It was all part of what has been termed the MANicure Movement, which is put on by Embrace Families Foundation as a way to draw attention to the crisis locally.

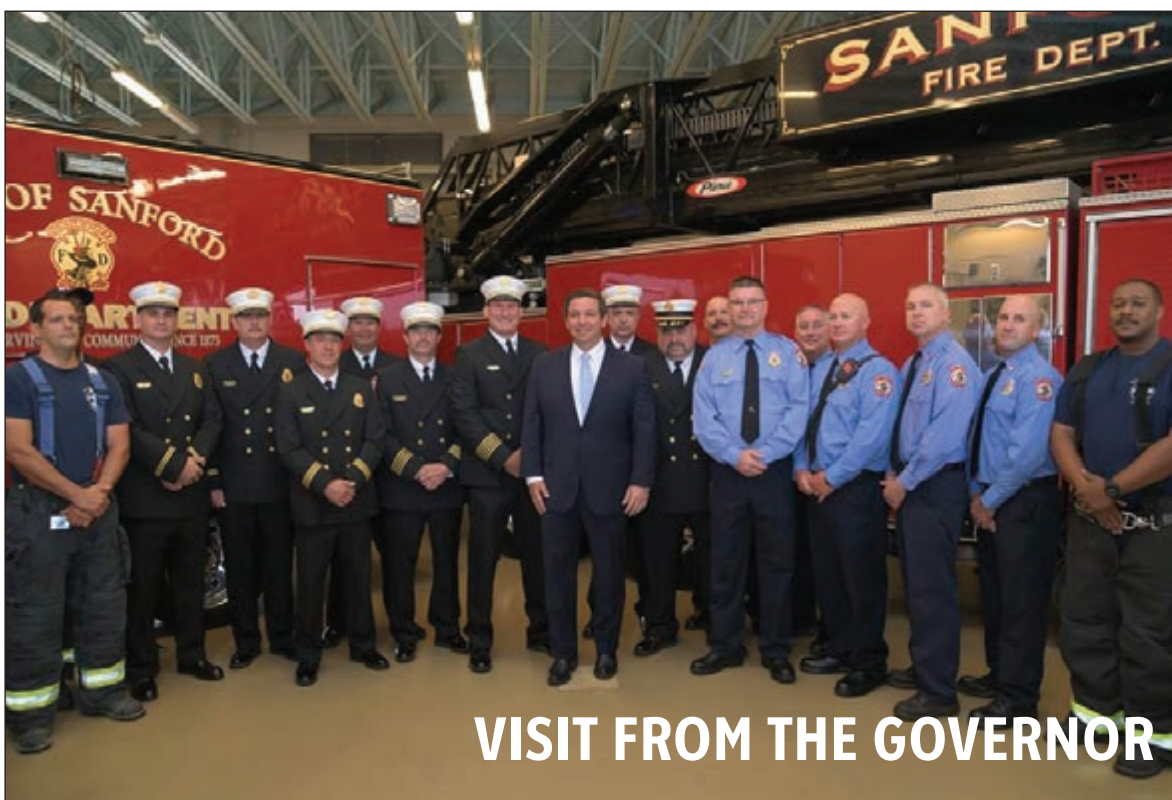
According to statistics presented by Embrace Families officials Michael Bryant and

Enjoy a new outdoor activity this spring on license-free freshwater fishing days

What better way to celebrate the state's great spring weather and ample outdoor opportunities than by casting a line into a freshwater lake or pond? This weekend, April 6 and 7, a freshwater fishing license isn't required to enjoy the sport.

License-free freshwater fishing days allow anglers to fish for freshwater species without being required to have a recreational fishing license. All bag limits and size restrictions apply.

"Maybe you've never fished before or it's been a few years," said Jon Fury, director of the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission's (FWC) Division of Freshwater Fisheries

COUCH THEATER -- VIDEO/DVD PREVIEWS

"The Mule" (R) -- Clint Eastwood returns to both the director's chair and the spotlight as Earl Stone, an octogenarian drug mule for a Midwestern drug cartel. The film is loosely based on the Sam Dolnick/New York Times article about a man named Leo Sharp, who was, like Eastwood's character, a war veteran at the end of a long life who hit hard times and turned in desperation to running drugs. Stone is an old, superficially affable white man who drives the speed limit and looks like an upstanding citizen. He's also facing foreclosure and the collapse of his business, and is surrounded by strained personal relationships. As his payloads grow, so does interest from cartel members and the DEA. The all-star cast includes Bradley Cooper, Andy Garcia, Michael Pena and Diane Weist.

"Vice" (R) -- Vice President Dick Cheney is in the crosshairs in this dark comedy-drama by director Adam McKay. It chronicles Cheney's rise in politics through the Nixon, Ford and Bush I administrations and Congress,

culminating as second in command to young George W. The political jabs at Cheney are real (and often deserved), but the real gold here is in the physical transformations. The hair and makeup department put in Oscar-level overtime turning Steve Carell into Donald Rumsfeld, Sam Rockwell into George W., and Amy Adams into Lynne Cheney. Christian Bale is incredible as Dick Cheney. For that alone, it's worth a rental. The story walks a strange line between real facts and surrealism that's sometimes too real to be funny. Ain't that politics, though?

"Bumblebee" (PG-13) -- In a California beach town circa 1987, a young, rebellious Charlie (Hailee Steinfeld) stumbles upon a cute but beat-up yellow VW bug in a junkyard. It's not just a car, though -- it's a transforming anthropomorphic vehicle that's just as cute as a ... bumblebee. This is the sixth live-action Transformers movie, but it's more of an origin story/prequel. It's also sweet and endearing tale of friendship, even if between girl and robot. John Cena supports as a lieutenant in an off-the-books military project prob-

ing space, and Jorge Lendeborg Jr. plays Charlie's neighbor and friend Memo.

"Nancy Drew and the Hidden Staircase" (PG) -- Sixteen-year-old sleuth Nancy Drew (Sophia Lillis) takes a small town by storm as she acclimates to her surroundings and makes friends, including some seniors who put her onto the case of a supernatural disturbance at the Twin Elms mansion. Plucky Nancy enlists her squad to solve the riddle of creaking doors and flying candlesticks, but is there something deeper going on? There's no clue too small, nor turn of logic too tough for Nancy Drew and company. It was cute but the story didn't need a large screen, in my opinion. It's no mystery that DVD is just where this film needs to be. Light and friendly TV fun for the kiddos.

Deputies responded to a home in Altamonte Springs on Tuesday after a man reported his baby's mother had thrown a brick through his window.

Police located the woman later and while speaking with her a pastor approached them and said she did, indeed, throw the brick through his window. How did he know? The woman had live-streamed on Facebook earlier that day and the pastor was able to produce a video where the woman admits "to breaking the window out of her 'baby's daddy's house.'" The woman had also received a court order in late March not to make contact with the man after she battered him by scratching him and dumping powdered baby formula on him.

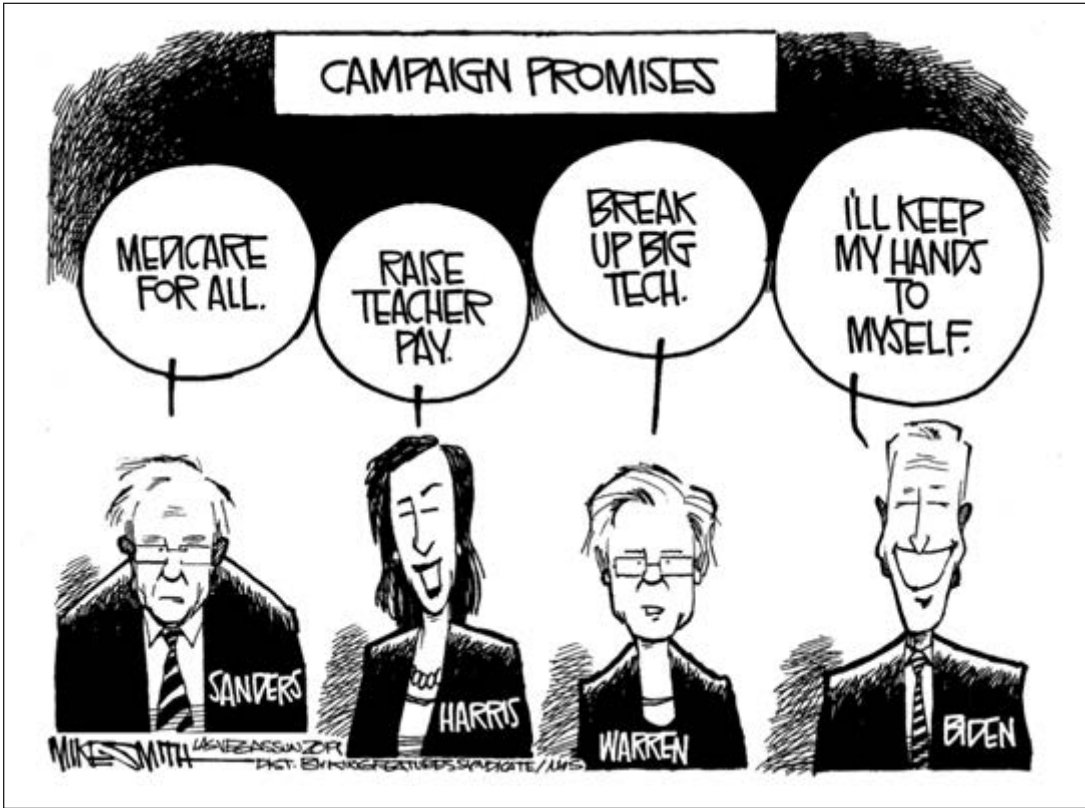

Please Reconsider, Mr. President

In 2017, speaking to a group of leaders from Central America, Vice President Mike Pence declared, "To further stem the flow of illegal immigration and illegal drugs into the United States, President Trump knows, as do all of you, that we must confront these problems at their source. We must meet them -- and we must solve them -- in Central and South America." What Pence said then was correct. What President Donald Trump is doing now -- cutting aid -- needs to be reconsidered.

Fifteen years ago, Colombia was on the verge of collapse. The nation was overrun with drug traffickers, cartels and local gangs. Crime and violence were rampant, and people were fleeing the nation. The United States deployed its foreign aid budget and military resources to help the Colombian government stabilize, fight its domestic drug war and beat the cartels. The nation went from the brink to being a stable leader in South America and a strategic ally of the United States. In the past decade, trade with Colombia has tripled to \$14 billion, benefiting American businesses.

Since 2016, American assistance to Guatemala, Honduras and El Salvador has declined 20%. Concurrent with that decline in

American assistance, those countries have seen an increase in domestic crime, corruption and flight of refugees headed toward the United States.

According to the U.S. Global Leadership Coalition, "in neighborhoods where USAID operates in El Salvador and Honduras, homicide rates have plummeted by up to 78%." Likewise, "for every 10 additional murders in Honduras, El Salvador, and Guatemala, 6 additional children sought safety in the United States."

Notably, the Trump administration itself claims El Salvador has used our aid to stem the tide of illegal immigrants headed to the border. The Washington Post's Kevin Sieff wrote last week about remarks made by U.S. Customs and Border Protection Commissioner Kevin McAleenan: "What (El Salvador is) doing is working, both on the security front and on the economic opportunity front." ... McAleenan, speaking last year at the Bipartisan Policy Center, described El Salvador as a model: "We want to achieve those same successes in Honduras and Guatemala as well."

The last time the United States worked in concert with Central American countries to fund internal projects related to fighting crime, corruption and abuse, those governments

committed 10 times as many resources and, with our dollars and direction, saw crime and population flight decrease. In 2017, we spent \$420 million in Guatemala, Honduras and El Salvador to help. Those countries combined spent \$5.4 billion of their own resources but let the U.S. take the lead in a partnership that benefited us all.

As former White House Chief of Staff and Southcom Gen. John Kelly has noted, "If we can improve the conditions, the lot in life of Hondurans, Guatemalans, Central Americans, we can do an awful lot to protect the southwest border."

I used to believe we should cut foreign aid from our budget. But I have realized we can spend far less in these countries helping stabilize situations than we could on the border wall, a project I support. If we just build a wall, we are going to see an increase in violence, drug trafficking and nation-state collapse. Those problems will eventually penetrate our

border with or without a wall. Right now, cutting off funding and having no wall will thoroughly destabilize the situation. On top of that, these countries are, in many cases, desperate. By ignoring them, we are seeding the ground for China to lay down roots in the Western Hemisphere as it and Russia have tried to do in places such as Venezuela.

We risk undermining our long-term national interests by cutting this foreign aid. We should, instead, spend it wisely in those countries to ensure stable governments that view us as allies and work with them to root out crime, corruption and cartels. The present policy to cut foreign aid cuts off our national nose to spite our face.

NOTICE OF FUNDING AVAILABILITY AND SOLICITATION OF PUBLIC SERVICES PROPOSALS CITY OF SANFORD ONE YEAR ACTION PLAN FOR FY 2019-2020

On October 1, 2019, the City of Sanford expects to receive funding from the U.S. Dept. of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for activities that benefit low and moderate income families or persons. Proposals are now solicited for projects to help meet the needs identified in the 2015-2019 Consolidated Plan.

In order to address these needs, federal funding in the amount of \$448,253 is anticipated for the 2019-2020 Program Year. Through an Interlocal agreement between the City of Sanford and Seminole County, projects will be administered by Seminole County. Interfaith Community promote Peace, Unity & Humanity

On Saturday, March 30, 2019 at Fort Mellon Park in Sanford, Florida a coalition of community groups and leaders congregated for a "Peace, Unity and Humanity" gathering to highlight the growing violence against religious, ethnic, minority and marginal groups domestically and internationally. Group spokesperson, Minaz Manekia stated, that "the first step to curb hostilities is for us as neighbors to know each other."

The group featured a cross section of leaders who represented various organizations in Central Florida, such as Dr. Joel Hunter past Pastor of The Northland Church, Imam Mujtaba Khaliq of the Husseini Islamic Center and Dr. Vibert White, Internal scholar and Human Rights Advocate. City Manager Norton Bonaparte of Sanford and Rev. Meghan Killingsworth summed up the event brilliantly. Bonaparte reminded the audience that it will take coalitions to destroy bigotry and hatred and that he is happy that his city is the springboard for this new movement. While, Pastor Killingsworth reflected that all us at some level are responsible for anti-human behavior; thus, we must be active in the destruction of this evil. One observer of the event remarked, "This is what we need. People to stand up to tell the truth against racism and bigotry."

The motivation of the gathering also was sparked by the recent New Zealand Massacre

on March 15, 2019; when a lone gunman shot and murdered Muslim worshippers in two mosques in Christchurch. James Coffin of the Interfaith Council of Central Florida who has traveled to New Zealand clearly stated that "violence and hate must stop. It is destroying our society and world." Other speakers who focused on the peaceful nature of Islam and on the evil of killing innocent people reflected as Imam Mujtaba Khaliq of the Husseini Islamic Center stated, "that when you kill one innocent person it is like killing all of humanity." While Dr. White said, "sadly we have choices—to continue down the road of bigotry and hatred or stop it immediately; that is, we must take responsibility of the actions of our neighbors and be proactive in eradicating evil: we must work."

Steven Beumer (Lutheran Church), Dr. Vibert White (Muhammad) Professor/Scholar, Gary Richard (Chaplain/Deputy Sheriff, Seminole County), James Mory (Pastor, First Longwood Church), Imam Mufti Mahad (American Muslim Community Centers), Meghan Killingsworth (Pastor, First United Methodist Church), Dr. Gobashi (Musalla Omar Farooq), Imam Mujtaba Khaliq (Husseini Islamic Center). a residence on Shire Court for a report of a burglary. There, they found that the victim had been robbed of several items: over ten pairs of sneakers, an XBOX 360, a PlayStation 4, a ring, a gold Cuban link necklace, an HP Stream Notebook, and a Remington shotgun, according to the press release.

Video surveillance was obtained of the two suspects walking through the neighborhood, and a witness reported seeing two males walking and carrying duffel bags and a shotgun.

The images were posted to social media. The next day, on April 4, one of the suspects' mothers called the Sanford Police Department and reported that her son was the one depicted on local news and had apparently participated in the robbery.

The parent then brought the suspect to the police station, and the investigation determined that Hope and Morales were the suspects, so the two were arrested.

They were each charged Armed Burglary of a Dwelling, one count of Grand Theft of a Firearm. Hope was also charged with Criminal Mischief and Grand Theft, the press release states.

Mary Mayor David Mealor and Orange City Mayor Gary Blair were in attendance, fielding questions from moderator Christina Hollerbach over breakfast, coffee and orange juice.

All of them had the same message: their cities are fast-growing, with new projects and interest coming all the time, and the challenge will be in going with the flow of that.

Triplett spoke about some familiar subjects like the RiverWalk Trail and the Heritage Park project, saying the former would help to connect Sanford to other towns and allow for greater mobility and that the latter would transform downtown.

And with downtown Sanford's assortment of night-life entertainment, Triplett said the challenge was that much of the traffic was now centered around I-4, far away from downtown for those not informed about Sanford.

"The issue is getting people downtown," he said. "We're putting in some roundabouts near the RiverWalk. When we were cutting the ribbon for that, an 18-wheeler sped by at 55 miles per hour. That is not a safe environment. We've moved all of that traffic onto State Road 46. But now how do we continue to move traffic from I-4 to downtown? A lot of downtowns die because traffic isn't seeing what they have."

On the SunRail, Triplett had a similar issue, as the station in Sanford is located on State Road 46, too far to easily access downtown or the Seminole Towne Center mall for the

uninitiated.

"We are cursed and blessed with the location of our station," he said. "We've started a trolley to try and move people, to get them to the mall and the river and downtown. The bad part is, when this was put together, there was not a lot of thought about smaller cities. We'll have to bite off a big bone if the legislature doesn't come up with something. We don't have the money to support it. You can't have \$30 million in costs annually and then have cities start picking up the bill."

That refers to the deal SunRail came with, which stated that it would transfer costs to local government eventually.

He also said he wanted to see more use for the SunRail going forward.

"It was originally created to get people from the cities and to work," he said. "But how do we pull people to us? We can't do it if the SunRail isn't running on the weekend, or if it's shutting down at 6 p.m."

But aside from those few issues, Triplett seemed happy about the state of Sanford. He praised those working at the city government like City Manager Norton Bonaparte and Communications Officer Lisa Holder. He said that his work with MetroPlan Orlando had helped him stay informed on transportation-related issues.

And he said the Mayor's Youth Council, made up of 12 young Sanford students learning about city government, inspired him as to the future of local leadership.

"We want these kids to fall in love with Sanford," he said. "We want them to go to college and come back and start their own businesses, or work for one of the businesses already here."

He said he valued their input

and ideas, too, when they made recommendations based on what they were learning.

"They're setting the stage for what's to come," he said. "What they think is totally different from what we're thinking."

The other mayors spoke about their own cities. Chazese said DeBary was undergoing a period of growth, with new housing coming along with more industrial and commercial space, including a solar farm.

Likewise, Blair said Orange City was also undergoing developments all the time and seeing a boom in visitors, increasing every year.

Mealor said Lake Mary had a formidable health corridor that was only improving all the time, and that they prided themselves on a commitment to public safety.

As to challenges, Mealor said one of their foremost ones was trying to un-clog traffic on Lake Mary Boulevard.

"We have to be able to move people," he said. "There's a lot of traffic."

One of the final audience questions to Triplett involved parking downtown, a concern due to the high amount of new construction set to go on over the next several years.

He said they were looking at "little dabs" of parking lots here and there throughout the city where there was vacant space, and they were also looking to eventually have a bid out to build an entire garage.

"We'll need 150 parking spots," he said, referring to the lot at the corner of 1st Street and Palmetto Avenue that will eventually be part of the Heritage Park development. "But fortunately, that property on the lot will be the last property developed. We've got time."

Most finesses are directed at missing kings or queens. Finesses against jacks or tens occasionally occur, and finesses against nines or eights are extremely rare.

Today's deal features an unusually deep finesse. Declarer was in four spades, and West started with the K-A and another heart. East had played high-low in hearts, so South knew from both the bidding and the

play that East had no more hearts. Declarer's most pressing problem was to decide which of dummy's cards to ruff with in order to avoid a trump loser either immediately or eventually.

As happens so often when declarer is trying to locate a missing queen, South had to weigh the probability of East holding the greater spade length (and therefore the queen) against the probability that West was more likely to have the queen because he had opened the bidding.

After considering all the relevant factors, South decided that East was apt to have more spades than West, so he ruffed with dummy's ace. He then led the ten of spades, intending to finesse. But East correctly covered the ten with the queen.

South won with the king and — pursuing his premise that East was more likely to have been dealt three spades than two — crossed to dummy with a club and returned the spade deuce. After East followed with the five, South finessed the six!

When the finesse succeeded, South was home free. He collected East's nine of spades with the jack, then conceded a diamond to the ace to bring a satisfying conclusion to a well-played hand.

Maureen Brockman, one in five children is abused before they turn 18, and five children die every day as a result of abuse or neglect.

In Central Florida, Embrace Families is one of the organizations trying to put an end to that, as they help children get out of harmful situations and heal from them.

The blue-painted fingernails are intended to be eye-catching, which Embrace Family officials hope will spur conversations that lead to donations to their organization all over.

"It started three years ago, when we had the help of the mayor of Orlando, sheriff's officials, police and fire, and they had the idea to paint the index fingers of their hands blue, to signify that one in five children are abused before their 18th birthday," Brockman told the Sanford Herald. "We want to start a conversation about a topic no one wants to talk about."

She said she thought the initiative was doing its part so far.

"We try to target men to wear nail polish," she said. "Because people will ask them what it's about, and they can say it's helping to raise awareness about child abuse. They can give out information on who to call, what to look for, the signs, and maybe engage a group

that has not been engaged." Speaking to reporters, Bryant said the problem was akin to how mental health had been treated up until recently.

"We know there's a crisis," he said. "It's preventable. Mental health, for years we didn't talk about it. But that changed. We can make the same change with child abuse."

He said Embrace Families' commitment to helping kids included programs like Pathways to Home, which assists families with children in finding housing to escape homelessness, and other programs helping children dealing with mental health issues.

Lemma spoke about the "unique partnership" the Seminole County Sheriff's Office has with local partners, and how they try to follow up with people they help out of abuse situations.

"We try to follow up with and support all children we help out of abuse or neglect situations," he said. "Our greatest responsibility is to protect kids."

But he said it's difficult to squash the problem entirely, since some abuse goes without being seen.

"We want to be a voice for the voiceless," he said. "Sometimes literally, because sometimes pre-verbal children find themselves victimized by someone who calls themselves a caregiver. There's abuse we don't know about. We have to support children and make them feel comfortable."
