell of a lot more troops than that."

Reinforcing Trump's denial, Secretary of State Mike Pompeo said at a joint news conference in Sochi with Russian Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov, "We fundamentally do not seek war with Iran."

A Trump administration official said a recent small meeting of national security officials was not focused on a military response to Iran, but instead concentrated on a range of other policy options, including diplomacy and economic sanctions. The official spoke on condition of anonymity to discuss internal deliberations.

Lavrov said Pompeo told him that a potential deployment of 120,000 U.S. troops to the Mideast was only a "rumor."

Lavrov said the international community needs to focus on diplomacy with Iran, including on the potentially explosive issue of Iran's nuclear program, which is constrained by a U.S.-brokered deal in 2015 that Trump has abandoned.

U.S. Iran envoy Brian Hook told reporters traveling with Pompeo in Brussels that the secretary of state shared intelligence on Iran with allies since "Europe shares our concerns about stability in the Gulf and the Middle East." What the Europeans do not share, however, is Washington's more aggressive approach to Iran.

"We are very worried about the risk of a conflict happening by accident,

with an escalation that is unintended really on either side but ends with some kind of conflict," British Foreign Secretary Jeremy Hunt told reporters in Brussels.

"What we need is a period of calm to make sure that everyone understands what the other side is thinking," Hunt said.

Last week, U.S. officials said they had detected signs of Iranian preparations for potential attacks on U.S. forces and interests in the Mideast, but Washington has not spelled out that threat.

The U.S. has about 5,000 troops in Iraq and about 2,000 in Syria as part of the coalition campaign to defeat the Islamic State group there. It also has long had a variety of air and naval forces stationed in Bahrain, Qatar and elsewhere in the Gulf, partly to support military operations against IS and

partly as a counter to Iranian influence.

Gen. Ghika's comments came amid dramatically heightened tensions in the Middle East. The U.S. in recent days has ordered the USS Abraham Lincoln aircraft carrier strike group to the Gulf region, plus four B-52 bombers. It also is moving a Patriot air-defense missile battery to an undisclosed country in the area. As of Tuesday, the Lincoln and its strike group had passed through the Bab-el-Mandeb Strait in the Red Sea, but officials would not disclose their exact location.

Tensions rose another notch with reports Sunday that four commercial vessels anchored off the United Arab Emirates had been damaged by sabotage.

A U.S. military team was sent to the UAE to investigate, and one U.S. official said the initial

assessment is that each ship has a 5- to 10-foot hole in it, near or just below the water line. The official, who was not authorized to publicly discuss details of the investigation, said the early interpretation is that the holes were caused by explosive charges.

The official on Tuesday acknowledged seeing some photographs of the damage to the ships, but those images have not been made public. The official also said that the team is continuing to conduct forensic testing on the ship damage and that U.S. leaders are still awaiting the final report. The team's initial assessment is that the damage was done by Iranian or Iranian-backed proxies, but they are still going through the evidence and have not yet reached a final conclusion, the official said.

in this country, and a little bit of the South, too," he told the Wisconsin State Journal in 2005. "For some reason, we're just more laid-back, more understanding. ... And Midwesterners have a kinder sense of humor."

Those qualities probably contributed to his wide popularity on "The Carol Burnett Show," which he joined in 1975 after years as a frequent guest. The show aired on CBS from 1967 to 1978 and had a short summer stint on ABC in 1979.

"We really didn't attack people or politics or religion or whatever. We just made fun of, basically, ourselves," he said.

The show operated with just five writers, one producer, one director and without network interference. The ensemble cast surrounding the redheaded star included Vicki Lawrence and Lyle Waggoner.

Lawrence on Tuesday mourned the passing of her co-star, saying

in a statement that "the angels are laughing out loud."

"Hysterical, crazy, bold, fearless, humble, kind, adorable... all synonyms for Tim Conway. I am so lucky to ever have shared a stage with him."

While America was laughing at Conway, so were his co-stars: Burnett and Harvey Korman were often caught by the camera trying not to crack up during his performances.

The short, nondescript Conway and the tall, imposing Korman were a physical mismatch made in comedy heaven. They toured the country for years with a sketch show called "Together Again," which drew on characters from Burnett's show.

Besides the four Emmys he won with Burnett (three as a performer, one as a writer), he won Emmys for guest appearances in 1996 for "Coach" and in 2008 for "30 Rock."

Conway also had a modest but steady movie career, appearing in such films as "The Apple Dumpling Gang" (1975), "The Shaggy D.A." (1976), "Cannonball

Run II" (1984), "Dear God" (1996) and "Air Bud 2" (1998).

"The Apple Dumpling Gang" and "Cannonball Run II" allowed him to work with his comedic hero, Don Knotts, who died in 2006.

He also found success in the 1980s in a series of comedy videos based on an oddly short character named Dorf. (Carefully costumed, Conway performed the bits on his knees.) Among them were "Dorf on Golf" and "Dorf Goes Fishing."

More recently Conway voiced the role of Barnacle Boy for the hugely popular children's series "SpongeBob SquarePants."

He was born Thomas Conway in 1933 in the Cleveland suburb of Willoughby. He attended Bowling Green State University and served in the U.S. Army. He got his career start on local TV in Cleveland in the 1950s, where his duties included comedy spots on a late-night movie show.

He was spotted by Rose Marie of "The Dick Van Dyke Show," who got him an audition for "The Steve Allen Show." He became

a regular on the show in the early 1960s. It was Allen who had advised him to change his name from Tom to Tim to avoid being confused with a British actor.

Following the Allen show, Conway gained attention as the incompetent Ensign Charles Parker on the Ernest Borgnine sitcom "McHale's Navy" from 1962-66. That led to series of his own, including "Rango" and "The Tim Conway Show," but they were short-lived.

"McHale's Navy" fans loved watching Ensign Parker infuriate the ever-flammable Captain Binghamton (played by Joe Flynn), but it was Conway's work on Burnett's show that would bring him lasting fame.

Conway and his wife, Mary Anne Dalton, married in 1961 and had six children. The marriage ended in divorce. He later married Charlene Fusco.

In addition to his wife and daughter Jackie, Conway is survived by children Tim Jr., Patrick, Jamie, Kelly, Corey and Seann, as well as two grandchildren, Courtney and Sophia.

for the name of the project. It's being called Artemis, after the twin sister of Apollo. Apollo was the name of NASA's moonshot program that, 50 years ago this summer, achieved the first manned lunar landing.

NASA landed 12 men on the moon over six Apollo missions. For the next go-around, the space agency wants its moonwalkers to reflect today's more diverse astronaut corps, thus the name of Apollo's sister. Artemis was goddess of the hunt as well as the moon.

"In the 1960s, young ladies didn't have the opportunity to see themselves in that role. Today, they do," Bridenstine said.

The administration seeks to use money from Pell Grants for college education, for NASA's new spending.

Bridenstine said he's already heard criticism of how the new spending will be "dead on arrival" in Congress because neither NASA nor the administration worked in advance with Congress on it. As a former congressman from Oklahoma, he said he knows how the process works and assured the space agency's 17,000 employees that would not be the case.

"This is a good out-of-the-gate first start, a very honest proposal from the administration that keeps us all together, moving forward," he said. In March, Vice President Mike Pence urged NASA to accelerate its moon-landing program, moving it up from 2028 to 2024.

NASA has flip-flopped between the moon and Mars, a victim of changing presidential administrations. More recently, President Barack Obama targeted Mars as astronauts' next big destination, while President Donald Trump has favored the moon.

A spokeswoman for Burr declined to comment. The North Carolina Republican has weathered fierce criticism for the subpoena from the president and his GOP colleagues.

Trump said Tuesday he believed that his son was being treated poorly.

"It's really a tough situation because my son spent, I guess, over 20 hours testifying about something that Mueller said was 100 percent OK and now they want him to testify again," Trump told reporters at the White House before traveling to Louisiana. "I don't know why. I have no idea why. But it seems very unfair to me."

It's the first known subpoena of a member of the president's immediate family, and some Republicans went as far as to say they thought Trump Jr. shouldn't comply.

Sen. Thom Tillis, R-N.C., tweeted, "It's time to move on & start focusing on issues that matter to Americans." Sen. John Cornyn of Texas, a GOP member of the panel, said

he understood Trump Jr.'s frustration. Cornyn's Texas colleague, Republican Sen. Ted Cruz, said there was "no need" for the subpoena.

Senate Judiciary Committee Chairman Lindsey Graham, R-S.C., said on "Fox News Sunday" that if he were Trump Jr.'s lawyer, "I would tell him, 'You don't need to go back into this environment anymore.'"

Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell has defended Burr, telling his colleagues during the private GOP luncheon last week that he trusted the intelligence committee chairman. On Tuesday, McConnell told reporters that "none of us tell Chairman Burr how to run his committee."

Still, McConnell made it clear that he is eager to be finished with the probe, which has now gone on for more than two years.

Burr has "indicated publicly he believes they will find no collusion" with Russia, McConnell said. "We're hoping we will get a report on that subject sometime soon."

It's uncertain when the panel will issue a

final report. Burr told The Associated Press earlier this month that he hopes to be finished with the investigation by the end of the year.

The subpoena has highlighted a delicate bind facing Burr, a third-term senator who has said he is not running for reelection in 2022. He has been adamant that the panel's Russia probe be bipartisan and fair and has worked closely with the panel's top Democrat, Virginia Sen. Mark Warner.

Burr's committee had renewed interest in talking to Trump Jr. after Trump's former lawyer, Michael Cohen, told a House committee in February that he had briefed Trump Jr. approximately 10 times about a plan to build a Trump Tower in Moscow before the presidential election. Trump Jr. told the Senate Judiciary Committee in a separate interview in 2017 he was only "peripherally aware" of the proposal.

The panel is also interested in talking to the president's eldest son about other topics, including a campaign meeting in Trump Tower with a Russian lawyer.

## Know the storm: Be prepared for hurricanes

Hurricanes are no laughing matter. Hurricanes are strong storms that can wreak havoc. Strong hurricane winds and rain can cause substantial damage, as can tidal surges that cause flooding to coastal areas.

Hurricanes are sometimes referred to as typhoons and tropical cyclones. But no matter the name, these storms pack the same powerful punch. Storms earn the hurricane designation when they include winds that reach 74 mph (119 kph).

Hurricane season typically runs between May and November. National Geographic says that hurricanes form over warm ocean waters near the equator. This warm, moist air from the ocean rises and then causes air from surrounding areas to be sucked into a continuous storm formation. Clouds begin to rotate with the Earth's rotation. If there is enough warm water to feed the storm, then the hurricane forms.

Surviving a hurricane can come down to understanding the risks of the storm. Understanding hurricane terminology also can help. The following are some hurricane facts and preparedness tips.

- The strongest part of a hurricane is called the wall. It is the most dangerous part of the hurricane with the strongest winds, heaviest rains and thickest clouds. The wall immediately surrounds the center eye of the storm.
- The circular “eye” of the hurricane is generally calm with no clouds. Hurricanes rotate in a counter-clockwise direction around the eye.
- Hurricanes are generally classified into five categories, depending on their severity. The higher the number, the more potent the storm.
- The National Hurricane Center started giving official names to storms in 1953. If a hurricane

has been especially destructive, its name may be retired. Examples of retired names include Andrew, Katrina, Mitch, and Sandy.

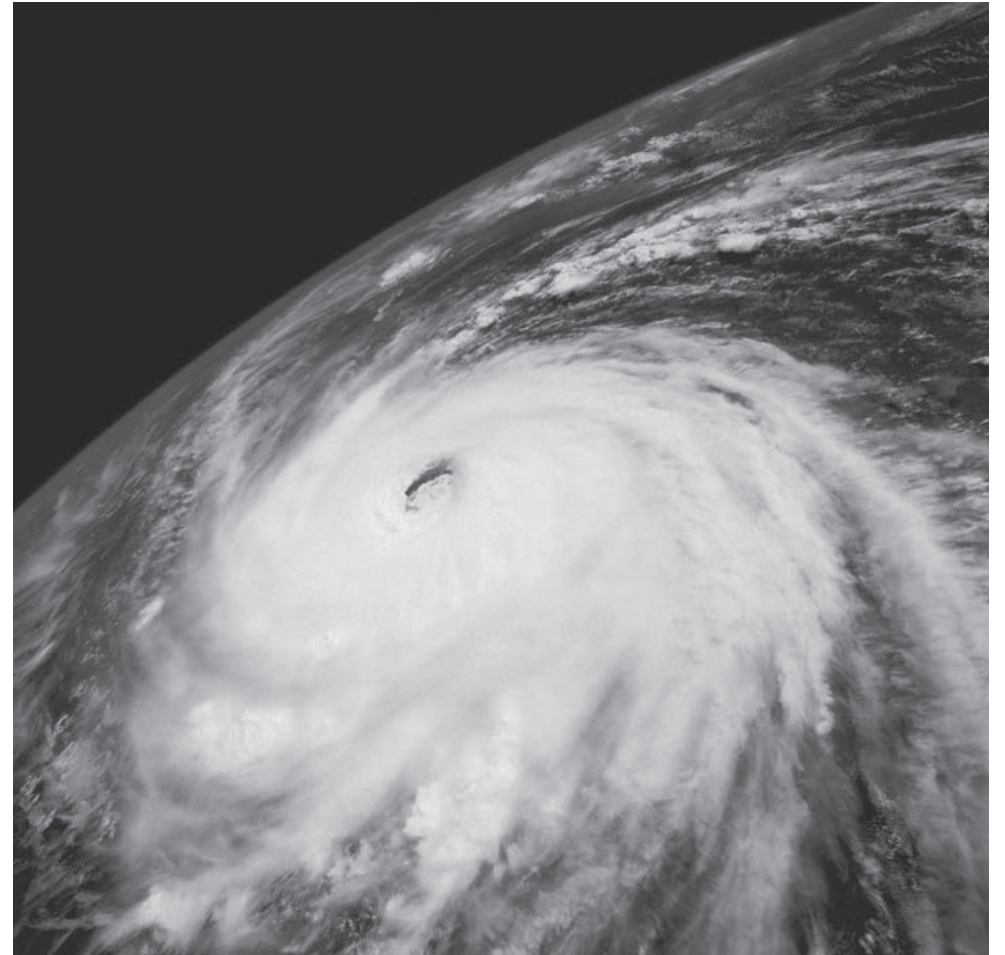
- Hurricanes will lose strength over land because they require moist ocean water for fuel.

- According to Science Kids, coastal regions are most at danger from hurricanes because of their proximity to the ocean.

- Data from the Atlantic Oceanographic and Meteorological Laboratory found the three states with the most hurricane landfalls are Florida, Texas and Louisiana.

- Hurricanes do not affect Canadian cities and towns as much as places in the United States, but the Canadian Hurricane Centre was created as an expert source of information for Canadian residents. Atlantic Canada, namely Nova Scotia, is an area in Canada that is most likely to be impacted by hurricanes.

- People who live in areas where hurricanes frequently touch down are advised to put together hurricane preparedness kits, which should include drinking water, nonperishable foods, extra cloth-



ing, flashlights and batteries, candles, and other supplies that are helpful if the power goes out.

- Although many like to batten down the hatches and ride out storms, if a hurricane evacuation is advised, people should leave their homes. It may take days for power to be restored, and emergency personnel may not be able to reach injured or stranded residents in the interim.

## Prepare for the financial impact of natural disasters

The fury of Mother Nature's wrath is displayed in vivid color during stormy times of year, including hurricane season.

And it seems no area of the planet is safe from such furor. In September 2018, Hurricane Florence battered the southeastern coast of the United States while Typhoon Mangkhut hit Hong Kong. Just a few months earlier, California saw devastating wild fires, and in August torrential rain flooded many areas of Taiwan.

After the flood waters recede and the rain or smoke has passed, people affected by storms must face the financial ramifications. Whether storms touch down nearby or overseas, the globalized economy means the financial fallout from natural disasters can be felt near and wide.

The National Centers for Environmental Information estimates that hurricanes cost an average of \$21.8 billion per event in damages for the United States. Since 1980, when data started to be collected, NCEI indicates hurricanes (tropical cyclones), drought, flooding, wildfires, freezes and winter storms tend to be the most costly events.

It's easy to underestimate the scope of the financial burdens caused by natural disasters. Here are a few ways to protect one's financial interests in advance of natural disasters.

- Experts at Property Casualty Insurers Association of America advise consumers to review and update their insurance policies regularly. Many homeowners are underinsured for natural di-

sasters, particularly for flooding or earthquakes, which are not included in most policies.

- Adjust insurance shortfalls based on what insurers provide and the type of weather that tends to affect the area in which you live.
- Policies should reimburse for hotel rooms or meals out if a home is uninhabitable after a disaster. In a Consumer Reports survey of people who experienced property damage after a hurricane, 5 percent said they had to stay elsewhere, while 42 percent needed to relocate temporarily after damages from wildfires.
- Remove valuables and store them in a bank safety deposit box or another location that's outside the path of the storm. Theft, vandalism and looting can occur after storms.
- Have a backup employment plan and savings strategy if storms come through regularly. It is not uncommon for local businesses to shut down for some time to recover. This can mean temporary or permanent loss of employment.
- Recognize your portfolio may suffer as commodity prices and stocks take a hit if regions are decimated by natural disasters. Think ahead in regard to how your investments may be affected and make changes accordingly to mitigate the financial damage.

Storms cause structural and economic damage when they roll through. Be prepared to protect your financial interests.

#### Why name hurricanes?

According to the National Hurricane Center, the following are reasons that we name storms such as tropical storms and hurricanes:

“Experience shows that the use of short, distinctive names in written as well as spoken communications is quicker and less subject to error than the older, more cumbersome latitude-longitude identification methods. These advantages are especially important in exchanging detailed storm information between hundreds of widely scattered stations, coastal bases and ships at sea.

The use of easily remembered names greatly reduces confusion when two or more tropical storms occur at the same time. For example, one hurricane can be moving slowly westward in the Gulf of Mexico, while at exactly the same time another hurricane can be moving rapidly northward along the Atlantic coast. In the past, confusion and false rumors have arisen when storm advisories broadcast from radio stations were mistaken for warnings concerning an entirely different storm located hundreds of miles away.

The National Hurricane Center explains that names are only given to tropical storms that have sustained winds speeds higher than 39 miles per hour. These names will stay with the storm as it reaches hurricane strength — for example, Tropical Storm Wendy will become Hurricane Wendy if it reaches maturity.

If a hurricane does tremendous damage — as did Hurricanes Katrina, Harvey or Sandy — the name is retired and replaced by a different name beginning with the same letter.

## How to safely handle a prolonged power outage

Storms, including hurricanes, can disrupt the electricity that powers everything in homes and businesses. A short-term loss of power can be a nuisance, but extended power outages can cause damage and may even be dangerous.

Widespread power outages are often anticipated during or after severe storms, which can disable entire power grids. Because damaged power lines and infrastructure must be carefully assessed after severe storms, it may take anywhere from hours to several days before power is fully restored.

The Food and Drug Administration says that food spoilage is one of the hazards of long-term power outages. If a storm is imminent, you can be proactive by freezing the contents of the refrigerator when possible so that items can stay at safe temperatures longer, advises the FDA. Food can remain safe for up to two hours at refrigerator temperature before it starts to spoil. Grouping food together in the freezer also can help it stay colder longer. Having extra ice on hand or freezing containers of water also can provide a chilling effect, as well as serve as a water supply if faucet water is unavailable — which can be a concern for those with well-pumped water.

Your barbecue can turn out to be your best friend during power outages. Many stoves, even gas ones, will not light because of electric ignitions. A gas camping stove or barbecue can serve as the primary place to cook food until power is restored. Always have a secondary propane tank on hand.

Keep plenty of bottled water on hand, especially if your water supply is well-fed and requires an electric pump to activate flow.

If you have a generator, run it safely. The Consumer Product Safety Commission says generators should be operated as far away from the house as possible to avoid deadly carbon monoxide fumes. Also, use appropriately-gauged, outdoor-rated extension cords to power up generators.

It is also important to stay put and avoid the road after a storm that causes a power outage. Wires may be down, traffic lights may not work and dangerous debris may be littering the roads. Hunkering down is the best approach until power is restored.



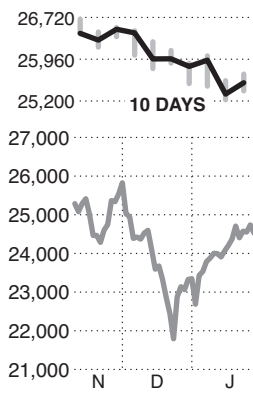
