births, deaths and burials shall be kept by said City Health Officer at his office, in suitable books for that purpose, open to public inspection during office hours, and information regarding the same shall be furnished without charge upon request.

Burial Permits.

SEC. 714. In the event of the death of any human being within the corporate limits of the City of Jacksonville, it shall be the duty of the attending physician, or if no physician, the nearest relations of the deceased, the undertaker or coroner, to report the same within twenty-four hours to the City Health Officer, at his office, and to file with said health officer a certificate of death, specifying the name, age, sex, descent, cause of death, and other details required by the City Board of Health, upon blanks furnished for that purpose; and thereupon a burial permit shall be issued by the City Health Officer, directed to the city sexton, granting permission to bury the body of the decedent, at the same time describing it as above specified. The certificates of death and duplicate burial permits shall be kept on file at the office of the City Health Officer, and the city sexton shall file at his office the original burial permits, and shall also keep a correct record of all burials in accordance with the provisions of the city ordinance.

Births to be reported.
Ib., Sec. 4.

SEC. 715. In the event of the birth of a child within the corporate limits of the City of Jacksonville, whether legitimate or illegitimate, whether alive or still-born, it shall be the duty of the attending physician, or, if there be no physician, of the midwife or other attendant upon the mother, to report the same within forty-eight hours to the City Health Officer, and file a certificate of birth, specifying the place and time of birth, the sex and descent of the child and the name, occupation, age and descent of the father and mother, and other details required by the City Board of Health upon blanks furnished for that purpose.

Marriage licenses.

SEC. 716. It shall be the duty of the City Health Officer to obtain from the County Judge, or other proper officer, at least once a week, full information relating to all marriage licenses issued within the corporate limits of the City of Jacksonville, including the names, ages, descent and occupation of the contracting parties, of which information he shall keep correct records in his office.

Penalty.
Ib., Sec. 6.

SEC. 717. Any physician or other person whose duty it is under the provisions of section 714 and section 715 to make a report and file certificate of deaths or births, who fails to do so within the required time, shall, upon conviction before the Municipal Court, be fined not exceeding five hundred dollars, or imprisoned not exceeding three months.
