IFAS Center to be 'repurposed'

Local agriculture representatives are raising some concerns about the recent decision by University of Florida Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences (UF/IFAS) to "repurpose" the IFAS Research Center in Immokalee as a demonstration center.

Located on 320 acres on SR 29 outside of Immokalee, the IFAS Center in Immokalee opened in 1986 to provide research for agriculturalists in a five-county area - Collier, Charlotte, Glades, Hendry

and Lee counties.

A demonstration center uses applied research and works with the ag community.

The Immokalee site will still do "active, relevant work," Ruth Borger, Assistant VP for IFAS Communications, said. An advisory committee will be named to formulate the center's new focus. Made up of local ag interests, the board will offer an opportunity for local leaders to carve out a definitive role for this center.

Faculty will be transferred to other research and education centers. Staff at the Immokalee

facility will be allotted time to complete current projects, ending operation as a Research and Education Center on September 1, 2014. This will also allow staff and faculty time to find other employment and relocate if necessary.

County Agent Gene McAvoy noted that, over the years, the extension office and growers have conducted many activities there.

He pointed out that an advisory committee will be appointed to meet with administration and

Veterans transport approved

What began as a heated debate earlier in the month ended on a highly conciliatory note at the September 24 county commission meeting.

Local veterans packed the commission chambers in a show of support for the DAV veterans transportation program, which they had feared losing.

In the end, all the veterans left the chambers with smiles.

Commission Chair Karson Turner took the trouble to emphasize the board's support for veterans, adding that "In no way, shape or form would the board tweak this program to the negative."

Speaking for the veterans Bob Kirkwood first asked all the veterans in the chambers - most of the room's occupants.

He spoke of the past "tumultuous weeks" for the veterans and blamed the uproar on incorrect information.

The county became involved in the program with the DAV in 2005.

The DAV had asked for \$32,000 for the program, but the county agreed to increase its support for the program to \$20,000.

The remainder is to come from LaBelle, Clewiston, Glades County and Moore Haven contributions through the aid of Veterans Service Officer David Abney.

Mr. Abney said he sent letters to all these local governments earlier, reminding them to place the program in their budgets. He will also

of 7.6779, This will produce \$13,066,539. The county's final budget for 2014 will be \$61,334,392.

This slight increase is due to additional construction, amounting to just over \$11 million, which has raised an additional \$158,621 over 2013.

mold the center's new role, but he did say he felt the extension service may need to take on some managerial responsibility for demonstration trials.

He said he is familiar with several of the IFAS extension and demonstration centers and has some concerns about future funding.

Mr. McAvoy said that the IFAS Center in Immokalee has always been important to the area's \$2 billion agriculture industry.

Citrus is huge. Vegetables are huge. Livestock is huge," he commented, adding that "research is essential to keeping our competitive edge."

He voiced concerns over the change to the program, noting that research is the only thing that sets American agriculture apart any more.

"We don't have cheap labor any more. We don't have cheap land any more. Research is all we have left to keep that edge."

The model has always been that IFAS research comes up with the information on local ag issues, which it then passed on by way of the extension to the growers. Mr. McAvoy is keeping an open mind, but said that it's hard to see how another model could be as effective.

The Gulf Citrus Growers Association President Wayne Simmons has similar concerns.

The announcement came as a surprise to area growers, catching them off guard. "I thought we would have been involved more" in such a decision, Mr. Simmons said. He noted that recently the center's research staff has dwindled to six of its original 12 or so. Still, he recognizes that "we all must be efficient."

He said the outcome remains "up in the air," but said that agricultural folks are open to seeing what happens.

Mr. Simmons pointed out that the IFAS center has always provided important local research geared to local Southwest Florida growing conditions.

"I hope we don't lose the interaction with research," he said. He said they've been assured that the relationship between research and growers will continue.

He hopes representatives of all major local commodities from the area will be included in planning the future of the center, he added.

The change may save some costs, but is mainly an effort to consolidate duplicated programs, according to Ms. Borger. She said

Perry resigns

In a surprise announcement at the end of the meeting District 4 Commissioner Al Perry resigned, effective at the end of the fiscal year, September 30.

He cited conflict of interest between his seat on the county commission and his po-

sition as City Manager for the City of Clewiston as the reason for his resignation.

Commissioner Perry has served on the board for three years, with one year remaining in his term. Commissioner Perry made the announcement reluctantly.

He said he didn't realize the dire financial condition the county was in when he came on the board and characterized the budget process over the past several years as "brutal."

The county's budget process has been a "tough balance," but added that it was much simpler this year.

After the past three years, "I have a new level of respect for my fellow commissioners," he said.

Commissioner Perry said there has been

Its focus has been on citrus, vegetable, horticulture, entomology, soil and water science and plant pathology research, as well as extension programs.

Duplication of services with Lake Alfred, Gulf Coast and Indian River Research and Education Centers is cited as the reason for the change. The UF/IFAS aim is to evaluate programming to "best serve southwest Florida interests."

The ultimate role the Immokalee center will play has yet to be determined. Ms. Borger explained that details still need to be worked out.

Ms. Borger called the move a reclassifying of the site as a demonstration center. A research and education center has faculty in residence as well as county agents.

In the end, she said, the change will probably not even be noticed by the public. "We understand the huge impact on the community." Ms. Borger said, "the goal is to minimize that impact."

It's flu season!

Flu seasons can be unpredictable. Cases of seasonal flu are reported every year, but the time of year, the severity and the length of the season can vary from one year to another. Flu activity most commonly peaks in the U.S. in January or February. However, seasonal flu activity can begin as early as October and continue to occur into the month of May. Flu viruses are constantly changing so it's not unusual for new flu virus strains to appear each year. Yearly flu vaccinations should begin in September or as soon as the vaccine is available. Remember that it takes up to 2 weeks to provide protection after you get the shot.

The flu viruses are usually spread from droplets when an infected person doesn't cover their mouth when they cough or sneeze. Sometimes people get infected from touching something with flu viruses on it. Then before they get a chance to wash their hands, they end up touching their nose, eyes, or mouth which can transfer the flu virus into their body! Many other viruses spread these ways too

People infected with flu may be able to infect others beginning 1 day before symptoms develop and up to 5-7 days after becoming sick. That means you may be able to spread the flu to someone else before you even know that you are sick!

Here are some tips to help prevent the spread of flu:

- Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze. Throw the tissue in the trash after you use it. Or cough into your elbow...not your hand!
- Wash your hands often with soap and water. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth. Germs are spread this way!
- Try to keep your distance from anyone that's sick
- If you're the one who's sick, keep your distance from others or stay home!
- Get re-vaccinated EVERY YEAR because flu viruses change.

Reasons you should get your flu shot:

- It helps to protect you and other people – Getting a flu shot not only protects you from getting the flu, but you are also protecting your family, friends, co-workers, or anyone that you may come in contact with.
- It may prevent severe illness – Over 200,000 people are hospitalized every year from flu related complications. Kids under 2 years of age and adults over 65 years of age are more likely to be hospitalized from the effects of the flu.
- It may prevent flu-related deaths – Each year, thousands of people in the US die because of the flu. Most of these deaths are infants and people aged 65 and older. More people die from the flu than from any vaccine-preventable disease.

Prepare local bills for legislative delegation

Monday, November 18, has been set as the date for the Hendry County State Legislative Delegation's Public Hearing for the local bills. The meeting will convene at 9 a.m. in the City Commission Room, located at 481 West Hickpoochee Ave, LaBelle, and will last until 12 p.m.

Members of the public will have an opportunity to address the delegation about issues not related to local bills upon completion of the local bill agenda.

All proposals for the local bills are expected to be presented at the hearing and must be drafted in bill form. Five (5) copies of the local bill should be submitted to Rep. Matt Hudson's office no later than noon on Friday, November 4, 2013. Unless there is an emergency, the delegation will consider for introduction only those bills that have been presented at the hearing. Decisions on whether to introduce local legislation will be made at the hearing.

If the local legislative delegation agrees to support the issue and introduce a local bill, a legal advertisement of the proposed bill must be placed in a newspaper of general circulation at least 30 days prior to introduction in the House or Senate unless the bill contains a referendum provision. The local entity requesting the proposed bill will be responsible for placing the legal advertisement

in the newspaper.

According to sections 11.021 and 11.03, Florida Statutes, evidence that notice has been properly published must be submitted before a local bill, not subject to referendum, can be introduced.

The notice must be broad enough to include all matters contained in the body of the proposed legislation, although the specific contents need not be listed in detailed form. The function of the notice requirement is to provide reasonable notice to a person whose interests may be directly affected by proposed legislation so that he or she may inquire further into details of the local bill and, if he or she so desires, seek to prevent enactment or to persuade the Legislature to change the substance of the proposed bill.

Meet your personal issues: Sort through the painful past

Routinely over the last thirty-five years in ministry I have met people who are in enormous emotional pain. Their struggles can be categorized into one of two categories: someone did or said something, or multiple things that has wreaked their self-esteem and diminished them as a person, or their own personal choices proved to be a self-inflicted wound to one or more sensitive zones within their person.

No one is exempt from these harmful encounters in this life. We live in a sinful world with sinful people and we ourselves make poor choices because of our own fallenness.

Since that is true, what can we do? How can we get a handle on our personal issues? Where do we go to be able to get a grip on these deeply personal issues?

There are several areas that we can put into motion that will help facilitate some needed changes in our thinking.

One, if you are serious about healing your spiritual and internal wounds, make an intentional choice to begin seeing Jesus whenever you think or talk about God. The beginning of change is calling a thing by its right name. Read and study the Gospels to learn how Jesus interacted with people. How did He treat people who were struggling with sin? Here's a hint: Jesus was astonishingly kind and gentle with people who knew they were sinful and amazingly confrontive with those who thought they were perfect.

Second, learn about some of God's attributes. See how God is revealed in Scripture, and most clearly in Jesus. He demonstrated grace, mercy, kindness, compassion and love. This will help you love and trust God more. At times we have mental impressions of God that simply aren't true.

Third, begin to believe God is like the ultimate loving parent. God wants us to know that He is not like people who, by nature, are unkind. Even though our own family or other people forsake us, He will receive us (See Ps 27:10). The word picture is that of God reaching down and adopting us as His own child, like a loving father would do for a child abandoned on His doorstep.

The Scriptures repeatedly emphasizes God's tender concern for the fatherless and for orphans (Ps. 10:14; 146:9; and Hosea 14:3).

Fourth, write down what you are learning. A personal journal is good to keep to write about how God differs from the perception you have of Him that was shaped by painful encounters with others in this life. It is amazing how truth changes a life once one has begun acting upon it. One Christian adult raised by a hurtful, perfectionistic setting made this observation: "I am blown away by Jesus' description of the father in the Prodigal Son parable. He is entirely different from my dad. I have been afraid and very reluctant to confess my sins to God because I always pictured Him with His arms folded over His chest, a disgusted look on His face, and shaking His head back and forth just like my dad. I think I can pray more easily if I can hold onto the picture of God as loving and forgiving."

Fifth, get help to deal honestly with the pain. When we begin to mourn our personal losses and to feel the grief and despair, the pain can be debilitating. It can feel like dying. And the worst part may be the pain of the pain. If the pain of our pain is that God allowed it, then the joy of our joy must be learning that God can heal and redeem our pain and lead us into lives of genuine joy.

Six, choose to trust God in the midst of your pain and questions. If we insist on waiting until the pain and doubt go away before trusting God, we'll never do it. God never promised pain-free lives in this sin-stained world. But He has promised to be with us and to comfort and strengthen us in the midst of it all. I invite you to examine His record of faithfulness to that promise and, after doing so, to purposefully decide to trust God. If you are willing to practice this choice (or even willing to be made willing), ask God to empower you.

Seven, choose to connect with a church family. No one could choose our birth families, but we can choose our church families. Deliberately evaluate the spiritual health of a church you are attending or considering. Make sure you are in a church that has the biblically balanced emphasis of 2 Peter 3:18, which tells believers to grow in grace and in the knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Find a church that has a balance of

both aspects.

In life we all hurt. That is why we need the Lord and His people to walk us through and to the truth. Our Shepherd will meet us – that

is His promise to those who call out to Him.

- Loose materials (grass/leaves) must be bagged or canned, not to exceed 40 pounds.
- Limbs/Branches are not to exceed 4 feet in length or 4 inches in diameter & must be bundled & tied or in cans, not to exceed 40 pounds.
- No vacant lot piles will be collected
- Do not mix Yard Waste with other garbage
- Composting/Mulching/Regulated Burns are options
- Direct Haul to Transfer Stations (tipping fee applies) is another option.
