### OBSTRUCTIONS AND ENCROACHMENTS.

SEC. 389. It shall be and is hereby declared unlawful for any person or persons by means of any address, speech, musical or vocal performance, show, exhibition or attraction of any kind, made, exhibited or held upon any sidewalk, street or other public place in the City of Jacksonville, or place adjacent thereto, to cause the assembling of any crowd or company of persons upon any sidewalk, street or other public place, to the obstruction of such sidewalk, street or other public place, so that any person or vehicle may not freely and uninterruptedly pass thereon, without the consent of the occupants of the property adjoining the place where such meeting is to be held, and also written permission of the Mayor having been first obtained. The provisions of this section shall not apply to orderly parades or processions of societies or companies moving continuously along any of said streets. Assembling of

SEC. 390. It is hereby further declared unlawful for any person who shall have caused the assembling of any crowd or company upon any sidewalk, street or other public place in the City of Jacksonville, under the permission provided for in section 389, or any other person, to solicit from the persons so assembled or any of them the contribution of money or other thing of value, whether such solicitation shall consist of spoken, written or printed words, or of signs only, to be used directly or indirectly in aid or furtherance of the purpose or object apparently or ostensibly sought to be promoted by the means used in assembling such persons, or in aid or furtherance of any other purpose or object. SEC. 391. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be punished by fine not exceeding one hundred dollars, or by imprisonment not exceeding thirty days, in the discretion of the court. Penalty.

SEC. 392. Whenever the Board of Public Works shall find any street, park or other public place to be unlawfully obstructed or encroached upon, they shall be authorized to call upon the Mayor for such force of police as they may deem neces B 208.
