School grades decline

The wait is over for Hendry County schools to get their annual district scoring from the Florida Department of Education. The state has raised the bar this year on academic standards, new assessments that measure students' progress toward meeting the standards and higher achievement levels for reading, math, science and writing.

A week after releasing the grades, the Department of Education recalculated school grades for districts around the state.

Central Elementary in Clewiston is the only Hendry County school affected by the recalculation. Originally Central Elementary receive a "B" grade, but after recalculation it was upgraded to an "A."

This is great news for Central Elementary students, teachers, administration and staff. Former Principal George Duckstein said it is all because of the hard work and dedication of his teachers and entire school staff along with the students, parents, district support, school board, community volun-

New face at SW Florida Works

Connie Cisnero is not only the Employment Security Representative for the Southwest Florida Works LaBelle office, she is living proof of how the program can help.

Connie was raised in LaBelle and had been a loan officer in a cash advance store. Like so many others in the area, she was laid off when the company she worked for failed. She began looking for a job, but knew she wanted to train to become a dental assistant.

Southwest Florida Works is in the business of matching up workers with potential jobs and helping make sure they have the skills necessary to land and be

successful in those jobs.

"I never knew this place existed," she said of the Southwest Florida Works office, until a relative told her about it. She said she first went to the Immokalee office to find help because she didn't know there was a center in LaBelle. Their Kuoman in Immokalee referred her to the LaBelle office. That was the beginning of her success story.

Connie needed a job and wanted to become a dental assistant. She met with Matt Kindermann of the LaBelle Workforce office, who had helped one of her relatives earlier, and soon found herself in a dental assistant program.

Unfortunately, there was another setback in store for her. She

graduated last December from the dental program, but found that dentists are reluctant to hire assistants who do not have experience - an old story.

But she was registered with Employ Florida, submitted her background, updated her information and put in a new resume.

Within just a few days she got a call from the Workforce office. They needed an employee for the LaBelle office. Matt Kindermann was being transferred to Immokalee - and they wanted to interview her for his position.

Connie was frustrated and upset after all the time and effort she put into her dental assistant training, but This felt Connie would

Budget tops county agenda

Hendry County commissioners set the tentative TRIM at 8.6045 mills, an increase of 1.3151 mills over this year, as recommended by County Administrator Judi Kennington-Korf. The 2011-12 millage rate was 7.2894, up from a number of years when the county held the line at 6.5 mills.

The action was taken at the Hendry County Commissioners meeting of July 24 in LaBelle. The tentative TRIM had to be set by August 4.

Commissioner Darrell Harris moved to set millage at 8.6045 mills. His motion was approved 3-1, with Commissioner Tris Chapman casting the only dissenting vote. Commissioner Janet Taylor was not at the July 24 meeting.

At this point in the process, the county's overall budget total for 2012-13 is expected to be some \$63 million, with a deficit of about \$2.2 million.

Between now and the end of September when the final TRIM must be set, commissioners and staff will be concentrating on whitening expenses, trying to make the amount of money coming in match the amount going out.

According to staff, most of the deficit has been caused by the Medicaid issue facing the entire

state. The State of Florida found that its accounting was in error and that many counties owe millions to the fund.

The final millage rate may be reduced after budget talks are finalized, but it may not be set above this tentative rate of 8.6045.

Budget workshops are continuing all this week.

Recreation

The commission is again confronting head on the continuing East Hendry County Rec funding issues. Commissioner Karson Turner confessed to having "heartburn" over this issue.

The request by the City of Clewiston for \$50,000 from the county this year, expressly excludes golf from being covered.

The interlocal agreement with the county covers Eastern county residents not residing

in City of Clewiston.

Commissioner Turner warned that the \$50,000 in the budget at this time may not make it through the budget process.

Referring to East Rec finances, he said, "The process is broken. We need to re-do the whole system."

County Commission Chairman Tris Chapman quickly recapped the past two years of East Rec financial history.

The current request from the county is \$250,000.

Al Perry said there is no bigger fan of youth recreation than him, but he pointed out that the county doesn't have the kind of money the department is asking for. He added that this is the worst timing possible.

Commissioner Turner said he would prefer to increase the non-ad valorem assessment for the department.

Clewiston City Commissioner Mali Gardner attended the meeting, offering to help get the rec department's finances back on track. She said that all interested parties need to sit down together to hash out a solution.

The question was deferred to budget workshops now in progress.

While on the subject of recreation, the commission approved Hendry/LaBelle Rec's request to use \$16,763.59 - about half of its available funding - to upgrade Bob Mason Park including pavilions.

Wayside Park

An offer to purchase Wayside RV Park was declined.

According to County Administrator Kennington-Korf, in July 2011 bids were rejected because they were less than the park's appraised value of \$250,000. The top bid at that time was \$225,500.

Correction

Probation moving

The State Probation Department is moving to the old DCF building in LaBelle on Cowboy Way with other judicial agencies.

The board discussed the need for providing them supplies, which is required for the State Attorney's Office and Public Defender's Office. The items was also written into the probation department lease.

After some discussion about the necessity for the county to pay for such expenses, the board finally approved the lease unanimously, feeling it all worked out in the end with the square foot rental amount.

teers and all stakeholders.

"Mr. Duckstein has done a great job at Central the last two years working with his staff and parents," according to Superintendent of Schools Rick Murphy. He has recently been appointed to the position of District Data Assessment Coordinator where he will work with all the schools and principals on data and assessment.

The new Principal for Central Elementary this coming school year is Mr. Jose Roquett, who formerly served as a Dean at Clewiston Middle, Assistant Principal at Clewiston High and Assistant Principal at West Glades. The Department of Education predicted schools across the state would drop a letter grade this year because of the new higher standards.

According to Gerard Robinson, Florida's Commissioner of Education, the combination of changes to Florida's accountability system has caused a temporary drop in some school grades.

This does not necessarily mean that the teachers or students are not doing as well as they were before. The tougher standards and new scores raised the bar. These chang-

es also make it difficult to compare scoring from previous years to the current scores. This can best be thought of as a transitional year for school grades.

In LaBelle, all three elementary schools dropped one letter grade this year. LaBelle Elementary went from a B to a C; Country Oaks from an A to a B and Upthegrove from an A to a B.

Grades for the other two Clewiston elementary schools - Westside and Eastside - remained the same as last year. Westside C, Eastside B.

Both LaBelle and Clewiston Middle Schools went from a C to a D.

High schools will not receive their grades until December.

Superintendent of Schools Richard Murphy said, "I and the Hendry County School Board will continue to work to provide our schools and teachers the resources they need to ensure that the students of Hendry County are provided the opportunity to be successful in school. Staff will use this year's school grades data to help plan improvement activities to increase student achievement in all schools across the district."

Household size and income criteria will be used to determine eligibility. An application can not be approved unless it contains complete eligibility information. Once approved, meal benefits are good for an entire year. You need not notify the organization of changes in income and household size.

Application forms are being sent to all homes with a letter to parents or guardians. To apply for Free or Reduced-Price Meals, households must complete the application and return it to the school. Additional copies are available at the principal's office in each school. The information provided on the application will be used for the purpose of determining eligibility and may be verified at any time during the school year. Applications may be submitted at any time during the year.

Households that receive SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) or TANF (Temporary Assistance for Needy Families) are required to list on the application only the child's name, SNAP/TANF case number, and signature of adult household member.

Foster children will receive free benefits regardless of the child's personal income or the income of the household.

Households with children who are considered migrants, homeless, or runaway should contact the district liaison **Jodi Bell at (863) 674-4108**.

For the purpose of determining household size, deployed service members are considered a part of the household. Families should include the names of the deployed service members on their application. Report only that portion of the deployed service member's income made available to them or on their behalf to the family. Additionally, a housing allowance that is part of the Military Housing Privatization Initiative is not to be included as income.

All other households must provide the following information listed on the application:

- Total household income listed by gross amount received, type of income (e.g., wages, child support, etc.) and how often the income is received by each household member;
- Names of all household members - check the "no income" box if applicable; if household member is a child, list school name for each;
- Signature of an adult household member certifying the information provided is correct; and
- Social security number of the adult signing the application or the word "NONE" for this household member if he or she does not have a social security number.

If a household member becomes unemployed or if the household size changes, the school should be contacted. Children of parents or guardians who become unemployed should also contact the school.

Under the provisions of the Free and Reduced-Price meal policy **DARRELL HARRIS** will review applications and determine eligibility. If a parent or guardian is dissatisfied with the ruling of the official, he or she may wish to discuss the decision with the determining official on an informal basis. If the parent wishes to make a formal appeal, he or she may make a request either orally or in writing to

Hidden Job Market

Only about 25 percent of jobs are advertised and open for outside applications. It is a striking thought to imagine that for every job that you see, there are three more - usually better jobs - that you do not know about.

These mystery jobs are called the "hidden job market." A common question is how one can crack this hidden job market and get that really good job that you would otherwise never know existed.

It is no small wonder that most of these hidden jobs are either available exclusively to existing employees or waiting for a person with a specific skill set to come along.

For instance, a company that outsources its marketing plan might consider promoting an existing employee who can provide the same service in-house, or the company may offer an in-house marketing position to an employee of the outsourced company.

To get yourself considered for these hidden opportunities it is important to identify

your capabilities to your existing employer, your customers and your vendors.

First, be happy to go to work, even if you hate your job. Be the best at what you do, even if it is cleaning the floors. You cannot be considered for advancement until you have mastered the basic duties. Second, position yourself for advancement by letting managers know that you can do more, without sounding like you do not appreciate your current position. Funny as it sounds, there is a thin line between selflessly contributing to company goals and sounding ungrateful.

If you are an internal candidate, apply or advancement opportunities but do not get discouraged if you are not selected. Your supervisors will know that you are trying and your name will stay at the top of their memory.

If you are an external candidate, make friends with someone at the company. Give them your resume and remind them to keep an ear out for possible opportunities, but be careful to not be overbearing by constantly asking if your inside contact has "heard anything yet."



Computer Corner

System Tools - Good to use!

The most common complaint about computers running the Windows operating system involves system speed. Last week we discussed how certain hardware upgrades might be helpful in speeding things up. This week, we'll talk about some related issues that can sometimes be handled with software. The best part is that the software is probably already installed on your hard drive because it is part of most Windows operating systems.

From our last article, we now know that starving the operating system for disk space can be a bad thing. While hard drive upgrades are definitely one way to go, there are times when cleaning up unneeded and unwanted files on the disk may just be all you

need. For this, there's a Microsoft tool called 'Disk Cleanup'. Microsoft describes this tool pretty thoroughly on its Web site:

"The Disk Cleanup tool helps you free up space on your hard disk by searching your disk for files that you can safely delete. You can choose to delete some or all of the files. Use Disk Cleanup to perform any of the following tasks to free up space on your hard disk:

- Remove temporary Internet files.
- Remove downloaded program files. For example, ActiveX controls and Java applets that are downloaded from the Internet.
- Empty the Recycle Bin.
- Remove Windows temporary files.
- Remove optional Windows components that you are not using.

• Remove installed programs that you no longer use.

Unless you're very savvy and can do some of the disk cleanup yourself, it is a good idea to run the Disk Cleanup tool periodically.

Disk fragmentation can seriously affect the speed of your system as well. Files are seldom written from start to finish on your hard drive. Your computer is 'smart' enough to find all sections of a file even though parts of it may be scattered across your disk. This scattering is called fragmentation. The Disk Defragmentation tool, or 'Defrag', realigns files on the disk, reducing the amount of 'scatter' and therefore reducing the amount of effort the drive must go through to retrieve and use any single file.

A good time to run defrag is after deletion of lots of files or any large files (like after running the Disk Cleanup, mentioned above).

'Defrag'-ing the drive is a good practice. How often you should defrag depends entirely on your computer usage. As always, when in doubt about anything involving your computer system, contact a qualified technician for help and advice.

be a "good fit" for the LaBelle office. Connie came to work at Southwest Florida Works on February 26. Although the position is not in the field she had envisioned for herself, Connie is very happy with the way things have turned out. She still gets to help people, which is what she said she always wanted. As a longtime LaBelle resident, she is also familiar with the plight of her clients. "I can relate," she said.

As Geri Yoraschek, employer and board member of the Education Center of Southwest Florida put it, "If you've ever looked for a job, you know what it feels like."

So it's easy for Connie to empathize with the desperation of job hunting. She really does understand.

Using the computer also scares some people, Connie pointed out. Now, the state requires anyone signing up for unemployment to do so on the internet. Anyone who doesn't have access to a computer can do this at the office, she said, and she can even show you how to do it.

Part of the process of looking for a job includes taking a standard assessment exam, which tests the job candidate on reading, cognitive skills and math, so a prospective employer can gauge their competence level for the job available.

Employ Florida is the state's job bank system for Southwest Florida including all sources. The system can narrow the information down to a specific field as small as a couple square miles for those who may have transportation issues. All you have to do is put your resume into the system. Employers can search Employ Florida for interesting resumes, especially those referred by the Southwest Florida Works Center.

Geri Yoraschek and her husband, Richard, have first hand experience using Southwest Florida Works to find employees. In addition to saving money by cutting through unnecessary information about potential workers, the system is also free for businesses.

Ms. Yoraschek said because Employ Florida has already taken care of screening candidates for the specific job your business has open, it can recruit employees without incurring any expense to the employer.

"It makes the process easy," she said, adding that recruiting can be especially expensive for small businesses like hers because it is so time intensive. When you're sorting through resumes and interviewing potential workers, you can't be doing your regular business. Connie said job seekers should pay extra attention to their resume. A good resume should be short and to the point with good grammar and punctuation.

Executive Director Joe Paterno said Southwest Florida Workplace provides classes and resources for job seekers. It's a place where you can get the training you need for the right job. He said the state has a target occupations list that the local board can add to, so you can get the training you need in a good job with a future. Mr. Paterno said the long range plan is to partner with Edison State College to have classes in the back room or the center.

The center can also set up an employer designed training program to cater to a business' specific needs, using educational resources from the county, school district, Edison, Education Center of Southwest Florida and other schools.

The center also tracks clients for one year after their training is complete.

As an employer, Ms. Yoraschek said attitudes have changed on employment. Employers don't want job hunters to come to their place of business any more. They would rather pick out the resume that seems the best fit for them. Going through the Southwest Florida Workforce allows the employer to fill positions with a minimum of expenditure of time and money.

Mr. Paterno has a hopeful eye on the future, saying he sees somewhat of an upswing in Southwest Florida's economy.

Southwest Florida Workforce has full service offices in Port Charlotte, Naples, Clewiston, Immokalee and Fort Myers; and two satellite offices in LaBelle and Cape Coral. Local companies are invited to call Connie when they need to hire someone, using their database of employees in the area to match up with an employer.

They can also set up on the job training and internships. Check out their Web site at www.swflworks.org for their many classes and programs. If, as Connie feels, you are "not aware of what we do here," you can contact Connie by email at ccisnero@swflworks.org, phone at 675-1412 or come in to the office at 921 Anvil Circle, off Cowboy Way and across from Fort Knox Storage.

Her success stories give Connie plenty of satisfaction. She recalls one man who came in every day doing job searches, and a woman who had been looking for work for three months and was finally referred to the State Attorney's Office. Finding a job takes a positive attitude and persistence, but if you're serious, either have or acquire some skills, you will be able to say with the pride one man did, "I'm not unemployed any more!"



Glades horse has mosquito-transmitted virus

GLADES COUNTY— A second Eastern Equine Encephalitis Virus (EEEV)-confirmed positive horse (onset has been reported from the Florida Department of Agriculture & Consumer Services (FDACS) for Glades County. This is the 13th horse with EEEV infection with onset during 2012. The Glades County Health Department encourages everyone to take basic precautions to help limit exposure to mosquitoes. You should:

Consult with your veterinarian on getting your horses vaccinated for Eastern Equine Encephalitis (EEE) and West Nile Virus (WNV). Avoiding mosquito bites is the best way to prevent disease. Protect yourself against mosquito-borne diseases by remembering to "Drain and Cover:"

Drain standing water to stop mosquitoes from living and multiplying around home or business.

- Drain water from garbage cans, or other containers where water has collected.
- Discard old tires, drums, bottles, cans, and other items not being used.
- Empty and clean birdbaths and pet's water bowls once or twice a week.
- Protect boats and vehicles from rain with tarps that don't accumulate water.
- Maintain swimming pools and keep them appropriately chlorinated. Empty plastic swimming pools when not in use.

Cover the skin to protect from mosquito bites and diseases mosquitoes carry.

Clothing - Wear shoes, socks, and long pants and long-sleeves.

Repellent - Apply mosquito repel-

lent to bare skin and clothing.

- Always use repellents according to the label, especially those with DEET, picaridin, oil of lemon eucalyptus, and IR3535.

- Use mosquito netting to protect children younger than 2 months old.

Cover doors and windows with screens to keep mosquitoes out of your house.

Repair broken screening on windows, doors, porches, and patios.

Tips on Repellent Use

Always read label directions carefully for the approved usage before you apply a repellent. Some repellents are not suitable for children.

Products with concentrations of up to 30 percent DEET are generally recommended. Other EPA-approved repellents contain Picaridin, oil of lemon eucalyptus, or IR3535. These products are generally available at local pharmacies. L

Apply insect repellent to exposed skin or clothing, but not under clothing.

In protecting children, read label instructions to be sure the repellent is age-appropriate. Mosquito repellents containing oil of lemon eucalyptus should not be used on children under the age of 3 years. DEET is not recommended on children younger than 2 months old.

Avoid applying repellents to the hands of children. Adults should apply repellent first to their own hands and then transfer it to the child's skin and clothing. If additional protection is necessary, apply a permethrin repellent directly to clothing.



Survey says: Most teens don't drink

Recently Drug Free Hendry County Staff discovered that many residents believe that most Hendry County Teens drink, some even suggesting that 90 percent of our teens drink and they must lie on our surveys. Other thoughts are that kids drink because they are bored. We'd like to address these misperceptions.

First, let's look at the numbers - At the end of the school year there were 1,868 teens en-

rolled in high school in Hendry County. That means that in order for "most" of them to be drinking, 1,681 would have had to get their hands on alcohol during a weekend in the past 30 days. That figure alone is enough to make you rethink the statement "everyone drinks".

As for teens lying on surveys, that's just plain silly. First, research shows that most people around the world are honest on

anonymous surveys. Second, knowing what we know about the teen brain, they would be more likely to lie about their negative behavior, not their positive non-drinking behaviors! The fact is however, our annual survey actually asks students, "Did you tell the truth?" the overwhelming majority of them say yes. Additionally, this is the fourth year we've given the same survey - that's four graduating classes that have all said about the same thing on this survey. It's one thing to think that teens might lie, but it's another to really believe that they would be lying the exact same way every year over four graduating classes. Let's give our teens a break - why is it so hard for us to believe that they make healthy decisions and that most of them are doing the right thing?

The surveys that we use for our data were completed here in Hendry County. Students from LaBelle High School, LaBelle Middle School, Clewiston High School, and Clewiston Middle School complete 2 surveys related to underage drinking.

The Florida Youth Substance Abuse Survey (FYSAS) is completed every two years in nearly every county in the State. The evaluation is professionally done by well-educated statisticians, mathematicians, and evaluators.

The Teen Social Norms Survey has been done each year in select counties throughout the state, including Hendry and Glades Counties. We have been administering it to students since 2008. This survey is evaluated by Dr. Greg Barker of Northern Illinois University.

There are questions built into both surveys to invalidate the inconsistent responders or liars. In fact, many students we talk to also feel many students lie on the survey but they themselves say they don't. I have found a couple of students who admitted they lied, out of the hundreds I've spoken to. Most students tell the truth - especially since it is a totally anonymous survey.

NOW for the statistics. Both surveys are pretty consistent across all responses.

Concerning alcohol THE 2010 FYSAS indicates that 33.3 percent of our high school teens have used alcohol in the past 30 days. That is almost five percent lower than the state average. It also indicates that 15.8 percent of students are binge drinkers - meaning they drink five or more drinks in a row. While it still indicates that most teens don't drink it raises a flag since about half of those drinkers are binge drinking - which is extremely dangerous.

The 2010 TEEN NORMS Survey indicates that 32 percent of Hendry County high school students report "they have had at least one drink of alcohol in the past 30 days". Yet when asked about their peers those same students believe that 81percent participated in the aforementioned behavior. This means that most (68 percent) of our teens are making good decisions, despite popular opinion. It is highly unlikely and probably impossible for any county to have a 90percent underage drinking rate. There are actually counties in the state that have a higher drinking rate than us - think college towns and spring break communities. Please also note that lifetime use and regular use are different and have different rates.
