Allen Cashe, arrested for murdering his girlfriend and one of her sons in 2017, was sentenced to life in prison on Wednesday morning for his crimes.

Cashe pled guilty to two counts of homicide and several counts of attempted homicide in December in a plea deal, in exchange for



His own pharmacy

Altamonte Springs police had their hands full during a traffic stop Sunday when a man attempted to flee because of the amount of drugs in his vehicle.

Police pulled the man over on Wymore Road after they said it appeared he had illegal tint on his vehicle. When the man got out of the vehicle, police said they smelled marijuana. Ignoring the police officer's request, the man grabbed a bag and took flight on foot. After one failed attempt to tase the man, police were eventually able to apprehend him.

When police searched the bag they found 127 grams of marijuana, 129 pills of MDMA, and suspected heroin. Inside the vehicle they found a loaded handgun and 88 grams of cocaine.

Craig Carwise, 45, of Orlando was charged with trafficking cocaine, trafficking amphetamine, possession of a weapon by a convicted felon, possession of marijuana with the intent to sell, possession of crack cocaine, possession of carisoprodol, resisting an officer without violence, and drug equipment possession.

Carwise, who is no stranger to the law, had previously served two prison terms, both for homicide

charges out of Orange County. On each charge he was released early before serving his entire sentence.

Strange choices

Oviedo police arrested two men Sunday after they said the two stole some unusual items from Publix and Winn-Dixie.

Police were first called to Publix on Broadway Avenue where two males were seen attempting to steal several bottles of wine. The manager was able to stop them and recover the wine, however he told police he still wanted to press charges.

Here, their choices were a little more interesting. The men claimed they were stealing the items to sell to other people.

Angelo Horne, 42, and Isaiah Nickson, 28, both of Oviedo, were charged with shoplifting, dealing in stolen property and trespassing.

Colin Pitner, 22, of Winter Park, was charged with possession of obscene material with sexual performance by a child under 18.

Longwood police were called to a shopping center in Longwood on Tuesday after it was suspected a man was suffering from an overdose.

Once the man was transported to the emergency room it was determined by doctors that he was simply "high." But, because of an active warrant, the man was taken to the Seminole County jail. Once there, it was explained to him that if he carried any contraband into the jail he would be given an extra charge. Despite this warning, the correctional officer still located three packets of heroin in his sock and buttocks. The man told police he had hid the drugs there because he was scared someone would kill him for it, and then

forgot about the drugs after the encounter with police. He told the officer it was "just heroin laced with fentanyl." When the officer said, "You know that's dangerous?" the man simply responded: "That's how I like it."

Adam Rainaldi, 33, of Casselberry, was charged with possession of heroin and smuggling contraband into a county detention facility.

Deputies said they were called to the area of Notre Dame Road and Lynchfield Drive in Altamonte Springs on Jan. 11 in reference to a suspicious person. There, in a vacant

home, they located Karina Geiersbach, 21, hiding in one of the back rooms.

Deputies later learned that the 9-year-old's mother had reported Geiersbach as suspicious because she learned Geiersbach had been in contact with her daughter for several weeks.

The 9-year-old told deputies she first saw Geiersbach on Christmas Day. The girl said Geiersbach told her "Merry Christmas" and asked her how she was doing.

From then on, the girl said she saw Geiersbach every day, and the woman would say hello.

On Jan. 10 the girl was walking home from school with her brother when Geiersbach approached and asked the girl to come to her "secret place" with

her. The brother told his sister that was not a good idea, but the girl began to follow Geiersbach anyway.

When the brother ultimately intervened, Geiersbach told him to "mind his business" and told the girl she did not have to listen to her brother and "she should come with her to her secret hide out," according to the arrest report.

The following day the girl noticed Geiersbach outside of her home and went outside to talk to her. Geiersbach reportedly gave the girl a hug and when the girl said she was uncomfortable Geiersbach said, "You don't have to feel uncom-

fortable. It's not like I'm going to take you or kidnap you."

At that point the girl's mother followed Geiersbach to the vacant home and reported the incident to the authorities.

When deputies came in contact with Geiersbach she said she didn't see a problem with talking to the girl and said she wanted the girl "to come and be in a play with her."

Geiersbach was ultimately charged with battery and aggravated stalking of a child under 16.

But this is not the first time the Geiersbach family has been in this situation.

In 2012 Karina Geiersbach's

older brother was charged with sexually assaulting children in a daycare operated by their

mother.
Roberto Geiersbach, who was then 18, was accused of sexually assaulting a 6 and 4-year-old at the Geierbachs Family Daycare, which was run by their mother, Norma Geiersbach, out of their home in Altamonte Springs on Tulane Drive.

During the investigation Norma was instructed to give detectives the names of all the children attending the daycare, but failed to provide two children's names. Furthermore, she was told by authorities to cease any of the daycare's business during the investigation, as Roberto resided in the home.

Detectives later learned she continued to watch children in the home during the investigation.

As a result Norma was charged with obstructing justice and child neglect.

The former daycare home is the same home where Karina Geiersbach currently resides. It is only about a block away from where the most recent incident occurred.

Karina Geiersbach has been released on a \$20,500 bond and has been ordered by the court not to return to the vacant home or have any contact with the girl or her family.



Fact-Free Politics

In this era when there has been more information available to more people than at any time in the past, it is also true that there has been more misinformation from more different sources than ever. We are not talking about differences of opinion or inadequate verification, but about statements and catchwords in utter defiance of facts.

Among the most popular current catchwords are "climate change deniers." Stop and think. Have you ever -even once in your entire life -- seen, heard or read even one human being who denied that climates change?

It is hard even to imagine how any minimally knowledgeable person could deny that climates change, when there are fossils of marine creatures in the Sahara Desert. Obviously there has been quite a climate change there.

The next time someone talks about "climate change deniers," ask them to name one -- and tell you just where specifically you can find their words, declaring that climates do not change. You can bet the rent money that they cannot tell you.

Why all this talk about these mythical creatures called "climate change deniers"? Because there are some meteorologists and other scientists who refuse to join the stampede toward drastic economic changes to prevent what others say will be catastrophic levels of "global warming.'

There are scientists on both sides of that issue. Presumably the issue could be debated on the basis of evidence and analysis. But this has become a political crusade, and political issues tend to be settled by political means, of which demonizing the opposition with catchwords is one.

It is much the same story on economic issues. Any proposal to reduce income tax rates is sure to bring out claims that these are "tax cuts for the rich," based on the "trickle-down theory" that reducing the taxes collected from the rich will cause some of their wealth to "trickle down" to people with lower incomes.

Here, yet again, all you need to do is think back over your own life, and ask yourself if you have ever -even once in your entire life -- seen, heard or read a single human being who advocated this "trickle-down theory."

Certainly none of the innumerable fellow economists I have encountered in my 88 years ever advocated any such theory. Nor am I aware of anyone else, in any other walk of life, who has done so.

Yet there are ringing denunciations of the "trickledown theory" in books, articles, and in politics and the media. That theory has been denounced as far away as India.

The next time someone talks about the "trickledown" theory, ask them to tell you where specifically you can find the writings, videos or any other evidence of someone advocating that theory. You may get some very clever and creative evasions of your question, but no actual answer.

One of the best-selling history textbooks did name Secretary of the Treasury Andrew Mellon as having said in the 1920s that letting the rich pay less taxes would allow their wealth to "trickle down" to others. It was one of the very rare examples that actually named a name.

Unfortunately, what this widely used history textbook attributed to Andrew Mellon was the direct opposite of what he actually said. In Mellon's own book, "Taxation," he said that wealthy people were not paying enough tax revenue to the government, because they put their money into tax-exempt securities.

Mellon called it "incredible" that tax laws allowed someone making a million dollars a year to pay not a cent in taxes, and an "almost grotesque" consequence that people of more modest incomes had to make up the shortfall.

Wes Allen Introduced as Hagerty Football Coach

When Wes Allen left Oviedo High School after the 2016 season, it was for his family. He didn't want to leave coaching for a job at AstroTurf, but to be financially stable enough for his wife, Ann, to stay home with his then 3-year-old son Austin and a second child, it was what had to be done.

"When you're a husband and a father, you take care of your family," Allen said. "You have to make some choices and do some things that may not be exactly what you want to do, but it's what the family needs."

Now, after two seasons away, Allen began his coaching comeback Wednesday night when he was introduced as the new head football coach.

Allen was selected from multiple candidates by administration after a three-step process that consisted of interviews, deliberations, and reference contacts.

"He had the knowledge base, he had experience growing a program, he had consistency within his program, and he's well-known in the community," Principal Mary Williams said. "I think all of those things add up."

Allen's hiring came in the wake of the Florida High School Athletic Associations' biennial reclassification of football districts, which placed Hagerty into the 8A division for the first time in program history. The team's new district also includes University, Winter Park, Colonial, Timber Creek, and Allen's former team, Oviedo, marking the first time the two schools have been in the same district for football.

'The biggest difference between 7A and 8A around this area is the depth of the teams," Allen said.

Allen is still assembling his staff, but he confirmed four

coaches that would be joining him next season on Wednesday night. Steve Laurence, who coached with Allen at Oviedo for 12 years before becoming linebacker coach at Lake Mary, will be defensive coordinator. Joe Cianflone, who was most recently the quarterback coach for Lake Mary, will be offensive coordinator. Rob Suavao and Rich Turner, who were on now-retired Phil Ziglar's staff, will be retained as defensive line coach and offensive line coach respectively. The hires were officially announced via the football team's Twitter account (@Hagerty_FB) the following day.

Allen will continue to meet with other members of last year's coaching staff, saying in an address to players and parents that if they wish to remain at Hagerty, he will find a spot

Allen will also become a P.E. teacher and the boys weightlifting coach, positions vacated after Ziglar's retirement last month.

The main factor that attracted both Allen and new athletic trainer Keith Miessau, also introduced Wednesday night, to Hagerty was the prospect of coaching within their community.

"My dream is for the Hagerty community to shut down on Friday night and fill the stadium," Allen said. "This place needs to be rocking on Friday night and the way you do that is to get the community involved and be a face in your community."

Answering questions from parents and players, Allen revealed two of his goals. One, aided by his newfound experience in the industry, is to install turf for Sam Momary Stadium. The other is to take over what Zilgar started.

"[Zilgar has] built a very good foundation, one that we're going to build our program off of," Allen said. "[Hagerty] will be a football program that people are going to respect and dread playing. It's going to happen faster than people believe."

"May All Who Enter as Visitors and Guests Leave as Friends and Volunteers". So reads the telling sign at the front desk of Meals on Wheels Etc., one of Sanford's most beloved and busy-- non-profit organizations. Sherry Fincher has been employed as the Executive Director of Meals on Wheels Etc. for 27 years. She also oversees its subdivision, Top Hat Catering. Both are located at 2801 South Fi-

The history of Meals on Wheels is rich. The group originated in 1973 from a Fern Park apartment complex where the elderly helped one another with meal preparation, transportation, and other support services. Later, a local church began assisting, then federal funding was applied for and received. A Board of Directors was formed for the Seminole County Better Living for Seniors. Eventually the name was changed to Meals on Wheels Etc.

"The 'Etc.' is a such an important part of our name because it encompasses all we do in addition to meal delivery," Ms. Fincher states.

Although known for its daily nutritious

meal delivery for homebound seniors in Seminole County, Meals on Wheels Etc. offers other services such as transportation, care coordination, chore assistance, and even home improvements for seniors. The challenges of senior citizens in Seminole County-financial, social, and others-- are addressed and many times overcome.

Last year the organization served 144,000 meals, made over 17,000 trips, provided 800

hours of homemaking services, provided 300 hours of home improvement, and even weatherized 36 homes.

For interested seniors in Seminole County, an initial home assessment is undertaken that includes a critical nutritional screening. Those at risk for losing the opportunity to live independently are prioritized. "We try to assist immediately the most vulnerable members of

the population we serve," declares Fincher. Additionally, the group offers extensive catering services to all individuals within and beyond Seminole County. Top Hat Catering, a subdivision of Meals on Wheels Etc., boasts professional chef Delano Lambertclare and his team. Working in his current capacity since 2006, Lambertclare saw the opportunity to use his gourmet talents in the service of high-quality meals to seniors, children, and the general public. Top Hat's array of offerings is available for special events like weddings and parties, as well as daily catering to area daycare groups, private schools, and other local organizations. All catering revenue is funneled back into Meals on Wheels Etc. to assist its waiting list of approximately 275 senior citizens to date. Since only 40 percent of the organization is funded by federal grants, catering is an important area of the or-

"The patrons of Top Hat Catering not only are provided with delicious food, but they know they are contributing positively to their communities," notes Fincher.

TO YOUR GOOD HEALTH: Is There Such a Thing as a Weather Allergy?

DEAR DR. ROACH: Is it possible to be allergic to the cold weather and temperature changes? My son is 23 years old, and when he goes out in the cold, he breaks out in hives. What can he do? -- K.R.

ANSWER: This sounds exactly like cold urticaria, which isn't an allergy, but is similar in some ways. Doctors may test this by placing an ice cube (in a plastic bag with water) on the skin (usually the forearm) for five minutes, then watch the skin as it rewarms. If a hive develops (with raised skin and redness), that confirms the diagnosis. Cold urticaria can be associated with some infections (Lyme disease, hepatitis and HIV, among others) and with celiac disease.

People with cold urticaria need to worry about systemic reactions. Avoiding cold (especially swimming in cold water) is critical, but even cold beverages can cause a serious systemic reaction, including swelling of the mouth and throat. Even anaphylaxis, a life-threatening collapse of the circulatory system, can develop. Many people with severe cold urticaria carry an epinephrine auto-injector in case of emergency.

Antihistamines, such as loratadine (Claritin) and cetirizine (Zyrtec), are the best pharmacologic treatment. Experts in cold urticaria include allergists and dermatologists.

DEAR DR. ROACH: I saw a new physician for the first time two years ago. As he had no EKG machine, he sent me over to the local hospital for an EKG (just for his records, I wasn't having problems). I had the EKG. The tech said that I was in atrial fib and needed to be admitted, as blood clots could form. I disagreed and went home. The doctor called me and persuaded me to go back to the hospital, which I did. I

was preparing to be admitted when a cardiologist came in and said: "She doesn't need admitting; she is not in atrial fib, it's just PVCs."

I found out later that the EKG machine spit out the interpretation; no cardiologist had read it. I did complain, of course, and received an apology letter from the hospital. They also stated that they would change this procedure.

Do hospitals actually rely on machines to do cardiology interpretations? And then go along with the machine's interpretation without a cardiologist looking at the EKG? Please tell me it isn't so. -- M.K.

ANSWER: It isn't so, or at least it shouldn't be. There are several errors here. The first is that the EKG machine made the wrong interpretation. The machines are pretty good most of the time, but there are times when it is very difficult to tell and the machine is wrong. The second error was that the technician told you rather than getting the results confirmed by a human being who could correctly interpret them. I give the technician credit for trying to act in the patient's interest, but you should be sure of your facts before telling the patient.

It's the third error -- that of the doctor who called you -- that upsets me the most, since the doctor was also wrong before calling you. I would be especially angry if the doctor had relied on the machine or the technician and hadn't checked the EKG personally.

It is good you wrote to complain: Hospitals rely on feedback to change the system.

burglary, attempted homicide and attempted robbery, along with fines paid to Picardat.

His sentencing is scheduled for March 6.

On Aug. 13, 2017, Picardat had arrived early to wait for a cleaning crew to arrive at Wolfy's.

Instead, two men armed with a gun and knife entered and put the gun to his head, attempting to force him to open the safe at the restaurant.

When he refused, they stabbed him

several times. He survived and recovered afterwards.

Hughes and another suspect, Alfredo Jackson Rivas, were arrested based off of witness accounts and

video surveillance.
In interviews with police, Rivas reportedly implicated Hughes as a suspect in the crime.

Rivas's case is still going through the court system.

Since Hughes and Rivas were arrested, Wolfy's closed its doors when the owner, Ed Levine, was arrested for tax fraud after owing over \$100,000 in unpaid taxes to the Internal Revenue Service.

Now in its place is a new events venue, 520 on the Water.

The depot, located at 212 West 1st Street, made Sanford the first Florida city to have an integrated rail system that went all around town in the late 1800s. It was historically used for shipping locallygrown celery nationwide.

Kelley, speaking with the Sanford Herald over the sound of construction at the building on Thursday, said they had switched gears after some delays once they saw how many other breweries were already popping up in Sanford's downtown area.

"There were already breweries here," he said. "But we thought this could be a good stopping point. You can come park, go downtown and enjoy the breweries, then come back here and eat."

He said his focus was on creating an environment for families and everyone to come enjoy. "It will be family-friendly," he said. "We want to draw people from Lake Mary, DeLand, Deltona, DeBary. It will be a venue for everyone."

Kelley didn't have a set opening date for Henry's Depot on Thursday, but he said there were three eateries already with leases signed, ready to move in as soon as they could.

The eateries he could name so far were Dixie Dharma, a vegan restaurant, wood-fired pizza joint Grain & Ember and sandwich shop Salvatore's.

Though, he added that there were others still in talks.

He said he wanted to "move along quick" and praised Sanford's "historic charm."

"There are a lot of great places to eat," he said. "The river front is awesome. My family and I moved here from Winter Park, and I think it's just like this hidden secret that's starting to get out. A lot more people are realizing that there's something special here."

avoiding the death penalty, which had been on the table since his arrest in 2017.

The deal, according to the State Attorney's Office, was the best they could hope for, as it would help avoid a painful trial for the surviving victims, particularly slain victim Latina Herring's surviving young son.

Although, the press release issued Wednesday also concedes that nothing would erase Cashe's

"While no amount of incarcera-

tion can account for the senseless and brutal actions of the defendant, it is our sincere desire that Allen Cashe, spending the rest of his natural life in prison, will provide some closure and deliver justice on behalf of the Herring family, and all of the surviving victims," the release reads.

On March 28, 2017, police were called to the scene at 209 Hays Drive to find Herring dead by gunshot wound and the others in the house, including her two sons and her father, injured by gunshot.

There were also two pedestrians in the vicinity, including one waiting for a bus and another taking a walk, that Cashe shot on his way to escape, though they survived.

One of Herring's sons, Branden

Christian, who was eight, passed away due to his injuries the following day.

Earlier that night, police had interacted with Herring and Cashe as they were in a loud argument over some items like a key to Herring's residence that she wanted Cashe to give back to her. But no action was taken and the two split up without violence at that time.

Hours later, Cashe would return to Herring's residence with an AK-47 and begin shooting.

The only words he spoke at Wednesday's hearing were to ask about the possibility of parole eventually, which was met with scornful laughter from the victims' family members in the crowd.

Jeff Dowdy, the public defender

who represented Cashe, said that the situation was a "tragedy for all involved," but that he was glad they had been able to conclude the matter with some closure on Wednesday.

He noted that Herring's family members, who were present and vocal at Wednesday's hearing, were "not pleased" with the result, and called that unfortunate.

Herring's sister Bertrice Herring delivered an impassioned rebuke through tears at the hearing, of the decision to allow Cashe to live.

"We lost a sister, most importantly a mother," Bertrice said of Latina. "She loved her family, especially her kids. Her kids are left in this world, motherless. Her sister, sisterless. Her father, daughterless."

She also devoted some time to Bertis Herring, their father, who Cashe also shot on his rampage that night.

"He is broken," she said.

"Almost like he is lifeless, like he has no purpose in this world. The good thing is, you thought you took him out, but God said 'not yet."

Mostly, Bertrice marveled at the tragic senselessness of it all.

"What was the reason for all of this - my nephew, my sister, and then my dad," she said. "When it was all said and done, did you get what you wanted? All of this over a set of keys? Now look at the situation - we are left without our beloved Latina. You are left without

And he spent his life traveling the country and the world opening similar churches else-

At home, he was an icon, having graduated from Crooms High School, gone off to college and then returned to Seminole County to teach, eventually becoming an Assistant Principal. He played football in college and would later coach various sports when he returned as a teacher.

In 1995, he went on to open his own school, the New Life Christian Academy, which aimed to help wayward boys.

He would go on to lead movements in Sanford, such as marches after the shooting of Trayvon Martin, and according to those who knew him, was a leader in general for Sanford.

Frances Oliver, curator of the Goldsboro Museum, didn't know him from church - they

went to different churches - or from school, as she was never a student of his. But she said she knew him as a friend.

"He was a friend to the people of Goldsboro," she said, noting that he had remained so even as he toured the country and the rest of the world. "He organized marches, he had a lot of events at the church. He worked with financial organizations, with political organizations. He knew the people on the corner. He knew the pastors and the movers and shakers in the community, and he was one of the movers and shakers. He wasn't just a pastor."

Oliver said Merthie, who had been raised in Sanford most of his life and was called 'Smokey' by his friends, had been a man of principle.

"His goal was to serve God, man and country," she said. "His passing will be felt in the community. We won't be able to consult with him anymore. And he was more of a consulting pastor than the average. If a student was having a problem, their parents could call Pastor Merthie. And he would try to talk to

the administration of the school. He was on the parents' side."

Of particular note to Oliver was his work with the New Life Christian Academy, which she said was a unique and valuable service to the community's young boys.

"This was for children not making it in public school," she said. "These children needed extra help, a smaller classroom and the guidance of a male figure. So many in this community don't have that."

Kerry Wiggins, incoming commissioner for District 2, knew Merthie growing up in Sanford and called him "a gentleman who a lot of young guys respected."

Wiggins spoke of Merthie's devotion to the things he loved, namely his church and sports. On the church, Wiggins called Merthie a "spiritual father" who treated everyone like family, and on sports, he said Merthie had been devout in his support of those who wanted to play.

In addition to playing, he coached basketball later on.

"He was in love with the sport," Wiggins

said. "There are thousands of men and women whose lives he touched."

Though, Wiggins noted that Merthie him-

self loved to play, too.
"He didn't want to lose," Wiggins said. "He

was very competitive."

Above all, Wiggins characterized Merthie as a man who was always there to help when

"He was a pillar of the community," Wiggins said. "He wanted what was right for the community on the whole. There were so many young men who needed a chance for society to accept them back. He didn't give up

trying to help you."

According to New Life Word Church, serv-

ices for Merthie will begin this weekend. The wake will take place on Saturday, January 19 from the hours of 3:30 to 6 p.m. for the general public at New Life Word Center Church at 1311 South Oak Avenue in Sanford.

The celebration service will also take place at New Life Word Center Church on Tuesday, January 22 at 11 a.m., with a repass to be held directly after that at Calvary Temple of Praise.



Soap Box Derby family reaches 900 races attended

SANFORD — December 29, 2018 for the Ostrander family from Illinois will be a memorable one, possibly being the first racing family in the 81-year history of The All-American Soap Box Derby to take part in their 900th Soap Box Derby race.

Joshua Ostrander, 15, and Mark Ostrander, 23, both of Rantoul, along with their parents Mike and Diana Ostrander celebrated the moment before the Saturday morning race with their fellow racers that came to Sanford Derby Park for the Holiday Rally race weekend from as far away as Colorado, Ohio and West Virginia. In all, racers from 10 states took part in the 4-race weekend. Joshua placed first in both Super Stock races on Saturday races, and placed 5th and 6th in the Sunday races.

The first race the Ostrander race team participated in was June 7, 2003, when Mark, then 8-years-old, won the Rantoul Soap Box Derby local in the Stock Division and raced that year in Akron, Ohio for the 2003 All- American Soap Box Derby World Championship.

Mark retired from racing in 2013, with 395 races entered, 118 career wins, a twotime overall National Points Champion and a four-time All-American Soap box Derby World finalist (at the time, only the third racer in the 75-year history of derby to be a four-time finalist).

Joshua began racing in 2011 and has currently participated in 507 races, has 145 wins and is the first ever back-to-back Rally Masters division National Points Champion (2016-2017), is the inaugural winner of the Local Masters Subway Challenge (2015) and is a top-three World Finalist (2017). Between them, Mark and

Joshua hold 10 AASBD awards or titles. Joshua is the currently the 2019 Super Stock division and overall National Points leader.

Other racers that raced with team Ostrander include Matthew Lord, of Rantoul (1 race), Megan Swanson, of Paxton (4 races), Alesha Cornett, of Paxton (12), Justin Bender, of Wauconda (12), and Vianca and Cole Irvin, of Paxton (29 Races), for a combined to of 960 races. By the end of the 2019 race season in July, Team Ostrander may reach their 1000th Soap Box Derby race.

The City of Sanford Recreation Services Ďepartment and Central Florida Soap Box Derby will be hosting the 2-day February Rally on Saturday and Sunday, February 2-3, at Mike Kirby Derby Park. Saturday will also feature the official re-dedication of the park at 1 p.m. in honor of recently retired Sanford Parks and Recreation Director Mike Kirby _ who is the father of Soap Box Derby racing in Sanford.

The final day to register is Wednesday, January 30, at 5:30 p.m.

Knights improve to 15-2 overall and 4-0 in AAC, will host SMU today

ORLANDO (UCFKnights.com) — A dominant defensive effort led the UCF women's basketball team to a 60-44 victory over Tulsa in CFE Arena on Wednesday evening.

UCF (15-2, 4-0 The American) limited Tulsa (9-8, 3-1 The American) to just 25 percent shooting from the floor for the game and held them without a field goal in the second quarter.

WICHITA, Kan. (UCFKnights.com) The UCF men's basketball team had its seven-game win streak snapped Wednesday, falling on the road at Wichita State by a score of 75-67. The Knights dropped its first game in American Athletic Conference play and fell to 13-3 overall with the defeat.

"Give them credit," UCF head coach Johnny Dawkins said. "They played inspired. They played really good basketball. They set the tone early and their play off of the energy was terrific."

UCF (13-3, 3-1) shot just 34.6 percent from the field in the first half and fell behind early against the Shockers. Wichita State (8-8, 1-3) shot nearly 50 percent in the first frame and held a 33-25 lead at the break.

"We hang our hat on the defensive end and I'm really disappointed with our defensive effort," Dawkins said. "Give them credit for running good action, but we have to be better defensively. That's not who we've been. It's very disappointing."

Things didn't change early in the

Wichita State shot 51.9 percent for the game, while UCF was connected on just 42.3 percent. The Shockers were a nearperfect 17-of-18 from the free throw line. The Shockers also outrebounded the Knights 35-22 for the game.

Dawkins led UCF with 22 points,

Knights Land Former Five-Star Recruit Yuat Alok

A former five-star recruit and number one junior college prospect in the nation is set to join the UCF men's basketball program immediately. Yuat Alok, a 6-foot-11 center out of Auckland, New Zealand, has signed to be a Knights, head coach Johnny Dawkins announced on Thursday.

"We're excited to bring in a player of Yuat's caliber," Dawkins said. "He brings plenty of six and skill, and will be a welcome addition to our front

court. We can't wait to get him integrated into our UCF family."

Alok comes to UCF from TCU, where he played in 10 games this season before injuring his hand, that likely would have sidelined him the entire 2018-19 season. With the Horned Frogs, he averaged 3.3 points and 2.5 rebounds in 13.1 minutes per game.

Born in Kenya, before moving to New Zealand at a young age, Alok came to the United States at the age of 17 and played at Impact Academy in Sarasota as a senior in high school. He was a five-star prospect by Rivals in 2016 and competed for the U19 New Zealand National Team.

Alok then spent two seasons at Chipola Community College and was the number one junior college prospect in the nation, as rated by JUCORecruiting.com. He averaged 12.3 points and 7.0 rebounds per game, shooting 55.1 percent from the field and 81.6 percent from the free throw line en route to All-Panhandle Conference honors.

Earlier this season, the Knights signed Darin Green Jr. out of Wharton in Tampa during the early signing period. UCF also has South Carolina transfer Ibrahim Famouke Doumbia sitting out this season and will be eligible for the 2019-20 season.







Opening lead — eight of spades.

The defenders usually have more to think about than declarer because, unlike declarer, they can't see each other's hands. Declarer, however, with his partner's hand in plain view, is in a much better position to formulate what needs to be done to secure the contract.

Take this case where West led a spade against three notrump following the auction shown. East won with the king after declarer played low from dummy and mulled over what

to do next. He then correctly decided there was no future in a spade continuation and shifted to a low club, sounding the death knell for declarer's chances.

South played low, West winning with the eight and returning a low club to East's king. There was no recovery for South, whatever he did, and he eventually lost three clubs, a diamond and a spade to go down

East unquestionably earned his success by abandoning spades and shifting to a club at trick two. But actually, he should never have had the opportunity to beat the contract. South erred grievously when he played low from dummy on the spade lead at trick one. He was asking for trouble, and he got it!

The bidding and opening lead had clearly marked East with the king of spades. It was therefore unnecessary to protect the queen by playing low from dummy.

There was far more pressing business to be taken care of. Dummy's diamonds were screaming for attention, and this had to be done before declarer's weak spot in clubs could be exploited. South should therefore have gone up with the ace of spades at trick one and attacked diamonds at trick two, which would have assured him of finishing with at least nine tricks.


