

PRESERVATION OF PEACE AND GOOD ORDER.

Penalty.

SEC. 348. If any person shall be guilty of disturbing the public peace and the morals and the good order and government of the City of Jacksonville by committing any of the acts hereinafter prohibited, within the corporate limits of the city, he or she shall, on conviction thereof before the Municipal Court, be fined in such sum or imprisoned such length of time as the Judge of said court may determine; Provided, That no fine imposed under the provisions of this ordinance shall exceed \$500, and no person shall be imprisoned exceeding ninety days, except for the non-payment of fines and costs.

Disturbing the

SEC. 349. Any person convicted of disturbing the public peace by committing any assault or any assault and battery upon any person or persons in any street, square or other public place or place of general resort within the city limits, or in any dwelling or other private building, when such assault or assault and battery therein committed shall tend to disturb any person or persons residing or being in the vicinity of such private house or building, shall be punished as provided in section 348.

Fight, riot
and disorderly

SEC. 350. Any person convicted of disturbing the public peace by engaging in or promoting or encouraging, aiding or abetting any fight, riot or noisy and disorderly proceedings in any street, square or other public place, or place of general resort within the city limits, or in any dwelling house or other private building, when such fight, riot or other noisy disorderly proceedings therein committed shall tend to disturb any person or persons residing or being in the vicinity of such private house or building, shall be punished as provided in section 348.

SEC. 351. Any person convicted of endangering or disturbing the public peace, or violating public decency by using any abusive, obscene or profane language, or making any threats of violence to or against any other person or persons, or by using profane, obscene or indecent language, or by being drunk, or by being noisy and disorderly in or upon any street, square or other public place within the city limits, or by racing or otherwise driving or riding in a furious manner any horse, or horses or cattle, or by the fast driving of any animal or animals or vehicles, or driving the same faster than an ordinary trot through the streets of the city, or by carrying any arms, such as pistols, knives (except pocket knives), sword canes, razors, or any other deadly weapon concealed about their person, or by bathing publicly within the city limits in the St. Johns river, or within any creek within said limits during daylight, or by making any indecent exposure of his or her person in any street, square or
