On August 5, 1984, around 7 a.m., the body of 25-year-old Navy recruit Pamela Cahanes was found in the side yard of a house on West 1st Street in Seminole County, and the case went cold for decades.

That was the case until this week, as Seminole County Sheriff's Office detectives, working with the Florida Department of Law Enforcement and the Naval Criminal Investigative Service, arrested 59-year-old Thomas Lewis Garner, a former Navy class-

For example:







# Local Mom creates Plant-Based Cookbook

Local mom and self-employed entrepreneur, Jayna Swan of Longwood, has set out to make her mark in the culinary world with her Plant Based Cookbook.

Much of her experience in the kitchen has come from watching, what she refereed to as, intense cooking and baking shows with Gordon Ramsy, YouTube "University" and a bit of trial and error. Although she has never worked directly in the culinary industry aside from serving in restaurants, she cited that she is "just a regular girl who enjoys cooking both delicious and highly nutritious foods for loved ones."

Growing up in Sanford and attending Seminole High School and Seminole State College, Swan has a vision of helping young women in many areas of their lives such as nutrition, fitness, relationship health, managing and building a healthy home, starting a sustainable small business, finances and early investing, beauty and self-love, as well as creating strong women of integrity and self discipline. " In my experience, these are all the ingredients to creating a well-rounded woman, none of which were discussed in school," said Swan.

She further elaborated, "The truth is, my cookbook is only the first ingredient in my larger recipe to positively impact the world at large," she said. "Five years ago, at one of my lowest points, I created a clear vision for what is now known as The Swan Academy, LLC. The mission of this organization is to Educate, Elevate and Empower women from across the world to expand their abilities in all areas of life. The reason my Plant-based Cookbook is my first ingredient is that I firmly believe everything starts in the gut. Our thoughts and actions are a result of what we are feeding ourselves and our children. So my first plan of action is to help inspire people to eat more whole plant-based foods, then they will start feeling better, thinking clearer, moving more and build more selflove and confidence in time."

The creation of the cookbook, according to Swan, has come with many unforeseen rewards, such a strong sense of fulfillment, as she considers the many lives this one book has the power to impact."Food is something we all deal with every single day," she said. "Many of us have gone all our lives with a damaged relationship to food. I'd love to help people see food as the fuel for our lives that it is. Uncovering the truth behind what's in their food and empowering them with knowledge and skills to take back control. I have learned so far, creating the recipes and cooking the foods are the easiest parts. Laying out the composition of the scenes, as well as styling the foods to look eye-catching and stimulate hunger through the lens of the camera is a whole different ballgame."

As most people, it is the childhood memo-

that stirs a contentment in this endeavor of love. I have had so many memorable experiences with my mother in the kitchen growing up," she shared. "Although, this past Thanksgiving with my grandmother was an extra special one for me. In May of 2018 my grandmother had a stroke and major bleeding in her brain. She spent many days in the ICU, then a few weeks in a rehab center. I was there for some of the worst times and it was so hard to watch her struggle with some of the simplest things. It had been about 5 months since I had the opportunity to travel to see her. I remember being amazed by the progress she had made in walking and talking on her own. I was in awe while she was working that kitchen as if she had never even skipped a beat. I ended up pulling out my camera and documented her making her special Sweet Potato Casserole, then turned it into a short film. That is an experience I will never forget."

Swan also shared one of the featured recipes in her cookbook, her favorite Protein Pancake recipe. Heat skillet to med/high heat, coat with coconut oil. Mix 4 egg whites, 1 scoop of protein powder (I like Vega Sport - Chocolate), 1/2 tsp baking powder, 1/2 tsp salt and a sprinkle of cinnamon in a bowl with a whisk until smooth. Pour batter onto hot pan. You can use silicone molds to create thicker pancakes (as shown). Let sit until small bubbles rise in the center of the pancake, then flip. Allow the second side some time to cook. using a spatula move the pancakes to a plate. Top with a tbsp of nut butter, fresh banana, crushed walnuts and a drizzle of honey. Optional: Add a few dark chocolate chips. You can always get creative and substitute the banana for blueberries, raspberries or strawberries.

Hired shortly before the school year began, geometry teacher Zhenzhen Zhang did not have enough time to apply to teach a Chinese course for the school year. This fall, she's fixing

Mandarin Chinese will join Spanish, French, German and American Sign Language to become the fifth world language program offered on campus.

After moving from Hengshui, China to Florida in 2010, and becoming a math teacher at Freedom High School in 2015, many of her students were drawn to the numerous Chinese objects that decorated her room. This year, one can find a calligraphy set, a wooden box handmade by her father and several pieces of paper currency, all depicting Mao Zedong.

"I felt like I could be the key to show people the culture of China or the language," Zhang

The new class has already drawn student interest, including the Asian-American population on campus, which represents 6.69 percent of the student body.

"Everybody thinks Chinese is hard to learn," Zhang said. "It's just different."

not need all the space of a regular home anymore.

The whole idea of tiny homes is affordable," Kim said. "A lot of people typically don't have the option to buy. People are just starting out, or they have debt. Or, for elderly people, it's smaller, it's less responsibility."

The resolution, passed early in March by the Longwood City Commission, would allow communities of tiny homes to be built in the city limits. It would only allow tiny homes that are not on wheels.

A tiny home is defined as a home ranging from 200 to 900 square feet.

Longwood Commissioner Abby Shoemaker, who proposed the ordinance in the first place, was happy that it passed.

"I am elated that I and my fellow commissioners unanimously approved allowing tiny home communities in the City of Longwood," she wrote in an email. "This is a progressive move and will also address the need for affordable NEW housing in our community. New home prices are unaffordable for some. Smaller homes, prices, electric bills, repairs, footprints, and smaller everything will enable some to experience home ownership in our great City that otherwise may not."

Cornerstone has existed for four

years and started when Brett was working as a licensed contractor and saw a tiny home while on the job. The concept interested him enough that he and Kim began looking into making them themselves as a side hobby.

When they were able to sell it, Brett and Kim decided to go into the business full time.

Now, they have a full warehouse on Timocuan Way, where a team of builders construct tiny homes that can be seen in various stages of completion as one walks through the work space.

The Hiltbrands were able to open up shop in Longwood because of the city's zoning laws. The City of Longwood has no minimum dwelling unit size requirements, and

so they were able to sell tiny homes, Kim said, even if only relegated to accessory dwellings for larger

The problem was that, for most customers, the cost to build the house and buy a larger lot wasn't worth it at the time.

"If you can build a \$400,000 house, you could justify a \$50,000 lot," Brett said. "You can't do that with this size."

He said they wanted to keep the prices for new tiny home communities low if possible, though they did not know exactly what the final price they'd be able to offer would

Brett said a use for such a community in Longwood could be a boon for those who were never able to afford to live in Seminole County even though they worked there.

"Seminole County is an expensive place to live," he said. "With a tiny home community, more teachers and first responders can live in the same area they work. I know a guy who works for the Seminole County Fire Department. He has to travel

from Volusia County to get here." They already have tenants signing up for the eventual area they square off as their own. Now, they need development partners, and land to call their own and start building on. Kim said she hopes it won't be much longer.

'It's our mission," she said. "And our passion," Brett chimed

mate of Cahanes', for the murder.

The arrest was the culmination of 34 years of investigating, particularly by SCSO investigators Jennifer Spears and Bob Jaynes. Jaynes, now retired, was one of the initial detectives on the case back in 1984, and said he never stopped thinking of solving it.

And Spears, at the time of Thursday's press conference, was out of state with Cahanes' remaining family members, having formed camaraderie with them as she investigated.

Garner, since he allegedly killed Cahanes, was living in Jacksonville and working as a dental hygeinist. Sheriff Dennis Lemma said he had apparently been living a totally normal

But in 1984, he allegedly committed an act that was anything but normal, Lemma said at the press conference Thursday.

Pamela Cahanes was born on Aug. 25, 1958 in Stillwater, Minnesota, one of eight siblings. She decided to enlist in the U.S. Navy, and was sent to Orlando to complete basic train-

In early August of 1984, she had just finished basic training. Investigators combed over the events of her last day alive for years.

Between 11 a.m. and 3 p.m. on Aug. 4, she was at the Fashion Square Mall in Orlando.

Then, at 3:18 p.m., she was seen at a local K-Mart near the mall. At 6 p.m., she was seen walking in front of

the training center for the Navy. From 6 p.m. to 8 p.m., she was seen socializing at a local club frequented by Navy personnel, celebrating her recent completion of

Then, a little after 8 p.m., she had been at the ABC Lounge in Sanford. And a Chinese food takeout receipt had been found on her person later on, dated around 1 a.m. on Aug.

But for 35 years, no one knew what had happened to her after that and before her

body was found the next morning. Though attempts were made over the years to trace the DNA found on the body, the technology was too primitive in the 80s, the 90s and even

Now, through the use of genetic genealogy research, DNA was traced to Garner's family and narrowed down to him through an inves-

Investigators went to his residence in Jacksonville, where he lived by himself in an apparently unassuming lifestyle, to arrest him. Lemma told reporters that Garner's reaction to being told he was under arrest for murder had been unusual if he'd been innocent.

"He did not have a normal reaction," Lemma said. "Most people would have been surprised. He began to say some spontaneous things about how he would never be involved with a recruit. It was not the normal behavior of an innocent person."

Lemma said that by all indications, Garner had lived an ordinary life since 1984: he had no criminal record, save for one arrest for battery while he was in the military, and he lived

alone and worked as a dental hygeinist, acting apparently as any normal citizen would.

That just made the alleged crime all the more chilling to investigators.

"It's extremely bizarre to think that he could do something like this and then go on to live a normal life," Lemma said.

Lemma said Jaynes and Spears had kept a picture of Cahanes on their desks and had looked at it every day as they came into work.

Jaynes was modest at the hearing, only offering words on the solving of the case when prompted by reporters.

"I wanted to provide closure to the family," he said. "Every family deserves it. And I hated to have an unsolved case. I wanted to know what happened. We had the DNA. There had

Lemma also revealed that they would be working with several retired detectives, who wanted to volunteer their services to help solve other cold cases in the near future, saying that SCSO had sharpened its priorities on solving cold cases.

Then, she reportedly went into the auditorium building and used a gun she had brought with her to school that day to shoot herself. She passed away from her

"It appears she went out of her way to do it in an area where nobody else was at," Lemma told reporters Wednesday morning.

Lemma said on Thursday that they were still investigating the possible causes for the suicide as well as how she had gotten a hold of the gun.

In a statement, Seminole County Public Schools said all classes at Lake Mary High School would be canceled on Thursday, March 14, and that grief counselors would be available at the school's Media Center from 7 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. Thursday, as well as from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m. Friday.

All Lake Mary High School extracurricular activities were canceled on Wednesday and Thursday, as well.

SCPS said their hearts were "deeply saddened" by the events of Wednesday morning. They also wanted to remind students and families that the anonymous Speak Out Hotline was available at 800-423-TIPS or through the website at www.speakouthotline.org.

As far as Lemma knew, there were no students who had seen the aftermath of the suicide, and the girl had not intended to harm anyone else

at school. As he spoke, parents were also driving to school to pick up their children, and grief counselors were getting ready to work. Lemma stressed that there were no threats to stu-

dents at the school, though. Lemma said it was important to take the issue of mental health seriously.

The most important thing is to be involved, and know what resources are available for your children," he said. "I'm not saying that wasn't the case here. I have two boys. I want to be involved, I want to know what notes they're writing, I want them to know what resources they have. When I got the text this morning, my stomach sank, and I came right over. I did that not as the Sheriff, but as the father of two boys."

Lemma said they would be increasing their presence at the school over the next few days, not just for security but also to make sure everyone was taken care of mentally and physically.

He said the situation on Wednesday should be a wake-up call for everyone on the realities and perils of mental health.

"We have to talk about this," he said. "We cannot turn a blind eye to mental health. A person you know may be grieving. We have to do what we can to prevent this from ever happening again."

Asked on Thursday about what changes would have to be made at Lake Mary High, particularly as a gun brought into the school easily could have turned into a mass

shooting scenario, Lemma was staunch in his opposition to increasingly militarized security such as metal detectors at the doors of the school.

"You'd have 1,000 people dropped off at any one moment," he said. "It's as likely to happen there as it is at a shopping mall. I don't want my kids to be dropped off at the line for a metal detector at school - an attacker could easily just come from behind them in line, or have been hiding in the school. There are a lot of ways around that."

Instead, he maintained that SCPS's security policy, including having dedicated officers at every school, was good enough as it was and he wanted to focus on healing the community.

He also said he hoped the conversation didn't turn "political," meaning that he didn't want the focus to be on the gun so much as the mental health issues at play.

"I hope it doesn't turn into

being about the gun," he said. "This is about mental health. If someone wanted to hurt themselves, they can do it with other things. I've seen people commit suicide with a lot of things, from a weapon to a noose. I hope people talk about mental health, rather than the instrument used to do this."

He said the girl had been Baker Acted in December of last year. To Lemma, that said it was important for people to look for signs in their loved ones that they're about to harm themselves or others.

"If you're Baker Acted and then released, some people are under the impression that you're 'good,'" he said. "But if it was just in the last year, you're probably not 'good' vet. There was no way to tell what she was thinking. It starts with a simple thought. Sometimes we think all kinds of things we never act on. But we have to pay attention to behavioral differences."

All told, 13 of the 26 locals that qualified for State finished in the Top 5 led by Ĥagerty's Ryan Rowland, who won the first ever State Championship for the school at 106-pounds in Class 3A, and Seminole's Curtis Ruff, who topped the Class 3A field at 285-pounds.

comer Kaitlin Ritenour.







# Hardwood Knights honored by The American

# Three UCF men, two women earn AAC recognition

ORLANDO (UCFKnights.com) — The UCF men's basketball completed one its best regular seasons in program history over the weekend, and on Monday three members of the team were honored by the American Athletic Conference with All-Conference accolades.

BJ Taylor, Aubrey Dawkins and Tacko Fall all earned postseason all-conference honors from The American, as voted on by the league's coaches. It marked the first time that UCF garnered multiple allconference accolades from The American and the first time in the program's D1 history that the team had three all-conference honorees in a single-season.

The Knights were the only team in the league to register three players on this year's postseason all-conference teams.

Taylor was one of five players in the league to earn First Team All-Conference honors after leading the Knights in scoring for the fourth time in his career. He's the first-ever UCF player to be named First Team All-Conference by The American and the first Knight in any conference since Isaiah Sykes in Conference USA back in 2012-13.

The Orlando native led UCF with 16.2 points per game and ranked in the Top-11 in the conference in points, assists, free throw percentage, assist-toturnover ratio and minutes played. His 172 free throws set a new UCF singleseason record and ranks 18th nationally.

Dawkins earned Second Team All-Conference honors after helping lead the Knights to a 23-7 record on the season, the program's most regular season wins in its D1 history. In his first year on the court for UCF Dawkins averaged 15.4 points and 5.1 rebounds per game, while shooting 39 percent from three-point range.

Fall rounded out the Knights' honors, earning a Third Team All-Conference selection. It marks Fall's second careerhonor from the league, having been

named the Defensive Player of the Year in 2017. The UCF center averaged 10.9 points and 7.2 rebounds per game, while leading the league with 2.43 blocked shots per game and a 75.1 field goal percentage.

Taylor, Dawkins, Fall and the Knights continued their season on Friday taking on host Memphis in the Quarterfinals of the 2019 Air Force Reserve American Athletic Conference Men's Basketball Championship.

Kay Kay Wright was named to The American All-Conference First Team and Kayla Thigpen

was tabbed as the Sixth Player of the Year. "I'm very proud that the hard work Kay Kay and Kayla have put in this year was recognized by the coaches in the league," UCF head coach Katie Abrahamson-Henderson said. Wright, who is just the second Knight to

earn first team honors, improved her allaround game, stepping up her scoring while maintaining her high level of defensive intensity and distribution of the ball during her junior campaign. In 16 league games, she reached double figures 13 times, with nine of those being 20-point performances.

As a freshman, Wright averaged 4.8 points and 3.1 rebounds per game. As a sophomore, she doubled her scoring, averaging 10.8 points and 3.2 rebounds per contest. She has improved those marks again as a junior, averaging 18.3 points and 4.1 rebounds per game. Entering this season, she had registered one 20-point contest in her first two seasons combined. In 29 regular season games, she accomplished the feat 14 times, including six of the last eight contests.

"Kay Kay knew that she would have to take on more of a scoring role this season," Coach "ABE" said. "She worked extremely hard over the last two summers and it has shown every time she has stepped on the floor."

The Orlando native finished league play ranked in the top 10 in five different statistical categories. She was second among conference players in steals (2.5) and free throw percentage (84.3), third in minutes played (35.4), fourth in scoring (17.7) and eighth in assists (3.8). Less than a month before conference play began, she tied the conference single game record for free throws, sinking 16 in UCF's Dec. 17 win over Pacific.

Thigpen became the first Knight to collect an individual award in The American, coming off the bench to earn the Sixth Player of the Year honor.

"Kayla has flourished back in her natural position," Coach "ABE" said. "She has been so unselfish, doing what she needed to help our team win."

The West Palm Beach native accounted for nearly 41 percent of UCF's bench points in the 12 games that she saw action as a reserve. Thigpen opened league play coming off the bench to score a career-high 20

points at Memphis. She followed with eight more double-figure outings in conference action, finishing as UCF's secondleading scorer with 10.2 points per game. She ranked among the top 25 conference players in field goal percentage (42.5), free throw percentage (68.5) and scoring (10.2).

UCF (26-6) posted its best finish in The American for the third straight season, earning the No. 2 spot and finishing in the same spot at last weekend's tournament.

The Knights not only tallied their most wins in league play (13-3), they posted the most conference victories since the 2004-05 Atlantic Sun squad that went 16-4.

The Knights, who have put themselves in a strong position to earn the program's first at-large bid, will now await to learn their postseason fate. The NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Championship bracket will be revealed at 7 p.m. on Monday on ESPN.

It is well-known that more contracts are won or lost on the opening lead than at any other stage of the play. Of course, some players are more gifted than others in choosing the opening lead, but the fact is that the batting average of almost every player suffers severely when the effectiveness of his opening leads is compared with the rest of his game.

As an illustration, take this deal played in a rubber-bridge game. It was reported to us by West, who was upset by the result.

After three passes, South opened the bidding with five diamonds. West was tempted to double but chose the more conservative course of passing. He then had no clear-cut opening lead and, after much thought, selected his fourth-best club.

This was not very successful, because declarer won East's king with the ace, played the ace and another heart, ruffing in dummy, and discarded his last heart on the ace of spades. South then led a diamond and lost two trump tricks to make exactly five diamonds.

Disturbed by the outcome, West later polled 10 top experts to see what they would have led against five diamonds.

As usual, where an opening lead is involved, there was a lack of unanimity among the experts. Seven of them agreed with West's opening lead of a club. Two favored a low heart lead and one said he would lead a low spade.

Remarkably, they all struck out! Not one found the only way to defeat the contract, which was to lead the ace of diamonds and continue with the queen! Against this defense South is helpless and, in fact, goes down

It just goes to show that even the experts can't achieve perfection when it comes to opening leads.

They said it would be bringing over 70 new jobs to the area, and would account for \$285,000 annually in Tourist Development Tax revenue - a number they boasted was 4.7 percent of the total TDT in

the area. The hotel will bring more than 50,000 new visitors to Sanford

every year, they said. Robbins said their goal was to attract people who were looking for more unique, individual hotel experiences away from the bigger

tourist attractions in the area. "We're not taking people from the Marriott," he said.

The hotel will have 130 rooms alongside a ballroom, meeting spaces and other amenities. And Robbins and Antonik want to make sure to incorporate events year-round for everything from

Oktoberfest to 4th of July, along with outside lawn events like jazz

And the proximity to the RiverWalk offered opportunities for collaborations on water events or marathons down the line, they

For transportation downtown, they'll have golf carts available to ferry people to and from the main part of downtown, which they admitted was a bit of a walk.

Robbins also said they were looking at getting the hotel on the

National Register of Historic Places, which he said would be significant because of a lack of other historic hotels in the immediate surrounding area.

"The nearest historic hotels are in Lakeland and St. Augustine," he

The hotel opened in 1925 as the Hotel Forrest Lake, named after the Sanford mayor at the time. However, due to Lake's bank fraud scandal, he stepped down in

1928 and the hotel was vacated. In 1935, W. Kirchhoff Jr. opened

it again as the Hotel Mayfair. Throughout that era, the hotel was known as a premiere destination in the area. In 1947, it was sold to the New York Giants, and then in the 1960s it was used as the Sanford Naval Academy.

Then from 1977 to 2017, it was used as the headquarters of New Tribes Mission, until it was purchased by affiliates of Key Performance Hospitality Management with an eye towards turning it back into a hotel.

Three years ago I started thinking about getting a dog. Seeing neighbors out with their small dogs, I knew I wanted what I consider a real dog, a big one, not a dog that would fit in my purse. I made a pro-con dog ownership

ering adopting a dog. Where I live there are a lot of rules, and one of them concerns the size of dogs. Specifically, the dog cannot top 25 pounds. and toys. I've found a partial solution, however. I'm thinking of signing up as a dog walker volunteer at the shelter. Maybe I'll fall in love with a






