## Deputies uncover meth lab

Hendry County deputies executed a search warrant on July 6 on a houseboat located at 1233 CR 78.

The location is on the north side of the Caloosahatchee River at the southernmost section of the property. The search warrant was signed by County Judge James D. Sloan.

According to sheriff's reports, members of the Hendry County Narcotics Unit entered the houseboat at about 12 p.m.

Inside they found Christopher Sean Cooper, 37, and Nona Gause, 56, in the living quarters of the houseboat. The inside was thick with haze and gases so deputies rushed the pair out onto the porch area and detained them.

Deputies reported a pungent chemical odor and after the pair was provided with their rights, Cooper told them he was in the middle of manufacturing meth in the bathroom and agreed to answer questions.

In the dining room deputies found evidence including two clear plastic bags of suspected meth, which field tested positive and weighed about

## New commander making history

Girl power ain't what it used to be.

No pink posies and Barbie dolls here, but Elmira "Myra" Johnson is making it felt at American Legion Post 130. In the end, it's not Girl Power - it's Veteran Power!

The first female commander of Post 130, Myra may be just getting her feet wet, but she has all the skills and experience necessary for the job, thanks to the Good Lord and Uncle Sam. From July 21, 1991, through October 20, 2000, she served aboard several ships, Myra learned to make her way on her own in the military. So being the first female commander of Post 130 is a natural for her.

Her first assignment was on

the destroyer tender USS Puget Sound out of Norfolk, Va.

Her experience working in the all-male environment in the Puget's print shop was an adjustment, she recalls, but mostly for the men. "After all," she notes, "I've always been a girl!"

When she first came on board, she was greeted by signs placed by her fellow lithographers like "No females beyond this point." They were testing her, trying to push her buttons. When she walked in and one of the sailors behind the counter told her no girls were allowed back there, she gave it right back, asking, "So,

## Comment requested on HCSO

A team of assessors from the Commission for Florida Law Enforcement Accreditation (CFA) will arrive on August 6, 2012, to examine all aspects of the Hendry County Sheriff's Office policies and procedures, management, operations and support services," Sheriff Steve Whidden announced today.

"Hendry County Sheriff's Office has to comply with approximately 260 standards in order to receive accredited status," he noted.

For more information regarding the CFA or for persons wishing to offer written comments about the Hendry County Sheriff's Office's ability to meet the standards of accreditation, please write: CFA, 3504 Lake Lynda Drive, Suite 380, Orlando, Florida, 32817.

Sheriff Steve Whidden said, "The Assessment Team is composed of law enforcement practitioners from similar agencies. The assessors will review written materials; interview individuals; and visit offices and other places where compliance can be witnessed."

The CFA Assessment Team Leader is Brad Hodge of the Satellite Beach Police Department. Other team members are Wendy Puglis of Martin County Sheriff's Office and Brian Hester of St. Lucie County Sheriff's Office.

Once the Commission's assessors complete their review of the agency, they report back to the full Commission, which will then decide if the agency is to receive accredited status.

Hendry County Sheriff's Office accreditation is for three years.

why are you back there?"

It was the right comeback and she soon became part of the team.

When the Puget was decommissioned, Myra was reassigned to the Shenandoah, another destroyer tender. She deployed on a Med Cruise, seeing Spain, Italy, Israel and France, and also was at Guantanamo Bay, Cuba. When the Shenandoah was also decommissioned, she was assigned to the aircraft carrier John F. Kennedy out of Mayport, FL - one of the first female sailors to serve on an aircraft carrier.

When she was undergoing a difficult pregnancy, she was assigned shore duty in Pensacola for two years. Her two youngest children require special care, so sea duty was out of question.

"I loved the military," Myra recalls, "but it's hard on a family."

Ultimately, she made the difficult decision to leave the Navy - she just couldn't leave her two young children to go out to sea.

A Collier County girl, Myra was born

in Naples and raised in Immokalee. She graduated from Immokalee High School in 1991. Her dad, Pedro Gonzalez, and grandmother, Aurelia Gonzalez (who will be 99 in September), are still there.

She joined the Navy right after graduation. At just 17 years of age, she embarked on a whole new life but she points out that people "mature fast in the military."

"It didn't faze me," she said, "I earned the right to be there."

She joined the Navy because she wanted to get away and see what the world was like.

"I always like to try something different," she added, "experience life."

Myra's oldest daughter Alyssa is going off to college and is now the one cautious to get out into the world. Myra just cautions her to remember that "Home is Home." After all, Myra herself was gone for nine years, but of all the places she could have gone, she returned to this area. Home.

Myra said she would recommend the military to young people but counsel them to stay single for their first four years.

"You need to have a strong, stable relationship to survive long deployments of up to two years," she points out, "You also need faith in yourself and to learn respect for authority to be successful in the military."

She added that the military teaches you not to take your blessings for granted; to appreciate what you've got.

In Myra's case, she said she had to beat the "trifecta" going into the military: she was female, Hispanic and young - all obstacles that not everyone has.

She said the military has been a source of pride in herself, but not because of

these obstacles. "It only has to do with being a proud American. You appreciate what you have more when you earned it."

Myra became acquainted with the American Legion when she and her husband, Richard, were looking for a place to renew their wedding vows. She didn't even know what the American Legion was, but when she met Legionnaires Tony Alvarez and Bill Davis she said she learned quickly.

Now her entire family are members of the American Legion Family. Last year Myra served as historian. Her husband, Richard Kohutek, is Sergeant-at-Arms of the Sons of the Legion and all four children, Alyssa, Bryce, Corbyn and Novie are Junior Legionnaires. They have all helped with the post's fish fries, blood drives and the veterans' organization's Fallen Heroes event, Memorial and Veterans Day celebrations as well as Christmas and Thanksgiving dinners. Alyssa attended Girls State and received the Legion Riders scholarship.

Myra feels it's important to "give back to the whole community," not just the veterans, and she is teaching her kids that ethic.

The Legion has some 300 members but is always looking for new ones. She said the Post members have a common respect for each other, no matter what their age, gender, background, when or where they served. The common denominator is - they all served.

Myra said over her year as commander, she hopes to guide the post to become even more involved in the community that has been so great in helping veterans with whatever they may need, to extend its ability to reach out.

In addition to the Legion, Myra is active in the Firehouse Community Center with her kids.

She wants to see local youth get involved in the Legion's Oracle contest for kids, a scholarship speaking contest promoting patriotism, and hopes to build the already successful blood drive and Children & Youth Fund projects.

She added that there is a misconception that the American Legion is a bar for old vets to tell war stories. It is a place where veterans can experience the comradeship of the military, but it is so much more. Commander Myra Johnson invites veterans, and anyone with a close connection to a veteran, to check out this organization.

For LaBelle's Legionnaires, the adjustment to its first female commander is already underway. The guys are learning fast: "She's not a lady, she's a veteran."

three grams. They also found two meth pipes with residue, a partially consumed marijuana cigarette (weighing just under a gram and testing positive for marijuana) and a coffee grinder (used to grind up pseudo tablets) with suspected pseudo ephedrine residue.

Scattered throughout the houseboat were numerous empty and partly used Coleman fuel containers, lye containers, draino containers and pseudo ephedrine boxes.

In the kitchen were garbage bags and lithium batteries cut open with the lithium extracted. Power aid bottles contained some type of mix of these items.

A bag of granule fertilizer was also found on a dining room shelf.

On the bathroom floor was a plastic bottle smoking, with a clear glass measuring cup and a white solid substance, which field tested positive for meth.

The solid substance had settled to the bottom and a clear liquid was at the top. The report stated that this was the final stage of meth.

Cooper said all the items belonged to him and that he made meth for personal use. He also advised officers that he is the owner of the houseboat, which is registered to him. Current papers confirmed the registration. Cooper had been living there for about three months and said he had manufactured meth there numerous times.

The suspected narcotics and some of the non-hazardous materials were collected for evidence.

The boat was left in Gause's control.

Christopher Sean Cooper, 37, was arrested and charged with producing methamphetamines, possession of methamphetamines schedule 1, possession of over 20 grams of marijuana and two counts of possession of drug equipment.

## The truth about bath salt stimulants

Bath salts were a hot topic this month due to the rise in erratic behavior from people who have used the drug. The truth is, though, that this is not an entirely brand new drug. Legislative action on this drug goes back to 2009 when a North Florida woman attacked her mother with a machete and state lawmakers began the push to ban the product from Florida.

### What are bath salts?

The drug called Bath Salts is very different from the product that you put into a bath. The only reason why they have the same name is because the products look similar like a fine powder. You will not find the "bath salt" drug at Bath & Body Works or Bed, Bath and Beyond. One will not get high by soaking their feet in Epsom Salt or taking a bath with Calgon.

The bath salt drug is considered a stimulant; it is made up of several chemicals. The chemicals are synthetic derivatives of cathi-

none, a central nervous system stimulant, which is an active chemical found naturally in the khat plant. Mephedrone and MDPV (3-4 methylene-dioxypyrovalerone) are two of the designer cathinones most commonly found in these "bath salt" products.

"Bath salt" stimulant products are sold in powder form in small plastic or foil packages of 200 and 500 milligrams under various brand names. Street names include: Bliss, Blue Silk, Cloud Nine, Drone, Energy-1, Ivory Wave, Lunar Wave, Meow Meow, Ocean Burst, Pure Ivory, Purple Wave, Red Dove, Snow Leopard, Stardust, Vanilla Sky, White Dove, White Knight and White Lightening.

### What are the effects?

People who abuse these substances have reported agitation, insomnia, irritability, dizziness, depression, paranoia, delusions, suicidal thoughts, seizures and panic attacks. Users have also reported effects including impaired perception of reality, reduced mo-

tor control and decreased ability to think clearly.

## Career Corner

### Counter-Productive Communication

Non-verbal communication during the job seeking processes is key to securing an interview. Some ways in which job seekers fail to connect to employers is how they address themselves when communicating during the application stage.

An easy way to turn off a potential employer is using inappropriate contact techniques through e-mail and voice messages.

In the daily course of e-mailing job notices to customers, I have seen many, many interesting e-mail addresses. Some e-mail addresses that job seekers use for personal communication are not appropriate for job seeking.

Consider the subliminal message effect on potential employers by the following e-mail addresses: politicalextremist@oustincumbent.com, amaturerocksinger@headbanger.com or flirtycutie@officeromancedrama.com.

While these addresses are highly fictionalized, if your e-mail address gives the impression that you would bring outside personal beliefs into the workplace, then

use a different address.

I suggest setting up an e-mail address just for job seeking purposes, using your first and last name, such as Ima.Worker@goodemployee.com.

I have also called customers and heard them answer the phone in unique ways or have left voice mail greetings reminiscent of a Yo-MTV episode.

Your personal greeting should clearly state your name in a pleasant tone, request that the caller leave a short message, and ensure the caller that you will return the call promptly. If you are able to take the call personally, ensure that background noise is limited and that you are not using hands-free devices such as Bluetooth or conference settings which can unpleasantly accentuate pronunciations.

How you answer and speak over the phone, and how your messages are interpreted, speaks volumes of how you will interact with customers.

As a rule of thumb, when actively searching for employment, treat every phone call as a job interview and smile as you talk.

## Enjoy your summer, be safe

As the school year winds down, children look forward to the summer and having more time to play outdoors, but risks for childhood injuries increases.

### Water Safety:

Florida leads the country in accidental drowning of children between the ages one year to four years old. Please use water safety measures to help to prevent accidental drowning. Never leave a child unattended in a pool or spa and always watch your child when he or she is in or near water. Teach children basic water safety tips. Learn how to swim and teach your child how to swim. Learn to perform CPR on children and adults, and update those skills regularly. To get more information on Pool Safety, visit: <http://www.poolsafely.gov/>

### Heat and Sun Safety:

The American Academy of Pediatrics advises that children do not tolerate heat and humidity as well as adults. Drink plenty of water before, during and after physical activity to stay hydrated to void heat-related illnesses, such as heat exhaustion or stroke.

Everyone is at risk for skin cancer — regardless of age, race or ethnicity. Everyone should practice these sun-safe habits:

- Dress for summer by wearing lightweight, light-colored and loose fitting clothing to reflect heat and sunlight. Wear wide-brimmed hats to shade your face and neck from the sun.

- Consider swim shirts for the pool and beach. Swim shirts are designed for swimming, and some have SPF ratings of up to 150.

- Protect your eyes and skin by wearing sunglasses and sunscreen (SPF 15 or higher that protect against both UVA and UVB rays).

- Wear a hat to protect your face, scalp, ears and neck.

- Exercise and play in the shade during the hottest parts of the day when the sun's rays are strongest: between 10 a.m. and 3 p.m.

- Drink plenty of fluids, and avoid beverages that promote dehydration (such as alcohol, drinks with large amounts of sugar, and caffeinated sodas).

- Rest in shady areas when outside, or go inside to an air-conditioned space.

- Schedule an annual exam with your doctor that includes checking for any changes to your skin and, between exams, you should check your skin monthly for any changes (don't forget your back!).

### Bicycle and Walking Safety:

Ride with traffic and walk against traffic. Be aware of your surroundings, use sidewalks, trails, and lanes whenever possible and look for well-lit routes at night.

Helmets are required for bicycle riders under the age of 16 and being visible, however body injuries can occur at any age so it is safer for all persons to wear a bike helmet. Also, be visible by wearing bright or reflective colors at night.

Please remember that bicycle riders must obey the same traffic laws as motorists such as stopping at stop signs, staying in your lane, and using hand signals. Be a responsible bicyclist!

We enjoy great weather all year in Florida, but as we prepare for the summer months and rising temperatures, please use precaution and have a safe and healthy summer!

# Runners helping kids

Living healthier is always a great option. It may be difficult, but lifestyles can change whenever people make up their minds to it.

At just 24, Amber Williams Cohen is a wife and mother of two toddlers. You wouldn't think Amber would feel the need for more activity, but just six months ago she and her husband, Josh, decided to start running.

Besides a healthier lifestyle, the couple has another reason for the change. They began running in honor of his dad, Stanley Cohen, who died of melanoma two years ago and have started an organization called StanUP.

Amber has moved to the Coast, but is asking her former community to help out their cause with donations.

The couple works along with Team for Kids taking donations to help kids choose a healthy lifestyle.

Any donations received on Amber's behalf help provide free or low-cost school and community-center based health and fitness programs to children who would otherwise have little to no access to regular physical activity. Currently, their programs serve nearly 100,000 children each year in more than 400 schools.

Taking up running seriously is always a commitment, but with two little ones, just 15 months apart, Amber and Josh have to run in shifts.

The couple first researched the science of running using Danny Dreyer's book called ChiRunning.

Amber is a believer that Dreyer's techniques help increase distance, while decreasing injuries and fatigue through practicing proper posture, breathing and stride.

Now the couple runs 5-6 days each week and has adopted other healthier habits. For instance, Amber is a vegetarian, while Josh has gone all the way to vegan - eating no meat at all. They say their nutrition habits increase their energy levels.

Actually, Amber said she never liked to run and, once she made up her mind to go for it, she started small.

After becoming comfortable running a mile, she found she liked it and soon broke through the "wall," allowing her to increase her distance. They've both been working their way up since then. Applying the techniques they learned, they have come a long way in a short time.

She did her first half marathon last October at Gasparilla Tampa Bay in 2 hours 4 minutes. The couple did their second half marathon in May in New York.

At this time, Amber is running 9:15 minute mile; Josh a 7:00 minute mile.

Amber said she enjoys the challenge of it all.

"I never thought I could enjoy running," she admits, adding that it has even brought the couple closer - sharing their focus on the run.

Up at 5 a.m., they push each other, she explained. Their goal for the upcoming New York City Marathon (26.2 miles) this November is under 4 hours for Amber, under 3 hours 15 minutes for Josh.

If they like the NYC Marathon, Amber said they may start training for Chicago after that.

The NYC Marathon will be a big challenge, she said, because it includes running up inclines on the city's bridges, through all five boroughs and ending at Central Park.

Amber Williams Cohen graduated from LaBelle High School in 2005.

She is the daughter of Jamie Williams of Immokalee and Synda Maynard, who worked for the Hendry County Sheriff's Office for many years and still has a home in LaBelle.

Amber is a part time massage therapist and her husband is a sales trainer. They are hoping to enlist the help of old friends and neighbors in the area through their StanUP charity connection. ## Marijuana and Hendry Teens

When asked if they have smoked marijuana in the past 30 days most Hendry County teens say they haven't. But they believe that over 80 percent of their peers have (high school; 51 percent middle school). In fact, 23 percent of Hendry County High schoolers and 13 percent of its middle schoolers report smoking marijuana in the past month.

While most Hendry County teens don't smoke marijuana the unfortunate thing is they believe most kids are doing it. Studies show that if teens believe something is the norm they are more likely to engage in that behavior if presented with the opportunity.

Drug Free Hendry County does educate the youth of our county about the true norm and about the negative consequences of marijuana use however due to increased media coverage of the legalization of marijuana and very vocal proponents having much to say about the benefits of marijuana, your children are most likely learning that marijuana is safe and "not that bad."

DrugFree Hendry County would like to dispel some myths or half-truths about marijuana.

## Myth: Marijuana is a mood enhancer

Maybe short-term. Because marijuana affects brain function, your ability to do complex tasks could be compromised, as well as your pursuit of academic, athletic or other goals that require you to be 100 percent focused and alert.

In fact, people who use marijuana over the long term report less life satisfaction, poorer education, and job achievement, and more interpersonal problems compared to people who do not use marijuana. Marijuana has actually been associated to depression.

Tell your kids: "Brad Pitt says he quit smoking marijuana because he became lazy and stayed in the house all day, he was unmotivated to the point of turning down

work."

## Myth: Marijuana is safe medicine

In some states it is legal to use marijuana that was prescribed for medical reasons. When doctors prescribe any drug, including marijuana, it is because the benefits of that drug outweigh the risks. There are still risks involved in marijuana use. There are risks and side effects in all prescribed medicine, some more than others. There are some drugs that cause seizures, insomnia, sleepwalking, even some that put one at higher risk for suicide but licensed professionals have reason to feel that those drugs will help a sick patient get better or save their life.

The chemical in marijuana that helps people can be found in pill form, so in MOST cases there is no need to smoke it at all.

Tell your kids: "Marijuana is sometimes used to help people with terminal illnesses like cancer or serious painful injuries. Your quality of life is pretty good right now (no cancer, no debilitating illness or injury, you have no need to smoke marijuana. The statement "it's legal in some states" won't get you out of trouble in THIS state."

## Myth: Marijuana natural and safe

It may seem that marijuana is all natural but the reality is by the time you might get a hold of it there are many more chemicals in it. There is the fertilizer used to grow it. There are pesticides and herbicides used to protect it from bugs and disease. There are chemicals sprayed on it to improve "the high," Dealers sometimes "cut" other drugs into them to further improve the high because they want you to think they have the best weed around.

Tell your kids: "This is a business, if so many chemicals, additives, and hormones are put into and on the beef, chicken, fruits, vegetables, and grains that we have in the name of improving the product, what are the chances that the same isn't happening to marijuana and other "natural" drugs. The people selling you the drug probably don't care to provide you with an ingredient list, but they do want your money."

## Myth: Alcohol is legal and way worse than marijuana

Despite what is "worse" or "not so bad" marijuana and alcohol are both drugs and both of them should not be used by a minor.

Marijuana and alcohol both affect the brain. Both can cause a person to lose coordination. And just like alcohol, Marijuana can affect judgment and decision making, using it can cause you to do things you might not do when you are thinking straight—like getting in a car with someone who's been drinking or is high on marijuana.

Tell your kids: "I am your parent and despite what is or isn't legal I don't want you smoking marijuana because it will still have an effect on your health. There are many things that are legal because we live in a free country but that doesn't mean you should do all those things."

## Myth: Marijuana never killed anyone

THC's effects on the cerebellum and the

basal ganglia can cause disaster on the road. Research shows that drivers on marijuana have slower reaction times, impaired judgment, and problems responding to signals and sounds. Studies conducted in a number of localities have found that approximately 4 to 14 percent of drivers who sustained injury or death in traffic accidents tested positive for THC (an ingredient in marijuana).

Also, because marijuana slows your reaction time, you are more likely to hit a pe-

destrian or child that runs out into the road due to the fact you can't brake or avoid fast enough.

Tell your kids: "You may not hear about it as much, but there is still a chance you could hurt yourself or someone else. Do you really want to take that chance?"

Don't forget Synthetic marijuana has been involved in deaths. It has also done immediate damage to smokers who will never recover.




