SEC. 654. Such deed shall be delivered within three months from the approval of this ordinance, and payment for said premises shall be made by the city on the approval of the title and on the delivery and approval of the deed, from the proceeds of the sale of Waterworks and Improvement Bonds, issued for that purpose.

SEC. 655. Every day in the week, Sunday excepted, is hereby declared to be a public market day, and a public market shall be held in, at and around the public market building, known as the central market, recently erected by the city on the west side of Ocean street, between Forsyth and Adams streets, and not elsewhere.

Market limits.

SEC. 656. No person shall sell or offer for sale at retail any fresh meats, dressed poultry, fresh fish, or market fruits or market vegetables at any time except during market hours, or at any place other than the said central market, within the territory bounded by the following lines, to-wit: Commencing at a point in the center of the channel of the St. Johns river at the intersection of the west line of Clay street, if said street were extended south to said channel; thence northerly along the west side of Clay street to the south side of Church street; thence easterly along the south side of Church street to the east side of Cedar street; thence northerly along the east side of Cedar street to the south side of Beaver street; thence easterly along the south side of Beaver street to the center of the channel of Hogans creek; thence down and along the center of Hogans creek to a point where the west line of Washington street would intersect the same, provided said west line of said street were extended northerly to the center of said creek; thence south along the west side of Washington street to the center of Duval street; thence easterly along the center of Duval street to the center of the channel of Hogans creek; thence southerly along the center of Hogans creek to the center of the channel of the St. Johns river; thence westerly along the channel of the St. Johns river to the point of beginning, which lines are hereinafter designated as the "market limits," and which said territory is hereinafter referred to as
