

of fire), and any person who shall obstruct such tracks, or parts thereof, or otherwise retard the progress of said cars, after due notice given by the car bell or whistle, or other proper signal, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding five dollars or imprisonment not exceeding five days.

SEC. 1286. In consideration of the requirements made under the provisions of this ordinance for the payment to the City of Jacksonville of the moneys mentioned in section 1281, and of the obligations as further provided in this ordinance to be kept and performed by said Jacksonville Street Railroad Company, it is hereby provided that in the event any franchise, privilege, right, right of way or authority not now legally existing, or for a longer time than now existing, shall be given or granted, or extended to any person, firm, association or corporation other than the grantee in this ordinance, or for the operation of any street railway on Bay street, or any other streets upon which the grantee herein is by this ordinance granted a right of way, and the city shall permit to be operated railways or street railways thereon in competition with the grantee herein, then from such time the grantee herein shall, for the remainder of the term of thirty years from and after the date of the publication of this ordinance, have all the rights, privileges, authorities and rights of way herein given or granted, free and relieved from the payment to the city of the percentage of the gross receipts from the operation of said street railway lines operated under the provisions of this ordinance, hereinbefore mentioned and provided for.

SEC. 1287. The said Jacksonville Street Railroad Company shall, within sixty days after being notified by the Mayor, in writing, of the approval of this ordinance, notify the City Council in writing of its acceptance of the provisions and conditions of this ordinance. And the failure on the part of the company to notify the City Council within sixty days after the receipt of notice of the approval of this ordinance, as herein prescribed, of its acceptance hereof, shall operate as a forfeiture of all rights and privileges granted and provided in this ordinance.

MAIN STREET RAILROAD COMPANY.

SEC. 1288. The Main Street Railroad Company is hereby granted the right of way over the following streets and parts of streets in the City of Jacksonville, to-wit: Commencing at the intersection of Main and Bay streets and running northerly along said Main street to the intersection of Main and Eighth streets, in Springfield; thence easterly along Eighth street to the intersection of what is now known as Walnut and Eighth streets, in said Springfield; thence southerly along said Walnut street to the intersection of
