Pantry reaching out for young volunteers

Local runners had a treat last Saturday morning when they got the chance to enjoy their hobby while raising money for a local charity. Twenty-one runners from Bradford and Union counties lined up on Call Street at 8 a.m. on June 28 to run the First Annual Bradford County Food Pantry Freedom From Hunger 5K Race to benefit the Bradford Food Pantry. Scotty Peirce in the field of male competitors and Amanda Lazenby in the female ranks won

the run, which took a little over 20 minutes for the fastest runner in the field. The route for the run began at the square downtown and continued to the end of the sidewalk on Call Street, turning left on 25th Avenue to a left on Wilson Springs Road, then another left on Parker Street. From there runners took another left on Powell Street, then a left again on Colley Road, finally feeding back onto Call Street and the finish just past the starting line. Some ran, some walked, but all completed the course under the watchful eyes of Food Pantry Volunteer Coordinator Betty Warren, the Rev. John Faulkner, timekeeper Paulette Sikes and Fundraising Chairman Bob Milner. Trophies were given to the two winners. In all, the run raised nearly \$300 for the food pantry.

Woman arrested in crime against child

Additional charges for perpetrator

A woman has been implicated in the sex crimes committed against a young victim.

Brandy Lee Foreman, 32, of Keystone Heights was arrested June 17 for allegedly knowing the child was in danger and doing nothing about it.

The child was allegedly assaulted by Jason Anthony Green, 33, who was arrested June 13 for sexual battery on a victim under 12 years old.

The victim disclosed the abuse to a family member, describing incidents that began with inappropriate behavior in Clay County but progressed to sexual assault in Starke.

According to the report from the Bradford County Sheriff's Office, Foreman, who was involved with Green for more than a year, was there for it. Previously unaware of her location, law enforcement picked her up walking down the side of the road on June 17.

The victim said Foreman was in bed with Green and the child when the abusive behavior began in Clay County. Foreman herself told the sheriff's office that after they moved to Starke, she walked in on Green assaulting the child.


That was just a few months ago, according to her interview. But in spite of what she witnessed, she took no action to protect the victim, either by removing the child from the situation or reporting the abuse to law enforcement.

Crack cocaine, prescription medication and heavy alcohol use were also mentioned in the report.

Foreman is in custody at the Bradford County jail on charges of failing to report a crime and child neglect. Bond is set at \$50,000.

Green also remains in custody with bond set at \$1 million, and he is now facing a second charge of sexual assault.

After news of Green's arrest, a friend of Green's asked another child if Green had abused them, and additional abuse was disclosed. The complainant contacted the sheriff's office immediately, and

Three new school principals appointed

Vacant principal positions in Bradford County schools have been filled with some familiar faces and one new one.

The school board approved Superintendent Chad Farnsworth's administrative appointments June 30. It was not a complete roster. A few positions remain to be filled.

The three elementary school principal positions, left vacant

by recent retirements, are vacant no more. Jennifer Vaughan, previously assistant principal at Starke Elementary, will be principal at Lawtey Elementary. Earnest Williams has been transferred from principal at Bradford Middle School to principal at Southside Elementary. The new hire is Talitha Chestnut, who will be principal at Starke Elementary.

Williams' transfer allowed BMS Assistant Principal

Mallory McConnell to move up to principal. The promotions have left the assistant principal positions at BMS and Starke Elementary empty for the time being.

Williams already has an assistant at Southside, however. Denise Ricks, formerly a curriculum resource teacher at Lawtey Elementary, will be taking over that position from Sherree Alvarez, who is becoming a district level reading

coach.

Lisa Graham and Lynn Bryan have retired from the district, but while Lynn Melvin will no longer be an administrator, she is returning to the classroom teaching kindergarten at Brooker Elementary.

The administrative team at the high school — Principal Bryan Boyer and assistant principals Jennifer Farnsworth and Anthony

Moore gets five years

Former Hampton Mayor Barry Moore has had his day in court, and now he will serve time in prison.

Judge Robert Groeb sentenced Moore to five years in a state prison June 24 with credit for time served. He was assessed fees totaling \$668.

Moore was only in office a couple of months when he was arrested for possessing and selling Oxycodone. Past entanglements with the legal system included traffic, battery and domestic violence.

Moore became a poster boy for corruption in the small town, although a state audit released a couple of months after Moore's November 2013 arrest had a lot to say about the practices of other city officials, including the former city clerk and police marshal. Among the problems were nepotism and the collection and use of city funds.

arrangements were made for an interview between the child and a member of the University of Florida's Child Protection Team on June 24.

The victim, who was also under 12, described assault that took place in Starke and identified Green as the perpetrator.

As with the original case, Green did not admit guilt.

An criminal investigation was launched by the State Attorney's Office, with assistance from the Florida Department of Law Enforcement and Bradford County Sheriff's Office, but no one else has been charged.

In the meantime, the Hampton City Council has been at work turning around perception of

the town by tackling problems highlighted in the audit. The biggest achievement — with the help of a small but vocal populace — has been saving the city from a legislative movement to eliminate it.

The city is also preparing for an upcoming election that will replace the entire council and make more permanent changes through amendments to the city's charter.

Among those changes is the elimination of the position Moore had to relinquish following his arrest. With voter approval, the position of mayor will be gone as an elected post. Instead, elected council members will choose one of their own to be mayor, whose responsibility will be limited to duties such as running the meetings.

There was no word as of press time where Moore would be serving his sentence.



High school report cards on hold

Secondary level report cards for Bradford County schools have been delayed indefinitely while the district updates technology with current state requirements.

Families were initially notified of the delay June 19, but when it was clear grades wouldn't be ready by the end of the month as announced, they were told they would be notified when report cards were ready for pickup.

Changes in course and graduation requirements — which come from the Florida Legislature through the Department of Education — have fluctuated in recent years with the introduction of new assessments. As a result, the requirements for the class graduating this year can vary from the classes following it.

One example is how performance on end-of-course exams impact final grades. In some cases, when an EOC assessment is introduced, passing

the test is required for credit and graduation. In some cases it isn't. Eventually, all are supposed to count for toward a percentage of the final grade, but they don't all count toward that grade for every class still enrolled.

It's complicated and, according to Bradford school officials, it was made more complicated by a change in the law made retroactive to this past school year.

Assistant Superintendent Lisa Prevatt said the change conflicted with what the district had set in its pupil progression plan for secondary students. While the district is allowed to exceed the minimum state standards, in this case, when it came to including performance on the Algebra I EOC in the grades of students it need not apply to, it didn't seem fair. Instead, Prevatt said they decided to follow the requirements of the law.

Parties at the high school were brought together June 30 to determine how the impacted grades would be calculated and

recorded in the computer system so they would show up on report cards and transcripts in a way that makes sense to everyone, Prevatt said.

Recalculating grades for those students whom performance on the EOC for algebra does not apply requires some reprogramming of what was already in place. Technology and Records Director Steven Miller told the school board Monday that he was still writing code for the system and there was no set date for when report cards would be ready.

Some changes in course requirements for a standard diploma include the ability to substitute a rigorous computer science course offering industry certification for one of the three required science credits. In addition, students who entered ninth grade last year and all future classes will be required to take Algebra II as one of their four credits in mathematics.

Fireworks are an exciting part of Fourth of July celebrations, but the colorful fun they provide can easily turn into a dangerous situation if not used safely and properly.

The Florida Forest Service recommends the following precautions for approved safe fireworks use:

- Adhere to all county and city fireworks laws and restrictions.
 - Use approved fireworks outdoors, away from dry grass and buildings. Use approved fireworks in parking lots, driveways, gravel or dirt areas.
 - Follow label instructions on how to properly discharge approved fireworks.
 - Only use approved fireworks with close adult supervision.
 - Keep a bucket of water, wet towels and a garden hose nearby.
 - Discard used fireworks; never try to relight them.
 - Allow used fireworks to cool thoroughly before handling to avoid possible burn injuries.
- Help reduce children caused fires by teaching kids that matches, lighters and fireworks should never be used without adult supervision. Teach kids how adults stay away from dead grass and brush and keep water nearby.

About the food pantry

In the mid-1980s a group of seven churches pooled their resources to create a central location where area residents who were having difficulties could go for food. These churches were St. Edwards Catholic, First Baptist of Starke, First Christian, First United Methodist, First Presbyterian, St. Mark's Episcopal and Kingsley Lake Baptist.

The Bradford Ecumenical Ministries Food Pantry started out in a little building behind Winn Dixie, but soon moved to a building donated by Joe and Clarice Wood on Andrews Street, located across U.S. 301 from Powell's Dairy Freeze, where they are still located today.

Arley McRae has been the director of the Food Pantry for nearly 20 years and, like

everyone there, is an unpaid volunteer. The operation has been a nonprofit organization since it began. He said the facility is run by a board that is elected every year and oversees policy. As well, each church in the area that is involved with the project (and there are many more than the original seven) has an elected representative who also votes.

McRae said many of the local service organizations, individuals and businesses are also involved with supporting the work. With their help, several annual fundraisers are held each year to provide cash to augment the food donated by Walmart, Publix, Winn Dixie and others.

Warren works most closely with the volunteers and said she hoped that events like the race would get the attention of the young people in the county because the pantry is desperately in need of volunteers.

"Currently, we have about 22 volunteers working regularly,"

Warren said. "We actually need about 40, plus some volunteers for paperwork and a few men to do the heavy lifting. We can work with volunteers on scheduling. We only ask one four-hour shift each month. We are a way in which area teens can accumulate the community service hours they need for school."

The Food Pantry serves a large part of the Bradford County community and has since its inception. In its first year, the pantry provided food to 2,301 people in 666 families. Last year, that number had increased to an all-time high of 18,570 individuals in 4,909 families.

"With the economy recovering so slowly, if at all, we don't expect our service numbers to go down any time soon," Warren said. "We need the community to become even more involved so that we can say, as a community, that we have done our best to see that no one has gone hungry when it could have been prevented."

His father established quite a legacy as a head coach. Now, Corey Green is looking to start a legacy of his own after being hired as Bradford High School's new head football coach on June 26, with final approving occurring at a June 30 school board meeting.

"I feel honored and humbled to come away with the position," said Green, who served as assistant head coach at Fleming Island High School last season.

Green has a 12-year coaching career, which included a three-year stint as head coach at Hamilton County High School from 2005 through 2007. He is the son of Danny Green, who compiled a 254-106 record in 31

Bradford was put in the position of having to hire a coach after Steve Reynolds resigned after two years on June 12. Green admitted the timing of taking a head coaching job is "not great," but said the job at BHS had what he was looking for. He likes the opportunity of coaching in a county that has only one high

school. Plus, he doesn't live far from Bradford County. He and his wife live south of Middleburg.

"It was very appealing to me," Green said of the job.

Green, after playing at the University of South Carolina and Carson-Newman College, started his coaching career in 2001 at Cook High School in

93-year-old Cox proud to have served on LST in WWII

Glenn Cox downplays his service in World War II. He'll tell you working in the engine room aboard an LST (landing ship, tank) kept him mostly out of harm's way. He even expresses disbelief at the fact he was awarded a Purple Heart, saying he may have been injured in a war zone, but the injury was the result of an accident of his own doing, not the enemy's.

The 93-year-old Union County resident, though, takes a tremendous amount of pride of having been aboard an LST and even donated money to restore LST-325, which is now docked in Evansville, Ind., as a museum/memorial.

"I don't believe we'd ever have won the war if we didn't have the LSTs," Cox said. "Dozens and dozens of jeeps and trucks and stuff that we got to the beach never would've gotten there if they'd had it on a cargo ship. They'd never have gotten to the beach with it."

Cox served more than three years in the Navy before putting in approximately another 17 years of service with the Air Force.

"I was crazy to have ever gotten out of the Navy," Cox said. "I would've probably come out a rank higher if I had stayed in the Navy."

Then, with a mischievous twinkle in his eye, Cox added, "Like they say, you have to have your nose in the right place in the Air Force to get anywhere."

Cox grew up as one of 12 children on a farm in Illinois. (It would've been 13 children if a sister hadn't died approximately eight hours after birth.)

"They raised big families up there, you know, because they had to have workers," Cox said. He laughed as he talked about his parents having "two" families.

"They had a family of older (children), and then they started in again and had another batch," Cox said. "I was about the middle one."

Cox admitted he knew little of what was going on in the world prior to the attack on Pearl Harbor, but he wasted little time in joining the war effort after that morning of Dec. 7, 1941.

"When I heard about (the Pearl Harbor attack), I made up my mind right then I was going to go in the service."

Cox, who was 21 and married at the time, attempted to enlist in the Marine Corps, but said he was rejected for weighing only 113 pounds.

"I went across the hall and joined the Navy," Cox said.

Great Lakes Naval Training Station was the start of the journey. From there, Cox went to diesel school in Chicago before going to Portland, Ore., where he boarded LST-452. The LST

sailed to Brisbane, Australia, and was the first LST to cross the Pacific Ocean, Cox said.

It wasn't a fast crossing by any means, Cox said, explaining the LST's top speed was 12 knots.

"An LST was what we called a 'large, slow, target,'" Cox joked, despite his love for the ship.

Brisbane was the location of Gen. Douglas MacArthur's headquarters. Cox recalled how he was on the same beach, though on a different ship, when MacArthur made his return to the Philippines. Though he didn't actually see it, Cox said he heard that MacArthur waded through the water several times from his ship to the beach as photographer's captured the iconic image.

"Well, I guess he wanted to make sure they knew he returned," Cox said.

In all seriousness, Cox thinks highly of MacArthur and his actions.

"I think MacArthur was the greatest general there ever was because he bypassed a lot of islands, where if he went in and hit the beaches there, there would have been a lot of boys killed. He would bypass some islands that had Japanese on them. I think he saved a lot of lives."

The last landing Cox experienced aboard his LST was in the Philippines. He said it was probably his scariest moment during the war. He said an LST alongside his was on fire. Plus, the skipper of the LST Cox was on disobeyed orders from higher-ranking officers who wanted the LST to back away from the beach. The LST was getting fired upon, but Cox said the skipper realized the ship would take more hits if he backed away from the beach.

"Our skipper, they were going to court martial him because he wouldn't back off," Cox said. "He explained to them why he wouldn't back off. If he'd have backed off the beach, probably several more would've gotten killed."

Cox said working in the engine room of the LST is probably the main reason he's still alive today. He wasn't as susceptible to getting hit by enemy fire as men on the top deck were.

Aside from scary moments in the Philippines, Cox doesn't look upon his war experience as having been that traumatic.

"Some veterans might have been through a lot tougher things than I did," Cox said. "You take some of these Marines that

saw some horrible stuff they don't want to talk about. Most everything I've seen hasn't been that bad."

Cox admitted he was thankful he wasn't in Europe where he possibly could've seen concentration camps.

"That's something I'm glad I didn't see—the Jews that were killed over there," he said.

When the war came to an end, Cox was in the Panama Canal Zone. He was later discharged from the Navy on "points."

Cox stayed out of the service for 18 months. He tried to rejoin the Navy, but said there were too many of his rank. Instead, he joined the Air Force.

While stationed at Edwards Air Force Base in California, Cox got to see—and hear—the rocket-powered X-15 aircraft that were part of a research program NASA conducted with the Air Force, Navy and North American Aviation Inc.

He also got to know Chuck Yeager while he was in the Air Force. Cox said the two were in the same "rod and gun" club.

Cox also had an interesting encounter with an actress he can't remember the name of while in the Air Force.

"When Bob Hope came over to Japan with his troupe, he had two or three girls with him," Cox said. "This girl, she said, 'I forgot my pea jacket. It's in my luggage up there in that truck. Can you help me up there?'"

"I looked her over. She had on these tight britches, and I thought to myself, 'How am I going to get her up there in that truck?' As I was lifting her up there, I just took both of her cheeks, you know, in my hands and pushed her up there on that truck."

Though he can't remember her name, Cox said, "She felt pretty solid."

Cox, who had since divorced his first wife and remarried a woman with children, said it was at that moment—when his hands were on the woman's rear end—that his stepson Jerrell Ellis, who was in the service, caught him. Cox laughed as he remembered Ellis saying, "Wait 'til I tell

Mom."

Avis Dukes was Cox's second wife. They met while Cox was stationed at MacDill Air Force Base in Tampa. A neighbor of Dukes' was stationed at MacDill as well, and he would take Cox home with him on weekends. Home was in Columbia County, where Dukes lived on an 80-acre farm with four children.

"I came down south to get the best girl I ever had," Cox said.

He and Dukes were married for 49 years before her death on Nov. 22, 1997.

Following his service with the Air Force—he retired in 1964—Cox went to work at the Reception and Medical Center for just over two years as a boiler operator. He transferred to Florida State Prison, where he worked another 11 years.

Cox lives in a house he built for himself and Avis between Lake Butler and Worthington Springs on S.R. 121. He is a member of Grace Christian Fellowship Baptist Church and occasionally visits Sardis Baptist Church. (He used to be a member of Philippi Baptist Church in Columbia County with Avis.)

He has found a home in the South. Cox said his son from his first marriage, Ronnie, has tried to talk him into moving back to Illinois to live with him, but his response is, "I'll never leave Florida."

Cox has become good friends with his neighbors, Rodney and Carol Prins. Carol Prins said she has enjoyed having coffee with

Adel, Ga. He was an assistant for four years, serving as offensive coordinator for the last two years.

In 2005, Green returned to Florida, accepting the head coaching position at Hamilton County High School at the age of 27. He went 11-18 in three seasons at Hamilton County before resigning to become offensive coordinator and assistant head coach at Orange Park High School, where his father was hired as head coach.

"I wanted to work for him and try to learn how he did things," Green said.

The biggest thing he learned from his father, Green said, was how to manage a coaching staff and ensure that coaches and players were all on the same page.

"He taught me a lot about how to do that and how to go about doing it the right way," Green said.

Orange Park went 34-22 in the five years Green and his father coached there. The school had won only two district championships in its history, but went on to win three straight in 2008, 2009 and 2010.

In his one year as assistant head coach at Fleming Island,

the Golden Eagles put together the second undefeated regular season in school history and finished 10-1 after a loss in the first round of the playoffs.

Farnsworth said he feels good about hiring Green because Green wasn't putting his name in for every head coaching opportunity that became available. He knew what he wanted, and Bradford High School was that school.

"What he was looking for was a small, rural community with one high school and one that he could put back on the map," Farnsworth said.

Green said it will take time and a lot of work as Bradford tries to rebound from a 3-7 season, though it was a season in which the Tornados qualified for the playoffs. Numbers were down in the spring as just over 30 players were attending practices.

"I'm willing to put in the time and effort it takes," Green said. "I know it's not a one-year turnaround."

Green said he would soon be getting out in the community, talking to current players and their families and describing to them his philosophies and what he wants to accomplish at BHS. The goal is to not only convince current players to stick with the program, but to also convince other kids, through word of mouth, to join as well.

Green stressed he has an open-door policy in which anyone, regardless of whether or not they played last year or in the spring, will be welcomed.

"My number-one priority right now is to try to touch the community through the kids and get the numbers back up," Green said.

In a portfolio that accompanied his resume and application, Green wrote that he envisions his offense operating out of multiple formations and running the ball 60-65 percent of the time. That is an estimate, though, as Green noted that the team will take what the opposing defense gives it.

"My philosophy on offense is that in order to win

championships, you must establish a strong running game and an efficient passing game," Green wrote in his portfolio. "I will use the run to set up the pass."

Green said his defensive philosophy centers on adapting to take away an opponent's strength and utilizing speed to create a blitzing and aggressive style of play. The key, though, is to keep it simple.

"I believe a confused defense is a passive defense, so we will keep it simple to allow our players to be aggressive," Green wrote in his portfolio. "The majority of the time, the most physical team will win, and we will strive to always be just that."

Green said he is looking forward to building upon the foundation already in place at BHS and "trying to take it to another level."

Farnsworth said, "I'm really excited about the future."



Warren said the expectation at the camp is for children to pay attention, give their all and do their best. The same applies to the classroom.






