

make all necessary preparations for said election, and shall pay all the expenses of said election out of the contingent fund in the city treasury. The ballots for use in said election shall be in substantially the following form:

Each cross mark on said ballot in front of the word "For" shall constitute a vote of the elector making such cross mark in favor of the proposition to issue said bonds, as provided for in and by this ordinance, and each such cross mark in front of the word "Against" shall constitute a vote of the elector making such cross mark, as a vote against said proposition.

If a majority of the votes cast at said election shall be "For approval of the issuance of the bonds proposed to be issued," then the bonds in the ordinance provided for shall be thereby authorized, and shall be issued; but unless a majority of the votes cast at said election shall be so cast in favor of said proposition, said bonds shall not be issued.

Provisions for

SEC. 845. The Election Commissioners shall, at least six days before the day of said election, appoint three inspectors and a clerk of election, to hold said election in each ward of the city. If any inspector or clerk of election so appointed fails to attend at the proper polling place at the time for opening the polls on the day of election, those inspectors present shall fill the vacancies, and if all the inspectors be absent, then those persons present qualified to vote shall fill the vacancies. The polls shall be opened at 8 o'clock a. m. and closed at sundown, with an intermission of half an hour between 12 and 1 o'clock, and shall be located at, or as nearly as practicable to, the polling places used in the last city election. The inspectors and clerk of election in each ward shall make out and sign duplicate returns of said election and deliver one copy thereof to the Recorder, and one copy to the Chairman of the Board of Election Commissioners, said
