THIS PLACE MATTERS: Sanford Historic Trust highlights residents' favorite places

This month, the Sanford Historic Trust wants residents to celebrate and memorialize their favorite places in town for the 'This Place Matters' campaign.

It's their first such event, and coincides with the national Preservation Month that takes place during the month of May.

According to Historic Trust president Zach Waters, the idea is to spotlight all kinds of buildings and places in the City of Sanford.

In a Facebook post from last week, the Historic Trust explains the simple method: take a picture of a place important to you, upload it to social media and state why it's important, using a hashtag like #ThisPlaceMatters.

How to apply for alligator hunt permits

Since 1988, the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) and its predecessor, the Game and Fresh Water Fish Commission, have offered hunters the opportunity to take part in their annual statewide recreational alligator harvest, which always runs Aug. 15 – Nov. 1. Alligators are a conservation success story in Florida. The state's alligator population is estimated at 1.3 million alligators of every size and has been stable for many years.

"Before you apply for alligator hunt permits, be sure to coordinate with everyone you plan to hunt with, regarding where you want to hunt and which harvest weeks work best with everyone's schedule," said Steve Stiegler, FWC's alligator program hunt

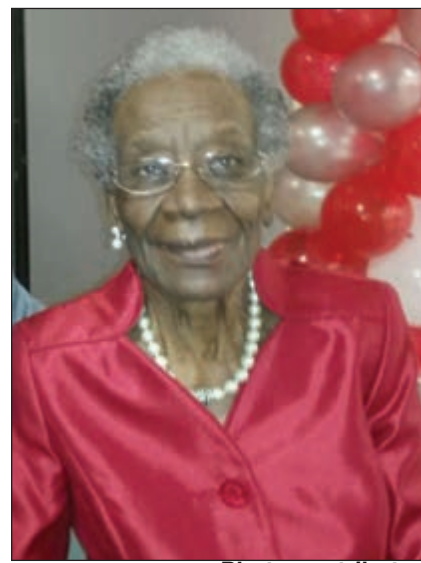

"Mama, I sure do love you"; and he reached down and got the letter and wrote in big words "PAID IN FULL". When you add it all up the real cost of a mother's love is no charge."

A Uniquely American Story

Feb. 19, 1942, was not President Franklin Roosevelt's finest day. Some 10 weeks after Japan's attack on Pearl Harbor, FDR signed Executive Order 9066, which violated the legal rights of some 120,000 Japanese Americans. In short order, people of Japanese descent were given just 48 hours to dispose of their homes, their farms, their businesses. Their investments and their bank accounts were expropriated.

Let us listen to the painful memories of a 10-year-old American citizen: "My own family was sent first to Santa Anita racetrack. We showered in the horse paddocks. Some families lived in converted stables, others in hastily thrown together barracks." That boy and his family were sent for three years to what FDR himself conceded was a "concentration camp" at Heart Mountain, Wyoming.

This is the story of Norman Mineta. That 10-year-old youngster would have been forgiven if he had spent the next decades brimming with anger and resentment. Instead, when his family was allowed to return to California, he finished high school, graduated from the prestigious University of California, Berkeley and then served three years

as a U.S. Army intelligence officer stationed in, you guessed it, Japan. He would become the first Japanese American ever elected mayor of a major U.S. city (San Jose, California), the first Japanese American in the continental U.S. ever elected to the U.S. Congress and the first Japanese American ever appointed to the Cabinet (as Bill Clinton's secretary of commerce), later appointed by Clinton's Republican successor, George W. Bush, to secretary of transportation.

But this is about a man himself, not the positions he has held, about the way he served. It is said that no man is a hero to his valet and the same can often be said about a politician and his staff. But not Norm Mineta. John Flaherty, who served him ably in Congress -- and later as chief of staff in the Department of Transportation -- recalls that almost "every Mineta staffer in Washington was pulled aside by Capitol Police, janitors, women working in the cafeteria and told how lucky we were to work for Mr. Mineta and how he was the only Member who remembered their names and even remembered their kids by name and actually asked about them." Flaherty shrewdly notes: "You couldn't fool these folks. They saw

When Will They Ever Learn?

A parking space in a successful downtown generates at least \$23,000 in sales per year. Each one taken away reduces the earning potential of businesses affected.

The \$775,000 Oak Avenue "beautification project", naturally, removed a number of parking spaces. When asked how many, The Public Works Director said he didn't know.

If they aren't removing spaces they will stripe the street to take them away, as at Sanford Avenue and First Street.

A few years ago, after the CRA took away 60% of the parking for Sanford Avenue bars and restaurants, the City paid the Sanford Supermarket a handsome sum to repave its parking lot so it could be used at night for the spaces lost. In addition, the City concreted the areas between the street and sidewalk on Third Street, Fourth Street, Fifth

Street and also Sixth Street just south of the Little Red Schoolhouse site.

Now, they are at it again, The Sanford Public Works Department, Thursday, removed a number of angle parking spaces on Palmetto where the Little Red Schoolhouse stood. Why? At what cost? How does it benefit the neighborhood?

An idea, designate some golf cart parking spaces. The wedgies on Palmetto between Commercial and Third, the space between the bulb out on Park and the EV charger. There are others, also include striping parts of Magnolia Square for carts. This will encourage people to visit downtown without driving cars.

The City will be **adding** parking spaces, who woulda thunk?

every variety of politician every day for years."

When Mineta was in the House, his office staff formed a softball team with a Democrat from a neighboring district, Leon Panetta, who would himself go on to an exceptional career of national service. When Democrat Jimmy Carter was hosting a state dinner for the Japanese prime minister, Carter's unsavvy staff did not invite Mineta. They mistakenly thought that he -- like Leon Panetta -- was the son of Italian immigrants. The name of the Panetta-Mineta staff softball team? The Sign of the Rising Pizza.

In 1988, Mineta redeemed the evil actions of his own country by sponsoring the law -- signed by President Ronald Reagan -- to

right the grievous wrong done to Japanese Americans nearly five decades earlier. Acknowledging Mineta's own history, Reagan stated: "For here we admit a wrong; here we reaffirm our commitment as a nation to equal justice under the law" -- words worth our recommitting to in the summer of 2019.

Documentary "Norman Mineta and His Legacy: An American Story" will premiere on PBS on May 20.

Science Teacher introduces Students to Wonders of the Outdoors

Mary Lynn Hess, science teacher at Goldsboro Magnet Elementary School, is as upbeat as one would expect of someone who's dedicated her life to teaching young children, with an easy, warm smile and an unflinchingly chipper attitude. "I have the best job in the world," she said. "I get to have fun all day."

Her classroom is full of live animals, including a snake and fish, a hydroponic gardening station, and she's recently been teaching kindergarteners to make back scratchers.

On the wall is a panoramic portrait of the Half Dome at Yosemite National Park, which she's climbed. And there are no chairs in the room, she said, which facilitates an atmosphere where students are always moving around and doing things constructively.

Hess has been profiled in local media for years, having gained notoriety for her outspoken advocacy for STEM education. She's appeared on PBS's NOVA series. And her character 'Pearl the Science Girl' has been a talking point for many, in which she dresses up to teach young students about animals and science.

All of it is in the name of making sure children learn about the world around them.

Outside, she regularly takes students to the several gardens all around the school's campus. There's the 'sensory garden,' with its numerous opportunities for all the senses. There are wisteria and cabbages growing in another.

One garden is an "enabling garden," modified so children in wheelchairs can admire the plants and flowers at their own eye level. And there are opportunities for students to see pollinators and bees doing their jobs.

Hess takes a two-pronged approach to teaching that she said works to immerse students in the material, rather than simply

dictating it to them.

"It's instrumental in helping kids learn about how plants grow," she said. "I think it's an extra thing rather than what they're getting out of the classroom. They can experience the things they're learning about."

But there were also other benefits, she said, that were perhaps even simpler.

"When I came here, there was none of this," she said. "It makes you feel joy. You can see beautiful foliage and flora, and kids can have conversations, see what nature made."

It's not all fun and games, though, as Hess has also made it a point to open her students' eyes to harmful things like the "Great Pacific Garbage Patch," the collection of trash particles in the Pacific Ocean between Hawaii and California.

Hess said she's used the garbage patch as a particular example to ask what students can do to help the environment, and also had them construct models to show how they would clean it up.

"It's all about teaching kids," she said. "Whatever it takes to make a connection. All children are different. They have different needs. If a kid is interested in insects, I help them learn more. However I can do it to get kids excited about the environment."

They also utilize partners from the community - there's a retired architect, Diane Forrest, who's helped design some of their garden areas like the fruit and vegetable garden, the fairy garden, the enabling garden and the pollinator garden.

There are master gardeners with the Seminole County Extension Office who help tend to the gardens, and readers from Northland Church who read books on nice days outside for the children.

Hess said the help from the community was much appreciated.

"It takes a village to raise a child," she said. "That's what we're trying to do."

The number is remarkable because, according to General Manager Bob Visscher, they were anything but safe prior to a change in ownership in late 2015. Under their previous owners Atlas Paper, the Sanford mill led even much larger branches of the company in the number of accidents

and injuries on the job. Visscher said they weren't even required to wear helmets or protective goggles on the job back then. But upon Resolute Forest Products purchasing the mill, things have turned around. According to Safety Manager Todd Fisher, they changed direction to focus more on a culture of safety, rather than prioritizing productivity first. By emphasizing what safety measures employees had to take and taking time out of the day to talk with employees about the issue, they were able to turn things around and they haven't had any injuries since 2016.

To celebrate, they consulted with the Greater Sanford Chamber of Commerce and determined that two of the best companies to charitably donate to were Meals on Wheels and St. Jude, giving \$5,000 to each. Esteban Vidal, development representative for St. Jude, said it was "amazing" that Resolute Tissue had supported them, and the donation would go far towards helping children. Likewise, Lori Robb and Sherry Fincher with Meals on Wheels called the donation "wonderful," adding

that they'd use it to further help housebound senior citizens in the area. One Resolute Tissue employee, James Jackson, said the contrast between their previous and current ownership on the issue of safety was like night and day. He said before, the company had been "real bad" about safety and that "nobody cared" about that issue. Jackson, who has worked there five years now, recalled one day before the switch in ownership, when someone had gotten hurt sticking their hand into a machine. "They called us in to talk about safety," Jackson recalled. "The funniest part was, everyone went back to work, and it wasn't 15 minutes before someone put their hand in the same part of the machine we just talked about." But now, Jackson said everything had improved. "It's a different mindset," he said. "Everyone couldn't believe that safety actually was important to these people. It's all thanks to [Fisher], telling us to wear ear plugs or put goggles on. It's more of a family atmosphere."

Protection defines a 'measles outbreak' as three or more cases. Since Florida has two known cases, the DOH wants to be proactive in telling people to get vaccinated. "Anyone can get measles, but complications from measles are more likely for children under 5 years old and adults over 20 years old. Vaccination against measles is the best way to prevent the infection and protect others from possible infection and complications," said Donna Walsh, health officer for the Florida Department of Health in Seminole County. Although measles was thought to be eradicated in the year 2000, recently it has begun to crop up again, with outbreaks in several states. According to national statistics from the CDC, there have been at least 764 cases of the measles across 23 states reported this year.

Lower rates of vaccination contributed to the sharp rise. A 2017 study by the CDC showed that 1.3 percent of children born in 2015 hadn't received vaccinations after two years. That's a rise from 0.9 percent in 2011 and 0.3 percent in 2001, according to the study. Every state offers medical exemptions for vaccinations, meaning those for whom a vaccination would be detrimental to their health in some way. Almost all states also offer religious exemptions for those who hold "sincere religious beliefs" against vaccinations, and about half of the country offers the option of "philosophical exemptions," which means personal convictions that lead people to refuse to vaccinate. Measles is an "acute, highly contagious viral disease," the press release from DOH reads. And while thought to be a primarily childhood disease, anyone can contract it, though generally most cases happen in younger people and inadequately immunized people. The disease is spread through the air by breathing, coughing or sneezing, and is highly contagious. The symptoms include fever, runny nose and rash, and

they begin around seven to 14 days after exposure. "Anyone who has these symptoms should contact his or her healthcare provider," the press release reads. "There is no specific treatment for measles." So, the DOH is recommending Seminole County children be immunized via the measles, mumps and rubella vaccine (MMR), in two doses; one at 12 to 15 months of age and another at four to six years of age. Adults should also receive one dose of the MMR vaccine, the press release states, with additional doses recommended for international travelers or health care workers. For information on vaccines or the measles, the Seminole County Department of Health recommends calling your physician or the local Health Department. For the Sanford office, call 407-665-3000. To schedule an appointment to get the vaccination, call the county's Immunizations Program at 407-665-3700. For more information on measles, visit floridahealth.gov/measles.

coordinator.

"The application process is a random drawing, so the more choices you make, the better your chances of getting drawn. You also can increase your odds of being drawn by choosing more areas during the

fourth harvest week," Stiegler said. "However, you shouldn't apply for any areas you feel are too far away or during weeks you're unable to hunt." And if you're still undecided on where to hunt, check out harvest data from past seasons at MyFWC.com/Alligator under "Statewide Alligator Harvest Program." **Phase I application period** The application period for the phase I random drawing begins May 17 at 10 a.m. and runs through May 27. More than 6,000 alligator harvest permits will be available. Hunters may submit their application for a permit that allows the harvest of two alligators on a designated harvest unit or county. Applicants must be at least 18 years of age by Aug. 15 and have a valid credit or debit card to apply. Applications can be submitted at any county tax collector's office, license agent (most retail

outlets that sell hunting and fishing supplies) and at GoOutdoorsFlorida.com. Applicants must provide their credit card information when they apply. If changes to hunt choices or credit card information are needed, applicants can make updates until the application period closes. **License/permit costs** The alligator trapping license/harvest permit and two hide validation CITES tags cost \$272 for Florida residents, \$22 for those with a Florida Resident Persons with Disabilities Hunting and Fishing License, and \$1,022 for nonresidents. The cost for applicants who already have an alligator trapping license is \$62. **Phase II and III application periods** Any permits remaining after the first phase will be offered during the phase II application period May 31 - June 10. Those

who were awarded a permit in phase I may not apply during phase II. Remaining permits will be available in phase III to anyone who did not draw a permit in either of the first two phases, and they may be applied for June 14-24. **Leftover application phase** If any permits remain after phase III, there will be a fourth-phase issuance period beginning at 10 a.m. on June 27 until all permits are sold. Anyone may apply during phase IV, even if they were awarded a permit in one of the earlier phases. Hunters who get to purchase additional permits will be charged \$62, regardless of residency or disability. **What to expect if you get drawn** Within three days of an application period closing, applicants can expect to see an authorization hold on their credit card, verifying there is a

sufficient balance to cover the cost of the permit. However, this does not mean they were awarded a permit. Once the credit card authorization process is complete, the lottery drawing will be held. All successful applicants will be charged, while those who were unsuccessful will have the authorization hold lifted from their credit cards. Successful applicants should expect to receive their alligator trapping license/harvest permit and two CITES alligator tags in the mail within six weeks of payment. Alligator trapping licenses are nontransferable. All sales are final, and no refunds will be made. 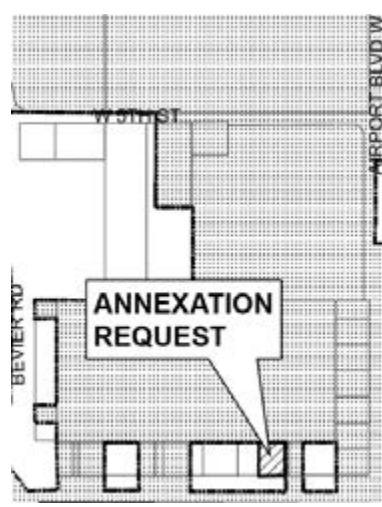

South wins with the king, and, with the cards divided as they are, he must eventually go down at least two against best defense. East is sure to score four heart tricks as soon as West gains the lead with the king of clubs and returns a heart through dummy's Q-3. The same result accrues if declarer plays low from dummy on the first trick, in which case East's eight forces the king.

But South has available to him a play that will stop East-West stone cold dead. All he has to do to stymie the defense is to play the queen of hearts from dummy on West's opening lead.

What can East then do? If he takes the ace, he can't return a heart without establishing dummy's ten. Whether East continues or discontinues the suit, South has the time he needs to wrap up nine tricks. And if East does not take the ace, he is no better off after declarer next leads the nine of clubs from dummy and loses the finesse to West's king.

The contract thus stands or falls on which card declarer plays from dummy at trick one. After giving due weight to East's one-heart overcall, South must recognize the importance of putting up dummy's queen. Otherwise, the contract goes down the drain.

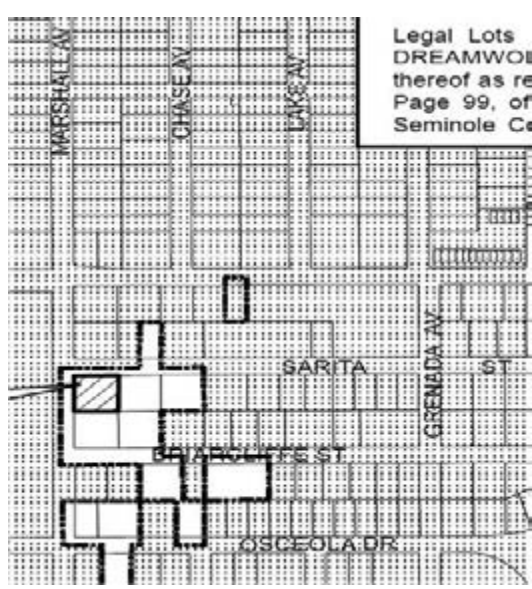

Waters said the places don't have to be historic; just places that matter to individuals.

One of the earliest participants in the This Place Matters campaign was attorney Daniel Lewis, who posted a picture of himself at Veterans Memorial Park, stating that his status as a veteran of the

United States Air Force gave him a special connection to the area.

"The happiest of days, my wedding day, also took place at Veterans Memorial Park in December of 2017, when I married my beautiful wife at this park," Lewis wrote. "Only 6 people were there, including 2 great friends who were our notary & photographer. We stood overlooking Lake Monroe on the same steps I spoke at 7 months previously and joined our lives together. THIS PLACE MATTERS!"

Waters told the Sanford Herald

that as president of the Historic Trust, his goal was to relish the beauty of the city and to spotlight its important older architecture, with an eye toward preserving it. That was important because the Historic Trust didn't exist until about 30 years ago, he said.

And to both Waters and his wife, history is important. It's in their blood.

"I grew up here," he said. "I went to school in Erie, Pennsylvania. It was a very historic town. The buildings there went back to the 1700s. In

Florida, there was new everything. There were a few places with historic buildings, like Sanford and St. Augustine, but everything else was so new. There is history here. It's not just strip malls through every city. I love the mom and pop places. It reminds me of where I went to school."

Waters works as a teacher in Sanford, and in keeping with his job at the Historic Trust, tries to slip in as much Florida history as he can.

He's a Geography teacher, but said the definition of that is so

broad that he can usually find a place to slip in some history in the lessons.

"There is no History of Florida class," he said. "The standards are so broad, we can just relate things to the culture."

In addition, Waters said they're also holding their Preservation Month Awards, in which they'll celebrate the best residential homes and businesses committed to preservation. That event will take place Thursday, May 16, at 7 p.m.
