

## RULE VI.

All resolutions and amendments thereto shall be sent to the Recorder's table and read by him before they shall be in order. All motions and amendments thereto shall likewise be reduced to writing at the request of the presiding officer or any other member, and shall be sent to and read by the Recorder before debate.

## RULE VII.

All questions relating to the priority of business shall be decided by the presiding officer without debate.

## RULE VIII.

The Recorder shall have at every meeting of the Council a list of unfinished business of the previous meeting, and a separate list of unfinished business generally in the order of its introduction, which shall be read without motion when that order is reached.

## RULE IX.

Motions and resolutions may be withdrawn by the mover at any time before amendment or putting to a vote.

## RULE X.

The presiding officer shall decide all questions of order without debate. From his decision an appeal may always be taken by any member as a matter of course, and on such appeal such officer shall have the right to briefly assign his reasons for decision.

## RULE XI.

When a member is called to order he shall immediately sit down and the presiding officer shall pass upon the point of order.

## RULE XII.

No member shall speak at any meeting more than twice on the same question, nor more than fifteen minutes at any time.

## RULE XIII.

The yeas and nays on any question before the Council shall be taken at the call of any member.

## RULE XIV.

After the decision of any question, it shall be in order for a member voting in the majority to move a reconsideration at the same or the next regular meeting. If a motion to reconsider be lost, it shall not be renewed without the unanimous consent of
