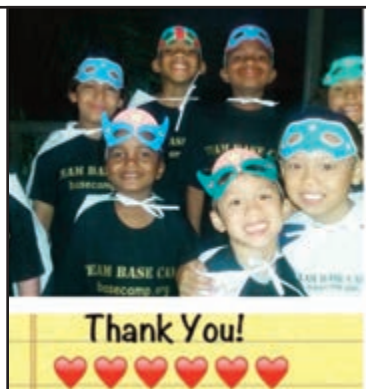

Chuluota murder suspect hopes millionaire will help bond him out

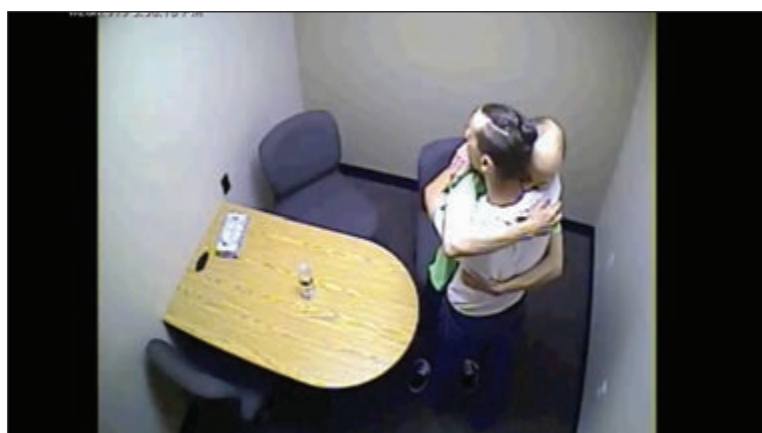

Murder suspect Grant Amato, accused of killing three family members in January, is trying to use his story as an incentive to reporters to help him bond out of jail, according to court email documents.

In a series of emails dating back to early April, Amato attempts to court reporters who want to hear his story by saying he'll tell it when he's granted bond and can get out of jail.

"If I can somehow make this

Dr. Bob Williams, respected doctor in Sanford community passes away at 75

Bob Williams, a respected doctor with roots in the Sanford community for decades, passed away at 75 this month.

Tim Hendrix, a former co-worker of Williams' and current Medical Director of CentraCare, recalled the early days of his career as he first started at CentraCare years ago, where Williams was something of a mentor to him.

He remembered some patients becoming upset if Williams wasn't there when they came in.

"I had a woman walk in and ask 'where is Dr. Williams?'" he recalled. "I said he's not working today, and she was very of-

COUCH THEATER -- VIDEO/DVD PREVIEWS

"Fighting With My Family" (PG-13) -- When dad Ricky Knight (Nick Frost) catches siblings Raya (Florence Pugh) and Zak (Jack Lowden) fighting, instead of breaking the kids up, he offers pointers on Zak's headlock. The Knights are a wrestling family. The kids step in the ring on the local circuit and eventually get a tryout for a professional spot with WWE, but only Raya is accepted. She is whisked off to Florida to train, an ocean away from her family, in the care of an obnoxious trainer played by Vince Vaughn and feeling that she's not like the other girls. I went in expecting it to be a little bit "girl power" -- it's based on the real-life story of WWE's Paige, the youngest Diva Champion -- but I left feeling like it's more about becoming comfortable with your own strengths, a message that applies to Raya and her brother.

"Groundhog Day" (G) -- But then her pal Ryan (Phi Vu) announces that HE is reliving the same day over again, and Tree jumps in with an assist. It had to be tremendously tricky to find a legitimate follow-up story, but producer Jason Blum and writer/director Christopher Landon managed to hit just the right time loop, coming up with a sequel that's still irreverent and self-deprecating, funny and somehow novel, despite the fact that it's a repetitive remake of itself.

"Cold Pursuit" (R) -- Liam Neeson headlines as Nels Coxman, a snow-plow driver in a Colorado ski town. He's a nice fellow, the hokey kinda guy whose fellow townsfolk would name "Citizen of the Year." But then his son turns up dead of an overdose under

some very suspicious circumstances (according to his brother with a criminal past), and ol' Nels decides to go after the local drug kingpin, named The Viking. Is he a stone-hearted killer? Nope, just a guy with a death vendetta, a snowplow, a can-do attitude and lots of places to hide bodies.

"Apollo 11" (G) -- Director Todd Douglas Miller takes advantage of a previously undiscovered archive of footage and audio recordings surrounding Michael Collins, Neil Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin's voyage to the moon and back in the documentary "Apollo 11." It covers pre-flight training, preparations and interviews and continues all the way through the actual moonwalk and return flight. Featuring voice-overs from Walter Cronkite, and painstakingly restored and scanned film, you'll find new background on key players. While its commanding scale is best viewed in large-format IMAX, it's still worthwhile as a rental, particularly if you have an interest in the space program.

Central Florida Zoo to host Pet Amnesty Day so owners can surrender exotic pets

On Saturday, June 1, residents of Central Florida will be allowed to surrender their exotic pets from 10 AM to 2 PM without penalty or cost, whether they are being kept legally or illegally.

The Central Florida Zoo & Botanical Gardens along with the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC), will be hosting a Pet Amnesty Day at the Zoo's front entrance. The Exotic Pet Amnesty Program offers an alternative to releasing unwanted pets and helps reduce the number of nonnative species being released into Florida habitats.

This free event is open to the public. Professionals from each organization will be onsite with information about caring for exotic pets, responsible pet ownership, and potential ecological impacts of invasive species in Florida. Animals that will be accepted include nonnative species of reptiles, amphibians, mammals, birds, fish, and invertebrates. Domestic animals such as dogs, cats guinea pigs, and rabbits will

not be accepted.

Please note—finding homes for large pond turtles including red-eared sliders, yellow-bellied sliders, cooters, chicken turtles, and redbelly turtles can take longer than a year. Owners of these turtles should contact the FWC's Exotic Species Hotline.

Some surrendered animals will be made available for adoption to pre-registered individuals the same day. Exotic pet adopters are required to be experienced and must be approved by the FWC prior to the event. There are no adoption fees, but potential adopters must register a minimum of one week before the event to adopt an animal. Approved adopters must bring their acceptance letters with them to the event.

The doctor is Out

An old friend, and boyhood idol went on to be with the Lord last week, slipping the bonds of pain and sickness and flying away to Glory. His departure sent waves of grief throughout our earthly realm, and great rejoicing in the streets of heaven! Bobby Williams son of "Mr. Bob" and "Dot" Williams of Sanford. He was a lone son in a houseful of Sisters

Mr. Bob was a man of many talents. A timber cruiser, saw mill and heavy equipment operator, real estate specialist and sportsman extraordinaire. He made the hardest of work look like child's play, and to be included in his realm of hunting and fishing was a condition to be seriously aspired to. EVERYBODY loved Mr. Bob!

My first recollection of Bobby was a frosty morning at Wekiva hunting camp, in an old frame house with cold seeping in through the cracks. In the front room was a crackling fire. On the floor in front of the hearth lay a pile of old quilts, blankets, feed sacks, and Bobby, then about 14, surrounded by a litter of hound pups. Hunting season in general, with dogs in particular, was the ultimate thrill for boys. The rest of the year, fishing was a close second. Mr. Bob made just as much fun out of that as he did hunting. Bobby was his shadow throughout, learning a love of the woods and waters that lasted a lifetime.

It being too cold and windy to hunt, Mr. Bob and my Dad busied themselves in the kitchen with grits, fatback, and coffee that smelled to the heavens, even to a boy who wasn't old enough to drink it. I nonetheless was captivated and enthralled by the people, sights sounds and smells around me. Mr Bob made mention of a "few fleas" like it was no big deal. After all, this was hunting camp. The domain of men, boys, dogs, fleas, and fire.

Bobby was nine years older than me. I thought he hung the moon. Here we were in the paradise that was Wekiva in those days, teeming with bear, deer, turkeys and on the best of occasions, the sound of hounds on the hunt. I was mesmerized by the men, intent on listening to the chase and getting situated for a shot at a buck. The fact that Bobby had a gun and thereby could shoot a deer should the opportunity present itself, was manhood defined!

I would see him periodically as the adults hunted, fished, and speculated together, although if Mr. Bob was driving a deal, it wasn't much of a speculation. He seemed to have the Midas touch most of the time. Getting to spend a day with them in the woods or on the river was a treat to be treasured, and hunting camp was a place to be revered. Bobby was someone to be looked up to even then. He took time time with us younger ones dressing squirrels and fish, trimming palmetto stems for "swords" or poking sticks in the fire with us and burning liver flukes. He was always good for allowing us a "tussle" with his pants legs. He'd let us get as rough as we could but shook us off when he'd had enough, always with a good natured grin.

I well remember Bobby "going off to medical school." What a strange, exotic, yea frightening experience, thought I. Especially because it required moving to of all places, Miami! I remember I was glad for him, and equally glad it wasn't me. Year after year, he'd come home during the holidays and be at camp just as before, but he was changing, growing, before our very eyes. The adults, always courtly, began to take greater interest in Bobby, evidence of a heightened admiration for one of their own who aspired to greater things. Medical school aside, he always remained the wonderful friend and mentor we'd always known. Only now, he would take time to answer our boyish questions about anatomy.

Upon graduation he was off to practice in Blakely Georgia. Knowing the area and the wonderful hunting and fishing that lay in store, I had mixed feelings. Sad because I figured I'd never see him again, glad as I envisioned his move to at least the third heaven. He stayed a while, but eventually, to our great excitement, moved back to Sanford

Working at home in his chosen profession, Dr. Williams enjoyed a long and successful practice. He worked mostly in the Emergency Room setting, with good reason. He had fairly regular hours, and knew when he could take time off to hunt and fish! It came as no surprise, he amassed a clientele who wanted his services, emergency or no. Through all his success, Bobby remained "Bobby" a husband, father to his children, and friend to all. He never used the "Doctor" title. His friends are many.

Bobby loved food. He came by it honest though. Mr. Bob could cook AND eat, and did! We cut our teeth on fried fish, grits, swamp cabbage, venison, rice and "thirty weight gravy." I remember one time fixing beef bourguignon at hunting camp. For several years afterward, he'd mention it from time to time and get a wistful/ hopeful "hint hint" look in his eye. Nutritional experts at the time were beginning to believe that all manner of what we enjoyed eating would kill us. Some few changed their eating habits, some pretended to, and the rest of us ate as we pleased. Medical Degree notwithstanding, Bobby enjoyed good food all the days of his life, and whatever his secret was, he didn't seem the worse for his favored indulgence. Many's the day he could be seen at Sanford's Colonial room, often with family and friends, eating fried bologna sandwiches, or fried chicken and lima beans over rice. He was on a first name basis with management and clientele, and unless you got sick, he was always "Bobby," period.

The last time I saw him was about a month ago at the Colonial Room, no less. He was sitting and talking with Bill Kirchoff, another of Sanford's original characters, and two more guys whose names escape me. The camaraderie was the same as always, and I was welcomed as well.

There was a reception after the funeral, catered by the Colonial Room. Among the many favorite food items was a big plate of fried bologna sandwiches, quartered, because they were as much for remembering Bobby as for eating. A most fitting tribute I must say. In this less formal setting, the guests enjoyed fellowship, recounting fond personal recollections associated with Bobby and his family. There were some tears as we contemplated life without him, smiles for having known him, what he meant to us, and laughter, as is the way of the Williams clan. Aye Bobby, sorely will we miss ye!

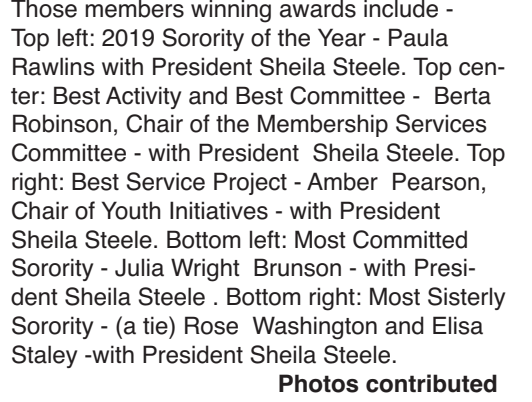

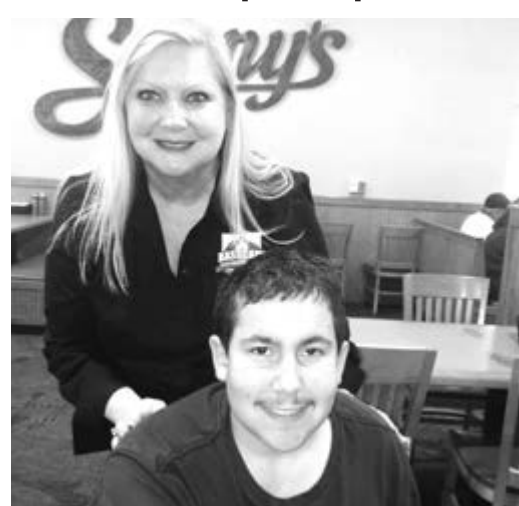

BASE Camp helps Families dealing with Cancer

What began as a simple volunteer effort, led Terri Jones Robbins to become the founder of BASE (Believe, Achieve, Support, Educate) Camp Children's Cancer Foundation. The organization has been serving children affected by cancer for 37 years and their year-round programs began in 1982 and focus on helping the entire family through this journey.

This married mom of two received her AA degree from Valencia College after a move to Central Florida in 1980. She also majored in an Intensive Office Training Track in high school which led to administrative assistant jobs and came in very handy when she entered the next phase of her life.

It was also during that same time frame that some new friends introduced Robbins to the Leukemia Society of Central Florida for a volunteering effort. Since Robbins grew up in a family of volunteers this seemed like a perfect fit. She worked with the Leukemia Society from 1982 to 1992 in an administrative role.

"I began meeting families affected by leukemia and then learned that children got other cancers as well as other hematology life-threatening illnesses; Hemophilia, Sickle Cell, Tate/orphan anemias and others," she said. "I am or have been a volunteer at all three local children's hospitals that treat children with hematology and oncology; Advent Health, Arnold Palmer, Nemours Children's. I also partner & volunteer with many other local organizations; Talia's Legacy, Whipping Childhood Cancer, Cannonballing Cancer, New Hope, Childhood Cancer Foundation-Volusia, Candlelighters of Brevard, Marlie Made, BELAC Foundation, Helpful Hands, Rotary, I'm in Events, iLifestyle to name a few."

Yet, it was through the many volunteer endeavors and such that Robbins came to establish BASE Camp. She shared that BASE Camp Children's Foundation serves children living and being treated in Central Florida in Arnold Palmer Children's Hospital. Florida Children's Hospital and Nemours Children's Hospital. Their Mission Statement cites that they provide a year around base of support for children and families facing the challenge of living with cancer and other life-threatening hematology and oncology illnesses. A BASE Camp is a place where you can always find comfort, friends, nourishment and encouragement along the journey. A place where you can find the strength to endure the day and finish the climb.

"Our programs and activities are like the encampments that are built as climbers climb mountains," said Robbins. "We set up base camps locally to help the children stop, rest, eat, play, gather with friends to gain the strength and encouragement to continue the journey." They include overnight camps in



local hotels camping in the ballroom with sleeping bags, rollaway beds and sometimes even tents. "At least six times a year we take 40-50 children 'camping' in local ballrooms, timeshare resorts and church gymnasiums," she said. "BASE Camp Nourishment delivers over 400 meals every week to children and families at the 3 local hospitals, their corresponding Doctors offices and outpatient clinics serving local pediatric cancer patients. A mixture of hot food from local restaurants, a pantry filled with single-serving foods, bags of groceries for home and grocery store gift cards. This program provides children with a much needed diversion from hospital food, parents with a much needed free meal and families with enough groceries to make dinner for a week in the toughest of times. Every Friday night the delivery of a dinner meal is enhanced with movies and popcorn and candy so that families can enjoy 'Dinner & a Movie' while in the hospital."

Robbins added that BASE Camp also coordinates milestone parties celebrating birthdays, end of chemo and radiation completed by bringing dessert and balloons to acknowledge and celebrate the day. BASE Camp also hosts a 'Parents Night Out' every Saturday at the BASE Camp office in Winter Park where free babysitting is offered for parents who have children currently on treatment. The focus is on children 12 and younger from 6 to 10:30pm. In addition, BASE Camp coordinates parent support groups in the hospitals and clinics and with local restaurants to help parents cope through treatment and beyond.

"The Base camp day center is open Monday through Friday for families to drop in and have a meal, get some rest and a break from the day," said Robbins. "Many of our families live far so this means traveling sometimes 100 miles to get to their treatment center. A typical day for a patient might be having blood work early in the morning, only to have to wait hours to find out whether or not they can get chemo or be admitted to the hospital. Patients and their caregivers often just have to sit around the hospital; eating in the cafeteria, waiting in the waiting room for hours. The base camp day center has rooms for boys, girls, parents where they can come and spend some time, watch a movie, get on the computer and research, play dress-up and have a meal."

In talking about plans for the future, Robbins said her succession plan is to create funding that will be sustainable and allow current programs to continue and evolve to meet the needs of local families fighting the fight. She jokes that she needs to find younger, smarter versions of herself who can lead this non-profit into the future. She has been recognized and nominated for several Central Florida awards throughout her 37-year work.

Girl Scouts open Food Pantry at Jackson Heights

A group of Oviedo middle school students is doing their part to help those in need of food at a recently-opened pantry at Jackson Heights Middle School.

The students are sixth grader Jessica Hodson, seventh grader Kirby Ferraro, and eighth grader Corbin Whitlow, all of whom are members of the Girl Scout Troop 1276.

The pantry, located in a closet in the school's administrative building, is stocked with cereal, canned fruits and vegetables, pasta, beans and more.

The idea for the pantry came from the willingness to do something about hunger. According to Corbin, there are 11 families they identified at Jackson Heights that struggle with getting food, and so every week, the girls go into the pantry, stock up bags for each of them and take them to the school's guidance counselor.

The idea came when the girls learned the school didn't have such a pantry and wanted

to fill the void. Learning facts about the number of people in society who go without guaranteed food only bolstered them.

"We were sad that there were kids going without food," Kirby said. "I had to ask permission from the principal, and we went off from there."

From there, they held food drives in local businesses, got donations from various clubs and used PTSA resources to build up the pantry.

And now they're off and running. "It feels good, improving someone's life," Corbin said. "They need help, especially at school."

Corbin is heading to high school next year, and hopes the others - and future students who want to make a difference - keep up the momentum.

"It's real important for anyone to learn, the younger the better," she said. "We need to teach kids to be empowered, to bring out the leadership skills, when they're younger."

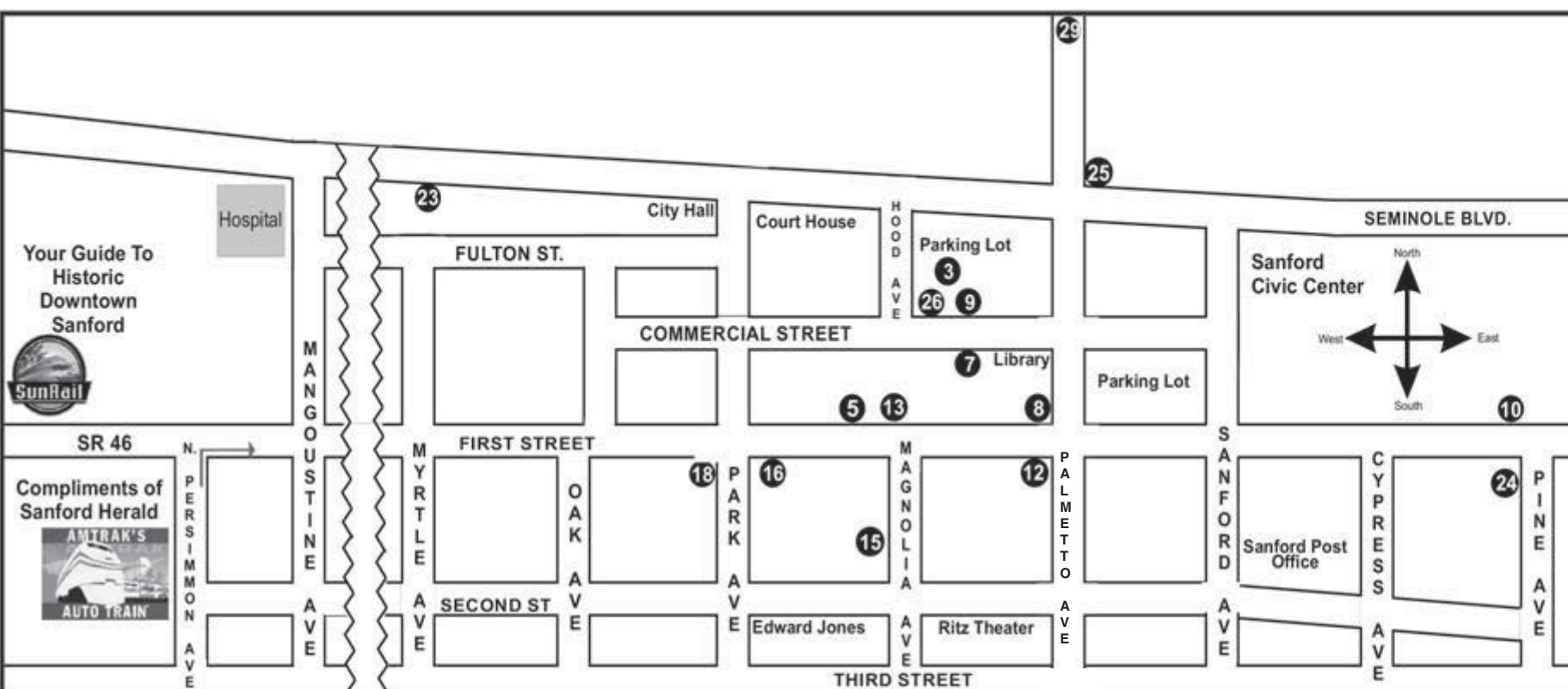

Mistake advances Seminole Baseball to Regional Final; 5 other baseball and softball teams still in action

It was totally unexpected — and not the way you want it to happen — but due to a mistake by the Jacksonville-Sandalwood baseball team, Seminole High School (20-10) will automatically advance to Tuesday's Class 9A-Region 1 Championship Game.

The Fighting Seminoles won their Regional Quarterfinal Game in Jacksonville on Wednesday, 9-3, over host Mandarin (16-10) and were expecting to return to Jacksonville today (Saturday) to face Sandalwood (21-7), which edged Spruce Creek (24-4), 6-5, in Port Orange.

But in a Press Release from Seminole County Public Schools it was announced: "Due to a self-reported pitch count violation in last night's Sandalwood vs Spruce Creek baseball game, the FHSAA has ruled that Sandalwood will be ineligible to play in our scheduled game against them on Saturday. SHS will move into the Regional Final next Wednesday. The team we will play and location will be announced after the conclusion of Saturday's other Regional Semi-Final. This puts SHS into the final eight teams competing for the 9A FHSAA State Title."

It was reported by a Jacksonville television station that the Sandalwood pitcher threw 120 pitches in the game against Spruce Creek, well over the FHSAA mandated 105 pitches.

The Tribe will advance to the Great 8 for the first time since 2001 and will travel to the home of Friday night's game between Olympia and Lake Brantley. The contest was played in Altamonte Springs last night because the field was unavailable today.

Seminole took a 2-0 lead in the top of the first inning, but Mandarin tied the contest with single runs in the first and second innings, but the Noles regained the lead for good by exploding for four runs in the fifth inning and three more in the sixth, before the host Mustangs got a run back in the bottom of the seventh inning.

Matt Allen, coming off his perfect game in the District Tournament last week, was the winning pitcher and a probable starter in the Region final.

Seminole collected 14 hits in the win, led by Mason Mazzerredo (3-for-4, double, two RBI), Gage Oylar (3-for-4), Jalen Debose (2-for-4, triple), TJ Malani and Zachary McCauley (both 2-for-2) and Allen added a double to help his own cause.

Lake Brantley (21-6) secured another home game when freshman catcher Luke Heyman lined a two-out, walkoff, game-winning home run in the bottom of the seventh inning to eliminate Boone (13-12), 4-3.

The Patriots had taken a 3-0 lead in the third inning when Heyman drove in two runs with a bases-loaded no out single and Logan Keller drove in the third run.

But the Braves finally broke through against Lake Brantley starter Logan Wash, who gave up a leadoff single before retiring 13 consecutive batters.

But after retiring the leadoff batter in the fifth, Boone would tie the game on a two-run double and sacrifice fly against reliever Reese Brown, although the run was charged to Wash.

Reese would stymie the Braves the rest of the way to set up Heyman's game-winning blast.

Host Hagerty (24-4) also won on a walkoff in the seventh inning as an obstruction call at third base allowed the Huskies to score the game-winning in a 3-2 victory over Celebration (11-10) in a Class 8A-Region 3 Quarterfinal in Oviedo.

Trent Caples went the distance on the hill for Hagerty, allowing one earned run on six hits. Vaughn Grissom led the Huskies offensive attack, going 2-for-3 with a double and a run scored.

Also contributing were Ryan Carroll (1-for-4, RBI), Hector Mangual (1-for-2), Trey Bradley (1-for-3), Riley Greene and Jordan Engel (run each) and Jackson Grabsky (RBI).

The shoe was on the other foot, however, in another Class 8A-Region 3 Quarterfinal as host Windermere High (23-4) got a game-winning walkoff single against Lake Howell (12-12).

Gabe Santiago (1-for-4, run), Daniel Baez and Zach Levenson (both 1-for-4), Naphis Llanos (two runs scored) and Billy Poure (RBI) provided the offense for the Silver Hawks, who scored a run in the first and plated two more in the third inning to take a 3-2 lead.

In a Class 4A-Region 1 Semifinal, Trinity Prep (16-10) had a tough time of it on the road, getting held to two hits in an 8-0 loss to Calvary Christian in Clearwater.

In Class 3A-Region 3 Semifinal, host Orangewood Christian (20-8) scored three runs in the bottom of the first inning and made it stand up in a 3-2 victory over visiting Spring Hill-Bishop McLaughlin Catholic (19-8) in Maitland.

Josh Morse was the winning pitcher, tossing a complete game, while allowing two earned runs on three hits with three walks and 11 strike outs.

Providing the offense for the Rams were Brooks Rikeman (2-for-3, run), Nate Sullivan (1-

Corrick, a Seminole High School graduate who was co-Pitcher of the Year in 2018, anchored USF to a second-straight regular season title in the circle, posting a 0.79 ERA in conference games. She started 14 of her 15 appearances in league play, tossing 12 complete games and earning a 12-2 record while holding opposing batters to a .177 batting average. Corrick struck out 128 batters in 105.2 innings of work in conference

games, totaling 221 strikeouts in 31 total appearances this season. In April, she was named as one of 26 finalists nationally for the 2019 USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year.

bridge the gap between law enforcement and the community, said Captain Paul Herx with the SPD.

"We want to admit we don't know what we don't know," Herx

told the Sanford Herald. "We want to have a frank discussion on how to serve diverse parts of the community."

Herx said the main problem with modern policing was communities where police weren't members of the communities and thus did not understand the ins and outs of peoples' lives.

He said they wanted to "break down the misconceptions, barriers

and obstacles" that people see between them.

The training will be put on by the University of Illinois. On June 7, there will be a class for law enforcement officers, and June 8 will open up the class for members of the community to interact with law enforcement and work together.

The theme of the classes is "cultural humility," which will lead to

"a foundation for interpersonal interactions and community outreach," according to a press release.

Herx said the SPD has been exemplary in their diversity and inclusion, citing their recent attempts to outreach to the community better. He said they work with citizens and the business community to make sure things are handled well.

But he said there's always room for improvement - thus the classes.

The classes will take place at the Sanford Police Department on Historic Goldsboro Boulevard, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. on June 7 and 9:30 a.m. to 12 p.m. on June 8.

sampiere outside his home on Suncrest Court, shouting at his neighbors Christopher and Jennifer Bain.

"You ever talk to my kid like that again, and I'll get my gun and go over there, and I'll (expletive) kill you," he said. "Take my picture. Here I am. Record this. She lost her damn cat. Go ahead. Put it on Facebook. You're both (expletive) (expletive)."

There was also an allegation that Persampiere had a gun when he shouted at the Bains, though no proof could be found of this on Monday, according to police.

The incident apparently started over a lost cat and Persampiere's 26-year-old daughter, reports state.

His daughter was reportedly searching near the Bains' property. The Bains suspected that she could've been taking pictures of

them, the police report states.

In response, they reportedly told her that they'd call the police if she stayed on their property.

Interviews with law enforcement revealed that there had been past animosity between the Persampiere and Bain families, related to Homeowners' Association issues. The Bains, according to investigators, believed Persampiere's daughter might have "ulterior motives" related to a HOA violation, as they had recently installed a new shed.

According to the police report, Persampiere alleged that the Bains have a long history of "continually harassing his wife and daughter," which led to his anger and outburst.

According to Persampiere's daughter in a police statement, Jennifer Bain approached "within 10 feet" of the daughter with her dog unleashed, with Jennifer only holding onto its collar.

The daughter said she did not cross onto the Bains' property line and explained clearly that she was looking for her cat. She said she offered her phone to prove that she

hadn't been taking pictures but the Bains declined this.

The daughter also said the Bains' dog had been trained as an attack dog, with her evidence being old Facebook posts of the Bains'.

Upon reviewing the case, law enforcement determined there was no cause to charge Persampiere with Aggravated Assault.

The Bains were upset with this, feeling that Persampiere had been shown preferential treatment due to his status as Mayor, though the Oviedo Police Department denied this and explained the definition of that crime.

Persampiere told the Sanford Herald that he did not regret sticking up for his daughter.

"When my daughter was verbally assaulted while looking for her lost cat and then threatened with a K9-trained German shepherd, I went into "protective dad" mode," he said. "For many years, this family has antagonized and threatened my wife in her role as HOA president. I will not accept them doing the same to my daughter. My words should

have been chosen more carefully. There are two things I am passionate about it is my family and my city."

Jennifer Bain told the Sanford Herald that the dog, actually only a puppy, had not harassed the girl and had been taken inside early on in the interaction.

Bain said she and her husband did not harass the Persampiere family and that all they had done on Monday was tell the girl to get off their property.

"She was out there with her phone in the air," Bain said. "She never said she was looking for her cat, never called an animal's name. We didn't know it was the Mayor's daughter. She just stood on the corner acting suspicious. My husband said 'if you're taking pictures, we'll call the police.' We did not curse at her, we did not say anything."

She said if anything, the Persampiere family had harassed them.

"We have no desire to be near them, or to be bothered with them," she said.

closed near the Regatta Shores apartments. Though residents of those apartments will be allowed access through the east end of the project, all other traffic will have a detour to State Road 46 via County Road 15.

This is the second of three sets of closures while construction workers replace the pipelines underneath the road. The first closures began in March, from Mangoustine Avenue to Regatta Shores.

That's part of the City's preparations for the completion of the RiverWalk Trail around Lake Monroe that will eventually unite a series of bike trails across the state and allow people to walk or bike all the way around the lake.

Some of the pipes are around 80 years old, according to the City, and there are eleven pipe sections that need replacing.

There will be one final set of closures, between Walnut Crest Run and the Central Florida Zoo, which will take place later this year.
