

on each side thereof, so as to conform to the established grade, making the needed repairs with like material used in said paving. Whenever and wherever the city or the owners of abutting property on any street shall have paved, or shall pave or cause to be paved any street, or part of street, on which said company now has or shall have its tracks, or any part thereof, the said company shall, at the same time, or upon notice given by the Board of Public Works, and under its supervision and direction, pave the space between its rails and tracks, and at least two feet on each side thereof, in the same manner and with the same material as is used in paving the remainder of said street, and shall maintain the same in good order and condition, to the satisfaction of the Board of Public Works; and the said company shall, within sixty days after its acceptance hereof, on notice given by the Board of Public Works, pave the space between its tracks and for at least two feet on each side thereof, on any and all streets and parts of streets where its tracks are now laid and where such street is paved. Said paving shall be of the same material and laid in like manner as said paving of the remainder of such street or part of street. At all crossings on unpaved streets the said company shall, under the supervision and direction of the Board of Public Works, cover the space between its tracks and between the rails of its tracks, and even therewith, for at least twenty feet wide, and the approaches thereto on each side, with good and substantial plank, and shall maintain the same in good repair and condition, to the satisfaction of the Board of Public Works.

Crossings.

SEC. 1291. The laying of said tracks, crossings and approaches at crossings and the location of wires and poles within the city limits and maintaining the same shall be under the supervision of the Board of Public Works, and shall be done in accordance with its instructions.

SEC. 1292. No freight shall be carried on such lines except the usual hand baggage of passengers, or of persons going to or returning from market.

SEC. 1293. The City Marshal and salaried police officers of said city shall have the right to ride free of charge on the cars of said company.

SEC. 1294. The said company shall run its cars for the accommodation of passengers to the extremities of its tracks as laid not less often than once in every twenty minutes between the hours of 6 in the morning and 10 in the evening.

SEC. 1295. The fare charged by said company from any point on its line to any other point on its line shall not exceed five cents; but for a round trip they shall be allowed to charge ten
