

be infected or exposed to infection from any such disease, and to cause such property to be fumigated or otherwise treated so that the health of the people may not be jeopardized.

QUARANTINE.

SEC. 730. The Mayor is hereby authorized to declare quarantine against any town, city or locality in which he may have good reasons to believe yellow fever or smallpox exist, and establish and enforce the same within five miles of the city, so as to prevent the introduction of contagious diseases in the city, whenever in his judgment such action is advisable.

Mayor may declare and enforce quarantine. Ord. 70, April 25, 1889.

SEC. 731. Every house, building and other structure, and all premises in the city which are in an unsanitary condition so as to be dangerous or detrimental to the health of persons residing or being in the vicinity thereof, or which are liable to spread disease by reason of such condition, are hereby declared to be nuisances.

SEC. 732. It shall be the duty of the health officer to inspect any and all houses, buildings and other structures, and all premises which he may suspect to be in an unsanitary condition, so as to be dangerous or detrimental to the health of persons residing or being in the vicinity thereof, and upon finding the same in such unsanitary condition, he shall immediately notify the owner, agent of the owner, or other person having charge or control of such house, building or other structure, or premises, to place the same forthwith in a sanitary condition and complete the same within a reasonable time to be named in the said notice, by the destruction of the said building, or otherwise, in the discretion of the health officer, and, if by him deemed necessary, the health officer may by such notice forbid such owner, agent of the owner, or other person in charge of such premises to let any person into the possession thereof while in such condition, except for the purposes of inspection and making such repairs or destruction, and the said health officer may, if by him deemed necessary, require the occupants of such house or building to remove therefrom within forty-eight hours after being notified so to do.

Removal.

Upon receiving such notice, the owner, agent of the owner, or other person having charge or control of such premises, or such occupant, shall be required to comply with the requirements thereof within the time specified therein; Provided, That if such occupants within the said forty-eight hours shall place said premises in a condition satisfactory to the health officer, such action on their part shall be accepted in lieu of a compliance with the order to remove.
