#### CONTRACTS—HOME LABOR TO BE EMPLOYED.

Preference.

SEC. 289. In all contracts made by the City of Jacksonville, or of its officers or boards, there shall be inserted a provision to the following effect: "It is mutually understood and agreed and a part of the consideration to the City of Jacksonville for the making of this contract, that in the carrying out of this contract citizens of the City of Jacksonville shall be given the preference of employment to perform all labor required by this contract to be performed; that the rate of wages to be paid shall not be less than the ruling rate of wages paid within the City of Jacksonville for the performance of work of the character specified, and that in the purchase of materials to be used in the carrying out of this contract all materials practicable to be obtained in the City of Jacksonville shall be purchased in the City of Jacksonville."

SEC. 290. It is hereby declared and made the duty of all city officers and boards superintending the carrying out of city contracts to enforce the foregoing provisions as inserted in all such contracts.

#### MAYOR MAY PROHIBIT SALES IN CERTAIN EMERGENCIES.

Selling in vicinity of fire or riot may be forbidden.

SEC. 291. Whenever, during the progress of a fire, epidemic, riot, or other public emergency in the City of Jacksonville, the Mayor shall deem it necessary to stop the sale of intoxicating liquors, he shall, by proclamation or personal notice, notify all persons selling intoxicating liquors and carrying on their said business in the vicinity of such fire or riot, or, in his discretion, he shall notify all persons engaged in said business to desist from such selling of intoxicating liquors until further permission be granted, and thereupon it shall be and remain unlawful for any such persons to sell any vinous, spirituous or malt liquors, or otherwise dispose of or allow the same to be drunk upon or near the premises so occupied by him until he shall have received permission from the Mayor to do so.

SEC. 292. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished by fine not exceeding two hundred dollars or imprisonment not exceeding thirty days.
