Workers feel pain of cuts

The first tangible effects have been felt in the county's 2012-13 budget cuts. Seven positions have been lost, the result of the five percent decrease in the budget.

In addition to the layoffs, the county trimmed a total of \$747,694 from its originally proposed 2012-13 budget. That figure includes \$100,000 from the sheriff's budget.

The Public Services Manager position in Building, Licensing and the Code Enforcement position was eliminated and the incumbent employee was laid-off. This position was responsible for a number of functions including issuing occupational licenses for construction trades.

The number of licenses issued in recent years has declined significantly, and it was decided that the duties of this position could be assigned to other staff.

One vacant Code Enforcement Officer position has been eliminated.

Advocates support children in need

Adult problems like domestic violence and substance abuse impact every facet of our society from the legal system, to our local communities, and ultimately, immediate family and friends. An often forgotten and neglected victim of this process is the child. Thankfully, there are people within local communities who are willing and able to step in and stand up for those unable to do so for themselves. Within our Hendry and Glades County community, the Guardian ad Litem (GAL) program is available to partner with local volunteers willing to act as the voice for these deserving children. A volunteer GAL Child Advocate is able to come along side children and help them through some of the most challenging times of their lives. A GAL Child Advocate can do this by observing what is going on in the world of the child. They receive training and support through the GAL program. They take time to familiarize themselves with the child's case and unique situation. They analyze the facts, communicate with the parents, caregivers, teachers and others involved. They speak and most importantly, listen to the child on their case. All these factors help them determine what is in the best interest of the child. The GAL Child Advocate then presents their facts and findings to the judge so that the child's voice may truly be heard.

Amanda Townsend is a new GAL Child Advocacy Coordinator for the Hendry and Glades county area. Amanda is local to the area and has an extensive background in the social services field. She joined the guardian program in July of this year.

Suzanne Flinn is a new GAL Recruiter for the Hendry and Glades county area. Suzanne however, is more than a recruiter for the GAL program. She is also a volunteer GAL Child Advocate, and is therefore well-equipped to be able to speak to the impact and value the GAL program can have upon a child's life.

By working together as a team, Suzanne and Amanda are focusing on increasing exposure and knowledge of the guardian ad litem program within our local community so that 100 percent of the children in need have a volunteer GAL Child Advocate. Currently, we have 17 volunteer GAL Child Advocates assisting 41 children in the Hendry and Glades county area. Many of these children are in foster care. They are displaced from their family, friends, and familiar environment. Unfortunately, only 41 percent of the children who need GAL Child Advocates are currently being assisted. The GAL program is in great need of people who value children and are willing to serve.

Judge Sloan for the Hendry County legal system sees great value in the GAL program and believes the GAL Child Advocate to be an invaluable tool within that system. As Judge Sloan says, "Too often it's easy to lose perspective as to what is really important. It is important for the child to understand and know that they have an advocate and a voice in these proceedings."

A new GAL Child Advocate, Lisa Ledesma, was recently added to the LaBelle area. Lisa has been involved in the program for only a few months, but during that brief time, has already assisted two different families and their children with her care, compassion and advocacy. When asked why Lisa chose to get involved with the GAL program, she replied, "That's easy. I was interested in being a guardian because I wanted to give back some of what I had the benefit of, as a child, growing up in a loving, caring home." As Lisa expresses, "When you grow up this way, in this kind of environment, you want to be able to pass that on to another child and their family."

GAL Child Advocate, Irma Scott was in Lisa's shoes over a year ago, as someone who was new to the program. At the time, she was getting ready to meet her first child and was looking forward to getting to know

him. Ms. Scott is a widow and school volunteer who enjoys keeping active. Since that first case, Ms. Scott has served many children, with her kind manner, and detailed approach. She meets with children, their families, caregivers, and teachers to find out as much as she can about the history and needs the children have. Ms. Scott seems to have a way with the children she serves and is able to connect with them, providing that listening ear that children in the child welfare system desperately need.

"One's approach with people and children matters a great deal and is a key to being a successful guardian," Ms. Scott advises. She is happy to be there for the children. "They're just so appreciative," she remarks. "In addition, there's a true repertoire between the child advocacy staff and the guardians. We all work well together as a team. We all help each other," Ms. Scott says. "Amongst the guardians we work together to be supportive and give each other helpful suggestions when we need them," Ms. Scott relays.

The 20th Circuit GAL Program, as part of the Statewide GAL Office, advocates for the best interests of abused, abandoned and neglected children in court, the child welfare system and the community in Lee, Collier, Charlotte, Hendry and Glades counties. The program utilizes a team approach, providing each child appointed to our program a GAL Child Advocate, supported by a staff child advocacy coordinator and a child's best interest attorney.

The team works together to ensure children's best interests are represented and that all of a child's needs—physical, emotional, psychological—are met. Through our advocacy, we facilitate the process of giving children a safe, permanent home.

Voice for Kids of Southwest Florida (VFK) is a non-profit organization supporting the 20th Circuit GAL program. Its mission is to ensure that every abused, abandoned, and neglected child in the five Southwest Florida counties has a court-appointed volunteer GAL Child Advocate and that financial assistance and other resources are available for their accompanying health, education and social needs. In addition to financial support for volunteer management, VFK provides a number of programs that give dependent children a sense of normalcy.

VFK has offered a number of programs for children since its inception in 1983, which have included: Happier Birthdays, Beds for Kids, Emergency Clothing, Special Needs and Tutoring to name a few. The Mail/Custodian Assistant Director position in the Maintenance Department was eliminated and the incumbent employee laid-off. Custodial and mail employees will now be reporting directly to the Facilities Management Director.

The Public Safety Director position was eliminated and the incumbent, Randal Bengston, was laid-off. Mr. Bengston is retiring. The EMS Chief and Emergency Management Director will now report directly to the County Administrator.

EMS Operations Manager Donna Aiken will head up EMS and the Fire Department while Emergency Management Lupe Taylor will be over Emergency Management and serve as 911 Director.

Two other EMS employee were impacted - one paramedic position was eliminated.

The employee in this position accepted a demotion to a vacant EMT position. A remaining position was eliminated. Fourteen shifts remain intact.

According to an October 10 letter announcing the cuts, employee benefits were not further cut this year and county employees did not receive any raises.

In it, County Attorney and Interim County Administrator Mark Lapp said, "Keep in mind that private businesses and governmental agencies across the country have already made tough decisions such as these in response to the continued economic slump. As we move into the new fiscal year, hopefully with a new county administrator in place, we all need to continue to look for more opportunities to economize and be prudent with taxpayer dollars."

IN RESPONSE TO PELLETIER'S INACCURATE STATEMENTS, PLEASE READ THE FACTS BELOW

As attorney of record for U.S. Sugar during the property assessment challenges that led to the legal settlement with the Hendry County Property Appraiser's Office, I would like to set the record straight.

U.S. Sugar contested overly high personal property assessments on the Clewiston Mill assets for tax years 2000-2004. In addition, we contested the assessment on the Southern Gardens Citrus processing plant for 2004. The major issue concerning the Clewiston Mill was the effect on its value caused by external economic conditions, specifically widely fluctuating global sugar prices. Appraisers refer to this as "economic obsolescence."

Economic obsolescence means a reduction in the value of an asset caused by uncontrollable external factors. An example would be the drop in the value of a home because someone else built an apartment building next door.

All Florida property appraisers use the cost approach to value machinery and equipment. Economic obsolescence is a widely recognized factor in the cost approach method of appraisal. It is measured by the income from the property, based on the premise that the personal property itself cannot be worth more than the entire business (equipment, real estate and intangibles) is worth. The Property Appraiser's office was unwilling to follow Florida Department of Revenue (FDOR) Guidelines on this, so U.S. Sugar was forced to file suit.

To settle the litigation and avoid future litigation, U.S. Sugar negotiated an agreement with the Property Appraiser's Office in June 2005. U.S. Sugar would drop its suit in consideration of the Property Appraiser agreeing to follow to the State guidelines in future assessments of the Mill property. In short, the Property Appraiser agreed to begin following Florida's Guidelines in assessing our property.

Ordinarily, a property appraiser may use the cost, market or income approaches, or any combination of them, to make an assessment-- as long as proper consideration is given to statutory criteria. In our case, the Settlement Agreement established the cost approach with an adjustment for economic obsolescence as the method to be used. The cost approach is what Hendry County uses to assess all of its tangible property accounts. There were and are no sales of processing plants comparable to the Clewiston Mill that could serve as the basis for a "market value" approach such as Pelletier proposed.

The Settlement Agreement set a formula to be used for future assessment years based on audited U.S. Sugar financials --a formula consistent with State guidelines for assessing agricultural properties. To protect the county, U.S. Sugar agreed to an assessment floor to apply in any year where the obsolescence was so great that otherwise the Company would pay no taxes. In effect, U.S. Sugar agreed to a minimum assessment for some years that greatly exceeded market value.

After being elected, Phil Pelletier continued to assess the Clewiston Mill per the Settlement Agreement for tax years 2009 and 2010. However, in 2011, Pelletier suddenly broke the Agreement by improperly assessing the Mill without following the Florida Department of Revenue Guidelines. In addition, he used an unrecognized technique averaging tax years to set his assessment.

The assessment method used in the Settlement Agreement is an accepted appraisal practice. In fact, Pelletier followed the Agreement for the first two years of his administration before apparently deciding that the Agreement was no longer valid. Meanwhile, U.S. Sugar has upheld the Agreement and continued to pay taxes in excess of market value as required by the floor provision.

Seasonal Jobs Part 2 by Matt Kindermann

Last week we discussed the types of jobs where the ratio of job seeker to job opening was skewed. Out of the 10 seasonal jobs that are most abundant this year, only 1 requires an education above a high school diploma, and that is Registered Nurses.

However, the other 9 jobs, including cashiers, servers, cooks and secretaries, earn on average less than \$31,000 a year.

This is important because if you are trying to bridge industries, you can target those that are in the most need.

For instance, if you are a loan officer and are interested in the medical field, you can see that Physical Therapy Assistants and Occupational Therapy Assistants are in high demand, each with about 50 openings for every qualified applicant. While these positions require at least an Associate's degree, the payoff is an average annual median wage of \$55,000.

With Lee Memorial Hospital having the second most job openings in the region for any single employer, that aspiring Therapy

Assistant may want to consider applying there for a seasonal job to start building that medical experience, even if it's not in Physical Therapy.

Seasonal employees almost always receive the same new employee training and orientation that full time employees do.

This is great training to document in one line on your resume and can be easily differentiated from other applicants if you use the corporate name to enhance your skills.

For example, consider the two following one-liners and how they read slightly different on a resume.

"Excellent customer service skills, experienced working with international customers at Hyatt Hotels and Resorts," or "Achieved in-house certification in Customer Service through Hyatt Hotels and Resorts, using these skills to benefit the success of the resort in-season, while working with international customers."

Take time and pray and say "Thank you, Lord" for civil liberties afforded to us. It is more rare than we often realize.


Let's get after that, shall we?

Jesus Cavazos, an LHS Senior, is a master at exhibition drill. He won first place at the JROTC Dual Exhibition State Competition in 2010, just for starters. making up routines to compliment them," Cavazos reasoned.

Cavazos is no stranger to danger, and is constantly dreaming up creative ways to add suspense to his act: the blindfold is just a beginning. "I really want to add a bayonet to the end of my rifle. That'll take it to the next level. I still have to get it past administration though," Cavazos laughed.

The inaugural exhibition act has caused a stir of student responses. "It is pretty legit that we have him in the band. He is just awesome," Senior Jeremiah "Jerry" Schauer stated. "He is entertaining. I never take my eyes off the band now," Sophomore Abby Arnold remarked.



Am I required to hold a broker or appraiser's license to be your Property Appraiser? NO. As your Property Appraiser, I network with local real estate professionals to stay informed on the current market trends and issues.

Do I have the education and training necessary to make fair and equitable property assessments? YES. I worked as a contractor in Hendry County for about 13 years before going to work for the Hendry County Property Appraiser. I was there for six years before transferring to the newly formed Hendry-LaBelle Recreation Department as Director, Secretary and Chief Financial Officer. I prepared an annual budget, managed personnel and acted as general contractor on all new projects and project manager for new parks and facilities built through grant funding thereby remaining knowledgeable in the area of current costs. While working for the Property Appraiser, I earned the designation of Certified Florida Evaluator through the International Association of Assessing Officers (IAAO) by the successful completion of Fundamentals of Real Property Appraisal, Income Approach to Valuation, Mass Appraisal of Residential Property, and Fundamentals of Mapping. In the position of Administrative Assistant, I trained and supervised field appraisers in residential, commercial and agricultural areas. Since taking office, I have attended Dept. of Revenue Continuing Education Classes and Property Appraisers Association of Florida (PAAF) conferences, thereby keeping updated on legislative changes and current events.

My opponent knows that my office does not set taxes, strictly values. Below is a graph that shows my own home value, the average of all Hendry County homes, and my opponent's value since my election in 2008. My home decreased 44%, the average single family home decreased 48%, and my opponent's home decreased 55%.

Guillermo Julian Ruiz, 31, was arrested on a warrant Oct. 15 and charged with aggravated battery with a deadly weapon. H. bledsoe was arresting officer.

Rachel Elaine Frederick, 36, was arrested Oct. 5 and charged with possession of harmful new legend drugs without a prescription, selling misbranded drugs in lieu of schedule, I, II, III, IV controlled substance, possession of marijuana under 20 grams and possession of drug equipment.

George Jones Jr., 44, was arrested Oct. 10 and charged with possession of cocaine with intent to sell within 1,000' of a specified area, selling cocaine within 1,000 feet of a child care facility, park etc., Schedule II.



Belle Family Livestock Club, LaBelle Youth Livestock & Agricultural Exhibition, LaBelle Black Heritage Festival, Pioneer Plantation Homeowners Association, and the Felda community leaders. I am a member of the LaBelle Gathering of Christian Men; a new Director of the Greater LaBelle Chamber of Commerce; member Clewiston Chamber of Commerce; member American Legion Post 130; member Citizens Emergency Response Team (CERT); Chairman Hendry County Solid Waste Committee;

I worked as a contractor in Hendry County for about 13 years before going to work for the Hendry County Property Appraiser. I was there for six years before transferring to the newly formed Hendry-LaBelle Recreation Department as Director, Secretary and Chief Financial Officer. I prepared an annual budget, managed personnel and acted as general contractor on all new projects and project manager for new parks and facilities built through grant funding to remain knowledgeable in the area of current costs.

While working for the Property Appraiser, I earned the designation of Certified Florida Evaluator through the International Association of Assessing Officers (IAAO) by the successful completion of Fundamentals of Real Property Appraisal, Income Approach to Valuation, Mass Appraisal of Residential Property, and Fundamentals of Mapping.

In the position of Administrative Assistant, I trained and supervised field appraisers in residential, commercial and agricultural areas. Part of my job was justifying the tax roll values to the Department of Revenue during periodic studies and preparing the annual sales ratio analysis for the level of assessment. Another perhaps more important part of my job was meeting with the public and helping them understand appraisals, taxing authorities, exemptions and the resulting tax bill. Since taking office, I have attended Dept. of Revenue Continuing Education Classes and Property Appraisers Association of Florida (PAAF) conferences, thereby keeping updated on legislative changes and current events.

I was elected as your Property Appraiser in 2008 by a margin of five votes. On the day before Christmas Eve, I was served with notice of a lawsuit wherein I was the Defendant along with the Supervisor of Elections and the Canvassing Board, and Kristina Kulpa was the Plaintiff. My first court appearance was on the day of my swearing in on January 6, 2009. After about a year, the Judge ruled in favor of the Defendants. The bill to the taxpayers of Hendry County was \$129,000. I will personally make my last payment to my attorney right before my re-election.

My belief is that the office administration should be local and visible and available to talk. That is why I appointed Dena Pittman from Clewiston as my Chief Deputy. That is also why I vacated the actual office my predecessor used which kept her out of site of the employees and the public and made her inaccessible. I am visible and available and make "house calls" to taxpayers when needed or wanted. Other agencies, commissioners, etc. now look to my office and myself for clarity and sometimes guidance and direction. Due to my community involvement, I know what's happening around our county. I reach out to the people in the communities to help meet their needs or provide a better understanding of specific issues.

I have reduced the travel budget from \$70,000 to \$11,000. The two main factors in the reduction are 1) obtaining five vehicles from the sheriff at no cost and only paying maintenance and fuel; and 2) not paying myself a large monthly per diem check for use of my personal vehicle.

I made it my mission to attack fraudulent and ineligible exemptions such as some homestead exemptions. By doing so, I have added over \$8,000,000 in value to the tax roll in the last two years. That's approximately \$190,000 in tax dollars for one year.

Galatians 6:9 of the Bible tells us to not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up. I do not plan to give up doing the right thing or following my beliefs even if it makes things difficult for me. I will continue to fight for you so "Keep the Change" and vote Phillip L. Pelletier, Property Appraiser.

Hendry County EDC links business and education

There is no greater foundation for a county than education. It is with that premise that the Hendry County Economic Development Council has created a Task Force to link the business community with our educational system.

While much of the early work of the Task Force has focused on the macro level of getting something like this started, more recent work has started to show tangible results in terms of collaboration between education and businesses.

So why attempt something like this in Hendry County? The simple answer is because the Hendry County young people deserve the best educational system possible to help prepare them for life beyond Hendry County schools. The more difficult answer is because pointing fingers regarding our challenges will not help secure a better educational system in Hendry County. The best counties in America rally around difficult issues and find creative solutions to improve. This simple statement is always the most difficult to achieve because we humans and organizations often operate in silos, are territorial, worry about our own environment, become distracted by less important issues and so on.

Right now there is enough momentum to push forward and strive for greater achievement. We are shooting for being one of those counties in America that pulls together under difficult circumstances and finds creative solutions for the overall betterment of Hendry County and our children and young adults. Ultimately a better Hendry County with well prepared graduates will equate to a workforce that will meet the demands of the business community.

The genius is in the details so here are some details regarding Task Force actions to date.

Each Hendry County school has a business member of the Task Force assigned to serve on their Strategic Action Committee (SAC).

There is now a more concentrated effort to have speakers from the business community in the classrooms and there is a subcommittee of the Task Force to focus on businesses and their employees to become engaged with education.

There is a focus on finding suitable, affordable housing for teachers coming to Hendry County to teach our children. We need to retain the best of these teachers and housing is one component of that retention.

Social activities are being arranged for new teachers to meet community/business people so they feel more at ease with their transition to Hendry County.

The EDC Leadership Alumni has agreed to become readers for our early school age children to help them get off to a better start in school.

There is a movement to lobby the legislature for full day funding for Pre Voluntary Kindergarten. Right now the state only funds for half day.

Hendry County is the recipient of a 'Turn-around Grant' and specific goals are being crafted as of this writing.

The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) will host a free hunter safety course on Oct. 20 from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Participants must successfully complete the online portion of the course prior to attending and bring the final Web report to the FWC course on Oct. 20. It does not have to be notarized.

Students will learn about hunting laws, safe gun handling and hunter ethics/responsibility, among other topics, before taking the final test. The course also includes live-firing instruction on a shooting range.

The class will be held at the Glades County Sheriff's Office Shooting Range in Moore Haven on Gun Club Road (north of the city barn), three miles north of U.S. 27 on State Road 78, and six miles south of Lakeport, near the Fisheating Creek entrance.



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


