County adopts tentative millage increase

At their September 11 meeting in Clewiston, Hendry County Commissioners set the tentative millage rate for fiscal year 2012-13 at 7.7926 mills.

The millage rate currently stands at 7.2894 mills. The rollback rate, the millage necessary to bring in the same amount of taxes as last year, is 7.3445.

The tentative millage rate represents an increase of .5032 mills and will generate an additional \$843,000 in propret taxes.

The commissioners feel the increase is necessary in order to cover the county's \$2.2 million shortfall, accrued from a huge unexpected Medicaid bill from the state. For

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BOCC rebuffs county administrator

County Administrator Judi Kennington-Korf has announced her intention to make a timetable for her resignation. The announcement came at the end of the September 11 county

commission meeting, at the prompting of Commissioner Karson Turner.

Commissioner Turner's motion to immediately dismiss Ms. Kennington-Korf was seconded by Commissioner Al Perry. It failed 2-3, with Commissioners Chapman, Taylor and Harris dissenting.

In a statement after the meeting, Chairman of the Hendry County Board of County Commissioners, Tris Chapman expressed concern and regret for the actions of some members of the Board of County Commissioners at Tuesday night's meeting in Clewiston.

"Judi Kennington-Korf has been a caring and passionate public servant and advocate for the citizens of our community for thirty-three years. Judi's contribution to Hendry County has been significant and I disagree with the actions of the board on a number of levels."

An attempt by the two young commissioners from Clewiston, Perry and Turner, to have the

County Administrator immediately step down was defeated when Commissioners Taylor, Chapman, and Harris voted 'No'. Commissioner Darrell Harris said that Ms. Kennington-Korf had already agreed to resign and should be given some time to put together a exit plan. "I don't know whether it should be a week or three weeks or five weeks, but a long time employee like Judi should at least be given a chance to come up with an exit timetable."

Chairman Chapman went on to say: "Ms. Kennington-Korf does have a contract, and when she notified me of her decision to step down yesterday, she agreed to continue to perform her duties through a transition period. Judi has handled herself with dignity and professionalism, even during this difficult time."

Longtime Commissioner Janet Taylor said, "The county will never have a more loyal,

Jodi Bell, named top migrant education administrator

Local folks often know what terrific talent we have in Hendry County, but it's especially rewarding when outsiders figure it out.

For instance, Jodi Bell is starting her seventh year as Director of Federal Programs for Hendry County School District.

She has been selected by the Florida Department of Education Florida Migrant Education Program as the Title I Migrant Program Administrator of the Year for 2012.

The honor reflects her "outstanding contribution to Hendry County's migrant students."

Jodi has been teaching in Hendry County since 1989, beginning as a Chapter I Migrant kindergarten teacher.

She has also been a classroom teacher and school administrator. Currently, she oversees Federal and Title Programs.

According to a statement from the Hendry County School District, the Migrant Education Program has been enhanced and improved during her tenure. She also gets personally involved in getting to know the students and families in order to better address their needs and concerns. One of Mrs. Bell's co-workers best describes her as "...a wonderful lady who wears many hats and is always willing to help everyone. What makes her a great Federal Programs Director?

Her dedication, understanding, and care for the Migrant farm workers and their families...going the extra mile to make a difference in a child's educational journey. Always willing to be a team player and leading by example."

Gordon Swaggerty, Deputy Superintendent stated, "I am not surprised that Mrs. Bell is the recipient of this award. Jodi is very deserving of the honor of being selected as Migrant Program Administrator of the Year for the State of Florida. She is an ex-

tremely talented and capable administrator with a great work ethic, but most of all she is truly an advocate for our students and is willing to do whatever she can to help them succeed."

For her part, Jodi said she's humbled by the "phenomenal staff" that drives the program.

There are nine advocates on staff - in the office, middle school and at UES, where they work with parents.

She said the folks on her staff advocate tirelessly, often 12-14 hours a day, for students. "They never say no to families," Jodi said.

Migrant families have a lot of needs and these advocates work to hook them up with resources for whatever those needs may be. They also do needs assessments with parents and teachers.

Martha Hernandez in Clewiston and Marie Delgado in LaBelle are the office managers.

In addition to working with students and

families, her office monitors 12-15 grants every year, she said. This year the office has a little more help, with Barbara Mundy as the new Administrator of Federal Programs.

Work often forces migrant families to come into the area late, which means the children start out behind the rest of the class. Staff members hold office and home visits, enroll students in school, make sure immunizations and physicals are complete, direct families to appropriate resources and generally make sure these kids are in school every possible day.

At the elementary level, children often need homework help. Many of these kids have no one at home that can help them so the office offers tutoring and after school programs.

For high schoolers, it's all about credit accrual for graduation so after school help is available.

As for all parents, it's important to know the stringent new Florida graduation guidelines for all ninth grade students beginning their high school careers, so Barbara Mundy works with the guidance counselors.

She also helps track freshmen at semester levels so they can make up credits as they go along.

Amy Plaza is the program's high school liaison at LaBelle High School. She helps arrange college tours.

Adrian Soto At Clewiston High Schools the program liaison and helps get college scholarships for their students.

Jodi said she has been able to take students to Washington, DC. every year as juniors in the Close Up program during Spring Break as part of their government studies.

The program serves Hendry County mi-

grant students ages 3-21. If they are 18-20 years old and haven't yet graduated from high school, they are referred to the Adult School and GED prep programs.

Last school term there were 1,700 migrant students in Hendry County schools. About half that are currently enrolled as school begins, but more will be coming. It just depends on when families arrive from their jobs elsewhere.

For many migrant families, Hendry County acts as a base where students remain with family while others go on the road to work.

Jodi said she likes to work with people. She especially is pleased when students call and ask for help with college paperwork or scholarship paperwork.

"It means we've made a difference and that the students trust us," she commented.

To demonstrate just how effective her program can be, Jodi said one of their graduates recently went to Brown University in New York, and another is at Notre Dame.

She said she "eavesdropped" on the student's Brown University interview and was impressed with the her poise, articulate answers and how her vision for the future impacts others.

Jodi said she is most proud of is the number of kids helped to graduate through this program.

Often it takes a lot of work with other states and even other countries to come up with school records and staff uses state resources whenever possible, especially for high school students.

For Jodi it's all about the team. "I guide," she said, "staff does the work."

2013 that bill will be some \$800,000, which will be paid through the tax increase.

At the last commission meeting, cuts from public safety, health and mental health departments and the library were discussed.

Commissioner Al Perry was looking for

more cuts, suggesting a five percent across the board cut for the board of county commission budget and a three percent cut for public safety, along with using some \$400,000 of the county's reserves.

The final budget hearing will be Tuesday, September 25, 5 p.m. at the Courthouse.

LaBelle man hospitalized after involvement in crash

A 69-year-old LaBelle man was transported to Lee Memorial Hospital August 30 after being involved in a one-vehicle crash.

According to the Florida Highway Patrol, Richard P. St. Germain was driving westbound on CR 78 and crossed the centerline. His 2006 Toyota pickup began to travel westbound in the eastbound lane and departed the roadway.

He lost control of the vehicle, which came to a culvert on the south shoulder, and overturned several times before coming to a final rest on its right side. Mr. St. Germain was in serious condition when he was transported. He was not wearing a seatbelt at the time of the crash, which was not alcohol related, according to FHP.

Clewiston man convicted of drug trafficking

On Wednesday, September 5, convicted felon, 42-year-old Curtis David Franklin of 965 Holly Drive, Clewiston, was sentenced to 40 years Department of Corrections by Judge D. Mason, 20th Judicial Circuit.

In 2010 Hendry County Narcotics Investigators conducted an undercover operation on Franklin where purchases were made and later a search warrant was conducted at Franklin's home.

During the undercover operation narcotic investigators purchased 15 Endocet with a total weight of 12.8 grams. During the search warrant 50.5 grams (122 pills) of Oxycodone were confiscated along with various other drugs found throughout Franklin's residence. Franklin was arrested in December 9, 2010 on charges of Drug Trafficking.

Paris charged with burglary

On Friday, September 7, 2012, Hendry County Deputy R. Steed responded to 630 S. Bridge Street in LaBelle after receiving a complaint of a burglary.

Business owner, John Kovarik, stated that after arriving at work, he and his employee began to notice items missing from his shop along with a bank bag containing cash from the office.

Prior to Kavarick reporting the burglary, Hendry County deputies had received information of an early morning burglary. As deputies continued to follow up on the information, they were able to develop leads indicating Paris and another party had committed the burglary.

Deputies made several attempts to locate Paris and question her about the burglary but they were unable to find her.

On September 8, 2012, in the early morning hours, 32-year-old Amanda Paris was arrested on unrelated charges of Possession of New Legend Drug, Possession of Drug Paraphernalia and an Outstanding Hendry County warrant. Hendry County Deputy R. Steed charged Paris additionally with Burglary to an unoccupied structure and Grand Theft. Paris is currently being held in the Hendry County Jail on \$50,000 bond.

Job Fair Season

Job Fairs are a great way for employers to connect with potential candidates in an uncommitted atmosphere. By design, the event is a means of quickly gaining that "first impression" of an applicant, before dedicating the time and energy to scrutinize an application or resume for necessary qualifications or experience. Simply put, it is the reverse application process, where the hiring authorities get a preview of the potential interviewee before the application is considered.

Finding a job fair early enough to participate as a business can be challenging, and while there is no local "jobfair.com," the local workforce office can guide the employer to the availabilities in the area. Florida Gulf Coast University offers two job fairs a year, the next one scheduled for April and registration is at <http://www.regonline.com/Register/Checkin>.

Every college in the area has a Career Center. Connect with employer support professionals at Edison State College (www.edison.edu/careerservices), Hodges University (www.hodges.edu/studentServices/career.aspx), I-Tech (www.itech.edu/partners_2.htm) and Southwest Florida College (www.swfc.edu/graduateplacement/employer/services.php) for direct connection to their respective student bodies.

Another great source is the Chambers of Commerce, where members should pay attention to newsletters for upcoming events. Any employer or agency desiring to hold an exclusive "Hiring Event," where you are the only employer conducting on-site interviews, should definitely contact your local workforce office. Hiring Events allow the employer to utilize the no-fee services of the workforce agency, including facilities, computer equipment, and marketing outreach.

Wake Up, America!

The Declaration of Independence, adopted by the Second Continental Congress consisting of 56 delegates and authored by Thomas Jefferson on July 4, 1776, underscores our trust in God: "We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights, that among these are Life, Liberty, and the Pursuit of Happiness." While there were slight differences in how those who authored the Declaration of Independence worshiped God, it is clearly discernible that there was by far an overwhelming affirmation that this new America would be dependent on the God of the Bible for His blessing, His confirmation and His oversight for truth.

Unless you have been living under a rock in the backside of a God-forsaken hell-hole, you can clearly see America has drifted light-years away from her earliest stated intentions.

How disappointed I was to see and hear that the Democratic National Committee (DNC) platform deleted any mention of God, which has always, without exception, appeared in their past platforms. Moreover, action was taken to say Jerusalem is not to be considered the capital of Israel!

– take any country in Europe. Review where those countries were when God's ways were held up before the people as the standard and then study where those nations are today. The contrast is like ammonia smelling salts under ones nose.

Or, consider the former USSR. When Aleksandr Solzhenitsyn was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize he was asked the question, "What made it possible for the Russian Revolution to take place and for Communism to rise to power?" Solzhenitsyn replied, "Men forgot God." God told Jeremiah, "My people have forgotten me" (Jer 2:32).

Does this not describe America today? When an entire political party defies God and resolves to move forward with Him, is that not an astonishing statement? Can you imagine President Harry Truman (D) publicly declaring as he assumed the highest office in America following the sudden death of FDR, "God is dismissed from America and that we would move into our battles apart from dependence on God?"

It is time that America woke up!

I challenge the preachers in our area to review with your congregations the founding principles of our country. Affirm the Biblical foundations that were deemed so precious by our fore-fathers they had these truths etched into marble and granite in strategic places like the Supreme Court, US Senate and House of Congress. Clearly this was done so all further generations would know what America was built upon from her earliest days.

For some this may seem a bit robust. One may wonder if the better plan would be to sit by and take little action.

Here's a question for those considering a "wait and see" position. Did you ever think you would see the day in our nation when the Catholic Church would be told by the Government, "You're position on the pre-born does not matter – you must provide healthcare that allows employees to have abortions paid for"? Can you imagine President John F. Kennedy (D), a Catholic, holding such a position?

We need to hear the ancient message of the prophet Hosea: "Hear the word of the Lord...because the Lord has a charge to bring against you who live in the land: There is no faithfulness, no love, no acknowledgement of God in the land...my people are destroyed from lack of knowledge...a people without understanding will come to ruin" (Hosea4:1). He means we are destroyed because of our lack of the knowledge of God and without an understanding of God we will come to ruin. The prophet goes on to tell us, "Come, let us return to the Lord...let us acknowledge the Lord; let us press on to acknowledge him" (Hosea 6:1, 3).

The Skin Cancer Foundation Helps Children Stay Sun-Safe

New York, NY (September 4, 2012) – Because many schools don't allow students to use sunscreen or wear a hat outdoors during the school day without written permission from a physician, The Skin Cancer Foundation has created a sun protection form that parents and doctors can sign, allowing students to bring these items to school, apply and use as needed. Suffering just one blistering sunburn in childhood or adolescence more than doubles a person's risk of developing melanoma, the deadliest form of skin cancer, later in life.

The Skin Cancer Foundation has always recommended that everyone, regardless of age and skin color, adopt a complete sun protection regimen. At school, children should be able to cover-up with protective clothing, including broad-brimmed hats and UV-blocking sunglasses. Additionally, they should wear a broad-spectrum SPF 15 sun-

screen every day, and be allowed to bring it to school for easy reapplication. The Skin Cancer Foundation's sun protection form ensures that children have access to recommended sun safety measures.

The Skin Cancer Foundation strives to educate children about the dangers of skin cancer and the need for early detection and prevention. The Foundation recently debuted Sun Smart U, an interactive education program that includes a robust website for teachers and a free downloadable lesson plan. knowledgeable and dedicated worker than Judi Kennington-Korf. It's a sad day in Hendry County that we have come to this. After 33 years of dedicated service to Hendry County, this is the reward."

Previous meeting

At their August 28 meeting, commissioners approved a request from Associate Planner for Hendry County Sarah Catala to change the zoning from residential/medium density to Planned Unit Development for 4.2 acres at 4975. SR 80W.

The owners were granted the zoning change in 2009, but were unable to get a site plan for the property in the two years allotted.

Therefore, the zoning reverted to its former zoning.

Ms. Catala told the commission that the owners still want to develop the property to high intensity commercial with three office/warehouse structures and three residences.

The change was granted on the condition that a front road or easement be set aside on the northside of the property for public and landowner use.

Sterling Blueprint

John Pieno presented a management system for county government intended to improve employee productivity, customer satisfaction and the county's return on its investments.

Sterling Blueprint is a not-for-profit public-private partnership begun 25 years ago under the Department of Commerce. Mr. Pieno said at this time 40 states participate.

The plan offers a review of the management system with measurements and encouraging improved communication.

There is a fixed cost of \$7,500 to set up system and for mentoring. The board decided to look at the plan seriously after the budget is set.

Franchise fee

County Administrator Judi Kennington-Korf suggested the board implement a franchise fee ordinance for unincorporated Hendry County. It was suggested that such a fee would provide some income from utilities such as FPL, Glades Electric Co-op, Lee County Co-op and the new natural gas lines coming in.

Commissioner Chapman was favorable, saying that already some 71 businesses have

hooked up to the natural gas line coming into the east side of the county.

Ms. Kennington-Korf said it could be a recurring revenue stream for the county. She said the maximum franchise fee for electric companies is 5.9 percent.

Population report

Sarah Catala presented the new preliminary population report from the Bureau of Economic and Business Research (BEBR) at the University of Florida.

The 2010 Census shows 27,345 permanent residents of Hendry County. BEBR's preliminary estimate is very close: 26,288. The estimate used for state revenue sharing will be 26,028. (Unincorporated Hendry County also lost 260 inmates when HCH closed.)

Ms. Catala told the board the difference would have a slight effect on the county's revenue sharing.

However, Commissioner Turner said he'd like to challenge these numbers. The discussion will take place at the commission's first meeting in September.

Also:

-Hendry County Engineer Shane Parker received authorization to use \$69,655 in SCRAPP funding to repave three miles of CR 835 beginning from 5.75 miles south of US 27.

-The county is still wrestling with the best way to reconstitute the East Rec Board from overwhelming monetary issues.

The West Rec Board has been held up as a model.

It has two members from the city, two from the county, one from the school board - but the East Rec does not have to be formatted the same way.

Commissioner Perry said the best option is to get the right community volunteers for the board.

A study group will decide the makeup of the board as well as appropriate fees for users. Commissioner Chapman was against instituting a sliding scale, saying those don't satisfy anybody.

Commissioner Turner said an advisory board is needed, that could ultimately morph into the final board.

- Clerk of Courts Barbara Butler suggested that the county could use some of the \$6 million in the solid waste fund to help residents in the MSBU to lower garbage fees for one year.



West Nile Virus and you

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), as of September 4, 2012, 48 states have reported West Nile virus (WNV) infections in people, birds, or mosquitoes. The CDC has received reports of 1,993 cases of West Nile virus disease in people, including 87 deaths. Over 70 percent of the cases have been reported from six states (Texas, South Dakota, Mississippi, Oklahoma, Louisiana and Michigan). A total of 28 cases have been reported in Florida this year (Duval, Escambia, Hillsborough and Okaloosa counties). At this time, no cases have been reported in Hendry and Glades counties.

Symptoms of West Nile Virus - People typically develop symptoms of WNV between 3 and 14 days after being bitten by an infected mosquito. Symptoms may include fever, headache, and body aches, nausea, vomiting, and sometimes swollen lymph glands or a skin rash on the chest, stomach and back. Symptoms can last for as short as a few days, though even healthy people have become sick for several weeks. Eighty percent of people (about 4 out of 5) infected with WNV will not show any symptoms at all. Some people infected with WNV may develop severe illness. Severe symptoms can include high fever, headache, neck stiffness, stupor, disorientation, coma, tremors, convulsions, muscle weakness, vision loss, numbness and paralysis. Talk with your healthcare provider if you have concerns or show symptoms of WNV.

Prevention is Key - Being outside means you're at risk. Pay attention to avoiding mosquito bites if you spend a lot of time working or playing outside. Everyone can take basic precautions to avoid getting mosquito bites by following the recommendations of the Hendry and Glades County Health Depart-



ments in the "Drain and Cover" prevention message listed below.

Drain and Cover - To prevent mosquitoes from living and multiplying around your home or business:

DRAIN standing water:

- Drain water from garbage cans, buckets, pool covers, coolers, toys, flowerpots or any other containers where sprinkler or rainwater has collected.

- Discarded old tires, drums, bottles, cans, pots and pans, broken appliances and other items that aren't being used.

- Empty and clean birdbaths and pet's water bowls at least once or twice a week.

- Protect boats and vehicles from rain with tarps that don't accumulate water.

- Maintain swimming pools in good condition and appropriately chlorinated and empty plastic swimming pools when not in use.

COVER your skin with:

- CLOTHING - If you must be outside when mosquitoes are active, cover up. Wear shoes, socks, long pants and long sleeves.

- REPELLENT - Apply mosquito repellent to bare skin and clothing. Always use repellents according to the label. Repellents with 10-30% DEET, picaridin, oil of lemon eucalyptus, and IR3535 are effective.

- Use mosquito netting to protect children younger than 2 months old.

COVER doors and windows with screens:

- Keep mosquitoes out of your house. Repair broken screening on windows, doors, porches, and patios.

AMAC urges seniors to get flu shots early

"As you get older, your immune system gets weaker and you become more susceptible to the flu virus, so get your flu shots early - before this year's outbreak begins later this month," cautioned Dan Weber, president of the Association of Mature American Citizens.

Weber pointed out that "it is literally a matter of life and death for older Americans, particularly those over 65." He cited the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), which reports that some 36,000 Americans die each year from the flu and that seniors account for 90% of those deaths.

The flu season starts in late September and early October, but it takes about two weeks for the vaccine to become fully effective. So, Weber urges older Americans to get their shots as early as possible, noting that the vaccine is fully covered by Medicare.

"Set an appointment with your family doctor to get vaccinated as soon as this year's batch of serum is available or go to the 'Flu Near You' Website [<https://flunearyou.org/>] to find locations by Zip Code where the vaccine will be available."

Meanwhile, the AMAC chief suggested, "take precautions such as limiting contact with friends and relations who may be showing symptoms of illness like coughing and sneezing. And, be sure to wash your

hands thoroughly after excursions that involve mingling in crowded public spaces and after riding public transit systems."

Weber pointed out that those who wind up getting the flu this year have recourse. There are antiviral drugs available to treat the illness, particularly if you act quickly, he said.

The World Health Organization reports that flu vaccines can be up to 90 percent effective in preventing illness and that it slashes influenza death rates by as much as 80 percent.

"There is no need for anyone to risk infection. The vaccine is widely available throughout the country and free for those on Medicare. And for those older Americans who are not old enough for Medicare, many communities offer free and/or low cost vaccinations. The shots don't hurt, but the flu can be downright deadly," Weber said.
