Cowboys hold off Lemon Bay

The Cowboys continued their fourth quarter dramatics in a come from behind win vs the Lemon Bay Manta Rays. Lemon Bay came in with a potent offense that was scoring 43 points per game and an undefeated record. Thanks to the Cowboys both the Manta Rays' offensive statistics and record are defunct.

In the first quarter the Cowboys' defense set the early tone by driving Lemon Bay back 11 yards on their first series with Devante Ray (sr.) leading the charge. After a 14-yard punt return by Cathavius Adams the Cowboys offense drove 34 yards for a score that was capped by a 16-yard pass from Derek Bass (sr.) to Ray. After David Marroquin (Jr.) made the extra point the Cowboys led 7-0.

After a short kick the Cowboys

defense was forced to begin play at the 50-yard line. However, they were up to the task as Phillip Stansly (sr.) led the charge making 3 out of 4 tackles as the Cowboys forced the Manta Rays to turn the ball over on downs. On the following drive the Cowboys were forced to punt to the dangerous Manta Ray offense.

The Cowboys held the Manta Rays to a third down attempt, but were unable to deny Lemon Bay as they scored a 69-yard touchdown pass. The Extra Point knotted the score at 7-7 and it stayed that way until part way through the third quarter when after a blocked punt the Manta Rays converted on a third and long to score on a 22-yard pass. However, on the extra point attempt Adams deflected the kick to keep the score at 13-7 in Lemon Bay's favor.

Following the score both offenses jockeyed for field position, but really could not establish a drive until in the fourth quarter when Ellis Johnson (sr.) returned a punt 26 yards, which set up a scoring drive. Following this scintillating return, Tyler O'Ferrell (sr.) connected with Johnson for a 23-yard pass and Johnson finished the drive with a 39-yard scoring run to tie the game at 13-13. After Marroquin's extra point the Cowboys took the lead 14-13 and would not relinquish it. Following the score Luis Hernandez (sr.) recovered a fumble and Adams intercepted a pass to ice the game for the Cowboys. The Cowboys open district play this Friday at Avon Park. City plans for water plant finalizing

The city is finally inching closer to actual construction of its new state-of-the-art water plant. Tim Taylor of Applied Technology Management (ATM) presented final documents to be submitted to USDA along with final approval of the bid package.

After that, a final meeting will need to be scheduled, along with the closing and preconstruction conference. The welcome news came at the September 13 city commission meeting.

Grant application

The board received the annual local elected officials and general public Fair Housing Training at the meeting. The training is required in order for the city to apply for \$700,000 or more in federal grants. The city must chose a category: housing, either neighborhood or commercial, or economic development.

These grants benefit low and moderate income persons, aid in the prevention or elimination of slums or blight and may alleviate other needs such as emergencies.

The board unanimously opted to seek funding for neighborhood revitalization, thinking of focusing on the Pamona Circle, Citrus Street and East Lincoln areas. No matching funds are required.

Fire department

Fire Chief Ray Pittman told the board that calls in August increased to 61, with 521 calls for service thus far this year.

The department has 23 firefighters on its roster and more on the waiting list.

The department has received a grant for an air monitor to measure potentially explosive levels of oxygen in the air.

The commissioners asked how the possibility of the county losing an ambulance due to budget constraints might affect the city.

Chief Pittman said it could add up to 20-30 calls for LFD first responders per month.

Firefighters respond when an ambulance is called out, he said.

The LaBelle Fire Department is funded by both the City of LaBelle and Hendry County

The LFD building, which is some 28 years old, may also need a new roof.

Safe sidewalks

Local resident Brandi Gonzalez represented the Yeomans Avenue neighborhood in seeking speed bumps or other means of improving her street. She said the sidewalk is old and unusable, unsafe for walkers or strollers.

She presented signatures of her neighbors asking for some relief.

Superintendent of Public Works Michael Boyle agreed that the sidewalks are cracked and the road holds water. However, the street needs fixing and speed bumps would only make that process more difficult.

Commissioners discussed other ways to improve the safety of the neighborhood, including stop signs.

Mayor Paul Puletti suggested the city put in new sidewalks first - the "permanent fix" for the area - the work on the street and possibly speed bumps in the future.

IAFF: Proposed cuts threaten public safety

LaBelle, Florida - Hendry County Professional Paramedics and EMTs are warning residents that proposed cuts to resources and staffing at the LaBelle Fire Department would leave citizens across Hendry County dangerously under protected.

"Even in the worst of times the safety and security of residents of Hendry County must be our highest priority," said Lex Canfield, president of the Hendry County Professional Paramedics and EMTs Local 4520. "We urge our elected officials to work with us to preserve public safety and help us protect lives."

The Hendry County Board of County Commissioners is considering a plan to remove an ambulance from service and lay off three EMTs and two paramedics. A sixth position that is vacant would not be filled.

"Reducing staffing and leaving us with just four ambulances to cover a geographically large county is unsafe. This plan would dramatically increase response times, forcing residents to wait longer for emergency medical help in their greatest time of need," Canfield said.

City of LaBelle paramedics and EMTs already are working hard to respond to emergencies despite limited staffing and resources. Currently, fire departments across

Hendry County must pool their resources and manpower to safely protect nearly 40,000 residents over 1,200 square miles.

A study by a broad coalition in the scientific, firefighting, EMS and public—safety communities shows that the size and configuration of an EMS first responder crew and an advanced life support (ALS) crew have a substantial effect on the ability to respond to calls for emergency medical service.

"Reducing staffing is equivalent to playing Russian roulette with the lives of Hendry County residents," Canfield said. "We urge Hendry County commissioners to work with us to ensure that we have the resources to protect those who live and work here."

The International Association of Fire Fighters, headquartered in Washington, DC, represents more than 300,000

Full-time professional fire fighters and paramedics who protect 85 percent of the nation's population. More information is available at www.iaff.org

Apprenticeship

The term Apprenticeship is almost an outdated title reminiscent of a bygone era of master craftsmen and artisans.

Some industries still maintain strict apprenticeship guidelines such as union pipe fitters, electricians and other construction trades.

However, the professional apprenticeship program is alive and well in an array of other industries across the United States, and there are significant benefits to being a Registered Apprenticeship Sponsor.

The Department of Labor (DOL) maintains all information for apprenticeship sponsorships (employers) and apprentices (employees) at www.doleta.gov/OA.

Programs do not have to be unionized under a formal labor agreement; many apprenticeships exist under Florida's Right to Work rules.

The terms usually last anywhere from 1 to 6 years, and include 2,000 hours of on the job experience as well as 144 hours of

classroom training, for over 1,000 different occupations including cooks, dental assistants, insurance adjusters and pharmacy technicians.

Employers benefit by having access to special grants and tax incentives, as well as the ability to grow your own technical professionals.

Manufacturers receive additional assistance with apprenticeship programs through the Manufacturing Extension Partnership (MEP) at www.nist.gov/mep, which conducts much of the classroom training through in-state, mobile classrooms. Employees benefit by gaining national credentials while earning a paycheck and experience.

There is no minimum or maximum number of apprentices an employer may have. The hardest part is getting started, but the DOL and the State of Florida has representatives standing by to assist you in any way at 404-302-5483 and 850-245-0454, respectively.

Foundation donates renovations

Hendry Regional is upgrading a number of its patient rooms, and the hospital foundation has pitched in to help. Through community donations, the HRMC Foundation has provided \$60,000 towards this project.

Room renovations include:

- New wood tone, rolled vinyl floorings, designed for effective infection control
- Textured & painted walls
- New plumbing fixtures
- Renovated bathrooms, which include tile flooring, walls, and showers
- Marbled window sills
- New lighting throughout
- Beautiful cabinets to include wardrobes and vanities (with corian surfaces)
- New air-conditioners and heating units
- New state-of-the-art beds

"A patient's room in a hospital becomes their home away from home for the duration of their stay. Nursing embraces the physical environment as fundamental in the healing process. Rooms that are quiet, have natural light, comfort, and reduced noise contribute to holistic nursing care and subsequent healing. Our rooms will provide a family centered care space that will assist in the healing process," says Sandi Viall, Chief Nursing Officer at Hendry Regional Medical Center.

The HRMC Foundation has established naming opportunities for those interested in donating \$15,000 for a patient room (now includes

a new \$7,500 patient bed). These donations may be paid by a one-time gift or through yearly installments of \$3,000 for five years, or \$5,000 for three years. Several donor plaques are visible on room doors where individuals, civic organizations and businesses have already named rooms through their individual donations.

When presenting the check to the hospital, Steve Nisbet, Foundation Chairman and Hospital Trustee, recognized the generosity of donors, "The foundation members would like to thank all the people in our community who have made this project possible through their contributions to the HRMC Foundation," he said.

Visitors are welcome to stop by the foundation and ask to see one of the renovated patient rooms.

Get the most out of your internet searches

There's no doubt that we live in the information age. From desktop computers to laptops to tablets and smartphones, you're probably never more than two people away from access to the largest source of information ever assembled: the internet.

Information on just about any subject is available online to anyone who can find it. With search engines like Google, Bing, Yahoo and others, searching through the ever-growing wealth of available information is actually pretty simple - most of the time.

For most of us, browsing to our favorite search engine and typing in what we're looking for is regular occurrence. But have you ever seen how many results there are on any given topic? A pretty straightforward search for this phrase: 'computer repair in labelle, fl' yields 'About 96,400 results' in Google. 96,400!! Granted, the likely winners of that search lottery will be at the top of the list because our friends at Google sort things in what they call 'organic indexes'. This simply means that they know approximately where in the world you are and list the most local results first. That's the power of a modern search engine at work.

But what happens when you're looking for information and the answer isn't going to be something local? What hap-

pens when you need specific information and your simple searches yield far too many links to look through? Answer: Use Advanced Search methods. Here are some basic tips.

Search for an exact word or phrase

Use quotes to search for an exact word or set of words in a specific order. Example: "imagine all the people" This is a good technique to use when searching for things like lyrics to a song. Be careful though, because when you use quotes, your search engine will probably not try to correct your spelling or make other suggestions.

Exclude a word

Add a dash (-) before a word to exclude all results that include that word. This is especially useful for synonyms like Jaguar the car brand and jaguar the animal.

Example: jaguar speed -car -automobile
Include similar words

Normally, synonyms might replace some words in your original query. Add a tilde sign (~) immediately in front of a word to search for that word as well as even more synonyms.

Example: ~food facts

This example will also find things like 'nutrition facts', etc...

Search for either word

By default, most search engines automatically assume 'AND' between search

terms. For example, searching 'Computer Repair' means 'Computer AND Repair'. To search for either word but not both, insert an 'OR' like these examples:

Computer OR Repair
Olympics location 2014 OR 2018

Each search engine has their specific rules and instructions for advanced searching. The examples given here are from google.com. For more information on advanced searching, use your search engine! Try a search for 'Advanced Searching' and see what happens!



The District's proposed agency action as set forth in the Staff Report shall become final unless a timely petition for an administrative hearing is filed under Sections 120.569 and 120.57 of the Florida Statutes before the deadline for filing a petition.

Right to Request Administrative Hearing

As required by Sections 120.569(1), and 120.60(3), Fla. Stat., following is notice of the opportunities which may be available for administrative hearing or judicial review when the substantial interests of a party are determined by an agency. Please note that this Notice of Rights is not intended to provide legal advice. Not all the legal proceedings detailed below may be an applicable or appropriate remedy. You may wish to consult your attorney regarding your legal rights.

A person whose substantial interests are or may be affected by South Florida Water Management District's (SFWMD or District) action has the right to request an administrative hearing on that action pursuant to Sections 120.569 and 120.57, Fla. Stat. Persons seeking a hearing on a District decision which does or may determine their substantial interests shall file a petition for hearing with the District Clerk within 21 days of receipt of written notice of the decision, unless one of the following shorter time periods apply: 1) within 14 days of the notice of consolidated intent to grant or deny concurrently reviewed applications for environmental resource permits and use of sovereign submerged lands pursuant to Section 373.427, Fla. Stat.; or 2) within 14 days of service of an Administrative Order pursuant to Subsection 373.119(1), Fla. Stat. "Receipt of written notice of agency decision" means receipt of either written notice through mail, or electronic mail, or posting that the District has or intends to take final agency action, or publication of notice that the District has or intends to take final agency action. Any person who receives written notice of a SFWMD decision and fails to file a written request for hearing within the timeframe described above waives the right to request a hearing on that decision.

Filing Instructions

The petition must be filed with the Office of the Clerk of the SFWMD. Filings with the District Clerk may be made by mail, hand-delivery or facsimile. **Filings by e-mail will not be accepted.** Any person wishing to receive a clerked copy with the date and time stamped must provide an additional copy. A petition for administrative hearing is deemed filed upon receipt during normal business hours by the District Clerk at SFWMD headquarters in West Palm Beach, Florida. Any document received by the office of the SFWMD Clerk after 5:00 p.m. shall be filed as of 8:00 a.m. on the next regular business day. Additional filing instructions are as follows:

- Filings by mail must be addressed to the Office of the SFWMD Clerk, P.O. Box 24680, West Palm Beach, Florida 33416.
- Filings by hand-delivery must be delivered to the Office of the SFWMD Clerk. Delivery of a petition to the SFWMD's security desk does not constitute filing. To ensure proper filing, it will be necessary to request the SFWMD's security office to contact the Clerk's office. An employee of the SFWMD's Clerk's office will receive and file the petition.
- Filings by facsimile must be transmitted to the SFWMD Clerk's Office at (561) 682-6010. Pursuant to Subsections 28-106.104(7), (8) and (9), Fla. Admin. Code, a party who files a document by facsimile represents that the original physically signed document will be retained by that party for the duration of that proceeding and of any subsequent appeal or subsequent proceeding in that cause. Any party who elects to file any document by facsimile shall be responsible for any delay, disruption, or interruption of the electronic signals and accepts the full risk that the document may not be properly filed with the clerk as a result. The filing date for a document filed by facsimile shall be the date the SFWMD Clerk receives the complete document.

Initiation of an Administrative Hearing

Pursuant to Rules 28-106.201 and 28-106.301, Fla. Admin. Code, initiation of an administrative hearing shall be made by written petition to the SFWMD in legible form and on 8 and 1/2 by 11 inch white paper. All petitions shall contain:

1. Identification of the action being contested, including the permit number, application number, District file number or any other SFWMD identification number, if known.
2. The name, address and telephone number of the petitioner and petitioner's representative, if any.
3. An explanation of how the petitioner's substantial interests will be affected by the agency determination.
4. A statement of when and how the petitioner received notice of the SFWMD's proposed action.
5. A statement of all disputed issues of material fact. If there are none, the petition must so indicate.
6. A concise statement of the ultimate facts alleged, including the specific facts the petitioner contends warrant reversal or modification of the SFWMD's proposed action.
7. A statement of the specific rules or statutes the petitioner contends require reversal or modification of the SFWMD's proposed action.
8. If disputed issues of material fact exist, the statement must also include an explanation of how the alleged facts relate to the specific rules or statutes.
9. A statement of the relief sought by the petitioner, stating precisely the action the petitioner wishes the SFWMD to take with respect to the SFWMD's proposed action.

A person may file a request for an extension of time for filing a petition. The SFWMD may, for good cause, grant the request. Requests for extension of time must be filed with the SFWMD prior to the deadline for filing a petition for hearing. Such requests for extension shall contain a certificate that the moving party has consulted with all other parties concerning the extension and that the SFWMD and any other parties agree to or oppose the extension. A timely request for extension of time shall toll the running of the time period for filing a petition until the request is acted upon.

If the District takes action with substantially different impacts on water resources from the notice or intended agency decision, the persons who may be substantially affected shall have an additional point of entry pursuant to Rule 28-106-111, Fla. Admin. Code.

Mediation

The procedures for pursuing mediation are set forth in Section 120.573, Fla. Stat., and Rules 28-106.111 and 28-106.401-405, Fla. Admin. Code. The SFWMD is not proposing mediation for this agency action under Section 120.573, Fla. Stat., at this time.

Right to Seek Judicial Review

Pursuant to Sections 120.60(3) and 120.68, Fla. Stat., a party who is adversely affected by final SFWMD action may seek judicial review of the SFWMD's final decision by filing a notice of appeal pursuant to Florida Rule of Appellate Procedure 9.10 in the Fourth District Court of Appeal or in the appellate district where a party resides and appeal a second copy of the notice with the SFWMD Clerk within 30 days of rendering of the final SFWMD action. 426455 CN 9/20/2012
